DIRECTIONS TO BAPTIST HEALTH ARENA

From Cincinnati, Ohio and Points North:

Take I-75 South through Lexington, Ky. Continue south on I-75 Richmond/Knoxville to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Huntington, W.Va., and Points East:

Take I-64 West for 104 miles to exit #96 (Fort Boonesborough S.P.) and remain on State Highway 627 until intersecting I-75 at exit #95. Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Lexington, Ky.:

Take I-75 South to exit #87 (second Richmond exit). Make a left and cross over the interstate heading east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Bowling Green, Ky., and Points West:

Take I-65 North to exit #43 (Glasgow) and travel east on the Cumberland Parkway through Somerset to exit #41 on I-75. Travel north on I-75 to exit #87. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

From Knoxville, Tenn., and Points South:

Take I-75 North approximately 162 miles to exit #87 in Kentucky. Turn right at the end of the off ramp and head east on the Richmond bypass for one mile and you will see the main EKU campus on the left.

WEEKLY MEDIA AVAILABILITY

PHOTO/VIDEO CREDENTIALS

Arrangements for photo or video credentials for the 2024-25 women's basketball season should be directed to Sports Information Director Alex Morgan via e-mail. Priority issuance of credentials will be given to daily media outlets and television stations that cover EKU women's basketball on a regular basis. Other credential requests will be fulfilled on a space-available basis.

WNBA SCOUT CREDENTIALS

Arrangements for WNBA Scout credentials for the 2024-25 women's basketball season should be directed to Sports Information Director Alex Morgan via e-mail. Press row seating will be provided only if space is available, but scouts will be provided with one seat in the arena's lower/upper bowl. Media guides, game notes and flipcards will also be provided for scouts when requested.

RADIO COVERAGE

Radio broadcast permission and press row reservations must be obtained in advance, outside of visiting team requests. EKU maintains a courtesy line for use by schools who can provide reciprocal arrangements for the EKU Sports Network. A radio station wishing to obtain an ISDN line must contact Sports Information Director Alex Morgan, or Kevin Britton, via e-mail.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking to EKU women's basketball home events is free for all working media and visiting sports information personnel. Please park on the right hand side of the Alumni Coliseum lot by the baseball field and enter through the EKU Athletics service door on the side of the gym to pickup credentials.

MEDIA WILL CALL

For members of the media wishing to pick their credential up at media will call, it is located on the downstairs concourse on the southeast corner inside Baptist Health Arena.

INTERNET ACCESS

Press row in Baptist Health Arena is equipped with high-speed wireless internet. Media wishing to utilize the wireless internet simply need to connect to the Murphy Guest wireless network. Ethernet availability can be requested at a first-come-first-serve basis.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS CONT.

The acceptance of media credentials is an acknowledgement of Eastern Kentucky University's rights to the game and play-by-play coverage and an outlet's agreement to abide by any restrictions EKU may place on real-time play-by-play coverage and use of comprehensive game statistics. Failure to abide by these restrictions implemented by EKU may result in revocation of press credentials.

EKU reserves the right to grant approval for distribution of real-time play-by-play, game-related statistics, and information through the internet. ("real time" is defined as any online media providing live, continual play-by-play coverage, in-game statistics, digital photographs, or audio or video of an event.)

RECRUITS

Per NCAA bylaws, media members may not have any contact with a prospect or their family members during on-campus visits (official or unofficial) of any sort. This includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, social media, etc.

POSTGAME SERVICES

Complete individual and team statistics, play-by-play and postgame quotes will be available to the media following each game. One hour prior to tipoff, media packets containing game programs, flipcards, updated stats and game notes will be distributed in the media working area.

92.5 WEKY FM is now streaming on most mobile devices. Download the TuneIn Radio app, available for iPhone/iPod/iPad, Android, Blackberry, Palm and Windows Phone.

Radio station WCYO (100.7 on the FM dial) serves as the flagship station for the EKU Radio Network. WCYO "The Coyote" is the flagship station for Wallingford Broadcasting of Richmond and Irvine. With 25,000 watts of power, The Coyote signal reaches more than 625,000 people.

This year's broadcast team will again be headed by longtime play-by-play announcer Wes Chandler.

In addition to the radio broadcasts, the EKU Sports Network features pre-game interviews with coaches and players, and post game comments from head coaches A.W. Hamilton (MBB) and Greg Todd (WBB).

EKU's Ahmed Jaziri became the second student-athlete in ASUN Conference history to become a national champion after winning the 3,000m Steeplechase. Additionally, more than 70 percent of ASUN student-athletes





TODD BIO

A household name in the Madison County area, Greg Todd was named the 10th head women's basketball coach at Eastern Kentucky University on May 10, 2021.

Todd, who's spent his entire 32-year coaching career inside the Commonwealth, has taken the EKU women's basketball to new heights in just three short seasons with the program.

EKU finished the 2023-24 season with a 22-12 overall record and an appearance in the Women's National Invitational Tournament (WNIT) for just the second time in program history, and the first national postseason tournament since 2013. EKU won 20 games for the first time since 2005 and advanced to the Atlantic Sun Conference semifinals. Todd developed two ASUN All-Conference selection in Antwainette Walker (First Team) and Alice Recanati (Third Team). He became the fastest coach to 50 wins during the 2023-24 season, while knocking down his 300th win milestone after an upset victory over UAB in the 2023 Great Alaska Shootout. EKU spent over 10 weeks receiving votes in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll, had its highest ranking of No. 162 in the NET rankings, and finished the year No. 192 in the Massey Ratings – the highest rank since 2005.

Since his arrival, "The Transfer Coach" has signed some of the most high-profile players out of the transfer portal, including Walker (Marquette), Kaitlyn Costner (Ohio State), Danielle Rainey (Florida) – who is currently playing overseas in Serbia. Todd has signed 15 players out of the portal in three seasons in Richmond.

In Todd's second season at the helm of the program, the Colonels finished with an 18-14 record and an 11-7 mark in ASUN play. EKU had conference series sweeps over Stetson, North Florida, and other key wins over Jacksonville State, North Alabama, and Kennesaw State. EKU ended its season advancing to the ASUN Tournament quarterfinals for the second consecutive season. Todd was named the 2023 Herald Leader Women's Basketball Coach of the Year.

Todd helped in the development of Antwainette Walker, who was named to two national awards in the 2023 Ann Meyers Drysdale Mid-Season Top 10 List and the 2023 Dawn Staley Late Season Watchlist. Walker finished the 2022-23 season averaging 21.0 points and 9.4 rebounds per game, her +16.3 points per game increase was the highest in the nation, she also led the ASUN in over 10 statistical categories and top-15 in the NCAA in five categories. Walker was named the 2023 ASUN Newcomer of the Year and First Team All-ASUN, EKU's first player of the year nod in over 10 seasons.

In his first season at the helm of EKU women's basketball, Todd led the program to a 15-16 overall record, 10-5 record at home, and seven conference wins in EKU's inaugural season in the ASUN. He guided the program to an appearance in the ASUN Tournament quarterfinals, defeating Kennesaw State 71-57 in the opening round.

Prior to EKU, Todd served as the women's basketball head coach at Morehead State University for seven years. He led the Eagles to three straight 20-plus win

seasons from 2016 to 2019 with two WNIT appearances. During the 2018-19 season, his team advanced to the second round of the WNIT after upsetting Big Ten foe Ohio State in the first round.

"As we set out to hire the next head women's basketball coach to elevate our program, we were pleased with the interest in our position and the opportunity that lies ahead of us. At every step in our process, Greg Todd rose to the top as the ideal coach to lead us at this exciting time," Vice President and Director of Athletics Matt Roan said. "He's a coach who has dedicated his entire coaching career to women's basketball, has experienced amazing success with each program he's led, has a wealth of experience and understands the landscape, and knows our state incredibly well. His love for his alma mater and desire to build a championship-contending program here are unmatched. He comes highly recommended from all corners of Kentucky and beyond, and those folks speak not only to his ability as a coach, but also to his quality as an individual. He's tested and proven, and we're excited to have him in charge of the Colonels and leading us to victories!"

The success between 2016 and 2019 marked the first time in program history that Morehead State had three straight 20-win seasons. The Eagles' 36 Ohio Valley Conference victories during that time is also the most-ever during any three-year period.

Todd recruited two top-50 nationally ranked players, the highest rated recruits in Morehead State history. He also recruited the junior college national player of the year. Under Todd's guidance, the Eagles' had a team grade-point-average of 3.0 or better each of the past six years.

"It's a great time to be a Colonel under the leadership of Athletics Director Matt Roan and President David McFaddin, and to build the women's basketball program at EKU," Todd said.

From 2006 to 2014, Todd was the head coach at Transylvania University where he led the team to four conference championships and three NCAA tournament appearances. In the 2009 season at Transylvania, Todd led the team to a regular season and conference tournament title while advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time.

In his eight years at Transylvania he helped produce four Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC) Players of the Year.

Before entering collegiate coaching, Todd was one of the most decorated high school coaches in the state of Kentucky. He built a national powerhouse at Lexington Catholic High School from 1999-2006, making five appearances in the state championship game and winning three state titles. Todd won the region championship six of his seven seasons at Lexington Catholic.

Todd's teams finished ranked in the top-10 nationally in 2005 and 2006. His 2005-06 team at Lexington Catholic finished the season ranked No. 3 in the nation by USA Today, which stands as the highest final ranking ever for a boy's or girl's Kentucky team. Todd was named EA Sports National Coach of the Year following that season.

In 2017, Todd was inducted into the Kentucky High School Basketball Hall of Fame.

"Being from Madison County, I am so excited to come home and get the women's basketball program to the top of the ASUN Conference as quickly as possible," said Todd. "I am excited about being able to build a bigger fan base with my local connections around the community."

Todd started his head coaching career at Berea Community High School where in seven seasons he led his team to a 166-54 record and an appearance in the state final four in 1998. Berea won 20 games every year under Todd, despite never winning 20 or more games before in school history. He is a member of the Berea Community High School Hall of Fame as a coach and basketball player.

"I am looking forward to re-recruiting and building a strong relationship with the players already on campus," Todd said.

team had won 20 of its last 21 games, including its last 11 games. "This is a wonderful thing to go to for the first time. Our defense rose to the occasion."

On the offensive side, Inman said he couldn't "single out" any outstanding performances but Goodrich's outing under the circumstances down the stretch couldn't be ignored or overlooked.

The Berea product punched in a clutch jumper that helped spark an 8-0 EKU run after Tennessee Tech had claimed a 60-58 lead with 4:30 left.

"The same thing has happened that has happened all year long, somebody stepped up," Inman said.

Goodrich added two free throws, had one steal and forced another, during that span that gave the Lady Colonels a 66-60 advantage with 2:06 remaining.

"It was the burning desire to compete and love for the game that got me out to play," Goodrich said.

When I came in the last time, I just told myself to contribute and help the team anyway I could."

The Eaglettes closed the gap to within one point on Becky Clabough's two free throws with 1:14 remaining but Laphelia Doss snagged her own missed shot with a put-back that kept EKU in the driver's seat.

"We were playing for respect," said Doss, who was named the tournament's most valuable player. "Some people said that the OVC regular season title was a fluke and we wanted to prove that it wasn't."

Doss scored 22 points, but her inside play was slightly overshadowed by Diane Seng's 35-point outing that kept Tennessee Tech afloat until the freshman center and her teammates started wearing out down the stretch.

"We fought back, but we never got control," said Tennessee Tech coach Bill Worrell, whose team controlled a 10-4 lead only to see it fall in opening minutes of the first half.

"Like I said yesterday (Friday) about us ... they had the lead at the right time."

"You've got to go to your money-maker (late in the game), that's what we were trying to do," Tech forward Amber Clark said.

Seng and Clark almost single-handedly carried Tech to another OVC title. Both players combined for 51 of the Eaglettes 65 points.

"We tried to slow her (Seng) down a little bit," Inman said, "but I thought the key to the game was the good job we did on Tech's other people."

Amanda Reid contributed to the Lady Colonels' scoring with 11 points, followed by Shannon Browning with 10.

"Their post players hurt us," Worrell said.

LADY COLONELS TO GO 'DANCING'

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Trina Goodrich's chances of playing were "slim to none."

That didn't matter.

Goodrich, a noted do-or-die player who suffered a severe ankle sprain in Friday's semifinal victory over Morehead State, came off the bench to score eight points - four in the closing minutes that helped Eastern Kentucky University post a 69-65 victory over Tennessee Tech here Saturday in the finals of the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament.

The victory gave EKU its first-ever OVC Tournament crown. And another first in school history - automatic berth to the NCAA tournament.

"This is what we talked about all season long," junior guard Lisa Pace said. "Our name is in the NCAA bracket."

The emotion varied from hugs and smiles to tears.

"This is the best feeling I've ever had," said EKU guard Chrissy Roberts, who was named to the five-member all-tournament team. "This is the kind of thing that you dream about, and a dream came true."

"I can't stop crying. I'm just happy we're going to the NCAA," EKU coach Larry Joe Inman, who guided Middle Tennessee to four OVC tournament titles and four NCAA appearances in the early 1980s, became the first coach in Ohio Valley Conference history to guide two schools to what is known as the "Big Dance."

"I'm just elated and ecstatic," said Inman, whose

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - After the final seconds ticked off the clock in the second overtime, Miranda Eckerle jumped into the arms of fellow senior Candis Cook, who lifted her off the ground in a joyful embrace.

It was a fitting way to celebrate an intense, competitive and emotional Ohio Valley Conference Tournament championship game.

"I just told her I loved her," Cook said. "We've grown so close as teammates and friends over the years. We just care for each other so much. I just have so much respect for her."

It was Eckerle's heroics that eventually led to that heart-felt moment.

The senior forward scored 16 of her game-high 29 points in overtime as the Lady Colonels picked up a thrilling 84-73 win over Southeast Missouri State Saturday in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship at the Gaylord Entertainment Center. Eckerle played the final 17 minutes of the game with four fouls, but still made almost all the key plays that carried the Lady Colonels to their first OVC Tournament title since 1997.

EKU's 15th straight win gave the school only its second conference tournament title and gave the Lady Colonels an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

"She's money in the bank," EKU coach Larry Joe Inman said of Eckerle. "When you need a deposit you know exactly where to go. She took care of business."

Laura Shelton made sure the Lady Colonels got to overtime, then Eckerle took over from there. EKU trailed 60-58 with 8.7 seconds left after Natalie Purcell hit a go-ahead jumper. Shelton, who finished with 14 points, got the ball, rushed the length of the court and connected on a tough hanging layup in the lane before the buzzer.

"That was a big shot for her because she had been knocked to the floor earlier in the game and she was starting to get down on herself," Inman said.

Eckerle drew the fifth foul on OVC Player of the Year Tatiana Conceicao just 15 seconds into the overtime and made a series of spectacular plays in the middle after the 6-foot-2 junior center was forced to the bench.

The OVC Tournament's Most Valuable Player scored all six of EKU's points in the first overtime and gave her team a six-point lead with a putback early in the second extra session.

"She hit some great shots," SEMO coach B.J. Smith said. "She did a great job late."

Purcell and Katrisha Dunn both hit three pointers in the first OT, giving SEMO a 66-64 lead in the final minute. Eckerle tied the game with 43.5 seconds left, then drew an offensive foul on the next Redhawk possession.

Freshman Ashley Cazee, EKU's other All-Tournament selection, missed a shot at the buzzer.

"It was kind of miraculous," Inman said of Eckerle's performance. "They kept going at her and she kept stepping up. We were real fortunate she didn't foul out."





HALL OF FAME

On December 14, 2005, Eastern Kentucky University announced the creation of an Athletics Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame's mission is to commemorate and honor student-athletes, other individuals and teams whose accomplishments have contributed to the esteemed tradition of Colonel Athletics and whose character has reflected positively on the University.

An extraordinary group of individuals, previously recognized by the University during the 1974 Centennial Athletic Awards Banquet, were inducted into the Hall of Fame on Nov. 3, 2006. This group of 25 is called The Founders. They were joined by an inaugural class of 13 members to make up the 2006 inductees.

Each of the first seven Hall of Fame inductions have included a former women's basketball player. Lisa Goodin was a member of the inaugural class in 2006. Chrissy Roberts joined the Hall of Fame in 2007 followed by Angie Cox Blevins in 2008. Kim Mays was inducted in 2009 and Jaree Goodin joined in 2010. Former head coach Larry Joe Inman joined four of his former players in the Hall of Fame in 2010. Peggy Gay Moore and Teresa McNair were inducted in 2011 and 2012 respectively. Laphelia Doss joined the Hall in 2014 and Tina Cottle was inducted in 2016.



Lisa Goodin (1980-84, Guard, Austin, Ind.)

The all-time leading scorer in EKU women's basketball history with 1,920 career points, Lisa Goodin is one of the most prolific student-athletes to compete in a Colonel uniform. At the time of her induction, Goodin ranked fifth on the career list for assists (375) and 10th for steals (182). A sharpshooter with consistent accuracy, she led the NCAA in free throw percentage as both a freshman (.897) and junior (.910).

Goodin earned all-conference honors all fours years of her collegiate career and was later named to the All-Time Ohio Valley Conference team. She was chosen as a first team honoree in 1983 and a second team selection in 1981, 1982 and 1984. Goodin was also picked for the OVC All-Tournament team during her senior season. That year, 1984, she led the team in scoring with 15.5 points per game average.

A native of Austin, Indiana Goodin was the principal at Jessie Clark Middle School in Fayette County at the time of her induction.



Chrissy Roberts (1996-98, Guard, Eminence, Ky.)

The nation's top sharp-shooter in 1997, Chrissy Roberts starred in her two seasons at Eastern Kentucky. Roberts earned All-Ohio Valley Conference honors in both seasons (1997 and 1998) and honorable mention All-America recognition in 1998. She earned 1998 OVC Player of the Year honors after leading the league in free throw shooting (89.2 percent) and three-point shooting (45.9 percent). At the time of her induction, she held the NCAA record for career three-point shooting percentage.

During her miraculous junior season, Roberts led the country with a 48.8 three-point shooting percentage. She won two national awards that year, the AT&T Long Distance Award and the Edward Seitz Award. Her uniform, practice gear and shoes were enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

When inducted into the Hall of Fame, Roberts held the EKU record for most three-pointers in a single season (84 in 1996-97) and career three-point field goal percentage (.475). She finished her career third on the all-time three-point field goals made chart with 151. At the time of her induction, Roberts was an assistant women's basketball coach at East Carolina University. A few months later she was named the head coach at EKU.



Angie Cox Blevins (1988-92, Guard, Somerset, Ky.)

A two-time All-American, Angie Cox Blevins held the EKU women's basketball record with 170 career three-pointers at the time of her induction. The program record holder with 488 career assists, Cox led the Ohio Valley Conference with 5.6 assists per game as a senior in 1992.

Cox earned all-conference honors following her junior and senior seasons and was also named to the OVC All-Freshman team in 1989. The Somerset, Kentucky native finished her stellar career with 1,425 points, ranking eighth on the Colonels' all-time list. During her senior year, Cox compiled the second most steals (113) and assists (164) for a single season in program history. She led the OVC in steals per game during her senior season (3.9 spg) as well as during her junior campaign (3.9 spg).

An all-state performer during her prep career at Pulaski County High School, Cox Blevins played professionally in Germany and graduated from EKU's occupational therapy department. At the time of her induction, Cox Blevins was working for the Wayne County School System.



Jaree Goodin (1989-93, Center/Forward, Corbin, Ky.)

Jaree Goodin was a four-year starter for coach Larry Joe Inman's basketball team. She finished her Eastern career as the No. 3 all-time leading scorer with 1,679 points and as the No. 2 career-leading rebounder with 914 rebounds. She also closed her Eastern career with the best field goal percentage (.492) in school history. Goodin was an OVC All-Freshman team choice in 1989-90, an honorable mention All-OVC pick as a sophomore and a second-team All-OVC selection her junior and senior years. Goodin was a two-time All-OVC Tournament choice and was chosen as the Most Valuable Player of the OVC Tournament in 1992.

At her induction, she was the school record holder for most field goals in a single game when she made 18 on her way to a 41-point scoring night as a freshman against Marshall. A three-time Fast Break Magazine All-America choice, she was the EKU Female Athlete of the Year in 1992-93 and a fourth-team Division I All-American that season.

She was chosen as a member of the Corbin High School Hall of Fame in 1999 and has served as Vice President of International Biological Resources.



Larry Joe Inman (1988-08, Head Coach)

Larry Joe Inman, who was inducted into the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame in 2009, served as head coach of the Eastern women's basketball team from 1988-2008, compiling a 319-244 record and leading the Lady Colonels to two OVC Tournament championships and two NCAA Tournament appearances (1996-97, 2004-05). In being named OVC Coach of the Year eight times, he also directed Eastern to five OVC regular season championships. He led the Lady Colonels to the 2002 WNIT Sweet Sixteen. He is the all-time winningest coach in Ohio Valley Conference women's basketball history with a record of 480-317. Prior to coming to Eastern, he served as a high school coach at Mt. Juliet (TN) High School, recording an impressive 126-24 mark in five seasons. He then moved to Middle Tennessee State University for eight seasons as head coach where he went 161-73 and won five OVC regular season titles and made four NCAA tourney appearances from his four OVC tournament championships.

He is currently retired. A 1970 graduate of Austin Peay State University, he is married to the former Bobbie Gene Follis and they have three children.



Peggy Gay Moore (1975-79, Guard/Forward, Buckhorn, Ky.)

Peggy Gay ranks as the second leading scorer in program history with 1,696 points. At the time of her induction, Gay held single season school records for most fields made (235, 1978-79) and most field goals attempted (569, 1978-79).

Her first season was one of the best in school history for the women's basketball program as Eastern rolled to a sparkling 17-3 record, the Kentucky Women's Intercollegiate Conference title and runner-up spot in the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Region II tournament. Gay averaged 16 points per game her freshman season.

She followed that season up with scoring averages of 13.9, 19.7 and 17.6 points for her next three years. She became the school's first 1,000-point scorer during her junior campaign. As a junior, she scored 38 points in a win over Louisville and was an All-KWIC pick. Another highlight for Gay came in the opener of her senior year against No. 1 Tennessee when she scored 26 points, prompting Lady Vol coach Pat Head Summitt to say, "That Peggy Gay is a super player, one of the best I've seen."

Following graduation in 1979 after being named first-team All-OVC, Gay was drafted by the Philadelphia Fox of the Women's Basketball League and played one season for that pro team. She received her master's degree in elementary education in 1984, served one season as an assistant coach at Morehead State and taught at Buckhorn High School for seven years.

She taught at Breathitt County High School where she also coached the Lady Cats for eight seasons, compiling a 148-92 record and winning four Region 14 titles.



Kim Mays (1992-95, Guard, Barbourville, Ky.)

Kim Mays was a two-time Ohio Valley Conference Player of the Year, winning the award in both the 1993-94 and 1994-95 seasons. She closed her three-year Eastern career as the fifth all-time scorer in program history with 1,587 points. Her best scoring season was her senior season when she averaged 25.7 points per game.

At the time of her induction, she held program single-season records for most points (719), best scoring average (25.7) and most free throws (226), all accomplished in the 1994-95 season. Her 44 points versus Western Michigan in 1994 still stands as the top single-game scoring effort in program history. As a junior, she averaged 21.2 points per game, ranking among the top 20 scorers in the nation. Mays was a first-team all-conference selection as a junior and senior, while making honorable mention All-OVC as a sophomore. She was also a second-team Academic All-America selection as a senior and a third-team choice as a junior.

When inducted, Mays lived in Laurel County with husband Michael Mills and daughters Ellie Rose and Shelbie Kate, and was employed as an occupational therapist with the Knox County Schools.



Teresa McNair (1999-03, Guard, Ocala, Fla.)

Teresa McNair played four seasons at EKU from 1999-2003 and started in all but five of the 116 games she played for coach Larry Joe Inman's women's basketball team.

She was an integral part of 76 victories during her career at Eastern, which included a fantastic junior year in 2001-02 that saw EKU finish with a 23-8 record, the regular season Ohio Valley Conference title and an advancement to the Women's National Invitational Tournament Sweet Sixteen. She closed her Eastern career with 1,183 points which ranked 15th on the program's all-time scoring list at the time of her induction.

McNair led the OVC in steals each of her four seasons at Eastern and holds the conference career steals mark with 406. As a Class 5A first-team All-State choice out of Forest High School in Ocala, Florida she made an immediate impact at Eastern, averaging 10.0 points and being named to the All-OVC Freshman Team. As a sophomore, she started all 28 games and won the second of four EKU Team Defensive Awards she collected in her career.

Her junior season saw her score 11.1 points per game and finish 24th in the nation in steals per game as Eastern won the regular season OVC title, totaled 23 wins, second most in program history, defeat Southwest Missouri in the opening round of the WNZT and host Alabama in the Sweet 16 of the WNZT. As a senior, she set EKU and OVC single season records for steals with 131 and led the nation in steals, while averaging 10.8 points per game and being named first-team All-OVC. She also holds the school single game record for steals when she had 11 in a win over Jacksonville State as a senior.

When inducted, she was listed among Eastern's top 10 career leaders in field goal percentage (fifth, .488); rebounds (eighth, 631); free throw percentage (ninth, .736); and blocks (tied for 10th, 37). She earned her degree in business administration and information technology from EKU in 2003. She then graduated from Saint Leo University with a master's degree in business administration with a concentration in information security management in 2010. She became the first African American women's head basketball coach at Forest High School in Ocala, Florida in 2006.



Laphelia Doss (1994-98, Forward, Franklin, Ky.)

Laphelia Doss played for coach Larry Joe Inman's Lady Colonels where she started all 113 games that were played by Eastern from 1994-98, ranking her second on Eastern's all-time games played list. She started her Eastern career in fine fashion, being named to the OVC All-Freshman Team in leading EKU to a four-way tie for the OVC championship. In the summer following her freshman year, she represented the United States through People-to-People Sports in Australia winning a silver medal. She put together a stellar first-team All-OVC sophomore year that saw her lead the OVC in rebounding and finish ninth in the final NCAA stats with her 11.5 rebounding average, while scoring in double digits in 22 games. She set an EKU single game record that year with 26 boards against Tennessee State and finished just one rebound shy of the EKU single season rebound mark with 309.

The Lady Colonels excelled her junior year in 1996-97 when they went 24-6 and ran off a stretch of 20 wins in 21 games, winning their first-ever outright OVC title. Doss did her part to help the Eastern cause that season by averaging 12.5 points in being named second-team All-OVC. Eastern won the conference regular season and league tournament as Doss was named MVP of the OVC Tournament. EKU made its first ever trip to the NCAA Tournament that season, playing Georgia in Athens, Georgia. She closed out her playing career in 1997-98 as Eastern went 20-8 and won the OVC with a 15-3 mark. Doss was again first-team All-OVC as she ranked second in the conference in rebounding and in field goal percentage, while scoring 14.6 points per contest.

At the time of her induction, she ranked second on Eastern's career list in rebounds with 1,026 and 12th in scoring with 1,378 points. When inducted, she held the EKU career record for double-doubles with 38, offensive rebounds with 413 and is second in career field goal percentage with her final 51.3 shooting mark. She is one of only two Lady Colonels to ever record more than 1,000 career points and 1,000 career rebounds.

Graduating from EKU in May of 1998 with her degree in broadcast journalism, she later received her master's degree in sports administration from Eastern. Doss began her coaching career in 2002-03 at Eastern where she served as an assistant coach for four seasons. At the time of her induction, Doss had a 16-year coaching career, making stops at James Madison, Southern Polytechnic State, Brewton-Parker, Austin Peay and North Carolina A&T.



Tina Cottle (1983-85, Guard, Miami, Fla.)

Tina Cottle played two spectacular years for the EKU women's basketball team from 1983-85, collecting first-team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors each season. She joined the program as a junior after being named a Junior College All-American at Miami Dade South Community College where she was selected as the conference athlete of the year.

As a junior, she led coach Dianne Murphy's Lady Colonels to wins over Wisconsin, Evansville, Duke, Bowling Green and Louisville en route to a 17-11 overall record and a second place OVC finish. That season, she led the OVC in field goal percentage with her 56.2 mark, was seventh in scoring at 15.2 points per game and third in rebounding at 9.5 boards per contest. One of her top performances her junior season was when she grabbed 17 rebounds in a 69-55 EKU win over Louisville. Following her junior season, she, along with fellow EKU Hall of Famer Lisa Goodin, were invited to Colorado to try out for the U.S. Olympic Team.

As a senior, Cottle helped EKU continue its winning ways as the Colonels compiled an 18-10 record with impressive victories over Miami (Florida), Dayton and Kent State. She averaged 15.5 points and 11.1 rebounds per game, both team-bests for the season. Her top rebounding performance came against Dayton when she pulled down 20 boards.

At the time of her induction, she held program records for most double-doubles (16), most rebounds (310) and best field goal percentage in a single year while attaining All-America status. Following her Eastern career, she played overseas in Ireland and England and was named Player of the Year in England in 1986.



Charlotte Sizemore (1997-02, Forward, Hazard, Ky.)

Sizemore played four years for head coach Larry Joe Inman's women's basketball team from 1997-2002. She is EKU's seventh all-time leading scorer, finishing her career with 1,561 points. She is also the 10th all-time leading rebounder with 611 rebounds, tied for ninth in three-pointers with 122 and sixth in career blocks with 71.

Sizemore was a three-time All-OVC performer, including collecting first-team accolades her sophomore and senior years. As a sophomore, she led the team in scoring with 17.6 points per game and received the team's award for Best Offensive Player. As a junior, she was a second-team all-conference selection while scoring 12.5 points per game. She was fourth in the league in assists and steals and fifth in blocked shots. She scored her 1,000th point that season against Murray State.

She returned to the first-team All-OVC list as a senior, leading the Colonels in scoring with her 12.7 per game average and finishing second in the OVC in steals with 72. Playing in 119 career games at EKU, Sizemore was a part of 78 victories and two Colonel teams that tied for the OVC regular season championship in 1997-98 and 2001-02.



Sue Fetter (1966-69)

Sue Fetter could certainly be considered a "pioneer" in the beginning of intercollegiate athletics for women being recognized on the EKU campus and nationwide. She played three sports at Eastern from 1966-1969 — volleyball for legendary Hall of Fame coach Geri Polvino; field hockey under longtime physical education teacher and administrator Gertrude Hood; and basketball for Millie Maupin.

The Colonels competed against other schools with these teams, called "Honor Teams", in competition with the University of Dayton, the University of Louisville, the University of Cincinnati, the University of Kentucky, Southeastern Christian College and Berea College, among others.

Following her graduation from EKU in 1970 and a stint as a student teacher at Shawnee High School in Louisville, she began a 27-year association with Ballard High School in Louisville. She started the girls' athletics program at Ballard, coaching every sport available for the girls which included tennis, golf, field hockey, track and junior varsity basketball. She led Ballard to the state runner-up title in field hockey in 1985 and to the state semifinals in three other years along with Jefferson County championships in seven other seasons.

Fetter also had success coaching track, directing the Ballard girls to state titles in 1974 and 1977, a runner-up in the state in 1975 and numerous county, district and regional championships in the 1970s. She also served as a director of the state, sectional, regional and county track meets from 1976-1986.

Fetter served as a director of the prestigious Mason-Dixon Games from 1976-80 and the UofL Cardinal Relays from 1979-82. After serving as assistant athletics director at Ballard, she was assistant AD at Presentation Academy in Louisville for four years. She has also officiated several sports contests including basketball, volleyball, field hockey, softball and track.

In 1988, Fetter received the National Association for Girls and Women's Sports Pathfinder Award. Other national awards included being Kellogg National Coach of the Year in 1977 and 1979. Among her many statewide and local awards are being named Kentucky High School Track Coach of the Year in 1976 and 1979. She was also recognized by EKU as the Physical Education Outstanding Alumnus in 2008. Her most recent recognition came in 2011 when she was inducted into the Kentucky Track and Cross Country Coaches Hall of Fame.



Alex Jones (2009-13, Forward, Elizabethtown, Ky.)

Jones had a steady career, playing in 115 games as a Colonel and averaging 29.5 minutes per game. She finished her career with 1,290 points and 1,050 rebounds, becoming one of only two Colonels in history to score 1,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds. Jones is Eastern's all-time leading rebounder, finishing her career in grand style by averaging 10.3 rebounds her senior year.

She accumulated many Ohio Valley Conference recognitions during her career, including being a member of the 2009-10 All-Newcomer team and second team all-conference designations her freshman, sophomore and junior seasons. She was OVC Freshman of the Week five times.

Jones posted career highs of 34 points and 18 rebounds as a freshman against Morehead State. She set a new career best her senior year when she grabbed 21 boards, finishing that season as the OVC's top rebounder with her 10.3 per game average.

Jones was an outstanding free throw shooter, making more than 70 percent in each of her four years, topped in her junior season when she hit 78.8 percent. She came to EKU as a top five player in Kentucky and the state's best low-post player by Blue Chip Basketball.



Bernadette Kok (1972-76, Forward, Louisville, Ky.)

Bernadette 'Bernie' Kok played four years for the EKU volleyball team and four seasons for the basketball team between 1972-76. Before coming to EKU, her experience in basketball included competing in AAU basketball leagues in eighth and ninth grade since there was no high school Kentucky state basketball championship for girls.

In her freshman season of basketball, Kok started and led the team to the KWIC title, mirroring volleyball's undefeated slate against league foes. EKU defeated Louisville, Georgetown and Murray to advance to the AIAW national tourney. Kok led the team in scoring versus Louisville with 29 points and against Murray State with 18. She also led the team in scoring in EKU's loss to South Carolina with 17 points.

Following her senior year in basketball, she was named the 1975-76 College Athlete of the Year in the state by the Louisville Area Chamber of Commerce, averaging 16.7 points and 13.4 rebounds that season. Kok's basketball teams were 61-19 won four straight KWIC titles and competed in four AIAW Regional championships.

Upon graduation from EKU, Kok taught physical education and behavior disorders for 34 years in Kentucky. She coached high school basketball for 22 years and high school volleyball for five years. Kok's 1977-78 Betsy Layne High School basketball team went 26-2 and she was named Coach of the Year.
