OPENING FACEOFF

The No. 5 Pioneers hockey team returns from the holiday break on Saturday night with an exhibition against UNLV of the ACHA.

It will be DU's first game in two weeks as the Pioneers last played on Dec. 13-14 against the then-No. 10 Colorado College Tigers to begin this season's Gold Pan series. The Pioneers split their set against the Tigers, falling 5-4 in the opener at Ed Robson Arena in Colorado Springs before winning 2-1 at home in their last outing before the break.

Denver will be facing an ACHA squad in an exhibition for the fourth straight season and will be playing an such a game before the New Year for in consecutive campaigns. The Pioneers defeated ACHA Minot State 9-3 on Dec. 30, 2023.

NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

Then-No. 4 Denver split its top-10 series against No. 10 Colorado College to begin this year's Gold Pan series on Dec. 13-14. Seniors **Jack Devine** and **Carter King** both had a goal and an assist for the Pioneers to begin the home-and-home set on Dec. 13 in Colorado Springs, but the Tigers scored four unanswered to win 5-4.

Denver evened the weekend series on Dec. 14 at Magness Arena with a 2-1 victory. Junior **Aidan Thompson** tied the contest midway through the second period and defenseman **Cale Ashcroft** scored the game-winner in the third. After making a season-high 34 saves in the opener, goaltender **Matt Davis** stopped 20-of-21 shots in the Saturday finale.

EXHIBITION HISTORY

The Pioneers own a 43-25-7 all-time record in exhibition games in program history. The team sports a 35-7-5 mark in season-opening exhibitions.

Denver will be playing an exhibition against an ACHA team for the fourth consecutive season and will be playing one mid-season in back-to-back years after hosting Minot State and winning 9-3 prior to the New Year in 2023-24. DU began the 2021-22 campaign against then-ACHA Lindenwood and started 2022-23 vs. UNLV.

The Pioneers have outscored ACHA teams by a combined 28-4 mark in their last three games and won 10-0 to start 2022-23 against UNLV—their largest margin of victory in an exhibition since a 17-4 win against DU Alumni on Oct. 6, 1984. DU has won each of its last eight exhibition contests dating back to 2014.

Last season's game vs. Minot State marked Denver first exhibition after having already started the regular season since Oct. 20, 2001 vs. the U.S. Under-18 Team. That game on Dec. 30, 2023 was also the latest in the season that DU had played an exhibition outing since 1987-88 when the Pioneers hosted the U.S. National Team on Feb. 3 and Feb. 23 (losing both).

LAST TIME VS. UNLV (OCT. 1, 2022)

Denver has faced the Rebels ACHA once before in an exhibition, with the squads facing off at Magness Arena to start the 2022-23 campaign, with DU winning 10-0 on Oct. 1, 2022. The defending national champion Pioneers began the night with three goals in the first period before doubling their lead in the second. Then-sophomore Carter King scored two goals in the first two frames before recording his hat-trick marker with 5:33 to play. King also had a pair of assists for a five-point night. DU added four goals in the third frame to reach double-digits, with all four tallies coming on the power play. The Pios finished 5-for-9 with the man advantage. Denver outshot Nevada Las Vegas 52-18, as goaltenders Magnus Chrona and Matt Davis shared the shutout.

- **Aidan Thompson** ranks tied for second in the NCAA in points (24) tied for fourth in goals (11) and is tied for 20th in assists (13). He ranks tied for sixth in power-play goals (5).
- **Sam Harris** is tied for fourth in NCAA in goals (11) and is tied for first in game-winning goals (5). He ranks tied for sixth in power-play goals (5).
- **Matt Davis** ranks second in the NCAA in wins (13).
- **Carter King** is tied for fourth in the nation in goals (11) and tied for 17th in points (19).
- **Zeev Buium** is tied for first among all defensemen in the NCAA in points (20), leads the position group in assists (16) and is tied for the 12th-most goals by a rear guard (4). His 16 assists are tied for the second-most among all skaters while his 20 points are tied for 11th overall.
- **Eric Pohlkamp** is tied for eighth among NCAA defensemen in scoring with 14 points and is tied for the 12th-most goals by a D-man (4).

As a team, Denver is tied for the national lead in goals for (4.0) and ranks near the top of the country in goals against per game (2.0, T-7th), power play (29.0%, T-1st), penalty kill (90.2, T-3rd), shooting percentage (.124, 2nd), save percentage (.919, 13th), shots/game (32.2, T-9th) and shots against/game (24.6, 6th).

SCOUTING THE REBELS

UNLV comes in at No. 3 in the ACHA rankings and sports a 16-3-0 record in club play this year. The Rebels entered the holiday break leading the WCHL Division-I standings with 32 points, three more than second-place Oklahoma. UNLV defeated Arizona State's D-I club team 1-0 and 6-2 in its last games on Dec. 13-14 to stretch its winning streak to 14 games. ASU gave the Rebels their last defeat by a 6-2 score on Oct. 18. Two of the team's losses came to NCAA D-I Lindenwood to start the year on Oct. 5-6. UNLV will play at Colorado College on Sunday in another exhibition.

Tristan Rand leads the Rebels in scoring with 15 goals and 23 points. Bradley Gollant is second with 19 points (9g/10a) while Preston Brodziak is third with 18 points (7g/11a). Jaxsen Wyatt is fourth and leads all team defensemen in scoring with 17 points (1g/16a). UNLV goaltenders Jeremy Forman and Doug Wakelyn have both seen significant time in net. Forman has played 10 games and owns an 8-1-0 record, 1.70 goals-against average, .922 save percentage and three shutouts in ACHA play. Wakelyn posts a 7-0-0 mark, 1.12 goals-against average, .955 save percentage and three clean sheets.

HALFWAY THERE

Denver has a 14-4-0 record at the halfway point of the season, with its .777 winning percentage tied for the program's best mark at the midpoint in the last 20 years. Both the 2022-23 and 2007-08 squads also had a 14-4-0 record midway through their 36-game regular season.

Only the 2001-02 team has posted a better winning percentage since the turn of the century, that group had an .888 mark and a 16-2-0 overall record at the halfway point of its 36-game campaign.

NOTABLES

- Denver and Colorado College have now faced off in 343 all-time games, tying Michigan and Michigan State for the most-played rivalry in college hockey history.
- DU improved to 15-3-0 in the last 18 games against Colorado College and has won 11 straight games vs. the Tigers in Denver and 10 in a row at Magness Arena (Jan. 27, 2023 at Ball Arena).
- The Pioneers are now 3-1-0 in their 75th Anniversary sweaters this season.
- The Dec. 13-14 series marked the second consecutive season that both Denver and CC were ranked in the top 10. Last season during their March matchup, they held the same ranking (No. 4 DU, No. 10 CC).
- Cale Ashcroft scored his second goal of the season on Dec. 14—with both tallies this year being game-winners, the first of his career.
- Aidan Thompson tied a career high by scoring his 11th goal of the season on Dec. 14.
- Jack Devine and Buium both had their assist streaks end on Dec. 14. Buium had a season-long five-game streak (0g/7a) while Devine's eight-game run (1g/10a) tied a career long.
- Eric Pohlkamp appeared in his 50th career game on Dec. 14.
- Matt Davis made a season-high 34 saves on Dec. 13 and his 15 stops in the second period also marked his most in a single frame this year. He recorded his first point of the season in the game as well with his fourth career assist.
- Davis has started a season-high 10 games in a row (6-4-0).
- Sam Harris' two blocked shots on Dec. 13 were a career high.
- Boston Buckberger tied a career high with four shots on goal (fifth time) and registered a new high with four penalty minutes on Dec. 13.
- DU wrapped up a three-game road swing on Dec. 13 (1-2-0) and is in a stretch where it is playing five-of-six contests away from home. The Dec. 14 outing marked Denver's only home regular-season game in a six-week period as the Pioneers are in a stretch of playing five-of-six contests on the road.
- Denver has played four straight one-goal games and picked up its first 2-1 win of the season on Dec. 14.

SAMU GOES SHORTY

Junior forward **Samu Salminen** scored two short-handed goals late in the first period on Dec. 13 at Colorado College. He tallied while Denver had a man disadvantage at 16:37 and 19:13 of the opening frame, and among the accomplishments of his feat:

- Became the sixth DU player to score two short-handed goals in the same game in program history and the fourth to do so in the same period as **Tyler Bozak** was the last to do so on Nov. 4, 2007 at Minnesota.

- Salminen recorded his second and third career short-handed goals after scoring his first on Oct. 7, 2023 at Colgate while a member of Connecticut.
- First career multi-goal game at DU and became the third Pioneer to score twice in a single period this season.
- His two scores came in a matter of 2:36, the quickest two goals by the same Denver player this year.

PIONEERS AT THE WORLD JUNIORS

Denver hockey is once again well-represented on Team USA at the 2025 IIHF World Junior Championship with head coach **David Carle** leading the Americans' bench for the second-straight year and sophomore defenseman **Zeev Buium** serving as an alternate captain on this year's team.

The under-20 tournament runs from Dec. 26, 2024-Jan. 5, 2025 in Ottawa, Ontario. USA is in Group A with host Canada, Finland, Germany and Latvia.

Carle and Buium are joined on the United States team with Denver director of hockey operations/video coach **Travis Culhane** and equipment manager **Nick Meldrum**, who are both back on Team USA after serving in the same roles in 2024. Also on Carle's staff are former Pioneer assistants **Steve Miller** (Minnesota) and **David Lassonde** (USA Hockey).

The United States looks to win back-to-back gold medals for the first time in the country's history after defeating host Sweden in the final last year in Gothenburg for its sixth championship. The 2024 tournament marked the first time that Carle had coached a USA roster in his career, and he joined **Marshall Johnston** (1977) as the only Denver coaches to guide a U.S. World Junior squad. Overall, Carle was the third NCHC head coach to lead the U.S. to gold at the WJC, joining former St. Cloud coach Bob Motzko (2017) and North Dakota and Omaha coach Dean Blais (2010 w/Omaha).

ASSISTANT COACHING EXPERIENCE

DU assistant coaches **Tavis MacMillan** and **Dallas Ferguson** own an 8-0-0 regular-season record when running the bench in **David Carle's** absence (family, illness, world juniors). Both MacMillan and Ferguson are former head coaches at Alaska Fairbanks.

The Pioneers outscored opponents 23-8 in four games last year while Carle was away for the birth of his second son, Callum (Oct. 7-8, 2023) and coaching at the 2024 World Junior Championship (Jan. 5-6, 2024).

KILLER PENALTY KILL

DU has killed off 90.2 percent of its penalties this season (46/51), including five-of-six man-disadvantage opportunities in the two contests against Colorado College on Dec. 13-14.

DU has not allowed a power-play goal against in 13-of-18 games this year and ranks tied for third in the country on the penalty kill with Colorado College. Boston College is first in the NCAA (97.6%) and St. Lawrence is second (92.0%).

The Pioneers had a stretch of 17 straight kills that began in the season opener on Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage and ended with Wisconsin tallying on its first power-play chance on Oct. 25 (four games)—the longest such streak since they were successful on 19 consecutive man disadvantages during the 2022 postseason from March 11 through April 7, 2022.

Denver was successful in nullifying 89.7 percent of its penalties over the final 13 games in 2023-24, going 26-for-28 in a stretch that began on Feb. 24. DU was perfect in nine of those games, including going 4-for-4 on the PK on three occasions and seven straight in the final five outings of the season en route to the 2024 championship.

PIOS POWER UP

Denver has tallied on the power play in 13-of-18 games this year and is tied for first in the country with Dartmouth by converting on 29.0 percent of its opportunities. The Pioneers scored at least one man-advantage goal in an 11-game stretch from Oct. 19-Nov. 23, the team's longest run in the last decade (since 2015-16).

DU has converted multiple times while a man-up in four contests this season, including going 4-for-9 in the season opener on Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage—the most power-play goals scored in a game by the squad since Dec. 4, 2021 at Arizona State (4-of-6).

Jack Devine is first on the team with 14 power-play points (0g/14a), while **Aidan Thompson** and **Sam Harris** are tied for the squad lead with five man-advantage goals. Five of **Devine's** six assists in Alaska on Oct. 5-6 came while DU was a man-up on the ice, while all four of **Zeev Buium's** assists in that series came on power-play goals.

MONTH BY MONTH

Denver went 2-2 in games in December, marking the team's 26th straight month where it has posted at least a .500 record dating back to January 2021.

EXTRA GOOD IN EXTRA TIME

Denver played its first overtime contest of the season on Dec. 7 at Western Michigan and won 3-2 after **Carter King** tallied at 2:11 of the extra period. It was the Pioneers' first OT game since **Tristan Broz** scored to defeat Boston University 2-1 on April 11 in the 2024 NCAA Frozen Four Semifinals at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn.

DU has now won four straight overtime contests and is unbeaten in its last nine outings that have gone beyond regulation (7-0-2). The Pios went 6-1-3 overall in OT games in 2023-24.

King's OT goal was the second of his career as he also netted the winner on Dec. 2, 2023 versus North Dakota. Overall, it was King's second game-winning goal of the season and seventh of his career.

DU VS. CC, WE'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE

Denver and Colorado College have faced off in 14 different venues in their history, with DU owning a winning record in 11 of them. The latest rink the teams played in came last season on Jan. 27, 2023 when the Pioneers won 2-0 at Ball Arena, which also marked the program's first-ever regular-season contest at the home of the NHL Colorado Avalanche.

The teams have played in five different rinks in the Denver area, including Coors Field in 2016 for the Battle on Blake and at McNichols Arena, the former home of the Avalanche (also at Magness Arena, DU Arena, Denver Coliseum). DU and CC have squared off against one another in four arenas out of state, with three in Minnesota (Xcel Energy Center, St. Paul Civic Center and Target Center) and the other in Columbus, Ohio, at Nationwide Arena in April 2005 in the Frozen Four national semifinals (the Pioneers won en route to their second consecutive national title).

The teams have also faced each other at the Air Force Academy's Cadet Ice Arena, Broadmoor Ice Palace, World Arena and Ed Robson Arena in the Colorado Springs area.

SENIOR CLASS SUCCESS

The Pioneers' 2025 senior class is on pace to be the winningest group in school history and became the 16th class to win at least 100 games on Nov. 1 at Yale. The seniors' current 107 total victories are the second-most in program history and includes three Gold Pan trophies, two Penrose Cups, an NCHC Frozen Faceoff title and two national championships.

The 2024 senior class is tied for fifth all-time with 103 victories and registered a .708 winning percentage (103-41-5). The 2005 seniors hold the record with 112 total victories.

GOLD PAN SERIES TIED AT 1-1

Denver and Colorado College split their first series of the season for the 2024-25 Gold Pan trophy, with the Pioneers falling 5-4 on Dec. 13 on the road before winning 2-1 on Dec. 14. The award will be decided in the regular-season finale on March 7-8.

In circulation since 1993-94, the Gold Pan is given to the team that wins the season series between the in-state rivals. DU has won the trophy in each of the last five seasons and has captured it 18 times compared to CC's 13. Since the Pioneers previously held the trophy, they only needed a series split to retain it while the Tigers had to win the four-game series outright.

CELEBRATING 75 YEARS OF PIONEER HOCKEY

Denver is commemorating 75 years of Pioneer hockey throughout 2024-25 to recognize its diamond jubilee as a program. DU hosted its 75th Anniversary reunion on Nov. 8-9 when Lindenwood visited Magness Arena. Among the activities were pre and post-game receptions for alums, alumni games and family skates and an on-ice recognition of approximately 150 former players in attendance during Saturday's first intermission, with each of the team's NCAA-record 10 championship trophies being presented as well.

The 2024-25 season is actually the 76th in DU hockey history, but the team's 75th anniversary of its first game was in December. The Pioneers' first ever contests were at home on Dec. 19-20, 1949 against Saskatchewan, with the squad losing 17-0 and 9-1 in the series. Denver's first win was Jan. 27, 1950 at Wyoming, and the program's first home victory came against that same Wyoming squad on Feb. 18, 1950 (10-6) at the old DU Arena.

THE "TENZER" STREAK

Denver extended its "Tenzer" Streak of winning 20 or more games to 22 consecutive full seasons in 2023-24. It is the longest active such stretch in the country, dating back to 2001-02.

The streak is named after former DU Director of Hockey Operations **David Tenzer**, who spent 16 seasons with the program from 2001-02 (the start of the streak) until retiring in 2017. The program only played 24 total contests in the COVID-shortened 2020-21 campaign.

30 FOR 30 FOR 30

Denver has won 30 or more games in each of the last three seasons, marking the first time in program history it has accomplished that feat in successive years. Overall, the Pioneers have reached the 30-win threshold nine times, with their 34 wins in 1985-86 setting the school record. DU's 32 wins a year ago were tied for the fourth-most in a season in program history. The Pioneers had 30 victories in 2022-23 and 31 in 2021-22.

DENVER — The No. 4-ranked University of Denver hockey team secured a 2-1 win on Saturday night at Magness Arena to wrap up the first of two series this season against the No. 10 Colorado College Tigers.

Junior forward Aidan Thompson scored the equalizer 2:35 into the middle stanza, and sophomore defenseman Cale Ashcroft registered his second game-winning goal of the season at 5:28 of the third period. Freshman forward Hagen Burrows and sophomore defender Eric Pohlkamp had assists on Ashcroft's marker.

Senior goaltender Matt Davis led a strong defensive push for the Pioneers (14-4-0, 4-4-0 NCHC), making 20-of-21 saves that the Tigers (10-5-1, 4-3-1 NCHC) sent his way. The only puck to get past him was one that he didn't see as Ty Gallagher's shot midway through the opening stanza was the result of a screen.

After Thompson's scored unassisted off his own rebound late in the second period, the two rival teams stayed tied for almost 23 minutes throughout the second and third periods until Ashcroft buried his shot from the right circle off a pass from Burrows.

A five-minute major and game misconduct was given to CC's Tyler Dunbar in the second period for a hit from behind on Denver freshman James Reeder, but the Pioneers weren't able to capitalize on the extended man advantage. Neither team scored on the power play.

Tigers goaltender Kaidan Mbereko saved 22-of-24 shots in the loss.

The Gold Pan series is now tied at 1-1 after CC won 5-4 on Friday night in Colorado Springs. Denver has taken the Gold Pan for five consecutive seasons, and Colorado College needs to outright win the regular-season finale series on March 7-8 to take the trophy.

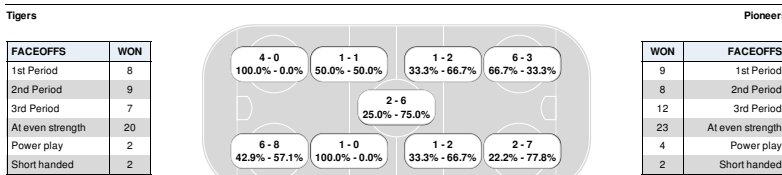

RECORD START

DU won its first 12 games of the season, marking the best start in school history. The previous record was wins in its first nine contests that was set by the 2001-02 squad (counting exhibition outings, DU actually won 11 consecutive games that year).

The Pioneers' 12 wins to start the season were the most by a defending national champion since 2000. In fact, it was more than double the previous best start by a reigning champ as North Dakota in 2016-17 and Union in 2014-15 both won their first five contests before suffering their first losses.

WHAT A WIN STREAK

The Pioneers went on a 21-games win streak that began on March 9 against Colorado College and went through Nov. 16 at North Dakota. It was the longest win streak across multiple seasons in program history, as the previous DU record was 19 straight victories that was accomplished twice: Feb. 13-Dec. 13, 1960 and Jan. 13-Dec. 2, 1961.

Overall, the 21-game stretch fell one game shy of tying the longest overall winning streak in school history, as the Pioneers won 22 contests in a row from Jan. 5-March 16, 1968 en route to the team's fourth national championship.

Denver went 9-1-0 in its last 10 games of 2023-24 and 27-2-1 in 30 contests from Feb. 2-Nov. 16.

PIONEERING OFFENSE

Denver is tied for the nation's lead in scoring with Maine and Minnesota by averaging 4.0 goals per game and ranks second behind the Gophers (80) in total tallies with 72. The Pios led the NCAA last season with 202 total goals and a 4.59 average.

DU scored at least four goals in each of the first 11 contests and 12 overall this season. The Pioneers have had 13 different players score and 19 of the 22 skaters register at least one point this year. Nine DU players have already reached double-digits in points.

PLAYING AHEAD

The Pioneers have had the lead or have been tied for most of the season, as they've not trailed in 83.8% of game play this season (907:08/1082:11)—leading for 49.8% (538:53) or being tied for 34.0% (368:15) of the time.

DU has only been down on the scoreboard in 16.2 percent of game play this season (175:03) and didn't trail for the first 244:12 of the season (4+ games).

THOMPSON MAKING HIS POINT AS NCHC PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Junior **Aidan Thompson** was named the NCHC Player of the Month for November after leading all players in the conference with 11 points and tying for first with six goals. In addition to his five assists, he scored three times on the power play, had four penalty minutes and registered +2 plus/minus rating in eight games.

Thompson began the season by registering a point in each of the first 14 games, a career-long point streak that ended on Dec. 6 at Western Michigan after he produced 10 goals and 12 assists. The forward's run was the longest season-opening point streak by a Pioneer in the last 10 years (since 2015-16), surpassing the previous long of **Henrik Borgstrom's** 11-game run to begin the 2017-18 campaign.

His 14-game streak was also tied with **Bobby Brink** for the second-longest by a Pioneer in the last decade (Dec. 31, 2021-Feb. 19, 2022), with only **Danton Heinen's** run of 18 straight contests from Jan. 22-March 27, 2016 being longer. Thompson also registered a personal-best seven-game assist streak from Oct. 18-Nov. 8.

The Fort Collins, Colorado, native set a career high for assists/points in a game on Oct. 19 vs. Northeastern with four helpers—the second four-assist game of the year by a Pioneer as **Jack Devine** also accomplished the feat in the season opener on Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage.

CAPTAIN KING

Senior **Carter King** was named the 95th team captain in program history prior to the season on Sept. 29. This is the forward's first time serving in the role at any level, but he was an alternate captain on last year's squad led by the now-graduated McKade Webster.

Graduate student **Connor Caponi** and junior **Aidan Thompson** are the alternates this season, with Caponi previously wearing the 'A' alongside King in 2023-24. Thompson, who is from Fort Collins, was last an alternate captain for the USHL Lincoln Stars in 2021-22.

PRESEASON HONORS

Senior forward **Jack Devine** and sophomore defenseman **Zeev Buium** were both selected to the NCHC's 2024-25 Preseason All-Conference Team in a vote by the media. Denver, Colorado College and North Dakota each had two players on the six-man team. Buium was one of two unanimous selections (CC's Noah Laba) on the squad while Devine was listed on 26-of-30 ballots.

NCHC PRESEASON FAVORITES

The Pioneers were voted to win the NCHC regular season in 2024-25 for the third straight season in the conference's annual preseason media poll. This was the fourth time that DU had been voted the preseason favorite, as it also earned the honor in 2017-18, 2022-23 and 2023-24.

A RING FITTING FOR THE KINGS

Denver hockey unveiled its 2024 National Championship ring in a private ceremony on Sept. 7 to celebrate the program's NCAA-record 10th title. The Pioneers' leadership group had input on what the ring ultimately looked like.

Among the unique features of the ring is a "flip top" of the dome that reveals the Frozen Four logo and the final scores of each of the NCAA Tournament games. The interior of the ring also displays a hockey rink with eight red dots on the bottom half to mark the exact position where each goal was scored by the Pioneers during the tournament, while the other half of the "ice" is a red brick in front of the net to symbolize goalie Matt Davis performance throughout the postseason en route to Most Outstanding Player honors.

The sides of the ring feature unique personal and team touches, including once side depicting the moment Zeev Buium jumped on Matt Davis when the final buzzer sounded. The ring also includes several gestures to the number "10" to recognize the Pioneers as the Kings of College Hockey.

SAMMY SCORING

Sophomore **Sam Harris'** 11 goals this year are tied for the second-most in the nation with Wisconsin's Quinn Finley (Boston College's Ryan Leonard, 12). He also shares the NCAA lead with BC's Ryan Leonard for game-winning goals with five, with three of them coming in consecutive game: Nov. 8-9 vs. Lindenwood and Nov. 15 at North Dakota—the first time that a Pioneer has notched the winning tally in three consecutive outings in the last four years (since 2021-22).

The San Diego, California, native recorded his second multi-goal game of the year on Nov. 9 vs. Lindenwood (Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage), with both tallies coming in a matter of 5:49 to break a 1-1 take and mark the fastest two goals scored by a single Pioneer player this season.

Harris recorded points in 11 of his first 13 games he played this season, which included a career-best nine-game point streak from Oct. 18-Nov. 16 (8g/6a).

DIVINE DEVINE

Senior **Jack Devine** leads the nation in scoring with 27 points and also paces all players in the NCAA with 25 assists. He has produced two career-long point streaks of eight games, doing so to start the season from Oct. 5-Nov. 2 (1g/15a) and again from Nov. 9-Dec. 13 (1g/10a). He has registered at least a point in 16-of-18 contests this year and multiple points in seven outings, including in five of the first six games and in three consecutive from Oct. 19-26.

Devine opened the season with a personal-best four assists on Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage (all on the power play) and recorded three points on Oct. 26 vs. Wisconsin (1g/2a) and Nov. 14 at North Dakota (0g/3a)—he owns 12 career three-point games in his college tenure.

Devine was named both the NCHC and National Player of the Month for October after leading all NCAA players with 14 points (1g/3a) in six games. It was his first career monthly honors.

DAVIS CONSISTENT IN GOAL

Goaltender **Matt Davis** won 20 straight games from March 9 of last season vs. Colorado College to Nov. 14 at North Dakota. He posted several long shutouts streaks during that time, including setting a new career best of 154:45 that began in the first period on Oct. 26 against Wisconsin and went until the third period on Nov. 9 vs. Lindenwood. It was his third career shutout streak of at least 120 minutes, going along with his other two previous personal bests of 136:53 from April 11-Oct. 4, 2024 and 127:19 from March 9-16, 2024.

Davis won each of his first 11 starts this year, tied for the longest in-season win streak in the last 10 years by a Denver goaltender since **Tanner Jaillet** also won 11 straight from Jan. 21-March 10, 2017.

The Calgary, Alberta, native started 33 consecutive games from Jan. 5 vs. Niagara to Nov. 1 at Yale before he was finally given the night off. He posted a 27-4-2 record, 2.02 goals-against average, .927 save percentage and three shutouts during the streak that stretched across two seasons.

Senior forward **Jack Devine** registered two assists last weekend at Western Michigan now has 131 career points (45 goals, 86 assists) in 134 games. The Glencoe, Illinois, native ranks 40th on the school's all-time scoring list and is one point from a tie for 37th place with **Bill Stewart** (1979-83), **Dylan Gambrell** (2015-18) and **Joey LaLeggia** (2011-15). He is three points from tying for 35th with **Dave Berry** (1980-84) and **Tom Miller** (1966-69).

Devine became the 103rd Pioneer to reach 100 career points after scoring in his 109th contest on March 8, 2024 at Colorado College. The forward is five goals away from being the 61st player in school history to score 50 career goals and the first since **Cole Guttman** on Feb. 11, 2022 against Minnesota Duluth.

MILESTONE MEN

Junior forward **Rieger Lorenz** is expected to play in his 100th career game in the next regular-season contest on Jan. 3 at Maine. He will be the first Pioneer to reach the century mark this season, while fellow classmates **Jared Wright** (four away) and **Aidan Thompson** (six away) are all within 10 games of 100 in their Denver tenure.

Graduate student **Connor Caponi** and senior **Jack Devine** each played in a milestone game on Nov. 1 at Yale, as Caponi became the 70th player in program history to play 150 contests while Devine skated in his 125th career outing that night as well. Senior **Carter King** skated in his 125th game on Nov. 9 against Lindenwood.

Caponi was the first DU player to reach the 150-game mark since **Kyle Mayhew** on March 10, 2023 vs. Miami, and he is nine contests from tying former teammate **Ryan Barrow's** school record of 168 games played (2017-2022). Barrow reached the milestone in the 2022 NCAA National Championship Game where he scored the game-tying goal that sparked DU to a 5-1 victory against Minnesota State.

DOMINANT AT THE DOT

The Pioneers rank eighth in the nation by winning 54.1 percent of their faceoffs this season, including posting season-high winning percentages of .640 and .643, respectively, on Nov. 1-2 at Yale.

Carter King leads Denver in faceoff wins (218) while **Samu Salminen** paces the Pios with a .587 winning percentage (135/230). King is second in percentage (.572) and **Kieran Cebrian** is second in draw victories at 152. King set a personal best by winning 20-of-34 faceoffs on Oct. 19 against Northeastern for the most wins by a Pioneer since **Tyson McLellan** went 23-for-35 on Jan. 4, 2020 against Massachusetts; he won 18 faceoffs on Dec. 7 at Western Michigan.

ZEEV WITH THE TRICK

Sophomore defenseman **Zeev Buium** recorded his first career hat trick on Nov. 15 at North Dakota to become the first Pioneer blueliner to score three goals in a game in more than 20 years. **Ryan Caldwell** was the last Denver D-man to tally three times when he accomplished the feat on Feb. 14, 2004 vs. Minnesota State, and Buium was the first DU rear guard to register a hat trick on the road since **Ian DeCorby** at St. Cloud State on Dec. 29, 1990. *See Full List Below*

Buium's three markers were his first of the season and the first such performance by a Pioneer since **Jack Devine** tallied four times on March 10, 2023 vs. Miami. It was just the third hat trick by a D-man in NCHC history, as Western Michigan's Ronnie Attard had the previous two: Oct. 19, 2021 at Colgate and Feb. 4, 2022 at Colorado College.

It was Buium's second career multi-goal game, joining his two-goal performance that included the overtime-winner in the NCHC Frozen Faceoff Semifinals on March 22, 2024 vs. St. Cloud State at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn. His hat trick performance also marked his seventh career three-point contest and second of the season (three assists on Oct. 5, 2024 at Alaska Anchorage).

PK SHOWS OFF SHOT

Sophomore **Eric Pohlkamp** paces all DU defensemen with four goals and 63 shots and is tied for eighth among NCAA defensemen in scoring with 14 points and is tied for the 12th-most goals by a D-man (4).

The Baxter, Minn., native recorded a career-high three assists on Nov. 8 vs. Lindenwood, his third three-point game of his career and his second in a three-game span after totaling two goals and an assist on Nov. 1 at Yale—his first multi-point contest as a Pioneer after joining the program as a transfer in the offseason.

SWEET 16-HUNDRED

Denver hockey won its 1,600th all-time game in its victory on Nov 2 at Yale, becoming just the sixth program in college hockey history to reach the mark. Only Minnesota (1927), Michigan (1805), Boston College (1720), Boston University (1671) and North Dakota (1640) have more wins, but the Pioneers are the newest of the programs to reach the milestone (began 1949) as the other five squads started play in 1922-23 or earlier.

The Pioneers all-time winning percentage as of Nov. 3 was .609, which is the fourth-highest among the six programs and higher than both North Dakota and Michigan at the time (both at .604). DU is expected to play in its 2,800th game during the 2025 NCHC postseason.

HOME ICE ADVANTAGE

Denver is 64-12-4 in its last 80 contests at Magness Arena and sport a 71-16-5 record on the DU hilltop since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. The Pios lost back-to-back home games on Nov 22-23 vs. Arizona State, ending a run of 34 straight home series without getting swept. It was their first consecutive losses over a weekend at Magness Arena since March 31-Feb. 1, 2020 vs. Minnesota Duluth.

The Pioneers finished their 20-game home schedule last season with a 14-3-3 record and ended the home campaign on a four-game winning streak from Feb. 24-March 16, matching a season-best stretch (Dec. 2-Jan. 12).

MAGNESS MADNESS

Denver has sold out each of its nine home games season, averaging 6,637 fans. The Pioneers set attendance records on Oct. 18-19 during homecoming weekend against Northeastern, including a new single-game high with a crowd 7,051 on Saturday for its banner-raising ceremony and series finale. Overall, 13,888 people watched the series sweep of NU—the most for a two-game weekend in school history and breaking the previous mark by more than 1,200 fans.

In 2023-24, DU set a home attendance record by averaging 6,130 fans at Magness Arena across 20 games, besting their previous high mark of 6,022 over the course of 24 contests in 2006-07. Denver had a sold-out crowd of 7,033 for its regular-season finale against Colorado College on March 9, which at the time was the highest-attended hockey game at Magness Arena in program history. DU had set its last high mark for attendance in its previous game against CC on Nov. 3 at Magness with a crowd of 7,021.

Overall, 122,594 people watched the Pioneers at Magness Arena in 2023-24 (20 games) after 133,117 people visited DU's home rink in 23 games in 2022-23 (the second-highest attended season in the rink's history). If the 17,952 that witnessed Denver defeat Colorado College at Ball Arena on Jan. 27, 2023 are included in the data (it officially counted as a DU home game), then 151,069 people watched Pioneer home games in 2022-23—the highest total attendance for the team since 1999.

ROAD TRIPPIN'

Denver is set to travel approximately 10,349 miles this season for road games (one way), which includes a trip to Anchorage and the two to the northeast to Yale and Maine. Denver traveled 8,605 miles for road contest during the regular season in 2023-24, which included a trip to Fairbanks and cross country to New England to start the campaign.

Counting postseason play at neutral sites from last season, DU owns a 17-3-0 record in its last 20 games away from Magness Arena since Feb. 16, 2024.

NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

The Pioneers are 10-0-0 in non-conference play and will wrap up their non-NCHC games after the New Year on Nov. 1-2 at the Maine Black Bears. It will be the program's first visit to Orono since Oct. 14-15, 2005 and the second of two trips to the northeast after playing at Yale on Nov. 1-2. DU began the season on Oct. 5-6 at independent Alaska Anchorage.

Denver wrapped up its home non-conference schedule with a pair of 4-1 wins against Lindenwood during the 75th Anniversary Weekend on Nov. 8-9. The Pioneers hosted Hockey East's Northeastern in its first home games of the year as part of Homecoming Weekend on Oct. 18-19, with the team raising its championship banner prior to the Saturday series finale. DU then faced the Big Ten's and former WCHA-foe Wisconsin on Oct. 25-26, winning 4-2 and 6-1.

The Pios have won 19 consecutive games against non-conference opponents since Nov. 11, 2023 at Arizona State and is 12-0-1 at home in non-NCHC contests dating back to Jan. 7, 2023 vs. Alaska Fairbanks. DU went 13-2-1 against non-conference opponents a season ago, which included wins in each of the final nine such contests and four in the NCAA Tournament en route to a championship.

QUICK STRIKE

Carter King's goal at 0:12 of the third period on Oct. 19 vs. Northeastern was the quickest to begin a period this season and the fastest by a Pioneer since **Chris Knowlton** at 0:11 of the first period on Nov. 26, 2011.

Jack Devine had the fastest goal to start a period last season when he tallied 16 seconds into the first on March 8 at CC.

CARLE QUICK TO 150 WINS

Head Coach **David Carle** won his 150th career game on Oct. 6 in his hometown against the Alaska Anchorage Seawolves. He ranks fourth in program history in wins behind **Murray Armstrong** (460), **George Gwozdecky** (443) and **Ralph Backstrom** (182).

Carle reached the 150-win mark in 228 career games (seventh season), the second-fastest among DU coaches with only Armstrong doing it faster in 216 contests (seventh season). Gwozdecky reached the mark in his 287th game and Backstrom hit the milestone in his 300th contest, with both coming in their eighth season.

The Anchorage, Alaska, native owns a .697 career winning

percentage--the highest mark by any coach in program history.

ANCHORAGE HOMECOMING

David Carle guided the bench for the first time as a head coach in his hometown of Anchorage on Oct. 5-6. Hired as the program's head coach prior to 2018-19, Carle had only ever coached in America's Last Frontier twice, going 2-0 in games in Fairbanks on Oct. 5-6, 2019 (he missed last year's games in UAF for the birth of his second son, Callum).

The only time Carle served as a "coach" in Anchorage was as an upperclassman in 2011 or 2012 while a student assistant coach under George Gwozdecky. He was still an assistant coach with the USHL Green Bay Gamblers when Denver last played the UAA Seawolves early in 2013-14 (he was hired at DU later on in the year).

WEEKEND OF FIRSTS

Denver freshmen **Hagen Burrows**, **Jake Fisher**, **Tory Pitner** and **James Reeder** made their collegiate debuts on Saturday, Oct. 5 at Alaska Anchorage, with transfer players **Eric Pohlkamp** (Bemidji State) and **Samu Salminen** (UConn) playing in their first contests with the Pioneers in that outing as well.

Fisher tallied his first career goal in his debut while **Reeder** and **Salminen** tallied in the series finale on Oct. 6. **Pohlkamp** picked up his first point as a Pioneer with an assist in the Sunday contest.

IN OPENERS

The Pioneers improved to 44-25-7 all-time in season openers and won their fourth such game in a row with a 6-2 victory at Alaska Anchorage on Oct. 5. It was the second straight season that DU began on the road after starting 2023-24 in Fairbanks, Alaska, against the Nanooks. The last time Denver began a campaign on the road in consecutive seasons was when it did it three years in a row: 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20.

Denver has a 53-18-5 all-time record in home openers and is 20-4-2 all-time in opening nights at Magness Arena, which includes going 14-2-2 in the last 18 games. The Pioneers are unbeaten in their last eight home openers (6-0-2).

KING'S BANNER NIGHT

Forward **Carter King** had a memorable night on Oct. 19, which began with him taking a lap with the 2024 NCAA Championship trophy and watching the program's 10th national title banner be raised to the Magness Arena rafters. After the pregame festivities, he went out and produced two goals and two assists and won 20 faceoffs.

His faceoff victories were the most in a game in his career while his four points matched a personal best previously set on Nov. 11, 2023 in DU's comeback win at Arizona State (1g/3a).

ROSTER BUILDING

Denver returns 18 players from the 2023-24 championship squad and welcomes seven newcomers—five incoming freshmen and transfer students **Eric Pohlkamp** (Bemidji State) and **Samu Salminen** (Connecticut). DU is bringing back 10-of-15 forwards, 5-of-8 defensemen and 3-of-4 goaltenders from a season ago.

The Pioneers' 25-member squad features graduate student **Connor Caponi** and seniors **Matt Davis**, **Jack Devine** and **Carter King**. There are also five juniors to round out the upperclassmen.

Five players from last year's team signed NHL professional contracts, while two transferred (Tristan Lemyre, Western Michigan; Lucas Olvestad, Massachusetts).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

DU is the second-youngest squad in college hockey for the second-straight season despite only having five freshmen on its squad. Denver's average age as of Oct. 1 is 20.9 years old—which was also its age to start 2023-24. Boston College, which was the youngest team last season at 20.6, is once again the youngest at 20.7 years of age.

DU's youngest player is defenseman **Tory Pitner** (March 6, 2006) while **Hagen Burrows** also started the season as an 18-year-old with an Oct. 15, 2005 birthday. Last season, **Zeev Buium** (Dec. 7, 2005) was the second-youngest player in college hockey behind only Boston University's and eventual No. 1 overall NHL Draft pick Macklin Celebrini (June 13, 2006). **Jack Devine**, who turned 21 on Oct. 1, was the second-youngest player in the nation as a freshman in 2021-22.

PRO PIOS ON NHL OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS

Denver had 11 former players make NHL Opening Day rosters for the 2024-25 season, the third-most in the conference and tied for ninth in the entire NCAA. Only North Dakota (13) and Minnesota Duluth (12) had more players on NHL teams than the Pioneers among NCHC programs.

The DU alums that began this year on NHL squads are **Bobby Brink** (Philadelphia), **Dylan Gambrell** (Columbus), **Danton Heinen** (Vancouver), **Scott Mayfield** (NY Islanders), **Ian Mitchell** (Boston), **Trevor Moore** (Los Angeles), **Logan O'Connor** (Colorado), **Troy Terry** (Anaheim) and **Jason Zucker** (Buffalo). In addition, **Shai Buium** (Detroit) and **Cameron Wright** (Edmonton) were on their respective teams' injured reserve/non-roster list.

The Pioneers had 11 alums play in an NHL game in 2023-24: **Brink** (Philadelphia), **Heinen** (Boston), **Mayfield** (NY Islanders), **Mitchell** (Boston), **Moore** (Los Angeles), **O'Connor** (Colorado), **Terry** (Anaheim), **Zucker** (Arizona/Nashville), **Magnus Chrona** (San Jose), **Devin Cooley** (San Jose), **Cole Guttman** (Chicago) and **Dakota Mermis** (Minnesota).

THE PICKS ARE IN

Defenseman **Zeev Buium** became the second-highest draft pick in DU hockey history after being selected No. 12 overall by the Minnesota Wild in the league's annual selection on June 28 at the Sphere in Las Vegas. Buium was the first American chosen in the draft and became just the fifth Pioneer to be picked in the first round. **Craig Redmond** at No. 6 by the Los Angeles Kings in 1984 is the only Denver player to be chosen earlier.

Overall, DU had four players selected as 2024-25 incoming freshmen **Jake Fisher** (Round 4, No. 121, Colorado), **Hagen Burrows** (Round 4, No. 128, Tampa Bay), **Tory Pitner** (Round 6, No. 185, Colorado) and **James Reeder** (Round 7, No. 198, Los Angeles) were also chosen. *Denver's four incoming freshmen chosen are the most in a single draft in program history.*

ZEEV IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Defenseman **Zeev Buium** produced one of the best rookie campaigns in DU history in 2023-24 as he led the team with 39 assists and was second in scoring with 50 points.

His 50 points were the 10th-most by a freshman player in school history and were the most by a rookie since **John McMillan** had 57 and **Dwight Mathiasen** had 51 in 1983-84. Overall, only two frosh defensemen have recorded more points in a single campaign than Buium: **Craig Redmond's** 54 in 1982-83 and **Greg Woods' 52** in 1975-76.

The San Diego, California, native's 39 assists were the most-ever by a freshman defenseman and the second-most by a rookie (forward **Dallas Gaume** owns the record with 47 assists in his rookie campaign in 1982-83). Among defensemen all-time, Buium's 39 helpers were fourth-best in Pioneer history.

Buium's 11 goals were the most by a rookie D-man since **Joey LaLeggia** (11) in 2011-12.

PIOS AT USA WORLD JUNIOR SUMMER CAMP

PRE-SEASON MISCELLANEOUS

- The Pioneers are returning the most goals (129) and points (328) from a year ago. Michigan State is second in goals (102) while Boston College trails only DU in points (303)
- Jack Devine's 106 points entering the season ranked third among active players while his 44 goals were second-most behind only Quinnipiac's Jack Ricketts (46). His 62 assists were ninth-most among current players and his 15 power-play goals were fifth-highest total. Devine's career +59 plus-minus rating was the best for all NCAA athletes to start 2024-25.
- Carter King's five career short-handed goals were tied for the fifth-most among active players.
- Jared Wright's eight game-winning goals were tied for the seventh-most in the NCAA going into theyear.
- Connor Caponi's 143 games played were the most among all players heading into 2024-25.
- Sophomore defenseman Zeev Buium's +33 plus/minus rating was tied for the eighth-best among active D-men while fellow classmate Boston Buckberger was 11th with a +32 rating.
- Matt Davis' 34 wins were the eighth-most among all goaltenders entering this season. His 2.19 goals-against average was second-best while his .919 career save-percentage ranked sixth among active netminders.
- The Pioneers weigh in as the fifth-biggest team at 193 pounds and is the second-youngest team with an average age of 20.9 as of Oct. 1, behind only BC (20.7).
- Denver is one of three programs returning multiple All-Amer-

icans from a year ago (Zeev Buium, Jack Devine), along with Boston College (3) and Colorado College (2).

- DU has reached the NCAA Tournament in three-straight seasons, tied for the fourth-longest streak in the NCAA, and is the only program to make it to the Big Dance in nine of the last 10 years. DU's four appearances in the last five tournaments are tied with five others for the second-most in that span.
- David Carle is one of eight active coaches that have won a national championship and one of three with multiple rings (Minnesota Duluth's Scott Sandelin, 2011, 2018, 2019; Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson, 1992, 1994 with Lake Superior State).
- Carle is the second-youngest coach in the NCAA, turning 35 years old on Nov. 9 (Long Island's Brett Riley turns 34 on Jan. 25). He is one of 24 coaches leading the bench at their alma mater.
- Denver had 11 former players skate in an NHL game last season, the 12th most among NCAA programs.

PERFECT 10

Denver won its 10th national title during the 2023-24 season, breaking a tie with Michigan for the most in NCAA history. The Pioneers captured their second championship in three years and their fifth in the past 20 completed seasons, the most among any program in that time (2004-present). DU's five NCAA titles are the most by any school since the turn of the century (2000-present).

The Pioneers were previously tied with Boston College for the most titles since 2000, as the Eagles had won four championships in that time (2001, 2008, 2010, 2012). DU became the first team since BC to win three titles in a span of seven tournaments (not contested in 2019-20 due to COVID-19 Pandemic).

DENVER, THE KINGS OF COLLEGE HOCKEY

The Pioneers have been among the top programs since the turn of the century, and they continued to solidify that spot last season by winning their NCAA-record 10th national championship.

Denver's seven Frozen Four since 2000 are tied for the fourth-most while its now five national titles broke a tie with Boston College for the most in that time.

In the last 20 years since 2004, DU's seven Frozen Four appearances are the third-most while its now five NCAA Championships lead college hockey in that span. BC reached nine Frozen Fours and won two titles in the past two decades.

CARLE THE YOUNGEST TO WIN TWO

Richard and Kitzia Goodman Hockey Head Coach **David Carle** guided the Pioneers to their second NCAA Championship in the past three seasons and DU's third Frozen Four appearance since taking over in 2018 (2019, 2022, 2024).

After being the fourth-youngest coach in history to win an NCAA D-I national title in 2022 (32 years, 5 months, 0 days), Carle became the youngest ever to win two national championships following the Pioneers' victory in 2024 (34 years, 5 months, 4 days). Overall, the Anchorage, Alaska, native is the 20th coach in NCAA history to win multiple national championships and the first to do so since Scott Sandelin of Minnesota Duluth (2011, 2018, 2019).

ANDERSON EARNS ELITE 90 AWARD

Defenseman **Kent Anderson** became the seventh overall Denver student-athlete to earn the NCAA Elite 90 award and the third member of the hockey program, joining **Gabe Levin** in 2016 and **Erich Fear** in 2019. The finance major earned the honor by having the highest grade-point average (3.975) at the Frozen Four.

DU AWARDED 2028 FROZEN FOUR IN CHICAGO

The NCAA announced on Oct. 2 that the University of Denver has been named the host institution for the 2024 NCAA Frozen Four at United Center in Chicago, Illinois. This will be the second time that DU will serve as the host of the men's ice hockey's championship weekend after also doing so in 2008 at the then-Pepsi Center (now Ball Arena) in downtown Denver.

Ball Arena was not in a position to bid for the 2028 Frozen Four during this most recent NCAA submission cycle, but Denver has a game slated at the home of the NHL's Colorado Avalanche in November 2025 against Minnesota in the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame Game.

Chicago is one of the University of Denver's largest markets for alumni and current student. The Pioneers won their eighth national championship at the 2017 Frozen Four at United Center.

It was also announced that DU will host the NCAA Regional at Blue Arena in Loveland, Colorado, in 2027 like the school did in 2021 and 2022. It was previously announced that Denver will also be regional hosts at the home of the AHL's Colorado Eagles in 2026.

2024 CHAMPIONSHIP NOTABLES

- The Pioneers, the highest scoring team in the country, won three consecutive 2-1 games in the national tournament before posting a 2-0 shutout of BC in the championship game. The 2-1 games were the team's first such scores of the season and marked the first time in program history that the Pios won games in that fashion (regular season or playoffs). The last time that DU won three straight games in the NCAA Tournament by a single score was during the first three rounds of 2022.
- Nine players from the 2024 championship squad were also members of the 2022 title team won.
- Denver won its third national championship in the state of Minnesota (2024 St. Paul, 1969 Duluth, 1958 Minneapolis)
- The Pioneers reached its 19th Frozen Four and won its 10th national championship. The Pioneers have reached the national tournament 33 times in their history.
- DU has made the Frozen Four in five of the last eight tournaments.
- Tristan Broz scored the overtime-winning goals in the 2024

Regional Semifinals vs. UMass and Frozen Four Semifinals vs. BU, becoming the first player in NCAA history to tally multiple OT goals in the same national tournament.

- David Carle became the youngest coach in NCAA history to win multiple national championship 34 years, 5 months, 4 days).
- Matt Davis was recognized as both the 2024 NCAA Frozen Four and Northeast Regional Most Outstanding Player after finishing the four-game national tournament with a 0.63 goals-against average, .979 save percentage and one shutout in 283:32 of playing time. His .986 save percentage in the Frozen Four tied Hockey Hall of Famer Ken Dryden (Cornell, 1967, 71/72) for the NCAA record.

The Pioneers have won each of their three appearances in the NCHC Final, as they also won the inaugural tournament in 2014 at Target Center in Minneapolis and 2018 at the first iteration of the event at Xcel Energy Center.
- Denver is 28-9-1 all-time in the NCHC Tournament and is the only squad to reach the conference's final four in all 10-held tournaments.
- The Pios led the country in offense in 2023-24 by averaging 4.59 goals per game, including by a 4.89 rate during the regular season. Boston College was second at 4.46 goals/game.
- The Pioneers had 11 players that scored 10 or more goals last season and also had 11 skaters that registered 30 or more points, both by far the most by a program in 2023-24. DU also had the most 20-plus point players (14) and was tied with Michigan State for the highest amount of skaters with 10 or more points (16).
- DU was one of five teams in the country last season multiple players with 20 or more goals this season in Jack Devine (27) and Miko Matikka (20).

David Carle is in his seventh season as the Richard and Kitzia Goodman Hockey Head Coach in 2024-25 after being named to the position on May 25, 2018. The ninth head coach in program history, Carle has led the Pioneers to five NCAA Tournament appearances, three Frozen Four berths and the 2022 and 2024

NCAA National Championship in his first six campaigns behind the bench. Denver's national championship victory in 2024 was the program's 10th in its 75-year history and set the NCAA record for the most-ever by a college hockey team.

At the time of his hire at DU, Carle was youngest head coach in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey at age 28. He became the fourth-youngest coach in history to win a D-I national title in 2022 (32 years, 5 months, 0 days) and is the youngest ever to win two national championships following the Pioneers' victory in 2024 (34 years, 5 months, 4 days). He is the 20th coach in NCAA history to win multiple national championships and the first to do so since Scott Sandelin of Minnesota Duluth (2011, 2018, 2019).

Carle entered this season with a 148-62-16 overall record and a 68-41-11 mark in National Collegiate Hockey Conference play in his first six campaigns at the helm of the program. The Pioneers won their third NCHC Frozen Faceoff Championship and Carle's first in 2024 following back-to-back campaigns where DU captured the conference's Penrose Cup as regular-season champions (2021-22, 2022-23).

Carle's .690 winning percentage going into 2024-25 is the best all-time among Denver hockey coaches. He surpassed his predecessor, Jim Montgomery (125), for sole possession of fourth place on the school's all-time wins list on Nov. 25, 2024, earning his 125th career victory in 13 fewer games than Montgomery.

The Pioneers were the highest-scoring team in the nation in 2023-24 at 4.6 goals per game and became a stingy defensive squad in the postseason as they only allowed three goals against during the NCAA Tournament, including a shutout in the National Championship Game against Boston College on April 13.

Overall, DU went 32-9-3 in 2023-24 for its third consecutive 30-win season, a first in program history. The Pioneers ended the year on a season-best nine-game winning streak and went 20-4-2 in the final 26 outings after the holiday break.

Carle, 34, was also the head coach of the United States National Junior Team in 2024 during the Americans' run to a sixth gold medal in the last 20 years at IIHF World Junior Championship. In his debut for USA Hockey behind the bench in Gothenburg, Sweden, Carle became the third NCHC head coach to lead the U.S. to gold at the World Juniors, joining former St. Cloud coach Bob Motzko (2017) and North Dakota and Omaha coach Dean Blais (2010 with Omaha). He was just the second Denver bench boss to lead the U.S. World Junior squad, joining Marshall Johnston in 1977. He will return to his role as the USA head coach at the 2025 tournament in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada.

The Anchorage, Alaska, native picked up his 100th career victory on Dec. 10, 2022 at Minnesota Duluth, becoming the fifth head coach in program history to reach the mark. Carle reached the milestone in 160 career games, second-fastest in school history behind Murray Armstrong (125) and five games faster than Montgomery (165). His .666 winning percentage (100-47-13) was also the second-best mark among coaches in their quest for 100 wins (Armstrong, 100-34-9, .731).

He coached his 200th contest with the Pioneers on Dec. 9, 2024 at Western Michigan, becoming the fifth DU bench boss to reach the milestone. His .675 winning percentage was the second-highest among Pioneer coaches through the first 200 games, with only Armstrong having a better mark (.735).

Denver recorded its second-straight 30-win campaign in 2022-23 (30-10-0), and the Pios also won their second consecutive Penrose Cup as NCHC regular-season champions after posting a 19-5-0 mark in league play. It was the first time in the program's 74-year history that the Pioneers won 30 or more games in back-to-back campaigns while the 19 conference wins were the team's most since 2009-10 in the WCHA.

During the program's then-record-tying ninth championship season in 2021-22, Carle and the Pioneers sported a 31-9-1 record and won its second Penrose Cup as conference regular-season champions with an 18-6-0 mark in NCHC play. The program went 17-1-1 at home and 22-1-1 in the state of Colorado during the campaign, which began with the Pioneers winning each of their first eight home contests—the longest streak to begin a campaign since Magness Arena opened in 1999 and tied for the third-longest in school history. Overall, DU began the year on a 15-game unbeaten streak at home, the third-longest in program history and the longest since the 1967-68 season. Carle was named the Coach of the Year by USCHO at the end of the season and was at the helm for the program's 1,500th victory on Oct. 8, 2021, helping Denver become just the fifth college hockey team to reach the milestone.

In his first season as head coach in 2018-19, the Alaskan guided the Pioneers to a 24-12-5 overall record and their 12th straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, which include the program's third berth in the Frozen Four in four seasons.

In Carle's second campaign at the helm, Denver finished its 70th Anniversary with a 21-9-6 record (11-8-5-4 NCHC), extending the "Tenzer

Streak” by winning 20 games for the 19th straight season and reclaiming the Gold Pan from Colorado College. The Pioneers were set to another NCAA Tournament in 2019-20, but the remainder of the season was eventually canceled due to COVID-19. Denver finished fifth in the Pairwise Rankings and sixth in the national polls with a resume that included top-10 sweeps of Boston College and UMass. The Pioneers opened the year on an eight-game winning streak, their best start to a campaign since 2001-02, and went on an 11-game unbeaten stretch from Dec. 7-Jan. 25, their best single-season unbeaten streak since 2016-17 (13).

Denver retained the Gold Pan for the 15th time (15-13) after sweeping Colorado College to end the 2020-21 regular season. In the single-elimination NCHC Tournament in Grand Forks, North Dakota, the Pioneers defeated Omaha 5-4 in the quarterfinals before falling 2-1 in overtime in the semifinals to the UND Fighting Hawks. Carle earned his 50th career victory with a 4-1 win over North Dakota on Jan. 17 (90th game, 50-28-12), accomplishing the feat in one fewer game than predecessor Jim Montgomery (91st game, 50-33-8).

Prior to being named head coach, Carle served four and a half seasons as an assistant coach with the Pioneers under Jim Montgomery. He joined the program on Jan. 1, 2014 following a season and a half as an assistant coach with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League (USHL). While in Green Bay, Carle assisted the Gamblers to a 37-23-4 record, a second-place finish in the USHL’s Eastern Conference and a franchise-record 15-consecutive wins on home ice.

During his tenure as an assistant coach with the Pioneers, Carle helped Denver to a 115-51-23 record, a 66-32-14-8 mark in the NCHC, one NCHC regular-season title (2016-17), two NCHC Frozen Faceoff titles (2014, 201), five NCAA Tournament appearances (2014-2018), two Frozen Four appearances (2016, 2017) and the 2017 National Championship.

Carle served four seasons as a student assistant coach with the Pioneers from 2008-2012 after being diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, the primary disease of the myocardium muscle of the heart, and being forced to retire from his playing career. Carle graduated from the University of Denver in 2012 with a business administration degree in finance.

As a player, Carle was a defenseman at Shattuck-St. Mary’s prep school in Faribault, Minnesota, where he helped the Sabres capture back-to-back national titles in 2007 and 2008 and was recruited to play at Denver. A 2008 NHL Draft-eligible prospect, Carle was drafted that year by the Tampa Bay Lightning (seventh round, 203rd overall) despite his diagnoses.

He resides in Denver with his wife, Mellissa, and sons, William and Callum.

ASSISTANT COACH: TAVIS MACMILLAN (10TH SEASON)

Tavis MacMillan is in his 10th season as an assistant coach with the Pioneers and has helped the program win three NCAA Championships since being named to the position on May 27, 2015.

McMillan has served on Denver's coaching staff in its 2017, 2022 and 2024 National Championship wins and helped the program reach five Frozen Four appearances, seven NCAA Tournament berths, two NCHC Frozen Faceoff championships and three NCHC regular-season titles in his decade with the team. Among his coaching duties on David Carle's staff include working with the forwards and penalty kill and leading the program's recruiting efforts.

Prior to joining DU, MacMillan served eight seasons as a scout for the NHL's Winnipeg Jets and 10 seasons as a coach for his alma mater, University of Alaska Fairbanks. MacMillan spent seven seasons as an assistant coach (1996-2003) and three seasons as the head coach of UAF from 2004-2006 (46-54-15 record as head coach).

As a player, the Milk River, Alberta, native played four seasons with Alaska Fairbanks (1990-1994), recording 192 points (56g/136a) in 135 NCAA games. Professionally, MacMillan played with the Greensboro Monarchs of the ECHL in 1994-95 and the Alaska Gold Kings of the West Coast Hockey League (WCHL) in 1995-96, serving as a player/marketing director for the team.

MacMillan's uncle, John, is a Denver alum and won two national titles with the Pioneers (1958, 1960) before embarking on a decade-long pro career. John MacMillan played in the NHL for both the Detroit Red Wings and Toronto Maple Leafs and became the first DU player to win the Stanley Cup by raising the trophy with the Leafs in both 1962 and 1963.

MacMillan, 53, resides with his wife, Deon, and has three daughters, Taryn, Camryn and Lauryn, and two grandsons, Decker and Bryer. An athletic family, Camryn played five seasons and was a captain on the Denver women's soccer team (2018-2023), while Lauryn also attended DU and used to play hockey as a goaltender. Taryn is a former NCAA soccer player as well and played at North Dakota and Concordia University St. Paul.



ASSISTANT COACH: DALLAS FERGUSON (7TH SEASON)

Dallas Ferguson is in his seventh season as an assistant coach with the Pioneers after being hired to the position on July 3, 2018. Ferguson has helped Denver win both the 2022 and 2024 NCAA National Championships, as well as the 2024 NCHC Frozen Faceoff Championship, two Penrose Cups as NCHC regular-season champions (2021-22, 2022-23) and help the team reach three Frozen Fours (2019, 2022, 2024).

The Wainwright, Alberta, native's primary responsibilities on David Carle's staff include working with the defensemen and power play.

Prior to coming to DU, Ferguson served as the head coach of the Calgary Hitmen of the Western Hockey League for the 2017-18 campaign after spending the previous nine seasons as the head coach of the University of Alaska Fairbanks. He led the Nanooks from 2008-2017 and guided the team to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2010, the first in the program's D-I history.

Ferguson, 51, began his coaching career as an assistant coach with the Fairbanks Ice Dogs junior team (2002-2004) before returning to his alma mater to serve as an assistant at UAF from 2004-2008, working under fellow DU assistant and then-Alaska head coach Tavis MacMillan from 2004-2007.

Ferguson played four seasons with Alaska Fairbanks from 1992-1996, serving as a captain of the squad during his senior campaign. He finished his college career with 104 points (17g/87a) and 64 penalty minutes in 138 games and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration.

The defenseman went on to play four seasons of professional hockey with the Richmond Renegades of the ECHL as well as with the Alaska Gold Kings and Anchorage Aces of the West Coast Hockey League. He recorded 69 points (6g/63a) points in 159 career WCHL games.

Ferguson resides with his family in Highlands Ranch, Colorado.



ASSISTANT COACH: RYAN MASSA (4TH SEASON)

Ryan Massa is in his second season as an assistant coach on the Pioneers after spending the previous two years on the staff as a volunteer assistant coach. He was promoted to his current role on Sept. 5, 2023, and the 2024-25 campaign marks his fourth with the Denver hockey program.

Massa, 34, first joined the DU coaching staff on Aug. 1, 2021 after spending the previous four years training goaltenders at various levels in the state of Colorado. Among his responsibilities is working with the Pioneers' goaltenders, assisting in on-ice skill development, providing scouting reports and assisting in managing the bench during games.

In his time at Denver, Massa has been a part of the Pioneers' 2022 and 2024 NCAA Championship victories, as well as the 2024 NCHC Frozen Faceoff Championship and two Penrose Cup as NCHC regular-season champions (2021-22, 2022-23).

The Littleton, Colorado, native helped guide goaltender Magnus Chrona to 50 wins and 10 shutouts across the 2021-22 and 2022-23 campaigns, which included being named the NCHC Goaltender of the Year award in 2023. In 2023-24, he helped Matt Davis post a 20-4-2 record in the final 26 games of the season and post a 0.63 goals-against average and .979 save percentage in four NCAA Tournament contest, including a shutout in the NCAA Championship Game.
