- Denver went down 2-0 in the opening half hour in this year's trip to SMU, but goals from Oje Ofunrein and Dylan Akau pulled Denver back from two goals down to earn a result for just the seventh time in their Division I era to earn a 2-2 draw on Sunday night in Dallas. Sunday's draw was the 100th draw in the history of Denver's men's soccer program that dates back to 1961.
- The Pioneers make their first of two trips to Omaha this year, this time to battle Creighton. Game five of the Pioneers season-opening six-match road swing will kickoff at 7:45 p.m. CT/6:45 p.m. MT.
- Denver will close out the long road swing with a trip to UCLA on Monday. Opening kickoff on BTN+ is set for 8 p.m. MT/7 p.m. PT.

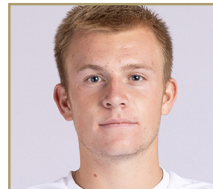

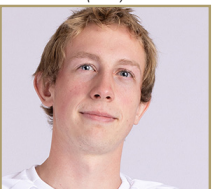

DENVER – The [RV/19] University of Denver men's soccer team and [RV/-] Creighton played to a 2-2 draw on Monday night at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.

Significant Stats:

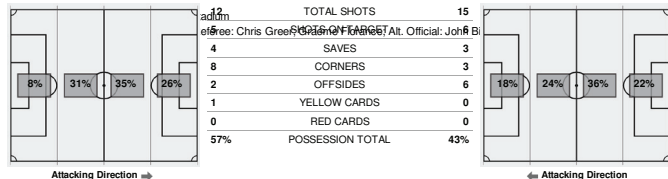
- Holger Olsson scored the breakthrough in the opening 10 minutes, his second of the season and the eighth of his career.
- Sam Bassett's goal to put Denver back in-front in the 29th minute was his second of the season and the ninth of his career.
- Lukas Fisher's assist on the Bassett go-ahead tally was his first helper of the season and the seventh of his four-year career.
- Aidan O'Toole's first-half assist was his second of the season and the ninth of his Pioneer career.
- Denver took the first nine shots of the match (opening 20:02), putting five of the nine on target. The Pioneers took a 12-4 shot advantage into the intermission.

First Half:

4' O'Toole put Denver's first shot on target of the night, but the keeper dove to his left to make the save and pushed it out for the Pioneers second corner of the night.
9' Denver earned its well-deserved early breakthrough in the opening 10 minutes. The Pioneers turned the Jays over in the press with three attackers surrounding the ball on the endline. O'Toole played a first-time cross to the center of the box. Olsson's first attempt looked to be stop by the keeper, but crossed the line in the keeper's hands to give the Pios the early advantage.
28' Creighton equalized in the 28th minute off its first corner kick of the night. The Jays corner was punched out of the area, but on the recycled ball, Jackson Castro crossed it into a dangerous area and Luke Mitchell headed it off the outstretched fingertips of Isaac Nehme and into the back of the net.
29' Just 35 seconds later, Denver got an instant response to retake the lead at 2-1. Less than a minute after coming onto the pitch, Fisher got free down the left flank and played it to Bassett in the center of the area. Bassett did well to get the shot off the ground over two sliding defenders to find the back of the net for his second of the homestand.

Second Half:

56' Oje Ofunrein got on the end of a header shy of the hour mark, but the cross was just inches behind him, and he was unable to get his header down enough to stay on target.
86' Creighton equalized in the final five minutes off a 22-yard free kick from just above the center of the D to tie things up with 4:15 to play.

TOP-10 SINCE 2015

- Denver is 111-36-30 since the start of the 2015 season.
- That record ranks tied for 9th in the country in wins, behind Wake Forest (141), Indiana (132), Clemson (127), Georgetown (124), Stanford (120), New Hampshire (116), Kentucky (114), Washington (114) and Seattle (111) (thru 9/2).
- Of the 16 teams that had at least 100 wins in that span entering the year, Denver has the fifth-fewest losses at 36.

2024 SCHEDULE

- Returning 20 letterwinners and 10 starters from a year ago, head coach Jamie Franks put his program up against the best once again with his 2024 schedule that was announced in June.
- In the regular season, Denver will play 11 opponents that finished in last season's RPI Top-100 (2-0-2), nine from the Top-50 (2-0-2) and four in the Top-20 (1-0-1).
- Eight of Denver's first nine matches are against teams that finished in the top-40 last season (2-0-2).

LIMITING CHANCES

- Denver has held opponents to two shots or less 13 times in its DI era.
- The Pioneers have held opponents without a shot on goal 23 times in their Division I history, including three times during the 2023 season.
- In the Summit Semi, KC broke a DU shutout streak that lasted 565:23.
- In the 2024 season opener, Denver didn't allow Cal to put a shot on target until right before the 83rd minute Bears goal.

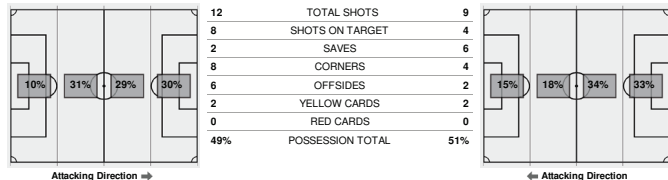

DALLAS – The [9/4] University of Denver men’s soccer program fell two goals behind 26 minutes in, but tallies from Oje Ofunrein and Dylan Akau pulled a point back for the Pios in a 2-2 draw at [RV/16] SMU on Sunday night at Washburne Soccer and Track Stadium

Scoring Summary:

[9] Denver: Ofunrein 30’ (Bassett), Akau 71’ (Bassett, Ofunrein)
[RV] SMU: Lopez 9’ (Mitchell), Sparks 26’ (pen)

Significant Stats:

Oje Ofunrein scored for the second-straight match to cut SMU’s first-half lead in half. The goal was the 15th of his Pioneer career to move him into ninth on Denver’s Division I scoring list.

Ofunrein also earned a secondary assist on the game-tying goal, his third career assist and his 33rd career point.

Ofunrein’s last assist came on September 23, 2023 at St. Thomas.

Dylan Akau’s goal was his first goal of the campaign and the second of his career. Akau’s tally was his first since the St. Thomas match last October 21.

Sam Bassett played the free kick from the side of the box that led to the first Denver goal, his first of two assists on the evening.

Bassett’s second assist of the night was the 49th point and the 17th assist of his career. Bassett’s 49 points moved him past Nick Hartman for sixth on Denver’s DI career list.

Bassett’s 16th assist moved him into a tie with Joey Mathot for fifth on Denver’s career list.

Denver’s fight back to get a point was the program’s seventh two-goal comeback in its Division I history, including its fourth draw.

The Pioneers last two-goal comeback came on September 22, 2018 at Omaha when Denver came from 3-1 down to win 4-3 courtesy of four goals from Andre Shinyashiki. Denver’s last fight-back to earn a draw from two goals down came on September 9, 2011 when Denver came from 2-0 down in the final 39 minutes to draw at Notre Dame 2-2. DU outshot SMU 12-9, including 8-4 on target. Denver also had an 8-4 advantage in corner kicks, including a 6-3 edge in the second half.

Sunday night’s draw was the 100th draw in Denver Men’s Soccer History (1961).

First Half:

9’ SMU opened the scoring on the first shot of the game just shy of the 10 minute mark. Jaylenn Mitchell dribbled through defenders down the Denver right, and the cross on the ground found the sliding deflection of Milton Lopez who redirected the pass into the top corner of the net to give the Ponies an early lead.

9’ Denver’s first shot came 30 seconds off the kickoff. Dylan Akau got a cross to Ian Smith. Smith’s shot in-front was blocked in-front by an SMU centerback in-front of the keeper and was eventually dove on and picked back up by Chance Johnson in-front of his own net.

26’ SMU doubled its advantage when Bailey Sparks converted from the penalty spot after Isaac Nehme was whistled for a foul in the area.

30’ Denver cut the deficit in half just shy of the half hour mark. Ben Smith earned a free kick that was ruled just outside the box. Sam Bassett stood over it on the side of the box, and whipped in a service that was briefly deflected out by the SMU goalie. Ofunrein was the first to the ball to tap it in to pull Denver back to within one.

43’ Cesar Ruvalcaba had the next best chance to add to a high-scoring first half, but his headed attempt landed on the roof of Nehme’s net.

45’ Kyle McGowan set up Denver’s chance at an equalizer before the intermission, playing a cross in from the right flank to Bassett in the center of the area. Bassett chested it down and got a shot off, but it was wide of the target.

The Pioneers outshot SMU 5-4, including 3-2 on target. Denver also took two of the three corner kicks in the opening 45 minutes.

Second Half:

46’ Bryce Willoughby earned a great chance in the opening minute of the second half, but his shot was deflected behind for a corner, the Pioneers third trip to the corner flag on the evening.

59’ Bassett created some space in the center of the box and got a shot off but it hit the back of Willoughby. Ronan Wynne was the first to the ball and was cleaned out by the keeper but the cross was already away. Willoughby had the goalie out of the net, but three SMU defenders limited Willoughby’s angle, and the striker couldn’t find the back of the net.

65’ Mitchell had SMU’s first chance of the second half to try to double the home side’s lead once more, but after dribbling past a few Denver defenders the Pios limited the angle and Nehme made a diving save to keep it 2-1.

71’ Denver used some great combination play in the middle of the field to setup the equalizer. Wynne played it into Ofunrein in the center of the park before Ofunrein touched it to Bassett. Bassett quickly turned and found the run of Akau who beat the offside trap and beat the keeper 1v1 to level the score at 2-2.

76’ The Pioneers had the next opportunity to retake the lead minutes after they leveled it. Ian Smith got free at the top of the box, but his shot that was heading towards the lower right corner of the goal, but the keeper Johnson not only saved it but held the rebound to keep it out of Ofunrein’s path for the tap-in.

- Denver is 24-43-15 in its Division I history against the USC Top-25, going 11-13-3 at home, 12-24-9 on the road and 1-6-3 at neutral sites.
- Under Jamie Franks, Denver is 15-17-7 against ranked opponents, including 7-5-2 at home, 8-10-4 on the road and 0-2-1 at a neutral site.
- The Pioneers are 10-8-4 against teams receiving votes, including 5-5-2 at home, 4-3-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at a neutral site.
- Denver is 4-11-0 against teams ranked in the top-5 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll, including 2-6 in true road games after its win over No. 5 Stanford on August 25.
- The Pioneers only road win against a top-5 team prior to this season came on December 2, 2016 when the fourth-ranked Pioneers beat No. 3 Clemson 1-0 in the NCAA Quarterfinals.
- Denver's last win against a top-5 team prior to this season came in a 3-2 win against No. 3 Washington on August 30, 2018 at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.

DENVER IN TOP-2 IN TOP DRAWER SOCCER POLL

- Denver moved up to second in the Top Drawer Soccer Poll on Sept. 3
- The Pioneers were in the top-2 of a poll for the first time since 2018, and only the second time in the program's history.
- Denver has not been in the top-2 of the primary poll, the United Soccer Coaches' Poll.
- On October 8, 2018, Denver was the No. 1 team in the Top Drawer Soccer Poll, its first and only No. 1 ranking to date in program history.
- Prior to October, 2018, Denver had been as high as No. 3 to end the College Cup run in 2016.

DENVER IN TOP-3 IN UNITED SOCCER COACHES POLL

- Denver moved up 6 spots to 3rd in the Sept. 3 USC Poll.
- The Pios were in the top-3 for the first time since August, 2017.

DENVER AND THE NEW POWER 4

- The Pioneers square off against six programs from the new power-4, including four from the newly-mapped ACC.
- Five matches on Denver's season-opening six-match road swing are against the Power-4, with the other coming against the deep BIG EAST Conference (Creighton).
- Denver's most wins against the power conferences came in 2016 when the Pios won four against members of the premier conferences.
- Denver had two wins against the Power-5 in 2022, making 2024 the third season with multiple wins against the P4 (2016, 2022, 2024).
- The Pioneers 2-1 win over Cal and 1-0 win over No. 5 Stanford in the season opening weekend was Denver's ninth and 10th wins against the Power Conferences under 10th-year head coach Jamie Franks.

UNIVERSITY OF DENVER SOCCER STADIUM

- Franks is 6-8-1 in the NCAA Tournament at DU (6-7-0 as HC). As a player and coach, Franks is 22-12-3 in the NAAs.
- In addition to National Coaching Staff of the Year, Franks is a five-time Summit League Coach of the Year (2015-18, 2023).
- Franks was the youngest head coach in Division I soccer when he was hired in 2015, and the second youngest in 2016 when he took the program to the College Cup.
- Franks led the Pioneers to back-to-back unbeaten regular seasons in his first two years in charge, the first program to go unbeaten in back-to-back regular seasons since Clemson in 1977-78.

- Jason Belloli (Defender), Sam Bassett (Midfielder) and Oje Ofunrein (Forward) were all named to the lists.
- Denver and Notre Dame were the only two programs to have at least three field players selected to the list.

PIOS IN THE TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP-100

- Denver had five players ranked in the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Top-100 players ahead of the 2024 season.
- Isaac Nehme (3rd), Sam Bassett (12), Oje Ofunrein (52), Jason Belloli (68) and Trevor Wright (98) were all ranked on the initial list.
- The Pioneers were one of three programs to have five players selected in the top-100, joined by Indiana (5) and Stanford (5).
- Nehme and Bassett were also selected to the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Best XI First and Second Teams, respectively.

ALL ACROSS THE COUNTRY

- The 2024 Denver Pioneers have players from 14 different states and three international countries (Germany, New Zealand, Sweden).
- The 14 states are: Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Hawai'i, Illinois, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Texas.
- 14 states represented on a single roster is the most in the program's Division I history, breaking the record of 12 states on the 2022 roster.

DI HISTORY BY STATE

- Denver has had players from 33 states in its Division I history.
- Including the 13 on the 2024 roster, the Pioneers have had 105 Coloradans in the program in their Division I era.
- The Pioneers have had double digit players from four states: Colorado (105), Texas (30), Illinois (10), Washington (10).
- Freshman Ian Shuler is Denver's first player from Georgia, making it the 33rd state.
- Since Franks took over in 2015, the Pios have recruited 30 Coloradans and 11 student-athletes from Texas
- Outside of the United States, the Pios have had players from 12 other countries, including Canada (6), Norway (5) and Sweden (4).
- Senior Ronan Wynne and freshman Keegan Kelly are Denver's only two Division I players from New Zealand.

FIRST HALF SCORING

- Denver has scored in the first half in 12 of its last 15 games dating back to the second half of 2023, including carrying a 1-0 lead into the intermission in nine of those 15 matches.
- The Pioneers outscored teams 23-9 in the first half last season.

RECAPPING THE 2023 SEASON

- The Pioneers opened last season with a six-match homestand, going 4-0-2 in the stretch including a 3-1 win over No. 11 SMU.
- The only two regular season losses of the season came in the four-match road swing to follow, as the Pios lost to No. 11 Portland and Pittsburgh on the road.
- Denver finished 7-0-1 in Summit League play, dropping their only two points of the campaign in a 1-1 draw with Oral Roberts on September 30.
- After winning the league regular season title, the Pios fell to Kansas City in penalty kicks in the Summit League Semifinal in Tulsa.
- Denver responded to the setback with a 2-1 come-from-behind win over LIU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.
- After trailing by two goals at halftime, Sam Bassett converted a spot kick to halve the deficit at SMU in the second round, but three strikes off the woodwork in the final minutes ended Denver's season in the second round for the third-consecutive year.

MATCH-BY-MATCH NOTES

MATCH 01: CALIFORNIA 1-2 [RV] DENVER

- Freshman Keegan Kelly, who came off the bench in the opening 10 minutes of the match for Holger Olsson, scored the breakthrough in his first NCAA match. Kelly's goal marked the first Pioneer goal on their collegiate debut since Ian Smith scored against Gonzaga in the 2022 opener.
- Coming off a First Team All-Summit League campaign a year ago, outside back Ian Smith got on the scoresheet in Thursday's season opener to double Denver's lead early in the second half. The goal is the fifth of the redshirt junior's career. Thursday's goal was his first since October 19, 2022
- MAC Hermann Watch List honoree Sam Bassett assisted on Denver's first two goals of the season.
- Bassett's assists give him 45 career points to move him into eighth on Denver's Division I career list. Bassett's 15th career assist moves him into a tie with Jarod Stigall, Colin Audley and Karsten Hanlin for seventh on Denver's DI list.
- Denver, who outscored teams 23-9 in the first half last season, is 133-10-17 when scoring first since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.
- Thursday night's win is Denver's ninth against a power conference team since Franks took over as head coach in 2015.
- Denver improved to 12-13-2 in season openers in its Division I history, including 3-6-1 on the road and 5-7-2 in openers decided by a goal or less.

MATCH 02: [5] STANFORD 0-1 [RV] DENVER

- Goalkeeper Isaac Nehme became the seventh keeper in the Pioneers Division I history to reach 100 career saves, stopping two Cardinal shots in the opening 45 minutes to reach the milestone.
- Keegan Kelly scored his second goal of the opening weekend of his collegiate career, the first Denver student-athlete to score in each of his first two collegiate matches since outside back Ian Smith scored in the first two matches of his redshirt-freshman season of 2022.
- Denver improved to 24-43-15 in its Division I history against ranked opponents, including 15-17-7 under Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks.
- The Pioneers improve to 4-11 against teams ranked in the top-5 in the United Soccer Coaches' Poll, including 2-6 in true road games (2016 NCAA Quarterfinal at Clemson).
- Sunday marked Denver's first win against a top-5 team since 2018 against Washington.
- Denver now has 10 Power-4 wins under Franks.
- The Pioneers are 134-10-17 when scoring first since Franks joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.
- Denver's defense didn't allow a shot on target for Stanford in the final 71 minutes.
- Nehme earned cleansheet number 22 of his career to pass Matt Bredehoft and move into second place on Denver's DI list. The win was also victory number 28 for Nehme, good for fourth in Denver's Division I history.

MATCH 03: WASHINGTON 2-2 [9] DENVER

- Sam Bassett's goal was his first of the season to go along with his fourth point of the campaign.
- Bassett's breakthrough was the 16th of his career, good for eighth on Denver's DI list.
- Bassett also has 47 career points, hopping Brian Todd for seventh on DU's DI points list.
- Ian Smith recorded the assist off a throw-in on Bassett's first-half opener, his first assist, his third point of the season and the 12th assist of his career.
- Oje Ofunrein scored his first goal of the season to give Denver the lead back in the final 10 minutes of the second half, finding the back of the net for the 14th time in his career.
- Ofunrein's goal puts him in a tie for ninth on Denver's Division I list, two goals behind his teammate Bassett for eighth.
- Ronan Wynne provided the assist on the Ofunrein goal, the eighth helper of his career. Two of Ronan's final three assists in his last season of play in 2022 were to setup Ofunrein goals.
- Denver dropped to 2-0-1 on the season halfway through a six-match season-opening road swing that features five Power-4 teams and five programs that finished last season in the RPI Top-40.

- Oje Ofunrein scored for the second-straight match to cut SMU's first-half lead in half. The goal was the 15th of his Pioneer career to move him into ninth on Denver's Division I scoring list.

- Ofunrein's last assist came on September 23, 2023 at St. Thomas.
- Dylan Akau's goal was his first goal of the campaign and the second of his career. Akau's tally was his first since the St. Thomas match last October 21.

- DU outshot SMU 12-9, including 8-4 on target. Denver also had an 8-4 advantage in corner kicks, including a 6-3 edge in the second half.
- Sunday night's draw was the 100th draw in Denver Men's Soccer History (1961).
