The Drake University women's basketball team will play its third-straight 2019 NCAA Tournament team Wednesday night when it visits South Dakota. Tipoff in Vermillion is scheduled for 7 p.m. and the game will be streamed on ESPN+.

Drake (2-0) and South Dakota (2-0) resumed their rivalry last season as the Bulldogs claimed a 76-64 win at the Knapp Center. The Bulldogs and Coyotes were picked No. 1 and 2, respectively, in this season's first ESPN+ Mid-Major poll.

Drake has a pair of home wins over South Dakota State and Iowa State while South Dakota collected two hard-fought road victories at Northeastern and Green Bay. Each team had players be named their respective conference's player of the week for their great performances. Redshirt senior forward **Sara Rhine** collected her 11th career MVC Player of the Week award while senior guard Ciara Duffy earned her fourth career Summit League Player of the Week honor. averaged 24.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.0 block and 1.0 steal while shooting a blistering 71.3 percent from the field, 75.0 percent from deep and 81.3 percent from the free throw line. Duffy averaged 22.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 6.5 assists in the first two games. Duffy is the Summit League's Preseason Player of the Year while Rhine's teammate **Becca Hittner** is the preseason MVC Player of the Year.

Following Wednesday's away game, Drake returns to the Knapp Center Saturday against former MVC rival Creighton (1-0). Tipoff with the longtime foes is scheduled for 6 p.m.

Creighton opened its 2019-20 campaign with a 67-54 win over Omaha. Last season, the Bulldogs won 85-69 in Omaha in the 68th all-time meeting and improved to 40-27 in the series that has continued with one game every season since Creighton departed the MVC for the BIG EAST in 2013. The Bluejays host South Dakota State Tuesday night before they make the short trip to Des Moines.

After playing four games in nine days, Drake will enjoy a break before its next contest when Western Illinois visits the Knapp Center Nov. 24.

Great Start

Drake won its fifth-straight season-opener with its 74-67 home victory over 2019 Sweet 16 participant South Dakota State to start the 2019-20 campaign. The Bulldogs have won every opener since dropping the 2014-15 season-opener to South Dakota.

game losing streak in the series for the Bulldogs and evened it at 2-2. The two teams resumed their rivalry in 2017-18 and SDSU won that meeting at the Knapp Center and the one in Brookings, S.D. last season. Drake's next game will be at SDSU's rival, South Dakota, on Wednesday night. The Bulldogs and Coyotes battled last year in Des Moines with Drake claiming a 76-64 win. South Dakota qualified for the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

In-State Win

Drake held off a tough Iowa State team, another NCAA team last year, for an 86-81 win Sunday afternoon. The Bulldogs and the Cyclones matched the exact same score as last season at Hilton Coliseum in Ames but this time the Bulldogs came out on top. The hard-fought win pulled Drake to within one game in the all-time head to head series between the in-state rivals. Iowa State now holds a slight edge, 30-29, as the home team has won each of the last six games.

Previewing Drake

Drake won its third-straight Missouri Valley Conference regular season title in 2018-19. It was the first three-peat in program history and just the fifth in MVC history. Drake qualified for its third-consecutive NCAA Tournament, the 13th time the Bulldogs made the tournament. This season, Drake is looking to make its fourth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, which has never happened in school history.

Hittner and Rhine are set for their final seasons at Drake. Last season, the decorated duo became just the second set of teammates to lead the Valley in scoring with Hittner at a league-best 19.7 points point per game and Rhine next at 18.3 points. Rhine with 1,702 career points and Hittner with 1,596 points will each strive for 2,000 career points, joining just four in program history and eight in MVC history to reach the impressive 2,000-point mark. Hittner, the back-to-back Jackie Stiles MVC Player of the Year, can become just the third MVC player to win the award three times. Rhine cracked the MVC's all-time scoring list at No. 25. **Brenni Rose** is the other senior for Drake. Rose appeared in every game last year and was third on the team in assists with 107.

The three seniors along with **Hannah Fuller** and **Maddie Monahan** are Drake's five returners with the most game experience. Fuller played in 33 games last season while Monahan started every game. Monahan was second on the team in assists with 120. They're joined by **Monica Burich**, a Colorado transfer who played in every game her first season as a Bulldog, **Mya Mertz**, who returned in 2018-19 after missing the previous season due to injury and sophomores **Maggie Negaard** and **Allie Wooldridge** who each earned significant playing time in their first season.

Rounding out the roster are Division I transfers, Grace Berg and **Kierra Collier**, who came to Drake from Missouri and Washington, respectively. A local standout from Indianola, Berg transferred from Missouri, where she played in 19 games and averaged 3.8 points, 1.7 rebounds and 12.7 minutes per game. Collier sat out 2018-19 after one season at Washington. A 5-6 point guard from Kansas City, Mo., Collier, played in 25 games with 14 starts for the Huskies in 2017-18. She averaged 6.6 points, 2.1 assists, 1.5 rebounds and 1.0 steals per game and earned Pac 12 All-Freshman Team honorable mention honors. Three freshmen, **Maggie Bair**, **Sarah Beth Gueldner** and **Taylor McAulay** round out the 2019-20 roster. Bair, a 6-3 power forward, is from Glen Ellyn, Ill., Gueldner is a 5-9 guard from Olathe, Kan. and McAulay is a 5-11 guard from Lino Lakes, Minn.

Highlights

- Drake is the only team in the country to rank in the top 3 of Assists Per Game each of the last 3 seasons. Baylor, UConn, and Iowa have done it twice.
- Drake has finished #1 in % of shots assisted each of the last two seasons. The year prior, they finished #2. No other team has been even top 10 all three years.
- Drake finished 10th in FG% last year, 5th in 2017-18, and 2nd in 2016-17. UConn is the only other school to finish in the top 10 all three seasons. Baylor, Notre Dame, and Iowa have done it twice.
- Drake has been third in the country in Points Per Scoring Attempt (points scored when taking a shot or sent to the line) the last two years and 5th in 2016-17. UConn is the only other team to rank in the top 5 all three seasons.

- The following teams have been in the Top 15 of Points Per Game the past 3 seasons: Drake, UConn, Baylor, Notre Dame, Marquette, DePaul, Central Michigan, and Troy.
- Drake is riding a streak of five consecutive seasons with 20 or more wins after a 27-7 record in the 2018-19 season. The last time the program had five consecutive 20 or more win seasons was 1996 to 2002 when it had six in a row. Drake is tied with Missouri State for most 20-win seasons in MVC history with 17.
- Last season, Drake played one of the toughest non-conference schedules in the nation with a non-conference strength of schedule of No. 2 and a final RPI of 20.
- WBCA - Fourth best team GPA in 2018-19 at 3.695. Sixth-straight season Drake ranked in the top 10 for the prestigious WBCA team academic honor.
- Head coach Jennie Baranczyk has the second-best all-time winning percentage in MVC games at 76.2 percent with record of 96-30.
- Drake was the only program with two student-athletes on the 2019 academic All-America teams with Sara Rhine and Becca Hittner earning the honors.
- Hittner is the back-to-back Jackie Stiles MVC Player of the Year winner.
- Rhine is the back-to-back MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. She is one of just three student-athletes to win the academic award twice and no student-athlete has ever won it three times.
- Hittner and Rhine both were selected to the All-MVC First Team for the third and second times, respectively.
- Rhine has scored the third-most points among active NCAA players with 1,702 while Hittner is No. 6 with 1,596 points.
- Hittner is the NCAA's leader in career three-point accuracy at 43.3 percent.
- Rhine and Hittner rank second and third, respectively, in career free throws with 383 and 351 makes. Rhine is No. 2 in attempts with 486.

Des Moines native Jennie Baranczyk has built a culture of excellence in leading the Drake University women's basketball program to the top of the Missouri Valley Conference and among the nation's best. Under Baranczyk, who was named the sixth head women's basketball coach at Drake University in April, 2012, the Bulldogs have won three-straight MVC titles and advanced to NCAA Tournaments in each of those seasons.

In addition to the success on the court, the program has ranked in the top 10 nationally in team grade point average each of the past five seasons and performed 1,000 or more community service hours in the Drake and Des Moines communities every school year since Baranczyk became head coach.

Baranczyk won back-to-back MVC Coach of the Year awards after her team's historic 2017-18 and 2016-17 seasons. Each team went 18-0 in regular season conference play and then won the MVC Tournament in Moline, Ill. No MVC team has ever gone undefeated in regular season league action. The 2016-17 team finished with a 28-5 record that included a school and MVC record 22-game winning streak. Baranczyk was honored with her first MVC Coach of the Year award and at the national level by being named the ESPNW Mid-Major Coach of the Year.

During the 2016-17 and 2018-19 seasons, Drake spent multiple weeks ranked in the AP Top 25 poll, including this past season when the team earned the program's earliest ranking in a season since 2001 after it was ranked No. 24 in the Nov. 26, 2018 poll. The 2018-19 team ranked No. 20 in the final RPI. Baranczyk challenges her teams with tough non-conference schedules that include in-state foes, Iowa and Iowa State, former MVC rival Creighton and top regional and national opponents. The 2018-19 team played the No. 2 toughest non-conference schedule in the nation with matchups against Notre Dame, South Carolina, South Dakota, South Dakota State, Rutgers, Nebraska, Iowa, Iowa State and Creighton.

Under her leadership, student-athletes have accomplished numerous individual successes on the court and in the classroom. Three student-athletes have been named the Jackie Stiles MVC Player of the Year four times, including Becca Hittner and Lizzy Wendell. Hittner, who will be a senior in 2019-20 and played for Dowling Catholic High School in West Des Moines, has won the MVC's top player award each of the past two seasons while Wendell claimed the award in 2017. Hittner was named an AP All-America honorable mention in 2019 while Wendell garnered the honor in 2017, the first for a Drake player since 2012.

In addition to four MVC Player of the Year honorees, there have been 22 all-conference selections, including a league-high 16 first team choices and a league-best 34 MVC Player of the Week winners during her tenure. In addition, Baranczyk has coached four MVC Freshmen of the Year honorees (Maddy Dean, Hittner, Sara Rhine and Wendell) and Sammie Bachrodt, who won the program's first two MVC Defensive Player of the Year awards. Rhine won the school's first two MVC Sixth Player of the Year awards in 2016 and 2018.

In the classroom, Rhine, who will be a redshirt senior in 2019-20, earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors in 2018 and 2019 in addition to being the MVC Scholar-Athlete of the Year each of those years. Rhine was tabbed to the 2019 Academic All-America First Team and Hittner the third team as Drake was the only school in the nation with two selections. Hittner and Rhine have been on the past two MVC Scholar-Athlete first teams while former standout Caitlin Ingle was a three-time selection to the top academic team from 2015-17. Ingle, who hailed from nearby Runnells, Iowa, and played for Southeast Polk High School, graduated as Drake's and the MVC's all-time career assists leader. Bachrodt graduated as the school's all-time career steals leader.

Baranczyk's teams have been highly successful in the classroom during her tenure at Drake, starting in 2013-14 as each of her teams earned prestigious accolades from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association with the Top 25 Team Honor Roll. Drake has ranked in the top 10 for the prestigious WBCA team academic honor in five straight seasons under Baranczyk.

On a national level, Baranczyk served as an assistant coach at the 2017 USA Basketball Under 19 Team trials that Hittner attended. In addition, Baranczyk has been a featured speaker at USA Basketball Coaches clinics held throughout the country. On the date of her hire, Baranczyk, who was 31 years old at the time, was the second-youngest Division I head women's basketball coach. Even as one of the younger Division I head coaches, she made an immediate impact in women's basketball as she attended the 2013 edition of The Center for Coaching Excellence (CCE). Along with 31 fellow WBCA-member college women's basketball coaches, she completed the invitation-only, two-and-a-half day elite leadership program hosted by Columbia University in New York City.

Baranczyk and her program are actively involved in the Des Moines community. Starting in 2013-14, the program has reached its goal of completing 1,000 community service hours in the Drake and Des Moines communities over the course of the academic year. Baranczyk previously was a member of the board for the Young Women's Resource Center in Des Moines. She was honored by the Business Record in June, 2017 by being named a 2017 Women of Influence honoree. The award celebrates the work of women who have made a difference.

Jennie and her husband, Scott, have one son, Eli, and two daughters, Jordi and Hope.
