◆ 15th head coach in ECU history

Eastern Kentucky University football head coach Walt Wells is a familiar name. Wells served as an assistant under legendary ECU Head Coach Roy Kidd from 1997 to 2002 and was an assistant again with the Colonels in 2015.

Wells was hired as the 15th head coach in program history on Dec. 9, 2019.

In his third season at ECU, Wells led the Colonels to their first NCAA FCS Playoff berth since 2014 and a share of the ASUN regular-season championship. ECU went 6-2 against FCS opponents and beat an FBS team for the first time in eight seasons. The Colonels rose to No. 16 in the national polls and posted a 5-2 mark at Roy Kidd Stadium. Wells earned the ASUN Coach of the Year honor for the second consecutive season.

The Colonels beat FBS foe Bowling Green 59-57 in seven overtimes, which tied the record for the second-longest game in Division I football history. ECU also knocked off No. 15 Southeast Missouri on the road for the program's third win over a ranked opponent in as many seasons.

ECU quarterback Parker McKinney was named the ASUN's Co-Offensive Player of the Year and the Colonels landed five players on the All-ASUN team. McKinney was named an All-American, along with offensive lineman Payton Collins, linebacker Matthew Jackson, and running back Braedon Sloan, giving the Colonels four All-Americans for the first time ever in a single season.

During the 2022 campaign, ECU ranked second in the FCS in punt returns, third in passing offense, fifth in third-down conversion percentage, sixth in kickoff returns, eight in completion percentage, 10th in total offense, 11th in scoring offense and

team passing efficiency, and 18th in red-zone offense.

In 2021, Wells orchestrated the biggest single-season turnaround in program history as ECU went 7-4 after a 3-6 campaign in 2020. The Colonels defeated three teams that were ranked in the preseason top-25 and went 5-1 at Roy Kidd Stadium. Eastern Kentucky climbed as high as No. 19 in the national rankings and won five consecutive games for the first time since 2014. Wells was named the ASUN Coach of the Year and was honored as the AFCA FCS Region 3 Co-Coach of the Year.

The Colonels upset No. 19 Austin Peay, 35-27, in Richmond and rallied from a 22-point road deficit to beat Central Arkansas. Eastern Kentucky also won its second consecutive Opportunity Bowl, knocking off Jacksonville State in double-overtime, 39-31.

ECU placed six players on the All-ASUN team while defensive back Davion Ross was named the ASUN Defensive Player of the Year and kicker Patrick Nations won ASUN Special Teams Player of the Year. Ross, Nations, and offensive lineman Payton Collins were each honored as All-Americans.

During 2021, the Colonels ranked second nationally in kickoff return average, fourth in defensive touchdowns and red-zone offense, 15th in red-zone defense, and 19th in sacks allowed.

In his first season, the Colonels faced one of the toughest schedules in program history. Among the nine games in the fall of 2020 were three contests against FBS teams and two games against a team ranked among the top-25 in the FCS. Wells led ECU to a road win at The Citadel, a near upset of FBS Troy, a victory over No. 11 Central Arkansas and a 49-17 win against Western Carolina in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl.

The win over 11th ranked Central Arkansas was the program's first victory over a ranked team since 2013 and the first win over a non-conference ranked team since 2003 when ECU beat No. 11 Appalachian State.

ECU was recognized as the national team of the week three times during the 2020 season. Quarterback Parker McKinney, wide receiver Key-ion Dixon and running back Alonzo Booth each earned national player of the week honors as well.

During the fall 2020 season, ECU ranked second in the nation in interceptions and passing efficiency, and third in first downs, passing offense, passing yards per completion, fumbles recovered and turnovers gained.

Wells served as a quality control assistant at the University of Kentucky during the 2018 and 2019 seasons. The 2018 Wildcat team beat Florida for the first time in 32 years, posted the program's best Southeast-

ern Conference (SEC) record in 41 years and beat No. 12-ranked Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. All totaled, the 10-3 record was Kentucky's best season in 41 years and only the third 10-win season in school history.

From 2016 to 2017, Wells worked on the staff at the University of Tennessee. He was an offensive quality control coach, working primarily with the offensive line during the 2016 season, and served as the offensive line coach during the 2017 season. He worked closely with the UT line that paved the way for 2,668 rushing yards (5.2 yards per carry) in 2016. The Vol offense also ranked 24th in the nation in scoring that season (36.4 points per game). Wells coached Freshman All-American and All-SEC left guard Trey Smith. He was ranked as a top-10 national recruiter.

Wells returned to the ECU coaching staff in the spring of 2015 as the assistant head coach and offensive line coach. His work helped the Colonels average 30.3 points per game, the 35th-most in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Lineman Brett Eyckmans earned first team All-Ohio Valley Conference recognition after the 2015 season.

During his first stint with the Colonels, ECU won the 1997 OVC title with a perfect 7-0 mark and advanced to the NCAA FCS playoffs. Wells served as Kidd's tight ends coach from 1997 to 1999, and as the offensive line coach from 2000 to 2002. He coached seven All-OVC players and

an All-American. ECU ranked among top-15 nationally in rushing in 2001 and 2002.

Wells has also spent time at Cumberland University, Western Kentucky, South Florida and New Mexico State.

As the offensive line coach in 2014 at New Mexico State, Wells helped center Valerian Ume-Ezeoke earn All-Sun Belt Conference accolades. The Aggies allowed just 10 sacks all year, which ranked second-best nationally. Ume-Ezeoke went on to sign a free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons.

Wells spent the 2013 season at South Florida as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach. Under Wells, tight end Mike McFarland and tailback Marcus Shaw were named second team All-American Athletic Conference. He also guided wide receiver Andre Davis to a program record in single season receiving yards (735).

Prior to joining the South Florida staff in December 2012, Wells spent 10 years at Western Kentucky working with the offensive line. During the final four years of his stay at WKU, Wells' role expanded to offensive coordinator and running game coordinator. Four Hilltopper offensive linemen earned All-America honors under Wells' direction, and Western ranked in the top four in the Sun Belt Conference in rushing each of his final four seasons – leading the league with 181.6 rushing yards per game in 2011 and improving that number to 186.2 yards per game in 2012.

Wells' collegiate coaching career began in 1994 at Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee, as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He led an offense that twice topped the NAIA in rushing, while helping the Bulldogs reach a top-15 national ranking. Wells also spent

two years as an assistant at Smyrna (Tenn.) High School.

Wells earned a bachelor's degree in finance from Belmont in 1993 after transferring from Austin Peay State University where he was on the football team for four years, having started and lettered in two of those seasons. He received a master's degree in human relations management in 1995 at Cumberland.

Wells and his wife, Jennifer, have two children - Madison and K.J.

Former Colonel Jake Johnson returned to ECU in December 2019 as the program's defensive coordinator. Johnson previously spent 12 seasons (2004-15) on the Colonel coaching staff, including the final 11 as the defensive line coach.

In his third season at ECU, two Colonel defenders were named to the All-ASUN team and linebacker Matthew Jackson was tabbed as a Fourth-Team Phil Steele/DraftScout All-American.

Jackson ranked third in the ASUN with 87 total tackles, while defensive lineman TK McLendon finished the season third in the conference with six sacks.

In 2021, the Colonel defense ranked fourth nationally in defensive touchdowns and 15th in red-zone defense. Cornerback Davion Ross was a consensus All-American, the ASUN Defensive Player of the Year, and three ECU defenders were named to the All-ASUN team.

Ross ranked fifth in the nation in passes defended. Kyle Bailey finished the season sixth in the nation in solo tackles, while Jackson ranked 20th.

In his first season, Johnson's defense stymied a pair of Southern Conference offenses helping ECU beat The Citadel, 37-14, on the road and Western Carolina, 49-17, in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl.

Johnson's defense held Troy to 10 second half points as ECU nearly upset the FBS Trojans on the road.

In his first season as a starter, linebacker Matthew Jackson excelled in Johnson's defense. Jackson led the nation during the fall season with two fumbles recovered and ranked ninth in the country with 9.9 tackles per game.

Johnson worked on the staff at Murray State University from 2016 to 2019.

Linebacker Quincy Williams was selected in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft, the highest draft pick in MSU history. In addition, defensive back Marquez Sanford signed a free agent contract with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2019.

In his first stint at Eastern Kentucky, Johnson helped the Colonels win OVC Championships in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and make four FCS playoff appearances.

After graduating from Eastern in 2002 with a bachelor's of science degree in geography, with an emphasis in global studies, Johnson spent a year at Wingate University as an assistant coach. Johnson then returned to Eastern Kentucky in 2004 as a graduate assistant coach.

A three-year starting offensive lineman during his collegiate career, Johnson garnered All-Ohio Valley Conference accolades at center in 2001.

Johnson earned four letters from 1997-2001 and was a freshman on the 1997 Colonel team which captured an OVC championship.

Johnson married the former Kate Lyon, a four-year volleyball letter winner at Eastern who was named team co-MVP in 2000, in the summer of 2007. The Johnsons have two children — Sam and Zoey.



• **Andy Richman**

Andy Richman was chosen as ECU's offensive coordinator and running backs coach in January 2020.

In his third season at ECU, the Colonels set a school record with 434 points scored, posting at least 40 points in six games, and quarterback Parker McKinney broke every school single-season and career passing record.

McKinney, offensive lineman Payton Collins, and running back Braedon Sloan each earned All-American honors.

In 2021, Eastern Kentucky boasted the fourth-best red-zone offense in the country. ECU scored 30 points in six different games and McKinney set a school record with 229 pass completions.

In his first season, Richman led an offense that concluded the fall third in the nation in passing offense (247.4 yards per game) and fourth in the country in total offense (376.4 yards per game).

Three offensive players — quarterback Parker McKinney, wide receiver Keyion Dixon and running back Alonzo Booth — were each chosen as the national player of the week during the 2020 season.

Receivers Jaquez Jones (4th) and Jackson Beerman (6th) also ranked among the national leaders in receiving yards.

Richman was the offensive line coach and run game coordinator at New Mexico State University from 2015 through the 2019 season. In 2017, the Aggies' offense ranked sixth in the nation in passing offense while winning seven games and earning a victory in the Arizona Bowl.

From 2011 through the 2014 season, Richman served on the staff at Valdosta State University. He was the offensive line coach and run game coordinator during the 2012 season and the offensive coordinator in 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Richman was an offensive line quality control assistant for the Wisconsin Badgers from 2008 to 2010. Richman was an offensive line assistant, working primarily with the centers and guards, at Louisiana during the 2007 season.

Richman worked at Western Kentucky University during the 2006 season, serving as the tight ends coach. He also coached the defensive line at Denison University (2005), and running backs and tight ends at Reedley College (2004).

During the 2002 and 2003 seasons, Richman was graduate student assistant at Eastern Kentucky, working with the tight ends in 2002 and the defensive line in 2003.

Richman was the offensive line coach at his alma mater, Wisconsin-Stevens Point, in 2001. He was part of two conference championships and one playoff team during his collegiate career (1996-99). He earned a physical education degree from Wisconsin-Stevens Point in 2002. Richman completed a master's degree in sport administration at ECU in 2004.

Richman is married to the former Heather Proctor.



• **C.J. Conrad**

C.J. Conrad was hired as ECU's tight ends coach in June 2023.

Before arriving in Richmond, Conrad spent the three seasons at Kentucky as a graduate assistant and quality control coach for the Wildcats. Conrad played at Kentucky from 2015-18 and signed with the New York Giants practice squad following his UK career in 2019.

As a Wildcat, Conrad played in 48 career games with 42 starts, totaling 80 catches for 1,015 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns. He became the 28th player in school history to reach 1,000 yards receiving and his 12 scores are the second-most TD receptions by a tight end in program history. He was an All-SEC selection as a junior and ended his career at No. 28 on the school's career receiving yards list.

A native of LaGrange, Ohio, Conrad was named the winner of the 2018 Pop Warner National College Football Award, which recognizes a college graduating senior who has made a difference on the field, in the classroom and in his community, and serves as a role model to Pop Warner's young student-athletes. He was also a member of the 2018 SEC Community Service Team and was a nominee for the 2018 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Trophy.

The four-time member of the SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll graduated in December of 2018 with a degree in communications. He earned his master's degree in sport leadership from UK in December of 2022.



• **Caleb Cox**

Caleb Cox was chosen as ECU's wide receivers coach in January 2020. In his third season at ECU, the Colonel wide receivers helped

quarterback Parker McKinney set single-season records for passing yards, completions, and touchdowns. Three different wideouts caught at least 50 passes for at least 700 yards.

ECU's passing attack topped 300 yards in nine different games, combining for 881 yards in the final two games of the season. The Colonels ranked third nationally in passing offense (329.7 yards per game), eighth in completion percentage (68.6%), and 11th team passing efficiency (161.26).

During the 2021 season, five different Colonel wide receivers caught touchdown passes and hauled in 160 catches to help McKinney set the program single-season record with 229 completions.

Against top-ranked Sam Houston, ECU's passing game racked up 338 yards through the air, led by 103 receiving yards from Matt Wilcox, Jr. The Colonels closed the season with 299 yards passing in an Opportunity Bowl victory over Jacksonville State.

In his first season, Cox helped the offense conclude the fall third in the nation in passing offense (247.4 yards per game) and fourth in the country in total offense (376.4 yards per game). The Colonels ran up a season-high 590 yards of offense against Western Carolina in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl. The unit totaled 400 yards or more of offense in six of the final seven games of the season.

Wide receiver Keyion Dixon was chosen as the national player of the week during the 2020 season. Dixon was third in the country in receiving yards and fourth in receiving touchdowns. Receivers Jacquez Jones (4th) and Jackson Beerman (6th) also ranked among the national leaders in receiving yards.

Cox served as an offensive assistant at the University of Tennessee from 2016-19. In 2015, Cox was an offensive assistant at ECU. He worked as the wide receivers coach at Kentucky Christian University in 2013 and 2014.

Cox helped Tennessee reach the Music City Bowl in 2016 and the Tax Slayer Bowl in 2019. He has coached three players who were either drafted or received invitations to an NFL camp, including former Colonel offensive lineman Justin Adekoya.

Cox has extensive recruiting experience in Georgia, Tennessee, Kentucky and North Carolina.

A 2013 graduate of Kentucky Christian, Cox earned a bachelor's of science degree in university studies and Biblical studies while playing wide receiver for the Knights. He earned a master's in Christian leadership from KCU in 2017 and a master's in agriculture leadership education communication at Tennessee in 2018.

Derek Day was chosen as ECU's inside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator in January 2020. He had previously

worked on the staffs at Butler, Tennessee, Iowa State and Western Kentucky.

In his third season at ECU, Day helped coach linebacker Matthew Jackson to an All-American season. Jackson ranked third in the ASUN in tackles and made 41 stops over the final three games of the season.

ECU's defense held No. 15 Southeast Missouri to 10 points in the second half of a comeback victory and limited Central Arkansas to its lowest point total against an FCS opponent of the season.

Before the 2021 season, Day switched from coaching inside linebackers to coaching outside linebackers. The Colonel defense ranked fourth nationally in defensive touchdowns and 15th in red-zone defense, allowing opponents to score just 10.1 points per game in the second half.

Linebackers Kyle Bailey and Matthew Jackson each recorded 102 tackles, with Jackson being tabbed as Phil Steele's ASUN Defensive Player of the Year. Fellow linebacker Eli Hairston finished third on the team in tackles.

In his first season, Day helped the defense stymie a pair of Southern Conference offenses helping ECU beat The Citadel, 37-14, on the road and Western Carolina, 49-17, in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl.

In his first season as a starter, linebacker Matthew Jackson excelled. Jackson led the nation during the fall season with two fumbles recovered and ranked ninth in the country with 9.9 tackles per game. As a team, Eastern Kentucky was third in the country during the fall with 16 turnovers gained.

For three seasons (2017-19), Day served as the linebacker coach, co-special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator at Butler. He coached two all-conference linebackers and an all-league kicker.

As a defensive quality control assistant working with linebackers at Tennessee in 2015 and 2016, Day helped the Volunteers reach the 2015 Outback Bowl and the 2016 Music City Bowl. He coached All-Southeastern Conference linebacker Jalen Reeves-Maybin who was a fourth round NFL Draft pick, and all-freshman team linebacker Darrin Kirkland Jr.

In 2012 and 2013, Day was a defensive graduate assistant linebackers coach at Iowa State. He helped the Cyclones reach the 2012 Liberty Bowl. He worked with two All-Big 12 and fifth round NFL Draft picks — linebackers AJ Klein (2013) and Jeremiah George (2014).

At Western Kentucky, Day served as a defensive graduate assistant with the defensive line and linebackers.

Day earned a bachelor's of science degree in education at Butler in 2009. He was a four-year starter at defensive end with the Bulldogs. Day received a master's degree in education at Iowa State in 2014. He and his wife Lacey have two children — Landyn and Cameron.

Mike Dietzel, who has 30-plus years of coaching experience at the college and professional level, joined the Eastern Kentucky staff as safeties

coach in March of 2021.

In 2022, three of ECU's safeties ranked in the top-11 on the team in tackling, led by Nic Cheeley's 57 stops.

Safety Joseph Sayles returned an interception 40 yards for a touchdown against Austin Peay, while Mike Smith Jr. recorded his first career interception against North Alabama.

In his first season in Richmond, ECU safeties recorded five of the Colonels' 13 interceptions on the season. Eastern Kentucky's defense ranked fourth nationally in defensive touchdowns and 15th in red-zone defense.

Sayles tallied three interceptions, broke up three passes, forced one fumble, and block the potential game-tying kick in ECU's victory at Central Arkansas.

Dietzel served as the defensive backs/safeties coach at Ball State during the 2019 and 2020 seasons.

Ball State ranked 15th nationally in turnovers gained (24) in 2019. In 2020, BSU was seventh in the nation in defensive touchdowns.

Dietzel spent seven seasons at Western Kentucky (2003-09), including three as defensive coordinator. As the linebackers/secondary coach/special teams coordinator, he helped Central Michigan to bowl appearances in three of his four seasons with the Chippewas.

Over nine seasons at Buffalo (2010-14) and CMU, Dietzel's teams ranked second in the MAC in total defense four times.

Dietzel helped the 2001 Kent State team to its first winning season in 14 years while serving as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach.

In 2001, Dietzel served as the secondary coach/defensive passing game coordinator for the New York/New Jersey Hitmen of the XFL. His Hitmen team led the XFL in pass defense.

As the running backs/wide receivers/tight ends coach at Army (1995-99) Dietzel mentored a running backs group that led the nation in rushing in 1996 and 1998.

As the inside linebackers coach at Pennsylvania (1998) he helped the team to a share of the 1988 Ivy League championship.

Dietzel also coached at Colorado (1985-86), Earlham (1987) and Johns Hopkins (1994).

Dietzel played football at Otterbein University, where he was an honorable mention all-conference defensive back in 1983. He earned his bachelor's degree in educational administration from Otterbein (1985) and his master's in educational administration from Colorado (1986). Dietzel started the Fellowship of Christian Athletes program at Earlham in 1987. He also coached track & field in his one year at Johns Hopkins.

He and his wife Jennifer, a Bowling Green, Kentucky native, have one son — Taylor.

Chris Franklin was chosen as EKU's safeties coach in April 2020. In his third season at EKU, Colonel cornerbacks tallied six of the

team's 10 interceptions on the season.

EKU cornerbacks tallied 21 pass breakups, 3.5 tackles for loss, and a forced fumble. The Colonels held five different opponents to less than 175 yards through the air.

In the spring of 2021, Franklin moved to coaching the cornerbacks. The Colonel defense ranked fourth nationally in defensive touchdowns and 15th in red-zone defense, allowing opponents to score just 10.1 points per game in the second half. Cornerback Davion Ross was named a consensus All-American and the ASUN Defensive Player of the Year after returning three interceptions for touchdowns and breaking up 13 passes

Colonel cornerbacks recorded 25 pass breakups on the year as EKU held three different teams to less than 160 yards passing.

In his first season, Franklin helped the defense stymie a pair of Southern Conference offenses helping EKU beat The Citadel, 37-14, on the road and Western Carolina, 49-17, in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl.

Safety Kmare Carey ranked ninth in the nation during the fall season with 0.40 interceptions per game. As a team, Eastern Kentucky was third in the country during the fall season with 16 turnovers gained.

Franklin spent the 2019 season working with cornerbacks in a defensive quality control position at Western Kentucky University. He helped the Hilltoppers to a 9-4 record and a victory in the 2019 SERVPRO First Responder Bowl.

In 2019, WKU produced a top-25 rated defense. Western allowed only 20.1 points per game, which was the lowest mark for the program since 2004 and ranked No. 22 in FBS. The Hilltoppers ranked 24th in total defense with 335.5 yards allowed per game, and 28th with 200 passing yards allowed per game. In a 45-19 win at Arkansas, the defense held the Razorbacks to just 87 yards through the air.

During the 2017 and 2018 seasons, Franklin was the defensive backs coach and punt return coach at Arkansas Tech University. He coached all-conference and All-America safety Cua Rose.

Franklin spent the 2015 and 2016 seasons on the coaching staff at the University of West Georgia. In 2015 he was a graduate assistant working with strong safeties. He served as the cornerbacks coach in 2016. He helped the Wolves capture a Gulf South Conference championship in his first season.

In the spring of 2015, Franklin worked with EKU linebackers in a defensive quality control position.

A defensive back during his playing days with the Hilltoppers, Franklin earned a degree in interdisciplinary studies with an emphasis in technology from Western Kentucky University in 2009. He and his wife Ashley have three sons — Caleb, CJ and Cameron, and one daughter — Amiya'h.

Jeremy Hawkins was chosen as EKU's defensive line coach in January 2020. He had previously worked on the staffs at Mercer, LSU and

Alabama-Birmingham.

In his third season at EKU, Hawkins helped TK McLendon earn All-ASUN status, finishing third in the conference in sacks. EKU held No. 15 Southeast Missouri to 10 points in the second half of a comeback victory and limited Central Arkansas to its lowest point total against an FCS opponent of the season. McLendon was a Second-Team Phil Steele All-ASUN selection, while Kelton Dawson was named to the Third Team and Ryan Jackson earned Fourth-Team honors.

In 2021, Hawkins oversaw a defensive line that helped the Colonels post a 7-4 record. EKU ranked 15th nationally in red-zone defense and totaled 22 sacks and 66 tackles for loss. Four defensive linemen garnered All-ASUN recognition. Eastern Kentucky allowed just 10.1 points per game in the second half and Hawkins was named to the AFCA's 35 Under 35 list.

In his first season, Hawkins helped the defense stymie a pair of Southern Conference offenses helping EKU beat The Citadel, 37-14, on the road and Western Carolina, 49-17, in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl. EKU also knocked off No. 11 Central Arkansas for the program's first win over a top-25 ranked team since 2013, and first victory over a non-conference ranked team since 2003. Eastern held Troy to 10 second half points as EKU nearly upset the FBS Trojans on the road.

In 2019, Hawkins was the defensive line coach at Mercer. He also coached field goal block and the scout team offense. As the assistant director of player personnel at LSU during the 2018 season, Hawkins helped the Tigers to a 10-3 record and a spot in the Fiesta Bowl. His responsibilities included all aspects of recruiting, coordinating recruiting areas for all coaches, and discovery and evaluation of all prospects.

Hawkins served as the assistant defensive line coach and director of player personnel at Alabama-Birmingham during the 2015, 2016 and 2017 seasons. In his final season, the Blazers went 8-5 and earned a spot in the Bahamas Bowl.

During the 2014 season, Hawkins was the head coach and defensive coordinator at Middle Georgia State College. In 2012 and 2013, he was the defensive line coach at Dublin High School. His college coaching career began as the running backs and tight ends coach at the University of Central Oklahoma during the 2011 season.

Hawkins was a four-year letter winner at Troy University where he earned a bachelor's degree in sports and fitness management in 2009 and a master's degree in sports administration in 2014. As a player, he helped the Trojans reach three bowl games. Hawkins also played one year of Arena Football for the Iowa Bandits.

**Title:** Offensive Line Coach

Erik Losey was chosen as EKU's offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in December 2019. He had served as the offensive line coach

at Southern Mississippi, East Tennessee and Alcorn State.

In his third season at EKU, the offensive line helped the Colonels rank third nationally in passing offense per game (329.7), fifth in third-down conversion percentage (.519), 10th in total offense per game (451.3), 11th in scoring offense (36.2), and 18th in red zone offense (.879). Losey's group also paved the way for EKU to tally its highest point total in program history.

Left tackle Payton Collins was named a Fourth-Team Phil Steele/DraftScout All-American, as well as Phil Steele's ASUN Offensive Lineman of the Year.

EKU ranked 13th nationally in sacks allowed and 19th in sacks allowed per game in 2021, surrendering just 14 on the season. The Colonels also boasted the fourth-best red-zone offense in the country, scoring on 31 of its 33 trips (93.9 percent) inside in the red zone.

In his first season, Losey helped the offense conclude the fall third in the nation in passing offense (247.4 yards per game) and fourth in the country in total offense (376.4 yards per game). The Colonels ran up a season-high 590 yards of offense against Western Carolina in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl. The unit totaled 400 yards or more of offense in six of the final seven games of the season.

Three offensive players — quarterback Parker McKinney, wide receiver Keyion Dixon and running back Alonzo Booth — were each chosen as the national player of the week during the 2020 season.

Losey spent the 2019 season as a strength and conditioning intern at the University of South Carolina.

During the 2017 and 2018 seasons Losey was the offensive line coach at Southern Miss. He helped the Golden Eagles to an 8-5 record and a trip to the Independence Bowl in 2017. That season, USM led Conference USA and was 11th in the country in fewest sacks allowed.

Losey was the offensive line coach at East Tennessee from 2014 to 2016 and at Alcorn State during the 2013 season. He coached Ben Blackmon to a spot on the 2016 all-conference freshman team in 2016 at ETSU.

During the spring of 2012, Losey coached tight ends at Campbell University. He moved over to coach the running backs during the 2012 season at Campbell. In 2011, he coached the offensive line at Webber International.

After starting his coaching career at Western Kentucky in a graduate assistant role in 2007 and 2008, Losey was an offensive quality control assistant at Florida State during the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

Losey earned a bachelor's degree in history and social studies at Western Kentucky in December 2006. He and his wife Kaitlyn reside in Richmond.



• **Maxwell Smith**

Title: Quarterbacks Coach

Year at ECU: 1st season

Maxwell Smith was hired as ECU's quarterbacks coach in February 2023.

Before arriving in Richmond, Smith served as the quarterbacks coach at Heidelberg University for two seasons. Under Smith's tutelage, Heidelberg quarterback Drew Sims ranked in the top-10 nationally in yards per completion in 2021 and 2022. Sims was also an All-OAC selection following the 2021 season.

Prior to joining the staff at Heidelberg, Smith coached for three seasons at Kentucky as a grad assistant.

As a player, Smith started 11 games at quarterback for Kentucky. In 2013, he led the Wildcats in passing, throwing for 1,276 yards and nine touchdowns against just one interception. Smith was a Freshman All-SEC performer in 2011, setting a UK school record for most passing yards by a true freshman with a 283-yard performance against Ole Miss.

Smith transferred to San Diego State in 2015 and won the starting job for the Aztecs. The Granada Hills, Calif., native threw for 1,529 yards and 13 touchdowns while setting an SDSU record by going 10 consecutive games without throwing an interception. As the starter, Smith guided the Aztecs to seven consecutive wins as SDSU captured the Mountain West Conference championship and won the Hawaii Bowl.

Title: Dir. Football Sports Performance

Billy Brown was chosen as ECU's director of football sports performance in February 2020.

In Brown's third season, the Colonels earned their first NCAA FCS Playoff berth since 2014 and a share of the ASUN regular-season championship. ECU went 6-2 against FCS opponents and beat an FBS team for the first time in eight seasons. The Colonels rose to No. 16 in the national polls and posted a 5-2 mark at Roy Kidd Stadium.

In 2021, ECU completed the biggest single-season turnaround in program history as the Colonels went 7-4 after a 3-6 campaign in 2020. Eastern Kentucky defeated three teams that were ranked in the preseason top-25 and went 5-1 at Roy Kidd Stadium. ECU climbed as high as No. 19 in the national rankings and won five consecutive games for the first time since 2014.

In his first season, he helped the Colonels to a road win at The Citadel, a near upset of FBS Troy, a victory over No. 11 Central Arkansas and a 49-17 win against Western Carolina in the 2020 Opportunity Bowl. The win over the 11th ranked Bears was the program's first victory over a ranked team since 2013 and the first win over a non-conference ranked team since 2003 when Eastern Kentucky beat No. 11 Appalachian State. ECU was recognized as the national team of the week three times during the 2020 season.

Before coming to Eastern Kentucky, Brown was the assistant strength and conditioning coach at Marshall from February of 2013 to 2020. While with the Thundering Herd, he collaborated on the design and execution of all aspects of the football strength and conditioning program, and implemented unique strength and conditioning programs for softball and baseball. He also created and directed all elements of the nutrition program at Marshall.

From January 2012 to February 2013, Brown served as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach at The Citadel. He oversaw the strength and conditioning programs for baseball and cross country while providing year-round assistance with the football and wrestling teams. While serving as an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Central Florida from May 2010 to December 2011, Brown worked directly with the football, baseball, tennis, soccer, track and men's golf programs.

Brown earned a bachelor's of science degree in exercise physiology from Central Florida in May 2011. He also is certified by the Collegiate Strength & Conditioning Coaches Association.

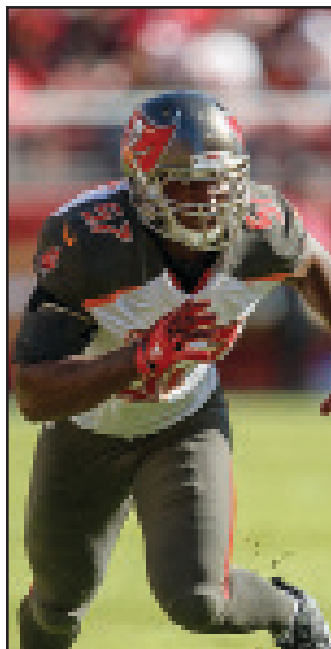

Eastern Kentucky University possesses one of the richest traditions in all of college football, and the future appears to be just as bright as the past. Now in its second century of football, the current group of Colonels hopes to leave its mark in the ECU annals just as the first 100 teams put together 'A Century of Excellence.'

EKU football has come a long way since the first organized game was played in 1909 on Stateland Field, and much of the credit is given to Roy Kidd, an All-American quarterback at Eastern in 1953, who returned to his alma mater in 1963 and proceeded to build a national powerhouse.

Kidd's 39-year record at Eastern concluded in 2002 with 314 wins, 124 losses and eight ties, for a remarkable .713 winning percentage. He was twice chosen National I-AA Coach of the Year and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame as well as the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame.

The popularity of Eastern football grew so rapidly in the 1960s that Hanger Stadium, the home of the Maroons (the school's nickname later became Colonels) since 1936, was too small for the large enthusiastic crowds. Eastern paid "old" Hanger a fitting farewell in 1968 as it thrashed rival Morehead State, 35-7. A new era in ECU football began the following year when the Colonels moved to Hanger Field, a modern 20,000-seat facility. Eastern christened its new playing field with a 29-10 drubbing of Austin Peay. In 1990, the stadium portion of the football complex was named in honor of Roy Kidd. The Colonels defeated the University of Central Florida that day, 24-12.

There have been many memorable moments in the rich heritage of Eastern football. One came in 1967 when ECU, the OVC champion, won the NCAA Midwest Regional championship by defeating Ball State, 27-13, in the Grantland Rice Bowl. Another occurred in 1954 when Eastern's third regular season undefeated team (the first was in 1940) made the school's first bowl appearance only to fall to the University of Omaha, 7-6, in the Tangerine Bowl.

Under the guidance of Coach Kidd on Dec. 18, 1982, ECU capped a perfect 13-0 season by defeating Delaware in the NCAA

Division I-AA title game, 17-14, for the University's second national championship.

That victory marked Eastern's fourth-straight appearance in the Division I-AA championship game, having also won the title in 1979 while taking the runner-up trophies in both 1980 and 1981.

Kidd's status among the coaching profession was well-known, but Eastern has had other successful coaches during its football history. Previous coaches include James Park (1909), Clyde Wilson (1910-11), Charles Keith (1912), Ben Bernard (1913-16), Clyde McCoy (1919-21), George Hembree (1922-28), Charles "Turkey" Hughes (1929-34), Rome Rankin (1935-42, 1945-46), Tom Samuels (1947-53), Glenn Presnell (1954-63), Danny Hope (2003-07), Dean Hood (2008-15) and Mark Elder (2016-19).

Walt Wells, the program's 15th head coach, took the helm in December 2019. He served previously at ECU as an assistant under Kidd (1997-02) and again under Hood (2015).

Following Kidd's retirement, the Colonels won conference championships in 2007, 2008 and 2011 under head coaches Hope and Hood. ECU remained a player on the national stage with FCS playoff appearances in 2007, 2008, 2011 and 2014.

Eastern Kentucky's 17-13 win at Austin Peay on Nov. 3, 2018 was the 600th victory in program history. The Colonels are now 609-391-38 in 106 seasons of football. ECU was the 20th FCS program to win 600 games.

Since 1948, ECU has won 16 regular season conference titles outright (1954, '67, '68, '74, '76, '81, '82, '83, '84, '88, '91, '93, '94, '97, '07 and '08), shared five titles (1962, '86, '87, '90 and '11).

EKU football has produced 67 All-Americans and has had 40 players drafted into the professional ranks. Three of the best known former Eastern players

are 1972 All-American Wally Chambers, who was voted 1973 NFC Defensive Rookie of the Year as a tackle with the Chicago Bears; 1993 All-American Chad Bratzke, who spent 11 years with the New York Giants and Indianapolis Colts as a pass-rushing defensive end; and Noah Spence, the 39th pick in the 2016 NFL Draft.

The 2021 campaign marks the 43rd season for the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), formerly Division I-AA, playoffs. The 2013 season featured an expanded 24-team bracket for the championship as another automatic berth (Pioneer Football League) and three at-large teams were added to the playoff field. More than 120 schools (including provisional members) play FCS football and more than half of those have been in the playoffs at least once.

Only North Dakota State (eight), Georgia Southern (six), Youngstown State (four), Appalachian State (three) and two-time champs Eastern Kentucky, Marshall, Montana and James Madison have won the title more than once.

The FCS playoffs provides for a maximum field of 24 teams. Sixteen teams play in the opening round with the winners joining the remaining eight teams the following week in the round of 16. Eleven conferences (Big South, Big Sky, Colonial Athletic, Mid-Eastern Athletic, Missouri Valley Football, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Pioneer Football, Southern and Southland) have been granted automatic qualification for the 2021 championship. The remaining 13 teams will be selected at-large by the FCS Football Committee.

This year's title game will be played at Frisco, Texas on Jan. 8, 2022 and mark the 12th consecutive year Frisco has hosted the championship contest.

Only four teams qualified for the NCAA FCS playoffs in the event's first three years. The field expanded for the 1981 championship (eight teams), the 1982 championship (12 teams), the 1986 championship (16 teams) and the 2010 championship (20 teams).

Roy Kidd Stadium, Hanger Field and the Robert B. Begley Building, the home of Colonel football since 1969, is one of the most unique, architecturally-designed academic-athletics complexes in the nation.

Roy Kidd Stadium was enhanced significantly in 2017. New east side seating was completed with 3,000 new bleacher seats and a concourse that features modern concessions and restroom facilities. The first floor is dedicated to the benefit of Colonel football student-athletes and includes a new team locker room featuring a team lounge, equipment room and a game day training area.

The entire structure was constructed with future expansion and renovations to Roy Kidd Stadium in mind.

More than a half million fans have visited Roy Kidd Stadium since 2000, highlighted by a crowd of 22,700 which watched the Colonels take on Western Kentucky in 2004 (the fifth-largest crowd in Roy Kidd Stadium history).

The stadium portion of the Begley Complex was named in honor of former head football coach Roy Kidd. The dedication took place on Sept. 8, 1990, when the Colonels defeated Central Florida, 24-12. Eastern opened the stadium in 1969 defeating Austin Peay, 29-10. Hanger Field was officially dedicated on Sept. 26, 1970 when the Colonels downed East Tennessee, 10-6. The field itself continues to bear the name Hanger Field.

The nine-story structure provides seating for approximately 20,000 football spectators. Hanger Field underwent a transformation from natural grass to synthetic turf in the spring of 2009.

The Colonels have found Kidd Stadium to their liking during its 52-year history. Entering the 2021 season, Eastern has won 229, lost 62, and tied 1 (.786 winning percentage), and had a home undefeated streak of 36 games which began on Sept. 23, 1978, and was brought to a halt Nov. 27, 1983. EKU also ran off 27-straight wins at Hanger Field from 1985-89 and had a Roy Kidd Stadium OVC consecutive game winning streak of 22 games dating back to 1977 broken in 1984 and another 20-game OVC win streak stopped in 1990.

The single-level pressbox, which towers 94 feet above the playing field, has working space for approximately 80 media representatives, including private coaching booths, radio booths and film areas. In the summer of 2013, new Daktronics LED video displays and a custom audio system were installed at RKS.

Facilities inside the stadium include offices for the athletics staff, locker rooms and media interview room. The structure also has 10 racquetball courts, two basketball courts, a gymnastics area, two cardiovascular rooms and classroom space to serve 2,000 students simultaneously.

There have been many successful years of Eastern Kentucky football, but a few truly stand out as memorable and historic seasons.

Hall of Fame coach Roy Kidd took over an EKU program in the 1960s in need of a spark. In just his fourth season at the helm, the Colonels won the 1967 NCAA Mideast Region championship. A decade later, Kidd led Eastern to four straight national championship game appearances while capturing the 1979 and 1982 national crowns. In those four years, Eastern compiled a 46-7 record, was continually ranked No. 1 in the nation, finishing at the top spot in the country in both the 1981 and 1982 seasons.

Those championship seasons also set in motion a string of 17 Division I FCS playoff appearances during the next 19 seasons for the Colonels that three times – 1986, 1988 and 1991 – ended just short of national title games with close semifinal round losses.

Today's Colonels, now led by seventh-year head coach Dean Hood, hope to make some history of their own in 2014 and build upon the successes of past EKU championship squads.

## 1967 Mideast Region Champions

In the 10 years prior to 1967, Eastern Kentucky had managed only two winning seasons. However, Coach Kidd and the Colonels tallied a respectful 7-3 record in 1966, setting the stage for the first EKU championship team.

"This team got the championship tradition started at Eastern," said Kidd, who coached the Colonels to 315 victories in 39 years, won 16 OVC titles, two national I-AA crowns and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003. "They have always been and will always be one of my favorite teams."

Things started out on a sour note that season when the Colonels opened their 10-game schedule with a 16-0 loss to a tough University of Dayton team on the road in a contest that saw EKU held to just 34 yards rushing, while the Flyers piled up 231 yards on the ground.

This was the last game that the Colonels would lose that year.

The second game of the year was a 35-7 decision for the Colonels over OVC rival East Tennessee that produced the emergence of freshman tailback Jack McCoy. He finished the game with 74 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Sophomore quarterback Tim Speaks, subbing for an injured Jim Guice, directed the Colonels to a 37-0 win over Austin Peay in the third game. The EKU defensive unit, known as the 'Headhunters,' lived up to their moniker by shutting out the Governors as tri-captain Chuck Siemon and all-conference linebacker Ron Reed combined for 16 tackles and 20 assists in the win.

Eastern's quality depth at quarterback again proved to be too much for opponent number four that season as Speaks started at signal-caller for the Colonels, while first team All-OVC and All-American candidate Guice was used in passing situations only, as Eastern edged Middle Tennessee, 14-7. Eastern's last non-conference game came the following week when 15 records

fell for the Colonels in a 55-0 trouncing of Northwood (Mich.) College. Guice was 17-of-30 in this game for 260 yards and four touchdown tosses.

The stage was set for the game of the year for who else but cross-state rival Western Kentucky who was visiting EKU for what would turn out to be its last appearance at the antiquated Hanger Stadium that stood in the middle of campus.

Every seat in the stadium was filled and many spectators stood on the hillside in the east end zone to form the record-setting 15,000 crowd in attendance that sunny Saturday afternoon.

One of the most memorable goal-line stands in Eastern history occurred in this game as the Headhunters stopped Western's All-American tailback Dickie Moore six out of seven times from the just outside the one-yard line, before Moore finally punched it in on the eighth try for a touchdown.

Eastern countered this score when fullback Bob Beck's 10-yard touchdown run was followed by Guice's two-point conversion run for the tying points, 14-14. A late would-be game-winning touchdown pass from Guice to Don Buehler was overthrown by inches as the game ended in a tie.

Three more easy victories and a tie with Morehead State in the regular season finale left Eastern with a 7-1-2 record. The Colonels were then chosen to make the University's second bowl appearance against Indiana Collegiate Conference champion Ball State University in the Grantland Rice Bowl in Murfreesboro, Tenn.

This bowl game was being held to decide the NCAA Mideast Regional Championship, which included a 10-state and 100 team area, one of four such college division championships set up by the NCAA that year.

Eastern went into the game shorthanded as the NCAA would not allow freshmen to play, which kept running back McCoy and fullback Butch Evans on the sidelines. Kidd countered this ruling by moving All-American receiver Aaron Marsh to tailback.

This move paid off as Marsh made a huge contribution in the first half, picking up 46 yards on the ground, grabbing three passes and totaling 39 yards on two punt returns, before being forced from the game with a back injury.

After the Colonels were leading 13-7 at the break, it was time for one of the biggest plays in Colonel football history when All-American nose guard Teddy Taylor burst through the line, stole the ball from Cardinal quarterback Doc Heath and ran 39 yards for a score that put Eastern up, 20-7.

Ball State, ranked fifth in the nation heading into the Grantland Rice Bowl, responded by reaching EKU's nine yard-line before the Colonel defense stiffened and stopped the Cardinals' drive. The next few minutes was vintage Guice. He sliced and diced the Ball State defense, hitting six straight passes for 64 of the 91 yards in the drive, and culminated the back-breaking sequence of events with a 28-yard scoring pass to Ted Holcomb that provided the Colonels with an insurmountable 27-7 lead.

In the jubilant ECU locker room following the 27-13 victory over Ball State, the tri-captains for the '67 Colonels – Harry Lenz, Siemon and Marsh – presented the game ball to their elated coach, Roy Kidd, signifying his first championship season at Eastern.

“Coach, you are the best coach in the OVC, the Mideast Region and anywhere else that anybody plays football,” Lenz said.

In addition to Guice, Marsh and Holcomb’s heroics and the overall play of the Headhunters in the Bowl victory, John Tazel concluded his fabulous ECU career with a remarkable performance that included 11 pass receptions for 127 yards and a touchdown.

“Ball State was a very good team,” Kidd said. “The thing that bothered me the most was their size. They were not only one of the biggest, but also one of the quickest teams we had ever faced.”

Guice, who was chosen MVP of the game, set a Grantland Rice Bowl record for passing percentage (15-of-19, .788), throwing for 136 yards and two scores.

“When you talk about what got it all started for the tremendous success this program has enjoyed for the past 40 years, you have to start here with this 1967 Eastern team,” former ECU head football coach Danny Hope said.

## 1979 National Champions

Eastern’s entry in national football prominence began ominously during spring break in 1979 when Colonel offensive lineman Don McKinnon tragically lost his life quickly with a bout with meningitis on March 11, 1979. ECU’s football family responded to this unpredictable loss to its football family by wearing McKinnon’s No. 68 on their helmets and by having the No. 68 painted in the corner of each end zone at Hanger Stadium for the 1979 year.

The 1979 season began on the heels of an 8-2 1978 campaign when ECU opened the season at NCAA Division I-A opponent Kent State. A goal line stand late in the game gave Eastern a hard-fought 17-14 win over the Golden Flashes and signaled to the football world that this '79 team could indeed be something special.

Eastern won four of its next five contests, defeating Troy State, Austin Peay, Middle Tennessee and Division I-A Cal-State Fullerton, losing only to East Tennessee, 27-20. This quick start propelled the Colonels to a 5-1 record and a No. 1 national ranking coming into ECU’s annual Homecoming battle with arch-rival Western Kentucky.

The 54th renewal of the state’s oldest football rivalry on Oct. 20, 1979, between Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky lived up to its billing. The game produced the biggest crowd in Roy Kidd Stadium history as 25,300 football fans filled every inch of stadium, bleacher and hillside seating available on a beautiful 75-degree sunny afternoon.

Fifty-nine minutes into the contest the scoreboard read Eastern 8, Western 6 with the difference being a two-point conversion pass from ECU quarterback Bill Hughes to tight end Cris Curtis. However, the Hilltoppers were driving and obviously setting up what the Red and White faithful surely figured would be a game-winning field goal.

With just seconds remaining, Western lined up for the 18-yard chip-shot boot that would give the 'Toppers the victory. However, senior All-Ohio Valley Conference defensive back Danny Martin had other ideas as he broke through the line and blocked the kick, preserving the two-point victory.

Elation was short-lived, however. The emotional victory took its toll as the Colonels traveled to Murray State the next weekend for an ABC televised contest that ended with the Colonels on the short end of a 24-7 Racer victory.

Eastern rebounded with three straight impressive victories — 35-0 over Tennessee Tech, 27-21 over No. 2 ranked Jackson State and 34-7 over conference rival Morehead State. These three wins, coupled with Grambling’s loss to Southern, caught the I-AA football committee’s attention and Eastern entered the four-team playoff for the national championship as an at-large representative.

ECU made the most of its invitation, hosting the game and ABC television in what was called by one veteran network announcer as “the most exciting football game I have ever seen.” The Colonels were pitted against No. 1 ranked Nevada-Reno and its outstanding tailback Frank Hawkins in the opening round game.

Once again, much like in the Western Kentucky contest played earlier that season at ECU, it seemed as though a last-minute kick was going to send Eastern to defeat. With Nevada-Reno having reeled off 20 straight points to tie the score at 23-all with 39 seconds left, All-American noseguard Joe Richard took a page out of Danny Martin’s ‘kick-blocking book’ and stormed through the line to block the extra point, leaving the score knotted at 23, keeping ECU’s national title dreams alive.

In the first overtime period, both teams scored a touchdown and kicked the extra point. In the second overtime, Eastern’s defense stiffened and held the Wolfpack scoreless on its possession.

After moving the ball to the one-yard line, Kidd called on the reliable David Flores who booted the winning 17-yard field goal that gave the Colonels the 33-30 victory and sent Eastern packing to Orlando, Fla., for an appearance at the Citrus Bowl Stadium and a match-up with the nation’s best I-AA defense — the Engineers of Lehigh University in the national championship game.

"That 1979 team was a group of kids that never gave up," Kidd said. "They kept getting better and better as the year wore on and kept plugging until they reached their goal of winning it all. If you believe in destiny, I believe that team was destined to be winners from the very first game of that season."

Eastern literally ran all over the vaunted Lehigh defense, totaling 288 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns. All-OVC fullback Dale Patton and tailback Alvin Miller led the way with 121 and 81 yards, respectively, on the ground. Miller was named MVP of the national championship game, as he totaled 144 all-purpose yards in the Colonels' dominating 30-7 win.

The jubilant ECU locker room underneath the massive Citrus Bowl stadium was filled with tears of joy and tears of remembrance as Don MacKinnon's mother and sister made their way through a host of well-wishers, members of the media and Colonel players and coaches to where Coach Kidd stood with the coveted national championship game ball.

As Don's mother, Elizabeth MacKinnon, accepted the game ball, thoughts went back to the goal-line stand in the season opening victory against Kent State, to Danny Martin's blocked field goal against Western Kentucky, to Joe Richards' blocked extra point against Nevada-Reno and to other "big-time" plays that kept the dream alive.

"I really think his [Don MacKinnon] memory was an inspiration to this team," Martin said, whose No. 7 jersey will long be remembered as always being around the football and making big play after big play. "I know that sometimes when I was down and things weren't going well, I'd find myself thinking about him."

Miller echoed the thoughts of his teammate.

"I gave my best for Don and so did everybody else," said the always affable Miller.

"We were really a close bunch of guys in '79 that had a lot of fun playing football together," Hope remembered. "I believe as I look back on our football history this team might have been extra special for the University because this was the first time that they got to take Cinderella to the Ball. There's always a lot of memories and pride felt when you talk about that first national championship team."

As ECU was returning to the hotel after the game, the marquee at the team's headquarters in Orlando told the story of a very exciting 1979 football season –

"Congratulations! Eastern Kentucky No. 1 National Champs."

## 1980 National Finalists

Thirty-three lettermen returned for Kidd as the Colonels tried to defend their national crown in 1980. The season began with a shockingly close 24-21 come-from-behind victory over Kentucky State and, seven games into the season, Eastern stood with a 5-2 overall record and 2-2 conference mark. Much like the year before, it was time to make a statement, and the Colonels did just that, reeling off four straight wins over Murray State, Tennessee Tech, Division I-A East Carolina and Morehead State to secure its second straight at-large bid into the four-team I-AA playoff field.

Instead of opening at the friendly confines of Eastern's Hanger Field, the I-AA committee sent the Colonels to Bethlehem, Pa., for a rematch of the 1979 national championship contest to do battle with the then-ranked No. 1 Lehigh Engineers. In a tight contest, Colonel tailback Anthony Braxton's 40-yard run down the near sideline gave ECU the boost it needed in a 23-20 upset victory.

This set up a second straight national championship game – this time in Sacramento, Calif., in the Camellia Bowl versus the Boise State University Broncos. A long touchdown pass from quarterback Chris Isaac to split end David Booze gave Eastern the 29-24 lead with just 55 seconds left until a second consecutive national title.

Boise State, however, methodically advanced the ball downfield and faced a fourth and goal from the Colonels' 16-yard line. Bronco quarterback Joe Aliotti was able to elude the Colonel pass rush and found an open receiver in the end zone for the game-winning touchdown. The 31-29 final verdict was gut-wrenching and difficult to accept on the foggy, drizzly California day as the 1980 Colonels had to settle for the national

## 1981 National Finalists

Kidd, who was honored at the conclusion of the 1980 season as the Chevrolet and ABC Sports I-AA National Coach of the Year, welcomed back 36 lettermen for the 1981 season as ECU went 10-1 through regular season play with the only blemish coming at Division I-A Navy.

Following the loss to the Midshipmen in the third game of the year, sophomore tailback Terence Thompson's effort against the University of Akron started the Colonels on a 10-game winning streak that would send ECU into the national title contest with a 12-1 record. On that day in September, Thompson rushed for a then-school record 293 yards and tied another school mark in that same game as he found paydirt four times on runs of 18, 66, 78 and 93 yards.

Eastern's 19-11 victory at Hanger Field over Western Kentucky gave the Colonels sole possession of first place in the OVC. That win was preserved when defensive tackle Randy Taylor sacked Hilltopper quarterback Ralph Antone late in the game. Two weeks later, ECU clinched its seventh conference crown and first since 1976 when the Colonels demolished Tennessee Tech, 63-20.

In the first round of the playoffs which had expanded that year to three rounds, ECU hosted Tubby Raymond's Delaware Blue Hens in a shootout. Colonel quarterback Chris Isaac hit flanker Ranard McPhaul on a 32-yard scoring pass midway through the final quarter to give Eastern the lead. Later, defensive back Gus Parks ended any Delaware hopes of springing the upset with an interception as ECU held on for a 35-28 victory, sending Eastern into a rematch of the 1980 national title game with a semifinal contest at Boise, Idaho, against the BSU Broncos.

On a windy, snowswept lake-blue color Astro-turf field before 22,000 rabid Bronco fans, Eastern avenged its devastating loss the year before to BSU by handing Boise State a 23-17 defeat on the strength of three Jamie Lovett barefoot-kicked field goals.

For the third straight year, Eastern found itself in the national championship game, this time in Wichita Falls, Texas, in a Pioneer Bowl appearance against Idaho State. Bengal quarterback Mike Machurek's accurate touch was too much for the Colonel defense as he completed 29-of-44 passes for 330 yards and four scores as Idaho State won the national crown with a 34-23 decision over the Colonels.

A remarkable season that was highlighted among other exciting plays by flanker Jerry Parrish's 87-yard run on a reverse for a score in Eastern's 14-3 win over Dayton; senior roverback and 1999 College Football Hall of Fame inductee George Floyd's game-saving interception in a 24-20 defeat of Murray State, one of a school-record 10 interceptions that season; and the emergence of "The Bruise Brothers" at linebacker – junior Alex Dominguez and sophomore David Hill – had come to its conclusion with Eastern finishing the year ranked No. 1 in the nation with a final 12-2 overall record.

"You really can't be sad about this season," recalled ECU offensive line coach Tom Jones. "You've got to realize not everyone gets to the finals ... especially three years in a row."

## 1982 National Champions

The string of four straight national championship game appearances would end in 1982 during the most magical of seasons which culminated in an undefeated 13-0 record, a No. 1 national ranking and the school's second national football crown.

The '82 year began with a nail-biter at Orangeburg, S.C., against South Carolina State. Eastern was trailing 19-17 late in the game when defensive end Allen Young blocked a Bulldog punt, setting up Lovett's game-winning 39-yard field goal.

"We tried to keep the ball in the middle of the goal posts," Kidd said. "We noticed that the ones he had missed were from the hashmarks."

Before the game-winning kick, Lovett groomed his spot

to attempt the field goal by pulling the tall grass from the turf, leveling a smoother surface in which to kick. His quick work brought the needed result as his field goal fluttered through the uprights to start the Colonels on their undefeated year.

This win featured quarterback Tuck Woolum in his first start for the Colonels and he responded with a 14-of-28 afternoon passing for 209 yards, including a 70-yard strike to tight end Tron Armstrong.

In the fifth game of the year, a 35-10 win over Middle Tennessee, split end Steve Bird was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against the Blue Raiders which included six receptions for 127 yards and two touchdowns. Tailback Eddie Hairston aided the cause by rushing for 155 yards and a score as the Colonels solidified their No. 1 ranking and set up the daunting task ahead of going to Bowling Green and doing battle with Western Kentucky.

For the first time since 1968 when Eastern defeated Western 16-7 in the dedication game of the Hilltoppers' L.T. Smith Stadium, the Colonels came away with a victory. A Woolum-to-Bird 49-yard touchdown pass got the scoring underway for ECU, as Terrence Thompson returned from

an ankle injury to rush for four scores and 143 yards in the 35-21 Colonel win.

The Eastern defense, led by Taylor, Dominguez, Hill, noseguard Mike McShane, Parks and defensive back Anthony Jones shut down the Western attack that afternoon with the win running the Colonels' record to 6-0.

And then it was time for "The Game" – the contest that is still talked about and etched in the memory banks of all diehard Colonel fans.

Murray State was the opponent, a national TV audience watched on the SuperStation TBS and 18,100 fans were in attendance on a beautiful October night.

To win this game and keep its record unblemished for the year, Eastern had to mount a 16-play, 73-yard drive that featured an

unheard-of three fourth-down conversions, including one fourth-down run by fullback Nicky Yeast that netted eight inches on a fourth and six-inch situation.

In a highlight-reel type game, it was once again the combination of Bird and Woolum that eventually put the game in the “W” column for the Colonels. This time, their six-yard touchdown hook-up with 14 seconds left gave Eastern a 21-20 lead. The students were so involved that twice they rushed on to the field with excitement, once when Bird’s score had tied the game at 20-all and once when Lovett’s extra point gave Eastern the lead.

After Eastern was assessed 27 yards in penalties for the fans rushing onto the field, Lovett had to kick off from the 13-yard line, setting up the Racers near midfield after the return. Not until Anthony Jones made an interception near the goal line did EKU pull off one of the most memorable wins in school history.

“We had lost our starting middle guard [McShane] and had an offensive tackle [Mark Willoughby] playing defensive tackle,” Kidd said in support of his team’s defensive effort.

After EKU clinched the OVC championship with a 34-17 win over Tennessee Tech and rounded out the regular season with a 20-3 defeat of rival Morehead State, Eastern was set to enter the I-AA playoffs with a spotless 10-0 record.

In the opening game of the playoffs, the Colonels gave coach Roy Kidd the best birthday present they could when they defeated coach Dennis Erickson’s Idaho Vandals, 38-30, on a warm December 4th night at Hanger Field. Offensively, Bird highlighted the playoff win with seven receptions for 154 yards and two touchdowns, including one catch of 48 yards where his body was fully extended parallel to the ground to haul in the slightly overthrown Woolum pass.

“This was the best game I’ve ever seen any individual have,” said Kidd as he talked about the All-American receiver Bird who hails from Kidd’s hometown of Corbin. The game was sealed when Jones made an interception with 38 seconds remaining to end the last Vandal scoring attempt.

The second round of the playoffs found Eastern hosting the big, fast, talented Tennessee State Tigers who featured arguably one of the best teams to ever play at Hanger Field with players like defensive end Richard Dent, running back James Hunter and fullback Larry Kinnebrew on the roster.

Somehow, with zeros showing on the clock at the end of the fourth quarter, Eastern had escaped with a 13-7 victory. Longtime TSU coach John Merritt had boldly predicted at the two team’s combined banquet the night before the game that “we were going to cage the bird.” And TSU was able to do that, but yet failed to put but seven points on the board, as EKU won its 12th straight game of the season and its 31st consecutive home game.

The Delaware Blue Hens were now all that stood between EKU and a second national title. The venue – Wichita Falls, Texas and a second straight appearance in the I-AA Pioneer Bowl.

In the title game, Parks blocked his sixth kick of the season, this one a Delaware field goal attempt which was scooped up by defensive end Richard Bell who romped 77 yards for a touchdown as EKU ran out to a 17-0 lead over the Blue Hens. Although Delaware scored 14 fourth-quarter points, the Colonel defense held firm and Eastern had its second national football title.

“Tuck became a super player and was a real leader that year,” Kidd said. “And our defense played its best two games of the year in the playoffs against Tennessee State and Delaware.”

In those final two games, Eastern held the nation’s top two scoring teams to a combined total of just 21 points.

“The 1982 season was simply amazing,” Bird said, who signed with the NFL’s St. Louis Cardinals upon graduation. “Everybody on that team brought something to the table and we all believed in each other. We went into that huddle. There was no funny business. We each had a job to do and we went out and did it and I’m talking about all 11 guys on every play.

“Tuck was great and he deserved to be the captain,” continued Bird. “He was always there for everybody, both on and off the field. Everybody loved him and he just kept proving people wrong with the way he played. I’ve been around a lot of teams and that was a unique bunch of seniors that refused to lose.”

Four years ... 53 games ... 46 wins ... four straight national championship games ... two national titles ... numerous weeks of being ranked No. 1 during those four seasons ... two conference championships ... the 1982 season culminating with a perfect 13-0 record ... first OVC team to win 13 games and one of the first in the history of college football to reach that win total in one season.

Can we say the word DYNASTY?

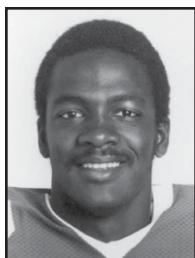

## George Floyd (inducted 1999)



George Floyd, former defensive back for Eastern Kentucky University from 1978-81, was among the 1999 Divisional Class of Inductees for the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame. Induction ceremonies were held in South Bend, Ind.

"We're very happy George was chosen for such a high honor," former ECU head football coach Roy Kidd said, who joined Floyd in the Hall in August 2003. "I know one thing, that

young man could play the game of football. And one of the things I liked best about George was that he didn't mind hitting people. He was always around the football and was certainly a big reason for our success those four years he played for us."

Floyd was a member of Eastern's first I-AA national championship team (1979) and played for two other Colonel teams (1980, 1981) that went to the national championship game before losing. He was a first-team All-American those last two years he played for ECU.

The defensive back was a four-year starter and served as the team co-captain in 1981. Floyd was selected as the 1980 Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year after recording five interceptions, one of which he returned 100 yards for a touchdown. While at Eastern, Floyd set several school records, two of which still stand – career interceptions (22) and career interception return yardage (328).

"We are proud of the Divisional Hall of Fame program, now in its fifth year, which continues to positively impact college football by honoring players and coaches from the divisional level with the ultimate honor, induction into the College Football Hall of Fame," stated Chairman of the National Football Foundation, Jon F. Hanson.

Floyd played four years (1983-86) of professional football for the National Football League's New York Jets. He is currently an assistant principal at Boone County High School in Florence, Ky.

Included in the 1999 Divisional Hall of Fame Class were George Bork, quarterback, Northern Illinois (1960-63); Randy Trautman, defensive tackle, Boise State (1961-64); Willie Gallimore, halfback, Florida A&M (1953-56); Jim LeClair, defensive tackle, North Dakota (1970-71); Teel Bruner, defensive back, Centre College (1982-85); and Floyd.

Coaches in the '99 Hall of Fame Class were Billy Nicks, Morris Brown (1930-42) and Prairie View A&M (1945-47, '52-65) and James Sochor, California-Davis (1970-89).



## Roy Kidd (inducted 2003)



The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame inducted legendary former Eastern Kentucky football coach Roy Kidd into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003.

Kidd, who retired from his coaching duties at ECU, his alma mater, after the 2002 football season as the sixth all-time winningest coach in NCAA Division I or I-AA football history, coached the Colonels for 39 years, compiling a 314-124-8 (.713) overall record.

During his tenure at Eastern from 1964-2002, he led the Colonels to 16 Ohio Valley Conference titles and made a record 17 NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances. ECU appeared in four consecutive NCAA Division I-AA national championship contests, winning the 1979 and 1982 national titles.

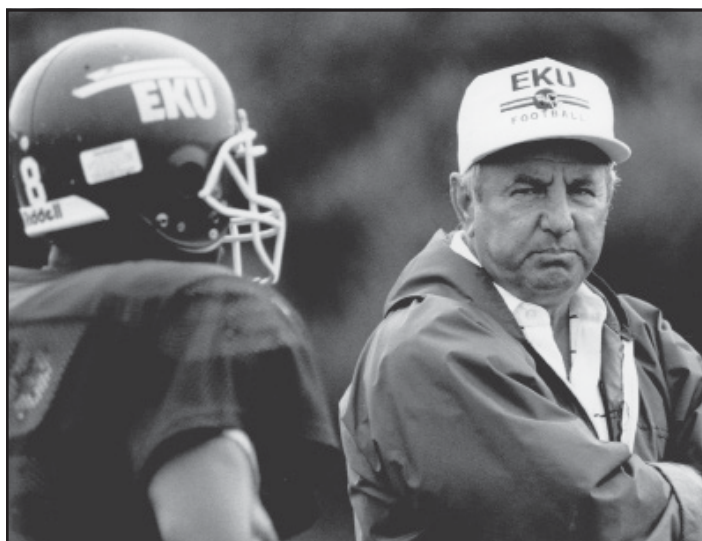
A two-time Division I-AA National Coach of the Year and 10-time OVC Coach of the Year, Kidd has the third most victories at a single school among all divisions in NCAA history. In 39 seasons, his teams recorded 37 non-losing seasons, including a streak of 25 consecutive seasons with a winning record.

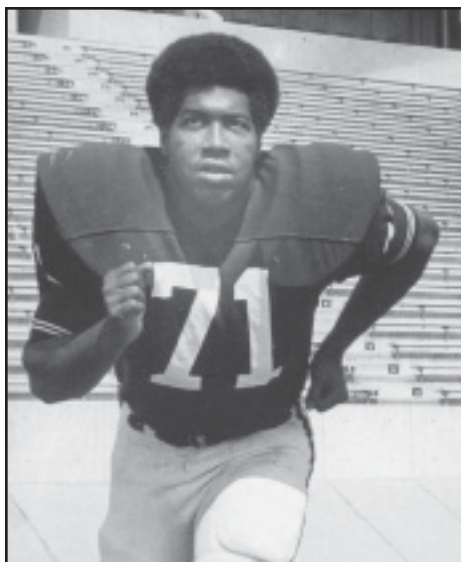
Kidd, who has coached 41 players who have gone on to sign with National Football League teams, 55 All-Americans and 202 first team All-OVC selections, is a member of the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame and has had the ECU football stadium named in his honor.

A past president of the American Football Coaches Association, Kidd has been a two-time *Lexington Herald Sportsman* of the Year.

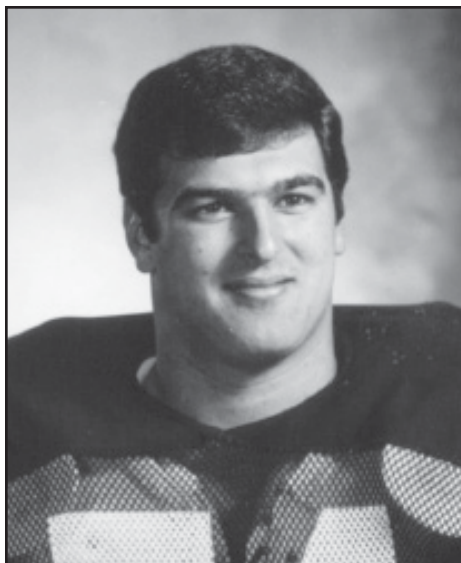
The Kentucky High School Athletic Association's highest football award each season, given to the best high school football player in the state of Kentucky, is named the Roy Kidd Award. Beginning with the 2003 season, the OVC Coach of the Year award was named the Roy Kidd OVC Coach of the Year Award.

Kidd was inducted into the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame on May 30, 2003, at the league's Honors Luncheon held in Nashville, Tenn.

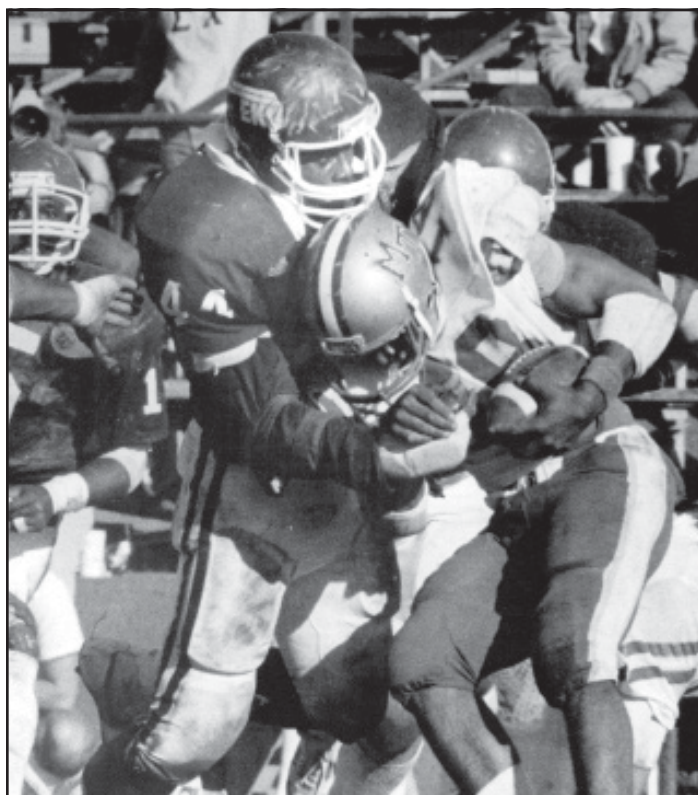

## EKU Athletics Hall of Fame

On Dec. 14, 2005, Eastern Kentucky University announced the creation of an Athletics Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame's mission is to commemorate and honor student-athletes, other individuals and teams whose accomplishments have contributed to the esteemed tradition of Colonel Athletics and whose character has reflected positively on the University.

The inaugural class of the ECU Athletics Hall of Fame, featuring 38 distinguished individuals, was inducted during an evening ceremony on Nov. 3, 2006, in the Keen Johnson Ballroom. Almost 300 people attended the induction ceremony. The honorees were also recognized prior to ECU's home football game against Murray State the following day.

The inaugural class was comprised of The Founders, a group of 25 who were previously honored at the 1974 Centennial Athletics Awards Banquet, and 13 members who were chosen by a selection committee.

The Department of Athletics accepts nominations for the Hall of Fame on a rolling basis. Nominations must be received by March 1 to be considered for that year's class.

**Jeremiah Bell  
(1999-2002)**

Played safety for coach Roy Kidd for three seasons... Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors and first-team All-America recognition as a junior... started as a freshman in 1999, recording 46 tackles, 16 assists, four caused fumbles and an interception... first-team All-OVC as a sophomore with 63 tackles, 47 assists and two interceptions... award-winning junior season included 61 solo tackles, 25 assists and six interceptions... finalist for the Buck Buchanan award after the 2001 season... drafted in the 6th round of the 2003 NFL draft by the Miami Dolphins... 114 tackles, three interceptions, and a Pro Bowl appearance in 2009... named to Eastern's All-Century Team in 2009... played 11 seasons in the NFL.

**Steve Bird  
(1979-82)**

Four-year letterman and three-year starter at wide receiver... played in four consecutive national championship games... helped lead Eastern to an undefeated 13-0 season which culminated in the school's second national championship in 1982... a first-team All-OVC choice in 1982 and also selected to the I-AA All-American team by Kodak, The Sporting News and Associated Press... OVC's Male Athlete of the Year for 1982-83... led Eastern and the OVC with 63 receptions for 1,056 yards and 10 touchdowns as a senior... drafted in the fifth round of the 1983 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Cardinals... played two seasons in the NFL.

**Joe Blankenship  
(1977-95)**

Played and coached at ECU... transferred to Eastern Kentucky from Kentucky to play for coach Glenn Presnell... graduated from ECU in 1965... joined the staff of ECU head coach Roy Kidd in 1977, coaching

linebackers and special teams until 1995... helped lead Eastern Kentucky to two national titles, a national runner-up, 11 Ohio Valley Conference Championships, and 16 NCAA playoff appearances...

**Chad Bratzke  
(1977-95)**

A two-time All-American and 1994 NFL draft pick. I-AA All-American and All-Conference standout in 1992 and 1993... OVC Defensive Player of the Year in 1993... selected by the New York Giants in the fifth round of the NFL draft... played five seasons in New York before spending five years in Indianapolis... led the Colts in sacks for three consecutive years, including a then-franchise record 12 in 1999... played 129 games in the NFL, recording 413 tackles and 56.5 sacks... All-Madden Team honors in 1999... graciously helped ECU establish its state-of-the-art Student-Athlete Academic Success Center that bears his name.

**Jimmie Brooks  
(1967-70)**

Set ECU's career rushing record with 3,842 yards... ran for 1,102 yards on 224 carries and scored seven touchdowns in 1969... set three school single-game and season rushing records... set OVC career records for most total offensive plays (921) and most rushing attempts (920)... helped lead Colonels to a 30-9-2 record and the NCAA Midwest Championship in 1967... played in the Canadian Football League for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers...

**Charles Bryant  
(1933-36)**

Four-year letterman in baseball and three-year letter-winner in football... posted a four-year career mark of 22 wins and 11 losses as a pitcher... signed to play professional baseball in Nashville, Tenn... pitched for

two seasons and compiled an 8-5 record in 1936...

**Patrick Bugg  
(2003-06)**

Two-time All-American in 2005 and 2006 at tight end... one of only seven players in ECU football history to reach All-American status twice... 29 catches for 434 yards and four touchdowns as a sophomore... second team All-Ohio Valley Conference his sophomore year... first-team All-America and first-team All-OVC in his junior and senior seasons... led the team in receiving yards with 611, while catching 37 passes for seven touchdowns as a senior... ended his career eighth on the Colonels' all-time list for receiving yards... concluded his career with 1,856 yards on 112 receptions with 23 touchdowns.

**Mike Cadore  
(1985-88)**

Played four seasons for coach Roy Kidd... played wide receiver and handled kickoff return duties... nine receptions for 137 yards and a touchdown as a freshman... scored six touchdowns as a sophomore while averaging 41.0 yards on three kickoff returns with 13 rushes for 130 yards and three touchdowns... averaged 37.0 yards per kickoff return in 1987, setting a NCAA record with 232 yards gained on kickoff returns... also had nine carries for 88 yards and a touchdown, and nine receptions for 107 yards and a touchdown... first team All-OVC in 1988... as a senior, posted 26 receptions for 380 yards and three touchdowns, 19 rushes for 303 yards and five scores; and 22 kickoff returns for 564 yards and one touchdown... holds ECU's record with 30.3 yards per kickoff return... finished his Colonel career with 2,355 all-purpose yards... drafted by the New Orleans Saints in the 12th round of the 1989 NFL draft... finished his professional football career with the Montreal Machine.

**Wally Chambers  
(1969-72)**

Led the Colonels in tackles and assists for three straight years... co-recipient of ECU's Most Valuable Player Award as a senior... first-team All-American and first-team All-OVC choice in 1972... selected to the North-South Shrine game and the Senior Bowl... following his senior season, ECU officially retired Chambers' No. 78 jersey... eighth pick of the first round by Chicago in the 1973 NFL draft... became the highest draft choice in ECU and Ohio Valley Conference history... NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year and Pro Bowl selection in 1973... led Chicago in tackles and assists as a rookie.

**Danny Copeland  
(1984-87)**

Started at defensive back at ECU and returned punts and kickoffs his final three seasons... holds Eastern's single-season records for most kickoff returns (34) and most kickoff return yards (967)... two-time All-Ohio Valley Conference choice... GTE Academic All-American in 1987... selected as a member of ECU's All Century Football Team... drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 1988... played five seasons in the NFL... started at strong safety and won a Super Bowl with Washington in 1992.

**Don Daly  
(1951-54)**

All-American halfback for coach Glenn Presnell... captain of the All-Ohio Valley Conference team in 1951... member of the 1954 undefeated Tangerine Bowl team... named head track and assistant football coach at ECU in 1960.

**Fred Darling  
(1938-41)**

First-team All-Ohio Valley Conference tackle for three seasons... All-American as a

senior... played on coach Rom Rankin's undefeated 1940 team... signed professionally with the Detroit Lions... served as line coach under three coaches at ECU... was on the staff of the undefeated 1954 Tangerine Bowl team... head track coach at ECU from 1948-58... coached Eastern's first undefeated track team and an OVC track championship squad.

**Alex Dominguez  
(1979-82)**

Member of ECU's All-Century Football Team... played four seasons for coach Roy Kidd at linebacker... played for all four of Eastern's teams that made it to the national championship game from 1979-82... led team in tackles and assists with 90 stops and 60 assists as a sophomore, the fifth best tackle totals for a single season in school history... second-team All-Ohio Valley Conference in 1980... first-team All-OVC in 1981... led Eastern to the regular season OVC championship and a second consecutive national runner-up finish... served as co-captain in 1982, helping the Colonels to a 13-0 record and the school's second national championship... totaled 69 solo tackles, 64 assists, three caused fumbles, one fumble recovery, one interception and eight tackles for loss... first-team all-conference honors for a second straight season... finished his ECU career as the third all-time leading tackler with 378 stops.

**Jason Dunn  
(1991-95)**

Played four seasons for coach Roy Kidd before embarking on a 12-year NFL career... totaled 11 receptions for 155 yards and 109 yards rushing with one touchdown as a sophomore... named second-team All-OVC and helped lead Eastern to a playoff berth... caught 14 passes for 278 yards with one touchdown and added 60 yards rushing his junior season... closed his Colonel career in

1995 with 20 receptions for 221 yards and two touchdowns and also added 57 yards rushing and one touchdown... drafted in the second round of the 1996 National Football League draft by the Philadelphia Eagles... caught 40 passes for 557 yards and four touchdowns from 1996-98... spent the last eight seasons of his professional career in Kansas City... career totals with the Chiefs included 41 catches for 353 yards and seven touchdowns... inducted into the Kentucky Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2006... member of ECU's All-Century Football Team.

**Lorenzo Fields  
(1987-90)**

Played quarterback at ECU for coach Roy Kidd... threw for 428 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for 362 yards and five touchdowns while leading the Colonels to a 9-3 overall record and a berth in the playoff quarterfinals as a freshman... honorable mention All-Ohio Valley Conference as a sophomore while setting an ECU single season record for highest pass completion percentage at 62.7... threw for 1,463 yards and 10 touchdowns and ran for an additional 418 yards and four touchdowns while leading ECU to the semifinals... served as co-captain and earned second-team All-OVC honors as a junior... threw for 1,377 yards and 13 touchdowns, while rushing for 447 yards and eight scores in directing the Colonels to a 9-3 record and a third straight appearance in the playoffs... suffered a season-ending injury in the seventh game of his senior season... threw for 3,719 yards and 31 touchdowns, while rushing for another 1,418 yards and 20 scores in his career.

**David Flores  
(1977-80)**

Placekicker named to three All-OVC teams... first-team All-OVC selection as a junior...

kicked a 20-yard field goal that gave the Colonels a 33-30 double overtime victory over Nevada Reno and sent ECU to its first national championship game in 1979... held seven OVC single game, single season and career kicking records at the end of his career... first kicker to be chosen Kentucky UPI College Player of the Week... led the OVC in kick scoring in three seasons... made 38-58 field goals and 126-132 extra points in his career.

**George Floyd  
(1978-81)**

Two-time All-American during his ECU career... defensive back for the 1979 national championship team... started all four years and served as team co-captain in 1981... 1980 and 1981 Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year... holds ECU's record for most career interceptions (22) and most career interception return yards (328)... two-time All-OVC honoree... OVC Male Athlete of the Year in 1981-82... member of the All-Time All-OVC Team... fourth-round draft choice of the New York Jets... played four years in the NFL... 1999 inductee into the College Football Hall of Fame.

**Kevin Greve  
(1978-81)**

Four-year letterwinner at offensive guard for coach Roy Kidd... member of ECU's All-Century Football Team... helped lead ECU to its first national title in 1979... part of an offensive line that helped Eastern rush the ball for 2,827 yards and 33 touchdowns... second-team Associated Press All-American as a junior in 1980... helped pave the way for 2,662 rushing yards and 31 touchdowns... a Kodak first-team All-American in 1981 while serving as offensive co-captain... ECU led the OVC in total offense with 5,006 yards, an average of 357.6 yards per game, rushed for 40

touchdowns and averaged 26.8 points per contest during his senior season... first-team All-OVC choice for three seasons.

**Jim Guice  
(1965-68)**

Three-time All-Ohio Valley Conference selection... set ECU records for single-season passing yards, attempts, completions, and touchdowns, as well as career attempts, completions, passing yards, and touchdowns... his 934 plays of total offense during his ECU career is still the program's all-time mark... led Eastern to the OVC championships in 1967 and 1968... helped ECU win a Mid-East Regional title in 1967... All-American selection in 1968.

**Myron Guyton  
(1985-88)**

Four-year starter in the defensive backfield for head coach Roy Kidd... led the Ohio Valley Conference in interceptions during his senior year... led the league in blocked kicks his final two seasons... team captain whom earned ECU MVP honors in 1988... was chosen in the eighth round of the 1989 draft by the New York Giants... led the NFL's second-ranked defense in tackles during his rookie campaign... instrumental part of New York's 1990 Super Bowl championship... recorded 10 interceptions in 98 games in the NFL.

**James Hand  
(1992-95)**

Four-year starter at left guard... played in 48 consecutive games... helped ECU lead the league in rushing with 2,783 yards as a freshman... part of a line that paved the way for two 1,000-yard rushers in his sophomore season... earned the first of three first-team All-OVC awards... led ECU to a second straight league title as a junior... earned first-team I-AA All-American honors... offensive co-captain in his senior season.

**Elroy Harris  
(1985-88)**

Selected as ECU's All-Century tailback in 2009... closed his career with 4,555 yards rushing, second on the Colonels' all-time list... scored 58 career touchdowns and totaled 355 career points, both Eastern records... scored 27 touchdowns and 164 points in 1988, both school single-season records... rushed for 1,134 yards and 14 touchdowns as a freshman... OVC Freshman of the Week six times that season while leading the league in scoring with 88 points... named honorable mention All-OVC... garnered first team All-OVC and honorable mention All-America honors in his sophomore season... rushed for an OVC-leading 1,423 yards and 17 touchdowns... first-team All-America and first team All-OVC as a senior... named OVC Player of the Year... rushed for a school record 1,998 yards and scored 27 touchdowns... set an ECU single-season record for most carries with 371... finished his career as the OVC career leader for most points with 288... selected in the third round by the Seattle Seahawks in the 1989 NFL draft.

**Fred Harvey  
(1983-86)**

Four-year starter and letterman at linebacker... named first-team All-American his senior season by Kodak, Associated Press, The Sporting News and the Walter Camp Football Foundation... second-team AP All-American and the 1986 The Football News I-AA Defensive Player of the Year... ECU's all-time leading tackler with 503 tackles... two-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year in 1984 and 1986... chosen as the 1986-87 OVC Male Athlete of the Year... selected to the All-Ohio Valley Conference first team in 1984 and 1986... picked as one of Eastern's best linebackers on Eastern's All-Century Football team.

**Ernie House  
(1974-77)**

Started three seasons and lettered all four years at quarterback... OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Year in 1976... set a new Eastern record for most yards total offense with 1,685 yards and led the Colonels to the OVC title with an 8-3 record as a junior... first team All-America in 1977... tied an Eastern school record for TD passes in a single game when he threw four in a 49-0 defeat of Austin Peay in his junior season... finished among the OVC's top two in most yards total offense and most yards passing in all three seasons as a starter... set single season school records in both categories... served two seasons as team co-captain... finished his Eastern career with 4,011 yards passing and 28 touchdowns, while adding another 571 yards rushing and 14 rushing TDs... voted offensive MVP by his teammates in 1976 and 1977.

**Bill Hughes  
(1976-79)**

Three-year letterwinner at quarterback... led the Colonels to their first I-AA national championship in 1979... two-time offensive co-captain... chosen OVC Player of the Week twice in leading Eastern to an 8-2 record as a junior... helped ECU lead the league in total offense and points scored... tied an OVC single-game record for accuracy when he completed 12-of-15 passes against Dayton... finished fifth in the league in total offense and fifth in passing offense... led ECU to a national championship as a senior... threw for 1,000 yards and seven touchdowns, while rushing for 264 yards and four more scores... chosen second-team All-OVC and the Colonels' co-MVP on offense.

**Jack Ison  
(1967-96)**

Served as an assistant coach at

ECU for 30 seasons... played halfback during the 1959-60 seasons before graduating in 1961... began his coaching career at Eastern in 1967 in charge of ECU's defensive secondary and took on the dual role of coaching defensive backs and serving as defensive coordinator until 1993 when he was defensive coordinator and in charge of Colonel linebackers... also worked with Eastern's weightlifting and strength and conditioning program for a good portion of his 30-year tenure... implemented a new powerlifting regimen in 1977 that helped prepare future Colonel teams for national dominance... ECU's strength and conditioning room is named the Jack Ison Sports Performance Center.

**Chris Issac  
(1978-81)**

Played four seasons at quarterback... led Eastern to back-to-back national runners-up finishes his junior and senior seasons... team's offensive most valuable player as a junior, throwing for 1,318 yards and seven touchdowns and rushing for 274 yards and five more TDs... ECU's MVP in the national championship game vs. Boise State... second-team All-OVC choice... served as offensive co-captain as a junior and senior... set an ECU single-game record for most yards passing in 1981 when he threw for 318 yards against Murray State... finished his career as the seventh leading all-time ECU passer with 3,611 yards... played three seasons in the Canadian Football League for the Ottawa Roughriders... won the CFL's Rookie of the Year award in 1982... was chosen for the 1982 CFL All-Star Game.

**John Jackson  
(1984-87)**

Offensive tackle on the Colonels' 1984, 1986 and 1987 OVC championship squads... co-captain during his senior

season... earned All-Conference honors in 1986 and 1987... chosen by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1988 NFL draft... played 14 years of professional football... 10-year starter in the league.

**Aaron Jones  
(1984-87)**

1987 I-AA First Team All-American defensive lineman... earned All-OVC honors in 1985 and 1987... chosen as the league's Defensive Player of the Year in 1987... made 40 tackles, 26 assists, and 12 tackles for loss during his senior season... first-round draft choice by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 1988 NFL draft... played nine years in the NFL... became just the third OVC student-athlete to be picked in the first round of the NFL draft... played in 113 games in the NFL.

**Roosevelt Kelly  
(1973-76)**

Played center for four seasons... first team All-OVC pick in 1976... named to the first-team Kodak, Associated Press and The Sporting News All-American teams... selected as the center on Eastern's All-Century Team... drafted in the ninth round of the National Football League by the Pittsburgh Steelers... the Colonels compiled a 31-11-1 record during his career, winning two OVC titles and participating in the 1976 NCAA Division II playoffs... was instrumental in opening holes for four seasons for All-American and ECU Hall of Fame member Everett "Poo-Loo" Talbert who twice ran for more than 1,000 yards behind Kelly... protected quarterback Ernie House who was OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Year in 1976 and who threw for 1,486 yards and 11 TDs.

**Roy Kidd  
(1964-2002)**

Head ECU football coach for

39 years... was an outstanding football and baseball player in his own right in his four year collegiate career at Eastern... received four varsity letters in football and baseball at Eastern... established a dozen records as quarterback of the Maroons... was an All-Ohio Valley Conference selection and "Little All-American" choice in 1953... was also a star centerfielder for Eastern, batting over .300 four consecutive seasons... served as a student assistant on the staff of Glenn Prenell's 1954 Eastern team which went undefeated, won the OVC, and lost 7-6 to Omaha in the Tangerine Bowl... returned to Eastern in 1963 as an assistant for one season before being named head coach in 1964... inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2003... led the Colonels to 16 Ohio Valley Conference titles and a national record 17 NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances... was the sixth all-time winningest coach in NCAA history with 314 victories when he retired following the 2002 season... two-time Division I-AA National Coach of the Year... recorded 37 non-losing seasons, including a streak of 25 straight with a winning record... coached 55 All-Americans, 202 First Team All-OVC selections and 41 student-athletes who signed National Football League contracts... member of the OVC and Kentucky Athletics Hall of Fames... EKV's football stadium is named in his honor.

### **Roy King (1935-38)**

Letterman in football, basketball and baseball at Eastern... served as captain of the football and basketball teams in 1937-38... earned Centennial Athletic Award in 1974 as one of EKV's top 25 athletes of the previous 100 years.

### **Larry Kirksey (1969-72)**

Four-year letterman and three-year starter for coach Roy Kidd's Colonels at wide receiver... caught 32 passes for 502 yards as a senior... following his graduation from Eastern in 1974, he coached collegiately at Miami University, Kentucky, Kansas, Kentucky State, Florida, Pittsburgh, Alabama, Texas A&M, and Middle Tennessee... part of the San Francisco 49ers staff that won Super Bowl XXIX... also coached in Detroit, Jacksonville, Denver, and Houston in the NFL.

### **Tim Lester (1988-91)**

Played both fullback and tailback... first-team All-OVC team as a freshman after finishing second in the conference in rushing to teammate Elroy Harris with 1,239 yards rushing which was the 10th best total in I-AA football that year... was named OVC Rookie of the Week five times that season. entered the 1989 season as the top ranked running back in Division I-AA by The Sporting News before suffering an injury... rushed for 1,047 yards as a junior which included totaling the most rushing yards in a single game in I-AA football that season when he ran for 291 yards versus Tennessee Tech... finished that season with the second-highest rushing total in the OVC and the 17th-best in the nation... was again chosen first-team All-OVC as a senior, finishing fourth in the OVC with 1,204 yards and scoring 17 touchdowns which tied for the OVC lead in scoring... finished his career with 3,640 yards rushing, sixth all-time on the Eastern history list, and scored 37 touchdowns... helped the Colonels compile a 42-8 record, win three conference titles and advance to the semifinals of the I-AA playoffs twice... was taken in the 10th round of the 1992 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles

Rams... played three seasons with the Rams before joining the Pittsburgh Steelers from 1995-98... played in Super Bowl XXX... closed his pro career in 1999 with the Dallas Cowboys.

### **Aaron Marsh (1964-67)**

Played tailback his first two years before switching to wide receiver for his final two collegiate seasons... one of the first African American student-athletes at Eastern Kentucky University... was a two-time All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 1966 and 1967... selected to the All-Time OVC team... named First Team All-American as a senior... was invited to play in an All-Star game following the 1967 season... third-round selection of the American Football League's Boston Patriots... earned 1968 Rookie of the Year honors after making 19 catches for 331 yards and four touchdowns.

### **Tony McCombs (1994-96)**

Three-year All-OVC linebacker... was named third team Sports Network All-American as a sophomore and was EKV's and the OVC's top tackler with 146 hits that season... helped Eastern finish with a 10-3 record, a conference championship, finish the season ranked fifth in the nation, and advance to the second round of the I-AA playoffs... was second team All-American recognition and the preseason I-AA National Defensive Player of the Year as a junior... recorded eight double-digit tackle games that season and was chosen EKV's Defensive MVP as the Colonels finished 10th in the nation... named first team All-American by four different outlets as a senior and was chosen as the OVC Defensive Player of the Year... tallied 60 solo tackles, 63 assists, 10.5 tackles for loss and five sacks... was invited to play in all four post-season

all-star games following the 1996 season and played in the East-West Shrine Game and the Senior Bowl contest... was chosen in the sixth round of the 1997 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals... played three seasons in Arizona and two years with the Cleveland Browns... was one of just three linebackers to be selected to Eastern's All-Century Team in 2009.

### **Bob McIntyre (1976-79)**

Played four seasons at linebacker... four-year letter winner, a first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference choice, a selection to the Kodak First-Team All-America team and a second-team Associated Press pick for All-America honors in 1979 when EKV won its first national championship... led the OVC in tackles that season with 67 solo tackles and 77 assists... was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after guiding EKV to a 17-14 season-opening win over Kent State to secure the Colonels' first win ever over an Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) school... second-team all-conference choice as a junior... had tryouts with the NFL's Green Bay Packers in 1981 and the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League in 1982.

### **Alvin Miller (1977-80)**

Played four seasons at both fullback and tailback... also returned kickoffs his first two years as a Colonel... emerged on the scene as a junior at tailback in the Colonels' potent running back tandem with Hall of Fame fullback Dale Patton... led the team and the Ohio Valley Conference in rushing in 1979 with 777 yards while scoring nine touchdowns... was a major contributor in Eastern's 1979 semifinal and national championship contests, being named Chevrolet Most Valuable Player in both games... rushed

for 144 yards and scored three touchdowns against Nevada-Reno... added 144 all-purpose yards against Lehigh as the Colonels won their first NCAA Division I-AA crown... was named second-team All-OVC... rushed the ball 134 times for 689 yards and six touchdowns helping lead the Colonels to a second straight NCAA Division I-AA playoff berth as a senior... was awarded another Most Valuable Player Award for the game by ABC Television and Chevrolet Corporation in the NCAA I-AA semi-final game against Lehigh.

**Jim Moberly  
(1965-68)**

Started all four years at linebacker and was part of two Ohio Valley Conference championship teams and the 1967 Grantland Rice Bowl championship team... helped ECU finish fourth in the league in team defense during his freshman season as the Maroons allowed just 278 yards per contest... helped lead ECU to 7-3 record and No. 15 ranking in the final UPI poll for small colleges as a sophomore... Eastern lead the league in scoring defense (10.8 ppg.) and overall team defense (203.8 ypg.) that season... part of an 8-1-2 team that went undefeated in conference play and won Roy Kidd's first league title and the school's third overall as a junior... helped Eastern defeat Ball State 27-13 in the Grantland Rice Bowl to capture the NCAA's 10-state Mideast Region championship... part of a defense that allowed a conference-best 7.5 ppg... ECU also closed the year second in team defense, giving up just 228.1 yards per game... as a senior, helped guide Eastern to a 8-2 campaign and an undefeated conference record for the second straight year in winning its second consecutive OVC title... was chosen as a first-team All-OVC selection.

**Frank Nassida  
(1953-54)**

Played offensive tackle, defensive tackle and outside linebacker in the 4-4 defense during two seasons at ECU... was a driving force in Eastern's 8-2 season during his junior year... was selected second-team All-OVC in 1953... as a senior, was named first-team All-OVC and co-captained the Maroons' first OVC championship team that was selected to play in the Tangerine Bowl in Orlando, Fla.

**Dale Patton  
(1977-80)**

Played fullback from 1977-80 where he was a member of three All-OVC teams, including being named to the first team in 1978 and 1979... was the starting fullback and the leading rusher in the 1979 national championship win over Lehigh... rushed for 121 yards on 21 carries in the victory... named honorable mention All-America and first team all-conference in 1978... was the top rusher for the Colonels that season, gaining 985 yards on the ground and rushing for 15 touchdowns... helped Eastern compile a 34-12 record and go to two straight of four consecutive national championship games while rushing for 2,396 yards and scoring 32 touchdowns.

**Buddy Pfaadt  
(1963-66)**

Four-year letterwinner who broke the Ohio Valley Conference record with nine interceptions in one season and four interceptions in one game... earned OVC Defensive Player of the Year, Little All-America and served as a team captain during his senior season... went on to training camp with the Pittsburgh Steelers and later played and coached in the Continental League with the Wheeling Ironmen from 1967-70.

**Glenn Presnell  
(1947-74)**

Served as assistant football coach, head football coach, athletics director and men's golf coach at ECU... began his career at Eastern in 1947 as backfield coach for Maroon head mentor Tom Samuels where he remained for seven years before being named head coach at Eastern in 1954... his first season as Eastern head coach was his best as the Maroons went 8-1-1 and compiled a perfect 5-0 mark in OVC play to capture the school's first conference football title... his 1954 team also earned an invitation to the Tangerine Bowl... served as head coach for 10 seasons, winning the OVC in 1954 and 1962... worked as ECU's Director of Athletics from 1963-71... coached the men's golf team from 1957-74.

**Joe Richard  
(1976-79)**

A member of ECU's All-Century Football team... was a four-year starter at noseguard... selected first-team All-OVC as a junior and senior... totaled 278 tackles and 186 assists in his career, including 97 solo tackles and 49 assists in 1979... credited with coming up with one of the biggest plays in Eastern football history when he blocked an extra point by Nevada Reno late in the semifinal game of the 1979 I-AA playoffs that sent the contest into double-overtime where the Colonels won 33-30 on their way to the school's first national football championship... during his four seasons at ECU, the Colonels were 32-12... voted Most Valuable Player his junior and senior seasons... had training camp stints with the Edmonton Eskimos (1981), Montreal Concordes (1982) and the Hamilton Tiger Cats (1985) of the Canadian Football League.

**Charles Shuster  
(1939-42)**

Lettered in four sports at

Eastern and was captain of the basketball team in 1942... lettered three seasons in football and was All-Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Conference each year... earned Little All-American recognition in 1941 and 1942.

**Chuck Siemon  
(1964-67)**

Played defensive end for the Colonels from 1964-67... helped ECU win an OVC championship and notch a 27-13 victory over Ball State in the NCAA Mideast Region championship game... was an All-OVC player as a sophomore and as a senior while also serving as co-captain for the 1967 Grantland Rice Bowl championship team... was the team's leading pass rusher as a sophomore and was second on the team in interceptions with four... served as tri-captain as a junior as ECU led the OVC in team defense, allowing but 203.8 yards per contest... part of a 1967 defense that gave up only 70 points in the 10-game regular season which included three shutouts and four contests allowing just seven points to the opponent... was signed as a free agent by the San Francisco 49ers.

**Jessie Small  
(1985-88)**

Played four seasons at defensive end... was a two-time All-OVC performer and in his senior season was named first team All-America by Kodak, Football News and Sports Network... set the Eastern single season record for quarterback sacks with 13... selected by the Philadelphia Eagles with the 49th pick of the NFL Draft... played in 47 games during three seasons in Philadelphia, starting 23... ranked fourth in quarterback sacks as part of the Eagles' "Gang Green" defense in 1990... also played with the Arizona Cardinals and Houston Oilers... spent a stint in the Canadian Football League with the Hamilton Tiger Cats for

three years, where he totaled 109 solo tackles, 105 assists, 25 quarterback sacks and an interception.

**Joe Spadafino  
(1982-85)**

Four-year letterwinner and a three-year starter on the offensive line... started his sophomore season at left tackle as the Colonels won the OVC crown and their second national championship... Eastern led the OVC in total offense with 353.1 yards per game and scored 27 rushing touchdowns and 14 touchdowns passing... was chosen first-team All-OVC and third-team Associated Press All-American while serving as the starting right tackle and offensive co-captain in 1984... helped the Colonels lead the conference that season in rushing offense with 206.4 yards per game as ECU scored 26 rushing touchdowns and won its fourth consecutive OVC championship... was a first-team Kodak All-American and second team AP All-American pick at left guard in 1985 as Eastern again led the conference in total offense with 392.3 yards per game while scoring 31 rushing touchdowns... was chosen as the team's Most Valuable Offensive Player and Most Valuable Offensive Lineman... a native of Dover, Del., he was selected as the 1985 Delaware College Player of the Year by the Lower Delaware Gridiron Club.

**Chris Sullivan  
(1981-84)**

Four-year letterman who started 52 consecutive games, setting an NCAA record... began his string of being the Colonels' starting center in 1981 as ECU led the conference in total offense and set school records for most yards rushing with 3,078 and touchdowns with 48... was a second-team All-OVC choice as a sophomore as the Colonels went 13-0 and won the national title... was selected as the team's Most Valuable Player on offense

as a junior on his way to being chosen as a first-team Kodak All-American... helped ECU finish the 1983 season eighth in the nation in rushing offense and eighth in the nation in the final poll on the way to a third straight OVC championship... was again named to the first-team Kodak All-American team as a senior... also served as offensive captain for the second straight season as Eastern won a fourth straight league title, finished eighth in the final I-AA poll and led the conference in rushing offense with 206.4 yards per game and in rushing touchdowns with 26.

**Everett Talbert  
(1973-76)**

Played four seasons at tailback where he was selected as the OVC Player of the Year in 1974 and then shared that same honor in 1976 with ECU quarterback Ernie House... turned in one of the most outstanding seasons for any tailback in Colonel history in 1974 when he rushed for 1,478 yards and scored 11 touchdowns on his way to being named first team All-American by the Associated Press, UPI and Eastman Kodak, becoming the OVC's first sophomore to gain first-team All-American recognition... also led the nation in rushing for 10 consecutive weeks, finishing second to fellow All-American and future NFL Hall of Fame running back Walter Peyton of Jackson State... closed his Eastern career as the seventh all-time leading rusher in school history with 3,138 yards and scored 20 touchdowns... was a two-time first-team All-OVC choice and won Eastern team awards as a three-time Outstanding Running back choice and a three-time pick as Offensive Most Valuable Player.

**Teddy Taylor  
(1966-69)**

1969 Milestone Outstanding Athlete... earned All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in 1967,

1968 and 1969... a two-time All-American who served as a team captain during his senior season. four-year letterwinner who was also named to the OVC All-Time Team.

**Markus Thomas  
(1989-92)**

One of the most prolific running backs in NCAA history... set the Ohio Valley Conference record with 5,552 career rushing yards and 54 touchdowns... earned OVC Offensive Player of the Year honors during his junior and senior seasons... 1992 All-American selection... three-time All-Conference selection... set the conference career record with 6.3 yards per carry... 12-time OVC Player of the Week... went on to play professionally for the Philadelphia Eagles... also spent time with the Scottish Claymores of NFL Europe and the Hamilton TigerCats of the Canadian Football League.

**J.W. Thurman  
(1938-41)**

Little All-American selection in 1940... was also an All-Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Football Association football selection from 1938-40.

**Cliff Tinnell  
(1939-41)**

Three-sport letterman... earned letters in baseball, basketball and football... regarded as the finest catcher in Eastern's history... member of the All-Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Conference baseball team for four seasons... all-league football player his senior year as a guard... played semi-professional baseball for a time after his graduation.

**Fred Troike  
(1939-41)**

Offensive lineman who earned All-America honors in 1968... All-Ohio Valley Conference selection in 1967 and 1968... led the Colonels to league titles each of those two years...

was an integral member of the 1967 Grantland Rice Bowl championship squad... was awarded the ECU Renegade Lineman of the Year award as a senior in 1968, a season in which he served as team co-captain.

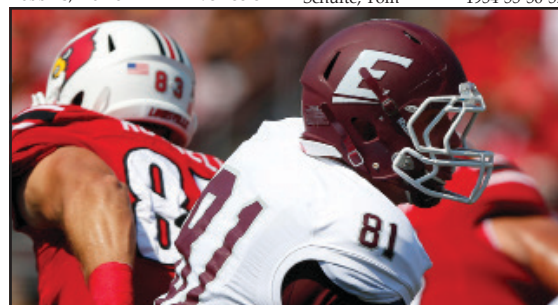

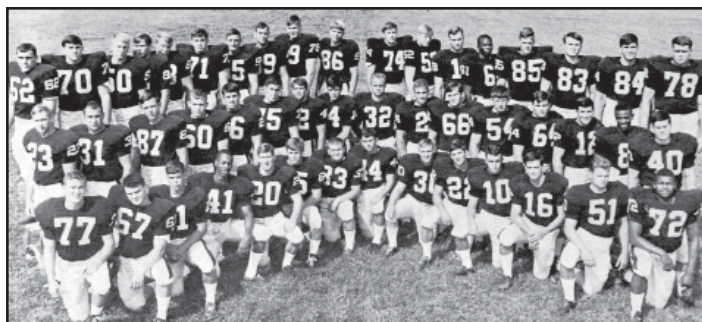
