

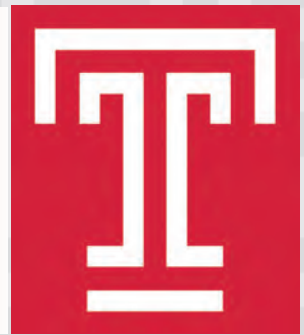

### THIS WEEK

Temple (1-1) takes on Delaware State (0-3) in a non-conference battle. This is the first meeting between the two teams.

Delaware State, who competes in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) has not played a FBS school since 2012, when they lost to Cincinnati. They are 1-4 vs FBS schools. Temple has played two MEAC members, Howard and Florida A&M. The Owls are 1-1 against MEAC schools.

### LAST GAME:

#### NAVY 31, TEMPLE 24

A little over a week after Temple lit up Vanderbilt Stadium, the team seemed to dim a little in a 31-24 loss to Navy. The defense could not contain Navy QB Kennan Reynolds and the Midshipmen's explosive offense in the Owls home opener, in front of 28,408 fans.

In their 11th meeting, and the last one with Navy as an independent team, the Owls allowed the Midshipmen to rush for 487 yards on 63 carries, while Reynolds was 4-8 for 30 yards and no touchdowns in the air. Reynolds also led Navy in rushing, with 21 carries for 181 yards and two touchdowns.

DB Sharif Finch was able to force a fumble during Navy's first possession and recover the ball in the end zone. On the ground, the Owls were able to rack up 156 yards, with sophomore QB P.J. Walker leading the herd, with 13 carries for 71 yards. Walker also went 29-49 and threw for 240 yards and two touchdowns.

**Monday Teleconferences**

**Tuesday Media Luncheon**

Matt Rhule's weekly media luncheon is held each week at Edberg-Olson Hall on the main campus (10th & Diamond Streets, 2nd floor). In most cases, the luncheon will take place at 12:00 noon on Tuesdays. However, please check the weekly gamenotes for luncheon schedule.

**Practice Regulations**

Head coach Matt Rhule and select players will be available for brief interviews following daily practices early in the week. Photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot the last 15 minutes of practice. Otherwise, all practices are closed to all individuals except Temple football personnel. Practices the day before a game are closed to the media in its entirety.

**Credentials**

All requests for credentials to cover Temple Football games and practices must be made through Athletic Communications. Season credentials should be requested in the preseason and game-by-game credentials must be requested at least one week prior to the game. Local media requesting credentials for a road game must have that request into Athletic Communications two weeks prior to the contest submitted in writing on company letterhead by e-mail (rich.burg@temple.edu).

Following home and road games, Coach Rhule and a few selected players will be brought to an area outside of the locker room for postgame interviews after a brief cool down period. **HEY TOUGH GUY**

In 2013, the Temple Owls got back to a tradition of awarding single-digit jerseys to the toughest players on the team. This season, the coaches awarded four numbers and the players selected the balance.

By NCAA rule, offensive linemen are not permitted to wear single-digits and that prevented Kyle Friend and Dion Dawkins - each recognized by their peers as two of the toughest on the team - from changing their numbers.

Three players - Jalen Fitzpatrick, John Christopher and Tyler Matakevich - remained tough enough to retain their numbers from a year ago.

The biggest surprise was that freshman Sean Chandler earned the respect of his peers as the players awarded him a single-digit jersey.

**WHO'S #1?**

When awarding the single-digit jerseys, there was a logjam on the ninth player. Head coach Matt Rhule decided that the #1 jersey would be given to the toughest player of the week. Therefore, the #1 will be worn by a different player from game to game.

**YOU'VE GOT A FRIEND IN ME**

Junior center Kyle Friend has taken his leadership to a new level this season. After earning captain status as a sophomore in 2012, and playing alongside three seniors, the Carlisle, PA, native has served as mentor to an inexperienced O-line.

Kyle and Eric Lofton became inseparable this Spring and the dividends paid off for Lofton who had seen limited action prior to his redshirt-junior season.

"I'm just trying to emulate what he does," said redshirt-junior Eric Lofton. "He's done it. I figure if I do what he does, we'll have another guy doing what Kyle Friend does. He does it the right way."

Said head coach Matt Rhule, "He's big, strong, fast and extremely intelligent. He keeps everyone on the same page."

**IT ALL STARTS ON THE LINE**

Temple enters the 2014 season with a very inexperienced offensive line. While center Kyle Friend has started 21 games, the remaining players - starters and backups - have a combined 5 starts under their belt (not including Shahbaz Ahmed's 5 starts at defensive end a year ago).

Only six Division I teams entered the season with fewer than TU's 26 starts: Tennessee (6), Ohio State (20), Arkansas State (22), San Jose State (23), Army and Louisiana Tech (24).

**WIZ KHALIF-A**

A former NJ High School player of the year, redshirt-sophomore WR Khalif Herbin has become a weapon for the Temple Owls. Entering 2014, the Owls plan to use Herbin as a wide receiver, running back, kick and punt returner.

"He's been fantastic, he's been explosive, competitive and the other guys are matching his intensity level. Kalif is really fun to have on the field," said head coach Matt Rhule.

**YOUNG CHAMP**

Freshman CB Sean Chandler has had the nickname "Champ" since before he set foot on the Temple campus. Since his arrival, he's been nothing less than a knockout.

Not only has he risen up the depth chart to a starting position, but he earned the respect of his peers when he was awarded the single-digit jersey given to the toughest players on the team.

Chandler, from Camden (NJ) High took advantage of his proximity to the Temple campus by watching his teammates during spring workouts before heading to class.

**TY GOES TO THE RUNNER**

Junior LB Tyler Matakevich has developed a reputation as a tackling machine. After becoming the first Temple freshman to break the 100 tackle barrier in 2012, he topped it the following year with 137 tackles. His 99 solo tackles led the nation, becoming the first Owl in 25 years to lead the nation in any category.

Not surprising, Matakevich finds himself among the nations elite players placing him on the Watch Lists for the Bednarik, Butkus, Nagurski, and Rotary Lombardi Awards, and CFPA LB Trophy.

Said head coach Matt Rhule, "He's a leader, he's tough, he's physical, he represents what we want to represent. Players around him respond to him. He has the physical tools, the mental tools and the intangibles - the instincts, the feel for the game - that are hard to find. I don't think there's any secret why he led the nation in tackles last year and right now he's much better than he was last year."

**SWISS ARMY KNIFE**

Redshirt junior WR John Christopher has become the jack of all trades for the Temple Owls. Besides his value as a wide receiver - one that has earned him the respect of his coaches and teammates who for a second season bestowed him with a single-digit jersey - he has become indispensable on special teams.

"He makes that diving catch at SMU that makes ESPN's top plays, and what I love about it is he ran down on the kickoff the following play," said Matt Rhule. "That's what John Christopher is. He was voted by his teammates into the single digits for the second year in a row. When your teammates do it, that's really something. He's physically tough, he's mentally tough, he's a great student, great teammate. He's everything that we're trying to find here. He's everything that we're trying to recruit."

Christopher serves as the long snapper on punts adding speed to the position which allows him to get downfield to make tackles. He also serves as a backup holder and punt returner.

**TEMPLE MADE**

When Adam DiMichele was promoted from graduate assistant to full-time wide receivers coach on February 6, 2014, he became the 19th Temple football player to become a coach at his alma mater - and the first in over 25 years.

DiMichele was a quarterback and two-time team MVP and captain for the Owls from 2006-08. He is ranked fourth in TU history with 5,024 passing yards and 40 TDs.

**BAM-BAM**

Redshirt-sophomore WR Zack Bambarly was a walk on from Easton, PA, in 2012. Last season, he saw limited game action in two contests and was awarded the scout team player of the week prior to the win at Army.

What makes Bambarly unique is that he suffers from Type-2 diabetes. Throughout practice he needs to track his blood sugar levels and often has to take insulin.

## POSITION BY POSITION

### QUARTERBACKS

The quarterback position is led by offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield, now in his second season. Last year, the Owls offense gained nearly 400 yards per game, the second best mark in school history and the most since 1979.

In 7 starts at QB in 2013, true freshman QB **P.J. Walker** threw for 2,084 yards and 20 TDs. Those marks set the record for Temple freshmen and challenged the all-time school marks. With a complete offseason of training and a full season ahead, many are expecting Walker to re-write the school passing records in just his sophomore season. He was already named by Athlon's as one of the Top 5 Players to Watch in 2014 and is on the Watch Lists for the Maxwell, Manning, Davey O'Brien and CFPB QB Awards.

**Connor Reilly** began the 2013 season as the starter but injuries and inconsistency opened the door for Walker. On a national stage in a packed house, Reilly made his first collegiate start in the opener at Notre Dame and showed promise. The following week, however, he suffered a knee injury and never completely recovered before the reins were handed to Walker.

**Frank Nutile** (Ramsey, NJ/Don Bosco Prep) and **Lenny Williams** (McKees Rocks, PA/Sto-Rox) were part of the 2014 recruiting class. Nutile suffered a torn ACL this summer and will miss the season while recovering from surgery.

**Tim DiGiorgio** and **Thomas Rumer** have redshirted over the past couple of seasons and did not see game action. DiGiorgio saw mop up duty at Vanderbilt.

### WIDE RECEIVERS

This position is under reconstruction from a year ago. Adam DiMichele, a graduate assistant last season, takes over after the departure of Terry Smith.

The 2014 unit will have to make up for the loss of energetic leader, Ryan Alderman (team captain), and statistical leader, Robby Anderson (44-791-9TDs), from a year ago.

Returning are **Jalen Fitzpatrick** (38-429-3TDs) and **John Christopher** (31-331-2TDs). Like Alderman, each is undersized but tough as nails. Both earned single-digit jersey numbers in 2013-14 - given to the Owls' toughest players - and each played through injuries to compete in every game last season.



FITZPATRICK

The Owls are looking for explosiveness from three players who redshirted a year ago. **Romond Deloatch** and **Samuel Benjamin** had their 2013 season cut short due to injury, knee and shoulder, respectively. **Khalif Herbin**, a former New Jersey player of the year, is a threat to score from anywhere on the field.

**Nate Hairston** saw action last year at WR. This spring he experimented at DB but was returned to offense. **Brandon Shippen**, a two-year contributor on defense, is making the switch to receiver.



CHRISTOPHER

Competition is emerging from a quartet of freshmen. **Ventell Bryant** (Tampa, FL/Jefferson), **Matt Eaton** (Pascagoula, MS/Pascagoula), and **Brodrick Yancy** (Bradenton, FL/Manatee) were all part of the 2014 recruiting class. **Derrek Thomas** was a mid-year transfer from Milford Academy. All four had their share of missed time this summer.

**Zach Bambarly** made contributions a year ago on the scout team and in limited special teams action. **Dean Mosley**, a converted QB, adds depth.

**Tom Bradway**, **Marshall Ellick**, and **Rob Heyen** are walk-ons who enrolled at Temple in the winter of 2014. Bradway transferred from Lafayette (where he was a baseball player) and Ellick comes by way of Air Force Prep.

Sophomore **Keith Kirkwood**, a transfer from Hawaii will have to redshirt for the 2014 season. The Neptune, NJ, native elected to play closer to home.

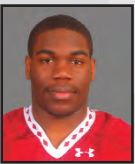
### TIGHT ENDS & FULLBACKS

Wryly veteran, Ed Foley, the assistant head coach, is entrusted with the fresh-faced group of tight ends.

Gone is last year's starter Chris Coyer. Coyer started 8 games with 20 catches for 277 yards and 2 TDs.

The only returner with experience is **Wanemi Omuso**. Omuso, who has played 18 games with 0 career catches, is primarily a blocking TE and is coming off knee surgery that derailed his 2013 season.

**Cole Boozer** and **Saledeem Major** redshirted in their first season with the squad last year.



OMUSO

The Owls added former Florida recruit and Archbishop Ryan star **Colin Thompson**. The redshirt sophomore has been hampered by foot injuries

throughout his college career and has yet to take the field for the Owls.

**Kip Patton** (Norristown, PA) and **Chris Myarick** (Elkins Park, PA) are incoming freshmen.

There are two fullbacks on the roster - **Marc Tyson** and **Eric Neefe**. A former wrestler, Tyson converted from LB to FB last summer. Neefe, a Philadelphia native, walked on and redshirted in 2013.

### RUNNING BACKS

The stable of running backs are tutored by Tyree Foreman, who in his eighth year at Temple has coached three all-conference players (Bernard Pierce, Montel Harris and Matt Brown).

**Kenneth Harper**, one of just eight seniors on the roster, returns. Last season he was the workhorse leading the team with 136 carries, 613 yards and 9 TDs on the ground (his 9 rushing TDs were 2nd in the conference). He added 26 catches for 241 yards and 2 TDs receiving. In 2014, he earned a spot on the Doak Walker Award Watch List.

**Zaire Williams** rushed for 533 yards, the 3rd best mark by a TU freshman in school history (behind only Bernard Pierce and Paul Palmer).

**Jamie Gilmore** played sparingly on offense but he averaged over 6.0-yards per touch. In his only extended action of the season, he rushed 16 times for 92 yards in the season finale win at Memphis.

Sophomore **Jahad Thomas** was moved to running back midway through camp and has impressed. He shared the backfield with P.J. Walker at Elizabeth HS.

**Hassan Dixon** made contributions a year ago on the scout team and in limited special teams action.

**Jabo Lee** spent the 2013 rehabbing from knee surgery and should be back to full strength by summer camp. The Dillon, SC, product was originally recruited by Tennessee.

**Chris Cargill** was a walk-on in 2013 and did not see game action last season. **Roy Wesley** walked on this spring.

**David Hood** (Galloway, NJ/Absegami) was part of the 2014 recruiting class.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

Perhaps even more than the receiving corps, the O-line has been under major reconstruction. Chris Wiesehan was hired from Hawaii to replace Allen Mogridge and five players who combined for 41 starts are gone. Coach Weez brought two simple philosophies in reference to the 5 starting O-linemen: "There are five steaks on the table. The hungriest guys are gonna eat," and "We can't be fingers. We have to become a fist."

The thumb would then be center **Kyle Friend**. He was team captain as a sophomore last season and has started 21 straight games. Friend was the only player to play every down of offense in 2013. He made the 2014 CBSportsline "Freaks" list due to his ability to bench press 225-pounds 40 times and run a 4.95 40 and finds himself on the Rimington Award Watch List.

**Dion Dawkins** was making strides as a true freshman in 2013. He made consecutive starts in games 4-5, however, he suffered a season ending foot injury vs. Louisville.

Two of the most improved players this spring were junior **Shahbaz Ahmed** and redshirt junior **Eric Lofton**. Ahmed made the switch from D-line to O-line this spring and Lofton played in 13 games in the past two seasons, mostly on special teams.

**Brendan McGowan** and **Jacob Quinn** each had opportunities to start in 2013 and hope that experience pays dividends in 2014.

**Leon Johnson**, **Semaj Reed**, and **Adrian Sullivan** each redshirted as freshmen last season and look to contribute this year. **Peter Calderone** is a redshirt-junior who has yet to see game action.

**James McHale** (Dunmore, PA/Dunmore), **Jaelin Robinson** (New Haven, CT/Wilbur Cross), and **Aaron Ruff** (Philadelphia, PA/Imhotep) were all part of the 2014 recruiting class. The Owls also added walkons **Nick Apostolu** (Springfield, PA/Springfield) and **Gordon Thomas** (Philadelphia, PA/Imhotep).

**DEFENSIVE LINE**

Camden native Elijah Robinson returns to the area as the new defensive line coach. Robinson played and coached at Penn State under the legendary Larry Johnson.

Incumbents **Hershey Walton** and **Matt Ioannidis**, who each started more than half of the 12 games, give the Owls toughness and experience on the interior of the line.

**Averee Robinson**, a true freshman who played in 11 games a year ago, and **Brian Carter**, who redshirted in 2013, will challenge on the inside. Carter has missed most of camp after suffering an ankle injury.

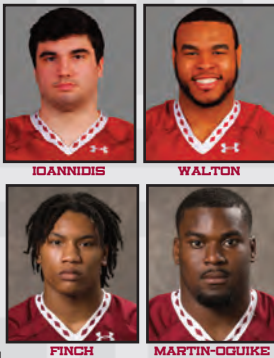
Both **Bryan Osei** and **Kiser Terry** will move inside from defensive end after bulking up during the offseason.

The Owls entered spring ball with questions at defensive end and believe that they have found answers in **Sharif Finch** and **Praise Martin-Oguike**. Finch played LB as a true freshman last season and showed a knack for rushing the passer. Martin-Oguike rejoined the team after missing two seasons.

The position remains fluid, however, as junior **Brandon Chudnoff**, redshirt-sophomore **Haason Reddick**, senior **Obi Onejeme**, sophomore **Avery Ellis** (who redshirted a year ago after playing LB as a freshman), and redshirt freshman **Julian Taylor** continue to improve.

Joining the competition is a group of star recruits. **Freddie Booth-Lloyd** (Cocoa, FL/Cocoa), **Michael Dogbe** (Morris Plains, NJ/Parsippany Hills), **Jacob Martin** (Aurora, CO/Cherokee Trail), and **Brenon Thrift** (Monroeville, PA/Gateway) were all part of the 2014 recruiting class.

The Owls recently added JUCO transfer **Julio Derosier**. Derosier played last season at ASA in Brooklyn and hails from Homestead, FL.

**LINEBACKERS**

The linebacking corps is led by Mike Siravo who returned to Temple last season after six seasons at his alma mater, Boston College.

One of the most stable units on the team, the linebackers return juniors **Tyler Matakovich** and **Nate D. Smith**. Both are two-year starters and leaders of not just the unit but the team.

Matakovich, who already has a laundry list of honors as an Owl including first team all-conference, led the nation in solo tackles last year with 8.8 per game. He is on the Watch Lists for nearly every major award he is eligible for including Bednarik, Butkus, Nagurski, Rotary Lombardi, and CFPA LB.

Manning the middle is Nate D. Smith who started 7 games at MLB last season, including the season's last six. Over that 6 game stretch, Smith had 38 tackles, 6 TFL, 3 sacks, and a fumble recovery returned for a TD.

**Jarred Alwan** and **Rob Dvoracek** saw a good deal of action at linebacker in 2013, and each has been sidelined during 2014. Dvoracek battled through injuries to stay on the field but will be sidelined once again to start the season. Alwan played as a true freshman, starting opening day, and continues to grow from the experience. **Stephaun Marshall** has been working at MLB.

The competition at strong-side LB has been a battle throughout camp. **Avery Williams** has found a home at linebacker. The redshirt-sophomore played RB, LB and DB last season and was able to contribute on special teams. **Shahid Lovett** (Vineland, NJ/Vineland/Lackawanna CC), a JUCO transfer was moved from SS to LB midway through camp. Marshall is making the conversion from safety to linebacker similar to the one made by **Michael Felton** a year ago. Both are strong and athletic and will be core special teams players in addition to seeing action on defense.

The Owls added depth with **Zayd Issah**, a highly touted high school prospect from Central Dauphin who spent some time at Penn State. **Jared Folks** (Harrisburg, PA/Susquehanna Township) was part of the 2014 recruiting class.

**Buddy Brown**, a redshirt freshman, was one of the more highly touted New Jersey players a year ago, is battling a knee injury that sidelined him for most of 2013. **Chris Smith**, redshirted in 2013 and contributed to the scout team. **Dan McLaughlin** was a walk on who joined the team in the spring of 2014. The Owls also added **Zach Mesday** (Bordentown, NJ), **Rob Ritrovato** (West Chester, PA), **Nick Sharga** (Cherryville, PA) and **Rob Varner** (Royersford, PA). Sharga played last season at West Virginia-Wesleyan.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS**

Coaching the secondary will be defensive coordinator Phil Snow (safeties) and Fran Brown (cornerbacks).

The defensive backfield has been transformed from a year ago due to the play of two JUCO transfers and one freshman recruit.

At the safety position, the Owls needed to replace FS Abdul Smith who started 12 games a year ago. The battle was expected to come from a trio of juniors.

**Alex Wells** (Baltimore, MD/Overlea/ASA College) and **Shahid Lovett** (Vineland, NJ/Vineland/Lackawanna CC) are mid-year JUCO transfers. Wells shined throughout the spring while Lovett was limited due to injury. Lovett has since been moved to LB.

**Boye Aromire** is a hard-hitting safety who played corner as a true freshman for Virginia Tech in 2011. **Nate L. Smith** was a highly touted recruit in 2012 and has made strides this offseason to compete for playing time. **Will Hayes** saw limited action in 2013.

They will all have to fight off 2014 recruits - **Shamir Bearfield** (Jersey City, NJ/St. Peter's Prep) and **Jyquis Thomas** (Plant City, FL/Plant City). Each has been impressive early in camp. The Owls have also added freshman **Cam Hutchins** (Matawan, NJ/Old Bridge).

Freshman **Sean Chandler** (Camden, NJ/Camden) has been the surprise of camp. He not only has moved up the depth chart to the starting CB spot but he impressed his teammates enough for them to vote him into a single-digit jersey reserved for the toughest players on the team.

Cornerback **Anthony Robey** has more experience than the rest of the DBs combined. His streak of 24 consecutive starts began in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in 2011 and his 28 starts overall are more than twice as many than the other 19 defensive backs combined. **Tavon Young**, who split the starting job with Zamel Johnson at the other corner last season, also returns with experience. They will need to fight off a talented group of incoming freshmen and junior transfer **Khiry Lucas** (Cleveland, MS/East Side/Hinds CC).

**Anthony Davis** (Monroeville, PA/Gateway) and **Cequan Jefferson** (Richmond, VA/Henrico) are both incoming freshmen and were part of the 2014 recruiting class. Jefferson was a mid-year transfer from Fork Union Military Academy. Also in the mix are **Brett Pierce**, **Ikeem Boyd**, and **Artrel Foster**.

**SPECIALISTS**

For the second year in a row, the Owls will need to replace one of the top NCAA punters. Last season, Paul Layton, a University of Albany graduate with one year of eligibility remaining, transferred to Temple to fill the void left when Brandon McManus departed for the NFL.

McManus left big shoes to fill and the experienced Layton handled the punting chores admirably.

**Jim Cooper**, a true freshman a year ago, was tasked to handle McManus' kicking duties and struggled through most of the season. With a year under his belt, Cooper was expected to return to the form that made him highly recruited coming out of high school.

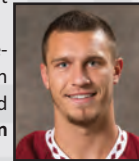

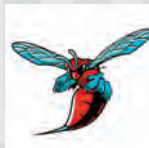

While working with the Hornets', Teasley spent time as the linebackers coach, assisted with special teams, and spent two seasons as a graduate assistant working with tight ends and recruitment.

Prior to Blount, Jones and Teasley making the move to Delaware State, they were at Winston-Salem University together, where Blount was the head coach for 17 years and Jones was the OC/recruiting coordinator. Teasley was an offensive lineman for the Rams starting in 2003, after he transferred from Hofstra.

### FIRST IMPRESSIONS

This will be the first time that Temple and Delaware State meet in a game. In their first meetings with teams, Temple is 84-76-10. This record does not reflect first meetings that were forfeited in 1986.

# Matt RHULE

Head Coach  
Penn State '97



8th Season at Temple (2nd as Head Coach)

On December 17, 2012, Matt Rhule returned to North Broad Street to take the helm as head coach of the Temple Owls. Following six seasons as one of Al Golden's top assistants, he joined the New York Giants as the assistant offensive line coach in 2012. He is now in his second year as the 26th Owls head coach and eighth on the Temple campus.

Prior to the start of his first season in charge he offered that his squad would produce an exciting brand of football and they would improve as the season progressed. Rhule delivered on those promises as the 2013 Owls produced nearly 400 yards per game of offense (the second best total in school history). Despite an 0-6 start to the season, the troops never surrendered and the team never trailed at the start of the fourth quarter in the second half of the season. The mission in the 2014 offseason was to learn how to finish out games.

The State College, PA native, a former player at Penn State, has 16 years of collegiate coaching experience, including seven seasons at Temple, and six bowl games -- two with the Owls -- on his resume.

Rhule joined the Giants in the spring of 2012. He worked closely with Pat Flaherty, who has been the offensive line coach since 2004. They finished the 2012 campaign at 9-7, second in the NFC East, and averaged 355 yards of offense per game. Four New York players, including guard Chris Snee, were selected to the Pro Bowl.

During his previous tenure at Temple, Rhule's role changed several times. In spring 2012, he was promoted to co-offensive coordinator after serving as the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach as well as the recruiting coordinator under Steve Addazio in 2011. Temple's 2012 recruiting class was ranked #1 in the Mid-American Conference and helped lay the foundation for the program's transition to the Big East Conference.

Under Al Golden, Rhule was promoted to offensive coordinator in the spring of 2008. He also coached the TU quarterbacks. He coached the defensive line in 2006 and served as the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. For three consecutive years, Temple's recruiting class was ranked #1 in the MAC [2006, 2007, 2008].

In 2011, the Owls went 9-4 and played in the fourth bowl game in school history, the Gildan New Mexico Bowl, where they crushed Wyoming, 37-15 -- Temple's first postseason victory since the 1979 Garden State Bowl. Rhule mentored two-time first-team All-MAC selection TE Evan Rodriguez. For the second time in Rhule's tenure, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record and rushing touchdowns records behind the explosive efforts of All-MAC junior running backs Bernard Pierce and Matt Brown.

In 2010, Rhule guided the offense to the largest margin of victory in a MAC game. Helping the team to an 8-4 regular-season record, the Owls recorded back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1978-79, including their first win over a BCS team. The Owls recorded the largest margin of victory (42 points) in a MAC game against Buffalo. A school record six offensive players earned All-MAC honors, including repeat first-team honorees OL Colin Madison, OL Darius Morris, and RB Bernard Pierce as well as first-time honoree TE Evan Rodriguez.

In 2009, Rhule's offense helped TU win a single-season record nine consecutive games en route to a 9-4 overall record and first-place tie in the MAC East. Under Rhule's guidance, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record. A school record five offensive players were named All-MAC, including three on the first team. All-American Bernard Pierce rushed his way into the Temple record book, re-writing all records for a rookie en route to 2009 MAC Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2008, Rhule took the reins as offensive coordinator, helping the Owls to their most wins in nearly two decades. The Owls out-scored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990. Rhule coached All-MAC honorees C Alex Derenthal and school record holder WR Bruce Francis, while

QB Adam DiMichele set the school record for passing touchdowns with six in the 55-52 win over Eastern Michigan. WR Bruce Francis set the school records for career receiving TDs (23) and consecutive games with a reception (38).

Rhule arrived in Owl Country after spending four seasons as an assistant coach at Western Carolina, including three as assistant head coach.

From 2002 to 2005, Rhule was an assistant at Western Carolina under head coach Kent Briggs, serving as assistant head coach during his last three seasons. In 2005, he was offensive line coach and run game coordinator after directing the linebackers his first three years. Rhule was special teams coordinator during his tenure in Cullowhee (NC). In 2005, the Catamounts led Division I-AA in kickoff returns, averaging 27.44 yards per return. Sophomore Mike Malone earned first team All-Southern Conference honors with a 31.29 yards per kickoff return average, ranking second nationally. Two offensive linemen and the team's punter captured second team all-league accolades.

In 2004, WCU ranked 12th nationally in total defense and 15th in pass defense, largely due to the production of Rhule's linebacker corps. The team's top five tacklers were linebackers in its eight man front scheme. In 2003, the Catamounts led the SoCon in rush defense for the first time in school history.

Rhule arrived at Western Carolina after serving as assistant defensive line coach at UCLA in 2001. He assisted in coaching five Bruins that earned All PAC-10 honors as the team posted a 7-4 record under head coach Bob Toledo.

From 1999 to 2000, Rhule served as an assistant coach at Mid-American Conference member Buffalo, directing the Bulls defensive line in 2000 and working as assistant defensive line coach in 1999. In 2000, the team's sack total increased from 12 to 27 utilizing a 3-4 alignment. Buffalo also earned its first two Division I-A victories that season.

Rhule began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Penn State in the spring of 1998 before working at Albright College in Reading, PA for the 1998 season. At Albright, he coached the linebackers in a 4-3 scheme and recruited western and central Pennsylvania.

Rhule played four seasons at linebacker with the Nittany Lions under Joe Paterno. A three-time Penn State Scholar-Athlete, he earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 1997. He received his undergraduate degree in political science before earning his master's degree in educational psychology from Buffalo in 2003.

Born January 31, 1975, he spent his childhood in New York City before moving to State College, PA, as a teenager.

He is married to the former Julie Nibert. The couple has a son, Bryant (9), and a daughter, Vivienne (1).

## Temple Storms to Victory in Season Opener

NASHVILLE - After an hour and 37 minute lighting delay, the Temple defense decided to light up Vanderbilt Stadium in a 37-7 stunner of a win in front of 31,731 fans. The night was highlighted by an amazing performance by the defense, which included two forced fumbles by sophomore DL Averee Robinson and only allowing the Commodores to 107 total yards in the first half. Overall, the defense forced seven turnovers, including three interceptions - the same total they had all last season.

With the win, Temple recorded its first victory over an SEC team since a 20-12 win at Florida on December 3, 1938.

On the first drive of the game, the Owls looked promising, but failed to convert a first down and freshman Alex Starzyk was forced to punt it away.



eted #1 jersey this week.

The first drive for the Commodores didn't amount to anything, as the 'Dores were held to only 3 total yards, with the assistance of junior DL Matt Ioannidis and junior LB Tyler Makatevich tackles on first- and second-down, respectively. Vanderbilt was forced to punt for the first time after junior DL Sharif Finch sacked QB Pat Robinette.

The Owls were the first to score after Vanderbilt RB Brian Kimbrow was the victim of a Nate D. Smith forced fumble, which was recovered by Robinson at the Vanderbilt 40. From there, a four play, 40 yard drive ended with a 35-yard pass on 4th-and-5 from sophomore QB P.J. Walker to junior WR Brandon Shippen, the first catch of his career.

Vanderbilt opened the second quarter by punting the ball away, after junior DL Praise Martin-Oguike sacked Robinette, which marked the third sack of the half for the Owls.

The Owls then tried to get a something going, after facing a 3rd-and-21 situation, after a chopblock penalty was called against Temple. However, the Owls were forced to punt it away, and the 'Dores would catch a break after freshman punter Alex Starzyk was unable to get a grip on a high snap. Oren Burks recovered the fumble in the end zone, tying up the game.

Once the Owls got the ball back and Walker had completed a pass to sophomore WR Khalif Herbin, the ball was put back into the 'Dores hands, as the ball was stripped and Jake Sealnd recovered at midfield. Vanderbilt was unable to capitalize on the mishap.

With a little over two minutes left before the half, Walker was able to launch a rocket to senior WR Jalen Fitzpatrick in the endzone, following Temple second successful 4th down attempt, an 11-yard completion to sophomore WR Nate Hairston on 4th and 7.

Even though Vanderbilt had the ball back following the Temple touchdown, the 'Dores once again were unable to get any movement. New Vandy QB Stephen Rivers

was sacked and Robinson recovered his second fumble of the night, running it 55-yards for the touchdown, making the halftime score 21-7 in favor of the Owls.

The third quarter started with Vanderbilt receiving the ball, but they were unable to score, as Hayden Lekacz's field goal attempt went to the left of the uprights.

Once again, the Owls shined through the rest of the third quarter, as sophomore RB Jahad Thomas was able to recover a fumbled punt catch by Darius Simms. This set up Austin Jones' field goal to make the score 24-7. Vanderbilt decided to switch up their quarterbacks again, bringing Johnny McCrary into the game. However, his first pass was intercepted by junior DB Tavon Young, who was chosen to wear the cov-

Walker was able to run the ball four yards in for another Temple touchdown. On the next Vanderbilt play, slight movement was made as they were able to make it out to their 34-yard line. But, Young was able to make his second interception. The Owls settle for a Jones field goal on the drive.

Vanderbilt once again hit a sour mark, after the kickoff was fumbled and freshman DB Artrell Foster was able to recover it. However, the Owls were unable to score as Jones was unable to put his kick through the uprights on the first play of the 4th quarter.

The night ended for the Owls with a junior kicker Tyler Mayes field goal, which sealed the deal at 37-7.

Walker went 24-34 with 207 yards of passing and two touchdowns, along with eight carries for 21 yards and another score. Jones was responsible for two field goals and four point-after attempts, racking his numbers up to 10 points.

**Owls Struggle With Triple Option and Drop Home Opener to Navy**

PHILADELPHIA - A little over a week after Temple lit up Vanderbilt Stadium, the team seemed to dim a little in a 31-24 loss to Navy. The defense could not contain Navy QB Kennan Reynolds and the Midshipmen's explosive offense in the Owls home opener, in front of 28,408 fans.

In their 11th meeting, and the last one with Navy as an independent team, the Owls allowed the Midshipmen to rush for 487 yards on 63 carries, while Reynolds was 4-8 for 30 yards and no touchdowns in the air. Reynolds also led Navy in rushing, with 21 carries for 181 yards and two touchdowns.

For the Owls, the game started off strong, as Sharif Finch was able to force a fumble during Navy's first possession and recover the ball in the end zone. That play gave the Owls their second defensive touchdown of the season, which doubles the amount the team had last year. Finch also had another fumble recovery in the second quarter.

On the ground, the Owls were able to rack up 156 yards, with sophomore QB P.J. Walker leading the herd, with 13 carries for 71 yards. Walker also went 29-49 and threw for 240 yards and two touchdowns, including one to Romond Deloatch in the very back of the end zone. Originally, the call was that Deloatch was out of bounds, but a review of the play saw the Owls collect a score.

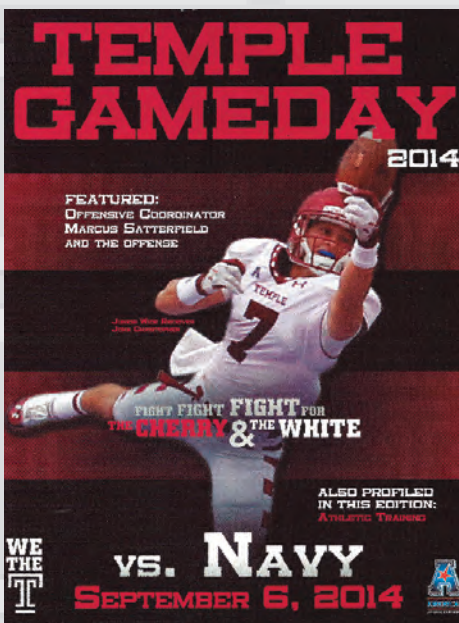
Walker threw his first interception of the season, when his pass was picked off by Parrish Gaines in the end zone less than a minute left in the first. From that turnover, Navy was able to capitalize and score its second touchdown of the game.

Two seniors led the Owls both statistically and emotionally as Temple mounted a comeback after being down 31-14. Kenny Harper led the team with eight receptions for 64 yards, while also picking up 55 yards on 13 carries. Jalen Fitzpatrick caught five passes for 59 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively for the Owls, LB Nate D. Smith led the team with 13 tackles (9 solos), while LB Tyler Matakevich had 11 solo tackles and a forced fumble. However, the struggles were there for Temple, as it allowed 27 first downs, 24 on rushing plays, and didn't force a Navy punt until early in the fourth quarter. Reynolds proved to be the "tremendous player" that head coach Matt Rhule described earlier this week.

To Coach Rhule, stopping Navy's triple option wasn't something that the defense failed to compete with.

"I don't think anyone blew it or missed an assignment. They just blocked those guys. They run a series of plays. If you do something, they have an answer for it. At the end of the day, you have to get off blocks and make plays, and we just didn't make any plays today."



In total, the Midshipmen had 517 offensive yards, which is almost double what Temple allowed in week one at Vanderbilt. Navy also had three fumbles, all of which were recovered by Temple. On their second field goal attempt, Nick Sloan missed wide right from the Temple 26-yard line, which allowed the Owls to try and get down the field to tie the game before the quarter ended.

For the Owls, freshman Alex Starzyk had another set of great numbers, as he had three punts of over 50 yards, with one being for 62 yards. The special teams continued to be consistent, as freshmen Austin Jones made three PATs and one field goal from 28 yards. Last week at Vanderbilt, Starzyk had a 58-yard punt and Jones was the leading scorer with 10 points (two field goals and four

PATs).

Temple went four of five in fourth-down conversions and scored in three of its four trips to the red zone. The team, however, committed six penalties for 56 yards. The Owls only had one fumble, which was committed by OL Brendan McGowan as the Owls attempted to score with laterals with no time left in the game.

Coach Rhule goes into a bye week with his team, wanting to make sure that the team is ready to overcome the losing season they had last year.

"We're beyond the point of it's okay to lose. That was last year. This year, it's about finding ways to win. I don't mind losing to teams that are significantly better than us, and Navy very well might be, but that was not the way we wanted to play. It wasn't crisp, clean or physical enough and our guys knew that."

The series with Navy is now 6-5 in favor of the Midshipmen. Both Navy and Temple are 1-1 on the season.
