Kent State welcomes Delaware State for its 2015 home opener Saturday at 6 p.m. The Golden Flashes have won two of their last three games at Dix Stadium, including a 27-24 victory over Akron to close out the 2014 season.

FACTS IN A FLASH

- The Flashes returned their top 11 tacklers from 2014, including junior safety **Nate Holley**, who ranked third in the FBS in tackles per game (12.5).
- Kent State returned the bulk of its offensive line from 2014, which has not allowed more than one sack in its last eight games.
- Junior QB **Colin Reardon** ranks 4th in career completions (429) at Kent State, and sixth in both career passing yards (4,579) and TD passes (26).
- Junior left tackle **Reno Reda** was chosen to wear number 54 this season, to carry on the legacy of former teammate **Jason Bitsko**.
- The Flashes held Illinois to 3-of-13 on third down conversion attempts.

- Redshirt freshman **Rackwon James** made his debut as a kick returner at Illinois, highlighted by a 43-yard return in the first half.
- In his last home game, junior running back **Nick Holley** had a career best two-touchdown game with 95 rushing yards on 14 carries against Akron.
- Senior safety **Jordan Italiano** was tabbed Smartest Player in College Football by NFL.com this summer. The pre-med/biochemistry major carries a 3.979 grade point average.
- Kent State returned six Academic All-MAC selections and five MAC Distinguished Scholar-Athletes.
- Senior **Anthony Melchiori** ranked 12th in the nation in punting average in 2014, helping the Flashes rank 16th in net punting.
- Sophomore cornerback **Demetrius Monday** has an interception in each of his last two games.
- With the Illinois game originally scheduled for Friday night (lightning), the Flashes have had postponements in each of their last two road trips, dating back to Buffalo, last November.

CREDENTIALS

All members of the media wishing to cover games in a working capacity must seek appropriate press or photo/video passes in advance. Requests should be made at least one week in advance of game day on http://kent.sidearmsports.com/sb_output.aspx?form=18. If time permits, credentials will be mailed; otherwise, they will be left at the media will-call window on the west side of Dix Stadium.

Media sideline credentials will be issued only to accredited photographers and reporters on assignment. Both a credential and an armband must be displayed for access to field level. Armbands may be picked up in the media area on the first floor of the press box. Media members may not work between the 25-yard lines as suggested in the NCAA game management manual.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE

Head Coach Paul Haynes will hold a weekly press conference Mondays at 11:15 in the M.A.C. Center loge (3rd Floor), from Sept. 7 - Oct. 26. Select players will also be available at that time. Drinks will be provided.

MAC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE

The Mid-American Conference football coaches will be available for a weekly teleconference each Monday beginning at 9:30 a.m., starting on Aug. 31 and running through December. Kent State head coach **Paul Haynes** will participate in the call from 10:34-10:42 a.m. Contact the Mid-American Conference or the Kent State Athletic Communications Office to obtain the call-in number. A replay will also be available.

All interviews with Kent State players and coaches must be coordinated through the Athletic Communications office. In-person interviews for coaches and players will be conducted after practice on select days only (typically Tuesday & Wednesday). Tuesday and Wednesday practices routinely end between 10:45-11:15 a.m. Coaches and players generally are not available for interviews immediately before or during practice unless special circumstances warrant. In addition, select players will be available at Paul Haynes' weekly Monday press conferences.

Media members should call at least one day in advance for phone interviews, which will be conducted around practice, meetings and class schedules.

Professional scouts may receive credentials by sending a request via e-mail (Imaurer2@kent.edu) to Director of Athletic Communications Lyndsey Maurer. If space permits, seats will be provided in the media area on the first floor of the press box; otherwise scouts will be given seats in the west side stands.

ALL-TIME SERIES

In the only two meetings between the two programs, Kent State defeated Delaware State in back-to-back seasons in 2007 and 2008. Both matchups came in the month of September at Dix Stadium and resulted in convincing wins for the Flashes, 38-7 and 24-3 respectively.

TV/VIDEO/RADIO

Saturday night's game can be seen on ESPN3 with Dave Wilson (play-by-play) and Marcus Ray (analyst). All Kent State games can be heard live on 640 WHLO and Golden Flashes Radio on iHeartRadio.

Ty Linder will handle the play-by-play duties and is joined in the booth for the sixth year in a row by color analyst **Rob Polinsky**. **Matt Miller** is the sideline reporter. iHeartRadio can be heard on a computer, smart phone or tablet.

THE COACHES

• **Paul Haynes** enters his third year at his alma mater with victories in his most recent home game (Akron) and his most recent non-conference game (Army). In 2013, Haynes became the first Flashes' head coach to win his debut since 1988. He was a two-time All-MAC safety at Kent State from 1987-91, despite joining as a walk-on. He returned as an assistant in 1999 and was promoted to assistant head coach in 2000. After seven seasons on an Ohio State staff that won six Big Ten titles (2005-11), Haynes spent 2012 as defensive coordinator at Arkansas. His current tenure has also brought Kent State's academic achievements to new heights with the highest term and cumulative team grade point averages in program history.

• **Kenny Carter** (The Citadel, 90) is in his first season as head coach of the Hornets. Carter most recently served as an assistant coach at Youngstown State in 2014. From 2010 to 2013, he was an assistant coach under Charlie Strong at Louisville, helping the Cardinals to two Big East championships and four bowl appearances. During the 2008 and '09 seasons Carter was running backs coach under Urban Meyer at Florida, including a 2009 BCS National Championship. Florida also competed in the 2010 Sugar Bowl and captured the 2008 SEC championship during his time. Carter has also served as an assistant at Vanderbilt, Penn State, Pitt & LSU

PREVIEWING DELAWARE STATE

• The Hornets returned 64 letterwinners this season, including seven starters on offense and six starters on defense.

• Delaware State dropped its season opener at Liberty, who is No. 15 in the FCS.

• The Hornets' last road victory came on Oct. 11 of last season, a 13-10 overtime win at Norfolk State.

• Delaware State's offensive line is stacked with juniors and seniors, bringing substantial game experience.

• The Hornet defense held Liberty to 188 yards passing.

KEY PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Junior quarterback Esayah Obado threw for 227 yards at Liberty after missing all of last season with an injury.

• Senior running back Jamaal Jackson had 81 yards of offense at Liberty and a rushing touchdown. Last season, he rushed for 493 yards.

• Junior receiver Malik Golson caught seven passes for 74 yards at Liberty. He has 87 career receptions for 866 yards.

• Senior safety Terrick Colston was a Preseason All-MEAC First Team selection. Colston made four interceptions last season with 75 tackles, a blocked punt and two touchdowns.

• Junior defensive end Gabe Sherrod posted 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack at Liberty. The Preseason All-MEAC Third Team selection had five sacks last season.

• Sophomore linebacker Malik Harris led both sides with 12 tackles at Liberty. He earned a MEAC Rookie of the Week honor last season.

GAME CAPTAINS

In a change from previous years, the Flashes did not name captains prior to its season. Each week, game captains will be named, while season captains will be named at the end of the year.

Game one: **Anthony Melchiori**, **Anthony Pruitt**, **Reno Reda** and **Nate Terhune**.

HOME MOMENTUM

Kent State finished the 2014 season with a dramatic 27-24 victory over archrival Akron, denying the Zips of bowl eligibility. With a minute to play in the game on a third-and-goal at the five, **Colin Reardon** found Chris Humphrey in the back of the end zone for the game-winning TD. **Jordan Italiano** sealed the win with an interception at midfield.

GETTING BROKEN IN

Twenty three players made career debuts for the Golden Flashes at Illinois. Freshman lineman **Stefano Millin**, redshirt freshman **Raekwon James** and sophomore defensive lineman **Anthony Johnson** each made their first career start.

COSTLY MISTAKES

The Flashes had touchdowns called back on penalties in each half against the Illini and could not reach the end zone afterward..

All four Kent State turnovers in the first half led to Illinois touchdowns, three of which came on one-play drives.

GAME EXPERIENCE

Last season, 24 Golden Flashes (12 offense, 12 defense) got their first career start. This year, the Flashes bring much more game experience to both sides of the ball.

AGAINST FCS

Kent State has won its last 12 games against FCS opponents, which includes two wins over Delaware State. Most recently, the Flashes downed Liberty 17-10 in the 2013 season opener, the first game of the Paul Haynes era. Each of those wins have come at home since 2001.

RUSHING BATTLE IS KEY...

Since 2012, Kent State is 14-2 when outgaining opponents on the ground. The Flashes are 3-19 when the opposition runs for more yards with two of those wins coming against the run-heavy Army offense in 2012 and 2014.

A NEW BEGINNING

The Flashes began their 2015 preseason camp with an unprecedented eight-day road trip to Xenia, Ohio. The four-hour bus ride began the mission of Head Coach **Paul Haynes** getting his team "comfortable with being uncomfortable."

CRITICAL FIRST HALF

Kent State's loss at Illinois came with what has become a critical component, a halftime deficit. Since the beginning of 2012, Kent State is 15-0 when leading at halftime and 1-20 when trailing at the break.

SMARTEST, TOUGHEST, SMALLEST

Senior defensive lineman **Nate Terhune** was named Toughest Player in College Football by NFL.com in the summer of 2014. In 2013, Terhune shattered his fibula at LSU and returned exactly four weeks later. He didn't take painkillers during rehab, which allowed him to lift weights. One month after returning, Terhune scored on a 61-yard fake punt, hurdling an Ohio defender.

In addition to **Jordan Italiano**'s smartest player recognition in 2015, NFL.com also recognized junior

receiver **Ernest Calhoun** as No. 12 among the smallest players in the nation, making an impact. At 5-6, 151 pounds, Calhoun made 33 catches for 319 receiving yards last season and led the Flashes with 1,033 all-purpose yards.

FREAKISH STRENGTH

Sophomore nose tackle **Jon Cunningham** made Bruce Feldman's (Fox Sports) list of Top 25 Freaks in college football for both his intensity and animation on the sidelines and his freakish strength in the weight room. Despite standing under six foot tall, Cunningham has a wing span of 6-7.25. This summer, he squatted 700 pounds and pulled up a 350-pound hang clean.

• Last year, **Nate Terhune** made the Freaks List, not only for his toughness, but his freakish flexibility, which is by far the best on the team.

LONG AWAITED RETURN

At Illinois, fifth-year senior tight end **Kyle Payton** took the field for the first time since the 2012 season. Payton played in 13 games in 2012, making two starts. A medical condition forced him to watch from the sidelines the next year.

Anthony Pruitt- Senior, OL

Trayion Durham- Senior, RB

Chris Fairchild- Junior, DL

DeVante' Strickland- Senior, LB

- Durham ranks fifth among Kent State's career rushing leader 2,766 yards. He ranks ninth among KSU all-time rushing touchdown leaders with 24.
- Pruitt made four starts at right guard and played in every game in 2013 after making the adjustment from the defensive line.
- Fairchild has played in 23 career games, making six starts at nose tackle in 2013.
- Strickland has played in 34 career games, making six starts at linebacker in 2013. He began his college career as a safety.

STABILITY ON O-LINE

Kent State's offensive line showed evidence of improvement throughout 2014, despite seven different starting five combinations. The current five slated for Saturday have been working together since the beginning of spring practice.

HOME OPENERS

Since 1946, Kent State is 40-28-1 in home openers. The Flashes have won 11 of their last 14 home openers with each victory coming over an FCS opponent. In 2014, Kent State fell to Ohio 17-14 on a last-second field goal. **Paul Haynes**. **Colin Reardon** completed 30-of-41 passes for 264 yards and two touchdowns. **Ernest Calhoun** caught 11 passes. **Nate Holley** made 18 tackles, forced two fumbles and recovered one.

SOLID ON 4TH DOWN

Since last season, the Flashes are 11-of-19 on fourth down attempts. On the other side, the Kent State defense has held opponents to 7-of-15 converted fourth downs since last year.

REARDON AT HOME

Junior quarterback **Colin Reardon**'s best two games of 2014 came at home, including 360-yard, three-touchdown performance against Army. Reardon did not throw more than one interception in each of his six home games in 2014.

SAFETY COMBO

Two of Kent State's most accomplished players are its starting safeties, who combined for 233 tackles in 2014:

Junior **Nate Holley** is one of 42 defensive backs on this year's Jim Thorpe Award Watch List. Holley earned All-MAC First Team honors in 2014. This

offseason he was named one of 10 MAC Players to Watch by the Columbus Touchdown Club and College Sports Madness projected him as the 2015 MAC Defensive Player of the Year. Holley ranked sixth in the nation in solo tackles per game last season (6.8).

Senior **Jordan Italiano** is looking to become the program's first three-time Academic All-American after earning first team honors in 2014. With 195 career tackles, Italiano is Kent State's nominee for the Wuerfell and Campbell Trophies, among other awards. He made interceptions in each of the last two games of 2014, which included a MAC Defensive Player of the Week honor for a 16-tackle performance at Bowling Green.

DELLINGER IN THE MIDDLE

In addition to Holley and Italiano, senior linebacker **Matt Dellinger** has been a regular among the MAC's tackling leaders. Dellinger has piled up 191 tackles in 38 career games.

COACHING ADJUSTMENTS

This past offseason, **Don Treadwell** was promoted from running backs coach to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. The former Miami head coach has been an offensive coordinator at five other Division I programs, most recently Michigan State from 2007-10. Offensive Line Coach **Shawn Clark** was promoted to assistant head coach. **Mark Spencer** was named running backs coach, while **Hank Poteat** was named cornerbacks coach.

POSITION ADJUSTMENTS

Sophomore **Nathan Puthoff** moved from guard to center in the spring, taking over the starting role. Juniors **Elcee Refuge** and **Darius Redmond** switched spots on defense. Refuge moved from the secondary to linebacker, while Redmond moved into Refuge's Apache (Star) position. Senior **Nate Terhune** moved from the interior of the defensive line to the end, while sophomore **James Alexander** moved from linebacker to Leo.

FLIPPING THE FIELD

Four-time Ray Guy Award Watch List member **Anthony Melchiori** joined Nate Holley on the All-MAC First Team in 2014. In last year's opener, Melchiori launched a 71-yard punt to start the season. He had a knack for placing the ball inside the 20 throughout the season with very few touchbacks. Last year's placekicker, Melchiori went 4-for-4 on field goal attempts against Army.

- Redshirt freshman **Shane Hynes** took over place kicking duties this season, while Melchiori does kickoffs for the third straight season. After getting

On Aug. 20, 2014 during a preseason camp morning practice, the Kent State football team received tragic news of the unexpected overnight death of **Jason Bitsko**. The fourth-year junior was slated to be the team's center after starting all 12 games at right tackle in 2013. Bitsko had become a team leader, mentor and friend to many both on and off the field. In his honor, the number 54 will be worn by a select offensive lineman every season beginning with **Reno Reda** this year. Last season, 54 was displayed on one side of every player's helmet throughout the year.

SCALING BACK

In an effort to keep players healthy and fresh, **Paul Haynes** has made noticable cutbacks on full-contact practices and overall practice time this season. However, individual players putting in extra work after practice is at an all-time high.

CLOSE CALLS

Four of the Flashes' losses last season came down to the game's final minutes, beginning with a last second field goal by Ohio.

ACADEMIC MILESTONE

Jordan Italiano, Nick Holley and Nick Cuthbert were all named to the Capital One Academic All-District Team in 2014, marking the first time since 2002 that three Flashes were on the all-district team. The three selections were also the most among all 13 MAC teams last season.

UNDERDOGS ALL SEASON

Kent State was picked to finish seventh of seven East Division teams in both the MAC Media and MAC Coaches preseason polls this summer. The underdog role is nothing new to the Flashes, who have just two winning seasons in the last 27 years. Even during its 11-win regular season of 2012, Kent State was an underdog in victories over Buffalo, Ball State, Army, Rutgers and Bowling Green.

NEW THREATS AT WR

Following the graduation of Kent State's top two pass catchers from 2014, a wide open competition at wide receiver followed this offseason. The most promise in 2014 came from sophomore **Kris White**, who caught four or more passes, four times in his last five games. White made a 58-yard reception at Illinois.

Senior **Connor Arlia** sat out last season due to transfer rules, but had an impressive spring season. Arlia had two catches at Illinois.

Freshman **PJ Simmons** led the Flashes with four catches against the Illini.

FLASHES IN THE NFL

As of the middle of August 2015, nine former Kent State athletes were in NFL training camps, including three with the Pittsburgh Steelers (**Dri Archer, Roosevelt Nix, James Harrison**) and two with the New England Patriots (**Julian Edelman, Josh Kline**). The others include **Casey Pierce** (Lions), **Ish Kitchen** (Browns), **Antonio Gates** (Chargers) and **Brian Winters** (Jets). Archer and Winters gave the Flashes top three round draft picks in back-to-back seasons (2013-14).

• Earlier this summer **Chris Humphrey** participated in rookie minicamp with the Green Bay Packers.

• **Rico Murray** is currently playing for the Hamilton TigerCats of the CFL.

• Edelman played a huge role in the Patriots' Super Bowl victory this past year with nine catches on the world's biggest stage, including what proved to be the game-winning touchdown grab.

VARIETY OF BACKS

Kent State used five different running backs at Illinois. The Flashes not only have position depth, but a wide variety in the types of backs available.

Kent State '93 • Third Season

Paul Haynes enters his second season as head coach at Kent State University and his ninth season affiliated with the program. Haynes was introduced as the Golden Flashes' 21st head football coach on Dec. 18, 2012, 25 years after he walked on to play football at Kent State as a college freshman.

In his first season, Haynes helped produce five All-Mid-American Conference selections, an SI.com All-American (Roosevelt Nix), an Academic All-American (Jordan Italiano) and four Academic All-MAC selections, which tied for the second most in the conference.

In 2013, Haynes became the first Kent State rookie head coach to win a season opener since 1988. He was also the Flashes' first rookie head coach to win a MAC road opener since 1986. At the end of the season, he joined Glen Mason as the only Kent State head coaches to defeat both Miami and Ohio in their first season.

In May of 2014, Dri Archer became just the fifth Kent State player since 1974, to be selected in one of the first three rounds of the NFL Draft.

Following the 2014 season, 10 Golden Flashes earned spots on the Academic All-MAC Team, including Italiano, who was named to the

Academic All-America First Team. Seven of those 10 were named Distinguished Scholar Athletes, tying Kent State for the most selections in the conference. Three Flashes earned all-conference honors, including Casey Pierce, who became just the third player in Kent State history selected to play in the Senior Bowl. Haynes, 46, spent the 2012 season as the defensive coordinator at Arkansas and also served as the secondary coach for the Razorbacks. Haynes joined the Arkansas staff in December 2011, taking over the Razorbacks' defense when it dominated No. 11 Kansas State 29-16 in the AT&T Cotton Bowl.

Haynes spent the previous seven seasons at Ohio State, serving as the co-defensive coordinator and safeties coach in 2011 and as defensive backs coach from 2005-10. He also worked with former Head Coach Darrell

Hazell on Jim Tressel's Ohio State staff from 2005-10.

In Haynes' seven years in Columbus, the Buckeyes compiled a 66-11 record, won six Big Ten titles and played in six consecutive BCS games. Ohio State defensive backs also boasted five first-team All-Americans and 10 first-team All-Big Ten selections in those seasons. Nine of the defensive backs Haynes coached at Ohio State were selected in the 2006-12 NFL Drafts, including first rounders Malcom Jenkins and Donte Whitner. In 2008, Jenkins won the Jim Thorpe Award.

The 2012 season at Arkansas was Haynes' third stint on a John L. Smith coaching staff. He also worked under Smith at Michigan State, from 2003-04, and at Louisville, in 2002 as defensive backs coach.

This is Haynes' second homecoming at Kent State. He spent two seasons as an assistant coach under former Golden Flashes head coach Dean Pees, who is now the defensive coordinator of the Baltimore Ravens. After coaching Kent State's defensive backs in 1999, Haynes was promoted to assistant head coach and safeties coach in 2000. Haynes then moved on to the NFL in 2001, spending one season as the defensive quality control coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Haynes' coaching career also includes stops at Northern Iowa (running backs/secondary, 1997-98), Ferris State (defensive backs, 1995-96), Bowling Green (graduate assistant, 1994) and St. Francis DeSales High School.

FLASHES IN THE COACHING RANKS

Two players from Don James' 1972 squad (he himself a member of the College Football Hall of Fame) have gone on to find great coaching success of their own. Current Alabama head coach **Nick Saban** (defensive back, 1970-73) won a national championship with LSU in 2003 and two more with Alabama in 2009 and 2011, while **Gary Pinkel** (tight end, 1971-73) directed Missouri to a school-record 12 victories in 2007, finishing the season fourth in the final Associated Press poll after being ranked No. 1 earlier in the year. Furthermore, Bob Stoops — who led Oklahoma to the 2000 national title — got his full-time coaching start as an assistant at Kent State in 1988. In addition to recent College Football Hall of Fame inductee **Lou Holtz**, the list also includes former head coach **Glen Mason** (1986-87), who went on to find success at Minnesota, and **Dean Pees** (head coach, 1998-03) and **Dom Capers** (graduate assistant, 1972-74) who are currently defensive coordinators with the Baltimore Ravens and Green Bay Packers respectively.

MAC BOWL SPOTS

This season, the MAC will have a minimum five guaranteed bowl opportunities. The Boca Raton Bowl, the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl and the Camellia Bowl, all began in 2014 join the GoDaddy Bowl and Famous Idaho Potato as primary partners with the MAC.

The conference will compete in the Miami Beach Bowl in the 2016 and 2018 seasons. The MAC will also be a primary partner in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl in 2017 and 2019 and a secondary partner in 2015-16 and 2018.

In 2012, a record seven MAC teams earned spots in bowl games.

LOOKING AHEAD

In 2016, the Golden Flashes will begin the season with a trip to Penn State. Kent State will then host FCS teams in back-to-back weekends against North Carolina A&T and Monmouth. KSU closes out non-conference play at Alabama. The Flashes are expected to make a return trip to Penn State in 2018. Kent State will visit Marshall and Clemson in 2017 and head back to Illinois in 2018.

UP NEXT

Kent State makes its second trip to a Big Ten opponent in the month of September at Minnesota. The Golden Flashes will be making their first program trip to the state of Minnesota on Sept. 19. The Golden Gophers are the only Big Ten team to have played at Dix Stadium (2006).
