# WORLD-CLASS FIELD THREATENS ASSAULT ON DRAKE RELAYS RECORDS

The 2025 Drake Relays presented by Xtream powered by Mediacom will continue its tradition of showcasing some of the world's premier track and field athletes. Numerous Olympians and Paralympians, including a foursome of 2024 Paris gold medalists, are set to hit the Blue Oval this weekend.

Olympic medalists, world champions, American record holders, and NCAA champions always enjoy performing in front of some of the most enthusiastic track and field fans in the world. This year's cast features three-time defending Olympic shot put champion Ryan Crouser, track and field power couple Tara Davis-Woodhall and Hunter Woodhall, 2024 Olympic gold medal hurdler Masai Russell, and the distance duo of Olympians Karissa Schweizer and Shelby Houlihan returning to their home state.

The Drake Relays presented by Xtream powered by Mediacom will again be an exclusive Silver Level event on the World Athletics Continental Tour with 16 invitational events in the elite division. The 'Thursday Night Throwdown' competition for both men's and women's throwers is back for the second time in as many years.

Newly minted Drake Relays Hall of Fame inductee Crouser headlines Saturday's WACT invitational shot put that features four of the top six 2024 Olympic finishers including defending Relays champion Payton Otterdahl who was fourth in Paris; 2024 Olympic bronze medalist Rajindra Campbell from Jamaica; and Nigeria's Chukwueba Enekwechi, a 2021 Olympic finalist who also was sixth in Paris. Roger Steen, silver medalist at the 2005 World Indoor Championships, and Tripp Piperi, the 2025 U.S. Indoor champion, also will compete.

Defending Olympic gold medalist Tara Davis-Woodhall highlights the WACT women's long jump lineup with sights set on toppling the Drake Relays record of 22 feet 1 1/2 inches by three-time Olympic medalist Brittney Reese in 2016. Nigeria's Ese Brume, who was third in the 2021 Olympics and fifth in the 2022 Olympics, also is in the invitational along with 2024 Olympic finalist Ruth Usoro from Nigeria and 2021 U.S. Olympian Quanesha Burks. Hunter Woodhall, Tara's husband, brings his own gold medal to Des Moines after winning the men's 400 dash at the 2024 Paralympics in Paris. Woodhall, a double amputee and T62 level competitor, will face off against world-class 400 runners including Nigeria Olympian Chidi Okezie and Michael Cherry who earned a gold medal on Team USA's 4x400 relay at the 2021 Olympics.

Houlihan, a 2016 Olympian, and Schweizer, a 2021 and 2024 Olympian, will aim for the record in the women's invitational mile which will be held for the first time since 1975 when five-time Olympian Francie Larrieu set the Drake Stadium record of 4:40.2 that still stands today. Houlihan, the American record holder in the 1500, and Schweizer, American record holder in the indoor 3000, are part of a loaded field which includes Olympians Alma Cortes from Mexico; Kate Current, Canada; Vera Hoffman, Luxembourg; and Aneta Konieczek, Poland. This will mark Houlihan's first appearance at the Drake Relays since 2017. However, she has won her last four races on the Blue Oval, claiming U.S. national titles in the 1,500 and 5,000 in 2018 and 2019. Schweizer, a former six-time NCAA champion at Missouri, captured the 5000 title in her last appearance at the Drake Relays in 2018.

All eyes will be focused on reigning Olympic gold medalist Masai Russell in the women's invitational 100 hurdles. Russell posted the second-fastest women's time in U.S. history of 12.25 at the 2024 Olympic Trials. Denisha Cartwright from the Bahamas, who competed in the 2024 Olympics, along with 2021 Olympic finalist Gabbi Cunningham look to challenge Russell. The men's 100 hurdles invitational includes Canadian Olympian Craig Thorne and former Iowa Big Ten Indoor and Outdoor champ Jamal Britt.

The women's invitational 400 hurdles field includes 2016 Olympic bronze medalist Ashley Spencer along with Olympians Tia Adana Belle from Barbados; Grace Claxton, Puerto Rico; Lauren Hoffman, The Philippines; and Australia's Alanah Yukich. Aldrich Bailey, Jr. is back to defend his Drake Relays crown in the men's invitational 400 hurdles. Oregon senior Klaudia Kazimierska and defending champion Aurora Rynda of Canada will run in the women's invitational 800. Kazimierska, representing Poland, finished 10th in the 1,500 at the 2024 Paris Olympics. Other performers to watch include Will Williams, 2025 U.S. Indoor champ and 2023 Drake Relays champ, in the men's invitational long jump along with 2021 Olympian Steffin McCarter.

Olympians Parul Chaudary (India), Ankita Dhyajni (India) and Aneta Konieczek (Poland) have their sights set on the Drake Relays record of 9:31.03 in the WACT women's invitational 3000 steeplechase Friday night.



Six athletes have run under that record led by Chaudary, the India national record holder at 9:15.31. Janette Schraft, who was third in the 2024 NCAA Championships for Iowa State, also is in the field.

The American record of 263-6 could be broken in the women's invitational hammer throw Thursday. Rachel Richezon, who threw a 2025 world leading mark of 258-6 April 11, looks to defend her title but she will be challenged by 2022 World champion Brooke Andersen, the No. 2 all-time performer in American history (263-0), 2024 Olympic silver medalist Annette Echikunwoke, Paris Olympian Erin Reese, two-time Olympian Stamatia Scarvelis and Great Britain's 2024 national champion Anna Purchase. Three-time Olympian Rudy Winkler returns in the men's invitational hammer throw that also includes Canadian Olympian Rowan Hamilton and Jordan Geist, a former two-time NCAA champion and two-time Pan American Games medalist.

The WACT men's javelin features one of the deepest event fields in Relays history led by two-time Olympian Curtis Thompson, who is a four-time U.S. champion, along with two-time Icelandic national champion Sindri Gudmundsson; 2024 Drake Relays champion Arthur Petersen, two-time Bahamas national champion Keyshawn Strachan and Nigerian Olympian and national champion Chinecherem Nnamdi. Rhema Otabor, a 2024 Paris Olympian from the Bahamas, leads the women's javelin field looking to rewrite the Drake Relays record she set last year.

## Collegiate Preview

Four NCAA champions headline a list of top collegiate performers who should make their presence known at Drake Stadium. Oregon's Wilma Nielsen, who won the women's mile at the 2025 NCAA Indoor Championships in 4:32.40, along her teammate Silan Ayyildiz who set a collegiate as well as Turkish national record in the mile of 4:23.46 Feb. 15, will run in the women's invitational mile Saturday.

Nebraska senior Tyus Wilson, who won the 2024 Drake Relays title and was third at 2024 U.S. Olympic Trials, won the 2025 NCAA indoor high jump title with a personal best of 7-5 3/4.

Iowa's Ryan Johnson, third in the men's weight throw at the 2025 NCAA Indoor Championships with a personal best of 80-3 3/4, also will be in the hammer throw. Minnesota senior Isaiah Schafer ranks No. 2 in the shot put at 65-2 1/4.

The men's javelin features three of the top throwers in the collegiate ranks led by Nebraska junior Dash Simron who ranks No. 3 (256-9), Iowa junior Mike Stein No. 5 (251-7), and Nebraska senior Arthur Petersen No. 6 (251-3). Stein, the 2024 Big Ten champ, was seventh in the 2024 NCAA Outdoor meet.

Iowa's Isaac Lewis ranks second nationally in the men's 400 hurdles in 49.68. Iowa senior Alli Bookin-Nosbisch ranks No. 6 in the women's 800 at 2:02.92. Iowa junior Elizabeth Korczak ranks No. 4 on the collegiate list in the women's javelin at 190-8, while Nebraska's Maddie Harris, the 2023 U.S. champion, is ranked No. 7 (184-0) followed by teammate Eniko Sara who is No. 8 (183-0).

South Dakota senior Marleen Mulla, who is ranked No. 4 on the collegiate list (14-8) could threaten the Drake Relays record in the women's university-college division pole vault mark of 14-5. South Dakota freshman Anna Willis has vaulted 14-4.

Kansas State, featuring 2025 Big 12 indoor women's triple jump champ Taylor Mayo, and Ohio State are making their first appearance back to the Drake Relays since 2018.

## High School Preview

Drake Relays record holders Tony Anania of Norwalk and Jaden Merrick from Cedar Falls headline the boys high school field. Merrick, who will run collegiately at Colorado, looks to lower his Drake Relays record in the boys 3200 of 8:55.14 that he set last year. Anania won the 1,600 in 4:06.54, bettering the meet record of 4:10.76 by Josh Evans, Linn-Mar in 2014. Anania, who is committed to Kentucky, was runner-up in the 800 last year behind then sophomore Quentin Nauman, an Oregon commit, from Western Dubuque of Epworth who is back to defend his title.

Ankeny's Ethan Zuber looks to change his luck after finishing second in both the 1,600 and 3,200 last year. With Zuber running a 1:51.62 anchor, Ankeny broke one of the oldest Relays records in the high school competition in winning the boys 4x800 relay in 7:39.54, which ranked No. 3 on the state's all-time list while erasing the Relays record of 7:45.63 set by Marshalltown in 1985. Zuber won the Iowa Class 4A state title in the 3200 while running legs on Ankeny's 4x800 and distance medley relays which won state titles.

Landon Prince from Clear Creek-Amana is the state leader in both the boys shot put and discus, bidding to become the sixth athlete in Drake Relays history to sweep both those titles.

Clear Lake senior Reese Brownlee captured Drake Relays titles in the girls 400 hurdles and long jump last year, while finishing second in the 400.

Hampton-Dumont senior Charlee Morton has won back-to-back Drake Relays titles in both the girls' shot put and discus. She is trying to become just the second prep to win three straight titles in the girls shot put joining former Iowa City West standout Danica Haight who accomplished the feat from 2005-07. If successful in defending her title in the girls' discus.

The top four returning placewinners return in the 100 hurdles led by defending champion Emma Havighurst from West Des Moines Valley who is the state leader this spring at 14.21. Ani Wedemeyer is back to defend her crown in the girls 800 and is a member of the Pleasant Valley team which returns all four relay runners which set a Drake Relays record in the 4 by 800 relay of 9:01.47. Other distance stars to watch include Indianola's senior Jordy Brown; Pella junior Marissa Ferebee and Cedar Falls freshman Charlee Gall.

Junior Abby Mecklenburg from Linn-Mar could threaten the Drake Relays record of 19 feet 3 3/4 inches in the girls long jump that dates back to 2004. She is the state leader having soared 19-6 this spring.

# BLAKE BOLDON

## Franklin 'Pitch' Johnson Director of the Drake Relays

Blake Boldon was named the 12th Franklin 'Pitch' Johnson Director of the Drake Relays on Oct. 12, 2016. In addition to leading the Drake Relays presented by Xtream powered by Mediacom, Boldon serves as Drake's Senior Associate Athletics Director for External Operations, including overseeing communications, marketing, broadcasting, and video production for the Bulldogs.

Boldon served as the executive director of the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon prior to taking the reins of the Drake Relays presented by Xtream. A native of Osceola, Iowa, he has an extensive background and record of success as a competitive athlete, collegiate coach, and event director.

"As an Iowan and former Relays competitor, I know firsthand the tremendous history and tradition the Drake Relays presented by Xtream powered by Mediacom has in Iowa, the U.S., and the international track and field community," Boldon said. "With Mediacom's partnership, the Drake Relays has become one of the premier athletic events in the world. Through my experience growing up as a spectator, competing as an athlete, and coaching, the Drake Relays presented by Xtream has played a significant role in making me who I am today. The opportunity to build upon the incredible foundation of success while we work to continue to elevate the profile of America's Athletic Classic is truly an honor."

In his first eight years as director, Boldon has maintained many generations-old traditions, while expanding event offerings and growing the Drake Relays presented by Xtream with 80 Drake Relays records set during his tenure.

In his first three years, the Drake Relays became more inclusive through partnerships with the USOPC, Special Olympics Iowa, and Adaptive Sports Iowa. Boldon led the staff successfully through the global pandemic in 2020 by hosting the Blue Oval Showcase in August, one of very few World Athletic Continental Tour competitions

of the entire global outdoor track and field season. In 2021, while all comparable events canceled or limited competition, the Drake Relays presented by Xtream featured Olympians preparing for the games in Tokyo, the nation's top collegians, and the top Iowa high school athletes. In 2022, the Relays were "Back on Track" featuring the strongest university division in decades, including the University of Michigan for the first time since 1956 and North Carolina A&T, the only school in the NCAA to earn both a men's and women's trophy at the 2021 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championship. In 2023, the Drake Relays presented by Xtream hosted the inaugural Collegiate Wheelchair 100 Championship and the winning performances at the Grand Blue Mile presented by Wellmark Blue Cross Blue Shield were ratified by World Athletics as the inaugural world records in the discipline. Last year, Relays Week expanded to include a one-of-a-kind team shot put competition in the historic Drake Fieldhouse and the Vault at Jordan Creek Town Center returned for the first time in a decade.

In 2020, Boldon was named to a four-year term on the NCAA Track and Field and Cross Country Committee, serving as chairperson in his fourth year. That same year, Blake was elected to serve as chair of the USATF Men's Long Distance Running, a committee he had served as vice chair for the previous six years. Within USATF he also served as the head men's manager for Team USA at the 2024 World Athletics U20 Championships, event manager at the 2023 World Athletics Championships in Budapest, Hungary, and the 2022 NACA Championships in Freeport, Bahamas, in addition to being the men's coach for Team USA at the 2023 World Athletics Road Running Championships in Riga, Latvia. In 2024, he became one of just 71 global candidates to earn the World Athletics Competition Director Diploma. Boldon is currently in his second term as a public director on the Iowa Sports Foundation Board of Directors.

Boldon's experience at Beyond Monumental

and the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon (IMM) presented the unique qualifications influential in his selection as the Franklin 'Pitch' Johnson Director of the Drake Relays. He transformed the IMM and its associated races within the Beyond Monumental organization into one of the premier road racing events in the nation. Overseeing a budget of nearly \$2 million, Boldon propelled the event from the 60th largest marathon in the country to the 20th. That growth rate was the third largest nationally for a marathon and the largest for a half marathon. His leadership resulted in the IMM setting annual revenue records and a 100 percent growth in sponsorships while also making the IMM an agent of change in the Indianapolis community. In addition to strengthening the lineup of events by acquiring the Indianapolis Marathon, Boldon created the Monumental Mile in 2014 that was ranked by Shape Magazine as one of the top 10 1-mile road races in the nation alongside Des Moines' Grand Blue Mile.

"The Drake Relays serves not only as one of the nation's most celebrated high school, intercollegiate, and elite track and field events, but also as a university-wide celebration for the Drake community and an important cultural event and economic driver for Des Moines and the Midwest," said Drake University President Marty Martin. "This legacy as America's Athletic Classic has been carefully cultivated over more than a century. Under his leadership experience, logistical expertise, and creative vision, Blake Boldon has carried this legacy forward."

Before leading the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon, Boldon spent two years at the University of Pennsylvania as the Quakers' head cross country coach and track and field distance coach. He was also involved in the planning and execution of the Penn Relays and coordinated the Penn Relays Men's Olympic Development Mile. Boldon also coached at UAB (2009-10) and Iowa State (2005-08), serving as the recruiting and academic coordinator at the latter.

Boldon is familiar with Drake Stadium and the iconic Blue Oval where he won the 1998 Iowa Class 3A state title in the 1600, running for Clarke High School of Osceola. As a collegian at Missouri State, he won five Missouri Valley Conference titles and a Drake Relays title in the 1500 in 2003. Boldon graduated from Missouri State with a degree in education in 2003 and was named MSU's Outstanding Male Athlete Award winner in addition to being a First Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He was inducted into the Missouri State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020.

Boldon competed professionally, returning to Drake Stadium many times. In 2007, he became just the third Iowan to run a sub-four-minute mile during the indoor season and finished fourth at the USATF Indoor Championships. Later that season, he finished second at the Drake Relays to American record holder Alan Webb, who shattered the Drake Stadium record with a 3:51.71 finish in that classic race. Boldon's professional career also includes four top 10 finishes at USATF Championships.

## **BRIAN HARDIN** **Director of Athletics - Drake University**

Des Moines native Brian Hardin joined the Drake Bulldogs staff on December 11, 2017, when he became the 17th director of athletics in University history. Immediately, Hardin began to transform the athletics department. He has led the Bulldogs to unprecedented heights during his tenure while branding Drake as Des Moines' Hometown Team.

Drake is the only NCAA Division I athletics program that had both of its basketball teams win back-to-back conference tournament titles while advancing to the NCAA Tournament in 2024. Hardin also saw the development of Elevate the IX which is an initiative led by Drake Athletics to celebrate and advance the impact of women in Drake Athletics.

The 2023-24 school year was arguably the best in the history of Drake Athletics. Drake won its first MVC All-Sports Championship in school history and became just the second private institution in league history to collect that honor. The Bulldogs won regular-season team titles in men's cross country, women's basketball, women's soccer, and tournament crowns in both men's and women's hoops. Drake also had top-five finishes in men's golf, men's track and field, women's cross country, women's golf, women's tennis, and volleyball. Adding to the success of the student-athletes in the classroom and competition were the record-breaking results Drake witnessed in donations to the Bulldog Club, ticket sales, and licensing revenue.

From the beginning, Hardin has emphasized developing Drake as the model NCAA Division I athletics department defined by sustained excellence in the classroom, competition, and community. The results from the roughly 390 student-athletes representing 29 states and 26 countries have been overwhelmingly supportive of his efforts.

Drake student-athletes have thrived academically since Hardin's arrival. The NCAA's Academic Progress Report measures eligibility, retention, and graduation of student-athletes. Six Drake athletic programs posted perfect scores in 2024 after a record-breaking seven teams met that mark a year earlier. The seven perfect 2023 scores were the second most of any Missouri Valley Conference school and one fewer than the combined total of the other

NCAA Division I schools in Iowa.

Over the last 11 consecutive semesters, Drake student-athletes have recorded a cumulative grade-point average of at least 3.30. Before 2017, only one such semester existed. All sports recorded their all-time best semester team GPA since 2017. More than 20 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors, placing Drake in the top-10 nationally.

Drake Athletics has experienced a renaissance in competition over the past five years. Twelve programs have combined to make 34 appearances at NCAA Championships. Fifteen regular-season conference championships and 14 conference tournament titles were earned. Fourteen of the 18 athletics programs have recorded at least one top-three finish in their respective conference standings.

The Greater Des Moines community has also benefited from Hardin's leadership within the Drake athletics department during his tenure. Drake student-athletes have registered more than 10,000 hours of community service. Hardin created "515 Day" in 2018 as a day of service performed by all Drake coaches and athletics staff to the Des Moines community every May 15 (515 is Des Moines' area code). Area groups that have benefited from 515 Day have included: Habitat for Humanity, Des Moines Public Schools, Des Moines Parks and Recreation, Des Moines Area Religious Council, YMCA, and Food Pantry of Iowa.

Hardin is part of numerous boards and organizations. He sits on the Iowa Sports Foundation Board of Directors and the Catch Des Moines Board of Directors. Catch Des Moines, the local convention and visitor's bureau, also has Hardin serve as a member of its Sports Advisory Committee. In 2022, Hardin was one of 11 members NCAA FCS Selection Committee members, where he helped select the field and determine the bracket for the NCAA Division I Football Championship. Within the Missouri Valley Conference, Hardin has served as the inaugural chair of the MVC Women's Basketball Improvement Group and as the chair of the MVC Men's Basketball Committee and the Media and Marketing Committee.

Hardin took the reins at Drake after serving as deputy director of athletics at Marquette University, with prior experience at Ball State University, the University of Notre Dame, the Chicago Bears, and Loyola University Chicago.

As deputy director and part of the athletic department's executive team at Marquette, Hardin helped oversee the university's 16 varsity sports, more than 300 student-athletes, and nearly 100 full-time employees. In addition, his work in the department's business development and external engagement areas generated more than \$11 million annually. Hardin was part of five BIG EAST championship programs, the first BIG EAST championships won by these respective programs in school history.

At Marquette, Hardin served as sport administrator for men's soccer, men's tennis, and men's and women's cross country and track and field, as well as advising the athletic director on matters pertaining to men's and women's basketball. He oversaw marketing and fan engagement, ticket sales and strategy, ticket operations and service, merchandising, licensing, corporate partnerships, and was the liaison with the affinity group for student-athlete alumni.

Hardin was born with a Bulldog spirit; his parents are Drake alumni. Bob and Jan Hardin graduated with bachelor's degrees from the School of Education in 1973. Bob earned his master's in education at Drake in 1987. Brian is a 1998 graduate of Valley High School, was a Drake Relays champion while in high school and competed at the Relays at the university level all four years while attending Marquette.

Brian and his wife, Cara, have three sons—Noah, and twins Elliot and Bennett.

# One Mile at a Time

## 2025 Marks 50 Years Since Francie Larrieu Set a Still-Standing Relays Record

Bob Ehrhart was excited about what could happen in the race. Francie Larrieu was determined to do everything she could to actually make it happen.

What both wanted was a Drake Relays record in the women's mile.

It was 50 years ago, April of 1975. Ehrhart, the Relays director, had arranged for Larrieu to headline the event, which in 1971 had become the meet's first full-fledged individual race for women – a year before the passage of Title IX.

After four years, Ehrhart saw an opportunity to lift the event to another level and there was no one better to do that than Larrieu, a 22-year-old Californian who already had competed in one Olympics and over the years would qualify four more times for the Summer Games.

When she showed up at Drake Stadium, Larrieu owned American records in the indoor 1000, 1500, 3000, mile and two-mile along with the outdoor mile. No runner in America was better at the middle distances on the women's side. She was among the best in the world and she'd be running at the Drake Relays for the first time.

So yeah, you can see why Ehrhart was so happy to have her.

"She won't go away without a record here," he declared.

With an already impressive array of records and championships, Larrieu was confident she could treat the Relays crowd to a record-breaking run. And why not? The Relays record at the time was 4:41.6. Seven weeks earlier, in Richmond, Virginia, she had run an indoor mile in 4:28.5 to break the world record.

But it was early in the outdoor season and she needed two things to happen if she was to make a serious run at the record: Good weather and someone to push her.

She got neither.

But she'd break the record anyway.

Now Francie Larrieu Cronk, the five-time Olympian, lives the life of a comfortable, but busy, retiree in suburban Austin, Texas. She retired in 2018 after 18 years as the track and cross country coach at Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, about 30 miles north of Austin.

She doesn't run anymore – the knees don't like it – but stays active biking, walking, working with a few weights and elevating her heart rate through a high-tech boxing workout.

"Every once in a while during a walk I break into a trot," she said, "and I am reminded of why I shouldn't run."

She travels frequently and still keeps up on the running world, a world she once dominated.

Growing up in the Bay Area of northern California, Larrieu admired her older brother Ron, an elite distance runner who competed in the 10,000 meters at the 1964 Olympics and won two national

cross country championships. Watching Ron at meets, she saw girls running and decided she wanted to do that, too. Maybe someday even run in the Olympics.

She begged her parents to let her get involved and they found a local club, the San Jose Cindergals. She joined at the age of 13.

"I think I was blessed that I had a gift and I had a family that understood what I wanted to do," she said. "Back then there was no girls program at my high school. I trained my first two years of high school with the boys team. That's kind of how it started."

She ran mostly in the Bay Area during those early years. If the club members wanted to venture farther from home, they had to finance it themselves.

"We had to sell raffle tickets and raise money to go to the national championships," she said. "I never had the opportunity to go to anything other than where my parents could drive me to a track meet or I could hitch a ride with somebody else's parents to track meets."

Folks tend to think of distance runners as long and lean and at barely more than 100 pounds, Larrieu certainly was lean. But long? Not at 5-feet-4. But she packed plenty of stamina into that frame and ran with an easy, efficient stride.

Neither her size nor her rudimentary beginnings kept her from excelling. Larrieu set the U.S. outdoor mile record for the first time as an 18-year-old in 1971, running 4:41.5 in Berkeley on June 5 to break Doris Brown's 3-year-old record. She would go on to break the record five more times.

She also owns the "record" – if you want to call it that – for the shortest span of holding the American record. Just one day after she first broke the record in 1971, Brown regained it at a meet in Tacoma, Washington. Brown held it until Larrieu got the record back two years later.

Larrieu eventually hooked up with Tom Jennings, who ran the Pacific Coast Track Club in Los Angeles. The move south put her among a prestigious group of athletes that at one time or another included high jumper Dwight Stones, hurdler Jim Bolding (he was the nation's best at the 400 hurdles until a guy named Edwin Moses came along) and throwers Mac Wilkins and Al Feuerbach. All four were Drake Relays champions. Feuerbach, who grew up in Preston in eastern Iowa, won the shot put five times and is in the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame.

It did not take Larrieu long to achieve her Olympic dream. She was just 19 when she ran the 1500 at the 1972 Games in Munich, getting there after breaking the American record in the event at the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Ore.

She remains the youngest U.S. woman ever to run the 1500 at the Summer Games. She also holds the distinction as the oldest U.S. woman to qualify in any track and field event, running the marathon at age 39 at the 1992 Games in Barcelona, where she had the honor of carrying the U.S. flag in the opening ceremonies.

In between, Larrieu qualified in the 1500 again in 1976, made the 1980 team that boycotted the Moscow Games and ran the 10,000 in Seoul in 1988. Over a competitive career that spanned nearly a quarter of a century, she won 20 national championships, set 36 American records and broke world indoor records 11 times.

She was at the forefront as opportunities for women in track and field – and other sports as well – evolved from those pre-Title IX days when it was so challenging to find places to train and compete. When she ran in Munich in 1972, the 1500 was the longest event for women. In Seoul 16 years later, she ran in the first women's 10,000.

The women's competition at the Drake Relays was still in its infancy when Larrieu ran in 1975. But it was growing and she became part of that, too. The Relays offered three women's events other than the mile that year – an 880-yard run, a high jump and an 880 medley relay.

When Larrieu returned the following year, the number had grown to seven and it kept rising from there to become an integral part of the meet, with women sometimes overshadowing the men's performances.

Larrieu began her 1975 outdoor season at the Texas Relays, hoping to build on a strong indoor season highlighted by world records in the 1000, 1500 and mile. That mile record, by the way, lasted almost seven years.

"I loved the indoor season," she said. "It was so much fun being that close to the crowd, just the energy you feel being in the building and running on the boards. I loved it."

She had won the first women's mile at the Texas Relays in 1974, running 4:37.90, and had hoped to go faster this time. But on a chilly Friday night with no competition, she cruised to the finish line in a pedestrian 4:46.08. With better weather, she ran 4:40.3 in Honolulu two weeks before Drake.

Larrieu trained hard for Drake, following a regimen of running five miles on Monday, 10 on Tuesday, 15 on Wednesday, 10 on Thursday and seven on Friday. She'd be running in Europe in the summer and needed to be in tip-top shape for the competition she would face there.

"Those early season meets are important to athletes to help them gauge where they are," she said. "They give them the opportunity to race and keep them on the path to their goal."

Barbara Lawson, a student at Colorado State, won that first women's mile at the Drake Relays in 1971, finishing in 4:54.8. Though not a remarkable time, she had opened the door for others. Teri Anderson won the following year in 4:41.6, which became the record Larrieu hoped to take down. Lawson, inducted into the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame in 2017, won again in 1973 and Brenda Webb took the title in 1974.

Now it was Larrieu's turn. She was fit, but the weather wasn't. It rained that Saturday morning and while it had stopped by the afternoon, the air held a damp chill and it a raw wind blew through the stadium.

Larrieu tended to be a frontrunner, especially when she figured she would win the race. "I was full of myself back then," she said, laughing. So with a sellout crowd of 18,000 looking on, she quickly bolted to the front and opened a 20-yard lead. It was obvious she would win. But could she push herself enough to break the record?

She did, of course, finishing in 4:40.2, well ahead of the others. She hated the cold and wind but loved the setting.

"The crowd was just super," she told reporters. "It helped me forget the pain of running."

Wisconsin's Cindy Bremser, in her first season of serious running, passed Webb and Iowa State's Peg

Neppel with a strong kick to get second in 4:43.8 and knock 12 seconds off her previous best. It was Bremser's introduction on a track where she later would enjoy great success. Neppel finished third and Webb was fourth.

When the Relays went metric in 1976, Larrieu returned and won the 800 – the first time that had been run for women – and the 1500 in her lead up to the Montreal Olympics. She repeated her Relays title in the 1500 in 1977 and won the 5000 in 1982. Her meet record and those five championships led to her induction into the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame in 1983.

"It was always a fun meet to go to," she said as she reflected on those years. "I loved those early meets. The announcers have knowledge. They try to get the crowd excited about the races and let them know what's happening down on the track, whether you're breaking a record or not. It was a very well run meet and fun meet to compete in."

It seems that Larrieu just couldn't stay away from the state because she showed up in Davenport in 1987 to win the Bix 7 road race.

As for Bremser, she ended up winning the women's 1500 at Drake six times, including five straight years from 1981-85, and joined the Hall of Fame in 1985. Neppel, whose forte was the longer distances, won the first women's 5000 at the Relays in 1976 and was inducted into the Athletes Hall of Fame in 1982.

Turns out that 1975 women's mile offered up some serious star power after all. And half-a-century later, Larrieu's time still stands as the Drake Relays record.

With that in mind, and with the university celebrating its women's athletics history with its Elevate the IX campaign, the Franklin "Pitch" Johnson Director of the Drake Relays, Blake Boldon, figured it was time to bring back the women's mile.

He did so with authority, lining up field that's a virtual Who's Who of American middle-distance running, a group that includes Iowans Shelby Houlihan and Karissa Schweizer, this year's NCAA indoor mile champion, the national collegiate record holder in the indoor mile and the defending U.S. Road Mile champion.

Here's a look at some of their accomplishments:

- Shelby Houlihan, who won eight Drake Relays titles during her high school days at Sioux City East, is the American record holder in the 1500. She's a 13-time U.S. champion, ran the 5000 in the 2016 Olympics and is coming off a silver medal in the 3000 at the World Indoor Championships.
- Karissa Schweizer, who prepped at Dowling Catholic, was a six-time NCAA champion and 10-time All-American at Missouri. She ran the 5000 and 10,000 at both the Tokyo Olympics in 2021 and the Paris Games in 2024 and once held the American record in the indoor 3000. In 2020, she and Houlihan were part of a 4x1500 relay team that set a world record.
- Oregon runner Wilma Nielsen won the NCAA indoor mile this year and is no stranger to the Blue Oval. Competing for Bradley, she won the 1500 at the Missouri Valley Conference outdoor champions at Drake Stadium in 2022. The year before, she finished second in the Drake Relays 800 and 12th in the 1500.
- Silan Ayyildiz, Nielsen's Oregon teammate, set the collegiate indoor mile record of 4:23.46 on Feb. 14 this year. She won the SEC title in the 1500 in 2023 before transferring to Oregon.
- Rachel McArthur won the U.S. Road Mile Championship in downtown Des Moines last April and finished second in the WACT 1500 at the Relays four days later.
- Krissy Gear was the U.S. steeplechase champion in 2023, upsetting 10-time champion Emma Coburn, and finished third in the 1500 at the U.S. Indoor Championships that year. She has a best mile time of 4:26.00.
- Colleen Quigley finished eighth in the steeplechase at the 2016 Olympics, captured the NCAA title in the event in 2015 while running for Florida State and was the U.S. indoor mile champion in 2019. She joined Houlihan and Schweizer on that record-breaking 4x1500 team.
- Hanna Hermansson was an 11-time national champion in Sweden, Vera Hoffman was an Olympian and 19-time national champion in Luxembourg, Eliza Megger has won four national titles in Poland and Canadian Kate Current ran in the 1500 at the 2024 Olympics.

"It's as good a field as we'll see in the U.S. for a women's one-mile this year," Boldon said. "I would say with full clarity everyone in the field has the ability to run underneath the record."

The runners also will be timed through 1500 meters, with an eye on Jenny Simpson's Drake Relays record of 4:03.35 set in 2013.

Larrieu was impressed when told of the field. As for the record, well, she figures she's held it long enough.

"I have a feeling it will be broken," she said. "Let's just put it this way: It needs to be broken."

# The World's Best Perform At Historic Drake Stadium

## A brief history of the home of America's Athletic Classic

Historic Drake Stadium is much more than one of the premier track and field facilities in the country. It has played hosts to some of the greatest track and field performances of all time.

Numerous world, national and collegiate records have been set here over the years. Drake Relays fans have seen 39 world records, 60 American records and 63 national collegiate records to be exact.

It has been the fans' rapport, along with the countless number of competitors, that has contributed to Drake Stadium's reputation as one of the most popular track and field venues in America today.

Hundreds of Olympic gold medalist have competed at Drake Stadium including Ryan Crouser, Harrison Dillard, Bob Hayes, Jim Hines, Bruce Jenner, Michael Johnson, Carl Lewis, Ralph Mann, Ralph Metcalfe, Bobby Morrow, Rodney Milburn, Al Oerter, Jesse Owens, Wilma Rudolph, Calvin Smith, Frank

Short, Gwen Torrence, Jeremy Wariner, Mac Wilkins and Dave Wottle.

The stadium (current capacity: 14,457) has undergone notable improvements in modern history. Following the 2005 Iowa State High School Track and Field Championships, Drake embarked on the most significant renovation project of Drake Stadium since the stadium was dedicated in the fall of 1925. The track was reconfigured and the new Mondo-surface track had lanes widened from 42 inches to 48 inches.

New venues for the javelin, discus and hammer throws were constructed. The \$15 million renovation project also featured permanent lights, a video scoreboard, and FieldTurf for football and soccer. Drake Stadium, as it stands today, is the second edifice to be constructed in the area on the north edge of the Drake University campus.

The first stadium was built in 1904 with 2,500 seats as a gift from Norman Haskins

in honor of his son Alvin A. Haskins, an 1884 Drake College of Law graduate who had died in 1896. The original name of the stadium was Haskins Field, but was changed to Drake Stadium at the request of the elder Haskins. In 1925, a new Drake Stadium was constructed to seat 18,000 fans in a building project that also furnished the campus with the 4,000 seat Drake Fieldhouse.

Relay officials honored longtime public address announcer Jim Duncan in 1988 by renaming the Drake Stadium Track, "The Jim Duncan Track."

In 2005, the Stadium's field was named Johnny Bright Field after the former Drake football player who was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame after setting an NCAA total offense record in 1950, while earning first-team All America in 1951. competition.





## Notable Dates in Drake Stadium History

1904 — Originally named Haskins Field, the stadium opened on Oct. 8, 1904 (capacity 2,500) with the Drake football team playing the University of Iowa. The first stadium was built as a gift from Norman Haskins in honor of his son Alvin A. Haskins, an 1884 Drake College of Law graduate who had died in 1896.

1907 — Stadium capacity expanded to 6,700

1910 — At the behest of the Haskins family the original name of the stadium was changed to Drake Stadium.

1925 — A new Drake Stadium was constructed to seat 18,000 fans in a building project that also furnished the campus with the 4,000 seat Drake Fieldhouse. On Oct. 10, 1925, new Drake Stadium opened with the Drake football team beating Kansas State, 19-0.

1926 — The first Drake Relays was held in the newly constructed Drake Stadium on April 23-24. 11,000 fans attended the Saturday session.

1961 — The Drake Relays was the first sporting event ever covered in the premier of ABC's iconic Wide World of Sports show which ran through 1997.

1969 — As a 60th birthday present for the Drake Relays, athletes and fans saw a synthetic red brown tartan track replace the red, crushed brick cinder track- eight lanes wide around the full oval of Drake Stadium. Before, the track had eight lanes only on the homestretch.

1970 — The NCAA Outdoor Championships were held for the first time at Drake Stadium with future Olympian Ralph Mann of BYU setting a world record in the 440-yard hurdles, while legendary Steve Prefontaine captured the first of seven NCAA career titles by winning the three-mile run. BYU, Kansas and Oregon tied for the team title with 31 points.

1976 — The oval Drake track was converted from 440 yards to 400 meters as all Drake Relays events went metric, while electronic timing was implemented.

1978 — An alteration of the north curve allowed for all relay races to be run in meters.

1988 — The track oval was renamed The Jim Duncan Track in honor of the longtime announcer who served as voice of the Drake Relays from 1963-88.

1989 — The Jim Duncan track was resurfaced into Drake blue school colors, featuring a combination of polyurethane coating and EPDM rubber granules.

2005 — The first ever Iowa High School Coed State Track & Field meet was held at Drake Stadium

2005-06 — A \$15 million renovation project improved many aspects of the stadium including permanent lights. The surface area of the stadium was flattened (previously the infield sat several feet lower than the track surface). It created a reconfigured track to meet NCAA and international standards, improved seating, and added a "safety lane" on the outside of the track for athletes. With the removal of Clark Street, behind the old Drake Stadium scoreboard, new venues for the javelin, discus and hammer throws were constructed. In addition, a new scoreboard with video screen was placed at the northeast corner of the stadium. Widening the track lanes from 42 inches to 48 inches reduced the stadium's seating capacity from 18,000 to 14,557. The football field at Drake Stadium was officially named Johnny Bright Field in memory of the former All-American Drake football player who is an inductee in the College Football Hall of Fame.

2007 — Drake Stadium served as host of the NCAA Midwest Regional Track and Field Championships.

2008 — The NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships returned to Drake Stadium for the first time since 1970 with Florida State and LSU winning the men's and women's team titles, respectively.

2009 — With a century of America's Athletic Classic under its belt, the Drake Relays celebrated its 100th year with 20 athletes being honored led by Olympic gold medalists Michael Johnson and Gwen Torrence, who were named the respective Men's and Women's Athletes of the Century.

2010 - Drake Stadium hosted the USA Outdoor Championships—the first of four held in Des Moines. Chaunte Lowe and Kara Patterson set American records in the women's high jump and discus, respectively. Lowe's mark of 6-8 3/4 still stands as the U.S. record in 2025.

2016 — New turf was installed and the track was resurfaced using the same material used at the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Summer Olympics.

2019 — Called the greatest track and field meet ever held in the state of Iowa, one world record, three American records and 18 Drake Stadium records were set when Drake Stadium hosted the USA Championships.







## PREVIOUS DRAKE RELAYS DIRECTORS

Twelve men have served as directors of the Drake Relays since the first event in 1910.

The founder and first director was Major John L. Griffith, serving from 1910 through 1918. Griffith moved to the University of Illinois after World War I and later became commissioner of the Big Ten Conference.

Succeeding Griffith was M.B. Banks, who served from 1919 to 1921. He also coached football and basketball.

Next in line was K.L. (Tug) Wilson, a former Illinois and Olympic athlete. Wilson directed the Drake games from 1922 to 1925 and later coached and was athletic director at Northwestern University. He is a former Big Ten Conference commissioner.

Ossie Solem, longtime Drake coach, succeeded Wilson. He left Drake to become head football coach at the University of Iowa, and later at Syracuse University and finishing at Springfield (Mass.) College. He was Relays Director from 1926-32.

F.P. (Pitch) Johnson, another fine Illinois athlete, was director of the Relays from 1933-40. He left to become track coach at Stanford University.

Johnson's successor was M.E. (Bill) Easton, the head man from 1941 to 1947. Easton moved to the University of Kansas as track coach and director of the Kansas Relays.

Tom Deckard, an outstanding distance runner at Indiana University, served as Relays boss from 1948-55. He resigned to enter business.

Bob Karnes, one of the track and field greats at the University of Kansas, served as Drake Relays director for 14 years and also served 17 years as the Drake athletic director before retiring in 1986.

He won more Big Seven Conference championships than any runner in Kansas history and captained five Kansas track and cross country teams. He twice was named the outstanding competitor in the conference meet. Karnes anchored or was a member of eight winning relay teams in a two-year span at the Drake, Kansas and Texas Relays.

Bob Ehrhart held the longest tenure as Drake Relays director for 31 years before retiring in 2000. A 1954 graduate of Northwestern, Ehrhart guided the track program at his alma mater for nine seasons before coming to Drake in 1969.

Under Ehrhart's direction, Drake track and cross country teams won nine Missouri Valley Conference championships, including six in indoor track, two in cross country and one in outdoor track. He coached 11 NCAA All-Americans at Drake, including 1970 NCAA decathlon champion Rick Wanamaker and Kevin Little, a two-time All-American at the NCAA indoor and outdoor meets in 1989 and 1990.

Mark Kostek served as Drake Relays director from 2001-05 expanding the meet to three days including a distance carnival on Thursday. The 2004 Drake Relays featured a record 116 events.

Brian Brown, who served as Drake Relays director from 2006-2016, widened the scope of the event considerably. Events such as the invitational pole vault at Jordan Creek Town Center, the Grand Blue Mile downtown, the Drake Road Races, the Olympic Games and World Championship preview events have featured some of the world's top athletes at Drake Stadium.

Blake Boldon, who is on the NCAA Track and Field Committee, has continued to enhance the international and collegiate fields during his tenure as Drake Relays director. Thirty-three Drake Relays records have been set since Boldon was named Drake Relays director in 2016.





Weiss earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish and Business Marketing from Loras College where she also honed her skills as a competitor. After concluding her time at Loras, Weiss eventually earned her Master's in Sports Leadership from North Central College. Prior to her time in Waverly, Hannah served as the Director of Cross Country and

in Columbus, Ohio for six years. At Capital, Weiss coached and recruited sprint and distance runners and coordinated the coaching, recruiting, fundraising and general development of both programs

(Sprints/Jumps/Hurdles)




Brown came to Drake in 2022 from his alma mater, Kent State University, where he was an assistant coach since October of 2018.

In addition to working with the sprinters and hurdlers at Kent State, Brown also worked with the middle distance runners. Brown previously spent two years on staff at Michigan, serving as a program assistant and recruiting coordinator. His efforts landed the Wolverines' 2018 recruiting class a No. 6 national ranking from MileSplit.

A three-year letter winner and two-year captain for the Golden Flashes, the Dayton, Ohio native earned multiple All-MAC honors. Brown earned two degrees from Kent State in 2014 and 2021.

### Jay Koloseus

Head Track & Field/Cross Country Coach



Jay Koloseus joined the Drake track & field and cross country staff in August of 2017 and was promoted to head coach in July of 2022.

Koloseus has mentored Adam Fogg and Isaac Basten to multiple All-America honors while they continued to break the 4-minute barrier in the mile. Fogg and Basten also qualified for the 2021 NCAA Cross Country Championships, becoming the first Bulldogs to run at the NCAA Championships since 2016.

Before arriving in Des Moines, Koloseus was the head track and field and cross country coach at Louisburg College in Louisburg, N.C. from 2013-2017. He started the cross country programs in 2013 and began the track & field programs in 2015. Both the Louisburg men's and women's track & field teams won regional championships in their first two seasons of existence. Koloseus was the 2014 Region X NJCAA cross country men's and women's Coach of the Year. In total, he was named Region X Coach of the Year six times.

Prior to constructing the programs at Louisburg, Koloseus was a graduate assistant coach at Auburn University where he helped oversee the Tigers' cross country teams and distance runners.

As a student-athlete, Koloseus was a member of two Big East champion cross country teams at Syracuse and was an All-Big East selection.

### Zane Chapman

Assistant Coach (Throws)



Zane Chapman joined the Drake track and field staff in August of 2017 and oversees the Bulldog throwers.

Under his direction, Drake student-athletes have established numerous school records and 10 performances that rank in the top-10 all-time at Drake. Most recently, Anthony Barmes broke the Missouri Valley Conference men's hammer throw record.

Prior to Drake, he spent a season at the University of Wisconsin as the Badgers' volunteer throws coach. In his season at UW, he aided in coaching four NCAA All-Americans, nine NCAA regional qualifiers, Olympian Kelsey Card and assisted in all aspects of the throws program.

He joined the staff at UW after a season at his alma mater, Eastern Illinois. At both EIU and UW, he gained extensive experience in strength and conditioning programs.

As a student-athlete, he was a team captain at EIU during his senior season as a well-rounded thrower that competed in all four throws and scored points in the discus, hammer throw and shot put to help the Panthers win an Ohio Valley Championship.

# FORMER OHIO STATE COACH KAREN DENNIS INDUCTED INTO COACHES HALL OF FAME



Karen Dennis, who guided Ohio State to 16 Drake Relays titles in a seven-year period, was inducted into the Drake Relays Coaches Hall of Fame during a Thursday luncheon at the Schickler Club in the Knapp Center on the Drake University campus.

The induction of Dennis increased membership in the Drake Relays Coaches Hall of Fame to 93. The Coaches Hall of Fame was established in 1977 with charter members John L. Griffith (Drake), Harry Gill (Illinois), Tom E. Jones (Wisconsin), Clyde Littlefield (Texas), Leo Johnson (Illinois) and Bill Easton (Drake, Kansas).

Dennis left her mark on the track & field world during a long career, retiring from coaching in 2022 after 20 seasons at Ohio State and 45 years of collegiate coaching. With 13 Big Ten team championships (12 at Ohio State), 12 Big Ten Coach of the Year accolades, coaching eight Olympians and eight national champions and six USTFCCCA Regional Coach of the Year awards, Dennis is a legend within the sport. She became the first coach in Big Ten history to be named coach of the year on both the men's and women's side at the same outdoor championships, doing so just weeks before her retirement.

Under Dennis, the Ohio State women won the Hy-Vee Cup at the 2017 Drake Relays buoyed by second-place finishes in the 4x100 and 4x400 relays and third in the 4x800. Leticia Wright from Ohio State won the women's university-college division 100 hurdles in 2010 and 2011, setting a meet record of 12.87 in 2011 which still exists today. The Buckeyes' Alexis Franklin swept the women's university-college 400 hurdles in 2014 and 2015, becoming the first in the event to repeat titles in 10 years. Ohio State also won the women's university-college 100, 800 and 1,500 at the 2018 Drake Relays.

The Buckeyes sped to championships in the Drake Relays men's university division 4x100 relay in 2017 and 2018, becoming the first team to win back-to-back titles in the event in 10 years. Ohio State's JC Murasky won back-to-back men's university division shot put crowns in 2015 and 2016. Zack Bazile won the 2018 Drake Relays men's university-college long jump and a month later captured the NCAA Outdoor championship.

Dennis began her coaching career as an assistant coach at Michigan State in 1977 before being promoted to head coach in 1981. She accepted a similar position as head coach at UNLV from 1992-2002 before joining the Ohio State staff. Dennis coached the Ohio State women's program from 2006-14, then became head coach of the overall program.

Under Dennis' leadership, athletes captured 118 Big Ten Conference individual titles plus an additional 22 relay crowns for a total of 140 Big Ten champions as head coach at Ohio State and Michigan State. Among the national champions were Christina Manning in the 60- and 100-meter hurdles in 2012 and three-time shot put champ Adelaide Aquilla. Her 2018 men's team swept the Big Ten indoor and outdoor championships. The Ohio State women's team completed a similar sweep in 2019 and 2011 and repeated as outdoor champion in 2012. In 2022, she guided the Buckeyes to the men's and women's outdoor titles to finish her Ohio State career with five women's outdoor championships, four women's indoor crowns, two men's outdoor titles and one men's indoor championship.

Dennis' coaching leadership on the national and international track and field circuit was highlighted by serving as head coach of the U.S. women's track and field team at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games. Prior to her Olympic coaching duties with Team USA, Dennis was an assistant coach of U.S. national teams at the 1995 World Championships in Gothenburg, Sweden; the 1991 Pan American Games in Havana, Cuba; and the 1989 World University Championships in Duisburg, Germany.

Dennis is a member of the USA Track & Field International Competition Committee and a past president of the Athletic Congress Women's Track Coaches Association. She also has served as a member of the NCAA Women's Track and Field Committee and the NCAA Track Coaches Association.

Dennis has been enshrined in three other Halls of Fame. She was named to the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association Coaches Hall of Fame in 2018, to the Michigan State Sports Hall of Fame in 2019 and to the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020.

Dennis is a 1977 graduate of Michigan State University with a degree in public affairs management and received her master's degree in sports administration in 1979. She helped the Spartans' track and field team to a fourth-place finish at the 1975 AIAW national championships.

## CROUSER, MITCHELL, PORTER MAKE UP ATHLETES HALL OF FAME CLASS

Three-time Olympic gold medalist and world record holder Ryan Crouser, along with former University of Nebraska track and field stars Paulette (Villarreal) Mitchell and Shanelle (Simmons) Porter were inducted into the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame during a Thursday luncheon at the Schickler Club in the Knapp Center on the Drake University campus.

The trio's induction increased membership in the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame to 228. The Athletes Hall of Fame was established in 1959 during the Golden Anniversary of the Drake Relays with 72 charter members, including Jesse Owens who was named the outstanding performer during the first half-century of the Drake Relays.

Crouser captured an unprecedented five straight Drake Relays invitational men's shot put titles from 2018-23. He was named the outstanding men's performer of the 2023 Drake Relays after recording the top spot in the world en route to setting a Drake Relays record of 73 feet-5 1/4 inches, breaking the previous meet record of 72-6 1/4 by Christian Cantwell in 2006.

Crouser launched the third and fourth throws of 22-plus meters (72-2 1/4) in Drake Relays history, pushing his career mark to 203 throws over 22 meters. Crouser also holds the Drake Stadium record of 74-6 1/2 set at the 2020 Blue Oval Showcase where he topped 22 meters on all six throws, displaying one of the greatest shot put series of all time.

He holds the world record in the shot put, both indoors and outdoors. He set the outdoor world record at 77-3 3/4 in May 2023, improving upon his previous record of 76-8 1/4 from July 2021. He has held the indoor record of 74-10 1/2 since January 2021.

Crouser is the only three-time shot put gold medalist in Olympic history, achieving his first Olympic gold medal at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympics with a throw of 73-10 3/4 and retained his title at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, setting an Olympic record of 76-5 1/2. He also won the gold medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics with a throw of 75-1 3/4. At the 2019 World Championships in Doha, Qatar, he secured a silver medal. Crouser then went on to win gold at both the 2022 World Championships in Eugene, Ore., and the 2023 World Championships in Budapest, Hungary. His throw of 77-1 3/4 in Budapest set a record for the farthest throw ever at a World Championships.

Of the 14 throws of more than 23 meters (75-5 1/2) in world history, Crouser has recorded nine, including the top four.

In his early career, Crouser set a national high school record for the indoor shot put and outdoor discus, and he won gold in the shot put at the 2009 World Youth Championships. He won four NCAA titles (two indoor/two outdoor) in the shot put at the University of Texas where he also captured nine Big 12 Conference titles (seven shot put/two discus). He won the national title in the shot put at the USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships seven of the eight times the event was held between 2016 and 2024. He is also a four-time national champion in the indoor shot put at the USA Indoor Track and Field Championships, with victories in 2019, 2020, 2022 and 2024.

Crouser has been named Track & Field News World Male Athlete of the Year. He was also awarded USA Track & Field's highest accolade, the Jesse Owens Award, and was twice a finalist for Male Track and Field World Athlete of the Year by World Athletics, the international governing body for track and field. Crouser holds the distinction of earning victories in a Diamond League Championship, Olympic Games, World Indoor Championship, World Outdoor Championship and World Youth Championship.

Mitchell was a three-time Drake Relays champion in the university-college shot put from 1994-96. Her three consecutive women's titles marked the first time an athlete won back-to-back-to-back women's shot put crowns and is only one of two athletes to do so. She took second place in 1993 when she matched the mark of the longest throw.

Mitchell also competed in the discus at the Drake Relays during all four years of her collegiate career, finishing as high as sixth in 1996. She still holds the Drake Relays high school record in the shot with a best of 50-4 3/4 set in 1992, the first year for that girls' event.

She was a five-time indoor NCAA All-American from 1993-96 including a runner-up finish in 1995, and earned indoor All-American honors in the 20-pound weight throw in 1996. Mitchell added five outdoor All-American awards at Nebraska including shot put, discus, and hammer. She won five indoor league championships and four outdoor league crowns in the Big Eight Conference. Her hammer throw of 199 feet at the 1996 Big Eight meet set the national collegiate record.


Porter was a five-time Drake Relays champion in the sprint relays. She ran on the winning university division 4x200 and 4x400 relays in the 1991 and 1992 Drake Relays. She was also a member of the triumphant 4x100 relay in the 1992 Relays.

She was a 12-time All-American as a Husker with two NCAA crowns to her credit, winning the indoor 400 dash in 1993 and anchoring Nebraska's 1991 outdoor 4x400 relay. She earned 17 Big Eight Conference titles including nine individual races and eight relay events. Her Big Eight titles include three in the indoor 400, two in the indoor 200, and two in the outdoor 400. As a team Nebraska was a four-time Big Eight indoor and outdoor championship winner during her competitive career.

Porter ran on the United States' 4x400 relay teams that set American records in earning a silver medal at the 1997 World Indoor Championships and a bronze medal at the 1999 World Indoor Championships. She was also a bronze medalist in the 400 at the 2000 USA Indoor Championships.



Cindy founded Iowa Kidstrong in 2005 with a mission to inspire and empower youth to lead healthier lives through physical activity and education, and a bold vision to create a community where every child has the opportunity and access to achieve their full potential. Elsbernd has been the steady hand and driving force behind Iowa Kidstrong's efforts to achieve this transformational vision for more than 20 years — tirelessly and selflessly working to provide a brighter, healthier future for our youth.

Iowa Kidstrong — via its cornerstone KidStriders program — has been integral to the annual Grand Blue Mile presented by Wellmark Blue Cross and Blue Shield since its first running in 2010. KidStriders encourages elementary and middle school students to engage in regular physical activity throughout the academic year, culminating in their participation in the Grand Blue Mile. With the support of Iowa Kidstrong under her supervision, Grand Blue Mile has grown to become the nation's second-largest mile run and a beloved staple of America's Athletic Classic. More importantly, however, Elsbernd has positively influenced countless young lives, motivating them to adopt healthy lifestyles, fostering a lifelong love for fitness.

As this program sunsets after two incredible decades to enable Cindy to pursue new horizons personally and professionally, I reflect on her achievements in leading Iowa Kidstrong with a deep sense of gratitude and admiration. # DRAKE RELAYS WALL OF HONOR ADDS FOUR OFFICIALS

The Drake Relays presented by Xtream powered by Mediacom added the names of four officials to the Drake Relays Wall of Honor at its annual Officials Reception April 6. The Drake Relays Wall of Honor Class of 2025 includes long-time officials Harrison Cass, Dave Keck, Larry Moklestad, and Charlie Walker.

"The individual expertise and collective efforts of the Drake Relays officials is vital in the success of America's Athletic Classic," said Blake Boldon, the Franklin P. Johnson Director of the Drake Relays. "It is only appropriate that we gather each spring to celebrate the contributions of the most distinguished officials. While we appreciate the volunteerism of all of our officials and celebrate these honorees, we also remain grateful to the McAdam family who made the Wall of Honor possible."

Cass' love for the Relays started as a child and has only continued to grow throughout his life. Cass competed at Norwalk High School and as an Iowa State Cyclone. After serving in the U.S. Navy, he went on to receive his master's degree in school administration from Drake University. Working as a school administrator for Iowa school districts in West Des Moines, Marshalltown, and Bettendorf, Cass also began officiating for the Drake Relays as an umpire. He served in an official role at the Relays from 1977-90, then again in 1992, another four-year stint from 2002-06, and finally in 2012 and 2013. Since his retirement from officiating at the Relays, he continues to officiate at track and cross country meets for Iowa State.

Dave Keck's father, Bill, has been a Drake Relays official for 60 years and started bringing Dave to watch the Relays when he was in elementary school. Dave went on to compete at the Drake Relays running the 200 and 400 for Lincoln High School. He has officiated 25 Drake Relays from 1999 until present and is a USATF Certified Official. Keck has officiated at USATF National Championships and NCAA Division I and Division III National Championships. Dave received his undergraduate degree from Drake, and passed the CPA exam. He has been working in the financial services industry in the Des Moines area for over 30 years.

Moklestad has spent 40 years as an educator in the state of Iowa, accruing 31 years of experience as an Athletic Director and 15 years as a coach. During his career, Moklestad was awarded the Iowa Athletic Director of the Year and the Central Iowa Track Coach of the Year. He has been inducted into the Iowa High School Athletic Directors Association Hall of Fame and the National Interscholastic Athletic Directors Association Hall of Fame. Previously he held the position of president for the Iowa High School Athletic Directors Association. Larry currently serves as Co-Athlete check-in clerk alongside Gary Ross and as the Co-Administrator for the 2A Girls State Tennis Tournament. Moklestad has been an active Drake Relays official since 1997.

An Iowa native and U.S. Army veteran, Charlie Walker has been involved in the track and field world for 41 years. He has worked as a middle school and grade school track coach for St. Edmund since 1984 and began his career as a track and field official in the same year. He is also still on staff as a Relays official and got his start at Drake in 1998. Outside of track and field, he is a graduate of Drake University's Law School and has served on the Brushy Creek Area Honor Flight Board of Directors since its inception in September of 2009.

## BILL KECK HONORED WITH PAUL MORRISON LEGACY AWARD

Long-time Drake Relays official Bill Keck has been selected as the 2025 recipient of the Paul Morrison Legacy Award. Keck has been involved with track and field at Drake Stadium as a competitor or official for nine consecutive decades including an illustrious officiating tenure.

After encouragement from Gus Rump, another long-time Drake Relays official, Keck began officiating at the Iowa High School State Meet and Drake Relays in 1964. He became the longest-tenured Drake Relays official in 2019 after working his 56th straight Relays. With his only absence being the pandemic cancellation in 2020, the 2025 running will mark his 60th year as a Relays timer or clerk. Keck will be the first official to hold their post for 60 years.

Bill began his officiating experience on the timing crew at the Drake Relays and the State Meet. He moved onto the clerk staff after automated timing technology rose in popularity and has served on the Drake Relays Committee for over 40 years. Keck is a Relays Champions Club member, helping to ensure that generations will celebrate America's Athletic Classic for years to come. His family business, Keck Parking, has also provided round-the-clock transportation for elite athletes during Relays week, adding to the local atmosphere of such a global event.

In 2019, Keck was enshrined in the Iowa Association of Track Officials (IATO) Hall of Fame and is the eighth recipient of the Paul Morrison Legacy Award.


"Bill Keck embodies the Drake Relays," Franklin P. Johnson Director of the Drake Relays Blake Boldon said. "His service to the Drake, Des Moines, and track and field communities is unmatched and his love for the sport is evident. Bill's legacy, while not yet finished, is certainly worthy of this esteemed recognition."

Keck made his first appearance as a youth runner when he ran a leg on the Hubbell Elementary Shuttle Relay at the 1949 and 1950 Drake Relays. Later in his adolescence, he led off the Des Moines Roosevelt Junior High Shuttle Relay that took fifth at the 1951 Relays. From 1954-56 Keck ran on a total of four different Roosevelt relays that collected Relays medals. In 1955, he won two gold medals at the Iowa High School State Meet on the Roughriders' mile and mile medley relays. His athletic career continued at Cornell College from 1958-60 where he won four more Drake Relays medals including a pair of golds in the Iowa College mile relay and Iowa College 880-yard relay.

Bill and his wife, Barbara, have been married for over 60 years and are the proud parents of Joan, Cindy, and Dave. They have been blessed with 12 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. His son, Dave, is a 25-year Relays umpire who was inducted into the Drake Relays Officials Wall of Honor this year. Grandson Nathan also officiates as his schedule allowed.

The award is named in honor of longtime Drake University athletic historian Paul Morrison, a beloved figure on the Drake campus who passed away at the age of 100 on Nov. 30, 2017. Morrison took pride in and maintained historical Drake athletics narratives while attending 80 Drake Relays. A half-mile stretch of Forest Avenue in front of the Knapp Center is named in his honor.

Morrison was the initial recipient of the Legacy Award in 2017, followed by Franklin (Pitch) Johnson, in 2018; the Gary Osborn family and Scott Osborn in 2019; Bob Clark, 2021; Dave Mills, 2022; Pete Guerrini, 2023; and Mike Henderson, 2024.

## 28 RECORDS SET AT 2024 DRAKE RELAYS

A world leading mark, a top national high school performance and a race that eclipsed a 40-year-old record punctuated the final day of the 114th running of the Drake Relays.

John Reniewicki's assault on Steve Scott's 1984 record in the men's invitational 1500 highlighted 13 records that were set Saturday, pushing the three-day total to 28.

After a year's absence, Kentucky returned to Drake Stadium and won a combined eight events while setting a Drake Relays record of 38.66 seconds in the men's university 4x100 relay.

Payton Otterdahl sent five throws beyond 70 feet en route to winning the men's invitational shot put with a mark of 72-7 3/4 – the best outdoor effort in the world at the time.

Reniewicki, the runner-up at the USATF Road Mile in downtown Des Moines on Tuesday night, was named the outstanding men's performer after making history on the Blue Oval with a record-breaking 1500 effort, setting both the Drake Relays and Drake Stadium record with a personal best of 3:36.57. The 28-year-old was one of four competitors to beat Steve Scott's mark that stood for 40 years.

Olivia Markezich, a graduate student at Notre Dame, earned the Drake Relays outstanding women's performer award after anchoring a pair of relay victories while setting new Drake Relays and Drake Stadium records. Twins Andrea and Olivia Markezich ran the final two legs to send the Irish to a Drake Relays victory in the 4x1600 relay in 18:44.15 – a Relays and national collegiate record. Andrea built a 100-meter lead over Iowa State heading into the final leg and Olivia, the defending NCAA champion in the steeplechase, kept pulling away from there. Olivia Markezich brought home Notre Dame's second Relays win on Saturday, running the final leg of the title-winning distance medley.

Reniewicki beat the runner who got the best of him in the Road Mile, Vince Ciattei. Scott had set the record at 3:38.27, which also was the Drake Stadium record. Ciattei finished second in 3:36.57. Abe Alvarado came in third at 3:37.56 and Kenyan Justin Kipkoech slipped under the old record with his fourth-place time of 3:37.78.

Drake's Blue Oval continued to serve as a fast ground for Kentucky, which captured the Relays Cup in both the men's and women's university divisions under coach Lonnie Green. It's the second Relays Cup for the Kentucky women, who also won in 2022. The Wildcats capped the weekend with sweeps in the university 4x100 and 4x400 relays. The men followed their record in the 4x100 with a winning time of 3:03.06 in the university 4x400 relay. The women ran 44.38 in the 4x100 and 3:31.88 in the 4x400. Sydney Steely charged from behind to give the Wildcats a victory in the sprint medley in 3:46.53. That came after they ran a world best 8:27.94 to win the women's university 4x800 relay on Friday night. The program's other Relays titles came courtesy of Alexander Chukwukelu in the men's university-college 110 hurdles and Charity Hufnagel in the women's university-college high jump.

Annie Rodenfels set a Drake Relays record in the women's invitational steeplechase in 9:31.03 to knock a second-and-a-half off the old record.

Minnesota freshman Angelos Mantzouranis, a 19-year-old from Athens, Greece, set a Drake Relays record in the men's university championship hammer throw with a personal best of 247-10, bettering the previous mark of 246-11 by his Minnesota teammate Kostas Zaltos who was redshirted.

American record holder K.C. Lightfoot's first Drake Relays pole vault title lifted him to the No. 4 spot on the world outdoor list with a clearance of 19-2 to win the men's invitational event.

Longtime Relays favorite Lolo Jones returned to competition at Drake Stadium for the first time since 2014 and finished fifth in the women's invitational 100 hurdles, two days after she was inducted into the Drake Relays Athletes Hall of Fame. Great Britain's Cindy Sember, who like Jones was a two-time Olympian, won the race in 12.59 earning her fourth Drake Relays title, though Jones still received the loudest ovation from the crowd. Jones, a four-time Drake Relays champion, ran 13.10.

Aurora Rynda, the 2023 Canadian outdoor 800 runner up, came from behind in the last 100 meters to clip Bradley's Julia Nielsen to win the women's invitational 800 in 2:00.97, just two hundredths of a second better than Nielsen, who was clocked in a personal best 2:00.99.

Former Texas A&M runner Deshae Wise burst past the leaders out of lane seven to win at the wire in the women's invitational 400 hurdles in 55.52. Aldrich Bailey pulled ahead with 40 meters to go and held on to win the men's invitational 400 hurdles in 48.42.

Ole Miss senior Jalani Davis beat a field loaded with top throwers to win the women's invitational shot put. Davis, the 2024 NCAA indoor weight throw champion, threw 59-9 3/4 to capture the Relays flag, falling just short of her personal best of 61-2. Nebraska's Axelina Johansson, the 2023 NCAA outdoor champion, was second at 58-11 1/2, while Jessica Ramsey, the 2021 Olympic Trials champion and an Olympic finalist, was third at 58-6 3/4.

Darek Hackett of Air Force, who earlier won the university-college 400 hurdles, picked up his second Drake Relays title of the weekend when he anchored the Falcons to victory in the men's university-college shuttle hurdle relay.

South Dakota's Erin Kinney won the women's university-college 100, edging Kentucky's Victoria Perrow by one-thousandth of a second after both were timed in 11.51. On Friday night, Kinney ran the first leg in helping South Dakota win the women's university-college 4x200.

Seven records were set on Friday. Iowa State had a close duel with Kentucky going until pulling away in the final carry to win the men's university 4x800 relay in 7:22.53. It was the Cyclones' fifth victory in the men's 4x800 relay in the last six Drake Relays.

Nebraska junior Tyus Wilson, the 2024 Big Ten Conference indoor champ, captured men's university-college high jump with a personal best 7-5. Minnesota's Shelby Frank, a two-time runner-up in the weight throw at the NCAA Indoor Championships, won the championship division in the women's university-college discus at 191-5 on her first attempt – the best mark at the Relays since Nebraska's Becky Breisch set the meet record of 205-5 in 2004.

The Augustana (S.D.) women won the college distance medley relay for the sixth straight year and ninth time overall in 11:45.82. Olivet Nazarene's Hannah Antkoviak lowered her NAIA all-time record and beat the defending champion in winning the women's university/college 400 hurdles. Antkoviak circled the Blue Oval in 56.20 to end South Dakota's Joy Pulse's bid to repeat.

Minnesota State swept both the Relays Cups in the college men's and women's division. Pleasant Valley won the Relays Cup in the high school girls and Ankeny captured the Relays Cup in the high school boys division.

West Des Moines Valley senior Addison Dorenkamp was named the outstanding high school girls performer after setting a Drake Relays record and nearly a new all-time best in the state of Iowa in the 1500 with a time of 4:26.93. Her record-breaking performance came on Saturday after waiting through a three-hour weather delay. Dorenkamp also collected the 3000 crown in 9:23.69, nearly 20 seconds faster than the runner-up.

Aidan Jacobsen of Iowa City West was named the outstanding high school boys performer after taking home top honors in the 400 hurdles (52.52) and running the third leg of the winning distance medley squad.

Pleasant Valley just missed becoming the first Iowa team to run under 9 minutes in the girls 4x800 relay, finishing in 9:01.47 for a Relays record and the all-time Iowa best. Not to be outdone, Ankeny broke one of the oldest Relays records in the high school competition in winning the boys 4x800 relay and posting the fastest time in the country this year. With Ethan Zuber running a 1:51.62 anchor, the Hawks put up a time of 7:39.54, which is No. 3 on the state's all-time list, while erasing the Relays record of 7:45.63 set by Marshalltown in 1985.

Tony Anania, a junior at Norwalk, won the boys 1600 in 4:06.54 to break the record of 4:10.76 that Linn-Mar's Josh Evans set in 2014. Iowa Falls-Alden senior Jaden Damiano set a Drake Relays record in the boys 110 hurdles when he won his preliminary heat in 13.98, then ran even faster in the finals, winning the title in 13.84. Senior Jackson Johannes of Cedar Rapids Prairie charged out of the turn in lane one to set a Drake Relays record in winning the boys 400 in 47.67. Waukee's Anjelena Carder set a Drake Relays record in the high school girls' 400, winning in 55.45.

Hampton-Dumont junior Charlee Morton earned a piece of Drake Relays history with her repeat victory in the girls discus. Coupled with her second straight win in the shot put on Thursday, Morton became the third thrower in the Relays girls division to sweep those two events twice. She was stuck in fifth place in the discus before coming up with her winning throw of 141-2 on her next-to-last attempt.

Clear Lake junior Reese Brownlee became a double winner with her victory in the girls 400 hurdles. Brownlee, the long jump champion on Friday, circled the Blue Oval in the hurdles event in 1:00.75. Brownlee also finished second in the 400. Hanson King of Pella completed a sweep of the boys throwing events with his victory in the shot put. King threw 58-7 to claim the Relays title after winning the discus on Thursday.


