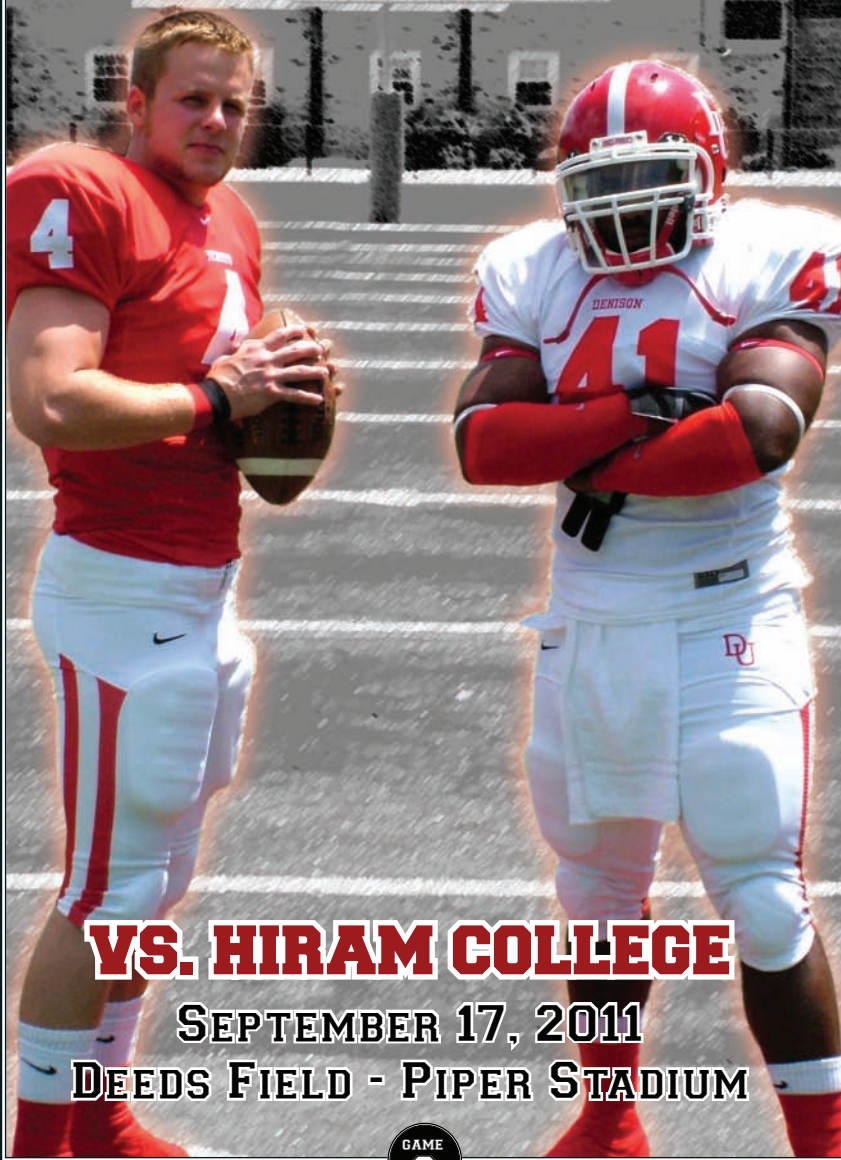

BIG RED VS. HIRAM - GAME PREVIEW

AT A GLANCE

Denison and Hiram will clash for the 12th time on the gridiron this evening. Denison has never lost to the Terriers, but last year's 31-24 overtime thriller got the Big Red's attention. It took a 29-yard touchdown pass from **Max Paulus** to **Braden Layer** with 14 seconds in regulation to send the game into overtime. From there, running back **Sam Fioroni** would take a toss sweep 13-yards for the eventual game-winning score.

In addition to tonight's home opener, Denison will honor the 25-year anniversary of its 1986 North Coast Athletic Conference Championship squad at halftime. That team, coached by DU Hall of Famer, **Keith Piper**, posted a 9-1 record while capturing the program's second-straight conference title.

SCOUTING THE BIG RED

Denison picked up their first victory of the 2011 season last Saturday in Richmond, Ind., after a 44-7 win over the Earlham College Quakers. The Big Red jumped out to a 31-0 lead in the first half and they came close to posting its first shutout since 2010. Earlham foiled that shutout bid with a touchdown with just 14 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

Junior quarterback **Max Paulus** played one of his best games since taking over as the Big Red's

starting signal caller prior to last season. Paulus completed 74 percent of his pass attempts (19-for-25) for 269 yards and a career-high four touchdown passes. He did not throw an interception and he led his squad to six scoring drives in three quarters of action.

Junior running back **Sam Fioroni** posted his second 100-yard rushing game, finishing with 14 carries for 133 yards and a touchdown. Fioroni leads the NCAC in rushing with 230 yards. His 115 yards-per-game ranks him 39th among running backs in all of Division III football. Fioroni rushed for 200 yards and two TD's against Hiram last season.

SCOUTING THE TERRIERS



Hiram picked up its first victory of the season with a 16-13 win over Kenyon last Saturday. The victory marked a positive grand opening for the recently renovated Charles A. Henry Field.

Offensively, the Terriers were led by freshman receiver Jeff Schofield who hauled in 10 catches for 104 yards, while senior lineman Jarrod Lewis helped seal the win with an interception with just seconds remaining in the contest. Quarterback Brandon Hanna passed for 162 yards and rushed for 84 yards.

DU HEAD COACH JACK HATEM



In the fall of 2011 Jack Hatem returns for his second season as the head football coach at Denison University. In his first season at the helm, Hatem guided the Big Red to a 4-6 record.

Hatem, 48, became Denison's 20th head coach in the 121-year history of Big Red football in March of 2010.

He has spent the last five seasons at Denison as an assistant coach, serving as defensive coordinator for the last three seasons. Prior to joining the Denison staff, Hatem spent 13 years as a high school football head coach. He also served three seasons as the head baseball coach at his alma mater, The University of Rio Grande. Hatem graduated from Rio Grande in 1982, earning his bachelor's degree in health and physical education. He also

holds a master's degree in physical education from Ohio University (1992).

A two-time Ohio High School Football Coach of the Year, Hatem brings 25 years of coaching experience and 13 years as a head coach at the high school level to the Denison program. He joined the Denison staff in 2005 and spent two years coaching defensive backs. In 2007 he was promoted to defensive coordinator. During that time (2007-2009), the defense forced 64 turnovers, which was the third most in the North Coast Athletic Conference during that span. In 2008 the Big Red posted a 6-4 record, winning five of their final six games of the season. Over the course of that streak, the Denison defense held its opponents to an average of just 12.8 points per game, and for the year, DU's opponents gained just 333.0 yards of total offense per game, which was the lowest average allowed by a Denison defense since 1995.

A native of Lancaster, Ohio, and a graduate of Fisher Catholic High School, Hatem was named head football coach at Fisher in 1992. Over the course of three seasons, he led the Fighting Irish to a 22-9 record, including the program's third undefeated season in school history in 1993. That year, Hatem earned his first Ohio High School Coach of the Year recognition and guided his Fisher squad to its first-ever state playoff appearance.

From 1995 to 1997, Hatem served as head football coach at Highland High School in Sparta, Ohio, and in 1998, he took over a struggling New Albany High School football program, quickly turning it into one of the top programs in central Ohio. Hatem was named Ohio High School Football Coach of the Year again in 1999 after guiding New Albany to a 9-1 record, the program's best season dating to 1966.

In addition to his accomplishments in football, Hatem also has had considerable success on the baseball diamond. A former baseball standout at Fisher Catholic, Hatem served as head baseball coach at Rio Grande for three seasons, shortly after his graduation from the college. While

he was an assistant football coach at Bishop Watterson High School in Columbus, Hatem also served as head baseball coach there. In 1991, he led Watterson to its second state baseball championship.



BIG RED COACHING STAFF



ZACK BRENT - Defensive Coordinator



Zack Brent '07 returns for his second season as an assistant football coach for the Big Red in 2011 and assumes the role of Defensive Coordinator.

The 2010 season saw the Big Red defense take a number of strides under the co-direction of Brent and assistant coach Mark Watts. Last year's defense allowed 4.0 fewer points per game, 77 fewer passing yards per game, 0.6 yards less per rushing attempt while increasing their season sack total by six.

Prior to returning to the Big Red sidelines last fall, Brent spent the previous four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Colorado and Michigan Tech.

FRANK LITTLE - Offensive Line



Frank Little returns for his 12th season as a member of the Big Red coaching staff in 2011. He has been with Denison for two coaching stints in his career. The first spanning 1997-2000 and his present stint which dates back to 2003. Little coached the offensive line at Kenyon from 2001-02 before returning to Granville.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Little began his coaching career at Big Walnut High School in 1992. After four years he entered the college ranks in 1996 at Urbana University.

MARK WATTS - Defensive Line



Mark Watts returns for his eighth year as an assistant football coach at Denison University. Watts, who also serves as the college's Director of Strength and Conditioning is responsible for the performance enhancement and injury prevention of 17 of the 23 varsity men and women's sports at Denison throughout the year. His football duties include coaching the defensive line, coordinating the punt & punt return teams, and assisting with

football operations.

Watts served as defensive line and strength and conditioning coach at Clarion University (Pa.) from 1998 to 2000 and at Allegheny College (Pa.) in 2001. In his first stint at Denison, Watts was the Defensive Coordinator and Head Strength & Conditioning Coach from August of 2002 until February of 2005. Watts left Denison in 2005 for The United States Military Academy where he spent 18 months as an Assistant Strength & Conditioning coach.

AUSTIN HOLTER - Quarterbacks



Austin Holter returns in 2011 for his season season at Denison and will serve as the team's quarterback coach.

Last season, Holter assisted in the development of first year starting quarterback Max Paulus, helping him throw for 1,916 yards, the most passing yards by a Denison quarterback since 2005.

A 2010 graduate of The College of Wooster, Holter spent three years as the Fighting Scots' starting quarterback. He was a two-time All-NCAC selection.

JIM COPE - Wide Receivers



Jim Cope enters his 11th season as a member of the Big Red staff and will coach the wide receivers in 2011. Cope brings over 30 years of coaching experience to the Big Red sidelines. Cope came to Denison in 2001 after serving 16 years as an assistant coach at Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio.

The Denison receiving corps are coming off a strong 2010 campaign which saw them total 2,039 yards receiving and 13 touchdowns. That marked the most receiving yards at Denison since 2001.

JEFF BUCHANAN - Strong Safeties



Jeff Buchanan returns for his second season as a defensive staff assistant in 2011 and will coach the strong safeties.

Buchanan rejoined Denison's staff last season 25-years after beginning his coaching career as an assistant under Keith Piper on the Big Red's 10-0 North Coast Athletic Conference Championship team in 1985.

Since leaving DU, Buchanan has gone on to become one of the most successful high school coaches in Central Ohio, guiding Lancaster Fisher Catholic, Newark Catholic, Watkins Memorial and Newark to a combined 141 victories.

JOE ULREY - Linebackers



Joe Ulrey '09 returns to Denison after spending the 2010 season as the defensive line coach at nearby Kenyon College. Ulrey will coach the linebackers for the Big Red in 2011.

A native of Marengo, Ohio and Sparta-Highland High School, Ulrey was a three-year starter at linebacker for the Big Red from 2006 through 2008. In 2007 and 2008 Ulrey was named to the All-NCAC honorable mention squad.

JEREMY PETIT - Defensive Backs



Jeremy Petit enters his first season as a member of the Denison coaching staff. Petit, who was a college teammate with fellow DU assistant coach Austin Holter, will coach the Denison defensive backs in 2011.

A 2011 graduate of The College of Wooster, Petit brings a strong understanding of the North Coast Athletic Conference with him from his time as a Fighting Scot. A four-year letterman at safety, Petit earned a bachelor of arts in political science from Wooster.

AJ HATEM - Running Backs



AJ Hatem begins his first season as an assistant coaching intern with the Big Red in 2011 and will coach the running backs.

Currently a senior at Shawnee State University in Portsmouth, Ohio, Hatem will graduate in December with a degree in exercise science. A native of Lancaster, Ohio, Hatem played high school football at Fisher Catholic where he started at linebacker for the Fighting Irish.

GARY SITLER - Kickers/Punters



Gary Sitler is back for his 11th season as a volunteer coach of the Big Red's kickers and punters.

A native of Newark, Ohio he has spent nearly 30 years teaching kicking and punting at local camps and clinics. A 1978 graduate of Wittenberg, Sitler was a part of the Tigers' national championship team in 1975 and was the program's all-time leader in punting for over 30 years.

DENISON FOOTBALL HISTORY: 101

Wilkie O. Moody: a profile by Kevin Bennett

With the recent resolution of the NFL strike and the advent of another football season, I often reflect upon the rich local football history. While Granville has been home to several others who competed at the professional level (Jim Barton, "Ike" Eikenberry, and John Tavener come to mind), the achievements of Wilkie Osgood Moody have been largely forgotten. A stellar player on the 1916 Denison University football squad, Moody was an early pioneer of pro football while playing for the Columbus Panhandles. In this role he was a starting player in what has been designated as the first game of the National Football League (NFL).

The Son of Missionaries

Long overshadowed by the accomplishments of his wife, noted journalist and author, Minnie Hite Moody, Wilkie Moody led an extraordinary life. Born in 1897 to missionary parents at Irabo, Belgian Congo, he and his parents barely survived the attack of a cannibal tribe when he was but 6 months old. Obviously concerned with the safety of their child and resolutely focused on their mission work, Moody's parents consigned him to the care of grandparents in Canada. Over the remainder of his childhood, Moody and his sister were largely raised by relatives and family friends, sometimes apart. On the average, the Moody children saw their parents every five years.

He attended Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia before transferring to Denison for his sophomore year in 1915. It appears that he had never played organized football until encouraged by legendary DU coach Walter Livingston to try out for the team in 1916. At 5-7, 185 lbs., Moody was hardly an imposing physical presence, yet his agility and toughness earned him a starter's role as both a guard on the offensive line and a defensive back.



Football Standout at Denison University

Wilkie Moody's gridiron accomplishments helped the 1916 Denison squad to another Ohio Conference championship. During this period Denison football competed at a higher level and routinely played against such giants as Ohio State, Miami and Cincinnati to name a few. As such, there was considerable fan interest in the local area and it was rare to not see Deeds Field packed with spectators.

Signs with Pro Football

After serving in World War I, his resumption of studies at Denison did not include a return to the football team. With the birth of his first child in December 1919, Moody was faced with the financial responsibilities of supporting his family. Instead of college ball, he decided to utilize his gridiron talents in the newly emerging professional arena. He signed a contract with the nearby Columbus Panhandles. This team was one of the charter members of the American Professional Football Association, consisting of teams in 14 different cities. This league which was initially headed by the legendary Jim Thorpe, was the forerunner of the NFL, changing its name in 1922. The first game of the league was played on October 3, 1920 with the Columbus team playing the host Dayton Triangles. Before a crowd of around 5,000, the Columbus Panhandles lost a 14-0 decision. The site is now marked by an Ohio Historical marker denoting it as the first football contest in the NFL. Wilkie Moody started the game, playing both offense and defense. Primarily a lineman on offense, he also carried the ball twice, netting 7 yards.

Moody played the entire 1920 season with the Columbus Panhandles. Recruited primarily from local men employed at the shops and rail yards of the Pennsylvania Railroad, the team found it hard to compete against those teams recruiting and signing top college players. Unlike the lucrative pro contracts of today, Moody played under an incentive contract: \$100 for each win, \$75 for each tie, and \$50 for each loss. Graduating from Denison in 1920 with a degree in physical education, Wilkie Moody signed with the Dayton Triangles for the 1921 season. At Dayton, he joined another noted Denison alumni, George Roudebush who played an instrumental role in introducing the forward pass into the college game. After a one year hiatus from the professional game, Moody re-signed with the Columbus team (now the Tigers) for the 1924 and 1925 seasons. Now 28, Moody quit the NFL for good after the 1925 season and took a position as the football coach and instructor at Warren High School in Ohio. The next year he coached at Clarion State College in Pennsylvania. Following his stint there, he took his family to Atlanta, Georgia where he served until the 1960's as an instructor, coach and athletic director in the city high schools.

After his retirement, the "Coach" and his wife, Minnie, returned to live at the family home at Tannery Hill, adjacent to the Granville Golf Course. Wilkie O. Moody passed on February 22, 1976 and is buried along with Minnie in the peaceful and rolling Welsh Hills cemetery outside Granville. Self-effacing, he appears to have made little mention of his professional football career or his involvement in the historic first NFL game. Hopefully this will shed a long overdue spotlight on the life of this remarkable educator, coach, soldier and athlete.
