Delaware State Head Coach Keith Walker (Clemson, '81): 8-10 at DSU (first year, plus 11 games as interim head coach in 2013-14); 99-112 career (ninth year); 0-0 vs. Delaware

Delaware Head Coach Monte Ross (Winston-Salem State, '92): 115-147 at UD and career (ninth year); 3-2 vs. DSU

THE GAME

Delaware State follows up its longest road trip of the season (at Hawai'i) with its shortest, visiting the University of Delaware in the 15th meeting between the state's two Division I teams. It also marks the final contest in a season-long six-game road swing for the Hornets. DSU is trying to bounce back from a 75-60 loss to Hawaii on Tuesday. The Rainbow Warriors scored 20 fast break points and forced 18 turnovers in the contest. The Hornets were also plagued by poor outside shooting, hitting just two-of-18 three-point shot attempts (.111). Delaware State trailed 35-23 at the break, and fell behind by 23 points early in the second half. **Kendall Gray** (sr.; Dover, Del.) was a bright spot for the Hornets, posting his third straight double-double with 13 points and 14 rebounds, including a season-high six offensive boards. Point guard **Charles Burley** (sr.; Wilmington, Del.) came off the bench to score a team and career-high 14 points for the Hornets. Burley nailed both of DSU's three-point field goals (2-for-4) and was eight-for-eight at the free throw line. **Amere May** (sr.; Covert, Mich.), the Hornets' leading scorer entering the contest was held to four points on two-of-13 shooting from the field. He was averaging 19.7 points entering the game, including a career-high 32 in the 72-65 win at Wake Forest in DSU's previous outing.

Delaware is seeking its first win of the season. The Hens are coming off a 73-69 loss to Army in their 2014-15 home opener on Wednesday. Cazmon Hayes led three Delaware players in double figures with 14 points. Corey Holden added 13 points and Chivarsky Corbett came off the bench to contribute 11 for the Hens. Delaware trailed 35-28 at intermission, but fought back to lead by four after two free throws with 7:27 left to play. There were 11 ties in the contest. Hayes is UD's leading scorer at 16.2 points per game. He also has a team-high 16 three-point field goals (16-for-50). Maurice Jeffers leads the Hen regulars in rebounding at 4.7 per game, while Holden has a team-high 24 assists.

DSU vs. DELAWARE SERIES HISTORY (Delaware leads 11-3)

The Hornets and Hens have split their last two meetings. Delaware won last year's contest 80-70 at DSU's Memorial Hall. Davon Usher led the Hens with a game-high 23 points. His performance was highlighted by 10-for-10 shooting at the free throw line. **Kendall Gray** was high scorer for the Hornets with 19 points (8-11 FGs). He also had four blocks in the contest. The last time the teams met at Delaware, the Hornets pulled out a 73-67 overtime victory during the 2012-13 season for their first victory at the Carpenter Center. DSU's **Tyshawn Bell** nailed a three-pointer with five seconds left in regulation to force the extra period. He also scored five points in the overtime to lead the Hornets. Delaware State won the first meeting between the teams in 1991. Delaware won the next eight games from 1992 to 2000. The teams did not meet from 2001 to '08.

DELAWARE STATE 2014-15 MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

HORNETS FIFTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL

Voters in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference 2014-15 men's basketball preseason poll believe Delaware State will be an improved team from a year ago. The Hornets have been picked to finish fifth out of 13 teams in the regular season race. The Hornets collected 194 points in the poll of league head coaches and sports information representatives. Defending MEAC champ North Carolina Central is favored to win its second straight regular season title. The Eagles collected 15 of 26 first place votes and 317 total points. Hampton is a close second to NCCU. The Pirates garnered nine first place votes and 304 points. Morgan State (265 points) and Norfolk State (225) are third and fourth, respectively, in the poll. Delaware State was 9-21 overall and tied for eighth in the final regular season standing with a 5-11 MEAC record during the 2013-14 season. The MEAC also announced its 2014-15 preseason player honors. Delaware State center Kendall Gray (jr.; Dover, Del.) has been selected to the preseason All-MEAC First Team, while guard Kendal Williams (sr.; Stone Mountain, Ga.) was a third team pick. Gray was second in the MEAC in rebounding (7.9 pg), third in field goal percentage (.579) and fourth in blocks (2.7 pg) last season. He ranked third on the Hornets in scoring (11.5 ppg) and set a school record for the second time in his career with 81 blocks. In addition, he led the team with 11 "double-doubles" during the 2013-14 campaign. In three seasons with the Hornets, Gray has 623 points, 420 rebounds and 210 blocks. He needs 13 blocks to become the school's all-time leader. Williams led the Hornets with 84 assists to rank 10th in the MEAC (2.8 pg) in his first year with the Hornets after transferring from Baltimore City Community College. Williams was fourth on the team in scoring and topped the club with a .420 three-point shooting percentage (29-for-69) last season. Howard University sophomore guard James Daniel has been selected as the 2014-15 MEAC Preseason Player-of-the-Year. Gray and Daniels are joined by Hampton's Deron Power (so.), Taariq Cephas of Coppin State (sr.) and North Carolina Central's Jordan Parks (sr.) on the preseason All-MEAC First Team.



HORNETS IN THE MEAC

Despite posting a 5-11 mark in the MEAC during the 2013-14 season, Delaware State has enjoyed its share of success in league play since the 2000-01 season. The Hornets own a 149-88 mark vs. MEAC competition during the span (.629). DSU has reached double figures in MEAC wins 10 times since 2000-01. Delaware State claimed three consecutive MEAC regular season titles from 2004-07. During that span, the Hornets were 46-8 in league games. Delaware State captured its only MEAC Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 2005.

HEAD COACH KEITH WALKER



Keith Walker was officially announced as head coach of the Hornets on Apr. 15, 2014. He served as DSU's interim head coach for 11 games after being appointed to the position on Jan. 30, 2014.

Walker first joined the Delaware State staff as an assistant coach in July 2000.

During his stint as interim coach, Walker led the Hornets to a 5-6 overall record and 5-5

mark in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Prior to the appointment, the team was 4-15 overall and 0-6 in the conference.

Delaware State posted a season-high three-game win streak, highlighted by a victory over MEAC Tournament runner-up Morgan State, during Walker's stint as interim head coach.

During the 2013-14 season, Hornet junior center Kendall Gray set a team record with 81 blocks. Gray was named to the 2014 All-MEAC Second Team.

Gray held the previous team record with 75 blocks as a sophomore. The Hornets recorded 185 blocks during the 2012-13 campaign, the second-best single-season mark in team history.

During the 2011-12 season, Walker's work with the Hornet big men was instrumental in the team's school-record 192 blocks, shattering the record previously held by the 1989-90 squad. Delaware State was tops in the MEAC and fifth among all NCAA Division I teams at 6.6 blocks per game during the 2011-12 campaign. In addition, DSU power forward Marques Oliver moved into first place on the team's list for career blocks that season. Oliver finished his career with 222 blocks.

Walker helped lead the Hornets to three consecutive MEAC regular season titles from 2004 to '07, during which the Hornets posted a league record of 46-8 (.850). The Hornets appeared in three consecutive MEAC Tournament championship games, capturing the title and accompanying NCAA Tournament berth in 2005.

The following year, Delaware State defeated Northern Arizona on the road in the National Invitation Tournament for the team's only national post-season win. The Hornets also appeared in the 2007 National Invitation Tournament.

Walker served as head coach at Division II Shaw University in Raleigh, N.C., for seven seasons from 1993 to 2000.

He posted a 91-102 overall record at Shaw, including a 21-9 mark and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth during the 1994-95 season. He led the team to a 17-9 mark in the 1997-98 campaign. The Bears finished in the Top 10 of the Sheridan Broadcast Network Black College poll during two of Walker's seasons.

In 1998, he coached a team of U.S. collegiate players to a bronze medal at a tournament in Russia. From 1987 to '93,

Walker was an assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. IUP was ranked number one in the NCAA Division II poll during parts of three seasons while Walker was on the staff.

Before entering the coaching ranks, he enjoyed a playing career that included a brief stint with the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers during the 1985-86 season. Prior to reaching the NBA, Walker played a total of seven years with various European and U.S. professional basketball leagues.

As a collegiate player at Clemson University, he helped lead the Tigers to a 23-9 overall record and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament during the 1979-80 season. He was a teammate of former NBA All-Star Larry Nance.

Walker earned a 1981 Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Clemson in 1981; and a master's degree in Student Personnel Services from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1991.

Keith and wife Kim have three children, Dockery, Zachary and Sawyer. Dockery is a member of the Brown University men's basketball team.

GRAY AMONG NATION'S BEST REBOUNDERS, SHOT BLOCKERS

Delaware State center **Kendall Gray's** rebounding and shot blocking this season have placed him among the nation's best. As of Dec. 3, he is tops in the MEAC in seven statistical categories, also ranking in the top four among all NCAA Division I players in six. Gray ranks first in the nation in total blocks (29), is second in defensive rebounds (9.14 pg), third in blocks (4.14 pg); and fourth in double-doubles (5), total rebounds (84) and rebounds per game (12.0). He's also third in the MEAC (35th NCAA) in field goal percentage (.607) and seventh in league in total field goals (37).

Gray has recorded "double-doubles in each of the last three games, including a 13-point, 14-rebunds performance at Hawaii in DSU's last outing (Dec. 2). He was two blocks away from school history in the Hornets' 72-65 win at Wake Forest on Nov. 28. Gray scored 14 points (6 -8 FGs), grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds and tied the school record for a third time with eight blocks in the contest, falling just short of the first "triple-double" in recorded team history.

Gray had five blocks at Arkansas on Nov. 21 to surpass **Marques Oliver** (2009-13) as the Hornets' all-time blocks leader. He has since raised his school record total to 239. The Wake Forest contest also marked the 19th time that Gray blocked at least five shots in a game with the Hornets. He also had a school record-tying eight blocks vs. NCA&T on Jan. 20, 2014; and against Wagner on Nov. 14, 2012.

Gray also holds the top two marks for single season blocks in team history. He swatted away 81 shots during the 2013-14, shattering the record of 75 he established the previous year.

Gray has been selected as the MEAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week in each of the first three weeks of the 2014-15 season.

The Dover, Del., native was named to the 2014-15 pre-season All-MEAC First Team after finishing second in the league in rebounding (7.9 pg), third in field goal percentage (.579) and fourth in blocks (2.7 pg) last season. He ranked third on the Hornets in scoring (11.5 ppg) and set a school record for the second time in his career with 81 blocks.

In addition, he led the team with 11 "double-doubles" during the 2013-14 campaign. Gray was also a two-time MEAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week as a junior last season.

Gray set the school record for blocks in a season for the first time with 75 as a sophomore during the 2012-13 season. He also proved to be more than just a defensive force last season. He reached double figures in scoring in 20 games and was third on the team in scoring at 11.5 points per game. Gray had a team-high 11 "double-doubles" last season, including a stretch of four straight games. He scored a career-high 20 points (8-12 FGs) and grabbed 12 rebounds, each a game high, vs. Norfolk State on Jan. 13. He tallied 17-points and 10 rebounds vs. Hamp-

ton in the previous game (Jan. 11). He has also recorded double-doubles against Oklahoma State (Dec. 17) and St. Francis Brooklyn (Dec. 30) and Campbell (Jan. 4). Gray tallied 14 points and a career-high 13 rebounds vs. St. Francis (Dec. 30). The previous game, he had 12 points and a game-high 11 rebounds vs. Oklahoma State. He tied his career-high with 13 boards vs. Campbell (Jan. 4).

He was second in the MEAC and 20th among all NCAA Division I players at 2.6 blocks per game as a sophomore. He also had eight blocks in DSU's 73-69 overtime win against Wagner on Nov. 14, 2012; and posted streaks of 12 and eight games with at least one block during his sophomore season.

As a freshman in 2011-12, Gray had 54 blocks, despite missing 12 games (including the last 10) due to a knee injury. He had at least one block in his first 13 collegiate games, including 26 during a five-game stretch.

Gray now has 718 points and 504 rebounds with the Hornets.

BLOCKS APLENTY

Thanks to **Kendall Gray**, DSU is the top shot blocking team in the MEAC. The Hornets are No. 1 in the league and 31st among NCAA Div. I teams in blocks at 5.7 per game (40 blocks in seven games). Led by Gray, DSU has posted its top two block numbers in the past three years. In Gray's freshman season of 2011-12, the Hornets set a school record with 192 blocks. The following season, DSU collected 185 blocks, the second-highest total in team history.

HOMEGROWN TALENT

For the second straight season, Delaware is the state with the highest number of players on the Hornets' roster. The 2014-15 roster includes six First State natives. Local products **Tyshawn Bell** (Dover) and **Kendall Gray** (Dover) are in their third season with the team. They are joined this season by fellow Delawareans **Charles Burley** (Wilmington), **Todd Hughes** (Smyrna), **Jason Owens** (Seaford), **Kendal Williams** (Dover).

BELL RINGS UP THREES FOR HORNETS

Delaware State forward **Tyshawn Bell** (sr.) continues to solidify his standing as one of the top three-point shooters in team history. Bell is third in the MEAC and 113th among all NCAA Div. I at 2.43 three-pointers per game; and is fifth in the league (104th NCAA) in total three-pointers with 17. He has hit 12 of his 23 three-point attempts in the last five games. Bell nailed a career-high five three-pointers (5-7) vs. Arkansas on Nov. 21; and hit four threes in the previous contest at North Texas (4-5). He now has 151 career threes, the seventh best total in team history. His next target on the school's three-point list is **Emanuel Davis** (1988-91), who is sixth with 153. Bell also had four threes in the season opener at Penn.

He tied his season-high with 19 points in the Arkansas contest, tying his total in the season-opening win at Penn. His career high is 21 points, which he has reached twice.

As a junior in 2013-14, Bell ranked among the MEAC leaders with a .345 three-point percentage (41-for-119); and was second in the league in free throw shooting at 86.2% (75-for-87).

He was also second on the Hornets in scoring with a career-best 12.1 point per-game average last season.

Bell is also on track to join the Hornets' 1000-point club this season. A career 9.1 ppg scorer, he currently sits at 867 points.

Bell was named MEAC Player-of-the-Week last Feb. 17 after scoring 42 points in two games. He was 13-for-20 from the field, including four-of-six from three-point territory, during the stretch.

He scored a career-high 21 points in back-to-back games last season. He scored 21 vs. Savannah State on Feb. 10 (7-9 FGs; 2-2 3pt; 5-5 FTs), and followed that with 21 at Bethune-Cookman the next game (6-11 FGs; 7-8 FTs). Bell also tallied 19 points in the previous game (vs. SC State) to give him 61 during the three-game stretch.

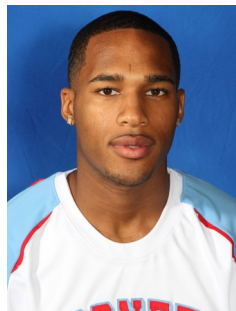

As a freshman during the 2011-12 season, Bell was a MEAC All-Rookie selection. He was fifth on the Hornets in scoring (7.2 ppg) and second in three-point field goals (43). Bell ranked fourth in the MEAC in three-point percentage (.387 ... 43-for-111) and knocked down at least one three-pointer in 22 of DSU's 30 contests during his rookie season.



HAYWOOD COLLECTS FIRST MEAC PLAYER OF WEEK AWARD

Sophomore guard **DeAndre Haywood** came out the gate strong in the 2014-15 season. Haywood has topped the Hornets in scoring in three games, including a career-high 23 points vs. Penn in the season opener. He was eight-for-16 from the field and seven-of-10 at the free throw line in the Penn contest. He scored five points in the overtime, including two free throws in the closing seconds to seal the win. In addition, Haywood tallied five rebounds, four assists and a game-high four steals in 38 minutes of playing time in the opener.



The MEAC thought enough of Haywood's performance at Penn to name him as its first Player-of-the-Week for the 2014-15 season. It also marked the first time he has received the honor.

Haywood is third among Hornet regulars in scoring at 12.4 points per game this season. He is also fifth in the MEAC (69th NCAA) with 17 total steals, and fifth in the league at 2.0 steals per game.

In addition, he ranks fourth in the MEAC in free throw attempts (35) and sixth in free throws made (23).

Haywood was named to the 2013-14 MEAC All-Rookie Team after averaging 6.2 points in his debut season. He set career scoring highs in three consecutive games last season, highlighted by a game-high 20 points vs. Florida A&M on Feb. 17. He tallied 17 points vs. Bethune-Cookman in the previous contest (Feb. 15) and 13 against Savannah State the game before that (Feb. 10). Haywood hit 16 of 28 shots from the field during the stretch (.571). In the Florida A&M contest, Haywood was seven-for-12 from the field. He scored 19 points in the second half. He was fifth on the Hornets in scoring last season.

K "WILL"

Delaware State guard **Kendal Williams** (sr.) has been recognized for his stellar play in his first season with the Hornets last year. Williams was named to the 2014-15 pre-season All-MEAC Third Team. He was among the MEAC leaders in three-point percentage last season, connecting on 29-of-69 attempts (.420). Williams was tops on the Hornets with 84 assists and ranked fourth in scoring at 8.2 points per game.

Williams came off the bench to score a season-high nine points at No. Texas on Nov. 19. He tallied eight points (4-4 FTs), three rebounds and two assists in Saturday's win at Penn in the season opener.

The former Dover (Del.) High School star was a 2012-13 All-Maryland Junior College First Team and All-Region XX Second Team selection at Baltimore City Community College. He averaged 14.8 points and 4.9 assists (each a team high) during 2012-13 season and helped lead BCCC to 21-10 overall record, a conference title and Region XX Tournament finals last season.

2014-15 HORNET NEWCOMERS

Delaware State's 2014-15 opening day roster features six players who are new to the program, including two with prior Division I experience and a local star. Swingman **Aric Dickerson** (jr.; 6-6) briefly played at West Virginia University under Bob Huggins before transferring to Lee College in Texas. Dickerson was a standout at Lincoln Park H.S. in Chicago. Newcomer **Kris Walden** (jr.; 6-6) played two seasons at Towson (Md.) University before enrolling at DSU. He was forced to sit out the 2013-14 season due to NCAA transfer rules. He was a 20-point scorer as a senior at Henrico HS in Virginia. **Todd Hughes** (fr.; 6-2) helped lead Delaware's Sanford School to a state championship. The Smyrna, Del., native was an All-State selection and 1000-point scorer during his scholastic career. Guard **Quincy Tillinghast** (fr.; 6-0) nailed more than 500 three-point field goals during his career at the School for the Performing Art in Cincinnati, OH, while swingman **Kavon Waller** (fr.; 6-5) was his district's Player-of-the-Year and an All-State selection as a senior at Virginia's Thomas Dale HS. Moscow, Russia native **Artem Tavakalyan** (fr.; 6-6) helped lead Florida Air Academy to a 26-2 overall record and state playoff berth as a senior in 2013-14.

HOME COOKING

Prior to last season, DSU's Memorial Hall had been an unfriendly place for Hornet opponents in recent years. Despite seven home losses last season (7-7), the Hornets are a solid 112-43 (.723) at home since the 2000-01 season. DSU was 8-3 at home during the 2012-13 season. The Hornets were 11-0 in front of the home crowd during the 2002-03 campaign and 9-1 in Memorial Hall during the 2004-05, 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons. The Hornets are 76-22 in Memorial Hall vs. MEAC opponents (.776) since the 2000-01 campaign.

AMERE MAY COMES FULL CIRCLE WITH THE HORNETS

One of the first calls **Keith Walker** received after being named head coach of the Hornets last spring was from **Amere May**, who left DSU after two seasons from 2011-to-13. May was recruited to Delaware State by Walker when he was a Hornet assistant. The Covert, Mich., native averaged 5.9 points in 53 games, primarily as a reserve in his first two seasons at DSU. May played the 2013-14 season at Div. II St. Augustine's (N.C.), where he averaged 19.3 points per game; and was named to the All-CIAA First Team. May left St. Augustine's last summer and re-enrolled at Delaware State. He petitioned the NCAA to allow him to compete for the Hornets this season. May was allowed to practice but did not compete in DSU's first three games this season while the petition was being considered. May was named MEAC Player-of-the-Week for the first time in his career on Dec. 1 after scoring 50 points in two games. He tallied a game-and-his-Div. I high of 32 points in the Hornets' 72-65 win over Wake Forest on Nov. 28. His performance was highlighted by six three-point field goals (6-10), five coming in the first half. It was his first start of the season. May scored a team-high 18 nine points (7-15 FGs; 2-6 3-pt.) in his second game of the season at Iona on Nov. 26. He is has taken over the team scoring lead at 15.8 points per game. May had 39 and 37-point performances at St. Augustine's during the 2013-14 season.

ROAD WARRIORS

Delaware State's men's basketball "traveling" party will spend plenty of time packing and unpacking this season. The Hornets are scheduled to log more than 24,600 miles by bus and plane to a total of 13 states and the District of Columbia. The schedule is highlighted by first-time trips to Hawai'i and Oregon.

The Hornets played at Hawai'i on Dec. 2; and lwill be back in the air for a flight to Eugene, Ore., to face the Ducks (Dec. 20).

In addition to Hawai'i and Oregon, the Hornets will visit Texas (North Texas), Arkansas (University of Arkansas), South Carolina (SC State), Rhode Island (URI) and New Jersey (NJIT); and make two trips to Pennsylvania (Penn; Temple), New York (Iona, St. Francis Brooklyn) North Carolina (Wake Forest; NC Central; NCA&T), Maryland (UMES; Coppin State) and Virginia (Hampton; Norfolk State; MEAC Tournament).

Delaware State will also visit Howard University in Washington, D.C.; and make the 45-mile trip upstate to take on the University of Delaware this season.

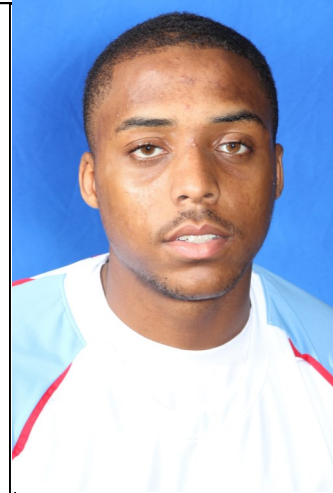
