ALL-TIME SERIES

This is just the seventh career meeting between the two schools as Ohio leads the match-up, 4-2, including both games at the Convocation Center.

Last year, the Titans shot 51.7% overall (30-of-58) and were 11-of-26 (42.3%) from three and 17-of-21 (81.0%) at the free throw line in an 88-74 win as Antoine Davis scored 28 points.

UDM also defeated Ohio, 84-77, on Dec. 21, 1971, in Ann Arbor during a tournament held at Michigan, but the Bobcats then claimed the next four meetings. Three of those losses came down the wire in a 66-65 decision at Calihan Hall in February of 2005, a 56-55 contest in Athens in December of 2005, and a 63-61 outcome in Calihan Hall in 2018 as the Titans' 3-pointer at the buzzer was too strong.

The Titans are starting the year with four straight away from Calihan Hall for the fourth time in school history and the third time under head coach Mike Davis.

In 2020-21, Detroit Mercy started the year with nine straight on the road, while in 2019-20, the red, white and blue played seven in a row away from the Motor City.

It also happened in 2006-07 when the Titans played their first five outside of Detroit.

A STRUGGLE ON THE ROAD

Detroit Mercy is 13-86 in true nonconference road games since the 2007-08 season, including 3-35 under head coach Mike Davis.

The three wins were at Tulsa last season. at Western Michigan in 2020 and at Eastern Michigan in 2018.

It should be noted that under coach Davis, the Titans have scheduled very aggressively against high-major teams and consistent mid-major powers.

MEDIA NOTE

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

All postgame interviews, except those needed for live television, will be conducted in the media room following the conclusion of the contest. On the road, Coach Davis and players are available on a request basis only. All requests should be directed to P.J. Gradowski before the end of the game by texting him at 313-585-0982.

INTERVIEW REQUEST

All player and coach interviews must be arranged through the Detroit Mercy Athletic Communications Office at least 24 hours in advance.

Generally, the Titans will practice from 3-6:00 p.m., with all practices closed to the public. Media interested in watching practice need to contact Detroit Mercy sports information for approval with social distance rules and making enforced. In addition, the Titan locker room, training room and weight room are off limits to all media personnel.



TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

The University of Detroit Mercy men's basketball team will have 11 non-conference games, with several against multi-bid leagues.

Nine of the 11 contests will have the Titans on the road as the red, white and blue face teams from the AAC, ACC, BIG 10, SEC and the WCC, among others.

The 11 foes totaled a 202-161 (55.6%) record last season, with four making postseason trips in NC State (NCAA), Northwestern (NCAA), Toledo (NIT), and Cincinnati (NIT).

AGAINST THE MAC

Detroit Mercy is 184-126 all-time against current members of the MAC and has won three of the last five over the league.

On the road, though, the Titans have dropped 12 of their last 14 MAC games since the 2015-16 season, with wins at Western Michigan during the 2020-21 campaign and at Eastern Michigan in the 2017-18 season.

IMPROVEMENT THROUGH 3

The Titans were outrebounded in the first two games but owned the boards against Ole Miss, 33-28, despite the Rebels' starting center checking in at 7'5.

Detroit Mercy was also just 14-of-27 at the line in the first two games, but shot 13-of-18 at Ole Miss and the red, white and blue have also lowered its turnovers from 23 at Toledo, to 15 at Cincinnati and 11 its last time out

STONE FINALLY REACHES NEW HIGH

Senior Jayden Stone tallied a career-high 25 points at Cincinnati, going 9-of-20 from the field and connecting on four triples.

He also led the team with 22 points at Ole Miss his last time out and is averaging 20.7 points in the first three games, shooting 43.4% overall and 41.7% from three.

He has now played in 16 career games with the Titans and has netted 20 or more seven times.

DEL CADIA NETS CAREER BEST

Graduate senior Edoardo Del Cadia tied and then set his career high in points, while posting his first career doubledouble in the first three games.

He just tallied a career-best 16 points and career-tying 10 boards at Ole Miss, to go with three assists, a block and a steal. He tied his then-career best with 13 points at Cincinnati, hitting 4-of-5 from the field and 2-of-3 from behind the arc before fouling out after playing just 22 minutes and that was after seven points, six boards and three helpers in the opener at Toledo.

He is currently averaging 12.0 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists, shooting 63.2% from the field (12-of-19).

TOATLEY'S BIG DAY

Graduate senior Donovann Toatley had a big day in the season opener at Toledo, going for a career-high 20 points, tying his career-best with three steals and assisting on six baskets.

Toatley's previous high was 19 points, accomplished four times, with the last against Western Carolina as a member of Tennessee Chattanooga in 2018-19.

OLAJUWON IN THE BOOKS

Redshirt freshman Abdullah Olajuwon scored his first basket in the season opener at Toledo and added two more points with six boards at Cincinnati and had a bucket at Ole Miss.

He is now 1,326 behind his dad, Hakeem Olajuwon, who netted 1,332 in three years at Houston from 1981-84.

SCORE IT MARK

Sophomore Marcus Tankersley scored just seven points in each of the first two games at Toledo and at Cincinnati on 6-of-13 shooting, but he exploded for a careerhigh 19 points at Ole Miss.

He was a career-best 8-of-13 from the field, hitting just his third career 3-pointer in the process, and also dished out a career-best five assists and grabbed four rebounds.

He saw action in 24 games, all as a reserve, last season and averaged 2.4 points and 1.2 rebounds, shooting 51.3% from the field (20-of-39) and 93.8% (15-of-16) at the line.

He really came on at the end of the year, scoring 10 points (4-5 FG, 4-4 FT) with three steals and tying his season high with five boards against Purdue Fort Wayne in the Horizon League Championship opening round and ending the year with a season-best 14 points, hitting 6-of-9 from the field, with three rebounds and three assists in the Horizon League Championship Quarterfinals at Youngstown State.

HARD WORK PAYS OFF FOR TRENTON

Junior Trenton Johnson - a walk-on - did not see action in the opener at Toledo and played just 15 minutes at Cincinnati, but when the Titans needed another man at Ole Miss, his hard work and dedication paid off.

Johnson scored his first DI points, finishing with eight on 3-of-4 shooting, 2-of-3 from three, along with three rebounds, two assists and a steal in 33 minutes.

He spent the last two years at Vincennes University, seeing action in 64 games with 27 starts and posted 5.3 points, 1.6 rebounds and 1.0 assists per game.

WIN #411 & COUNTING

Head coach Mike Davis earned his first triumph as a head coach on Nov. 14, 2000, when his Indiana Hoosiers defeated Pepperdine, 80-68, in Bloomington.

Last season, he won his 400th career game in the 70-49 victory over Charlotte at Calihan Hall.

He now has 411 career wins, 142nd in DI NCAA history, one away from 141st and Mike Deane.

Davis is one of nine current coaches to win 100 games at three different schools (Indiana, UAB, Texas Southern).

FROM ALL OVER

Detroit Mercy's roster features studentathletes from five states (Michigan, Tennessee, Texas, Maryland, Indiana) and five countries outside the states (Australia, Canada, Croatia, France, Italy).

Edoardo Del Cadia is believed to be the first Titan from Italy, while Jayden Stone is the first Titan from Australia and Alex Tchikou the first from France.

COACH WILLIAMS MAKES HISTORY

Detroit Mercy hired its first female assistant coach in school history in former high school coach Jerica Williams.

She is one of 31 women on DI MBB staffs in positions of leadership directly working with the players, although she is the only coach in Division I who has on-the-court instruction and recruiting duties.

She was the girls' basketball head coach at Detroit Country Day from 2020-2022, where she was named back-to-back Coach of the Year in her first two years as a head coach while leading her team to back-to-back MSHAA Final Fours, before becoming Girls' Basketball Program Lead at the Windward School in Los Angeles, California. In the off-season, she continued working with NBA players on and off the court.

Prior to that, she served as an Assistant Coach at Cal State Northridge from 2019-2020 and was the Chief of Staff at her alma mater, San Diego State in 2018-19.

Williams played collegiate basketball from 2006-2010 at UCLA and San Diego State, where she was part of two Mountain West Conference championship teams along with two NCAA appearances. Prior to college, she led her high school team to four straight CIF championships, winning 3 in a row.

It was announced that prior to the home opener on Nov. 21, Detroit Council Member Angela Calloway will present the prestigious Spirit of Detroit Award to her for her outstanding achievement in becoming the program's first-ever female men's assistant coach.

The Spirit of Detroit Award is issued by the Detroit City Council to a person, event,

or organization deemed to have performed an outstanding achievement or service to the citizens of Detroit.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Nothing new for the Titans to have a family connection in the program and this season, Detroit Mercy will once again feature a pair of Davis' in head coach Mike Davis and assistant coach Mike Davis Jr.

For the last five years, Antoine Davis joined his dad and his brother on the team as a student-athlete and became one of the greatest scorers in NCAA history.

From 2010-13, the Titans had head coach Ray McCallum and star guard Ray McCallum, winning the HL title in 2012 and earning a trip to the NIT in 2013.

Also, the legendary Bob Calihan coached his son, Bob Calihan Jr., for one season as he transferred to U-D from Loyola for his senior season in 1968-69.

The current father-son coaching player duo is part of seven in DI.

ONE DAVIS OWNS THE DINNER TABLE

Head coach Mike Davis is quick to point out that former Titan Antoine Davis is not the defender that he was in college, but in terms of offense, the son has won the battle.

Coach Davis starred at Alabama from 1979 to 1983 and totaled 1,211 points in 121 career games, going 478-of-1003 (47.7%) from the field with 238 assists.

Antoine finished his career with 3,664 career points, second in NCAA history and just three shy of Pete Maravich's record 3,667, with 594 assists and 181 steals.

Compared to his brother, current assistant coach Mike Davis Jr., Antoine has him beat as well as he recorded 143 career points, 33 assists and 25 steals in three seasons at UAB from 2006-09.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS

Detroit Mercy will have to replace four starters, including the two-time Horizon League Player of the Year Antoine Davis.

The Titans welcome back just five letterwinners from a year ago and one starter in Jayden Stone, who missed the second semester.

With those returners, the Titans bring back just 19% of minutes played (1,273/6,650) and 11.9% of points scored (302/2,527) from a year ago, some of the lowest amounts in the nation.

Alex Tchikou was a four-star prospect by Rivals, 247sports and ESPN out of high school, ranked by Rivals.com as the No. 36 overall player and the #6 power forward in the 2020 class and ESPN had him #56 nationally and #11 power forward.

Emmanuel Kuac was a top-five prospect in Canada, a three-star recruit by 247Sports and Rivals and ranked as the #5 player in his class in Utah by 247Sports.

Donovann Toatley was the No. 8 point guard per BigShots.net in DMV (D.C.-Maryland-Virginia) while also listed as DMVelite 18 standout.

Ryan Hurst finished fifth in the state for the Mr. Basketball award and was a Division 1 First Team All-State selection by the Detroit Free Press and the Detroit News.

Oton Jankovic was ranked the #21 overall player in the state of Florida and the 57th-best power forward in the nation by 24/7 Sports.

The Titans contain a few family connections that have played college and professional sports.

Edoardo Del Cadia's dad was a pro basketball player in Italy

Kyle LeGreair's God brother is Chris Douglas-Roberts, who played college basketball at Memphis.

Jayden Stone's dad played college basketball at Cal State Northridge.

Abdullah Olajuwon's dad is Hakeem Olajuwon, who played 18 years in the NBA, winning two championships with the Houston Rockets in 1994 and 1995 before being inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2008

Ryan Hurst's cousin, Jaden Hardy, was drafted in the 2022 NBA Draft in the second round by the Sacramento Kings and currently plays for the Dallas Mavericks.

Trenton Johnson's dad played college basketball at Tennessee State

Tyree Davis' dad, Ricky Davis, played 12 years in the NBA and averaged 13.5 points per game, including a career-high 20.6 with the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2002-03.

Tobin Schwannecke's two older brothers ran track at Wagner and Michigan.

CAN I CHECK YOUR ID

Graduate senior Edoardo Del Cadia was born on March 10, 1999, as the 24-year old is the 13th oldest player in Division I.

BUON GIORNO

Graduate senior Edoardo Del Cadia has played at two Division I programs in Nicholls State and UNLV and is the first Titan to hail from Italy.

After an injury ended his 2021-22 season with the Colonels, he came back to play in 25 games with four starts last year and tallied 3.9 points, 2.9 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game, while coming away with 28 steals. He had a season-high 11 points in back-to-back games at New Orleans and against Houston Christian, put in 10 against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and pulled down a career-high 10 boards at Southeastern Louisiana.

At UNLV in 2020-21, he played in 21 games and logged six starts, averaging 2.8 points and 3.0 rebounds, reaching double figures twice, including a career-high 13 points in the regular season finale against Wyoming and 10 points with five rebounds against Utah State in the second round of the Mountain West Tournament.

He started his career recording 14.0 points and 10.0 rebounds as a freshman at Cloud County Community College and netted 13.2 points with 9.1 rebounds as a sophomore at the College of Central Florida.

MOTOR CITY PRIDE

Senior Kyle LeGreair is one of the lone veterans under head coach Mike Davis as he has played in 60 career games.

He just had five rebounds and three assists at Ole Miss.

Last year, he battled a shoulder injury, but still played in all 33 games with three starts and averaged 1.3 points, 2.1 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game. He made 15-of-31 shots from the field (48.4%), including 3-of-5 from distance, and also had 23 steals and two blocks.

He was credited with multiple assists 16 times, at least three rebounds in 10 contests and a steal in 16 games.

He posted four points, four rebounds and a career-tying five assists with a block and a steal at Robert Morris last season. He also had three points, three rebounds, two assists and a career-high five steals at

GOOD DAY MATE

Senior Jayden Stone started all 13 games he saw action in a year ago - missing the second semester - and tallied 13.9 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game, hitting 49.2% from the field (62-of-126), 51.9% from three (27-of-52) and 85.7% at the free-throw line (30-of-25).

He scored in double figures in eight games with five 20-point efforts and had at least five rebounds in seven contests.

Stone recorded his first career double-double with 15 points (5-9 FG) and 12 rebounds against Rochester in his Titan debut and posted a career-high 24 points, hitting a career-high 10-of-19 from the field, with eight boards, at Wright State and 24 points, shooting a career-best 6-of-9 from three, with nine rebounds, three assists and a steal at NKU.

RETURN OF THE MAK

Junior Mak Manciel is a local product from Sterling Heights, Michigan, who was a First Team National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) All-American as a sophomore at Henry Ford College after posting 15.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists, shooting 47.6% from the field, 40.8% from three and 83.0% at the line.

Last year, he was at Arkansas State, but missed last season due to a knee injury.

He scored his first Division I points on two free throws at Ole Miss, along with a steal

NEW GUARD IN TOWN

Graduate senior Donovann Toatley has played in 45 collegiate games with eight starts in his previous stops at Bethune-Cookman, Monmouth and Tennessee-Chattanooga, although he did not play in any games last season at Bethune-Cookman.

He suited up for 17 games at Monmouth in 2020-21, averaging 7.3 points, and scoring a career-high 17 points at Niagara, hitting 6-of-11 from the field and 3-of-6 from three. He also had 13 points against Marist, 16 points versus Canisius and 13 points with three steals against St. Peter's.

As a freshman at Chattanooga in 2018-19, he played in 28 contests for the Mocs, starting eight, and scored 11.4 points per game, second on the team, while shooting 42.1%

His 82 assists led the team, good for an average of just shy of three per contest, and he netted 17 double-figure scoring nights, registering a career-high 19 points against Western Carolina, at East Tennessee and at UT Martin. He also had five points and a career-best 10 assists at Mississippi.

O NO

Graduate senior Oton Jankovic played in 21 games in three years at Tulane and started his collegiate career at Vanderbilt, playing in 21 games as a rookie.

He prepped at Montverde Academy in Florida and Prolific Prep in California. He was a member of the Croatian National Team at every level from U14-U18 and trained with the Olympic team in the summer 2020, averaging 10 points a game in his age-group FIBA European Championship.

NEW TO DETROIT

Graduate senior Emmanuel Kuac has seen action in 47 games with six starts in his four years at New Mexico and averaged 2.7 points and 3.6 rebounds, but has played just seven games the last two years due to injury.

He played in 19 games as a rookie and 21 games with five starts as a sophomore, registering 3.4 points and 3.2 rebounds per game, and scored a season-high eight points at Colorado State.

He made his first career start in the season opener at Rice, scoring eight points and grabbing a career-high seven rebounds and also posted a then career-high nine points on a career-high three 3-pointers versus Our Lady of the Lake and nine points at Air Force.

Kuac posted career highs with 11 points, nine rebounds, three blocks and two assists against Norfolk State as a junior, but ended up appearing in just six games that season and one as a senior due to injury.

THE PRESEASON

The stats didn't count, but the lone preseason game was the 5th Annual City College Series against Wayne State.

The Titans fell to the Warriors, 88-78, but with 1,011 people in attendance, the game made \$2,022 in ticket sales. With a matching donation from Michigan First Credit Union, over \$4,000 will be donated to Detroit Public Schools, K-5. In the five-year history of the event, Detroit Mercy and Michigan First Credit Union have now teamed to raise nearly \$35,000.

TANK REPRESENTING THE TITANS

The Horizon League has announced the student-athletes who will participate on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2023-24 academic year as women's cross country and track and field sophomore Ayva Schmalz and men's basketball sophomore Marcus Tankersley will represent the Titans.

In addition, Schmalz will serve on the committee's Governance Cabinet.

Each of the League's member institutions are represented by two student-athletes.

Horizon League SAAC participated in an in-person meeting in early June and will continue to meet over several videoconferences throughout the academic year. Additionally, SAAC members will serve as Cabinet members in the Horizon League governance

structure, while two student-athletes will also represent the student-athlete voice and hold one vote on the League Council, alongside all 11 Athletics Directors, one Faculty Athletics Representative and one Senior Woman Administrator.

WILLIE GREEN NOW GUIDING NEW ORLEANS

Willie Green was named the head coach of the New Orleans Pelicans in 2021-22 and is entering his third year as a NBA head coach.

He helped the team to a 36-46 record, finishing ninth in the Western Conference and securing a spot in the NBA Play-In Tournament in his first season. The Pelicans would go on to beat the San Antonio Spurs and the Los Angeles Clippers en route to their first playoff berth since the 2017–18 season. Green and the Pelicans would ultimately fall to the Phoenix Suns, Green's former team, in six games in the First Round.

Last year, they were 42-40, just missing the playoffs.

Green starred as a Titan from 1999-2003, was named an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns in 2019 after spending the prior four seasons on the Golden State Warriors staff, helping the team win two NBA Championships.

Green was a part of four Titan winning seasons, including a pair of 20-win campaigns and postseason appearances.

As a sophomore, Green helped Detroit Mercy reach the semifinals of the NIT, knocking out Bradley, Connecticut and Dayton as the Titans made their way to Madison Square Garden.

Green is still fourth all-time in scoring with 1,779 points. As a senior, he was an AP Honorable Mention All-American and the HL Player of the Year after averaging a league-best 22.6 points per game.

He was selected in the second round (41st) in the 2003 NBA Draft by the Seattle SuperSonics and later traded to the 76ers. He would play seven of his 12 NBA seasons with Philadelphia, averaging a career-high 12.4 points in 2007-08 and 11.3 points in 2006-07.

He finished his career playing in 731 games, tallying 8.3 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists.



UDM RANKED HIGH AGAIN

The Wall Street Journal/College Pulse ranked the University of Detroit Mercy among the top institutions of higher education in the United States for 2024.

This year, UDM was ranked No. 52, making it:

- * Michigan's second highest-ranking university on the list
- * Fourth among Catholic institutions nationally, behind only Georgetown University, Boston College and University of Notre Dame
- * The third-highest ranked Jesuit university and only Mercy institution ranked.
- * 41 out of 196 private universities included in the rankings

"This is a tremendous honor not just for our University, but for our students and alumni who do great work on our campuses, in their field and communities," said UDM President Donald B. Taylor. "It is truly gratifying to be recognized for the determination and commitment of our faculty, staff and entire University family in working to help our students and community achieve success."

UDM also ranked well in the three categories that make up the ranking:

The Titans also have a partnership with Basepath, another NIL company that works with Athletic Departments that want to enable NIL opportunities for their student-athletes. They provide operational

COACH DAVIS COACHING STAFF

Experience in the system and on the collegiate level will be all over the Titan sidelines for head coach Mike Davis.

Mike Davis Jr.

Someone who knows coach Davis more than anyone, Mike Davis Jr. learned the game from his dad and not only played under him at Indiana and UAB, but has been on the sidelines with him for 12 years now.

Davis Jr. served as an assistant coach for six years at Texas Southern, where the Davis duo built the Tigers into a perennial power in the SWAC and a staple in the postseason.

During his six seasons, Texas Southern won four regular season and conference tournament championships and appeared in four NCAA Tournaments with one NIT bid. In 2018, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game, defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four match-up.

His first collegiate coaching job was at Chipola Junior College in 2011-12. Prior to that, he worked on the AAU circuit with the Alabama Ice as an assistant coach from 2010-12

Davis Jr. played collegiate basketball at Blackhawk Community College, Indiana and UAB, and saw action in 76 games at the Division I level.

Donnie Marsh

Veteran collegiate coach Donnie Marsh joined the coaching staff three years ago.

Marsh brings over four decades of collegiate coaching to the Motor City - mostly at the Division I level - as an assistant and head coach and has also been a part of coach Davis' staff at Indiana, UAB and Texas Southern. He has been a part of seven regular-season and tournament championships and 11 postseason teams, including five in the NCAA Tournament.

He spent the prior three seasons at Florida Gulf Coast as the associate head coach and that was after serving as head coach at Alabama A&M for one season. At FGCU, he helped retool a defense that led the Atlantic Sun in blocks per game the last two years as well as finishing top three in the conference in overall scoring defense, field goal percentage defense, steals per game and turnovers forced per game.

Prior to that, he was on coach Davis' staff at Texas Southern for four seasons from 2012-13 and 2014-17, helping the

program to four SWAC regular-season championships and a pair of postseason titles with the Tigers earning two trips to the NCAA Tournament as well as an NIT bid. The Tigers went 64-8 in league play in the four seasons he was there and 80-54 overall with two 20-win seasons.

In between those stops, he was an assistant head coach at South Florida from 2013-14, which came after being on coach Davis' staff at UAB from 2006-12 and Indiana from 2004-06. In those eight seasons, he helped the programs reach the postseason six times with two NCAA Tournament appearances and two NIT bids. The teams also finished top four in their conferences in six of those campaigns, while his time at UAB saw the Blazers post a 95-41 (.698) record and winning their first outright Conference USA Regular Season Championship in 2011.

Marsh was the head coach at FIU from 2000-2004. Prior to FIU, Marsh served as an assistant (1997-99) and associate head coach (1999-00) at Virginia Tech. Marsh had gone to Virginia Tech after serving as an assistant coach at Florida State from 1995-97, helping the Seminoles to the 1997 NIT Final.

A 1979 graduate of Franklin & Marshall (Pa.) College with a bachelor's degree in history and education, Marsh earned All-America honors and helped the Diplomats to a 27-5 record and Division III Final Four. He averaged 15.4 points per game during his career, including 18.9 as a senior, which helped him become the third-round pick of the Atlanta Hawks in the 1979 NBA Draft.

Jerica Williams

Jerica Williams joined the staff in September.

She was the girls' basketball head coach at Detroit Country Day from 2020-2022, where she was named back-to-back Coach of the Year in her first two years as a head coach while leading her team to back-to-back MSHAA Final Fours, before becoming Girls' Basketball Program Lead at the Windward School in Los Angeles, California. In the off-season, she continued working with NBA players on and off the court.

Prior to that, she served as an Assistant Coach at Cal State Northridge from 2019-2020 and was the Chief of Staff at her alma mater, San Diego State in 2018-19.

Williams played collegiate basketball

from 2006-2010 at UCLA and San Diego State, where she was part of two Mountain West Conference championship teams along with two NCAA appearances. Prior to college, she led her high school team to four straight CIF championships, winning 3 in a row. Recognized as San Diego Section Player of the Year during her stint, she was inducted into Mount Miguel High School's Hall of Fame in 2018.

Will Finch

Will Finch - who was a student manager under Davis at IU - arrived back in the Motor City in the summer of 2018 for his second stint with the program and will serve as the men's basketball video coordinator.

Finch was the men's basketball Director of Basketball Operations under former head coach Ray McCallum in 2009-10 before leaving to take an assistant coaching position at the NAIA level with Saint Catharine College.

More recently, he coached preps in the state of South Carolina and helped studentathletes secure 19 Division I scholarships.

From 2012-13, he was an assistant athletic facilities coordinator at his alma mater Indiana and that came after serving as a graduate assistant for men's basketball at Marshall from 2011-12. He was also an assistant men's basketball coach at Saint Catharine College from 2010-11. At both stops, he handled day-to-day operations including practice, scouting, game prep, and coaching as well as monitored academic performance of the student athletes.

He began his role in college basketball as a student manager at Indiana under coach Davis as an undergraduate from 2005-07, and later took on roles in event management and athletics administration while pursuing his master degree.

He worked with Impact Basketball in Las Vegas in 2009, where he organized the renowned basketball training center's management and aided in the on-court training of NBA-caliber players, prior to joining the Titan staff in 2009. He was part of the largest turnaround in school history as Detroit Mercy went from 7-23 the previous year to 20-14 in 2009-10, ending with a run to the HL semifinals.

Finch earned his undergraduate degree in Sports Management and Marketing from Indiana in 2007 and his master in Sports Administration, Management and Marketing from IU in 2008.

OUR COURT NAMED AFTER DICKY V

Dick Vitale was honored as the court was renamed after him in 2012.

He was the head coach at the University from 1973-77, tallying a 78-30 record with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 1977.

He recruited the likes of John Long, Terry Tyler, Terry Duerod and Wilbert McCormick and turned Calihan Hall into one of the most visited venues in college basketball in the late 70's.

He went 17-9 in each of his first two seasons and posted a 19-8 mark in 1975-76. In his final year as a head coach, the Titans torched the competition, going 25-4, including a 21-game winning streak, and earning a bid to the NCAA Tournament. They would defeat Middle Tennessee State, 93-76, for the school's first-ever victory in the NCAA Tournament and then took on a powerful Michigan squad, dropping an 86-81 decision.

Vitale has been selected for 10 halls of time in his career.

118 YEARS OF TITAN BASKETBALL

This season is the 118th year of collegiate basketball at the University of Detroit Mercy - the oldest Division I program in the state - as the Tigers – yes, Tigers as they were called back then - beat Collegiate, 18-7, in the first official Detroit basketball game in 1905.

Until 1919, the U-D teams were known as the Tigers. In the fall of 1919, Detroit Free Press' sportswriter Stan Brink, who was covering football for the paper, thought that a good nickname for the team would be the Titans.

In its 118 years (two years records are missing in 1907-08 and 1908-09), Detroit Mercy is 1468-1304 (.540) with two regular-season HL Championships (1998, 1999) and three tournament titles (1994, 1999, 2012).

HEAD COACH MIKE DAVIS



Mike Davis enters his sixth season as the Titan head coach in 2023-24 and in his five years, the Titans have started an upside to a program that was in last place and dealing with APR bans. In his five years, 11 players have gone on to play professionally and that does not include the 2022-23 players that could have as many as six more join that list, which already includes NBA players and lottery picks.

Antoine Davis just graduated in 2022-23 as a two-time HL Player of the Year, AP Honorable Mention All-American and Third Team All-American By USBWA, as he led the nation in scoring at 28.2 points per game, total points at 930, and with 4.82, 3-pointers per game, third in NCAA history. All three marks were Horizon League records, while the 930 points and 4.82 triples per game were both

school marks. He became just the second Titan to ever lead the nation in a stat.

As his career came to an end, he left the University holding four NCAA records in total 3-pointers (588), 3-pointers by a freshman (132), consecutive games in double figures (144) and total games in double figures (144). His 3,664 career points are second in NCAA history, just three shy of Pete Maravich's record 3,667, while his

1,219 field goals are sixth all-time in the NCAA record book. Davis' 4.08, three-point field goals per game are also third all-time in NCAA history, and he is also the only play to ever post 3,500 points and 500 assists in a collegiate career.

This past season, the Titans were eighth in the nation with 10.2, 3-pointers per game, 11th in three-point field-goal percentage (38.6%), eighth in offensive rebounds per game (13.12) and 60th in offense (76.6), while setting a school record with 338 triples.

In 2021-22, the Titans posted a winning record in conference play at 10-7 in the Horizon League, the first back-to-back winning campaigns in league action since 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. The red, white and blue were also selected to play in The Basketball Classic postseason tournament as the Titans finished sixth in the regular season and defeated Green Bay in the first round for a second-straight season with a triumph in the HL conference tournament. Detroit Mercy also saw Antoine Davis named the Co-Horizon League Player of the Year, a Lou Henson award finalist and All-American, USBWA All-District V and NABC First Team All-District 12 on the court and a HL All-Academic and a CoSIDA Academic All-American, the first in school history.

As a team, the Titans led the Horizon League and were seventh in the nation with 10.4, 3-pointers per game, topped the conference and 24th in the country in three-point field-goal percentage (37.4%) and committed the fewest turnovers in the HL at 11.6 per game, 82nd in the country. They were also second in the conference and 14th in the nation in free-throw percentage (77.6%). Six Titans were also named to the AD's Honor Roll, while four student-athletes were named to the HL Fall Academic Honor Roll.

In his third year in 2020-21, guided the team up the Horizon League standings and a win in the Horizon League Championship. In the classroom, the Titans finished the 2020-21 season with their third-straight semester of a cumulative 3.0 GPA posting a 3.259 in the spring of 2021.

The Titans recorded their first winning season since 2015-16 as the red, white and blue finished the year at 12-10 overall and 10-6 in the Horizon League. The 10 wins in league play were the most since going 12-4 in 2012-13, while the win in the first round of the HL Championship was the first postseason victory since 2015-16. Three Titans earned awards as Matt Johnson was named the Horizon League Sixth Player of the Year, Bul Kuol was selected third Team All-Horizon League and Davis was First Team All-HL, an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American, Lou Henson award finalist and All-American and NABC First Team All-District 12.

Davis came to Detroit Mercy from Texas Southern University, where he spent six seasons building the Tigers into a perennial power in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) with five postseason tournament appearances, including four NCAA Tournaments. For his efforts, he was named the SWAC Coach of the Year on three occasions. Texas Southern also had a team GPA of 3.0 and had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score.



Statistically, the Titans were also top 100 in the nation in a number of areas, including fifth in both 3-point field goal percentage (39.1%) and free-throw percentage (80.4%) and 10th in 3-point field goals per game (10.2). They also ranked 11th in least fouls per game (14.3), 50th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25), 52nd in total 3-pointers (225), 56th in field goal percentage (46.4%) and scoring offense (76.5%), 60th in least turnovers per game (11.5) and 89th in assists per game (14.3).

In his second season in 2019-20, the Titans finished with eight wins and six in Horizon League play, while he guided the program through an APR postseason ban and a young squad featuring eight underclassmen. The six wins included a victory over eventual conference champion NKU and could have been more as six conference losses came by just 16 points for the young Titans.

The 2019-20 Titans also led the conference and finished ninth in the nation in free throw percentage at 78.2 percent, a new school record. The team topped the HL with 8.5 triples per game, 54th in the country, as well as with 263, 3-pointers, 66th in the nation.

Detroit Mercy was picked to finish last in the league in the preseason poll in 2018-19, but Detroit Mercy notched 11 wins on the year and seven in conference play to qualify for the postseason. Led by star guard and son Antoine Davis, the Horizon League Freshman of the Year and First Team All-League, Detroit Mercy won the Gotprint. Com Legends Classic Subregional Championship game, presented by Old Trapper, with wins over Loyola Maryland and Bowling Green and had wins against conference co-champion Wright State and College Insider. com Invitational Tournament finalist Green Bay.

Davis was named the 22nd head coach in program history on June 13, 2018.

"After an extensive search that included multiple high-quality candidates, we are pleased to have Mike Davis join us as

our new men's basketball head coach," said Detroit Mercy Director of Athletics Robert C. Vowels, Jr. "Mike has achieved great success as a coach and leader of young men, and as an individual, he reflects the values upon which our University is built. I am confident he will help return Titan basketball to a championship level."

Davis came to Detroit Mercy from Texas Southern University, where he spent six seasons building the Tigers into a perennial power in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) with five postseason tournament appearances, including four NCAA Tournaments. For his efforts, he was named the SWAC Coach of the Year on three occasions.

"Coach Davis has not only proven that he can win on the basketball court, but he has also demonstrated that his players can excel in the classroom, as demonstrated by his team GPA of 3.0, four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 Academic Progress Rate and graduation of 18 of 20 players over his last six years at his previous institution. I am confident that his motivation and inspiration will energize the entire university and the city of Detroit," said Detroit Mercy President Dr. Antoine Garibaldi.

A high school basketball star in the state of Alabama, Davis played collegiately at the University of Alabama before embarking on a professional career. His coaching resume includes more than 20 years of experience. This includes 18 years of head coaching experience, building a 352-241 record with 14 postseason trips, nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and guiding Indiana to a national championship runner-up effort in 2002. His squads have recorded at least 20 wins nine times, while posting a winning record in 14 of his 18 campaigns.

"First and foremost, I'd like to thank God for this opportunity," said coach Davis. "I'd also like to thank the President Dr. Antoine Garibaldi, and Director of Athletics Robert Vowels, Jr. for entrusting me with their men's basketball program. I am enthusiastic and optimistic about its future. My family and I look forward to getting to know the city of Detroit as well as the students, faculty, administration, alumni, donors and fans."

In his six seasons at Texas Southern, he posted a 115-89 (.564) record, including an 88-20 mark in conference play. His teams won four regular-season titles and four conference tournament championships advancing to four NCAA Tournaments. In

his final season at the helm of TSU, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four.

Under his leadership, five Tigers were named the SWAC Player of the Year, a feat which had never occurred in the league and was the fourth-longest streak in the history of the NCAA. In addition, 11 earned All-League honors, three were tabbed the Defensive Players of the Year, two were selected the Newcomer of the Year and one was picked the Freshmen of the Year.

He started his collegiate head-coaching career at Indiana University from 2000-06 after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons under legendary head coach and Hall-Of-Famer Bobby Knight.

At IU, he compiled a 115-79 record, 55-41 in the Big Ten, and led the Hoosiers to five postseason tournaments, including a run to the NCAA Championship game in 2002. Davis' teams played some of their best basketball during the postseason tallying a 21-12 record in the month of March and a 7-4 NCAA Tournament mark.

He was named the 25th head coach in Indiana history on Sept. 12, 2000, succeeding Knight, and had the most successful first season of any of his 24 predecessors going 21-13 and finishing fourth in the Big Ten at 10-6. His 21 wins were four more than any other first-year IU head coach. He was also the first coach in Indiana history to open his tenure with three straight 20-plus win seasons and three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances as he directed the Hoosiers to a share of the 2002 Big Ten championship and an appearance in the 2002 national championship game, while also defeating 22 nationally-ranked opponents.

In his second season, the Hoosiers were 25-12 and 11-5 in the Big Ten to share the regular season title. As the No. 5 seed in the South Regional of the NCAA Tournament, IU downed Utah (75-56) and UNC-Wilmington (76-67) to advance to the Sweet 16. The Hoosiers then ousted top-seeded Duke (74-73) and Kent State (81-69) to move into the Final Four.

In the national semifinal, Indiana overcame a halftime deficit to move past the West Regional's No. 2 seed Oklahoma, 73-64, before falling to the East Regional's No. 1 seed Maryland, 64-52, in the title contest.

Prior to being named head coach Davis had already contributed significantly to the Indiana program. He spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with the Hoosiers. His successful recruitment of several of the country's top prep players earned him national recognition at Indiana.

In addition to his recruiting success, he was instrumental in the development of several players including A.J. Guyton, the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 2000, Kirk Haston, a first-round NBA selection in 2001, and 2002 Big Ten MVP and consensus second-team All-American Jared Jeffries, who was the 11th overall pick of the 2002 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards.

In Davis' three seasons as an IU assistant, the Hoosiers compiled a 63-32 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament all three seasons.

In 2010-11, Davis also guided the Blazers to an NCAA Tournament at-large berth with a record of 22-9 and a 12-4 mark in league play. UAB earned at least 20 victories in the regular season in four-straight years during Davis' tenure (2007-2012), marking the first time that feat had been in achieved in program history. The Blazers also won at least 11 conference games in each of those seasons.

Under Davis, the program clinched four consecutive postseason berths (three NITs and one NCAA Tournament). Davis subsequently etched his name in the record books as he became only the second coach in UAB history to reach 90 wins in a four-year span. The only other coach in program history to accomplish the feat was Hall of Famer Gene Bartow, who reached the pinnacle with a school-record 94 victories from 1983-87.

"Our vision in the Horizon League is to be a nationally recognized NCAA Division I conference that develops student-athletes to their fullest potential," said Jon LeCrone, former Horizon League Commissioner. "Mike is a proven winner and brings the knowledge, skill and values that our League embraces."

He started coaching at Miles College as an assistant in 1989-90 and then moved to Venezuela to work with the country's national and professional teams. He arrived back in the states to coach in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) with the Wichita Falls franchise that eventually relocated to Chicago. Davis moved with the team not only as an assistant coach, but also as a player. Despite not playing professional basketball for five years, Davis averaged 8.3 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.6

assists per contest in 1994-95.

Davis was then an assistant coach at his alma mater from 1995-97 under David Hobbs at Alabama before taking the assistant coaching job at Indiana. The 1995-96 Crimson Tide basketball team posted a 23-10 record and advanced to the NIT Final Four.

Davis spent his collegiate-playing career with the Tide after earning the state's Mr. Basketball honor and All-America status in 1979. He was a standout for four seasons at Alabama and finished his career in the Top 25 on the Crimson Tide's all-time scoring list with 1,211 points. In his first season, he played for the legendary C.M. Newton and then spent his final three years playing under another coaching legend, Wimp Sanderson.

"I think coach Davis is a great hire. He is an experienced coach who has coached and won on every level. His veteran experience is going to be a big boost to the University. He is a coach with a wealth of knowledge and he will do a great job there," added former Titan coach and college basketball legend Dick Vitale.

Davis averaged 10.1 points per game for his collegiate career and ranks third all-time on the school's steals list with 165. During his four seasons at Alabama, the Crimson Tide posted an 80-42 record and advanced to two NIT and two NCAA Tournaments.

Davis is married to Tamilya Davis and the couple has one son, Antoine, the 2022 and 2023 HL Player of the Year. Davis is also the father of current assistant coach Mike Davis, Jr., who was a member of the Indiana and UAB men's basketball team that he coached and was an assistant with him at Texas Southern, and he also has one daughter, Lateesha.
