POINTS OF INTEREST

- Coming off its longest break of the young season without a game, three days, East Carolina is back on the hardwood Saturday at 5 p.m. against instate foe N.C. Central inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum.
- ECU is 5-0 at home this season and has won all five of its previous games against the Eagles, who enter the contest on a five-game winning streak.
- East Carolina will be shooting for its 18th consecutive non-conference home victory Saturday. The Pirates are 5-0 at home this season against non-conference opponents after going 7-0 inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum prior to American Athletic Conference play a year ago.
- N.C. Central represents ECU's fourth MEAC opponent of the season and fifth HBCU foe. East Carolina has won 15 consecutive games against current members of the MEAC with their last lost coming at Morgan State on Dec. 18, 2006.
- UPCOMING MILESTONES:** B.J. Tyson is one point shy of becoming the 28th player in school history with 1,000 career points. He posted 17 points Tuesday night against Hampton.
- Tyson has picked up his scoring prowess recently. After scoring 12, 13, 12 and 14 in the first four games of the season, he netted 17, 15, 17 and 18 in the last four and now leads the Pirates in scoring.
- Graduate transfer Andre Washington has led East Carolina in rebounding in five of the last six games with eight rebounds in four of those games and 16 in the other. He's also in a pattern of scoring double figures every other game and will be looking to put together back-to-back double figure scoring games for the first time this season Saturday.
- Senior Caleb White continues to climb the ECU career record book. White is four minutes away from becoming just the third player in program history to play 3,300 minutes. He needs to average 17 minutes a game over the final 24 contests to become the Pirates' all-time leader in that category.
- Sophomore Kentrell Barkley continues to be a model of consistency. He's scored double figures in six games this season and has secured six or more rebounds six times. Barkley hasn't had fewer than six boards in any contest since the second game of the season. He currently ranks third on the team in scoring, second in rebounding and first in assists.
- Freshman Jeremy Sheppard scored nine points against Hampton Tuesday after chipping in seven versus Air Force. After starting the season 2-of-9 shooting, he's made 8-of-12 field goal attempts the last three games.

EAST CAROLINA 68, HAMPTON 48 - WILLIAMS ARENA AT MINGES COLISEUM – GREENVILLE, N.C. (11/29/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: B.J. Tyson had 17 points, making 7-of-8 free throw attempts to lead ECU past Hampton, 68-48 ... Andre Washington scored 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting, grabbed eight rebounds and blocked five shots ... Kentrell Barkley scored 12 points and had six rebounds ... Deng Riak and Raquan Wilkins each posted their highest rebounding total with eight and six, respectively ... Clarence Williams was a perfect 3-of-3 from the field with a pair of 3-pointers ... Jeremy Sheppard missed the first double figure scoring game of his Pirate career by one point, finishing with a season-high nine.

TURNING POINT: ECU outscored Hampton 26-7 over the game's final 13:37 and held Hampton to just one field goal in the final 13 minutes of play ... ECU used a 10-0 run to turn a one-point lead into an 11-point cushion, 52-41, with 9:36 to play.

KEY PERFORMERS: B.J. Tyson had 18 points and Caleb White added 15 as East Carolina knocked off Air Force 70-63 in the third place game of the Savannah Invitational on Saturday ... Kentrell Barkley and Andre Washington shared the team lead in rebounding and assists with each grabbing eight boards and dropping three dimes ... Jabari Craig came off the bench to block three shots ... Trevor Lyons led Air Force with 13 points and seven rebounds ... Zach Kocur was 4 of 6 from beyond the arc for 12 points.

Barkley scored 17 points in the second half on 6-of-9 shooting, while grabbing six rebounds. He also made all four of his free throw attempts after halftime ... LEBO BECOMES ECU'S TOP DI COACH

► Seventh-year head coach Jeff Lebo passed Tom Quinn for the most coaching victories in the school's Division I era (since 1965) Nov. 22 with an 82-62 triumph over Florida A&M for his 103rd victory.

► Lebo recorded his 100th victory at ECU on Veteran's Day as the Pirates defeated Grambling State, 72-57. He became just the third coach in school history to win triple digit games.

► Lebo's 105 wins ranks second behind Howard Porter, who coached the Pirates to 182 victories during their NAIA membership from 1947-59.

NOVEMBER WINS

► The Pirates tied the program record for victories in November by winning six games, matching the 2013-14 squad.

► It's .750 winning percentage during November marked as the third-highest with a minimum of six games played. ECU posted a 5-0 mark in 2012 and a 6-1 record in 2013. Prior to 2007, the Pirates played six games in the month of November just once (2001).

► Head Coach Jeff Lebo steered ECU to a 33-13 (.717) record during the month of November the past seven autumns.

► Head Coach Jeff Lebo steered ECU to a 28-11 (.712) record during the month of November the past seven autumns.

DEFENSE, DEFENSE

► East Carolina has been one the nation's top all around defensive teams during the first month of the season. The Pirates are the only team in NCAA Division I to rank among the top-25 statistically in scoring defense, field goal percent defense, 3-point field goal percent defense, rebounding margin and total blocks.

► UCF, South Carolina and Louisville join ECU as the only teams in NCAA Division I to rank among the top-25 statistically in scoring defense, field goal percent defense, 3-point field goal percent defense and rebounding margin.

► Subtract rebounding margin from the previous note and Syracuse joins the list.

PIRATES SWIPING GLASS CLEAN

► East Carolina has out-rebounded each of its eighth opponents of the season by an average of 10.4 boards per game, 12th largest in the nation.

► The Pirates' have out-rebounded three of their opponents by double digits with the largest margin of the season to date being 25 (63-38) vs. Stetson. They out-rebounded N.C. A&T and Air Force by 14 boards each.

► Four times this season the Pirates have secured an equal or great amount of defensive rebounds than their opponent posted total rebounds (N.C. A&T 33/33; Charlotte 29/29; Stetson 45/38; Air Force 35/32; Note: Totals displayed as ECU defensive rebounds/opponent total rebounds).

► ECU's 63 rebounds against Stetson were the most under coach Jeff Lebo and the most since they grabbed a school-record 71 against USF in 2003. Its the seventh-highest single game rebounding total in program history.

EARLY DEFENSIVE TRENDS

► ECU has held six of its first eight opponents under 63 points, including all five at home. In 16 halves of basketball this season, ECU has held its opponent to less than 30 points eight times.

► The Pirates have yet to allow an opponent to score 30 points in the first half inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum. They have only surrendered 30 points during a half at home once this season when Florida A&M scored 41 second half points.

► The Pirates have 46 blocks through the first eight games after they finished the 2015-16 season with 64 total blocks. ECU ranks 12th nationally in total blocks, which is third in The American behind Cincinnati (49) and Temple (49).

► ECU has forced its opponents to shoot 35 percent or less five times this season, including two under 30 percent (Stetson, .203, Hampton, .281).

REJECTIONS

► The Pirates are on pace to shatter the program's single-season blocked shots record of 156 set by the 2012-13 squad. Through eight games, they have blocked 46 shots, an average of 5.8 per game. At that rate they would end the season with approximately 180 blocked shots.

► Graduate transfer Andre Washington is averaging 2.6 blocked shots per game this season and is on pace to become the third player in program history to reject 80 field goal attempts in a season. Moussa Badiane did it twice with 90 during the 2003-04 season, followed by 87 the next year.

► Washington (21) and junior Jabari Craig (10) have combined for 31 of the team's 46 blocks this season. Kentrell Barkley is third with six, while Deng Riak and Clarence Williams have rejected four apiece.

► ECU sits 12th in the nation in total blocks with 46. However that is only third-best in The American as both Cincinnati and Temple have 49 blocks. The Pirates are also third in the league with 5.8 blocks per game, trailing the Bearcats and Owls with 7.0.

AMERICAN WEEKLY HONOR ROLL PIRATES

► Kentrell Barkley was named to The American Honor Roll for the first time this season Nov. 28 after averaging 16.7 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists in a 2-1 week for ECU.

► Andre Washington earned his first American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll on Nov. 21. He scored a career-high 21 points and grabbed a career-best 16 rebounds, while blocking six shots to help ECU defeat Stetson, 73-50, in the first game of the Savannah Invitational. Washington's performance made him the first ECU player to register a 20-point, 15-rebound game since 2006.

► Senior Caleb White was named to the first American Athletic Conference weekly honor for the 2016-17 season. White scored 22 points in the season opener against Grambling State to earn a place on the conference's weekly honor roll for the sixth time.

OPENING NIGHT TRENDS CONTINUED

► As the curtain rose on the 2016-17 season, the Pirates continued a successful streak of opening night trends:

- ECU won its season opener for the 17th consecutive year.
- The Pirates won their home opener for the 15th straight season.
- It was the program's 16th straight victory when playing its first game of the season at Minges Coliseum. The last time ECU was 0-1 after playing its initial game at home was 1989.

TYSON & BARKLEY RECEIVE PRESEASON HONORS

► Junior B.J. Tyson was named to The American Preseason Second-Team as voted upon by the league's 11 head coaches. Tyson is the fourth-leading returning scorer in the conference after averaging 14.6 points per game last season.

► Tyson and sophomore teammate Kentrell Barkley were also tabbed all-conference third-team selections by Athlon Sports.

► The duo was also named to the CollegeSportsMadness.com American Athletic Conference preseason fourth-team.

PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH SEVENTH IN THE AMERICAN

► ECU was picked to seventh in The American this season by the league's head coaches. The Pirates garnered 39 points to finish ahead of UCF (37), Tulsa (34), USF (25) and Tulane (11).

► East Carolina posted a 4-14 record in The American last season to finish tied for ninth.

COACHING STABILITY

► Coach Jeff Lebo is in his seventh season as the Pirates' top man, making him the third-longest tenured head coach in program history behind Howard Porter (1947-59) and Tom Quinn (1966-74).

► Assistant coach Michael Perry is in his 10th season at ECU, making him the second-longest tenured basketball coach, head or assistant, in the program's 85-year history. He joined the coaching staff prior to the 2007-08 season as an assistant coach to Mack McCarthy and was retained for Lebo's staff in 2010.

► Assistant coach Ken Potosnak is in his seventh season at ECU, after coming over from Auburn with Lebo, as is Director of Basketball Operations Kyle Robinson. Mike Netti is in his fourth year as an assistant coach. Potosnak is second only to Perry in terms of years spent as an assistant coach at ECU.

DAVIS SIGNS NLI

K.J. Davis, a 6-foot-6 guard at I.C. Norcom High School in Portsmouth, Va., signed a National Letter of Intent to join the Pirates for the 2017-18 season, during the 2016 fall signing period. Davis helped Norcom win its third straight 3A state title earlier this year, scoring 16 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the championship game, nailing four 3-pointers, to cap a 29-1 campaign. An honor roll student and two-time all-conference player, Davis was named second-team 3A all-state a year ago as well as a first-team 3A All-East region selection. He played on the AAU circuit for Virginia's Team Loaded as well as Boo Williams.

WILLIAMS TO SIT OUT 2016-17 SEASON

► Freshman point guard Shawn Williams must complete a year of academic residency at the ECU before being cleared for competition according a ruling by the NCAA over the summer.

► A native of Little Rock, Ark., Williams inked his National Letter-of-Intent with the Pirates during the 2015 fall signing period. As a senior at Maumelle High School, he received all-state honors from the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette and Arkansas High School Athletic Association. He averaged 23.0 points and 3.6 assists per game, while leading his team to the state 5A championship game.

CRAIG & WASHINGTON BRING ADDED SIZE

► The summer addition of graduate transfer center Andre Washington and junior college transfer Jabari Craig gave the Pirates a much needed boost in size.

► At 7-foot-1, Andre Washington is the tallest player in school history and one of only two American-born seven-footers to compete at ECU. With his shoes on, Washington is nearly 7-foot-2 at 7-1 3/4.

► Toronto native Jabari Craig brings a 6-foot-10, 235-lb. frame to the Pirates after spending the previous two seasons in junior college. Although his minutes were limited in JUCO, Craig has the potential to impact the game on both ends of the floor.

► The Pirates also got bigger up front with the return of 6-foot-10 forward Deng Riak, who played in a mere eight games before sustaining a should injury that cost him the final 24 contests of the year. He received a medical redshirt and has four years of eligibility.

MILLENNIAL SCORERS

► Senior Caleb White enters his final campaign ranked eighth on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,200 points. With a career average of 12.4 ppg, White is on pace to score more than 1,500 points and finish as the Pirates' second all-time leading Division I scorer (since 1965) and fourth overall.

J ► Junior B.J. Tyson will look to become just the fourth Pirate to score more than 1,000 points in his first three seasons since freshman were ruled eligible for competition in 1972. Tyson scored a total of 881 during his first two seasons in Greenville, averaging 13.6 ppg during 65 games played as a freshman and sophomore.

► ECU returns three of its top four scorers from a year ago: B.J. Tyson (14.6), Caleb White (12.5) and Kentrell Barkley (10.1). The trio was referred to as the "three-headed apparatus," by Matt Norlander of CBSports.com.

TRIPLE THREATS

► East Carolina has finished in the top-3 in its conference in 3-point field goals made per game each of the last five seasons, averaging 7.1 or more made 3s each campaign. The Pirates made an average of 7.3 3-pointers per game last year, which was third-best in The American behind Temple (7.7) and Cincinnati (7.6).

► Caleb White finished ranked sixth in The American in 3-point field goal made per game (2.3).

RANKED FOES

► ECU has four games scheduled against teams ranked in the pre-season AP and/or coaches polls. Virginia, whom the Pirates will face in Charlottesville on Dec. 6, is ranked seventh in the coaches poll and eighth in the AP. UConn comes in at No. 16 in the coaches poll and 18th in the AP, while Cincinnati, who ECU will face just once at home on Jan. 15, is No. 25 in the coaches poll, but isn't ranked in the AP.

NEW FACES

► ECU added nine new faces to the team in 2016-17 following the loss of five seniors and three transfers. Isaac Fleming and Andre Washington are both Division I transfers, Jabari Craig joined the program from junior college and four freshmen (Elijah Hughes, Jeremy Sheppard, Raquan Wilkins, Shawn Williams) signed NLIs. The Pirates also added a pair of walk-ons (Addison Hill, John Whitley).

► Billy Hubly is the newest member of the coaching staff, taking over the role of video coordinator. Hubly spent the previous three seasons at Georgia Tech, two as a graduate assistant coach on the floor and the previous as the Yellow Jackets' video coordinator.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

► The Pirates' 2016-17 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) from seven states and three foreign countries (Australia, Canada and Switzerland).

► Five Pirates are native North Carolinians, while an additional seven hail from eastern seaboard states (Delaware, Florida, Georgia, New York, Virginia).

► East Carolina has one graduate transfer, three seniors, three juniors, three sophomores, one redshirt freshman and five true freshmen. Junior Isaac Fleming and freshman Shawn Williams will both sit out the 2016-17 season in compliance with the NCAA.

► Six Pirates stand 6-foot-7 or taller, while 10 are 6-foot-5 or smaller.

► Five players transferred to ECU from either another NCAA institution or junior college.

NEARLY 140 DIFFERENT TRIUMPHS FOR LEBO

► ECU Head Coach has defeated 136 different opponents during his 18-year head coaching career. This season he will have a chance to bring that number to 140 as he leads ECU against two foes he never faced for the first time: Hampton and Presbyterian. Should ECU face Akron in the Savannah Invitational, the Zips would be a first time opponent for both Lebo and the Pirates.

► The only other opponent on the schedule that Lebo has yet to gain a victory over is UConn. He will have two opportunities to record his first win over Huskies, first in Hartford on Jan. 22 and then at home on March 1.

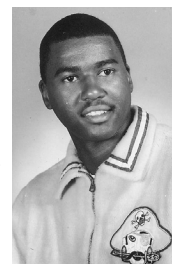
WILLIAMS EARNS PLACE IN D-LEAGUE

► ECU graduate Prince Williams, who was named The American's Most Improved Player last season, was named to the inaugural roster of the NBDL's expansion Greensboro Swarm, NBA affiliate of the Charlotte Hornets. He made his professional debut on Nov. 12 and scored 16 points, going 4-of-6 outside the arc, in the Swarm's first game against Fort Wayne.

► Williams received an invitation to training camp following a local tryout in October.

HISTORIC ANNIVERSARIES

► Fifty years ago, Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a basketball scholarship to East Carolina University in 1966. Colbert averaged more than 14 points per game during his two seasons (1966-68) with the Pirates.



► The 2016-17 season marks the 45th anniversary of East Carolina's first-ever trip to NCAA Tournament. Head coach Tom Quinn led the Pirates to an upset win over Southern Conference regular season champion Davidson in the SoCon semifinals and then took down Furman to win its only SoCon title. ECU lost to Villanova in the first round of the NAAs in Princeton, N.J.

► It's been 10 years since East Carolina defeated NC State in the Wolfpack's only visit to Greenville, 75-69. Senior Sam Hinnant dropped 30 on the 'Pack as a sea of Purple flooded the court following the final buzzer.

The 2015-16 campaign is Jeff Lebo's seventh season as the head coach of the East Carolina Pirates and no coach in school history has won more games in its Division I era (since 1965) than Lebo. He was hired by ECU in March of 2010 and is the fourth-longest tenured coach in school history. Lebo received a contract extension which runs 2020 following the 2013-14 campaign after leading the Pirates into the postseason three times during his first four seasons as the helm.

Lebo directed the Pirates to 99 wins during his first six years, the most successful stretch of victories during that time span in the program's Division I history. No coach in the 83-year history of ECU basketball won more games in his first five seasons. Under his supervision, the Pirates recorded their first-ever 20-win season as an NCAA Division I member, received three postseason tournament invitations and claim their first postseason championship.

He directed the Pirates to a pair of winning campaigns and one .500 season in his first four years. During the 13 years prior to his arrival, ECU hadn't won more than 14 games in any given season and posted a .500 record just once. Lebo coached the Pirates to 18 wins in 2011-12, second-most in the program's Division I history, which dates back to 1965.

The Pirates had also gone winless in conference tournament play since 1996 until he led them to a pair of wins at the 2011 Conference USA Championship tournament as ECU defeated UCF in the opening round and then knocked out No. 1 seed UAB in the quarterfinals to earn the program's first trip to semifinals.

East Carolina is 5-6 in conference tournament play under Lebo, including a victory over UCF in the first round of the 2015 American Basketball Championship

tournament.

Six Pirates earned All-Conference USA accolades under his direction, including the school's first C-USA scoring champion and first-team all-league player, Maurice Kemp in 2013. A year later, Akeem Richmond led all NCAA Division I players in 3-point field goals per game (4.56), made (155) and attempted (392). His 155 3-pointers made is the third-highest single season total in NCAA history.

Lebo's Pirates have set schools records for points, 3-point field goals, assists, blocks and steals during his tenure as well, while also establishing the ECU record for most wins as a Division I member.

Lebo spent the first 12 years of his head coaching career restoring programs at Tennessee Tech, Tennessee-Chattanooga and Auburn and responded by leading each program to at least one 20-win season before departing. He guided Tennessee Tech and Auburn into the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) play, winning five of seven contests - falling on both occasions to teams, which advanced to the NIT Championship Game. Lebo was honored with three consecutive OVC Coach-of-the-Year awards for his unprecedented success at Tennessee Tech. In addition, he was named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach-of-the-Year and the Tennessee Coach-of-the-Year at the conclusion of the 2001-02 season.

Lebo began his coaching career as an assistant at East Tennessee State under Alan LeForce for two seasons from 1990 to 1992 before he joined Eddie Fogler's staff as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt in 1992-93. During his only season in Nashville, Lebo helped coach the Commodores to an SEC Championship, a Sweet 16 appearance and a 28-6 record. He then followed Fogler to South Carolina the next year, where he spent five seasons and played a key role assisting the Gamecocks to their only SEC title in 1997 and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In his final three seasons in Columbia, Lebo helped the Gamecocks to an average of 22 wins per year, posting records of 19-12, 24-8 and 23-8.

A four-year letterman at North Carolina, Lebo played for legendary coach Dean Smith and was part of a Tar Heel program that posted a 116-25 record during his career, captured a pair of ACC regular season titles and won the 1989 ACC Tournament title. UNC advanced to the Sweet 16 each of his four years and made two Elite Eight appearances. He was a two-time All-ACC Tournament selection and a second-team all-conference pick in 1988.
