Preseason Notebook

■ Dooley Takes Over Again

- Coach Joe Dooley returned to take over the ECU program for a second time in April after five seasons at Florida Gulf Coast. Dooley served as the Pirates' head coach from 1995-99 and compiled a 57-52 ledger during his four-year tenure.
- Dooley spent a total of eight years during his previous stint at ECU, serving as the top assistant coach to Eddie Payne from 1991-95 before being promoted to head coach following Payne's departure.
- He won more games (44) in his first three years at the helm of the program than any of his predecessors. In 1996-97, he led the Pirates to their only top-3 finish during their 15-year membership in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), tying for third with a 9-7 record.

■ Coaching Staff Additions

- Coach Joe Dooley added four new members and retained two others to make up his 2018-19 coaching staff. Raphael Chillioux and Steve Roccaforte joined the program as coaches while Tyler Lewis and Derek DeMasi signed on as support staff members. Ken Potosnak and Kyle Robinson were retained from the previous regime.
- Chillioux will serve as the Pirates' associate head coach after spending the previous season in the same capacity at UConn following seven years at Washington and one at Villanova.
- Roccaforte was named assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator in July after four years at Virginia Tech, serving as associate head coach during the 2017-18 season. Prior to going to Blacksburg, Roccaforte was the head coach at Lamar as well as an assistant at Centenary, Memphis, Tulane, USF and Wyoming.
- Lewis, former guard at NC State and Butler, spent one year as the director of recruiting at Furman before joining the Pirates' program, while DeMasi was the assistant video coordinator for Dooley at Florida Gulf Coast in 2017-18.

■ Roster Breakdown

- The Pirates' 2017-18 roster features 15 players (11 scholarship student-athletes) from eight states and one foreign country (Serbia).
- Five Pirates are native North Carolinians, while an additional six hail from eastern seaboard states (Delaware, Georgia, Maryland, Virginia).
- ECU has three seniors (one on scholarship), two juniors (one scholarship), four sophomores, six true freshmen (one walk-on).
- Eight Pirates are listed between 6-foot-4 and 6-foot-7, while three are listed at 6-foot-8 or taller and four at 6-foot-3 or smaller.
- Forward Seth LeDay is eligible to play this season after sitting out the 2017-18 campaign in accordance with NCAA rules.
- The Pirates welcome six freshmen to their 2018-19 roster. The group is comprised of guards Tyler Foster, Tae Hardy and DeShaun Wade along with forwards Jayden Gardner, Rico Quinton and Samson Strickland.
- Senior Isaac Fleming and junior Seth LeDay are the only scholarship upperclassmen on the 2018-19 roster.
- There are a total of five upperclassmen on the team, but seniors Addison Hill and Justice Obasohan along with junior John Whitley are all walk-ons.


■ Fleming Atop The American Distribution Leaders

- Isaac Fleming leads all returning American Athletic Conference players in assists after distributing an average of 4.8 per game as a junior. He ranked second only to Wichita State's Landry Shamet, who posted a league-best 5.2 assists per game. Fleming topped The American with four double-digit assist games a year ago.

■ Williams' Shooting Improves In League Play

- After shooting just 31.5 percent outside the arc during non-conference play, Shawn Williams found his groove in league play and shot 38.7 percent from 3-point range. In the final nine games of the season, Williams connected on 43.8 percent of his 3-point attempts (32-of-73). He finished the year ranked 11th overall in The American in 3-point field goal percentage (.367) as well as conference only games.
- Williams finished second in The American with 3.13s per game during conference play behind Houston's Cory Davis, who is returning for his senior season in 2018-19. He ranked third overall with 2.4 triples per game behind Davis (2.9) and Landry Shamet (2.6). During the final 13 games of the year, Williams averaged 3.5 3-point field goals per game.

Credential Requests

The ECU Athletics Media Relations office reserves the right to revoke or deny working media credentials to any individual or organization at any time for any reason. All credentials are property of ECU and must be surrendered upon requests. Any requests placed less than 24 hours prior to the game may not be honored.

Photographers

Photographer credentials are limited. Accredited photographers may work along the baseline at either end of the court in the designated areas. No photographer will be allowed to shoot in front of the scorer's table, press row, behind the team benches or from the stands. The platform atop the south side of Williams Arena is reserved exclusively for team videographers and network television cameras. Photographers must be sitting or kneeling in the end zone areas at all times.

Covering Practice

ECU practices are CLOSED the media and public. Media desiring to conduct coach or player interviews should contact the ECU Athletics Media Relations at least 24 hours in advance. Photographers are allowed to shoot a predetermined portion at the beginning of each practice. Pirate coaches and student-athletes will be available for interviews prior to the start of practice the day before home games, and the day prior to traveling for away games.

Parking

Media parking is located in the lower Minges lot. Entry to the lot is off Charles St. and onto Ficklen Drive. Parking is on a first-come, first-serve basis, and no passes are required to park in this lot.

Game Services

Pregame statistics, game notes and roster cards are provided prior to tip-off. A play-by-play and final statistics are included in the postgame booklets. Complete stat books will be available to media after the completion of each contest. Statistical monitors will be provided to television and radio broadcasts based on availability.

Wireless Internet

Wireless internet access is available inside the arena and the interview room. An access code is required and can be obtained from a member of the ECU Athletics Media Relations staff. Press row, which is located at the top of section 213, is also equipped with high speed ethernet cables.

Postgame Interviews

At home games, all postgame interviews will be conducted in the interview room located in the hallway behind sections 112-114. A multi-box is available. Each head coach and designated players will be brought into this area following a customary 10-minute cooling off period. The ECU locker room is closed.

Real-Time Internet Policy

The ECU Department of Athletics retains the rights to the distribution of play-by-play, statistical material and photographs of ECU basketball during and following game action, just as it retains the rights to the video and audio description of game action. All rights to the dissemination of audio, video and real-time material is granted on a contractual basis only. Failure to abide by these restrictions may result in the revocation of press credentials.

ECU's official athletic website is ECUPirates.com, which features the 2018-19 team fact book, statistics, game notes, roster, schedule, past season archives and other information. Video highlights as well as pre-practice and postgame interviews are posted to the site.

Visiting Radio

Radio network right-holders for opposing teams are provided three seats along the scorer's table directly next to the visiting team bench. A stat monitor is available and printed stats will be provided at halftime and at the conclusion of each game. ECU provides an ISDN line and analog line at no charge.

Injury Reports

Per university policy, athletic training room personnel are not allowed to publicly comment on player injuries. All requests for player injury reports should be directed to the Athletics Media Relations office. Federal policy (HIPPA) prohibits information other than listing the injured "body part" and "game status" from being released.

■ 100,000-Watt Flagship Steers Pirate IMG Radio Network

The ECU Athletics Department and IMG College, the multimedia rights-holder for Pirate Athletics, are in the 11th year of a partnership with 107.9 WNCT-FM, the 100,000-watt flagship station for the Pirate IMG Radio Network.

WNCT-FM's powerful signal provides expanded coverage for ECU sports, extending to Raleigh (to the west), southern Virginia (to the north) and up and down the North Carolina coastline.

The ECU Department of Athletics and IMG College, the national leader in the collegiate sports marketing industry, entered into an agreement during the spring of 2006 that provides the company with the exclusive multimedia rights to Pirate Athletics.

The partnership, which now runs through 2023 and continues to guarantee the university an annual rights fee plus additional considerations based upon revenue generated by IMG College, encompasses all sales and marketing opportunities associated with ECU sports, including radio and television programming, game programs and other athletics publications, signage in all campus athletic venues, and at-event corporate promotions and hospitality functions.

Pirate Basketball may be heard throughout North Carolina as well as portions of South Carolina and Virginia via the Pirate IMG Radio Network.

Jeff Charles is in his 31st year handling the play-by-play duties on the network after previously serving in the same capacity at Virginia Tech, Illinois, and Furman prior to becoming the "Voice of the Pirates." The two-time North Carolina Sportscaster-of-the-Year also served as sports director at WSB in Atlanta where he was the night-time host of a sports talk show heard throughout 38 states and Canada on the 50,000-watt clear channel station. He resides with his wife, Debbie, in Farmville.

Joining Charles for his 21st season on the broadcast is Si Seymour. The Elizabeth City native served as head basketball coach at Craven Community College in New Bern for 17 years and was four times named Region X Coach of the Year. 

Take U.S. Highway 13 from Suffolk to Ahoskie, N.C. Take bypass around Ahoskie (N.C. Highway 11) and take N.C. Highway 11 to Greenville where it turns into Memorial Drive. Take Fifth Street to Cotanche Street and take a right. Take Cotanche, which turns into Charles Boulevard to Ficklen Drive and take a left. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

From I-95 North

Take I-95 South to U.S. Highway 264 exit (Wilson, N.C.). Take a left at the end of the exit ramp and continue on U.S. Highway 264 past Wilson and head into Greenville. Take U.S. Highway 264 to Allen Road (second traffic light) and turn right. Allen Road turns into Greenville Boulevard. Take Greenville Boulevard to Charles Boulevard and take a left (ECU message board on corner). Take Charles Boulevard down hill (passing Clark-LeClair Stadium on the right) and turn right on Ficklen Drive. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

From I-95 South


From the Triangle Area

It enrolls more than 29,000 undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students and is North Carolina's largest preparer of initially licensed teachers and baccalaureate nurses. ECU is the state's most influential preparer of primary care physicians who practice in rural and underserved communities. It is home to a rapidly growing Honors College and the largest College of Business in North Carolina. Additionally, the university is one of only a few nationwide with dental medicine, engineering and medicine at the same institution.

Our motto is *Servire*, or To Serve.

Quick Facts

- Military ties:** ECU is located near four major military bases, including Camp Lejeune and Fort Bragg. In 2010, the university received the Freedom Award from the United States Department of Defense for its support of military families and service men and women, and in 2017, ECU was the first university to receive the United States Department of Defense Extraordinary Support Award for sustained support of National Guard and Reserve service members.
- Economic Muscle:** ECU's economic impact is estimated at \$2.8 billion statewide, with more than \$1.8 billion in eastern North Carolina.
- Primary Care:** The Brody School of Medicine has consistently been ranked by the American Academy of Family Physicians among the top five (often No. 1) in the nation for the percentage of graduates who choose residencies in family medicine each year. The school is a national model for producing family physicians who practice in rural and underserved communities. Nearly 60 percent of Brody graduates remain in primary care five years after graduation – the highest percentage of any medical school in North Carolina.
- Dental Medicine:** ECU dental students spend their fourth year training and serving patients at community service learning centers located in eight underserved areas across the state. The method prepares them to practice and engage with rural communities while also providing much-needed dental care to these regions. In recognition of this work, Dr. Gregory Chadwick, dean of the School of Dental Medicine, was awarded the 2017 James E. Holshouser Jr. Award in Public Service by the University of North Carolina system. Our second class of graduates headed into practice or residency in 2016.
- Leading in Preparing Teachers:** ECU's Partnership East program, funded by a private sector grant, helps fill an urgent need for teachers in North Carolina's rural classrooms by providing scholarships allowing residents of rural communities to complete their senior year teaching internships without leaving home. Seventy-five percent of Partnership East graduates are teaching in North Carolina, and 94 percent of those are teaching in eastern North Carolina.
- National Recognition for Engagement and Public Service:** ECU received the prestigious C. Peter Magrath Award for University/

Community Engagement in 2012 from the Association of Public and Land Grant Universities for its partnership with and service to the citizens of West Greenville through the Lucille W. Gorham Intergenerational Center.

- Improving Lives:** Dr. Sam Sears, a psychologist and researcher who is the world's authority on cardiac psychology, performs groundbreaking work to help cardiac patients improve their quality of life. His work toward the welfare of the human race won him the highest faculty honor in the UNC system, the O. Max Gardner Award, in 2013.
- ECU was named one of four national finalists for the 2016 Magrath Award, this time for the Brody School of Medicine's MATCH Wellness program – an interdisciplinary, community-university partnership created to combat childhood obesity.
- Dr. Carmen RussoNielo, director of ECU's Center for Applied Psychophysiology, was awarded the 2015 James E. Holshouser Jr. Award for Excellence in Public Service for his work using biofeedback in the treatment of wounded warriors with PTSD.

- ECU nurtures a culture of high academic achievement on campus; the Honors College received nearly four times the number of applications over the number of open slots this year.
- In addition, we integrate public service into the custom learning experience of our highest-performing students, immersing them in leadership and learning that requires service projects as part of the Honors College curriculum.
- We are a highly diverse campus, with minorities making up 32 percent of our undergraduate, 36 percent of our medical and 26 percent of our dental students.
- ECU students, faculty and staff engage in 238 campus-community partnerships.

Chancellor

Cecil P. Staton

(Furman '80)

Dr. Cecil P. Staton is East Carolina University's 11th chancellor after formally being appointed to the position by the University of North Carolina Board of Governors on April 27, 2016. He began his duties on ECU's campus July 1, 2016.

In Fall 2017, Staton announced the launch of the Rural Prosperity Initiative, combining the resources of ECU's campus along with university partners to focus its extensive research and engagement expertise on finding solutions to the extraordinary disparities in health, education and economic development in rural and coastal North Carolina communities.

In December 2017, Staton was appointed to the NAFSA: Association of International Educators board of directors. NAFSA, based in Washington, D.C., is the world's largest and most comprehensive nonprofit association of professionals dedicated to international education with more than 10,000 members, representing 3,500-plus institutions in more than 150 countries.

Before joining ECU, Staton served from 2014-16 as vice chancellor for extended education for the University System of Georgia. He was also USG's liaison with the Georgia Research Alliance and supported USG's economic development initiatives and efforts to match the resources of USG institutions with Georgia's evolving workforce needs.

From 2015-2016, Staton also served as interim president of Valdosta State. In that role, he focused on retention, improving student success and better marketing and branding to reverse recent enrollment declines and associated budget shortfalls.

Additionally, he was associate provost at Mercer University in Macon, Georgia and served five terms as a Georgia state senator. While in the legislature, he was recognized as a leader on health care and higher education matters.

Staton's private-sector experience includes founding and leading three communications companies: Smyth & Helwys Publishing, a publisher of books and curriculum products; Stroud and Hall Publishers, a publisher of books on politics and current events; and Georgia Eagle Media, a holding company for broadcasting, newspaper and media properties.

Active in professional and civic organizations, Staton has been recognized numerous times for his service and leadership. His awards and honors include the Georgia Independent College Association's 2014 Miller-Deal Award for significant public service in higher education; Legislator of the Year awards from the Georgia Hospital Association, Georgia Technology Association and Georgia Rural Health Care Association; and the Georgia Ambulance Association Star of Life Award.

Staton, a first-generation college student, is a native of Greenville, South Carolina. He has a bachelor's degree in religion from Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina, master of theology and master of divinity degrees from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in Wake Forest and a doctorate in Old Testament, Hebrew and ancient Near Eastern studies from the University of Oxford in England.



He and his wife, Catherine, have two children: Cecil P. Staton III, a financial planner in Atlanta, and William Davidson Staton, a graduate student at DePaul University in Chicago.

Lee Workman currently serves as the athletics department's acting chief operating officer following an appointment by ECU Chancellor Cecil P. Staton in the spring of 2018.

In addition to his recent assignment providing leadership and comprehensive oversight of the department's day-to-day operations, Workman also holds the title of senior associate athletics director for administration and chief financial officer.

As a member of the department's executive leadership team beginning in 2013, he was charged with the development of strategic planning and policy administration initiatives. He also directed the unit's human resources efforts and coordinated apparel, footwear and equipment relationships, as well as brand and trademark licensing. Workman additionally served as sport administrator for the men's and women's swimming and diving teams, as well as the men's and women's tennis programs.

In 2014, Workman spearheaded ECU Athletics' rebranding process, ultimately leading to what is the Pirates' official logo today.

A long-time member of the Pirate family, Workman began at the university as an intern in 1984 before working his way up the administrative ladder. He has served in various capacities, including assistant marketing director, marketing director, assistant athletics director for special events and ticket sales, assistant athletics director for special events and assistant athletics director for ticketing and promotions.

Among his duties in previous roles was the successful handling of fan engagement at sporting events, neutral site, bowl game and postseason logistics for all of ECU's athletic programs. Workman also coordi-



nated the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame, marketing, promotions and ticket sales, while serving on various university committees.

A Knoxville, Tenn., native, Workman graduated from Tennessee Tech in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing, before earning his master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University in 1984. He is an IA Athletic Director's Association Fellow and holds numerous memberships with organizations such as NACDA and ICLA.

Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum

One of the most intimate and fan friendly arenas in all of NCAA Division I Basketball is Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum, home of ECU basketball. This cozy 7,100-seat facility gives the Pirates a distinct home court advantage unlike any other.

Now in its 52nd season of hosting Pirate basketball, the coliseum is connected to the second level of the Murphy Center by an indoor walkway. The floor inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum received a fresh look prior to the 2014-15 season with new designs and logos, while a new video boards and scoreboards were installed. Courtside seating was also instituted in recent years.

After 27 years of basketball, Minges Coliseum underwent a facelift prior to the 1994-95 season. The anticipation was great and the much-awaited unveiling was everything it was supposed to be and more. The renovations, totaling almost \$12 million, have made the arena one of the finest on-campus basketball facilities on the East Coast.

Constructed at a cost of \$2 million, Minges Coliseum was dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968, in the name of the Minges family of Greenville, N.C. As owners of Pepsi-Cola bottling operations in Greenville, Kinston and New Bern, the Minges family has provided leadership and support of ECU Athletics over the years, going back to the days when the late Dr. Ray Minges served as President of the Century Club (forerunner of the Pirate Club), from 1965-68.

The Pirates have won 66 percent of their games since the Coliseum opened in 1967. ECU has had only eight losing records in Minges in its history. Since the building was renovated in 1994, the Pirates have won nearly 70 percent of their home games.

All the Minges Coliseum attendance records were shattered following renovation in 1995, including total season (71,761), average season (5,980 for 12 games) and for a single game (7,670 vs. UNC Wilmington (Feb. 25). The single-game mark, in fact, was broken three times during the season – Jan. 6 vs. East Tennessee State, Jan. 14 vs. James Madison and Feb. 25 vs. UNC Wilmington.

Williams Arena is named in honor and recognition of the late Walter and Marie Williams for their support of ECU Athletics over the years. As alumni of East Carolina College, Walter and Marie have endowed two Men's Basketball Position scholarships, the Spirit of the East Post-Eligibility Scholarship, and an unrestricted student-athlete scholarship on behalf of the University's athletics program. Further, through Trade Oil Company, the Williams family gave the first \$1 million gift ever given to the Educational Foundation in support of ECU Athletics, through the Shared Visions Campaign.

In addition to his financial support, Walter Williams gave his time unselfishly in support of the Pirate Club. During 1997-98, he served as Executive President of the Educational Foundation.



The Smith-Williams Center



It had been talked about for years and dreamed about perhaps even longer, but the aspiration of having a dedicated basketball practice facility has become a reality at ECU.

The 49,000 square-foot Smith-Williams Center was officially dedicated on Aug. 30, 2013 as ECU athletic department staff, donors and media got their first look at the sparkling new building which is the new home to both the men's and women's basketball programs, providing them with a state-of-the-art venue in which to practice, train and condition.

Named for lead donors Harry and Tammy Smith and Walter and Marie Williams, the center features mirror image practice courts, locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms, training rooms for each program and will also house the Athletics Hall of Fame, which will feature a prideful display of the rich tradition of intercollegiate athletics at ECU.

Each court is named for donors who contributed significantly to the Step Up To The Highest Level campaign. The floor inside the women's practice gym is called Barnhill Court in recognition of the financial support of Bob Barnhill of Tarboro.

The men's gym floor is named Whitaker-Rogers court in appreciation of the monetary gifts of Mike and Janet Rogers of Cary, N.C. and Don and Donna Whitaker of Virginia Beach, Va. Whitaker was a two-year ECU letterman on the hardwood for coaches Dave Patton and Larry Gillman.

The center has a total project cost of \$17 million that was funded entirely through private gifts.

For years, the ECU men's and women's teams have been routinely displaced from the Minges Coliseum for practices due to classes, concerts and numerous other events in the arena, which has been in existence since 1965. In recent years practices have been held at Christenbury Gym,



Gold's Gym, North Campus Crossing and area high schools due to scheduling conflicts.

Now they won't have to compete with other activities - or themselves - for court time.

While a lot of the perception is based upon recruiting both coaches and players understand the value it will have on each individual's overall development.

It's because of the vision of former Director of Athletics Terry Holland, who helped initiate the launch of the Step Up To The Highest Level Campaign in the spring of 2010, that the Pirate basketball programs now have a home of their own.

Strength & Conditioning



The Murphy Center, still considered one of the athletic department's newest facilities, is located between Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium and Minges Coliseum. It's one of the largest and best-equipped strength and conditioning centers in the country.

ECU's Board of Trustees approved the project in the spring 1997, thus putting it into the athletics department staff's hands to make this 52,475-square-foot, two-story strength and conditioning/Pirate Club multipurpose center a reality.

ECU's strength and conditioning programs for its student-athletes are based out of the 22,000-square-foot first floor of the \$13 million facility. The weight room has revolutionized the Pirates' strength and conditioning efforts.

The center opened for workouts in June, 2002 and was dedicated at ECU's home football game on September 14, 2002.

The second floor of the building features a private dining area for recruits as well as a 9,000-square-foot banquet hall and a large terrace with a view of the football stadium for Pirate Club functions.

Because of its location behind the Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium endzone, its connection to Minges Coliseum and the Smith-Williams Center (ECU Athletics Hall of Fame), the Murphy Center is an ideal place for Pirate Club members to socialize at both football and basketball games.

ECU's student-athletes train for competition under the direct supervision of Assistant Athletics Director for Strength and Conditioning Jeff Connors. The 2017-18 full-time strength staff consists of assistants Vinie Calautti, Lauren Collier, Brandon Golden, De'Vaughn Gordon and Brandon Stegall.

Athletic Training

The student-athlete at ECU has the luxury of having one of the most dedicated health care teams in the Southeast. Directed by Mike Hanley, Associate Director of Athletics for Student Services, along with trainers Krista Carano, Nate Clark, Colleen Driscoll, Christopher D'Errico, Lannie Hales, Jake Moore, Daniele Petty, Zac Womack and team physician Dr. Joe Armen, the ECU Athletic Training program provides every Pirate student-athlete the best available care for their injuries. Hanley, the 2009 National Athletic Trainer's Association (NATA) Trainer-of-the-Year, and his staff are assisted by a wide array of community-based physicians and other health care providers.

the gap between college and the years after graduation.


The mission of the CHAMPS (Challenging Athletes Minds for Personal Success) program is to provide a personal development program designed to reach each student-athlete based on his or her individual needs. The focus of the program is on the student-athlete, as a whole person—academically, athletically and emotionally—and on they're changing needs and skills during college and in the years after graduation.

Ultimately, the CHAMPS program is designed to help student-athletes realize higher academic achievement, a higher level of maturity, self-responsibility and greater overall success. As a participant in this program, ECU is dedicated to carrying out all the program's goals and commitments.

Among the Academic Development Services available for student-athletes are tutorial programs, study halls, academic skills development, and orientation. Additional programs such as leadership development seminars, a speaker's bureau and community service programs are an important part of the student development program.

The athletics department has set up several prestigious awards for ECU student-athletes. For the past eight years, PCS Phosphate has sponsored the ECU Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award. The award is presented annually to a male and female athlete who best exemplifies both academic and athletic success. PCS Phosphate also recognizes an All-Academic team selected from the highest cumulative GPAs of each team.

Student-athletes also serve on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council, which is an advisory organization for the Office of Student Development and the Department of Athletics.

Joe Dooley

(Fifth Season • George Washington, 1988)

After leading Florida Gulf Coast to five conference titles and five consecutive 20-win seasons, former ECU head men's basketball coach Joe Dooley returns for a second stint at the helm of the Pirates' program beginning with the 2018-19 campaign.

Dooley finished his tenure at FGCU with a five-year record of 114-58 (.663), leading the Eagles to three Atlantic Sun (ASUN) Conference regular season championships, including their first-ever title in 2014, and two second-place finishes. He also helped them capture two conference tournament trophies and earn NCAA Tournament appearances in 2016 and 2017. The Eagles defeated Fairleigh Dickinson in the 2016 First Four to advance into the main bracket.

He is one of only 35 NCAA Division I coaches over the last five years with a winning percentage of over 66 percent and more than 110 victories.

Dooley was twice named ASUN Coach-of-the-Year (2017, 2018) as well as the 2017 NABC District III Coach-of-the-Year. He coached 10 all-conference selections, including 2018 ASUN Player-of-the-Year and Associated Press honorable mention All-America selection Brandon Goodwin as well as 2017 ASUN Defensive Player-of-the-Year Demetris Morant.

The Eagles participated in postseason play each of Dooley's five seasons in Fort Myers, winning 21 or more games every year with two NIT and one CIT appearance in addition to a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament.

FGCU finished among the top-25 nationally in field goal percentage three times, rebounds per game twice and was among the top-42 in scoring twice during Dooley's tenure.

A renowned recruiter, three of Dooley's recruiting classes at FGCU were ranked No. 1 in the ASUN with each of those classes ranked among the top-25 outside the Major 7 conferences (ACC, American, Big East, Big Ten, Big XII, PAC-12 and SEC).

Dooley also tutored 26 ASUN All-Academic performers during his five seasons on the Fort Myers campus.

He has a nine-year overall head coaching ledger of 171-110 (.608), including four years at ECU.

Dooley, who is the Pirates' all-time Division I leader in winning percentage (.523), led ECU to an overall record of 57-52 during his four-year tenure that included back-to-back 17-win campaigns during his first two years. He won more games (44) in his first three years at the helm of the program than any of his predecessors.

In 1996-97, he led the Pirates to their only top-3 finish during their 15-year membership in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), tying for third with a 9-7 record led by Raphael Edwards, who was a two-time all-conference selection under Dooley's tutelage.

Dooley was the youngest head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball at the age of 29 when he was promoted to ECU's top basketball position in April of 1995.

Prior to being named head coach, Dooley served four seasons as coach Eddie Payne's top assistant and was part of the Pirates' staff that went to the 1993 NCAA Tournament by securing the CAA's automatic bid.

Before coming to Greenville, Dooley and Payne served on the same staff as assistant coaches at South Carolina for three seasons.

Dooley began his coaching career as an assistant on the Gamecocks' staff in 1988 under George Felton, working alongside Payne and three-time National Coach-of-the-Year Tubby Smith before accompanying Payne to Greenville.

He later served as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-02) and Wyoming (2002-03) before joining Bill Self, a four-time Big XII Coach-of-the-Year during their 10 campaigns together, for his inaugural season at Kansas in 2003-04. During his decade in Lawrence, the Jayhawks compiled a 300-58 record, including a 137-27 mark in the Big XII with nine regular-season crowns and six conference

tournament titles.

He won a national championship as an assistant coach at Kansas in 2008 and helped the Jayhawks earn another Final Four berth in 2012.

Dooley also served as an court coach under Self at the 2018 USA Men's Basketball U18 Training Camp.

In 2010, Dooley ranked first among all "High-Major Assistants" by *Foxsports.com*, which was up from his No. 6 ranking by the media outlet in 2008. In 2007, he was rated the fourth-best recruiter in the nation by *Rivals.com*. Dooley recruited or coached 19 NBA draft picks in his 10 years at KU, including 12 first-round selections.

In 30 years as an assistant and head coach, Dooley has helped lead six different programs into the postseason, accumulated 657 victories with 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven NIT bids.

Dooley is a 1988 graduate of George Washington University in Washington, D.C., where he earned his bachelor's degree in speech communications. A four-year basketball letterwinner at GW, he started his last two seasons and was elected a team captain as a senior.

A native of West Orange, N.J., Dooley and his wife, Tanya, have a son, Max.



Assistant Coaches



Raphael Chillious

Associate Head Coach

First Year (Lafayette, 1996)

Regarded as one of college basketball's top recruiters and known for his ability to develop players, Raphael Chillious joined the ECU men's basketball program as associate head coach in April 2018.

Chillious came to ECU after one season at Connecticut, where he served as associate head coach and helped assemble a top-25 recruiting class.

Prior to joining the Huskies, Chillious spent seven of the previous eight seasons on the coaching staff at the University of Washington, including the 2016-17 season as associate head coach. He began his Division I coaching career at Washington in 2009-10, where he remained for three seasons before becoming an assistant coach at Villanova in 2012-13. After one year at Villanova, Chillious returned to Washington and remained there until going to UConn.

During his second stint in Seattle, Chillious helped mentor the team's guards while assisting with the recruiting resurgence that featured the nation's No. 7 class in 2015 headlined by NBA First Round Draft picks Dejounte Murray and Marquese Chriss. He was also key in the signing of Markelle Fultz for the class of 2017. Fultz, who finished the 2016-17 season sixth in the NCAA in scoring with 23.2 points per game as the nation's top freshman scorer and the PAC-12's overall leading scorer, was the first overall pick by the Philadelphia 76ers in the 2017 NBA Draft.

Chillious assisted future First-Team All-America Nigel Williams-Goss' evolution from a PAC-12 all-freshman team performer in 2014 to a second-team all-conference player the following season. He also helped Quincy Pondexter mature into a 2010 First-Team PAC-10 player and NBA First Round selection.

He was influential in the recruitment and development of Terrence Ross and Tony Wroten into 2012 NBA First Round Draft picks. Chillious was also instrumental in the progression of C.J. Wilcox from 2011 PAC-12 all-freshman team player into a 2014 NBA First Round Draft pick.

While at Villanova in 2013, he helped the Wildcats to a 20-14 record, 10-8 in BIG EAST action. He coached third-team All-BIG EAST selection Jay-Vaughn Pinkson and All-Rookie team member Ryan Arcidiacono and Villanova notched three wins over AP Top 5 ranked opponents, including a 73-64 victory over eventual national champion Louisville. The Wildcats earned a No. 9 seed in the NCAA tournament and lost in the first round to North Carolina.

Arcidiacono earned Most Outstanding Player honors at the 2016 Final Four as Villanova won the national title.

Chillious was named an assistant coach at Washington in April 2009 and was an integral part of the staff that helped the Huskies win consecutive PAC-10 tournament championships in 2010 and '11, plus the regular season title in the first year of the newly formed PAC-12 in 2012.

He helped coach the team to a 26-10 record and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance his first year, followed by a 24-11 season and second consecutive PAC-10 Tournament Championship in 2011. In 2012, Washington was 24-11 overall and finished 14-4 in the conference to

claim the regular season title.

Chillious played a key role in coaching guards at Washington - including future NBA All-Star Isaiah Thomas, who was a two-time All-PAC-10 performer. He also established his foothold in the world of recruiting by helping the Huskies construct highly acclaimed 2010 and 2011 classes.

Chillious previously served as the head basketball coach and co-athletic director at South Kent (Conn.) School from 2003-2008, where he mentored the aforementioned Thomas, Dorell Wright, Andray Blatche and Dion Waiters. Before going to South Kent, he was also a prep school coach at West Nottingham Academy (Md.), where he coached future New Jersey Nets forward Josh Boone.

A native of Mt. Zion, Md., Chillious attended Lafayette College (Pa.), earning his Bachelor of Science degree in psychology in 1996. He served as the basketball team captain during his senior year and also received the President's Silver Award with a 3.45 GPA as a senior. He continued his education at the University of Victoria (Victoria, B.C.), where he also began his coaching career in 1997. From there, he moved on to become the head coach at West Nottingham in 2001, then took the job at South Kent two years later.

Chillious and his wife, Charlene, have a daughter.

Steve Roccaforte begins his first season as assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator at ECU after spending the previous four years at Virginia Tech, the last of which he served as associate head coach.

Roccaforte, known nationally as a tireless recruiter and enthusiastic floor coach, helped the Hokies earn back-to-back NCAA Tournament at-large bids in 2017 and 2018 and post three consecutive 20-win seasons (2015-18) since a five-year span that ended in 1985-86. He also helped the Hokies win 10 ACC games in three consecutive seasons for the first time since joining the conference in 2004.

Roccaforte joined the coaching staff at Virginia Tech following three years as an assistant coach at South Florida. He played a large role in USF getting a top-15 nationally ranked recruiting class for both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons and helped the Bulls advance to the round of 32 in the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

Prior to USF, Roccaforte was the head coach at his alma mater, Lamar University, for five seasons after serving as an assistant coach at Lamar (2003-06), Memphis (2000-03), Wyoming (1998-00), Tulane (1994-98) and Centenary (1989-94) to begin his career.

With more than 30 years of experience at the NCAA Division I level, Roccaforte has worked with some of the top coaches in the business and has recruited some of the top talent in the country. He has served under national coaches of the year in John Calipari, Perry Clark and Billy Tubbs to develop multiple nationally ranked recruiting classes.

Roccaforte helped assemble a top-20 recruiting class at five institutions, including the nation's top-rated class at Memphis in 2001. He also aided in the construction of a pair of top 10 classes at Lamar, two additional top 15 classes at Memphis and USF and three top 25 groups at both Tulane and Virginia Tech. In total, Roccaforte has facilitated 14 top 25 units, including four top 10.

Roccaforte's penchant for recruiting was as evident as ever in 2009-10 as Lamar's eight-player class was ranked ninth by *HoopScoopOnline.com* and 15th-best in the nation by *Basketball Times*. The class featured three of the top 15 scorers in Junior College Division I. *HoopScoop.com* rated Lamar's class in 2004, the first full recruiting class with Roccaforte on staff, among the top 10 in the country.

During his career, Roccaforte has coached or signed 18 future NBA players including six-time All-Star Amare Stoudemire and Kendrick Perkins, member of the 2008 NBA Champion Boston Celtics, along with first round draft picks Dejuan Wagner, Antonio Burks, Qyntel Wood and Rodney Carney.

Roccaforte is also no stranger to postseason play, having served on the staff of eight teams that extended their seasons. He has been to a five NCAA Tournaments, two with Virginia Tech and one each with USF, Tulane, and Memphis along with NIT appearances at Tulane, Wyoming, Memphis and Virginia Tech. Tulane advanced to the NIT Final Four at Madison Square Garden in 1996. He helped Memphis reach MSG in 2001, win the NIT title in 2002 and advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2003 for the first time in seven years.

In all, Roccaforte's teams have made 11 postseason appearances with the Hokies' 2018 NCAA appearance being the most recent.

Roccaforte finally got his chance to be a head coach after Tubbs resigned his post at Lamar to focus on his Director of Athletics duties in March 2006.

In his five seasons, Lamar was a sparkling 55-20 at home in the Montagne Center and Roccaforte guided LU to its first SLC regular-season championship in more than 20 years in his second season with an impressive 13-3 conference mark. He coached nine all-conference selections at Lamar.

The 2007-08 season featured a number of impressive streaks. Among them were a 14-2 home record, a school-record six-consecutive conference road victories and the eighth-largest home crowd in school history. Lamar ranked eighth in the nation in scoring offense (81.5 ppg.) and in the top 50 in both field goal percentage (46.9) and 3-point field goal percentage (38.2).

For his efforts, Roccaforte was named the 2007-08 Southland Conference (SLC) Coach-of-the-Year by the Lake Charles American-Press newspaper and the *CollegeInsider.com* Southland Conference Coach-of-the-Year.

Academics are a high priority for Roccaforte as evidenced by the fact that Lamar's increase in Academic Progress Rate (APR) was among the best in the country. Lamar's APR, which is a real-time measurement of a team's ability to stay on course and graduate, moved up 101 spots to No. 20 in the country during Roccaforte's tenure. Nineteen of 20 seniors earned their degrees while he was the head coach as did 100 percent of the seniors at USF from 2011 to 2014.

He earned his Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree from Lamar in 1989. He has two daughters, Victoria and Sofia, and a son, Lucien.



Ken Potosnak

Assistant Coach

Ninth Year (Randolph-Macon, 1990)

Ken Potosnak begins his ninth year as an assistant coach at ECU and his 27th overall as a Division I assistant coach. Potosnak worked as a member of coach Jeff Lebo's staff for eight seasons and was retained when Joe Dooley became the Pirates' head coach.

As a member of the ECU coaching staff, Potosnak helped the Pirates construct their most successful four-year period in the school's Division I history. The Pirates have made three postseason appearances, won 20 games for the first time as a Division I institution and captured the 2013 CIT title with Potosnak on the bench.

Six players have earned all-conference honors during Potosnak's tenure, while four players have garnered American Athletic Conference All-Rookie Team accolades. Three players have also received specialty awards: Brock Young (2011 Conference USA Sixth Man-of-the-Year), Prince Williams (2016 American Athletic Conference Most Improved Player) and Shawn Williams (2018 American Athletic Conference Rookie-of-the-Year).

Prior to ECU, Potosnak spent one season with Lebo as an assistant coach at Auburn after serving in the same capacity at South Carolina for three years under former ECU coach Dave Odom from 2005-08; helping guide the Gamecocks to their second consecutive NIT title in 2006. Among the players Potosnak coached at South Carolina were future NBA players: Randal Blackman (2006 NBA Draft First Round pick), Tarence Kinsey and Brandon Wallace. His recruiting efforts resulted in the Gamecocks landing a top 20 recruiting class in 2006, which featured three-time First-Team All-SEC point guard Devan Downey and 2011 SEC Defensive Player-of-the-Year Sam Muldrow. That class claimed a share of the 2009 SEC Eastern Division title, the program's first since 1997.

Prededing his time in Columbia, Potosnak was the top assistant at Furman for eight years from 1997-2005. His recruiting efforts landed six All-Southern Conference performers, including 2005 SoCon Freshman-of-the-Year Quan Prowell. The Paladins made their first SoCon Championship game appearance since 1980 in 2002 with Potosnak assisting.

A renowned recruiter throughout the United States, he has concentrated efforts internationally where he recruited Brazilian guard Guilherme Da Luz, French forward Karim Souchu and Senegalese forward Malaye Ndoye,

Potosnak made his way to Furman after he served as an assistant at The Citadel for five years (1992-97). He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant to Odom at Wake Forest for two seasons from 1990-92, helping the Demon Deacons to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances with teams that featured future NBA players Randolph Childress, Rodney Rogers, Chris King and Anthony Tucker.

The New Kensington, Pa., native has extensive experience as a working camps and clinics both domestically and internationally. He was a long-time coach at the Five-Star Basketball Camp and operator of offseason professional player development workouts in Atlanta. His expertise in the game has taken him throughout Europe and Asia.

Potosnak is a 1990 graduate of Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Va., where he helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a pair of top 25 finishes in 1989 (No. 22) and 1990 (No. 14). As a senior guard leading his team to the NCAA Division III Tournament in 1990, he was named Randolph-Macon's Scholar Athlete-of-the-Year. He earned a master's degree from Wake Forest in 1992.

He is married to Sherry McWherter of Durham, N.C.

Kyle Robinson

Director of Basketball Operations

Ninth Year (Gardner-Webb '03)

Kyle Robinson is in his ninth season as the director of basketball operations at ECU. He joined the Pirates' coaching staff in 2010 after spending the previous three seasons in the same position at College of Charleston.

Robinson's duties include, but not limited to, developing and managing the annual budget, organizing team travel, managing all community outreach activities, serving as the chief liaison to academic counselors and compliance officers, working with adidas to order equipment as well coordinating on-campus recruiting visits among many things. Robinson also oversees all logistics and registration of the Joe Dooley Basketball Camp.

During his time at ECU, the Pirates have made three postseason appearances, posted the most wins in a single-season and captured their first CIT title. Six players have received all-conference accolades and four have merited all-rookie team honors.

Before planting roots in Greenville, Robinson served as director of basketball operations at College of Charleston under legendary coach Bobby Cremins and was a part of a Cougar program that won 27 games and made the 2009 South Conference Championship game. During the 2010 season, Robinson was on the bench when the Cougars, led by Andrew Goudelock, upset No. 9 North Carolina. Goudelock finished his career as Charleston's career leader in points and ranks third in Southern Conference history with 2,571. Goudelock was drafted in the second round of the 2011 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Lakers with the 46th overall pick.

Robinson spent three seasons as a graduate assistant/manager to Jeff Lebo at Auburn after a year stint as assistant men's basketball coach at Lincoln (III.) Christian College where the Preachers won a school-record 21 games en route to the school's first Midwest Regional Championship. Lincoln Christian then advanced to the 2004 national semifinals.

Robinson began his career as an undergraduate at Gardner-Webb, where he was the head men's basketball manager for four years (1999-2003). The Runnin' Bulldogs were the 2000 South Atlantic Conference Champions and went on to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Robinson has worked numerous NCAA Division I team and individual camps in the Southeast and coached in YMCA summer leagues and youth recreational leagues.

The Clover, S.C., native earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Gardner-Webb in 2003. He was a member of the Dean's List and a three-time selection to the President's List. He also holds a master's degree in sports administration from Auburn.

Robinson is married to the former Bobbie Holder of Winston-Salem, N.C. They are the parents of two sons, Samuel Chase and Lincoln Joseph. He is the co-founder and president for Aces for Autism, a local non-profit in Greenville serving children and families affected by autism.



Derek DeMasi

Assistant Director of Basketball Operations

First year (Rhode Island '11)

Derek DeMasi is in his first season as assistant director of basketball operations at ECU after spending the 2017-18 campaign as assistant video coordinator at Florida Gulf Coast for coach Joe Dooley.

DeMasi serves as the liaison between the student-athletes and the financial aid office and the admissions office, while assisting with travel, on-campus recruiting, social media and game day operations.

As member of the coaching staff at FGCU, DeMasi helped coordinate all video operations, develop the team playbook and organize detailed scouting reports as the Eagles won the Atlantic Sun regular season title and posted a 23-12 overall record.

Prior to joining the staff at FGCU, DeMasi served two seasons as assistant coach at St. Andrews School in Barrington, R.I. During his two years at St. Andrews, DeMasi helped the squad record back-to-back 20-win seasons, reaching the NEPSAC AA Tournament semifinals each year, and seven student-athletes earn Division I scholarships.

DeMasi began his basketball coaching journey with a four-year stint as an assistant coach at Wheaton College in Norton, Mass.

DeMasi received his Bachelor of Science in business administration from the University of Rhode Island in May, 2011. A four-time Dean's List student, DeMasi was the head student manager for the Rams' baseball team from December 2009-June 2011. During that time, he was responsible for the breakdown and compilation of statistical data and video editing while assisting with the coordination of team travel and the development and production of yearly fundraisers. DeMasi also managed numerous events, including the annual golf tournament and Autism Awareness Day and organized recruiting information.

A four-year football operations summer intern with the New England Patriots, DeMasi spent the entire 2010 season with the organization and helped with both the logistical coordination of the team's football operations and the day-to-day logistical needs of players and staff. Additionally, DeMasi was accountable for the organization and production of player/coach game plan books and playbooks. He also assisted with media resource projects, the research of player information, and the transportation of players and personnel.



Tyler Lewis

Video Coordinator

First Season (Butler '17)

Former NC State and Butler guard Tyler Lewis joined the ECU men's basketball staff as the program's coordinator of video operations in June after spending the 2017-18 campaign as director of recruiting at Furman University.

Lewis will serve as the Pirates' primary video contact and will also be heavily involved in recruiting and player development.

As a senior at Butler in 2016-17, Lewis averaged 6.5 points and four assists per game to lead the Bulldogs to a 25-9 record, second-place finish in the Big East Conference and NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance. The Bulldogs' point guard ranked second nationally and paced the Big East in assist/turnover ratio. He was named to the 2016-17 Big East All-Academic Team.

After sitting out the 2014-15 campaign, Lewis shot a team-high 85.2 percent from the foul line for the 2016 Bulldogs squad that reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He played in 67 games and made 40 starts during his two seasons in Indianapolis and helped Butler win 45 games.

Lewis played in 70 games and made 20 starts as a freshman and sophomore at NC State and helped the Wolfpack earn an at-large bid to the 2014 NCAA Tournament. As a sophomore he led NCSU with 135 assists, while shooting a team-best 74.4 percent at the charity stripe. Lewis also set the school single-season record for assist-to-turnover ratio (3.55).

The Statesville, N.C., native began his high school career at Forsyth Country Day (N.C.) School and finished as the school's all-time leader in points (1,927) and assists (685). A two-time *Maxpreps.com* All-America selection, Lewis finished runner-up for the 2011 Associated Press North Carolina High School Player-of-the-Year.

He concluded his high school career at Oak Hill Academy (Va.). In 2012, he earned McDonald's All-America Team honors and was named Virginia Gatorade Player-of-the-Year after averaging 12.0 points and 7.9 assists per game to help Oak Hill to a 44-0 record.

Lewis graduated from Butler in 2017 with a degree in marketing. He is married to the former Ali Burgiss, a former ECU cheerleader, of Statesville, N.C.



Jennifer Bonner

**Assistant Director of Student Development
14th season (ECU, 1999)**

Jennifer Bonner has been a member of the ECU student development staff since being hired as a learning specialist and tutor coordinator in April of 2005 and was promoted to assistant director in 2017. She was the first learning specialist employed by the athletic department and first full-time tutor coordinator.

In addition to working directly with the men's basketball program, Bonner is responsible for providing academic support and learning techniques to student-athletes across all of ECU's sports programs. She also supervises the study hall planning for all sports and manages the departmental screening/testing process for at-risk student-athletes, while promoting the development of independent learning.

Bonner began working with men's basketball full-time following her promotion in 2017. In her first year working with the program, seven student-athletes were named to The American All-Academic team and junior Justice Obasohan was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court, which recognizes men's collegiate basketball student-athletes who excelled in academics during the season.

A total of eight ECU men's basketball student-athletes were named to the ECU Dean's List and three to the ECU Honor Roll during the 2017-18 academic year with her tutelage.

The American Athletic Conference

The American Athletic Conference consists of 13 prestigious institutions: the University of Central Florida, the University of Cincinnati, East Carolina University, the University of Connecticut, the University of Houston, the University of Memphis, the U.S. Naval Academy (in football only), the University of South Florida Southern Methodist University, Temple University, Tulane University, the University of Tulsa, and Wichita State University (in basketball and Olympic sports).

Under the leadership of commissioner Mike Aresco, the American Athletic Conference has an impressive list of accomplishments, both in the competitive arena and the classroom. The American has taken its place at the forefront of intercollegiate athletics, with a collection of national team and individual championships and football and men's and women's basketball postseason victories that place The American among the elite Division I FBS conferences.

The league has produced four NCAA championship teams – UConn men's basketball in 2014 and UConn women's basketball in 2014, 2015 and 2016 – in addition to three New Year's Six bowl champions (UCF in 2013 and 2017; Houston in 2015), 11 NCAA individual championships, and a Rhodes Scholar. Additionally, American Athletic Conference teams have advanced to the College World Series, reached the semifinal and final rounds of the NIT, qualified for the match play round of the NCAA Men's Golf Championship and registered Top 10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country and Outdoor Track and Field championships.

The American Athletic Conference was one of six finalists for the 2016 *Sports Business Journal* Sports League of the Year award, along with Major League Baseball, Major League Soccer, NASCAR, the National Basketball Association and the PGA Tour.

The 2017 football season saw The American enjoy unprecedented success as UCF finished as the only undefeated team in the nation, and the first in the last four college football seasons, capping a 13-0 campaign with a win against Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. UCF ended the year as the No. 1-ranked team in the Colley Matrix and was ranked No. 6 in the final *Associated Press* poll, marking the best final ranking for a team from The American in the league's brief history. UCF's finish in the AP poll gave teams from The American three Top 10 finishes in the last five end-of-the-year polls.

Additionally, seven teams from The American played in bowl games last season as the league went 3-1 against other Power 6 conferences in the postseason. UCF and Memphis finished No. 12 and No. 20, respectively, in the final College Football Playoff rankings, giving The American three-straight seasons with multiple teams in the final ranking. UCF, Memphis and USF were all ranked in the final AP Top 25 poll of the season. The American is one of only three conferences (along with the Big Ten and the Big 12) that has had at least three 10-win teams in each of the last two seasons.

The American has had a combined 22 teams play in bowl games in the last three seasons, highlighted by UCF's win against Auburn last year and Houston's win against Florida State in the 2015 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Additionally, Navy and Temple have both finished in the

top 25 of either the CFP, *Associated Press* or *USA Today* polls as members of The American.

Beyond the gridiron, The American has sent a combined seven teams to the last two NCAA Men's Basketball Championships. Since the conference's reconstitution in 2013-14, teams from The American have registered Top 10 national rankings in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's soccer, men's golf, and men's track and field.

Under The American's banner, the UConn women's basketball team won its NCAA-record ninth, 10th and 11th national championships and broke its own NCAA record with a 111-game winning streak that spanned three seasons. The American sent four baseball teams to the NCAA Championship in 2018.

American Athletic Conference student-athletes have distinguished themselves in all facets of intercollegiate athletics. Temple linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy

as the nation's top defensive player in 2015, while Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting. More recently, Houston's Ed Oliver won the 2017 Out-

land Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman, while UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton was eighth in the 2017 Heisman balloting.

Additionally, SMU's Avery Acker was chosen as the Division I women's volleyball Academic All-America of the Year in 2015, while Tulsa cross country standout Kirk Smith was chosen as a Rhodes Scholar in the fall of 2016. The conference has had a record 31 student-athletes earn Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-America accolades in the last two seasons.

American Athletic Conference alumni have made their mark in professional sports as well. The league has had 11 NBA Draft picks since 2014, including four this past year as duo of Wichita State's Landry Shamet and Cincinnati's Jacob Evans III, along with Tulane's Melvin Frazier and SMU's Shake Milton, were selected in the 2018 NBA Draft. The four selections are the most in The American's history, surpassing the output from the 2017 and 2014 NBA Drafts, when the conference saw three players selected in both years. The first round selections of Shamet, to Philadelphia, and Evans III, to Golden State, mark the first time the conference has had multiple first round selections. The league has also produced 66 NFL Draft picks highlighted by UCF quarterback Blake Bortles who was selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the No. 3 overall pick in the 2014 NFL Draft.

The American Athletic Conference holds media rights partnerships with ESPN and CBS Sports, which provide the conference with outstanding national exposure on the two industry leaders in sports television. The men's basketball portion of the contract calls for all conference-controlled games to be televised, with more than 63 percent slotted for national broadcast or national cable - a minimum of 107 games. The entire postseason tournament is televised, including the championship game, which is on ABC or ESPN.

2019 American Basketball Championship



The American Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championship will be played March 14-17, 2019 (Thursday to Sunday) at the FedExForum in Memphis.

FedExForum hosted the inaugural American Athletic Conference Championship in 2014.

"We are pleased to be returning to Memphis and FedExForum for our Conference Championship," American Athletic Conference Commissioner Mike Aresco said. "The City of Memphis graciously welcomed us for our first-ever league tournament in 2014 and our student-athletes, coaches and fans experienced a first-class weekend. This is a great basketball town that supports and appreciates the sport."

All 12 American Athletic Conference schools will participate in the 2019 championship. The format calls for four first-round games on the first day, followed by four quarterfinal matchups, two semifinal contests and the championship game. The ESPN family of networks again will provide television and digital coverage of the tournament.

The tournament begins Thursday, March 8 with matchups between the No. 9 and No. 8 seeds, No. 5 and No. 12 seeds, No. 10 and No. 7 seeds and No. 11 and No. 6 seeds. The winners will advance to meet the first, second, third and fourth seeds, respectively, on Friday.

Season Review



Season Notebook

■ ECU Suffers Fourth Straight Losing Season

- ECU finished with an overall record of 10-20 and a mark of 4-14 in the American Athletic Conference, finishing in 11th place. The Pirates opened the season with a 2-4 record, but won four of their final five non-conference games under interim head coach Michael Perry.
- The Pirates closed the season with six consecutive losses.

■ Coach Jeff Lebo Resigns In Late November

- ECU Head Coach Jeff Lebo resigned from his post on Nov. 29, 2017 following a 2-4 start. Assistant coach Michael Perry was tabbed as interim head coach for the remainder of the season.
- Lebo compiled 116 victories during his seven-plus seasons at the helm of the ECU program making him the winningest coach during the school's NCAA Division I era, which dates back to 1965, and second-most all-time.
- Under his guidance, the Pirates recorded their first-ever 20-win season as a Division I institution, received three postseason tournament invitations and captured the 2013 CIT postseason tournament title.
- He missed the final 14 games of the 2016-17 season after undergoing hip replacement surgery on Jan. 16.

■ Williams Named American Rookie-Of-The-Year



- ECU redshirt freshman Shawn Williams was named the 2017-18 American Athletic Conference Rookie-Of-The-Year by a vote of the league's 12 head coaches. He was also a unanimous all-rookie team selection.
- For the season, Williams averaged 12.4 points and 2.4 3-point field goals made per game. He connected on 36.7 percent of his 3-point field goal attempts, knocking down 72-of-196 shots outside the arc.
- Williams led The American in free throw shooting (.878), ranked third in 3-point field goals made per game, 11th in 3-point percentage and 20th in scoring.
- During conference play, he ranked first in free throw percentage (.902), second in 3-point field goals made per game (3.1), ninth in scoring (14.6) and 11th in 3-point field goal percentage (.387).
- He led all conference freshmen in scoring, 3-point field goals per game and 3-point field goal percentage both overall and in conference play.
- Williams was the only freshman in the league to score 30 points in a game.
- He was named The American Rookie-of-the-Week four times.

■ Tyson Finishes Career Among ECU's All-Time Best



- Senior B.J. Tyson finished his career ranked No. 5 all-time at ECU in scoring with 1,570 points and second all-time in the American Athletic Conference.
- He also finished ranked among the school's all-time Top 10 in field goals made (3rd), free throws made (5th), games played (6th), assists (10th) and steals (10th).
- Tyson is one of only six players in school history to score more than 1,500 points.
- He played in 120 games and averaged 13.1 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest.
- Tyson ranked among the Top-11 in The American in scoring three times and was named to the league's all-rookie team in 2015.

■ Barkley Reaches Two Milestones In One Night

- Junior Kentrell Barkley further etched his name into the ECU record book on Feb. 3 versus Memphis, joining the list of 1,000 point scorers and 600 rebounders.
- Barkley became the 31st player in school history to reach 1,000 career points by scoring 19 points against Memphis after entering the game 17 points shy of the millennial mark.
- He also entered the game 12 rebounds short of 600 for his career and grabbed 13 to become the 15th player in ECU history to reach the mark.
- Earlier in the season Barkley tied the ECU record and American Athletic Conference record for steals in a game with seven against USF on Jan. 17.
- Barkley was suspended for the final four games of the season for conduct detrimental to the team.
- Barkley is the only player in school history with more than 1,000 points, 600 rebounds and 200 assists during his career.

■ Resounding League Win

- ECU's 38-point victory over USF on Jan. 17 was its largest margin of victory in a conference game since defeating VMI, 108-66, when both were in the Southern Conference in 1970.
- It was the Pirates' first 30-point win in a league game since beating James Madison 90-60 as a member of the CAA in 1998.
- The win tied for the sixth-largest margin of victory over a Division I opponent in school history and largest margin of victory over a DI foe since 2008 when ECU defeated UNC Greensboro by 44 (97-53).



Fleming Records Program's First Triple-Double

- Junior Isaac Fleming recorded the first triple-double in ECU history with 11 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists against Memphis on Feb. 3. His 11 assists matched his career-high and he grabbed double-digit rebounds for the first time in his career.
- Fifteen days later, Fleming recorded another triple-double with 13 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at home against UCONN. He is

owner of the only two triple-doubles in ECU history and two of the four in The American. He is the only player in league history to register a triple-double in a conference game and he has done it twice.

- Fleming was one of two players nationally to record multiple triple-doubles during the season along with Marshall's Jon Elmore, who also had two.

Comeback Gets ECU Over The Hump

- The Pirates rallied from 17 points down in the second half, 51-34, to defeat Campbell, 69-66, on Dec. 4, 2017. It tied for the fourth-largest come from behind victory at ECU since 1981.
- ECU overcame a 12-point halftime deficit, 42-30, to match the third-largest halftime deficit overcome since 1968.
- ECU overcame double digit deficits to win five times this season. The Pirates rallied from behind to beat Cleveland State (-10), UNCW (-10), Campbell (-17), Grambling State (-12) and USF (-10).

Lots Of Lineups

- ECU used nine different starting lineups throughout the season with the most-often used starting five consisting of Fleming, Tyson, Barkley, Dimitrije Spasojevic and Jabari Craig. The unit began the game together 15 times.
- Tyson was the only player to start all 30 games. Fleming was second with 28 followed by Spasojevic (25), Craig (22) and Barkley (21).
- Six starting lineups were used just once.

LeDay Given Sixth Year

- Junior Seth LeDay was forced to sit out the 2017-18 season after transferring from Virginia Tech according to an NCAA ruling. However, he was granted a sixth-year of eligibility and will be able to play in the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons.

- LeDay played at Seminole State College in Seminole, Okla. during his freshmen season (2014-15) and then at Northwest Mississippi Community College as a sophomore (2015-16) before transferring to Virginia Tech (2016-17).

Underclassmen Depart

- In addition to its three seniors, four underclassmen that were on the roster at the start of the season are no longer with the program: juniors Kentrell Barkley and Usman Haruna along with sophomores Jeremy Sheppard and Raquan Wilkins.

Academic Notes

- Jabari Craig, Kevin Davis, Addison Hill, Justin Obasohan, Dimitrije Spasojevic, Justin Whatley, and John Whitley were each named to The American All-Academic Team.
- Obasohan was named to the NABC Honors Court.
- B.J. Tyson and Jabari Craig each received their bachelor degrees. Tyson completed his academic requirements and received his degree in recreation and park management in December, while Craig earned his degree in communication during spring commencement ceremonies.





#19 • C • 6-6 • Kinston, N.C. — Hodges was a two-sport athlete at East Carolina University, where he started four years at tackle and end for the Pirates' football team and was a four-year starter on the ECU basketball team. On the hardwood, Hodges was all-conference from 1952-54 and conference MVP in 1953 and '54. He earned all-state honors in 1963 and '54, serving as team captain in '54. He was also voted All-America in 1954 and was selected by the Philadelphia Warriors in the 1954 NBA Draft. He was inducted into the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1974 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 1993.



2 Lester Lyons (1,825)

#15 • G • 6-4 • Lewiston, N.C. — Lyons is the school's all-time leading scorer in its Division I era. He was named the 1991 CAA Rookie-of-the-Year and was a three-time second-team all-conference selection. He is the only player in ECU history to lead the Pirates in scoring each of his four seasons.

Twice named to the CAA All-Defensive Team, Lyons led the Pirates in steals all four years and graduated as the Pirates' all-time leader in field goals made, 3-point field goals made, free throws made, assists and steals. He remains the only Pirate with 600 career field goals made as well as the only letterman with over 200 steals.

Although he never led the team in scoring, White put together a consistent scoring line that never rose above 12.4 ppg and never dropped below 11.8 ppg. He only missed three games in four years and was in the starting lineup in 90 percent of the games he played.

Physical interior play, aggressive rebounding, balanced point production and a solid bench all played a part in ECU's only Southern Conference championship and first NCAA Tournament berth in 1972.

After upsetting regular season champion Davidson in the semifinals, the Pirates' dreams of going to the NCAA Tournament were nearly derailed, twice, by the Furman Paladins in the championship game.

If Jim Fairley hadn't scooped up Ernie Pope's missed jumper and laid it in to tie the game as time expired, ECU wouldn't have won.

The two teams then battled through four overtime ties, before the Paladins took a one-point lead, 75-74, with eight seconds left.

With no time-outs remaining, ECU's Al Faber grabbed the rebound off a missed free throw and cut loose a desperation 40-footer that wasn't even close.

Fortunately for the Pirates, reserve guard Nicky White was standing underneath the basket, grabbed the rebound and banged home the winning bucket as the horn sounded.

The Pirates had lost to Davidson in the championship game two years prior.

Earl Quash wound up as the leading scorer for ECU in the finals scoring 18 points, including 13 in the final 14 minutes of play. Fairley added 13 points, while Faber and Pope had 12 each.

ECU would've been eliminated from the tournament in the semifinals if it hadn't been for the efforts of Fairley.

Fairley, who scored 56 points in three games, scored 26 points in the semis to lead the Pirates into the title contest.

ECU rallied from a seven-point second half deficit to best the regular season champion Wildcats. Two free throws by Dave Franklin and another by Quash in the final 18 seconds lifted the Pirates to a four-point victory, 81-77.

Thanks to Franklin's 20-point performance in the quarterfinals, ECU was able to dispose of a pesky Citadel squad.

After trailing by as many as nine in the first half and five at intermission, the Pirates looked to Franklin in the second half.

He made ECU's first four shots after intermission to reclaim the lead at 38-37. They never trailed after that point.

Leading by as many as 13 in the second half, ECU watched its lead diminish to three with 43 seconds left. Pope, however, hit two free throws with 29 seconds remaining to run the Pirates out to a five-point lead. ECU then got a pair of steals for buckets in the final second to dart out the final nine-point margin.

Franklin collected 39 points during the three-day run; Pope 37; Jerome Owens 36; Quash 32; and Faber 21 as no one man was forced to carry the burden.

Fairley and Pope were named first-team all-tournament, while Franklin earned second-team honors.

1993 CAA Champions

The Colonial Athletic Association was in its eighth year of existence and ECU was still searching for its first CAA title. And with the Pirates entering the 1993 CAA Tournament in Richmond as the No. 7 seed with a 10-16 record, there was little reason to expect ECU would win its first.

But thanks to the play of a pair of sharp shooting guards, a vibrant senior and a championship hungry coach, ECU captured its lone CAA championship and advanced to the its second NCAA Tournament in school history.

The Pirates ended the regular season losing two of its final three games, including a 73-60 loss at home to Old Dominion, the tournament's No. 2 seed and ECU's first round opponent. The Monarchs won both regular season meetings between the two by an average of 16.5 points. ECU reversed its fortunes during the third meeting of the year, 73-67, behind the outstanding play of senior Ike Copeland.

Copeland scored a career-high 24 points, hitting on near perfect 9-of-10 shooting from the field. He also connected on 6-of-6 free throws, and grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds. Anton Gil contributed 14 points as the Pirates outscored the Monarchs, 8-2 over the final 3:47.

The semifinal round pitted a pair of Cinderella teams, as ECU faced sixth-seeded UNC Wilmington, who upset Richmond the night before. The Pirates played one of its best defensive games of the season as they held the Seahawks to 31.6 percent shooting from the field and held on for a 55-50 win after leading by as many as 19 in the second half. Lester Lyons tallied 18 points in the game, the only Pirate to reach double figures.

As expected, the upstart Pirates faced top-seeded James Madison in the championship game. Coach Lefty Driesell led the Dukes to a 19-7 overall record during the regular season and a first place finish in the CAA for the fourth consecutive year.

A relaxed and confident group of Pirates set the tempo and forced JMU to play their way, ran their motion offense patiently and led by as many as six on two occasions during the second half. ECU trailed by one with 5:56 remaining, but out-scored the Dukes, 12-8 during the final minutes to claim a 54-49 victory.

Lyons, the tournament's Most Valuable Player, scored 14 points in the win, while Curley Young poured in a team-high 15 points. Lyons was joined by one of his teammates, Copeland, on the all-tournament team.

With ECU leading by three in the final 20 seconds, JMU attempted a three-point field goal that rattled in and out, and bounced into the hands of Copeland. A 58 percent free-throw shooter, Copeland scored his only two points of the game with 14.3 seconds left as he swished a pair of free throws to seal the victory.

"You can't explain it," said Pirate head coach Eddie Payne. "It's a supernatural thing. I didn't think about winning the tournament when we got here. I just pointed out that we've been playing good basketball of late. You can't win without winning the first game."


"It's a dream come true," said Copeland. "I always thought we had a chance."

The Pirates earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and a date with the East Region's No. 1 seed and eventual national champion, North Carolina.

The Pirates fell, 85-65, but drew the respect of many college basketball observers. During the NCAA Championship Game, CBS color commentator Billy Packer noted that he had seen no one play better against North Carolina's trapping defense than ECU during the NCAA Tournament.

2013 CIT Champions

Junior Akeem Richmond hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to lift ECU over Weber State 77-74 and claim the CollegeInsider.com tournament championship, capping the best season in school history.

Miguel Paul led ECU with 23 points and Maurice Kemp added 20 for the Pirates, who tied a school record for wins in a season set by the 1953-54 squad and won their first-ever Division I postseason championship.

Kemp was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player with Paul and Robert Sampson earning all-tournament team honors.

The Pirates trailed 71-65 with 2:50 remaining but closed on a 12-3 run. Kemp sank a 3 to cut the lead in half and Paul made a pair of free throws to make it a 2-point game with less than two minutes to play.

Following two missed foul shots by Weber State, Paul tossed the ball up to Sampson for the game-tying layup. After Scott Bamforth made just one of two free throws, Paul hit Sampson streaking down the lane for the go-ahead slam.

Davion Berry then made just one of two foul shots to tie the game at 74 with 21 seconds to play. Weber State made just 3 of 9 free throws in the final three minutes, hitting only 9-of-19 foul shots overall.

Bamforth led Weber State with 19 points, while Berry and Frank Otis had 16 apiece.

The two teams traded the lead six times in the first 14 minutes before ECU used an 8-0 spurt to take the largest lead of the game by either side, seven points.

The Pirates shot 60 percent in the first half and led 42-35 at halftime with Ty Armstrong scoring all 10 of his points in the opening frame. ECU scored 28 points in the paint before halftime and tallied 38 inside the lane for the game.

Both teams ended the game shooting over 50 percent from the floor with ECU connecting on a season-high 58.1 percent of its shots (30-51) and

the Wildcats making 52.7 percent (29-55) of their attempts.

Although they didn't get to the foul line as often, the Pirates capitalized on more of their attempts, making 11 of 14.

Weber State opened the second half on an 9-2 run to tie the game at 44 in less than three minutes before taking a 48-46 lead. ECU then outscored the Wildcats 13-4 to reclaim its seven-point halftime advantage.




History



ECU Basketball Timeline —

1931-32

After 22 years of existence as a college, basketball is established as the first intercollegiate sport at ECU. The first game is played Dec. 15 against Greenville All-Stars and won by ECU, 23-17. This is the first game of a 20-game schedule, which produces a 10-10 record.

1934-35

G.L. Mathis is hired as the first paid basketball coach and the nickname "Pirates" was adopted. Mathis coaches the team for two years, and post an 18-17 record.

1936-37

ECU scores over 100 points for the first time on Jan. 15, beating the Washington All-Stars 103-18. Two officials were also used during home games for the first time.

1942-43

Due to the United States' entrance into World War II, the remainder of the 1942-43 season and the 1943-44 season is canceled.

1945-46

Howard Porter is hired as an assistant coach, making him the first assistant coach in ECU history.

1947-48

ECU is accepted into the North State Conference, marking its first conference affiliation. The Pirates post a mark of 6-4 during its first season in the league.

1948-49

Sonny Russell is named All-North State Conference, becoming the first all-conference player in school history.

Louis Collie and Todd Fennel are given the first basketball scholarships at ECU.

1951-52

ECU plays in its first postseason game in the N.A.I.B. District Tournament, defeating High Point before losing to Elon.

1952-53

ECU defeated Elon, 72-56, to win the NAIA District 26 Tournament and advance to the NAIA National Tournament.

The Pirates advanced to NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, where they lost to Arkansas Tech. It was the first flight for an ECU athletic team for competition.

1953-54

The 1953-54 season marks the best season in school history with 23-2 record. The Pirates win the North State Conference regular season and tournament championship and its second consecutive NAIA District Tournament championship.

Bobby Hodges ends his career in 1954 with 2,108 points, establishing him at that time, as the all-time leading scorer in North Carolina.

The Pirates win a school record 16 consecutive games during that season.

1955-56

ECU had its 50-game home winning streak snapped by Lenoir-Rhyne in the fifth game of the season. The streak began on Jan. 5, 1953 with a win over Appalachian State.

1964

ECU is admitted into the Southern Conference, but wasn't eligible for competition until the following year.

1965-66

The Pirates post a record of 5-7 and finish in fifth place during their first season in the Southern Conference during the 1965-66 campaign.

1966-67

Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a scholarship at ECU. Colbert averages over 14 points per game from 1966-68.

1967-68

Minges Coliseum opens on the ECU campus. The Pirates compile a record of 7-5 during their first season in the facility. The coliseum is officially dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968.

The Pirates defeat George Washington, 71-68, on Jan. 3 in the only quadruple overtime game in school history.

1968-69

On Dec. 7, ECU defeats Atlantic Christian, 126-111, to set school records for points in a game and most combined points scored by two teams.

ECU plays in its first Southern Conference Tournament Championships game, losing to Davidson.

1971-72

ECU wins its only Southern Conference title by defeating Furman in the championship game, 77-75. The Pirates made their first trip to the NCAA Tournament and lost to Villanova in the first round.

1974-75

ECU posts its best-ever Southern Conference record going 11-3 and finished in second place. ECU is upset in the second round of the tournament, but received an invitation to play in the Collegiate Commissioners Tournament. ECU lost to Arizona in the first round.

1977

The Pirates withdrew their membership from the Southern Conference during June of 1977. ECU competed as an independent from 1978-80.

1977-78

Oliver Mack finishes fourth in the nation in scoring with a 28.0 points per game average. Finishing ahead of him were Freeman Williams of Portland State, Larry Bird of Indiana State and Purvis Short of Jackson State.

1981-82

ECU joins the Eastern College Athletic Conference and competes in the ECAC-South Division. The seven members of the South Division will eventually form their own conference in 1985, the Colonial Athletic Association.

1985-86

ECU becomes a charter member of the eight team Colonial Athletic Association. The Pirates post a record of 6-8 during the first year of CAA play and finish tied for fourth.

1988-89

Theodore "Blue" Edwards becomes the only Pirate to win CAA Player-of-the-Year honors. He is also the first Pirate to be selected in first round of the NBA Draft. Edwards was taken by the Utah Jazz with the 21st overall pick.

1991-92

Wake Forest graduate and former ECU assistant coach Eddie Payne is named the Pirates' 18th head coach prior to the start of the season. His first team goes just 10-18, but the foundation is laid for a remarkable run a year later.

A Quick Run Through The History Books

1992-93

Despite finishing in seventh place in the CAA, ECU rode a string of upsets through the CAA Tournament to win its lone conference tournament championship. ECU defeats James Madison in the championship game to advance to its second NCAA Tournament. The Pirates lost to eventual national champion North Carolina in the opening round.

1994-95

ECU wins 18 games in a season for the first time in 20 years, marking the third-highest single-season win total in school history.

1995-96

Taking over for the departed Eddie Payne, new head coach Joe Dooley wins 17 games, second most ever at ECU by a first-year head coach. Dooley wins 17 games each of his first two seasons.

ECU defeats East Tennessee State, 80-76, on Jan. 6 in the first game at the newly renovated and named Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum. The Pirates played their first nine games of the season away from home.

1999

ECU changes conferences for the fifth time as the announcement is made that the Pirates are leaving the CAA to join Conference USA in 2001-02.

2001-02

ECU competes in Conference USA for the first time as it compiles a 5-11 mark.

The Pirates defeat Louisville, 87-77, to record their first Conference USA victory on Jan. 16.

ECU shocks No. 9 Marquette at home, 51-46, winning its first-ever game over a top 10 opponent on Feb. 26.

2003-04

The Pirates stun the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles again, 73-70, at Minges Coliseum on Dec. 30.

2004-05

Moussa Badiane establishes the Conference USA career record for blocked shots. Badiane finished his four-year career with 314 blocked shots.

2005-06

Corey Rouse becomes the first player in school history to garner All-Conference USA honors. Rouse is named second-team all-conference.

2006-07

Darrell Jenkins becomes the first player in school history to lead a conference in assists. Jenkins averaged 5.53 helpers per game to post the highest average in Conference USA during the 2007-08 season. He repeated the feat the following year.

The Pirates defeat an ACC opponent for the first-time in school history, beating N.C. State 75-69 in the Wolfpack's first-ever visit to Minges Coliseum on Dec. 8.

2008-09

Brock Young finished the year ranked second in the NCAA in assists per game with 7.57. He set an ECU record by distributing 227 assists during the season.

2010-11

Jeff Lebo is introduced as the 22nd basketball coach in school history on March 23.

The Pirates post their first winning season in 14 years, finishing with an 18-16 record and receive an invitation to compete in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). It was ECU's first post-season appearance since 1993.

Brock Young was named Conference USA Sixth Man-of-the-Year.

ECU defeated UCF in the first round of the Conference USA tournament, recording its first-ever victory in the championship event. The Pirates defeated top-seeded UAB the following day to advance to the semifinals.

2011-12

Derrius Morrow becomes the seventh player in school history to amass 1,000 points and 700 rebounds in his career.

Miguel Paul becomes the first player named to an NABC All-District II squad, earning second-team honors.

ECU wins a game in the C-USA tournament for the second straight season, marking the first time that the Pirates have won a conference tournament game in consecutive seasons since 1972 and '73.

2012-13

The Pirates capture the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) championship, securing the first postseason title in school history.

ECU records its first-ever 20-win season as a Division I institution, posting 23 victories.

Senior Maurice Kemp becomes the first player at ECU to be named First-Team All-Conference USA and first to lead C-USA in scoring.

ECU registers its only winning C-USA season and finishes in a program-best fourth place with a 9-7 record and receives a bye into the tournament quarterfinals.

The Pirates defeat UAB on Jan. 23 to record the program's 1,000th victory.

2013-14

Akeem Richmond becomes the first player in ECU history to be an NCAA statistical champion, leading the nation in 3-point field goals made, attempts and per game.

2014-15

ECU plays its inaugural season in the American Athletic Conference. The Pirates finish tied for seventh place with a 6-12 record and advanced to the quarterfinals of the conference tournament.

ECU defeated Houston, 66-61, to win its first American conference game on Jan. 14.

Freshman B.J. Tyson is a unanimous selection to the league's all-rookie team.

2015-16

ECU defeats Charlotte in its second game of the season to give coach Jeff Lebo his 300th career victory.

Kentrell Barkley is voted to The American All-Rookie team.

Prince Williams is named the conference's Most Improved player.

2016-17

Coach Jeff Lebo becomes the school's all-time leader in Division I coaching victories.

Caleb White becomes the fifth player in school history to score 1,500 career points.

Jeremy Sheppard is voted to The American All-Rookie team.

Andre Washington sets the ECU single-season record for blocked shots and ranks among the top six nationally in total blocks and blocked shots per game.

2017-18

Coach Jeff Lebo resigns six games into the season and Michael Perry takes over as interim coach the remainder of the season.

Shawn Williams is named The American Rookie-Of-The-Year.

B.J. Tyson finishes his career ranked fifth all-time at ECU in scoring.
