## CAL HEADS TO ANAHEIM FOR DIRECTV CLASSIC

**BERKELEY** - California heads to Anaheim, Calif. to compete in the DirecTV Classic over the Thanksgiving holiday. The Golden Bears look to open the season 4-0 for the second straight season and the third time under fifth-year head coach Mike Montgomery when the take on Drake at the Anaheim Convention Center Thursday at 8:30 p.m. (PT).

The ESPN family of networks will provide live television of the DirecTV Classic. The Cal-Drake matchup will be televised on ESPN2 with Dave Flemming handling the play-by-play and Sean Farnham serving as an analyst. The game can also be accessed on WatchESPN.com.

The Cal IMG Radio Network will carry the game on KSFS NewsTalk 910 AM locally with Cal alum Roxy Bernstein (play-by-play) and former Todd McKim (analyst) on the call. The broadcast is also available through CalBears.com/All-Access. The pre-game show starts at 8 p.m.

The 2012 field for the DirecTV Classic consists of Cal, Drake, Rice, Georgia Tech, Drexel, Saint Mary's, Xavier and Pacific. Twelve total games will be played beginning Thursday and running through Sunday evening. There will not be any games played on Saturday.

Cal enters this week's tournament 3-0 overall thanks in large part to the junior guard duo of Allen Crabbe and Justin Cobbs. Crabbe leads the way with a Pac-12 leading 26.7 points per game. The total is also the fourth-highest in the nation through Monday's games. Cobbs averages 20.7 points per contest as the pair have combined for 142 of the team's 229 points this season. Crabbe became the 42nd member of the school's 1,000-point guard with 20 points last time out at Denver. He enters the DirecTV Classic with 1,010 points in 82 career games.

Crabbe and Cobbs are joined in the line-up by junior forward Richard Solomon, sophomore forward David Kravish and senior guard Brandon Smith. The Bears have used the same starting lineup in all three of their games this season.

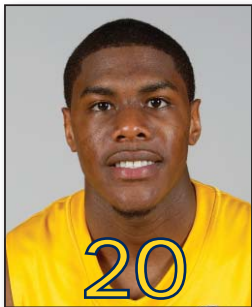

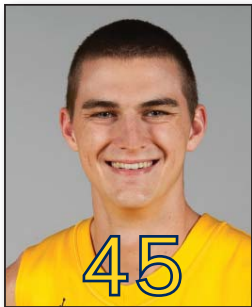

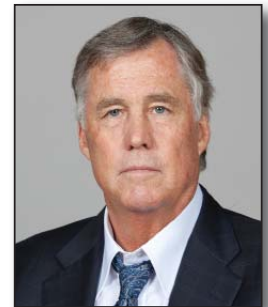

## HEAD COACH MIKE MONTGOMERY



One of college basketball's elite coaches, Mike Montgomery has led California to one of the most successful stretches in school history in his first four seasons at the helm of the Golden Bears.

Cal has earned a postseason berth and finished in the top-four in the Pac-12 Conference in each of Montgomery's four seasons in Berkeley. The Bears captured their first conference championship in 50 years in 2010 and tied for second in the league in

2012 with 24 wins overall and 13 victories in conference each of those seasons. The Bears' 88 wins under Montgomery is the most in any four-year stretch in more than 50 years.

Montgomery was rewarded with a contract extension by Director of Athletics Sandy Barbour in the summer prior to the 2012-13 season for his standout achievements at Cal.

Under Montgomery, several Bears have earned individual recognition, including 2012 Pac-12 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year, Jorge Gutierrez, 2011 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year Allen Crabbe, 2010 Pac-10 Player of the Year Jerome Randle, as well as seven all-conference honorees in his four seasons in Berkeley. The Bears have had multiple representatives on the all-conference squad in each of Montgomery's four seasons.

A four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year and recipient of a John R. Wooden "Legends of Coaching" Lifetime Achievement Award, Montgomery has brought a proven record of success to Berkeley following successful tenures at Stanford and Montana, and a stint as the head coach of the NBA's Golden State Warriors. He has led

his squads to 22 postseason appearances, claimed five conference titles, and reached the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament. Last fall, Montgomery became the seventh active NCAA head coach to reach 600 Division I wins.

Montgomery owns a 638-291 (.687) record at the college level. He was 393-167 (.702) over 18 years at Stanford from 1987-2004 and 154-77 (.667) during the previous eight seasons at Montana. In his fifth season at Cal, Montgomery is 91-47 (.659). Overall, 29 of his 30 teams have posted winning records.

In his first season at Cal, Montgomery took a team that was predicted finish eighth, in the Pac-12, and guided the Bears to a third-place finish. Under his guidance, Jerome Randle and Patrick Christopher earned All-Pac-12 first-team honors in 2009 and 2010; and Randle went on to win Pac-12 Player of the Year honors in 2010.

At Stanford, Montgomery led the Cardinal to 12 NCAA tournament appearances, including the 1998 Final Four, four NIT selections, four regular-season Pac-12 titles and the 2004 Pac-12 Tournament crown. 27 of his players earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors and first- or second-team Pac-12 All-Academic notice on 25 occasions.

Montgomery received the John R. Wooden "Legends of Coaching" Lifetime Achievement Award in 2004. Three student-athletes under his tutelage have been named Wooden All-Americans; Todd Lichti (1989), Mark Madsen (2000), and Casey Jacobsen in (2001).

The 15th men's basketball head coach in Cal history, Montgomery earned his bachelor's of arts in physical education at Long Beach State in 1968. He received a master's degree in physical education from Colorado State in 1976. In 2002, Montgomery was named to the Long Beach State Hall of Fame.

## ALLEN CRABBE

### CRABBE ENTERS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Junior Allen Crabbe became the 42nd player in school history to reach the 1,000-point milestone for his Golden Bear career. He hit the four-digit total with a three-pointer at the 9:34 mark of the second half at Denver last Friday. Crabbe achieved the milestone in his 68th career game, which is 19 games less than it took Cal's all-time leading scorer Jerome Randle (1,835 from 2006-10) to reach the 1,000-point mark.



### CRABBE NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD LIST

Crabbe was named to the Preseason Top 50 list for the John Wooden Award for the second-straight season by the Los Angeles Athletic Club on Nov. 8. Crabbe was one of just nine current players in the country named to the list in consecutive years. He is one of four Pac-12 players - Arizona's Solomon Hill, Washington State's Brock Motum and Colorado's André Roberson were the others - on the list, chosen by college basketball media members.

### PAC-12'S LEADING SCORER

With an average of 26.7 points per game through the season's first three contests, Crabbe is the Pac-12 Conference's leading scorer by more than three points over UCLA's Jordan Adams through Monday's contests. His career-high 33 points against Pepperdine this season equaled the most points by an individual in the conference through Monday's action. Oregon State's Ahmad Starks scored 33 against New Mexico State on Nov. 11. He is also among the conference leaders in three-point field goals made per game (1st, 3.3), free-throw percentage (5th, .941), three-point field goal percentage (6th, .588) and minutes played (8th, 33.0) through Monday's games.

### SCORING IN BUNCHES

Crabbe has scored 17 or more points in a single half in each of the first three games. In the first half of the season opener vs. CSUB, the junior poured in 20 points on 8-of-12 shooting, including 4-of-4 from the three-point range. In the second half of the Pepperdine contest, the guard registered 24 points on 7-of-10 shooting, including a perfect 7-of-7 from the free-throw line and 3-of-4 from beyond the arc. In the second half of the Bears' game at Denver, Crabbe posted 17 points on 5-of-7 shooting and 6-of-6 from the free-throw line.

### FROM THE LINE

Crabbe has attempted 198 career free throws through the first three games of his junior season in Berkeley, converting 165 of those attempts. The guard owns a .828 free-throw percentage, which ranks sixth on the school's all-time list. He was a perfect 9-of-9 on free-throw attempts last time out against Pepperdine and is 10-of-11 from the free throw line overall this season.

### FROM BEYOND THE ARC

Crabbe is one of the Pac-12 conference's top three-point shooters. Through three games of his junior season, he has drained 155 career three-pointers, which ranks seventh on Cal's all-time list. His .408 three-point field percentage ranks fifth-best in school history. As a sophomore in 2011-12, Crabbe recorded 62 three-pointers, which ranked as the seventh-most in a season in school history.

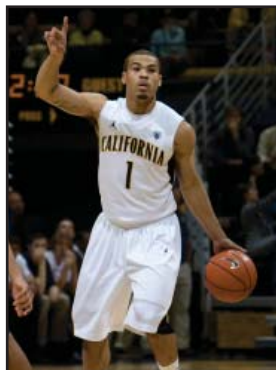

## MORE ON CRABBE

Crabbe has scored 20 or more points in at least three-straight games for the second time in his career. He opened the 2012-13 season with 27 points vs. CSU Bakersfield and a career-best 33 points against Pepperdine. The guard recorded four-straight games of 20 or more points during his freshman season, pouring in 26 at Oregon State, 24 vs. Stanford, 21 against USC, and 20 vs. Mississippi in consecutive games.

## COBBS AND CRABBE

Junior guards **Justin Cobbs** and **Allen Crabbe** have combined to score 142 of Cal's 229 points through the first three games. Crabbe has poured in a conference-leading 80 points on the year thanks to a career-high 33-point outing vs. Pepperdine. Cobbs, who was an All-Pac-12 honorable mention pick last season, isn't far behind with 62 points.

The duo has connected on 51 of the Bears' 84 field goals this season and is shooting a combined .607 (51-of-84) from the floor through the first three games of the year. The pair has also accounted for 17 of Cal's 41 assists this season.

## COBBS AMONG LEAGUE'S ASSIST LEADERS

Junior **Justin Cobbs** ranks among the conference leaders in several categories. He is third in scoring (20.7 ppg.), fourth in field goal percentage (.686), sixth in free throw percentage (.917) and tied for 14th in assists per game (3.0). Cobbs leads the Bears in assists (9) for the second-straight season. The 6-3 guard, who transferred from Minnesota, made his Cal debut last season after sitting out 2010-11 due to NCAA transfer regulations. He earned a starting role eight games into last season and finished the year with a 12.6 points-per-game average. Cobbs was Cal's assist leader and ranked third in the Pac-12 Conference in assists with 169 last season for a 4.9 assists-per-game average. His 169 assists was the ninth-most in a season in school history.

## KRAVISH PROVIDES POST PRESENCE

After a 2011-12 season where **David Kravish** earned a spot on the All-Pac-12 Freshman team, the 6-9 forward added 20 pounds to his frame in the off-season and has become a bigger presence in the post. In the season opener vs. CSU Bakersfield, the sophomore posted a game-high three blocks to go along with nine rebounds. He is the team's leading rebounder by more than 11 boards with 28 through three games, which ranks third in the Pac-12 through Monday's action. The forward is coming off his first career double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds last time out at Denver.

As a freshman, Kravish started 24 games and averaged 6.9 points and 5.6 rebounds. He recorded 41 blocks - the third-most by a freshman in school history - ranked ninth overall and second among freshmen in the Pac-12. Kravish's .594 field-goal percentage (98-of-165) was the highest among Cal's regular starters last season.

## SOLOMON RETURNS TO LINEUP

Junior forward Richard Solomon returned to the Cal lineup in the season opener, playing his first game since Jan. 12, 2012. After missing the final 15 games last season, Solomon has started each of the Bears' first three games. He finished the season opener with eight points and nine rebounds in 27 minutes. The forward averaged 6.0 points and 6.2 rebounds to go along with 16 blocks last season.

## 3-0 START

California has opened the season 3-0 for the third-straight season and the fourth overall under fifth-year head coach Mike Montgomery. It is the second-straight season the Bears have won their first three games by a double-digit margin.

## CONTROLLING THE GLASS

Cal has out-rebounded each of its first three opponents, with a +8 (46-38) advantage against CSU Bakersfield, a +3 (39-36) edge vs. Pepperdine, and a +12 (40-28) advantage at Denver.

## 2013 RECRUITING CLASS AMONG NATION'S BEST

Head coach Mike Montgomery announced the signing of three scholastic standouts to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 15.

Salesian High School star Jabari Bird, Santa Monica High School product Jordan Mathews and Ransom Everglades standout Sam Singer will enroll at Cal and compete for the Golden Bears beginning in the 2013-14 season.

The three future Golden Bears form what is regarded as a consensus top-20 recruiting class by the national recruiting services.

## SHARP-SHOOTING KREKLOW MAKES CAL DEBUT

Sophomore guard Ricky Kreklow played in a collegiate game for the first time in nearly two years against Pepperdine on Nov. 13. He made his Cal debut 6:30 into the game against the Waves, playing 17 minutes total. The guard recorded three points, four rebounds, three steals and two assists in limited action while he continues to recover from pre-season foot surgery. In an increased role (28 minutes) at Denver last time out, Kreklow posted 10 points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks.

The Missouri transfer sat out last season due to NCAA transfer regulations after leaving the Tigers' program following the 2009-10 season. He played in 32 games as a true freshman at Missouri, averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds in 9.8 minutes per contest for the Big 12 school. At Missouri, 13 of Kreklow's 22 field goals were from three-point range.

## DRAKE CONNECTIONS

Two Golden Bears have connections to Drake. Sophomore guard Ricky Kreklow's father, Wayne, was an All-American basketball player at Drake in 1980 before he was drafted by the Boston Celtics. He went on to win the 1981 NBA Championship with the Celtics. His father is now the head coach of the Missouri Volleyball team and his mother is former head coach at Missouri and current Director of Volleyball Operations.

Cal assistant coach Gregg Gottlieb was a two-year letterman at Drake from 1991-93.

## DRAKE SCOUTING REPORT



### DRAKE BULLDOGS (1-1)

The Drake Bulldogs, out of the Missouri Valley Conference, come into Thursday's contest 1-1 overall. They split their first two games of the season, with a 96-66 season-opening victory over William Jewell and an 85-79 loss at Detroit.

Drake has five players averaging double figures in the scoring column through two games, with Ben Simons leading the way at an 18.0 ppg. clip. Richard Carter is averaging 14.5 points and Chris Hines is contributing 14.0 points per contest. Jordan Clarke controls the glass for the Bulldogs at 8.5 rebounds per game.

### CAL PICKED THIRD IN PAC-12 PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

**SAN FRANCISCO-** The Arizona Wildcats are picked to finish first in the 2012-13 Pac-12 Conference men's basketball race, according to a poll of media members who cover Pac-12 men's basketball.

Arizona, led by senior All-Conference forward Solomon Hill (12.9 ppg/7.7 rpg), tallied 15 first-place votes and just narrowly edges out UCLA. The Bruins, guided by redshirt-junior forward David Wear (10.2 ppg/6.3 rpg), earned 16 first-place votes and is tabbed for second. California rounds out the top three, while earning three first-place votes.

Reigning NIT champion Stanford is slotted fourth in the poll, while reigning Pac-12 regular season champion Washington was ranked fifth. Colorado, the defending Pac-12 Tournament champion, is picked sixth.

The second half of the poll is led by Oregon, with Oregon State grabbing the eighth spot. USC and Washington State were voted ninth and tenth place respectively. The poll was rounded out by Arizona State in 11th and Utah in 12th.

Media have correctly picked the Conference winner 12 times in 20 tries. Arizona has correctly been selected in seven of the previous 11 times it has been slated to capture the league crown.

The 2012-13 season gets underway for the Pac-12 with six games on Friday, November 9. Five of those games will be aired on the Pac-12 Networks, with one game televised by Fox Sports Net.

## A LOOK BACK AT 2011-12

California earned its fifth-straight postseason appearance and its third NCAA Tournament berth in the past four years in 2011-12.

Led by Pac-12 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year **Jorge Gutierrez**, the Bears amassed 24 victories, matching their total from 2009-10 (24-11). No team had more than 24 wins since the 1960 squad that reached the NCAA championship game compiled a 28-2 mark.

Guard **Allen Crabbe**, a First Team All-Pac-12 choice, paced Cal with 15.3 ppg, while Gutierrez contributed 13.1 ppg. Guard **Justin Cobbs** (12.9 ppg) and forward **Harper Kamp** (11.3 ppg) also averaged double figures for Cal in 2011-12.

Cal tied for second overall in the Pac-12 with a 13-5 league mark. The Bears tied with Oregon for second place, giving them a top-four conference finish all four seasons under head coach **Mike Montgomery**. With 48 overall wins in its last four seasons, California has enjoyed its winningest four-year span in more than 50 years.

### JORGE GUTIERREZ NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior G **Jorge Gutierrez** was named the Pac-12's Player of the Year and was also honored as the league's Defensive Player of the Year. It was the first time in conference history that the same player has received the two awards, let alone in the same year. Gutierrez also received his second nod for All-Pac-12 first-team honors and earned his third appearance on the All-Defensive Team. He finished the season averaging 13.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game to go along with a team-leading 37 steals.

### FOUR GOLDEN BEARS HONORED BY LEAGUE

Sophomore G **Allen Crabbe** parlayed last year's Pac-10 Freshman of the Year award into a selection to the Pac-12 All-Conference First Team, this season. Senior F **Harper Kamp** earned his second All-Pac-12 second-team honor and sophomore G **Justin Cobbs** received all-conference honorable mention. Forward **David Kravish** was selected to the Pac-12 All-Freshman Team. This year was the third time in four years that Cal has had at least two first-team representatives. **Patrick Christopher** and **Jerome Randle** were each first-team selections in 2008-09 and 2009-10.

### GUTIERREZ AMONG RARE COMPANY

Senior guard **Jorge Gutierrez** finished his career with **423** assists and became the sixth player in Cal history to record at least 400 assists. He is just the second Golden Bear to reach at least 1,000 points, 400 assists, and 400 rebounds in his career. The other is **Kevin Johnson** (1984-87).

### 1,000/500 CLUB

Senior forward **Harper Kamp** became the 18th player in Cal history to record 1,000 points and 500 rebounds in his career on Feb. 11, 2012, in a 73-63 win against UCLA. He scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds to move across both plateaus on the same day. He is the first player to do so since forward **Patrick Christopher** from 2007-10. Senior **Jorge Gutierrez** came within six rebounds of becoming the 19th player to do the same. He would have become the first player in school history to tally 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, and 400 assists in a career.

### MONTGOMERY MAKING HIS MARK

Head coach **Mike Montgomery** became the only coach in Cal history to record at least three 20-win seasons within his first four years on campus. He has now matched both **Pete Newell** and **Lou Campanelli** for 20-win seasons at Cal (three, each). Only **Ben Braun** had more 20-win seasons at Cal (six). Montgomery was just the second coach to ever record four consecutive double-digit win seasons in league play. Only **Pete Newell** had more with five straight years from 1955-60. He has guided Cal to the postseason and a top-four league finish in each of his first four seasons.

## PREVIEWING 2012-13

### ROBERTSON RETURNS TO BEARS

**Theo Robertson**, who was a standout forward for California from 2005-10, re-joined the Golden Bears' program as a graduate manager for this season. Robertson starred for Cal from the 2005-06 season through the 2009-10 campaign where he was a two-year captain and voted the team's Most Valuable Player as a senior on the Golden Bears' 2010 conference championship squad. Robertson completed his career with 1,315 career points, good for 16th on the program's all-time scoring list. He is Cal's all-time leader in career three-point field goal percentage at .440 (154-of-350) and is among the school's career leaders in three-point field goals made (seventh), three-point field goals attempted (10th) and games played (seventh with 125). The forward, who was a second-team All-Pac-12 selection as a senior, was limited by injury during his career in Berkeley where he underwent three separate hip surgeries and was forced to miss the entire 2007-08 season.

Robertson completed his undergraduate bachelor of arts degree in social welfare in 2010 with a 3.10 cumulative grade point average. While training for the NBA draft, he suffered his third hip injury that required immediate surgery.

In his new role, the former student-athlete will assist with all facets of the program from a competition and academic standpoint, while working towards his master's degree at Cal.

### DeCUIRE ELEVATED TO ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

**Travis DeCuire**, who served as an assistant men's basketball coach for the Golden Bears the past four seasons, was elevated to associate head coach prior to the season.

A part of Montgomery's coaching staff since his arrival in Berkeley prior to the 2008-09 season, DeCuire has helped guide the Bears to 88 victories and a Pac-12 championship over the past four seasons. He has helped develop several all-conference standouts, including the 2010 Pac-10 Player of the Year **Jerome Randle**, the 2011 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year **Allen Crabbe**, and the 2012 Pac-12 Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year **Jorge Gutierrez**. The Bears have reached the postseason all four years with DeCuire on staff.

### BEARS WELCOME FIVE-MEMBER FRESHMAN CLASS

A talented five-member freshman class arrived in Berkeley this season, providing strong depth to the Bears' lineup. Three of the top scholastic players from the Golden State last season – **Bakersfield's Tyrone Wallace**, **Los Angeles' Kahlil Johnson** and **Del Mar's Garrett Galvin** – and Colorado standout forward **Kaileb Rodriguez** and **Carlsbad, Calif. 7-1 center Geoffrey Frid** joined the program for the 2012-13 season. Wallace and Johnson made their collegiate debuts in Cal's season opener against CSU Bakersfield. Wallace has played in each of the first three contests, while Johnson played in the opening two games.

### SENIOR TRIO LOOKS FOR ANOTHER LEAGUE TITLE

The senior class of guard **Brandon Smith** and forwards **Bak Bak** and **Robert Thurman** have provided veteran leadership for the Bears. Smith is one of Cal's top guards with strong perimeter play, while Bak and Thurman are a big part of the Bears' post presence. Each was a member of the 2009-10 team that won the league title. Smith played in 26 games that season, while Bak saw action in eight contests. Thurman redshirted after transferring from Norwich University.

All three have seen action in 2012-13. Smith has started each of the first three games with 3.7 points in 22.0 minutes per contest. Thurman is Cal's leading scorer off the bench with 6.7 points in 15.0 minutes per game. Bak saw time in the first two games, averaging 1.5 points in seven minutes per game.

**CAL DOWNS CSU BAKERSFIELD IN SEASON OPENER, 78-65**

**BERKELEY** - Junior guard Allan Crabbe scored 27 points, Justin Cobbs added 22 and California opened its season with a 78-65 win over Cal State Bakersfield on Sunday night.

The Golden Bears led comfortably throughout and were never challenged by the smaller, slower Roadrunners after going on a 21-3 run midway through the first half.

Crabbe, Cal's leading scorer and rebounder in 2011, had 20 points before halftime then gave the crowd at Haas Pavilion a brief scare after injuring his left ankle with 1:27 left while positioning for a rebound. Crabbe returned for the second half and fed David Kravish for an alley-oop dunk that helped push the Bears' lead to 57-35.

**BERKELEY** - Junior Allen Crabbe scored 24 of his career-high 33 points in the second half, and California overcame another rough rebounding game to beat Pepperdine 79-62.

The Golden Bears (2-0) never trailed but didn't pull away from the pesky Waves until a 14-4 run after halftime in the second meeting ever between the two teams. Crabbe, Cal's leading scorer and rebounder a year ago, had seven points in that stretch.

## CRABBE NETS 1,000TH CAREER POINT IN WIN AT DENVER

**DENVER** - Junior Allen Crabbe scored 17 of his game-high 20 points in the second half to lead California to a 72-61 victory at Denver Nov. 16. The guard became the 42nd member in school history to score 1,000 career points to guide Cal to a 3-0 start to the season.

Justin Cobbs added 17 points for the Bears and California pulled away in the final 12 minutes of the contest. David Kravish had 11 points and 12 rebounds for the Bears, who had five players score in double figures.

Brett Olson had 17 and leading scorer Chris Udofia had 16 points for the Pioneers. Sophomore Royce O'Neale heated up late to finish with 14 points for Denver.

Crabbe had 17 points in the second half and helped key a decisive run to keep the Bears undefeated on the young season.

Cal (3-0) led by one at the break but quickly opened up a seven point lead behind the scoring of Cobbs and Robert Thurman. Thurman scored six quick points as the Bears went ahead 45-39 near the 12-minute mark.

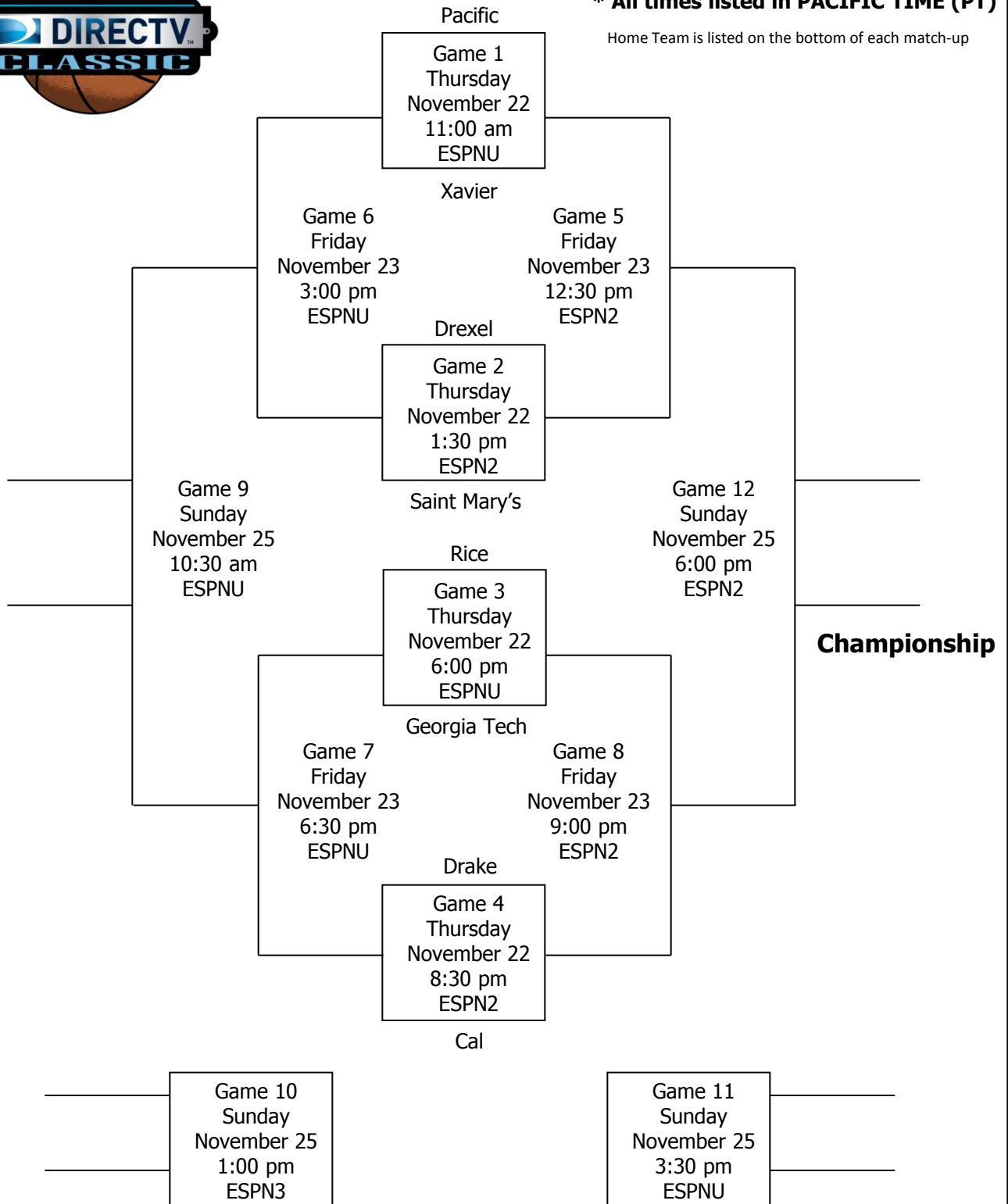
