**Delaware State Head Coach Keith Walker** (Clemson, '81): 17-19 at DSU (1st year, plus 11 games as interim in 2013-14); 108-121 career (9th year); 0-1 vs. Coppin St; 11-9 MEAC regular season

**Coppin State Head Coach Michael Grant** (Malone, '84): 5-20 at Coppin State (first year); 257-218 career (16th year); 0-0 vs. DSU

**THE GAME**

The Hornets (11-13; 5-4 MEAC) look to continue their recent rise in the MEAC standings against Coppin State. DSU has won its last two games to climb from sixth to fourth in the league race. The Hornets are coming off a thrilling 91-85 road win at UMES on Saturday. Delaware State never trailed in the contest but experienced some tense moments down the stretch. **Kendal Williams** led four Delaware State players in double-figures with a career-high 22 points in the contest, highlighted by four three-point field goals (4-7). Williams also led the Hornets with five assists. **Amere May** added 20 points, including an off-balanced jumper in the lane to give DSU an 89-85 lead with 12 seconds left to play. **Tyshawn Bell** contributed 19 points, including five three-pointers, and **Kendall Gray** 15 to the win. The Hornets are 1/2 game behind third place Howard (7-4) in the MEAC standings. Howard plays at UMES Monday evening.

Coppin State (14-12; 7-4 MEAC) is trying to snap a two-game losing streak. The Eagles are coming off a 77-60 home loss to Howard on Saturday. Howard shot 54.3% from the field (25-for-46), including five-of-nine from three-point territory (55.6%) in the game. **Taariq Cephas** led CSU with 18 points, while **Sterling Smith** added 17 for CSU in the contest. Smith leads the Eagles in scoring at 12.9 points per game, while Cephas is second on the team in scoring (11.9 ppg) and tops in assists with 120 to rank second in the MEAC at 4.8 per game. Arnold Fripp is the team's top rebounder at 5.9 per game. Smith also has a team-high 58 three-point field goals.

**DSU vs. COPPIN STATE SERIES HISTORY (CSU leads 43-27)**

This is the first of two scheduled meetings between the Hornets and Eagles this season. CSU swept two meetings between the teams last year, winning 73-54 at Delaware State and 54-53 on its home court to open up a 43-27 lead in the series. Cephas had 12 points and 10 assists in Coppin's 2013-14 win at DSU. **Kendal Williams** had a team-high 18 points for the Hornets the last time the teams met at Delaware State. Coppin State is currently 10th in the 2014-15 MEAC standings. The Hornets and Eagles are scheduled to meet again in the regular season finale on Mar. 5 at Coppin State in Baltimore, Md.

## DELAWARE STATE 2014-15 MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### HORNETS FIFTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL

Voters in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference 2014-15 men's basketball preseason poll believe Delaware State will be an improved team from a year ago. The Hornets have been picked to finish fifth out of 13 teams in the regular season race. The Hornets collected 194 points in the poll of league head coaches and sports information representatives. Defending MEAC champ North Carolina Central is favored to win its second straight regular season title. The Eagles collected 15 of 26 first place votes and 317 total points. Hampton is a close second to NCCU. The Pirates garnered nine first place votes and 304 points. Morgan State (265 points) and Norfolk State (225) are third and fourth, respectively, in the poll. Delaware State was 9-21 overall and tied for eighth in the final regular season standing with a 5-11 MEAC record during the 2013-14 season. The MEAC also announced its 2014-15 preseason player honors. Delaware State center Kendall Gray (jr.; Dover, Del.) has been selected to the preseason All-MEAC First Team, while guard Kendal Williams (sr.; Stone Mountain, Ga.) was a third team pick. Gray was second in the MEAC in rebounding (7.9 pg), third in field goal percentage (.579) and fourth in blocks (2.7 pg) last season. He ranked third on the Hornets in scoring (11.5 ppg) and set a school record for the second time in his career with 81 blocks. In addition, he led the team with 11 "double-doubles" during the 2013-14 campaign. In three seasons with the Hornets, Gray has 623 points, 420 rebounds and 210 blocks. He needs 13 blocks to become the school's all-time leader. Williams led the Hornets with 84 assists to rank 10th in the MEAC (2.8 pg) in his first year with the Hornets after transferring from Baltimore City Community College. Williams was fourth on the team in scoring and topped the club with a .420 three-point shooting percentage (29-for-69) last season. Howard University sophomore guard James Daniel has been selected as the 2014-15 MEAC Preseason Player-of-the-Year. Gray and Daniels are joined by Hampton's Deron Power (so.), Taariq Cephas of Coppin State (sr.) and North Carolina Central's Jordan Parks (sr.) on the preseason All-MEAC First Team.

## HEAD COACH KEITH WALKER



Keith Walker was officially announced as head coach of the Hornets on Apr. 15, 2014. He served as DSU's interim head coach for 11 games after being appointed to the position on Jan. 30, 2014.

Walker first joined the Delaware State staff as an assistant coach in July 2000.

During his stint as interim coach, Walker led the Hornets to a 5-6 overall record and 5-5 mark in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Confer-

ence. Prior to the appointment, the team was 4-15 overall and 0-6 in the conference.

Delaware State posted a season-high three-game win streak, highlighted by a victory over MEAC Tournament runner-up Morgan State, during Walker's stint as interim head coach.

During the 2013-14 season, Hornet junior center Kendall Gray set a team record with 81 blocks. Gray was named to the 2014 All-MEAC Second Team.

Gray held the previous team record with 75 blocks as a sophomore. The Hornets recorded 185 blocks during the 2012-13 campaign, the second-best single-season mark in team history.

During the 2011-12 season, Walker's work with the Hornet big men was instrumental in the team's school-record 192 blocks, shattering the record previously held by the 1989-90 squad. Delaware State was tops in the MEAC and fifth among all NCAA Division I teams at 6.6 blocks per game during the 2011-12 campaign. In addition, DSU power forward Marques Oliver moved into first place on the team's list for career blocks that season. Oliver finished his career with 222 blocks.

Walker helped lead the Hornets to three consecutive MEAC regular season titles from 2004 to '07, during which the Hornets posted a league record of 46-8 (.850). The Hornets appeared in three consecutive MEAC Tournament championship games, capturing the title and accompanying NCAA Tournament berth in 2005.

The following year, Delaware State defeated Northern Arizona on the road in the National Invitation Tournament for the team's only national post-season win. The Hornets also appeared in the 2007 National Invitation Tournament.

Walker served as head coach at Division II Shaw University in Raleigh, N.C., for seven seasons from 1993 to 2000.

He posted a 91-102 overall record at Shaw, including a 21-9 mark and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth during the 1994-95 season. He led the team to a 17-9 mark in the 1997-98 campaign. The Bears finished in the Top 10 of the Sheridan Broadcast Network Black College poll during two of Walker's seasons.

In 1998, he coached a team of U.S. collegiate players to a bronze medal at a tournament in Russia. From 1987 to '93,

Walker was an assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. IUP was ranked number one in the NCAA Division II poll during parts of three seasons while Walker was on the staff.

Before entering the coaching ranks, he enjoyed a playing career that included a brief stint with the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers during the 1985-86 season. Prior to reaching the NBA, Walker played a total of seven years with various European and U.S. professional basketball leagues.

As a collegiate player at Clemson University, he helped lead the Tigers to a 23-9 overall record and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament during the 1979-80 season. He was a teammate of former NBA All-Star Larry Nance.

Walker earned a 1981 Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Clemson in 1981; and a master's degree in Student Personnel Services from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1991.

Keith and wife Kim have three children, Dockery, Zachary and Sawyer. Dockery is a member of the Brown University men's basketball team.

## GRAY IS NATION'S TOP REBOUNDER

Delaware State center **Kendall Gray** has pulled down 181 rebounds in the last 13 games (13.9 pg) to remain No. 1 among all NCAA Division I players in the category. Gray is tops in the nation in rebounds per game (12.7 pg) and defensive rebounds (9.4 pg), according to the NCAA's Feb. 15 report. He also has two of the top four single-game rebound totals in the country this season. Gray had a career-high 23 rebounds in the Hornets' 60-49 win over South Carolina State on Jan. 17. It is the third-best single game figure in Div. I this season. **Rico Gathers** of Baylor has the top single game total (28), while **Daniel Ochefu** of Villanova had 24 in a game this season. Gray had 22 rebounds vs. Morgan State on Jan. 10, tying for fourth-best in a game this season. He has reached double figures in rebounds in 11 of the last 12 games; and a total of 17 times in his 23 games this season.

Gray is tops in the MEAC in six statistical categories, ranking in the top 15 among all Div. I players in each. He is third in the nation in total rebounds (291), seventh in double-doubles (14), 15th in blocks per game (2.9) and 13th in total blocks (66).

On Jan. 19, Gray earned national recognition for his stellar play. He was selected as the Lou Henson Award National Mid-Major Player-of-the-Week; and Press-Box-to-Press Row HBCU Player of the Week after recording 41 rebounds, 30 points, five blocks and six assists in a 2-0 week for the Hornets.

Gray was also tabbed as the MEAC's Player-of-the-Week AND Defensive Player-of-the-Week for the games.

He has been selected as the MEAC's Defensive Player-of-the-Week a league-high eight times this season, including the last four. Gray also earned the award in each of the first four weeks of the season.

The Dover, Del., native was two blocks away from school history in the Hornets' 72-65 win at Wake Forest on Nov. 28. Gray scored 14 points (6-8 FGs), grabbed 16 rebounds and tied the school record for a third time with eight blocks in the contest, falling just short of the first "triple-double" in recorded team history.

Gray had five blocks at Arkansas on Nov. 21 to surpass **Marques Oliver** (2009-13) as the Hornets' all-time blocks leader. He has since raised his school record total to 268.

He also had a school record-tying eight blocks vs. NCA&T on Jan. 20, 2014; and against Wagner on Nov. 14, 2012. Gray also holds the top two marks for single season blocks in team history. He swatted away 81

shots during the 2013-14, shattering the record of 75 he established the previous year.

Gray has been more than a defensive presence for the Hornets this season. He is second on the team with a career-best 12.1 point per game average. In addition, he's at shooting 56.5% clip, knocking down 95 of his 168 shots from the floor. Gray has reached double-figures in scoring in 14 of his 20 games played this season. He tied his career high with 21 points (9-12 FGs) vs. South Carolina State in the Hornets' last contest. He also scored 21 points (9-14 FGs) in the Hornets' 66-53 win at Delaware on Dec. 7.

The Dover, Del., native was named to the 2014-15 pre-season All-MEAC First Team after finishing second in the league in rebounding (7.9 pg), third in field goal percentage (.579) and fourth in blocks (2.7 pg) last season. He ranked third on the Hornets in scoring (11.5 ppg) and set a school record for the second time in his career with 81 blocks.

In addition, he led the team with 11 "double-doubles" during the 2013-14 campaign. Gray was also a two-time MEAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week as a junior last season.

## DELAWARE STATE 2014-15 MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### BLOCKS APLENTY

Thanks to **Kendall Gray**, DSU has been among the MEAC's best shot blocking team in recent years. The Hornets are No. 3 in the league and 65th among NCAA Div. I teams in blocked shots at 4.6 per game this season. DSU is also third in the MEAC and 64th nationwide with 91 total blocks. Led by Gray, DSU has posted its top two block numbers in the past three years. In Gray's freshman season of 2011-12, the Hornets set a school record with 192 blocks. The following season, DSU collected 185 blocks, the second-highest total in team history.

### HOMEGROWN TALENT

For the second straight season, Delaware is the state with the highest number of players on the Hornets' roster. The 2014-15 roster includes six First State natives. Local products **Tyshawn Bell** (Dover) and **Kendall Gray** (Dover) are in their third season with the team. ### HORNET THREE-POINT THREAT JOINS 1,000-POINT CLUB

Delaware State forward **Tyshawn Bell** (sr.) joined the Hornets' 1000-point club during his team-high 13-point performance against North Carolina Central on Jan. 26. He's now at 1075 career points. Bell continues to solidify his standing as one of the top three-point shooters in team history.

Bell knocked two triples against SC State on Saturday to give him 176 for his career, good for fifth on the Hornets' all-time list. He's second on the team with 50 three-pointers this season.

Bell had a career-high five three-pointers (5-7) vs. Arkansas on Nov. 21; and hit four threes in the previous contest at North Texas (4-5).

He tied his season-high with 19 points in the Arkansas contest, tying his total in the season-opening win at Penn. His career high is 21 points, which he has reached twice.

Bell shared game-high scoring honors with 16 points against Savannah State last Monday.

As a junior in 2013-14, Bell ranked among the MEAC leaders with a .345 three-point percentage (41-for-119); and was second in the league in free throw shooting at 86.2% (75-for-87).

He was also second on the Hornets in scoring with a career-best 12.1 point per-game average last season.

Bell is also on track to join the Hornets' 1000-point club this season. A career 9.1 ppg scorer, he currently sits at 867 points.

Bell was named MEAC Player-of-the-Week last Feb. 17 after scoring 42 points in two games. He was 13-for-20 from the field, including four-of-six from three-point territory, during the stretch. He scored a career-high 21 points in back-to-back games last season. He scored 21 vs. Savannah State on Feb. 10 (7-9 FGs; 2-2 3pt; 5-5 FTs), and followed that with 21

at Bethune-Cookman the next game (6-11 FGs; 7-8 FTs). Bell also tallied 19 points in the previous game (vs. SC State) to give him 61 during the three-game stretch.

As a freshman during the 2011-12 season, Bell was a MEAC All-Rookie selection. He was fifth on the Hornets in scoring (7.2 ppg) and second in three-point field goals (43). Bell ranked fourth in the MEAC in three-point percentage (.387 ... 43-for-111) and knocked down at least one three-pointer in 22 of DSU's 30 contests during his rookie season.

### AMERE MAY COMES FULL CIRCLE WITH HORNETS

**Amere May** stepped into the national spotlight with his career-best 48-point performance in the Hornets' 72-64 victory over St. Francis Brooklyn on Dec. 17, the second highest total in team history. May was 16-for-25 from the field, including six-of-10 from three-point territory; and 10-for-10 at the free throw line. His point total was the most by a Hornet since Tom Davis set the team record with 50 against Brooklyn College on Feb. 1, 1989; and is tops among all NCAA Division I players this season. His 16 field goals in the St. Francis contest

is also a Division I high this season. May's previous DSU high was 32 points in the Hornets' 72-65 win over Wake Forest on Nov. 28. His six three-pointers against St. Francis and Wake Forest marked career highs. The performance against St. Francis helped earn May his second MEAC Player-of-the-Week award this season on Dec. 22. He was named MEAC Player-of-the-Week for the first time in his career on Dec. 1 after scoring 50 points in two games.

As of Feb. 12, May was second in the MEAC (48th nationally) in scoring at 18.3 points per game. He's also fourth in the league in free throw percentage (82.5%) and third in three-point field goals per game (2.3). He has scored at least 20 points in seven games this season, including 24 vs. Florida A&M in DSU's last outing (Feb. 9).

One of the first calls **Keith Walker** received after being named head coach of the Hornets last spring was from May, who left DSU after two seasons from 2011-to-13. May was recruited to Delaware State by Walker when he was a Hornet assistant. The South Haven, Mich., native averaged 5.9 points in 53 games, primarily as a reserve in his first two seasons at DSU. May played the 2013-14 season at Div. II St. Augustine's (N.C.), where he averaged 19.3 points per game; and was named to the All-CIAA First Team. May left St. Augustine's last summer and re-enrolled at Delaware State. He petitioned the NCAA to allow him to compete for the Hornets this season. May was allowed to practice but did not compete in DSU's first three games this season while the petition was being considered.

Walker has a history with the May family. He coached May's father (Amere Sr.) at Shaw University.



## DELAWARE STATE 2014-15 MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

### **K "WILL"**

Delaware State guard **Kendal Williams** (sr.) had a career performance in the Hornets' 78-74 loss to South Carolina State on Jan. 31. Williams scored a career-high 20 points, highlighted by four three-point field goals to tie his career best in the contest. He also led all players with a career-high eight assists without a turnover in the game. Williams was named to the 2014-15 pre-season All-MEAC Third Team. He was among the MEAC leaders in three-point percentage last season, connecting on 29-of-69 attempts (.420). Williams was tops on the Hornets with 84 assists and ranked fourth in scoring at 8.2 points per game. This season, has appeared in all 24 games, starting the last 19. He is fifth on the team in scoring at 7.3 points per game and leads the team with 79 assists.

The former Dover (Del.) High School star was a 2012-13 All-Maryland Junior College First Team and All-Region XX Second Team selection at Baltimore City Community College. He averaged 14.8 points and 4.9 assists (each a team high) during 2012-13 season and helped lead BCCC to 21-10 overall record, a conference title and Region XX Tournament finals last season.

### **FRESHMAN STANDS OUT IN WIN AT HOWARD**

Freshman swingman **Todd Hughes** was honored as the MEAC's Rookie-of-the-Week last Monday after a breakout game in the Hornets' 79-76 win over Howard on Jan. 12. Hughes had a team and career-high 25 points, connecting on nine-of-14 shots from the field, including four-of-five from three-point territory. The four three-pointers also marked a career-high. He scored 12 points in the first half and 13 after the break. His previous career-high was 15 points vs. Baptist Bible in his collegiate debut on Nov. 17, 2014. Hughes is sixth among team regulars in scoring at 4.5 points per game this season. Hughes left the Hornets' 59-50 win over Savannah State on Jan. 19 due to an ankle injury; and missed the next three games. As a high school player, Hughes helped lead Delaware's Sanford School to a state championship. The Smyrna, Del., native was an All-State selection and 1000-point scorer during his scholastic career.

### **HOME COOKING**

DSU's Memorial Hall had been an unfriendly place for Hornet opponents in recent years. The Hornets are a solid 116-46 (.719) at home since the 2000-01 season. DSU is 4-2 at home this season after posting an 8-3 home mark during the 2012-13 campaign. The Hornets were 11-0 in front of the home crowd during the 2002-03 campaign and 9-1 in Memorial Hall during the 2004-05, 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons. The Hornets are 76-22 in Memorial Hall vs. MEAC opponents (.776) since the 2000-01 campaign. The Hornets are 4-2 at home this season.

### **HAYWOOD POSTS CAREER HIGH VS. CHEYNEY**

Sophomore guard **DeAndre Haywood** returned to his early season form with a career-high 25-point performance in the Hornets' 90-68 win over Cheyney on Jan. 5. Haywood was nine-for-11 from the field and three-of-four from three-point territory in the contest. It was his first double-figure scoring game since four straight to start the season. Haywood came out the gate strong in this season. He topped the Hornets in scoring in each of the first three games, including 23 points vs. Penn in the season opener. He was eight-for-16 from the field and seven-of-10 at the free throw line in the Penn contest. He scored five points in the overtime, including two free throws in the closing seconds to seal the win. In addition, Haywood tallied five rebounds, four assists and a game-high four steals in 38 minutes of playing time in the opener. The MEAC thought enough of Haywood's performance at Penn to name him as its first Player-of-the-Week for the 2014-15 season. It also marked the first time he received the honor. Haywood is fourth among Hornet regulars in scoring at 8.0 points per game this season. He is also tops on the team with 21 steals this season. Haywood was named to the 2013-14 MEAC All-Rookie Team after averaging 6.2 points in his debut season. He set career scoring highs in three consecutive games last season, highlighted by a game-high 20 points vs. Florida A&M on Feb. 17, 2014. He was fifth on the Hornets in scoring at 6.2 points per-game last season.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

Delaware State's men's basketball "traveling" party will spend plenty of time packing and unpacking this season. The Hornets are scheduled to log more than 24,600 miles by bus and plane to a total of 13 states and the District of Columbia. The schedule is highlighted by first-time trips to Hawai'i and Oregon. The Hornets played at Hawai'i on Dec. 2; and were back in the air less than three weeks later for a trip to Eugene, Ore., to face the Ducks (Dec. 20). In addition to Hawai'i and Oregon, the Hornets will visit/have visited Texas (North Texas), Arkansas (University of Arkansas), South Carolina (SC State), Rhode Island (URI) and New Jersey (NJIT); and make two trips to Pennsylvania (Penn; Temple), New York (Iona, St. Francis Brooklyn) North Carolina (Wake Forest; NC Central; NCA&T), Maryland (UMES; Coppin State) and Virginia (Hampton; Norfolk State; MEAC Tournament). Delaware State will also visit Howard University in Washington, D.C.; and made the 45-mile trip upstate to take on the University of Delaware this season.

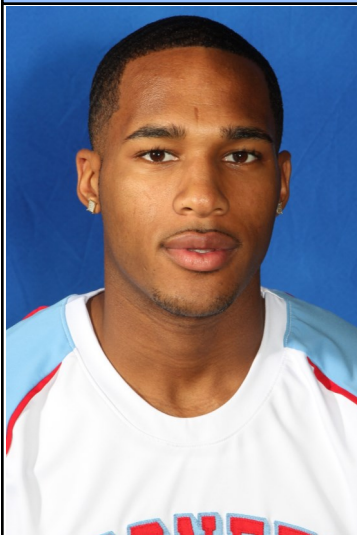
