Officials: **ST. PAUL, Minn.** – The [12/7] University of Denver men's soccer program got a first career brace from redshirt sophomore Bryce Willoughby and goals from Oje Ofunrein and Kyle McGowan in a 4-0 win over St. Thomas on Saturday afternoon at South Field.

Bryce Willoughby scored his third and fourth goal of the season and the eighth and ninth of his career.

Willoughby's brace was the first multi-goal game of his career.

Willoughby's opening goal is the fifth game-winning goal of his career.

Willoughby's goals were his first since September 14 against Yale.

Jake Smith earned his third assist of the season and of his career on the Willoughby opener.

Oje Ofunrein scored his sixth goal of the season and the 19th of his career to double Denver's lead late in the first half.

Ofunrein's goal is his first since October 5.

Ofunrein's 19th career goal moved him into a tie with Jarod Stigall (2008-11) for fifth on Denver's Division I career list.

Ofunrein's 41st career point moved him into a tie with Collin Audley (2006-09) for 11th on Denver's Division I career record list.

Kyle McGowan scored a goal and earned an assist on Ofunrein's goal.

McGowan's assist was the first of his career.

McGowan's goal was his second in as many matches, and the third of his career.

Ronan Wynne earned an assist on McGowan's goal, his second of the season and the ninth of his career.

Dylan Akau earned an assist on Willoughby's second goal of the afternoon, his third assist of the season and the ninth of his career.

Denver improved to 140-10-18 when scoring first since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Jamie Franks first joined the staff as an assistant in 2012.

The Pioneers improved to 48-6-8 in the Summit League since Franks took over as head coach in 2015.

Denver outshot St. Thomas 21-1 on Saturday afternoon.

The Pioneers held an opponent to two shots or less for the 14th time in their Division I era.

Denver held an 11-0 advantage in shots on goal.

The Pioneers held an opponent without a shot on goal for the 24th time in their Division I history, including the first time this season and the fourth time in the last two seasons.

First Half:

8' Ben Smith took the first shot of the game, getting some space at the top of the box, but he didn't get all of his attempt and it bounced several times off the turf right to the St. Thomas' keeper.

16' A throw-in in the Pioneers defensive half from Dylan Akau to Jake Smith started the opening scoring opportunity for the Pioneers. Smith turned around and played a ball over the top of the St. Thomas back-four. Not sure if he was going to be ruled offside, Oje Ofunrein let the ball go and Willoughby made the long run around four other players and was the first to the ball. Willoughby shook off a defender and beat the keeper 1v1 to put the Pioneers in front.

23' Ben Smith played a cross to Ian Smith to the back post, but the ball bounced up on Ian Smith and his shot sliced off his shin and wide of the post.

32' Sam Bassett had the next opportunity to double the Pioneers advantage when his run in the center of the area was picked out by the feed from Akau, but Bassett's shot rolled up his foot and went over the crossbar.

37' Bassett had a free kick 25 yards out in the center of the field at the top of the box. The All-American had his free kick blocked in-front. The recycled ball after the block eventually came to the feet of Kyle McGowan who took Denver's eighth shot of the opening 45 minutes, but had it stopped by the UST keeper.

42' Denver did eventually double its advantage before halftime off a third corner in the opening 45 minutes. Bassett's set piece took a couple deflections off heads in front before ending up at the feet of McGowan on the far side of the penalty area. McGowan struck it hard and low across the face of goal and Ofunrein was there to tap in the Denver second.

Second Half:

48' Ben Smith had the first shot attempt of the second half, striking it from the top of the box, but right at the St. Thomas goalkeeper.

63' McGowan made it 3-0 just after the hour mark. Bassett took a corner to Ronan Wynne who had his shot blocked in front. Ian Smith got to the ball on the left wing, and had his cross deflected. Wynne touched the deflection on to McGowan who split a pair of defenders with his first touch and roofed his second goal in as many matches.

68' Ian Smith nearly made it four, rattling the woodwork from 10 yards out. Ofunrein was the first to rebound, but his shot was saved by the keeper.

70' Willoughby's first career brace was capped off by a rebounded finish from the Denver striker. Dylan Akau made line-splitting run down the right side of the box before feeding it to Willoughby. Willoughby's first attempt was blocked in front, but the forward knocked the rebound into the open net for his second of the day and Denver's fourth of the afternoon.

83' Luke Schultz got in-behind the St. Thomas defense and had a go for a Denver fifth, but his chip went over the bar.

84' Senior Iain Magruder made his second career appearance, coming on for Bassett.

TOP-10 SINCE 2015

- Denver is 133-46-34 since the start of the 2015 season.
- That record is good for sixth in the country in wins during that span, behind Wake Forest (158), Indiana (152), Clemson (149), Georgetown (142), Stanford (138).
- Of the 27 teams that had at least 100 wins in that span entering the year, Denver has the seventh-fewest losses at 46.
- Six of Denver's opponents are among the 27 that began the year with 100 wins since the start of the 2015 season.

LIMITING CHANCES

- Denver has held opponents to two shots or less 13 times in its DI era.
- The Pioneers have held opponents without a shot on goal 24 times in their Division I history, including three times during the 2023 season, once in 2024 and at Pittsburgh on October 14 this season.
- Denver's defense enters Sunday evening's match on a 252 minute shutout streak, having allowed just 10 shots on goal in the last four matches.
- Denver held St. Thomas to just one shot, and no shots on goal in the match in Minnesota on Oct. 26, 2024.
- The Pioneers held [14] Indiana to just two shots on goal in the NCAA Round of 16 win on November 30, both of which came in the final 15.

LEAVING IT LATE AT NO. 14 GEORGETOWN

- Luke Schultz scored on a free kick at 89:44 to complete Denver's comeback at No. 14 Georgetown, sending the Pios past the Hoyas 2-1 in the nation's capital on October 7.
- With 16 seconds on the clock, the Schultz game-winner is tied for the fourth-latest goal in regulation in program history, and is the latest game-winner in Denver's DI era.
- The win was Denver's first against a top-25 opponent this season.
- It was also the first win after conceding the first goal since September 14, 2024 against Yale (Denver won 4-1).
- The goal was the first game-winner in the final five minutes since Ian Smith scored an 86th-minute winner at Grand Canyon in August, 2022.

SPREADING THE SCORING

- When Dylan Akau scored Denver's 10th goal of the season in the first half of its September 14 match vs. Mercer, the Pioneers had 10 different players score its first 10 goals of the campaign.
- 10 unique goal scorers entered the week (matches thru 9/14) tied for the fourth-most in the country in 2025.
- Grant Lund became Denver's 11th unique goal scorer in the fourth minute on November 1 vs. Oral Roberts.
- Kyle McGowan was the first Pioneer to score twice this season and on September 19 became the first to three.
- McGowan scored in three-straight matches from September 8-19, Denver's first player to score in three matches since teammate Holger Olsson did it in November, 2022.
- Denver has six multi-goal scorers this year, led by McGowan's seven.
- Denver had 14 different goal scorers all of last season.

DENVER – The [RV/-] University of Denver men’s soccer program nailed down its second-consecutive 2-0 win, this one at home over Oral Roberts on Senior Saturday at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium.

Following the match on Saturday, Denver honored four seniors in: Dylan Akau, Isaac Nehme, Gabe Schwartz and Aidan Semelsberger.

Denver improved to 114-23-19 at the University of Denver Soccer Stadium since it opened in 2009, including 104-14-13 in their home stadium since Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men’s Soccer Coach Jamie Franks joined the staff in 2012.

The Pioneers improved to 64-9-9 in Summit League regular season play, including 55-7-8 since Franks took over as head coach in 2015.

With one more win on Wednesday at St. Thomas, Denver would earn its 11th Summit League regular season title in 13 seasons.

Denver improved to and will finish the regular season 7-7-1 against teams that finished in the top-100 of the RPI a year ago.

The Pioneers moved to 25th in the RPI with the victory on Saturday.

Grant Lund’s header in the opening five minutes was the first of his career.

Lund’s goal was Denver’s seventh off a set piece this season, and its third directly off a corner.

Jake Smith played the corner to setup Lund’s breakthrough, his first assist of the season and the fourth of his career.

Kyle McGowan netted his third goal in the last two matches, his seventh of the season and the 10th of his career. The goal is also McGowan’s fourth in Summit League matches this season.

The cleansheet was the Pioneers fourth shutout in their last five matches, after having just one in the opening 12 competitions.

Isaac Nehme’s career shutout record for Denver now sits at 34. Nehme’s record win total moved up to 49 after Saturday’s match.

Nehme and Trevor Wright made their 80th career starts on Saturday, tying for second in program history and three behind the record held by Scott DeVoss (2015-18).

Dylan Akau made his 82nd career appearance on Saturday to move into sixth on Denver’s Division I list.

First Half:

4’ Bryce Willoughby earned Denver its first set piece of the match. Jake Smith played the corner from right next to the home bench, and picked out the authoritative run of Grant Lund who gave the keeper no chance with a thundering header.

19’ Willoughby created Denver’s second opportunity of the half as well. Kyle McGowan dribbled in the middle of the field before spraying the ball out to the run of Willoughby. The Denver redshirt-junior got the ball to his left and hit it hard and low, a shot the ORU keeper didn’t handle cleanly but was able to get on the rebound quickly.

23’ McGowan earned Denver its second corner of the afternoon when he had a hit from the top of the box that was blocked in-front and saved by the keeper, who pushed it in behind for a corner.

35’ Will King got on the end of a quickly-taken corner kick service from Smith, hitting a high-floating header to the far post that was cleared off the line by a ORU defender.

Denver outshot Oral Roberts 8-1 and had a 5-0 edge in corners in the opening 45 minutes.

Second Half:

61’ McGowan kept his hot run of form going, backing up his brace last week with his seventh of the campaign. With Denver in the press, McGowan pick-pocketed the ORU back line and took three touches to setup his strike from the top of the box.

81’ Denver continued to build on the pressure despite the two-goal lead, and Willoughby got a feed from Schultz before nearly making it 3-0 from the top of the box. Joao Mesquita made the save.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF SET PIECES

- The Pioneers outscored their opponents 3-0 off set pieces in the 2024 NCAA Tournament en-route to the College Cup
- Last season, Denver held a 12-8 edge in goals off set pieces.
- This season, DU's opponents have outscored them 9-7 off set pieces.
- Both of Denver's goals in its 2-1 win at No. 14 Georgetown on October 7 came off set-pieces, including a 90th-minute winner from Luke Schultz off a 22-yard free kick.
- Will King's 5th minute goal vs. San Diego off a corner was Denver's fastest goal to start a match since Oje Ofunrein scored 3:08 in to the 2023 Summit League Semifinal against Kansas City.

RECORD BOOK WATCH

- **Career Shutouts:** Isaac Nehme broke the career shutouts record in the Pios 2024 NCAA Second Round win with his 27th, and now has 34.
- **Career Goalkeeper Wins:** Isaac Nehme broke the career goalkeeper wins record on August 31 vs. SIUE (2-1), capturing his 43rd victory to pass Nick Gardner (2014-18). Nehme now has 49.
- **Career Saves:** Isaac Nehme has 178 career saves to sit fourth in Denver's DI history in career saves. Nehme is 12 saves behind Parker Jarvis (1999-01) for third on the list.
- **Career Matches Started:** Isaac Nehme and Trevor Wright enter Wednesday having made 80 career starts. With a start Wednesday, the Pioneer duo will sit together in a tie for second, two behind the record held by Scott DeVoss (2015-18 | 83).
- **Career Matches Played:** With his next appearance, Dylan Akau will move into a tie for second in program history at 83. On October 19, Akau became just the eighth Pioneer in program history to reach 80 career appearances. Wright and Nehme's next appearance will tie them with Destan Norman (2017-21) for seventh in DU's DI history.

KELLY RETURNS FROM NEW ZEALAND U-20 WORLD CUP TEAM IN CHILE

- Sophomore Keegan Kelly was named to the New Zealand U-20 National Team squad on September 11 for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup.
- Kelly returned to the Pioneers, and made an appearance off the bench in Denver's 2-1 win at No. 14 Georgetown on October 8 after missing four matches on international duty.
- New Zealand's group stage matches were Sept. 27 vs. Chile (L, 2-1), Sept. 30 vs. Egypt (W, 2-1) and Oct. 3 vs. Japan (L, 0-3). Kelly was in the Starting XI in all three matches.
- Kelly scored four goals and had three assists in 21 matches in his freshman season, including goals in back-to-back NCAA Tournament matches against Gardner-Webb and Indiana - the first Pioneer to score in back-to-back postseason games in program history.
- Kelly is one of two Pioneers to ever play in the U20 World Cup (Sam Garza- U.S.- 2009).

DENVER ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT SUCCESS

- The Denver athletic department has combined to win 35 national championships, with the last one coming in April, 2024 when Denver Hockey lifted its NCAA-record 10th.
- Denver’s 35 national championships are currently the 14th most by an athletic department in NCAA Division I.
- Last season’s appearance for men’s soccer was the program’s second trip to the College Cup (2016), and the athletic department’s 33rd DI national semifinal in its history, including its 17th since the entire athletic department rejoined Division I in 1998-99.
- The Denver athletic department finished as the top non-football school in the LEARFIELD Directors’ Cup standings for the 12th-straight year in 2024-25, and for the 16th time in the last 17 years.
- Denver finished fourth last season among athletic programs that are outside of the FBS, trailing only Harvard, Princeton and Cornell.
- The Pioneers finished fifth among schools outside the Power-4, trailing only the aforementioned three Ivy League schools and New Mexico.
- Denver finished ahead of 10 Power-4 programs in the overall Directors’ Cup standings.

TOP DRAWER SOCCER PRESEASON TOP-100 PLAYERS

- In Top Drawer Soccer’s Preseason Top-100 Player ratings, Isaac Nehme was ranked the 19th player and the second-best goalkeeper in the preseason rankings, while captain Trevor Wright landed 49th.
- Nehme entered the season with a 41-9-14 record and a 0.82 GAA in 64 career matches.
- Wright played and started in 63 matches entering the season, totaling 18 career points on seven goals and four assists.

- Denver is 4-13-0 against teams ranked in the top-5 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll, including 2-8 in true road games.
- The Pioneers only road win against a top-5 team prior to last season's 1-0 win at No. 5 Stanford came on December 2, 2016 when the fourth-ranked Pioneers beat No. 3 Clemson 1-0 in the NCAA Quarterfinals.
- Denver's last win against a top-5 team prior to last season came in a 3-2 win against No. 3 Washington on August 30, 2018 at DU.
- Denver's first win over a ranked opponent in 2025 came at No. 14 Georgetown on October 7 (GT 1-2 DEN).

DENVER IN THE SUMMIT LEAGUE REGULAR SEASON

- In Summit League regular season play since the Pioneers joined the league in 2013, Denver is 64-9-9.
- Since Jamie Franks took over in 2015, Denver is 55-7-8.

THE FRANKS FOUNDATION

- Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks is in his 11th season as the bench boss and his 14th with the program overall in 2025.
- Franks and his staff were named the 2016 National Coaching Staff of the Year after taking Denver to its first College Cup appearance.
- Franks is 133-46-34 in his time as a head coach, 168-63-42 in his time at Denver overall and 267-90-59 in his time as a player and a coach in college soccer.
- Franks is 9-8-2 in the NCAA Tournament at DU (9-7-1 as HC). As a player and coach, Franks is 25-12-4 in the NCAAs.
- In addition to National Coaching Staff of the Year, Franks is a five-time Summit League Coach of the Year (2015-18, 2023).
- Franks was the youngest head coach in Division I soccer when he was hired in 2015, and the second youngest in 2016 when he took the program to the College Cup.
- Franks led the Pioneers to back-to-back unbeaten regular seasons in his first two years in charge, the first program to go unbeaten in back-to-back regular seasons since Clemson in 1977-78.
- In his first 10 seasons, Denver qualified for the NCAA Tournament nine times and received a bye into the second round four times. Denver has played in the second round now seven times.
- Franks won the national championship as a player with Wake Forest in 2007 in Cary, defeating Ohio State 2-1 in the final.
- Franks made his sixth College Cup appearance combined as a player and coach last season.

DENVER AND THE NEW POWER 4

- Five matches on Denver's season-opening six-match road swing were against the Power-4 in 2024, with the other coming against the deep BIG EAST Conference (Creighton).
- Denver's most wins against the power conferences came in 2016 when the Pios won four against members of the premier conferences. DU has had multiple wins in three seasons, winning three times against the P4 in 2024 and twice in 2022.
- The Pioneers 2-1 win over Cal and 1-0 win over No. 5 Stanford in the season opening weekend last season were Denver's ninth and 10th P4 wins, and its 11th under Franks came against [14] Indiana in the NCAA Round of 16.
- In the second year of the new Power-4, the Pios played four P4 teams in the regular season in 2025.

- The double-digit win season in 2024 was the Pios fourth-straight and the 16th in their DI history.

- Four players entered the season with at least 59 matches played, and 10 made at least 30 career appearances before this season.
- Coming into the campaign, four Pioneers had made at least 40 career starts for Jack and Sheila Weinberg Head Men's Soccer Coach Jamie Franks side.

NEW FACES

- Jamie Franks signed nine freshmen to the 2025 roster who are joined by three redshirt-freshmen from last year to give the Pioneers 12 players with four years of eligibility remaining.
- The true-freshmen class is made up of two players from Colorado, two from Oregon, and one from California, Illinois, Texas and Washington, and an international student-athlete from Norway.

FOUR FIFTH YEARS RETURN

- The Pioneers have four student-athletes playing in their fifth year of college soccer.
- Trevor Wright, who redshirted due to injury in 2023, returns to the center of Franks' defense for the Crimson and Gold in 2025. Wright has played and started 63 matches heading into his final season of college soccer, scoring seven goals and tallying four assists in his first four years with the program.
- Jake Smith redshirted to develop in his freshman campaign of 2021, and has since made 59 appearances and 54 starts in Denver's defensive midfield. Smith had three assists last year for the first points of his career.
- Aidan Semelsberger redshirted in his freshman year of 2021 and did not play in 2022 before combining to make 38 appearances and 14 starts in the Denver midfield in the last two seasons.
- Reserve goalkeeper Gabe Schwartz is in his fifth season with the program after redshirting in 2021.

ALL ACROSS THE COUNTRY

- The 2024 Denver Pioneers have players from 13 different states and three international countries (New Zealand, Norway and Sweden).
- The 13 states are: Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawai'i, Illinois, Minnesota, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, Texas and Washington.
- 13 states represented on a single roster is the most in the program's Division I history, tying the record set last season, which broke the previous record of 12 states on the 2022 roster.

DI HISTORY BY STATE

- Denver has had players from 32 states in its Division I history.
- Including the nine on the 2025 roster, the Pioneers have had 107 Coloradans in the program in their DI era.
- The Pioneers have had double digit players from four states: Colorado (107), Texas (31), Illinois (11), Washington (11).
- Since Franks took over in 2015, the Pios have recruited 32 Coloradans and 12 student-athletes from Texas
- Outside of the United States, the Pios have had players from 12 other countries, including Canada (6), Norway (6) and Sweden (4).

- Jamie Franks has put his program up against the best once again with his 2025 schedule that was announced in July.
- Denver's opponents combined for a 173-99-73 record a year ago, and had an RPI average of 54.5.
