Ticketing

- All seating, except for grass seating, at Rhodes Stadium is reserved. There is no general admission section.
- Ticket holders should be prepared to show their tickets to an usher to gain access to seating sections.
- Children three years of age and younger are admitted free with a paying adult.
- Please contact the Elon Ticket Office at 336-278-6750 for information regarding ticket packages, group rates and other discount opportunities.
- To purchase tickets in advance, call the Elon Ticket Office at 336-278-6750, or purchase tickets online at elonphoenix.com.
- Tickets may be purchased at the Rhodes Stadium Box Office an hour and a half prior to kickoff on game days. Tickets will be distributed as available and specific seats cannot be selected.
- The Will Call window is located at the main entrance of Rhodes Stadium. Will Call opens an hour and a half prior to kickoff and a photo ID is required to claim tickets.
- Tickets cannot be resold at Rhodes Stadium. Elon University is not responsible for lost or stolen tickets. There are no refunds on tickets.
- Reentry into Rhodes Stadium is not permitted except in case of emergency.

Guest Services

- Concessions are available for purchase along the concourse of Rhodes Stadium.
- Restrooms are available on the Rhodes Stadium concourse.
- Designated seating for spectators using wheelchairs and a companion are located throughout Rhodes Stadium. Ask for seating directions at the ticket window.
- Emergency care is provided by Campus Safety and Police and the Alamance County Rescue Unit. The first aid station is located on the concourse, behind section 107.

Parking

- All lots open five hours prior to game time.
- Handicapped parking is available in the Ingold Parking Lot.
- Permits are required to park in the Ingold Parking Lot, Hunt Softball Parking Lot, Global Neighborhood Parking Lot, Barnes Parking Lot, the Oaks Parking Lot and the Koury Athletic Center Parking.
- Public parking is available for \$10 in the McMichael Center and Colonnades parking lots.

Rhodes Stadium Regulations

- To ensure a fan and family-friendly atmosphere, the following items are prohibited in Rhodes Stadium:

- Banners must be approved prior to display in Rhodes Stadium. Call 336-278-6800 no later than 5 p.m. Thursday prior to game day.
- Gates to Rhodes Stadium open 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

Leo M. Lambert has led Elon's rise to national prominence since 1999, promoting a student-centered culture that values strong relationships between students and their faculty and staff mentors. Focused on developing students as global citizens, ethical leaders and creative problem-solvers, Lambert has led two strategic plans, creating a model for the modern liberal arts university.

During Lambert's presidency, applications for undergraduate admission have doubled, enrollment has grown from 4,000 to more than 6,700, and full-time faculty numbers have increased from under 200 to 425. During this period of growth, student academic credentials increased, average class sizes dropped and the student-faculty ratio decreased from 16-to-1 to 12-to-1. Nationally accredited schools of communications, education, health sciences and law have been established and Elon gained a chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, achieving the highest standards of quality in the arts and sciences. More than two-thirds of Elon's iconic campus has been built or acquired during Lambert's tenure, creating one of the nation's finest environments for learning.

Throughout his presidency, Lambert has been an advocate for the highest levels of academic excellence. He has increased resources for

faculty and supported development of the Elon teacher-scholar-mentor model. Professors who excel in teaching and mentoring students are attracted to Elon's mission, and the university has increased funding to support faculty scholarship and their partnerships with students in research, scholarly and engaged learning activities. During Lambert's tenure, Elon has established the Center for Engaged Learning and the Center for the Advancement of Teaching and Learning and consistently receives top rankings for excellence in undergraduate teaching.

Elon has maintained a position as one of the nation's best values in private higher education under Lambert's leadership, quadrupling the university's endowment to \$230 million with a priority on funding increased student financial aid. During Lambert's presidency, the number of endowed scholarships has more than doubled to a total of 613. Lambert led completion of the record-setting \$107 million "Ever Elon" campaign in 2011 and has made endowed scholarships a central goal of the "Elon Leads" campaign that is now in its leadership phase.

Lambert's passion for educational excellence extends beyond the campus to include schools in the Alamance County area. He has been a leading voice for increased investment in K-12 public education and has promoted the university's involvement in these efforts. He provided inspiration and support for the creation of Elon's Center for Access and Success, which includes the Elon Academy for area high school students with no family history of college attendance; the It Takes a Village Project, a literacy effort for struggling young readers; and Collegiate Start @Elon, which allows local high school seniors to take Elon courses.

Providing leadership on intercollegiate athletics issues, Lambert chaired the NCAA Division I Committee on Athletics Certification. At Elon, he guided the university through its transition from NCAA Division II to Division I and through conference affiliation changes from the Big South, to the Southern Conference, to the current membership in the Colonial Athletic Association. Throughout the development of Phoenix athletics, Lambert has placed a priority on academic achievement of student-athletes and on their involvement in engaged learning opportunities including study abroad, undergraduate research and service.

Lambert has held a number of leadership roles nationally, currently serving on the boards of the American Council on Education, the Association of Governing Boards of Universities and Colleges (AGB), the National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (NAICU), the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (board chair), the John N. Gardner Institute for Excellence in Undergraduate Education (JNGI), the Piedmont Triad Partnership, and as a member of the NCAA Division I Presidential Forum. He formerly served on two national boards encouraging civic engagement among university students,

Campus Compact and Project Pericles.

As a prominent figure in North Carolina's Triad region, Lambert has been named one of the "most influential leaders" for six consecutive years by the Triad Business Journal. In 2011 he was named the #1 large workplace leader in a survey by the Greensboro News & Record. He has also received the Thomas Z. Osborne Distinguished Citizen Award, the highest honor bestowed by the Greensboro, N.C., Chamber of Commerce.

With over 20 years of experience and leadership in intercollegiate athletics administration, the 2017-18 academic year marks the 12th for Dave Blank as Elon University's Director of Athletics.

Blank's leadership has led to numerous enhancements across all areas at Elon, including academic progress, global experiences for student-athletes, facility upgrades, marketing and fundraising. Blank led Elon University's move to the Colonial Athletic Association in 2014-15 and was named one of four national recipients of the 2015-16 FCS Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year Award by NACDA.

Phoenix programs have achieved both athletic and academic success during Blank's time at Elon. Elon teams and individuals have won a combined 69 conference championships over the last 11 years, while teams or individuals have appeared in postseason play on 26 occasions. Elon teams have appeared in national rankings 22 times during Blank's tenure, while 18 student-athletes have captured conference player of the year honors and 18 have earned freshman of the year laurels. Elon student-athletes have been equally successful in the classroom over the last 11 years, with 716 earning academic all-

conference recognition.

During his first 11 years at Elon, Blank has ignited ambitious expansions in the department, including a restructuring of the Phoenix Club with emphasis on funding scholarships for student-athletes. Since arriving at Elon, Blank has tripled annual Phoenix Club fundraising, while Phoenix Club membership has increased by over 58 percent. In conjunction with the Office of the Provost, Blank has also restructured the academic assistance program for athletics.

In order to ensure student-athletes have access to study abroad opportunities, Blank has led the organization and funding of team global experiences, combining academic experiences with competition in countries around the world. Since 2011, Phoenix student-athletes have studied abroad in Europe, Asia and Central America.

Blank has led Elon's plan for future facility improvements over the last decade, which included the renovation of the Jeanne and Jerry Robertson Track and Field Complex, the completion of Hunt Softball Park and BB&T Field, new scoreboards at the Jimmy Powell Tennis Center, the construction of Alumni Field House, renovations to Alumni Gym and the Latham Park baseball facility, permanent bleachers and new press box for soccer at Rudd Field, construction of the new Worsley golf practice facility, and a renovation of the Koury Field House, which includes baseball offices, new athletic training amenities and locker rooms that serve over 200 of Elon's student-athletes. Construction on the Schar Center, a 5,400-seat convocation center that will serve as the home for the Elon basketball and volleyball programs, is under construction and scheduled to open in 2018.

Under Blank's leadership, Elon introduced women's lacrosse as its 17th NCAA Division I sport. The Phoenix began competition in 2014.

Blank has been instrumental on the national scene of NCAA Division I athletics as well. Most recently, Blank was named to the prestigious NCAA Division I Baseball Committee. Blank is a member of the 10-person committee that selects the annual 64-school tournament field. His four-year tenure on the committee began Sept. 1, 2016, and continues through Aug. 31, 2020.

Previously, Blank served on the NCAA Division I Leadership Council from 2011-13, and from 2008-11, he served on the NCAA Division I Championships/Sports Management Cabinet. He has also served as a member of the NCAA I-AA Governance and Football Issues Committee. In 2005, he received the Gen. Robert R. Neyland Outstanding Athletics Director award from the All-American Football Foundation.

Blank became the Elon Director of Athletics in 2006 after spending six years as the Director of Athletics at Drake University. While at Drake, he directed an 18-sport NCAA Division I athletics program that competes in the Missouri Valley Conference. He was responsible for the

creation of a comprehensive academic assistance program. During his tenure, Drake student-athletes consistently posted a combined grade point average of 3.0 or above. Also, Blank oversaw the addition of the women's crew and women's soccer programs.

Facility enhancements were a priority, including upgrades in the softball complex, renovation of the strength and conditioning facilities and new locker rooms for several sports. Under Blank's guidance, Drake completed a \$17 million renovation of Drake Stadium, which hosts football, soccer and track and field events as well as the nationally known Drake Relays.

Prior to 2000, Blank worked at Coastal Carolina University where he served as Assistant/Associate Director of Athletics for three years (1996-99) and Director of Athletics for one year (1999-2000). While at Coastal Carolina, Blank spearheaded efforts to raise more than \$4 million to establish an intercollegiate football program at the university, which began play in 2003.

Before moving into athletics administration, Blank spent eight seasons (1988-96) as head men's basketball coach at Lock Haven University. Blank's teams won 119 games during his tenure, making him the winningest head men's basketball coach in Lock Haven history. He was named the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1989 and 1996.

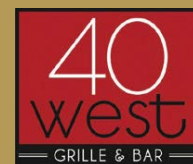

Curt Cignetti was named Elon University's 22nd head football coach on Dec. 31, 2016. The assistant coach/recruiting coordinator on Nick Saban's undefeated 2009 National Championship team at Alabama, Cignetti has spent the previous six seasons as the head coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, amassing a career record of 53-17.

In six seasons at IUP, Cignetti led the Crimson Hawks to a 53-17 (.757) record, including a 33-11 (.750) mark in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. In 2011, Cignetti inherited a team that finished 4-10 against conference foes two years prior to his arrival. IUP made three NCAA Division II Playoff appearances in 2012, 2015 and 2016 and finished this past season ranked No. 12 in the nation. Cignetti helped the Crimson Hawks to a 4-3 record in postseason play, as well. It marked the first time IUP made back-to-back NCAA Playoff appearances since 2002-03.

IUP finished the 2016 season ranked first in the nation in passing efficiency (183.44), third in scoring offense (46.3 points per game), fourth in rushing offense (279.8 rushing yards per game), and 12th in total offense (489.6 yards per game). The Crimson Hawks also ended the year first in the country in turnover margin (+2.08) and third in third down conversion percentage (.566). IUP racked up 50 or more points

in a game four times in 2016, including a 62-point outburst in the first round of the NCAA Playoffs.

Cignetti was hired on Saban's original staff at Alabama, helping the Crimson Tide to a national title in 2009 and back-to-back SEC West championships in 2008 and 2009 as the recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach. Alabama won 29 consecutive regular season games during Cignetti's stint in Tuscaloosa. Cignetti brought in the consensus No. 1 recruiting class in the country in 2008, the first of three consecutive top-five recruiting classes.

In addition to the national title, Cignetti was part of Alabama teams that posted a record of 33-3 over three seasons, including a berth in the 2008 Sugar Bowl. Among his recruits was Mark Ingram, who won the 2008 Heisman Trophy, and Cignetti also coached Julio Jones, the Associated Press SEC Freshman of the Year and Columbus Touchdown Club National Freshman of the Year.

Cignetti joined the staff at Alabama after spending seven seasons (2000-06) as the recruiting coordinator at North Carolina State while also coaching tight ends from 2000-02 and 2005-06 and quarterbacks during the 2003 and 2004 campaigns. NC State qualified for five bowl games during that time, including the 2002 Gator Bowl, when the team set a school record with 11 victories. One of his last recruits before moving to Alabama was quarterback Russell Wilson, who played at NC State before moving on to Wisconsin as a senior. Following his record-setting collegiate career, Wilson was drafted by the Seattle Seahawks and led the team to a Super Bowl XLVIII victory.

Two of Cignetti's recruiting classes at NC State ranked in the top 10 in the nation, and Rivals.com named him one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation in 2004. While working with the NC State quarterbacks, Cignetti had the opportunity to coach 2003 ACC Player of the Year Philip Rivers and help prepare him to become the fourth pick in the NFL draft the following spring.

Cignetti first served as a recruiting coordinator during a seven-year stint (1993-99) at the University of Pittsburgh. He also coached the Panthers' tight ends and quarterbacks at various times under College Football Hall of Fame head coach Johnny Majors. Cignetti began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pitt during the 1983 and 1984 seasons and was part of the team's Fiesta Bowl participant his first year. He coached quarterbacks and receivers at Davidson in 1985 and was the quarterbacks coach at Rice (1986-88) and Temple (1989-92).

Cignetti's father, Frank Cignetti Sr., is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame and won 199 games as a head coach at West Virginia and IUP. Cignetti's brother, Frank Cignetti Jr., is currently the quarterbacks coach with the NFL's New York Giants.

Cignetti was a quarterback at West Virginia, where he earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1982. He is married to

the former Manette Lawer and the couple has three children – Curtis John, Carly Ann and Natalie Elise.

NESTING AT HOME

The 2017 season marks Elon's 96th year of football. In that time, the maroon and gold has posted an all-time home record of 218-136-3 (.615) – including a sizzling 176-84-3 (.674) mark in 52 seasons of home games at Burlington Memorial Stadium. In its current home of Rhodes Stadium, the Phoenix has gone 42-52 (.447).

Elon will recognize 10 players of part of pregame Senior Day ceremonies – offensive lineman Graham Albright, defensive lineman Josh Armstrong, defensive back Chris Blair, defensive back Malcolm Galloway, defensive lineman Nick Groll, defensive lineman Dondre Howell, linebacker Johnathan Jackson, defensive back Jack Landry, wide receiver Tre Lennon and offensive lineman Ikenna Nwokeji.

WATCH THIS

Junior linebacker Warren Messer was added to the watch list for the Buck Buchanan Award on Oct. 18. Messer currently leads Elon with 96 total tackles. He has 10.0 tackles for a loss, including 5.5 sacks, and has intercepted two passes. He ranks 22nd nationally, and second in the conference, with 9.6 tackles per game.

Freshman quarterback Davis Cheek was named to the initial watch list for the Jerry Rice Award on Oct. 25. Cheek has completed 158 of his 262 passes for 2,105 yards and 14 touchdowns. He is 31st nationally and fourth in the league with a passing efficiency mark of 140.1. Among freshmen, he is third nationally in passing yards, third in passing yards per game and second in passing efficiency.

PROGRAM TURNAROUNDS

After going 2-9 overall a year ago, the Phoenix has engineered a six-game improvement in the win column in 2017, tied for the second-best turnaround in program history. The largest improvement was an eight-game difference from 1979 (five wins) to 1980 (13 wins). Elon also had a six-game difference from 1975 (five wins) to 1976 (11 wins).

UNDEFEATED MONTHS

After dropping its season opener on Aug. 31 at Toldeo, Elon went undefeated during the months of September and October. That is the first time that the Elon program has accomplished that feat at the Division I level. The last time an Elon football team went unblemished through September and October was 1986. That year, the maroon and gold went 3-0 in both months.

DOWN TO THE WIRE

The Phoenix has won eight games this season, but its largest margin of victory in those eight games is just eight points. Elon's eight victories have come by a combined 31 points. Five of the eight games came down to a final play as Elon hit a field goal with just five seconds remaining to win at Furman, partially blocked a 51-yard field goal attempt on the final play to hold off Charleston Southern, batted down a pass on the final play to shutout Albany, recorded a sack on the last play to defeat William & Mary and kicked a field goal in double overtime to beat Towson. Elon also had to hold off a final Rhode Island drive, intercepting a pass at its own 19 with 28 seconds left.

FIVE GRADUATES ON 2017 ROSTER

Elon's 2017 roster features five players who earned their bachelor's degrees last spring. Those five are defensive back Chris Blair, offensive linemen Graham Albright and Ikenna Nwokeji and defensive linemen Nick Groll and Dondre Howell. That number rates second in CAA Football behind James Madison's 10 graduates.



Rhodes Stadium is designed to give fans the ultimate game-day experience. Designed by architectural firm Ellerbe Becket, the seats are contoured for comfort and they're right on top of the action. All of the stadium's services are within an easy walk of any seat. Rhodes Stadium, named for trustee Dusty Rhodes, his wife, Peggy, and their family, opened its doors on September 22, 2001 for the first game against North Carolina A&T.

In 2009, the largest crowd in stadium history – 14,167 fans – was on hand to watch Elon take on Appalachian State on November 14.

The facility has also hosted soccer and lacrosse games. Prior to the 2016 season, a new high-definition video board was installed. Two 19-foot long boards were also installed along the walls inside the stadium.

Named in honor of trustee Bob McKinnon '62 and his wife, Ray, the green grass of McKinnon Field is the result of extensive research and planning, and sophisticated construction methods.

McKinnon Field is identical to the playing surfaces in many NFL stadiums. McGovernSports Fields, Inc., of Ft. Myers, Fla., which installed similar fields for venues such as stadiums in Charlotte and Miami, did the work for the field. Functional and attractive, these sand-based fields help reduce injuries by providing a firm, reliable surface for players to make quick cuts and turns.

Work on the field began in the fall of 2000 with the installation of more than 12,000 feet of plastic pipe to provide drainage. On top of this drainage network came a four-inch blanket of stone, followed by a 12-inch root zone composed of a blend of silica sand and peat moss.

Landscaping specialists spent months studying varieties of grass and the latest methods in turf maintenance before selecting TifSport brand Bermuda grass, which is bred specifically for athletic fields and golf courses.

The 106,000 square feet of turf was grown over an 18-month period at Oakland Plantation in Council, N.C., and then laid down in 50-foot-long strips.

Following its installation, the sod was mowed daily and weekly tissue and soil tests helped crews keep an eye on the level of nutrients in the soil and make the necessary adjustments in irrigation and fertilizer amounts. The sand base and drainage pipes will keep McKinnon Field playable even in the heaviest rain.

Fans entering Rhodes Stadium will walk under Theos Arch, named in recognition of Nick Theos' lifetime accomplishments as an educator. Theos

is a 1956 Elon alumnus from Charleston, S.C.

Furman Moseley, Theos' friend and former Elon football teammate, dedicated \$1 million to Elon in 1998 in honor of Theos. The two men were recruited to Elon by John L. Georgeo, Elon class of 1946, who coached football at a Mt. Pleasant, S.C., high school.

Both Theos and Moseley played guard on the Elon squad for coach Sid Varney. Varney called Theos "a truly outstanding player" and a leader who always knew what to do on the field.

Moseley went on to become chairman of an international paper company based in Seattle, while Theos had a distinguished career as principal of Bishop England High School in Charleston.

Theos is credited with building the new Bishop England High School campus on Daniel Island. When he retired in 1999, after 27 years at the school, he was honored with the Benemerenti Medal, a papal medal first bestowed by Pope Pius VI in the 18th century and given in recognition of service to the church and society. The former bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Charleston, the Most Rev. David B. Thompson, conferred the title of "honorary bishop" to Theos in a school assembly.

On Saturday, November 14, 2009, Elon University broke ground on Alumni Field House, a new 30,000-square foot facility to be built adjoining the north end zone of Rhodes Stadium. The university's board of trustees has named the field house to honor all Elon alumni. The building opened in January 2011.

The new field house includes the Hendrickson Football Center in recognition of a gift from alumni Jay '71 and Amy '69 Hendrickson of Raleigh, N.C., who made a \$1 million gift in honor of Jay's father, Horace J. Hendrickson, one of Elon's all-time great coaches.

Located on Zac Walker Place, the building also contains the Walker Room and Terrace in recognition of a gift from alumnus and trustee Zac Walker '60 and his wife, Dot, of Raleigh, N.C. The Walkers made a \$500,000 gift in honor of Zac's father, Zachary T. Walker Jr., a member of Elon's Sports Hall of Fame, and Zac's uncle, D.C. "Peahead" Walker, another of Elon's all-time great coaches.

The facility includes a large team meeting room and locker room for football; a conference room; an advanced athletic training facility, including a hydrotherapy area; a large strength and conditioning room; and space for student-athletes to study. It also provides offices for the athletics director and coaches in the football, lacrosse, soccer, cross country and track and field programs, as well as other athletics staff.

A \$250,000 gift from trustee emeritus W.E. "Dub" Love Jr. '48 and his wife, Ann, named the football locker room.

The Ward family - mother Cynthia, son Hunt '82 and his wife, Julia - gave \$100,000 in memory of C. Max Ward '49. Rear Admiral Edward "Ted" Walker, a member of the Board of Visitors, contributed \$100,000. There were many other contributions to the project, including gifts by several former football players in honor of their coaches.

Alumni Field House is pursuing Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification, which is the nationally recognized benchmark for the design, construction and operation of high performance green buildings. LEED was created by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC), a non-profit organization committed to expanding sustainable building practices. The building's sustainable features include, but are not limited to, an energy efficient mechanical system, low flow plumbing fixtures, materials containing recycled content, regional materials and materials with low or no amounts of volatile organic compounds (VOCs). The automatic irrigation system will be part of the campus wide system, which is supplied with reclaimed stormwater collected on campus. During construction, the waste generated is being recycled or reused as much as possible.

There is an interactive touch screen in the lobby of the Field House, which contains information for visitors and building users. One of the features of this touch screen is access to the campus wide electricity monitoring system, which provides real-time electricity consumption information for over 50 campus buildings and will include the Alumni Field House.

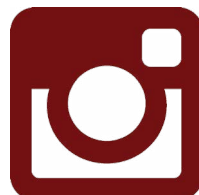
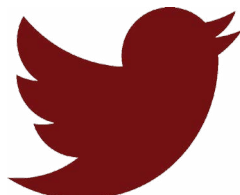

nities are limitless when you put God at your forefront and trust in him. Even when the odds are against you, you must keep moving forward and believing in yourself. The football team at Elon is not just a team, but a brotherhood. These men are some of the most outstanding people that I've met. I know that whatever situation I'm in, they will have my back.

Additionally, my Omega Psi Phi brothers are some of the strongest group of men I've seen. They have impacted my life in ways that can't be explained in words. I've also had people that have unexpectedly entered my life and have helped me grow into a better person. My girlfriend has truly made me want to be the best version of myself. With her also being a student-athlete at Elon, we are able help each other stay motivated in and out of classroom. These relationships don't just last in college; they are ones I will value forever.

My family has never fallen short in their love and support for me. They are constantly encouraging me and pushing me to be the man I am today. I truly cannot repay them for all that they have done, so every time a workout seems too hard or I am exhausted in the fourth quarter, they are what I think about to keep me going.

Elon is a very special place. I've built strong relationships with a variety of departments, and the staff here is like no other. It is an amazing feeling when you have professors that care about you as a person and not just as a student. When you can walk in the different dining facilities and have conversations with employees that treat you like family. When you have an academic support staff that are on you like parents, but want you to be successful, not just on the field but in life. This is what makes Elon different. People here don't just look at their career as a job, but as a chance to help students grow. This is why I am proud to say that I am part of the Elon University community.

As I approach my last college football season and my time here as a Phoenix comes to an end, I want to thank everyone who has impacted me and encouraged me these last four years. I am very appreciative of what I have gained being a part of this school and football program. I am very excited for this upcoming season and ready to leave it all on the field every game. The Phoenix will rise once again!

The Phoenix Club is the athletics fundraising arm of Elon University. 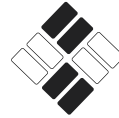

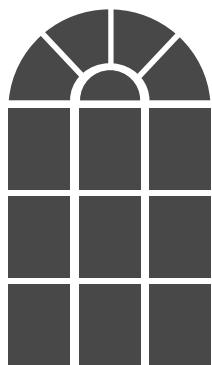

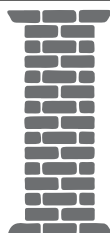

CAA Football has established itself as one of the nation's premier FCS power conferences over the past decade due to its on-field success, broadcast exposure, marketability and the achievements of its student-athletes in the classroom, in the community and at the next level.

James Madison capped an outstanding 2016 season for the conference by capturing the league's sixth FCS national title with a 28-14 victory over Youngstown State. CAA Football sent four programs to the NCAA Division I Football Championship for the third straight season and each of them won at least one playoff game. In addition to the Dukes' national title, New Hampshire extended the nation's longest FCS playoff streak with its 13 straight appearance, Richmond advanced to the FCS quarterfinals for the second year in a row and Villanova earned a playoff berth for the sixth time in nine years.

CAA Football continued its success against non-conference opponents in 2016, finishing 24-7 against FCS foes and 27-18 overall. The mark was the best of any FCS conference. The league posted a pair of victories over FBS competition for the first time since 2013 as Richmond knocked off ACC member Virginia, 37-20, and UAlbany defeated Buffalo, 22-16. CAA Football teams have now recorded 34 wins over FBS opponents in its history.

A strong presence in the national rankings remained another constant for CAA Football in 2016. James Madison finished the year as the unanimous #1 team in the country, while Richmond, Villanova and New Hampshire were also ranked in the final FCS top 25 polls. Eleven different CAA teams were either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls at some point during the 2016 season.

A total of 20 CAA Football players were named to one or more All-America teams in 2016, led by consensus first-team All-America selections, offensive lineman Mitchell Kirsch of James Madison and defensive lineman Tanoh Kpassagnon of Villanova. In addition, Towson's Jake Ryder was chosen to the FCS ADA Academic All-America team.

CAA Football continues to provide a path to the next level, with two players selected in the 2017 NFL Draft. Kpassagnon was drafted in the second round (59th overall) by the Kansas City Chiefs and Villanova offensive lineman Brad Seaton went to the Tennessee Titans in round seven. The conference has now had multiple players picked in each NFL Draft since 2006.

CAA Football reached a national audience last fall with 30 regular-season games televised by various outlets. In addition, numerous others were distributed on CAA.tv. In 2015, the CAA's national appeal was showcased when ESPN's iconic College Gameday aired live from James Madison on Oct. 24 prior to the Dukes' conference showdown with Richmond. It marked the show's first trip to a CAA campus.

CAA Football's emphasis on its players' off-the-field achievements was evident again in 2016. New Hampshire's Casey DeAndrade was the recipient of the Chuck Boone Leadership Award, which honors the player who best embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity, teamwork and sportsmanship in his academic and athletic pursuits. Towson's Jake Ryder and New Hampshire's Cam Shorey were selected as CAA Football's Student-Athlete of the Year.

Showing a desire to unite behind a common cause, all 12 CAA Football schools partnered with the Be the Match Foundation and its "Get in the Game, Save a Life" program in 2016. Former Villanova coach Andy Talley has been a driving force nationally for the program, which raises awareness of the need for bone marrow donors.

CAA Football has enjoyed a tremendous record in the postseason, earning 98 total playoff berths and at least three in every year since 2006. The league's 99 all-time wins in the NCAA playoffs are second-most of any FCS conference, and the league has further established its presence at the national level by placing 12 teams in the national semifinals over the past 11 seasons.

James Madison's national title in 2016 was the third in the past decade and sixth overall for CAA Football. Villanova captured the 2009 national championship and Richmond claimed its first FCS crown in 2008. In 2004, JMU took home the national championship, becoming the first team since the field expanded to 16 teams in 1986 to reach the final after winning three road playoff games. Delaware rolled past Colgate, 40-0, to capture the

first title-game shutout in 2003. Former league member Massachusetts earned a national championship in 1998.

CAA Football boasts a total of 27 individual national award winners in league history. Villanova quarterback John Robertson (2014), Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke (2012), New Hampshire quarterback Ricky Santos (2006), William & Mary quarterback Lang Campbell (2004), Villanova running back Brian Westbrook (2001), Nova wide receiver Brian Finneran (1997), UNH running back Jerry Azumah (1998) and Towson running back Dave Meggett (1998) all earned the Walter Payton Award as the top offensive player in FCS under the league banner. UNH linebacker Matt Evans (2011), James Madison defensive lineman Arthur Moats (2009), and JMU linebacker Derrick Lloyd (2001) each received the Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in FCS. Robertson (2012) and Towson's Terrance West (2011) are past recipients of the Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in FCS. New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell (2005 and 2014), Towson's Rob Ambrose (2011), JMU's Mickey Matthews (1999 and 2008), Villanova's Andy Talley (1997) and Boston University's Dan Allen (1993) are past Eddie Robinson Award winners from the league as the top coach in FCS. JMU's Mike Houston (2016), McDonnell (2014), Matthews (2004), Talley (1997 and 2009), Delaware's K.C. Keeler (2010), Richmond's Mike London (2008), and Massachusetts' Mark Whipple (1998) have all garnered the AFCA National Coach of the Year honor as well.

The league remains successful beyond the collegiate playing field. CAA Football has had 113 players drafted by NFL franchises dating back to 1948. A total of 35 players have been selected in the draft over the last 12 years, including 2013 Super Bowl MVP Joe Flacco of Delaware (18th overall to the Baltimore Ravens in 2008). More than 30 players currently join Flacco on active NFL rosters.

CAA Football's geographic footprint extends up and down the East Coast, with schools located from Maine to North Carolina. Members include UAlbany, Delaware, Elon, James Madison, Maine, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Richmond, Stony Brook, Towson, Villanova and William and Mary. Joe D'Antonio begins his second year as commissioner of CAA Football and the Colonial Athletic Association.

While CAA Football officially began March 1, 2007, its roots date back more than 60 years. On December 3, 1946, the Code of the Yankee Conference went into effect. Established as an all-sports conference for the New England land grant colleges, the six charter members included Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont. Upon the formation of Division I-AA football in 1978, the league disbanded all sports except for football. Delaware and Richmond were admitted to the conference in 1986, Villanova was added in 1988 and James Madison, Northeastern and William and Mary joined the league in 1993. The Atlantic 10 assumed operational control of the conference from 1997-2006, with Hofstra becoming part of the league in 2001 and Towson joining the group in 2004. With the conference under the CAA Football banner, UAlbany and Stony Brook were welcomed in 2013, followed by Elon in 2014.
