While the official name of our institution remains East Carolina University, we would appreciate your help in referring to us simply as the ECU Pirates. Thank you for your assistance as we continue our rebranding efforts.

POINTS OF INTEREST

▶ ECU will end its pre-exam schedule Monday night as it welcomes longtime foe Campbell to Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum for a 7 p.m. tip-off. Both teams enter the game winners in each of their last two games with identical records of 4-4.

▶ The Pirates lead the all-time series with the Camels, 38-20 and have won 31 of 41 meetings since 1980 when both teams were Division I members. The series is the oldest in school history, dating back to East Carolina Teacher's College inaugural season of 1931-32. This will be the first time any current member of the Pirates has ever played against Campbell as this is the first meeting in the series since Jan. 2, 2014.

▶ ECU will be looking to win three games in a row for the first time since the early portion of the 2015-16 season when it won three straight against Stetson (Nov. 27), Florida Atlantic (Dec. 1) and USC Upstate (Dec. 4).

▶ Kentrell Barkley and Isaac Fleming each scored 17 points, while Barkley grabbed 14 rebounds and Jabari Craig nabbed 14 boards in ECU's 63-57 win over Delaware State Saturday. The Pirates won the battle of the boards by 18 and outscored the Hornets by eight at the free throw line to earn the victory despite committing 17 turnovers.

▶ ECU has outscored seven of its first eight opponents in the paint. The Pirates own 280-232 advantage in the lane, averaging 35.0 points per game. ECU scored a season-high 50 points in the paint Thursday night against UNCW.

▶ Fleming has scored double figures in a season-long four straight games, averaging 18.75 points per game. The longest double-figure scoring streak of his career is five games which he did twice during his sophomore season (2015-16) at Hawaii.

▶ Barkley is four rebounds shy of becoming the 23rd player in school history to grab 500 career rebounds. He has posted a double-double in two of the past three games, averaging 15 points and 10 rebounds per game during those contests. He is one of seven players in The American to have registered multiple double-doubles this season.

▶ Freshman Shawn Williams has scored double figures in each of the past three games and five times overall this season. Williams has scored 76 points this season, while the other seven players who haven't started a game for ECU this season have combined for 49 points. ECU's five starters have combined for 441 points, while bench has supplied only 125 points.

▶ Dimitri Spasojevic is the only freshman to rank among the top 20 in the American Athletic Conference in rebounding AND field goal percentage. He is fifth in the conference in field goal percentage (.585) and 19th in rebounding (5.6 rpg).

▶ ECU is the only team in the league to have three players rank among the top 20 in rebounding: Jabari Craig (6th, 7.6), Kentrell Barkley (6.3/13th) and Spasojevic (19th/5.6).

GAME 5 RECAP - Rutgers 61, ECU 47

RESULT: Rutgers, the nation's leader in scoring defense, held ECU to 47 points and defeated the Pirates 61-47 in the final game of the Showcase On The Banks for both teams.

TURNING POINT: After ECU had pulled within seven early in the second half, Rutgers (6-0) outscored the Pirates 25-8 over a 10-minute stretch to take 57-33 lead with 7:56 remaining. Six Scarlet Knights scored three or more points during the run led by seven from guard Mike Williams, who capped the spurt with a 3-pointer.

KEY PERFORMERS: Senior Jabari Craig scored a career-high 14 points on 6-of-11 shooting with five rebounds in 22 minutes of action ... ECU freshman Dimitri Spasojevic grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds, marking the first time he garnered double digit rebounds in his career ... Senior Isaac Fleming was the only other player on the team to score double figures, finishing with 14 points.

GAME 6 RECAP - North Carolina A&T 87, ECU 81

RESULT: North Carolina A&T posted its first-ever victory over ECU on Sunday, 87-81, snapping the Pirates' five-game winning streak in the series.

TURNING POINT: Aaren Edmead's 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4:07 to play gave North Carolina A&T a 76-71 lead. The Aggies outscored the Pirates 7-2 over a two minute stretch late in the game to break a 69-all tie. ECU pulled within three on two made free throws by Kentrell Barkley with 3:19 remaining, but never got closer.

KEY PERFORMERS: Barkley posted his first double-double of the season, scoring 19 points and grabbing 11 rebounds and distributed a team-high five assists, while playing all 40 minutes ... Isaac Fleming tied his career-high with 23 points, scoring 17 second half points ... Shawn Williams came off the bench to score a career-high 19 points, including 14 in the first half ... Williams made 4-of-4 3-point attempts in the first half ... B.J. Tyson added 11 points and became the ninth player in school history to score 1,200 career points and moved into fifth-place on The American's all-time scoring list with 1,209 points ... Jabari Craig snatched nine rebounds and blocked three shots.

GAME 7 RECAP - ECU 93, UNCW 88 (ot)

RESULT: ECU snapped a two-game skid with a 93-88 overtime win against in-state rival UNCW Thursday night in its first game under interim coach Michael Perry. ECU Head Coach Jeff Lebo resigned his position Wednesday afternoon.

TURNING POINT: The Pirates scored six unanswered points during a 1:21 of overtime to take an 88-83 lead with 2:15 remaining. Isaac Fleming penetrated the paint for two layups and B.J. Tyson made a pair of free throws, while UNCW missed a pair of 3-point attempts.

RESULT: ECU (4-4) recorded its second straight victory with a 63-57 win over Delaware State (2-7) inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum Saturday and improve to 2-0 under interim head coach Michael Perry.

TURNING POINT: Barkley's steal and subsequent dunk gave ECU a two possession lead with two minutes remaining. That was part of a 7-0 run which gave the Pirates a 60-52 lead with 1:35 to play. The Hornets pulled within three with 1:06 remaining but came up empty on their game-tying possession and Shawn Williams sealed it with two free throws with 17 seconds left.

KEY PERFORMERS: Junior Isaac Fleming scored 17 points, grabbed six rebounds and dished out four assists and collected two steals ... Fleming was 7-of-13 from the field and 3-of-3 at the free throw line ... It was his fourth straight game scoring 14 or more points and third in a row with 17 or more ... Barkley posted his second double-double in the last three games scoring 17 points and grabbing a season-best 14 rebounds ... Jabari Craig pulled down double digit rebounds for the second straight game, grabbing 11 boards ... In the past three games he grabbed 34 total rebounds (9-14-11) ... Shawn Williams added 12 points off the bench, shooting 4-of-8 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from 3.

► Jayden Gardner (F • 6-8 • Wake Forest, N.C. • Heritage HS)

Tabbed CAP-8 Player-of-the-Year as a junior last season after earning co-conference player-of-the-year honors as a sophomore in 2015-16 ... Voted first-team all-state in 2017 by the North Carolina Basketball Coaches Association (NCBA) as well as District V Player-of-the-Year ... As a junior, he averaged 22.8 points and 15.8 rebounds per game while shooting 59 percent from the floor to lead the Huskies to the CAP-8 regular season championship and to the third round of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) 4A state playoffs. Heritage finished the season with an overall record of 28-2 ... Stands as Heritage's all-time leader in points (1,154) and rebounds (903) entering his senior season; first player in school history to score over 1,000 career points ... PERRY TABBED INTERIM COACH

► For the second time in 10 months, Michael Perry has been handed the reigns of the ECU basketball program in the middle of the season. Perry was tabbed interim coach following Jeff Lebo's resignation on Nov. 29.

► Perry served as acting head coach for the final 14 games of the 2016-17 season while Lebo recovered from hip replacement surgery. ECU posted a 6-8 mark during those games.

GOOD PERIMETER D

► The Pirates have held four of their first seven opponents to 32.0 percent or less shooting outside the arc, limiting both Coppin State and Cleveland State to 23.1 percent.

► Two of the Pirates' three victories this season have come when holding thier opponent to under 30 percent outside the arc.

LEDAY TO MISS THE SEASON BUT GIVEN A SIXTH YEAR

► Virginia Tech transfer Seth LeDay will have to sit out the 2017-18 season according to an NCAA ruling. However, he was granted a sixth-year of eligibility and will be able to play in the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.

► LeDay played at Seminole State College in Seminole, Okla. during his freshmen season (2014-15) and then at Northwest Mississippi Community College as a sophomore (2015-16) before transferring to Virginia Tech (2016-17).

SHEPPARD AND WILKINS SUSPENDED

► ECU sophomores Jeremy Sheppard and Raquan Wilkins have been suspended indefinitely from the men's basketball program for a violation of athletics department policy. The suspension was announced on Nov. 3.

► Sheppard was named to The American All-Rookie Team last season averaging 9.2 points, 2.1 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 26.6 minutes per game.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

► The Pirates' 2017-18 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) from eight states and three foreign countries (Canada, Nigeria and Serbia).

► Seven Pirates are native North Carolinians, while an additional five hail from eastern seaboard states (Delaware, Georgia, Virginia).

► ECU has one graduate transfer, two seniors, five juniors, three sophomores, one redshirt freshman and three true freshmen.

► Three Pirates stand 6-foot-8 or taller, while nine are 6-foot-6 or smaller.

► Four players (not including LeDay) transferred to ECU from either another NCAA institution or junior college.

► Guards Isaac Fleming and Shawn Williams are each eligible to play this season after sitting out the 2016-17 campaign.

HOME IS WHERE THE PIRATES ARE

► ECU will play its eighth of a record-tying 19 regular season games inside Williams Arena at Mingos Coliseum (10 non-conference, nine American Athletic Conference) on Monday. The only other occurrence came 10 years ago when they hosted 11 non-conference opponents and eight Conference USA foes, posting a 9-10 record.

► The Pirates opened the 2017-18 campaign with four straight home games before heading to Piscataway, N.J. to face Rutgers on Nov. 24. ECU will play its final six non-conference tilts inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum before opening American conference play at Tulsa on Nov. 28.

► ECU has a combined record of 85-65 (.571) inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum against the 19 opponents that comprise the 2017-18 home schedule, which includes 19 victories over both Campbell and UNCW.

BARKLEY AMONG AMERICAN'S TOP RETURNERS

► Junior Kentrell Barkley ranks among the top-7 returning scorers and rebounders in The American this season. He is the seventh leading returning scorer after averaging 13.2 points per game last season. Barkley also ranks third in rebounding among league players back from a year ago with a 7.6 rebounds per game average.

► Barkley was tabbed preseason all-conference by *Sports Illustrated* along with Jalen Adams (UConn), Rob Gray (Houston), Landry Shamet (Wichita State) and Obi Enechionya (Temple).

► He was named preseason all-conference fourth team by *collegesportsmaddness.com*.

← JEFF LEBO RESIGNS AS HEAD COACH →

ECU Head Men's Basketball Coach Jeff Lebo announced his resignation effective immediately Wednesday afternoon.

Lebo compiled 116 victories during his seven-plus seasons at the helm of the ECU program making him the winningest coach during the school's NCAA Division I era, which dates back to 1965, and second-most all-time. Under his guidance, the Pirates recorded their first-ever 20-win season as a Division I institution, received three postseason tournament invitations and captured the 2013 CIT postseason tournament title.

The Pirates won an ECU-record 23 games en route to their 2013 CIT championship.

Lebo is one of only three ECU coaches to have recorded multiple winning seasons in the school's Division I history. The Pirates won 56 games during his first three seasons, the second-most by any Pirate coach during any three-year period (Howard Porter, 57, 1952-55). His average of over 16 wins per season ranks first among all ECU basketball coaches.

The Carlisle, Pa. native produced six All-Conference USA selections, including the Pirates' only first-team selection and scoring champion Maurice Kemp in 2013. He also helped a trio of players earn American Athletic Conference All-Rookie team honors.

In addition to setting records for victories, Lebo's Pirates also established single-season marks for points, three-point field goals made, assists, blocks, steals and fewest turnovers per game. His teams own six of the top seven places on the ECU team season record list for 3-point field goals made and four of the best five assist campaigns.

Lebo departs as one of only three coaches in school history to lead the program for more than six seasons joining Howard Porter, who coached the team for 12 seasons (1947-59) and Tom Quinn, who led the Pirates' transition to Division I for eight years (1966-74).

WOJCIK JOINS COACHING STAFF

► Doug Wojcik, a veteran college basketball coach with more than 25 years of experience, joined the coaching staff prior to the start of the 2017-18 season after he most recently served as the special assistant to Gonzaga Head Coach Mark Few during the 2015-16 season.

► Wojcik joined the Pirates after previously holding head coaching duties at the University of Tulsa (2005-12) and the College of Charleston (2012-14) where he compiled a career record of 178-121 over nine seasons and led four teams into postseason play. He is the all-time winningest head coach in Tulsa history with 140 victories and averaged 20 wins per season with the Golden Hurricane.

► A 1987 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Wojcik spent 15 years as an assistant coach at the U.S. Naval Academy, Notre Dame, North Carolina and Michigan State, helping seven teams reach the NCAA Tournament.

► He helped recruit six McDonald's All-Americans, four of whom were first round NBA Draft picks, during his tenure in Chapel Hill and South Bend. Wojcik has coached or recruited nearly two dozen NBA players, developing eight first round draft picks.

SILVER ANNIVERSARY CHAMPIONSHIP

The 2017-18 season mark the silver anniversary of ECU's lone CAA championship and last trip to the NCAA Tournament in 1993. The seventh-seeded Pirates defeated No. 2 seed Old Dominion in the quarterfinals and then took down No. 6 seed UNCW in the semifinals the following night. In the championship game, ECU knocked off top-seeded James Madison, 54-49, to complete its improbable run and claim the conference's automatic bid to the tournament. Senior Lester Lyons was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player, scoring 14 points in the title game. Fellow senior Isaac Copeland, who scored his only points of the championship tilt at the free throw line with 14.3 seconds to play, was also named to the all-tournament team.

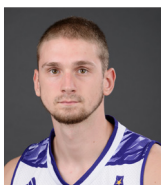

A member of the ECU coaching staff for the previous 10 seasons, Michael Perry was named interim head coach on Nov. 29, 2017 following the resignation of coach Jeff Lebo.

Perry, now in his 11th season with the Pirates, served as acting head coaching for the final 14 games of the 2016-17 campaign while Lebo recovered from hip replacement surgery. The Pirates compiled a 6-8 record during those games which included a victory over UCONN and a win over Temple in the first round of the American Athletic Conference Basketball Championship tournament.

Prior to joining the East Carolina coaching staff, Perry spent five years (2003-07) as the head coach at Georgia State after serving as an assistant coach to "Lefty" Driesell for five years. During his 10 years, Perry was a major catalyst in the growth of the basketball program and helped lead the transition from the Atlantic Sun Conference into the Colonial Athletic Association.

During his tenure at Georgia State, the Panthers won 165 games (an average of 16.5 per year) and advanced to postseason play twice. Perry

helped guide the Panthers to the Atlantic Sun Conference title in 2001 and a NCAA Tournament First Round upset of Wisconsin. Georgia State received a bid to the NIT the following year.

With Perry on the bench, Georgia State won three regular season conference championships and one tournament title. He also coached the team to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history, while helping direct a trio of 20-win campaigns. Perry guided the Panthers to a 20-9 record during his first full season as head coach in 2003-04.

He was promoted from associate head coach to head coach on Jan. 3, 2003, when Driesell announced his retirement. He had joined the staff as an assistant with Driesell in 1997.

Perry began his coaching career at Virginia Union in 1985. He then moved to his alma mater, University of Richmond, in 1986 where he remained until joining Driesell at Georgia State in 1997.

Perry was a four-year letterman at Richmond and was elected to the Richmond Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002. He started in all 108 of the Spiders' games from 1978-81. Perry was an all-conference player and honorable mention All-America. He averaged close to 20 points each season, including 22.8 points per game average as a senior. He was a 1981 draft pick of the Kansas City (now Sacramento) Kings.

Perry, a native of Richmond, Va., received his degree in real estate business from the University of Richmond. He and his wife Darlene have two daughters, Rashawna and Ashley, and one son, Michael, Jr.
