■ DOOLEY ENTERING SIXTH SEASON AT ECU

- ECU Head Coach Joe Dooley is in his second season leading the Pirates following a five-year tenure at Florida Gulf Coast. It is his sixth season overall at the helm of the program, previously serving as head coach from 1995-99 and compiling a 57-52 ledger during his four-year tenure.
- Dooley spent a total of eight years during his previous stint at ECU, serving as the top assistant coach to Eddie Pavne from 1991-95 before being promoted to head coach following Payne's departure.
- He won more games (44) in his first three years at the helm of the program than any of his predecessors. In 1996-97, he led the Pirates to their only top-3 finish during their 15-year membership in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), tying for third with a 9-7 record.

■ COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- · George Wright-Easy, who previously served as head coach at Dexter Southfield School in Boston, joined the Pirates coaching staff during the summer. Wright-Easy takes over for Ken Potosnak, who moved into the role of assistant to the head coach. Wright-Easy also served as a graduate assistant coach at Providence from 2012-14 and helped the Friars win the 2014 BIG EAST title.
- In his new role, Potosnak will serve as an advisor, provide analysis for purposes of program and player development as well as analyze film of opponents to contribute to the development of game strategy.
- Derek DeMasi was promoted from assistant director of basketball operations to director of player development.

■ PIRATES ASSEMBLE TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

- The Hoop Scoop ranked ECU's incoming class of 2019 as the 10th best in the nation this past summer. The Pirates welcome 11 newcomers to the roster this season. featuring seven junior college transfers and four freshmen. Among the transfers are former Virginia Tech quard Tyrie Jackson and former Washington quard Bitumba Baruti.
- Tremont Robinson-White, JJ Miles, Edra Luster, Baruti and Jackson were all ranked among the top 50 in 247sports.com 2019 top junior college recruits. Robinson-White was ranked No. 8.

■ ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- The Pirates' 2019-20 roster features 16 players (13 scholarship student-athletes) from seven states and two foreign country (Democratic Republic of Congo and Guadeloupe).
- ECU has one senior, six juniors (four scholarship), four sophomores (three scholarship) and four true freshmen.
- Senior Seth LeDay and sophomore Jayden Gardner are the only returning lettermen on the team. The duo accounted for 40 percent of the Pirates' points and rebounds last season.

■ PIRATES HAVE SIZE

- ECU's 13 scholarship student-athletes have an average height of 78.69 inches, making this squad the biggest group of scholarship players in school history. The previous largest roster was also compiled by Coach Dooley as the 13-player 1996-97 squad averaged 78.1 inches per person.
- · Freshman Charles Coleman as well as juniors Ludgy Debaut and Edra Luster are each seven-feet tall. Its the first time in school history that three players on the roster are listed at seven feet.

■ GARDNER AMONG TOP RETURNEES IN THE AMERICAN

• Sophomore Jayden Gardner, an unanimous selection on The American All-Freshmen Team last season, is tied with Temple's Quinton Rose as the second-leading returning scorer in the league with 16.3 ppg behind Cincinnati's Jarron Cumberland (18.8 ppg). He is also second among returning players with 8.5 rebounds per game behind fellow sophomore Alexis Yetna of USF (9.6 rpg).

Media Information

■ CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Credentials for ECU home basketball games are for working media only and are issued on a priority basis. Credentials should be requested as early as possible. Credential requests should be made through the ECU Athletics Media Relations Office no later than 48 hours in advance of a game via e-mail and directed to ECU Associate Director of Athletics Media Relations Jody Jones (jonesjod@ecu. edu). Spouses, dates and non-workers are not permitted along press row. Credentials will be left at the Will-Call window at the front of Minges Coliseum.

The ECU Athletics Media Relations office reserves the right to revoke or deny working media credentials to any individual or organization at any time for any reason. All credentials are property of ECU and must be surrendered upon requests. Any requests placed less than 24 hours prior to the game may not be honored.

■ PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographer credentials are limited. Accredited photographers may work along the baseline at either end of the court in the designated areas. No photographer will be allowed to shoot in front of the scorer's table, press row, behind the team benches or from the stands. The platform atop the south side of Williams Arena is reserved exclusively for team videographers and network television cameras. Photographers must be sitting or kneeling in the end zone areas at all times.

■ COVERING PRACTICE

ECU practices are CLOSED the media and public. Media desiring to conduct coach or player interviews should contact the ECU Athletics Media Relations at least 24 hours in advance. Photographers are allowed to shoot a predetermined portion at the beginning of each practice. Pirate coaches and student-athletes will be available for interviews prior to the start of practice the day before home games, and the day prior to traveling for away games.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the lower Minges lot. Entry to the lot is off Charles St. and onto Ficklen Drive. Parking is on a first-come, first-serve basis, and no passes are required to park in this lot.

■ GAME SERVICES

Pregame statistics, game notes and roster cards are provided prior to tip-off. A play-by-play and final statistics are included in the postgame booklets. Complete stat books will be available to media after the completion of each contest. Statistical monitors will be provided to television and radio broadcasts based on availability.

WIRELESS INTERNET

Wireless internet access is available inside the arena and the interview room. An access code is required and can be obtained from a member of the ECU Athletics Media Relations staff. Press row, which is located at the top of section 213, is also equipped with high speed ethernet cables.

■ POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

At home games, all postgame interviews will be conducted in the Smith-Williams Center. A mult-box is available. Each head coach and designated players will be brought into this area following a customary 10-minute cooling off period. The ECU locker room is closed.

■ REAL-TIME INTERNET POLICY

The ECU Department of Athletics retains the rights to the distribution of play-by-play, statistical material and photographs of ECU basketball during and following game action, just as it retains the rights to the video and audio description of game action. All rights to the dissemination of

■ ECUPIRATES.COM

■VISITING RADIO

Radio network right-holders for opposing teams are provided three seats along the scorer's table directly next to

the visiting team bench. A stat monitor is available and printed stats will be provided at halftime and at the conclusion of each game. ECU provides an ISDN line and analog line at no charge.

■INJURY REPORTS

Per university policy, athletic training room personnel are not allowed to publicly comment on player injuries. All requests for player injury reports should be directed to the Athletics Media Relations office. Federal policy (HIPPA) prohibits information other than listing the injured "body part" and "game status" from being released.

■ 100,000-WATT FLAGSHIP STEERS PIRATE IMG RADIO NETWORK

The ECU Athletics Department and IMG College, the multimedia rights-holder for Pirate Athletics, are in the 12th year of a partnership with 107.9 WNCT-FM, the 100,000watt flagship station for the Pirate IMG Radio Network.

WNCT-FM's powerful signal provides expanded coverage for ECU sports, extending to Raleigh (to the west), southern Virginia (to the north) and up and down the North Carolina coastline.

The ECU Department of Athletics and IMG College, the national leader in the collegiate sports marketing industry, entered into an agreement during the spring of 2006 that provides the company with the exclusive multimedia rights to Pirate Athletics.

The partnership, which now runs through 2023 and continues to quarantee the university an annual rights fee plus additional considerations based upon revenue generated by Learfield IMG College. It encompasses all sales and marketing opportunities associated with ECU sports, including radio and television programming, game programs and other athletics publications, signage in all campus athletic venues, and at-event corporate promotions and hospitality functions.

ECU is one of an impressive group of NCAA member institutions, conferences and venues that are aligned with Learfield IMG College. With primary offices in Atlanta, Ga.,

Jefferson City, Mo., and Winston-Salem, N.C., and headquartered in Plano, Texas, Learfield IMG College is a longtime advocate for intercollegiate athletics and the student-athlete experience. Since 2008, it has served as title sponsor for the accalimed Learfield IMG College Directors' Cup, supporting athletics departments across all divisions.

■ PIRATE BASKETBALL ON THE RADIO

Pirate Basketball may be heard throughout North Carolina as well as portions of South Carolina and Virginia via the Pirate IMG Radio Network.

Jeff Charles is in his 32nd year handling the play-by-play duties on the network after previously serving in the same capacity at Virginia Tech, Illinois, and Furman prior to becoming the "Voice of the Pirates." The two-time North Carolina Sportscaster-of-the-Year also served as sports director at WSB in Atlanta where he was the night-time host of a sports talk show heard throughout 38 states and Canada on the 50,000-watt clear channel station. He resides with his wife, Debbie, in Farmville,

The Elizabeth City native served as head basketball coach at Craven Community College in New Bern for 17 years and was four times named Region X Coach of the Year. 

FROM THE TIDEWATER (VA.) AREA

Take U.S. Highway 13 from Suffolk to Ahoskie, N.C. Take bypass around Ahoskie (N.C. Highway 11) and take N.C. Highway 11 to Greenville where it turns into Memorial Drive. Take Fifth Street to Cotanche Street and take a right. Take Cotanche, which turns into Charles Boulevard to Ficklen Drive and take a left. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

■ FROM I-95 NORTH

Take I-95 South to U.S. Highway 264 exit (Wilson, N.C.). Take a left at the end of the exit ramp and continue on U.S. Highway 264 past Wilson and head into Greenville. Take U.S. Highway 264 to Allen Road (second traffic light) and turn right. Allen Road turns into Greenville Boulevard. Take Greenville Boulevard to Charles Boulevard and take a left (ECU message board on corner). Take Charles Boulevard down hill (passing Clark-LeClair Stadium on the right) and turn right on Ficklen Drive. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

■ FROM I-95 SOUTH

Take I-95 North to US 264 exit (Wilson, N.C.). Take a right and continue on U.S. Highway 264 past Wilson and head into Greenville. Take U.S. Highway 264 to Allen Road (second traffic light) and turn right. Allen Road turns into Greenville Boulevard. Take Greenville Boulevard to Charles Boulevard and take a left (ECU message board on corner).

Take Charles Boulevard down hill (passing Clark-LeClair Stadium on the right) and turn right on Ficklen Drive. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

■ FROM THE TRIANGLE AREA

Take U.S. Highway 64 from Raleigh and head east. Exit right onto U.S. Highway 264 past Zebulon and head east past Wilson and toward Greenville. Take U.S. Highway 264 to Allen Road (second traffic light) and turn right. Allen Road turns into Greenville Boulevard, Take Greenville Boulevard to Charles Boulevard and take a left (ECU message board on corner). Take Charles Boulevard down hill (passing Clark-LeClair Stadium on the right) and turn right on Ficklen Drive. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.

■ FROM WILMINGTON

Take I-40 northwest to Wallace. Take right onto N.C. Highway 51 and head north through Chiquapin and Beulaville (about 20-25 miles). Get on N.C. Highway 241 in Beulaville and head about 10 miles north to Pink Hill, where you will pick up N.C. Highway 11. Take N.C. Highway 11 through downtown Kinston and into Greenville, where it turns into Memorial Drive. Take Memorial Drive to Greenville Boulevard and take a right. Take Greenville Boulevard to Charles Boulevard and take a left (ECU message board on corner). Take Charles Boulevard down hill (passing Clark-LeClair Stadium on the right) and turn right on Ficklen Drive. Minges Coliseum is up the hill on the right.



East Carolina University

■WHO WE ARE

East Carolina University is a 112-year-old public university nationally recognized for preparing educators and primary care physicians and for its cultural and performing arts programs.

It enrolls more than 28,700 undergraduate, graduate and doctoral students and is North Carolina's largest preparer of newly licensed teachers and nurses. ECU is the state's most influential preparer of physicians who practice in North Carolina, especially in rural and underserved communities. It is home to a rapidly growing Honors College and the largest College of Business in North Carolina. Additionally, the university is one of only a few nationwide with dental medicine, engineering and medicine at the same institution.

Our motto is Servire, or To Serve.

■ OUICK FACTS

- Military ties: ECU is located near four major military bases, including Camp Lejeune and Fort Bragg. In 2010, the university received the Freedom Award from the United States Department of Defense for its support of military families and service men and women, and in 2017, ECU was the first university to receive the United States Department of Defense Extraordinary Support Award for sustained support of National Guard and Reserve service members.
- Economic Muscle: ECU's economic impact is estimated at \$2.8 billion statewide, with more than \$1.8 billion in eastern North Carolina.
- Medicine: No medical school in North Carolina and only one other in the nation - has produced a higher percentage of family physicians in the last decade than ECU's Brody School of Medicine, according to the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Brody leads the state in its percentage of graduates who are currently practicing primary care in North Carolina. Brody's medical and residency program graduates practice in 86 of North Carolina's 100 counties.

ECU Physicians, Brody's faculty-led practice, includes more than 500 medical providers who see patients in dozens of primary and specialty care clinics. The practice serves as the "health care safety net" for a 29-county area of eastern N.C., providing care to a disproportionately large number of patients who are uninsured or enrolled in government-sponsored health insurance programs.

Brody laboratory and clinical researchers are studying the health conditions and health challenges most prevalent throughout the region. They're recognized as international leaders in the study of metabolic diseases like diabetes, hypertension and obesity.

• Dental Medicine: The ECU School of Dental Medicine employs a nationally unique model of education and patient care that earned it a 2019 Gies Award for Innovation from the American Dental Education



Association. Fourth-year dental students complete three 9-week rotations at the school's statewide community service learning centers, giving them a well-rounded and diverse experience serving patient populations in different parts of North Carolina.

The eight centers, strategically placed to best meet the needs of the state's rural and underserved populations, are located in Ahoskie, Brunswick County, Davidson County, Elizabeth City, Lillington, Robeson County, Sylva and Spruce Pine.

The dental school's on-campus clinics and community service learning centers have treated nearly 64,000 patients from all 100 North Carolina counties since the dental school enrolled its inaugural class in 2011.

- •Leading in Preparing Teachers: ECU's Partnership East program, funded by a private sector grant, helps fill an urgent need for teachers in North Carolina's rural classrooms by providing scholarships allowing residents of rural communities to complete their senior year teaching internships without leaving home. Seventy-five percent of Partnership East graduates are teaching in North Carolina, and 94 percent of those are teaching in eastern North Carolina.
- · National Recognition for Engagement and Public Service: ECU received the prestigious C. Peter Magrath Award for University/Community Engagement in 2012 from the Association of Public and Land Grant Universities for its partnership with and service to the citizens of West Greenville through the Lucille W. Gorham Intergenerational Center.
- Improving Lives: Dr. Sy Atezaz Saeed, chair of ECU's Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine and Founding Director of the North Carolina Statewide Telepsychiatry Program (NC-STeP), a state-funded program covering more than 60 hospitals in North



Carolina, received the University of North Carolina System's highest faculty honor in 2019. He was honored with the Oliver Max Gardner Award, recognizing faculty who have "made the greatest contribution to the welfare of the human race," for his work to increase access to mental health services for patients in rural and underserved areas. Dr. Saeed is the ninth ECU faculty member to receive the award.

■OTHER NOTABLES

- •ECU nurtures a culture of high academic achievement on campus. The Honors College receives more than 1,200 competitive applications for 200 freshmen openings. Each freshman entering the Honors College receives some level of scholarship support.
- In addition, we integrate public service into the custom learning experience of our highest-performing students, immersing them in leadership and learning that requires service projects as part of the Honors College curriculum.
- We are a highly diverse campus, with minorities making up 32 percent of our undergraduate students. In fall 2018, ECU's medical school welcomed its most diverse class of medical students in its 42-year history. More than half are minority students, and 33 percent are from minority groups - African-American, Native

- American and Hispanic or Latino who are considered "underrepresented in medicine."

Interim Chancellor

■ DAN GERLACH (Notre Dame '89)

Dan Gerlach assumed duties as interim chancellor at East Carolina University on May 6, 2019 after being named to the position by University of North Carolina System Interim President Bill Roper in April.

"Dan Gerlach has been a tremendous advocate for higher education and eastern North Carolina for more than a decade," said Roper, "I know Dan will work in lock-step with the strong leadership team at East Carolina, which includes the ECII Board of Trustees, the UNC Board of Governors, faculty, staff and students, alumni and the entire East Carolina community. With his ex-

emplary record of service and leadership, he is the ideal candidate to lead ECU going forward."

Since October 2008, Gerlach has served as president of the Golden LEAF Foundation. Gerlach previously served as a legislative budget analyst, nonprofit policy director and senior advisor to the governor. He has served on over a dozen commissions on budget, tax, agriculture and economic development at the state and national level. He is currently on the boards of the MyFutureNC Commission and the N.C. Early Childhood Foundation. He was named to the transition committee for Roper





earlier this year.

"It is an honor and privilege to be asked to serve in this role at East Carolina University," Gerlach said. "ECU provides more opportunity for rural North Carolinians than any other institution, and I look forward to working with the entire ECU community to meet the needs of our students, their families and the communities that look to this great university for inspiration and leadership. It's a great day to join Pirate Nation."

Gerlach has led Golden LEAF on its primary mission to build economic opportunity across North Carolina. The Golden LEAF Foundation was established in 1999 to administer one half of the tobacco

settlement agreement monies back into North Carolina's rural and economically distressed communities. Under Gerlach's leadership, the foundation has partnered with state and local governments and other foundations. Through grants, collaboration, innovation and stewardship, Golden LEAF has been firmly established as an independent and perpetual foundation.

Gerlach earned an MPA in state and local public finance from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University in 1990 after receiving bachelor's degrees in economics and English from the University of Notre Dame in 1989. He previously served as an adjunct instructor of public administration at UNC-Chapel Hill and N.C. State University.

Director of Athletics

■JON GILBERT

(Lenoir-Rhyne '91)

Jon Gilbert was named director of athletics at East Carolina University in Decemher of 2018.

Prior to serving as athletics director at the University of Southern Mississippi since January 2017, Gilbert worked in senior athletics administrative positions at two Southeastern Conference institutions - the University of Alabama and the University of Tennessee.

At Southern Miss, Gilbert installed a student-athlete first mindset that focused on education. comprehensive excellence and community involvement. He used a grassroots approach to share his vision with stakeholders, speaking at numerous local, regional and state events.

USM increased resources in the areas of academic success and student-athlete well-being under his leadership. The school hired Conference USA's first full-time nutritionist and built the student-athletes' first nutrition fueling bar. To further assist student-athlete development, Gilbert added positions of learning specialist, tutors and life skills staff members. Additionally, student-athletes volunteered more than 3,800 hours of community service from 2016-17.

In the classroom, 67 Southern Miss student-athletes were named to the President's List (4.0, GPA) and 102 student-athletes to the Dean's List (3.50-3.99 GPA) in 2017-18. Overall, all 17 teams met or exceeded the national average in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) standards.

In competition, the Golden Eagles won three conference championships with four athletic teams advancing to the NCAA postseason. In addition, USM had 10 individual conference champions, one C-USA player-of-the-year, two league coach-of-the-year honorees and nine NCAA All-America selections.

As part of a restructure in the athletics development office, the department generated the highest cash and support in department history while the Eagle Club registered its second-highest ever membership total. As part of the "I'm In" Campaign, the Eagle Club gained 100 percent participation from athletics staff members.

Gilbert came to Southern Miss from Tennessee, where he served as executive senior associate athletics director since 2011 under former longtime ECU athletics ad-

ministrator Dave Hart. At UT, Gilbert was responsible for different facets of day-to-day department of athletics operations. His role included leadership duties across the department from strategic planning and management, to external operations, academic affairs and more.

Before his experience at Tennessee, Gilbert worked for nearly 17 years at Alabama where he served in multiple roles, including associate athletics director from 2009 to 2011. There, the development office generated \$82 million in gifts and pledges for the Crimson Tide Foundation and Gilbert had oversight of the marketing and promotions department, as well as all facets of the ticket office and seat licensing program.

Gilbert is a 1991 graduate of Lenoir-Rhyne College in Hickory, N.C., where he was a three-year letterman on the football team. He earned a master's degree in sport administration at Eastern Kentucky University in 1992, while working as a graduate assistant football coach. The Colonels captured one Ohio Valley Conference championship and earned two berths in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

He and his wife, Katie, have two teenage children daughter Larsen and son Kent.

Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum

One of the most intimate and fan friendly arenas in all of NCAA Division I Basketball is Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum, home of ECU basketball. This cozy 7,100-seat facility gives the Pirates a distinct home court advantage unlike any other.

Now in its 52nd season of hosting Pirate basketball, the coliseum is connected to the second level of the Murphy Center by an indoor walkway. The floor inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum received a fresh look prior to the 2019-20 season with new designs and logos, while a new video boards and scoreboards were installed in 2014-15. Courtside seating was also instituted in recent years.

After 27 years of basketball, Minges Coliseum underwent a facelift prior to the 1994-95 season. The anticipation was great and the much-awaited unveiling was everything it was supposed to be and more. The renovations, totaling almost \$12 million, have made the arena one of the finest on-campus basketball facilities on the East Coast.

Constructed at a cost of \$2 million, Minges Coliseum was dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968, in the name of the Minges family of Greenville, N.C. As owners of Pepsi-Cola bottling operations in Greenville, Kinston and New Bern, the Minges family has provided leadership and support of ECU Athletics over the years, going back to the days when the late Dr. Ray Minges served as President of the Century Club (forerunner of the Pirate Club), from 1965-68. The Pirates have won 66 percent of their games since the Coliseum opened in 1967. ECU has had only eight losing records in Minges in its history. Since the building was renovated in 1994, the Pirates have won nearly 70 percent of their home games.

All the Minges Coliseum attendance records were shattered following renovation in 1995, including total season (71,761), average season (5,980 for 12 games) and for a single game (7,670 vs. UNC Wilmington (Feb. 25). The single-game mark, in fact, was broken three times during the season — Jan. 6 vs. East Tennessee State, Jan. 14 vs. James Madison and Feb. 25 vs. UNC Wilmington.

Williams Arena is named in honor and recognition of the late Walter and Marie Williams for their support of ECU Athletics over the years. As alumni of East Carolina College, Walter and Marie have endowed two Men's Basketball Position scholarships, the Spirit of the East Post-Eligibility Scholarship, and an unrestricted student-athlete scholarship on behalf of the University's athletics program. Further, through Trade Oil Company, the Williams family gave the first \$1 million gift ever given to the Educational Foundation in support of ECU Athletics, through the Shared Visions Campaign.

In addition to his financial support, Walter Williams gave his time unselfishly in support of the Pirate Club. During 1997-98, he served as Executive President of the Educational Foundation.



Smith-Williams Center



It had been talked about for years and dreamed about perhaps even longer, but the aspiration of having a dedicated basketball practice facility has become a reality at ECU.

The 49,000 square-foot Smith-Williams Center was officially dedicated on Aug. 30, 2013 as ECU athletic department staff, donors and media got their first look at the sparkling new building which is the new home to both the men's and women's basketball programs, providing them with a state-of-the-art venue in which to practice, train and condition.

Named for lead donors Harry and Tammy Smith and Walter and Marie Williams, the center features mirror image practice courts, locker rooms, coaches' offices, meeting rooms, training rooms for each program and also hous-

es the Athletics Hall of Fame, which features a prideful display of the rich tradition of intercollegiate athletics at ECU.

Each court is named for donors who contributed significantly to the Step Up To The Highest Level campaign. The floor inside the women's practice gym is called Barnhill Court in recognition of the financial support of Bob Barnhill of Tarboro.

The men's gym floor is named Whitaker-Rogers court in appreciation of the monetary gifts of Mike and Janet Rogers of Cary, N.C. and Don and Donna Whitaker of Virginia Beach, Va. Whitaker was a two-year ECU letterman on the hardwood for coaches Dave Patton and Larry Gillman.

The center has a total project cost of \$17 million that was funded entirely through private gifts.



For years, the ECU men's and women's teams have been routinely displaced from the Minges Coliseum for practices due to classes, concerts and numerous other events in the arena, which has been in existence since 1965. In recent years practices have been held at Christenbury Gym, Gold's Gym, North Campus Crossing and area high schools due to scheduling conflicts.

Now they won't have to compete with other activities or themselves - for court time.

While a lot of the perception is based upon recruiting both coaches and players understand the value it will have on each individual's overall development.

Its because of the vision of former Director of Athletics Terry Holland, who helped initiate the launch of the Step Up To The Highest Level Campaign in the spring of 2010, that the Pirate basketball programs now have a home of their own.

Strength & Conditioning



The Murphy Center, still considered one of the athletic department's newest facilities, is located between Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium and Minges Coliseum. Thanks to a major renovation during the summer of 2019, it is now considered one of the largest and best-equipped strength and conditioning centers in the country.

ECU's Board of Trustees approved the initial project in the spring 1997, thus putting it into the athletics department staff's hands to make this 52,475-square-foot, two-story strength and conditioning/Pirate Club multipurpose center a reality.

ECU's strength and conditioning programs for its student-athletes are based out of the 22,000-square-foot first floor of the \$13 million facility. The weight room has revolutionized the Pirates' strength and conditioning efforts.

The center opened for workouts in June 2002 and was dedicated at ECU's home football game on September 14, 2002.

The second floor of the building features a private dining area for recruits as well as a 9,000-square-foot banguet hall and a large terrace with a view of the football stadium for Pirate Club functions.

Because of its location behind the Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium endzone and its connection to Minges Coliseum and the Smith-Williams Center (ECU Athletics Hall of Fame), the Murphy Center is an ideal place for Pirate Club members to socialize at both football and basketball games.

ECU's student-athletes train for competition under the direct supervision of Director for Strength and Conditioning John Williams, Jr.. The 2019-20 full-time strength staff consists of assistants Vinnie Calautti, Lauren Collier, Ahston Farmer, Brandon Golden and Brandon Stegall.

Athletic Training

The student-athlete at ECU has the luxury of having one of the most dedicated health care teams in the Southeast. Directed by Mike Hanley, Senior Associate Athletics Director for Student Services, along with trainers, Dillion Barron, Krista Carano, Nate Clark, Lannie Hales, Hannah Herman, Molly Maffei, Allie Minori, Jake Moore, Kassy Mosley, Kelsey Reilly, Zach Wright, Zac Womack, Casey Zimmerman and team physician Dr. Joe Armen. The ECU Athletic Training program provides every Pirate student-athlete

Housed in the Ward Sports Medicine Building adjacent to Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium and Minges Coliseum, the main athletic training room is a modern facility complete with the latest equipment. Satellite athletic training rooms are located in Minges Coliseum, Murphy Strength and Conditioning Center, Clark-LeClair Stadium, Smith-Williams Basketball Facility and the Williams-Harvey Teams Building (Terry Holland Sports Complex).

Head Basketball Coach



Joe Doolev (George Washington '88)

After leading Florida Gulf Coast to five conference titles and five consecutive 20-win seasons, former ECU head men's basketball coach Joe Dooley returned for a second stint

at the helm of the Pirates' program beginning with the 2018-19 campaign. The 2019-20 season marks his sixth overall season as head coach at ECU and 11th overall with a five-year tenure leading Florida Gulf Coast along with stops at New Mexico, Wyoming and Kansas sandwiched between head coaching duties in Greenville.

He has a 10-year overall head coaching ledger of 181-131 (.580), including five years at ECU.

During his first year back in Greenville, he laid the foundation for the future of Pirate basketball, highlighted by a win over league champion Cincinnati. He helped rookie Jayden Gardner earn all-freshman team honors in the American Athletic Conference as well as second-team all-district accolades. ECU was also lauded with academic awards from The American and National Basketball Coaches Association as eight players were named to The American All-Academic Team and three to the NABC Honors Court.

His first full recruiting class (of 2019) was ranked No. 10 by The Hoop Scoop. The group consisted of seven junior college transfers, four of which were ranked

among the top 50 JUCO players in the country, as well as four freshmen.

Dooley finished his time at FGCU with a five-year record of 114-58 (.663), leading the Eagles to three Atlantic Sun (ASUN) Conference regular season championships, including their first-ever title in 2014, and two second-place finishes. He also helped them capture two conference tournament trophies and earn NCAA Tournament appearances in 2016 and 2017. The Eagles defeated Fairleigh Dickinson in the 2016 First Four to advance into the main bracket.

Dooley was twice named ASUN Coach-of-the-Year (2017, 2018) as well as the 2017 NABC District III Coach-of-the-Year. He coached 10 all-conference selections, including 2018 ASUN Player-of-the-Year and Associated Press honorable mention All-America selection Brandon Goodwin as well as 2017 ASUN Defensive Player-of-the-Year Demetris Morant.

The Eagles participated in postseason play each of Dooley's five seasons in Fort Myers, winning 21 or more games every year with two NIT and one CIT appearance in addition to a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament.

FGCU finished among the top-25 nationally in field goal percentage three times, rebounds per game twice and was among the top-42 in scoring twice during Dooley's tenure.

A renowned recruiter, three of Dooley's recruiting classes at FGCU were ranked No. 1 in the ASUN with each of those classes ranked among the top-25 outside

the Major 7 conferences (ACC, American, Big East, Big Ten, Big XII, PAC-12 and SEC).

He also tutored 26 ASUN All-Academic performers during his five season on the Fort Myers campus.

Dooley led ECU to an overall record of 57-52 during his four- year tenure that included back-to-back 17-win campaigns during his first two years. He won more games (44) in his first three years at the helm of the program than any of his predecessors.

In 1996-97, he led the Pirates to their only top-3 finish during their 15-year membership in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), tying for third with a 9-7 record led by Raphael Edwards, who was a two-time all-conference selection under Dooley's tutelage.

Dooley was the youngest head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball at the age of 29 when he was promoted to ECU's top basketball position in April of 1995.

Prior to being named head coach, Dooley served four seasons as coach Eddie Payne's top assistant and was part of the Pirates' staff that went to the 1993 NCAA Tournament by securing the CAA's automatic bid.

Before coming to Greenville, Dooley and Payne served on the same staff as assistant coaches at South Carolina for three seasons.

Dooley began his coaching career as an assistant on the Gamecocks' staff in 1988 under George Felton, working alongside Payne and three-time National Coach-of-the-Year Tubby Smith before accompanying Payne to Greenville. He later served as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-02) and Wyoming (2002-03) before joining Bill Self, a four-time Big XII Coach-of-the-Year during their 10 campaigns together, for his inaugural season at Kansas in 2003-04. During his decade in Lawrence, the Jayhawks compiled a 300-58 record, including a 137-27 mark in the Big XII with nine regular-season crowns and six conference tournament titles.

He won a national championship as an assistant coach at Kansas in 2008 and helped the Jayhawks earn another Final Four berth in 2012.

In 2010, Dooley ranked first among all "High-Major Assistants" by Foxsports.com, which was up from his No. 6 ranking by the media outlet in 2008. In 2007, he was rated the fourth-best recruiter in the nation by Rivals.com. Dooley recruited or coached 14 NBA draft picks in his 10 years at KU, including nine first-round selections.

In 30 years as an assistant and head coach, Dooley has helped lead six different programs into the postseason, accumulated 657 victories with 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven NIT bids.

Dooley is a 1988 graduate of George Washington University in Washington, D.C., where he earned his bachelor's degree in speech communications. A four-year basketball letterwinner at GW, he started his last two seasons and was elected a team captain as a senior.

A native of West Orange, N.J., Dooley and his wife, Tanya, have a son, Max.

Assistant Coaches



Raphael Chillious Associate Head Coach (Lafavette '96)

Regarded as one of college basketball's top recruiters and known for his ability to develop players, Raphael Chillious joined the ECU men's bas-

ketball program as associate head coach in April 2018.

During his first season with the Pirates, Chillious helped assemble the No. 10 ranked recruiting Class of 2019, inking four top 50 junior college prospects.

Chillious came to ECU after one season at Connecticut, where he served as associate head coach and helped assemble a top 25 recruiting class.

Prior to joining the Huskies, Chillious spent seven of the previous eight seasons on the coaching staff at the University of Washington, including the 2016-17 season as associate head coach. He began his Division I coaching career at Washington in 2009-10, where he remained for three seasons before becoming an assistant coach at Villanova in 2012-13. After one year at Villanova, Chillious returned to Washington and remained there until going to UConn.

During his second stint in Seattle, Chillious helped mentor the team's guards while assisting with the recruiting resurgence that featured the nation's No. 7 class in 2015 featuring NBA First Round Draft picks Dejounte Murray and Marquese Chriss. He was also key in the signing of Markelle Fultz for the class of 2017. Fultz, who finished the 2016-17 season sixth in the NCAA in scoring with 23.2 points per game as the nation's top freshman scorer and the PAC-12's overall leading scorer, was the first overall pick by the Philadelphia 76ers in the 2017 NBA Draft.

Chillious assisted future First-Team All-America Nigel Williams-Goss' evolution from a PAC-12 all-freshman team performer in 2014 to a second-team all-conference player the following season. He also helped Quincy Pondexter mature into a 2010 First-Team PAC-10 player and NBA First Round selection.

He was influential in the recruitment and development of Terrence Ross and Tony Wroten into 2012 NBA First Round Draft picks. Chillious was also instrumental in the progression of C.J. Wilcox from 2011 Pac-12 all-freshman team player into a 2014 NBA First Round Draft pick. He was prominent in the recruiting and signing of Matisse Thybulle, a 2019 first round pick by the Philadelphia 76ers.

While at Villanova in 2013, he helped the Wildcats to a 20-14 record, 10-8 in BIG EAST action. He coached thirdteam All-BIG EAST selection JayVaughn Pinkson and All-Rookie team member Ryan Arcidiacono and Villanova notched three wins over Top 5 ranked opponents, including a 73-64 victory over eventual national champion

Louisville. The Wildcats earned a No. 9 seed in the NCAA tournament and lost in the first round to North Carolina. Arcidiacono earned Most Outstanding Player honors at the 2016 Final Four as Villanova won the national title.

Chillious was named an assistant coach at Washington in April 2009 and was an integral part of the staff that helped the Huskies win consecutive PAC-10 tournament championships in 2010 and '11, plus the regular season title in the first year of the newly formed PAC-12 in 2012.

He helped coach the team to a 26-10 record and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance his first year, followed by a 24-11 season and second consecutive PAC-10 Tournament Championship in 2011. In 2012, Washington was 24-11 overall and finished 14-4 in the conference to claim the regular season title.

Chillious played a key role in coaching guards at Washington - including future NBA All-Star Isaiah Thomas, who was a two-time All-PAC-10 performer. He also established his foothold in the world of recruiting by helping the Huskies construct highly acclaimed 2010 and 2011 classes.

Chillious previously served as the head basketball coach and co-athletic director at South Kent (Conn.) School from 2003-2008, where he mentored the aforementioned Thomas, Dorrell Wright, Andray Blatche and Dion Waiters. Before going to South Kent, he was also a prep school coach at West Nottingham Academy (Md.), where he coached future New Jersey Nets forward Josh Boone.

A native of Mt. Zion, Md., Chillious attended Lafayette College (Pa.), earning his Bachelor of Science degree in psychology in 1996. He served as the basketball team captain during his senior year and also received the President's Silver Award with a 3.45 GPA as a senior. He continued his education at the University of Victoria (Victoria, B.C.), where he also began his coaching career in 1997. From there, he moved on to become the head coach at West Nottingham in 2001, then took the job at South Kent two years later.

Chillious and his wife, Charlene, have a daughter.

Steve Roccaforte Assistant Head Coach/ Recruiting Coordinator (Lamar '89)

Steve Roccaforte begins his second season as assistant head coach/re-

Philadelphia (First)

cruiting coordinator at East Carolina after spending the previous four years at Virginia Tech, the last of which he served as associate head coach.

During his first season with the Pirates, Roccaforte led the efforts to construct the No. 10 ranked recruiting Class of 2019, inking four top 50 junior college prospects.

Known nationally as a tireless recruiter and enthusiastic floor coach, Roccafort helped the Hokies earn backto-back NCAA Tournament at-large bids in 2017 and 2018 and post three consecutive 20-win seasons (2015-18) since a five-year span that ended in 1985-86. He also helped the Hokies win 10 ACC games in three consecutive seasons for the first time since joining the conference in 2004.

Roccaforte joined the coaching staff at Virginia Tech following three years as an assistant coach at South Florida. He played a large role in USF getting a top-15 nationally ranked recruiting class for both the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons and helped the Bulls advance to the round of 32 in the 2012 NCAA Tournament. Consistently towards the top of the list, he was ranked as the 23rd best assistant coach in the country that season.

Prior to USF, Roccaforte was the head coach at his alma mater, Lamar University, for five seasons after serving as an assistant coach at Lamar (2003-06), Memphis (2000-03), Wyoming (1998-00), Tulane (1994-98) and Centenary (1989-94) to begin his career.

With more than 30 years of experience at the NCAA Division I level, Roccaforte has worked with some of the top coaches in the business and has recruited some of the top talent in the country. He has served under national coaches of the year in John Calipari, Perry Clark and Billy Tubbs to develop multiple nationally ranked recruiting classes.

Roccaforte helped assemble top 20 recruiting classes at six institutions, including the nation's top-rated class at Memphis in 2001. He also aided in the construction of a pair of top 10 classes at Lamar, two additional top 15 classes at Memphis and USF and three top 25 groups at both Tulane and Virginia Tech. In total, Roccaforte has facilitated 14 top 25 units, including four top 10.

According to recruiting analyst Dave Telep, Roccaforte is one of the 25 hardest-working coaches in the nation as well as one of the top 15 recruiters in the country.

Roccaforte's penchant for recruiting was as evident as ever in 2009-10 as Lamar's eight-player class was ranked ninth by HoopScoopOnline.com and 15th-best in the nation by Basketball Times. The class featured three of the top 15 scorers in Junior College Division I. HoopScoop. com rated Lamar's class in 2004, the first full recruiting class with Roccaforte on staff, among the top 10 in the country.

During his career, Roccaforte has coached or signed 22 future NBA players including six-time All-Star Amare Stoudemire and Kendrick Perkins, member of the 2008 NBA Champion Boston Celtics, along with first round draft picks Dejuan Wagner, Antonio Burks, Qyntel Wood and Rodney Carney.

Roccaforte is also no stranger to postseason play, having served on the staff of eight teams that extended their seasons. He has been to a five NCAA Tournaments. two with Virginia Tech and one each with USF, Tulane, and Memphis along with NIT appearances at Tulane, Wyoming, Memphis and Virginia Tech. Tulane advanced to the NIT Final Four at Madison Square Garden in 1996. He helped Memphis reach MSG in 2001, win the NIT title in 2002 and advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2003 for the first time in seven years.

In all, Roccaforte's teams have made 11 postseason appearances with the Hokies' 2018 NCAA appearance being the most recent.

Roccaforte was listed as one of the top four assistant coaches ready to take over their own program according to Dan Wetzel of CBS Sportsline.com and was voted the seventh-best assistant coach in the country by Basketball Times for the 2002-03 season. According to Telep, Roccaforte is one of the 25 hardest-working coaches in the nation as well as one of the top 15 recruiters in the country. Clark Francis of HoopScoop.com listed Roccaforte as the top mid-major assistant coach in the country in 2005.

Roccaforte finally got his chance to be a head coach after Tubbs resigned his post at Lamar to focus on his Director of Athletics duties in March 2006.

In his five seasons, Lamar was a sparkling 55-20 at home in the Montagne Center and guided LU to its first SLC regular-season championship in more than 20 years in his second season with an impressive 13-3 conference mark. He coached nine all-conference selections at Lamar.

The 2007-08 season featured a number of impressive streaks and great players. Among them were a 14-2 home record, a school-record six-consecutive conference road victories and the eighth-largest home crowd in school history. Lamar ranked eighth in the nation in scoring offense (81.5 ppg.) and in the top 50 in both field goal percentage (46.9) and 3-point field goal percentage (38.2).

For his efforts, Roccaforte was named the 2007-08 Southland Conference (SLC) Coach-of-the-Year by the Lake Charles American-Press newspaper and the College-Insider.com Southland Conference Coach-of-the-Year. Seniors Lamar Sanders and Kenny Dawkins were both named first team All-SLC, with Dawkins matching his teammate as SLC Newcomer-of-the-Year. The success of that season led to a top 25 ranking in the mid-major poll the following year. Lamar ranked 12th in the NCAA in assists at 17.3 per game, 31st in 3-pointers made per game (8.3) and 52nd in 3-point percentage (.379).

Individually, Sanders led the SLC, and ranked 12th in the NCAA, in rebounding at 9.8 rpg. The Cardinals set a new single-season school record for 3-point attempts (702) and posted the second-best mark in 3-pointers made (266).

Roccaforte's first recruiting class as the head coach paid immediate dividends as Sanders was named SLC Newcomer of the Year and earned second-team All-SLC honors. Center James Davis was a third-team All-SLC performer, and guard Darren Hopkins was an honorable mention selection.

Academics are a high priority for Roccaforte as evidenced by the fact that Lamar's increase in Academic Progress Rate (APR) was among the best in the country. Lamar's APR, which is a real-time measurement of a team's ability to stay on course and graduate, moved up 101 spots to No. 20 in the country during Roccaforte's tenure. Nineteen of 20 seniors earned their degrees while he was the head coach as did 100 percent of the seniors at USF from 2011 to 2014.

During his four years at Tulane, the Green Wave consistently ranked among the top-25 recruiting classes in the nation and included an All-America and seven All-Conference USA selections. The final recruiting class that he helped sign was ranked eighth nationally.

Roccaforte was part of a Tulane staff that coached the Green Wave to three consecutive 20-win seasons during his tenure (1994-97). The Green Wave advanced to the NCAA Tournament second round in 1995, the NIT Final Four in 1996 and made another NIT appearance in 1997. The program also captured Conference USA Red Division titles in 1995-96 and 1996-97.

He earned his Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree from Lamar in 1989. He has two daughters, Victoria Elise and Sofia Rose, and a son, Lucien Anthony.

George Wright-Easy Assistant Coach (St. Francis (Pa.) '07)

George Wright-Easy was named an assistant coach for the East Carolina men's basketball program in July of 2019.

Wright-Easy has spent the past five years as the head varsity boys' basketball coach at Dexter Southfield School in Brookline, Mass. During his time at Dexter Southfield, he had numerous players earn all-conference honors, coached four 1,000-point scorers and four players received Division I basketball scholarships under his tutelage.

Wright-Easy led DXSF to its first-ever playoff appearance in 2015 followed by three more from 2017-19. He was named the New England Preparatory School Athletic Council's (NEPSAC) Class C Coach-of-the-Year in 2018 after engineering the school's Class C championship run. This past season, he led DXSF into the Class B tournament. During his first season, he set the school record for wins, tied it two years later then broke it in 2018-19.

In addition to coaching Dexter Southfield, Wright-Easy has worked heavily in the grassroots/AAU circuit, founding WrightWay Skills. Wright-Easy has developed and coached fourteen players with Division I basketball scholarships in the past year and a half at WrightWay Skills. He established the AAU program in 2014 following a two-year graduate assistantship at Providence College.

During his stint at Providence, the Friars reached the guarterfinals of the NIT in 2013 before winning the 2014 BIG EAST Championship and receiving the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. He played a big role in tutoring and mentoring multiple Division I basketball players.

Wright-Easy spent his vocational career in secondary education. He served as an assistant boys' basketball coach at Cambridge Rindge and Latin School, spent three years as a special education teacher in the Everett (Mass.) Public School System and worked 28 months at KIPP Lynn as both a physical education instructor and Dean of Students.

A two-sport athlete at St. Francis (Pa.), Wright-Easy played both Division I football and basketball. He graduated from St. Francis in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology and criminal justice.

Ken Potosnak Assistant to the Head Coach (Randolph-Macon '90)

Ken Potosnak, now in his 28th season coaching at the Division I level, begins his 10th year as a part of the

ECU coaching staff after being retained by head coach Joe Dooley following the 2017-18 campaign.

After serving nine years as an assistant coach at ECU, Potosnak will serve as assistant to the head coach in 2019-20 and act as an advisor, provide analysis for the purposes of program and player development as well as analyze film of opponents to contribute to the development of game strategy.

As a member of the ECU coaching staff, Potosnak helped the Pirates construct their most successful four-year period in the school Division I history. The Pirates have made three postseason appearances, won 20 games for the first time as a Division I institution and captured the 2013 CIT title with Potosnak on the bench.

Six players have earned all-conference honors during Potosnak's tenure, while five players have garnered American Athletic Conference All-Rookie Team accolades. Three players have also received specialty awards: Brock Young (2011 Conference USA Sixth Man-of-the-Year), Prince Williams (2016 American Athletic Conference Most Improved Player) and Shawn Williams (2018 American Athletic Conference Rookie-of-the-Year).

Prior to ECU, Potosnak spent one season with former ECU Head Coach Jeff Lebo as an assistant coach at Auburn after serving in the same capacity at South Carolina for three years under coach Dave Odom from 2005-08; helping guide the Gamecocks to their second consecutive NIT title in 2006. Among the players Potosnak coached at South Carolina were future NBA players: Renaldo Blackman (2006 NBA Draft First Round pick), Tarence Kinsey and Brandon Wallace. His recruiting efforts resulted in the Gamecocks landing a top 20 recruiting class in 2006, which featured three-time First-Team All-SEC point quard Devan Downey and 2011 SEC Defensive Player-of-the-Year Sam Muldrow. That class claimed a share of the 2009 SEC Eastern Division title, the program's first since 1997.

Preceding his time in Columbia, Potosnak was the top assistant at Furman for eight years from 1997-2005. His recruiting efforts landed six All-Southern Conference performers, including 2005 SoCon Freshman-of-the-Year Ouan Prowell. The Paladins made their first SoCon Championship game appearance since 1980 in 2002 with Potosnak assisting.

A renowned recruiter throughout the United States, he has concentrated efforts internationally where he recruited Brazilian guard Guilherme Da Luz, French forward Karim Souchu and Senegalese forward Malaye Ndoye, who were All-Southern Conference selections at Furman.

Potosnak made his way to Furman after he served as an assistant at The Citadel for five years (1992-97). He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant to Odom at Wake Forest for two seasons from 1990-92. helping the Demon Deacons to consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances with teams that featured future NBA players Randolph Childress, Rodney Rogers, Chris King and Anthony Tucker.

The New Kensington, Pa., native has extensive experience as a working camps and clinics both domestically and internationally. He was a longtime coach at the Five-Star Basketball Camp and operator of offseason professional player development workouts in Atlanta. His expertise in the game has taken him throughout Europe and Asia.

Potosnak is a 1990 graduate of Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Va., where he helped lead the Yellow Jackets to a pair of top 25 finishes in 1989 (No. 22) and 1990 (No. 14). As a senior guard leading his team to the NCAA Division III Tournament in 1990, he was named Randolph-Macon's Scholar Athlete-of-the-Year. He earned a master's degree from Wake Forest in 1992. He is married to Sherry McWherter of Durham, N.C.

Kyle Robinson is in his 10th season as the director of basketball operations at ECU. He joined the Pirates'

coaching staff in 2010 after spending the previous three seasons in the same position at College of Charleston.

Robinson's duties include, but not limited to, developing and managing the annual budget, organizing team travel, managing all community outreach activities, serving as the chief liaison to academic counselors and compliance officers, working with adidas to order equipment as well coordinating on-campus recruiting visits among many things. Robinson also oversees all logistics and registration of the Joe Dooley Basketball Camp.

During his time at ECU, the Pirates have made three postseason appearances, posted the most wins in a single-season and captured their first CIT title. Six players have received all-conference accolades and four have merited all-rookie team honors.

Goudelock was drafted in the second round of the 2011 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Lakers with the 46th overall pick.

Robinson spent three seasons as a graduate assistant/ manager to Jeff Lebo at Auburn after a year stint as assistant men's basketball coach at Lincoln (Ill.) Christian College where the Preachers won a school-record 21 games en route to the school's first Midwest Regional Championship, Lincoln Christian then advanced to the 2004 national semifinals.

Robinson began his career as an undergraduate at Gardner-Webb, where he was the head men's basketball manager for four years (1999-2003). The Runnin' Bulldogs were the 2000 South Atlantic Conference Champions and went on to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Robinson has worked numerous NCAA Division I team and individual camps in the Southeast and coached in YMCA summer leagues and youth recreational leagues.

The American Athletic Conference

The American Athletic Conference consists of 13 prestigious institutions: the University of Central Florida, the University of Cincinnati, East Carolina University, the University of Connecticut, the University of Houston, the University of Memphis, the U.S. Naval Academy (in football only), the University of South Florida Southern Methodist University, Temple University, Tulane University, the University of Tulsa, and Wichita State University (in basketball and Olympic sports).

Under the leadership of commissioner Mike Aresco, the American Athletic Conference has fashioned an impressive list of accomplishments in the competitive arena, in the classroom and in support of student-athlete welfare. The American is firmly established as a Power 6 conference thanks to its collection of national team and individual championships, football and men's and women's basketball postseason victories, expansive media rights contracts with the leading national outlets, and its commitment to providing the highest levels of support for student-athletes.

The league has produced four NCAA championship teams - UConn men's basketball in 2014 and UConn women's basketball in 2014, 2015 and 2016 - in addition to three New Year's Six bowl champions (UCF in 2013 and 2017; Houston in 2015), 12 NCAA individual championships, and a Rhodes Scholar. Additionally, American Athletic Conference teams have advanced to the College World Series, reached the semifinal and final rounds of the NIT, qualified for the match play round of the NCAA Men's Golf Championship and registered top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country and Outdoor Track and Field championships.

In 2018, The American once again saw a member school claim a spot in a New Year's Six bowl as UCF capped a 12-win season in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. It was the the fourth time in six seasons that The American placed its champion in a New Year's bowl. Cincinnati enjoyed an 11-win season that included a victory against Virginia Tech in the Military Bowl as seven teams from the conference played in bowl games. UCF was ranked No. 11 in the final Associated Press poll, while Cincinnati was No. 23 in the final coaches' poll.

In addition to the success in football, The American saw UConn reach the NCAA Women's Final Four for the 12th consecutive year, while Houston reached the round of 16 in men's basketball. Houston finished third at the NCAA Men's Outdoor Track and Field Championship, while SMU registered a top-eight finish at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship.

Since the conference's reconstitution in 2013-14, teams from The American have registered top-10 national rankings in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's soccer, men's golf, and men's track and field. Houston's Kahmari Montgomery capped the 2018-19 season with an NCAA individual title in the outdoor 400-meter dash, giving The American at least one national individual champion in five of the league's first six seasons.

Under The American's banner, the UConn women's basketball team won its NCAA-record ninth, 10th and 11th national championships and broke its own NCAA record with a 111-game winning streak that spanned three seasons. Houston's men's track and field team took third place at the 2018 and 2019 NCAA Outdoor Championships. Tulsa placed sixth at the 2016 NCAA Men's Cross Country Championship.

American Athletic Conference student-athletes have distinguished themselves in all facets of intercollegiate athletics. Temple linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player in 2015, while Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting. More recently, Houston's Ed Oliver won the 2017 Outland Trophy as the nation's best interior lineman, while UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton was the only player in the nation to finish in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy balloting in both 2017 and 2018. UConn basketball standout Breanna Stewart finished her career in 2016 as the most decorated player in college basketball history as she was chosen as the consensus national player of the year for the third time and became the first player be named four times as the Most Outstanding Player at the Final Four. Reynolds and Stewart were selected as the winners of the 2016 AAU James E. Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athletes, marking only the second time in the 86-year history of the award that multiple winners were chosen.

The American announced a lucrative and comprehensive media rights extension with ESPN in May of 2019, providing the conference with a stronger and more extensive presence on ESPN's primary television networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU). When the extension takes effect in the 2020-21 academic year, a minimum of 40 regular-season football telecasts per season will appear on those primary networks and nearly every conference-controlled game will appear on an ESPN network or on ESPN+.

Away from the competitive arena, The American has established itself as a leader in the area of student-athlete wellness, both through the adoption of NCAA autonomous legislation on matters including full cost of attendance and nutrition. The conference, in cojunction with its Student-Athlete Advisory Committee has also launched the Pow6rful Minds campaign to improve awareness and education on mental issues and recognize the scholarly achievements of the conference's student-athletes.

The American Athletic Conference serves its membership from a state-of-the-art office located in Providence, Rhode Island. The conference headquarters also serves as the home of the American Digital Network, which provides live coverage of all 22 conference championships.



The 2020 American Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championship will be played March 12-15 (Thursday to Sunday) at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth, Texas

The venue will also host the championship in 2021 (March 11-14) and 2022 (March 10-13).

"We are delighted to partner with the city of Fort Worth and Dickies Arena for our 2020-22 Men's Basketball Championships," Aresco said. "This three-year agreement will bring our Men's Championship to a vibrant, sports-minded community that embraces major events and extends wonderful hospitality to visitors. Dickies Arena is a state-of-the-art facility that our student- athletes, coaches and fans, as well as a national television audience, will enjoy."

All 12 American Athletic Conference schools will participate in the 2020 championship. The format calls for four first-round games on the first day, followed by four quarterfinal matchups, two semifinal contests and the championship game. The ESPN family of networks again will provide television and digital coverage of the tournament.

The tournament begins Thursday, March 12 with matchups between the No. 9 and No. 8 seeds, No. 5 and No. 12 seeds, No. 10 and No. 7 seeds and No. 11 and No. 6 seeds. The winners will advance to meet the first, second, third and fourth seeds, respectively, on Friday.

2018-19 Year-In-Review

■ECU SUFFERS FOURTH STRAIGHT LOSING SEASON

• ECU finished with an overall record of 10-21 and a mark of 4-14 in the American Athletic Conference, finishing in 11th place. The Pirates opened the season with a 6-5 record, but won just four games after returning from the Christmas break. The Pirates closed the season with five consecutive losses.

■JOE DOOLEY RETAKES THE REIGNS AT ECU

- Nineteen years after he was dismissed as head coach, Joe Dooley began his second tenure at ECU and was renamed to the position April 4, 2018.
- Dooley became the seventh coach in school history to be at the helm of the Pirates' program for five years. He previously held the position from 1995-99 and posted a winning record in each of his first two seasons from 1995-97 (34-21) before he departed following the 1998-99 season with a career record of 57-52.

■GARDNER HAS SPECTACULAR ROOKIE SEASON

- Unanimous selection to The American All-Freshman Team and named NABC All-District 25 Second-Team.
- Named The American Freshman-of-the-Week five times, most in school history; selected as the USBWA National Freshman-of-the-Week following his 35-point, 20-rebound at UCF (Jan. 13).
- First Pirate to score 30 points and grab 20 rebounds in the same game since Charles Alford had 31 points and 21 boards versus Atlantic Christian College on Feb. 7, 1966 (52 years, 11 months, 6 days).
- Finished second in The American in rebounding (8.5), offensive rebounds (3.0), double-doubles (10) and 30point games (3), third in defensive rebounds (5.5) and 10th in scoring (16.3) and field goal percentage (49.3).
- Ranked seventh among all Division I freshmen in scoring and rebounding and made the most free throws (171) among all NCAA Division I freshmen, ranking 30th overall.
- Second freshman in school history to score 500 points in a season and set ECU freshman records for rebounds, rebounds per game, free throws made and free throws attempted.

FLEMING FINISHES HIGH ON ECU CAREER LIST FOR ASSISTS & STEALS

- Senior Isac Fleming finished his ECU career with an average of 4.41 assists per game, ranking among the school's top 5 in both categories.
- Fleming played two seasons at ECU and dished out 269 assists, 10th-most in school history and third-most

among two-year players.

- He has two of the top 10 total assists in Pirate lore, handing out 144 in 2017-18 and 125 in 2018-19, which rank as eighth and 10th in the ECU record book.
- · Ranked second in The American in assists per game as junior (4.8) and eighth as a senior (4.0).
- Produced the first two triple-doubles in school history during the 2017-18 campaign.

■WILLIAMS NETS 70 3S AGAIN

- Sophomore Shawn Williams became just the third player in school history to make 70 3-point field goals in multiple seasons, finishing with 70 despite missing the first five games of the year.
- During two seasons at ECU, Williams made 142 3-point field goals and shot 36.3 percent (142-of-391) outside the arc.
- Williams made an average of 2.7 3s per game in 2018-19, ranking fifth in The American, after netting 2.4 triples a contest a freshman, third-highest average in the conference.

■ LEDAY CONTRIBUTES IN FIRST SEASON AT ECU

- After sitting out the 2017-18 season following his transfer from Virginia Tech, Seth LeDay played in 29 games and averaged 11.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game before suffering a season-ending injury at Wich-
- · He finished second on the team in rebounding and third in scoring.
- LeDay completed the year ranked among the top 10 in The American in field goal percentage (7th/.529) and offensive rebounds per game (10th/2.2).
- Posted four double-doubles with a career-high 21 points against James Madison with 11 rebounds versus Prairie View A&M.

■ CREDIBILITY WIN

- In his first home game coaching in the American Athletic Conference, Joe Dooley led the Pirates to a 73-71 win over reigning league champion Cincinnati.
- It was just the Pirates' second win in 14 all-time meetings with the Bearcats and first since 2015.

■TWO DOUBLE DIGIT DEFICIT COMEBACKS

• ECU overcame a pair of second half double digit deficits to win this season, rallying from 10 down (63-53) against Lamar and 13 (64-51) versus Appalachian State.



• The Pirates overcame seven double digit deficits for victory during Coach Dooley's first stint as head coach from 1995-99, including a 17-point road (26-9) deficit at Richmond (1/31/96) for an eight-point win (66-58).

■ PIRATES WERE AMONG NCAA'S YOUNGEST TEAMS

- ECU was one of 17 schools nationally to have one or fewer seniors/graduate transfers on its roster in 2018-19, while the Pirates' nine freshmen (true and redshirt) and sophomores ranks seventh nationally and are only surpassed by the 13 at Arkansas and UNC Asheville, 12 at Duquesne and 10 at Cal State Northridge, James Madison and Kentucky.
- The only player on the team to have been in the program more than two years was Obasohan, who joined the Pirates as a walk-on prior to the start of the 2015-16 campaign.

■ LOTS OF LINEUPS

- ECU used 12 different starting lineups throughout the season with the most-often used starting five consisting of Fleming, Williams. Gardner, K.J. Davis and Dimitrije Spasojevic. The unit began the game together seven times.
- Gardner was the only player to start all 31 games with Williams starting all 26 games which he played. K.J. Davis made 17 starts, while no other player appeared in the starting lineup over 15 times.
- Five starting lineups were used just once.

UNDERCLASSMEN ENTER THE PORTAL

 Seven underclassmen that were on the roster at the start of the season entered the transfer portal at the conclusion of the season: K.J. Davis (Samford), Ty Foster (Youngstown State), Tae Hardy (Pearl River Community College), Dimitrije Spasojevic (UMBC), DeShaun Wade (Longwood), Justin Whatley (N.C. Central) and Shawn Williams (New Mexico State).

■ ACADEMIC NOTES

- ECU was honored with The American Team Academic Excellence Award for posting the highest GPA, 3.134, among all the league's men's basketball programs.
- Tyler Foster, Jayden Gardner, Addison Hill, Justice Obasohan, Samson Strickland, Dimitrije Spasojevic, De-Shaun Wade and John Whitley were each named to The American All-Academic Team.
- ECU received the American Athletic Conference Team Academic Award for recording the highest GPA among all men's basketball programs in the league.
- The Pirates were recognized by the NABC with the Team Academic Excellence Award for achieving a team GPA of 3.0.
- · Hill, Obasohan and Whitley were named to the NABC Honors Court.
- Five student-athletes earned their bachelor's degree last season: Fleming, Hill, Seth LeDay, Obasohan, and Whitley.





by the Philadelphia Warriors in the 1954 NBA Draft. He was inducted into the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1974 and the North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame in 1993.



2 Lester Lyons (1,825)

#15 • G • 6-4 • 160 • Lewiston, N.C. — Lyons is the school's all-time leading scorer in its Division I era. He was named the 1991 CAA Rookie-of-the-Year and was a three-time second-team all-conference selection. He is the only player in ECU history to lead the Pirates in scoring each of his four seasons. Twice named to the CAA All-Defensive Team, Lyons led the Pirates in steals all four years and graduated as the Pirates' all-time leader in field goals made,

3-point field goals made, free throws made, assists and steals. He remains the only Pirate with 600 career field goals made as well as the only letterman with over 200 steals.

1972 Southern Conference Champions

Physical interior play, aggressive rebounding, balanced point production and a solid bench all played a part in ECU's only Southern Conference championship and first NCAA Tournament berth in 1972.

After upsetting regular season champion Davidson in the semifinals, the Pirates' dreams of going to the NCAA Tournament were nearly derailed, twice, by the Furman Paladins in the championship game.

If Jim Fairley hadn't scooped up Ernie Pope's missed jumper and laid it in to tie the game as time expired, ECU wouldn't have won.

The two teams then battled through four overtime ties, before the Paladins took a one-point lead, 75-74, with eight seconds left.

With no time-outs remaining, ECU's Al Faber grabbed the rebound off a missed free throw and cut loose a desperation 40-footer that wasn't even close.

Fortunately for the Pirates, reserve guard Nicky White was standing underneath the basket, grabbed the rebound and banged home the winning bucket as the horn sounded.

The Pirates had lost to Davidson in the championship game two years prior.

Earl Quash wound up as the leading scorer for ECU in the finals scoring 18 points, including 13 in the final 14 minutes of play. Fairley added 13 points, while Faber and Pope had 12 each.

ECU would've been eliminated from the tournament in the semifinals if it hadn't been for the efforts of Fairley.

Fairley, who scored 56 points in three games, scored 26 points in the semis to lead the Pirates into the title contest.

ECU rallied from a seven-point second half deficit to best the regular season


champion Wildcats. Two free throws by Dave Franklin and another by Quash in the final 18 seconds lifted the Pirates to a four-point victory, 81-77.

Thanks to Franklin's 20-point performance in the guarterfinals, ECU was able to dispose of a pesky Citadel squad. After trailing by as many as nine in the first half and five at intermission, the Pirates looked to Franklin in the second half.

He made ECU's first four shots after intermission to reclaim the lead at 38-37. They never trailed after that point.

Leading by as many as 13 in the second half, ECU watched its lead diminish to three with 43 seconds left. Pope, however, hit two free throws with 29 seconds remaining to run the Pirates out to a five-point lead. ECU then got a pair of steals for buckets in the final second to dart out the final nine-point margin.

Franklin collected 39 points during the three-day run; Pope 37; Jerome Owens 36; Quash 32; and Faber 21 as no

one man was forced to carry the burden.

Fairley and Pope were named first-team all-tournament, while Franklin earned second-team honors.

1993 CAA Champions

The Colonial Athletic Association was in its eighth year of existence and ECU was still searching for its first CAA title. And with the Pirates entering the 1993 CAA Tournament in Richmond as the No. 7 seed with a 10-16 record, there was little reason to expect ECU would win its first.

But thanks to the play of a pair of sharp shooting guards, a vibrant senior and a championship hungry coach, ECU captured its lone CAA championship and advanced to the its second NCAA Tournament in school history.

The Pirates ended the regular season losing two of its final three games, including a 73-60 loss at home to Old Dominion, the tournament's No. 2 seed and ECU's first round opponent. The Monarchs won both regular season meetings between the two by an average of 16.5 points. ECU reversed its fortunes during the third meeting of the year, 73-67, behind the outstanding play of senior Ike Copeland.

Copeland scored a career-high 24 points, hitting on near perfect 9-of-10 shooting from the field. He also connected on 6-of-6 free throws, and grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds. Anton Gil contributed 14 points as the Pirates outscored the Monarchs, 8-2 over the final 3:47.

The semifinal round pitted a pair of Cinderella teams, as ECU faced sixth-seeded UNC Wilmington, who upset Richmond the night before. The Pirates played one of its best defensive games of the season as they held the Seahawks to 31.6 percent shooting from the field and held on for a 55-50 win after leading by as many as 19 in the second half. Lester Lyons tallied 18 points in the game, the only Pirate to reach double figures.

As expected, the upstart Pirates faced top-seeded James Madison in the championship game. Coach Lefty Driesell led the Dukes to a 19-7 overall record during the regular season and a first place finish in the CAA for the fourth consecutive year.

A relaxed and confident group of Pirates set the tempo and forced JMU to play their way, ran their motion offense patiently and led by as many as six on two occasions during the second half. ECU trailed by one with 5:56 remaining, but out-scored the Dukes, 12-8 during the final minutes to claim a 54-49 victory.

Lyons, the tournament's Most Valuable Player, scored 14 points in the win, while Curley Young poured in a team-high 15 points. Lyons was joined by one of his teammates, Copeland, on the all-tournament team.

With ECU leading by three in the final 20 seconds, JMU attempted a three-point field goal that rattled in and out, and bounced into the hands of Copeland. A 58 percent free-throw shooter, Copeland scored his only two points of the game with 14.3 seconds left as he swished a pair of free throws to seal the victory.


"You can't explain it," said Pirate head coach Eddie Payne. "It's a supernatural thing. I didn't think about winning the tournament when we got here. I just pointed out that we've been playing good basketball of late. You can't win without winning the first game."

"It's a dream come true," said Copeland. "I always thought we had a chance."

The Pirates earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and a date with the East Region's No. 1 seed and eventual national champion, North Carolina.

The Pirates fell, 85-65, but drew the respect of many college basketball observers. During the NCAA Championship Game, CBS color commentator Billy Packer noted that he had seen no one play better against North Carolina's trapping defense than ECU during the NCAA Tournament.

2013 CIT Champions

Junior Akeem Richmond hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to lift ECU over Weber State 77-74 and claim the CollegeInsider.com tournament championship, capping the best season in school history.

Miguel Paul led ECU with 23 points and Maurice Kemp added 20 for the Pirates, who tied a school record for wins in a season set by the 1953-54 squad and won their first-ever Division I postseason championship.

Kemp was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Player with Paul and Robert Sampson earning all-tournament team honors.

The Pirates trailed 71-65 with 2:50 remaining but closed on a 12-3 run. Kemp sank a 3 to cut the lead in half and Paul made a pair of free throws to make it a 2-point game with less than two minutes to play.

Following two missed fouls shots by Weber State, Paul tossed the ball up to Sampson for the game-tying layup. After Scott Bamforth made just one of two free throws, Paul hit Sampson streaking down the lane for the goahead slam.

Davion Berry then made just one of two foul shots to tie the game at 74 with 21 seconds to play. Weber State made just 3 of 9 free throws in the final three minutes, hitting only 9-of-19 foul shots overall.

Bamfort led Weber State with 19 points, while Berry and Frank Otis had 16 apiece.

The two teams traded the lead six times in the first 14 minutes before ECU used an 8-0 spurt to take the largest lead of the game by either side, seven points.

The Pirates shot 60 percent in the first half and led 42-35 at halftime with Ty Armstrong scoring all 10 of his points in the opening frame. ECU scored 28 points in the paint before halftime and tallied 38 inside the lane

for the game.

Both teams ended the game shooting over 50 percent from the floor with ECU connecting on a season-high 58.1 percent of its shots (30-51) and the Wildcats making 52.7 percent (29-55) of their attempts.

Although they didn't get to the foul line as often, the Pirates capitalized on more of their attempts, making 11 of 14.


Weber State opened the second half on an 9-2 run to tie the game at 44 in less than three minutes before taking a 48-46 lead. ECU then outscored the Wildcats 13-4 to reclaim its seven-point halftime advantage.

ECU Basketball Timeline —

1931-32

◆ After 22 years of existence as a college, basketball is established as the first inter-collegiate sport at ECU. The first game is played Dec. 15 against Greenville All-Stars and won by ECU, 23-17. This is the first game of a 20-game schedule, which produces a 10-10 record.

1934-35

• G.L. Mathis is hired as the first paid basketball coach and the nickname "Pirates" was adopted. Mathis coaches the team for two years, and post an 18-17 record.

1936-37

◆ ECU scores over 100 points for the first time on Jan. 15, beating the Washington All-Stars 103-18. Two officials were also used during home games for the first time.

1942-43

◆ Due to the United States' entrance into World War II, the remainder of the 1942-43 season and the 1943-44 season is canceled.

1945-46

◆ Howard Porter is hired as an assistant coach, making him the first assistant coach in ECU history.

1947-48

◆ ECU is accepted into the North State Conference, marking its first conference affiliation. The Pirates post a mark of 6-4 during its first season in the league.

1948-49

- ◆ Sonny Russell is named All-North State Conference, becoming the first all-conference player in school history.
- ◆ Louis Collie and Todd Fennel are given the first basketball scholarships at ECU.

1951-52

◆ ECU plays in its first postseason game in the N.A.I.B District Tournament, defeating High Point before losing to Elon.

1952-53

- ◆ ECU defeated Elon, 72-56, to win the NAIA District 26 Tournament and advance to the NAIA National Tournament.
- ◆ The Pirates advanced to NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, where they lost to Arkansas Tech. It was the first flight for an ECU athletic team for competition.

1953-54

- ◆ The 1953-54 season marks the best season in school history with 23-2 record. The Pirates win the North State Conference regular season and tournament championship and its second consecutive NAIA District Tournament championship.
- ◆ Bobby Hodges ends his career in 1954 with 2,108 points, establishing him at that time, as the all-time leading scorer in North Carolina.
- ◆ The Pirates win a school record 16 consecutive games during that season.

1955-56

◆ ECU had its 50-game home winning streak snapped by Lenoir-Rhyne in the fifth game of the season. The streak began on Jan. 5, 1953 with a win over Appalachian State.

1964

◆ ECU is admitted into the Southern Conference, but wasn't eligible for competition until the following year.

1965-66

◆ The Pirates post a record of 5-7 and finish in fifth place during their first season in the Southern Conference during the 1965-66 campaign.

1966-67

◆ Vince Colbert became the first African-American to receive a scholarship at ECU. Colbert averages over 14 points per game from 1966-68.

1967-68

- ♦ Minges Coliseum opens on the ECU campus. The Pirates compile a record of 7-5 during their first season in the facility. The coliseum is officially dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968.
- ◆ The Pirates defeat George Washington, 71-68, on Jan. 3 in the only quadruple overtime game in school history.

1968-69

- ◆ On Dec. 7, ECU defeats Atlantic Christian, 126-111, to set school records for points in a game and most combined points scored by two teams.
- ◆ ECU plays in its first Southern Conference Tournament Championships game, losing to Davidson.

1971-72

◆ ECU win its only Southern Conference title by defeating Furman in the championship game, 77-75. The Pirates made their first trip to the NCAA Tournament and lost to Villanova in the first round.

1974-75

◆ ECU posts its best-ever Southern Conference record going 11-3 and finished in second place. ECU is upset in the second round of the tournament, but received and invitation to play in the Collegiate Commissioners Tournament. ECU lost to Arizona in the first round.

1977

◆ The Pirates withdrew their membership from the Southern Conference during June of 1977. ECU competed as an independent from 1978-80.

1977-78

Oliver Mack finishes fourth in the nation in scoring with a 28.0 points per game average. Finishing ahead of him were Freeman Williams of Portland State, Larry Bird of Indiana State and Purvis Short of Jackson State.

1981-82

◆ ECU joins the Eastern College Athletic Conference and competes in the ECAC-South Division. The seven members of the South Division will eventually form their own conference in 1985, the Colonial Athletic Association.

1985-86

◆ ECU becomes a charter member of the eight team Colonial Athletic Association. The Pirates post a record of 6-8 during the first year of CAA play and finish tied for fourth.

1988-89

◆ Theodore "Blue" Edwards becomes the only Pirate to win CAA Player-of-the-Year honors. He is also the first Pirate to be selected in first round of the NBA Draft. Edwards was taken by the Utah Jazz with the 21st overall pick.

1991-92

◆ Wake Forest graduate and former ECU assistant coach Eddie Payne is named the Pirates' 18th head coach prior to the start of the season. His first team goes just 10-18, but the foundation is laid for a remarkable run a year later.

1992-93

Despite finishing in seventh place in the CAA, ECU rode a string of upsets through the CAA Tournament to win its lone conference tournament championship. ECU defeats James Madison in the championship game to advance to its second NCAA Tournament. The Pirates lost to eventual national champion North Carolina in the opening round.

A Quick Run Through The History Books

1994-95

 ECU wins 18 games in a season for the first time in 20 years, marking the third-highest single-season win total in school history.

1995-96

- Taking over for the departed Eddie Payne, new head coach Joe Dooley wins 17 games, second most ever at ECU by a firstyear head coach. Dooley wins 17 games each of his first two seasons.
- ECU defeats East Tennessee State, 80-76, on Jan. 6 in the first game at the newly renovated and named Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum. The Pirates played their first nine games of the season away from home.

1999-00

- ECU changes conferences for the fifth time as the announcement is made that the Pirates are leaving the CAA to join Conference USA in 2001-02.
- ◆ Bill Herrion takes the reigns as the Pirates' head coach following a successful eight-year stint at Drexel, where he led the Dragons to three NCAA Tournament appearances.

2001-02

- ◆ ECU competes in Conference USA for the first time as compiles a 5-11 mark.
- ◆ The Pirates defeat Louisville, 87-77, to record their first Conference USA victory on Jan. 16.
- ECU shocks No. 9 Marguette at home, 51-46, winning its first-ever game over a top 10 opponent on Feb. 26.

2003-04

 The Pirates stun the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles again, 73-70, at Minges Coliseum on Dec. 30.

2004-05

 Moussa Badiane establishes the Conference USA career record for blocked shots. Badiane finished his four-year career with 314 blocked shots.

2005-06

 Corey Rouse becomes the first player in school history to garner All-Conference USA honors. Rouse is named second-team all-conference.

2006-07

 Darrell Jenkins becomes the first player in school history to lead a conference in assists. Jenkins averaged 5.53 helpers per game to post the highest average in Conference USA during the 2007-08 season. He repeated the feat the following year.

The Pirates defeat an ACC opponent for the first-time in school history, beating N.C. State 75-69 in the Wolfpack's first-ever visit to Minges Coliseum on Dec. 8.

 Brock Young finished the year ranked second in the NCAA in assists per game with 7.57. He set an ECU record by distributing 227 assists during the season.

2010-11

- Jeff Lebo is introduced as the 22nd basketball coach in school history on March 23.
- ◆ The Pirates post their first winning season in 14 years, finishing with an 18-16 record and receive an invitation to compete in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). It was ECU's first postseason appearance since 1993.
- Brock Young was named Conference IISA Sixth Man-of-the-Year.
- ECU defeated UCF in the first round of the Conference USA tournament, recording its first-ever victory in the championship event. The Pirates defeated top-seeded UAB the following day to advance to the semifinals.

2011-12

- ◆ Darrius Morrow becomes the seventh player n school history to amass 1,000 points and 700 rebounds in his career.
- Miquel Paul becomes the first player named to an NABC All-District II squad, earning second-team honors.
- ◆ ECU wins a game in the C-USA tournament for the second straight season, marking the first time that the Pirates have won a conference tournament game in consecutive seasons since 1972 and '73.

- The Pirates capture the CollegeInsider. com Postseason Tournament (CIT) championship, securing the first postseason title in school history.
