POINTS OF INTEREST

- ▶ The East Carolina Pirates will wrap up non-conference play Thursday, Dec. 22, inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum against Big South Conference foe Presbyterian. It'll be the first meeting between the two schools since 2000 and fifth overall. ECU is 3-1 all-time against the Blue Hose.
- ▶ The Pirates will be looking to snap a three-game losing streak Thursday. East Carolina is coming off an 81-71 loss at UNCW Tuesday. Junior B.J. Tyson led ECU with 17 points, while freshmen Elijah Hughes and Jeremy Sheppard added 12 as did senior Caleb White.
- ▶ During the second half of Tuesday night's game at UNCW, East Carolina posted its best shooting half of the season connecting on 64 percent of its field goal attempts (16-25). It was the fifth time this season that ECU shot better than 50 percent for a half and the second time over 60 percent. The Pirates shot 60 percent against Air Force in the first half.
- ▶ ECU got a season-best 32 points from its bench against UNCW, led by Hughes and Sheppard's combined 24 points. Michel Nzege and Deng Riak each scored four points to complete the scoring.
- ▶ Washington is 15 points of equaling his three-year, 67-game Wake Forest career scoring total of 116. Through 12 games at ECU, he's scored 101 points, an average of 8.4 points per game. He averaged 1.7 points per game for the Demon Deacons.
- ▶ White has scored 20 points in four of the first seven home games. Should he post his fifth 20-point game Tuesday, he would move into sixth-place on the ECU all-time scoring list surpassing Bill Otte (1961-64), who scored 1,368 points. White enters the game with 1,348 points.
- ▶ Tyson is five points shy of moving into 24th-place and 14 short of 23rd-place on the school's all-time scoring list. He currently ranks 25th with 1,034 points, which ranks sixth on The American career scoring list.
- ▶ Hughes posted double figures for the second time in four games played Tuesday. He played a season-high 23 minutes in just his second game back after missing eight games due to injury.
- ▶ Sheppard is the only player to score double figures each of the last four games, netting 13 against NC Central, 17 at Virginia, 11 versus College of Charleston and 12 at UNCW. In the last three games, he's averaged 13.25 points per game, while shooting 17-of-41 (.415) from the field and 8-of-20 (.400) outside the arc.

UNCW 81, EAST CAROLINA 71 - TRASK COLISEUM – WILMINGTON, N.C. (12/20/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: JDenzel Ingram made six 3-pointers and scored 26 points, C.J. Bryce had 25 points and eight rebounds, and UNCW won its eighth straight in an 81-71 victory over East Carolina on Tuesday night ... B.J. Tyson scored 17 points for East Carolina (7-5), which suffered its third straight loss ... Jeremy Sheppard, Elijah Hughes and Caleb White scored 12 points each for the visiting Pirates.

TURNING POINT: UNCW used a 13-0 run, as ECU went scoreless for two-plus minutes, to take a 25-10 lead. The Seahawks led by 10 points at halftime behind 11 points apiece from Ingram and Bryce. ECU was just 7 of 29 from the floor (24 percent) in the first half.

PIRATES HIGHLIGHT: ECU posted its highest single-half shooting percentage of the season by shooting 64.0 percent from the field in the second half, making 16-of-25 field goal attempts.

KEY PERFORMERS: Jeremy Sheppard led a trio of Pirates in double figures with 11 points with Andre Washington and Caleb White adding 10 apiece in a 53-35 loss to College of Charleston ... Washington also added 12 rebounds for his second double-double of the season along with five blocks ... CoFC guard Joe Chealey led all scorers with 14 points and teammate Jarrell Brantley added 11 ... Nick Harris grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds.

TURNING POINT: College of Charleston scored the first 19 points of the second half to turn a 10-point halftime lead, 23-13, into a 42-13 advantage.

PIRATES HIGHLIGHT: ECU held the Cougars to 33.3 percent shooting from the field and 29.4 percent behind the arc and blocked eight shots.

► Seventh-year head coach Jeff Lebo passed Tom Quinn for the most coaching victories in the school's Division I era (since 1965) Nov. 22 with an 82-62 triumph over Florida A&M for his 103rd victory.

► Lebo recorded his 100th victory at ECU on Veteran's Day as the Pirates defeated Grambling State, 72-57. He became just the third coach in school history to win triple digit games.

► Lebo's 106 wins ranks second behind Howard Porter, who coached the Pirates to 182 victories during their NAIA membership from 1947-59.

► East Carolina won 18 consecutive non-conference home games inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum from Nov. 20, 2014 - Dec. 3, 2016 when College of Charleston ended the streak.

► The Pirates are 6-1 at home in non-conference play this season with one game remaining before American Athletic Conference play begins Dec. 28 against USF.

► East Carolina posted a 7-0 record at home in non-conference play last season.

► ECU Head Coach Jeff Lebo has produced a record of 46-10 in non-conference regular season home games since 2010. Add six post-season CIT games to the mix and he has an overall record of 50-13 when playing non-conference foes inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum.

DEFENSE, DEFENSE

► East Carolina has been one the nation's top all around defensive teams during the first six weeks of the season. The Pirates are one of only eight teams (UCF, Miami, Wichita State, Baylor, Louisville, California, Oregon) in NCAA Division I to rank among the top-35 statistically in scoring defense, field goal percent defense, 3-point field goal percent defense and rebounding margin.

PIRATES SWIPING GLASS CLEAN

► East Carolina out-rebounded each of its first nine opponents of the season, by an average of 10.8 boards per game, before being out-rebounded in consecutive games by Virginia, College of Charleston and UNCW.

► The Pirates' have out-rebounded four of their opponents by double digits with the largest margin of the season to date being 25 (63-38) vs. Stetson. They out-rebounded N.C. A&T, Air Force and Hampton by 14 boards each.

► Four times this season the Pirates have secured an equal or great amount of defensive rebounds than their opponent posted total rebounds (N.C. A&T 33/33; Charlotte 29/29; Stetson 45/38; Air Force 35/32; Note: Totals displayed as ECU defensive rebounds/opponent total rebounds).

► ECU's 63 rebounds against Stetson were the most under coach Jeff Lebo and the most since they grabbed a school-record 71 against USF in 2003. Its the seventh-highest single game rebounding total in program history.

MORE DEFENSIVE TRENDS

► ECU has held eight of its first 12 opponents under 63 points, including all seven at home. In 22 halves of basketball this season, ECU has held its opponent to less than 30 points 12 times.

► The Pirates have yet to allow an opponent to score 30 points in the first half inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum. They have surrendered 30 points during a half at home only three this season when Florida A&M scored 41 second half points and College of Charleston and NC Central netted 30 each.

► The Pirates have 61 blocks through the first 12 games after they finished the 2015-16 season with 64 total blocks. ECU ranks 32nd nationally in total blocks, which is fourth in The American behind Temple (70), Cincinnati (65) and Memphis (64).

► ECU has forced its opponents to shoot 35 percent or less five times this season, including two under 30 percent (Stetson - .203, Hampton - .281).

REJECTIONS

► The Pirates are on pace to shatter the program's single-season blocked shots record of 156 set the 2012-13 squad. Through 12 games, they have blocked 61 shots, an average of 5.1 per game. At that rate they would end the season with approximately 163 blocked shots.

► Graduate transfer Andre Washington is averaging 2.5 blocked shots per game this season and is on pace to become the third player in program history to reject 80 field goal attempts in a season. Moussa Badiane did it twice with 90 during the 2003-04 season, followed by 87 the next year.

► Washington (30) and junior Jabari Craig (10) have combined for 40 of the team's 61 blocks this season. Kentrell Barkley is third with eight, while Deng Riak and Clarence Williams have rejected four apiece.

SCORING GREATS

► Senior Caleb White and junior B.J. Tyson rank among the top all-time scorers in program history. Over the past 12 months they became the 27th and 28th players at ECU to score 1,000 career points.

► White currently ranks seventh on the all-time scoring list with 1,348 points. He's currently averaging 13.5 ppg this season. With a minimum of 20 games remaining on the schedule, he is on pace to finish his career with 1,665 points which would make him fourth all-time.

► Tyson, who joined the club Dec. 3, has accumulated 1,034 points in his career but has already established himself as one of the top scorers in the brief history of The American.

AMERICAN WEEKLY HONOR ROLL PIRATES

► Freshman Jeremy Sheppard was named the conference's Rookie-of-the-Week for the week ending Dec. 4. He averaged 11.0 points, 5.5 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game in helping the Pirates to two wins over Hampton and NC Central.

► B.J. Tyson was named to The American Weekly Honor Roll for the first time this season and third time in his career on Dec. 3 after reaching the 1,000 career point plateau and helping ECU to a 2-0 week with wins over Hampton and NC Central.

► Kentrell Barkley was named to The American Honor Roll for the first time this season Nov. 28 after averaging 16.7 points, 9.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists in a 2-1 week for ECU.

► Andre Washington earned his first American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll on Nov. 21. He scored a career-high 21 points and grabbed a career-best 16 rebounds, while blocking six shots to help ECU defeat Stetson, 73-50, in the first game of the Savannah Invitational. Washington's performance made him the first ECU player to register a 20-point, 15-rebound game since 2006.

► Senior Caleb White was named to the first American Athletic Conference weekly honor for the 2016-17 season. White scored 22 points in the season opener against Grambling State to earn a place on the conference's weekly honor roll for the sixth time.

NOVEMBER WINS

► The Pirates tied the program record for victories in November by winning six games, matching the 2013-14 squad.

► It's .750 winning percentage during November marked as the third-highest with a minimum of six games played. ECU posted a 5-0 mark in 2012 and a 6-1 record in 2013. Prior to 2007, the Pirates played six games in the month of November just once (2001).

► Head Coach Jeff Lebo steered ECU to a 33-13 (.717) record during the month of November the past seven autumns.

DAVIS SIGNS NLI

K.J. Davis, a 6-foot-6 guard at I.C. Norcom High School in Portsmouth, Va., signed a National Letter of Intent to join the Pirates for the 2017-18 season, during the 2016 fall signing period. Davis helped Norcom win its third straight 3A state title earlier this year, scoring 16 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the championship game, nailing four 3-pointers, to cap a 29-1 campaign. An honor roll student and two-time all-conference player, Davis was named second-team 3A all-state a year ago as well as a first-team 3A All-East region selection. He played on the AAU circuit for Virginia's Team Loaded as well as Boo Williams.

NEARLY 140 DIFFERENT TRIUMPHS FOR LEBO

► With ECU's win over Hampton, head coach Jeff Lebo defeated his 137th different opponent during his 18-year head coaching career. Before season's end he will have a chance to bring that number to 139 with a non-conference game against Presbyterian and two meetings with UConn.

► He will have two opportunities to record his first win over Huskies, first in Hartford on Jan. 22 and then at home on March 1.

OPENING NIGHT TRENDS CONTINUED

► As the curtain rose on the 2016-17 season, the Pirates continued a successful streak of opening night trends:

- ECU won its season opener for the 17th consecutive year.
- The Pirates won their home opener for the 15th straight season.
- It was the program's 16th straight victory when playing its first game of the season at Minges Coliseum. The last time ECU was 0-1 after playing its initial game at home was 1989.

WILLIAMS EARNS PLACE IN D-LEAGUE

► ECU graduate Prince Williams, who was named The American's Most Improved Player last season, was named to the inaugural roster of the NBDL's expansion Greensboro Swarm, NBA affiliate of the Charlotte Hornets. He made his professional debut on Nov. 12 and scored 16 points, going 4-of-6 outside the arc, in the Swarm's first game against Fort Wayne.

► Williams received an invitation to training camp following a local tryout in October.

TYSON & BARKLEY RECEIVE PRESEASON HONORS

► Junior B.J. Tyson was named to The American Preseason Second-Team as voted upon by the league's 11 head coaches. Tyson is the fourth-leading returning scorer in the conference after averaging 14.6 points per game last season.

► Tyson and sophomore teammate Kentrell Barkley were also tabbed all-conference third-team selections by Athlon Sports.

► The duo was also named to the CollegeSportsMadness.com American Athletic Conference preseason fourth-team.

RANKED FOES

► ECU has four games scheduled against teams ranked in the preseason AP and/or coaches polls. Virginia, whom the Pirates lost to in Charlottesville on Dec. 6, was ranked seventh in the coaches poll and eighth in the AP. UConn came in at No. 16 in the coaches poll and 18th in the AP, while Cincinnati, who ECU will face just once at home on Jan. 15, was No. 25 in the coaches poll, but wasn't ranked in the AP.

PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH SEVENTH IN THE AMERICAN

► ECU was picked to seventh in The American this season by the league's head coaches. The Pirates garnered 39 points to finish ahead of UCF (37), Tulsa (34), USF (25) and Tulane (11). East Carolina posted a 4-14 record in The American last season to finish tied for ninth.

THREE-HEADED APPARATUS

► ECU returns three of its top four scorers from a year ago: B.J. Tyson (14.6), Caleb White (12.5) and Kentrell Barkley (10.1). The trio was referred to as the "three-headed apparatus," by Matt Norlander of CBSSports.com.

COACHING STABILITY

► Coach Jeff Lebo is in his seventh season as the Pirates' top man, making him the third-longest tenured head coach in program history behind Howard Porter (1947-59) and Tom Quinn (1966-74).

► Assistant coach Michael Perry is in his 10th season at ECU, making him the second-longest tenured basketball coach, head or assistant, in the program's 85-year history. He joined the coaching staff prior to the 2007-08 season as an assistant coach to Mack McCarthy and was retained for Lebo's staff in 2010.

► Assistant coach Ken Potosnak is in his seventh season at ECU, after coming over from Auburn with Lebo, as is Director of Basketball Operations Kyle Robinson. Mike Netti is in his fourth year as an assistant coach. Potosnak is second only to Perry in terms of years spent as an assistant coach at ECU.

CRAIG, RIAK & WASHINGTON BRING ADDED SIZE

► The summer addition of graduate transfer center Andre Washington and junior college transfer Jabari Craig gave the Pirates a much needed boost in size. ECU ranks among the top-10 tallest teams in college basketball.

► At 7-foot-1, Andre Washington is the tallest player in school history and one of only two American-born seven-footers to compete at ECU. With his shoes on, Washington is nearly 7-foot-2 at 7-1 3/4.

► Toronto native Jabari Craig brings a 6-foot-10, 235-lb. frame to the Pirates after spending the previous two seasons in junior college. Although his minutes were limited in JUCO, Craig has the potential to impact the game on both ends of the floor.

► The Pirates also got bigger up front with the return of 6-foot-10 forward Deng Riak, who played in a mere eight games before sustaining a should injury that cost him the final 24 contests of the year. He received a medical redshirt and has four years of eligibility.

HISTORIC ANNIVERSARIES

► Fifty years ago, Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a basketball scholarship to East Carolina University in 1966. Colbert averaged more than 14 points per game during his two seasons (1966-68) with the Pirates.

► The 2016-17 season marks the 45th anniversary of East Carolina's first-ever trip to NCAA Tournament. Head coach Tom Quinn led the Pirates to an upset win over Southern Conference regular season champion Davidson in the SoCon semifinals and then took down Furman to win its only SoCon title. ECU lost to Villanova in the first round of the NCAAs in Princeton, N.J.

► It's been 10 years since East Carolina defeated NC State in the Wolfpack's only visit to Greenville, 75-69. Senior Sam Hinnant dropped 30 on the 'Pack as a sea of Purple flooded the court following the final buzzer.

TRIPLE THREATS

► East Carolina has finished in the top-3 in its conference in 3-point field goals made per game each of the last five seasons, averaging 7.1 or more made 3s each campaign. The Pirates made an average of 7.3 3-pointers per game last year, which was third-best in The American behind Temple (7.7) and Cincinnati (7.6).

► Caleb White finished ranked sixth in The American in 3-point field goal made per game (2.3).

NEW FACES

► ECU added nine new faces to the team in 2016-17 following the loss of five seniors and three transfers. Isaac Fleming and Andre Washington are both Division I transfers, Jabari Craig joined the program from junior college and four freshmen (Elijah Hughes, Jeremy Sheppard, Raquan Wilkins, Shawn Williams) signed NLIs. The Pirates also added a pair of walk-ons (Addison Hill, John Whitley).

► Billy Hubly is the newest member of the coaching staff, taking over the role of video coordinator. Hubly spent the previous three seasons at Georgia Tech, two as a graduate assistant coach on the floor and the previous as the Yellow Jackets' video coordinator.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

► The Pirates' 2016-17 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) from seven states and three foreign countries (Australia, Canada and Switzerland).

► Five Pirates are native North Carolinians, while an additional seven hail from eastern seaboard states (Delaware, Florida, Georgia, New York, Virginia).

► East Carolina has one graduate transfer, three seniors, three juniors, three sophomores, one redshirt freshman and five true freshmen. Junior Isaac Fleming and freshman Shawn Williams will both sit out the 2016-17 season in compliance with the NCAA.

► Six Pirates stand 6-foot-7 or taller, while 10 are 6-foot-5 or smaller.

► Five players transferred to ECU from either another NCAA institution or junior college.

WILLIAMS TO SIT OUT 2016-17 SEASON

► Freshman point guard Shawn Williams must complete a year of academic residency at the ECU before being cleared for competition according to a ruling by the NCAA over the summer.

► A native of Little Rock, Ark., Williams inked his National Letter-of-Intent with the Pirates during the 2015 fall signing period. As a senior at Maumelle High School, he received all-state honors from the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette and Arkansas High School Athletic Association. He averaged 23.0 points and 3.6 assists per game, while leading his team to the state 5A championship game.

The 2015-16 campaign is Jeff Lebo's seventh season as the head coach of the East Carolina Pirates and no coach in school history has won more games in its Division I era (since 1965) than Lebo. He was hired by ECU in March of 2010 and is the fourth-longest tenured coach in school history. Lebo received a contract extension which runs 2020 following the 2013-14 campaign after leading the Pirates into the postseason three times during his first four seasons as the helm.

Lebo directed the Pirates to 99 wins during his first six years, the most successful stretch of victories during that time span in the program's Division I history. No coach in the 83-year history of ECU basketball won more games in his first five seasons. Under his supervision, the Pirates recorded their first-ever 20-win season as an NCAA Division I member, received three postseason tournament invitations and claim their first postseason championship.

He directed the Pirates to a pair of winning campaigns and one .500 season in his first four years. During the 13 years prior to his arrival, ECU hadn't won more than 14 games in any given season and posted a .500 record just once. Lebo coached the Pirates to 18 wins in 2011-12, second-most in the program's Division I history, which dates back to 1965.

The Pirates had also gone winless in conference tournament play since 1996 until he led them to a pair of wins at the 2011 Conference USA Championship tournament as ECU defeated UCF in the opening round and then knocked out No. 1 seed UAB in the quarterfinals to earn the program's first trip to semifinals.

East Carolina is 5-6 in conference tournament play under Lebo, including a victory over UCF in the first round of the 2015 American Basketball Championship

tournament.

Six Pirates earned All-Conference USA accolades under his direction, including the school's first C-USA scoring champion and first-team all-league player, Maurice Kemp in 2013. A year later, Akeem Richmond led all NCAA Division I players in 3-point field goals per game (4.56), made (155) and attempted (392). His 155 3-pointers made is the third-highest single season total in NCAA history.

Lebo's Pirates have set schools records for points, 3-point field goals, assists, blocks and steals during his tenure as well, while also establishing the ECU record for most wins as a Division I member.

Lebo spent the first 12 years of his head coaching career restoring programs at Tennessee Tech, Tennessee-Chattanooga and Auburn and responded by leading each program to at least one 20-win season before departing. He guided Tennessee Tech and Auburn into the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) play, winning five of seven contests - falling on both occasions to teams, which advanced to the NIT Championship Game. Lebo was honored with three consecutive OVC Coach-of-the-Year awards for his unprecedented success at Tennessee Tech. In addition, he was named the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach-of-the-Year and the Tennessee Coach-of-the-Year at the conclusion of the 2001-02 season.

Lebo began his coaching career as an assistant at East Tennessee State under Alan LeForce for two seasons from 1990 to 1992 before he joined Eddie Fogler's staff as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt in 1992-93. During his only season in Nashville, Lebo helped coach the Commodores to an SEC Championship, a Sweet 16 appearance and a 28-6 record. He then followed Fogler to South Carolina the next year, where he spent five seasons and played a key role assisting the Gamecocks to their only SEC title in 1997 and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In his final three seasons in Columbia, Lebo helped the Gamecocks to an average of 22 wins per year, posting records of 19-12, 24-8 and 23-8.

A four-year letterman at North Carolina, Lebo played for legendary coach Dean Smith and was part of a Tar Heel program that posted a 116-25 record during his career, captured a pair of ACC regular season titles and won the 1989 ACC Tournament title. UNC advanced to the Sweet 16 each of his four years and made two Elite Eight appearances. He was a two-time All-ACC Tournament selection and a second-team all-conference pick in 1988.

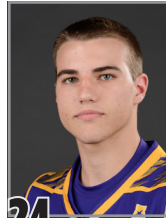
