QUICK HITS

- After two straight weeks on the road, Campbell returns home on Saturday, Sept. 22, hosting preseason PFL favorite Drake at 6 p.m. at Ed Gore Field at Barker-Lane Stadium. The game will be a part of Campbell University's Family Weekend.
- The Camels, 1-3 overall in 2012, opened PFL play on the road at Butler in week four, falling 35-14. Wolf set a CU quarterback record in the loss, rushing for 111 yards on 31 carries. In his first two career starts, Wolf became the first CU quarterback to rush for 100 or more yards in back to back games after totaling 101 with a touchdown at No. 6 Old Dominion one week prior.
- Junior running back Kurt Odom, who leads the Camels in rushing touchdowns with four to go along with 150 yards, punched in two scores on the ground at Butler with 32 yards. Chad McMichael paces all CU receivers with 135 yards on 12 receptions this season.
- Paul Pizzuti paced the Campbell defense on Saturday with a career-high 12 tackles at Butler. The mark is tied for the fourth-most in a single game in the CU record books, and the most by a Campbell player this season.
- The Camels will take on Drake for the fifth time in the series' short history, with the Bulldogs owning a 4-0 edge over Campbell. The meeting will be just the second in Buies Creek, with the first coming in 2010.

CAMEL NOTES | LAST TIME OUT

The Camels, 1-3 overall in 2012, opened PFL play on the road at Butler in week four, falling 35-14. Wolf set a CU quarterback record in the loss, rushing for 111 yards on 31 carries. In his first two career starts, Wolf became the first CU quarterback to rush for 100 or more yards in back to back games after totaling 101 with a touchdown at No. 6 Old Dominion one week prior.

Despite playing in just two of the Camels' four games this season, Wolf leads the team in rushing while topping the PFL in yards per game. The Stanley, Va. native added a career-high 159 yards passing, completing 17-of-23 without an interception. His long pass of 36 yards to Jordan Hildreth set up the Camels' touchdown just before the end of the first half, cutting the Butler lead to 14-7.

Junior running back Kurt Odom, who leads the Camels in rushing touchdowns with four to go along with 150 yards, punched in two scores on the ground at Butler with 32 yards. Chad McMichael paces all CU receivers with 135 yards on 12 receptions this season.

Paul Pizzuti paced the Campbell defense on Saturday with a career-high 12 tackles at Butler. The mark is tied for the fourth-most in a single game in the CU record books, and the most by a Campbell player this season. Pizzuti added a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery in the game, and now leads the Camels in tackles this season with 34.

Redshirt sophomore Isaac Scott leads the team with 6.5 tackles for loss, including 3.5 sacks. The defensive lineman stands fourth on the team with 23 total tackles and a forced fumble.

SCOUTING DRAKE

Drake heads into the weekend at 2-2 overall and 1-0 in league play coming off a 28-25 win over Morehead State.

Senior quarterback Matt Piatkowski, averaging 294.8 passing yards per game with seven touchdowns. Sophomore Gary Scott adds 67.8 yards rushing per game with two scores, ranking second in the league. Senior wide receivers Joey Orlando and Nick Rosa combine for 106.8 yards per game.

The Drake defense leads the PFL in total sacks with 14, edging out the Campbell's 11. Senior linebacker Tyler Morehead leads the conference with 4.0 sacks while Brandon Coleman ranks fourth with 3.0. John Hugunin and Travis Merritt lead the Bulldogs with 46 and 45 tackles, respectively.

The Camels will take on Drake for the fifth time in the series' short history, with the Bulldogs owning a 4-0 edge over Campbell. The meeting will be just the second in Buies Creek, with the first coming in 2010. In that game, Drake came away with the

14-12 edge.

NEXT UP FOR THE CAMELS

Campbell will enjoy a bye week for Oct. 6 before heading to San Diego on Oct. 13. The West Coast trip will be the Camels' first in program history.

THE WOLF ERA BEGINS

Junior quarterback Dakota Wolf started the first game of his career at Old Dominion. Now, two starts in, the junior leads the Camels in rushing with 212 yards, adding 215 yards passing.

Starting in place of injured senior Braden Smith, Wolf has led the team to its first two 200 yard rushing games of the season.

Wolf set a CU quarterback record in the loss, rushing for 111 yards on 31 carries. In his first two career starts, Wolf became the first CU quarterback to rush for 100 or more yards in back to back games after totaling 101 with a touchdown at No. 6 Old Dominion one week prior.

Despite playing in just two of the Camels' four games this season, Wolf leads the team in rushing while topping the PFL in yards per game. The Stanley, Va. native added a career-high 159 yards passing, completing 17-of-23 without an interception.

His long pass of 36 yards to Jordan Hildreth set up the Camels' touchdown just before the end of the first half, cutting the Butler lead to 14-7.

Coming into the ODU game, the 6-foot-3 Stanley, Va. native had seen action in seven games over two seasons, going 5-for-10 for 54 yards through the air. Wolf has also rushed 11 times for 64 yards in his career, posting a long of 33 as a freshman in 2010 against Valparaiso.

CAMELS AMONG PFL LEADERS

Campbell stands second in the PFL in team rushing at 169.8 yards per game, while standing second in the league in sacks with 11. Individually, Kurt Odom, who has rushed for four touchdowns in 2012, is sixth in the PFL in rushing at 50.0 yards per game. Senior defensive back Brandon Chandler is third in

CAMELS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

The Camels fell to 0-2 all-time against ranked opponents with their 70-14 loss at No. 6/4 Old Dominion. In 2010, the Camels nearly upset No. 22 Jacksonville on the road, falling to the Dolphins 31-24 after leading 17-14 at the half.

USING ALL FOUR DOWNS

The Camels were 4-for-4 in fourth down conversions in its 10-0 win over UVA-Wise, including 3-for-3 on the team's fourth quarter touchdown drive.

Clinging to a 3-0 lead to begin the fourth quarter, faced a fourth and one on the Wise 46, when Braden Smith rushed up the middle for a first down. five plays later, the Camels faced another fourth down (4th-and-2, Wise-21), when Smith found Chad McMichael on the right side for a four yard gain and another first down.

Four plays later, Campbell stood on the Wise 11 yard line with another fourth down try. Smith's pass to McMichael in the end-zone fell incomplete, but a pass interference call moved Campbell down to the two yard line, first and goal.

Smith's next pass found a wide-open Alex Green for a touchdown, giving Campbell a 10-0 lead after Sam Eberwein's PAT.

The Camels again faced fourth down in their final drive of the game, this time at the UVA-Wise 28 and 2:53 on the clock and three yards to go. Josh Williams pushed for 10 yards for another first down, preserving the ball for CU.

PITCHING A SHUTOUT

The Camels came away with a 10-0 shutout over visiting UVA-Wise in week two. The shutout was the second-ever in the modern era of CU football. Campbell's only other shutout came in a 76-0 win over Apprentice in last season's home opener.

The Cavaliers posted eight penalties for 169 yards, with the Camels giving up four for 40 yards. CU allowed just 175 yards of total offense in the win.

PRESS CREDENTIALS

Press credentials are limited to working members of the print and electronic media, as well as photographers and videographers. Photographers are restricted to designated areas of the field.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

The Campbell Media Services Department will attempt to arrange all reasonable requests for interviews with Fighting Camel head coach Dale Steele and team members. With respect to practice, study and personal time, a few guidelines should be followed.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interview requests with Campbell football players must be arranged through the media services office. Players are generally available for interviews immediately following practice sessions. If a media member desires to set up a telephone interview, this can be arranged.

POST GAME INTERVIEWS

Following each home game, the visiting head coach and any requested players will be brought to the media interview room after a 10-minute cool-down period. Campbell head coach Dale Steele and players will follow in the interview room. The Campbell locker room is closed to all individuals with the exception of authorized team or university personnel.

ROAD INTERVIEWS

Interviews with Coach Steele or team members away from campus or contact outside of playing sites must be arranged through the media services department. Every attempt will be made to satisfy the interview request within reason.

HEAD COACH INTERVIEWS

Requests for interviews with Coach Steele should be made through assistant director of athletic media services Jason Williams at (910) 814-4367 or (910) 228-6908.

HOME GAME SERVICES

Working press facilities are available at Barker-Lane Stadium / Ed Gore Field. Telephone lines, high-speed internet connections, wireless internet connections and fax services are available upon request.

Campbell Athletics Media Services will provide a pre-game snack to working media members in the press box. A full NCAA box score and play-by-play sheets will be distributed as soon as possible following the completion of each game. Stats are also provided to press row after each quarter, and after scoring plays.

WILLIAMS IMPRESSES IN FIRST START

In just his first career start, redshirt sophomore running back Josh Williams posted 89 yards rushing on 23 carries, adding a team-high four catches for 26 yards. Williams came into the night with just 12 career rushing yards on two carries.

Williams posted 16 yards on six carries in the team’s fourth quarter touchdown drive, and converted a crucial fourth down later in the period to preserve the ball and keep the clock running for the Camels.

MOORE PASSES PUNTING DUTIES TO LUTZ

With his pair of punts against Shorter in Campbell’s 2012 opener, sophomore Adam Lutz broke a streak of 221 Campbell punts by four-year starter Ted Moore, and became just the third person to punt for Campbell in a game.

Moore amassed 8,711 punt yards in four seasons, averaging 39.4 yards per kick. Brennan Burt is the only other Camel to punt in a game, kicking 11 times over the team’s first two games of the 2008 season.

CAMELS OPEN '12 WITH THURSDAY NIGHT GAME

The Camels welcomed 5,130 fans to their season opener, the third largest home attendance in CU history, surpassed only by the program’s first game (5,845 vs. Birmingham-Southern, 8/30/08) and against Old Dominion in 2010 (5,462, 9/11/10). In Campbell’s 31-20 loss to Shorter, senior quarterback Braden Smith passed for 336 yards with 29 completions, both school records, adding a touchdown through the air and 42 yards rushing.

Campbell fell to 2-3 all-time in season openers and 2-3 all-time in home openers. CU is now 2-3 all-time in night games and break a three-game home winning streak (the longest in program history), dating back to last season. The Camels are 4-9 in

BARKER-LANE ADDS LIGHTS

Campbell hosted not only its first ever Thursday game for the program on Aug. 30 against Shorter, but hosted a night game for the first time as well. The installation of lights was completed at Campbell's Ed Gore Field at Barker-Lane Stadium over the offseason.

The four 110-foot poles, two on each side of the stadium, feature 42 each and 168 total fixtures, providing 100 foot candle on all portions of the playing field.

The stadium's permanent lights will allow the Camels more options for practice times, as well as greater flexibility for broadcasts and other sporting events.

SMITH SETS SCHOOL RECORDS IN OPENER

In Campbell's 31-20 loss to Shorter, senior quarterback Braden Smith passed for 336 yards with 29 completions, both school records, adding 42 yards rushing. Smith added a 10-yard passing touchdown to Jonathan Rogers, and a long of 38 yards to Matt Tanner. Eight different Camels caught passes from Smith.

TOP CU PERFORMERS VS. SHORTER

In addition to Braden Smith's record-setting performance, Campbell was led by Isaac Scott, who notched a career-high 10 tackles, including four solo tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss. Scott's 2.0 tackles for loss tied for sixth in the team's single-game history. Scott's two tackles for loss set Shorter back six yards. Scott was one of two Camels with double-digit tackles on the day, along with Matt Farris.

Senior defensive back Brandon Chandler returned six total kicks,

including four kickoffs, for 115 total yards. Chandler posted a long kickoff return for 27 yards, and a long punt return for 23 yards. Chandler added seven tackles in the game, including four solo stops. The senior posted a pass breakup and blocked one field goal attempt.

Junior running back Kurt Odom added 65 yards rushing with a touchdown, while senior wide out Matt Tanner caught six passes for 90 yards in his CU debut.

BUILDING ON 2011

The Camels are coming off their most successful season to date, finishing 2011 at 6-5 overall and 5-3 in Pioneer Football League play to mark the program's highest win total since restarting the program in 2008. The Camels led the PFL in rushing for the third straight year at 210.45 yards per game, and placed 11 on all-conference teams.

PFL GAINS FCS CHAMPIONSHIP AUTOMATIC QUALIFIER STATUS

Beginning in 2013, the Pioneer Football League will gain access to the Division I Football Championship through an automatic bid as a result of the NCAA Board of Directors approving a budget that will allow expansion of the tournament to 24 teams.

The championship's 2013 expansion will be the second this decade after the bracket grew from 16 to 20 teams in 2010, its first expansion since 1978.

The PFL will join 10 conferences currently awarded an automatic bid. They will be placed into the 24-team bracket by the NCAA Football Championship selection committee along with 13 at-

large qualifiers. The committee will select its eight national seeds which will receive first-round byes. The remaining 16 teams will then be placed in the bracket with an emphasis on geographical proximity.

The Pioneer Football League, which began with four members upon its inception in 1991, will expand to 12 members in 2013. It is the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference.

The PFL is a truly national conference with members on each coast and throughout the nation's heartland. The league still retains four of its charter members – Butler University, the University of Dayton, Drake University and Valparaiso University, plus the University of San Diego (joining in 1992) – which were joined in 2001 by Davidson College, Jacksonville University and Morehead State University.

Campbell University joined the PFL in 2008, its first season of intercollegiate football. Marist College, which joined prior to the 2009 season, further extended the league's footprint into the northeast. The league will add Mercer University and Stetson University in 2013, improving the league's representation in the southeast.

CHANGE OF THE GUARD ON THE OFFENSIVE LINE

After graduating nearly its entire offensive line, a unit that had started virtually every game in Campbell's modern football history, the Camels will start only two linemen with starting experience in their careers.

Senior Daniel Ritter, expected to make the transition to right tackle after playing most of his career at right guard, has logged 13 of the unit's 15 collective starts. Sophomore Dalton Brown started two games as a true freshman in 2011 at guard, and will take over duties at center this season. Will Sawyer and Adam

For the sixth-straight year, Campbell University’s flagship station is 107.3 WCLN-FM. WCLN’s 92,000-watt signal reaches parts of 21 counties in southeastern North Carolina including all of Harnett, Cumberland, Johnston, and Sampson counties. The station’s signal also covers a majority of Wake County, including a large portion of Raleigh.



In addition to the on-air signals at 107.3 WCLN-FM, audio and video coverage of Campbell Football games is also available on-line at GoCamels.com, the official web site of Campbell Athletics.

Football coverage on the Campbell University Radio Network will begin 30 minutes prior to the scheduled kickoff time with a comprehensive pregame show. The Bojangle's Tailgate Show includes a complete breakdown of the day's contest, interviews, and scores from around the Pioneer Football League and the nation.

Coverage continues well after the final whistle has blown. The Postgame Report features reaction from Coach Steele and selected players, final statistics from the game, highlights and other game scores.

If you can't make it to Buies Creek you can still see every Campbell home game live at GoCamels.com. Fans can buy the season package with every home football game, or buy a per game subscription. Fans can also get free audio of every game, both home and away, on GoCamels.com

THE VOICE OF THE CAMELS

Athletics Marketing Coordinator Chris Hemeyer is in his second year as the radio voice of Fighting Camel Football and Men's Basketball.

Hemeyer joined the Fighting Camel staff in 2011 from Kinston, NC, where he was Director of Broadcasting and Public Relations for the Kinston Indians, the Cleveland Indians affiliate in the Carolina (Class A) League. In his six years with the Indians, the radio network grew from one to four stations. He also produced and hosted a weekly television show, Tribe Talk, and spear-headed the All-Star Student Program, which reached more than 66,000 students in Eastern North Carolina.

In addition, the native of Columbia, Mo., oversees Campbell's web streaming video and audio program, the production of video content for GoCamels.com as well as producing marketing and promotional videos for the athletics department. Campbell produces live web streaming of home events in football, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, wrestling, baseball and softball.

PFL ADDS MERCER, STETSON IN 2013

Pioneer Football League Commissioner Patty Viverito announced in June of 2011 that Mercer University and Stetson University have accepted the league's invitations for membership. Both institutions will begin play with the 2013 season, bringing the league's membership to 12 teams.

Mercer, located in Macon, Ga., announced the return of its football program in 2010. The Bears have not competed in football since 1941 but its history includes playing the first football game in Georgia against the University of Georgia in 1892. Mercer is the only private university in Georgia with NCAA Division I membership.

Stetson, located in DeLand, Fla., will return to the football gridiron for the first time in 57 years after a 2011 decision to reinstate the program. The Hatters last competed in football during the 1956 season, however the program's roots can be traced back to the first organized football game played in Florida.

TAR HEEL BRED

Of the 108 players on Campbell's 2012 preseason roster, 74 of them are from the Camels' home state of North Carolina. That number is down six, from 80 last season. Only one other state has produced double digit Camels for the 2012 unit, with 12 South Carolinians sporting Orange and Black this season. There are also nine Camels from the state of Virginia.

ODOM A DUAL THREAT ON THE GRIDIRON & THE DIAMOND

Campbell junior running back Kurt Odom, expected to be one of the Camels' top offensive options in 2012, is also a member of the CU baseball team in the spring. Odom, a former four-sport star at Robbinsville High School in western North Carolina, was named First Team Academic All-PFL last season, while earning CoSIDA Academic All-District III and PFL Academic Honor Roll accolades.

Odom collected 534 all purpose yards with 288 yards rushing, 57 receiving, 176 yards returning kicks and 13 yards returning punts on the CU football team. He also played in 23 games for the record-setting 2011 Campbell baseball team as an outfielder, scoring eight runs and stealing six bases.

CAMPBELL WEEKLY TEAM AWARDS

The Campbell coaching staff began issuing awards during the team's preseason camp, and will continue to do so weekly throughout the season.

An orange hard hat is awarded to the team's offensive MVP, while the defensive winner receives a lunch pale. Campbell's special teams performer gets the sledge hammer with an orange "CU" painted on the head.

2012 CAMPBELL UNITY COUNCIL

Each season, the Campbell football team selects a number of representatives to serve as team leaders on what the Camels call their "Unity Council." The unit consists of members from each class and position.

This year's unity council is Daniel Ritter (OL), Alex Green (TE), Chad McMichael (WR), Kurt Odom (RB), Braden Smith (QB), Isaac Scott (DL), Mike Rudisill (LB), Paul Pizzuti (DB), Steth Monroe (DB), Sam Eberwein (Special Teams), Ryan Davis (Sr.), Will Sawyer (Jr.), Dalton Dillon (So.) and Brandon Mobley (Fr.).

In addition to their team leadership duties, Eberwein, Rudisill and Odom also represent Campbell student-athletes on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Elected on Aug. 26, Eberwein will serve as the SAAC president for the 2012-13 year.
