2013 HSRN All-American Football Teams Announced

Hartly, DE – Tennessee State’s Rod Reed and Winston-Salem State’s Connell Maynor, head coaches of the 2013 Heritage Sports Radio Network’s (HSRN) football champions in Division I (FCS) and Division II, have been named the *Coaches of the Year* in their respective Divisions.

Southern University quarterback Dray Joseph and Tennessee State safety Daniel Fitzpatrick were tabbed *Players of the Year* in Division I (FCS) with Lane College quarterback Chris Rini and Shaw University defensive back Darnell Evans named *Players of the Year* in Division II.

Reed’s Tennessee State Tigers finished the year with a record of 10-3, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division I (FCS) Play-offs. Maynor’s Winston-Salem State Rams, the CIAA Champion, finished the year with a 10-2 record and won their first round game in the NCAA Division II Play-offs. He has subsequently taken the head coaching position at Hampton University.

In Division I (FCS), ten players from seven schools in the Mid Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) are represented, with two players each from Bethune-Cookman, Morgan State and South Carolina State. Delaware State, Hampton, North Carolina Central and Norfolk State have one each. Twelve players from six schools in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) are represented, with three from Alabama State, two each from Alcorn State, Jackson State and Southern. Arkansas-Pine Bluff has one player. Tennessee State had four players named to the team.

In Division II, fifteen players from ten schools in the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) are represented, led by Shaw with three and two each from Bowie State Saint Augustine’s and Winston-Salem State. Cheyney State, Chowan, Lincoln (PA), Johnson C. Smith, Virginia State and Virginia Union have one each. Eleven players from five schools in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) are represented, led by Albany State and Tuskegee with three each. Fort Valley State and Lane have two each and Miles has one player.
