- The Pioneers will host Kansas City or Oral Roberts in the Summit League Final next Saturday, November 16 at 2 p.m. MT. The winner will earn the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament.

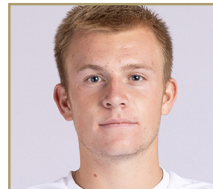

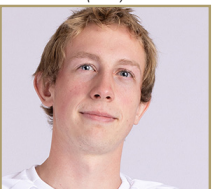

DENVER – The [14/8] University of Denver men's soccer program got a pair of first half goals and kept its second cleansheet of league play in a 2-0 win over Omaha on Wednesday night at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.

- Sam Bassett opened the scoring with his seventh goal of the season and the 22nd of his career.
- Bassett's 22nd point of the season moved him into a tie for 11th in DU's single-season history, tying with Andre Shinyashiki's 2017 season.
- Bassett's 22nd career goal moved him one shy of Matt Harrell's 23 for third in Denver's Division I history.
- Bassett's 22nd career assists ties him with Zach Bolden for Denver's Division I record.
- Bassett's 66th career point on his assist on Denver's second goal moved him past Kyle Christensen for second in Denver's Division I history.
- Jake Smith's assist on the Denver opener was his second assist of the season and of his career.
- Tyler Schommer earned his third assist of the season and the fourth of his career, earning the primary helper on Denver's second goal.
- Luke Schultz made his first career start on Wednesday night.
- Keegan Kelly was reinstated into the starting lineup on Wednesday, his eighth start of the season and his first start since September 19.
- Isaac Nehme's shutout was his fourth of the season and the 25th of his Pioneer career, one shy of Nick Gardner for Denver's Division I career record.
- Nehme's 34th career win ties him with Matt Bredehoft for second on Denver's Division I list, eight shy of Gardner's DU DI record 42.
- With the win, Denver improved to 103-21-19 at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.
- The Pioneers are 7-0-1 when scoring first this season, and 139-10-18 since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.
- Denver is 47-6-8 in the Summit League regular season since Franks took over as head coach in 2015.

TULSA – The [9/4] University of Denver men's soccer program got a second-half goal from Ian Smith and a five-save cleansheet from Isaac Nehme to lift the program's 10th Summit League regular season title after a 1-0 win at Oral Roberts on Saturday afternoon at the Case Soccer Complex.

- Saturday's victory earned the Pioneers their 12th conference regular season title in their Division I history, including their 10th Summit League crown since joining the conference in 2013.
- When Denver finishes the regular season next weekend, the Pioneers will be 6-1-4 against teams that finished in the top-100 of the RPI a year ago, winning three of their last four.
- With the outright regular season title, Denver earns the right to host the Summit League Final on Saturday, November 16. Opponent and kickoff time will be determined at a later date.
- Denver improved to 10-0-1 this season when scoring first, and 107-8-12 when opening the scoring since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks took over as head coach in 2015.
- Under Franks, the Pioneers have won eight of 10 possible regular season titles.
- Ian Smith opened the scoring just after the hour mark with his second goal of the season and the sixth of his career.
- Smith's goal was his first since his game-winning goal in the season opener at California.
- Smith's game-winner on Saturday was the fourth of his career.
- Isaac Nehme completed the 26th shutout of his career to tie Nick Gardner for the most in Denver's Division I history.
- Nehme's win was the 37th of his career, moving within five of Gardner's record.

First Half:

11' Luke Schultz took the first shot on target of the afternoon, beating his defender near the end line before uncorking his attempt, but it was right at the ORU keeper.

13' Keegan Kelly looked to open the scoring from outside the area, but his attempt was right to the feet of the goalkeeper.

24' Bryce Willoughby setup Sam Bassett just inside the top of the box, but a sliding effort from an ORU defender turned the shot away.

28' ORU found some joy down their right channel, and Juan Moreno took the first shot of the afternoon for the home side just shy of the half hour mark, but Moreno's shot was also right to the goalkeeper as Isaac Nehme picked up his first save.

36' Off the first corner kick of the afternoon, Damani Harris earned a quality chance. Nehme pushed the shot off the underside of the crossbar and the Pioneers cleared the danger.

39' Denver's best chance of the opening 45 minutes came off a turnover in the press. ORU coughed it up in their own penalty area as Kyle McGowan won a tackle in the corner of the box, but the pass mixed up the striker's footwork, and he couldn't get anything on the shot and pushed it wide.

43' ORU was whistled for a back pass inside the box, but the 14-yard shot from Bassett banged off the wall to keep things scoreless.

Second Half:

49' Bassett took the first shot of the second half after a penetrating ball from Dylan Akau, but Bassett's shot was blocked and cleared by the ORU defense.

55' Oje Ofunrein rattled the woodwork on Denver's best chance in the opening hour. Ian Smith got free down the Denver left, touched it around his man and got to the endline. Ofunrein got on the end of it, but couldn't get a clean look at redirecting it into the net before it went off the post and out for a corner.

61' Ben Smith looked to continue his hot run of form, but had his first shot of the afternoon deflected in-front and straight-up in the air.

62' Ian Smith found the breakthrough for the Pioneers off a cross from Ronan Wynne. Wynne's cross from 35 yards out down Denver's right side bounced in the area and deflected off a couple players to the back post. Smith had it bounce in-front of him before taking the volley first time and driving it into the upper-90 to put the Pios in-front.

89' Oral Roberts had a couple half chances late before Nehme was called upon to make his fifth and final save of the afternoon.

- On October 8, 2018, Denver was the No. 1 team in the Top Drawer Soccer Poll, its first and only No. 1 ranking to date in program history.
- Prior to October, 2018, Denver had been as high as No. 3 to end the College Cup run in 2016.
- On November 4, Denver moved back up to No. 2 in the Top Drawer Soccer Poll, behind only B1G regular season champions Ohio State.

DENVER AND THE NEW POWER 4

- Five matches on Denver's season-opening six-match road swing were against the Power-4, with the other coming against the deep BIG EAST Conference (Creighton).
- Denver's most wins against the power conferences came in 2016 when the Pios won four against members of the premier conferences.

- Franks is 6-8-1 in the NCAA Tournament at DU (6-7-0 as HC). As a player and coach, Franks is 22-12-3 in the NAAs.

DOUBLE DIGIT WIN SEASONS

- Denver recorded its 10th win of the season on October 30 against Kansas City.
- The double-digit win season in 2024 is the Pios fourth-straight and the 16th in their DI history.
- DU's record for wins in a season is 20, set in the 2016 College Cup campaign.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT IN DALLAS

- Denver came from two goals down in the opening half hour at SMU to earn a 2-2 draw in a rematch of last season's NCAA Second Round clash on September 1.
- The result was DU's seventh after trailing by two goals in DU's Division I era. **Last Two Goal Comeback:** September 22, 2018 at Omaha when Denver came from 3-1 down to win 4-3 courtesy of four goals from Andre Shinyashiki. **Last Two Goal Comeback to End in Tie:** September 9, 2011 when Denver came from 2-0 down in the final 39 minutes to draw at Notre Dame 2-2.

HEAD COACHING ENDOWMENT

- On June, 28, 2021, Jack and Sheila Weinberg helped launch Denver's third of now five head coaching endowments at DU.
- "The Weinbergs' commitment will have an immense impact on our program and our pursuit of excellence on the field, in the classroom and in the community. The Weinbergs' energy and love for this university is truly inspiring, and we cannot thank them enough for their continued support." - Head Coach Jamie Franks
- Hockey (Richard and Kitzia Goodman), Men's Lacrosse (William G. Tierney), Gymnastics (Joy S. Burns) and Alpine Skiing (Otto Tschudi) are the other four head coaching endowments at DU.

WORK IN THE CLASSROOM

- Denver has recorded the top grade point average in the country among Division I men's soccer programs in five of the last nine years.
- The Pioneers have finished in the top-5 in the country in GPA in all nine years in Jamie Franks' head coaching tenure.

RETURNING CAST

- Denver returns 18 players that started at least one game a year ago, including nine that started at least 10 matches in 2023.
- Entering 2024, Denver's returning cast combined to make 736 career appearances and 449 starts.
- Five players entered the season with at least 50 matches played, and 11 made at least 40 career appearances before this season.
- Coming into the campaign, seven Pioneers had made at least 40 career starts for Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks side.

NEW FACES

- Jamie Franks signed eight freshmen to the 2024 roster who are joined by four redshirt-freshmen from last year to give the Pioneers 12 players with four years of eligibility remaining.
- The true-freshmen class is made up of three players from Colorado and one apiece from Florida, Ohio, New Zealand, Texas and California.

FOUR FIFTH YEARS RETURN

- The Pioneers have four student-athletes playing in their fifth year of college soccer.
- Ben Smith, who redshirted due to injury last season, entered his fifth year with 52 career appearances and 49 career starts for the Crimson and Gold.
- Ronan Wynne, who also missed last season due to injury, made 46 starts in 47 appearances in his first three years of playing time with the program.
- Lukas Fisher is the only Pioneer to play full seasons in his first four years with the program.
- Aaron Kronenberg played three seasons at George Washington before spending his senior year with the Pios a year ago, and his fifth year of eligibility in Denver this season.

DENVER IN THE SUMMIT LEAGUE

- The Pioneers have won 12 conference regular season titles and eight conference tournament titles in their Division I history (1999).
- Since joining the Summit League in 2013, the Pioneers have won 10 regular season titles and eight Summit League Tournament titles.

SUMMIT LEAGUE PRESEASON HONORS

- The Pioneers were picked first in the Summit League preseason poll on August 20.
- Denver has been picked as the preseason favorite 11 out of its 12 years in the league
- 2023 All-American Sam Bassett and 2022 Summit League Defensive Player of the Year Ronan Wynne were both selected as Summit League Players to Watch this season.

UNITED SOCCER COACHES PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Denver had three players recognized by United Soccer Coaches as Players to Watch at their position ahead of the 2024 campaign.
- Jason Belloli (Defender), Sam Bassett (Midfielder) and Oje Ofunrein (Forward) were all named to the lists.
- Denver and Notre Dame were the only two programs to have at least three field players selected to the list.

PIOS IN THE TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP-100

- Denver had five players ranked in the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Top-100 players ahead of the 2024 season.
- Isaac Nehme (3rd), Sam Bassett (12), Oje Ofunrein (52), Jason Belloli (68) and Trevor Wright (98) were all ranked on the initial list.
- The Pioneers were one of three programs to have five players selected in the top-100, joined by Indiana (5) and Stanford (5).
- Nehme and Bassett were also selected to the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Best XI First and Second Teams, respectively.

ALL ACROSS THE COUNTRY

- The 2024 Denver Pioneers have players from 13 different states and three international countries (Germany, New Zealand, Sweden).
- The 13 states are: Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Hawai'i, Illinois, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Texas.
- 13 states represented on a single roster is the most in the program's Division I history, breaking the record of 12 states on the 2022 roster.

DI HISTORY BY STATE

- Denver has had players from 32 states in its Division I history.
- Including the 13 on the 2024 roster, the Pioneers have had 105 Coloradans in the program in their Division I era.
- The Pioneers have had double digit players from four states: Colorado (105), Texas (30), Illinois (10), Washington (10).
- Since Franks took over in 2015, the Pios have recruited 30 Coloradans and 11 student-athletes from Texas
- Outside of the United States, the Pios have had players from 12 other countries, including Canada (6), Norway (5) and Sweden (4).
- Senior Ronan Wynne and freshman Keegan Kelly are Denver's only two Division I players from New Zealand.

RECAPPING THE 2023 SEASON

- The Pioneers opened last season with a six-match homestand, going 4-0-2 in the stretch including a 3-1 win over No. 11 SMU.
- The only two regular season losses of the season came in the four-match road swing to follow, as the Pios lost to No. 11 Portland and Pittsburgh on the road.
- Denver finished 7-0-1 in Summit League play, dropping their only two points of the campaign in a 1-1 draw with Oral Roberts on September 30.
- After winning the league regular season title, the Pios fell to Kansas City in penalty kicks in the Summit League Semifinal in Tulsa.
- Denver responded to the setback with a 2-1 come-from-behind win over LIU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.
- After trailing by two goals at halftime, Sam Bassett converted a spot kick to halve the deficit at SMU in the second round, but three strikes off the woodwork in the final minutes ended Denver's season in the second round for the third-consecutive year.

MATCH-BY-MATCH NOTES

MATCH 01: CALIFORNIA 1-2 [RV] DENVER

- Freshman Keegan Kelly, who came off the bench in the opening 10 minutes of the match for Holger Olsson, scored the breakthrough in his first NCAA match. Kelly's goal marked the first Pioneer goal on their collegiate debut since Ian Smith scored against Gonzaga in the 2022 opener.
- Coming off a First Team All-Summit League campaign a year ago, outside back Ian Smith got on the scoresheet in Thursday's season opener to double Denver's lead early in the second half. The goal is the fifth of the redshirt junior's career. Thursday's goal was his first since October 19, 2022
- MAC Hermann Watch List honoree Sam Bassett assisted on Denver's first two goals of the season.
- Bassett's assists give him 45 career points to move him into eighth on Denver's Division I career list. Bassett's 15th career assist moves him into a tie with Jarod Stigall, Colin Audley and Karsten Hanlin for seventh on Denver's DI list.
- Denver, who outscored teams 23-9 in the first half last season, is 133-10-17 when scoring first since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.
- Thursday night's win is Denver's ninth against a power conference team since Franks took over as head coach in 2015.
- Denver improved to 12-13-2 in season openers in its Division I history, including 3-6-1 on the road and 5-7-2 in openers decided by a goal or less.

MATCH 02: [5] STANFORD 0-1 [RV] DENVER

- Goalkeeper Isaac Nehme became the seventh keeper in the Pioneers Division I history to reach 100 career saves, stopping two Cardinal shots in the opening 45 minutes to reach the milestone.
- Keegan Kelly scored his second goal of the opening weekend of his collegiate career, the first Denver student-athlete to score in each of his first two collegiate matches since outside back Ian Smith scored in the first two matches of his redshirt-freshman season of 2022.
- Denver improved to 24-43-15 in its Division I history against ranked opponents, including 15-17-7 under Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks.
- The Pioneers improve to 4-11 against teams ranked in the top-5 in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll, including 2-6 in true road games (2016 NCAA Quarterfinal at Clemson).
- Sunday marked Denver's first win against a top-5 team since 2018 against Washington.
- Denver now has 10 Power-4 wins under Franks.
- The Pioneers are 134-10-17 when scoring first since Franks joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.
- Denver's defense didn't allow a shot on target for Stanford in the final 71 minutes.
- Nehme earned cleansheet number 22 of his career to pass Matt Bredehoft and move into second place on Denver's DI list. The win was also victory number 28 for Nehme, good for fourth in Denver's Division I history.

MATCH 03: WASHINGTON 2-2 [9] DENVER

- Sam Bassett's goal was his first of the season to go along with his fourth point of the campaign.
- Bassett's breakthrough was the 16th of his career, good for eighth on Denver's DI list.
- Bassett also has 47 career points, hopping Brian Todd for seventh on DU's DI points list.
- Ian Smith recorded the assist off a throw-in on Bassett's first-half opener, his first assist, his third point of the season and the 12th assist of his career.
- Oje Ofunrein scored his first goal of the season to give Denver the lead back in the final 10 minutes of the second half, finding the back of the net for the 14th time in his career.
- Ofunrein's goal puts him in a tie for ninth on Denver's Division I list, two goals behind his teammate Bassett for eighth.
- Ronan Wynne provided the assist on the Ofunrein goal, the eighth helper of his career. Two of Ronan's final three assists in his last season of play in 2022 were to setup Ofunrein goals.
- Denver dropped to 2-0-1 on the season halfway through a six-match season-opening road swing that features five Power-4 teams and five programs that finished last season in the RPI Top-40.

- Oje Ofunrein scored for the second-straight match to cut SMU's first-half lead in half. The goal was the 15th of his Pioneer career to move him into ninth on Denver's Division I scoring list.

- Sunday night's draw was the 100th draw in Denver Men's Soccer History (1961).

MATCH 05: CREIGHTON 1-3 [3] DENVER

- Isaac Nehme made a season-high four saves in his 29th career victory.
- Nehme's four saves is his most in a game since the 2023 Summit League Semifinal against Kansas City.
- Nehme's 29 wins ties him with Oliver Brown for third in Denver's Division I history.
- Sam Bassett scored his second goal of the season in the opening 45 minutes to put the Pioneers ahead just after the half hour mark. Bassett also provided the primary assist on Denver's second goal.
- Bassett's goal was his 17th career tally to move him into a tie with Nick Hartman and Zach Bolden for sixth on Denver's Division I goals list.
- Bassett also became the sixth Pioneer to 50 career points in the program's Division I history.
- Bassett has four multi-point games in our first five matches.
- Bassett has been involved in (goal or assist) in five of Denver's last seven goals.
- Denver scored first for the fourth time this season and entered the intermission with a 1-0 lead for the third time in the first five matches of this six-match road swing.
