The Hornets are ninth in the latest Heritage Sports Radio Network (HSRN) weekly Division I Black College poll. Delaware State also received votes in the weekly Sheridan Broadcast Network Black College poll, but not enough to crack the Top 10.

The Series: Morgan State leads 32-24

Delaware State Head Coach Kermit Blount (Winston-Salem State, 80): Blount is in his third season as head coach of the Hornets. He has a 14-18 overall (11-12 MEAC) at DSU. Now in his 20th year as a collegiate head coach, he has a career record of 105-105-3. Prior to accepting the DSU post, he was 91-87-3 in 17 years as head coach at Winston-Salem State University. Blount led WSSU to two CIAA championships and three league title game appearances. He was named CIAA Coach-of-the-Year in 1999 & 2000. Blount is 3-3 vs. Morgan State, including 1-1 since coming to Delaware State.

Morgan State Head Coach Donald Hill-Eley (Virginia Union, '91) is in his 12th season as head coach of the Bears. Hill-Eley has an overall record of 58-76 at Morgan State and in his career. He previously served as offensive coordinator at Morgan State (2001) and Hampton (1997-2000). He helped lead Hampton to two MEAC championships and a victory in the 1999 heritage Bowl. Hill-Eley is 5-6 vs. Delaware State.

THE GAME

Delaware State closes out the 2013 season against long-time Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference rival Morgan State. The Hornets have won four of their last five games to improve to 5-5 overall and 5-2 in the MEAC. DSU is coming off a 29-21 come-from-behind win over Florida A&M last Saturday. The Hornets scored 26 unanswered points after trailing 21-3 in the second quarter. The Rattlers scored 14 points off two Delaware State turnovers to help build their lead. The Hornets began their comeback when Dae-Hon Cheung scored a touchdown on a nine-yard run in the second quarter. DSU trailed 21-10 at the break. The Hornets pulled to within 21-16 when Cory Murphy connected with Bo Ceravolo on a nine-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter. Delaware State completed the comeback when Murphy hit Milton Williams III for an 18-yard touchdown pass with 11:37 left in the fourth quarter to lead 22-21. On Florida A&M's next possession, DSU defensive back Cory Scott scooped up a Rattler fumble and ran 55 yards to the endzone to give the Hornets a 29-21 lead. Delaware State outscored Florida A&M 19-0 in the second half. The win gave DSU a 3-1 record in MEAC road games this season.

Morgan State (4-7; 4-3) is trying rebound from a 38-3 loss to South Carolina State in its last outing on Nov. 14. The Bears fell behind 21-0 in the first quarter and never recovered. MSU had won its previous two games. The Bears are currently tied for fourth place in the MEAC with a 4-3 in league games. Morgan State enters the contest as one of the MEAC's better rushing teams. The Bears are fourth in the league in rushing at 173.5 yards per game.

THE SERIES

This is the 57th meeting between the Hornets and Bears. It is Delaware State's second oldest rivalry (69 games vs. Howard). Delaware State won the last meeting, although Morgan State holds a 32-24 lead in the series. The last time the teams met, the Hornets posted a 28-23 victory over the Bears in Baltimore, Md., in 2012. DSU quarterback Nick Elko completed 33-of-42 passes for a career-high 398 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Hornets in last year's meeting. The last time the teams played at Delaware State, Morgan State won 12-0 in a driving rainstorm in 2011. Tracey Martin rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Bears.

HORNETS STILL ALIVE IN MEAC RACE

DSU is currently third in the MEAC standings. Bethune-Cookman and South Carolina State lead the league with 6-1 records. A Delaware State win over Morgan State and losses by Bethune-Cookman (vs. Florida A&M) and South Carolina State (at Norfolk State) this weekend would create a three-way tie atop the conference standings at seasons end. The Hornets lost to Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 5 (21-7), but did not face South Carolina State this season.

Defending champ Bethune-Cookman and South Carolina State are tied for first at 5-1, although Bethune-Cookman holds the tie-breaker by virtue of its win over SC State this season.

Delaware State, a charter member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), is in its 43th season of league play. The Hornets have an all-time record of 128-146-1 in MEAC contests. Delaware State has won or shared six MEAC championships. The Hornets claimed outright MEAC titles in 1985, 1989 and 2007, while sharing the crown in 1987, 1988 and 1991. Delaware State was tied for third place in the MEAC with a 5-3 mark in 2012.

MURPHY HOLDS ON TO MEAC PASSING LEAD

Delaware State quarterback **Cory Murphy** (sr.; 6-2, 205) continues to lead the MEAC in passing yardage per game, but his lead has tightened. Murphy came off the bench in the third quarter to connect on 10-of-15 passes for 141 yards and touchdowns in the Hornets' 29-21 come-from-behind win over Florida A&M last week. For the season, Murphy is tops in the MEAC in passing at 192.8 yards per game, just ahead of Howard's Greg McGhee, who is second at 192.2 ypg. Murphy has completed 175-of-316 passes (55.4%) for 1928 yards and 10 touchdowns. His record also includes 12 interceptions, resulting in an efficiency rating of 109.5, seventh-best among league QBs. Murphy completed 30-of-45 passes (67%) for 302 yards and two touchdowns in his DSU debut at Delaware on Sep. 7. He also led the Hornets with 44 yards rushing in the opener. The Hornets had an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive and a 14-play, 81-yard scoring march under Murphy's direction in the contest. He completed five-of-eight passes for 58 yards in engineering an eight-play, 61-yard drive that consumed eight-minutes-42 seconds in DSU's 14-7 win over Norfolk State on Oct. 12. Murphy was 26-for-53 for 234 yards at Towson the next week. On Sep. 28 at Savannah State, he matched his career-high with two touchdown passes. Murphy played two injury-plagued seasons at Foothills JC in California after two solid years at Wilcox High School in Santa Clara, Cal. He passed for more than 200 yards and two touchdowns in the Hornets' Red-White scrimmage last spring.



WILLIAMS III GOLSON ARE MEAC'S TOP PASS CATCHERS

Delaware State receivers **Milton Williams III** (jr.; 6-3; Washington, D.C.) and **Malik Golson** (r-fr.; 5-9, Dover, Del.) have combined to form the MEAC's best 1-2 punch this season. Golson is tops in the MEAC in receptions at 5.1 per game (47th in FCS), while Williams is second at 4.9 per contest. Golson has a league-best 51 receptions this season, Williams has 49. Williams ranks second in the conference in receiving yards at 70.9 per contest (709 yards total), while Golson is third at 49.9 (499 yards). Williams has four 100-receiving-yard games and four touchdowns, which ties for second in the MEAC. He scored the go-ahead touchdown on an 18-yard reception at Florida A&M last week. Williams had 10 receptions for 112 yards, each a career-high, in the 2013 opener at Delaware. The following week at Towson, he had nine catches for 105 yards and his second career touchdown catch. He hauled in six passes for 100 yards at NCA&T on Oct. 19. In DSU's last outing (Nov. 2 vs. Howard), Williams had five catches for 107 and a touchdown. His previous single-game highs were five catches and 44 yards. Williams entered the 2013 season with 18 catches for 138 yards and a touchdown in 13 games at DSU. Golson is also tied for second in the MEAC with four touchdown receptions. He tied a career-high with nine catches for 80 yards at Hampton on Oct. 26. He also hauled in nine passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns (4 & 7 yards) in his collegiate debut at Delaware on Sep. 7. His 53-yard touchdown reception at Savannah State (Sep. 28) is tops for the Hornets this season.



YOUTH IS SERVED ON DSU OFFENSIVE LINE

Delaware State's youthful offensive line has had its share of ups-and-downs this season. In last week's 29-21 win at Florida A&M, the Hornets rushed for a season-high 137 yards and collected 346 total yards, their second best output of the season. After allowing just one sack and paving the way for 440 yards of total offense against a veteran Delaware defensive line in the opener, the line surrendered five sacks, while the Hornets netted just 15 yards on the ground at Towson the next week. In game three at No. 1 North Dakota State, DSU gained just 199 yards, including 34 rushing. On Sep. 28 at Savannah State, the Hornets rushed for 134 yards. DSU senior center **Brandon Cunningham** (Lumberton, N.J.) appeared in 30 games with the Hornets entering the 2013 season, more than the combined total of all other Hornet offensive linemen on the squad. Cunningham, a 2013 preseason All-MEAC First Team selection, is the lone senior on a unit that features a first-year junior college transfer, two sophomores, three redshirt freshmen and four true freshmen.

ADJEI LEADER OF VETERAN DEFENSE



Delaware State University inside linebacker **Ernest Adjei** (sr.; Woodbridge, Va.) is living up to his preseason billing. Adjei, a preseason All-MEAC First Team pick, is tops on the Hornets and 16th in the MEAC at 7.5 tackles per game (75 total tackles). He had a career-high 16 tackles (seven solo) in DSU's 14-7 win over Norfolk State on Oct. 12). Adjei also leads the Hornets with 10.5 tackles-for-loss; and is also credited with two sacks. Adjei returned to his natural position at linebacker in 2011. That season, he was third on the team with 59 total tackles. His 2011 season was highlighted by a career-high 14 tackles (12 solo) vs. Morgan State. Last season, Adjei added All-MEAC First Team to his resume'. He earned the honor after finishing seventh in the league

with 93 tackles (8.5 pg) while competing in all 11 games. His efforts helped lead the Hornets to a 6-5 overall record in 2012, their first winning season in five years; and a tie for third in the MEAC with a 5-3 mark.

KNEE INJURY SHELVES MORE FOR REST OF SEASON

The Delaware State defense will not be able to rely on free safety **Davon Moore** (jr.; 5-11, 205) for the remainder of the season. Moore is out for the rest of the season due to a knee injury. He missed the previous two games because of the injury, which occurred during a practice session. Moore was putting together another solid season as one of the top defensive backs in the MEAC. Moore was tops on the Hornets and tied for 13th in the MEAC in tackles at 7.7 per game (54 total) before the injury. He also has an interception this season.



A 2012 All-MEAC First Team selection, Moore was tops

on the Hornets and third in the MEAC at 8.8 tackles per-game and 97 total tackles. He led all FCS players with a school-record 175 interception return yards and was tied for third in the MEAC (24th FCS) at 0.36 interceptions per game (4 total ints.). Moore was honored by the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and College Football Performance for his play in the Hornets' 20-17 win at Norfolk State last season. He was named MEAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week and College Football Performance HBCU National Defensive Back-of-the-Week after recording eight tackles (six unassisted), two interceptions, a forced fumble, pass break-up and a block in the contest.

PERRY COMES THROUGH FOR DSU DEFENSE

Delaware State linebacker **Alex Perry** (jr.; 6-0, 235) is making the most of his second chance with the Hornets. Perry sat out the 2012 season after competing in 2010 and 2011. The Jacksonville, Fla., native has been a major factor in the Hornets' recent defensive turnaround. Perry is third on the Hornets with 8.0 six tackles-for-loss (-39 yards) and is second on the team with three sacks (-19). He's also credited with two forced fumbles and a recovery this season.

HORNETS BACK IN INTERCEPTION GAME

After failing to record an interception in the first five games, DSU defenders have picked off passes in each of the last five contests. Cornerback **J.R. Robinson** has an interception in three of the last five games to tie for the team lead with three. Rover **Joe Boyd** also has three picks, while **Cameren Judge** has two. **Davon Moore** and **Cory Scott** have one each this season.

COLSTON BUILDING ON FIRST-YEAR SUCCESS

Delaware State University defensive back **Terrick Colston** (so.; Lakeland, Fla.) is following up a stellar freshman season with solid play in his second year. Colston is second on the team (18th in MEAC) with 74 tackles (7.4 per game). He's also credited with 4.5 tackles for loss, four fumble recoveries and a pass break-up. Colston has been playing at free safety since the injury to **Davon Moore**.



Colston played a key role in the Hornets' 24-22 win at Savannah State on Sep. 28. He was tied for the team high with 10 tackles (5 solo). He also recovered two fumbles, broke up a pass and recorded a backfield tackle in the contest. Colston was rewarded for his outstanding freshman season with a 2013 preseason All-MEAC selection.

A 2012 SportsNetwork Jerry Rice Award candidate for top Football Championship Subdivision freshman and All-MEAC Second Team pick, Colston was second on the Hornets and fifth in the MEAC at 8.6 tackles per-game (95 total tackles), tops among league freshmen, setting a team record for tackles by a freshman. He was a two-time MEAC Rookie-of-the-Week last season, once after collecting a team-high nine tackles (five solo), two interceptions and a pass break-up in the Hornets' 31-17 win over South Carolina State (Oct. 13). He returned the first interception 53 yards for a touchdown.

GUNTER LIVING UP TO EXPECTATIONS

Hornet defensive end **Rodney Gunter** (jr.; Haines City, Fla.) is living up to his lofty preseason status. Gunter leads the Hornets with 4.5 sacks and is second on the team with 9.0 tackles for loss. Gunter had six tackles (five solo), including a sack and 1.5 other backfield stops in last week's 29-21 win over Florida A&M. He collected had two tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks in the contest vs. Savannah State on Sep. 28; and also recorded 1.5 sacks vs. Bethune-Cookman the following week. He has been named to the 2013 preseason All-MEAC First Team by league head coaches and sports information directors, and *Phil Steele's College Football Magazine*.

A 2012 All-MEAC Second Team selection, he was team leader and tied for seventh in the MEAC at 0.50 sacks per game (5.5 total) last season. In addition, Gunter was seventh on the Hornets with 49 total tackles, tops among team defensive linemen with 27 unassisted tackles and second on the team with nine tackles-for-loss (-46).

HORNETS STRUGGLING TO FIND RUNNING GAME

Delaware State has struggled with its running game throughout the 2013 season. The Hornets are 10th in the MEAC (117th FCS) in rushing at 82.3 yards per game this year. DSU's running game was slowed early in the season by the absence of last year's leading rusher, **Malcolm Williams** (jr.; 5-9, 175), who missed the first four games due to a toe injury. Williams has

rushed for 175 yards on 57 carries, while catching nine passes for 73 yards in the six games since his return. Williams, a 2013 preseason All-MEAC First Team selection, was the Hornets' top rusher with 437 yards despite missing two games due to an ankle injury in 2012. Williams had two 100-yard games last season, including 120 vs. FBS Cincinnati. Williams' absence, along with early deficits against nationally ranked opponents and a young offensive line, contributed to the subpar rushing numbers this season. The Hornets had their best rushing output of the season in their Sep. 28 win over Savannah State. DSU rushed for a season-high 134 yards in the contest. **Dae-Hon Cheung** (so.; 5-9, 180) is DSU's leading rusher with 344 yards on 78 carries this season. He has the Hornets' longest run this season, 61 yards for a touchdown against Savannah State (Sep. 28). Cheung rushed for 410 yards (5.0 ypc) and three touchdowns as a true freshman last season.

Nagee Jackson (so.; 6-1, 215) is DSU's third leading rusher and top short-yardage back. He has carried the ball 49 times for 167 yards and two touchdowns this season. He had 238 yards rushing and a team-high seven touchdowns on the ground, tops among all MEAC freshmen last season.

Lamar Shaw (jr.; 5-10, 230) has been used in short yardage situation more of late. He scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard run at NCA&T on Oct. 19. Shaw is fifth on the Hornets with 61 yards rushing on 25 attempts this season. He is tied with Jackson for the team lead with two rushing touchdowns this season.

TURNOVERS WIN, AND LOSE, BALL GAMES

Delaware State forced four turnovers last week (3 INTs; 1 FR) and committed two in last week's win over Florida A&M. The Hornets are 10th in the MEAC (102nd FCS) in turnover margin at -0.5 pg. Delaware State is minus-seven in the turnover department this season. The Hornets have forced 21 turnovers while giving the ball away 26 times in their nine games. Delaware State opponents have scored 93 points following Hornet turnovers this season. DSU has scored 35 points off opponent turnovers this year.

DSU was among the nation's most opportunistic Football Championship Sub-division teams in 2012. The Hornets were second in the MEAC and fourth in the nation with a 1.4 turnover margin in 2012. Delaware State had 31 takeaways (16 fumble recoveries/15 INTs) and just 16 giveaways (11 lost fumbles/5 INTs) last season.

STAYING HOME

Delaware State's 2013 roster includes a total of nine in-state players, second to Maryland (13) for tops among the states. DSU PUNTER AMONG SEMIFINALISTS FOR NATIONAL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Delaware State University punter Marco Kano (sr.; Cottbus, Germany) is among 170 candidates for 2013 National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete honors. The nominees also comprise the list of semifinalists for the 2013 *William V. Campbell Trophy*, which recognizes individuals as the best scholar-athlete in the nation. The 170 semifinalists represent the most since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Kano, DSU's starting punter since the 2010 season, entered 2013 Delaware State University Fall semester with a nearly perfect 3.99 grade-point-average (on a 4.0 scale) as an engineering/physics major with a minor in mathematics. He is one of 46 NFF scholar-athlete semifinalists from Football Championship Subdivision schools, and one of two from Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference institutions.

Marco may also get to try his hand at defense this season. When the Hornets' ended spring camp last April, Delaware State University defensive coordinator Mike Ketchum suggested punter **Marco Kano** (sr.; Cottbus, German) try his hand at defensive end when the team returned in the summer.



"We asked Marco if he was willing to play some defense because of his size (6-6, 240) and athleticism," said Ketchum. "Despite being new to the position, he is a fast learner with good instincts and a tremendous work ethic. I'm confident he will contribute to our defense this season."

HOLD THOSE FLAGS

Delaware State is seeking to be the MEAC's least penalized team for the fourth time in the last five seasons. Through 10 games this season, the Hornets are averaging 41.7 penalty yards per game, fewest among all MEAC teams. DSU is also averaging a MEAC-low 5.7 penalties per game this season. The Hornets had a season-low four penalties for 28 yards vs. Hampton on Oct. 26. DSU was second to North Carolina A&T for fewest penalties in the league in 2012, snapping a string of three straight seasons atop the list. DSU was penalized 68 times for 559 yards last season (50.8 ypg). In 2011, the Hornets were flagged 67 times for 570 yards (51.8 pg). Delaware State was flagged 73 times in 2010 (50.1 ypg) and 71 in 2009 (60.2 ypg).

WARD HONORED BY THE MEAC

Delaware State University placekicker **Mitchell Ward** (jr.) was honored by the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference for his late-game heroics in the Hornets' 22-20 win over Howard on Nov. 2. Ward was named MEAC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the contest. The Binghamton, Eng., native nailed a 26-yard field goal for the winning points as time expired in the contest, setting off a wild celebration on the field. His holder, Marco Kano, helped make Ward a hero by cleanly fielding a high snap and setting the ball in quick fashion. DSU's game-winning field goal would not have occurred had Ward not executed a perfect onside kick to give the Hornets the final possession of the game. The onside kick was recovered by Hornet receiver Milton Williams III to set up the game-winning drive. Ward has connected on four-of-six field goal attempts and is 12-for-13 on extra point kicks. He had a string of 43 straight extra point kicks snapped in the Hornets' last outing.

GREAT SCOTT

Strong safety **Cory Scott** (jr.) has emerged as one of the Hornets' top defenders this season. Scott leads all DSU players with 40 solo tackles and is fifth on the team with 52 total tackles this year. In addition, he's credited with four tackles-for-loss, including a sack, one interception, two fumble recoveries, three pass and two break-ups. In last week's 29-21 win at Florida A&M, Scott had five solo tackles, a 55-yard fumble return for a touchdown and a late fourth quarter interception. He was listed as one of the *MEAC's Other Top Performers* for his play last week.

TOUGH SLATE

Three of Delaware State's 2013 opponents this season are nationally ranked this week. The Hornets' Sep. 28 opponent, two-time defending FCS champ North Dakota State, remains No. 1 in the latest SportsNetwork Top 25 poll. DSU lost to the Bison 51-0. The Hornets have also faced the current FCS No. 7 Towson this season (49-7 loss on Sep. 14). Current FCS No. 14 Bethune-Cookman defeated the Hornets 21-7 on Oct. 5.

Delaware State's three nationally ranked opponents (Delaware, North Dakota State, Towson, Bethune-Cookman) have a combined record of 28-4, with one of the losses to an FBS opponent.

HORNETS HAVE STABILITY ON THE SIDELINE

The Delaware State coaching staff has remained pretty much intact in the third year of the **Kermit Blount** era. The only change from last season is the addition of safeties coach **Don Jones**. Also during the off-season, Blount promoted former graduate assistant **Lonnie Teasley** to cornerbacks coach.

Nick Calcutta, the assistant head coach, is in his third year as Blount's offensive line coach.

Coordinators **Arrington Jones** (offense) and **Mike Ketchum** (defense) have re-turned to the staff for their third seasons at DSU. Each worked with Blount during his tenure as head coach at Winston-Salem State. Jones, a former member of the NFL's San Francisco 49ers, also served as head coach at Virginia Union University. Ketchum was a head coach at his alma mater, Guilford University. **Tory Woodbury** (running backs) also returns for his third season at DSU. Woodbury was a star quarterback at Winston-Salem State before playing in the NFL for the New York Jets, New Orleans Saints and Buffalo Bills.

Veteran coaches **Curtis Thomas** (wide receivers/special teams) and **Jeff Braxton** (defensive line) also remain on the staff. Thomas, a former star receiver for the Hornets, is in his 14th year on the staff. He has served each of the last three DSU head coaches. Braxton is in his third stint at Delaware State. He returned to the Hornets in 2011 after serving the previous three years as head coach at Cheyney University (Pa.).

Blount has also welcomed the volunteer assistance of former Delaware State standout punter **Chuck Poplos** (1991-94) this season. Poplos, a three-time All-MEAC First Team selection, was inducted into the DSU Athletics Hall-of-Fame in 2012.

HORNETS EIGHTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL

Delaware State has been picked to finish eighth in the 2013 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference football standings, according to a poll of league head coaches and sports information representatives announced at the annual MEAC Kickoff Luncheon in Norfolk, Va.



The Hornets received a total of 201 points in the pre-season poll. Bethune-Cookman is the overwhelming favorite to win its second straight MEAC championship. The Wildcats collected 16 of 21 first place votes and 480 points in the poll.

Delaware State exceeded the preseason MEAC expectations in 2012. The Hornets were tied for third in the final standings with a 5-3 record after a 10th place prediction in the preseason poll last season.

"The preseason polls are good for conversation, but what happens on the field is all that matters," said Delaware State third-year head coach Kermit Blount. "We lost a number of key players from last year, but we have a solid group of veterans returning and some promising newcomers. There are a lot of question marks on our team, and we have great deal of work to do to get ready for the new season." South Carolina State, North Carolina A&T, North Carolina Central and Florida A&M round out the top five in the 2013 MEAC preseason poll.

5 HORNETS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-MEAC 1ST TEAM

Five Delaware State players were selected to the preseason All-MEAC First Team: LB **Ernest Adjei** (sr.); DL **Rodney Gunter**; DB **Terrick Colston** (so.); C **Brandon Cunningham** (sr.); and RB **Malcolm Williams**.

Adjei, a 2012 All-MEAC First Team pick, Adjei was tied for sixth in the MEAC in tackles at 8.5 per game last season (93 total).

Gunter was a 2012 All-MEAC Second Team selection. He was tied for seventh in the MEAC in sacks (0.5 pg; 5.5 total) and tops among DSU defensive linemen with 49 tackles (27 solo) last season.

Colston, a 2012 Jerry Rice Award nominee (top FCS freshman), was second on the Hornets and fifth in the MEAC in tackles (8.6 pg; 95 total) a year ago.

A 2012 All-MEAC Second Team selection, Cunningham is the lone returning starter on the Hornets' offensive line.

Williams is the Hornets' top returning rusher with 437 yards despite missing two games due to an ankle injury in 2012. He had two 100-yard games last season, including 120 vs. FBS Cincinnati.

Delaware State free safety Davon Moore (jr.) was named to the 2013 preseason All-MEAC Second Team. A 2012 All-MEAC First Team pick, Moore was third in the league in tackles (8.8 pg; 97 total) and tied for third with four interceptions in 2012. His 175 interception return yards were tops in the MEAC and second among all FCS players last season.

Florida A&M quarterback Damien Fleming and Bethune-Cookman running back Isidore Jackson were selected as the MEAC's 2013 Preseason Co-Offensive Players-of-the-Year; while Bethune-Cookman linebacker Jarkevis Fields was named as the top defensive player.

DELAWARE STATE HEAD COACH KERMIT BLOUNT



Blount is making good on his promise to rebuild the Delaware State University football program.

The 2013 season will mark Blount's third with the Hornets. During his second year at the school, he led DSU to a 6-5 overall record, the team's first winning mark since 2007 and a three-game improvement from the previous season. The 2012 Hornets also posted five Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) wins, four more than the previous year.

Delaware State University quarterback Nick Elko was selected as the 2012 MEAC Offensive Player-of-the-Year, while Travis Tarpley (WR), Justin Wilson (WR), Nail Muradymov (OL), Ernest Adjei (LB) and Davon Moore (DB) were also named to the All-MEAC First Team

In addition, Moore was named to the 2012 College Sports Information Directors and Football Championship Subdivision Athletic Directors All-Academic Teams.

Despite a 3-8 record in Blount's first season with the Hornets, the team showed noticeable improvement on the field and in the classroom. DSU closed out the 2011 season with a 39-36 win over Howard, which featured one of the nation's stingiest defenses entering the contest. The Hornets racked up 412 total yards, including 324 by the pass during the game. The Bison were third among all FCS schools in pass defense (141.3 ypg) and fourth in total defense (288.5 ypg) prior to the contest.

Blount's 2011 Delaware State team was also the most disciplined in the MEAC. The Hornets were No. 1 in the league in fewest penalties (67) and penalty yards (570) last season.

In the classroom, 13 members of the 2011 Hornets earned MEAC Commissioner's All-Academic recognition. The team's combined grade point average also improved by 0.75 percentage points during the season.

Blount has nearly 30 years of collegiate coaching experience, including 16 as the head football coach for Winston-Salem State University in North Carolina.

It didn't take long for Blount to earn the respect of the Hornet players and the Delaware State University family. He quickly became an ambassador for the University and the football program throughout the region, in addition to establishing new academic, training, practice and accountability policies for the team.

Along the way, he found time to attract a top-notch staff of assistant coaches and support personnel to DSU.

Despite just a few weeks to prepare, Blount also directed the Hornets to a successful 2011 spring camp, during which time, new offensive and defensive formations were installed.

During his tenure at Winston-Salem, Coach Blount had a career record 91-87-3, which included his final 2009 season with the Rams in which he led the team to an 8-2 record. He guided the Rams to two Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) Championships and a total of three CIAA Championship game appearances. He also led Winston-Salem to two Pioneer Bowl appearances, one of which the team emerged as the victor (1999).

Blount is the winningest coach in the history of the Winston-Salem State football program. In fact, he reached the top of the list with a 28-27 come-from-behind win against Delaware State in Dover, Del., in 2008. He also led the Rams to 25 percent of their conference championships, directing WSSU to two of its eight conference titles as a head coach and to two more conference titles as a quarterback on the team's 1977 and 1978 squads.

Blount was honored as the CIAA Coach of the Year and as the Washington D.C. Pigskin Coach of the Year, as well as the 100% Wrong Club Coach of the Year - each award in both 1999 and 2000.

Throughout his coaching career, Blount has been associated with programs that have experienced phenomenal success. In all, he has been in a leadership role with teams that have won a total of six conference titles at both the NCAA Division I and Division II levels.

Blount began his coaching career in his home state of Virginia at Armstrong Kennedy High School in Richmond as a quarterbacks coach and assistant offensive coordinator. Following two seasons at the high school level Blount moved on to the collegiate ranks in 1983.

In 1983 he became a graduate assistant and assistant quarterbacks coach at East Carolina University where he would begin his collegiate coaching career.

Following his stint with the Pirates, Blount joined the staff at Howard University, where he assumed the responsibilities of offensive coordinator from 1984-89 under Bison head coach Willie Jeffries.

Soon after his arrival in the nation's capital, Blount's presence was felt as he directed a potent Bison offense to the 1987 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championship. Following his time at Howard, he spent four more years as part of Jeffries' staff at South Carolina State University (MEAC) in Orangeburg, South Carolina before returning to his alma mater, Winston-Salem State University, as the head football coach in 1993.

During his coaching career, Blount and his coaching staffs have been responsible for recruiting and coaching student-athletes that have earned a total of 106 all-conference selections. In addition, Blount has guided a pair of conference player-of-the-year recipients, one All-America selection and a two-time Academic All-America honoree.

His focus on academics resulted in more than 20 percent of Winston-Salem State University football scholarship student-athletes earning above a 3.0 GPA during the 2007-08 academic year and 22 football players have been named to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Commissioner's All-Academic team over the span of the last two seasons.

Not only has Blount helped to shape the futures of former student-athletes at WSSU, he has also helped to guide the careers of countless assistant coaches and coordinators. Blount has helped four of his former assistant coaches move on to successful head coaching careers at the collegiate level.

A 1980 graduate of Winston-Salem State University, Blount enjoyed a fruitful playing career as a Ram. As a four-year starter at quarterback at WSSU, Blount guided the Rams to back-to-back CIAA titles in 1977 and 1978 earning all-conference and All-America honors along the way. The 1978 All-American sat atop the WSSU record books for more than 25 years before his 3,330 career passing yards were surpassed in 2004.

A native of Richmond, Va., Blount has a Bachelor of Science in Health and Physical Education from Winston-Salem State University.

Kermit and wife Ava have two grown children, April and Bryan.

For the second year in a row, Delaware State racked up big yardage but fell way short on the scoreboard to the University of Delaware. The Hens defeated the Hornets 42-21 for their fifth win in five meetings between the state's two Division I football programs before 19,316 fans at UD's Tubby Raymond Field. DSU outgained Delaware 456-to-440 and held the advantage in first downs (25-21) and time of possession (36:10-to-23:50); but was plagued by several big plays by the Hens , three turnovers and two missed field goals. Delaware quarterback Trent Hurley was selected as the game's Most Outstanding Player after completing 24-of-31 passes for 328 yards and four touchdowns. Delaware State quarterback Cory Murphy (sr.; Santa Clara, Cal.) connected on 30-of-45 passes for 302 yards and two touchdowns in his Hornets debut. He also led the team with 44 yards rushing on 10 attempts. DSU's Milton Williams (jr.; Washington, D.C.) led all players with 10 catches and 112 receiving yards. Hornet wideout Malik Golson (r-fr.; Dover, Del.) hauled in nine passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns in his first game. After each team was forced to punt on its opening possession of the game, Delaware used a big play to draw first blood. Hurley connected with Michael Johnson on a 55-yard touchdown pass for the game's first score. Sean Baner's extra point gave Delaware a 7-0 lead with 9:19 left in the first quarter. The Hornets responded with two first downs, one on a 22-yard pass from Murphy to Milton Williams, to the UD 44. Two pass later, Murphy and Williams connected on an 11-yard pass play, but Williams fumbled the ball on the tackle and the Hens recovered at the Delaware 28. UD took advantage of the turnover with a long scoring drive to open up a two-touchdown lead. Hurley hit Rob Jones on a five-yard touchdown pass to cap off the 12-play, 72-yard drive. Baner's PAT kick gave the Hens a 14-0 lead with two minutes left in the opening quarter. The Hornets answered with an impressive touchdown drive of their own on the next possession to cut the Hens' lead in half. The 11-play, 75-yard drive was capped off by a four-yard touchdown pass from Murphy to Malik Golson with 11:32 left in the second quarter. It was Murphy's first touchdown pass and Golson's first TD catch with the Hornets. The five-minute-28-second drive featured five first downs, including two on third-down plays. Murphy was 5-for-5 for 46 yards during the drive, including a 19-yard pass to Nagee Jackson to the Delaware three yard line. Mitchell Ward's extra point kick after the touchdown pulled the Hornets to within 14-7 with 11:32 left in the second quarter. Delaware's Michael Johnson returned the ensuing DSU kickoff 40 yards to midfield. Three plays later, Hurley connected with Jones for a 33-yard touchdown pass to give the Hens a 21-7 lead with 10:33 left in the second quarter. After a three-and out by the Hornets on their next possession, Jones struck again on a 62-yard punt return for a touchdown to stretch Delaware's lead to 28-7 with 9:03 left before halftime. Delaware State picked up one first down on its next possession, but was forced to punt. Delaware chewed up 83 yards on seven plays, capped off by a nine-yard touchdown run by Julian Laing, to give the Hens a 35-7 halftime lead. The Hornets scored the only points of the third quarter on the second Murphy to Golson touchdown pass of the game. The 14-play, 81-yard drive was highlighted by first down passes by Murphy of 11 and 17 yards to Joe Ceravolo. The seven-yard scoring pass to Golson came on a fourth down play.

Towson University lived up to its No. 4 national ranking with a 49-7 victory over Delaware State in the Tigers' home opener before 10,302 fans at Johnny Unitas Stadium. The Tigers scored the first 49 points of the game en route to its third victory in three games this season. Towson racked up 408 yards of total offense, 209 by the pass and 199 rushing. All-America candidate Terrence West rushed for 82 yards and a school-record tying five touchdowns on 16 carries in the contest. West has scoring runs of 1, 3, 1 and 2 yards in the first half; and a 17-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Towson quarterback Peter Athens completed 16-of-24 passes for 209 yards and a touchdown. For the second straight week, Delaware State tallied more passing yards than the opponent but failed to muster much of a running game. Hornet quarterback Corey Murphy connected on 26-of-53 passes for 234 yards and a touchdown. Murphy has 536 yards passing in the first two games this season. DSU netted just 15 yards on the ground. The Hornets had 42 positive rushing yards, but lost 17, including 16 on five Towson sacks. Hornet receiver Milton Williams surpassed the 100-yard mark for the second straight game. Williams led all players with nine catches for 105 yards and the Hornets' lone touchdown on a six-yard pass from Murphy with 4:27 left in the third quarter. He has 19 catches for 217 yards in the Hornets' two games. Delaware State was plagued by four turnovers, two interceptions and two lost fumbles. Towson scored 28 points off the Hornet turnovers. The Tigers led 7-0 after the first quarter before adding 28 points in the second to hold a 35-0 lead at intermission. DSU also surrendered a special teams touchdown for the second straight week. Towson's Derrick Joseph returned the second half kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown to give the Tigers a 42-0 lead. Defensive back Joe Boyd led the Hornets with 10 tackles, including five solo stops. Free safety Davon Moore had nine tackles (eight unassisted), a forced fumble and a pass break-up.

North Dakota State, the nation's No. 1 FCS team, capped off a memorable day with a 51-0 win over Delaware State before a boisterous capacity crowd at the FargoDome. The two-time defending FCS champion Bison improved to 3-0 this season, while the Hornets dropped to 0-3. North Dakota State began the day by hosting ESPN's popular College GameDay for the first time; and ended it with a dominating performance for its 12th straight win, the longest among all FCS teams. The Hornets have fallen to the nation's No. 3 (Towson) and No. 1 teams in the last two weeks. North Dakota State racked up 542 total yards, 299 by the pass and 243 on the ground. Delaware State passed for 155 yards, but was held to 34 rushing for a total of 189. NDSU scored touchdowns on its last six first half possessions to hold a 41-0 lead at intermission. Bison quarterback Brock Jensen, playing less than half, completed 13-of-20 passes for 138 yards and three touchdowns. Jensen connected with Ryan Smith (four yards) and Zach Vraa (25 yards) for first quarter scoring passes and hooked up with Copper Wahlo for a 22-yard second quarter touchdown. John Crockett led the Bison with 87 yards rushing and a touchdown (one yard) on nine carries. Delaware State quarterback Cory Murphy (sr.; Santa Clara, Cal.) completed 13-of-29 passes for 115 yards. Robert King (jr.; Randallstown, Md.) led the Hornets with four receptions, while Milton Williams III (jr.; Washington, D.C.) had a team-high 60 receiving yards on three catches. DSU free safety Davon Moore (jr.; Mt. Vernon, N.Y.) led all players with season-high 13 tackles, including 10 solo stops. Terrick Colston (so.; Lakeland, Fla.) had 11 tackles (four unassisted), while J.R. Robinson (so.; Jersey City, N.J.) had 10.

Delaware State led by 15 points midway through the fourth quarter and held off a late Savannah State surge in a 24-22 victory in the MEAC opener for both teams at Ted Wright Stadium. DSU led 24-9 after a 31-yard touchdown pass from [Cory Murphy](#) to freshman [Aris Scott](#) with 8:11 left in the fourth quarter. The scoring pass was Murphy's second of the game and first for Scott as a collegian. Savannah State quarterback Antonio Bostick threw two touchdown passes in the fourth quarter to pull the Tigers to within 24-22. The Tigers failed to tie the game after the second touchdown when Bostick's two-point pass was deflected by the Hornet defense with 1:51 left in the game. DSU sealed the win when Murphy hit Milton Williams for a first down on a 12-yard pass with 1:26 left to play. After a scoreless opening quarter, Savannah State broke through first when John Barron finished off a 10-play, 48-yard drive with a 28-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 3-0 lead with 7:49 left in the second quarter. On the first play from scrimmage after the SSU field goal, Delaware State snapped a six-quarter scoreless drought and grabbed its first lead of the season when [Dae-Hon Cheung](#) broke off a 61-yard touchdown run to put the Hornets in front 6-3. It was the longest run of Cheung's career and the team's longest play of the season. [Mitchell Ward](#)'s extra point kick gave DSU a 7-3 lead with 7:31 left in the second quarter. Savannah State answered with a score of its own on the ensuing possession to regain the lead. Quarterback Leon Prunty capped off a six-play, 72-yard drive with a 16-yard touchdown run to give the Tigers a 9-7 lead with 4:39 to go before halftime. SSU failed on a two-point run following the touchdown. Delaware State regained the lead on its first possession of the second half. Ward's 37-yard field goal gave DSU a 10-9 lead with 11:27 left in the third. On the ensuing kickoff, Ward's line drive kick nailed one of the up-men on the Savannah State return team. The live ball caromed back in the direction of the Hornet kickoff team before being recovered by Ward at the DSU 25. It took six plays for the Hornets to capitalize on the break. Murphy connected with [Malik Golson](#) on a 53-yard touchdown pass on a crossing pattern to complete the 75-yard drive. Golson took the pass in stride at the SSU 30-yard line and outran three defenders along the Delaware State sideline to the endzone for his third touchdown catch of the season. Ward's extra point kick gave the Hornets a 17-9 lead with 9:26 to play in the third quarter. Murphy shook off a slow start to complete 8-of-19 passes for 190 yards and two touchdowns. Golson had two catches for 84 yards, while Williams (41 yards) and Scott (40) each had two receptions. The Delaware State defense recorded six sacks, the most since tallying eight against Florida A&M in 2005. The Hornets did not have a sack in their first three games this season. [Cory Scott](#) and [Terrick Colston](#) led DSU with 10 tackles each.

Delaware State played even with nationally-ranked Bethune-Cookman for nearly three quarters, but the Hornets gave up two late touchdowns in a 21-7 loss to the Wildcats in DSU's home opener at Alumni Stadium. Bethune-Cookman, ranked 21st in the latest SportsNetwork Top 25 FCS poll, was Delaware State's third nationally-ranked opponent in the last four weeks. The Hornets, playing home for the first time after opening the season with four straight road games, drew first blood in the contest. Quarterback [Cory Murphy](#) (sr.; Santa Clara, Cal.) connected with [Malik Golson](#) (r-fr.; Dover, Del.) on a seven-yard touchdown pass to cap off an 11-play, 69-yard drive with 6:48 left in the first quarter. Murphy completed five-of-seven passes during the five-minute-21-second drive, including first down completions of 17 yards to [Milton Williams III](#) (jr.; Washington, D.C.) and 18 yards to [Bo Ceravolo](#) (r-so.; Venice, Fla.). [Nagee Jackson](#) (so.; Gainesville, Ga.) had a 15-yard run and [Malcolm Williams](#) (jr.; Reading, Pa.) broke off an 11-yard run during the drive. [Mitchell Ward](#) connected on his 39th straight extra point to give the Hornets a 7-0 lead. The touchdown was DSU's first in the opening quarter of a game this season. Bethune-Cookman used a 10-play, 75-yard drive to tie the game in the second quarter. Anthony Jordan capped off the drive with a three-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7 with 9:14 left in the second quarter. The score was 7-7 at the half. The Wildcats took advantage of a Delaware State turnover to take the lead. Six plays after the Hornets lost a fumble at midfield, BCU quarterback Quentin Williams rushed for a 31-yard touchdown on a fourth-down-and-one play with 6:02 left in the third quarter. BCU added an insurance touchdown on a 15-yard pass from Williams to Poole with 4:40 left in the fourth quarter. Murphy, the MEAC's top passer, completed 19-of-33 throws for 213 yards; but was intercepted twice. The Hornets committed three turnovers in the contest, while Bethune-Cookman was turnover free. Wilson and Williams combined to complete 14-of-19 passes for 168 yards for the Wildcats. BCU, the MEAC's top rushing team, ran for 241 of its 409 total yards. Delaware State was held to 223 total yards, including 10 on the ground. The Hornets lost 36 yards on four Wildcat sacks. Delaware State's defense recorded five sacks of its own for minus-45 yards. The Hornets have 11 sacks in the last two games. [Rodney Gunter](#) (jr.; Lake Hamilton, Fla.) was credited with 1.5 sacks, giving him three in the last two games. DSU's Davon More (jr.; Mt. Vernon, N.Y.) led all players with 13 tackles (nine unassisted).

Quarterback Cory Murphy scored the go-ahead touchdown on a one-yard keeper with 5:25 left to play to give Delaware State a 14-7 homecoming win over Norfolk State in a MEAC contest at Alumni Stadium. The Spartans drove to the DSU 30 on their final possession, but Hornet safety Davon Moore intercepted a pass by Norfolk State quarterback Rico Flores at the nine-yard line to seal the win. Delaware State's 61-yard game-winning touchdown drive took 18 plays and consumed eight-minutes-42 seconds. The Hornets had three third-down conversions and two fourth-down conversions during the march. Murphy completed six-of-nine passes for 58 yards on the drive, including first down completions of 11 and 16 yards to Malik Golson; and 17 yards to Milton Williams III. The Hornets kept the drive going when Lamar Shaw rushed for four yards on a fourth-and-two at the NSU 15. DSU faced another fourth down after Murphy connected with Aris Scott for 12 yards to the Norfolk State two. Shaw again got the call, picking up the one yard needed to continue the drive. On the next play, Murphy followed center Brandon Cunningham into the endzone for the go-ahead score. Mitchell Ward's extra point kick gave the Hornets a 14-7 lead. Ward was two-for-two on extra points to give him 41 straight since 2011. After a scoreless first quarter, Norfolk State took advantage of a Hornet turnover to draw first blood. Five plays after a Brent Singleton interception of a Murphy pass and 17-yard return to the DSU 32, Norfolk State quarterback Tyler Clark connected with Derrick Demps for a 14-yard touchdown. Cameron Marouf's extra point kick gave the Spartans a 7-0 lead with 3:11 in the second quarter. Delaware State appeared to tie the game just two seconds before halftime when defensive back Joe Boyd returned an interception to the endzone, but there was a Hornet penalty on the return. DSU finally broke through in the third quarter to tie the game. The Hornets took possession of the ball after Alex Perry forced a Norfolk State fumble that was recovered by Cory Scott at the DSU 44. A Spartan penalty and a 15-yard pass from Murphy to Golson helped the Hornets advance the ball to the NSU 13. Two plays later, Nagee Jackson rushed for seven yards to endzone for the Hornets' first score of the game. Ward's extra point tied the game at 7-7 with 7:07 left in the third quarter. The Hornets forced a season-high five turnovers in the contest, highlighted by their first two interceptions of the year. The DSU defense held the Spartans to 184 total yards, the season-low for a Hornet opponent.

Delaware State held North Carolina A&T to 208 total yards in a 12-7 victory at Aggie Stadium this afternoon. The Hornets won their second straight game to improve to 3-4 overall and 3-1 in the MEAC. The Aggies dropped their third straight to fall to 3-3 and 1-3. The DSU defense limited NCA&T to 35 yards rushing and 67 yards through the air. The Hornets have allowed a total of 50 yards rushing in the last two games. Norfolk State netted 15 yards rushing in a 14-7 loss to the Hornets last week. North Carolina A&T was one-for-14 on third down conversions in the contest. The Hornets narrowly missed their second straight shutout against North Carolina A&T when the Aggies scored a touchdown on a seven-yard pass from Lewis Kindle to Desmond Lawrence to cut DSU's lead to 12-7 with 1:57 left to play. The Aggies attempted an onside kick following the score, but Hornet linebacker [Ernest Adjei](#) recovered the kick at the A&T 47 to seal the win. Delaware State opened the scoring on a 37-yard [Mitchell Ward](#) field goal to cap an eight-play, 61-yard drive on its first possession of the game. The big play in the drive was a 43-yard pass from [Cory Murphy](#) to [Milton Williams III](#) on the Hornets' first play from scrimmage. The Hornets used their "two-minute" offense to stretch the lead at right before halftime. Ward capped off a 10-play, 38-yard drive with a career-best 43-yard field goal as the first half clock expired to give DSU a 6-0 lead at the break. Delaware State put together an impressive third quarter drive to widen its lead. [Lamar Shaw](#) put the finishing touch on a 15-play, 70-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give the Hornets a 12-0 lead with 5:12 left in the third quarter. The six-minute-39 second drive featured five first downs, including a 21-yard pass from Murphy to [Robert King](#) to the NCAT 43. The Hornets converted a fourth down on a three-yard run by [Lamar Shaw](#) to the Aggie 19 yard line during the march. DSU failed on a two-point pass following the touchdown. Adjei led the DSU defense with six tackles, including two behind the line-of-scrimmage. Cory Scott had five tackles, all solo; while cornerback Cameron Judge had four tackles and his second career interception. [Williams III](#) had six catches for 100 yards, the second 100-yard game of his career. [Malcolm Williams](#) led the Hornets with 10 rushes for 53 yards. DSU quarterback [Cory Murphy](#) completed 16-of-30 passes for 180 yards. He also rushed for 29 yards.
