- 1st** After an eight-year break, Davidson's most familiar rivalry is being renewed. Of the 114 opponents Davidson has faced all-time, it has played VMI the most. This is game No. 59.
- 2nd** Davidson is looking to snap a nine-game losing streak against the Keydets. Davidson failed to convert a game-winning two-point conversion in the last meeting in 2006.
- 3rd** **William Morris** needs 61 yards receiving to move up to 11th all-time at Davidson.
- 4th** The 'Cats enter the game at 1-1 after splitting its first two games of the season at home.
- XP** Davidson and VMI were longtime foes together in the Southern Conference.

Quarterback Ryan Alexander '09 attempted 58 passes and spiked two more for a VMI opponent record total of 60. Alexander completed 34 of those attempts for 404 yards, accounting for all but 58 yards accumulated by Davidson's offense that day. He was Davidson's all-time passing leader with 9,376 yards until being surpassed by Jonathan Carkhuff '14 last season.

A Davidson win would . . .

- Snap a six-game road losing streak.
- Snap a nine-game losing streak against VMI, for its first win over the Keydets since 1972.
- Give Davidson its first football win over a SoCon foe since defeating The Citadel in 1973.

Young 'Cats

- The team is very young, with 36 freshmen and just 25 upper-classmen (9 seniors, 16 juniors.) It's the largest freshman class since the 'Cats also had 36 in 2009.
- Of the 22 slots on the offensive two-deep, 10 are occupied by underclassmen (5 sophomores, 5 freshmen), while 15 (11 sophomores and 4 freshmen) are listed on the defensive side. Eight of 12 specialists slots are filled by freshmen.
- The Wildcats return 35 letterwinners and 14 starters (6 offense, 8 defense).
- The top returner on offense is junior **WR William Morris**. He had 1,090 yards receiving in 2013 – the third most in Davidson history - and 67 receptions - tied for the fourth most in a single season in school history. His 6.1 catches per game ranked second in the PFL, while his 99.1 yards per game led the league. He is on pace to break Davidson's all-time receiving records and was an All-PFL honorable mention last season.
- On defense, **LB Matt Casey** is the top returner. He finished 2013 with 106 tackles, which ranks as the fourth-most in a single season at Davidson. He was named to the All-PFL second team.

SoCon Reunion

- From 1936-75 and 1983-86, Davidson was a member of the Southern Conference, winning the league championship and playing in the Tangerine Bowl in 1969.

The Series

- The rivalry dates back 110 years to 1904.
- Davidson trails all-time, 17-38-3, and is just 12-27 on the road.
- The Keydets fended off late-game heroics to win their ninth straight in the series the last time the two teams met in 2006.
- Davidson trailed by 10 with 5:41 to play, but pulled within a touchdown after a field goal with 2:55 to go. The 'Cats then forced a three-and-out, and took over at their own 25 with 1:19 to play.
- With 10 seconds remaining QB Ryan Alexander connected with Myles Potter on a 33-yard completion to VMI's 5. Alexander then connected with Beaux Jones for a touchdown as regulation expired.
- Holder Matt McGreevy then attempted to run it in, but he was stopped a half-yard short of the goaline, allowing VMI to prevail, 20-19.

- The Keydets are in their first season back in the Southern Conference.
- VMI was picked to finish in a tie for seventh with 2013 PFL-member Mercer in the eight-team conference.

Schedule Notes

- The VMI game is Davidson's first on the road this season, and the first of two road contests in the first half of the season.
- Davidson will host Morehead State next week for Homecoming.
- Davidson is playing 12 games this season for the first time in its history.
- The Wildcats will play their final two games of the season on the road.

Last Time Out

- Quarterback Mike Sheehan threw three touchdown passes and seven Catawba rushers totaled 310 yards, as the Indians defeated Davidson, 35-7, Saturday night in Richardson Stadium.
- **J.P. Douglas** completed 19 of 29 pass attempts for 117 yards targeting freshman Cam Chevront seven times, for 53 yards, while William Morris hauled in six catches for 60 yards. However, he also had two interceptions.
- **Matt Casey** made a career-high 14 tackles to lead Davidson's defense in the category, while **Myles Atkins** matched his career high of 10 and also forced a fumble. **Bryant Bednarek**, who recorded a sack, and **James Gessner** also had fumble recoveries.
- The Wildcats started off strong, moving 45 yards on their first possession to Catawba's 29-yardline before being forced to punt, but Atkins was able to punch the ball free during Catawba's ensuing offensive possession, and Bednarek recovered it at Catawba's 40. However, the prime field position went to waste as Jamal Lackey intercepted a screen pass and returned it 67 yards for a 7-0 Catawba lead with 8:33 left in the first quarter.
- Sheehan threw three touchdown passes before the half ended. Catawba then scored on its first drive of the second half.
- The 'Cats lone touchdown came on a one-yard run by David Rogers with 7:37 remaining in the game.

New Look

- The 'Cats are wearing brand new, all-black uniforms at home this season, while retaining their

same white jerseys for the road. The new black Nike jerseys are black with red sleeves and white numbers trimmed in red, while the pants are black with red and white stripes on the hips.

- The helmet is matte black with a red stripe that starts off wide in the front, but tapers to a point towards the back. The left side of the helmet features Davidson's 'D' ligature mark, while the right side features the player's number in the Davidson font in white with a red trim.
- The 'Cats last wore all black in the early 2000's.

Uniting For a Good Cause

- Members of the Davidson and College of Faith football teams briefly united for a good cause at the Men's Shelter of Charlotte on the Monday prior to their game to serve lunch. **Dan Casey, Nate Casey, Reese Schaffner and head coach Paul Nichols** represented Davidson, while five players and assistant head coach Robert Massey-Brice represented the Coll. of Faith.

Big Start

- Davidson was able to play every fully healthy player on its roster in its season opening victory over College of Faith.
- The win snapped a 12-game losing streak for Davidson, and was its first shutout since defeating Campbell 49-0 in 2008. It was also the first time the Wildcats had surpassed 50 points since scoring 50 against Butler in 2006.
- It was also **Paul Nichols'** first win as head coach.
- Davidson scored six touchdowns in the first half for a 43-0 lead, and added two more in the second half. The Wildcats rushed for 355 yards led by David Rogers, who ran for a career-high 116 yards on 13 carries.
- In addition to finishing 10-of-11 for 128 yards, the Wildcats' **J.P. Douglas** threw for a career-high three touchdown passes and ran for another.
- The game was College of Faith's first against a NCAA Division I opponent.

Preseason Honors

- **Matt Casey** and **William Morris** drew the most accolades, as both were names to the Preseason All-PFL team. They were also named USA College Football Preseason All-America and College Sports Madness First-team Pioneer Football Preseason All-Conference. Additionally, Morris was named to the 2014 College Football Performance Awards Wide Receiver Preseason Watch List. **Trey Huelskamp** earned the equivalent recognition from CFPFA at tight end. Huelskamp also was named to College Sports Madness' pre-season third team, along with **Myles Atkins** and **Bryant Bednarek**.

Head Coach Paul Nichols

- Paul Nichols '03, who as a student-athlete in 2000 quarterbacked Davidson to its first-and-only undefeated season, returned to his alma mater to serve as the football program's 27th head coach, Director of Athletics Jim Murphy announced Dec. 21, 2012.
- He is the second youngest head coach in all of NCAA Division I football, born January 25, 1981.
- Nichols most recently served as the director of player personnel at Illinois last season. Prior to his time at Illinois, Nichols spent three seasons on Tim Beckman's staff at Toledo as co-defensive coordinator/safeties coach.
- In 2011, Nichols helped guide the Rockets

to a 9-4 record and a win over Air Force in the Military Bowl. Toledo was 7-1 in the MAC and shared the West Division title.

- Before Toledo, Nichols served as an assistant at Marshall University for three seasons after completing two seasons as a graduate assistant at Ohio State from 2004-05, where he assisted with the defensive backs and defensive line.
- A native of Dunwoody, Ga., Nichols graduated from Davidson College in 2003 with bachelor's degrees in political science and history.
- Nichols was a first-team All-Pioneer League and a first-team Pioneer League All-Academic selection as a senior in Davidson's first year in the PFL, and was named honorable mention All-America by Don Hansen's Football Gazette.
- Nichols departed as the school record holder for career passing yards (5,822), completions (465) and touchdown passes (51), and compiled a 22-6 record as a starting quarterback. After seeing limited action as a freshman, Nichols won the starting job prior to his sophomore year and guided the 'Cats to a 10-0 season. His junior year was cut short by a knee injury, but Nichols bounced back as a senior and matched the school record for touchdown passes in a single season with 25.
- Nichols now ranks third in passing yards and completions after being surpassed by Ryan Alexander '09 and Jonathan Carkhuff '13. He is also now third to Alexander and Carkhuff in career passing touchdowns.
- Nichols is the first Davidson alumnus to guide the football program on a full-time basis since Dave Fagg '58, who finished his second coaching stint with the Wildcats following the 1992 season. He joins Matt Spear '93 (men's soccer) as the only other Davidson alum currently serving as a head coach at Davidson.

New Coaches

- Davidson made multiple coaching staff changes this season after former assistant head coach and OL/TE coach Mitch Browning departed to be the OL coach at Rutgers, offensive coordinator and QB/WR coach Mike LaFleur departed to become a coaching intern with the Cleveland Browns and longtime veteran Brett Hayford left to become the head coach at nearby Pine Lake Prep.
- Local product **Derham Cato** has been named as the offensive line and tight ends coach. Cato, a Charlotte Country Day graduate, comes to Davidson after serving three years as a Vanderbilt graduate assistant. Cato was a four-year letterwinner at Dartmouth College, starting three years at defensive tackle. He also played professionally in the CFL, NFL Europe and Arena Football League.
- Former Boise State captain **Bush Hamdan** is the team's new offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Hamdan, who brings a wealth of experience playing and coaching at the FBS level, most recently served as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for Arkansas State, which claimed the 2013 Sun Belt Conference Championship and the 2014 GoDaddy.com Bowl.
- **Anthony Antonacci** joins the Davidson football coaching staff as the defensive line coach after two seasons at Illinois. Last season, he served as a defensive graduate assistant, while Antonacci was the team's recruiting/operations graduate assistant in his first season at Illinois in 2012. A 2009 magna cum laude graduate of Northern

Illinois, Antonacci played defensive line for three seasons before moving to fullback in 2008.

Honor Committee

- Instead of team captains, Coach Nichols has instituted an "honor committee" comprised of two representatives from each class.
- Bryant Bednarek and Matt Casey represent the senior class, Chris Woods and David Rogers represent the juniors, Dustin Atchley and Nate Casey represent the sophomores, and Ben Rowell and Austin Wells represent the freshmen.
- The committee is tasked with handling discipline issues, representing the team in the community and serving as liaisons to the coaching staff to deal with issues ranging from team meals to equipment.
- Team captains will be selected on a per game basis based on leadership and performance, and a captain of the offense, defense and special teams will be voted on at the end of the season based on leadership demonstrated.

- Davidson was picked to finish 10th in the Pioneer Football League in the Preseason Coaches' Poll.
- The Wildcats finished 11th last season at 0-8.

- Given that there are roughly 950 males at the school, that means roughly one of every 10 male students at Davidson plays football.

YES, WE'RE DIVISION II!

- In the 116-season history of Davidson football, the team was only an NCAA Division III member for four seasons (1989-92). Davidson returned to Division I-AA (now known as Division I FCS) in 1993 as an independent member, but received a geographic waiver from the NCAA to play a Division III schedule, which it did until the early 2000's. Davidson joined the Pioneer Football League, the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Sub-division conference, in 2001. The PFL champion now receives an automatic bid in the NCAA FCS playoffs. In the early 1900's Davidson played not only regional foes but today's traditional college football powers, winning the North Carolina State Championship in 1926. From 1936-75 and 1983-86, Davidson was a member of the Southern Conference, winning the league championship and playing in the Tangerine Bowl in 1969.

Difficult Decade

- In the 11 seasons since Nichols graduated, the Wildcats have tallied more wins than losses just twice, and have been unable to match the 7-3 mark of the 2002 team Nichols quarterbacked as a senior.

Overtime Fortunes Improve

- With its 26-20 loss to Campbell Oct. 29, 2011, Davidson had lost its last four games that went into overtime, but an OT win at Valpo in 2012 snapped the streak. The Wildcats are now 4-5 when playing beyond 60 minutes.

More Marbles on the Table

- Davidson will be competing for an automatic bid to the Division I Football Championship again in 2014, as the Pioneer Football League earned an automatic berth as a result of the NCAA tournament's expansion to 24 teams last season.
- Butler was last season's NCAA qualifier.
- The PFL joined 10 conferences currently awarded an automatic bid. The PFL champion is placed into the 24-team bracket by the NCAA Football Championship selection committee along with 13 at-large qualifiers.

About the PFL

- The 2014 season marks the 22nd year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.
- The 11-member PFL is one of only two conferences that sponsor football as its only sport (the Missouri Valley Football Conference being the other). However, the PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation's heartland. The league

still retains four of its charter members – **Butler, Dayton, Drake and Valparaiso**, plus **San Diego** (joining in 1992) – which were joined in 2001 by **Davidson, Jacksonville and Morehead State**. **Campbell** joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. **Marist**, which joined for the 2009 season, further extended the league's footprint into the northeast

- In 2013, the league expanded its footprint in the Southeast when Mercer and **Stetson** – which each restarted long dormant programs – join the league. However, Mercer left after one season to join the Southern Conference.
