#### THE GAME

The four-time defending MEAC champion Lady Pirates will hit the road on Saturday to begin the bulk of conference play, taking on Delaware State at 2 p.m. in Memorial Gym.

#### THE SERIES

The Lady Pirates are 31-12 all-time against Delaware State, and they have won the last 11 meetings — including a 63-28 win in the quarterfinals of last season's MEAC Tournament. Delaware State last beat Hampton on Feb. 9, 2008 in Dover, Del., and the Lady Pirates are 11-7 against Delaware State in Dover, Del.

#### LADY PIRATES: ROAD WARRIORS

The Lady Pirates were 13-2 on the road last season, with their only road defeats being at Duke in the NCAA Tournament and at Virginia Tech. Under head coach David Six, the Lady Pirates are 45-18 in road games over the past four-plus seasons. So far this season, the Lady Pirates are 2-3 in true road games after an 89-70 loss at Georgia Tech on Dec. 30.

#### FIVE IN A ROW?

In David Six's first four years as head coach, the Lady Pirates have won four straight MEAC Tournament championships — as well as the last three MEAC regular-season titles. This marks the first time the Lady Pirates have won four straight MEAC titles, and Hampton joins Howard (1987-90) as the only MEAC schools to win the tournament four straight times.

No MEAC team has ever won five straight MEAC titles.

## SCOUTING DELAWARE STATE

The Lady Hornets were picked to finish 10th in the MEAC this season, their second under head coach Tamika Louis. Delaware State snapped a six-game losing streak on Tuesday with a 75-72 overtime win over NJIT, and the Lady Hornets are led by junior forward Tierra Hawkins, who averages 22.5 points and 10.0 rebounds per game.

## LADY PIRATES AGAINST THE MEAC

Hampton is 297-138 against teams currently in the MEAC — including a 31-12 mark against Delaware State — and the Lady Pirates have won six MEAC regular-season titles to go along with seven tournament titles, including each of the last four. Overall, the Lady Pirates have won their last 32 games against MEAC foes, including conference tournament games.

## LADY PIRATES PICKED TO REPEAT

The MEAC's head coaches and sports information directors have chosen the Lady Pirates to repeat as MEAC champions in 2013-14, giving Hampton 20 of a possible 26 first-place votes. Hampton has won the last three MEAC regular-season titles and the last four MEAC Tournament crowns. No MEAC women's program has ever won five straight conference tournament crowns.

## BENNETT, HAMILTON HONORED IN PRESEASON AWARDS

Senior forward Alyssa Bennett and senior guard Nicole Hamilton were each named Preseason First Team All-MEAC, and Bennett, the reigning MEAC Defensive Player of the Year, was named Preseason Co-Player of the Year, along with Florida A&M's Jasmine Grice.

## LADY PIRATES: VIRGINIA'S BEST

Since David Six's arrival, the Lady Pirates have been the best program in the Commonwealth of Virginia — even better than such programs as James Madison, Old Dominion, Virginia, Richmond, and Liberty. On top of four straight MEAC Tournament titles, three straight MEAC regular season titles, and four straight NCAA Tournament appearances, the Lady Pirates are serving notice throughout Virginia.

Over the past four seasons, Hampton has the best record among Virginia's Div. I women's basketball programs, compiling a .767 winning percentage during Six's tenure.

## LADY PIRATES ODDS AND ENDS

### BACK HOME AGAIN — AND LOCKING PEOPLE DOWN

There's a reason senior forward Alyssa Bennett was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year in 2012-13 — becoming the third Lady Pirate in four years to win that honor. On top of her 10.1 points and 6.6 rebounds per game last season, Bennett was perhaps Hampton's most athletic and versatile defender, shutting down the opponent's best player regardless of position.

She was also a Second Team All-MEAC selection last season.

Bennett, a Hampton, Va. native who played high school basketball under head coach David Six, was named MEAC Preseason Co-Player of the Year along with Florida A&M's Jasmine Grice. After a win over Virginia Tech on Jan. 1, Bennett has 493 career rebounds, leaving her seven shy of 500 for her career.

She is also 183 points shy of 1,000 for her career.

### HAMILTON ANOTHER HOMETOWN PRODUCT

Junior guard Nicole Hamilton is a native of Hampton, Va., and she played at Phoebus High School under current Lady Pirates assistant Barbara Burgess. A natural shooting guard, Hamilton moved to the point guard role last season, where she averaged 11.9 points a game and ranked third in the MEAC with 5.3 assists per contest.

She was a First Team All-MEAC selection last season, and this year, Hamilton was a Preseason First Team All-MEAC selection. On top of her offensive prowess, Hamilton proved quite the defender in 2012-13, leading the team in both steals (78) and blocked shots (48).

After a win over Virginia Tech on Jan. 1, Hamilton has 936 career points, leaving her 64 points shy of becoming the 24th player in Lady Pirates history to score 1,000 points for her career.

### TATE-DeFREITAS A SCORING MACHINE

Freshman guard Malia Tate-DeFreitas was named an All-American by *Parade* magazine following her senior year of high school. She averaged 29 points per game as a senior last season, and she became just the ninth player in Pennsylvania state history — male or female — to score at least 3,000 career points. The three-time AP Class A Player of the Year finished her high school career as Steelton-Highspire's all-time leading scorer, regardless of gender. She had 15 points, six rebounds, and four steals in her collegiate debut against Saint Peter's on Nov. 10, and she leads the team in scoring (and ranks fourth in the MEAC) with 18.1 points a game after a monster performance against Utah State (career-high 36 points) and Santa Clara (25 points).

### WARD CRASHING THE GLASS

The Lady Pirates have played 15 games so far this season, and in six of those games, redshirt-sophomore forward Brielle Ward has grabbed double-digit rebounds — including a career-high and school-record 23 against Virginia Tech on Jan. 1. She is currently second on the team with 8.6 rebounds per game, and she pulled down 11 boards in a loss at UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 26. She also grabbed 13 rebounds at Drexel on Dec. 18, and she added 12 rebounds against Kansas State on Dec. 21.

### COLE HEATING UP

In her last three games, junior guard Kenia Cole is averaging 20.0 points per contest — including her career-best 30-point effort against Virginia Tech on Jan. 1. Cole also had 19 points against Brown on Dec. 29, and in her last three games, Cole is 12-for-19 (.632) from 3-point range — and 17-for-31 (.548) from the floor.

### ALL THEY DO IS WIN

With a 59-38 win over Howard in the MEAC Tournament championship game on March 15, the Lady Pirates won their 19th consecutive game, extending the longest winning streak in program Division I history. Hampton's previous longest winning streak in Div. I came in 1997-98, when the Lady Pirates rattled off 15 straight wins.

Since head coach David Six took over in 2009-10, the Lady Pirates came into the 2013-14 season with the best winning percentage among all Div. I programs in the commonwealth of Virginia, sitting at .767 (99-30). Hampton has won 20 games or more in each of Six's first four seasons.

### LADY PIRATES AGAINST "POWER CONFERENCES"

In David Six's four-plus seasons at the helm, the Lady Pirates have enjoyed success against the six so-called "power conferences:" the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big XII, Pac-12, and SEC. After an 89-70 loss at Georgia Tech on Monday, the Lady Pirates are 8-11 against teams in these six conferences — including a 2-2 mark this season after defeating Virginia Tech 70-60 on Jan. 1.

Hampton was 3-3 against such teams last season, including wins over LSU, Mississippi State, and Boston College. During Six's tenure, Hampton boasts wins over LSU, Florida, Boston College, Pitt, Mississippi State, Kansas State, and Virginia Tech — and the Lady Pirates took Kentucky to overtime in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in March 2011.

### SIX REACHES A MILESTONE

When the Lady Pirates defeated Saint Peter's 64-37 on Nov. 10, it marked the 100th win in head coach David Six's collegiate career. So far, Six's career winning percentage (.764) is the best in Div. I program history and second overall to the legendary James Sweat, who won 82.1 percent of his games with the Lady Pirates from 1981-88.

Only four head coaches have an overall winning record with the Lady Pirates: Six, Sweat, the late Tiny L. Laster (.626, 1988-95), and Patricia Cage-Bibbs (.605, 1997-2004).

### THEY HAVE A HISTORY

Before coming to Hampton University, head coach David Six was the head girls basketball coach at nearby Hampton High School — where he won 331 games and two state championships. While at Hampton High, Six sometimes squared off against current Lady Pirates assistant Barbara Burgess, who from 2002-08 was the head girls basketball coach at Peninsula District rival Phoebus High School. Burgess went 73-67 at Phoebus, and she led the Lady Phantoms to three Eastern Region tournament appearances.

# 2013-14 HAMPTON UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

## HEAD COACH DAVID SIX



David Six is in his fifth year as head coach of the Hampton University women's basketball team, turning the Lady Pirates into a dynasty in the MEAC after spending a year as the Director of Intramurals at Hampton University.

In four seasons with the Lady Pirates, Six is 99-30 overall and 58-6 in conference play.

The 2012-13 season was perhaps Six's best yet with the Lady Pirates, as he guided the team to a program Division I-record 28 wins and a fourth straight MEAC Tournament championship – marking just the second time in conference history that a women's program won four straight tournaments (Howard, 1987-90).

The Lady Pirates also went 16-0 in the MEAC last season, marking the first time in program history that Hampton went unbeaten in the MEAC – and just the fifth time in the history of the conference. Along the way, Hampton won 19 straight games from Jan. 2 through March 15, setting a program Div. I record for longest winning streak.

Six was named MEAC Coach of the Year for the second time, while senior forward Keiara Avant was named MEAC Player of the Year, becoming the first Lady Pirate to ever earn that honor. Junior forward Alyssa Bennett was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year; in Six's first four seasons, the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year award went to a Lady Pirate three times.

Continuing Six's emphasis on defense, a staple of his tenure, the Lady Pirates led the nation in scoring defense in 2012-13, holding opponents to just 47.8 points per game. Hampton was also third in the nation last season in both field goal percentage defense (.320) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.243).

Six's third season at the helm proved historic on many levels for the Lady Pirates, beginning with a 26 wins. The Lady Pirates also went 15-1 in the MEAC, claiming their second straight MEAC regular-season title, before claiming their third straight MEAC Tournament crown – becoming the first MEAC team to win three straight conference tournaments since Howard (1996-98).

After winning yet another MEAC Tournament crown, the Lady Pirates were given a No. 16 seed in the NCAA Tournament, squaring off against top-seeded Stanford in the first round in Norfolk, Va.

In 2011-12, the Lady Pirates were second among all Div. I teams – behind only Connecticut – in scoring defense, giving up just 47.6 points per game. The Lady Pirates were also fourth in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.331) and fifth in turnover margin (+6.61).

Hampton also led the nation last season in 3-point field goal defense, only allowing 21.3 percent of shots from behind the arc.

Three Lady Pirates earned All-MEAC honors in 2011-12, led by senior

guard Jericka Jenkins – who was a First Team All-MEAC selection after finishing the season fifth in the NCAA in assists (7.1) and assist-turnover ratio (2.4).

Jenkins was also the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

Senior guard Choicetta McMillian and senior forward Melanie Warner were Second Team All-MEAC selections.

His second season with the program proved even more successful than the first, as Six guided the Lady Pirates to their second straight 20-win season (the first time in program Div. I history), the MEAC regular-season title and a second straight MEAC Tournament crown. Six's team was rewarded with a No. 13 seed in the NCAA Tournament – the highest seed ever for a MEAC school in the 64-team format.

The Lady Pirates gave No. 4 seed Kentucky everything it could handle in the first round before falling 66-62 in overtime in The Pit on the campus of the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, N.M.

Six saw Jenkins earn First Team All-MEAC honors, as well as Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America accolades, after finishing the season second in the nation with 7.0 assists per game, while also leading the team in scoring.

Senior forward Quanneisha Perry, who led the MEAC with 9.0 rebounds per game, was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season – marking the first time in conference history a player won the award in back-to-back years.

As the interim head coach in 2009-10, Six led the Lady Pirates to their first MEAC Tournament title since 2004 and a first-round NCAA Tournament game against Duke in Durham, N.C. Six went 20-12 in his first season at Hampton, marking the first time the Lady Pirates won 20 games in a season since the team went 23-9 in 2002-03.

The Lady Pirates also went 12-4 in MEAC play, with Perry earning First Team All-MEAC and MEAC Defensive Player of the Year honors. Sophomore guard Bernadette Fortune was named Second Team All-MEAC, while Breanna Jones was named to the All-MEAC Rookie Team. On top of all that, sophomore forward Melanie Warner was named the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

Hampton University rewarded Six on March 15, 2010 with a three-year contract.

With a 45-19 overall record in his first two years with the Lady Pirates, Six has led Hampton to the third-best record among NCAA Div. I women's basketball programs in Virginia over the last two seasons. Over that span, Hampton has a better record than such school as Virginia, Old Dominion and Richmond.

Six arrived in the Tidewater area in November 1985, by way of the United States Air Force Langley Air Force, Hampton, Virginia and Hampton University.

At Langley, Six played base level basketball, where he was selected All-Uni-Com for six straight years. After leaving the military, Six set his sights on the coaching profession, where he began as a volunteer assistant for the varsity boys at Hampton High School in 1991, where he served in that capacity for two years before taking the reigns as the head girls varsity coach in 1993.

Six made an immediate impact on the Hampton High program, going 14-8 in his first season. In three seasons, Hampton High captured its first district title ever and appeared in the 1995 Virginia Group AAA state Final Four, finishing with 26-4 record the best in school history at the time.

After the 1995 season, Six left Hampton High to become the head varsity boys coach at Gloucester (Va.) High School. Six is the only boys coach in Gloucester history to qualify for the district tournament – a feat he accomplished twice.

At the conclusion of the 1998 season, Six returned to the helm at Hampton High. Again Six ignited the program, capturing the 2000 district tournament championship.

In the 2001 season, the Lady Crabbers won the district and district tournament championship, before capturing the first female state championship in the 105-year history of Hampton High, finishing the season 27-3.

At that point, Six-coached teams had won seven straight district titles, and an astounding eight straight district tournament titles, en route to a remarkable 141-6 record against Peninsula District competition.

The 2007 season was nothing short of spectacular for Six and the Lady Crabbers, as they set a school record with 30 wins against just two losses. The Lady Crabbers defeated the No. 11 and No. 13 teams in the nation, capturing their eighth district title and eighth straight district tournament title, as well as the Eastern Regional title, culminating with the school's second state title in six years.

The team finished that season ranked ninth in the country.

Six, a native of Brooklyn, N.Y., has been selected as the Virginia High School League Coaches Association (VHSLCA) Coach of the Year twice (2001, 2007), as well as the 2007 Associated Press Coach of the Year.

He amassed an incredible 331-93 overall record in 14 seasons. His accomplishments include: two state titles, one regional title, 10 regional appearances, five state Final Four appearances, nine district titles and nine district tournament titles.

During his tenure as a high school coach, Six was instrumental in helping more than 30 players receive basketball scholarships, while transforming the Hampton High girls basketball program into one of the elite programs in the country.

More importantly, Six's dedication, influence and strong leadership skills greatly contributed in many of the young women that he has coached excelling in a variety of professions to include a lawyer, entrepreneur, Rhode scholar, two college coaches, four educators and host of other young productive citizens.
