POINTS OF INTEREST

► East Carolina takes to the court Tuesday, Nov. 22, against Florida A&M in its second game of the inaugural Savannah Invitational. The Pirates defeated Stetson, 73-50, on Sunday in its opening contest, while Florida A&M lost at Air Force, 87-62, in its initial tournament contest.

► A win over Florida A&M Tuesday would make ECU Head Coach Jeff Lebo the winningest coach in the program's Division I era. A victory would be his 103rd at the helm of the program, surpassing Tom Quinn, who posted 102 wins from 1966-74. East Carolina entered the ranks of NCAA Division I with the 1965-66 season, one year before Quinn arrived.

► East Carolina and Florida A&M are meeting in Greenville for the second time in three years, but just the third time overall. The Pirates won the previous meeting 75-57 behind 19 points from Caleb White, 14 from Michel Nzege and 11 from B.J. Tyson.

► ECU is looking to extend its non-conference home winning streak to 16 games. It's last non-conference home loss was Nov. 16, 2014 to UNC Asheville (79-83).

► Graduate transfer Andre Washington was named to The American Weekly Honor Roll on Monday after scoring 21 points and grabbing 16 rebounds Sunday against Stetson. He became the first Pirate since 2006 to have 20 points and 15 rebounds in the same game.

► Washington was one of three Pirates to grab double digit rebounds against the Hatters Sunday. Clarence Williams nabbed a career-high 13 boards and Kentrell Barkley pulled down 11. It was the first time since 2004 that a trio of ECU players turned that trick.

► The Pirates collected 63 rebounds Sunday, their most under coach Jeff Lebo and most since grabbing an ECU record 71 against USF during the 2002-03 season.

► Florida A&M is ECU's third HBCU opponent of the season. The Pirates defeated Grambling State to open the season and then took down N.C. A&T the following game. They will also host HBCU foes Hampton and N.C. Central upon their return from Georgia.

KEY PERFORMERS: Caleb White led East Carolina with 19 points on 7-of-15 shooting, including 4-of-9 outside the arc ... Michel Nzege added 14 points on 7-of-8 shooting and grabbed a team-high six rebounds ... B.J. Tyson came off the bench to score 11 points ... Terry Whisnant handed out four assists and Paris Roberts-Campbell knocked in a pair of 3s ... Jermaine Ruttley led the Rattlers with 16 points and Craig Bowman had 13.

TURNING POINT: Florida A&M used an 8-0 run of its own to pull within one, 49-48, but the Pirates did not succumb and responded with an 11-1 spurt, capped by White's fourth 3-pointer of the game, to push its lead out to double digits with White and Terry Whisnant combining for nine points during the run.

EAST CAROLINA 61, N.C. A&T 51 - WILLIAMS ARENA AT MINGES COLISEUM – GREENVILLE, N.C. (11/14/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: B.J. Tyson and Caleb White each scored 13 points to lead the Pirates to a 61-51 win over N.C. A&T Monday ... White moved into sole possession of seventh place on the school's time scoring list with 1,233 points ... Freshman Elijah Hughes added 10 points off the bench on 4-of-9 shooting, burying a pair of 3-pointers ... Junior Jabari Craig pulled down 13 rebounds, including eight offensive boards ... He also blocked four shots to help ECU recorded its most total blocks in a game in nearly three years, nine ... Redshirt freshman Deng Riak also rejected a pair of Aggie field goal attempts ... Tyson collected four of the Pirates' seven steals ... Tyson went over the 900-point plateau for his career and now has 906 for his career in 67 games ... White made three of the Pirates' six 3-point baskets.

TURNING POINT: With the game tied a 6-all, ECU scored nine unanswered to start a 20-3 run and gave the Pirates a 26-9 lead with 8:52 left before halftime ... The Pirates led by as many as 21 in the second half before winning the final margin of 10.

PIRATES HIGHLIGHT: In addition to blocking nine shots, the Pirates made more free throws (19) than the Aggies attempted (16) ... ECU also held A&T to 25.9 percent shooting (7-27) in the first half.

KEY PERFORMERS: Anthony Vanhook had 13 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists on Charlotte beat East Carolina 76-64 ... Jon Davis added 24 points and five assists, and Braxton Ogbueze and Hudson Price added 11 points each for the 49ers ... All five of the East Carolina starters scored in double digits but none more than 12. Andre Washington, B.J. Tyson and Raquan Wilkins had 12 points each, Clarence Williams scored 11 and Kentrell Barkley added 10 ... ECU was without the services of four scholarship players: Elijah Hughes (injured), Michel Nzege (injured), Jeremy Sheppard (suspension) and Caleb White (minor NCAA infraction).

TURNING POINT: Charlotte took the lead for good at 56-54 on Hudson Price's 3-pointer with 7:41 left. The teams traded baskets and then Charlotte scored nine straight for a 67-56 lead.

PIRATES HIGHLIGHT: East Carolina had the lead for stretches of the first half and never trailed significantly until Charlotte first pulled away at 52-42. The Pirates held a 38-29 edge on the glass.

KEY PERFORMERS: Caleb White scored a season-high 22 points on the strength of five 3s ... Andre Washington posted his first career double-double with career-highs for points (21) and rebounds (16) ... Kentrell Barkley also produced a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds, while he dished out seven assists as well ... Clarence Williams grabbed 13 rebounds additionally ... The starters scored 71 of ECU's 73 points ... Washington blocked six shots and ECU out-rebounded the Hatters by 25 ... Derick Newton led Stetson with 15 points and Divine Myles added 10.

TURNING POINT: East Carolina led start to finish ... Leading by three, 12-9, East Carolina went on a 22-5 run to extend to a 20-point lead, 34-14, with 4:23 left in the first half and led 37-23 at halftime ... The Pirates outscored Stetson by eight to start the second half giving the Pirates a 55-33 advantage with 13:43 to play ... The Pirates took their largest lead of the game, 25 points, when White made 1-of-2 free throws for a 69-44 advantage with 5:39 to play.

PIRATES HIGHLIGHT: ECU had three players grab double figures rebounds for the first time since 2004 and its 63 rebounds were the most since garnering a school record 71 against USF in 2003.

EARLY DEFENSIVE TRENDS

► ECU has held three of its first four opponents under 60 points, all at home. In eight halves of basketball this season, ECU has held its opponent to less than 30 points seven times.

► The Pirates have 24 blocks and 24 steals through the first four games. While they did have 20 steals after four games last season, they didn't record their 24th block until game 10.

► ECU has forced its opponents to shoot under 35 percent from the floor in six halves this season, including four halves under 30 percent. Stetson was 6-for-37 (.162) in the second half Sunday after shooting 8-of-32 (.250) in the first half. N.C. A&T shot just 25.9 percent in the first half and Charlotte made just 29.4 percent of its first half field goal attempts.

► After four games, East Carolina holds a +12.8 rebounding margin over its opponents. It has out-rebounded each opponent of its first four opponents with a high margin of 25 (63-38) against Stetson.

AMERICAN WEEKLY HONOR ROLL PIRATES

► Andre Washington earned his first American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll selection Monday.

► Senior Caleb White was named to the first American Athletic Conference weekly honor for the 2016-17 season. He scored a career-high 21 points and grabbed a career-best 16 rebounds, while blocking six shots to help ECU defeat Stetson, 73-50, in the first game of the Savannah Invitational. Washington's performance made him the first ECU player to register a 20-point, 15-rebound game since 2006.

LEBO ON THE CUSP OF HISTORY

► Seventh-year head coach Jeff Lebo tied Tom Quinn for the most coaching victories in the school's Division I era (since 1965) Sunday with his 102 victory.

► Lebo recorded his 100th victory at ECU on Veteran's Day as the Pirates defeated Grambling State, 72-57. He became just the third coach in school history to win triple digit games. Three days later he posted his 101st win.

► Lebo's 102 ranks second behind Howard Porter's 182 victories

OPENING NIGHT TRENDS CONTINUED

► As the curtain rose on the 2016-17 season, the Pirates continued a successful streak of opening night trends:

- ECU won its season opener for the 17th consecutive year.
- The Pirates won their home opener for the 15th straight season.
- It was the program's 16th straight victory when playing its first game of the season at Minges Coliseum. The last time ECU was 0-1 after playing its initial game at home was 1989.

TYSON & BARKLEY RECEIVE PRESEASON HONORS

► Junior B.J. Tyson was named to The American Preseason Second-Team as voted upon by the league's 11 head coaches. Tyson is the fourth-leading returning scorer in the conference after averaging 14.6 points per game last season.

► Tyson and sophomore teammate Kentrell Barkley were also tabbed all-conference third-team selections by Athlon Sports.

► The duo was also named to the CollegeSportsMadness.com American Athletic Conference preseason fourth-team.

PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH SEVENTH IN THE AMERICAN

► ECU was picked to seventh in The American this season by the league's head coaches. The Pirates garnered 39 points to finish ahead of UCF (37), Tulsa (34), USF (25) and Tulane (11).

► East Carolina posted a 4-14 record in The American last season to finish tied for ninth.

WILLIAMS TO SIT OUT 2016-17 SEASON

► Freshman point guard Shawn Williams must complete a year of academic residency at the ECU before being cleared for competition according a ruling by the NCAA over the summer.

► A native of Little Rock, Ark., Williams inked his National Letter-of-Intent with the Pirates during the 2015 fall signing period. As a senior at Maumelle High School, he received all-state honors from the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette and Arkansas High School Athletic Association. He averaged 23.0 points and 3.6 assists per game, while leading his team to the state 5A championship game.

COACHING STABILITY

► Coach Jeff Lebo is in his seventh season as the Pirates' top man, making him the third-longest tenured head coach in program history behind Howard Porter (1947-59) and Tom Quinn (1966-74).

► Assistant coach Michael Perry is in his 10th season at ECU, making him the second-longest tenured basketball coach, head or assistant, in the program's 85-year history. He joined the coaching staff prior to the 2007-08 season as an assistant coach to Mack McCarthy and was retained for Lebo's staff in 2010.

► Assistant coach Ken Potosnak is in his seventh season at ECU, after coming over from Auburn with Lebo, as is Director of Basketball Operations Kyle Robinson. Mike Netti is in his fourth year as an assistant coach. Potosnak is second only to Perry in terms of years spent as an assistant coach at ECU.

GEORGIA ON MY MIND

► East Carolina will participate in the first Savannah Invitational to be held Nov. 25-26 at the Savannah Civic Center. The Pirates will face Mercer on Nov. 25 at 5 p.m. and then take on either Air Force or Akron the following day.

► As a part of the event, ECU will host Stetson on Nov. 20 and Florida A&M Nov. 22. The Pirates defeated Stetson last season at the Las Vegas Invitational and took down FAMU at home two years ago. ECU and

Mercer haven't met since 1978, while the Pirates have never competed against either Air Force or Akron.

CRAIG & WASHINGTON BRING ADDED SIZE

► The summer addition of graduate transfer center Andre Washington and junior college transfer Jabari Craig gave the Pirates a much needed boost in size.

► At 7-foot-1, Andre Washington is the tallest player in school history and one of only two American-born seven-footers to compete at ECU. With his shoes on, Washington is nearly 7-foot-2 at 7-1 3/4.

► Toronto native Jabari Craig brings a 6-foot-10, 235-lb. frame to the Pirates after spending the previous two seasons in junior college. Although his minutes were limited in JUCO, Craig has the potential to impact the game on both ends of the floor.

► The Pirates also got bigger up front with the return of 6-foot-10 forward Deng Riak, who played in a mere eight games before sustaining a shoulder injury that cost him the final 24 contests of the year. He received a medical redshirt and has four years of eligibility.

MILLENNIAL SCORERS

► Senior Caleb White enters his final campaign ranked eighth on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,200 points. With a career average of 12.4 ppg, White is on pace to score more than 1,500 points and finish as the Pirates' second all-time leading Division I scorer (since 1965) and fourth overall.

J ► Junior B.J. Tyson will look to become just the fourth Pirate to score more than 1,000 points in his first three seasons since freshman were ruled eligible for competition in 1972. Tyson scored a total of 881 during his first two seasons in Greenville, averaging 13.6 ppg during 65 games played as a freshman and sophomore.

DAVIS SIGNS NLI

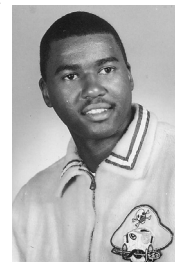
K.J. Davis, a 6-foot-6 guard at I.C. Norcom High School in Portsmouth, Va., signed a National Letter of Intent to join the Pirates for the 2017-18 season, during the 2016 fall signing period. Davis helped Norcom win its third straight 3A state title earlier this year, scoring 16 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the championship game, nailing four 3-pointers, to cap a 29-1 campaign. An honor roll student and two-time all-conference player, Davis was named second-team 3A all-state a year ago as well as a first-team 3A All-East region selection. He played on the AAU circuit for Virginia's Team Loaded as well as Boo Williams.

HISTORIC ANNIVERSARIES

► Fifty years ago, Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a basketball scholarship to East Carolina University in 1966. Colbert averaged more than 14 points per game during his two seasons (1966-68) with the Pirates.

► The 2016-17 season marks the 45th anniversary of East Carolina's first-ever trip to NCAA Tournament. Head coach Tom Quinn led the Pirates to an upset win over Southern Conference regular season champion Davidson in the SoCon semifinals and then took down Furman to win its only SoCon title. ECU lost to Villanova in the first round of the NCAAs in Princeton, N.J.

► It's been 10 years since East Carolina defeated NC State in the Wolfpack's only visit to Greenville, 75-69. Senior Sam Hinnant dropped 30 on the 'Pack as a sea of Purple flooded the court following the final buzzer.





THREE-HEADED APPARATUS

► ECU returns three of its top four scorers from a year ago: B.J. Tyson (14.6), Caleb White (12.5) and Kentrell Barkley (10.1). The trio was referred to as the "three-headed apparatus," by Matt Norlander of CBSSports.com.

RANKED FOES

► ECU has four games scheduled against teams ranked in the preseason AP and/or coaches polls. Virginia, whom the Pirates will face in Charlottesville on Dec. 6, is ranked seventh in the coaches poll and eighth in the AP. UConn comes in at No. 16 in the coaches poll and 18th in the AP, while Cincinnati, who ECU will face just once at home on Jan. 15, is No. 25 in the coaches poll, but isn't ranked in the AP.

TRIPLE THREATS

► East Carolina has finished in the top-3 in its conference in 3-point field goals made per game each of the last five seasons, averaging 7.1 or more made 3s each campaign. The Pirates made an average of 7.3 3-pointers per game last year, which was third-best in The American behind Temple (7.7) and Cincinnati (7.6).

► Caleb White finished ranked sixth in The American in 3-point field goal made per game (2.3).

NEW FACES

► ECU added nine new faces to the team in 2016-17 following the loss of five seniors and three transfers. Isaac Fleming and Andre Washington are both Division I transfers. Jabari Craig joined the program from junior college and four freshmen (Elijah Hughes, Jeremy Sheppard, Raquan Wilkins, Shawn Williams) signed NLI's. The Pirates also added a pair of walk-ons (Addison Hill, John Whitley).

► Billy Hubly is the newest member of the coaching staff, taking over the role of video coordinator. Hubly spent the previous three seasons at Georgia Tech, two as a graduate assistant coach on the floor and the previous as the Yellow Jackets' video coordinator.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

► The Pirates' 2016-17 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) from seven states and three foreign countries (Australia, Canada and Switzerland).

► Five Pirates are native North Carolinians, while an additional seven hail from eastern seaboard states (Delaware, Florida, Georgia, New York, Virginia).

► East Carolina has one graduate transfer, three seniors, three juniors, three sophomores, one redshirt freshman and five true freshmen. Junior Isaac Fleming and freshman Shawn Williams will both sit out the 2016-17 season in compliance with the NCAA.

► Six Pirates stand 6-foot-7 or taller, while 10 are 6-foot-5 or smaller.

► Five players transferred to ECU from either another NCAA institution or junior college.

NEARLY 140 DIFFERENT TRIUMPHS FOR LEBO

► ECU Head Coach has defeated 136 different opponents during his 18-year head coaching career. This season he will have a chance to bring that number to 140 as he leads ECU against two foes he never faced for the first time: Hampton and Presbyterian. Should ECU face Akron in the Savannah Invitational, the Zips would be a first time opponent for both Lebo and the Pirates.

► The only other opponent on the schedule that Lebo has yet to gain a victory over is UConn. He will have two opportunities to record his first win over Huskies, first in Hartford on Jan. 22 and then at home on March 1.

The 2015-16 campaign is Jeff Lebo's seventh season as the head coach of the East Carolina Pirates and no coach in school history has won more games in his first six seasons than Lebo. He was hired by ECU in March of 2010 and is the fourth-longest tenured coach in school history. Lebo received a contract extension following the 2013-14 campaign after leading the Pirates into the postseason three times during his first four seasons as the helm.

Lebo directed the Pirates to 99 wins during his first six years, the most successful stretch of victories during that time span in the program's Division I history. No coach in the 83-year history of ECU basketball won more games in his first five seasons. Under his supervision, the Pirates recorded their first-ever 20-win season as an NCAA Division I member, received three postseason tournament invitations and claim their first postseason championship.

He directed the Pirates to a pair of winning campaigns and one .500 season in his first four years. During the 13 years prior to his arrival, ECU hadn't won more than 14 games in any given season and posted a .500 record just once. Lebo coached the Pirates to 18 wins in 2011-12, second-most in the program's Division I history, which dates back to 1965.

The Pirates had also gone winless in conference tournament play since 1996 until he led them to a pair of wins at the 2011 Conference USA Championship tournament as ECU defeated UCF in the opening round and then knocked out No. 1 seed UAB in the quarterfinals to earn the program's first trip to semifinals.

East Carolina is 5-6 in conference tournament play under Lebo, including a victory over UCF in the first round of the 2015 American Basketball Championship

tournament.

Six Pirates earned All-Conference USA accolades under his direction, including the school's first C-USA scoring champion and first-team all-league player, Maurice Kemp in 2013. A year later, Akeem Richmond led all NCAA Division I players in 3-point field goals per game (4.56), made (155) and attempted (392). His 155 3-pointers made is the third-highest single season total in NCAA history.

Lebo's Pirates have set schools records for points, 3-point field goals, assists, blocks and steals during his tenure as well, while also establishing the ECU record for most wins as a Division I member.

Lebo spent the first 12 years of his head coaching career restoring programs at Tennessee Tech, Tennessee-Chattanooga and Auburn and responded by leading each program to at least one 20-win season before departing. He guided Tennessee Tech and Auburn into the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) play, winning five of seven contests - falling on both occasions to teams, which advanced to the NIT Championship Game. Lebo was honored with three consecutive OVC Coach-of-the-Year awards for his unprecedented success at Tennessee Tech. In addition, he was named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach-of-the-Year and the Tennessee Coach-of-the-Year at the conclusion of the 2001-02 season.

Lebo began his coaching career as an assistant at East Tennessee State under Alan LeForce for two seasons from 1990 to 1992 before he joined Eddie Fogler's staff as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt in 1992-93. During his only season in Nashville, Lebo helped coach the Commodores to an SEC Championship, a Sweet 16 appearance and a 28-6 record. He then followed Fogler to South Carolina the next year, where he spent five seasons and played a key role assisting the Gamecocks to their only SEC title in 1997 and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In his final three seasons in Columbia, Lebo helped the Gamecocks to an average of 22 wins per year, posting records of 19-12, 24-8 and 23-8.

A four-year letterman at North Carolina, Lebo played for legendary coach Dean Smith and was part of a Tar Heel program that posted a 116-25 record during his career, captured a pair of ACC regular season titles and won the 1989 ACC Tournament title. UNC advanced to the Sweet 16 each of his four years and made two Elite Eight appearances. He was a two-time All-ACC Tournament selection and a second-team all-conference pick in 1988.
