### THE GAME

- The Drake University football team closes out its 2012 season at Jacksonville Saturday afternoon with a share of the Pioneer Football League title hanging in the balance for the Bulldogs.
- With a win, Drake would finish tied with Butler and potentially San Diego in the PFL standings. Drake won both of its games against Butler and San Diego by a combined 53 points.
- The PFL title would be the sixth in program history and the 12th overall conference title. It would also mark the first time Drake has won back-to-back league titles since winning four straight Missouri Valley Conference titles from 1928-31.
- In its last outing, Drake cruised past league leading Butler by a 45-20 margin at home with the offense racking up 546 yards of total offense as Mike Piatkowski threw for five touchdowns in the win.
- That effort helped Drake's passing offense climb to seventh in the nation at 304.8 yards per game while Piatkowski became the FCS active leader in touchdown passes with 74 career touchdown passes. Among all Division I (FBS and FCS) quarterbacks, he is fifth.
- Jacksonville is 7-3 this season and 5-2 in the PFL after defeating Campbell, 40-14, last weekend to snap a two-game skid. The Dolphins lead the PFL in total defense by surrendering just 309.6 yards per game and 20.7 points per game.
- While Drake's offense boasts national rankings, its defense is second in the PFL in both scoring and total defense. The squad also ranks second in the league in interceptions with 12 and sacks with 24.
- Receiver Nick Rosa comes into the final game of the season with back-to-back 100-yards games after going for 119 yards in the loss at Dayton and 123 yards in the win over Butler. He has three 100-yard games this season.

DRAKE CRUISES PAST PFL LEADING BUTLER

- Drake had little trouble getting the upper hand in its meeting with league leading Butler last weekend, handing BU their first conference loss of the season by a 45-20 margin.
- The Bulldogs racked up a season-high 546 yards of offense while the defense limited Butler to just 50 yards rushing.
- Senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski threw for a career-high five touchdowns in the win while Nick Rosa recorded his second straight 100-yard receiving game with nine catches for 123 yards.

BEATING THE BEST

- Drake is the only team in the PFL this season that has beaten both the other title contenders in Butler and San Diego.
- More impressively, the Bulldogs defeated those two squads by a combined 53 points (83-30) by virtue of a 38-10 win over San Diego and a 45-20 win against PFL champion Butler.
- Additionally, Drake amassed 924 yards of total offense against those squads.

- In those two contests, Drake scored on 92 percent of its trips inside the redzone as well.

ABOUT THE LOSSES ...

- Drake has only suffered three losses this season, two of them to nationally ranked opponents.
- Drake's first loss this came at the hands of then No. 4 Montana State by a 34-24 margin. The Bobcats checked in at No. 2 in this week's poll with a 9-1 record and have outscored their opponents by an average of 14.4 points per game.
- Drake's second loss came to then No. 22 Indiana State in Terre Haute, Ind., by a 28-10 margin. ISU is currently tied for second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference with a 7-3 record and is ranked 18th.

DRAKE SCORES 31 STRAIGHT TO RALLY

- With less than 21 minutes left in the game against Marist, Drake's chances of improving to 5-0 in the PFL to stay at the top of the conference standings looked dim as the Bulldogs faced a 27-3 deficit.
- However, an 82-yard scoring drive on Drake's next possession quickly changed momentum as the Bulldogs rattled off 24 straight points to force

**BOSCH NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM**

Zach Bosch, a senior offensive lineman on the Drake University football team, has been named to the 2012 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team for his involvement in the community off the field, the organization announced.

"It's great to be recognized, but when I started getting involved in the community, I never thought about something like this," Bosch said.

"It's just what we do at Drake. Growing up, I was always taught to give back to people. For me, community service is the most simple and the easiest way to give back to others."

A native of Tuscola, Ill., Bosch was recognized for the impact his tireless volunteer work has had on the Des Moines community. The Allstate/AFCA Good Works team recognizes 22 total student-athletes, 11 from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and 11 combined from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Division II, Division III and NAIA classifications which consists of more than 5,000 student-athletes.

One of the sport's premier service honors, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team shines a spotlight on the positive, off-the-field impact that a select group of student-athletes has on their communities.

"This is, in my opinion, one of the biggest and most significant awards a college football player can receive," head coach Chris Creighton said. "It is an phenomenal achievement and he is very deserving. It is not something where he did just one thing for his resume. He literally went to the VA and started a program where our guys are visiting and building relationships with our veterans and spending quality time with them. That is the most significant service he has done, but he has been a part of all of our service projects. I'm so proud of him and the AFCA for honoring him for what I believe is a richly earned award."

Bosch has participated in nearly every service project the Drake football team has participated in, but his biggest accomplishment in the Des Moines community has been involvement with the Veterans Affairs Hospital. He began a program where he and his teammates regularly visit ill veterans at the facility – many of whom rarely have other visitors – to provide comfort, support and camaraderie to those that have served this nation.

**Bosch's other community service work includes**

- Boys & Girls Clubs - Drake's players have established a consistent program of visits to the local Boys & Girls Club branches, and implemented both a reading program to improve literacy rates and a mentor program for youth.
- Des Moines Public Schools Reading Program - Zach and his teammates have developed and maintained a program in which players visit several Des Moines Public Schools elementary schools every Friday during the season to read to children. The program is designed to develop consistency and familiarity with the visits to encourage students to embrace reading and improve their skills through the time spent together with books.
- Traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall - Zach helped to make sure the traveling Vietnam Memorial Wall exhibit is properly disassembled and packed to assist with the success of the program, and share it with more people.
- Thanksgiving Meal - For military families with husbands and fathers serving overseas. Volunteering time and talents for this important local program.
- Meals From the Heartland - Bulldogs players join other Drake student-athletes to help package food items each year in January to aid hunger relief around the world. Together they spend one day measuring and packing pre-packaged food allotments that will feed those in need.
- Blank Children's Hospital - Visits with children at Des Moines' local children's hospital to provide companionship and encouragement to children suffering from a variety of illnesses.

This is the second straight season in which a Drake football student-athlete has earned the prestigious honor as Stoy Hall was one of 22 honorees in 2011.

- Gary Scott, Jr. scored on a 2-yard touchdown run in overtime.
- Marist drove to the 1-yard line on its overtime possession, but a pair of sacks from Brandon Coleman, John Hugunin and Tyler Moorehead ended the contest.
- Moorehead's sack marked the second time this season he made a defensive play to end a game. Against Morehead State, he intercepted a pass in the final minute as MSU was driving to preserve the Drake win.

**PIATKOWSKI ADDS ANOTHER RECORD**

- Already Drake's career leader in passing yards and completions, quarterback Mike Piatkowski also became Drake's all-time leader in career touchdown passes with his two scores against Marist.
- He threw for one touchdown at Dayton to give him 69 passing touchdowns and tacked on a career high five touchdowns against Butler.
- He is first among active FCS passers in the nation in career touchdown passes and fourth in PFL history.

**BULLDOGS PICK UP THE PACE**

- In the win over Marist, Drake picked up the offensive pace by running a season high 93 plays from scrimmage.
- Even without the overtime period, Drake still ran 87 plays in the win, just the second time Drake has run 80 or more plays in a game this season.
- Drake also hit the 80-play plateau with 85 snaps in the win over Butler.
- Drake also had 546 yards of total offense in the game, its most this season and most in Chris Creighton's five seasons at Drake.
- Prior to the Marist game, Drake had averaged 75 plays per game.
- In its 10 games this season, Drake has run more offensive plays than its opponent in seven of those contests.

**GROUND GAME TAKES OFF IN WINS**

- Drake's rushing attack has struggled in its losses, due in large part to facing nationally ranked opponents.

**SCHMUDLACH'S CAREER DAY LIFTS DRAKE OVER VALPO**

- Junior Jacob Schmuldach's career day helped propel Drake to its 35-21 win at Valparaiso.
- He caught seven balls for 143 yards, accounting for almost half of the Bulldogs' 327 receiving yards.
- Coming into the contest, he had just 67 receiving yards in the previous six games.

**SCOTT GETS SECOND 100-YARD GAME**

- Sophomore running back Gary Scott, Jr. notched the second 100-yard game of his career with 119 yards on 28 carries against Morehead State.
- He also scored on a 14-yard option that proved to be the game-winning score with four minutes left in the fourth quarter.
- Scott is one of seven PFL backs with multiple 100-yard games this season.

**PIATKOWSKI'S ODOMETER KEEPS TICKING**

- With a five-yard pass against Morehead State, Mike Piatkowski became Drake's leader in career passing yardage. The fifth-year senior currently has 9,923 career yards after throwing for 366 yards in the win over Butler.
- He has four other 300-yard games this season including 373 yards in the win over Marist and 327 yards in the rain at Valparaiso. Additional 300-yard

games this season came with 329 yards at No. 22 Indiana State and 311 yards in the loss to No. 4 Montana State as well.

- He is one of five active quarterbacks in FCS with 9,000 or more career yards and one of two in the PFL.
- He is currently second in the nation in active passers behind only Illinois State's Matt Brown.
- He also has a 62.1 career completion percentage (852-of-1373), the best in school history. His 65.3 percentage in 2011 (231-of-354) ranks as the best single-season mark in school history.
- He is also the school record-holder in completions (852).

**MORE ON PIATKOWSKI'S YARDAGE**

- The football has traveled 29,769 feet or approximately 5.63 miles after leaving Mike Piatkowski's arm during his career under center.
- If stretched out from the Drake campus traveling east down University Avenue, the yardage would extend past the Iowa State Fairgrounds.
- If the 2012 Drake Relays men's 10,000 meter champion, Illinois' Colin Mickow, were to run Piatkowski's career yardage at the championship pace, he would finish in approximately 27:02.97

**SPREADING THE WEALTH**

- Quarterback Mike Piatkowski hasn't honed in on a single target this season as his 228 passes have found 12 different receivers.
- Additionally, Drake has had four receivers have 100-yard games. In the PFL, only Butler has as many receivers post 100-yard games.

**MOOREHEAD NAMED A CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST**

- Tyler Moorehead, a fifth-year senior captain on the Drake University football team, has been named a semifinalist for the National Football Foundation's William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for their performances on and off the field.
- Moorehead, a linebacker, is currently enrolled in Drake's pharmacy program with a 3.58 grade point average and is on-track to receive his doctorate in pharmacy. He is one of 147 candidates to be nominated for the award that honors seniors with a 3.2 GPA or higher who have demonstrated outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.
- The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.

**CREIGHTON VS. THE PFL**

- In his five seasons at the helm of the Bulldogs, head coach Chris Creighton has racked up a 29-10 (.744) record in PFL action and a 25-6 (.806) record the last three seasons.
- Dayton is the only PFL team that Creighton has a losing record against and five PFL teams have never defeated a Creighton-led Drake squad.

**STAFF TAKES ON NEW LOOK**

- Drake's defensive coaching staff takes on a new look in 2012, including a new coordinator in Brad McCaslin, formerly the defensive coordinator

and associate head coach at Nebraska-Omaha, where he coached for 14 seasons.

- Also new to the coaching staff is defensive backs coach/recruiting coordinator Todd Frakes, an 11-year collegiate coaching veteran who spent nine seasons on the staff at Centre College in Danville, Ky; defensive line coach Dain Taylor, the former Drake star who was an All-American in 2010; and cornerbacks coach Kahlil Carter, who played 11 seasons in the Arena Football League, Canadian Football League and NFL Europe.

### DRAKE PICKED SECOND IN PFL POLL

- Drake was picked to finish second in the 2012 preseason Pioneer Football League Coaches' Poll behind the team with which they tied for the conference title a year ago, the San Diego Toreros.
- The Bulldogs received one first-place vote. San Diego received eight of a possible nine first place votes and 79 of 81 possible points as coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll.
- Both the Toreros and Bulldogs finished the 2011 campaign with identical 7-1 records, San Diego winning the regular-season meeting between the two teams.
- In the 2012 meeting between the two league favorites, Drake prevailed, 38-10, in Des Moines.
- Jacksonville was picked to finish third with 65 points. Dayton picked up the remaining first-place vote and 56 total points to finish fourth in the preseason poll. Campbell rounded out the poll's top half with 45 points for fifth place.
- Marist (6th, 42 points), Butler (7th, 34), Morehead State (8th, 27), Davidson (9th, 20) and Valparaiso (10th, 11) rounded out the PFL Preseason Poll.

### BULLDOGS LAND FIVE PLAYERS ON PRESEASON ALL-PFL TEAM

- Five Drake Bulldogs earned positions on the 2012 preseason All-Pioneer Football League team.
- Defensive end Brandon Coleman, tight end Kevin Marshall, linebackers Travis Merritt and Tyler Moorehead and quarterback Mike Piatkowski.
- Piatkowski and Moorehead were first-team All-PFL performers on Drake's conference co-champion squad in 2011, while Coleman was a second-team choice and Marshall earned honorable mention.
- Piatkowski is the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year and Merritt was Freshman Defensive Player of the Year.
- Coleman, a senior from Cary, Ill. (Cary-Grove) is coming off a stellar junior season in which he recorded a team-high 12.0 sacks (-76) and led all Bulldog defensive linemen with 51 tackles (31 solo) in his first year as a starter. Coleman ranked fourth in the PFL and 10th in the nation (FCS) in sacks, and added 16.5 tackles for loss.
- Marshall, a senior from Glen Ellyn, Ill. (Glenbard South) had a breakout season in 2011, in his second season of eligibility. He caught a career-high 33 passes to rank fourth on the team and totaled 280 receiving yards (8.5) and three touchdowns in his first year as a full-time starter.
- Merritt, a junior from Johnston, Iowa (Johnston), ranked second on the team in tackles last year with 66 (38 solo), as well as one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his first year as a starter. He also earned second-team Academic All-PFL honors.
- Moorehead, a fifth-year senior from Mason City, Iowa (Newman Catholic), is a 2012 co-captain for Drake, who has earned first-team All-Pioneer Football League honors each of the past two seasons, and was a first-team Capital One Academic All-District choice in 2011. Moorehead has led the Bulldogs in tackles each of the past two seasons. Last year he recorded 78 stops (55 solo), including 10.5 sacks (-87) and 21.0 tackles for loss (-109), along with two interceptions, three forced fumbles, two pass breakups and two blocked kicks. Moorehead has started all 33 games in his career and recorded 218 tackles (150 solo), including 14.5 sacks and 40.0 tackles for loss.
- Piatkowski, a co-captain and fifth-year senior from Wheaton, Ill. (Warrenville South), enters his final season as the Bulldogs' signal-caller within reach of most of the school's career passing records.

### AT HOME IN DRAKE STADIUM

- Drake had won a program-record 11 home games in a row before falling to Montana State.
- The Bulldogs are now 25-4 at Drake Stadium since Chris Creighton became head coach in 2008.
- The Bulldogs last home winning streak of 10 or more games came during 1995-97.
- Under Creighton, Drake is 18-2 in PFL home games, including winning each of its last nine conference games at Drake Stadium.

### BULLDOGS AMONG THE BEST

- Drake ranks 20th in overall victories (579) among the 123 schools that make up the Division I Football Championships Subdivision (FCS).
- This week's game will be the 1,097th in 119 years of football for the school, dating back to the initial campaign in 1893.
- The Bulldogs' all-time record is 579-488-29 (.539).

### 2012 PRESEASON NOTES

- The 2012 Bulldogs will seek to win back-to-back Pioneer Football League championships for the first time. Drake's previous titles came in 1995, '98, 2000 (co-champions), '04 and 2011 (co-champions).
- Five Bulldogs who earned All-PFL recognition last year return in 2012, including first-team All-PFL quarterback and Offensive Player of the Year Mike Piatkowski and Freshman Defensive Player of the Year linebacker Travis Merritt (Johnston, Iowa/Johnston). Also back are two-time first-team All-PFL linebacker Tyler Moorehead, second-team defensive end Brandon Coleman (Cary, Ill./Cary-Grove) and honorable mention tight end Kevin Marshall (Glen Ellyn, Ill. (Glenbard South)).
- Coleman, Marshall, Moorehead and Piatkowski also have been named to the College Football Performance Awards preseason Watch List at their positions.
- Though the Bulldogs lost 52 percent of their pass-catching targets from 2011, they return the QB who threw 97 percent of those pass completions.
- Tight end Kevin Marshall has earned 2012 preseason Watch List status from the College Football Performance Awards after emerging as a new favorite target of Piatkowski's in 2011. He caught a career-high 33 passes for 280 yards (8.5) and three touchdowns to earn honorable mention All-PFL honors last year.
- Four Bulldogs who earned Academic All-PFL accolades in 2011 return this season, including one first-teamer (Moorehead) and three second-teamers (Fuhs, Coleman and Merritt).
- Each of the top three tacklers, and four of the top five, return in 2012 from a defensive unit that ranked No. 2 in the FCS (No. 1 PFL) in rushing yards allowed (77.2) and No. 7 (No. 1 PFL) in points allowed (17.8). The four are: Moorehead (78 tackles), Merritt (66), Michael Ratelle (63) and Coleman (51).
- In addition, a defense that led the PFL and ranked No. 13 in the FCS in tackles for loss returns the top three players in that category, in Moorehead (21), Coleman (16.5) and Anthony Gianaras (Mundelein, Ill./Mundelein) (9.5), and the personnel who recorded 61.0 of the team's 85.0 TFLs.
- The Bulldogs were one of the nation's top defenses in quarterback sacks (5th FCS, 3rd PFL), and return the top three players in that category, including Coleman (12.0; 10th FCS), Moorehead (10.0) and Gianaras (5.0). Overall, players who accounted for 30.5 of Drake's 39 sacks in 2011 are back in 2012.

**THE LAST MEETING**

The Drake Bulldogs scored two touchdowns in the final four minutes Saturday to erase a 24-17 deficit and topple first-place Jacksonville 31-24, keeping the Bulldogs in contention for the Pioneer Football League title with one game remaining.

Senior running back Pat Cashmore scored his second touchdown of the day on a 4-yard burst with 21 seconds remaining to break a 24-24 tie and send the Bulldogs to victory, ending Jacksonville's 16-game conference winning streak.

The Bulldogs trailed 24-17 with 10:46 to play after Jacksonville scored on a 48-yard pass completion from Josh McGregor to Josh Philpart. It was the Dolphins' second touchdown in a three-possession span to erase a 17-10 Drake halftime lead.

Drake's following possession resulted in a punt, but Billy Janssen's boot was low and short, and bounced off a Jacksonville player, allowing the Bulldogs' Jacob Dines to pounce on it and give his team an opportunity to start its comeback.

A 15-play, 54 yard drive followed, and was capped by an 8-yard touchdown pass from Mike Piatkowski to Joey Orlando on a 4th-and-goal play to tie the game at 24. It was Piatkowski's 21st touchdown throw of the year, and the sixth to Orlando. Creighton praised Piatkowski's decision-making at the line of scrimmage on the play-call.

On Jacksonville's first play of the next series, cornerback Lyndon Crawford intercepted McGregor, setting up the final drive and the Cashmore touchdown.

The Drake defense put forth a spectacular effort against the powerful Jacksonville offense, creating five turnovers, including four interceptions of McGregor, the PFL's all-time passing leader. The Bulldogs also registered five sacks and limited the Dolphins to 43 rushing yards.

Cashmore rushed for a career-high 160 yards and scored two touchdowns on a career-high 35 carries. He tallied 99 of those yards in the second half to help Drake hold the ball for a remarkable 19:28 of the 30 minutes.

Cashmore registered his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season and sixth of his career.

Piatkowski completed 17 of 30 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns.

Wide receiver Drew Blackmon caught four passes for a game-high 86 yards and one touchdown, on a 28-yard pass from Piatkowski in the second quarter.

Blackmon's touchdown tied the game at 10 with 5:09 to play in the first half, and was followed by Cashmore's first scoring run, from 1 yard out, on the Bulldogs' next possession. That score was set up by a Nick Chenier interception and 20-yard return that gave Drake possession at the Jacksonville 29-yard line.

Drake scored first on a 43-yard Janssen field goal with 28 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Janssen also had a tremendous day punting the football, including an 83-yard boot in the third quarter that was the third-longest in Drake history and the second-longest by an FCS punter in 2011. For the day Janssen averaged 48.7 yards on six punts and converted the one field goal attempt along with four point-after tries.

In addition to the interceptions by Crawford and Chenier, fifth-year senior captain Michael Lahart had two interceptions.

Defensive tackle John Sawhill led the Bulldogs in tackles with six solo stops, while linebacker Tyler Moorehead had six total tackles (4 solo), including two sacks.

DES MOINES, Iowa - The Drake football team trailed early but settled in to defeat Grand View 28-8 Thursday night in front of a crowd of 4,158 in their season opener at Drake Stadium.

After going down a touchdown after a mis-played punt return, the Bulldogs took the lead when Mike Piatkowski (Wheaton, Ill.) floated a one-yard pass to wideout Nick Rosa (Owasso, Okla.). Spencer Lee (Johnston, Iowa) converted the extra point to give the Bulldogs a 7-6 lead.

The Vikings opened the scoring on the night when Neko Graf (Rascine, Wis.) fumbled a punt and the ball was recovered at the Bulldogs 10 yard line. Darius White then carried the ball in on a sweep. Grand View failed to convert the extra point however.

On the ensuing kickoff Mike Ratelle (Edina, Minn.) brought the ball to the Drake 47 to start the drive. The Bulldogs marched down the field on impressive runs from sophomore Gary Scott, Jr. (Forsyth, Ill.) and were capped with the Piatkowski to Rosa connection.

Piatkowski, the 2011 Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year, went 25-41 on the night for 271 yards. He threw two touchdowns and one interception. Rosa led Drake with 68 yards on four catches. Michael Hudson (Urbandale, Iowa) had six catches for 57 yards in his first game with the Bulldogs.

The Vikings put together their best drive of the evening starting at their own 33-yard line and marching the ball all the way down to the Drake 12. The Bulldogs came up with a big stop before slicing through the line in order to block the field goal attempt.

Drake's defense shone the entire night. They held the Vikings to 241 total yards of offense with 12 tackles for a loss and nine sacks.

The Drake offense took advantage of their opponent's miscues when Scott Jr. punched in a two-yard touchdown as the time dwindled down in the first quarter. It was Scott Jr.'s first collegiate rushing touchdown, in his first official game. He also led all rushers with 110 yards on 17 carries. Junior T.J. James (Des Moines, Iowa) carried the ball 11 times for 63 yards.

Yet another special teams miscue lead to the Vikings final points of the game. In the second quarter the Bulldogs lined up to punt deep in their own territory. The snap was well over the head of Jeremy Stein (Carpinteria, Calif.) and out of the endzone for a safety.

The game stalled with neither team amounting any real threat to score for nearly two quarters. The Bulldogs again turned to special teams for help. Senior Naser Hannon (West Des Moines, Iowa) split through the Grand View line and blocked a punt attempt. John Hugunin (Oswego, Ill.) scooped up the ball and took it to the house. Piatkowski again connected with Rosa on the two-point conversion and effectively put the game out

of reach at 22-8.

Drake controlled the ball for the rest of the game and sealed the victory with a Piatkowski touchdown pass to junior Dan Hohenstein (Warrenville, Ill.).

The Bulldogs moved to 1-0 on the season with the victory and 3-0 all time against their cross-town foe.

DES MOINES, Iowa - The Drake University football team kept No. 4 Montana State on the ropes for nearly 60 minutes Saturday evening, but a pair of late touchdowns helped the Bobcats escape Drake Stadium with a 34-24 victory.

The Bulldogs (1-1) led 24-21 at the end of three quarters before MSU (2-0) scored twice and made critical stops on defense to preserve the win in the contest between a pair of defending conference champions.

"This is not ok that we lost, we wanted to come in here tonight and win this game," head coach Chris Creighton said. "Don't get me wrong, that's a great football team that we played, but we came out here to win this game."

Senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski (Wheaton, Ill.) led the Bulldogs' aerial attack with 311 yards on 25-of-43 passing and a touchdown. He also added a touchdown on the ground. However, the Bobcats had a significant advantage on the ground, outgaining Drake, 168-59, with the yardage split almost evenly between Orenzo Davis, Tray Robinson and Cody Kirk.

Drake's defense, especially on the line, continued its strong play with 12 tackles for loss and three sacks against the Bobcats extremely mobile passer, DeNarius McGhee. John Hugunin (Oswego, Ill.), who finished with a game-high 13 tackles, Brett Park (Olivette, Mo.) and Brandon Coleman (Cary, Ill.) each had three tackles for loss.

"Those guys were so focused today that I didn't know what to say to them from the pre-game meal on," Creighton said. "They left everything on the field tonight. Those guys are good."

The Bulldogs took a 17-14 lead into the half on an eight play, 76-yard drive, with a 15-yard touchdown strike from Piatkowski to Hudson. Orlando grabbed another key catch on the drive, this time for 30 yards, to keep the drive alive and set Drake up in the Montana State red zone.

Montana State started the second half with renewed energy. After holding the Bulldogs to a three-and-out, the Bobcats roared down the field to take the lead, 21-17. Quarterback DeNarius McGhee scrambled for two third down conversions, including his five-yard touchdown run.

Later, it was Drake's turn to take advantage of a Montana State mistake, when Drew Ormseth (Lake in the Hills, Ill.) picked off McGhee to give the Bulldogs great field position on the MSU 41-yard line. The passing game continued to be strong as Piatkowski found Marshall once again, this time for a 16-yard gain to set the Bulldogs up inside the five-yard line. Piatkowski got into the endzone on a keeper two plays later from the one-yard line to put the Bulldogs on top, 24-21, with 3:20 remaining in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs stayed within striking distance as sophomore John Bloss (Wheaton, Ill.) recovered a fumble at the Bulldogs' 20-yard line with 7:12

remaining in the fourth quarter. Drake's offense stalled at the 40-yard line after Gary Scott, Jr.'s (Forsyth, Ill.) run on fourth down was smothered.

Montana State didn't put an end to the Bulldogs' upset bid until a touchdown extended its lead, 34-24, with 1:28 remaining in the game. The 9-play, 40-yard drive, erased 3:25 of game clock, which would not leave enough time for Drake to make a comeback.

The Drake University football team fell, 27-10, to No. 22 Indiana State in its final non-conference test of the season in Terre Haute, Ind.

The Sycamores' vaunted rushing offense proved to be the difference as ISU rushed for 368 yards with Payton Award finalist Shakir Bell racking up a school-record 349 yards. The Bulldogs were paced again by senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski's 329 yards on 31-of-53 passing with a touchdown strike to Nick Rosa.

The Drake defense, which came into the game leading the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, was led by Bob Quilico's 11 tackles with the defense getting six tackles for loss and an interception from Drew Ormseth.

"That back [ISU's Shakir Bell], is special and we knew it," Drake head coach Chris Creighton said. "Those guys played hard and are a great football team. We're all about being our best and part of being your best is knowing how to win on gameday. We go into the Pioneer Football League now and we've got to find a way to do that."

The two teams entered halftime knotted at 10-10, but ISU firmly put the momentum in its favor in the third quarter by scoring quickly on its first two possessions with touchdown runs of 60 and 48 yards from Bell. Those touchdowns put ISU up 24-10 less than five minutes into the second half.

However, the Bulldogs continued to battle and got inside the ISU 5-yard line on its next two drives. Unfortunately for Drake, neither of those redzone trips resulted in points, but rather a missed field goal and an inspired ISU goal-line stand. A 35-yard ISU field goal with less than four minutes to play gave the Sycamores the final 17-point cushion.

"We didn't execute and when you're playing a really good team, you've got to execute," Creighton said. "We left a lot out there offensively with opportunities to score. Whenever we executed, we moved the ball down the field."

Drake executed early by scoring on its first drive courtesy of a 21-yard field goal from Spencer Lee that capped an 11-play, 76 yard drive. The Bulldogs held that advantage until midway through the second quarter when ISU got on the board with 22-yard touchdown pass from Mike Perish to Demory Lawshe.

Drake answered that score with one of its own on its next drive as a 41-yard pitch and catch from Piatkowski to Gary Scott, Jr. (Forsyth, Ill.), put the Bulldogs inside the ISU 10-yard line to set up a 7-yard Piatkowski to Rosa touchdown.

An ISU field goal as time expired at the half sent the teams into the locker room tied.

In a battle of two top-10 passing offenses, the Drake University football team outdueled Morehead State on a record-setting Saturday afternoon at Drake Stadium.

Led by fifth-year senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski, the Bulldogs fought off a 10-point deficit in the fourth quarter to top the Eagles, 28-25. Piatkowski set the school record for career passing yards in the second quarter with a 75-yard completion to senior Joey Orlando. Piatkowski needed just 31 yards coming in to the game to surpass Ira Vandever's record of 7,868 yards set in 2002. The reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year finished the game with 29-for-41 passing, for 268 yards and three touchdowns. He now stands alone at 8,106 career passing yards.

"I try not to think about it [the record]," Piatkowski said after the game. "At the end of the season, I'll probably think about it, but we got a win today and that's all that matters. It was a team effort and the crowd was a big part of that."

Orlando was Piatkowski's top target on the day, with eight receptions for 73 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Gary Scott, Jr. led the ground game with 119 yards on 28 carries and one touchdown.

Defensively, the Bulldogs shut down the sixth-ranked passing offense of the Eagles. Despite only recording one sack on the afternoon, the Bulldogs held the Eagles to a season low 172 pass yards. Sophomore John Hugunin led the defense with 16 tackles and one sack. Junior Travis Merritt added 14 additional tackles to the defensive total.

Drake used an eight-play, 74-yard drive at the beginning of the fourth quarter to regain momentum lost in the third quarter. The drive concluded with a Piatkowski touchdown pass to sophomore J.T. Teague to bring the Bulldogs within three points with 13 minutes remaining in the game.

After the Drake defense came up strong on the following MSU possession, sophomore Drew Ormseth set the offense up with great field position following his 36-yard punt return. Piatkowski then gave the Blue and White its first lead of the game, 21-17, with 9:51 remaining in the game, by finding senior Nick Rosa in the end zone.

Drake all but sealed the victory with four minutes remaining in the game, converting on 4th-and-2 from the 14-yard line. Scott took an option pitch into the end zone to give Drake a two-score lead. With the run, Drake's leading rusher recorded the second 100-yard game of his career.

"We kind of had to have a wake-up call there late," head coach Chris Creighton said. "I don't know that we played any differently in the fourth quarter outside of there being some passion and imposing our will."

Although Morehead State countered with a six-play, 62-yard drive that resulted in a touchdown, they could not recover the onside kick,

allowing Drake to bleed the clock to 1:28. Despite sustaining a drive to midfield, Lewis was picked by fifth-year senior Tyler Moorehead (Mason City, Iowa) with 36 seconds remaining on the clock to put an end to any chance at a comeback.

The Drake University football team improved to 2-0 in the Pioneer Football League with a commanding 35-7 victory over Campbell in Buies Creek, N.C. The Bulldogs held one of the top rushing teams in the league to just 57 yards on the ground in a game that was delayed by more than an hour due to inclement weather and played in wet, rainy conditions.

The Bulldogs held a 481-to-286 advantage in total yardage and racked up 32 first downs in the victory. Offensively Drake was led by senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski's (Wheaton, Ill.) 258 yards on 23-of-38 passing with a touchdown through the air and on the ground. The aerial attack was supported by 283 rushing yards with Gary Scott, Jr. (Forsyth, Ill.) leading the pack with 77 yards and a touchdown followed by Trey Morse's (Elmo, Texas) 68 yards.

The staunch defensive effort recorded a pair of interceptions, five tackles for loss and two sacks. Jake Underwood (Cary, Ill.) was in on a team-high 10 tackles to help DU improve to 3-2 overall while the Camels fell to 1-4 overall and 0-2 in the PFL.

"It was a weird game with lightning delays," head coach Chris Creighton said. "But I was proud of our guys and how they were able to maintain the momentum and the emotion through all the breaks."

The Bulldogs ended the first half with a firm 21-0 lead thanks to a 27-yard Derek Temple (Grimes, Iowa) interception return for a touchdown with 1:51 left in the half. That defensive highlight redeemed an offensive drive that stalled out on the Campbell 8-yard line and resulted in a missed field goal. It was one of three Drake trips inside the CU 30-yard line that came up scoreless in the first half.

"Our defense was great," Creighton said of Temple's interception return and the squad's ability to stop the run. "I'm really proud of our defense. They led the charge tonight and it's a tall order when you don't see an option team that often. It's tough to prepare for and our guys did a great job."

The Bulldogs got on the board first on their second drive of the game as Scott strode into the end zone from three yards out to cap an 8-play, 63-yard drive. Drake's next score came on a momentum-shifting special teams play when the Campbell punter failed to handle the snap. The pressure and miscue gave Drake excellent field position on the Camels' 22-yard line. Two plays later, Piatkowski found Nick Rosa for an 11-yard strike before the 63-minute lightning delay suspended play with 5:29 left in the half. Rosa finished the game with a team-high seven catches and 92 yards.

After halftime, the Bulldogs suffered one of their few defensive miscues on the night as Campbell quarterback Dakota Wolf found A.J. Artis behind the DU defense for a 57-yard touchdown pass.

Wolf finished the evening with 169 passing yards and 41 on the ground.

The Bulldogs countered the Camels' lone score on the ensuing drive with a 4-minute drive that spanned 64 yards on nine plays the resulted in a Piatkowski keeper getting into the endzone.

A 14-play, 61-yard drive accounted for the final tally with James scoring on a 1-yard run to cap the evening's scoring. Twenty-five of James' yards came on the drive that allowed the Bulldogs to comfortably end the game.

The Drake University football team's defense forced six turnovers en route to a 38-10 victory over San Diego at Drake Stadium. The homecoming win avenged the Bulldogs' only Pioneer Football League loss from a year ago and improved Drake to 3-0 in the PFL and 4-2 overall.

The Toreros, who shared the PFL title with Drake last season, dropped to 2-3 on the year and 1-1 in PFL play.

"It's early in the Pioneer Football League season, but all of them are big in this league," Drake head coach Chris Creighton said. "They shared the title with us and are picked to win the league, so our guys wanted to play well today and I think that they did."

Drake put up 378 yards of total offense, but had great field position throughout the day thanks to the defense's effort. Senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski had four touchdowns on the afternoon, three passing and one on the ground and was 21-of-31 through the air for 250 yards.

Seniors Nick Rosa and Kevin Marshall each had big games receiving. Rosa led the game with 112 yards on six catches and two touchdowns, all in the first half. Marshall snagged five catches for 45 yards and a touchdown, his first of the season.

The Drake defense forced a season-high six turnovers on the afternoon, never giving San Diego an opportunity to get into rhythm on offense.

"They were No. 1 in the league in fewest turnovers coming in," Drake head coach Chris Creighton said. "We knew we that we were going to have to change that and that any really good team is going to struggle with that many turnovers."

Junior Travis Merritt had the team's first interception on the first play of the Torero's second drive. Senior Mike Ratelle, and sophomores Brad Duwe and John Bloss each also had a pick.

Duwe and Merritt each forced fumbles as well that were recovered by sophomore John Hugunin and junior Matt Acree.

Junior T.J. James led the Bulldogs in rushing on the day with 11 carries for 83 yards and a score. His 19-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter was Drake's final touchdown of the afternoon.

The Toreros' offensive attack looked very formidable throughout most of the afternoon. Quarterback Mason Mills threw for 216 yards on 24-of-37 passing and halfback Kenn James ran for 98 yards. The 13th best passing offense in the FCS was continually disrupted by high pressure at the line and the Bulldog secondary.

Piatkowski quickly got the Drake offense going. After tossing three consecutive first down passes to Marshall, senior Joey Orlando, and Rosa the reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year hit Marshall again for a 5-yard score. It was Marshall's first touchdown of the season and Piatkowski's ninth to put the Bulldogs up 7-0.

On the ensuing San Diego drive, Mills misread Drake's coverage and was intercepted by Merritt.

The Bulldogs took over, but stalled at the USD 28-yard line. Electing to go for it on 4th and five, Rosa burned his defender with a hesitation move and Piatkowski hit him in stride to give Drake a 14-0 lead.

With 42 seconds left in the half Drake struck quickly. Piatkowski hit Rosa on two quick out passes before going over the top to hit the streaking Rosa for a 40-yard touchdown strike, putting the halftime score at 21-7.

The Drake University football team overcame rainy conditions and a determined Valparaiso squad to defeat the Crusaders, 35-21, in a Pioneer Football League contest at Valparaiso's Brown Field.

Junior Jacob Schmudlach had a career day for the Bulldogs, leading the receiving corps with 143 yards on seven catches and a touchdown on the ground. Despite the soggy conditions, quarterback Mike Piatkowski remained accurate, completing 22 of his 36 passes for 327 yards and a touchdown. Trey Morse led Drake in rushing with 67 yards on 12 carries and a touchdown.

Defensively, Drake held strong when needed, limiting the Crusaders' scoring opportunities. Travis Merritt paced the defense with 10 tackles while John Hugunin added nine stops.

Drake set the tone for the game on the opening kickoff as senior Mike Ratelle returned the kickoff 88 yards to give the Bulldogs the early 7-0 advantage. Ratelle's touchdown return was the first for the Blue and White since the 2007 season. He also added eight tackles and a sack.

The downpour hindered Drake's offense early as the pace was slowed by officials replacing wet balls on every down. However, the weather conditions did impact the game again until Drake's second turnover of the day, a dropped punt return that set up the Crusaders at the Drake 28-yard line.

The Drake offense picked up pace in the closing minutes of the first half with Piatkowski leading the Bulldogs on an eight-play, 80-yard drive that concluded with a one-yard touchdown run by Schmudlach to give the Bulldogs a 21-7 halftime lead.

Senior Trey Morse was instrumental on the drive, rushing for 16-yards on four carries, and one reception for nine yards, to set up the Schmudlach touchdown.

The Crusaders fought back on the opening drive in the second half, however, capitalizing on a penalty that nullified an interception. It looked as if John Bloss had ended Valpo's scoring threat with an interception at the 11-yard line, but a roughing the passer penalty allowed the drive to continue. The Crusaders used their second chance to cap the 16-play, 69-yard drive with a Ryan Lehr rushing touchdown to pull the Crusaders within one score at 21-14.

The following Drake drive saw the Bulldogs take advantage of a pass interference call on Valparaiso that extended the Bulldogs drive. After penalties set the offense back 20 yards, Drake elected to keep the offense on the field on 4th-and-22. While Piatkowski's pass fell incomplete to Nick Rosa (Owasso, Okla.), the Crusaders were called for pass interference to extend the drive. Drake made the most of the second chance and extended its lead, 28-14, on Piatkowski's 1-yard sneak with 3:48 remaining in the third quarter.

Morse put the game out of reach late in the fourth quarter, taking a pitch for 29 yards, to extend Drake's lead, 35-14, with 3:38 remaining in the game. Valparaiso tacked on a score with 2:05 left in the contest on a 23-yard Quinn Schafer reception from Eric Slenk to account for the 35-21 final.

The Drake University football team overcame a 24-point deficit to defeat Marist, 34-27, in overtime at Drake Stadium. The Bulldogs' offense struggled early before hitting its stride late in the third quarter to score 31 unanswered points.

Mike Piatkowski engineered Drake's comeback victory as he led the Bulldogs back from a 27-3 deficit, to add another impressive performance to his career totals. The fifth-year senior rewrote the record book again, with two touchdown passes to give him 68 career touchdown tosses, passing Ira Vandever in the Drake record books. The quarterback was 32-for-54, with 373 yards, and one interception through the air, and had 28 yards scrambling.

Gary Scott, Jr. gashed the top rushing defense in the conference, finding the end zone twice – including the game-winning score – to complement his 90 yards on 19 carries. Joey Orlando was the top passing target for Piatkowski, catching nine passes for 103 yards, one touchdown, including a key two-point conversion. Nick Rosa also caught eight passes for 89 yards, and Graham Butler added 72 receiving yards and a touchdown.

John Hugunin led the Bulldogs defensively, adding 12 tackles to his team-leading total, including joining Brandon Coleman in sacking Marist's quarterback in overtime. Tyler Moorehead sealed the victory in overtime, recording a sack on fourth down. Moorehead had six tackles in the game.

Facing a 24-point, 27-3, deficit late in the third quarter, Drake finally found the end zone with 3:35 remaining on the clock as Piatkowski found Butler on a 22-yard strike. The same combination connected for the two-point conversion to ignite the Bulldogs' comeback.

With momentum in tow, the defense forced a three-and-out and the Bulldogs drove down the field to bring themselves within one possession at 27-19. Scott capped a 63-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown run. The ensuing two-point point was converted with Piatkowski finding a wide-open Orlando in the corner of the end zone.

Drake tied the game, 27-27, with 7:07 left in the fourth quarter, to erase the Red Foxes lead. Set up by a Mike Ratelle hit to separate the ball from the Marist receiver on fourth down, the Bulldogs drove 66-yards down the field with the drive being capped by Piatkowski's record-breaking touchdown connection to Orlando from 17 yards out. Piatkowski once again converted the two-point conversion, this time finding Kevin Marshall.

After holding the Marist offense once again, Drake gave itself an opportunity to take the lead with time expiring. The offense moved the ball down to the 4-yard line, before giving Cam Bohnert a 22-yard field goal try with 10 seconds remaining in regulation. The kick, however, narrowly missed to the right of the goal post, sending the game to overtime.

In overtime, the Bulldogs' offense gained possession first and put pressure back on Marist after scoring a touchdown to give Drake their first lead in the game, 34-27. Drake's defense sealed the comeback with a goal line stand, coming up with a pair of sacks to neutralize the Red Foxes' scoring bid and preserve Drake's perfect PFL record.

The Drake University football team suffered its first conference setback of the season in a 28-13 loss at Dayton. The Flyers scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns, the last coming on a drive that lasted 8:27, to pull away and squash any comeback hopes for the Bulldogs.

The Flyers, who came into the game with the PFL's top rushing offense racked up 118 yards in cold, rainy conditions that hindered Drake's offense. However, senior Mike Piatkowski still managed to pass for 243 yards with Nick Rosa accounting for a season-high 119 receiving yards.

The teams played the first half to a 7-7 draw and as the cold rain continued in the second half, Dayton broke the stalemate when Kyle Sebetic intercepted an errant Piatkowski pass and returned it 32 yards for the touchdown to make the score 14-7, Dayton.

A possession later, Drake answered with an interception of its own as Travis Merritt tipped a pass that Jake Underwood snagged out of the air for his second interception of the season. Ten plays later, Cam Bohnert hit a 25-yard field goal to cut Dayton's lead to 14-10.

Bohnert tacked on another field goal, from 30 yards, on the Bulldogs' next possession. However, the Flyers answered with a 3-yard touchdown run from Rob Washington that capped a 5-play, 68-yard drive with just over 12 minutes left in the contest to put Dayton up, 21-13.

Dayton's next possession sealed the game as the Flyers engineered a their clock-sapping drive that took 8:27 and spanned 67 yards on 14 plays. The final play of the drive, a 5-yard run by Dan Jacob, accounted for the 28-13 score and left Drake with just over a minute left in the game. Jacob ran for 39 of his 68 yards on that drive.

The first half saw Dayton waste little time in lighting up the scoreboard with a 77-yard drive on its opening possession. The following series resulted in a field position battle that saw Drake come up on the short end until Tyler Moorehead (Mason City, Iowa) blocked a field goal attempt to end Dayton scoring attempt.

That block gave Drake another long field with the ball on its own 4-yard line, but the offense found itself in the endzone 13 plays later as a 6-yard Piatkowski to Scott pass capped the 96-yard drive to tie the game midway through the second quarter.

The Drake University football team kept its Pioneer Football League title aspirations alive Saturday by knocking off league-leading Butler, 45-20, on Senior Day.

Senior quarterback Mike Piatkowski had an impressive finale to his historic career at Drake Stadium, throwing for 366 yards on 29-of-40 passing with a career-high five touchdowns. Gary Scott, Jr. showed his versatility on the ground and as a receiving target for Drake. Scott had 88 total yards for the Bulldogs, to go along with three touchdowns, two on touchdown receptions. Nick Rosa was the top target for Piatkowski, catching nine passes for 123 yards. Graham Butler added two touchdown catches, along with five receptions for 91 yards.

Drake's defense completely shut down Butler's offense, only allowing three scoring drives. That defense, ranked second in the PFL in yards allowed limited Butler to a season-low 303 yards of total offense. The Butler rushing attack was also held to a season-low 50 yards without the services of the PFL's top rusher in Trae Heeter who missed the contest due to injury. Anthony Gianaras led the Bulldogs with eight tackles, two behind the line of scrimmage, in his final home game. Tyler Moorehead had two critical sacks that disrupted scoring opportunities for Butler, and seven tackles overall.

Although Drake was down early, they did not trail again after taking the lead, 7-6, at 4:02 in the second quarter. On that drive, Piatkowski found Rosa on consecutive plays, for 12 and 38 yards, respectively, to set his offense up in striking distance inside the red zone. After Joey Orlando converted a third and long to keep the drive alive, he hauled in a 12-yard pass from Piatkowski to give Drake a 7-6 lead with 4:02 left in the second quarter.

Momentum continued to favor Drake as the half came to a close. After holding Butler to a three-and-out, Drake had favorable field position at midfield. Capped by a seven-yard touchdown rush by Scott, the Bulldogs found themselves with a 14-6 lead at halftime.

The Drake offense matched Butler's opening drive of the half, with a 10-play, 75-yard drive, highlighted by Butler's 29-yard touchdown grab to put his team back up by eight, 21-13, with 6:13 on the clock in the third quarter.

Scott was instrumental on Drake's final drive in the third quarter, gaining over half of the Bulldogs' 47-yards on the drive, including picking up the 9-yard touchdown reception to give Drake a two possession lead, 28-13.

After a 32-yard punt return by Mike Ratelle that set up the offense in the red zone, the Bulldogs took five plays before Piatkowski found Scott again for a six-yard touchdown through the air, his second receiving score of the afternoon. This scoring drive put Butler on the ropes, trailing 35-

13 with 13:34 remaining in the game.

After Drake scored another touchdown, Butler answered with a 15 play, 75-yard drive that concluded with a touchdown, to make the score 42-20 with 6:46 remaining in the game.

The Bulldogs would score once more, a season-long 36-yard field goal by Cam Bohnert to close out scoring with the reserves in the game.
