ABOUT BUCKNELL

Bucknell came into the season ranked No. 16, one spot behind the Dragons, in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25, but have started out impressively with a pair of wins over Monmouth and the No. 1 team in the poll, Quinnipiac. The Bison throttled Monmouth 70-32 on the road on Nov. 6 to open their campaign, then took down a Bobcats team which

held off Drexel by four, winning 75-58 at home on Sunday afternoon.

Kaitlyn Slagus leads the team with a double-double average very early on this season. She is scoring a team-best 13 points per game and pulling down 12 rebounds a contest. Kate Walker (12.5 ppg) and Ellie Mack (10.0 ppg) are also putting up double figure points for the Bison.

Both Slagus and Walker were named Preseason All-Patriot League choices for the Bison, who were tabbed as the preseason favorites. Slagus is a two-time Second Team All-PL player.

HEAD COACH · DENISE DILLON

Villanova '96 · 16th Season · Career Record: 283-196

Entering her 16th season as the head coach of Drexel's women's basketball team, Denise Dillon has become one of the most respected coaches in collegiate women's basketball, elevating the program to new heights and maintaining an enviable consistency and high level of play.

The winningest head coach in program history, Dillon has led the Dragons to nine postseason appearances. Those include the Dragons' first CAA Championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in the 2008-09 season, and a WNIT championship in 2012-13.

Dillon's Dragons are coming off their ninth postseason appearance and their fourth consecutive trip to the WNIT. Drexel captured its second regular season CAA crown in 2017-18, winning a program-record 24 regular season games and finishing 16-2 in conference play. The Dragons did not lose a regular season game at the Daskalakis Athletic Center, and advanced to their fifth conference championship game before earning the league's automatic bid to the WNIT. Dillon's charges included the program's sixth Dean Ehlers Leadership Award recipient in Kelsi Lidge, and its third CAA Rookie of the Year in Hannah Nihill.

Drexel has boasted a winning record in 10 of the last 11 seasons. The sixth of those came in 2012-13 when the Dragons won a school-record 28 games on its way to a 28-10 record and the WNIT title. The Dragons finished third in the CAA, reaching their third-ever and second-straight CAA title game before earning a bid to the WNIT. Drexel beat Iona, Harvard, Bowling Green, Auburn, Florida and Utah on its way to the title. Drexel had never defeated an SEC or Pac-12 team until the 2013 WNIT.

The first break-through season for Dillon and her Dragons came in 2008-09. Led by a core of veteran senior leaders and a talented junior in Gabriela Marginean, the Dragons played their way to the 2009 regular-season championship, a then-program record 24 wins and the top seed in the CAA Tournament. There, Drexel did what many thought was impossible: knocking off 17-time defending champion Old Dominion and ending the Lady Monarchs' NCAA-best 50-game conference tournament winning streak. The Dragons went on to defeat James Madison on its home court to bring home the school's first CAA title.

During her tenure Dillon has helped guide the careers of 23 All-Conference selections, five Dean Ehlers Leadership Award recipients, the program's first AP All-American, the leading scoring in Philadelphia women's basketball history and the first Drexel women's player to be selected in the WNBA Draft.

Dillon came to Drexel in 2001 as an assistant coach in charge of recruiting and player development. In 2003, Director of Athletics Dr. Eric Zillmer tapped Dillon to become interim head coach and by the 2004-05 season she received full appointment as the head coach of Drexel women's basketball. That season she turned a 10-18 team into a 19-10 squad that earned its first opening-round bye in the CAA Tournament.

Before coming to Drexel, Dillon boasted a remarkable playing career at Villanova under the tutelage of coaching legend Harry Perretta. Playing in an offense similar to the one now run by Drexel, Dillon scored 1,355 points and pulled down 677 rebounds. She was an All-Rookie selection and a three-time All-Big 5 and All-Big East pick. Her playing career earned her enshrinement in the Philadelphia Big 5 Hall of Fame in 2004, the Delaware County Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012, and the Villanova Varsity Club Hall of Fame in 2013. She was also inducted into the Cardinal O'Hara High School Hall of Fame in 2018.

Off the court, Dillon's commitment to helping student-athletes grow as players and as people has been one of the program's greatest success stories. Andrea Peterson ('09), Gabriela Marginean ('10), Hollie Mershon ('13), Meghan Creighton ('16) and Kelsi Lidge ('18) earned the CAA's prestigious Dean Ehlers Leadership Award. Nicole Hester ('09) was the recipient of the John Randolph Inspiration Award and the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association's Most Courageous Award in 2009. Hester, whose battle back from Hodgkin's Lymphoma in 2006-07 galvanized the team and the Drexel Athletics family, was recognized nationally as the recipient of the V Foundation Comeback Award and the Honda Inspiration Award. Through community outreach and serving others, the Dragons have helped to rally the Philadelphia community while using their experiences within the game of basketball to grow as individuals.

During her tenure Dillon has helped guide the careers of 23 All-Conference selections, five Dean Ehlers Leadership Award recipients, the program's first AP All-American, the leading scoring in Philadelphia women's basketball history and the first Drexel women's player to be selected in the WNBA Draft.

DRAGON BITES

LAST TIME OUT

- Drexel rebounded from an opening night loss to take down Saint Joseph's on Sunday afternoon, 51-34.
- The Dragons have now won five straight times in their second game of the year after starting a season 0-1.
- The win over the Hawks was the third straight for Drexel, which is now 6-1 against Saint Joseph's at home since Denise Dillon took over.
- The Dragons held SJU without a point in the first quarter, leading 16-0. It was the first time Drexel has ever blanked a team in a quarter.
- Bailey Greenberg had 17 points and eight rebounds, leading all players in both categories for a second consecutive game.
- Aubree Brown added 12 points with four steals.

UP NEXT

- The Dragons will venture away from the DAC for the first time this season, heading to Vermont for the TD Classic over Thanksgiving weekend.
- Drexel will take on Siena on Friday, Nov. 23 and either host Vermont or Wagner on Saturday, Nov. 24.
- The Dragons will play their next five games away from home, visiting La Salle after the trip to Vermont on Nov. 28 and taking part in the Manhattan College Holiday Tournament Dec. 7-8.
- Drexel will go more than a month between home games, returning to the DAC on Dec. 16 against Gardner-Webb.

HOME SWEET HOME

- The Dragons went 16-2 at the DAC last season, establishing a new program record for home wins in a year.
- They went 13-0 during the regular season at home, their first perfect home regular season.
- The Dragons have a .698 winning percentage at the DAC under Denise Dillon (148-64).
- This year's senior class has gone a combined 40-9 at home, an .816 winning percentage.

REGULAR SEASON RECORD

- Last year's team won 24 regular season games, a new program record for victories before the start of the conference tournament.
- The previous record was held by the CAA Champion 2008-09 team, which went 21-8 in the regular season.
- The Dragons' .771 winning percentage is also the highest in program history, eclipsing the mark of .759 set in 1989-90 (22-7).

POLLING FAVORABLY

- Drexel remains in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25, currently sitting at No. 18.
- The Dragons opened the season at No. 15.
- Last year's team finished the season ranked 14th, its highest ranking of the season.
- The Dragons are joined by CAA mate James Madison in the poll (No. 11).
- Four of Drexel's opponents in 2018-19 are currently ranked in the poll (No. 7 Quinnipiac, No. 8 Bucknell, No. 11 JMU, No. 21 Penn).
- Elon, Gardner Webb and Northeastern, three other opponents for the Dragons this season, are currently receiving votes in the ranking, while Wright State received votes earlier this year.

CLOSE AND LATE

- The Dragons were 10-3 in games decided by 10 points or less last season, and 4-1 in games decided by five or less.
- The team's three losses came at No. 24 Syracuse, at CAA co-champion James Madison, and in the WNIT against Fordham.
- Drexel was 3-0 in overtime games. The Dragons have won four straight in overtime overall after losing six straight prior to that run.
- The Dragons have started this season 0-1 in such games, losing 56-52 to Quinnipiac.

20/20 VISION

- Drexel won 27 games last season on the heels of a 22-11 year in 2016-17. It marks the first time in program history that Drexel has recorded back-to-back 20-win seasons.
- The Dragons have seven 20-win years all-time. Four of those have come in the last seven seasons.

MARGIN OF SUCCESS

- Drexel's +6.09 turnover margin last season ranked 13th nationally and tops in the CAA.
- Opponents turned the ball over 655 times to Drexel's 442 last season.

PRESEASON PICKS

- The Dragons were picked to finish second in the CAA by the preseason coaches poll. Drexel got two first-place votes and collected a total of 71 points, eight behind first-place James Madison.
- Bailey Greenberg has been selected as a Preseason First Team All-CAA performer. She was a Second Team choice after the 2017-18 season, and an All-Rookie Team member following the 2016-17 campaign.
- Aubree Brown and Hannah Nihill were both tabbed as Pre-season Honorable Mention All-CAA choices. Nihill is the reigning CAA Rookie of the Year.

ALL-LEAGUE ALL THE TIME

- Drexel junior Bailey Greenberg is the fifth player in program history to be named to a postseason All-CAA team after each of her first two seasons. She was an All-Rookie Team choice in 2017 and a Second Team All-CAA selection last year.
- She joins Catherine Scanlon (2003-04), Narissa Suber (2005-06), Gabriela Marginean (2007-08) and Sarah Curran (2013-14).
