Setting the Scene

The Dartmouth football team returns home after two weeks away when the Big Green host Brown on Senior Day. Opening kickoff is set for 12 p.m. on NESN and ESPN+. Despite last Saturday's loss at Cornell, Dartmouth enters the weekend with a chance to earn a share of the Ivy League Championship. The Big Green need to beat Brown and have Yale beat Harvard to earn a share of their fourth championship in five seasons. Saturday will also be Youth Football Day, as any youth wearing their football jerseys receive free admission.

Dartmouth had a slow start at Cornell, falling behind 6-0, but bouncing back to take leads of 7-6 (in the second quarter) and 14-13 (in the third). However, from there, the Big Red scored 23 straight points to take a 36-14 lead late in the fourth, which Dartmouth couldn't overcome. Turnovers were a big story from the game, with each team having three interceptions and the Big Green also fumbling once, which immediately led to a Cornell return for a score.

Dartmouth's interceptions came from **Micah Green**, **Patrick Campbell** and **Sean Williams**. Campbell also led the Big Green in tackles with a career-high 11. Green had 10, marking his second straight double-figure tackles effort and fourth in the last six games. He leads Dartmouth with 69 tackles on the season. Offensively, **Daniel Haughton** tied a career high six receptions for a career-high 101 yards and a touchdown.

The Big Green struggled to run the ball, finishing with just 60 yards on 25 carries. **Jackson Proctor** led the way with 46 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown. Throwing the ball, he was 26-for-37 (career highs in both attempts and completions) for 258 yards and a touchdown.

The loss marked Dartmouth's second straight at Cornell. Looking ahead to Saturday, the Big Green have won seven straight against Brown. Dartmouth is hoping for a repeat of last season, which featured a win over Brown, along with a Yale win over Harvard moments later, to earn a share of the Ivy championship.

Notables

With a Win on Saturday...

- Dartmouth would finish the season 8-2, marking the fifth time in the last seven seasons played (not including 2020 which didn't happen due to COVID-19) that the Big Green finished with eight or more victories (also 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021).
- The Big Green would finish 5-2 in Ivy League play, the fourth time in the last five seasons with five or more Ivy victories.
- (With a Yale win over Harvard and Columbia win over Cornell) The Big Green would finish in a 3-way tie for first place and share the Ivy League title with Harvard and Columbia. It would mark their 22nd title in program history and fourth championship in the last five seasons.
- (With a Yale win over Harvard and Cornell win over Columbia) The Big Green would finish tied with Harvard and share the Ivy League championship with the Crimson.
- Dartmouth would earn its eighth straight win over Brown and 11th in its last 12 tries.
- The Big Green would earn their third straight win over Brown at home.
- Dartmouth would finish with one or fewer home loss for the sixth time in the last seven seasons. The only other season in which the Big Green have had more than one was 2022.

Scouting Brown

Brown enters 3-6 on the season and 2-4 in the Ivy League. The Bears began the year 2-0 with wins over Georgetown (26-14) and Harvard (31-28), have struggled since, but that includes some close defeats. Their other victory came at home over Cornell via a 23-21 final.

At quarterback, **Jake Willcox** has completed 232-of-363 passes for 2,384 yards, 11 touchdowns and 12 interceptions. **Matt Childs** leads the Bears in rush yards with 369 on 92 carries (4.0 average), along with two touchdowns. **Mark Mahoney's** 44 catches and 539 yards lead the way, with Childs also adding 28 receptions for 376 yards from the backfield. **Tim Malo** leads the defense in tackles (59) and interceptions (2).

As a team, Brown leads the Ivy League in first downs (220) and passing offense (281.7 yards per game). The passing offense is also good for ninth nationally. Wilcox stands third nationally in completions per game (25.67) and 10th in passing yards per contest (264.3).

Quick Hitters

- **Chris Corbo's** six touchdown receptions this season are the most by a Big Green player since **Drew Estrada** had eight in 2019.
- **Micah Green** has emerged in leading the Big Green with 69 tackles. He's had double-figure tackles in four of the last six games.
- **Owen Zalc's** 34-yard field goal at Princeton ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one FG to 17 (all but his first collegiate game a year ago at New Hampshire). The previous Ivy record was 11 consecutive games, originally set by Brown's **Steve Morgan** almost 20 years ago.

National TV Win Over the Tigers

- On Friday, Nov. 8, the Big Green defeated Princeton 26-17, using a 21-0 second quarter to take a commanding lead before holding on.
- **Grayson Saunier** rushed for a pair of touchdowns in the span of 7:16 in the second quarter, with **Jackson Proctor** also finding **Chris Corbo** from five yards out with 15 seconds left in the first half.
- Princeton pulled within 21-14 and 24-17 in the second half, but a safety gave the Big Green a 26-17 lead with 1:54 remaining, effectively ending the Tigers' chances.
- A big key in the victory was senior punter **Davis Golick**, who tied a career high for punt average (46.5), but he stole the show in the fourth quarter. He had punts of 62 and 59 yards to flip the field. The second one landed at the Tigers' 2-yard line, helping lead to the safety.
- Defensively, **Micah Green** and **Ejike Adele** each had career highs in tackles (12 and 10).
- **Cameron Best-Alston** and **Harrison Keith**, who both jumped into the starting lineup, tied career highs in tackles with five and six, respectively.
- A big second-quarter play came from special teams, as **Nico Schwikal** blocked a punt (his second-career punt block, the other coming at Penn last season). **Lou Lamar** recovered it, leading to the Corbo touchdown. It was the Big Green's first punt block since **Patrick Campbell** had one against Columbia last Oct. 21.

The Series

BIG GREEN LEAD 64-32-4

- This is the 101st game in the series.
- The Big Green are aiming to win their seventh straight in the series for the first time since taking 15 in a row from 1960-74.
- In the first 20 years of the Ivy League, Dartmouth was 18-0-2 against the Bears, which included a 15-game winning streak.
- The Green are 25-12-2 all-time against Brown at Memorial Field and 21-10-2 since the start of formal Ivy play in 1956.

Notables

Golick - Special Teams Player of the Week

Following the Princeton win, **Davis Golick** was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week after averaging 46.5 yards per punt and knocking a career-long 62-yard punt. Golick's Special Teams Player of the Week honor marks the fifth time in eight weeks a member of the Big Green has won the award this season.

Golick stole the show in the fourth quarter by kicking a career long 62-yard punt. The 62-yarder led to a Princeton fumble recovered by the Big Green and was the longest by a Dartmouth punter since Brian Scullin's against Cornell in 2008. With the score 24-17 in favor of the Big Green, Golick boomed another long punt, knocking this one for 59 yards, landing at the Princeton 2-yard line, leading to a safety to make the score 26-17, the final score. The 59-yard punt was also the longest Big Green punt since September 2015, meaning in the span of the fourth quarter, Golick had the two longest punts by a Big Green punter in nine years.

Tough Loss to Harvard

- On Saturday, Nov. 2, Harvard took an early 10-0 lead. Dartmouth responded with a 20-0 run, then after trading touchdowns, the Crimson ended the game with 14 unanswered points over the final 5:59 to pull out the 31-27 victory.

- Dartmouth senior quarterback **Jackson Proctor** returned to the lineup after missing three games. He had a strong effort, going 18-for-26 for 235 yards and two touchdowns. - **Grayson Saunier**, who replaced Proctor when he was out, came in for one play, which was a 1-yard touchdown pass to **Sean Ward** (marking Ward's first-career touchdown).

- **Daniel Haughton** led the receivers with a career-high 82 yards on two catches, including a career-long 72-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. It marked the second 70+ yard passing touchdown from Proctor this season, along with his 75-yard toss to **Painter Richards-Baker** at Merrimack.

- Meanwhile, **Jackson Namian** led Dartmouth in receptions with a career high five.

- As a team, Dartmouth rushed for 118 yards, with **D.J. Crowther** leading the way (45) followed by Proctor (36) and **Q Jones** (34).

- Defensively, **Micah Green** enjoyed another strong game with eight tackles to tie for the team lead, along with a sack and fumble recovery. **Tyson Grimm** also added eight tackles, which marked a career high. **Patrick Campbell** had six tackles, along with a forced fumble and pass breakup.

- Despite the loss, the Big Green scored their most points (27) against Harvard since 2003

Stats Perform FCS Top 25

- Another highlight was **Owen Zalc**, who knocked through a career long and program record 54-yard field goal. which also tied an Ivy League record.

Undefeated Showdown at Columbia

- Dartmouth picked up a big 24-21 victory at Columbia on Saturday, Oct. 26.

- The Big Green outscored the Lions 10-0 in the second quarter to take a 10-0 halftime lead. Dartmouth extended its lead to 24-7 after three quarters. Columbia scored two touchdowns in the final 2:05, but the Big Green recovered the ensuing final onside kick to officially clinch their ninth straight victory dating back to the 2023 season (which at the time, marked the longest active streak in the nation).

- Dartmouth's running game proved critical, with **Q Jones** rushing for a career-high 182 yards on 19 carries (9.6 average). His third quarter featured 123 rushing yards on seven carries. Jones was recognized with Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week, along with being named the winner of the New England Football Writers Association Gold Helmet Award. Jones' 182 rush yards marked the most by a Dartmouth player since **Jared Gerbino** had 183 on Oct. 27, 2018.

- **D.J. Crowther** had a 33-yard rushing touchdown in that quarter, with quarterback **Grayson Saunier** adding a 16-yard rush.

- The Big Green finished the third quarter with 173 rushing yards, with only one passing attempt.

- Defensively, **Ejike Adele** was stellar, posting career highs in tackles (9), tackles-for-loss (3.5) and sacks (2).

- The Big Green had a season-high three interceptions (**Zach Farris**, **Tyson Grimm** and **Danny Cronin**), which proved critical. It marked Grimm's first-career pick and Farris' second of the season.

- **Patrick Campbell** returned from injury and promptly doubled his previous career high for tackles (finished with eight, previous was four).

- Grimm's seven tackles were also a career high, with **Braden Mullen's** two sacks tying a career high.

Finding a Way vs. CCSU

- Dartmouth held off a tough CCSU team, coming back from trailing after one quarter of play and again in the fourth. Quarterback **Grayson Saunier's** second rushing touchdown of the day put the Big Green ahead, 20-16, with 5:13 remaining. The Blue Devils' ensuing drive reached the Dartmouth 6-yard line, but the Big Green defense stood tall and forced a turnover on downs.

- Saunier finished the CCSU game 15-of-21 for 177 yards passing, while also running for 42 yards on 13 carries, including two touchdowns.

- **Q Jones** led the ground attack with 51 yards on 16 carries, with **Desmin Jackson** adding 49 on 12. Paxton Scott and **Desmin Jackson** each had four catches, with **Daniel Haughton's** 55 receiving yards leading the way.

- **Micah Green** led the defense in tackles for a second straight week and third time in the last four weeks, tallying 10.

- **Ejike Adele** was one of three Big Green tied for second with six tackles; Adele's 2.0 tackles-for-loss marked a career high.

- **Jamal Cooper's** five total tackles were a career high as well, as Dartmouth improved to 3-0 all-time against CCSU.

Historic Comeback Win

- Dartmouth picked up a historic 44-43 overtime win at Yale, as the Big Green posted their largest comeback victory in program history, coming back from down 23 points in the third quarter and 21 points midway through the fourth.

- The comeback was also the largest comeback in NCAA FCS football this season and moved the Big Green to 2-0, all alone in first place in the Ivy League.

- Dartmouth found itself trailing 30-7 and later 37-16. That's when the Big Green had receiving touchdowns from **Paxton Scott** and **Daniel Haughton** with 7:30 and 6:34 left in the fourth quarter. In between was a perfectly-executed onside kick. After Dartmouth's defense came up with a stop, which ended with a long missed field goal from Yale, the Big Green put together an eight-play, 71-yard drive in less than two minutes. After Haughton made a sensational one-armed grab, quarterback **Grayson Saunier** ran it in from 32 yards away on the ensuing play to even the score at 37. Each team scored a touchdown in the extra session, but the Bulldogs went for two and were unsuccessful.

- Saunier finished with 276 yards passing and 84 rushing, accounting for 360 yards. That marked the highest combined passing and rushing yards by a Dartmouth quarterback since **Jack Heneghan's** 379 on Oct. 21, 2017 against Columbia. Meanwhile, Saunier's 276 pass yards were most by a Big Green quarterback in an Ivy League game since **Derek Kyler** had 303 against Brown on Nov. 23, 2019. Saunier accounted for 111 pass yards and 50 rush yards in the fourth quarter alone.

- Scott finished with six catches for 100 yards, his second 100-yard effort of the season and fifth of his career. He also moved from eighth into seventh place in program history for career receiving yards (now 1,858). **Q Jones** ran for 84 yards, highlighted by a 31-yard run in overtime to erase a couple penalties and set the Big Green up inside the 5-yard line.

- Haughton made a major impact with four catches for a career-high 69 yards, with each catch seeming more critical than the last. Several Big Green posted career highs in tackles (setting or tying): **Micah Green** (11), **Zach Farris** (8), **Ejike Adele** (7), **Jordan Washington** (6), **Derrell Porter**

2023 All-Ivy Honorees

Sammy McCorkle, Dartmouth's Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach, was selected by his peers as the Ivy League Coach of the Year after his first year at the helm of the Big Green. Dartmouth, which won a share of its 21st conference crown this fall, had a total of 18 honors bestowed upon its players, most of any team in the league. Three Big Green made the first team, six more earned a spot on the second team and eight were honorable mentions, plus one member of the Academic All-Ivy Team.

Still All-Time Ivy Champs

Since the Ivy League began play in 1956, no other school in the conference has won more football titles than Dartmouth with 20. The last time an Ancient Eight squad had more crowns than the Big Green was in 1961 when Yale had a grand total of two. The next season, Dartmouth equaled that amount and has never looked up at another team since. But Penn isn't far behind with 18 titles, while Harvard and Yale both have 17.

Ivy League Opening Win

- Penn held a 14-10 halftime lead, but Dartmouth began the second half with a nine-play, 69-yard drive to take a 17-14 lead and wouldn't look back. The Big Green also ended the half with a 20-play, 74-yard drive that took 10:30, not giving the ball back to Penn until 11 seconds remaining at the Quakers' 1-yard line.

- Six seconds into the fourth quarter, **Owen Zalc** knocked through his second field goal of the day, a 39-yarder, to give the Big Green a 20-14 lead, which proved to be the difference. He went on to be named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week for the second straight week (marking the Big Green's third consecutive honor).

- **Jackson Proctor** threw for a season-high 232 yards on 24-of-31 (career highs for both completions and attempts).

- **Paxton Scott** tied a career high in receptions with 10.

- The ground game was stellar as **Q Jones** rushed for 101 yards on a career-high 22 carries, marking his third-career 100-yard game, first at home; the others were in 2022 at Sacred Heart and 2023 at Brown.

- Entering the day with two career rushing attempts and zero yards, **Desmin Jackson** seized his opportunity, finishing with 98 yards on 14 carries, including a long of 42.

- Defensively, **Jordan Washington** covered Penn preseason All-American wide receiver **Jared Richardson** for most of the game and held him to just two receptions (on six targets) for 18 yards. It was by far Richardson's season low in both categories; he had entered with five catches for 98 yards at Delaware and six for 96 against Colgate.

- **Zach Farris** led the Big Green in tackles, recording a career-high eight. **Ejike Adele** and **Braden Mullen** each recorded a sack.

- In the end, the Big Green won their Ivy League opener (all coming against Penn) for the sixth time in the last seven seasons.

Golick Wins Ivy League Award

Punter **Davis Golick** was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week after the Princeton win. It marked the fifth time in eight weeks a member of the Big Green has won the award this season.

Golick was a difference maker in the Big Green's win over the Princeton Tigers, Friday, stealing the show in the fourth quarter by kicking a career long 62-yard punt. The 62-yarder led to a Princeton fumble recovered by the Big Green and was the longest by a Dartmouth punter since **Brian Scullin's** against Cornell in 2008. With the score 24-17 in favor of the Big Green, Golick boomed another long punt, knocking this one for 59 yards, landing at the Princeton 2-yard line, leading to a safety to make the score 26-17, which proved to be the final.

The 59-yard punt was also the longest Big Green punt since September 2015, meaning in the span of the fourth quarter, Golick had the two longest punts by a Big Green punter in nine years.

Zalc - Ivy Special Teams Player of the Week for Third Time

Owen Zalc was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week for the third time this season following a record-breaking day against Harvard. Zalc was 2-for-2 on field goals and 3-for-3 on extra points, highlighted by a program-record 54-yard field goal in the second quarter. That field goal broke the previous Dartmouth football record of 52 yards, while also tying the Ivy League mark. It pulled the Big Green within 10-6 with 8:01 left in the second quarter. Earlier in the quarter, Zalc knocked through a 37-yard field goal. He is now 12-for-15 on field goals on the season, including two of 50+ yards.

The recognition marked Zalc's seventh-career Ivy League weekly award and fourth special teams honor; he was also named Rookie of the Week three last season. It's the Big Green's fourth Ivy special teams weekly award of the season out of seven weeks.

Multiple Awards for Jones

After his career performance at Columbia, Jones was recognized with Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week, along with being named the winner of the New England Football Writers Association Gold Helmet Award. Jones' 182 rush yards marked the most by a Dartmouth player since **Jared Gerbino** had 183 on Oct. 27, 2018. For Jones, it came on 19 carries (9.6 average). His third quarter featured 123 rushing yards on seven carries. It marked Jones' second-career Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week Award, the other coming after his 124 rush yards and two touchdowns in the 2023 season finale at Brown.

Saunier Earns Ivy League Award

After helping lead the Big Green to their biggest comeback win in program history at Yale, quarterback **Grayson Saunier** was recognized with Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week honors. In his first-career extended minutes, he finished 20-of-34 for 276 yards with three touchdowns through the air. He also added 12 carries for 84 yards and two rushing touchdowns. Dartmouth went on to beat Yale, 44-43 in overtime, for a critical Ivy League victory. Saunier's 32-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter evened the score at 37. In the fourth quarter alone, he threw for 111 yards and rushed for 50 as the Big Green scored 21 straight points over the final 7:30 of regulation to force OT.

Mullen Named Campbell Trophy Semifinalist

Senior **Braden Mullen** has been named one of 203 semifinalist for the 2024 William V. Campbell Trophy®, which recognizes the top football scholar-athlete in the nation. Mullen is a team captain, who has a strong GPA in the classroom as a government and economics (modified) major, and as an All-Ivy performer on the field. Celebrating its 35th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior who will complete his final year of eligibility in the 2024 season or graduate student or graduate transfer who has already earned a degree and participating in the 2024 season; have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale; have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor; and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.

Moving up the Ranks

Paxton Scott finished with six catches for 121 yards during the season opener against Fordham. It was the first 100-yard receiving game for a Big Green player since last Oct. 14 at Colgate when Scott had 185. It was also the second straight season opener Scott has reached the 100-yard mark; he had 10 receptions for 153 yards in last year's opener at New Hampshire.

- Also in the process, Scott moved from a tie for 10th to sixth place in program history for catches (137). He also upped his career receiving yards total to 1,647, which moved him up two spots to ninth in Dartmouth history. He passed **Victor Williams** (2012-15) who had 1,632 and **Tim McManus** (2007-11), who tallied 1,633.

- Scott began the day with 131 career receptions. With his six, he passed **Ryan Fuslier** (2004-06) who had 131, **Dave Shula** (1978-80) who had 133, **Tim McManus** (2007-11) who had 134, **Jack Daly** (1981-83) who had 135 and Williams (2012-15) who had 135.

- At Merrimack the following week, Scott's four catches moved him to 141 in his career, past **Craig Morton** and into fifth place all-time.

- Against Penn, Scott's 75 yards receiving gave him 1,758 yards, passing **Michael Reilly** for eighth place in program history.

- At Yale, Scott finished with six catches for 100 yards and a touchdown,

his second 100-yard effort of the season and fifth of his career. He also moved from eighth into seventh place in program history for career receiving yards (now 1,858), passing Shula's (1978-80) 1,822.

- Against CCSU, Scott had four catches for 37 yards, giving him 161 career receptions and moving him into fourth place in program history, passing **Hunter Hagdorn's** 160.

Thrilling Win at Merrimack

- Dartmouth picked up an exciting 16-14 win at Merrimack. **Owen Zalc** was the hero, knocking through a 32-yard field goal with three seconds remaining to give the Big Green the two-point advantage.

- Earlier in the quarter, Zalc hit a career-long 50-yard field goal while his three total field goals for the game also marked a career high. He was named Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts.

- With just 19 seconds left in the first quarter, after the Warriors took a 7-0 lead, **Jackson Proctor** found **Painter Richards-Baker** for 75 yards, the longest catch by a Big Green player since Oct. 12, 2019 when **Drew Estrada** had a 75-yard reception from **Jared Gerbino** in a 42-10 win over Yale.

- Defensively, **Micah Greene** tallied a career-high nine tackles while Sean Williams added eight. The six tackles from **Ejike Adele** and four from **Patrick Campbell** were also career highs, as were **Derrell Porter's** two tackles-for-loss.

Season Opener Notes

- Dartmouth's 32-point margin of victory (45-13) vs. Fordham marked its largest in a season opener since a 41-0 victory over Georgetown on Sept. 15, 2018.

- The Big Green's 45 points were their most in a season opener since a 56-6 win over New Hampshire on Sept. 25, 1965.

- It was also Dartmouth's most points in any game since a 52-31 win at Brown in the 2021 season finale (Nov. 20).

- The 45 points were the Big Green's most against a nonleague opponent since a 49-7 victory at Marist on Oct. 19, 2019 and most points at home since a 59-24 win over Columbia a week later.

- **Nico Schwikal's** three tackles marked a career high.

- **Q Jones'** 19-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was the first TD grab of his career.

- **Jackson Proctor** set a career high for touchdown passes (2) while **D.J. Crowther's** 79 rush yards marked a career high as well.

Washington Named Ivy Special Teams Player of the Week

Senior **Jordan Washington** provided the highlight moment of the dominant 45-13 season-opening win over Fordham, and on Monday, he was recognized with Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week honors. Early in the third quarter, the defensive back came around the edge to block a 39-yard Fordham field goal attempt. Washington subsequently scooped it up and went 60 yards for the touchdown. Following the extra point, the Big Green led 31-0.

Looking Back to Last Year's Title

Standing 3-4 overall and 2-2 in the Ivy League after a 17-9 loss at No. 23 Harvard, the Big Green finished last season with three straight wins, beating Princeton (23-21), Cornell (30-14) and Brown (38-13). After beating the Bears in the season finale, Dartmouth waited on the field, many with phones in hand, to catch the end of the Harvard at Yale game. The Big Green needed Yale to win to force a three-way tie atop the standings, and despite many tense moments, that's exactly what happened as Dartmouth celebrated its third Ivy League Championship since 2019.

Micah Greene Named to Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®

For his outstanding service, Dartmouth senior linebacker **Micah Green** has been named to the 2024 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. One of only 23 total honorees and four from Division I FCS, Green is Dartmouth's second straight honoree after **Josh Greene** was named to the team last season. Dartmouth is one of just three Division I programs, and only FCS program, to have a member on the Good Works Team® in consecutive years.

This year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was selected from a record 178 nominees, representing players and coaches from colleges and universities across the country for their unwavering commitment to community service and their "good works" off the field.

In addition to being actively involved with a charitable organization or service group, each player must also maintain strong academic standing. Allstate will host the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® members in New Orleans for the Allstate Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, an annual tradition provided courtesy of Allstate, as an additional honor for being selected to the team.

Zalc Named Preseason All-American

Following a historic rookie season, sophomore kicker **Owen Zalc** was named a Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-American, earning a spot on the third team. He was one of only three Ivy League student-athletes to earn the All-America honor.

Last season, Zalc broke the program record for field goals (connecting on 17-of-21), while also breaking the Ivy mark for field goals in league play (14). He was named first team All-Ivy League and was named an FCS Freshman All-American, while also earning a spot on the Division I All-New England Team. Zalc received Dartmouth football's Earl Hamilton Freshman Award after the season as well. Among Zalc's field goals were clutch kicks at Penn (in overtime) and vs. Princeton (in the final two minutes of regulation) to lead Dartmouth to victories.

NFL Presence

Two former Dartmouth players begin the season with NFL clubs. Both defensive end **Niko Lalas** (New Orleans Saints) and defensive back **Isaiah Johnson** (Miami Dolphins) are on their teams' practice squads.

Captains Named

At halftime of the spring game, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach **Sammy McCorkle** announced the team captains for the fall of 2024, which were rising senior defensive lineman **Josiah Greene**, quarterback **Jackson Proctor** and linebacker **Braden Mullen**.

"These three guys are phenomenal," said McCorkle. "They've proven to be leaders of this football program in every aspect, not just on the practice field, not just in the locker room, but in everything. Up the street on campus, the way they represent our football program, the way they train in the offseason, that's what you look for. They're three different guys, but three guys who were voted on across the board from the coaches and players. I can't say enough about how excited we are of these three guys."

Notables

Coach Teevens

Dartmouth lost its winningest coach in program history with the passing of **Buddy Teevens** '79 last Sept. 19 from injuries he suffered in a bicycle accident in March. The Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach guided the team for 22 seasons over two stints, including the last 17 campaigns, winning five Ivy League titles along the way. He was named the New England Coach of the Year three times (1990, 2015, 2019) and the Ivy League Coach of the Year twice (2015, '19) while racking up 117 victories, 83 in conference play.

On Oct. 4 when Dartmouth hosted Penn, Buddy Teevens Stadium at Memorial Field was named, in honor of BT's legacy.

National Award Announced in BT's Honor

Prior to the FBS National Championship Game last January, **Peyton Manning** revealed on ESPN's College GameDay that a new award will be given out for the first time following the 2024 college football season in honor of the late Dartmouth football coach **Buddy Teevens**.

The Buddy Teevens Award will go to a coach who makes a lasting impact on the game of football, on and off the field. Manning detailed some of the innovations Teevens made to preserve and improve college football, including the elimination of tackling from practices to reduce injuries, inspiring the development of a robotic tackling dummy and the hiring of women coaches, two of whom are currently coaching in the NFL — **Callie Brownson** (Cleveland Browns) and **Jennifer King** (Chicago Bears).

A Decade-Plus of Success

Dartmouth football returned to prominence throughout the 2010s decade, recording a record of 70-30 (.700) over the 10 years. Only eight teams enjoyed a higher winning percentage in that span. And with a third consecutive 9-1 season in 2021, the Big Green enjoyed more victories over a span of three seasons (27), four (35), five (39), six (48) and seven (56) than at any point in their history. Dartmouth has also added four Ivy League titles since 2015 to boost its conference-record total to 21 crowns since the league first officially formed for the 1956 season.

Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach Sammy McCorkle



Sammy McCorkle, who had been on Buddy Teevens' staff since the head coach's return to Hanover in 2005, was filling in as the interim head coach for the 2023 season following Teevens' bicycle accident in March of 2023 and subsequent passing on Sept. 19. On Oct. 19, McCorkle had the interim tag removed as he became the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach.

McCorkle enters his second season in 2024. During the 2023 season, he went on to be named the Ivy League Coach of the Year, as the Big Green earned a share of the Ivy League Championship for the third time in four seasons. It upped Dartmouth's Ivy League best mark of championships to 21. The Big Green won their final three games of the season, beating Princeton (23-21), Cornell (30-14) and Brown (38-13) to finish tied with Yale and Harvard at 5-2 in league play. Dartmouth had a total of 18 honors bestowed upon its players, most of any team in the league. Three Big Green made the first team, six more earned a spot on the second team and eight were honorable mentions, plus one member of the Academic All-Ivy Team.

As a team, Dartmouth led the nation in fewest sacks allowed (0.50 per game) and was fourth in first down defense (allowing just 170 all season).

McCorkle, a 1996 graduate and three-time letter winner at the University of Florida is in his 20th year on the Big Green staff, helping Dartmouth to the program's 20th Ivy League championship in 2021. In the seven seasons of 2013-19, the Big Green were first or second in passes defended in the Ivy League, and his secondary was instrumental to the team's top-12 ranking in passing efficiency defense from 2018-21.

McCorkle's special teams have excelled as well, ranking among the top 25 nationally in each of the four seasons in punt returns between 2017-21, including a pair of top-10 rankings. In his first season as head coach, the Big Green ranked seventh nationally in blocked punts with three.

McCorkle has coached 11 players who have earned All-Ivy League First Team honors a total of 15 times, including two-time All-American CB Isiah Swann. No fewer than 26 of his defensive backs have received All-Ivy honors a combined 41 times, most recently safety Sean Williams '26

(first team) in 2023.

The Dartmouth defense was 14th nationally in scoring defense in 2023 and 13th in 2022 after placing among the top three in the previous three seasons. The 2021 squad also ranked fourth in fewest passing yards. And in the previous campaign of 2019, McCorkle's players were quite opportunistic during the season with four pick-sixes among the five defensive scores, fourth among FCS programs.

In 2018, the defense ranked second nationally in fewest points allowed and red zone defense, and fourth in total defense as Dartmouth finished the season ranked 15th in the coaches' poll. Three years prior, the squad led the nation in those first two categories and was also fourth in total defense as the Big Green won a share of its first conference crown in 19 years. Cornerback Vernon Harris '16 earned a spot on the All-Ivy First Team in 2014 and '15, and two-time co-captain Garrett Waggoner garnered first-team honors as a safety in both 2012 and '13.

McCorkle also mentored one of the finest cornerbacks and return men in Dartmouth history in Shawn Abuhoff '12, who earned first-team All-Ivy honors at both positions in 2010 and 2011.

In his first season on staff, three members of the Green's defensive secondary in 2005 — Steve Jensen, Mike Ribero and Ian Wilson — earned All-Ivy recognition as Dartmouth ranked first in the league in pass defense and 14th in the FCS.

In 2003-04, McCorkle was the head coach at Martin County High in Stuart, Florida. In 2003, he led Martin County to its best record in 10 years.

McCorkle previously coached at the University of Tennessee-Martin from 2000-02. He coached the defensive secondary in 2000 and was defensive coordinator in 2001-02.

From 1997-99, McCorkle was a graduate assistant at his alma mater, assisting the secondary and special teams coaches while also scouting opponents.

During the 1996-97 academic year, McCorkle taught PE while coaching the defensive backs and linebackers, and coordinating special teams at Spanish River High School in Boca Raton, Fla.

McCorkle was a standout defensive back at Florida. He played on four SEC championship teams, competed in four bowl games (Gator, Sugar twice and Fiesta) and a national title game. McCorkle graduated with Florida's single-season and career

records for blocked punts. He twice was named Florida's special teams player of the year.

McCorkle, was the football staff's academic liaison, as coordinator of the Mentoring Program that brings Big Green football players and successful Dartmouth alumni together to introduce the players to business and professional opportunities when they graduate.

He and his wife, Vicki, have three daughters, Madison, Allie and Campbell.

Game #1: Dartmouth 45, Fordham 13

HANOVER, N.H. — The Dartmouth football team scored the game's first 31 points and wouldn't look back, as the Big Green opened their season in style with a 45-13 win over Fordham on Saturday at Memorial Field. Dartmouth set the tone early, scoring just four plays into the contest, as the Big Green used a balanced attack for their largest margin of victory in a season opener since 2018.

"Super excited," said Sammy McCorkle, the Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "Excited the way the guys prepared all preseason and prepared this week. Really thought our energy was great... it really was. There are some things we've got to clean up, a couple mistakes here and there. We can't take our foot off the gas, but I think the guys responded well, they played fast, they played hard and were pretty much assignment sound the entire time."

Q Jones scored Dartmouth's first two touchdowns of the season, the first a 40-yard run and the second a 19-yard reception, both coming in the first quarter. He finished the day with 86 yards on 16 carries. D.J. Crowther added 79 yards on nine carries, including a 46-yard touchdown. As a team, Dartmouth scampered for 233 yards.

"A lot of holes," said Jones when asked about the key to success. "My job is to hit those. My tight ends and O linemen handled their business up front and to repay them, I try to get touchdowns, I try to get first downs because it's a testament of all their hard work."

The Big Green's passing attack was strong as well, led by Jackson Proctor, who was 14-of-18 for 185 yards and two touchdowns. Six of those completions for 121 yards were to Paxton Scott, who moved from a tie for 10th to sixth place in program history for catches (137). He also upped his career receiving yards total to 1,647, which moved him up two spots to ninth in Dartmouth history.

"You can't do it without everybody else," said Proctor. "The offensive line played great. The receivers caught the ball. Q had a really good game. Obviously prepping up throughout this game, throughout the week, I think we did a really good job. That's a testament to the team we have."

Defensively, the Big Green were strong in shutting out Fordham until late in the third quarter. Zach Farris picked up his first-career interception while Cameron Lee had two of Dartmouth's four sacks, with Josiah Green and Danny Cronin recording the others. Cameron Best-Alston posted a team-high five tackles.

"We wanted to make sure we broke them down as much as possible," said Green. "Coach Lark talks about pursuit all day every day. Angles beats speed any day of the week."

Defensive back Jordan Washington's big-

gest play came on special teams, as his early third-quarter field goal block and ensuing return for touchdown gave Dartmouth the 31-0 advantage, pretty much erasing any doubt.

On the third play of the game, Proctor found Proctor for 44 yards. One play later, Jones found the end zone with a 40-yard run to give Dartmouth a 7-0 lead just 1:52 into the contest.

The Big Green doubled their advantage later in the quarter with a long 10-play, 86-yard drive, ending with Proctor finding Jones for 19 yards, a touchdown and 14-0 Big Green lead after one quarter of play.

Dartmouth tacked on 10 more points in the second. Early in the stanza, it looked like Chris Corbo was just out of bounds in the back of the end zone, but upon review, it was determined he had dragged his left toe before his right foot was down. That 12-yard grab gave the Big Green a 21-0 lead.

With two minutes left in the second quarter, Owen Zalc knocked through a 40-yard field goal to give Dartmouth a 24-0 halftime advantage.

On Fordham's first drive of the third, the Rams lined up for a 39-yard field goal, but Washington came around the edge for the highlight-reel block. He corralled the loose ball and went 50 yards into the end zone with an ease to make the score 31-0.

Later in the third, a 10-play Fordham drive pulled the Rams within 31-7, but that's as close as they would come. Crowther had a 46-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter, Fordham responded with a touchdown, but making his collegiate debut, Grayson Saunier's 31-yard rushing touchdown with 1:51 remaining gave Dartmouth a 45-13 lead — which proved to be the final.

"I was impressed with the fact the guys we wanted to step up, they stepped up, and they put us in a really good situation early in the game," said McCorkle. "They put to where Fordham had to play catchup."



As a team, Dartmouth held a 418 to 293 edge in total yards.

NOTES: Dartmouth's 32-point margin of victory marked its largest in a season opener since a 41-0 victory over Georgetown on Sept. 15, 2018 ... The Big Green's 45 points were their most in a season opener since a 56-6 win over New Hampshire on Sept. 25, 1965 ... It was also Dartmouth's most points in any game since a 52-31 win at Brown in the 2021 season finale (Nov. 20) ... The 45 points were the Big Green's most against a nonleague opponent since a 49-7 victory at Marist on Oct. 19, 2019 and most points at home since a 59-24 win over Columbia a week later ... Paxton Scott began the day with 131 career receptions; with his six, he passed Ryan Fuslier (2004-06) who had 131, Dave Shula (1978-80) who had 133, Tim McManus (2007-11) who had 134, Jack Daly (1981-83) who had 135 and Victor Williams (2012-15) who had 135 ... In yards, Scott passed both Williams who had 1,632 and Tim McManus (2007-11) who finished with 1,633.

Game #2: Dartmouth 16, Merrimack 14

NORTH ANDOVER, Mass. — Owen Zalc knocked through his third field goal of the afternoon, a 32-yarder with three seconds remaining, to help the Big Green erase a 14-10 fourth-quarter deficit and spoil Merrimack's homecoming, 16-14, on Saturday afternoon at Duane Stadium. In front of an announced crowd of more than 15,000 fans, the Big Green put together drives of 35 and 62 yards in the fourth quarter to improve to 2-0 on the season.

"Going into the game, we knew it was going to be a huge challenge. It was going to be a hostile environment," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "We knew they were a good football team. They came in with a lot of energy; they were an aggressive football team, and they were prepared to play us. I thought we didn't quite come out the way we needed to come out, but our guys came out of halftime, adjusted and made some changes offensively and defensively. Our guys came out with a lot more energy in the second half and played a lot more aggressively."

With 7:54 left in the fourth, Zalc converted a career-long 50-yarder as he finished the day with three field goals to tie a career high.

"Owen continues to do what he does," said McCorkle. "He's such a gamer. It's nice knowing you have a guy like that. It allows you to do some things earlier in the game that could put you in a situation at the end where he can win it for you."

"Just do the same thing I do every time," said Zalc, when asked about the game-winner. "I'm going to get good protection, I know that. The snap is going to be there, the hold's going to be there, I just have to kick it."

Quarterback Jackson Proctor finished 14-of-29 passing with 161 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for 43 yards on 10 attempts, with Q Jones posting a team-high 52 rush yards.

Painter Richards-Baker had one catch, but it was for 75 yards and a first-quarter touchdown. All four of Paxton Scott's team-high four receptions were in the second half, with them going for 46 yards. Scott moved into fifth place in program history for career receptions, now with 142. Daniel Haughton and Chris Corbo each added two catches.

Micah Green led the Big Green in tackles with nine while Sean Williams added eight and Josiah Green tacked on seven. Ejike Adele had a half sack and 1.5 tackles for loss in a strong effort.

Merrimack's Jermaine Corbett, who entered the weekend 11th in the nation in rushing yards, led the Warriors with 137 yards on the ground (on 21 carries) and two touchdowns. He also led the Warriors in receiving yards (45).

After a Dartmouth three-and-out, Merrimack turned its first drive into a 7-0 lead, as Corbett finished it off with a 13-yard touch-

down. Following the extra point, the Warriors led 7-0 with 8:40 on the first-quarter clock.

It took just 19 seconds for Dartmouth to answer. On the second play of the drive, a play-action pass finished with Proctor finding Richards-Baker down the right side. He went all the way for 75 yards, evening the score at seven with 8:21 left in the first. It marked the Big Green's longest reception since October of 2019.

"We needed a little jump start there," said McCorkle. "I felt like our guys were going through the motions a little bit, but that was helpful. The energy has to stay. We have to match our opponent's energy and even more. I thought [Merrimack] did a good job of coming out with more energy than us. We can't wait until the second half to do that. Luckily, we ended up on the winning side."

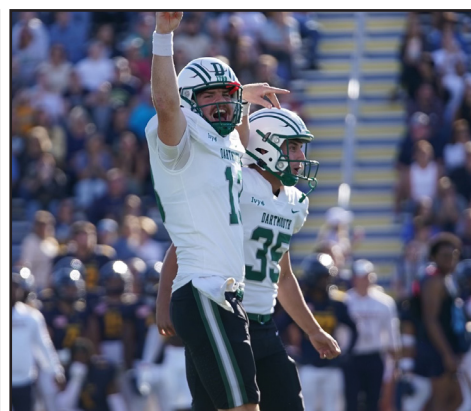
After each team had a touchdown, the defenses took over until late in the second quarter. A Merrimack running-into-the-punter penalty kept Dartmouth's drive alive, which finished with Zalc converting his first field goal of the afternoon, 31 yards, to give Dartmouth a 10-7 lead with 1:59 on the clock. That proved to be the halftime score.

Merrimack took the opening drive of the second half 72 yards on seven plays, finishing with an 11-yard Corbett run, to put the Warriors back in front, 14-10.

On the ensuing drive, Dartmouth methodically marched down the field. Twelve plays later, Zalc had plenty of distance on a 50-yard field goal, but it fell wide of the mark.

Proctor played his best in the fourth quarter, finishing 6-of-9 for 70 yards. Three of those completions were to Scott to keep the chains moving. Midway through the fourth, Dartmouth was facing fourth-and-nine from the Merrimack 33-yard line. McCorkle sent Zalc back out for his second 50-yard attempt and he converted, pulling the Big Green within 14-13 with 7:54 on the clock.

On the ensuing drive, a sack by Josiah Green and Adele proved critical in forcing



second-and-18. The Warriors would punt, as the Big Green started from their own 25-yard line. Dartmouth got first downs on each of its first two plays, via a 13-yard reception by Chris Corbo and 15-yard catch by Jones. The drive saw two more first downs, and ended with Zalc knocking through a 32-yard field goal with just three seconds remaining.

Total yards were 280-264 in favor of Dartmouth, with the Big Green holding a slim 18-15 edge in first downs.

"It's always good to get a win," said McCorkle. "It's hard to win. It's not always going to be pretty. A game like this, coming down to the wire, is going to help us for sure."

NOTES: Zalc's game-winning field goal marked the third of his young career in the final two minutes of regulation or overtime. Last season, he converted a walk-off 37-yarder in overtime at Penn then later gave the Big Green a 23-21 lead over Princeton with 1:29 left in the fourth quarter, which proved to be the final ... Richards Baker's 75-yard reception was the longest catch by a Big Green player since Oct. 12, 2019 when Drew Estrada had a 75-yard catch from Jared Gerbino in a 42-10 win over Yale ... Paxton Scott passed Craig Morton (1986-88) for fifth place in program history for career receptions, now owning 142.

Game #3: Dartmouth 20, Penn 17

HANOVER, N.H. — The Dartmouth football team held visiting Penn without a touchdown for the entire second half, coming back from a 14-10 halftime deficit to defeat the Quakers, 20-17 on Saturday afternoon in the first-ever game at the newly-named Buddy Teevens Stadium at Memorial Field. The Big Green had a drive of 10:30 in the fourth to leave Penn with just 11 seconds from its own 1-yard line and no timeouts remaining.

The Ivy League opener for both sides saw the third straight tight contest in the all-time series, after the teams went to overtime each of the previous two years. Dartmouth improves to 3-0 and 1-0 in the Ivy League, with Penn falling to 1-2 and 0-1 in the league.

"I can't say enough how proud I am of that football team," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "The first half, they were prepared, came out and really battled. We had some opportunities to make some plays in the first half that we didn't and it cost us, but we didn't panic. I thought we did a good job of staying on script."

"I challenged the guys at halftime, let's finish each play, let's come out and let's finish this game," McCorkle continued. "Our offense coming out in the first drive of the second half, we were sending a message. Our defense did a great job responding and shutting them down. That last drive, I told our team after the game, you're developing an identity. To be able to take the ball 10 minutes, to hold onto that thing and drive the length of the field was critical."

Offensively, Jackson Proctor was 24-of-31 for a season-high 232 yards and two touchdowns. Dartmouth's ground game was stellar, with Q Jones rushing for 101 yards on 22 carries. Desmin Jackson wasn't far behind, scampering for 98 on 14 carries, including a long of 42 yards.

"Big shoutout to the coaching staff, Coach [Braxton] Chapman putting people where they have to be," said Jackson. "We have a really deep running back room. Any one in there can go in and will perform at a high level. It's really trusting the people up front, opening up holes for us and hitting it with all you've got. Big shoutouts to the O line and coaching staff for putting us in positions that we need to be."

Paxton Scott tied a career high with 10 receptions for 75 yards, along with a touchdown. Chris Corbo had a career-high seven receptions for 51 yards and his second touchdown of the season. Zach Farris led the defense with a career-high eight tackles. Jordan Washington was tremendous in covering Penn preseason All-American wide receiver Jared Richardson, holding him to just two receptions for 18 yards.

As a team, the Big Green held the Quakers to a season-low 17 points, which was their fewest since Nov. 12, 2022.

Both defenses stood tall in the early going, until late in the first quarter, when the Big Green took advantage of good field position following an Ejike Adele sack. On the sixth play of the drive, Proctor found Corbo for 10 yards and the score. After the extra point, the Big Green led 7-0.

Penn responded midway through the second quarter to pull even at seven, but the ensuing drive saw Grayson O'Bara make an incredible leaping catch on a ricochet, good for 43 yards to the Quakers' 26-yard line. That helped set up a 42-yard Owen Zalc field goal and a 10-7 Big Green advantage with 5:23 left in the second quarter.

Penn had another answer, going 69 yards on nine plays, ending with a 1-yard touchdown run from Malachi Hosley and a 14-10 lead, which proved to be the halftime margin.

Dartmouth's offense marched 75 yards on nine plays to begin the second half and retake the lead, 17-14. The drive saw a 33-yard rush from Q Jones to the Penn 17-yard line. Three plays later, Proctor found Scott, who spun away from the would-be tackler and into the end zone from 12 yards out. The extra point gave the Big Green a 17-14 advantage with 10:23 left in the third quarter.

The teams traded field goals early in the fourth quarter. After Penn pulled within 20-17 with 10:41 remaining, Dartmouth had a 20-play, 74-yard drive. One of the key moments came on second-and-16 when on consecutive plays, Jackson and Jones each ran for eight yards and a key first down. Penn didn't get the ball back until 11 seconds remaining, with 99 yards to go, as the Big Green defense stood tall.

"I told the guys at halftime, let's just finish," said McCorkle. "Finish each play. Focus on that one play and do whatever you've got to do to finish that play. I thought our guys did a good job of responding."

Total yards were 439-211 in favor of Dartmouth. The Big Green held Penn quarterback Aidan Sayin to only 123 yards passing after he



entered the day eighth in the country averaging 274 pass yards per game.

"Our guys did a good job of sticking to their jobs, their fundamentals," said McCorkle. "They played with confidence, and it was a quiet confidence, but you could tell offensively and defensively when our guys took the field, they were hungry."

NOTES: Dartmouth rushed for 207 yards, the second time in as many home games at 200+ rush yards ... The Big Green beat Penn, and won their Ivy League opener, for the sixth time in the last seven tries ... Dartmouth pulled even at 34 against Penn since Ivy League play officially began in 1956 ... Paxton Scott's 10 receptions tied his career high from two occasions, most recently at Colgate last season.

Game #4: Dartmouth 44, Yale 43 (OT)

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — The Dartmouth football team just wouldn't quit. Despite trailing 30-7 late in the third quarter and 37-16 midway through the fourth, the Big Green scored touchdowns with 7:30, 6:34 and 1:22 remaining in regulation before topping Yale in overtime, 44-43, on Saturday afternoon inside the Yale Bowl. Quarterback Grayson Saunier helped spark the offense; in the fourth quarter alone, he threw for 111 yards and rushed for 50 more, as the Big Green improved to 4-0 and 2-0 in Ivy League play. The 23-point comeback victory marks the largest comeback in the program's storied history.

Yale fell to 2-1 and 0-2 in the league.

"Super proud of the guys, just the way they battled," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "We came out, didn't play our game early, made a lot of mistakes early in that game and put ourselves in a really, really tough situation. What we talked about at halftime is don't look at the scoreboard, just go out there and go one play at a time, chip away at this. You could just sense the energy as the second half was going on."

Seeing extended minutes for the first time in his career, Saunier finished 20-of-34 passing for 276 yards and three touchdowns. He also had 12 carries for 84 yards and two rushing scores.

"That game was incredible, one of the best games I've ever been a part of," he said. "Not about myself, but as a team. I have never seen a team fight back like that before. We were down three or four possessions, but Coach Mac talks about it all the time, trying to figure out our identity. I just think it's our fight. We never give up."

"We never stopped having confidence in ourselves," Saunier continued. "We were going to give it our all until the end of the game."

Paxton Scott finished with six receptions for exactly 100 yards, with Daniel Haughton added four for a career-high 69 yards. Q Jones had 39 of his 84 rush yards in overtime.

Micah Green led the Big Green defense with a career-high 11 tackles. For the game, Dartmouth had 10 tackles-for-loss, with three coming from Micah's brother Josiah Green — marking a career high.

The comeback began late in the third quarter when Saunier finished off a four-play, 75-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run. One play prior, Saunier found Haughton for 42 yards down to the 1-yard line.

The two-point conversion was no good, but just moments later, Owen Zalc knocked through a 48-field goal with 2:31 on the third-quarter clock to make it nine straight Dartmouth points. That pulled the Big Green within 30-16 heading to the fourth.

Yale added some insurance at 11:02 of the fourth to take a 37-16 lead, but that insurance wasn't enough. An 11-play, 75-yard Dartmouth drive ended with Saunier connecting with Scott from seven yards out. The extra point pulled Dartmouth within 37-23 with 7:30 left in regulation.

The Big Green subsequently executed a

perfect onside kick, which fell into the arms of Chris Corbo. And it took only 56 seconds on four plays to get even closer. Saunier found Scott for 38 yards to the Yale 7-yard line. Two plays later, Haughton finished off his first-career touchdown reception, from eight yards out, as Dartmouth pulled within 37-30 with 6:34 still on the clock.

The Bulldogs went on to gain two first downs, but a missed 47-yard field goal gave Dartmouth life and the ball with 3:20 on the clock. The Big Green marched to the Yale 43-yard line when Haughton came back to the ball for a dazzling one-handed grab and a much-needed first down on 3rd-and-10. One play later, Saunier ran it in himself from 32 yards away, evening the score at 37 with 1:22 left in the fourth.

In the final moments of regulation, Yale marched to the Dartmouth 28-yard line, but a missed 46-yard field goal sent the game to overtime.

In the extra session, two penalties backed the Big Green up to the 35-yard line, but Jones immediately scampered for 31 yards down to the four. Five plays later, Jones finished off a 2-yard rush for the touchdown. Following the Zalc extra point, the Big Green led for the first time, 44-37.

On its offensive possession, Yale converted a 4th-and-5 to stay alive, then two plays later, found the end zone. However, the Bulldogs went for the 2-point conversion and Grant Jordan's pass sailed overtop his intended receiver, as the Big Green bench erupted.

"I thought across the board, those guys were confident," said McCorkle. "They knew we could move the ball when we had to. There were some times we stalled there, but overall, they felt like they had the confidence that we could put points up. We needed those points. We needed them to do it in a fast way and I thought tempo wise, they did a great job of moving fast, putting those points up and getting us back in the game."

The first half saw the Bulldogs jump out to a 9-0 lead behind a safety and 71-yard touchdown reception from Joey Felton. A Corbo



32-yard touchdown catch, his third TD grab of the year, got the Big Green within 9-7, but Yale ended the first half with 14 straight points and a 23-7 halftime lead.

"Halftime is a very important time," said Jones. "You being able to see everybody's eyes and understand that nobody's holding their heads down, that there's still hope [is important]. Even though we went down, it was never a loss of hope. We wanted to reiterate that throughout the team. That type of energy you give each other is very contagious and the fact that you have hope and play with confidence, it carries throughout the whole team."

For the game, Yale held a 532-445 edge in total yards. Dartmouth held a 157-120 edge on the ground and the Bulldogs had the advantage through the air, 412-288.

NOTES: Dartmouth's 44 points were its most ever scored against Yale; Saturday was the 107th all-time meeting ... The Big Green's 23-point comeback victory marked their largest in program history. They had a 21-point comeback against Yale in 2017 along with a 23-point comeback to tie a team in 1933, which ironically, was also Yale ... Scott finished with his second 100-yard receiving game of the season and fifth of his career ... Saunier's 276 passing yards were most by a Big Green quarterback against an Ivy League opponent since Derek Kyler had 303 against Brown on Nov. 23, 2019 ... The Big Green are off to their best start since 2021 when they began 5-0 ... Dartmouth is the only 2-0 team in the Ivy League; Columbia and Brown are each 1-0.

Game #5: #22 Dartmouth 20, CCSU 16

HANOVER, N.H. — Sophomore quarterback Grayson Saunier ran in both of Dartmouth's touchdowns, including what proved to be the game-winner with 5:13 remaining, as the Big Green football team improved to 5-0 with a hard-fought 20-16 win over Central Connecticut State on Saturday afternoon at Buddy Teevens Stadium at Memorial Field. On their ensuing possession, the Blue Devils drove to the Dartmouth 6-yard line, but Dartmouth's defense stood tall to force a turnover on downs, securing the victory.

With the win, the Big Green improved to 3-0 at home for the first time since 2019 and wrapped up a perfect nonleague record for the time since 2021. CCSU fell to 3-4, but two of those losses have come against FBS opponents, one by only four points to UMass.

"I felt every phase was a big part of that victory," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "I thought offense, defense and special teams all stepped up and did a good job, especially in the second half. It took the whole team; CCSU is a very good football team. We knew that going in; we knew every phase was going to be a battle."

The reigning Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week, Saunier was calm, cool and collected in anchoring the Big Green offense. He finished 15-of-21 passing for 177 yards. He also ran for 42 yards and two touchdowns.

"I definitely felt confident, but props to Coach Daft and the rest of the quarterback room," said Saunier. "We all prepare every single week as if we're the starter. We prepare every single week and we feel comfortable. No matter if you're the third string or the second string or whatever, you have to be ready."

"Coach Mac says it all the time, the next guy has to be ready," Saunier continued. "We're all in it together."

A balanced offense saw three Big Green with three or more catches: Paxton Scott (four for 37), Desmin Jackson (four for 28) and Daniel Haughton (three for 55). In the process, Scott moved into fourth place in program history for career receptions, now with 161.

Q Jones led Dartmouth with 51 rushing yards, with Desmin Jackson adding 49.

CCSU's 16 points marked its season low against an FCS opponent. Micah Green led the Big Green in tackles for a second straight week and third time in the last four games, finishing with 10. Ejike Adele, Danny Cronin and Josiah Green each had six, as they combined for 3.5 tackles-for-loss.

The Blue Devils got on the board with 3:19 left in the first quarter as former Big Green wide receiver, and current CCSU graduate transfer, Isaiah Boston finished off a spectacular catch in the corner of the end zone. That

capped off a 14-play, 68-yard drive which took 6:51.

Early in the second quarter, Dartmouth got down to the CCSU 3-yard line, but couldn't punch it in. Instead, Owen Zalc knocked through a 22-yard field goal to pull the Big Green within 7-3 with 10:45 on the second-quarter clock.

After CCSU answered with a field goal, the Big Green drove 78 yards on 10 plays. A key play came on 3rd-and-3 when Saunier found Corbo for 31 yards to the CCSU 40-yard line. The drive ended with a 4-yard touchdown rush from Saunier. After the extra point, the score was deadlocked at 10, which proved to be the halftime margin.

The Big Green may have been trailing if it wasn't for Jordan Washington, who blocked a 50-yard field goal attempt in the final seconds of the first half. It was Washington's second field goal block of the season (the other being against Fordham in the season opener).

In the third quarter, a 12-play, 64-yard Dartmouth drive ended with Zalc's second field goal of the afternoon, a 36-yarder, to give the Big Green their first lead at 13-10.

Less than four minutes into the fourth, CCSU capped off a seven-play, 66-yard with a 13-yard rushing touchdown from Jadon Turner. The ensuing extra point was missed, keeping the Big Green within 16-13.

Later in the quarter, Sean Williams sparked the Big Green on special teams with a 26-yard punt return, along with a CCSU facemask penalty, which started the Dartmouth drive at the CCSU 32-yard line.

The Big Green capitalized in seven plays, as Saunier rushed in his second touchdown of the day, from one yard out, to give Dartmouth a 20-16 advantage with 5:13 remaining.

Boston made a big 31-yard catch to set up CCSU 1st-and-goal, but a 3-yard rush followed by three straight incompletions gave



the ball back to Dartmouth. Two kneel downs officially wrapped up the victory.

For the game, total yards were 317-315 in favor of CSU, with the Blue Devils holding a 204-177 edge through the air and the Big Green tallying a 138-113 advantage on the ground.

"It wasn't always pretty, it didn't always work, it wasn't always good plays, but I thought our guys kept just going and leaned on each other," said McCorkle. "We said you're going to go out there and you're going to have to go out there as a team and win this game. That was the big difference. We played as a team and were fortunate enough to end up on the right end [of the result]."

NOTES: With his four catches on Saturday, Paxton Scott moved into fourth place in program history with 161 in his career, passing Hunter Hagdorn (2016-19) ... The Big Green improved to 3-0 all-time against CCSU ... Dartmouth entered the weekend No. 22 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and 24th in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll ... CCSU graduate transfer Isaac Boston finished his Big Green career with 35 receptions for 354 yards and a touchdown.

Game #6: #22 Dartmouth 24, Columbia 21

NEW YORK, N.Y. — The Dartmouth football team outscored Columbia 10-0 in the second quarter and wouldn't look back, defeating the Lions 24-21 on Saturday afternoon in what was a battle of the only unbeaten in Ivy League play. With the win, the Big Green improve to 6-0 and 3-0 in the league, standing all alone in first place in the standings.

Dartmouth and Montana State are the only two unbeaten teams in Division I FCS, but with the Bobcats having a bye this week, the Big Green now own the nation's longest active winning streak of nine (which dates back to last season).

"Excited the way our guys came out and played today," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "We knew it was going to be a heck of a battle. That's a very good football team, a well-coached team. We knew we were going to have to come out and be ready to play from the get-go. Our guys did a good of competing on every snap and playing with energy."

The Big Green's running game led the offensive attack, combining for 271 yards on 39 carries. An explosive second half saw Dartmouth tally 214 rush yards in the second half, 173 of which were in the third quarter. Q Jones finished with a career-high 182 rush yards, with 123 yards coming in the third quarter. The 182 total marked the most by a Big Green player since Jared Gerbino had 183 on Oct. 27, 2018 against Harvard.

D.J. Crowther added 52 yards on eight carries in his first action since the season opener against Fordham. Quarterback Grayson Saunier rushed for 35 yards while through the air, he was 10-of-15 for 70 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, the Big Green held the reigning Ivy League Offensive Player of the Week (Columbia quarterback Chase Goodwin) to just 6-of-11 passing for 79 yards and two interceptions. Dartmouth also intercepted Cole Freeman and finished the day with three picks, four sacks and seven tackles-for-loss. Ejike Adele enjoyed a career day with career highs in tackles (9), sacks (2.0) and tackles-for-loss (3.5). Braden Mullen also had six tackles, two sacks and two tackles-for-loss along with a pass breakup. Zach Farris, Tyson Grimm and Danny Cronin all had interceptions.

"We talking about the importance of getting some turnovers and I felt that was a bit part [of today]," said McCorkle. "The defense did a heck of a job of creating some turnovers for us, especially early in the game. We talked about having to win up front. We knew it was going to be a battle throughout the game. We continuously fought, battled and made plays when we needed to. Us being able to establish the run was a big boost for us, too."

The first quarter didn't see any scoring, with just 113 total yards, only 29 from the Big Green. Columbia missed a field goal attempt on its first drive.

Farris' second interception of the season set up the Big Green at the Columbia 20-yard line. Owen Zalc would get Dartmouth on the board with a 35-yard field goal to give the Big Green a 3-0 lead with 10:37 on the second-quarter clock.

After a Columbia 3-and-out, Dartmouth drove 81 yards on 12 plays. Paxton Scott had three catches for 37 yards on that drive to help the Big Green move the ball, ending with a 10-yard connection from Saunier to Chris Corbo. The extra point gave Dartmouth a 10-0 lead.

On the ensuing drive, Columbia drove to the Dartmouth 37-yard line, but Grimm ended it with his first-career interception, to help the Big Green go into halftime leading by 10.

On the Big Green's first drive of the third quarter, it was the Jones show. In four plays, he had rushes of 27, six, one and 35 yards, finding the end zone to give Dartmouth a 17-0 lead with 10:56 left in the third quarter.

"Shoutout to my offensive linemen, my tight ends and wide receivers," said Jones. "They continue to block their butts off. Like I always say, my one job is just to hit the hole. Today, in the trenches, they were handling their business. I was seeing the whole and I was hitting it."

Columbia broke the shutout late in the third, finishing an 11-play, 83-yard drive with a 1-yard rushing score. But it didn't take long for Dartmouth to answer. Jones began the drive with a 39-yard scamper into Columbia territory. Two plays later, Crowther went 33 yards to the end zone, as the Big Green took a 24-7 lead into the fourth.

The Big Green remained in firm control, but the Lions wouldn't go away. They scored touchdowns at the 2:05 and 0:34 mark to pull within 24-21, but Dartmouth recovered the ensuing onside quick to seal the victory.

"It was a good win for our football team," said McCorkle. "The guys prepared well this week. We talked about working hard that day, win that day and they did a very good job pre-



paring themselves. They came ready to play and beat a good football team."

For the game, the Big Green held a 341-336 edge in total yards, including 271-84 on the ground. Columbia finished with a 252-70 edge through the air.

NOTES: The Big Green's last five wins have now come by a total of 13 points, with no win in that stretch by more than four ... Patrick Campbell's eight tackles marked a career high, as did Tyson Gimm's seven ... The Big Green are now 6-0 for the first time since the 2019 season, and 3-0 in the Ivy League for the first time since that same year ... Game #7: Harvard 31, #22 Dartmouth 27

HANOVER, N.H. — In a game of runs, the Dartmouth football team scored 20 straight points to turn a 10-point deficit into a 10-point lead, but it was Harvard who responded with the game's final 14 points to hand the Big Green their first loss of the season, 31-27 on Saturday afternoon. The loss moves Dartmouth's record to 6-1, 3-1 in the Ivy League while Harvard improves to 6-1 and 3-1 in Ivy play.

With three weeks to go, Dartmouth, Harvard and Columbia are all tied for first place.

"I can't say enough how proud I am of this team and how hard they played out there," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "Obviously, it was a bit of a rough go to start there, but our guys didn't flinch and did a good job of battling back and putting themselves in a situation to get back in the game and take the lead.

"Obviously, they're all competitors, we're all competitors," McCorkle continued. "You don't like to lose, but we've got to learn from this, got to wash it. We have a short week; we've got to get ourselves ready for Princeton."

In his return to the lineup after three weeks out, quarterback Jackson Proctor led a Dartmouth offense that scored its most points against Harvard since 2003 and most points against Harvard at home since 1993. He finished 18-of-26 passing for 235 yards and two touchdowns.

"Obviously, we had guys who stepped up and did a good job in those three weeks," said Proctor. "I did my best to stay ready, whether that was mental reps or doing extra conditioning or whatnot. Obviously, it wasn't the outcome we would have wanted [today], but we have to wash it and move on. Princeton, short week, and we've got to keep battling."

Daniel Haughton finished with a career-high 82 receiving yards, 72 of them coming on a third-quarter touchdown reception. Jackson Namian tallied a career-high five catches for 39 yards while Chris Corbo added three receptions for 32 yards and his team-leading fifth touchdown catch of the season.

D.J. Crowther tallied a team-leading 45 rush yards on six carries, 31 of them coming on a big third-quarter run. Micah Green and Tyson Grimm each tallied eight tackles to lead the team, with Green also recovering a fumble which Patrick Campbell forced.

It didn't take long for Harvard to strike first. A 48-yard kickoff return set up the Crimson at the Dartmouth 42-yard line. Seven plays later, Charles DePrima rushed from eight yards out into the end zone, as the Crimson took a 7-0 lead.

That score remained until later in the quarter. After a strong punt return set the Crimson up at the Big Green 46-yard line, Harvard went 32 yards on seven plays, end-

ing in a 32-yard field goal from Kieran Corr for a 10-0 Crimson lead with 1:46 left in the first quarter.

Dartmouth kicker Owen Zalc stole the show to start the second quarter, as he knocked through field goals of 37 and 54 yards, with 11:19 and 8:01 on the clock, to pull the Big Green within 10-6. The 54 yarder was a career long, beating the 50 yarder he had earlier this season at Merrimack. It was also a Dartmouth football program record, while tying the all-time Ivy League mark.

The Big Green ended the second quarter with a 10-play, 70-yard drive. After a 3-yard Desmin Jackson rush, Proctor found Sean Ward for 14 yards, Luke Rives for 14 yards and Namian for 12 yards on consecutive plays. The drive ended with Grayson Saunier connecting with Ward for a one-yard touchdown, marking Ward's first-career touchdown reception. It came with 1:47 left in the first half, giving the Big Green a 13-10 lead, which proved to be the halftime score.

Midway through the third quarter, Dartmouth drove 65 yards on 11 plays. A big play was Crowther's 31-yard run to the Harvard 13-yard line. Three plays later, a scrambling Proctor found Corbo from 11 yards out. The extra point gave Dartmouth 20 unanswered points and 20-10 lead with 3:03 left in the third.

That was the start of three touchdowns in the span of 2:06, two from the Big Green. It took Harvard just four plays to go 75 yards and find the end zone, pulling the Crimson within 20-17. But on Dartmouth's next drive, a 3-yard run from Crowther preceded a 72-yard reception from Haughton. Haughton caught it at the Dartmouth 45-yard line then used his speed to beat Harvard defenders to the end zone. Just like that, the Big Green were back up by 10, 27-17, with 57 seconds left in the third quarter.

The 27-17 score stood until late in the fourth quarter. Harvard used a 14-play, 94-yard drive, ending in a DePrima 6-yard rush-



ing touchdown to pull the Crimson within 27-24. After Harvard forced a Big Green 3-and-out, the Crimson drove 73 yards on 10 plays, chewing up 3:32 of the clock. Ultimately, DePrima again ran it in from nine yards out, his third rushing touchdown of the game. The extra point put Harvard ahead, 31-27 with just 27 seconds remaining.

The Big Green got from their own 30-yard line to the Harvard 44 and had a Hail Mary at the end into the end zone, but it wouldn't connect as the Crimson held on.

"There were situations when we had opportunities to get them off the field there offensively," said McCorkle. "We've got to be able to do that. And then offensively, we had a chance there, that one drive, to keep the drive going. But it's a combination of things; it's everything. We put ourselves in a situation to try and win the game at the end. That's all you can ask for, and we just came up short."

Harvard finished with a 434-354 edge in total yards, including 311-236 through the air and 123-118 on the ground.

NOTES: Dartmouth's 27 points marked its most against Harvard since a 30-16 win in 2003; the 27 points were its most at home against the Crimson since a 39-34 win in 1993 ... The Big Green entered the weekend No. 22 in both the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and AFCA FCS Coaches Poll. Harvard was receiving votes in both polls.

Game #8: Dartmouth 26, Princeton 17

PRINCETON, N.J. — The Dartmouth football team outscored Princeton 21-0 in the second quarter, which proved to be the difference as the Big Green went on to a 26-17 win on Friday evening in front of a nationally-televised audience on ESPNU. Grayson Saunier came in for two of the touchdowns via 1-yard runs, while after a punt block, Jackson Proctor found Chris Corbo for a 5-yard touchdown catch with 15 seconds on the second-quarter clock to give the Big Green a 21-7 halftime lead.

With the win, Dartmouth improves to 7-1 and 4-1 in the Ivy League. Princeton falls to 2-6 and 1-4 in the league.

"It wasn't pretty, but the guys did a good job of fighting and kept putting themselves in situations to make plays when we needed them," said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. "We were fortunate enough to come out with a win at the end there."

Dartmouth's defense impressed, especially in the first half when the Big Green allowed just 31 yards. That included allowing minus-6 yards to Princeton in the second quarter. Dartmouth outgained the Tigers 130 to negative-6 in the second.

One of the standouts was Ejike Adele, who had a career-high 10 tackles, including two tackles-for-loss and a half sack.

"We just did a great job of doing what we had to do to win," said Adele. "Coming into it, we knew with one loss that we have to win out. There's no other option, and that's what we did. We simply got it done and I'm really proud of what we did tonight."

Along with Adele, Micah Green also set a career high for tackles (12). Thaddeus Gianaris finished with two sacks and two tackles-for-loss.

Proctor finished 21-for-30 for 185 yards and a touchdown. Chris Corbo set a career high for catches (8), going for 42 and his team-leading sixth touchdown reception of the season. Daniel Haughton had three catches for 41 yards while Grayson O'Bara tallied a career-high three for 39.

Q Jones led the Big Green in rushing with 53 yards on 20 carries. Proctor added 30.

Dartmouth got the ball first, but a fumble gave Princeton the ball on the Big Green 39-yard line. It took seven plays for the Tigers to find the end zone, as an 8-yard touchdown reception from Connor Hulstein followed by the PAT made the score 7-0.

That score remained until early in the second quarter when Dartmouth finished an 8-play, 68-yard drive with Saunier running it in from one yard out. Prior to that, Proctor found O'Bara for 28 yards then Haughton for 22 yards to reach the Princeton 1-yard line.

Princeton got the ball back and went backwards due in large part to the Big Green defense. A Gianaris sack followed by two

tackles-for-loss led the Tigers to punting from their own 9-yard line on 4th-and-26.

Dartmouth's offense kept the momentum going, driving 49 yards. After a 6-yard gain from Jones, Proctor found Sean Ward for 20 yards. The drive ended like the previous one, a 1-yard touchdown run from Saunier as Dartmouth took a 14-7 lead with 5:16 left in the second quarter.

The Big Green special teams unit came up big in the final two minutes of the half, as Nico Schwikal blocked a punt, which Lou Lamar recovered and returned, setting up the offense at the Princeton 17-yard line. Five plays later, Proctor connected with Corbo in the corner of the end zone for a 21-7 halftime lead.

"Our guys settled down a little bit," said McCorkle. "We were able to get better field position; that was key. We were able to flip the field a little bit there, but the offense did a great job of executing. I thought our defense locked down and figured it out and got the offense the ball."

The third quarter saw one touchdown, from Princeton, via a Luke Colella 18-yard reception with 8:10 on the clock. That pulled the Tigers within 21-14 entering the fourth.

Davis Golick proved critical in the fourth. Early in the stanza, he boomed a career-long 62-yard punt, which led to a Princeton fumble, recovered by Braden Mullen. The Big Green got one first down before Owen Zalc hit a 34-yard field goal for a 24-14 lead with 9:58 left in the fourth.

Princeton responded with a field goal, then after Dartmouth's offense stalled, Golick boomed another long punt, this time 59 yards all the way to the Princeton 2-yard line. Three plays into the Tigers' drive, quarterback Blaine Hipa was being pressured when an intentional grounding call gave Dartmouth the safety, two points and the 26-17 victory.

Final yards were 303-175 in favor of Dartmouth, including 185-137 through the air and 118-38 on the ground.



"Our guys did a good job of doing their jobs," said McCorkle. "That was huge for us, especially on special teams, to make those plays — block a punt, get a fumble recovery. That helped us no doubt."

NOTES: Dartmouth's 38 rush yards allowed marked its fewest since allowing 11 at Penn on Sept. 30, 2023 ... The Big Green beat Princeton for the fourth time in their last five tries ... This marks the second straight season Dartmouth has beaten Princeton on ESPNU ... Corbo's six touchdown receptions are the most by a Big Green player since Drew Estrada had eight in 2019 ... Golick's 62-yard punt was the longest by a Dartmouth punter since Brian Scullin's 62-yarder against Cornell on Nov. 8, 2008 ... Golick's 59-yarder was also the longest since September of 2015, meaning in the span of the fourth quarter on Friday, Golick had the two longest punts by a Big Green punter in nine years.

Game #9: Cornell 39, #24 Dartmouth 22

ITHACA, N.Y. — Patrick Campbell picked off Cornell quarterback Jameson Wong to set up a go-ahead touchdown with 8:50 left in the third quarter, but the Big Red responded with 23 consecutive points, on their way to downing the 24th ranked Dartmouth football team, 39-22 on Saturday afternoon. The Big Green tied a season high with three interceptions on the afternoon, but they also turned the ball over four times themselves and Cornell capitalized.

With the loss, Dartmouth falls to 7-2 and 4-2 in the Ivy League. Cornell improves to 4-5 and 3-3. The Big Green still have a chance to share the Ivy League Championship with a win over Brown next Saturday combined with a Harvard loss against Yale.

“Very disappointing... very disappointing,” said Sammy McCorkle, Robert L. Blackman Head Football Coach. “It’s not the outcome we wanted. Hats off to Cornell, who came out ready to play. They executed and made plays when they needed to. We didn’t make plays when we needed to.

“We don’t want to come out and have this type of showing, but the guys battled, kept fighting,” McCorkle continued. “Just too many mistakes. You can’t do that and allow a team the opportunity to control the ball, control the clock and allow them opportunities to score more points.”

The Big Green struggled to rush the ball, finishing with just 60 yards on 25 carries. Quarterback Jackson Proctor had 46 of those yards on 10 attempts. Through the air, he finished 26-of-37 for 258 yards and a score. Daniel Haughton posted career highs in receptions (6) and yards (101). Twelve different Big Green players had at least one catch.

Along with his interception, Campbell recorded a career-high 11 tackles, with Micah Green adding 10 — marking the fourth time in his last six games in double figures. Green tallied his first-career interception, with Sean Williams making a pick as well.

The Big Red controlled the early stages of the game, but Dartmouth held them to just a pair of field goals. Then with 11:35 left in the second quarter, Dartmouth finished off an eight-play, 75-yard drive as Proctor ran it in from 10 yards out. The drive began with Proctor connecting with Jackson Gerard for 16 yards. After an incompleteness, he found Chris Corbo for 36 yards. Following the extra point, the Big Green led 7-6 with 11:35 left in the second

quarter.

The Big Red responded with a 13-play drive, which included multiple third-down conversions, to retake a lead at 13-7. A Cornell interception in the final minute set the Big Red up in prime position to tack onto their lead, but Green’s interception ended thoughts of that.

Early in the third quarter, Campbell made a sensational interception and even stronger run back. Four plays later, the Big Green had the lead back as Grayson Saunier ran it in from eight yards out. The extra point gave Dartmouth a 14-13 advantage with 8:50 on the third-quarter clock.

The ensuing two drives saw each team pick up another interception. For Dartmouth, it was Williams in the end zone. However, Cornell’s Luke Babury picked off Proctor to give the Big Red the ball at the Dartmouth 24-yard line. Three plays later, Wang ran it in from 14 yards out. The 2-point conversion was no good as Dartmouth led, 19-14, heading into the fourth.

The Big Red added a touchdown with 10:08 left in the fourth and field goal with 5:53 on the clock. By that time, Cornell led 29-14. The margin swelled to 22 at 36-14 before a Haughton four-yard touchdown reception, followed by the 2-point conversion to Jackson Namian, pulled the Big Green within 36-22, but with just 2:28 remaining.

Cornell would add a field goal to finish off the 39-22 final.

Total yards were 378-327 in favor of the Big Red, with the Big Green holding a 267-203 advantage through the air and Cornell tallying a 175-60 edge on the ground.

“It hurts. I told [the team] it hurts,” said McCorkle. “It should hurt, but we’ve got to do better. We’ve got to coach better; we’ve got to prepare better. I told them,



we’ve got to learn from this, get better and watch it and make the corrections we need to make.”

The Big Green return home for their season finale next Saturday, Nov. 23 to host Brown at 12 p.m. on Senior Day and Youth Football Day. With a win and Harvard loss to Yale, Dartmouth would clinch a share of the Ivy League Championship.

“We’ve got to get ready for Brown and finish strong,” said McCorkle. “It’s out of our control now, but we can’t worry about that. We can only control what we can control, which is preparing for Brown.”

NOTES: The 12 different Big Green to record a catch on Saturday marked a season high ... Dartmouth and Cornell have now alternated wins in each of the last six meetings ... The Big Green’s four turnovers were a season high ... Saturday marked Dartmouth’s first road loss since last Oct. 28 at Harvard (one year and 19 days ago).
