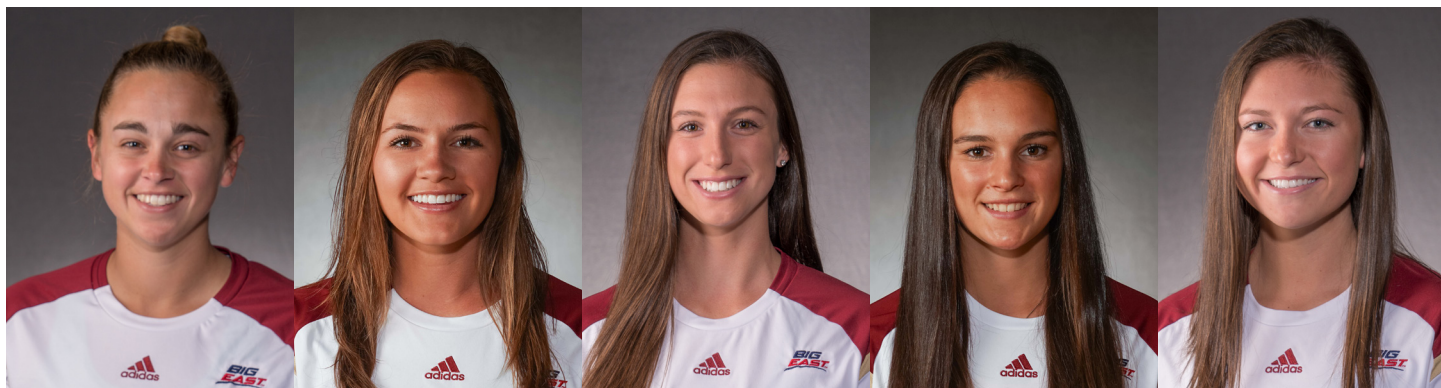

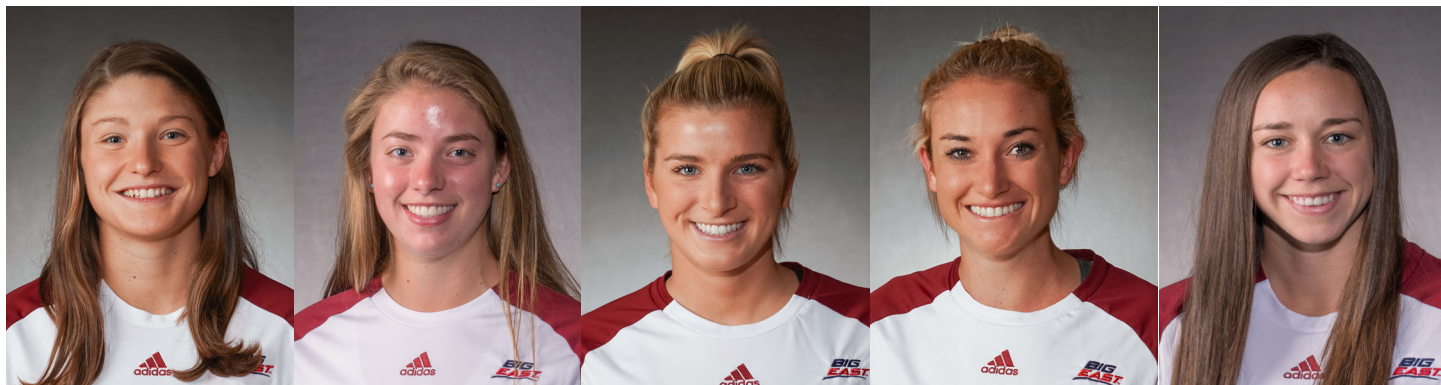

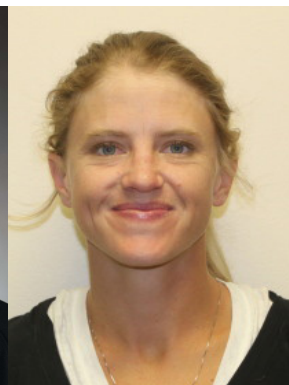

Liza Kelly completed her 11th season as head coach at the University of Denver in 2017, finishing with a 14-4 record and guiding the Pioneers to the BIG EAST championship game in their first year in the conference.

Senior Layne Voorhees and sophomore Kendra Lanuza were unanimous First Team All-BIG EAST selections and the duo would also earn spots on the IWLCA All-West/Midwest Region first and second teams, respectively. Sophomore Elizabeth Behrins and senior goalkeeper Maddy Stevenson were both named to the Second Team All-BIG EAST in leading the Pioneers to their best record in three years.

In 2017, the Pioneers finished 4th in the nation in scoring defense (8.44), 8th in caused turnovers per game (11.61) and 11th in scoring margin (4.83). Denver led the BIG EAST in scoring defense, while on an individual basis, Voorhees led the conference in caused turnovers

by game (2.33), Julia Feiss led in shots on goal per game (4.94) and Stevenson led in goals-against average at 8.65.

On March 12, 2017, Kelly recorded her 200th career win with a 14-4 victory over Vermont.

In 2016, DU went .500 at 9-9, while in 2015, Kelly led the Pioneers to a 13-5 finish and their fourth straight winning season.

Kelly led the Pioneers to their second-straight NCAA Tournament in 2014, where they beat Jacksonville to advance to the Round of 16. Denver went undefeated in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation for the second season in a row in 2014 and finished the year with a 19-2 record.

Denver completed the 2013 season with an 18-3 overall record and a perfect 8-0 mark in the MPSF. DU was ranked No. 16 in the final IWLCA Coaches Poll. The Crimson and Gold ranked second in the nation in caused turnovers (11.76), fourth in win percentage (.857), fifth in points (433.0) and ninth in scoring offense (13.9). Denver broke a team record, set a season before, by winning 15-straight games.

In 2012, the Pioneers posted a 12-3 overall record and a 6-1 record in the MPSF. DU was No. 1 in the nation in caused turnovers (12.6 per game), 10th in scoring offense (13.93 goals per game) and 11th in scoring margin (4.2). The Pioneers also set a team record by winning 12-straight games.

The Pioneers went 13-5 overall and a perfect 6-0 in the MPSF in 2010. Denver advanced to the MPSF Championship Tournament final, which DU hosted at Peter Barton Lacrosse Stadium, but was edged 11-10 by Stanford in double overtime. Denver ended the season ranked No. 20 in the nation.

Kelly led the Pioneers to a record of 13-6 overall and 5-0 in the MPSF, concluding the 2008 season ranked No. 19 in the nation. In 2007, Kelly steered DU to a 16-3 mark and a 5-0 sweep of the MPSF schedule, ending the season ranked No. 15. In Kelly's first two years at DU she led her players to success. Kristie Leggio (2007) and Kelly O'Connell (2008) picked up IWLCA All-America honors during their careers and were named MPSF Player of the Year in 2007 and 2008, respectively.

In addition to her duties with Denver's team, Kelly serves on the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse committee.

Prior to DU, Kelly served five years as the head coach at Boston University. The Baltimore native posted an impressive 64-33 (.660) mark as head coach at BU, including consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and America East regular season and tournament championships in 2005 and 2006. The Terriers finished in the top-10 in the national rankings in Kelly's final two seasons, and Kelly was named America East Coach of the Year twice during her five-year tenure at BU.

During Kelly's tenure, 24 players were named to the America East Honor Roll, while five received selection to the Commissioner's High Honor Roll. In addition, six Terriers received IWLCA Academic Honor Roll accolades. During her five seasons at BU, 15 different Terriers earned a combined 26 selections to the all-conference first team, while 11 players received a combined 19 regional All-America accolades, including the first two first-team All-Americans in program history.

Before taking over the reins at BU, Kelly served under Linda Ohrin as an assistant coach at Towson University for three years. Kelly coached the Tigers' defense and assisted in scouting and recruiting.

As a player, Kelly was a standout midfielder at the University of Delaware from 1995-98, earning All-America honors in 1996, 1997 and 1998, before playing for the United States National team from 1997-2001. Kelly was inducted into the University of Delaware Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008 and the Baltimore Chapter of U.S. Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 2009.

Kelly has held a number of coaching positions. In addition to traveling throughout the U.S. teaching lacrosse, she has been an ambassador for the game of lacrosse all over the world. In 1995, she traveled to Tokyo, Japan, to teach the sport to Japanese university students.

Assistant Coach Tee Ladouceur

Alma Mater: Syracuse, '11

Experience: First Season

Theresa "Tee" Ladouceur joined the University of Denver women's lacrosse program prior to the start of the 2018 season.

No stranger to the University of Denver and the women's lacrosse program, Ladouceur (pronounced "LAD-uh-SIR") previously served as the head coach at UC Davis for the past two seasons, where, in her first season, led the Aggies to their first conference tournament appearance since 2010. Under her leadership, two players earned All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation recognition, and eight were named MPSF All-Academic, which tied a program best.

Prior to her time in Davis, Ladouceur coached at Albany from 2013 to 2015, overseeing the offense. In her role with the Great Danes, she mentored two America

East Offensive Players of the Year, one conference Player of the Year and five first-team all-conference midfielders and attackers.

She also served as the head coach at Bethlehem Central High School, her alma mater, for one season, and was an assistant coach/acting head coach at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI).

Ladouceur played attack collegiately at Syracuse University, where she graduated in 2011 with a bachelor of science degree. In her three-year career with the Orange, she scored 130 goals with 112 assists in 68 games, adding 45 ground balls, 34 draw controls and 36 caused turnovers. In her senior year, she led the team in goals (38) and ranked second in scoring with 57 points. She made the IWLCA All-America Third

Team and All-Northeast Region first team in 2010 and was one of just 48 players named to the Tewaaraton Award List in 2011. Ladouceur also garnered All-BIG EAST distinction in each of her junior and senior years. She began her collegiate career at Albany, where she ranked second on the team in goals, points and caused turnovers, and was twice named America East Rookie of the Week in 2008.

Her primary role with the Pioneers will be as an offensive coordinator.



Assistant Coach Hannah Hook

Alma Mater: Denver, '15

Experience: Third Season

Former University of Denver women's lacrosse goalkeeper Hannah Hook was named the Assistant Coach ahead of the 2016 season.

As the assistant coach, Hook is primarily responsible for the defense and goalies. In addition to her role on the field, Hook will organize team travel, community service and fundraising.

Hook ranks first in DU history with an 8.68 career goals against average, with the second-, third- and fourth-best single-season goals against averages in school history with 8.27 in 2014, 8.80 in 2015 and 8.89 in 2013. The two-

time Tewaaraton watch list candidate earned 50 goalkeeper wins in 63 games played, recording a career save percentage of .494 (second in school history) and 487 saves (fourth in school history).

The Arnold, Md., native also holds two Denver top-five performances in single-season save percentage and saves. She ranked fifth in the country with a .514 save percentage in 2013 and ranked third with a .510 save percentage in 2014 and made the most saves in the country in 2013 (190) and 171 saves in 2014, the fifth most in the country.

In 2013, Hook was named to the All-MPSF First and Tournament teams as well as the IWLCA All-Region Second Team. As the goalie in 2014, Hook once again anchored the Denver defense in all 21 games, leading the Pioneers to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances. In her senior season, the four-time MPSF Defensive Player of the Week recorded a career-high 45 ground balls in 16 games before injury prevented her from playing in the final two games of the season.

Hook is in her second year of grad school at Denver.

Volunteer Assistant Coach Megan Zeman

Alma Mater: Denver, '10

Megan Zeman was named the new volunteer assistant coach for the Pioneers in February 2018.

Zeman attended the University of Denver from 2007-10, appearing in 72 games for the Crimson and Gold. During her career, she scored 15 goals, had three assists, 67 ground balls, 47 draw controls and 49 caused turnovers.

In 2010, she started all 18 games as a defender and finished fifth on the team in caused turnovers with 17. Prior to that season, she played midfielder, where she was second on the team in ground balls in with 25 and fourth in caused turnover with 15 while starting all 18 games in

2009.

Her sophomore year, in 2008, Zeman was fourth on the team in draw controls with 21, led the team in face-off percentage at .582 (32-55) and was third in shot percentage at .615 (8-13) while playing in all 19 games that season and starting in nine. Her freshman year, she appeared in 17 games, scoring six goals on 13 shots, with a .769 shots on goal percentage (10-13). That season, she took six face-offs, winning five of them.

From Littleton, Colo., Zeman attended Mullen High School, where she earned All-America and Rocky Mountain News "Best of the Best"

honors as a sophomore and junior. A three-time all-conference honoree, Zeman was named to the all-state team her junior season.

Zeman graduated from Denver with a degree in communications and will primarily work with the draw players.

Director of Women's Lacrosse Operations Bailey Mathis

Bailey Mathis was named the new director of operations for the University of Denver women's lacrosse program in August 2017.

Mathis recently graduated from Loyola University Maryland in 2017. She was a four-year starter for the Greyhounds and was named a regional All-American. As a defender, Mathis was considered the top match-up defender on the team, and finished with 55 ground balls, 62 draw controls and 45 caused turnovers, while playing in all 82 games throughout her career. As a sophomore, Mathis played as a midfielder as well, scoring three goals.

As a result of her play on the field, she was a three-time All-Patriot League award winner, and was named Patriot League Rookie of the Week in 2014. In 2016, Mathis was invited to the US National Team tryouts.

Academically, Mathis was named the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for women's lacrosse in 2017, was a three-time Patriot League All-Academic Team member and was named to the IWLCZA Zag Sports Academic Honor Roll in 2016.

Mathis was recently drafted by the New England Command from the Women's Professional

Lacrosse League, and starting in the fall, she will be a graduate student at DU studying sport and performance psychology.

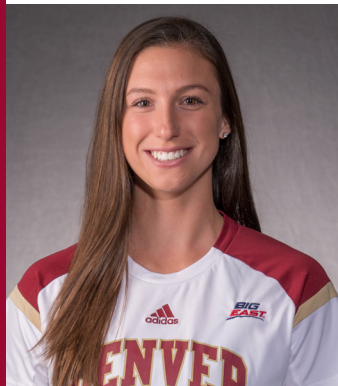
