PIRATES SET TO TRAVEL TO DAYTONA BEACH TO COMPETE IN BOARDWALK BATTLE

► East Carolina will leave the friendly confines of Mingos Coliseum for the first time this season as the Pirates gear up for the inaugural Boardwalk Battle at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, Florida. The Pirates will play three games in the span of three days starting with Jacksonville State on Thursday, Nov. 21 at 3:30 p.m. The game will be streamed via BallerTV with each contest of the tournament costing \$5 to stream. All of ECU's games can also be heard on 107.9 WNCT and 94.3 The Game with Daron Vaught on the call.

► After losing nine players in the offseason, the Pirates have added experienced, veteran talent through the portal in C.J. Walker, Jordan Riley, Julien Soumaoro and Yann Farell as well as JUCO transfers Jayshayne Woodard and Trevion LaBeaux. The quartet of Walker, Riley, Soumaoro and Farell have combined for 215 starts and 7,710 minutes played in their collegiate careers. ECU also brings in three freshmen in Ladontae Felton, Tybo Bailey and Reid Cason to round out its roster.

► The Pirates are led in scoring by All-Conference senior guard RJ Felton's 23.3 points per game (3rd in AAC, 1-20th in NCAA) and 8.8 rebounds per game. C.J. Walker (16.3 ppg, 9.3 rpg), Jordan Riley (14.5 ppg, 7.3 rpg) and Cam Hayes (10.3 ppg, 4.3 apg) round out the Pirates' double-figure scorers.

► ECU (4-0) is off to its best four-game start since the 2020-21 season after its thrilling double overtime victory over George Mason last Saturday. The Pirates are aiming to improve to 5-0 for the first time since that 2020-21 season. The best start to a season in program history is 7-0, accomplished by both the 1953-54 and 2002-03 teams.

► East Carolina compiled a 15-18 overall record in 2023-24 including a 7-11 mark in American Athletic Conference play. The seven league wins for the Pirates were the most in the American for the program since joining the conference prior to the 2014-15 season.

► TEAM NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

► RJ Felton scored a game-high 27 points and grabbed eight rebounds as East Carolina gutted and grinded out a 78-77 double overtime win over George Mason on Saturday afternoon inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum.

► Jordan Riley (15 points, 10 rebounds) and C.J. Walker (12 points, 12 rebounds) each recorded double-doubles for the Pirates (4-0), who are off to their best start to a season since 2020-21. Jayshayne Woodard added 11 points in his first start of the season and Cam Hayes continued his strong play at the point with 10 points, five assists and only one turnover.

QUICK POINTS

► The last time ECU won a double-overtime game prior to Saturday was on Jan. 25, 2003 when the Pirates outlasted South Florida, 68-62 at home.

► RJ Felton is now 10th all-time in career points in program history with 1,247, passing Brock Young who has 1,232 points in four seasons at ECU.

► Felton scored in double figures for his 29th consecutive game dating back to last season.

► Jayshayne Woodard added five steals to his 11-point, seven rebound performance.

► The Pirates' 14 steals in a game on Saturday and 19 forced turnovers against George Mason are tied for the most in a game in the Schwartz era.

► Cam Hayes has recorded 17 assists to just two turnovers in four games.

RETURN OF RJ

► In the midst of their nine player departures and nine roster additions, the biggest news of the offseason for the Pirates was all-conference senior guard RJ Felton announcing on social media that he is a 'Pirate for life' and was returning for his senior season.

► Felton has been a model of consistency and hard work over his ECU career as the Aiken, S.C. native enjoyed a career-high last season in multiple statistical categories including points per game (17.3) and rebounds (6.0). Felton became the 34th player in program history to record 1,000-career points as a Pirate and was the first Pirate since Theodore "Blue" Edwards to record back-to-back 30-point games in a season.

► Felton has continued to build off of last year's success, averaging 23.3 points and 8.8 rebounds in ECU's first four games. He recorded his sixth career double-double against Mount Olive on Tuesday and rose up the leaderboard in career points at ECU with 1,247 (10th all-time) and was named the AAC Player of the Week.

WALKER'S HOT START TO THE SEASON

► One of the Pirates' main offseason acquisitions was graduate forward C.J. Walker. Entering his sixth and final collegiate season, Walker provides strong leadership and experience in a young Pirate frontcourt.

► The Sanford, Fla. native wasted little time in making his presence felt in the season-opener on in his Pirate debut, scoring ECU's first six points and recording 16 of his 21 points in the first half of the Pirates' blowout victory.

► Walker also snared a game-high 12 rebounds for his fourth career double-double and finished just two points shy of tying Jonathan Moore (11/14/01) for the most points scored in a Pirate debut since 1986.

► Walker scored a career-high 24 points on Tuesday night on an efficient 11-of-16 shooting from the floor, including a couple of impressive dunks. He recorded his second double-double of the season on Saturday with 12 points and 12 rebounds.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

► East Carolina is slated to play 18 contests inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum during the 2024-25 with nine games coming during league play. The Pirates played 20 home games last season including the three games of the TowneBank Holiday Classic. ECU is also just two wins away from 500 wins as a program inside Minges Coliseum.

► Playing at home for the majority of its regular season games has benefitted the Pirates in the past as the team has posted a record of .500 or better on its home floor in seven of the last eight seasons. This season's team will hope to put that home-court advantage to good use as the Pirates' first four games of the season are at home.

11TH SEASON IN THE AMERICAN

► East Carolina enters its 11th men's basketball season as a member of the American Athletic Conference after previously spending 13 years as part of Conference USA. The Pirates eclipsed their previous program-high AAC win total of six with their seventh, beating Tulane on Feb. 18. ECU had previous tallied six league wins in four seasons, including back-to-back in the past two seasons (2021-22, 2022-23).

BONDING IN THE BAHAMAS

► Over the summer, the Pirates were able to take a summer foreign tour to the Atlantis Resort in the Bahamas from July 29-August 2. The trip provided the players and staff with a once-in-a-lifetime experience and helped strengthen the group's chemistry in the offseason.

► In addition to playing two scrimmages, the team took part in team-bonding activities like swimming with dolphins, team dinners and volleyball on the beach.

NEW SEASON, NEW FACES

► The Pirates reloaded and retooled their roster over the summer with nine additions comprised of four Division I transfers, two JUCO transfers and three freshmen. The four Division I transfers are C.J. Walker (UCF), Julien Soumaoro (Gardner-Webb), Jordan Riley (Temple) and Yann Farell (St. Bonaventure). Jayshayne Woodard (Indian River State CO) and Irevion LaBeaux (Indian Hills CO) arrive in Greenville via the JUCO route and Ladontae Felton (South Aiken), Tybo Bailey (Winston-Salem Christian) and Reid Cason (Kingston) are entering their first season of collegiate basketball.

► Walker joins the Pirates for his sixth and final collegiate season after spending his previous four seasons at UCF where he averaged 7.8 points and 4.7 rebounds per contest in 19 games played last year and averaged 9.4 points over his final eight games played.

In 2021-22, Walker averaged career-highs in points per game (8.3), rebounds per game (5.7), field goal percentage (47.9) and three-point percentage (37.1). He posted single-game career marks with 19 points against Tulsa and 12 rebounds at Temple. During his sophomore campaign, Walker led The American with 1.7 blocks per game, which ranked 47th in the nation and his 1.6 offensive rebounds per game were 14th best among AAC players. Walker played his freshman season at Oregon in 2019-20.

► Soumaoro averaged career-highs in points per game (12.7), assists per game (2.6) and field goal percentage (40.3) last season with the Runnin' Bulldogs and started in 29 of his 31 games played. He scored in double figures in 21 games highlighted by a career-high 27 points on 10-of-13 shooting from the floor including 5-of-8 from behind the arc in Gardner-Webb's win over Weber State.

► Riley arrives in Greenville after appearing in 33 games at Temple where he averaged 11.9 points and six rebounds per game, highlighted by a career-high 23 points at Tulane. He also recorded four double-doubles on the season including back-to-back double-doubles in the AAC Tournament and was a Big 5 Honorable Mention. Riley also excelled in the classroom, earning Academic All-District Honors from College Sports Communicators.

► Farell started in 32 of his 33 games played as a sophomore, averaging 7.4 points per game and 5.5 rebounds per game. His best offensive game of the year came against Fordham as he scored a career-high 23 points on 8-of-9 shooting, including a 7-of-7 mark from behind the arc and he scored in double figures in three of his last five games of the season. He was named All-A-10 as a freshman in 2022-23.

► Woodard comes to Greenville after competing at Indian River State College in Florida where he was tabbed the FCSAA/Region Eight Player of the Year in both of his seasons with the Pioneers and was named the FCSAA/Region Eight Player of the Week seven times. Woodard averaged 15.5 points per game and 10.5 rebounds last season at Indian River State on 51.4 percent shooting from the floor and 36.3 percent from the three-point line. He also added 6.8 assists per contest and started in all 31 games played in 2023-24.

► LaBeaux arrives in Greenville after competing at Indian Hills Community College where he averaged 13.3 points and 9.5 rebounds per game last season to earn first team NJCAA All-American Honors while being tabbed the Iowa Community College Athletic Conference (IACCAC) Player of the Year. The IACCAC's leading scorer and rebounder also shot over 50 percent from the floor for the second consecutive season while posting personal bests in three-point shooting percentage (34.9) and free throw shooting percentage (73.2).

AIR JORDAN (RILEY)

► One of the most impressive moments from the Pirates' 37-point victory over Mount Olive on Tuesday took place with eight minutes to go in the first half with ECU holding just a 33-21 lead.

► RJ Felton broke the Trojans' full-court press with a pass ahead to Cam Hayes, who then advanced the ball past halfcourt to Jordan Riley. Riley took advantage of the open lane to the basket and threw down an authoritative tomahawk slam over a Mount Olive defender.

► Riley arrived at ECU being known for his elite athleticism and the Pirates have seen it first hand when Riley was at Temple last season. Riley's dunk on Tuesday ended up being the No. 1 play on SportsCenter's Top 10 on Tuesday night.

ON THIS DATE

► The Pirates are 5-3 in games on Nov. 21 with the last game on this date coming just last year when ECU defeated Kennesaw State on a last-second heave to beat the buzzer on the final day of the TowneBank Holiday Classic.

SERIES HISTORY

► The all-time series between the Pirates and Gamecocks is tied at 2-2 as Thursday's meeting will be the first time since Dec. 18, 1999 that both schools have played one another. The Pirates dropped that contest in Greenville, 69-53. ECU won the first two meetings of the series but Jacksonville State has taken the last two games. Thursday will be the first neutral site meeting of the series.

SCOUTING THE GAMECOCKS

► Jacksonville State is coming off a 71-53 win on the road against Coastal Carolina last Saturday behind a career-high 31 points from Jaron Pierre Jr. Pierre Jr. earned Conference USA Player of the Week honors and leads the Gamecocks in scoring 25.8 points per game. Jamar Franklin (11.3 ppg), Michael Houge (11.0 ppg) and Mason Nicholson (10.3 ppg) provide supplementary scoring and Jacksonville State boasts a stout defense, only allowing 60.3 points per game.

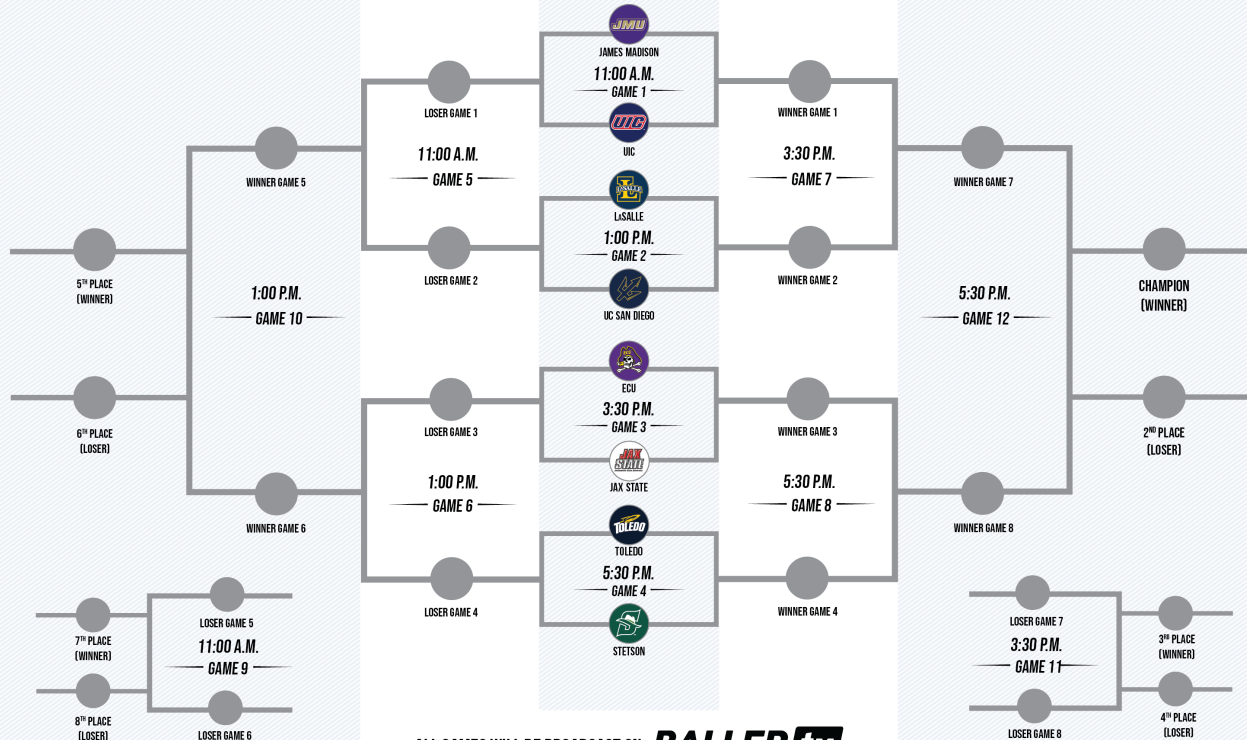

THE AMERICAN

The American Athletic Conference, which has established itself as a preeminent NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision conference, is poised to continue its remarkable ascension to national prominence under the leadership of Commissioner Tim Perneti, who began his tenure in May of 2024.

The American consists of 15 prestigious institutions: the University of Alabama at Birmingham, the United States Military Academy (in football only), the University of North Carolina Charlotte, East Carolina University, Florida Atlantic University, the University of Memphis, the United States Naval Academy (in football only), the University of North Texas, Rice University, the University of South Florida, Temple University, the University of Texas at San Antonio, Tulane University, the University of Tulsa, and Wichita State University (in basketball and Olympic sports).



The American has fashioned an impressive list of accomplishments in the competitive arena, in the classroom and in support of student-athlete welfare. The American stands as one of the elite Division I conference thanks to its collection of national team and individual championships, its football and basketball postseason victories, its expansive media rights contract with ESPN, and its commitment to providing the highest levels of support for student-athletes.

With the addition of Army to the conference ranks in 2024, The American has an institutional presence in five of the top 10, eight of the top 25 and 13 of the top 51 Nielsen media markets.

The league has produced four NCAA championship teams in addition to a College Football Playoff semifinalist, four New Year's Six bowl champions, two NCAA Men's Final Four participants, six Women's Final Four teams, an NIT champion, 15 NCAA individual championships, and a Rhodes Scholar. Additionally, American Athletic Conference teams have advanced to the College World Series, qualified for the match play round of the NCAA Men's Golf Championship and registered multiple top-10 finishes at the NCAA Cross Country and Outdoor Track and Field championships.

The American has seen a member school claim a spot in a New Year's Six bowl eight times in the league's first 11 football seasons, including the 2022 campaign, when Tulane capped the biggest one-year turnaround in major college football history with a thrilling win against USC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic.

Individual teams in The American have enjoyed some of their best football seasons in program history as members of the conference. Tulane went 12-2 and earned a top-10 final ranking in 2022. Navy won a program-record 11 games in 2015, its first season in the conference, and matched that mark with its 2019 campaign. Memphis, which had not won 10 games in a season since 1938, has registered three 10-win seasons in the last nine years (2015, 2017, 2019), including a school-record 12 wins in 2019. Temple enjoyed its first 10-win season in school history in 2015. South Florida finished in the top 25 for the first two times in program history (2016, 2017). Tulsa returned to the top 25 for the first time in 11 years in 2020. East Carolina earned a top-20 ranking in 2014.

Since the conference's reconstitution in 2013-14, teams from The American have registered top-10 national rankings in football, men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, men's soccer, women's soccer, women's lacrosse, men's golf, women's rowing, men's tennis, women's tennis, men's cross country, men's track and field, and women's track and field.

American Athletic Conference student-athletes have distinguished themselves in all facets of intercollegiate athletics. Memphis quarterback Brady White was the 2020 winner of the National Football Foundation's James V. Campbell Trophy as the top scholar-athlete in college football. Temple linebacker Tyler Matakovich won the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player in 2015, while Tulsa linebacker Zaven Collins repeated that feat in 2020. The American has had four top-10 Heisman Trophy finishes including Navy quarterback Keenan Reynolds, who was fifth in 2015. Reynolds was also selected as the winner of the 2016 AAU James E. Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete.

Additionally, South Florida star Georgina Corrick was the Division I softball Academic All-America of the Year in 2022, while Tulsa cross country standout Kirk Smith was chosen as a Rhodes Scholar in the fall of 2016.

American Athletic Conference alumni have made their mark in professional and international sports as well. A number of American Athletic Conference athletes have been selected in the first round of the professional entry drafts in football, basketball, baseball and soccer, including former Memphis center James Wiseman, who was the No. 2 pick in the 2020 NBA Draft, and former Wichita State third-baseman Alec Bohm, the No. 3 selection in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft. Former Memphis tennis player Joe Salisbury, a 2014 all-conference selection, has gone on to win five Grand Slam championships in men's doubles and mixed doubles. Former Tulane standout Dominik Koepfer has earned a top-50 world ranking in men's tennis and reached the fourth round of the US Open in 2019.

The American announced a lucrative and comprehensive media rights extension with ESPN in May of 2019, providing the conference with a stronger and more extensive presence on ESPN's primary television networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPN+). Since the extension took effect in the 2020-21 academic year, a minimum of 40 regular-season football telecasts and 60 regular-season men's basketball games per season will appear on those primary networks. Nearly every conference-controlled game in all sports will appear either on an ESPN network or on ESPN+.

The first nine American Athletic Conference Football Championships were televised by ABC as part of Championship Weekend. Subsequent championship games will appear on either ABC or ESPN through the duration of the 12-year extension, including the 2024 game, which will air in Friday prime time on ABC.

Away from the competitive arena, The American has established itself as a leader in the area of student-athlete wellness, both through the adoption of NCAA autonomous legislation on matters including full cost of attendance and nutrition. The American's Academic Symposium annually features scholars and students engaged in collaborative research related to student-athlete well-being. The conference, in conjunction with its Student-Athlete Advisory Committee has also launched the Powerful Minds campaign to improve awareness and education on mental health issues and recognize the scholarly achievements of the conference's student-athletes.

**> HEAD COACH MICHAEL SCHWARTZ (TEXAS '99, THIRD SEASON)**

Michael Schwartz enters his third season as head coach of the East Carolina men's basketball program after being appointed the 24th head coach in program history on March 16, 2022.

Schwartz led the Pirates to their most wins in conference play as a member of the American Athletic Conference with seven league victories in his second season and the Pirates won three consecutive AAC contests for the first time since joining the league. ECU also recorded a win the AAC Men's Basketball Championship in consecutive seasons for the first time with the Pirates' 84-79 win over Tulsa in the second round. RJ Felton was named to the AAC All-Conference Third Team and NABC All-District 24 Second Team after enjoying a career year in multiple statistical categories including his 17.3 points per game and six rebounds per contest. Under Schwartz's tutelage, Felton also became the first

Pirate to record back-to-back 30 point games since Blue Edwards in 1989 and he became the 34th player in program history to record 1,000 career points. The Pirates finished the campaign top five in scoring defense in the American, allowing 70.3 points per game, were one of the league's best ball clubs in recording steals, tallying the third-most in the conference at 7.8 per game and finished fourth in turnover margin.

In Schwartz's first season at the helm, the Pirates posted a 16-17 overall record and a 6-12 mark in conference play. The 16 wins were the most for the Pirate program in nearly a decade (2013-14) and the six conference victories tied for the most since the Pirates joined the American prior to the start of the 2014-15 season. ECU defeated South Florida 73-58 in the first round of the AAC tournament to win its first game in the tournament since 2017. Under Schwartz's guidance, Ezra Ausar led all AAC freshmen in field goal percentage at 56 percent (5th best in AAC) to become the first Pirate freshman since 2019 to be unanimously selected to the All-AAC Freshman team. The Pirates were also one of the league's top offensive rebounding clubs at 12.2 per game and in rebounding margin at +2.1, led by Brandon Johnson's 8.1 rebounds and 10 double-doubles.

Considered one of the most versatile and well-rounded assistant coaches in college basketball, Schwartz spent the last seven seasons on staff at the University of Tennessee — including four as the associate head coach. In the fall of 2019, Schwartz earned feature placement on The Athletic's list of the nation's top-25 up-and-coming college basketball coaches.

Tennessee Head Coach Rick Barnes has entrusted Schwartz with the role of defensive coordinator for each of the last five seasons, a move that has yielded extraordinary results, as the Vols own a 118-45 record dating to the start of the 2017-18 campaign. During the 2020-21 season, Tennessee posted the nation's fourth-best defensive efficiency rating, per KenPom.com — its second top-10 finish in four years. Additionally, Schwartz's schemes resulted in the Vols leading the Southeastern Conference in scoring defense in 2018 (65.7), 2021 (63.5) and 2022 (62.8).

Schwartz's leadership was instrumental in helping guide the Big Orange to the 2022 SEC Tournament title, 2018 regular-season SEC Championship, an appearance in the 2018 SEC Tournament Championship Game and a No. 3 seed in the 2018 NCAA Tournament where the Vols advanced to the second round.

Tennessee's defensive statistics during that 2017-18 season stood among the top programs nationally. The Vols led the SEC in scoring defense and ranked sixth nationally in KenPom's defensive efficiency ratings.

There was no drop-off in 2018-19. Tennessee led the SEC in field-goal percentage defense (.395) and blocks per game (5.4). The team's 199 total blocks stood as a school record. The Vols held 17 opponents to fewer than 70 points and eight opponents to fewer than 60. And three Vols who benefited from Schwartz's tutelage were selected in the 2019 NBA Draft.

For four consecutive weeks — amid a school-record 19-game win streak — Tennessee stood atop the Associated Press top 25 rankings. During that span, McDonald's All-American Josiah-Jordan James signed with UT, validating Schwartz's years of tireless effort as the elite guard's primary recruiter.

The Vols earned a No. 2 seed for the 2019 NCAA Tournament, advanced to the Sweet Sixteen and finished the season ranked fifth in the coaches' poll.

In 2019-20, Schwartz's defensive schemes saw UT lead the SEC in blocks while ranking second in scoring defense during league play. Junior forward Yves Pons, another standout recruited by Schwartz, was named the 2020 SEC Defensive Player of the Year — the first Tennessee player ever to win the award.

Tennessee finished the 2020-21 season with the nation's fourth-rated defensive efficiency, per KenPom, while ranking 13th nationally in defensive turnover percentage — forcing turnovers on 22.8 percent of its opponents' possessions.

Schwartz has handled the scouting duties for numerous wins over the past five seasons, including triumphs over No. 3 Auburn, No. 15 Kansas and No. 18 Purdue, four wins over Kentucky (two on the road), a pair victories vs. Georgia Tech and a win against Wright State in the NCAA Tournament.

An outstanding scout and floor coach, Schwartz played a key role in the development of Tennessee's 2016-17 freshman class, which was responsible for 44 percent of the team's scoring that season and finished the year as the highest-scoring crop of freshmen in program history (1,040 points). Forward Grant Williams anchored that class and developed into a two-time SEC Player of the Year, a consensus first-team All-American and a first-round NBA Draft pick.

Schwartz spent the 2015-16 season as an assistant coach, offensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Tulsa, helping the Golden Hurricane advance to the NCAA Tournament. Prior to that, he spent four seasons as the lead assistant under Rodney Terry (another former Barnes assistant) at Fresno State, including one year as associate head coach.

Shouldering responsibility for Fresno's in-game coordination, recruiting, scouting and skill development, Schwartz helped guide the Bulldogs to their first 20-win season and postseason appearance in seven years — the finals of the College Basketball Invitational — in 2013-14. That same year, Paul Watson was named Mountain West Freshman of the Year and selected to the Kyle Macy Freshman All-American team.

Fresno State produced an NBA guard during Schwartz's time on staff there, as Tyler Johnson (2011-14) spent four seasons with the Miami Heat. During Johnson's three seasons with Schwartz on staff at FSU, his scoring average, field-goal percentage, 3-point percentage and free-throw percentage all improved each year.

Schwartz also helped spearhead the assembly of some of Fresno State's highest-rated recruiting classes. The Bulldogs beat out several Pac 12 schools to sign shooting guard Marvelle Harris, who in 2016 became Fresno's all-time leading scorer and the Mountain West Player of the Year as well as earning AP All-American acclaim.

No stranger to the Southeast and East Coast, Schwartz spent six years on staff at Miami (Fla.) in the Atlantic Coast Conference — the first two as coordinator of basketball operations and the final four as a full-time assistant coach.

As an assistant in Coral Gables, Schwartz helped lead the Hurricanes to an 83-52 record, appearances in the top 25 rankings and three postseason appearances in four years. His impact was immense during Miami's historic 2007-08 campaign, which included the second-most wins in school history (23), a school-record 14 home wins and a program-best fifth-place finish in the ACC.

Miami earned a No. 7 seed in the 2008 NCAA Tournament and defeated St. Mary's before falling to Barnes' No. 2-seeded Texas squad in the second round.

In Schwartz's operations role at Miami, he handled video responsibilities, film breakdown, opponent scouting, oversight of recruiting mailings and served as a liaison with the program's managerial staff.

Schwartz's tenure in southern Florida was preceded by a one-year stint as an assistant coach at the University of Texas at San Antonio, a position he attained after working as Barnes' video coordinator at Texas for two seasons.

While working in a full-time capacity alongside Barnes at Texas, Schwartz was a part of a Longhorns program that posted a two-year record of 51-15, produced a pair NBA Draft picks (guards T.J. Ford and Royal Ivey) and advanced to the 2003 Final Four and the 2004 Sweet Sixteen.

Following his prep career at Beverly Hills High School, Schwartz played two seasons of college basketball at Sonoma State University in Rohnert Park, California. He then transferred to Texas where he concluded his playing career and was a member of Barnes' 1999 Big 12 championship team. After Schwartz earned his degree in speech communication studies from Texas in 1999, Barnes appointed Schwartz to a graduate assistant position, which he held from 1999-2001.

Schwartz also boasts valuable experience with USA Basketball, having served in a support capacity for the 2000 USA Youth Development Festival, the 2000 USA National Select Team — coached by Mike Jarvis and Bob Huggins and featuring future NBA stars Shane Battier and Jason Richardson — and the 2001 Young Men's World Championship Trials.

**RILEY DAVIS (TEXAS, '11, THIRD SEASON)**

Riley Davis is in his third year as an assistant coach for the Pirates after joining the staff in April of 2022. Davis spent his previous four years at UT Arlington and during his time with the Mavericks, Davis played an integral role in leading the team to finish in the top-40 nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio, three-point percentage defense, fewest turnovers per game, and assists per game. Before arriving at UTA, Davis served

as the video coordinator and director of player development at Tennessee for two seasons. Davis also spent seven seasons at his alma mater, Texas, as a volunteer assistant and assisted in video coordination and internal operations.

**REGGIE WILLIAMS (VMI, '08, THIRD SEASON)**

Reggie Williams is in his third season with the Pirates and in his second as assistant coach after serving as director of player personnel in his inaugural year with ECU. Williams holds a decorated 11-year professional basketball career which included tenures with the Golden State Warriors, Charlotte Hornets, Oklahoma City Thunder, San Antonio Spurs and New Orleans Pelicans. Williams played collegiately at the Virginia

Military Institute where he led the NCAA in scoring for two straight seasons, becoming one of nine players in NCAA Division I history to do so - joining "Pistol" Pete Maravich and Oscar Robertson. Williams finished his collegiate career as the all-time leading scorer in VMI, Big South Conference and Virginia state Division I history with 2,556 points, while ranking fourth all time in VMI history in rebounds (820), fourth in three-point field goals made (196), sixth in assists (368) and sixth in steals (175). In 2010, Williams became the fifth VMI athlete in school history to have his jersey retired.

**I.J. POOLE (TEXAS, '15, FIRST SEASON)**

I.J. Poole enters his first season as an assistant coach for the East Carolina Men's Basketball program after being hired to the position in June 2024. Poole arrives to Greenville after spending the last two seasons at Providence where he was the associate director of player development, scouting and recruiting coordination. Before joining the Friars, he served as the director of player personnel and scouting at

George Mason from 2021-23. Prior to his stops at Providence and George Mason, Poole served as the assistant to the head coach at Tennessee from 2019-21, which marked his second stint with the Volunteers as he was previously a graduate manager from 2015-17. Poole worked for two seasons at Appalachian State where he handled budget management, daily scheduling and team travel as director of basketball operations in his first year before being promoted to assistant coach for the 2018-19 campaign. He began his career at the University of Texas, where he worked as a student manager and was part of two NCAA Tournament teams with the Longhorns, and Texas averaged 22 wins per season during that stretch.

**MICHAEL PERRY (RICHMOND, '81, FIRST SEASON)**

Michael Perry enters his first season as an assistant coach with the Pirates after being named to the position in August 2024. Perry previously served as the radio color analyst for each ECU men's basketball game for the last three seasons. The hire marks a return to the Pirates' bench for Perry, who served as an assistant coach for East Carolina for 11 seasons including the 2017-18 season when he was the Pirates' interim head coach for the team's final 24 games. Prior

to his 11 seasons on the coaching staff at ECU, Perry spent five years (2003-07) as the head coach at Georgia State after serving as an assistant coach to "Lefty" Driesell for five years. During his 10 years, Perry was a major catalyst in the growth of the basketball program and helped lead the transition from the Atlantic Sun Conference into the Colonial Athletic Association. During his tenure at Georgia State, the Panthers won 165 games (an average of 16.5 per year) and advanced to postseason play twice. Perry helped guide the Panthers to the Atlantic Sun Conference title in 2001 and a NCAA Tournament First Round upset of Wisconsin. Georgia State received a bid to the NIT the following year. With Perry on the bench, Georgia State won three regular season conference championships and one tournament title. He also coached the team to back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time in school history.

**JOSH GIARDINA (MARYMOUNT [VA.], '20, THIRD SEASON)**

Josh Giardina is in his third season with the Pirates and his second as an assistant coach for the East Carolina men's basketball program. Giardina's most recent stop was on Rick Barnes' staff at Tennessee as a graduate assistant for the 2021-2022 season. He played a key role in the development of the All-SEC Freshman Zakai Zeigler and All-SEC point guard and SEC Tournament MVP Kennedy Chandler. Prior to Tennessee, Giardina spent the 2020-21 season as a graduate assistant at Radford University under head coach Mike Jones. Radford was projected to finish fifth in the Big South standings. The 2020-2021 Highlanders incoming recruiting class added 8 new players to the program, 5 of which were freshman. Radford outperformed expectations and turned in a second-place finish with a 12-6 league mark.

**JESSE HIGDON (TENNESSEE, '22, THIRD SEASON)**

Jesse Higdon is in her third year as Director of Operations for East Carolina men's basketball. Prior to arriving in Greenville, Higdon served as an arena management assistant for Thompson-Boling Arena at Tennessee since 2016 as both a student then full-time employee, helping with operations for both concerts and sporting events in 21,600-person venue including ticketing, customer service, event preparation, VIP area coordination and event liaison for concert tours. In addition to her duties with Thompson-Boling Arena, Higdon worked

with Tennessee Athletics in ticketing, event management, hospitality and administration. Higdon is slated to complete requirements for a Master of Business Analytics from the Haslam College of Business in May.

**NATE CLARK (LOCK HAVEN, '01, 17TH SEASON)**

Nate Clark is in his 17th year as the men's basketball athletic trainer at ECU. He joined the Pirate athletic program in the summer of 2008 and works primarily with the men's basketball team while supervising several Olympic sports. Prior to arriving at ECU, Clark spent five years as an assistant athletic trainer at North Carolina Wesleyan, serving as the head football trainer and the primary athletic trainer for baseball. Clark began his career in sports medicine as a student athletic trainer at Lock

Haven University. After completing his undergraduate studies, he served as a graduate assistant at Ohio University during the 2001-02 season, working primarily with the Bobcats' football program. From there, he spent one season as a resident athletic trainer at Lafayette College before becoming a part of the athletic training staff at N.C. Wesleyan.

**ROB LEWIS (FLORIDA STATE, '24, FIRST SEASON)**

Rob Lewis is in his first year as the Director of Player Development with the men's basketball program at East Carolina. Lewis previously served as a graduate assistant at Florida State under Leonard Hamilton for two seasons where he assisted with player development. Lewis also served as a site director for Yescan Basketball from 2020-22 where he oversaw basketball operations and coordination of schedules as well as coaching. Lewis competed professionally overseas for three different teams over the span of five seasons after

spending his collegiate career at Queens University of Charlotte and Houston Baptist. He started in every game for the Royals in his last two seasons of college including posting a career-high 18.3 points per game in 2015-16 as well as 3.4 assists per game, leading to a SAC All-Conference First Team appearance. Lewis averaged 12.8 points and 2.8 rebounds in 20 games at Houston Baptist in 2013-14 and scored 8.2 points per contest as a freshman with the Huskies in 2012-13.

**COLIN DONAHUE (NEVADA, '24, FIRST SEASON)**

Colin Donahue is in his first season as the Special Assistant to the Head Coach with the Pirates' men's basketball program. Donahue arrives in Greenville after spending the last two seasons at the University of Nevada where he was a graduate assistant with the men's basketball team. Prior to joining the Pack, Donahue spent one year working as a financial analyst at Eli Lilly & Company while also continuing to work part-time in college basketball as a volunteer-assistant coach at Marian University in Indianapolis. Originally from Carmel, Indiana,

Donahue attended college at DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana, where he played baseball for the Tigers for one year before joining the Tigers' men's basketball staff as a student assistant coach for the following three seasons. He holds a bachelor's degree in economics from DePauw and recently acquired his master's in business administration from Nevada in the spring of 2024.

**COLTON SUSEN (SIU EDWARDSVILLE, '20, FIRST SEASON)**

Colton Susen was named an Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach at East Carolina University in June 2024. Susen arrives in Greenville after spending the last two seasons at Southern Illinois University where he served in the same role with the men's basketball team and the men's and women's golf programs. He comes to ECU with a specialty in all aspects of basketball performance along with an extensive background in strength and conditioning, nutrition, and sport science application. Prior to his two seasons with the Salukis, Susen was the first full-time Director of Basketball Performance at Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville, working with men's and women's basketball programs in all facets of the sport. Before his stint as the Director of Basketball performance at SIUE, he was a graduate assistant in the same program, spending a total of four years at the university. Prior to SIUE, Susen served as an intern strength and conditioning coach for the University of Wisconsin and the University of Michigan, working exclusively with the men's and women's basketball teams. A 2017 graduate of the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, Susen holds a bachelor's degree in exercise sport science with an emphasis in coaching competitive athletics. He obtained his master's degree in exercise physiology shortly after at SIUE. Susen is a certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist and Performance and Sport Scientist through the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). He holds certifications in Reflexive Performance Reset (RPR), is a certified basketball speed specialist (CBSS), Primal Reflexive Reset (PRRT) technique, a Certified Sport Nutrition (CSNC), Signal 6 and is a United States Weightlifting Coach (USAW).

**JENNIFER BONNER (EAST CAROLINA, '99)**

Jennifer Bonner was appointed to the East Carolina University Office of Student Development staff in April of 2005 and currently serves as the department's assistant director, men's basketball academic coordinator and learning specialist/tutor coordinator. In addition to handling various leadership roles within the division, Bonner spearheads the learning assistance program by providing individual skill consultations, overseeing student evaluation referrals, acting as a liaison between the office and ECU's Disability Support Services and directing student-athlete study halls. From 2005 to 2014, she had oversight of student development's successful summer freshmen orientation program. As the men's basketball academic tutor, the Pirates set a team cumulative grade point average (GPA) record in the spring of 2019, established an academic year GPA record for 2018-19, earned the 2018-19 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Academic Excellence Award and received a 1,000 academic progress rate (APR) score in the 2019-2000 academic year. Bonner both held and currently holds committee assignments and affiliations with numerous internal and external entities, including the ECU Student Development Tutorial Services Committee (chair), Academic Integrity Education Committee (chair), Study Hall Taskforce (chair), Freshman Orientation Committee, ECU Mentor Summit, ECU Tutor Advisory Board, College Reading and Learning Association (CRLA) and the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics (N4A).

**GRADY DILLON (EAST CAROLINA, '20, THIRD SEASON)**

Grady Dillon is entering his third year overseeing media relations for the men's basketball program. A 2020 graduate of East Carolina University, Dillon recently earned his master's in Sports Administration at the University of Louisville while serving as a graduate assistant in the athletics department for sports information. In his role, Dillon assisted with coverage of the Cardinals' 22 sports including postseason coverage of women's basketball, volleyball and baseball. During the spring, Dillon served as the primary contact for men's tennis and covered the team in the 2022 ACC Men's Tennis Tournament and 2022 NCAA Men's Tennis Tournament. Dillon also served as the editor of the football and men's basketball digital game programs. The Greenville, N.C. native earned his degree in Communication while at ECU, where he assisted the media relations department with football, men's and women's basketball and baseball through his four years as a student. During his senior year, Dillon was an intern with the ECU News Services office and wrote monthly feature stories called 'Pirate Profiles', which highlight outstanding students and faculty at the university.

► WILLIAMS ARENA AT MINGES COLISEUM

One of the most intimate and fan friendly arenas in all of NCAA Division I is Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum, home of East Carolina men's and women's basketball and volleyball. The cozy 7,100-seat arena gives the Pirates a distinct home court advantage.

Now in its 58th season of hosting Pirate basketball, the coliseum is connected to the second level of the Murphy Center by an indoor walkway. The floor inside Williams Arena at Minges Coliseum received

a fresh look prior to the 2019-20 season with new designs and logos, while a new video boards and scoreboards were installed in previous years. Courtside seating was also instituted in recent years and prior to this season, new LED lighting was installed along with 422 chairbacks to further enhance the gameday experience for Pirate fans.

The men's basketball team has compiled an overall record of 487-283 in 56 seasons at Minges Coliseum and in the over the past 13 seasons, the Pirates have won at least 10 or more home contests in six of those seasons highlighted by a 17-4 mark in 2012-13. The single-game record for attendance for a men's basketball game at Minges is 8,081 that saw ECU take down Dwyane Wade and No. 9 Marquette 73-70 on Dec. 30, 2002.

Constructed at a cost of \$2 million, Minges Coliseum was dedicated on Jan. 27, 1968, in the name of the Minges family of Greenville, N.C. As owners of Pepsi-Cola bottling operations in Greenville, Kinston and New Bern, the Minges family has provided leadership and support of East Carolina University Athletics over the years, going back to the days when the late Dr. Ray Minges served as President of the Century Club (forerunner of the Pirate Club), from 1965-68. After 27 years of basketball, Minges Coliseum underwent a facelift prior to the 1994-95 season. The renovations, totaling almost \$12 million, have made the arena one of the finest on-campus basketball facilities on the East Coast.

Williams Arena is named in honor and recognition of Walter and Marie Williams for their support of East Carolina Athletics over the years. As alumni of East Carolina College, Walter and Marie have endowed two Men's Basketball Position scholarships, the Spirit of the East Post-Eligibility Scholarship, and an unrestricted student-athlete scholarship on behalf of the University's athletics program. Further, through Trade Oil Company, the Williams family gave the first \$1 million gift ever given to the Educational Foundation in support of ECU Athletics, through the Shared Visions Campaign. In addition to his financial support, Walter Williams has given his time unselfishly in support of the Pirate Club. During 1997-98, Walter served as Executive President of the Educational Foundation.

In addition to showcasing ECU basketball and volleyball, Williams Arena is also an outstanding venue for University and local high school graduation ceremonies, concerts and other entertainment events throughout the year. The arena previously served as home of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) Eastern Regional Boy's Championships. The Harlem Globetrotters, National Basketball Association (NBA) and World Wrestling Entertainment (WWE) have also visited Minges Coliseum throughout the years. Presidents George W. Bush and Barack Obama have also given speeches inside the coliseum.
