A highly-regarded prospect out of high school who battled through an injury-plagued collegiate career at East Carolina ... Missed the last two spring practice periods (lower back/2014, right shoulder/2015) which limited development and prevented consistent inclusion on program's depth chart at the outside linebacking position ... Played in only three combined contests as a freshman, sophomore and senior, but did contribute as a defensive reserve and special teams member during junior campaign ... In all, experienced action in 15 career games and logged three stops ... Although action on the field was limited, displayed growth in strength and conditioning program when healthy ... Owns a back squat of 605 pounds, a bench press of 365 and a pro shuttle time of 4.55. **2015:** Earned two-deep standing as the top reserve at the "will" position after completion of fall camp ... Experienced action in the first two contests against Towson and Florida, but did not record any statistics ... Participated on special teams and defensive unit against Tigers before suffering left knee injury on defense against the Gators ... Did not play in remaining 10 games (because of aforementioned injury). **2014:** Appeared in 12 games in a reserve linebacking and special teams role, and was credited with a pair of tackles (one solo) ... Did not play at South Carolina ... Recorded first stop in season opener against N.C. Central, which was a seven-yard sack in the third quarter ... Made other hit vs. Florida in the Birmingham Bowl at Legion Field to close out campaign. **2013:** Played in the season opener vs. Old Dominion and was credited with a solo tackle against the Monarchs before separate right leg and lower back injuries sidelined him for the remainder of the year. **2012:** Was hampered by a shoulder injury that kept him out of spring drills, and subsequently, did not experience game action during first active season on the roster. **2011:** Made contributions on the scout squad during redshirt campaign as a true freshman ... Signed with the Pirates in February. **High School:** Played both tight end and defensive end for the Marlins as a senior ... Guided Bayside to a 13-1 record and the Virginia High School League Group AAA Division 6 state semifinals during final campaign ... Team suffered only loss of the season in semifinals, falling 42-27 to Hermitage ... At the start of the second half of Hermitage contest, returned a fumble 72 yards for a score that pulled the Marlins to within one ... Selected to the Honorable Mention All-Beach District Team following final season ... Totaled seven tackles and a sack in Bayside's 33-13 victory over Woodside in the Eastern Region semifinal ... Tallied seven tackles, three for lost yardage and a fumble recovery during a blanking of Landstown in the third week of the season ... An integral part of a defense that surrendered just 15 points per game and posted a pair of shutouts ... Did not participate as a sophomore or junior ... Played the final three games of freshman season at the varsity level after earning a promotion from JV squad ... Was clocked at 4.7 seconds in the 40-yard dash during prep testing day ... Played for head coach Darnell Moore. **Personal:** Full name is Jeton Donavon Beavers ... Born December 6, 1992 at Virginia Beach, Va. ... Has pair of cousins that also play or played collegiate football, both defensive ends – Eli Harold (Virginia) and Sage Harold (James Madison) ... A former special teams stalwart who quickly developed into a three-year all-conference performer and moved to the cusp of the national awards stage as East Carolina's starting "mike" linebacker ... Earned selection to the 2015 Chuck Bednarik Award, Dick Butkus Award and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists prior to senior season ... Recorded multiple stops in 42 of 51 career games, including 38-straight to end career ... Tallied at least five tackles on 34 occasions (and had 10-plus 12 times) ... Made 34 starts and produced a total of 333 tackles (164 solo) – good enough for 10th on ECU's all-time career tackle list ... Played in every contest (51) during collegiate career, never missing playing time due to an injury ... Ranked among the FBS career leaders in assisted tackles (169/7th) and total tackles (12th) at close of senior campaign ... Added 14.5 tackles for lost yardage (TFL), 3.0 sacks, 12 quarterback hurries, 10 batted passes and three interceptions (97 return yards) ... Helped lead a defensive unit that held 10 opponents to 17 or fewer points and 14 to less than 100 rushing yards since the start of 2013 season ... Participated in three consecutive bowl games as a redshirt freshman, sophomore and junior ... Recorded lifts of 370 pounds (bench press), 525 (back squat) and 308 (power clean) in ECU's strength program ... Owned one of the better broad jumps (9'11") and pro shuttle times (4.08) among position mates. **2015:** Was the Pirates' leading tackler for the second-straight year, logging 98 stops (51 solo) ... Also topped unit with seven quarterback hurries ... Earned First-Team All-American Athletic Conference honors after standing seventh in the league in tackles per game (8.2) ... Additionally, was credited with 6.5 TFLs (-14 yards), 1.5 sacks (-6) and one batted pass (Temple) ... Played in all 12 games with 11 starts (came off bench vs. UCF/coaches decision) ... Recorded five or more stops in 11 contests and reached double-digit totals on four occasions – season-high 13 vs. Tulsa, 12 vs. USF, 11 vs. Navy and 10 in the season opener against Towson ... Was team's top tackler in seven games (Towson, Florida, SMU, Tulsa, Temple, USF and UCF) ... Matched a career-best with 2.0 TFLs in season finale against Cincinnati, while also registering lost-yardage hits vs. Tulsa (1.5), Temple (1.0), UCF (1.0), Navy (0.5) and Towson (0.5) ... Tallied only sacks (1.5) of season in third-quarter action against Tulsa during ECU's 30-17 victory ... Established personal bests with two quarterback hurries each vs. Florida and Golden Hurricane ... Credited with single "pressures" against Virginia Tech, SMU and UCF ... In addition to double-digit totals, also turned in one nine-tackle effort (Cincinnati), one eight-stop outing

(UCF) and a pair of seven-hit performances (Florida, Temple) ... Produced a season-high nine solo deliveries vs. USF at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium a week after netting a season-low four overall tackles (0 solo) at Connecticut ... Easily led Pirates in stops during eight-game AAC schedule with 70 (40 solo) – 21 more than runner-up Jordan Williams (49) ... Averaged nearly 10 tackles per game (9.5) in six home contests ... Displayed a consistent level of play throughout the season, logging team-highs in stops during both the first (45) and second (53) halves of the campaign ... Was ECU's noted run-stopper with 81 (of 98) tackles coming on rushing plays (82.7 percent) ... Played key role in helping Pirate defense hold two opponents under the 100-yard rushing mark (40/SMU, 72/Temple) and four foes to 20 or less points (20/Towson, 17/Tulsa, 7/UCF, 19/Cincinnati) ... Was a six-time game captain (Towson, Navy, Virginia Tech, Temple, USF, Cincinnati) ... Selected to Preseason All-American Athletic Conference (first-team) squads by *Athlon Sports*, *Phil Steele Magazine* and *Sporting News*. **2014:** Topped all American Athletic Conference defenders with 140 tackles (66 solo) – the highest single-season total by a Pirate since Chris Moore tallied 148 in 2003 ... Stood ninth nationally in tackles-per-game average (10.8) ... Earned Second-Team All-American Athletic Conference honors ... Started all 13 games as a junior ... Booked seven or more stops in 12 contests and reached double-digit tackle totals on seven occasions (11/N.C. Central, 13/South Carolina, 13/Virginia Tech, 17/North Carolina, 10/Cincinnati, 10/Tulane, 14/Tulsa and 14/UCF) ... Added a pair of nine-tackle performances (USF, Connecticut) and two seven-stop contests (SMU, Temple) ... Recorded a career-best 17 hits (seven solo) against No. 25 North Carolina, just seven shy of the school single-game record held by Pernell Griffin (2001) and Moore (2004) ... Tied for second (Montese Overton) with five quarterback hurries, establishing a career-best of three during the Pirates' win at Virginia Tech ... Recovered first career fumble against UCF in the regular season finale at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium ... Booked a season-high 11 first half tackles against the Tar Heels on the way to a personal-best performance which garnered Walter Camp National Defensive Player-of-the-Week accolades ... Matched or set career-highs in tackles during first four games (entered season with a previous best of nine vs. Florida Atlantic and Virginia Tech in 2013) ... Picked off passes against North Carolina and Tulsa to stand second on the unit ... Scored first career touchdown against Tar Heels on a 46-yard interception return ... His third career pick (second of season) came during second quarter action at Tulsa and included a return of 22 yards to set up a Jimmy Williams 16-yard scoring grab ... Recorded 3.5 TFLs (2.0/USF, 0.5/Temple, 1.0/UCF) for a total of four yards ... Had a pair of 10 solo tackle performances (South Carolina, Tulsa) ... Also ranked fourth on team with four pass breakups (SMU, Tulane, Tulsa, UCF) ... Finished successful campaign with six tackles (three solo) against Florida in the Birmingham Bowl ... Played integral role for a defense which held seven of 13 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing (N.C. Central/70, Virginia Tech/91, SMU/51, USF/93, Connecticut/84, Temple/65, Tulane/24) and ranks 11th nationally in rush defense (111.8 ypg) ... Also keyed a squad that surrendered only 32 fourth quarter points in American Conference action (outscored opponents 109-32) ... Selected as East Carolina's Linebacker-of-the-Year during the programs annual awards banquet ... Also earned selection to *Phil Steele's* Midseason All-American Athletic Conference Team (second-team). **2013:** Earned All-Conference USA accolades (honorable mention) for efforts as a sophomore ... Played in all 13 games and made 10 starts at inside linebacker ... Opened first collegiate contest against Virginia Tech and matched a season-high with nine tackles (one solo) while also adding a pass breakup ... Stood third on the squad with 77 tackles (38 solo) and five pass breakups ... In addition, was credited with 4.5 TFLs (-7 yards), 1.5 sacks and one interception ... Fifty-one (51) of 77 stops came on running plays, which ranked third among all defenders ... Intercepted first career pass against Tulsa and added a 29-yard return in the second quarter with 1:25 remaining and the Pirates holding a slim 14-10 lead ... Registered multiple tackles in last 12 games (10 of 12 with five or more) ... Credited with half a sack (first of career) in the second quarter vs. Florida Atlantic, dropping Jaquez Johnson for a two-yard loss (one of six Pirate sacks in the contest) ... Booked solo sack in the third quarter at Tulane ... Added TFLs against North Carolina (1.0), Tulsa (0.5), NC State (0.5) and Marshall (1.0) ... Credited with a career-best two pass breakups at Middle Tennessee ... Had additional batted passes against FAU, Virginia Tech and Tulsa ... Tied for the team lead in tackles on four occasions (FAU/9, TLN/7, UAB/8, NCSU/7) ... Ranked among the C-USA top 25 tacklers ... Averaged nearly seven stops per game in his last five outings ... Closed year with six hits (four solo) vs. Ohio during the Beef 'O' Brady's Bowl at Tropicana Field ... Key member of a defensive unit that held six of 12 opponents to 100 or less rushing yards and 17 or fewer points. **2012:** Played in all 13 games as a member of the special teams unit as a redshirt freshman ... Topped the Pirates with 18 special teams stops (15/KO, 3/punt) ... Half (9) of 18 tackles were solo hits ... Booked a season-high five tackles (4 solo) against UL-Lafayette in the R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl ... Also tallied three stops on three occasions (ASU, UAB, UH) ... Tallied multiple hits in five contests ... Made collegiate debut against Appalachian State, booking three tackles (solo) ... Returned one kickoff for three yards at South Carolina in the first quarter ... Fourteen (14) of 18 stops came in the last six games (four multi-tackle outings). **2011:** Redshirted and served as a member of the scout team during his initial year in the ECU program ... Inked with Ruffin McNeill and the Pirates during the traditional February signing period. **High School:** A two-year starter and All-Big South 3A Conference selection for the Green Wave after transferring from Forestview High School prior to junior campaign ... Played both ways as a senior, adding running back duties to linebacker role ... Tallied 93 tackles, six for a loss, one sack and one interception during final year ... Offensively as a senior, rushed for 498 yards and five touchdowns ... Scored a TD on offense and tied for the team lead with six tackles in guiding Green Wave to first victory of 2010 season against Crest ... Named the *Gaston Gazette* Defensive Player-of-the-Week following Crest heroics ... Guided Ashbrook to four victories in year's final seven contests ... Paced the team with eight tackles in last game of the season, a 3AA playoff defeat in a rematch versus Crest ... Named the team's offensive skill player-of-the-year following final season ... Booked 101 tackles, including five for a loss, five sacks, two forced fumbles and picked off a pass during breakout junior season ... On the Forestview varsity unit both seasons prior to transferring ... Noted for run-stopping ability ... Rated as the 96th best outside linebacker in the nation according to *ESPN.com* ... *Tireless commitment and dedication resulted in a productive leadership role on the offensive unit during last two seasons of collegiate career ... Development was slowed by injuries early during career (suffering a right knee injury during redshirt campaign in 2011 before missing most of the spring in 2013 because of a left shoulder ailment) ... Once healthy, work ethic generated additional strength that was clearly evident during emerging junior season ... Unselfishly contributed in ECU's multi-pronged rushing attack in 2014 before emerging as program's featured back in 2015 ... A personable, exciting and heady playmaker who filled a myriad of responsibilities, including reliable receiving production in the flats ... Appeared in 49 career games (13 starts), closing career with a run of 43 consecutively ... Rushed for 1,560 yards on 293 carries – an average of 5.0 per attempt – and scored 13 touchdowns ... Logged three 100-yard rushing contests (two in 2015, one in 2014) ... Caught 41 passes for 284 yards and one TD ... In all, recorded 53 plays of 10 or more yards (44/rushing, nine/receiving) ... Participated in three bowl games (one start) ... Displayed considerable growth in strength and conditioning program, ranking as a "freak" in coach Jeff Connors' power quotient ... Consistently exhibited one of the higher levels of improvement among running backs corps with increases in the bench press (330), back squat (500), power clean (291), push jerk (270), vertical leap (34") and broad jump (10'4") ... Also trimmed 40 (4.38) and pro-shuttle (3.88) times down in impressive fashion over a 24-month period (junior and senior years). 2015: Opened 11 of 12 games as a senior (did not start at SMU) and was the Pirates' leading rusher ... Ran for 754 yards and eight touchdowns on 165 carries – an average of 4.6 yards per attempt ... Was ECU's top ground gainer on eight occasions ... Also led team in overall TDs scored with nine (eight rushing/one receiving) ... Enjoyed two 100-yard rushing outings, racking up a career-high 154 vs. Towson in the season opener before adding 123 against UCF in last road contest ... Effort vs. Tigers marked the first triple-digit rushing total by a Pirate RB on opening day since 2009 (Dominique Lindsay vs. Appalachian State) and highest opener total since 1999 (183 by Jamie Wilson vs. West Virginia) ... Registered 10 or more carries in 10 games with a season-high of 18 against Towson, SMU and Tulsa ... Scored four ground TDs against Towson, which matched an American Athletic Conference single-game record and was the first for a Pirate ball-carrier since 2007 (Chris Johnson vs. Memphis) ... One of the scores came on a 45-yard scamper, the longest TD run of career ... Tallied single touchdowns against SMU, BYU, Temple and UCF ... In addition to Towson and UCF, other ground performances of note (60-plus yards) came against SMU (18-91), BYU (15-77), Tulsa (18-82), Temple (8-65), Connecticut (12-66) ... Twenty-two (22) rushes went for 10 or more yards (eight for 20-plus, three for 30-plus, one for 40-plus) ... Racked up an overall total of 35 first downs and posted best efficiency numbers on third-down snaps (33 plays, 5.9 ypr, 10 first downs, five TDs) ... Stood fifth on unit with 29 receptions for 193 yards (6.7 ypr) and one TD out of the backfield ... Only receiving score came on a 12-yard toss from James Summers vs. Tulsa ... Caught at least one pass in nine contests, including a career-high six at Navy (30 yards) ... Established a personal-best in reception yards with 50 at BYU (on three catches), which also included a career-long 36-yarder in the fourth quarter ... Recorded 16 receptions for 83 yards in the first three games (Towson/5-19, Florida/5-34, Navy/6-30) before following with a combined 13 catches for 110 yards the remaining nine contests ... Other multiple reception tallies include a trio of three-catch outings (BYU, Temple, Cincinnati) and two grabs at UCF ... Put together a run of four-straight games with a TD (SMU/rush, BYU/rush, Tulsa/reception, Temple/rush) ... Produced triple-digit all-purpose yard totals three times, logging 173 vs. Towson, 137 vs. UCF and 127 vs. BYU ... Averaged 63.1 rushing yards per outing during eight-game AAC schedule (62.2 ypg in four non-conference contests) ... Offered consistency from start to finish with 63.0 and 62.7 ypg averages during first and second halves of season, respectively ... A 10-time game captain (Towson, Florida, Virginia Tech, SMU, BYU, Tulsa, Temple, Connecticut, USF and Cincinnati) ... A Preseason All-American Athletic Conference selection (fourth-team) by *Athlon Sports* and *Phil Steele Magazine*. 2014: Experienced action in all 13 games and made two starts (vs. N.C. Recorded a career-high 178 all-purpose yards at Temple ... Also was ECU's leading rusher against SMU in the American Athletic Conference opener, running 12 times for 53 yards with a score ... Rushed for a team second-best 58 yards against the Tar Heels on five carries, which included a long of 43 yards in the fourth quarter ... Averaged an impressive 6.9 yards-per-carry in eight league contests (48-329) ... In fact, only lost two yards during AAC play ... Second-highest work load (17 carries) came against Gators at Legion Field ... Hauled in a season-high three receptions vs. Temple (for 25 yards). 2013: Played in all 13 games in a reserve running back role and as a member of the special teams ... Ranked third on the team with 186 net rushing yards on 49 carries (3.8 ypr.) ... Scored three ground touchdowns – four-yarder vs. Florida Atlantic, a three-yarder at North Carolina and a four-yarder against Southern Miss - which also stood third on unit ... Caught six passes out of the backfield for 60 yards (10.0 ypr) ... Rushed for 30 or more yards in a game three times – 94/MTSU, 32/USM and 48/UAB. 2012: Played in 11 contests in a special teams role during first campaign on the Pirates' active roster ... Was not credited with any statistics, either offensively or on return squads ... Did not play against Appalachian State and UAB. 2011: Served developmental role on scout squad as a redshirt until suffering season-ending injury during ECU's off week (following Virginia Tech contest). **High School:** Two-year starter and team captain at running back for the Mustangs ... Finished senior season with 1,156 yards rushing and 13 touchdowns on 140 carries ... An All-Forsyth County selection following final campaign ... *A personable, lengthy, sure-handed and assignment-conscious pass-catcher who offered the Pirates plenty of flexibility as either a reliable receiver or physical blocker on the line of scrimmage during collegiate career ... Lined up in the fullback position at times during his first two active seasons on the ECU roster, but was utilized as a true tight end as a senior in 2015 and significantly enhanced unit's third down and redzone production ... Became the first-ever East Carolina player to be selected to the John Mackey Award Watch List (nation's top tight end) and John Mackey Midseason Award Watch List prior to and in the middle of senior campaign, respectively ... Joined the ECU program as a walk-on transfer prior to preseason camp in 2012 after beginning his collegiate career at Marshall and developed into a three-time all-conference selection (All-Conference USA in '13, All-American Athletic Conference in '14 and '15) ... In all, played in 38 career games with 18 starts ... Caught 96 passes for 1,045 yards (10.9 ypr) and 13 touchdowns ...
