Delaware State Head Coach Keith Walker (Clemson, '81): 30-46 at DSU (2nd year, plus 11 games as interim in 2013-14); 121-148 career (10th year); 2-2 vs. Hampton; 19-21 in MEAC regular season
Hampton Head Coach Edward "Buck" Joyner (Johnson C. Smith, '95): 116-105 at Hampton and career (seventh year) ; 7-6 vs. DSU

THE GAME

Delaware State (7-22; 5-9 MEAC) wraps up its 2015-16 road schedule against defending MEAC champ and current league leader Hampton. The Hornets have lost their last two games after winning the previous three. DSU fell to UMES 74-65 in its last outing this past Saturday. The Hornets trailed by 17 points in the first half, but pulled to within three midway through the second half before falling short. Freshman guard **Devin Morgan** was high scorer for DSU with 20 points, tying for game-high honors. He has 51 points in the last two games. Morgan was six-for-nine from the field, including four-of-seven on three-point shots. **DeAndre Haywood** was the only other Delaware State player in double figures with 16 points in the game. Morgan is the Hornets' leader in scoring (12.1 ppg), rebounding (3.2 pg), assists (76) and three-point field goals (62). Haywood is second on the team with an 11.3 points per game.

The first place Pirates (8-21; 5-9 MEAC) have won four straight and six of their last seven games. Hampton is coming off a 68-67 victory over Howard on Saturday. Dionte Adams hit a lay-up and free throw with four seconds left for the game-winning points. Reginald Johnson led three Hampton players with 18 points, while Lawrence Cooks added 14 and Adams 12. Quinton Chievous had a team-high 11 rebounds in the contest, giving him 30 in the last two games. Johnson is tops on the team and second in the MEAC in scoring at 18.7 points per game, while Chievous is fourth in the league in scoring at 16.8 points per game. Chievous is also the MEAC's leading rebounder at 11.1 rebounds per game. The Pirates lead the conference in rebounds per game (42.1) and rebound margin (+4.2 pg).

HORNETS vs. Pirates (DSU leads 27-25)

The Hornets and Pirates are meeting for the second time in a week. Hampton won this season's first contest 82-72 in DSU's Memorial Hall on Feb. 22. The Hornets cut a 20-point second half deficit to five before running out of gas in the contest. The loss overshadowed a career performance by DSU freshman guard **Devin Morgan**, who led all players with 31 points, a single-game high for the Hornets this season. Morgan was 10-for-19 from the field, including five-of-nine from three-point territory, and perfect on six free throws. Hampton's Quinton Chievous recorded a double-double, tallying 21 points (7-13 FGs) and topping all players with 19 rebounds. Reginald Johnson added 16 points, while Brian Darden contributed 11 and Dionte Adams 10 for the Pirates. Hampton has won the last two meetings between the teams, including an 82-61 victory in the 2015 MEAC Tournament championship game. The last time the teams met at Hampton, Delaware State pulled out a 74-71 win during the 2014-15 regular season.

DELAWARE STATE 2015-16 MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

HORNETS NINTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL

After reaching the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference championship game last season, the Delaware State men's basketball team has been given long odds in the league's 2015-16 regular season race.

The Hornets have been picked to finish ninth in the 13-team MEAC this season, according to a poll of league head coaches and sports information representatives.

Delaware State was sixth in the final 2014-15 MEAC regular season standings with a 9-7 record. The Hornets won three straight MEAC Tournament contests before falling to Hampton in the championship game.

North Carolina Central is the voters' choice to capture its third straight MEAC regular season title. The Eagles were 16-0 in last year's race and the No. 1 MEAC Tournament seed, but lost to the Hornets in the tourney semifinals.



Defending MEAC Tournament champ Hampton has been picked to finish second in this year's regular season race, while Norfolk State, Maryland-Eastern Shore and Howard round out the top five.

"Given the talent we graduated from last year's squad, I'm not surprised about our standing in the poll," said Delaware State head coach Keith Waller. "I believe we have a young and talented team that is capable of doing big things this season. Preseason polls are good for conversation, but the games are won on the court; and I believe we will surprise some people in the conference this season."

The Hornets must replace five seniors that helped lead the 2015 MEAC championship game run, including three of the school's all-time greats. The departures include center Kendall Gray, the 2014-15 MEAC Player-of-the-Year and Defensive Player-of-the-Year; guard Amere May, the MEAC's top scorer last season; and sharp-shooting forward Tyshawn Bell, the school's third all-time leading three-point marksman.

Other departures include guards Kendal Williams and Charles Burley. Williams averaged 8.5 points and dished out a team-high 93 assists, while Burley was second on the squad with 88 helpers.

Gray, the Hornets' all-time leading shot blocker with 305, became the second player in MEAC history to capture player-of-the-year and top defender honors. May averaged a league-high 21.0 points per game last season, highlighted by 48 points vs. St. Francis Brooklyn, the top scoring contest in Div. I during the 2014-15 season.

Bell tallied 204 three-point field goals in his four seasons with the Hornets. The MEAC also announced its Preseason Player-of-the-Year and all-conference teams.

Redshirt senior guard Jeff Short of Norfolk State has been selected as the league's Preseason Player-of-the-Year. Short is joined on the first team by guard James Daniel of Howard (jr.), Hampton swingman Quinton Chievous (gr.), forward Bruce Beckford of North Carolina A&T (sr.) and UMES center Dominique Elliott (sr.).

No Delaware State player was selected to the MEAC's preseason first, second or third team.

HORNETS IN THE MEAC

Delaware State has enjoyed its share of success in league play since the 2000-01 season. The Hornets own a 164-103 mark vs. MEAC competition during the span (.614). DSU has reached double figures in MEAC wins 10 times since 2000-01 season. Delaware State claimed three consecutive MEAC regular season titles from 2004-07. During that span, the Hornets were 46-8 in league games. Delaware State captured its only MEAC Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 2005. The Hornets have competed in six MEAC Tournament championship games, including the 2015 title contest last March.

HEAD COACH KEITH WALKER



Keith Walker was officially introduced as head coach of the Hornets on Apr. 15, 2014. He served as DSU's interim head coach for 11 games after being appointed to the position on Jan. 30, 2014.

In his first full season as head coach of the Hornets during the 2014-15 campaign, he led the team to its first MEAC championship game and post-season appearance since 2007.

The Hornets defeated Savannah State, Howard and top seed North Carolina Central to advance to the 2015 MEAC

title game. NC Central was undefeated during the 2014-15 MEAC regular season.

Delaware State was invited to compete in the 2015 College Basketball Invitational (CBI) and serve as host of a first round game, marking the first post-season home game in team history.

Among the other highlights of Walker's first full season as head coach of the Hornets was 72-65 win at Wake Forest, Delaware State's first-ever victory against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent.

The Hornets also posted impressive road wins at Penn in the historic Palestra (77-75) and Delaware (66-53) during the 2014-15 season.

Walker is also credited with aiding the development of center Kendall Gray, who became the second player in league history to earn MEAC Player-of-the-Year and Defensive Player-of-the-Year in the same season (2014-15). Last season, Gray also became the first player in recorded NCAA Div. I history to reach 30 points (33) and grab 30 rebounds in a game (Mar. 5, 2015 vs. Coppin State). Also during the 2014-15 season, Amere May became the first Delaware State player to lead the MEAC in scoring in more than 20 years.

Walker first joined the Delaware State staff as an assistant coach in July 2000.

During his stint as the interim coach, Walker led the Hornets to a 5-6 overall record and 5-5 mark in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Prior to the appointment, the team was 4-15 overall and 0-6 in the conference.

Delaware State posted a season-high three-game win streak, highlighted by a victory over MEAC Tournament runner-up Morgan State, during Walker's stint as interim head coach.

During the 2013-14 season, Hornet junior center Kendall Gray set a team record with 81 blocks. Gray was named to the 2014 All-MEAC Second Team.

Gray held the previous team record with 75 blocks as a sophomore the previous year. The Hornets recorded 185 blocks during the 2012-13 campaign, the second-best single-season mark in team history.

During the 2011-12 season, Walker's work with the Hornet big men was instrumental in the team's school-record 192 blocks, shattering the record previously held by the 1989-90 squad. Delaware State was tops in the MEAC and fifth among all NCAA Division I teams at 6.6 blocks per game during the 2011-12 campaign. In addition, DSU power forward Marques Oliver moved into first place on the team's list for career blocks that season. Oliver finished his career with 222 blocks.

Walker helped lead the Hornets to three consecutive MEAC regular season titles from 2004 to '07, during which the Hornets posted a league record of 46-8 (.850). The Hornets appeared in three consecutive MEAC Tournament championship games, capturing the title and accompanying NCAA Tournament berth in 2005. The following year, Delaware State defeated Northern Arizona on the road in the National Invitation Tournament for the team's only national post-season win. The Hornets also appeared in the 2007 National Invitation Tournament.

Walker served as head coach at Division II Shaw University in Raleigh, N.C., for seven seasons from 1993 to 2000. He posted a 91-102 overall record at Shaw, including a 21-9 mark and the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth during the 1994-95 season. He led the team to a 17-9 mark in the 1997-98 campaign. The Bears finished in the Top 10 of the Sheridan Broadcast Network Black College poll during two of Walker's seasons.

In 1998, he coached a team of U.S. collegiate players to a bronze medal at a tournament in Russia. From 1987 to '93, Walker was an assistant coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. IUP was ranked number one in the NCAA Division II poll during parts of three seasons while Walker was on the staff.

Before entering the coaching ranks, he enjoyed a playing career that included a brief stint with the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers during the 1985-86 season. Prior to reaching the NBA, Walker played a total of seven years with various European and U.S. professional basketball leagues.

As a collegiate player at Clemson University, he helped lead the Tigers to a 23-9 overall record and an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA Tournament during the 1979-80 season.

Walker earned a 1981 Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Clemson in 1981; and a master's degree in Student Personnel Services from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1991.

Keith and wife Kim have three children, Dockery, Zachary and Sawyer. Dockery was a four-year basketball letterwinner at Brown University.

HORNET GUARD DEVIN MORGAN AMONG MEAC's TOP NEWCOMERS

Delaware State freshman guard **Devin Morgan** is making a strong case for MEAC top rookie honor this season. Morgan earned his fourth MEAC Rookie-of-the-Week award of the season last Monday, tops among all league rookies. The Chester, Va., native scored a career-high 31 points in the Hornets' 82-72 loss to Hampton last Monday. He was 10-for-19 from the field, including five-of-nine from three-point territory, and perfect on six free throws. His previous high was 27 vs. Morgan State on Jan. 9. Morgan has DSU's tops two scoring games this season.



He is tops on the Hornets and 24th in the MEAC in scoring at 11.8 ppg. He also leads the team in rebounding (3.3 pg), assists (75) and three-point field goals (58). He has reached double figures in scoring in 17 games this season and has at least one three-pointer in the last 24 games and in 26 of his 27 contests this season

A four-year varsity letterwinner at Matoaca High School in Virginia, Morgan was Conference 12 Player-of-the-Year and First Team All-Region and All-Metro selection after averaging 29.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists per game as a senior. He was also an All-VHSL 5A Second Team selection during senior season and the No. 2 all-time scorer in school history.

HORNETS IN MEMORIAL HALL

DSU's Memorial Hall has not always been the friendliest place for Hornet opponents. Since the 2000-01 season, the Hornets are 120-55 in Memorial Hall (.686), including a 97-40 mark vs. MEAC opponents (.711). The Hornets were 11-0 in front of the home crowd during the 2002-03 campaign and 9-1 in Memorial Hall during the 2004-05, 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons. DSU has been average at home in recent years, going just 18-20 overall in Memorial Hall, including 14-9 in conference games since the 2013-14 campaign. The Hornets are 6-6 at home this season.

DICKERSON FROM DOWN TOWN

Delaware State senior forward **Aric Dickerson** has risen to the top of the MEAC for three-point shooting accuracy. Dickerson is shooting a league-best .443 from three-point territory, knocking down 31 of 70 attempts this season. He has been particularly deadly from long distance of late, hitting 20 of his 36 three-point tries over the last seven games (.556). Dickerson has four three-pointers in two games and three triples in six contests this season. For the season, he is sixth on the Hornets in scoring at 4.8 points per game, and is third on the team with 31 three-point field goals. Dickerson has reached double-figures in scoring in five games, including a career-high 17 points in the Hornets' 93-44 victory over Summit on Jan. 4.

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

Delaware State faces the challenge of replacing five seniors that helped lead the Hornets to the 2015 MEAC championship game, including three of the school's all-time greats. The departures include center Kendall Gray, the 2014-15 MEAC Player-of-the-Year and Defensive Player-of-the-Year; guard Amere May, the MEAC's top scorer last season; and sharp-shooting forward Tyshawn Bell, the school's third all-time leading three-point marksman.

Other departures include guards Kendal Williams and Charles Burley. Williams averaged 8.5 points and dished out a team-high 93 assists, while Burley was second on the squad with 88 helpers.

Gray, the Hornets' all-time leading shot blocker with 305, became the second player in MEAC history to capture player-of-the-year and top defender honors.

May averaged a league-high 21.0 points per game last season, highlighted by 48 points vs. St. Francis Brooklyn, the top scoring contest in Div. I during the 2014-15 season.

Bell tallied 204 three-point field goals in his four seasons with the Hornets.

Gray (Detroit Pistons) and May (Chicago Bulls) competed in the 2015 National Basketball Association Summer League. Gray (Germany), Bell (Germany) and Williams (Georgia) are currently playing professionally in Europe.

NEW ERA BEGINS FOR HORNETS

The Hornets' 2015-16 newcomers include a state high player-of-the-year, another who was player-of-the-year in his conference and three junior college transfers.

Local product **DeVaughn Mallory** (fr.; Dover, Del./Polytech HS) was the state's Gatorade Boy's Basketball Player-of-the-Year after averaging 19 points and 11 rebounds per game, while shooting 54 percent from the field to help lead Polytech to the state championship game as a senior forward last season.

Freshman guard **Devin Morgan** (Chester, Va.) was the Conference 12 (Va.) Player-of-the-Year after averaging 29.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 6.0 assists per game as a senior at Matoaca HS last season.

Dana Raysor (so.; Willingboro), **Malik Carter** (so.; Phila., Pa.) and **Joseph Lewis** (jr.; Detroit, Mich.) join the Hornets from the junior college ranks.

Raysor attended San Jacinton JC in Texas, while Carter and Lewis were teammates at New Mexico JC last year.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

The 2015-16 Hornets have a distinct international flavor. It marks the first time recent memory that DSU's roster included three players born outside the United States.

Center **Demola Onifade** (fr.), born in Lagos, Nigeria, joined the team this season. Onifade came to America at age 16, and attended Camden Catholic HS in N.J.

Mrdjan Gasevic, born in Serbia is in his third season with the Hornets. Gasevic resided in Texas before joining the Hornets prior to the 2013-14 season.

Russia-born **Artem Tavakalyan** is in second year at Delaware State. He joined the Hornets before the 2015-16 season after attending the Florida Air Academy.

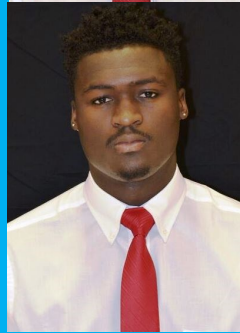
