QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 40th year of the Horizon League (1979-80) and the 39th with Detroit Mercy as a member as the Titans are the eldest program in the league. The Titans joined in 1980-81 with the next current HL programs all joining in 1994 in Cleveland State, Green Bay, Milwaukee, UIC and Wright State.

- Detroit Mercy will open league play on the road for just the third time in the last 10 seasons.

- Detroit Mercy has dominated the all-time series, 37-9 advantage, which includes winning 11 in a row, and are also 14-6 all-time on the road claiming nine of their last 10 visits to the Beeghly Center.

- Freshman Antoine Davis - who was featured in an online article by Sports Illustrated in December and is listed as the No. 6 freshman in the country by CBS Sports' Matt Norlander - is third in the nation in scoring at 26.0 points per game.

ALL-TIME SERIES

Detroit Mercy has dominated the all-time series to the tune of a 37-9 advantage, which includes winning 11 in a row.

The Titans are 14-6 all-time on the road against the Penguins and have won nine of their last 10 visits to the Beeghly Center.

THE OHIO TITANS

Detroit Mercy has seen and will continue to see a lot of Ohio in this six-week span as the game is in the midst of a nine-game swing against teams from the Buckeye State.

The Titans are 280-225 (.560) all-time against programs that reside in the state of Ohio.

LAST TIME OUT

Freshman Antoine Davis scored a team-high 19 points, graduate student Derrien King added 13 points and a team and career-high eight rebounds as Detroit Mercy fell to Xavier, 69-55, last Friday night.

Senior Josh McFolley led the Titans in assists with six and posted a game-high four steals.

Detroit Mercy and Xavier traded baskets for most of the first half, but a 10-0 run gave the Titans' their first lead of the contest, 24-23, with 4:36 remaining until halftime.

Despite taking the loss, the red, white and blue kept things close in their final tune-up before Horizon League play.

Freshman Chris Brandon and senior Gerald Blackshear Jr. each had six rebounds for the Titans. Four of Brandon's came on the offensive end, as Detroit Mercy edged Xavier 16-12 in offensive rebounds.

TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

Detroit Mercy's basketball non-conference schedule was one of the toughest in the country with nine road games and teams posting a 90-53 (62.9%) record so far. Nine of the 12 teams have winning records and one is .500 on the season.

The schedule was featured as the 14th hardest by ESPN's BPI standard in a recent article released on Dec. 17.

In total, the Titans' 12 non-conference opponents posted a 213-182 record (53.9%) last season, and four teams making the postseason with NCAA appearances by Butler and Xavier, a NIT team in Temple and one CIT opponent in Eastern Michigan.

HORIZON LEAGUE ROAD HISTORY

The Titans are 15-23 all-time in Horizon League openers and 11-27 in Horizon League road openers.

Detroit Mercy has dropped five-straight HL road openers with its last win coming in 2012-13, a 101-60 victory at Youngstown State.

No interviews will be granted on game days. In addition, the Titan locker room, training room and weight room are off limits to all media personnel, unless special permission has been granted through the SID and the men's basketball office.

13 POSTSEASON APPEARANCES

113 YEARS OF TITAN BASKETBALL

This season is the 113th year of collegiate basketball at the University of Detroit Mercy - the oldest Division I program in the state - as the Tigers - yes, Tigers as they were called back then - beat Collegiate, 18-7, in the first official Detroit basketball game in 1905.

Until 1919, the U-D teams were known as the Tigers. In the fall of 1919, Detroit Free Press' sportswriter Stan Brink, who was covering football for the paper, thought that a good nickname for the team would be the Titans.

In Greek mythology, the Titans were a class of oversized people who happened to have almost perfect physiques.

In its 113 years (two years records are missing in 1907-08 and 1908-09) Detroit Mercy is 1,401-1190 (.543) with two regular-season HL Championships (1998, 1999) and three tournament titles (1994, 1999, 2012).

Detroit Mercy has also made six NCAA tournaments (1962, 1977, 1979, 1998, 1999, 2012) and seven NIT appearances (1960, 1961, 1965, 1978, 2001, 2002, 2013).

FAMILY FUN

Nothing new for the Titans to have a family connection in the program and this season, Detroit Mercy will feature three Davis' in head coach Mike Davis, assistant coach Mike Davis Jr. and freshman guard Antoine Davis.

From 2010-13, the Titans had head coach Ray McCallum and star guard Ray McCallum winning the Horizon League Championship in 2012 and earning a trip to the NIT in 2013.

AD GETTING BUCKETS

Freshman Antoine Davis led the team for the 12-straight game - every game this season - finishing with 19 points at Xavier.

He now has eight 20-point games, five 30+ performances and the 42-point barrage in his first 12 collegiate games.

To start the year, he posted eight-straight 20-point games, the first Titan to have eight-straight games with 20 or more since Willie Green's 10 in a row in 2002-03.

His five 30-point games on the season are the most since Green had five in 2003 and another would be the most since Tony Tolbert's six in 1993-94.

Green was just in town on Dec. 2 as he is an assistant coach with the Golden State Warriors as they held a practice at Calihan Hall.

DAVIS AMONG NATION'S LEADERS

Freshman Antoine Davis - three-time HL Freshman of the Week - comes into the contest leading the nation in one national category

and among the leaders in a few others..

Davis is third in the nation in scoring at 26.0 points per game.

His 60, three-pointers top the country and he is third in three-pointers per game (5.00), sixth in total points (312) and eighth in total field goals (109).

Davis is also second in the Horizon League and 80th in three-point field goal percentage (41.1%), third in the HL and 85th overall in free throw percentage (84.0%) and leading the conference and 11th in the country in minutes per game (37:10).

WE GOT OUR CURRY

It was a long road for junior Harrison Curry to get back on the court, but he has added a scoring punch for the Titans.

He scored 16 points with three rebounds and two blocks in 27 minutes of action, getting a start in just his second collegiate game - first as a Titan at Toledo.

He then had 12 points with four rebounds, a block and a steal against Ohio.

After playing just one game at Louisiana Tech last year before an injury in the season opener forced him to miss the year, he transferred to Detroit Mercy and applied for a waiver to play immediately.

He missed the first nine games this year before it was approved by the NCAA.

LET IT FLY

Detroit Mercy has started the season on fire from the outside as it is fourth in the Horizon League with 9.8 triples per game, 32nd in the country, while ranking fourth in the HL and 88th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (36.6).

The Titans have nailed 117 treys on the year, tying a school record with 17 against Loyola Maryland and then connecting on 15 versus Bowling Green and at Eastern Michigan.

The 117, 3-pointers are 37th in the nation.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Detroit Mercy has seen its offense struggle of late, but not because it is turning it over.

The Titans lead the Horizon League and are 27th in Division I committing just 11.2 per game.

They have five games on the season with less than 10 turnovers and after turning it over a season-high 19 times at Temple and following that up with 18 at Butler, Detroit Mercy has just 88 in their last nine games (9.8 per game).

EIGHT POSTSEASON WINS

BRANDON SHOWING OFF

Freshman Chris Brandon had five points and four rebounds in the season opener, but he earned his first collegiate start at Temple and had a stellar game

Brandon finished 7-of-9 from the floor with a team-high nine rebounds and had some nice buckets off his four offensive caroms and came away with two blocks.

The nine rebounds are the most by a true freshman since teammate Gerald Blackshear Jr. had 10 at Cleveland State in 2016.

He tied his season high with nine boards and scored six points against Ohio and grabbed six more caroms on the road at Xavier.

He also put together a 12-point, six-rebound game against Kent State, where he was 6-for-6 from the field. At one point in the first half, he scored eight-straight points for the Titans, using his athleticism to corral two offensive boards for tip-ins during the spurt.

He posted a season-high three blocks against Bowling Green in just nine minutes and had five rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block at Eastern Michigan.

On the season, he is 20-of-32 (62.5%) from the field and averaging a team-high 4.8 boards and 0.9 blocks per game.

OH LORDY HE WENT FOR 40

Antoine Davis set the Titan freshman with 42 points in the win over Loyola Maryland.

The 42 points are the most by a Titan since Willie Green had 43 at UIC in 2003 and tied for

the eighth most in school history as well as the seventh most by a player in NCAA DI this year.

Davis was 14-of-21 from the field and 10-of-14 from the outside to go with five assists, three rebounds and two steals. The 10 treys tied him with Desmond Ferguson, who had 10 against Milwaukee in 2000.

The freshman record was 33 points by Corey Allen against Fort Wayne in 2016.

WHAT A DEBUT

Freshman Antoine Davis had a collegiate debut to remember as he netted a team-high 32 points at Western Michigan.

He scored the team's first points and ended the contest 12-of-26 from the field and 6-of-14 from behind the arc.

The 32-point outing was the most ever by a Titan true freshman in his debut game - and one off the Titan freshman record of 33 points that he would eventually break - and the second most ever by a Titan in their collegiate debut behind only junior college transfer Spencer Haywood's 36 he tallied against Aquinas in 1968, a game that was called with 6 1/2 minutes left after he broke the backboard with a dunk and the Titans up 105-40.

THE ENCORE

After going for 32 at Western Michigan, freshman Antoine Davis became the first freshman in school history to post back-to-back 30-point games as he scored a team-high 30 at Temple.

Davis was 11-of-21 from the field and 6-of-13 from behind the arc.

He reached 30 points for the second-straight game, the first Titan to record back-to-back 30's since Jon Goode did it during the 2007-08 season with 30 at Loyola and 35 at UIC.

GETTING THE D BACK

The Titan defense was a big reason it won three in a row and nearly had a fourth against Kent State.

Detroit Mercy held KSU to 37.1 percent shooting - 28.1 percent in the second half - and just 10-of-31 from the outside with 14 turnovers in the tough 78-74 setback.

Detroit Mercy forced Loyola Maryland to 36.5 percent shooting from the field and 5-of-25 from behind the arc with 14 turnovers before slowing down Bowling Green to 36.5 percent shooting and 5-of-23 from the outside with 11 miscues.

At Eastern Michigan, EMU shot 41.8 percent but just 6-of-27 (22.2%) from behind the arc.

ZONE PRINCIPLES

The Titans have used a zone defense this year and they have frustrated teams at times trying to shoot the three ball as they are 157th overall holding teams to just 33.0 percent from behind the arc.

Last year, the Titans ended the season ranked 333rd in three-point field goal percentage defense (39.7%).

TAKE IT AWAY

Detroit Mercy is second in the Horizon League and 54th in the country with 8.1 steals per game.

The Titans posted a season-high 12 steals against Ohio and had 11 versus Kent State and its last time out at Xavier.

A lot of that is due to the Horizon League's leading burglar in senior Josh McFolley as he tops the conference and is 35th in the nation with 2.17 steals per game.

1,183 & COUNTING

Senior Josh McFolley became the 42nd Titan in school history to reach 1,000 last year and he did so in dramatic fashion scoring Detroit Mercy's first 12 points and ending with a career-high 34 against Green Bay in the regular season finale.

With his nine points at Xavier, he now has 1,183 points, 27th in school history, just five in back of Frank Russell for 26th place.

PICKING YOUR POCKET

Senior Josh McFolley has been a thief for all of his Titan career and came away with four steals against at Xavier, matching his season high that he had at Temple and against Kent State.

He now has 26 steals on the year and is leading the Horizon League and is 35th in the nation with 2.17 steals per game.

The 172 thefts in his career is fifth in school history, just three behind Ray McCallum.

He led the team and was tied for second in the Horizon League with 1.5 steals per game last year as his 49 steals was the second most in the league.

Had also had six games with at least three steals last season, including a career-best six steals against UIC, where he also scored 30 points.

In his career, he has recorded a steal in 79 of his 105 career games, including 39 multi-steal contests and 21 with at least three takeaways.

McFOLLEY FOR 3

Josh McFolley connected on a 3-pointer in 25 of the Titans' 32 games last year, including a season-high six in the regular season finale against Green Bay.

He has brought those sharp shooting to his senior, showcased by his 6-of-10 performance

at Eastern Michigan.

He now has 189 career 3-pointers, sixth in school history, 13 away from the fifth spot.

JOSH SAVING HIS BEST FOR LAST

Senior Josh McFolley scored a season-high 20 points - his 12th career 20-point game - hitting 6-of-12 from three and registering six rebounds and six assists at Eastern Michigan.

He is averaging 12.1 points - 18th in the HL - 3.1 assists and 2.8 rebounds, while shooting 38.3 percent overall and a career-high 35.5 percent from three.

McFolley started the season scoring in double figures in six-straight games - 11 straight dating back to last year - but saw that streak end as he had two points against Kent State.

He had 19 points with a season-high seven rebounds off the bench at Akron and just tallied nine points and tied his season high for the third time this year with six assists at Xavier.

KING ME

Graduate senior Derrien King has come tallying double digits in scoring in five of the last nine contests and is coming off a 13-point and career-high eight rebounds at Xavier.

He scored 13 points with six rebounds against Kent State, hitting a big three with just over six minutes to go as the Titans took the lead and built an eight-point advantage against the Golden Flashes.

He was named to the Legends Classic Subregional All-Tournament Team after recording 15.5 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists, while nailing eight triples in wins over Loyola Maryland and Bowling Green.

He had 14 points and a career-tying seven rebounds in the title game versus BGSU and that was after scoring a season-high 17 points - hitting four 3-pointers - with four rebounds, two assists a steal and a block.

The 17 points was the second most in his career behind the 22 he registered as a junior while at Washington State against Montana State in 2016.

He started coming into his own at Butler netting 10 points on 4-of-8 shooting.

BLOCK PARTY

The Titans swatted away eight shots against Bowling Green, the most since they had 10 against NKU in 2016.

Six Detroit Mercy players had a rejection, led by freshman Chris Brandon's three in just nine minutes of action.

HAMRICK TIME

Junior Lamar Hamrick made his Division I debut in the season opener at Western Michigan and had 13 points - 10 in the second half - to go with a team-high four steals.

Against Loyola Maryland, he scored five points and grabbed six rebounds with two blocks and a steal and just pulled down a team and season-high nine boards with four assists and three points against Kent State.

He hit three from distance and finished with nine points and four boards at Akron and had a season-high 16 points at Dayton with three steals.

G CRASHING THE GLASS

Senior Gerald Blackshear Jr. had some early foul trouble against Western Michigan, but he showed just how important he is registering eight points and a team-high 10 rebounds in just 23 minutes of court time.

The 10 rebounds are the most since he pulled down a career-best 11 boards at Cleveland State as a sophomore.

He compiled six points, a team-high seven rebounds and two steals at Butler, a team-high nine boards in the win against Loyola Maryland and eight points with six boards at Xavier.

He is second on the team with 4.3 rebounds per game.

DAVIS WIN #1 A BIG VICTORY

Detroit Mercy's 91-63 victory over Loyola Maryland was not only the first Titan win for head coach Mike Davis, but the 28-point margin was the most by the Titans over a Division I school since they downed Florida Atlantic, 77-44, at home on Nov. 22, 2012.

TITANS INK JAMAIL PINK

Detroit Mercy head coach Mike Davis went back to some familiar territory to start off his 2018-19 recruiting class as Jamail Pink (Houston, Tex./Clear Lake) signed a NLI.

"Jamail is a good point guard who is smart and a hard worker," said head coach Mike Davis. "He has a great work ethic and we are excited to have him here at Detroit Mercy."

The 6-1, 170-pound point guard averaged 10.2 points, 4.3 assists, 2.6 rebounds and 1.0 steals as a junior, helping his team post a 31-6 record and was among the top 10 in the state.

This summer, he played AAU on Team Harden and tallied 10.1 points and 4.0 assists.

Pink was a 2-star recruit according to Verbal Commits and was ranked No. 33 in the state by MaxPreps.

Detroit Mercy won the Legends Classic Subregional with victories over Loyola Maryland and Bowling Green on Nov. 19-20.

MAKE SURE TO SEE US IN DETROIT

The Titans' 13 home games are the fewest since they had 12 in 2008-09 under then first-year coach Ray McCallum.

The four non-conference home games are also the fewest since that season when the red, white and blue had just three.

ALL-AROUND TITANS

Detroit Mercy's roster has 17 total players - 13 new - and the roster features players from 10 states and two countries in Georgia and Newfoundland.

The team has players covering four time zones from the eastern standard in Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Indiana, and of course Michigan, central time in Alabama, Kansas, Texas and Wisconsin, mountain time in New Mexico and the pacific in California.

WHO IS THAT?

Detroit Mercy will bolster one of the highest groups of newcomers in the nation at 13 (14 if you count walk-on Musial Gjysma who redshirted last season).

Among Division I teams with the highest number of newcomers are Tennessee Chattanooga and Duquesne at 13, while Florida Atlantic and Wichita State welcome 12.

COMING BACK

Just four players return from last year's team and only three of those saw the court totaling 1,496 minutes in senior Josh McFolley (804), senior Gerald Blackshear Jr. (191) and junior Cole Long (501).

The 1,496 minutes represents just 23.2 percent of the total minutes returning.

The three players also posted 521 combined points (McFolley-354, Long-115, Blackshear Jr.-

52), which is just 20.7 percent of the returning offense from last year.

FOLLOWING HIS DAD

The Davis family has always been close and when it came time to play college basketball, they both chose to play for their dad.

Assistant coach Mike Davis Jr. played for his dad at both Indiana and UAB and Titan freshman guard Antoine Davis chose to come to Detroit Mercy.

Antoine originally committed to Kelvin Sampson at Houston as a senior in high school, but changed that to Texas Southern in the spring and then followed his dad to the Titans.

He was a 3-star recruit by ESPN and Rivals and was also ranked 28th in the region and 20th in the state of Texas and the 15th best recruit in the Houston area for the Class of 2018 by the Houston Chronicle

As a senior with the Homeschool Christian Youth Association in Houston, he led his team with 23.0 points per game

He played AAU on the Nike EYBL Summer Circuit with Houston Hoops in 2017 and averaged 13.3 points and 2.3 rebounds.

BASKETBALL FAMILY

Freshman Chris Brandon is another player that head coach Mike Davis knows well as he is from Houston, Texas.

Brandon is the nephew of former NBA player and head coach John Lucas and cousins to former NBA player John Lucas and former Texas standout Jai Lucas.

Brandon was First Team All-District in 2016, 2017 and 2018 and averaged 10.0 points and 6.0 rebounds per game as a senior.

He also helped his team to a top-five ranking in the state in the last two years.

HOLLAND, KING LOOKING TO BRING SENIOR LEADERSHIP

The Titans have two graduate seniors on the roster in Jacob Holland and Derrien King.

Holland spent last year at New Mexico Highlands University, where he started all 25 games he appeared in and led New Mexico University in scoring at 14.7 points per game to go with 2.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists

His college career has also seen him play at Fresno State.

Holland's dad played football at New Mexico University and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2008 and he is also engaged to a former Fresno State softball player.

King was at Angelo State last season, but did not play after transferring from Washington St.

At WSU, he played all of his sophomore year and nine games as a junior before transferring

CURRY BACK IN MICHIGAN

Junior Harrison Curry is back in his home state after leaving Michigan as a senior to attend prep school in South Carolina.

Last year, he was at Louisiana Tech, but only played in the season opener before a knee injury ended his season.

Curry was ranked the No. 45 best junior college player in the country in 2017 at Pensacola State College after averaging double figures in both of his seasons, including a team-high 14.5 points and 6.3 rebounds per game as a sophomore.

He played his senior year of high school at Legacy Charter School in South Carolina and tallied a double-double with 15.7 points and 10.1 rebounds per game and was named the Offensive MVP and Male Athlete of the Year.

Curry's dad - the late Rodney Curry - played collegiate basketball at Western Michigan.

3 HL CHAMPIONSHIPS

GIVING BACK

Detroit Mercy hosted Wayne State on Nov. 3 in the Third Annual City College Series.

This year was even bigger as the men's and women's basketball teams hosted Wayne State in the charity exhibition contest.

The Titans once again partnered with Michigan First Credit Union and the Detroit Sports Commission in benefiting Detroit Public Schools (DPS), grades K-5. All proceeds from the \$2 ticket sales were donated to Detroit Public Schools to provide financial assistance for the district's K-5 classrooms with Michigan First contributing a matching donation for all tickets sold.

With over over 1,500 people in attendance, the game raised over \$6,000 for DPS with Michigan First Credit Unions matching donation and has now raised over \$20,000 in the three years of the event.

HORIZON LEAGUE BACK ON ESPN

Continuing its longstanding and innovative relationship with ESPN, the Horizon League will stream nearly 300 events over its digital streaming services this winter on ESPN+ and ESPN3, including women's basketball and men's basketball regular season and championship contests.

ESPN+, which will carry the early rounds of the Horizon League women's basketball and men's basketball championships offers fans thousands of live events, on-demand content and original programming not available on ESPN's linear TV or other digital networks. Fans can subscribe to ESPN+ for just \$4.99 a month (or \$49.99 per year) and cancel at any time. Additionally, the swimming and diving and indoor track and field championships will be featured on ESPN3.

Detroit Mercy men's and women's home basketball games will have 24 games on ESPN3 or ESPN+ with 11 of the 13 Titan games on the ESPN platform and all 13 women's contests. Nine of the 11 home men's games will be on ESPN+ as will eight of the 13 women's games at Calihan Hall.

Last year, Horizon League institutions produced over 600 live events, providing major visibility and highlighting the league's 2,700 student-athletes. The Horizon League and ESPN+ showcased the league's spring championships shortly after the platform's launch in the spring. Additionally, three member institutions – Oakland, UIC and Wright State – aired regular-season baseball content through the service.

Launched in April of 2018, ESPN+ is an integrated part of a completely redesigned

DETROIT MERCY HITS 90 PERCENT IN LATEST NCAA GSR REPORT

Make it 14 straight years of academic success and recognition as Detroit Mercy's student-athletes academic success was praised in the latest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Federal Graduation Rate (FGR).

For the 14th-straight year, Detroit Mercy ranked among the top-five in the state – second overall – with a GSR of 90-percent, the second-straight year the Titans have reached that mark. The 90-percent mark trailed only Michigan's 93-percent. The 90-percent GSR was also third in the Horizon League.

The Graduation Rates Institution Report gives graduation information about the most recent six-year graduating class of students and student-athletes who entered as freshmen in 2011-12.

For the Federal Graduation Rate, Detroit Mercy ranked third in the state at 71-percent, trailing only Michigan's 81-percent and Michigan State's 75-percent. Detroit Mercy was also tied for second in the Horizon League in that report.

Overall, more Division I student-athletes than ever are earning their degrees, according to new Graduation Success Rate data as the most recent rate is 88 percent, a record high and an increase of 1 percentage point from 2017 numbers.

TITANS ONCE AGAIN HIGH ABOVE NATIONAL APR STANDARDS

The University of Detroit Mercy Department of Athletics showcased another tremendous period of academic greatness as the Titans were once again above the national threshold in the latest NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) report.

All 19 Titan teams posted multi-year scores above the 930 NCAA qualifying mark for the sixth straight year, with one program at a perfect 1,000, three above 990 and nine above 980 in the latest 2016-17 data.

The APR, created to be a more real-time measurement of academic success than graduation rates, is a team-based metric through which scholarship student-athletes

each term earn 1 point for remaining eligible and 1 point for staying in school or graduating. At schools that don't offer scholarships, recruited student-athletes are tracked.

DETROIT MERCY RANKED TOP 25

For the 18th consecutive year, Detroit Mercy is listed in the top tier of Midwest Best Regional Universities in the 2019 edition of the U.S. News & World Report's "Best Colleges."

Detroit Mercy ranked No. 25 for Midwest Best Regional Universities and is one of two universities in Michigan to be listed in the top 25.

In addition to the University's No. 25 ranking, Detroit Mercy earned a No. 17 rank for Best Colleges for Veterans in the Midwest Region and is ranked No. 35 nationally for Best Value Schools. Detroit Mercy also had a strong retention rate. In 2017, first-to second-year retention was 86.8 percent; and over the past four years, the retention rate has averaged 84 percent.

This year, Detroit Mercy has its fourth consecutive freshman class increase, with 587 students compared with 550 in 2017. It is also the largest freshman class since 2009 and the University's second largest class in 24 years.

WILLIE GREEN NOW COACHING IN NBA

Willie Green, who starred as a Titan from 1999-2003, was named an assistant coach for the Golden State Warriors in 2016-17, helping the team win to NBA Championships.

Green was a part of four winning seasons, including a pair of 20-win campaigns and postseason appearances. As a sophomore, Green helped Detroit Mercy reach the semifinals of the NIT knocking out Bradley, Connecticut and Dayton as the Titans made their way to Madison Square Garden. Detroit Mercy would end the year tying a school record with 25 wins.

Green is still fourth all-time in scoring with 1,779 points, which includes 678 points as a senior, ninth in the Titan record book. As a senior, he was an AP Honorable Mention All-American and the Horizon League Player of the Year after averaging a league-best 22.6 points per game, 12th in school history.

He was selected in the second round (41st) in the 2003 NBA Draft by the Seattle SuperSonics and later traded to the 76ers. He would play seven of his 12 NBA seasons with Philadelphia, averaging a career-high 12.4 points in 2007-08 and 11.3 points in 2006-07.

He finished his career playing in 731 games tallying 8.3 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists.

COACH DAVIS ANNOUNCES COACHING STAFF

Experience in the system and experience on the collegiate level will be all over the Titan sidelines for head coach Mike Davis.

Mike Davis Jr.

Someone who knows coach Davis more than anyone, Mike Davis Jr. learned the game from his dad and not only played under him at Indiana and UAB, but has been on the sidelines with him for six years.

Davis Jr. served as an assistant coach for the last six years at Texas Southern, where the Davis duo built the Tigers into a perennial power in the SWAC and a staple in the postseason.

During his six seasons, Texas Southern won four regular season and conference tournament championships and appeared in four NCAA Tournaments with one NIT bid. In 2018, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game, defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four match-up.

His first collegiate coaching job was at Chipola Junior College in 2011-12. Prior to that, he worked on the AAU circuit with the Alabama Ice as an assistant coach from 2010-12.

Davis Jr. played collegiate basketball at Blackhawk Community College, Indiana and UAB, and saw action in 76 games at the Division I level.

Tracy Dildy

No stranger to the Midwest, Horizon League or coach Davis, Tracy Dildy worked with coach Davis at UAB in 2006-07 and also has coaching stops at Mississippi, Auburn, DePaul and Ball State before his recent assignment as head coach at Chicago State.

He was the head coach at Chicago State from 2010-2018 and also served as the athletic director in his final season. He guided the Cougars to their first-ever Division I postseason appearance as the team won the

Great West Conference and earned a bid to the CIT in 2013.

He was named the top mid-major assistant by Hoop Scoop in 2008, one of the top 25 mid-major assistant by CollegeInsider.com in 2009 and one of Hoop Scoop's top 50 mid-major assistants in Basketball Times when he was at UIC from 2007-10.

He helped assemble a nationally-ranked recruiting class for the 2005-06 season at Mississippi that was rated as high as third by numerous recruiting publications and earned a spot on Rivals.com's list of the Top 25 recruiters in the nation in June 2005.

At DePaul from 1997-2002, he worked as an assistant coach, the associate head coach and even served as an acting head for a period in 2001 and helped the Blue Demons advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT in 2001 and reached the second round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament. He spearheaded four huge recruiting classes for DePaul which included the nation's top-ranked class in 2001 and the second-best class in the country in 1999, in addition to signing future NBA players Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons, Steven Hunter and Eddy Curry.

Keith LeGree

A two-sport start in college and a veteran in the coaching ranks, LeGree has been an assistant coach at the Division I level for over 10 years and has almost 20 years of coaching experience under his belt.

LeGree and coach Davis know each other well as he spent the last six seasons (2012-18) on staff at Texas Southern. He helped the program win four regular-season titles and four conference tournament championships along with advancing to five postseason tournaments, including four trips to the NCAA's.

He also has coaching stops at Chipola Junior College, Alabama Southern Community College and at his alma mater Cincinnati.

EIGHT POSTSEASON WINS

LeGree was on staff under his college coach Bob Huggins at UC from 2000-05, helping the Bearcats to 123 wins, with a school record 31 in 2001-02, and five trips to the NCAA Tournament, including the Sweet 16 in 2000-01.

LeGree was a standout student-athlete on the hardwood at Cincinnati and Louisville and also played professional baseball, parlaying that into a seven-year playing career in the minor leagues and reaching the Triple A level before he entered the coaching profession.

Eric Devendorf

A basketball prodigy from Bay City, Michigan, who went on to an outstanding collegiate career at Syracuse before embarking on a seven-year professional career overseas and in the NBA D-League, Eric Devendorf will fill the role of Special Assistant to the Head Coach.

Devendorf comes to the Motor City after spending the last two years at his alma mater as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for the basketball team as well as a mentor to the Orange guards.

His stops overseas included playing in the Ukraine, Israel, Greece and New Zealand. In 2010, he helped the Wellington Saints in the New Zealand NBL win a championship and he also led the league in scoring. He also played in the NBA D-League with the Reno Bighorns in 2009-10 and the Idaho Stampede in 2011-12.

In college, he starred for Syracuse from 2005-09 and tallied 1,680 career points, 14th in school history. In 116 career games, he averaged 14.3 points and is fourth in career 3-point baskets at Syracuse with 208, sixth in three-point attempts (550) and fifth in three-point percentage (.378). He also accumulated 372 assists, 170 steals and shot 43.8 percent from the field and 79.5 percent at the free throw line.

Broadcasting Hall of Fame,

Vitale joined ESPN during the 1979-80 season -- just after the network's September 1979 launch -- following a successful college and pro coaching career. Vitale called ESPN's first-ever NCAA basketball game -- Wisconsin at DePaul on Dec. 5, 1979 (a 90-77 DePaul win). Since then, he's called close to a thousand games, including NBA contests for ESPN during the 1983 and '84 seasons.

He was the head coach at the University from 1973-77 tallying a 78-30 record with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 1977.

He recruited the likes of John Long, Terry Tyler, Terry Duerod and Wilbert McCormick and turned Calihan Hall into one of the most visited venues in college basketball in the late 70's.

He went 17-9 in each of his first two seasons and posted a 19-8 mark in 1975-76. In his final year as a head coach, the Titans touched the competition going 25-4, including a 21-game winning streak, and earning a bid to the NCAA Tournament. They would defeat Middle Tennessee State, 93-76, for the school's first-

ever victory in the NCAA Tournament and then took on a powerful Michigan squad, dropping an 86-81 decision.

Vitale has now been selected for 10 halls of fame in his career.

The University of Detroit Mercy has been named a tournament host for 2021 NCAA men's basketball first and second round tournament games as well as selected as the host institution for the 2020 NCAA Women's Bowling Championship and the 2020 NCAA Men's & Women's Fencing Championships.

Detroit Mercy, in partnership with Olympia Entertainment and the Detroit Sports Commission hosted the 2018 NCAA men's basketball first and second round games on March 16 & March 18, 2018 from the brand-new Little Caesars Arena.

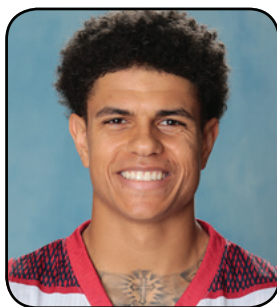

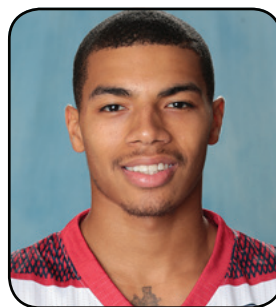

HEAD COACH MIKE DAVIS



The University of Detroit Mercy men's basketball program will have a successful, proven veteran coach to lead the Titans back to championship contention as Mike Davis was named the 22nd head coach in program history on June 13, 2018.

"After an extensive search that included multiple high-quality candidates, we are pleased to have Mike Davis join us as our new men's basketball head coach," said Detroit Mercy Director of Athletics Robert C. Vowels, Jr. "Mike has achieved great success as a coach and leader of young men, and as an individual, he reflects the values upon which our University is built. I am confident he will help return Titan basketball to a championship level."

Davis came to Detroit Mercy from Texas Southern University, where he spent the last six seasons building the Tigers into a perennial power in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) with five postseason tournament appearances,

including four NCAA Tournaments. For his efforts, he was named the SWAC Coach of the Year on three occasions. Texas Southern also had a team GPA of 3.0 and had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score.

A high school basketball star in the state of Alabama, Davis played collegiately at Alabama before embarking on a professional career. His coaching resume includes more than 20 years of experience. This includes 18 years of head coaching experience, building a 352-241 record with 14 postseason trips, nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and guiding Indiana to a national championship runner-up effort in 2002. His squads have recorded at least 20 wins nine times, while posting a winning record in 14 of his 18 campaigns.

"First and foremost, I'd like to thank God for this opportunity," said coach Davis. "I'd also like to thank the President Dr. Antoine Garibaldi, and Director of Athletics Robert Vowels, Jr. for entrusting me with their men's basketball program. I am enthusiastic and optimistic about its future. My family and I look forward to getting to know the city of Detroit as well as the students, faculty, administration, alumni, donors and fans."

In his six seasons at Texas Southern, he posted a 115-89 (.564) record, including an 88-20 mark in conference play. His teams won four regular-season titles and four conference tournament championships advancing to four NCAA Tournaments. In his final season at TSU, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four.

Under his leadership, five Tigers were named the SWAC Player of the Year, a feat which had never occurred in the league and was the fourth-longest streak in the history of the NCAA. In addition, 11 earned All-League honors, three were tabbed the Defensive Players of the Year, two were selected the Newcomer of the Year and one was picked the Freshmen of the Year.

He started his collegiate head-coaching career at Indiana University from 2000-06 after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons under legendary head coach and Hall-Of-Famer Bobby Knight.

At IU, he compiled a 115-79 record, 55-41 in the Big Ten, and led the Hoosiers to five postseason tournaments, including a run to the NCAA Championship game in 2002. Davis' teams played some of their best basketball during the postseason tallying a 21-12 record in the month of March and a 7-4 NCAA Tournament mark.

He was named the 25th head coach in Indiana history on Sept. 12, 2000, succeeding Knight, and had the most successful first season of any of his 24 predecessors going 21-13 and finishing fourth in the Big Ten at 10-6. His 21 wins were four more than any other first-year IU head coach. He was also the first coach in Indiana history to open his tenure with three straight 20-plus win seasons and three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances as he directed the Hoosiers to a share of the 2002 Big Ten championship and an appearance in the 2002 national championship game, while also defeating 22 nationally-ranked opponents.

In his second season, the Hoosiers were 25-12 and 11-5 in the Big Ten to share the regular season title. As the No. 5 seed in the South Regional of the NCAA Tournament, IU downed Utah (75-56) and UNC-Wilmington (76-67) to advance to the Sweet 16. The Hoosiers then ousted top-seeded Duke (74-73) and Kent State (81-69) to move into the Final Four.

3 HL CHAMPIONSHIPS

In the national semifinal, Indiana overcame a halftime deficit to move past the West Regional's No. 2 seed Oklahoma, 73-64, before falling to the East Regional's No. 1 seed Maryland, 64-52, in the title contest.

Prior to being named head coach Davis had already contributed significantly to the Indiana program. He spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with the Hoosiers. His successful recruitment of several of the country's top prep players earned him national recognition at Indiana.

In addition to his recruiting success, he was instrumental in the development of several players including A.J. Guyton, the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 2000, Kirk Haston, a first-round NBA selection in 2001, and 2002 Big Ten MVP and consensus second-team All-American Jared Jeffries, who was the 11th overall pick of the 2002 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards.

In Davis' three seasons as an IU assistant, the Hoosiers compiled a 63-32 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament all three seasons.

After Indiana, Davis was named the head coach at the University of Alabama-Birmingham (UAB), where he led the Blazers to a 122-72 (.629) overall record with a 62-34 mark in Conference USA during his six years (2006-12). Davis also led his teams to success off the court and in the classroom as the team had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score.

Davis had a highly successful season at UAB in 2010-11 leading the Blazers to the program's first-ever Conference USA regular season title. In doing so, he was named the 2011 Conference USA Coach of the Year, while also earning NABC All-District Coach of the Year accolades.

In 2010-11, Davis also guided the Blazers to an NCAA Tournament at-large berth with a record of 22-9 and a 12-4 mark in league play. UAB earned at least 20 victories in the regular season in four-straight years during Davis' tenure (2007-2012), marking the first time that feat had been achieved in program history. The Blazers also won at least 11 conference games in each of those seasons.

Under Davis, the program clinched four consecutive postseason berths (three NITs and one NCAA Tournament). Davis subsequently etched his name in the record books as he became only the second coach in UAB history to reach 90 wins in a four-year span. The only other coach in program history to accomplish the feat was Hall of Famer Gene Bartow, who reached the pinnacle with a school-record 94 victories from 1983-87.

"Our vision in the Horizon League is to be a nationally recognized NCAA Division I conference that develops student-athletes to their fullest potential," said Jon LeCrone, Horizon League Commissioner. "Mike is a proven winner and brings the knowledge, skill and values that our League embraces."

He started coaching at Miles College as an assistant in 1989-90 and then moved to Venezuela to work with the country's national and professional teams. He arrived back in the states to coach in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) with the Wichita Falls franchise that eventually relocated to Chicago. Davis moved with the team not only as an assistant coach, but also as a player. Despite not playing professional basketball for five years, Davis averaged 8.3 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest in 1994-95.

Davis was then an assistant coach at his alma mater from 1995-97 under David Hobbs at Alabama before taking the assistant coaching job at Indiana. The 1995-96 Crimson Tide basketball team posted a 23-10 record and advanced to the NIT Final Four.

Davis spent his collegiate-playing career with the Tide after earning the state's Mr. Basketball honor and All-America status in 1979. He was a standout for four seasons at Alabama and finished his career in the Top 25 on the Crimson Tide's all-time scoring list with 1,211 points. In his first season, he played for the legendary C.M. Newton and then spent his final three years playing under another coaching legend, Wimp Sanderson.

Davis averaged 10.1 points per game for his collegiate career and ranks third all-time on the school's steals list with 165. During his four seasons at Alabama, the Crimson Tide posted an 80-42 record and advanced to two NIT and two NCAA Tournaments.

Davis is married to Tamilya Davis and the couple has one son, Antoine. Davis is also the father of Mike Davis, Jr., who was a member of the Indiana and UAB men's basketball team that he coached and was an assistant with him at Texas Southern, and he also has one daughter, Lateesha.

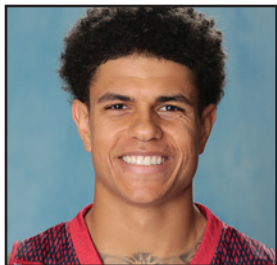
