» TIP-OFF POINTS

▶ ECU opens the 2019 Air Force Reserve American Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championship Thursday night against Wichita State in the final game of the first round. The winner advances to play No. 3 seed Temple Friday.

▶ The Pirates are 2-4 all-time at The American Basketball Championship. ECU won its first round game against UCF in 2015 and then beat Temple in the opening game two years later, losing to top-seeded SMU both years. Last season, UCF eliminated the Pirates in a 6 vs. 11 matchup in Orlando.

▶ The Pirates lost both of their regular season meetings with the Shockers, falling at home by 16, 65-49, and on the road by 17, 72-55. ECU is 0-3 all-time against Wichita State with all three meetings taking place since the Shockers joined The American in 2017-18.

▶ ECU enters the tournament on a four-game losing streak. Included in the streak is its road loss at Wichita State on March 5. The Shockers held the Pirates to 35.6 percent shooting and 3-of-15 outside the arc. Isaac Fleming led ECU with 17 points versus WSU with Shawn Williams scoring 12 and Rico Quinton posting his first career double-double (11 points, 10 rebounds).

▶ Freshman Jayden Gardner was unanimously voted onto The American All-Freshman Team by the league's 12 head coaches. Gardner led all rookies in scoring and ranked second overall in rebounding (behind fellow USF freshman

Alexis Yetna). He is the only player in the conference to rank among the top 10 in both scoring (10th) and rebounding. He is six points shy of setting the ECU freshman scoring record and 32 off The American rookie mark. His 16.3 ppg ranks the best scoring average by a freshman in conference history.

▶ Junior Seth LeDay sustained a knee injury at Wichita State on March 5 and is out for the remainder of the season. LeDay was averaging 11.0 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.

▶ Williams has averaged 16.75 points per game the last eight contests, coring 20 or more points three times. He dropped 26 against Tulsa before torching the nets for 27 at Tulane and scoring 20 in the regular season finale against UConn. He is shooting 49.2 percent (31-of-63) from beyond the 3-point arc the last eight games after making just 11-of-52 3-point attempts (.212) in the Pirates' eight previous games. He made a career-best eight 3-point attempts versus Tulsa.

▶ Fleming has become more of an offensive contributor late in the season, scoring double figures in 12 of the last 16 games after he scored double figures only three times in ECU's first 14 games of the season. In the last six games, Fleming has scored 101 total points (16.8 ppg) and grabbed 42 rebounds (7.0 rpg) with 38 assists (6.3 apg) in 217 total minutes (36.2 mpg).

LAST MEETING - WICHITA STATE 72, ECU 55 • KOCH ARENA • WICHITA, KAN. • MARCH 5, 2019

RESULT: Wichita State completed a regular season sweep of ECU with a 72-55 victory at Koch Arena less than two weeks ago.

TURNING POINT: The Pirates (10-19, 3-14) got out of the gates quickly and scored the game's first four points, but Wichita State countered with an 18-5 run capped by a thunderous dunk from Dennis to give the Shockers an 18-9 lead 10 minutes into the contest. WSU extended its lead to 14, 32-18, just before the under-4 first half media timeout and led 34-22 at the break. WSU stretched its lead to 17 in the first five minutes after halftime.

KEY PERFORMERS: ECU senior Isaac Fleming led the Pirates with 17 points and sophomore Shawn Williams added 12. Freshman Rico Quiton recorded his first double-double with a career-high 11 points and 10 rebounds. Markis McDuffie led the Shockers with 16 points. Asbjorn Midtgaard added 11 points and Dennis Dexter also scored double digits, netting 10 points. Haynes-Jones added seven points for the Shockers.

DEFENDING THE ARC

► The Pirates held 14 of their 30 regular season opponents to under 30 percent shooting outside the 3-point arc, including four to less than 20 percent (Lamar 18.8%, Prairie View A&M 14.3%, UMS 14.3%, Cincinnati 15.8%).

► ECU is 8-5 this season when holding opponents to less than 30 percent shooting outside the arc, suffering a one-point loss to James Madison (.294), a three-point loss to High Point (.286), a six-point setback at Charlotte (.250) and 12-point loss at UCF. Oddly enough, ECU was out-rebounded and made fewer free throws than its opponent in each of the three aforementioned defeats.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

► ECU committed 56 fewer turnovers in last 15 games (165) than it did in the first 14 games (221) of the season, averaging 11.0 turnovers during its most recent stretch compared to 15.8 giveaways per game during the first 15 games.

► The Pirates committed fewer turnovers than their opponent in 10 of their last 13 games.

► The fewest turnovers the Pirates have committed in a game this season was seven in their 66-65 victory over Tulane as well as their 91-78 loss at Tulsa. ECU is 6-5 this season when committing 12 or fewer turnovers in a game.

► The Pirates committed fewer than 10 turnovers six of the last 10 games, including four consecutive games from Jan. 31 - Feb. 10, its longest such streak since 2008.

WINNING MARGINS

► The Pirates have won three games by 20 or more points this season after winning just two games by that margin last season. In their last four wins, two have been by 20 or more, while the other two were by two points each.

► Two years ago (2016-17), ECU won four games by more than 20 points. The record for most 20-point victories in a season as a Division I institution is five (1970-71, 2003-04, 2012-13).

► Coach Dooley owns 12 20-point wins as the Pirates' top man, tying him with his former boss Eddie Payne for fourth-most by an ECU coach in its DI era. Jeff Lebo's Pirates recorded 26 20-point wins in his seven-plus seasons on the Pirates' bench.

► ECU has overcome a pair of second half double digit deficits to win this season, rallying from 10 down (63-53) against Lamar and 13 (64-51) versus Appalachian State.

► A year ago, the Pirates overcame double digit deficits to win five times this season. ECU rallied from behind to beat Cleveland State (-10), UNCW (-10), Campbell (-17), Grambling State (-12) and USF (-10).

► The Pirates overcame seven double digit deficits for victory during Coach Dooley's first stint as head coach from 1995-99, including a 17-point road (26-9) deficit at Richmond (1/31/96) for an eight-point win (66-58).

PRIVILEGE TO START

► Following the game against High Point, Coach Dooley was asked about using all the different starting lineups and if he was trying to send a message and his reply was: *"The message is, it's a privilege to start and it's a privilege to be a Pirate. If you're going to take it for granted then you're not going to start."*

► ECU has used 12 different starting lineups through the first 30 games of the year with freshman Jayden Gardner being the only player to start every game and with sophomore Shawn Williams starting all 25 games in which he's played since serving his suspension.

► In addition to the quartet of first-year players (Gardner, Seth LeDay, Tae Hardy, Tyler Foster) who made their initial starts for ECU this season, seniors Addison Hill and Justice Obasohan also made their first career starts during the 2018-19 campaign.

ONE OF THE YOUNGEST TEAMS

► ECU is one of 17 schools nationally to have one or fewer seniors/graduate transfers on its roster in 2018-19, while the Pirates' nine freshmen (true and redshirt) and sophomores ranks seventh nationally and are only surpassed by the 13 at Arkansas and UNC Asheville, 12 at Duquesne and 10 at Cal State Northridge, James Madison and Kentucky.

► The only player on the team to have been in the program more than two years is senior Justice Obasohan, who joined the Pirates as a walk-on prior to the start of the 2015-16 campaign. None of the players who signed an NLI with the Pirates or transferred to ECU have spent more than one season donning the purple and gold. Obasohan has spent three years wearing an ECU uniform, while fellow walk-ons Addison Hill and John Whitley have each worn a Pirate jersey for two seasons.

DOOLEY ADDS NEW STAFF

► Coach Joe Dooley added four new members and retained two others to make up his 2018-19 coaching staff. Raphael Chillious and Steve Roccaforte joined the program as coaches while Tyler Lewis and Derek DeMasi signed on as support staff members. Ken Potosnak and Kyle Robinson were retained from the previous regime.

► Chillious will serve as the Pirates' associate head coach after spending the previous season in the same capacity at UConn following seven years at Washington and one at Villanova.

► Roccaforte was named assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator in July after four years at Virginia Tech, serving as associate head coach during the 2017-18 season. Prior to going to Blacksburg, Roccaforte was the head coach at Lamar as well as an assistant at Centenary, Memphis, Tulane, USF and Wyoming.

► Lewis, a former guard at NC State and Butler, spent one year as the director of recruiting at Furman before joining the Pirates' program. DeMasi was the assistant video coordinator for Dooley at Florida Gulf Coast in 2017-18.

GARDNER AMONG NCAA TOP FRESHMEN

► Freshman Jayden Gardner ranks eighth among all NCAA Division I freshmen in scoring and in rebounding, averaging 16.3 points and 8.5 rebounds per game. Gardner, Duke's Zion Williamson and Lamine Diane of Cal State Northridge are the only players to rank among the Top-8 among all DI freshman in both categories.

► Gardner ranks among the Top-25 Division I players in total free throws made (167) and total free throws attempted (223). Gardner has averaged 5.6 made throws and 7.4 free throw attempts per games through the first 30 contests. He has gone to the charity stripe 10 or more times in nine games and made double digit free throws in five of those games.

► Gardner set the ECU freshman single-game record for free throws made (16) and attempted (19) against Appalachian State.

GARDNER SELECTED NATIONAL FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

► Jayden Gardner was named the CBS Sports/USBWA Freshman of the Week on Jan. 15, becoming the first player at ECU to be recognized with the award on the heels of a week in which he averaged 26.5 points, 14.0 rebounds and 54.3-percent shooting. Gardner had 18 points and eight rebounds at Memphis before posting 35 points and 20 rebounds at UCF. It's the first time in AAC history that any player has had a 30/20 double-double.

TRIO OF GUARD COMPOSE THE PIRATES' 2019 EARLY SIGNING CLASS

► The ECU men's basketball team received a trio of signed letters of intent from guards Logan Curtis, Tyrie Jackson and Tremont Robinson on the first day of the 2018-19 early signing period.

► A native of Ashburn, Ga., Jackson transferred to Northwest Florida State College after redshirting in 2016-17 and averaging just 7.2 minutes per game in 28 contests during the 2017-18 season at Virginia Tech. A 6-foot-1 guard, he averaged 18.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 5.0 steals as a senior at Tift County (Ga.) High School and earned 6A South all-state honors. Jackson will have two years of eligibility remaining with the Pirates.

► A 6-foot-1 point guard from Little Rock, Ark., Robinson began his college career at Northwest Mississippi Community College in 2017-18 before transferring to Garden City Community College, where he is redshirting this season. Robinson averaged 18.3 points, 5.4 assists and 4.6 steals per game, while shooting 45.7 percent from outside the 3-point arc at NWMCC as a freshman. Robinson will have three years of eligibility at ECU.

► Curtis, a 6-foot-4 guard from Baltimore, attended the same school as former Maryland All-America guard Juan Dixon and 2010-11 NBA All-Rookie Team member Gary Neal. As a junior, Curtis averaged 17.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, and 3.0 assists per game for the Cardinals. Curtis will have four years of eligibility with the Pirates.

LEDAY DONE FOR THE SEASON

- After sitting out each of the last two seasons, junior Seth LeDay made up for lost time. He scored double figures in 19 games and averaged 11.0 points per game before suffering a season-ending injury on March 5 at Wichita State.
- LeDay began his Pirate career by scoring double figures in each of his first three games, which included a game-high 21 points against James Madison, converting 7-of-9 field goal attempts as well as 7-of-9 free throws.
- His putback with 1.3 seconds left against Lamar forced the game into overtime and finished the game with 16 points and nine rebounds.
- LeDay's go-ahead tip-in with 23.8 seconds left against Appalachian State helped the Pirates rally from 13 points down and earn an 83-81 win.
- He has the highest field goal percentage on the team (.527), ranking seventh in The American. LeDay ranks second on the squad in 13 categories, including rebounds, assists, steals and blocked shots.
- He has recorded four double-doubles this season including two against Memphis.
- LeDay's dunk at UConn on Feb. 3 was awarded as the No. 2 play on ESPN Sportscenter's Top-10 on Super Bowl Sunday.

WILLIAMS BURIES 100 3s

- Shawn Williams reached the century mark for 3-pointers made in his 41st career game to become the third-fastest player in school history to reach the milestone. Akeem Richmond needed just 33 games to reach the century mark for 3s and James Legan took only 37.
- Williams has a career average of 2.5 made 3-pointers per game. Through 20 games this season, he is averaging 2.6 made 3s per game after burying 2.4 per game as a freshman a year ago.
- Thus far in his career, he's made four or more 3s in a game 13 times and six or more six times. He knocked down a career-high eight 3s against Tulsa at home on Feb. 17, 2019.

- Fleming has a career scoring average of 10.3 points per game, which includes 11.0 points per during his tenure at ECU after averaging 9.5 points per game at Hawaii.

After leading Florida Gulf Coast to five conference titles and five consecutive 20-win seasons, former East Carolina University head men's basketball coach Joe Dooley returns for a second stint at the helm of the Pirates' program beginning with the 2018-19 campaign.

Dooley finished his tenure at FGCU with a five-year record of 114-58 (.663), leading the Eagles to three Atlantic Sun (ASUN) Conference regular season championships, including their first-ever title in 2014, and two second-place finishes. He also helped them capture two conference tournament trophies and earn NCAA Tournament appearances in 2016 and 2017. The Eagles defeated Fairleigh Dickinson in the 2016 First Four to advance into the main bracket.

He is one of only 35 NCAA Division I coaches over the last five years with a winning percentage of over 66 percent and more than 110 victories.

Dooley was twice named ASUN Coach-of-the-Year (2017, 2018) as

well as the 2017 NABC District III Coach-of-the-Year. He coached 10 all-conference selections, including 2018 ASUN Player-of-the-Year and Associated Press honorable mention All-America selection Brandon Goodwin as well as 2017 ASUN Defensive Player-of-the-Year Demetris Morant.

The Eagles participated in postseason play each of Dooley's five seasons in Fort Myers, winning 21 or more games every year with two NIT and one CIT appearance in addition to a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament.

Dooley also tutored 21 ASUN All-Academic performers during his first four seasons (the 2017-18 team will be announced later this spring).

Dooley, who is the Pirates' all-time Division I leader in winning percentage (.523), led ECU to an overall record of 57-52 during his four-year tenure that included back-to-back 17-win campaigns during his first two years. He won more games (44) in his first three years at the helm of the program than any of his predecessors.

In 1996-97, he led the Pirates to their only top-3 finish during their 15-year membership in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), tying for third with a 9-7 record led by Raphael Edwards, who was a two-time all-conference selection under Dooley's tutelage.

Dooley was the youngest head coach in NCAA Division I men's basketball at the age of 29 when he was promoted to ECU's top basketball position in April of 1995.

Prior to being named head coach, Dooley served four seasons as coach Eddie Payne's top assistant and was part of the Pirates' staff

that went to the 1993 NCAA Tournament by securing the CAA's automatic bid.

Before coming to Greenville, Dooley and Payne served on the same staff as assistant coaches at South Carolina for three seasons.

He later served as an assistant coach at New Mexico (1999-02) and Wyoming (2002-03) before joining Bill Self, a four-time Big XII Coach-of-the-Year during their 10 campaigns together, for his inaugural season at Kansas in 2003-04. During his decade in Lawrence, the Jayhawks compiled a 300-58 record, including a 137-27 mark in the Big XII with nine regular-season crowns and six conference tournament titles.

He won a national championship as an assistant coach at Kansas in 2008 and helped the Jayhawks earn another Final Four berth in 2012.

Dooley also served as an court coach under Self at the 2018 USA Men's Basketball U18 Training Camp.

In 2010, Dooley ranked first among all "High-Major Assistants" by Foxsports.com, which was up from his No. 6 ranking by the media outlet in 2008. In 2007, he was rated the fourth-best recruiter in the nation by Rivals.com. Dooley recruited or coached 19 NBA draft picks in his 10 years at KU, including 12 first-round selections.

In 30 years as an assistant and head coach, Dooley has helped lead six different programs into the postseason, accumulated 657 victories with 14 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven NIT bids.

Dooley is a 1988 graduate of George Washington University in Washington, D.C., where he earned his bachelor's degree in speech communications. A four-year basketball letterwinner at GW, he started his last two seasons and was elected a team captain as a senior.

FLEMING PLAYING HIS BEST DOWN THE STRETCH

East Carolina's men's basketball team might not have the wins to show for it, but it's obvious the team has been much more competitive over the last handful of games, largely thanks to the consistency of two players.

While sophomore shooting guard Shawn Williams regaining his 3-point stroke has received most of the attention, senior point guard Isaac Fleming has also put together a string of strong performances, running the offense efficiently, guarding the other team's most effective perimeter player, and scoring at a high clip.

Fleming had a recent double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds in a win at Tulane, and he hasn't had more turnovers than assists in a game dating back to Jan. 13 against Temple. Over the past eight games, Fleming has dished out 26 assists to 16 turnovers, and he's averaging 11.1 points per game. His season scoring average sits at 8.1 ppg.

The only true scholarship senior on the team, Fleming has just three regular season games remaining for the 10-17 Pirates, and he intends to make every one of them count.

"Really I just came to a conclusion with myself just to play my game," Fleming said. "Early on I was more so trying to play to make the coaches happy and try not to be benched or anything. But I just decided I was going to more focus on playing my game."

While attitude and sloppy play has been a bit of an issue for Fleming in the past, the former Hawaii transfer has seemingly put that behind him, providing a consistent presence each day on the practice and game court.

"He's playing much better," head coach Joe Dooley said. "I think the urgency of being a senior and to his credit he's been not good to coach, but unbelievably great to coach the last couple of months. I think they all have their little blips, which we all do, but he's tried to do the right thing, he's tried to compete, he's tried to play the right way and that's a tribute to him."

SUMMERS: DOOLEY TAKES ONE FOR THE TEAM

There is still some fire in Minges Coliseum.

When boos — and a few water bottles — cascaded down from the seats inside East Carolina's basketball home early in the second half on Wednesday night, it conjured an energy the building has not felt in a long time, save for some concerts on non-game nights.

Boos in a sports venue are not ideal for the home team, and the Pirates were KO'd in the game by No. 8 Houston, 99-65, but the emotion was raw and real. It seems a somewhat curious venture when a school urges fans to pack their home arena to see their team face the tallest odds of the entire season, but in this case, the 4,087 spectators were witness to an uncommonly rowdy ECU basketball event, something not seen more than a few times in the last decade.

Now the onus is on ECU fans to make it that way every time, and not just when a top 10 team is in town. That's always been the challenge with ECU basketball.

When head coach Joe Dooley was in the ear of lead official Tony Greene two minutes into the second half following the first in a series of hotly contested calls, ultimately earning his first career ejection, he was either consciously or subconsciously working on that long-standing ECU hoops culture void.

Imagine never being tossed from a game in 31 years, then suddenly pressing the right button on a veteran officiating crew. Dooley said he was surprised, said his players were surprised. But in a game that eventually saw sophomore Shawn Williams also tossed along with a handful of fans in what became a cauldron, one can't help but wonder if it was on purpose.

If it was, good for Dooley.

Anyone who has followed sports for any period of time is aware that sometimes you have to play the role of antagonist in order to rally the support success demands. If you have ever seen a hockey fight or a baseball manager kicking dirt on an umpire, you understand.

There is a temptation to lay it all at the feet of the officials for affecting the outcome of a game, but the reality is the Pirates were down by nearly 20 and fading fast when the game went off its rails. And in that sense, the timing was perfect.

There was no victory to be had on the scoreboard, but there was one to be had both on the Pirates' bench and in the Minges seats that were not full but were a good deal closer to it than usual. Whether intentional or not, Dooley united a fan base that's been splintered for a long time and which has put its faith in a slew of coaches since his first stint in Greenville in the 1990s.

Dooley might have won his team and the fans over, even as he simultaneously took responsibility for the outcome of the game when he addressed his team afterward.

On the other side, Houston not only got the win — its 27th in 28 games this season — but also carried the distinction of keeping its collective head during the string of technical fouls and ejections for the Pirates. UH head coach Kelvin Sampson reminded his players when things got testy to keep their heads, that there would likely be hard fouls coming their way and to simply walk away from them.

Houston has a lot to lose. The Pirates do not, at least not yet. Dooley doesn't boast the talent, depth

or experience it takes to contend with a potential NCAA tournament heavyweight, or to simply turn the other cheek in a testy situation. Against the Cougars, he instead tried to inspire his team's willingness to stand up for itself.

Building a team of Houston's caliber takes time, experience and ups and downs. And sometimes a few technical fouls.

DOOLEY, ECU LOOKING FOR BREAKTHROUGH RECRUITS

East Carolina basketball coaches have been hot on the recruiting trail, including for Boston 7-footer Charles Coleman who also is a target by Wake Forest, Duke and DePaul, as the Pirates have faced difficulties on the court for another season.

A 79-69 loss to Memphis on Wednesday night, a game in which ECU led 61-60 with 8:11 remaining in Minges Coliseum, dropped the Pirates (9-15 overall) to 2-10 in the American Athletic Conference and recruiting was a focus during the postgame news conference.

That was partly because Memphis and coach Penny Hardaway are prominent in recruiting rankings and the Tigers this year start five seniors, including Jeremiah Martin who has developed into an explosive 6-foot-3 shooting guard and he scored 31 points against ECU.

"I don't know how long it will take, but we are recruiting high-level guys and we just have to get a couple of them," said Pirate head coach Joe Dooley, whose team hosts Tulsa today. "We have to develop guys in the program and when we get guys, we have to develop them and retain them."

The Pirates have been led this year by freshman 6-6 forward Jayden Gardner, last year's main recruiting target by Jeff Lebo and then Dooley to secure his signature. The in-state product has been slowed some lately by opposing AAC clubs, but he still is averaging 17.5 points and 8.6 rebounds per game for the season.

ECU's only senior who plays significant minutes is point guard Isaac Fleming, who transferred in from Hawaii in 2016 and suffered an injury to the head versus Memphis. That led to freshman wing Tyler Foster playing 33 minutes and he finished with 10 points, five rebounds, four assists, two steals, one turnover and a block.

"We are not going to be able to get McDonald's All-Americans, but we need guys who can develop and be really good players," Dooley said. "They can be part of getting this thing up, and the other point is we have to get to the point where we have upperclassmen. ... Something we have tried to emphasize (in recruiting) is that we are in a great league when you look at the number of guys from our league in the NBA, and there will be more in the future."

Tulsa (15-10, 5-7) is 3-1 in its last four games and coming off an 80-57 victory at last-place Tulane on Thursday. The Golden Hurricane was 18-of-23 from the free throw line, and 6-7, 222-pound bench player Jeriah Horne scored 20 points with 12 rebounds.

ECU will travel to Tulsa, which also beat Temple 76-58 last weekend, on March 3.

DOOLEY TAKES AWAY PRACTICE JERSEYS AS ECU HEADS TO USF

As East Carolina's basketball team took the court inside the Smith-Williams Center on Friday for its first practice since Wednesday's 65-49 home loss to Wichita State, it did so in an assortment of different colored shirts, shorts and shoes.

Noticeably absent were ECU's practice jerseys, which Pirate head coach Joe Dooley stripped the team of after one of its poorest performances of the season in the largely non-competitive loss to the Shockers.

"Right now, we don't deserve to wear East Carolina stuff," Dooley said. "We've got to create a mindset where it matters and you care. We're going to line up every day, and even if you get beat, at least you tried hard. That's the mindset we've got to create."

Sunday's game at USF will mark ECU's first opportunity to right the wrongs it displayed on the court versus Wichita State. It was just over two weeks ago when East Carolina fell at home to USF, 77-57.

As the only senior on the roster, guard Isaac Fleming said he's trying his hardest to keep his teammates' confidence up and mindset intact despite the Pirates' recent rough stretch. Fleming and freshman forward Jayden Gardner took ownership on Wednesday after the loss to Wichita State, saying the team needs to quit straying away from the coaching staff's plan as the game develops.

"I'm just trying to lead by example and just showing the team when we do what we're supposed to do, we are a hard team to beat," Fleming said. "But when we go do on our thing, it's very easy to beat us."

ECU got off to a red-hot start at home on Jan. 26 versus USF, jumping out to a 19-6 lead. But the Bulls ended up storming back to take a two-point lead at halftime, and outscored ECU on its home floor by 18 in the second half to come away with the 20-point victory. USF has won four games in a row and enters Sunday's game 16-6 overall and 6-4 in conference play. East Carolina comes into the contest 9-13 and 2-8 in league action.

The Pirates are 0-8 on the road, while the Bulls are 12-2 inside the Yuengling Center. Sunday's 5:30 p.m. ET tip-off on ESPN3 will mark the first time this season ECU has played the same opponent twice.

"I think you go back to the tape and see what you did well and what you did poorly, and also what they tried to attack," Dooley said, "Things that they scored on, things they took advantage of and you try to address those. Obviously they are going to be doing the same thing, looking at things that worked for them and things that they can do again."

Freshman forward Alexis Yetna, who scored 28 points in USF's win at ECU, didn't play in the Bulls' Thursday night win over SMU due to a leg injury. Yetna's status for Sunday's game is to be determined.

ECU PERFECT FIT FOR SPASOJEVIC

No one has come further to be a Pirate than Dimitrije Spasojevic has, and it's not even close.

Spasojevic is a native of Vrsac, Serbia, a small town about 60 miles northeast of the capital city of Belgrade and only 10 miles from the border with Romania. It takes two flights to get to Raleigh, then a 90-minute drive to make it to Greenville, completing a trip of nearly 5,000 miles.

He made that day-long journey for the first time in the summer of 2017, and instantly knew that in ECU, he had found the right place to combine his love of basketball and his equally strong desire for a quality education.

"I come from a small town, and Greenville is considered a small town," said Spasojevic, a 21-year-old sophomore who is on track to graduate in May 2021 with a degree in communications. "I really liked it here from the first time I saw it. I really like the hospitality here, really just everything about this place."

Well, almost everything. Some things took some getting used to.

"Fried food," he said. "I'm not a big fan of fried food. I'm more of a healthy eater. That's the biggest difference."

"But I have a lot of friends here. I have a lot of people who believe in me. I love the coaches, and my teammates are like my brothers."

At 6-foot-8 and 240 pounds, Spasojevic provides a solid inside presence for ECU. His mentor growing up was his uncle, Zoran Spasojevic, who was a professional basketball player in Romania and Israel before ending his career with Hemofarm, a well-known club based in Vrsac.

"He played the same position as me, but my game is a little more physical than his," said Dimitrije, one of two sons of Milomir and Dragana Spasojevic. "He was a great shooter and post-up player, but he wasn't that physical. He taught me a lot. He was the one who put the ball in my hand. I went to his games while he was still playing, and I kind of fell in love with the game. As soon as he saw that, he tried to teach me everything he knows."

Spasojevic started playing in 2004, at the age of 7, and by the time he was 13 he began playing for national teams. The better players in Serbia were invited to camps that would last for two to three days at a time and also served as recruiting grounds for the national squads. He has played for the U-16, U-18 and U-20 teams.

"That's when I realized I could do something with basketball, and that's when my dream of playing basketball here in college in the U.S. started," Spasojevic said. "I played a lot internationally. We used to play tournaments in Greece and Turkey, mainly in countries in that region, so I had a lot of experience with different styles of basketball. I faced a lot of different players and saw different styles."

He left home at 15 and played for three years based in Belgrade, then one in Cacak before going back to Vrsac, where he had a decision to make. There is no college athletics system in Serbia, so it's education or sports. Spasojevic already had an established love for basketball, but he wanted to earn a degree so he could have what he termed a "plan B for life."

Ken Potosnak, now in his ninth year as an assistant at ECU, saw Spasojevic at the European championships and on various videos available on YouTube, and invited him to visit with the Pirates.

So in the summer of 2017, Spasojevic obtained a visa for a one-week trip to the U.S. He was sold on the Pirates instantly, and joined the ECU student body in August. He started 25 of 30 games as a freshman and averaged 6.1 points and 4.0 rebounds while shooting 56.6 percent from the field.

Now in his second season, he's growing more comfortable and confident, despite a coaching change that brought Joe Dooley back in for a second stint with the Pirates. Spasojevic views the changes as a positive.

"The leadership is way different because of the head coach and what he brings to the table," he said. "We kind of recognized what his goals are for the season and we just flow into it. We just try to prove that we belong in this league and that we can really make a significant difference over last year."

Spasojevic adjusted quickly in the classroom as well, earning all A's and B's. Doing well academically always has been a point of emphasis for him, as he is fluent in four languages — Serbian, English, German and Macedonian — and knows enough French to get by.

"My personal goal is to be remembered as a really good basketball player and somebody who cleared a path for putting my family's last name on the map," Spasojevic said. "My most important thing is to take care of my little brother (12-year-old Damian). Then I would like to have a family and hopefully try to live here."

ROAD LESS TRAVELED

It probably wasn't surprising to anyone who knows him when Addison Hill stepped onto the court in uniform for ECU during the Pirates' game at Charlotte on Nov. 17, 2016.

But the story of how Hill, then a sophomore, got there is interesting. Just a year earlier, he was a team manager for ECU. Four years before that, he was cut from the junior varsity at South Central High School in Winterville.

Yet there he was, logging 13 minutes and totaling two points and one rebound in his Pirate debut. Although Hill didn't go on to become a major in-game contributor for ECU — he entered this season, likely his last with the Pirates, with career totals of six points, four rebounds and one assist — he has appreciated every step along the way.

"Making the team my sophomore year was another humbling experience along the way for me," said Hill, a 6-3, 180-pound guard. "There were a lot of prayers and a lot of hard work, and it just kind of worked out for me."

Hill comes by his athleticism naturally. His father, William, was a two-time All-MEAC selection at Delaware State from 1978-82, finishing with 1,020 career points, a total that stands 20th in school history. His mother, Tina, is an ECU graduate who plays sports in high school in Fayetteville.

Hill's older sister, Kennedy, also an ECU graduate, is an accomplished dancer who often performs in New York City. His twin sister, Maya, is a student at ECU.

When Addison didn't make the team at South Central, he never hung his head, choosing instead to get to work on improving. By the time he was a senior, he was team captain and an all-conference pick for Coach Chris Cherry. The Falcons finished 23-3 that season after losing to eventual state champion Garner Magnet in a 4-A regional semifinal.

"It was hard work in the summers and consistency," Hill said. "I wasn't the best player on the team, but I was consistent. I worked hard and I tried to be a leader."

Coming out of high school, though, Hill had no college offers. But through a relationship between Cherry and the ECU coaching staff, he was able to join the Pirate program as a manager.

"It's humbling, definitely," Hill said. "I had to take a year off of basketball to work with the team. It was definitely humbling, but you can't lead unless you serve."

"Walking on the next year was always in the back of my mind. That whole year I was playing one-on-one with (players on the ECU team). Akeem Richmond (former Pirate standout) would come down and we'd play one-on-one. I was always still working on my game."

That work, obviously paid off, although his first two seasons with the Pirates didn't result in a lot of playing time. This season, however, has been a very different story. Through 14 games, Hill saw action in 12, including seven starts. In his first start he scored five points, including his first career 3-pointer, in a 69-64 victory over UT-Rio Grande Valley on Nov. 19.

Hill also had five rebounds against UT-RGV while defending Terry Winn, a 6-7 forward. Winn shot just 6-for-16 from the field. Afterward Hill drew praise from Coach Joe Dooley for his willingness to do whatever is necessary to help the team, not only in that game but in practices as well.

The transition to playing under Dooley, now in the first season of his second tenure at ECU, has been a seamless one for Hill and the rest of the team.

"It's been great," he said. "The coaching staff is cool. They're dedicated. Everybody has a good relationship with them. We go to coach's house all the time. It's been pretty easy."

Hill will have another year of eligibility left after this season, but he's unsure of what he'll do. He is set to graduate in May with a degree in applied sociology and a minor in criminal justice.

"That's still to be determined," he said. "I've kind of gotten into investing and real estate. I'm still trying to wrap my head around what I want to do. I might even consider going back and getting a business degree, but really, it's all still to be determined."

Regardless of what the future holds, though, there's no doubt Hill will leave his mark on the ECU program.

"When it's all said and done and I graduate and hang up my sneakers, I will always remember four of the most inspiring people in the program: Ian Jones, Evan Umstead, John Whitley and Justin Miller," he said. "The coaches and players dubbed us 'the green machine' because of the green pinnies we would wear during scout team. We competed week after week to get the guys prepared for upcoming games."

"When the opportunity came for me to play in games, those four guys and Justice Obasohan poured into me with words of encouragement and support. I love those guys, they are my brothers, and are the backbone of this program."

CROWN JEWEL EMERGES TO ANCHOR PROGRAM'S FUTURE

There are several conclusions can be taken away from East Carolina's 76-65 loss at American Athletic Conference favorite Central Florida on Sunday.

First and foremost is the fact that the Pirates' young star Jayden Gardner is an elite talent and as new coach Joe Dooley observed after last week's home upset of Cincinnati, "a guy to build around."

The stocky 6-foot-6 forward scored 35 points and pulled down 20 rebounds against the Knights to become only the second freshman in conference history to score that many points in a game and the first rookie to record as many rebounds.

With three 30-plus point games to his credit already this season, Gardner is well on his way to becoming the AAC's Rookie of the Year. But as good as he is and figures to get as his career progresses, he can only do so much on his own.

It was obvious from Sunday's performance that as improved as the Pirates already are, they still need to recruit more talent to put around Gardner. They also need more size to battle on the boards and defend inside, and more experience among the players already on the roster in order to consistently compete with and beat the best teams in their league.

The popular narrative on the subject of accomplishing those goals is that it's easier said than done to attract top talent to Greenville because of its proximity to all those higher profile programs that surround it in the state.

While it's true that the best of the best will naturally be attracted to North Carolina, Duke, N.C. State, Wake Forest and other regional and national powers, there's still plenty of talent to go around within our borders. Gardner, a graduate of Heritage High School in Wake Forest, is proof of that.

Because of the strength and exposure of the AAC, which regularly places multiple teams in the national rankings and NCAA tournament bracket, it can also be an attractive landing spot for imported talent such as Arkansas product Shawn Williams — the 2018 conference Rookie of the Year — Virginia native K.J. Davis and Texas product Seth LeDay.

The fact that all of those players, including Gardner, were signed by former coach Jeff Lebo, shows that recruiting to ECU isn't as difficult as most might believe. The hard part has been keeping the best of those talented players in purple and gold long enough for them to develop into a winning unit.

Just look at all the players that have come and gone from the Pirates over the past 2-3 years and what they're doing now.

Elijah Hughes, for example, is currently the second-leading scorer for a Syracuse team that will almost certainly finish in the top half of the Atlantic Coast Conference. The 6-foot-6 wing is averaging 15 points, 4.8 rebounds and 32.3 minutes per game for the Orange.

Guards Jeremy Sheppard and Raquan Wilkins, both of whom were suspended last season before leaving the program, are excelling at junior colleges as they work to earn another Division I opportunity.

Sheppard, a 2017 AAC All-Freshman team selection, is averaging 16.7 points and 4.2 assists while shooting 43 percent from 3-point range for the College of Central Florida while Wilkins is scoring at an 18 point per game clip at Lee College in Texas. Wilkins scored 48 points in a game earlier this season to earn national junior college Player of the Week honors.

That trio would provide the makings of a formidable lineup even without forward Brandon Stith, whose eligibility is up but who earned All-Conference USA recognition at Old Dominion after leaving ECU following his freshman season of 2014.

While there are many reasons for players leaving, sometimes not of their own choice, those recent departures emphasize that in addition to going out and recruiting new talent, Dooley and his staff must make a concerted effort to retain the core of young players already in the program.

Gardner is clearly a centerpiece around which a winning program can be built. The job now is to do everything possible — from surrounding him with talented teammates to filling the stands for home games at Minges Coliseum — to make sure that the program he transforms is ECU's and not someone else's.

JAYDEN GARDNER JUST KEEPS ADDING TO A STELLAR FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

If you looked at the stats after ECU's season-opening game against Delaware State on Nov. 6, you wouldn't think Jayden Gardner was going to dominate the way he has this season. After all, Gardner shot 0-for-8 from the field with all six of his points coming from the free throw line in his collegiate debut.

And against James Madison in his second career game as a Pirate, he was still getting used to playing to this level, as Gardner went 1-of-4 from the field and 4-of-8 from the free throw line to finish with six points.

But Something clicked from after the JMU game on Nov. 9th to Nov. 11th when ECU faced Lamar. The 6-foot-6 forward out of Heritage High School in Wake Forest, N.C., had his first career double-double, tallying 30 points, and 10 rebounds. Gardner shot 9-of-10 from the field and 12-of-14 from the free throw line that game.

It turns out, that was just a sign of things to come. Gardner has already tallied six double-doubles and three 30-point games in his first 16 college outings.

"We think he is a foundational type of guy," head coach Joe Dooley said on the AAC teleconference on Monday. "I think one of the exciting things about him is that we don't think he is a finished product. I mean he is continuing to figure some things out. I think he will be a guy we can facilitate through this season. One of our goals is to get our younger guys older for next year and add some pieces to go with them."

After that 30 and 10 performance, Gardner had a lesser game against his first ACC opponent in Georgia Tech with 13 points and three rebounds. But he didn't let that impact his play the rest of the season.

He would bounce back and score 15 against Texas-Rio Grande Valley and then record his second double-double against Prairie View A&M with 28 points and 17 rebounds.

Among many firsts this season, Gardner got to travel down to Wilmington to face UNCW where he surfed his way to his third double-double. This one was 30 points and 15 rebounds.

Since the UNCW game, Gardner has recorded three more double-doubles, and seven double-figure scoring games, including his historic performance against UCF this past Sunday when he dropped 35 points and grabbed 20 rebounds.

"He is a guy from an effort standpoint and a dependability standpoint that every day you get the same type of effort and I think it has been rewarded, his hard work has been rewarded," Dooley said. "The good thing for us and for him is that I think he has another level to go to."

After the UCF game, Gardner is averaging 19.4 points per game, which ranks fifth among freshmen in the NCAA and 56th in the country overall. The only first-year players ahead of him are Detroit Mercy's Antoine Davis (27.7 ppg), Lamine Diane (23.9 ppg) from Cal State Northridge, and RJ Barrett (23.4 ppg) and Zion Williamson (20.3 ppg) from Duke. Romo Langford (18.8 ppg) of Indiana is sixth in scoring for freshman.

He should be in the running for AAC Freshman of the Year and Pirate fans hope he will take home that award. The preseason AAC Freshman of the Year pick Nate Hinton, who plays for Houston, is averaging 7.5 points and 4.3 rebounds. As of now, Gardner not only leads all AAC rookies in scoring, but he paces the entire roster of players in the league early in conference action.

Gardner has been named the AAC Freshman of the Week three times and the Weekly Honor roll twice this season. He has also set an ECU and AAC record as the first freshman in ECU and American Athletic Conference history to post multiple 30-point games in a season.

ON THE HOP: GARDNER'S FREE THROW STYLE IS UNIQUE, EFFECTIVE

Jayden Gardner's free throw routine begins pretty basic. He dribbles a few times, mixed in with a couple of spins of the basketball.

Then he goes off script.

One dribble to the far right is followed by Gardner's body regrouping to the center, and he rises up to shoot as his feet leave the court upon the release of the ball and during his follow-through. The end of the routine in some ways resembles a youth recreational player not strong enough to shoot free throws without jumping, but instead it comes from a 6-foot-6, 245-pound freshman at East Carolina who has been one of the best players this season in the American Athletic Conference.

"It's just comfortable and I like to get a good arc on the ball," Gardner said of his slight hop. "It's never short. I like that if I miss it, then it is always possible to get an offensive rebound."

Gardner has done this since early in his standout career at Heritage High School.

It also works. He is 101-for-131 from the line as a rookie, ranking in the top 10 nationally in free throws made and attempted heading into today's game at UCF. Seth LeDay is second on the Pirates (8-7, 1-2) in free throw makes with a 42-for-60 mark.

"He could shoot it with one leg, but as long as it goes in then we don't care," ECU senior guard Isaac Fleming said of Gardner.

Heritage coach Tilden Brill said Gardner was the school's best player as soon as he stepped on campus for workouts as a rising freshman already 6-foot-3 and with a promising ability to score. But Gardner also initially struggled from the free throw line, which led to the change in his routine before his sophomore season.

Gardner and his coach worked after practices to figure out the best possible solution. Those sessions laid the foundation for Gardner to develop into a dependable free throw shooter via his unique style.

"I just remember him finishing short a lot on his free throw shot, because he was unbalanced," Brill said. "I think free throw shooting is really mental and it's really good to develop a routine. You can look at his routine now and see it is so much better than when he was at Heritage, even in this short amount of time."

The key to finding the best routine was that Gardner needed to use his height, strength and soft shooting touch to be able to drop the ball just over the front of the rim.

His feet leaving the ground also put an importance on where his feet landed after releasing the ball. Stepping over the foul line results in a lane violation and the point not counting, even if the ball goes through the hoop.

"You know in high school there is always that one referee every four games that was so pressed about that," Brill said. "He would get some violations and it was so frustrating, because he went to the line a lot. We tried to give him the freedom to do what works for him and not try to mess with it too much, because if you do, then you start to get into the whole mental aspect of it."

Transitioning to college basketball presented its own challenges, beginning with some ribbing from teammates when they first saw Gardner shoot free throws.

Fleming said he was probably 10 years old when he stopped jumping at the foul line.

ECU's players are now used to Gardner's hop, but opponents often are caught off guard when he goes to the line. It can be an easy target for trash-talk.

Gardner, however, can usually offer the perfect rebuttal with simply a smile or a glance over to an engaging opponent.

"Yeah, but I have to wait until I make it," he said.

LEDAY'S EYE STILL ON THE PRIZE AFTER LONG JOURNEY

By the time he was 21, Seth LeDay was in his fourth state on a basketball odyssey that included a stellar high school career in Dallas, two junior college stops and a redshirt year at Virginia Tech. He opted to leave Blacksburg for East Carolina, only to learn that the NCAA was making him sit out another year.

Last year at this time LeDay was frustrated, forced to resign himself to the NCAA decision that he and ECU had fought for months. For the second year in a row, he had to find ways to improve his game and his physical condition without the benefit of competition.

It seemed that things weren't going according to plan for LeDay. But then Joe Dooley accepted the head coaching job, and LeDay saw that even the rocky sections of his journey had led purposefully to this point.

Dooley had recruited LeDay in high school and junior college to play at Florida-Gulf Coast, and his chief recruiter when he went from Northwest Mississippi Community College to Virginia Tech had been Steve Roccaforte, who left Virginia Tech to join Dooley's staff last spring. Suddenly he was with two coaches he had known and respected for years with two years of eligibility remaining to help them rebuild the Pirates program.

"It's been great," he said. "I knew Coach Dooley before he got here, and then Coach Roc came here, I've known Coach Roc since I was 14 years old. Everything is amazing, I'm happy I'm playing here, I love my teammates, I love everything about it. The win we got the other day, it's just a big, big stepping stone."

That signature victory over Cincinnati, in which LeDay contributed 11 points and 6 rebounds, was proof positive that the program is already in a better place. LeDay said that defeating the defending American Athletic Conference champions has boosted the Pirates' confidence that they can compete with anyone in the league.

With that new attitude in tow on a road trip to Memphis, LeDay notched a double-double (14 points and 10 rebounds) even though ECU fell to the Tigers 78-72 after leading at halftime.

Looking back on his Dallas to Oklahoma to Mississippi to Virginia to East Carolina pilgrimage, LeDay is grateful for the coaches who challenged him — most notably Bubba Skelton at Northwest Mississippi.

It certainly isn't a roadmap he would have plotted out when he was a high school standout, but he sees that every new adjustment forced him to grow up a little more.

"It definitely made me mature at a young age, pretty fast," he said. "I think I'm pretty mature and became a young man, all the journeys I've been on and all the sacrifices I've had to go through just to be able to play. All the stops just helped me grow up and become a man."

LeDay has been an unmistakable presence on the Pirates' roster, adding athleticism to a roster that often needs to make up for a size disadvantage with scrappy, athletic play. Dooley knew LeDay was special when he started pursuing him years ago, a hunch that has only been reinforced as LeDay has resumed game play after two years on the sidelines.

"His athleticism is different," Dooley said. "He's a fast-twitch guy, he's able to do some things that some of our other guys can't do — second jumps, he can guard multiple positions, he can drive it from the perimeter. He gives us a lift."

To play the all-out, athletic style of ball that drove the Pirates past the Bearcats, players like LeDay risk foul trouble every outing. The balancing act, as the season goes on, will be in keeping their foot on the gas without losing top players in the process. Fouls will come, LeDay said, but the Pirates need to avoid unnecessary fouls as they sustain their intensity.

"Coach has really instilled that in us, to play really physical, really hard, just with a lot of energy, and just always going hard nonstop," he said. "So I think everything he's been teaching us every day, it's starting to click now. We've just got to become that team where we're just always going hard, just bringing it every possession."

MILESTONE WIN GIVES JOLT OF ENERGY TO DOOLEY ERA

Every great building project needs a solid foundation. Otherwise the structure on top won't last, no matter how architecturally sound it might be.

For the long-suffering East Carolina basketball program, the first few blocks of that foundation were put down in April when Joe Dooley was brought back as coach to continue the job he didn't get the chance to finish two decades ago.

The next layer went on shortly thereafter when Dooley convinced three-star signee Jayden Gardner

to stick with his commitment and play for the Pirates.

Saturday afternoon at Minges Coliseum, the most visible bricks to date were put into place when Dooley, Gardner and everyone else associated with ECU's increasingly rejuvenated program beat American Athletic Conference heavyweight Cincinnati 73-71 for their first signature win together.

It wasn't the kind of win that will turn heads or rattle any cages nationally and it certainly doesn't mean that the Pirates have arrived as a realistic postseason contender.

But every great building project has to start somewhere.

By beating who they did and how they did it, Dooley and his young team announced to the rest of AAC, the 4,238 fans in attendance and the students that have yet to return from their holiday break that the process of building ECU into a relevant basketball entity has officially begun.

"It's a new era. It's the Dooley era," Gardner said after responding to the most difficult challenge of his young career by recording his sixth double-double as a Pirate. "We practiced so hard, we worked so hard for this. So why not reward ourselves with wins?"

That's hardly a new concept. Every team in every sport believes it stands at least a chance of winning every time it takes the field or court. But whereas previous ECU basketball teams would often just hope for positive results, this new version showed Saturday that it has an actual belief in its ability to make good things happen.

"Last year, we would have never thought we would have come back and beat Cincinnati," said sophomore guard K.J. Davis.

He's right.

If the 9-0 deficit to start the game wouldn't have sunk previous editions of the Pirates, then the early second half surge that helped Cincinnati erase ECU's surprising 36-27 lead would have done the trick.

Not this time.

Instead of being satisfied with just playing well and holding its own against a quality opponent for 30-35 minutes as it has so often in the past, Dooley's team continued to battle and answered every challenge.

First it was Davis, who helped dig the Pirates out of their early hole by scoring 10 of his team-high 17 points immediately after coming off the bench. Then it was last year's AAC Rookie of the Year Shawn Williams, whose three second half 3-pointers prevented the Bearcats' comeback bid from gaining any traction.

In the end, it was deep reserve Justice Obasohan — on the floor only because both Gardner and Seth LeDay had fouled out — that made the most important play of all by blocking a last-second shot by Cincinnati's Jarron Cumberland as time expired to seal the victory.

"The big thing was the guys believed they could win," Dooley said. "When things weren't going necessarily right, we didn't cave in. There was a couple times we were on the ropes and guys sort of dug their heels in. I'm proud of them. It's a good win."

But it was only one win, a beginning rather than an end.

Although the Pirates have made positive strides in many areas, meaningful and permanent change isn't going to happen overnight. Dooley is a basketball coach, after all, not a miracle worker, especially with a program that has been in the doldrums as long as ECU's has.

At the same time, the signs of growth and promise are unmistakable Saturday.

The adjustments Dooley made to negate the Bearcats' decided size advantage inside played a major role in the upset victory, as did the rigorous conditioning program he and his staff put their players through upon their arrival this summer. The Pirates were clearly the fresher team both physically and mentally down the stretch against the defending conference champions.

Star freshman Gardner also showed personal growth by bouncing back from a scoreless first half to go 7 of 10 from the free throw line in the second on his way to a 13-point, 12-round performance. In the process, he served notice that he can be a difference maker no matter who he's matched up against — even against a bigger, more experienced opponent.

"If I didn't think we could win, I wouldn't be here," Dooley said. "We have some things we've got to work on, but we also have an opportunity to play in a high level league and we've got a guy to build around."

In order to take the next step as a program and continue to grow, the young Pirates must now learn to consistently play at a high level and learn to win on the road. Dooley must also do his part by bolstering the roster with even more high caliber, high character players.

There are still some bricks that need to be put into place before the ECU's basketball foundation is strong enough for a winning structure to be built upon it.

But at least finally, the process has officially begun.

PIRATES PULL UPSET, CELEBRATE IN MINGES

A growing trend in celebrations after big college basketball wins is for players from the winning team to wait on their coach in the locker room and spray him with water upon arrival.

After East Carolina held on to upset Cincinnati, 73-71, on Saturday in Minges Coliseum, first-year

Pirate coach Joe Dooley was prepared for what he might face.

"They weren't smart enough to realize that I had water in my hand and I got about half of them, too" said Dooley, who has experienced plenty of nationally significant victories at previous coaching gigs including at Kansas and Florida Gulf Coast. "They need to work on that."

ECU's players were plenty good enough the rest of the afternoon.

The upset over the Bearcats (12-3, 1-1 American Athletic Conference), a team receiving Top 25 votes that was playing only its third road game and went 1-2 in those contests, was led by the difference in 3-point shooting.

ECU (8-6, 1-1) was 9-of-22 from the 3-point arc. Shawn Williams (16 points) was 4-for-10 and K.J. Davis 3-for-5 en route to a career-high 17 points.

Cincy was 3-for-19 from beyond the arc, missing its first 11 attempts.

The visitors' final lead was 54-53 with 8:17 left to play. Davis hit a 3 on the ensuing ECU possession and the Pirates led by as many as eight points during the final 5 minutes.

Cincinnati rallied during the final 20 seconds and trailed 73-71 when Jarron Cumberland's final drive was halted with a block by Pirate walk-on Justice Obasohan.

"Anything could have happened, so I wasn't completely ready to congratulate and celebrate and everything until those six seconds were over," said Davis, who also was defending around the rim at the buzzer after Obasohan's clutch block.

Saturday's result, which will be viewed by a lot of people with surprise, also came after the Pirates began AAC play Wednesday with an 82-54 loss at SMU. ECU's 73 points were the most allowed by the Bearcats this season.

"I thought the team that deserved to win won today," said Bearcats coach Mick Cronin, who is in his 13th season at Cincinnati. "We lost the game because of our arrogance and when you are arrogant, you don't listen to the game plan and you don't follow the defensive scouting report. Our defense was terrible."

"We also had 15 turnovers and winning on the road requires toughness, because you are going to get everyone's best shot."

Cincinnati started the game on a 9-0 run, but ECU's hot shooting guided the Pirates' surge and the hosts led 36-27 at halftime. Their largest lead was 11 points — 36-25 — after a Davis layup at the 0:11 mark of the opening half.

Gardner had 10 rebounds before halftime and finished the game with 13 points, all in the second half, and 12 boards. Seth LeDay scored 11 and had six rebounds.

LeDay and Gardner both fouled out, including Gardner after he had made 1-of-2 free throws to give the Pirates a 73-69 lead with 13 seconds remaining.

This was ECU's second win ever against the Bearcats, who still hold a 12-2 lead in the all-time series. Their lone meeting a season ago was an 86-60 win by Cincinnati.

"This one was big," said Gardner, who already has six double-doubles as a freshman. "This is a new era. It's the Dooley era."

The Bearcats were 0-for-10 on 3-pointers during the first half. The Pirates were 5-of-11.

With many ECU students not back to campus from winter break, the announced attendance still was 4,238.

"The place was rocking," Gardner said.

EMBRACING THE PRESENT AND FUTURE

Within moments of beginning a conversation with Justice Obasohan, it becomes obvious that he's different than the typical college basketball player.

Sure, he has a polished basketball pedigree. After all, that's a large part of what earned him a spot on the ECU men's team. And at a chiseled 6-foot-5, 220 pounds, with very little body fat, he looks the part as well. But Obasohan carries himself with purpose and listens intently to each question asked, then clearly gives them thought before answering.

Without the knowledge that he has earned a 3.76 grade-point average and is on schedule to graduate in May with a degree in public health studies with an eye toward medical school, it wouldn't be hard to guess that he's a serious student. In fact, he was on the American Athletic Conference All-Academic Team each of the last three seasons.

For that, Obasohan can thank his parents, Austin and Uyiosa. His father, who grew up in a small village in Nigeria before attaining a bachelor's degree from a university in England and then coming to the United States to earn a doctorate from Appalachian State and specialist and master's degrees from Virginia State, is the superintendent of Duplin County Schools. His mother is an assistant teacher in Duplin County.

There's a common theme running through the Obasohan household, which also includes younger sister, Modesty, and younger brother, Trust.

"My parents, both of them, always emphasized education and doing right in the classroom," Obasohan said. "That's what I carry with me today. I'm always strict on getting my schoolwork done first, even before athletics. I just make sure I have that right before I do anything else."

That hard work also extends to basketball. Obasohan did not come to ECU as a scholarship player after graduating high school in 2015. Instead, he came as a walk-on and earned a scholarship beginning last spring semester.

He received plenty of attention from recruiters during his junior and senior seasons at North Carolina School for Science and Mathematics in Durham. After playing his first two seasons back home in Duplin County at Wallace-Rose Hill, Obasohan was accepted into the rigorous academic program at NCSSM.

On the court, he averaged 17.3 points and 11.9 rebounds per game during his two seasons at NCSSM, including 18.2 points and 14.2 rebounds as a senior. In a 79-65 win over Louisburg during his senior year, he totaled 33 points, 26 rebounds, five blocks and four assists.

He drew interest from Howard, Guilford, UNC Pembroke and Elizabeth City State, among others, but chose to accept a spot as a walk-on at ECU.

"I came here because the pieces of the puzzle just fit together perfectly in terms of the school, academics, athletics, being able to play basketball," Obasohan said. "It was the right fit. I had to eliminate a lot of places because they didn't fit all the criteria for me, to be honest."

Though his playing time has been limited the past three seasons — he's seen action in 16 games so far, with career-highs of 22 minutes and 9 points in a home game against Wichita State last season — Obasohan has relished his time with the Pirates. Earning the scholarship last spring only made it better.

"Basketball-wise at ECU, it's been great," he said. "I'm happy to be here and happy to put that Pirate logo on my chest. I just came in with the mindset from day one that I'm going to work. I think that's what I've done. They just told me that they were going to give me a spot and that I'd be expected to work hard, and that's what I expect of myself anyway."

"When they brought me to the side after practice and explained the situation and told me I was on scholarship last year, I was grateful. It was a blessing."

Looking toward his future, it also doesn't hurt that ECU has a well-respected medical school. After injuring his left knee as a freshman in high school, Obasohan had surgery to repair the damage, and that set in motion his goal to become an orthopedic surgeon.

"I thought it was over for me playing basketball, but the way that doctor fixed me up, it's almost like I came back better than I was before," he said. "I want to provide that same turnaround and that same rejuvenation to help peoples' lives. I want to go to medical school and become a surgeon, hopefully an orthopedic surgeon, but I'm open to other options."

Obasohan plans to take a gap year, during which time he plans to polish his medical school application a little and take the Medical College Admission Test again and maybe gain some experience in the medical field.

OLDER AND WISER, JOE DOOLEY IS BACK FOR A SECOND ACT AT EAST CAROLINA, BENT ON REVIVING A STRUGGLING PROGRAM

Joe Dooley is getting a mulligan. His return to East Carolina 23 years after the school made him the nation's youngest head coach in the country is in some ways a chance to rewrite his own history, a chance to take the knowledge he has since gained back to correct the mistakes and naivety of a first-time coach.

Dooley was an assistant at Kansas when the Jayhawks won the national title in 2008. He spent the past five years as the coach at Florida Gulf Coast, where he won 114 games and never fewer than 21 in a season while making two NCAA Tournament appearances. Now 52, he believes he's both smarter and wiser. But East Carolina?

The Pirates haven't made the NCAA Tournament since 1993, and over the past 21 years they have had just two winning seasons. The NCAA drought is the longest of the 17 North Carolina schools that compete in Division I. Even N.C. Central, which didn't become a full-fledged Division I member until 2012, has earned a bid to three of the past five tournaments. (Elon, High Point, Gardner-Webb and Campbell have never made an appearance, but they only began playing in D-I between 1999 and 2002.)

"I like challenges," Dooley says. "I think there's a ton of potential. Now it's our time to fulfill the potential."

Coaches come and go at ECU, but not in a stepping-stone sort of way. The job has mostly offered up a long plank for coaches whose careers are winding down. Its location in the basketball-friendly state of North Carolina hasn't helped. East Carolina is one of the toughest jobs in all of Division I, a job that only got tougher when the school moved to the American Athletic Conference in 2014.

"It's like going from fishing in a little boat in a pond to out in the ocean," says Jeff Lebo, who stepped down last December as the winningest coach in program history (albeit with a losing record) since it moved to Division I in 1965. "You look up and the boats out there have all the big crew and all the equipment. Sometimes you still have some of the stuff you had from the pond. You're fishing hard, but sometime it doesn't always work."

Take, for example, this comparison to a fellow AAC member. Memphis spent more than \$3 million in operating expenses for men's basketball during the 2016-17 fiscal year, according to the school's most recent Equity in Athletics Disclosure Act (EADA) submission. That broke down to \$233,313 per partici-

pant, which led all schools in the American. Operating expenses can include things such as equipment, pre- and postgame meals, uniforms and travel. East Carolina spent \$55,320 per player, which ranked ahead of only Tulsa, Tulane and South Florida in the 12-member American.

ECU is slowly investing more in its basketball. Dooley's salary for next season is \$900,000 – a \$400,000 base and an additional \$500,000 from a combination of Pirate Club obligations and a broadcast package.

That's still on the low end in the American, but it was enough to lure Dooley, who was making \$350,000 at Florida Gulf Coast.

"We're able to do things we hadn't been able to do in the past," Dooley says. "Are we where we need to get yet? No. It's going to be a process, but I think we're getting moving in the right direction pretty quickly."

East Carolina didn't built much in the way of history or tradition in the two decades Dooley was away — that is, unless sub-.500 records and postseason absences qualifies as tradition. Four coaches have come and gone since he was fired after going 57–52 in four seasons. The latest was Lebo, who was in his eighth season when he abruptly resigned six games into last season. Dooley's parents still reside in Greenville, and in many ways returning to ECU is akin to moving back into the family residence and sleeping in the same, twin-sized bed from your childhood days. But the thing is, Dooley knows exactly where he's resting his head, and that in itself he sees as an advantage.

"People will tell you you're crazy for taking over any job in this business," Dooley says. "I think it's fair that people wonder why. There are times you take a job and you don't understand – it takes you a year or two to understand — the dynamics of the job or what the culture of the school is. I have a pretty good understanding of what this university is and what the community here is about."

The perception has long been East Carolina doesn't care about basketball, that the community is all about its barbecue and beach outings. Kareem Richardson was a starting guard on the Pirates' last tournament squad, on which Dooley served as an assistant coach. Richardson, now the coach at Missouri-Kansas City, says the Pirates' biggest obstacle was playing in the shadow of the football program.

"Even as a player, you knew it was a football school," Richardson says. "I think it's always been like that. That was the reason they changed leagues in the first place. Football left before basketball, and obviously everybody had to join on with what football was doing."

In 1997, ECU had a football-only membership with Conference USA, and four years later the school's other sports programs left the Colonial Athletic Association and began competing in the league. Mike Hamrick, then the athletic director, didn't hire Dooley, and he saw an opportunity to name his own coach to usher the Pirates' entrance into a more competitive conference. In the CAA, ECU faced programs that had comparable budgets and histories. In the 2001 version of Conference USA, the Pirates simply couldn't compete against programs with rich and deep basketball traditions, including Louisville, Memphis, Cincinnati, Marquette, Houston and Charlotte.

"That's when the job became not a great one, quite frankly," says ESPN analyst Fran Fraschilla, who interviewed with East Carolina after Dooley's firing. Fraschilla instead took the New Mexico job, and Dooley followed him to Albuquerque, serving as an assistant coach from 1999-2002. "I have no doubt that he's a lot more prepared to go back to East Carolina than the guy who was handed the job back in '95," adds Fraschilla.

Perhaps because he had been an assistant on the staff the previous four seasons, that 29-year-old guy didn't fully understand the challenges that awaited him. Yet Dooley saw no reason why he couldn't build off the program's mild success. He went 17-11 and 17-10 in his first two years, giving the Pirates three consecutive winning seasons for the first time since the late 1960s. However, doomed by injuries and an over-reliance on younger players, ECU had a losing record in each of the next two seasons, and Dooley was shown the door.

"One of the biggest mistakes, we got young last time I was here," he says. "I think the key is getting old and staying old."

They were supposed to grow old together. Plenty of boosters thought Dooley never should have been fired.

He was still so respected that Terry Holland, who served as ECU's athletic director from 2004-13, tried to hire him in 2010. Holland says Dooley, who was then an assistant at Kansas, was still a popular figure and "a lot of the people were on his side."

Holland, the owner of two Final Four rings when he coached at Virginia and a member of the USA Basketball committee that selected the 1992 Dream Team, threw his bona fide basketball credentials into making East Carolina basketball successful.

It wasn't easy. Holland oversaw three coaching changes, from Bill Herrion (one season) to Ricky Stokes (two seasons) to Mack McCarthy (three seasons) to Lebo.

"Old basketball coaches always think they can fix things," Holland says. "So I thought this is not going to be easy, but I thought we'd be able to make a lot of progress even in a short time period."

Even with a "basketball guy" running the athletic department, football was still king. Holland spent his first few years trying to get the football program out of what he called a "disastrous situation" — three straight losing seasons that included winning a combined three wins in 2003 and 2004. Holland's first major hire was to lure Skip Holtz to coach football. In doing so, he also committed to minor upgrades for the program. That puts the needs of the basketball program on hold.

"We ended up spending a good amount of money on football just for the basics," Holland says. "A new practice field, an artificial turf field — it was not terribly expensive, but for us it was an expenditure that we had to be careful about making sure we did the right thing with it."

And the right thing at the time was making sure the football program got turned around. Doing right by basketball would entail much more. Holland raised \$17 million in private donations for a basketball practice facility. It didn't open until 2013, which compared to other programs in the state and the conference was woefully late. It couldn't have come a moment too soon for the Pirates.

When he arrived in 2010, Lebo says his team had to share the court at Minges Coliseum with women's basketball, volleyball, physical education classes and intramurals. It made for some strange scheduling of practice times, and on occasion the Pirates were relegated to holding practice at an apartment complex that had a full-sized gym.

Dooley remembers those days vividly. During his first stint as coach, practice time fit square into a 2-4 p.m. slot. At 4:01 p.m., he says, "they started putting up the volleyball nets for intramurals."

Now he's downright giddy as he takes a visitor on a tour of the Smith-Williams Center, where the practice facility is housed. His office has a window and a deck that overlook the practice court. He weaves from there through a conference room with leather chairs and the school logo head stitched into the backrests. The weight room, the dining area for pregame meals, the academic center — they are all a short walk from the basketball offices. Recruiting will be a whole lot easier.

"Joe's one of those guys who can recruit to any school in the country," Fraschilla says. "If you put Joe in Alaska, he could get players. He's got a good personality and is relentless. He lives to recruit."

Dooley's tenure with Fraschilla marked the first time he had coached west of the Mississippi, and it helped him develop more of a national profile that was only enhanced when he went to Kansas. And now that he's recruiting players to one of the high-major conferences, he believes that's more than enough to make inroads in places he hadn't been previously.

"You've got a multiple-bid league, which we didn't have," Dooley says. "You've got a practice facility, which we didn't have. I don't know many places that have a better weight and strength and conditioning center than we do. So you start those types of deals, that all helps right from the get-go."

The move to the American did bring a new set of challenges in recruiting. While the increased visibility that comes with having more games televised has been a boon, the number of schools invading North Carolina for talent has also increased. Lebo notes that ACC expansion cut into the Pirates' opportunity to land the high-level players who weren't being recruited by North Carolina, Duke, Wake Forest or N.C. State. Before expansion, players such as Jerome Robinson and Ky Bowman probably never would have escaped the state.

Instead, Boston College signed the pair in consecutive classes. Robinson led the ACC in scoring in league games last season, averaging 24.3 points. Bowman was sixth with a 17.7 average.

"Those were the kind of guys you needed to get to compete in this league," Lebo says. "It became more difficult to get the quality kid that you needed to compete at this much higher level for us."

Although he plans to recruit the state first, Dooley also sees an opportunity to go outside the borders and recruit the I-95 corridor in the Northeast. That's one of the reasons why he hired Raphael Chhillous as his associate head coach. Chhillous, a Maryland native, was instrumental in recruiting Markelle Fultz, the first pick in the 2017 NBA Draft, to Washington. Chhillous also coached at Villanova and last season was an assistant at Connecticut.

Wake Forest coach Danny Manning, for one, believes Dooley can be successful at ECU. Manning credits Dooley with helping him learn the nuances of coaching when both started on the staff at Kansas in 2003.

Manning says Dooley would talk a lot about the responsibilities of managing things off the court. "His vision is extremely impressive, being able to map out the plan for his team, for his players, for his program," Manning says. "He's always been very forward-thinking in that regard."

Dooley kept two of Lebo's signees from November: forward Jayden Gardner from Wake Forest, N.C., and center Rico Quinnton from Newbern, Tenn. DeShaun Wade, a 6-foot-2 guard from Charlottesville, Va., asked for his release. Dooley granted the request, but he scored his first recruiting coup when Wade recommitted to ECU.

Florida Gulf Coast may have posed more of a recruiting challenge than even East Carolina. Dooley relied heavily on the transfer market; four of the top six scorers on last season's 23-win team were transfers. He'd like to build things a little differently now, with transfers being more of a complement to the roster.

Dooley was never going to match the popularity of Andy Enfield at Florida Gulf Coast. In 2013, Enfield became the first coach to lead a 15-seed to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, then left for the USC job. His wildly entertaining brand of play, which earned the moniker "Dunk City," was a tough act to follow.

Dooley's style of play wasn't as wide open, and he emphasized playing sound defensively. He isn't as charismatic as Enfield either, which is why even as he was twice named the Atlantic Sun Coach of the Year, some FGCU boosters never quite warmed to him. That Dooley's name was frequently mentioned for job openings —including after his first season when Tulsa and Boston College reportedly were interested— only added to the disconnect. Those feelings didn't change as Dooley interviewed at Wright State and Saint Louis in 2016, and at New Mexico and UNC-Wilmington last year.

ECU, however, is welcoming Dooley back as one of its own. He's built a cache of goodwill in the

community dating to his first run in Greenville. Now he's thinking of other ways to build. He plans to be a regular around campus for lunch, openly recruiting students to attend games. But he knows it'll take more than just lunchtime conversations to win over fans.

"I'm not opposed to opening up a practice," Dooley says. "I do think with our students we have to get them active. You need a home-court advantage."

East Carolina doesn't have many advantages. But as Dooley begins his second go-round in Greenville, he'll take any little edge he can find.

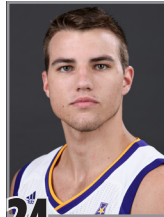

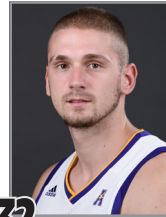
