GAME #5: The USD Toreros (2-2; 1-0 PFL) head to Des Moines, Iowa for a key Pioneer Football League contest against Drake (3-2; 2-0) on Saturday, October 6th. Game time from Drake Stadium/Johnny Bright Field (14,577 seating capacity) is 10:30 a.m. Pacific.

SERIES RECORD: This is the 20th meeting between USD and Drake with the Toreros owning a slight 10-9 advantage... The Toreros won last year's meeting in San Diego by the score of 31-24 that ended a Drake 2-game winning streak in the series... **Sam Hoekstra** helped seal the win with a brilliant 85-yard punt return in the 4th quarter that gave the Toreros a 31-17 advantage with 7:42 to go... The Bulldogs won the last meeting played in Des Moines back in 2010 by the score of 38-17.

WEBCAST: Saturday's contest will be webcast live with **Jack Cronin** calling the action. His pre-game call begins at 10:20 a.m. (PST).

A LOOK AHEAD: San Diego returns to Walter J. Zable Field at Torero Stadium on Saturday, October 13th, for a 2:00 p.m. PFL contest against Campbell University.

TORERO TIDBITS: USD heads to Drake with a 1-0 PFL record and 2-2 overall mark... Its lone two losses have come to teams currently ranked in The Sports Network FCS Top-25 College Football Poll - #20 Cal Poly (4-0 record) and #25 Harvard (3-0 record)... The Toreros rank 13th among all FCS team in passing offense (277.75 yards per game)... Four different Toreros rank in the Top-25 individually - junior wide receiver **Sam Hoekstra** (#10 in punt returns; 14.60 yards per return), senior safety **Drew Harris** (t-#19 in interceptions; .50 per contest), sophomore wide receiver **Brandon White** (#22 in receptions per game, 6.50); and senior kicker **Ernie Collins** (t-#24 in field goals, 1.25 per contest)... Among PFL teams, San Diego ranks first in field goals (5-5), punting (38.5 net yards per punt), time of possession (33:04), turnover margin (+0.50 per game) and red zone offense (12-for-12)... Toreros leading PFL statistical categories include **Ernie Collins** (t-1st in scoring, 7.0 points per game; t-1st in field goals made per game, 1.35; t-1st in PAT kicking percentage, 92.9%), **Sam Hoekstra** in punt returns (14.6), and **Drew Harris** in interceptions (0.50 per game).

COLLINS RECOGNIZED FOR KICKING AND COMMUNITY SERVICE: Senior kicker **Ernie Collins** (San Ramon, CA) was recognized by the Fred Mitchell Award for his excellence on the field and in the community during the month of September. During this past month 31 kickers were recognized from among more than 750 FCS, Division II, III, NAIA and NJCAA football teams. The 2012 recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award will be announced in mid-December based on performance on the field and in the community. During the month of September Collins led the Toreros with 28 points. He was a perfect 5-for-5 in field goals including a personal-best 51-yarder (ties 2nd longest in Torero history) against Western New Mexico. He also added two 48-yarders and has converted 13-of-14 PAT kicks. He is a volunteer for the Autism Tree Project Foundation; participates in Toreros Linking the Community events, including the Donate-a-Dollar and Toy Drive program which helped support 30 local families by collecting hundreds of unwrapped gifts and more than \$2,500.

Head Coach Ron Caragher - 6th Season

Head Coach Ron Caragher (pronounced "CARE-ah-ger") enters his sixth season leading the USD Torero football program. He'll enter the 2012 campaign with a five-year mark of 36-19 (.655). The 2011 team finished with a 9-2 record, tied for the Pioneer Football League Championship, and was ranked in the FCS Coaches Poll Top 25 following the conclusion of the regular season. Caragher was selected as PFL Coach of the Year and was a nominee for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. DE Blake Oliaro ranked 4th in the FCS in sacks (15) and was selected to The Associated Press FCS All-American Second Team and named the Pioneer Football League Defensive Player of the Year. Sophomore RB/KR Kenn James finished 2nd in the nation in all-purpose yardage (210.09 ypg.) and 1st year receiver Brandon White won the PFL Freshman of the Year (offense) Award.

In the 2010 season the Toreros won four of their final five contests to finish with a Pioneer Football League record of 5-3. The team was paced by All-America defensive end Mario Kurn, a nominee for both the Buck Buchanan Award and Ted Hendricks Award. A unanimous All-PFL First Team pick, Kurn led all FCS players in sacks with 17. The Torero defense, that also saw CB Al-Rilwan Adeyemi collect 6 interceptions, led the league in scoring defense (16.1 ppg), rushing defense (67.1 ypg), and total defense (265.0).

Three seasons ago (2009) the Toreros continued battling despite dropping five contests by 7 points or less. Senior running back JT Rogan left the program as the all-time leader in rushing (3,559 yards), touchdowns (54) and points scored (326). Redshirt freshman receiver Kyle Warren was named the PFL Offensive Freshman of the Year.

In 2008, Caragher guided the Toreros to their second straight 9-2 record, and the team placed second in the PFL with its 6-2 mark. Senior WR John Matthews was named a First Team All-American and was also a Walter Payton Award candidate. He led all FCS receivers in catches (102), yards (1,478) and touchdowns (21). The season was capped off with a 28-20 home victory over scholarship-program UC Davis.

Caragher's first season in 2007 was outstanding as he guided the Toreros to a 9-2 overall mark and 6-1 Pioneer Football League record, good for a share of first place. Caragher was a nominee for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year award. USD finished ranked second in the final Sports Network FCS Mid-Major poll. Seven Toreros were named Sports Network FCS All-Americans, while eleven players were tabbed Mid-Major All-Americans by the same outlet. Senior quarterback Josh Johnson was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 5th round, and three other players received looks by NFL clubs. Johnson, who passed for 43 touchdowns with just one interception, was a Walter Payton Award Finalist. Senior defensive end Eric Bakhtiari, who led the nation in sacks, was a finalist for the Ted Hendricks Award. The Toreros ranked first in the nation among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams in scoring (44.36 points per game) and passing efficiency (197.35 rating). The 44 points per game average is a USD single season record. Additionally, the Toreros ranked 3rd in the nation in total offense (483.1 yards per game).

The University of San Diego introduced Ron Caragher as its new head football coach on January 9, 2007. Caragher became the Toreros' 12th head football coach at USD and replaced Jim Harbaugh who was hired as Stanford's head coach.

"As I talked to people around the country, I kept hearing the same things about Ron Caragher," said Ky Snyder, Executive Director of Athletics. "He is a student of the game, elite class of coach, very knowledgeable, great recruiter, develops players, motivated, competitor, great family man, high character and integrity. These are the qualities you seek in a head coach and we have found them in Ron Caragher. He has had access to some of the best minds in coaching in Terry Donahue, Bob Toledo and Rich Brooks. He has been a winner his whole life and we expect that will continue at USD."

Prior to being hired at USD, Caragher, spent four seasons (2003-2006) at the University of Kentucky as an assistant coach under Rich Brooks. He was the running backs coach all four years, and starting in 2005 served as Recruiting Coordinator. In 2006 Kentucky finished 8-5 overall, and 4-4 in the Southeast Conference Eastern Division, good for a tie for third place and the program's best league mark since 1993. The 8 wins is also the program's best win total since their 9-3 campaign back in 1984. The Wildcats finished off the 2006 season in fine fashion as they upset Clemson, 28-20, in the Music City Bowl on December 29th. It was Kentucky's first bowl appearance since 1999, and the program's first bowl win in 22 years.

Caragher also has Southern California ties. He spent nine seasons (1994-2002) on UCLA's staff where he worked with both Terry Donahue and Bob Toledo. After two seasons as a Graduate Assistant, Caragher was promoted to assistant coach where he coached Bruin wide receivers. Additionally, he coached punters all seven seasons (1996-2002), and kickers for his final two years (2001-02). During the 1997 and 1998 seasons, UCLA won a school-record 20 straight games and averaged more than 40 points per game while setting numerous school records. He coached in five bowl games during his term there, including the Aloha, Cotton, Rose, Sun, and Las Vegas bowls.

A native of Morgan Hill, California, Caragher was a three-sport letterman at Bellarmine College Preparatory in San Jose, CA where he earned three varsity letters as a QB in football. (Caragher was inducted into the BCP Athletic Hall of Fame in April). He earned an athletic scholarship to UCLA in 1985 and went on to earn four varsity letters (1986-89) and was part of teams that won four consecutive bowl games. After graduating from UCLA in 1990 with a BA in Psychology, Ron went on to earn his Master's Degree in Education (Administrative Studies) in 1995. Caragher and his wife, Wendy, have three sons, Josh (15), Ryan (13), and Scott (12).

MILLS EARNS PFL HONORS: Junior quarterback **Mason Mills** (Coronado, CA) was named the PFL Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 9th) after leading the Toreros to a 34-27 come from behind win over Western New Mexico. Mills connected with Reggie Bell for a 29-yard touchdown pass with a just a minute remaining to seal the first victory of the season for the Toreros. On the day Mills completed 27-for-37 for 303 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions. With the game tied at 27-27 and just 3:32 remaining in the game, Mills led the Toreros on a nine-play 84-yard drive going 6-8 for 65 yards and connecting with four different receivers. It was the third time Mills has been honored as the PFL Offensive Player of the Week in his career.

2011 RECAP FROM USD-DRAKE CONTEST: (Oct. 15, 2011) - In a game of unbeaten PFL teams, the host USD Toreros (4-0 PFL; 6-1) held off the visiting Drake Bulldogs (3-1 PFL; 5-2) 31-24 in front of 2,529 fans at Walter J. Zable Field at Torero Stadium. With their fourth straight victory the Toreros stay atop the PFL standings with Jacksonville (4-0 PFL; 5-2). The hard-fought physical contest was tied at 17-all early in the fourth period when Drake's Jacob Schmudlach found the end zone from 2 yards out with 11:14 to go that capped off a 7-play, 50-yard Bulldog drive. Just over two minutes later the Toreros regained the lead as **Mason Mills** connected with **Brandon White** for a 3-yard TD pass that culminated a 5-play, 57-yard drive of their own with 9:09 to go. The Torero defense forced Drake to punt away from their own 39-yard after just six plays from scrimmage, and USD sophomore **Sam Hoekstra** fielded the punt at his own 15-yard line and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown. The 85-yard punt return tied the second best mark in Torero history; just 6 yards shy of the school record (91, Ed Bunsic vs. Mexico Poly, 1957). Hoekstra redeemed himself from a first quarter fumbled punt return attempt that led to the game's first points, a 33-yard Billy Janssen field goal. That brilliant play gave USD a 31-17 edge with 7:42 to go. Drake responded with a solid 10-play, 80-yard drive that ended on a Trey Morse 2-yard TD run that pulled the Bulldogs to within 31-24. The Toreros took over with 3:48 to go and were able to run down the clock to under 40 seconds left before **Ernie Collins** boomed an excellent 55-yard punt all the way down to the Drake 4-yard line. The Bulldogs began their last drive with just 34 seconds to go, and QB Mike Piatkowski completed his first attempt for 15 yards to Nick Rosa. His second attempt fell incomplete and his third was picked off at midfield by senior strong safety Loka Kanongataa to seal the victory. USD answered Drake's early field goal with back-to-back touchdowns by the Scudellari twins. Nick Scudellari scored on a 2-yard pass from Mills with 1:02 left in the first half, and Sam hauled in a 6-yard pass from Mills at the 10:34 mark of the third period. This was the third straight game for the Scudellari's to each score a touchdown. Mike Levine added a 23-yard field goal with 4:50 to go in the third that gave the Toreros a 17-10 cushion heading into the final period. For the game Mills completed 25-of-37 passes for 315 yards and 3 touchdowns. His main target was Hoekstra who hauled in 8 balls for 86 yards. Hoekstra was followed by John McGough (5-72) in the receiving column. **Kenn James** rambled for 58 yards on 19 carries, and added 95 yards on 3 kickoff returns. Defensively the Toreros were led by Loka Kanongataa (8 solo stops, 1 interception), **Zach Dunaj** (8 tackles), and Joe Martin (7 stops). USD's bookends of Mario Kurn (4 tackles, 2 sacks) and **Blake Oliaro** (5 stops, 2 sacks) also caused havoc in the Drake backfield. For the game USD totaled 396 yards of offense to Drake's 296. Drake was paced by QB Mike Piatkowski (21-37 for 296 yards, 1 TD).



SCOUTING THE DRAKE BULLDOGS: The Drake Bulldogs are off to a 2-0 PFL start following last Saturday's 35-7 road win over Campbell... They opened up PFL play two weeks ago with a 28-25 home win over Morehead State... In the win over Campbell, Drake was paced by senior QB Mike Piatkowski who completed 23-of-38 passes for 258 yards and 1 TD... His main target was senior WR Nick Rosa who

hauled in 7 receptions for 92 yards and 1 TD... Sophomore RB Gary Scott paced the ground game with 77 yards and 1 TD on 14 carries... The Bulldog defense was paced by junior LB Nick Underwood (10 tackles, 2 breakups)... Prior to PFL play the Bulldogs opened up the season with a 28-8 home win over Grand View before dropping back-to-back games to #4 Montana State (34-24) and #22 Indiana State (27-10)... Through 5 games Drake is being paced by Piatkowski (133-216 for 1,437 yards and 8 TDs), Scott (348 yards rushing on 78 attempts with 3 TDs), senior WR Joey Orlando (26 receptions for 276 yards and 1 TD), senior TE Kevin Marshall (25 catches for 210 yards) and senior WR Nick Rosa (20 receptions for 300 yards and 4 TDs)... Defensively the Bulldogs are led by sophomore LB John Hugunin (53 tackles), junior LB Travis Merritt (52 stops) and sophomore DB Bob Quilico (35 tackles)... Head Coach Chris Creighton is in his 5th season at the helm of the Drake program... He owns a record of 32-16... Now in his 16th season overall as a head coach, his career mark is 127-40.

GAME 4 (SEPT. 22ND) USD EARNS 51-14 WIN OVER VALPO: The USD football team opened up PFL play with a convincing 51-14 win over the Valparaiso Crusaders to extend the Toreros home win streak to nine. The game was never in question as the Toreros opened up the contest by scoring 37 unanswered points. Junior running back **Kenn James** got to the Toreros offense in a groove early, running for 50 yards on the opening drive, which James ended with an 11-yard TD run. After forcing the Crusaders into a three-and-out, junior QB **Mason Mills** led the Toreros on a six-play 90-yard drive. Mills was able to scramble into the end zone from five yards out to put the Toreros up 13-0. Mills TD run was set up by a 43 yard reception by junior WR **Sam Hoekstra**. Freshman RB **Darrion Hancock** played a huge role on the Toreros next scoring drive, rushing for 35 yards on five carries, which set up a **Lawrence Larivee** 7-yard TD reception. The Toreros quickly got the ball back after junior DL **Weston Yahn** forced a fumble that senior LB **Zach Dunaj** recovered on the Valparaiso 14 yard line. Four plays later Hancock ran it in from 1-yard out to extend the USD lead to 27-0. After another Crusader three and out, the Toreros offense struck quickly on a 4-play, 69-yard drive. This time Mills found sophomore WR **Brandon White** in the end zone on an 18 yard pass putting the Toreros up 34-0. **Ernie Collins** connected on a 48 yard field goal as time expired in the first half, giving the Toreros a 37-0 lead going into the locker room at halftime. Mills, who only played one series in the 2nd half, finished an effective 17-for-20 for 242 yards and 3 touchdowns. His favorite weapon of the day was Hoekstra, who hauled in five catches for 133 yards and a TD. James had his first big game of the 2012 season rushing for 128 yards and a TD on 12 carries. Hancock chipped in with 66 yards on 11 carries. The Toreros outrushed Valparaiso 260-30. **Zach Dunaj** led the USD defense with six tackles, two forced fumbles, and an interception. Junior defensive end **Steve Gargiulo** chipped in with two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. Safety **Matt Miller** also had an interception.

GAME 3 (SEPT. 15TH) USD DEALT 28-13 LOSS AT HARVARD:

The USD football team fell to Harvard 28-13 Saturday in a non-conference matchup. The Toreros couldn't repeat the 4th quarter magic of a week ago as they allowed Harvard to score 21 unanswered points in the final quarter after holding a 13-7 lead. San Diego (1-2) started the game by marching down the field on a methodical 19-play, 81-yard drive. However the Torero offense stalled on the goal line and settled for a 20-yard **Ernie Collins** field goal. The Crimson (1-0) found their way into the end zone at the beginning of the 2nd quarter when QB Colton Chapple connected with Cameron Brate for a 29 yard TD, putting Harvard up 7-3, which would be the score going into the halftime break. The Toreros were able to score on their opening drive of the 2nd half as Collins booted another long field goal, this one from 48 yards out which brought the score to 7-6 Harvard. After forcing the Crimson into a three and out, the Toreros put together their most impressive drive of the day. Junior quarterback **Mason Mills** led the Toreros on a 10-play, 69-yard drive that ended with a **Logan Smith** 25-yard TD reception putting USD up 13-7 with 1:50 remaining in the 3rd quarter. The Crimson answered back with a 9-play, 94-yard drive that ended with an 8-yard TD from Chapple to Kyle Juszczyk putting the Crimson back on top 14-13. The Toreros had chances to stop the Crimson but committed three turnovers on what would end up being the game winning drive. The Toreros had multiple chances in the fourth quarter but couldn't find a rhythm on offense and went three and out on three consecutive possessions. The Crimson were able to close the game out with an 8-play, 82-yard drive that resulted in a Treavor Scales one yard TD run. Scales finished the Toreros off with another touchdown, this one from 66 yards out with just over a minute to go to ice the game away. "Hats off to Harvard for playing a good game when it mattered most. Second and fourth quarters they played very solid football, while for us we played our best ball in the 1st and 3rd quarters," said head coach **Ron Caragher**. Harvard, led by Scales 177 rushing yards, outrushed the Toreros 215-58. Mills had a busy

day, setting USD records for completions (38) and pass attempts (63) while throwing for 354 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Chapple paced the Crimson offense going 16-29 for 209 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. Sophomore wide receiver **Brandon White** had a career day hauling in 12 passes for 135 yards. His 12 receptions are the second most in a game by a USD player. Mills connected with three other receivers for 5 catches each - **Joe Ferguson** (43 yards), **Colin King** (43 yards) and **Kenn James** (13 yards). Defensively, the Toreros were led by **Zach Devaney**, **Zach Dunaj**, and **Blake Oliaro** (7 tackles). Senior safety **Joey York** had the Toreros lone interception.

GAME #2 (SEPT. 8TH): TOREROS HOLD OFF WNMU 34-27:

The Toreros rallied for a 34-27 victory against the visiting Western New Mexico Mustangs who are an NCAA Division II scholarship program and member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference... USD held a 17-7 intermission lead as **Ernie Collins** opened the game with a 37-yard field goal, and **Mason Mills** completed TD passes of 47 yards (**Joe Ferguson**) and 31 yards (**Brandon White**)... In the third period WNMU received touchdown runs of 57 yards (Donald Byrd) and 21 yards (John De La Rosa) to take a 21-17 lead, but **Ernie Collins** boomed a 51-yard field goal with 4:13 to go to pull the Toreros to within 1 point to close out the third period... With 11:22 to go WNMU QB Mitch Glasmann connected with senior WR Marquis Sumpter (Oceanside, CA) for the second time for a score, this time from 8 yards out to extend their lead to 27-20... With 5:19 left Mills hit White for his second TD, this time from 12-yards out, and then found **Reggie Bell** open down the field for the game-winning 29-yard touchdown score... Offensively Mills completed 27-37 for 303 yards and 4 TDs... His favorite targets were White (8-96 yards, 2TDs) and **Sam Hoekstra** (7-53)... The running game was paced by newcomers **Joe Ferguson** (11 carries for 42 yards) and **Darrion Hancock** (12 carries for 38 yards)... The defense was paced by a quartet of Toreros with 6 tackles - CB **Jamil Wade**, DT **Brandon Pulealii**, LB **Zach Devaney** and safety **Joey York**... Senior safety **Drew Harris** pulled down two interceptions.

GAME #1 (SEPT. 1ST): TOREROS DROP OPENER TO CAL POLY:

In their season opener against the Cal Poly Mustangs, the game was closer than the final 41-14 score would indicate... Heading into the 4th quarter USD found itself down just 20-14, but the Mustangs were able to find the endzone on their first drive of the final quarter when QB Andre Broadous connected with Akaninyene Umoh for 7 yards that culminated a 12-play, 74 yard drive... CP's final two scores came after interception tosses by Torero QB **Mason Mills**... Down 10-0 to start the game, USD pulled to within 3 points on **Darrion Hancock's** first collegiate touchdown when he found the endzone from 1-yard out with 9:51 left in the second quarter... USD's first score capped off an impressive 11-play, 75 yard drive... Hancock played a key role during the drive with 4 rushes for 21 yards, and caught one screen pass for 11 yards... USD's second score was set-up by defensive end **Weston Yahn** recovering a CP fumble on the Mustang 38 yard line... Twelve plays later the Toreros found the end zone again, this time having the good fortune of freshman OL **Tobin Gramyk** falling on the ball in the end zone after junior RB **Joe Ferguson** fumbled trying to bull his way in from the 1-yard line... All-in-all, there were a lot of positives the Toreros will take from this game as they move forward... Defensively the Toreros had three players tally double-digit tackles - senior SS **Joey York** (14), senior LB **Zach Dunaj** (13) and junior LB **Zach Devaney** (11)... USD showed it will have depth at the running back position with **Joe Ferguson** (13 carries for 43 yards), **Darrion Hancock** (9 carries for 29 yards, 1 TD) and **Kenn James** (6 carries for 18 yards)... The receiving corp was paced by **Sam Hoekstra** (5 catches for 40 yards), **Brandon White** (4-47) and **Reggie Bell** (3-32)... Mills finished the day 15-for-27 for 138 yards and 3 picks... Punter **Ernie Collins** averaged 36.4 yards on 5 punts.

2012 TEAM CAPTAINS: By vote of the players, four Toreros have been selected team captains for the 2012 campaign. USD's two offensive captains are senior OL **Matt Peleti** (Laguna Niguel, CA) and junior QB **Mason Mills** (Coronado, CA). The two defensive captains include senior DT **Dustin Geyer** (Oak Park, CA) and senior safety **Joey York** (Pleasant Hill, CA).

OLIARO CONTINUES TO RACK UP PRESEASON HONORS: Junior DE **Blake Oliaro** (Folsom, CA) continues to rack up preseason recognition with the College Sports Journal naming him to their preseason FCS All-America team. Oliaro has already been named to the Preseason All-America teams selected by Phil Steele's Magazine, College Sporting News and The Sports Network. He is also on The College Sports Network's Buck Buchanan Preseason Watch List. A preseason All-PFL pick by the league's coaches after earning Defensive Player of the Year and First-Team All-PFL honors last season, he finished the season ranked fourth among FCS athletes with 1.36 sacks per game (15 sacks in 11 games) and was ranked 10th nationally with 1.77 tackles for loss per game (19.5 total).

2012 TORERO OUTLOOK: Despite the loss of 21 players from last year's Pioneer Football League championship team, sixth-year head coach **Ron Caragher** returns a strong nucleus of skill players to go with a solid group of returners and newcomers as they aim for a second consecutive PFL title. The Toreros, coming off a 9-2 season (7-1 PFL mark), have been tabbed the 2012 PFL favorite in the preseason coaches poll. To get ready for league play, USD will play arguably its toughest nonconference slate to date with its season opener at Cal Poly on September 1st, followed by a home date with Western New Mexico and a cross country trip to face Harvard for the first time ever in week three. Directing the Torero offense will be junior QB **Mason Mills** (184-298; 2,370 yards; 22 TDs), last year's USD Offensive MVP. Two targets that should get plenty of balls thrown their way include junior **Sam Hoekstra** (53 catches for 554 yards, 6 TDs) and sophomore **Brandon White** (45 for 561 yards, 5 TDs). The backfield will be in good hands with the return of junior **Kenn James** (1,208 yards; 12 TDs) and back-up **Joe Ferguson** (American River JC). Last season James, USD's team MVP, ranked second in the FCS in all-purpose running (210.3 yards per game). Up front look for senior linemen **Matt Peleti** (6-3, 300 lbs.) and **Mike Arnold** (6-3, 290 lbs.) to solidify the pass protection and run blocking. The Torero defense will be anchored by junior defensive end **Blake Oliaro** (6-5, 250 lbs.), a 2012 Buchanan Watch List candidate. Oliaro is coming off an outstanding 2011 campaign that saw him earn Associated Press FCS All-America Second Team honors. Additionally, he was named the PFL Defensive Player of the Year and the USD's Defensive Most Valuable Player. He tied for 4th in the FCS in sacks (1.36) and ranked 10th in tackles for loss (1.77). Oliaro is joined by plenty of teammates with starting experience with the return of senior defensive tackle **Dustin Geyer**; linebackers **Zach Devaney** and **Zach Dunaj** (team best 74 tackles); corner **Jamil Wade** and safety **Joey York**. Additional defensive returners expected to play key roles include junior safety **Robbie Beathard**, junior corner **Ryan Costa**, junior defensive end **Steve Gargiulo** and senior corner **Fred Obi**. In the special teams department, look for senior **Ernie Collins** to see plenty of action with punting & kicking chores, while the return game is anchored by **Kenn James** (24.4 yards) on kickoffs and **Sam Hoekstra** (11.2 yards) on punts.

TOREROS TEN YEAR RUN: Over the past 10 seasons the Toreros have combined for an overall record of 71-32 (68.9 winning %) ... Last year's 9-2 mark was Coach Caragher's third 9-2 record in five seasons ... His 7-1 PFL record earned him his second PFL title (also won it in 2007) ... Over the past 10 years the Toreros own an overall Pioneer Football League record of 47-15.

FORMER TOREROS IN NFL CAMPS: USD had five former players in NFL camps this season, including two from last year's 9-2 ball club ... **Patrick "Packy" Doyle** signed a free agent contract with the San Diego Chargers and was competing at a hybrid fullback position, but is now done for the year with an undisclosed injury; **Mario Kurn** signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Raiders, but is currently on their injured reserve list with a knee injury. Former USD head coach and current San Francisco 49ers head coach **Jim Harbaugh** had three players in camp - QB **Josh Johnson**, DE **Eric Bakhtiari** and DB **Ben Hannula**, but all were released when the final 53-man roster was made.

TOREROS PFL FAVORITE IN PRESEASON COACHES POLL: USD and Drake University, the defending PFL co-champions, were picked to finish first and second, respectively, in the league's preseason coaches' poll. The upcoming 2012 season marks the 20th year for the Pioneer Football League - the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. USD received eight of a possible nine first place votes and 79 of 81 possible points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll. Drake received one first place vote and 71 possible points. Both the Toreros and Bulldogs finished the 2011 campaign with identical 7-1 records, San Diego winning the regular-season meeting between the two teams. The two teams will meet again in 2012 with Drake hosting San Diego in an Oct. 6 contest. Jacksonville was picked to finish third with 65 points. Dayton picked up the remaining first-place vote and 56 total points to finish fourth in the preseason poll. Campbell rounded out the poll's top half with 45 points for fifth place. Marist (6th, 42 points), Butler (7th, 34), Morehead State (8th, 27), Davidson (9th, 20) and Valparaiso (10th, 11) rounded out the PFL Preseason Poll.

PFL GAINS NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP AUTOMATIC QUALIFIER: Beginning in 2013, the Pioneer Football League will gain access to the Division I Football Championship through an automatic bid as a result of the NCAA Board of Directors approving a budget that will allow expansion of the tournament to 24 teams that season. The championship's 2013 expansion will be the second this decade. The bracket grew from 16 to 20 teams in 2010, its first expansion since 1978. The PFL will join 10 conferences currently awarded an automatic bid. They will be placed into the 24-team bracket by the NCAA Football Championship selection committee along with 13 at-large qualifiers. The committee will select its eight national seeds which will receive first-round byes. The remaining 16 teams will then be placed in the bracket with an emphasis on geographical proximity. "Having the Pioneer Football League champion automatically qualify for the FCS Playoffs is hugely important to our teams," said PFL commissioner Patty Viverito. "This opportunity seemed a distant hope just one year ago, but will become a reality when the FCS bracket expands to 24 teams in 2013." The Pioneer Football League, which began with four members upon its inception in 1991, will expand to 12 members in 2013. The PFL is the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation's heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members - Butler, Dayton, Drake and Valparaiso, plus USD (joining in 1992) - which were joined in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville and Morehead State. Campbell joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. Marist College, which joined prior to the 2009 season, further extended the league's footprint into the northeast. The league will add Mercer and Stetson in 2013, improving the league's representation in the southeast.
