INSIDE THE MATCHUP

- Elon and Western Carolina met last season at Rhodes Stadium for the first time since Elon left the Southern Conference. The Catamounts prevailed in that game 24-17 in part to a blocked field goal returned for a touchdown in the final minutes.
- Elon and Western Carolina met 11 times as SoCon foes and Elon prevailed seven of the 11 times with all seven coming consecutively from 2006-12.
- Western Carolina looks to bounce back from back-to-back losses to Gardner-Webb and Wake Forest the last two weeks.
- Kerwin Bell is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Catamounts.

THE LEAD

Elon football hits the road Saturday to take on the Western Carolina Catamounts following a statement, 55-7 win over the Davidson Wildcats in the home opener. Kickoff at E.J. Whitmire Stadium will be at 2:30 p.m. in Cullowhee. Elon travels to Western Carolina for the first time since 2013 and looks for its first win in Cullowhee since 2011. The matchup with the Catamounts is the first of two, 2024 rematch games for the Phoenix against SoCon foes this month (WCU & ETSU). Like 2024, the Phoenix and Catamounts will meet with Elon searching for another in-state non-conference victory while Western searches for their first win.

KEY STORYLINES

1. SMOOTH LANDEN

Landen Clark was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Monday for his performance against Davidson, becoming the first Elon quarterback to earn the honor since 2017. He passed for a career-high 247 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for another touchdown in the win, giving him back-to-back games with a rushing score. Clark became just the fourth Elon freshman to start at quarterback in the Phoenix's season opener since 2005 when he took his first snap at Duke last week. Clark was a cool customer against Elon's ACC foe, completing 10-of-16 passes (62.5%) for 101 yards while leading Elon with 61 rushing yards and a rushing touchdown.

2. TJT

Sophomore running back TJ Thomas Jr. returns to the backfield for his second year with the Phoenix with an offseason of recovery and learning a new offense under his belt. After starting the first seven games of the 2024 season, Thomas missed the remainder of the season with an injury but is back, fresh, improved and wearing a new jersey number. The 2024 freshman All-American made his presence felt in Elon's season opener at Duke last week with a pair of plays that went for over 40 yards. On a 3rd-and-20 play, Thomas

found the hole on a counter play and juked out three Duke defenders on his way to a 44-yard scamper. Thomas continued to show an ability to break the long run on a kickoff return following a Duke touchdown, accelerating to midfield for a 46-yard effort. Thomas – who totaled 588 rushing yards on 89 carries (6.6 YPC) prior to his injury last year – had 95 all-purpose yards in the loss at Duke last week.

3. YURK DOIN' WORK

Elon has become a destination location for kickers and punters at the FCS level under the tutelage of Mike Nall. Punter Jeff Yurk – a 2024 All-American and 2025 preseason All-American – is a shining example as he's developed into one of the nation's best at the position.

Yurk averaged an FCS-leading 47.9 yards per punt in 2024 and ranked third in all of college football, trailing only Florida State's Alex Mastromanno (49.3) and Vanderbilt's Jesse Mirco (48.04). The redshirt senior picked up where he left off, showcasing his fine form with an average of 49.8 yards per punt on five punts last week at Duke. Two of those punts went for 50-plus yards and he pinned a pair inside the 20-yard line as well.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

547

The Phoenix compiled 547 yards of offense in the 55-7 win over Davidson last Saturday. Elon's offense went off for 250+ yards of rushing and passing in the win. 547 yards are the most by a Phoenix offense since 2012 versus West Virginia State.

Seven different Phoenix have recorded a sack in opening two games. Elon answered a multi-sack performance against Duke with five sacks against Davidson. The Phoenix is tied for fourth in the FCS in sacks per game and total sacks.

160.33

Landen Clark in two games as Elon's starting quarterback has compiled a 160.33 passing efficiency. Clark's passing efficiency is ranked 15th in the FCS but he has also done damage on the ground. Clark has two rushing TDs to go along with three passing TDs.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK

ELON IN YEAR 7 OF TONY TRISCIANI ERA

- Tony Trisciani was named the 23rd head football coach in Elon history on Dec. 17, 2018.
- Trisciani led the Phoenix to three consecutive winning seasons (2021-23) for the first time since 2007-10, which included a return to the FCS playoffs in 2022, and had the Phoenix at 6-6 in 2024.
- Trisciani, though in his seventh season as head coach, is in his 10th year overall with Elon; he served as the defensive coordinator from 2017-18 before his elevation to the lead chair and in 2006 he coached the defensive backs and ran the special teams.
- Trisciani has been a member of the Phoenix staff each of the last three times Elon has made the playoffs: as head coach in 2022 and as defensive coordinator in 2018 and 2017.
- Including the 2024 season, Elon has won at least five games and four league contests in all five fall campaigns in which Trisciani has been the head coach. The 2020 season was competed during a shortened spring campaign due to COVID-19.
- Elon won 22 conference games from 2021-24 under Trisciani and is the only program to finish conference play above .500 in each of those seasons. Those results came after being picked to finish 12th, sixth, fifth, and sixth respectively, in the league's preseason coaches poll.
- The 2025 season is Trisciani's 30th year as a football coach and 20th at a CAA football institution.
- Since his return to Elon in 2017, he has helped the program defeat 16 FCS Top 25 programs. As head coach, he has notched 10 wins over ranked teams, with at least one win over a ranked opponent in every fall campaign. In 2023, Elon twice beat a top five opponent, a feat the Phoenix had only done once in the program's FCS history previously (10/6/18 at No. 2 James Madison).

HART TO HART

- Tony Hart III and Tyler Hart not only share a position this season at bantam, but they also share a few more things. Mainly a family name.
- Brothers Tony and Tyler are reuniting in the Maroon and Gold after a pair of seasons together at Dunbar High School in Baltimore.
- Tony, the elder brother and a redshirt sophomore, was selected as a second-team All-CAA special teams contributor according to Phil Steele in 2024. He looks to do more in 2025 as the starting bantam safety. Of his 21 tackles last season, according to PFF, 13 of those tackles came on special teams, the most in a single season in FCS Football since 2022.
- Playing behind him is Tyler, a freshman. Tyler arrived on campus early in the spring of 2025 and joins his brother in the safety room, coached by Dominique Battle.

LATE SEASON SUCCESS

- Over the last three seasons, the Phoenix have become accustomed to winning late in the season. Elon has played their best ball in the back half of the schedule and 2024 was no different.
- Elon finished their 2024 season on a four-game winning streak, tied for the third longest in the FCS. Elon averaged 38 points per game during that stretch despite averaging less than 20 in the eight games prior.
- The Phoenix are a combined 10-2 in the last four games of each respective season over the past three years (2022-24). Elon lost just one of its last four games in both 2022 and 2023 and went unbeaten in its final four games in the 2024 season.

MORE ON TJ THOMAS JR.

- TJ Thomas Jr., Elon's freshman All-American running back in 2024, made a splash with a national rookie of the week performance in a week 2 win at North Carolina Central. He followed that up with a second consecutive 100-yard rushing game against Western Carolina and then posted his third of the season at UAlbany.
- Against North Carolina Central, Thomas carried the football 11 times for 163 yards and a touchdown. It was the best performance by a freshman running back at Elon since 2018. For his efforts, he was named Stats Perform National Rookie of the Week and CAA Rookie of the Week.
- For an encore, Thomas carried the ball 14 times for 101 yards and a 60-yard touchdown run against Western Carolina. He added three receptions for 28 yards and 75 yards on three kick returns. In total, he had 214 all-purpose yards.
- Thomas then carried the ball 19 times for 138 yards and a touchdown in the win at UAlbany. It was the second-most rushing yards of his career.
- The Thomasville, Georgia, native had a touchdown in six consecutive games, which included a touchdown catch against Richmond to go along with five in the rushing department.
- The last time a true freshman running back had at least 100 yards on the ground for Elon in one game was 2018 when another Thomas, Jaylan, posted 150 against Richmond and 222 against Rhode Island in back-to-back weeks.
- TJ's 74-yard rushing touchdown in the North Carolina Central game was the longest rush for an Elon player since Jaylan had an 86-yard carry in that Rhode Island game in 2018. Interestingly, that game also featured an 86-yard interception return for a touchdown and an 82-yard touchdown pass, all by Elon.

RE-LAX, SINGER

- Elon linebacker Jayson Singer already has done more than just about any football player in the FCS. Win a national championship and be named a conference defensive player of the year. Just, not in football.
- Singer joined the Phoenix as a graduate student after four years at Cornell in their lacrosse program. Singer played 61 career games for Cornell and started 50 of them as a defenseman for Cornell. He snagged 62 career ground balls and caused 38 turnovers in his career, with 21 ground balls and 15 caused turnovers coming in his senior season. For his efforts in his senior season, Singer was named the Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year.
- Singer and Cornell finished the 2025 regular season 14-1 with one loss coming from a lone goal against Penn State. Cornell ran through the NCAA Tournament on their way to the national championship game against Maryland.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK

- Singer and the Cornell defense allowed just nine goals per game in the tournament leading up to the title game. After 60 minutes, the Big Red were national champs with a 13-10 win over the Terrapins, the school's fourth men's lacrosse national championship. After coming up short in the title game in 2022, Singer was a national champion four years later.

SPUR OF THE MOMENT

- Elon's five-defensive back system is flooded with versatility, none more than at the SPUR position.
- A linebacker/safety hybrid position, the SPUR has provided the Phoenix with an ability to make plays in the backfield, the secondary and patrol the middle of the field.
- After anchoring the SPUR slot last year, Ish Atkins will slide over to cornerback this fall, making way for Jesse Powell II to return to the hybrid position after he was limited by injury in 2024. Powell made 10 starts at SPUR in 2023 and totaled 26 tackles (5.0 TFL), 2.0 sacks, 3 pass break ups and a forced fumble.
- Powell, though limited last season, still had 24 tackles (6.0 TFL) and two sacks. The highlight of his 2024 season came against North Carolina Central with a 40-yard interception return for a touchdown in which he hurdled a defender along the sideline on the way to the end zone.

BANDITS ON THE LOOSE

- For the first time in seven of the last eight seasons, the name Cole Coleman or Caleb Curtain will be patrolling Elon's starting safety spot, or what we call a Bandit.
- The role this year falls upon Tony Hart III who has already been a key contributor on special teams but will make the leap to starting Bandit in 2025.
- Hart was second on the team with 8.0 tackles (5 solo) in Elon's season-opening loss at Duke on Aug. 28.
- Hart fills the shoes of two Elon legends in Cole Coleman and Caleb Curtain who both had All-American type careers in the Maroon and Gold.
- Cole Coleman finished his career with the Phoenix by receiving a rookie camp invite from the Indianapolis Colts after five seasons at Elon. After a short time with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders, Coleman has settled with the Munich Ravens. The Ravens are headed into the European League of Football semifinals with Coleman as their leading secondary tackler. He has 61 total tackles in ten games this season with an interception and forced fumble.
- Caleb Curtain finished off a four-year Elon career with two seasons of First and Second Team All-American play. Curtain led Elon with 75 tackles, 11 passes defended and two interceptions in a First Team All-CAA season. In the game against Duke last season, Curtain intercepted a pass and defended four passes. In each of the last two games against ACC opponents, Curtain picked off a pass.

WE-FENSE

- The Phoenix special teams unit has not only emerged as one of the best in the FCS under coordinator Milo Austin, it has become known by a different name: We-Fense.
- The unit showed out against Duke in the season opener on Aug. 28 with a 46-yard kickoff return by TJ Thomas Jr., while Elon limited the Blue Devils to less than 20 yards per kick return.
- Elon excelled in both special teams coverage and the return game in 2024, led by the stellar play of now-graduated Chandler Brayboy, who was an undrafted signee with Jacksonville after being named FCS Special Teams Player of the Year.
- Though without Brayboy in 2025, Elon returns many

faces of success from its special teams units including preseason first-team All-American punter Jeff Yurk (47.9 yards per punt in 2024), kicker Luke Barnes (6-of-10 FG, 21-of-21 PAT in 2024), and defensive back Tony Hart III, who recorded 13 of his 21 tackles last season on special teams; the most by an FCS player since 2022, per PFF.

NO PICKS FOR YOU

- Since 2021, Elon has thrown just 21 interceptions as a team. That includes five in 2021, four in 2022, six in 2023 and six in 2024.
- Following Elon's clean game against Davidson on Sept. 6, the Phoenix has not thrown an interception in its last four games dating back to last season. Since Matthew Downing's interception last season against William & Mary, the Phoenix quarterback room has not thrown an interception in 125 straight passing attempts.
- From 2021-23, just one FCS program threw fewer interceptions than Elon's 15. Kennesaw State, now in playing FBS Football, threw 14 interceptions over that three-season span. By comparison, Elon threw 1,010 passes from 2021-23, while Kennesaw State attempted just 514 passes during that span.
- After Elon with 15 interceptions, Montana State threw 16 interceptions from 2021-23. North Dakota State, North Dakota, South Dakota State and Dartmouth each had 17 interceptions, while Texas Southern had 18. Columbia and Princeton had 19 each to round out the group of schools with fewer than 20 interceptions.
- In the 2024 regular season, Montana State lead the country with just one interception thrown. North Dakota State has thrown two and Dartmouth four.

LUUUUUUE

- Elon's kicker Luke Barnes returns for his second season with kicking duties. But Barnes looks more like a basketball player than a football player. After both of Elon's kickers from 2018-2023 were listed at 5'8 (Skyler Davis) and 5'7 (Jack Berkowitz), Barnes at 6'6 towers above the rest.
- Barnes connected on his only field-goal attempt, a 35-yarder, in the season opener at Duke (Aug. 28) and was 2-for-2 on PATs.
- Barnes came in midseason last year and converted every PAT he attempted (21-21) and made 6-10 field goals last season but was 5-7 going into the final game against North Carolina A&T.
- The 6'6 placekicker is also a homegrown product out of Grimsley High School in Greensboro. He did not start kicking at Grimsley until his senior year of high school where he was known more for his soccer abilities.

NIGHT WALKER

- Brayden Walker returns for his third season at Elon as the most experienced offensive lineman on the roster.
- As a redshirt freshman, Walker started nine games on the offensive line at two different positions (left tackle and left guard) for the Phoenix.
- Walker will begin the 2025 season at a new position, center, which may be new for Elon to see Walker there but not for his high school teammates.
- In his last two seasons at Eastern View High School, Walker switched to center. Walker looks to replace Jabrill Williams who spent six seasons with the Phoenix and started nearly 50 games (48). Walker is one of three returning linemen who have a start for the Phoenix and is the most experienced with nine.

ABOUT THE PHOENIX

- In 1921, Elon's sports teams were first called the Fighting Christians. As the department transitioned to NCAA Division I athletics in the late 1990s, a new nickname was sought out.
- A 15-member task force was selected to choose the new identity.
- In 2000, Elon officially changed its mascot to the Phoenix. The choice refers to a 1923 fire that consumed school records, classrooms, the library and the chapel. Trustees immediately voted to rebuild and Alamance County residents rallied to help raise funds. A new building opened in 1923, with four more buildings added between 1924 and 1925.
- The Phoenix's plumage matches the school's maroon and gold colors. Once every 500 years, when it felt its death approaching, the Phoenix would build a nest in an oak tree -- a link to the college name, Elon, which is Hebrew for oak.
- After being consumed in the nest by its own flames, the Phoenix would rise again to fly to the temple of the sun. The bird is a symbol of light, knowledge and everlasting vigor.
- As there can only be one Phoenix at any time, please refer to the Phoenix in the singular.

Did You Know?

- Elon University has no connection to Elon Musk and the word Elon, in fact, is the Hebrew word for oak, as the school was founded in a grove of oak trees. Students receive an acorn during New Student Convocation and an oak sappling during Commencement Week to symbolize growth.
- Spike Lee filmed part of "He Got Game" on campus in 1997. Elon represented "Tech University" in the film, one of the schools that Ray Allen's character was invited to visit. Six Elon students landed speaking roles and four communications students had the opportunity to shadow the film's producer for the day.
- The CW's "The Flash" got his start at Elon. Actor Grant Gustin attended the University before he got his big break in television.
- Elon has been named one of the most beautiful campuses in the nation on multiple occasions and it is designated as a botanical garden.

FROM THE NOTEBOOK**MATCHING AN ELITE ERA**

- Elon's 22 conference wins in the past four seasons (2021-24) are tied for the most in a four-year stretch in the program's FCS history. It matches the 22 wins from 2007-10.
- Elon also won 21 conference games from 2008-11.

PHOENIX IN THE NFL

- Chandler Brayboy (Jacksonville) and Rushawn Baker (New York Giants) signed undrafted free agent contracts in the offseason. Brayboy saw playing time during the preseason on special teams as both a returner and a gunner in special teams coverage.
- Former Elon offensive lineman Oli Udoh played in 43 games, with 18 starts, over five seasons with the Minnesota Vikings from 2019-23. He was signed as a free agent by the New Orleans Saints during the offseason and played 14 games for the Saints, starting one. Udoh signed a free agent deal in the offseason with the Tennessee Titans.

DJ, TURN UP THE MUSIC

- In Elon's five defensive back system, two starters from last season will be starting again this season. But, in a whole new position.
- DJ James-Hamilton is one of those players. After starting last season at corner for the first three games last season, James-Hamilton returns to the defensive backfield but as the team's free safety.
- In his first action since sustaining his injury against Western Carolina last season, James-Hamilton became a tackling force against the Blue Devils. He was the leading tackler between both Duke and Elon with no player topping his 11 total tackles.
- This was not the first time DJ showed off his tackling against Duke. Against the Blue Devils in 2024, James-Hamilton led the Phoenix with nine total tackles.

SHEPHERD LEADS THE FLOCK

- After two seasons at Shepherd University, linebacker Brodie Carroll is already making an impact in the maroon & gold.
- Through two games, Carroll is second on the team in tackles and is an FCS leader in tackles-for-loss and forced fumbles.
- Against Davidson, Carroll paced the Elon defense with five tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and a strip sack. In his first game versus Duke, he finished the night with seven tackles, a TFL and a forced fumble that shut down a potential Blue Devil scoring drive.
- At Shepherd, Carroll earned PSAC East Division Freshman Player of the Year honors after ranking fourth on the team with 52 tackles, adding 7.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks. He also had a pass break-up and a fumble recovery.

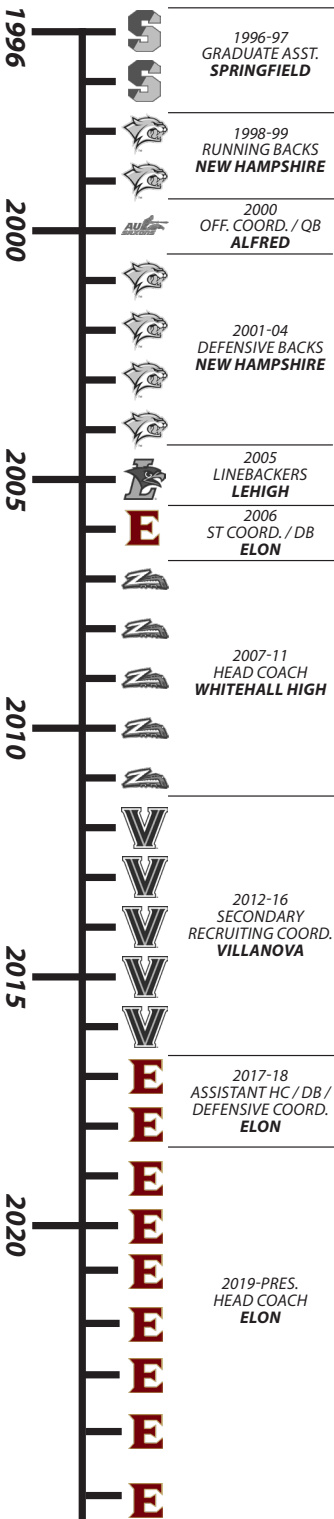
