DRAKE BULLDOGS: The Drake Bulldogs are 2-3 on the season after going 1-2 at the DirecTV Tournament in Anaheim, Calif. last weekend. DU head coach Mark Phelps is in his fifth season leading the Bulldog men's basketball program and has career mark of 64-72. Last season the Bulldogs went 18-16 and tied for third in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 9-9 record.

DU has a balanced scoring attack with six players averaging between nine and 18 points per game. Senior forward Ben Simons (6-8) tops the team averaging 17.4 points per game. Another senior forward, Jordan Clarke, (6-8) averages a double-double scoring 12.4 points per game and grabs 11.2 rebounds per contest. Clarke was named to the DirecTV All-Tournament team.

Guard Richard Carter (5-11) is scoring 10.4 points per game and is dishing out a team-high 3.8 assists per outing. Forward Joey King (6-9), center Seth VanDeest (6-11) and guard Chris Hines (6-0) average 9.2, 9.2 and 9.0 points per game respectively.

The Bulldogs are averaging 78.4 points per game and hold opponents to 72.8. From the field they shoot 46.6 percent and opponents 42.8. An

outstanding three-point shooting team they are connecting on 44 percent of their attempts and holding opponents to 29.4 percent shooting from behind the arc. On the glass they are being outrebounded 36.2 to 32.4.

BACK-TO-BACK 1,000 POINT GAMES: Junior point guard Deonte Burton scored his 1,000 career point on Nov. 17 against Green Bay and less than 24 hours later senior shooting guard Malik Story joined the club, scoring his 1,000 point on Nov. 18 versus Southern Utah. The duo became the 23rd and 24th players in school history reach the 1,000 point plateau at Nevada.

Since reaching the 1,000 point mark, the backcourt duo have continued to climb the Nevada scoring chart. Burton's 1,068 career points ranks 19th with former teammate Dario Hunt (2008-12) at 18th with his 1,103 points. Story is tied for 20th with Matt Williams (1987-91) with 1,062 points. See page 7 for a list of Nevada's 1,000 point scorers.

BURTON MR. CLUTCHBU: Nevada fans have come to expect junior guard Deonte Burton to come through down the stretch as he did his sophomore year with a game-tying three-pointer to force overtime versus Washington. A game the Pack would win 76-73 in overtime as he scored eight-of-10 points in the extra period. Another clutch three-pointer with 11 seconds on the clock at home against Utah State gave the Pack a 53-52 victory last season.

Mr. clutch has come through three times this season in front of the home faithful. In the World Vision Classic with Nevada trailing CS Fullerton 77-75 he drove the lane scored and converted the free throw after being fouled to put the Pack up 78-77 with 14 seconds to play. It was not all offensive as he blocked a potential game winning layup at the other end of the court then sealed the victory with two more free throws to give him the last five points in a game the Pack won 80-77.

He delivered the next night against Green Bay hitting a game-winning three-pointer from deep behind the arc with 2 seconds on the clock to give the Pack the 71-69 victory over the Phoenix. This coming after GB had just gone ahead 69-68 on a three-pointer. Burton's three-pointer gave him exactly 1,000 career points in the Silver & Blue.

His most recent game winner came on Wednesday night as he hit a jumper in the lane with 3 seconds on the clock to give Nevada an 84-83 victory over UC Davis. He finished with a game-high 26 points.

CHANGING LEAGUES: After 12 seasons in the Western Athletic Conference Nevada will compete in the Mountain West for the first time this season. The MW sent four teams to the NCAA Tournament last season and had six schools advance to postseason play.

In the preseason MW media poll Nevada was picked to finish fifth. San Diego State, UNLV, New Mexico and Colorado State placed ahead of the Wolf Pack.

The Pack left the WAC in style winning its sixth regular season title in 12 years in the league. Nevada went 13-1 in WAC play last season.

NEWCOMERS MAKING AN IMPACT: All three of Nevada's newcomers have been productive in the first six games of the season. Freshman forward Cole Huff tops the team in rebounding at 5.7 per game and is third in scoring at 8.0 points per contest. Huff has two double figure scoring games of 11 versus Cal State Fullerton and Southern Utah. He grabbed a game-high nine rebounds in his outing against CSF and three times has topped the Pack in rebounding. He is playing 20.2 minutes per game

Coleman is scoring 3.8 points in 11 minutes per game. He reached double figures for the first time against Green Bay scoring 11 points in 13 minutes on the floor.

The 6-9, 250-pound Fall is scoring 2.0 points and grabbing 2.3 rebounds per game in 11.3 minutes per contest. Against Southern Utah he scored in double figures for the first time finishing with 10 points and had five rebounds.

EXPLOSIVE BACKCOURT: Nevada's backcourt duo of Deonte Burton and Malik Story has started all 73 games in their Wolf Pack careers. They are responsible for 47.3 percent of the Pack's offense production this season. Burton is averaging 19 points per game and Story is close behind at 17.3. They rank fourth and sixth respectively in the MW in scoring.

Burton has scored in double figures in the last five games with three of those outings being game highs. In the last two games he scored 28 at Marshall and 26 versus UC Davis.

Story tops the team with four 20 plus point games on the season. In the last three outings he has scored 73 points an average of 24.3 points per game. He had back-to-back 25 points games versus Southern Utah and at Marshall then followed that with 23 at home against UC Davis. He has been on fire from behind the arc the last three games making 12 of his last 24 attempts.

The duo combined to score 53 of Nevada's 82 points at Marshall and 49 of the Pack's 84 points versus UCD.

BENCH SCORING: Nevada's bench is averaging 21 points per game and has outscored its opponent in three-of-six games this season. Leading the way off the bench is freshman forward Cole Huff whose 8.0 points per game is third on the team. Jordan Burris (6.0), Marqueeze Coleman (3.8) and Ali Fall (2.0) have all been productive off the Pack bench in the early season. Huff has two double figure scoring games this season and the other three one each.

A year ago the Pack averaged 10.6 points per game during the entire season. Nevada's opponents this season are averaging 20.5 points per game off the bench.

4-2 RECORD BEST START UNCEC CARTER, 66 WINS RANKS NINTH: Nevada's 4-2 record is the best start after six games for a Wolf Pack team under the direction of head coach David Carter. A win on Friday would be the best seven game start for a Carter coached team.

Carter is 66-41 in his fourth season leading the program. The 66 wins is one more than Jim Carey (1976-80) for the ninth most wins by a Pack head coach in school history. Carey went 65-46 in his four seasons directing the Wolf Pack. Trent Johnson (1999-04) is eighth with his 79-74 mark. Carter was Johnson's assistant all five seasons that he led the Pack basketball program.

NEVADA WINS WORLD VISION CLASSIC: Nevada went 3-0 to win the four-team World Vision Classic Nov. 16-18, played at home in the Lawlor Events Center. The Wolf Pack defeated Cal State Fullerton 80-77, Green Bay 71-69 and Southern Utah 79-61 to claim the title.

STORY FROM LONG DISTANCE: In just two plus seasons senior sharpshooting guard Malik Story has put his name in the Wolf Pack record books. Story ranks in three career categories and his name appears on two single season lists.

Story's 185 career three-pointers made is tied for third in school history with Jerry Hogan (1990-94). Next on the list is Terrance Green's (1999-03) 209 made in 110 games played.

In 73 games Story has attempted 461 shots from behind the arc which is fourth most at Nevada. Hogan is third with 466. Story has been successful on 40.1 (185-of-461) percent of his three-point attempts which is eighth at Nevada.

Last season Story attempted a Pack single season record 226 three-pointers and made 94 for a percentage of 41.6. The 41.6 percent ranked 24th in NCAA I and his 2.69 made per game was 37th. The 94 three-pointers made a year ago are second most in Pack history behind Jimmy Carroll's (1996-97) 96. As a sophomore he made 76 three-pointers which is the fourth best season in Pack history. See page six of this release for Nevada three-point records.

BURTON HONORED: Nevada point guard Deonte Burton was named to the Mountain West Preseason Media Team. Burton was one of four juniors and four guards on the five man squad.

The junior was also named the most under-the-radar player CBSSports and ranked as the 35th best point guard by CBSSports.com.

Honors are not something new to the Los Angeles native as he was the 2011 Western Athletic

Conference Freshman of the Year, 2012 WAC Player of the Year and a 2012 AP honorable mention All-America selection to name just a few of his many honors.

VETERAN GROUP: Despite the loss of frontcourt seniors Dario Hunt and Olek Czyz, Nevada returns three starters and 10 total letterwinners from last year's 28-7 team that advanced the quarterfinals of the National Invitation Tournament, leaving the Pack one game short of playing in New York's Madison Square Garden.

Guard Deonte Burton, Malik Story and Jerry Evans, Jr. started all 35 games last season. Burton and Story have started all 73 games in their Pack careers while Evans has started 61 and the last 55. Evans has played in 72-of-73 games during his career missing one with an injury.

Forward Devonte Elliott has played in all 73 games during his Pack career and started nine. Junior forward Kevin Panzer has played in 72 of a possible 73 contests and started 16. Senior guard Patrick Nyeko saw action in all 35 games last season and has played in 82 in his three plus seasons at Nevada.

ELLIOTT AND PANZER POST CAREER HIGHS: Junior forwards Devonte Elliott and Kevin Panzer posted career highs in the World Vision Classic. The two frontcourt players have started all six games this season taking over for departed seniors Dario Hunt and Olek Czyz.

Elliott scored a then career-high 10 points against Green Bay and topped that with a 13 point outing at Marshall. Those two performances are his only double figure scoring games in the Silver & Blue. In the Green Bay contest he played a career-high 30 minutes. From the field he is shooting 62.1 (18-of-29) percent. In the GB game he made five-of-seven shots and at MU was good on five-of-eight. For the season he is fourth on the squad averaging 7.7 points per game and is second in rebounding at four per contest.

Panzer posted his career-high of 18 points in the Pack's 80-77 victory over Cal State Fullerton (11/16/12) in the first game of the World Vision Classic. The 6-9 forward made six-of-10 shots from the field which included two-of-three from behind the arc. He was also solid at the free throw line making four of his five attempts. On the season he is averaging 6.7 points to rank fifth on the team and his 4.5 rebounds per game is second.

PERFECT IN LAWLOR: Nevada is a perfect 4-0 at home this season and has won 83 percent of its games over the past nine plus seasons posting a 130-26 record at Lawlor Events Center. The Pack has not posted a losing home mark during that stretch and posted double digit wins in eight-of-nine seasons.

tial go-ahead basket to seal the win. He also tallied a game-high 19 points against Green Bay on Saturday, capped off by another game-winning basket. After the Phoenix went up, 69-68, with 11 seconds left to play, Burton took the inbounds pass and hit a deep 3-pointer with two seconds on the clock for the 71-69 victory. Burton closed out the week with 14 points in a 79-61 triumph over Southern Utah. His 3-pointer and two free throws during a two-possession span midway through the second half brought the Wolf Pack back from a three-point deficit (49-46) and gave them a lead they would not relinquish. For the week, Burton averaged 17.3 points, 3.5 rebounds, 3.5 steals, 3.0 assists and 2.0 blocks per game.

FINN TO REDSHIRT: Junior guard Jordan Finn will sit out the 2012-13 campaign and use the year as a redshirt season giving him two seasons to play for the Wolf Pack. Finn is one of many in a crowded backcourt and allows coach Carter to have a fourth-year junior next season.

The current 15 man roster includes nine juniors and with the redshirt of Finn it allows the breakup of the large class. One of the nine juniors is Michael Perez who will sit out this season under NCAA transfer rules after playing the previous two seasons at UTEP.

FENNER SIGNS WITH NEVADA: University of Nevada head men's basketball coach David Carter has signed D.J. Fenner to a National Letter of Intent to play for the Wolf Pack next season. Fenner is 6-6, shooting guard from Seattle Prep in Seattle, Wash.

"I am very excited about D.J. joining our team next season," Carter said. "He is a very talented player who will contribute as a freshman. I look forward to coaching him for the next four years."

Fenner led Seattle Prep to a runner-up finish in the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association 3A State tournament last March.

The shooting guard averaged 18.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game for a Panther squad that went 24-6 last season. In the state title game he scored a team-high 26 points making seven-of-14 shots including two-of-three from behind the arc and five-of-six free throw attempts.

He was a first-team All-State selection and second-team All-Metro league pick as a junior. In his freshman season he earned first-team All-Metro league honors after averaging 17 points per game. As a sophomore he played his prep basketball at Gonzaga College High School in Washington, D.C..

He enters his senior season 80 points from 1,000 in his three-year career at Seattle Prep. His father Derrick play nine seasons in the NFL. Originally drafted by Seattle, he also played for Cincinnati and Oakland.

BURTON'S LATE SHOT GIVES PACK 84-83 VICTORY: University of Nevada (4-2) junior point guard Deonte Burton came through in the clutch for third time this season as the Wolf Pack defeated UC Davis (1-3) 84-83 at Lawlor Events Center. With the victory the Pack improved to 4-2 while the Aggies fell to 1-3.

With the Pack trailing 83-82 Burton drove the lane and hit the shot with 3 seconds to play to give the Pack an 84-83 victory. The Los Angeles native has given the Pack fans several exciting moments at Lawlor this season.

With Nevada trailing CS Fullerton 77-75 on Nov. 16 he drove the lane scored and converted the free throw after being fouled to put the Pack up 78-77 with 14 seconds to play. It was not all offensive as he blocked a potential game winning layup at the other end of the court then sealed the victory with two more free as he scored the last five points of the game the Pack won 80-77. He delivered the next night against Green Bay hitting a game-winning three-pointer from deep behind the arc with 2 seconds on the clock to give the Pack a 71-69 victory over the Phoenix. This coming after GB had just gone ahead 69-68 on a three-pointer.

Tonight Nevada jumped to a 12-point advantage with less than seven minutes gone in the game but UCD would not go away and closed within five by halftime, 41-36. The Pack built an eight-point advantage in the second half but again the Aggies rallied and tied the game at 52-52 at the 12:53 mark.

The two teams went back-and-forth down the stretch and UCD led 74-73 with 2:53 to play. With 1:11 to go Nevada was in front 82-79 and 82-80 with 59 seconds to play. UCD's Ryan Sypkens' eighth three-pointer of the game put the Aggies in front 83-82 with 16 seconds on the clock. After a Pack timeout Burton delivered the game-winning shot with 3

seconds remaining in the game.

The game was tied 10 times and there were 13 lead changes before the Pack prevailed.

Burton finished with a game-high 26 points and senior shooting guard Malik Story scored 23. It was Burton's fifth consecutive double figure scoring game and Story scored 20 or more points for the third consecutive game and fourth on the season. Junior guard Jordan Burris scored a season-high 11 points off the bench.

Sypkens finished with 24 points making eight-of-11 three-pointers in the game. Corey Hawkins (15), Josh Ritchart (13) and J.T. Adenrele (12) also scored in double figures.

Nevada shot a season-high 51.7 percent but the Aggies shot 54.9 percent in the game. The Pack and Aggies each grabbed 29 rebounds in the game. Kevin Panzer led the Pack with eight boards and Ryan Howley posted a game-high nine for UCD.

NEVADA SEASON PREVIEW

After one of the most successful seasons in school history the University of Nevada basketball team will mark its 100th year of basketball by joining the Mountain West for the 2012-13 campaign. Last year, the Wolf Pack posted a 28-7 overall mark and captured its sixth Western Athletic Conference title fourth outright, going 13-1 in conference play.

The 28 wins were the second most in school history, more than double the 13 the team had the previous year, making the Pack one of the most improved teams in the country. Nevada continued a trend of success during the 2011-12 season; winning 20 or more games for the eighth time in nine seasons, made its ninth postseason appearances in 10 years, fifth National Invitation Tournament appearance and reached the quarterfinals for the first time and tied the school record with 16 consecutive victories.

Head coach David Carter was named the Don Haskins WAC Coach of the Year and received a contract extension through 2017. Sophomore guard Deonte Burton was named the WAC Player of the Year and earned AP honorable mention All-America honors. It was the sixth time a Pack player earned WAC Player of the Year honors and the third time a Nevada sophomore grabbed the honor.

The 2012-13 squad returns three starters and 10 letterwinners from last season. Gone are frontcourt standouts Dario Hunt and Olek Czyz.

Hunt was three-time All-WAC Defensive team selection and twice selected to the WAC second team. He averaged near a double-double, scoring 10.3 points and grabbing 9.7 rebounds per game along with a conference best 2.4 blocks per game.

Czyz was a first-team All-WAC selection his senior year. He was third on the team, averaging 13.8 points per game and ranked second with 6.5 rebounds per contest. He shot a team best 54 percent from the field.

Backcourt

The strength of the Pack lies within the backcourt as starters, Deonte Burton, Malik Story and Jerry Evans, Jr. return. Letterwinners Patrick Nyeko, Keith Fuetsch, Jordan Burris, Jordan Finn and Brice Crook are all back. Finn will redshirt this season but highly touted freshman Marqueze Coleman joins the veteran group of backcourt players.

Burton, the 2012 WAC Player of the Year and AP honorable mention All-America selection, averaged a team-best 14.8 points, 4.2 assists and 1.1 steals per game a year ago. The junior shot 40 percent from the field and 37 from behind the arc and was named to the preseason MW media team.

Story, a senior, was second on the team, scoring 14.1 points per game and ranked 24th nationally making 42 percent of his three-point attempts. He was selected to the US-BWA District VIII first team, NABC District 6 second team and the WAC honorable mention squad.

The Pack's top wing defender, Evans, Jr. joined Hunt on the All-WAC Defensive team. The 6-8 junior averaged 6.7 points and 4.7 rebounds per contest. He shot 45 percent from the field and 39 percent from three-point range.

The 6-6 Nyeko returns for his senior season after playing in all 35 games off the bench a year ago and averaging 1.5 points per game. He is one of the Pack's top perimeter defenders.

Finn, a junior, took on the challenge of playing point guard last season after working primarily at shooting guard his freshman year. As the primary backup to Burton, he averaged

1.4 points per contest in 32 games.

Fuetsch, a senior, served as a backup point guard again last season, seeing time in 19 games off the bench and averaging 1.4 points per game in six minutes of action per contest.

Appearing in 34 games last season, Burris returns for his junior campaign this year. The 6-7 wing averaged 2.6 points per game in just over 11 minutes per outing. His 2.6 points per game ranked second among the reserves.

Crook earned a spot on the roster as a walk-on a year ago and played in seven games off the bench.

Coleman helped Bishop Alemany High School to the California Division III state championship his senior year. The 6-3 guard averaged 21.4 points, 6.9 rebounds and 2.4 assists as a senior. He was named the Cal-Hi Sports/ESPN High School Division III California Player of the Year and received the prestigious John Wooden Award as the Division III California Player of the Year. In his first year at Nevada, he could see time at either backcourt position.

Frontcourt

With the graduation of Hunt and Czyz, the Pack coaches will look to juniors Kevin Panzer and Devonte Elliott to fill those two frontcourt spots. Redshirt freshman Richard Bell, junior-college transfer Ali Fall and freshman Cole Huff will also battle for time this season.

The 6-9 Panzer was the Pack's top scorer off the bench last season, averaging 2.9 points per game and grabbing 2.5 rebounds in just over 12 minutes per game. From the field, he shot 39 percent and 31 from three-point range appearing in 34 games as he missed one with an injury.

Elliott played in all 35 games last season and averaged 1.7 points and 1.7 rebounds per game in just under eight minutes per contest. The 6-10 forward shot 37 percent from the field and blocked 14 shots on the year.

The 6-9 Bell practiced and traveled with the team but sat out the season as a redshirt. He adds depth to the frontcourt and should see time in his second year in the program.

Fall is a 6-9, 250-pound big man who comes to the Pack after two years at Barstow Community College (Calif.). The All-Foothill Conference selection averaged 13 points and eight rebounds last season. Originally from Thies, Senegal, he played prep basketball in Japan.

Huff is a 6-8, 205-pound forward who averaged 20.8 points and 14.6 rebounds his senior year at Campbell Hall High School in North Hollywood, Calif. A first-team All-Alpha League and CIF selection, he helped CHHS to the sectional semifinals and a state playoff berth.

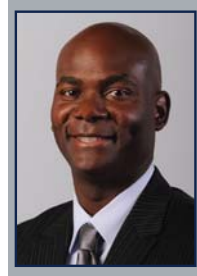
