SPRING AGENDAS

While stressing fundamentals and team discipline, first-year head coach Scottie Montgomery and his staff will also use the spring as an opportunity to fill six offensive openings, including quarterback, running back and three line positions, and five defensive slots. East Carolina returns nearly 75 percent of its lettermen heading into its third year of American Athletic Conference play, but just 50 percent of its positional starters (5/offense, 6/defense) from a 5-7 squad in 2015. Nearly 60 percent of the Pirates' 2016 spring roster consists of upperclassmen (51 of 89; 24 seniors and 27 juniors).

✓ BRIEFLY IN 2015

East Carolina recorded a 5-7 overall mark and stood fifth in the American Athletic Conference's East Division at 3-5. The Pirates opened the season by posting a 4-3 ledger after a convincing 30-17 victory over Tulsa on Oct. 17, but dropped four of their last five contests to fall short of bowl eligibility for the first time since 2011. Included in the late season collapse was a three-game home losing streak - a first for ECU since 2003.

SCOTTIE MONTGOMERY

Head Football Coach (Duke '00)



Scottie Montgomery, who played an integral role leading Duke and the Pittsburgh Steelers to divisional championships and postseason play, is in his first season as head football coach at East Carolina University.

Montgomery, a North Carolina native with a documented history of balanced success on the offensive side of the ball, was formally introduced as the Pirates' 21st head coach on December 14, 2015.

His acceptance of the ECU position officially ended a two-year tenure as the Blue Devils'

associate head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Overall, Montgomery served on the Duke staff for seven seasons under head coaches Ted Roof (2006-07) and David Cutcliffe (2008-09, 2013-15) - five as receivers coach. He helped guide Duke to three-straight bowl appearances, including an exciting 44-41 overtime victory against Indiana in the 2015 New Era Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium.

Montgomery's coaching experience in the National Football League spanned three seasons under Mike Tomlin's leadership. His work with the Steelers' receivers in 2010, 2011 and 2012 resulted in two playoff appearances, the 2010 AFC North Division championship and a spot in Super Bowl XLV.

The 2015 campaign marked Montgomery's second as both primary offensive play-caller and guarterbacks coach at Duke, a program in which he starred as an All-Atlantic Coast Conference wide receiver from 1996 to 1999. Tasked with grooming a new starting quarterback following the graduation of the school's all-time winningest signal-caller and All-ACC selection Anthony Boone, Montgomery encouraged balance to a unit that continued to display a consistent level of production.

Behind protégé guarterback Thomas Sirk, the Blue Devils ranked among the nation's top 45 squads in rushing offense (192.9 ypg), passing offense (246.5) and total offense (439.4). Its 31.5 points-per-game clip and 5,712 yards of total offense marked the fourth-straight season Duke matched or eclipsed a 30.0 scoring average and surpassed the 5,000-yard milestone - a first in school history for both categories. The Blue Devils also stood fourth in the ACC and 33rd at the FBS level with a 43.3 third-down conversion percentage and suffered only seven interceptions during the regular season, a number which ranked 17th in the country.

Sirk was one of only four Power 5 quarterbacks to lead his team in both rushing and passing during his first full-time season orchestrating the Duke offense.

Montgomery was recognized for his efforts as a one of three finalists for the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Assistant Coach-of-the-Year Award in 2015h. In addition, he was listed by *Athlon* as one of "College" Football's 20 Best Coaches Under 40" - ranking among the top 13 coordinators in the country.

During his first year as offensive coordinator in 2014. Montgomery had oversight of an attack that tallied 421 points, the second-highest single-season total in program history. Only the 2013 squad, which Montgomery served as Duke's wide receivers coach, owns a better point total. In addition to a 32.4 scoring average, the Blue Devil offense also racked up 5,178 yards of total offense on the way to a 9-4 overall record and an appearance in the Hyundai Sun Bowl. 🛘 has three sons - Cassius (6), Moses (2) and Magnus (10 months).

Over Montgomery's two-year stint as Duke's offensive coordinator, the Blue Devils featured two All-America selections along the offensive line (guard Laken Tomlinson in 2014, center Matt Skura in 2015), the ACC's all-time leader in pass receptions (Jamison Crowder) and record-setting running back Shaun Wilson, who, in 2014, rushed for a school single-game record 245 yards against Kansas and finished the season with the highest yards per rushing attempt average (7.67) in school history. In the 2015 NFL Draft, Tomlinson was selected in the first round by the Detroit Lions while Crowder was a fourth-round choice. of the Washington Redskins.

In 2013, Montgomery guided a Duke receiving unit that included Crowder, a first-team All-ACC pick, who set a conference single-season record with 108 pass receptions for 1,330 yards and eight touchdowns. The Blue Devils rolled to a 10-4 mark and captured the ACC's Coastal Division championship with a 6-2 ledger before falling to Texas A&M in a 52-48 shootout at the Chick-fil-A Bowl. Duke stood 22nd and 23rd in the final USA Today/Coaches and Associated Press polls, respectively, while ranking 24th in the last BCS listing.

Montgomery helped the Steelers to a three-year regular season record of 32-16. mentoring receivers such Hines Ward, Mike Wallace and Antonio Brown, A four-time NFL Pro Bowl selection, Ward finished his career as the organization's all-time leader in receptions (1,000), receiving yardage (12,083) and receiving touchdowns (85). Wallace earned a Pro Bowl bid in 2011 after catching 72 passes for 1.193 vards and eight touchdowns while Brown was the Steelers' team MVP. in 2011 after becoming the first player in NFL history to amass 1,000-plus yards both receiving and on kick returns.

During his earlier four-year coaching stay at Duke, Montgomery directed several of the finest pass-catchers in school and ACC history. Eron Riley was a two-time All-ACC selection in 2006-07 and caught 144 career passes for 2.413 yards and 22 touchdowns. Donovan Varner and Conner Vernon both were recruited to Duke by Montgomery out of Miami and enjoyed outstanding careers in Durham. A first-team All-ACC pick in 2009, Varner caught 207 passes for 2,660 yards from 2008-11, while Vernon, a three-time (2010-12) all-league selection, became the ACC's career leader in both catches (283) and receiving yardage (3,749).

As a wide receiver for the Blue Devils from 1996 to 1999. Montgomery paced Duke in receiving three-straight seasons as a sophomore, junior and senior. and was a two-time winner of the program's Carmen Falcone Award as the Most Valuable Player in 1998 and 1999.

Montgomery closed his collegiate career with 171 catches for 2.379 yards and 13 touchdowns. He caught 51 passes in both 1997 and 1999, and registered a career-high 60 receptions as a junior in 1998. On special teams, Montgomery finished his career ranking among Duke's all-time leaders in kickoff returns (63) and kickoff return yards (1,515) and all-purpose yardage (4,188).

During his senior campaign in 1999. Montgomery established the school standard for all-purpose yards in a season with 1,565.

He played professionally with the NFL's Denver Broncos (2000-02) and Oakland Raiders (2003).

Montgomery, 37, was born in Shelby, N.C., and graduated from Burns High School before earning a bachelor's degree in cultural anthropology from Duke in 2000.

He is married to the former Ebony McDuffie of Detroit, Mich., and the couple

Deke Adams (Southern Miss '95) **DEFENSIVE LINE COACH**

Deke Adams, who has played a key role in the development of six National Football League draft picks since 2013, including two first-round selections, will direct the Pirates' defensive line following a three-year tenure on the South Carolina staff.

Following his appointment as the Gamecocks' defensive line coach in 2013, tackle Kelcy Quarles and end Jadeveon Clowney

each earned first-team All-America honors under Adams' tutelage. In addition, both players garnered First-Team All-Southeastern Conference selection by the *Associated Press* and the league's 14 coaches. Quarles led the team with 13.5 tackles for loss, including 9.5 sacks, while Clowney was the first overall pick by the Houston Texans in the 2014 NFL Draft.

Before helping Steve Spurrier's South Carolina program to a pair of bowl wins in 2013 and 2014, Adams spent the 2012 season as Larry Fedora's defensive line coach at North Carolina after serving the three previous seasons in the same capacity under Fedora at Southern Miss.

During his one-year stint in Chapel Hill, Adams had the opportunity to coach All-America tackle Sylvester Williams, a first-round selection in the 2013 NFL Draft by the Denver Broncos.

In his final year in Hattiesburg, Adams provided leadership for a front four that allowed just 112.6 rushing yards per game in 2011, which ranked 22nd nationally. He helped the Golden Eagles to the Conference USA title and an eventual 12-win season after a Hawai'i Bowl win over Nevada. Among the players he mentored at USM were First-Team All-Conference USA end Cordarro Law and 2013 second-round NFL draft pick Jamie Collins.

In his initial campaign at Southern Miss in 2009, the Golden Eagle defense finished the year No. 18 nationally in sacks and No. 24 in tackles for loss after standing 93rd and 68th, respectively, in those two defensive categories a season earlier.

Adams came to USM after spending the previous year as linebackers coach and coordinator of player development at Louisiana-Monroe. Prior to his stint at ULM, he worked for two seasons at North Carolina A&T. During his first season in Greensboro, Adams was elevated to interim defensive coordinator status after two games before earning the job on a permanent basis following the final contest. He coached the Aggies' defensive line in 2006 and had responsibility for the linebackers in 2007 in addition to his coordinator duties.

Adams spent the previous four years at Ouachita Baptist (Ark.) University, coordinating the defense and coaching the defensive line in his last season (2005).

He began his career in 1997 as the defensive line coach at Jacksonville (Ala.) State before moving on to Pearl River (Miss.) Community College, where he first served as the linebackers coach and later was named co-defensive coordinator and secondary coach. In 2001, he became the defensive coordinator and continued his duties as recruiting coordinator.

A three-year letterman at USM, Adams was a pivotal part of the Golden Eagles' "Nasty Bunch" defense who wrapped up his linebacking career in 1994 with 76 tackles, five tackles for loss, one sack and one interception.

In the classroom, Adams was a four-year member of the Southern Miss Dean's List during his time as a student-athlete. He earned his bachelor's degree in psychology and sports administration in 1995 before following with a master's degree, also from USM, in 1996.

He is married to the former Alexis Hall, a member of the 1,000-point club and fouryear letterwinner for the Southern Miss women's basketball team. The couple has two boys, Jaylen and Jordyn.



Ryan Anderson (Presbyterian '09) *INSIDE LINEBACKERS COACH*

Ryan Anderson is in his first year as East Carolina's inside linebackers coach after officially accepting the position on the Pirates' staff on Jan. 8. 2016.

His acceptance of the East Carolina position concludes three years of service as a defensive assistant at Southeastern Conference member Vanderbilt from 2013 to 2015. During his last

two seasons in Nashville, Anderson worked alongside Thompson and helped build the Commodore linebackers into one of the SEC's more notable units.

Coaching primarily the inside linebackers and defensive ends, Anderson assisted a unit that statistically ranked among the NCAA's top 25 in fourth down defense (4th), first down defense (5th), redzone defense (6th), third down defense (7th), most fumbles recovered (20th) and scoring defense (23rd) by allowing only 21.0 points per game. One of his top players, Zach Cunningham, earned *Associated Press* First-Team All-SEC honors after ranking among league leaders in tackles for loss (16.5), solo tackles (69) and overall stops (103), forced fumbles (4) and recovered fumbles (3).

In 2014, Anderson played a key role developing inside linebacker Nigel Bowden into a Freshman All-Southeastern Conference performer. Bowden topped all SEC first-year players in total tackles (78) and became the first rookie to pace Vanderbilt in stops since 1998.

The Commodore defense stood among the nation's best in several categories during Anderson's first campaign in Nashville in 2013, including passes intercepted (13th), turnovers gained (13th), pass defense (23rd) and total defense (23rd).

Anderson joined the Vanderbilt staff after serving as defensive line coach at Reinhardt (Ga.) University in 2012. During the 2010 and 2011 seasons, he worked at Cumberland (Tenn.) University as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator, guiding the Phoenix to No. 1 and No. 9 NAIA rankings in third down defense and total defense, respectively.

His first coaching role came at E.C. Glass High School in Lynchburg, Va., where he mentored linebackers and tight ends in 2009.

Anderson was a standout linebacker at Presbyterian (S.C.) College, earning letters in 2006, 2007 and 2008. He received a bachelor's degree in psychology from PC in 2009 before adding a master's of education in community development & action from Vanderbilt in 2015.

He is married to the former Ashley Cook.



Antonio King (N.C. Central '05) RUNNING BACKS COACH

Antonio King is in his first season as running backs coach at East Carolina after formally joining Scottie Montgomery's staff on Jan. 8, 2016.

The appointment at ECU concludes an illustrious prep coaching career for King, who guided Durham Hillside High School to a run of six-straight PAC-6 titles and the 2010 North Carolina High

School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) 4A State Championship with a perfect 16-0 record.

He also captured PAC-6 Coach-of-the-Year honors in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015, while earning Durham Herald-Sun top coaching accolades twice.

After joining the football staff at Hillside in 2005 as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, King was promoted to the head coaching position prior to the 2009 campaign and produced a 72-20 (.783) overall mark and a PAC-6 ledger of 40-1 in seven seasons.

He developed a total of 60 all-conference selections, including the league's offensive back, offensive lineman, defensive lineman and defensive back of the year who helped the Hornets to a 10-3 record in 2015.

King directed Hillside to 40-straight PAC-6 victories after falling to then-conference rival Southern Durham during his first year as head coach.

Recently, he was invited to serve as a coach in both the 2014 Semper Fidelis All-American Game and the 2015 Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas, where King helped the North Carolina all-star squad to a 54-39 win over South Carolina.

While working as an assistant at HHS under Ray Harrison, King played a key role in the turnaround of a Hillside program, that in 2006, posted its first winning season since 2000. In all, the Hornets were 33-8-1 from 2006 to 2008 and advanced to the playoffs each year. As quarterbacks coach, he tutored three unanimous All-PAC-6 signal-callers.

King began his collegiate playing career in 1993 as a quarterback at Howard before transferring to North Carolina Central in 1996. He earned his bachelor's degree in parks and recreation management from NCCU in 2005.

He holds memberships in the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and North Carolina Coaches Association (NCCA).



Phil McGeoghan (Maine '08)
WIDE RECEIVERS COACH

Phil McGeoghan (pronounced muh-GAY-gehn), who spent the last four seasons in the National Football League with the Miami Dolphins, was appointed East Carolina's wide receivers coach on Dec. 23, 2015.

McGeoghan initially joined the storied franchise's offensive staff as assistant wide receivers coach in 2012 before earning

a promotion to wide receivers coach in November, 2015.

Under McGeoghan's direct leadership, standout second-year pass-catcher Jarvis Landry set a single-season franchise record with 110 receptions in 2015 to easily surpass 0.J. McDuffie's mark of 90 set in 1998.

Working along with receivers coach Ken O'Keefe, he helped the LSU product headline a unit in 2014 with 84 catches, which not only ranked fourth overall in club history, but set a Dolphins standard for most by a rookie and stood as the sixth-highest total in the NFL annals for a first-year player. McGeoghan helped Landry hit his stride in December with 35 receptions, the second-most catches in any month in Miami history.

In 2013, McGeoghan assisted in guiding a receiving corps that featured a pair of players with 70-plus receptions in Brian Hartline (76 for 1,016 yards) and Mike Wallace (73 for 930). Additionally, Hartline became the fifth receiver in team history to tally consecutive 1,000-yard seasons, while Wallace finished third in both receptions and receiving yards for a Dolphins player in his first season with the team.

McGeoghan helped coach a young group of wide receivers in 2012 that included a breakout performance from Hartline, who set career highs at the time in receptions (74), reception yards (1,083) and 100-yard receiving games (three). The former Ohio State star also had one of the most prolific games for a receiver in club history, tallying 12 receptions for 253 yards and one touchdown against the Arizona Cardinals on September 30. The 12 grabs served as the second-highest single-game total in the storied franchise's history, while the 253 yards established a new Dolphins standard.

Before accepting a position in the NFL, McGeoghan spent three seasons as wide receivers coach at South Florida beginning in 2009 under head coach Jim Leavitt before working two years with former East Carolina coach Skip Holtz.

During his final season at USF in 2011, three Bulls' receivers - Sterling Griffin (43), Victor Marc (33) and Deonte Welch (31) - each tallied more than 30 receptions. A year earlier in 2010, senior Dontavia Bogan produced one of the best seasons in school history with 685 yards and six touchdowns on 47 receptions to earn All-Big East honors.

In his first season with the Bulls, USF wide receivers were constant big play threats, as both Carlton Mitchell and A.J. Love each averaged more than 17 yards per catch, with

Love's 18.8 clip ranking third all-time at USF. McGeoghan also played a key recruiting role for signing classes that earned Top 25 rankings by various publications during his time in Tampa.

In 2008, McGeoghan worked as the offensive coordinator for the Naval Academy Prep School, which oversees the professional and athletic development of midshipmen and cadet candidates. He began his coaching career at alma mater Maine in 2007 as wide receivers and tight ends coach after a four-year playing career in the NFL that included roster positions with the New Orleans Saints, Denver Broncos, Oakland Raiders and the New York Jets, in addition to playing in NFL Europe for the Berlin Thunder.

McGeoghan earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Maine in 2008 and starred as a wide receiver for the Black Bears, standing fourth in career receiving yards and fifth in receptions.

In the classroom, he earned Academic All-America honors and was recognized as an Arthur Ashe Jr. and Dean Smith Sport Scholar. McGeoghan also served in a leadership capacity as UM's student-athlete president.



Shannon Moore (Black Hills State '00) SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR/TIGHT ENDS COACH

Shannon Moore is in his first season as special teams coordinator and tight ends coach at East Carolina, officially joining the Pirate staff on Jan. 2, 2016.

Moore will direct ECU's punt, field goal, kickoff, return and coverage units after orchestrating the overhaul of one of the most improved special teams squads in Conference USA, if not

nationally, during his two recent years of work at Florida International.

His 2015 edition topped the league and ranked among the country's best in punt return average (10.8 ypr), most blocked kicks (four) and fewest blocks suffered (zero). Moore's efforts at FIU followed eight seasons on the South Dakota State staff where he directed special teams play and worked with quarterbacks, tight ends and running backs.

His work rejuvenating the Golden Panthers' specialists were reflected in a No. 14 national rank in overall efficiency. In addition, his kickoff return coverage squad stood 30th among all FBS programs by allowing only 19.2 yards per attempt.

Individually, All-Conference USA performer Richard Leonard topped the league and ranked 23rd nationally with a punt return average of 10.7, while also rating 18th in the country in combined kick returns (787 yards) under Moore's leadership.

In 2014, Moore's punt return unit established a school record with an 18.2 average for a No. 2 national rank and his kickoff return team was 23rd after netting 23.0 per attempt. Leonard, who earned first-team all-conference honors and was a three-time C-USA Special Teams Player-of-the-Week selection, set a FIU single-season standard with a 23.8 yards-per-return clip.

Prior to his move to Miami, Moore spent the previous eight seasons in a variety of roles at South Dakota State under head coach John Stiegelmeier, coordinating special teams and coaching tight ends from 2010 to 2013 before his departure.

Moore coached the running backs and tight ends in 2006, 2007 and 2008, before taking on the duties of special teams coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2009 campaign. In 2010, Moore returned to coaching the tight ends, while retaining special teams responsibilities.

During his tenure with the Jackrabbits, Moore coached four all-conference running backs and a pair of all-conference tight ends. At running back, Kyle Minett developed into a two-time All-America honoree while ranking second in career rushing with 4,277 yards. Anthony Watson and Cory Koenig also ended their careers in the top five on SDSU's career rushing chart.

Moore played an instrumental role in the development of two-time All-Great West Football Conference tight end Chris Wagner, who later signed as a free agent with the Oakland Raiders. He also served as a mentor to tight end Colin Cochart, who earned first-team All-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors in 2010 and later signed with the Cincinnati Bengals.

The Jackrabbits consistently ranked among the top teams in the Missouri Valley Football Conference in several special teams categories under Moore's direction. SDSU ranked first or second in kickoff coverage in 2010 and 2011, while ranking among the Top 20 nationally for net punting in those respective campaigns as well. The Jackrabbits also stood ninth nationally for kickoff returns with an average of 23.86 yards per attempt in 2010.

In addition to his coaching duties, Moore performed a key role in the academic success of the South Dakota State football program, which led its league in the number of academic all-league selections in each of the eight seasons. In addition, six Jackrabbits earned Capital One Academic All-America honors, two received Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Athletic Directors Association Postgraduate Scholarships and another pair were bestowed with NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

Moore previously served as a graduate assistant at SDSU during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, working with the running backs, tight ends and special teams while pursuing a master's degree in education administration. He later added a master's degree in sports administration from South Dakota State in 2007.

Before returning to Brookings, he served as head coach of the Wyoming Cavalry of the National Indoor Football League, where he compiled an 18-11 record over two seasons. In 2005, Moore led the Casper-based Cavalry to a franchise-best 10-5 record and a playoff berth, while also serving as the team's offensive coordinator.

A native of Gordon, Neb., Moore played three seasons at Black Hills (S.D.) State, where he earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 2000.

Tony Petersen (Marshall '90) OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS COACH

Tony Petersen, who has directed some of the nation's most exciting and prolific offenses that have paved the way for championships and bowl victories, is in his first year as East Carolina's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after accepting the position on Dec. 31, 2015.

Petersen brings over 25 years of experience to the ECU program, including success as a coordinator in the Big Ten Conference and recent record-setting tenures guiding units at both Marshall and Louisiana Tech. His arrival at East Carolina ends a three-year stay in Ruston where he played a pivotal role in the Bulldogs' 18 combined victories and consecutive bowl titles in 2014 and 2015.

He recently helped Louisiana Tech to a 9-4 record, which included a 47-28 win over Arkansas State in the 2015 R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl. Petersen's last contest under (former ECU) head coach Skip Holtz served as a fitting conclusion as the Bulldogs racked up 458 passing yards, 687 total yards and set or tied 17 New Orleans Bowl records at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Dec. 19.

A record-setting quarterback at Marshall, Petersen joined the Bulldog staff in January, 2013 after serving as the Thundering Herd's co-offensive coordinator for three seasons in the second of two stints at his alma mater.

Petersen led a 2015 Louisiana Tech offensive attack that ended the regular season ranked in the top 10 in school history in five different offensive categories, including total yards, points scored, rushing touchdowns, touchdown passes and passing yards. For his efforts, he was formally named a nominee for the Broyles Award - an annual honor that recognizes the nation's top assistant coach.

As the Bulldogs' quarterbacks coach, Petersen molded senior Jeff Driskel into one of the nation's top signal-callers who earned top 25 statistical ratings in eight different offensive categories in 2015, including total offense (335.1 ypg), passing yards (4,033), passing yards per completion (14.4 ypc) and passing touchdowns (27). Louisiana Tech completed the regular season ranked 14th in the NCAA in passing offense and 17th in scoring offense with 37.5 points per game.

A year earlier in 2014, Petersen directed an offense that stood fifth at the FBS level in most improved scoring offense (37.4 ppg) as the Bulldogs powered their way to a 9-5 overall record that included a C-USA West Division title and a 35-18 win over Illinois in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl.

Transfer quarterback Cody Sokol helped the Bulldogs become the 13th-highest scoring offense in the country, while Petersen's guidance resulted in No. 11 and No. 20 national ranks in passing touchdowns and passing yards, respectively, for the senior standout.

In his first season at Tech, Petersen inherited an offensive unit that lost eight starters to graduation with a quarterbacks group that had never taken a collegiate snap. That 2013 season saw four wins with another three games decided by 10 or less points.

Petersen's third season on Doc Holliday's staff at Marshall proved to be his best as he mentored sophomore quarterback Rakeem Cato to an impressive 2012 campaign. The Herd's signal-caller became the first Marshall player and underclassman in C-USA history to earn MVP honors. Cato led the nation in completions per game (33.83) and passing yards per game (350.08) and finished third in TD passes (37), fourth in completion percentage (69.5) and fifth in total offense per game (352.67). He also led the league in pass efficiency (147.1).

As co-coordinator, Petersen's unit led the league in scoring offense, passing offense, total offense, pass efficiency, third down conversions and first downs. In the latter two categories, Marshall ranked second nationally.

Prior to his second stint at Marshall, Petersen spent the 2009 season as the assistant head coach and wide receivers coach at the University of South Dakota. He served the previous two seasons as quarterbacks coach at lowa State University.

Under Petersen's leadership, lowa State quarterback Bret Meyer finished his Cyclone career in 2007 with school record totals for passing yards and total offense.

Prior to serving Iowa State, Petersen coached at the University of Minnesota from 1999 to 2006. He was co-offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach and eventually the passing coordinator for the Golden Gophers, where quarterback Bryan Cupito set an all-time passing mark under Petersen. He also played a critical role in the development of Asad Abdul-Khaliq, a quarterback who rewrote UM's record books.

In Petersen's eight seasons during his first stint at Marshall, the Thundering Herd qualified for the postseason eight straight times, winning Football Championship Subdivision (formerly NCAA Division I-AA) national championships in 1992 and 1996, and Mid-American Conference titles in both 1997 and 1998 when the school moved up to the FBS level.

Petersen served as wide receivers coach in 1992 and directly worked with eventual three-time Super Bowl Champion Troy Brown. Peterson served as quarterbacks coach for five of his previous eight years at Marshall and was offensive coordinator in 1998, coaching future NFL quarterbacks Chad Pennington and Byron Leftwich in that capacity.

As a player at Marshall, Petersen was named the 1988 Southern Conference Athleteof-the-Year and the SoCon Offensive Player-of-the-Year in 1987 after leading the Herd to the NCAA Division I-AA National Championship Game with a school-record 35 touchdown passes.

A free agent signee of the Minnesota Vikings in 1989, Petersen set 16 Southern Conference single-season and career standards in passing and total offense, to go along with six Marshall single-season school marks. He also established NCAA records for most passes in a game without an interception (68) and for most regular season games (11) with more than 200 yards passing.

Petersen went to Marshall after a stellar career at Delta Community College in Stockton, Calif. He was drafted by the Kansas City Royals after his first season at Delta CC.

He earned his bachelor's degree in sports management and marketing in 1990 and master's degree in administration in 1995, both from Marshall.

Petersen and his wife Beth have three children - Andy, Nikki Nelson and Taylor.



Rick Smith (Florida State '71) ASSISTANT HEAD COACH/SECONDARY COACH

Rick Smith, who possesses 35 years of collegiate coaching experience - eight at East Carolina alone - and has directed defenses at the FBS level for nine seasons was immediately retained as secondary coach by first-year head coach Scottie Montgomery on Dec. 23, 2015. Additionally, he was elevated to assistant head coach status on Feb. 3, 2016.

His second tour of duty at ECU, which began in January of 2013, followed a five-year tenure guiding defensive backs from 2005 to 2009 - an era which produced two Conference USA championships, back-to-back league scoring defense statistical titles and a run of four-straight bowl appearances.

Despite inheriting a unit that ranked 75th nationally in passes intercepted, 87th in total defense, 88th in scoring defense and 107th in pass defense a year earlier, Smith exceeded the first-year success he enjoyed in 2005 during his first Pirate tenure with a foundation-building, impacting-producing, bowl-winning second initial campaign in 2013.

In addition to developing 10 All-Conference USA performers, including second-team selections in outside linebacker Derrell Johnson, free safety Damon Magazu and end Lee Pegues, Smith's defense ranked among the nation's top 50 units in four of five major categories and stood 13th at the FBS level against both the pass (18 interceptions) and run (116.7 yards per game allowed).

Under Smith's direction as defensive coordinator, the Pirates surrendered less than 100 rushing yards in six contests alone during the 2013 season, a feat last accomplished in 2009 -- ironically, Smith's final year at ECU during his first stop in Greenville. After giving up a combined 185.6 rushing yards per game, 430.0 total yards per game and 36.1 points per game during Ruffin McNeill's first three years, the Pirates promptly responded to Smith's tutelage by significantly trimming the numbers down to 116.7, 368.8 and 24.8 in just one year of work.

Smith offered an encore in 2014 by ranking 11th nationally against the run (111.8 ypg) and 13th in defensive third-down percentage (34.2), while also standing among the country's top 40 units in interceptions (29th/14), pass efficiency defense (37th/120.21) and total defense (37th/367.3 ypg).

The Pirates held seven opponents under triple-digit yardage totals on the ground and featured the nation's ninth-leading tackler in junior linebacker Zeek Bigger, who became the first ECU defender to reach 140 stops since 2003. Nose tackle Terry Williams, linebacker Brandon Williams joined Bigger on the All-American Athletic Conference squad, while cornerback Josh Hawkins was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award after topping the secondary with five interceptions and 11 pass breakups.

Before re-joining the East Carolina program, Smith served as assistant head coach with oversight of cornerbacks and safeties at Big East Conference member South Florida for three seasons beginning in 2010. His efforts aided a defensive unit that ranked 17th nationally in total defense (317.9 ypg), 22nd in scoring defense (20.0 ppg) and 24th in pass defense (192.3 ypg).

After joining Skip Holtz' initial Pirate staff, Smith quickly provided the revamped ECU defensive backfield with an immediate lift, molding a unit that finished the 2005 campaign ranked among the nation's top 20 in pass defense, allowing only 184.9 yard a game. His schematic preparation also allowed for 15 interceptions during the year before topping that mark in 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2009 with 16, 17, 22 and 17, respectively - figures which ranked 21st, 25th, fifth and 16th nationally.

Smith directed the efforts of two all-conference selections in first-year safety and top team tackler Van Eskridge (104) along with veteran cornerback Travis Williams in 2007 before developing cornerback Emanuel Davis into a five-time all-freshman honoree in 2008, one of which was an All-America designation from Rivals.com. Of the 22 interceptions, which were the most for a Pirate squad since 1994, five came against Tulsa in the C-USA Championship Game victory against the nation's top-ranked offense.

Smith's secondary helped East Carolina to a No. 2 pass defense rank that year in the explosive and offensive-heavy C-USA statistical standings with a 197.2 ypg mark.

In 2009, the Pirate backfield played a key role in ECU's No. 5 FBS standing with 34 forced turnovers and a conference-best 21.9 defensive scoring average, and turned in another notable title game performance by intercepting Houston quarterback Case Keenum three times, including the game-clincher with 42 seconds remaining.

Prior to arriving at East Carolina, Smith served a one-year stint as a defensive backs coach for Berlin in NFL Europe, where he helped lead the Thunder to a league-high 15 pass thefts, a 9-1 record and a 30-24 World Bowl victory over the Frankfurt Galaxy in June, 2004.

Before heading overseas, Smith spent two seasons as co-defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech in 2002 and 2003 after handling recruiting coordinator, assistant head coach and secondary duties at Southeastern Conference member Kentucky during the previous season.

While Cincinnati's defensive coordinator, Smith's unit stood fourth nationally in turnovers gained (34) in 2000 to help the Bearcats to a 7-5 record and an appearance in the Motor City Bowl. Before his two-year tenure at UC, he headed the Tulane defense where he played a pivotal role in the Green Wave's No. 7 national rank and undefeated (12-0) campaign in 1998 which was capped by a win over BYU in the Liberty Bowl. In 1997, he helped Tulane to a 7-4 mark while topping the nation in interceptions with 26.

Smith, 67, enjoyed an earlier seven-year stay at Kentucky, and from 1987 to 1989, he worked under legendary College Football Hall of Fame inductee Grant Teaff at Baylor. His appointment as the Bears' secondary coach followed a season on Ray Perkins' staff at Alabama.

In all, he has played an integral role helping squads reach 12 bowl games during his career, which includes post-season showings as defensive coordinator at Tulane, Cincinnati and ECU, along with other invitations while at Georgia Tech, Alabama, Kentucky and USF.

Smith, who earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Florida State in 1971, is married to the former Barbara Reddick and they are the parents of three grown children - Beth, Steve and Billy -- and three grandchildren.



Kenwick Thompson (Harding '92) DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS COACH

Kenwick Thompson will take over the ECU defense after two seasons at Vanderbilt where he served as associate head coach and mentored all Commodore linebackers in 2015 after directing outside linebackers a year earlier during his first campaign in Nashville.

In 2015 he helped Vanderbilt to Top 25 FBS statistical rankings in fourth down defense (4th), first down defense (5th), redzone defense (6th), third down defense (7th), most fumbles recovered (20th) and scoring defense (23rd) by allowing only 21.0 points per game. His star pupil Zach Cunningham earned Associated Press First-Team All-SEC honors - a first for a Commodore linebacker since 2005 - after ranking among league leaders in tackles for loss (16.5), solo tackles (69), overall stops (103), forced fumbles (4) and recovered fumbles (3).

A year earlier, Thompson was responsible for developing Stephen Weatherly into one of the team's most productive defenders. Moving from defensive end to outside linebacker, Weatherly finished the 2014 season by racking up a team-leading 12.5 tackles for loss.

Thompson joined the Vanderbilt staff after spending the 2013 season as defensive coordinator at San Jose State in the Mountain West Conference and the six preceding years as an assistant at the University of California in the Pac-12 Conference under Jeff Tedford.

While coaching the Spartan linebackers at San Jose State, Thompson helped senior captain Keith Smith to become just the second player in school history to earn All-MWC honors for four years after leading the nation in total tackles with 159. In addition to Smith, Thompson also tutored First-Team All-MWC defensive back Bene Benwikere at SJSU. Benwikere matched the Spartan career record with 14 interceptions, including five picks as a senior. He also ranked among NCAA leaders with 16 passes defended.

From 2007 to 2012, Thompson worked as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at California, playing a key role assisting the Golden Bears to four bowl appearances. In 2012, he was elevated to associate head coach status.

In 2011, Thompson's linebacker corps helped the Golden Bears lead the Pac-12 in both total defense (332.9 yards) and pass defense (204.2 yards) during a 7-6 regular season that concluded with a Holiday Bowl appearance. Cal also topped the Pac-12 in total defense during the 2010 season.

Several of Thompson's linebackers at California earned all-conference accolades. Among his top players was Mychal Kendricks, who earned All-America honors and was selected as the Pac-12 Defensive Player-of-the-Year in 2011 before starring for the Philadelphia Eagles.

During his first tour of duty at San Jose State from 2001 until 2006, Thompson served in a variety of coaching roles under head coaches Fitz Hill and Dick Tomey. His positions included linebackers coach (2001-03), defensive line coach (2004), defensive tackles coach (2006), recruiting coordinator (2001-2004) and head strength and conditioning coach (2005).

From 1994 to 2000, Thompson was on the coaching staff at Texas Southern University, including the last five seasons as defensive coordinator. During the summer of 2000, he was a participant in the prestigious National Football League Minority Coaching Fellowship with the Oakland Raiders, working with the linebackers and defensive line.

As a collegiate player, he was a defensive standout and team captain at Harding (Ark.) University, earning all-conference honors as a senior and finishing his career as the school's all-time sack leader. Thompson earned his undergraduate degree in marketing and sales from Harding in 1992.

Thompson's first coaching position came in a player-coach capacity in the Italian-American Professional Football League in 1990. The following season, Thompson was named as a graduate assistant at his alma mater.

Thompson and his wife, Monica, have two sons, Jaxson and Jacob.



Geep Wade (Chattanooga '02)

OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

Geep Wade, who played a pivotal role helping Middle Tennessee rank among the nation's leaders in both rushing and passing for the past three seasons, is in first year as offensive line coach at East Carolina after officially joining the Pirate staff on Jan. 5, 2016.

Wade recently concluded his tenure with the Blue Raiders with an appearance in the Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, capping a stellar 2015 offensive performance which included 5,946 total yards and school records for passing yardage and touchdowns. Last fall, his line paved the way for an aerial attack that ranked 15th nationally with an average of 311.7 yards per game, a year after his group opened holes for a unit that stood 30th among all FBS programs in rushing.

Three members of the Blue Raiders' offensive line - Jaylen Hunter (first team), Maurquice Shakir (honorable mention) and Chandler Brewer (freshman team) - were honored by Conference USA and gave quarterback Brent Stockstill ample time to produce a school-record 4,005 passing yards, which ranked 11th in the country. In addition, his crew was among the nation's toughest to penetrate, rating 15th in fewest tackles for loss allowed and 22nd in fewest sacks surrendered.

Led by all-conference linemen Isaiah Anderson and Darius Johnson in 2014, Middle Tennessee had four different players rush for more than 100 yards in a game, while quarterback Austin Grammer became the first quarterback in school history to throw for over 200 yards in each of his first seven games.

In 2013, Wade helped develop all-league performer Josh Walker while engineering a group that helped five different players eclipse the 100-yard rushing milestone in a contest. The unit also played an integral role for an offense that ranked 31st nationally in rushing and topped Conference USA in ground yards during MT's eight-game league schedule on the way to an Armed Forces Bowl showing against Navy.

In all, the Blue Raiders amassed over 5,000 yards of offense in each of Wade's three seasons at Middle Tennessee.

Wade made his way to Murfreesboro from Marshall where he coached the offensive line in 2012. His 2012 squad helped Marshall register 365.0 passing yards per game (first in FBS), 534.2 yards of total offense (sixth) and 40.9 points a game (seventh), all C-USA highs. His line also withstood the pounding of an FBS-high 90.6 plays per game that generated 24 rushing touchdowns. The offense also produced just over 20 plays of 10 yards or longer per game to lead the nation.

He spent two seasons leading the offensive line at alma mater Tennessee-Chattanooga, while also serving as the recruiting coordinator. He returned to the sidelines for his second stint as an assistant coach at UTC after serving on the Mocs' staff in 2002 following his graduation.

Wade was in charge of the tackles and tight ends during the 2010 campaign, helping Chris Harr (OT) and Garrett Hughes (TE) to first team All-Southern Conference honors. The play of the offensive line allowed the Mocs to finish 11th among all FCS programs in total offense (430 ypg), while the unit threw for an average of 277 yards, second in the SoCon and eighth nationally.

Wade spent the previous four seasons as an assistant coach at Tennessee-Martin, serving as the offensive coordinator in 2009. In 2008, the Skyhawks posted an 8-4 overall record, ranking fourth in the country in scoring offense (37.33).

In 2007, Wade and the Skyhawk offense ranked No. 1 in the Ohio Valley Conference in total offense (433 ypg) and points scored per game (33.36). The team finished first in rushing offense (218.5 ypg) in the OVC, 12th in the nation.

Before coming to UT Martin in 2006 with head coach Jason Simpson, Wade was an offensive line coach at Western Carolina and Midwestern (Texas) State. He also enjoyed a stint at Tennessee where he was an offensive line graduate assistant for the Volunteers in 2004, the same year the team won the Southeastern Conference East Division title and the Cotton Bowl. In 2003, Wade coached the offensive line and served as the recruiting coordinator at Mars Hill College.

Wade was a team captain and an offensive lineman at UTC from 1999 to 2001, earning his bachelor's degree in business management in 2002.

He is married to the former Amy Howell of McKenzie, Tenn. The couple has two children - Emma Kate and Jackson.

Greenville. N.C. – Senior running back Chris Hairston rushed for a careerhigh 154 yards and four touchdowns on 18 carries to lead East Carolina to a 28-20 nonconference win over Towson in the season opener for both teams at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium ... Hairston, who also hauled in a personal-best five pass receptions, averaged nearly nine yards (8.6) per attempt and became the first Pirate back to eclipse the 100-yard mark in an opener since 2009 ... The four scores were also the most by an ECU ball-carrier since Chris Johnson tallied four at Memphis in 2007 ... Blake Kemp, making his first career start, used a short but effective passing game with a 29-of-37, 230-yard performance to offer ECU balance offensively ... Although the Pirates racked up 440 yards, victory wasn't certain until junior strong safety Terrell Richardson's bone-jarring hit on Tigers' receiver Sam Gallahan knocked the ball loose on what appeared to be an apparent fourth-down catch at the Pirate 16-yard line with only 1:55 remaining in the contest ... Towson never led, but kept in striking distance behind a relentless rushing attack by Darius Victor (28-137) ... After East Carolina opened its biggest advantage of the night, 28-13 with 12:21 remaining in the fourth quarter on Hairston's final ground score of the game, the Tigers immediately answered with an 11-play, 75-drive that was capped with a one-yard TD plunge by quarterback Connor Frazier with 7:53 left ... Towson forced a three-and-out on ECU's next possession and followed by marching 44 yards down to the 16 before Richardson's game-preserving hit ... Although the Pirates did not commit a turnover, they were flagged eight times.

Gainesville, Fla. – Junior quarterback Blake Kemp passed for a career-high 333 yards and three scores, but a costly fumble at the Gator 30-yard line with 12 seconds remaining preserved Florida's 31-24 non-conference victory over East Carolina at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium ... For the second time in as many games against UF within an eight-month span, the Pirates rallied late by driving deep into Gator territory trailing by a touchdown before a turnover ended any hopes of a comeback ... After Kemp connected with Bryce Williams on a seven-yard TD pass with 3:04 remaining to pull ECU within seven, the Pirate defense forced a Florida punt after a three-and-out ... Kemp drove East Carolina down to the Gator 13-yard line, but lost his grip on a pass attempt during a second-and-10 snap and UF's Alex McCalister recovered the loose ball ... After defensive struggle produced a 10-7 Florida halftime edge, ECU took its last lead of the game on Isaiah Jones' 27-yard scoring catch early in the third period ... The Gators answered with a Will Grier touchdown strike and a 39-yard interception return for a score by Jalen Tabor to close out the quarter with a 24-14 cushion ... Davis Plowman's 30-yard field goal pulled the Pirates to within seven before Kelvin Taylor's seven-yard TD jaunt appeared to put the game out of reach with 6:57 remaining ... While Kemp enjoyed success through the air, the Gators clamped down on the run - limiting ECU to -13 yards - the program's third-lowest single-game ground total in history ... Jones (14-135) and Williams (9-83) each enjoyed personal-best outings.

Conn. – While Arkeel Newsome's 179-vard, two-touchdown rushing effort highlighted the offensive attack, it was the Huskies' defense that spearheaded Connecticut's 31-17 American Athletic Conference win over East Carolina at Pratt & Whitney Stadium ... The Pirates were held to their lowest passing total since 2012 after managing just 137 air yards, plus were intercepted a season-high four times - three inside the UConn 35-yardline ... Holding a slim 10-6 halftime lead, the Huskies clamped down on ECU's offense in a game-deciding third quarter by surrendering only 25 ground yards ... The Pirates did not complete a pass in eight attempts and were 0-of-5 on third down during the 15-minute stanza, while Connecticut got a 23-yard scoring pass from Bryant Shirreffs to Alec Bloom and a 90-yard TD scamper from Newsome to extend its cushion to 24-6 ... East Carolina got on the board first via safety DeShawn Benton's 32-yard interception return, but were held scoreless until quarterback Blake Kemp came off the bench to cap a four-play, 49-yard scoring drive with a two-yard run midway through the fourth quarter ... James Summers earned the start for ECU and experienced extended action through most of the third quarter, but only managed 87 yards on a 12-of-21 passing effort ... Kemp took his first snap of the contest with 1:51 remaining in the period and was seven-of-11 for 50 yards, but was also picked off three times ... In all, both Pirate quarterbacks accounted for 50 total air yards in the final 30 minutes which hampered comeback efforts ... One of the bright spots for ECU offensively was the return of Marquez Grayson, who rushed for a career-high 87 yards on nine carries (9.7 ypr) after missing the first seven games.

East Carolina was held to just 29 first-half yards (six passing), but entered intermission only trailing 12-7 ... Summers, who rushed for a team-high 42 yards, capped an eight-play, 59-yard drive late in the third quarter to give ECU its first lead of the game, 14-12 ... The Bulls and Pirates then traded field goals, setting the stage for Flowers' heroics ... Marlon Mack led an efficient USF ground attack with 117 yards on 27 carries.

Orlando, Fla. – Quarterback Blake Kemp passed for a career-high 465 yards and four touchdowns to highlight the Pirates' most complete offensive performance of the year as East Carolina posted a convincing 44-7 American Athletic Conference triumph over UCF at Bright House Networks Stadium ... The win was ECU's first in Orlando since 2008 and snapped a three-game losing skid ... The Pirates racked up a season-best 622 yards on 85 total plays - an average of 7.3 yards per snap - and had three additional touchdowns called back because of penalties ... Kemp's efforts were complemented by a 14-reception, 181-yard, two-touchdown outing by Isaiah Jones, a 123-yard rushing night by Chris Hairston and three field goals by Davis Plowman, including a career-long 45-yarder in the second quarter ... After spotting the Knights an early 7-0 lead, the Pirates stormed back by scoring on their first two offensive possessions to go ahead 14-7 and spark a run of 44 unanswered points ... Kemp was 20-of-30 for 260 yards and three TD strikes in the first half to help ECU build a 31-7 advantage at intermission ... The Pirates forced three turnovers, two coming on fumbles during special teams returns, and held UCF to just 232 total yards - the fewest tallied against East Carolina all season ... Hairston averaged 8.8 yards per carry and scored from 39 yards out, while Davon Grayson added 99 reception yards on four grabs.

After Gantz' three-point miss from 44 yards, ECU got the ball back at its own 27 with 4:27 remaining hoping to drive into field goal range but netted just seven yards on three plays before punting it back and setting the stage for the Bearcats' game-deciding possession ...
