Pirate Basketball Timeline

A QUICK RUN THROUGH THE HISTORY BOOKS

1931

After 22 years of existence as a college, basketball is established as the first intercollegiate sport at East Carolina. The first game is played Dec. 15 against Greenville All-Stars and won by ECU, 23-17. This is the first game of a 20-game schedule, which produces a 10-10 record.

1934

G.L. Mathis is hired as the first paid basketball coach and the nickname "Pirates" was adopted. Mathis coaches the team for two years, and post an 18-17 record.

1937

East Carolina scores over 100 points for the first time on Jan. 15, beating the Washington All-Stars 103-18. Two officials were also used during home games for the first time.

1943

Due to the United States' entrance into World War II, the remainder of the 1942-43 season and the 1943-44 season is cancelled.

1946

Howard Porter is hired as an assistant coach, making him the first assistant coach in East Carolina history.

1947

East Carolina is accepted into the North State Conference, marking its first conference affiliation. The Pirates post a mark of 6-4 during its first season in the league.

1949

Sonny Russell is named All-North State Conference, becoming the first all-conference player in school history. Louis Collie and Todd Fennel are given the first basketball scholarships at ECU.

1952

East Carolina plays in its first postseason game in the N.A.I.B District Tournament, defeating High Point before losing to Elon.

1953

The Pirates defeat Elon, 72-56, to win the NAIA District 26 Tournament and advance to the NAIA National Tournament.

1954

The 1953-54 season marks the best season in school history with 23-2 record. The Pirates win the North State Conference regular season and tournament championship and its second consecutive NAIA District Tournament championship.

- Bobby Hodges ends his career in 1954 with 2,108 points, establishing him at that time, as the all-time leading scorer in North Carolina.
- The Pirates win a school record 16 consecutive games during that season.

1956

East Carolina had its 50-game home winning streak snapped by Lenoir-Rhyne in the fifth game of the season. The streak began on Jan. 5, 1953 with a win over Appalachian State.

1964

East Carolina is admitted into the Southern Conference, but wasn't eligible for competition until the following year.

1965

The Pirates post a record of 5-7 and finish in fifth place during their first season in the Southern Conference during the 1965-66 campaign.

1966

Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a scholarship at East Carolina. Colbert averages over 14 points per game from 1966-68.

1967

Minges Coliseum opens on the East Carolina campus. The Pirates compile a record of 7-5 during their first season in the facility. The coliseum is officially dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968.

1968

East Carolina defeats Atlantic Christian, 126-111, on December 7 to set school records for points in a game and most combined points scored by two teams.

1972

East Carolina win its only Southern Conference Tournament by defeating Furman in the championship game, 77-75. The Pirates make their first trip to the NCAA Tournament and lose to Villanova in the first round.

1975

ECU posts its best-ever Southern Conference record going 11-3 and finished in second place. ECU is upset in the second round of the tournament, but received an invitation to play in the Collegiate Commissioners Tournament. ECU loses to Arizona in the first round.

1978

Oliver Mack finishes fourth in the nation in scoring with a 28.0 points per game average. Finishing ahead of him were Freeman Williams of Portland State, Larry Bird of Indiana State and Purvis Short of Jackson State.

1981

ECU joins the Eastern College Athletic Conference and competes in the ECAC-South Division. The seven members of the South Division will eventually form their own conference in 1985, the Colonial Athletic Association.

1985

East Carolina becomes a charter member of the eight team Colonial Athletic Association. The Pirates post a record of 6-8 during the first year of CAA play and finish tied for fourth.

1989

Theodore "Blue" Edwards becomes the only Pirate to win CAA Player of the Year honors. He is also the first Pirate to be selected in the NBA Draft. Edwards was taken by the Utah Jazz with the 21st overall pick.

1991

Wake Forest graduate and former ECU assistant coach Eddie Payne is named the Pirates' 18th head coach. His first team goes just 10-18, but the foundation is laid for a remarkable run two years later.

1993

Despite finishing in seventh place in the CAA, ECU rode a string of upsets through the CAA Tournament to win its lone conference tournament championship. ECU defeats James Madison in the championship game to advance to its second NCAA Tournament. The Pirates lose to eventual national champion North Carolina in the opening round.

1995

Taking over for the departed Eddie Payne, new head coach Joe Dooley wins 17 games, second most ever at ECU by a first-year head coach. Dooley wins 17 games each of his first two seasons.

1999

Faced with the daunting task of rebuilding the ECU program from the ground up, Bill Herrion is named the school's 20th head coach. ECU also changes conferences for the fifth time as the announcement is made that the Pirates would become a member of Conference USA in 2001-02.

2002

East Carolina competes in Conference USA for the first time as compiles a 5-11 mark. ECU also records its first-ever win over a top 10 team. ECU shocks No. 9 Marquette at home on February 26, 51-46.

1972 Southern Conference Champions

Physical interior play, aggressive rebounding, balanced point production and a solid bench all played a part in East Carolina's only Southern Conference championship and first NCAA Tournament berth in 1972.

After upsetting regular season champion Davidson in the semifinals, the Pirates' dreams of going to the NCAA Tournament were nearly derailed, twice, by the Furman Paladins in the championship game.

If Jim Fairley hadn't scooped up Ernie Pope's missed jumper and laid it in to tie the game as time expired, ECU wouldn't have won.

The two teams then battled through four overtime ties, before the Paladins took a one-point lead, 75-74, with eight seconds left.

With no time-outs remaining, ECU's Al Faber grabbed the rebound off a missed free throw and cut loose a desperation 40-footer that wasn't even close.

Fortunately for the Pirates, reserve guard Nicky White was standing underneath the bas-

ket, grabbed the rebound and banged home the winning bucket as the horn sounded.

The Pirates had lost to Davidson in the championship game two years prior.

Earl Quash wound up as the leading scorer for East Carolina in the finals scoring 18 points, including 13 in the final 14 minutes of play. Fairley added 13 points, while Faber and Pope had 12 each.

East Carolina would've been eliminated from the tournament in the semifinals if it hadn't been for the efforts of Fairley.

Fairley, who scored 56 points in three games, scored 26 points in the semis to lead the Pirates into the title contest.

ECU rallied from a seven-point second half deficit to best the regular season champion Wildcats. Two free throws by Dave Franklin and another by Quash in the final 18 seconds lifted the Pirates to a four-point victory, 81-77.

Thanks to Franklin's 20-point perfor-

mance in the quarterfinals, ECU was able to dispose of a pesky Citadel squad.

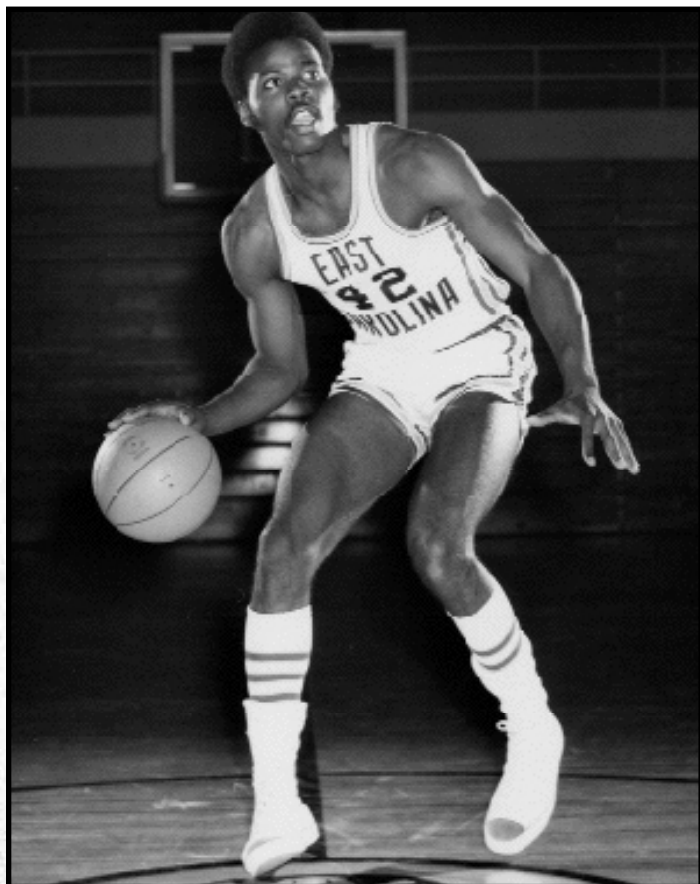
After trailing by as many as nine in the first half and five at intermission, the Pirates looked Franklin in the second half.

He made ECU's first four shots after intermission to reclaim the lead at 38-37. They never trailed after that point.

Leading by as many as 13 in the second half, ECU watched its lead diminish to three with 43 seconds left. Pope, however, hit two free throws with 29 seconds remaining to run the Pirates out to a five-point lead. ECU then got a pair of steals for buckets in the final second to dart out the final nine-point margin.

Franklin collected 39 points during the three-day run; Pope 37; Jerome Owens 36; Quash 32; and Faber 21 as no one man was forced to carry the burden.

Fairley and Pope were named first-team all-tournament, while Franklin earned second team honors.

1993 CAA Champions

The semifinal round pitted a pair of Cinderella teams, as ECU faced sixth-seeded UNC Wilmington, who upset Richmond the night before. The Pirates played one of its best defensive games of the season as they held the Seahawks to 31.6 percent shooting from the field and held on for a 55-50 win after leading by as many as 19 in the second half. Lester Lyons tallied 18 points in the game, the only Pirate to reach double figures.

As expected, the upstart Pirates faced top-seeded James Madison in the championship game. Coach Lefty Driesell led the Dukes to a 19-7 overall record during the regular season and a first place finish in the CAA for the fourth consecutive year.

A relaxed and confident group

of Pirates set the tempo and forced JMU to play their way, ran their motion offense patiently and led by as many as six on two occasions during the second half. East Carolina trailed by one with 5:56 remaining, but outscored the Dukes, 12-8 during the final minutes to claim a 54-49 victory.

Lyons, the tournament's Most Valuable Player, scored 14 points in the win, while Curley Young poured in a team-high 15 points. Lyons was joined by one of his teammates, Copeland, on the all-tournament team.

With ECU leading by three in the final 20 seconds, JMU attempted a three-point field goal that rattled in and out, and bounced into the hands of Copeland. A 58 percent free-throw shooter, Copeland scored his only two points of the game with

14.3 seconds left as he swished a pair of free throws to seal the victory.

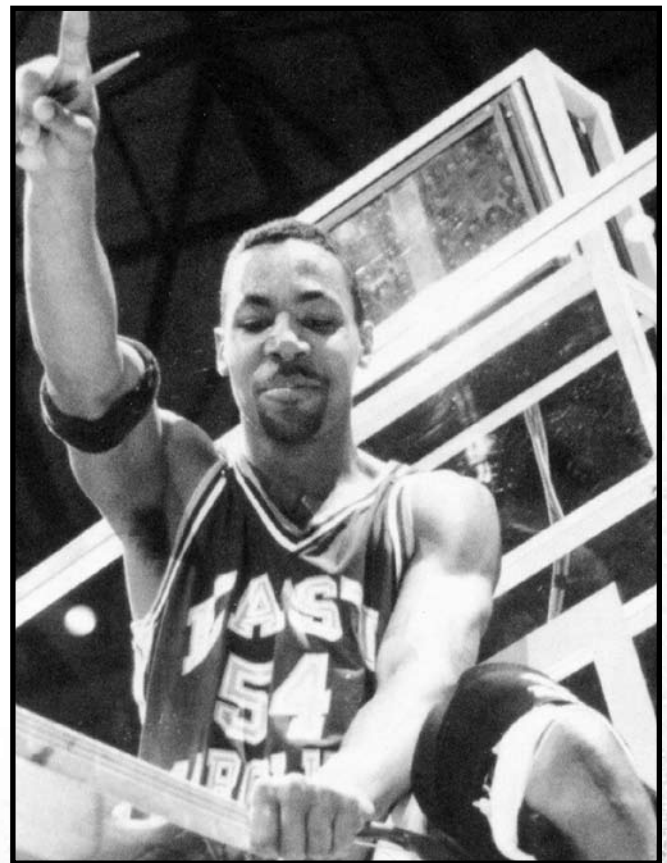
"You can't explain it," said Pirate head coach Eddie Payne. "It's a supernatural thing. I didn't think about winning the tournament when we got here. I just pointed out that we've been playing good basketball of late. You can't win without winning the first game."

"It's a dream come true," said Copeland. "I always thought we had a chance."

The Pirates earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and a date with the East Region's No. 1 seed and eventual national champion, North Carolina.

The Pirates fell, 85-65, but drew the respect of many college basketball observers. During the NCAA Championship Game, CBS color commentator Billy Packer noted that he had seen no one play better against North Carolina's trapping defense than ECU during the NCAA Tournament.

The Colonial Athletic Association was in its eighth year of existence and East Carolina was still searching for its first CAA title. And with the Pirates entering the 1993 CAA Tournament in Richmond as the No. 7 seed with a 10-16 record, there was little reason to expect ECU would win its first.

But thanks to the play of a pair of sharp shooting guards, a vibrant senior and a championship hungry coach, East Carolina captured its lone CAA championship and advanced to the its second NCAA Tournament in school history.

The Pirates ended the regular season losing two of its final three games, including a 73-60 loss at home to Old Dominion, the tournament's No. 2 seed and ECU's first round opponent. The Monarchs won both regular season meetings between the two by an average of 16.5 points. ECU reversed its fortunes during the third meeting of the year, 73-67, behind the outstanding play of senior Ike Copeland.

Copeland scored a career-high 24 points, hitting on near perfect 9-of-10 shooting from the field. He also connected on 6-of-6 free throws, and grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds. Anton Gil contributed 14 points as the Pirates outscored the Monarchs, 8-2 over the final 3:47.



Memorable Pirate Victories

HIGHLIGHTS OF FIVE UNFORGETTABLE WINS IN ECU BASKETBALL HISTORY

December 30, 2002 · East Carolina vs. Marquette

Derrick Wiley made a pair of free throws to break a tie with 32 seconds left as East Carolina beat Marquette 73-70, upsetting the ninth-ranked Golden Eagles for the second game in a row in Greenville. After Dwayne Wade missed a short jumper from the right wing with about 10 seconds left, Moussa Badiane increased the margin to three on a free throw with 9.5 seconds left. Marquette had a chance to tie it, but Steve Novak and Wade missed 3-point shots in the final seconds. It marked the first time in school history that the Pirates defeated a team that eventually reached the final four.

February 26, 2002 · East Carolina vs. Marquette

After over 35 years as a Division I institution, East Carolina recorded its first-ever victory over a top 10 team, defeating No. 9 Marquette, 51-46, at home. ECU held the Golden Eagles to six points over the final 12:30. East Carolina never led and fell behind by 12 points with 12:37 to go before going on an 11-0 run to throw a scare into Marquette. Travis Holcomb-Faye hit a 3-pointer and then a runner on the baseline with 4:29 left to tie it at 44-44 to set the stage for the final few tense minutes. Moussa Badiane made a layup and his block of a shot in the lane led to a fastbreak hoop by Kenyatta Brown and the Pirates went up by four. Marquette closed to 48-46 with 36 seconds left, but Holcomb-Faye hit a free throw and Badiane pulled down a key rebound after Scott Merritt missed the front end of a 1-and-1 to set up a dunk by Brown to seal it.

January 16, 2002 · East Carolina vs. Louisville

In its first year in Conference USA, it didn't take the Pirates long to get noticed. ECU shocked tradition-rich Louisville, 87-77, in Rick Pitino's first season at UofL. Travis Holcomb-Faye had 20 points to lead four Pirates in double figures, which played in front of the largest crowd in school history at the time (8,051). Leading 43-38 at halftime, the Pirates shot 52.4 percent and hit 19 of 28 free throws in the second half. Louisville made it to the line only four times in the half and shot 35.7 percent. The Pirates also hit eight of 14 shots from 3-point range. The first half featured nine ties and 10 lead changes.



East Carolina defeated 9th-ranked Marquette twice in a span of 10 months at home in 2002.

The Pirates, however, inched into the lead late in the first half. Brandon Hawkins was 4-for-4 from 3-point range in the period.

March 8, 1993 · East Carolina vs. James Madison

Seeded seventh in the 1993 Colonial Athletic Association Tournament, East Carolina knocked off second-seeded Old Dominion in the opening round, sixth-seeded UNC Wilmington in the semifinals and top-seeded James Madison, led by Coach Charles "left" Driesell, in the title game to earn its first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1972, 54-49. ECU trailed by one with 5:56 remaining in the championship game, but ended the game by outscoring the Dukes, 12-8. With ECU up by three with 14 seconds left, senior Ike Copeland, a 58-percent free throw shooter, calmly sank two free throws, his only points of the game, to seal the win.

March 3, 1972 · East Carolina vs. Davidson

Two free throws by Dave Franklin with 18 seconds left boosted ECU into a three-point lead and another by Earl Quash with two seconds left gave the fourth-seeded Pirates an 81-77 win over regular season champion Davidson in the semifinals of the 1972 Southern Conference Tournament. Despite trailing by as many as seven early in the second half, ECU knocked down an amazing 73 percent of its shots after intermission. Jim Fairley's jumper with 9:06 to play gave ECU a 56-55 lead and never trailed again. Fairley led the Pirates with 26 points to advance to the finals. ECU then defeated Furman in overtime the following night, 77-75, to earn its first-ever trip to the NCAA Tournament. Oddly enough, the coach of that Davidson team was Terry Holland, the Pirates' current Athletics Director.
