Bredbenner begins her fourth season as the Hornets head coach. She led ESU to its fifth consecutive MIAA regular season title in 2008. They also won their fourth straight post-season tournament championship and second regional championship. They also had their second national runner-up finish in three years. She was also named the MIAA Coach of the Year for the second straight season. In 2007 Bredbenner was the MIAA Coach of the Year and led the squad to their second straight regional championship game coming just short of a second NCAA World Series berth. In 2006 she led the Hornets to the NCAA Division II National Championship game last season. Her squad finished with a record of 62-7 which set the MIAA record for wins in a season. Bredbenner and her staff were named the NCFA/Speedline Coaching Staff of the Year.

"Coach Bredbenner has established herself as one of the top softball coaches in the country," Athletic Director Kent Weiser said. "The level of success our program has achieved under her leadership, both on the field and in the classroom, is remarkable."

Before coming to ESU Bredbenner spent the last three seasons as the top assistant at UC-Santa Barbara. Working with players in all aspects of the game, she played an instrumental role in guiding the Gauchos to their first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2004 and a second place finish in the tough Big West Conference—the highest finish in UCSB history. She was the interim head coach at her alma mater, Truman State University, during the 2002 season. The Bulldogs went 31-19, won the MIAA Tournament Championship and advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament under her guidance.

As a player, Bredbenner was a four-time All-MIAA pick, two-time Division II All-American and was named MVP of the conference in 2000. In her four years at Truman she claimed nearly every hitting record, including career and single season records for games played, at bats, hits, doubles, home runs, total bases, RBI's, walks, batting average, and slugging percentage. Her three home run day against the Hornets on April 7, 2000 is tied for fourth all-time on the Division II single game list.

The O'Fallon, Mo. native graduated from Truman in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in business/marketing and received her master's degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific University.

## Nicole Churnock

Nicole Churnock will begin her first season as an Assistant Coach with the Hornets. She joins ESU after playing four seasons for UC-Santa Barbara where Head Coach Kristi Bredbenner served as her assistant coach during her Freshman season.

Churnock played outfield for the UC-Santa Barbara and during her senior season hit .301 with 15 RBI. She had eight double, one triple and one home run during the season.

Prior to playing for the Gauchos she attended Rosary High School in Fullerton, Calif. While there she hit .330 during her senior year with the Royals.

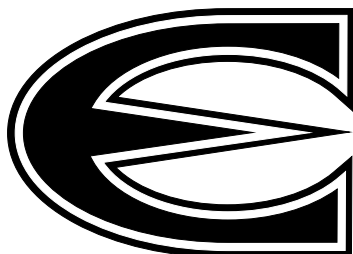
Prior to coming to ESU she was a 2003 graduate of Jefferson West High School. While a member of the Tigers she led the team in hits, runs, doubles and triples.

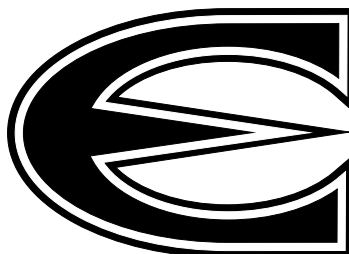

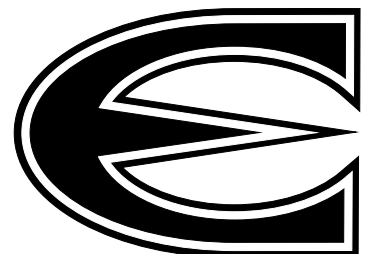

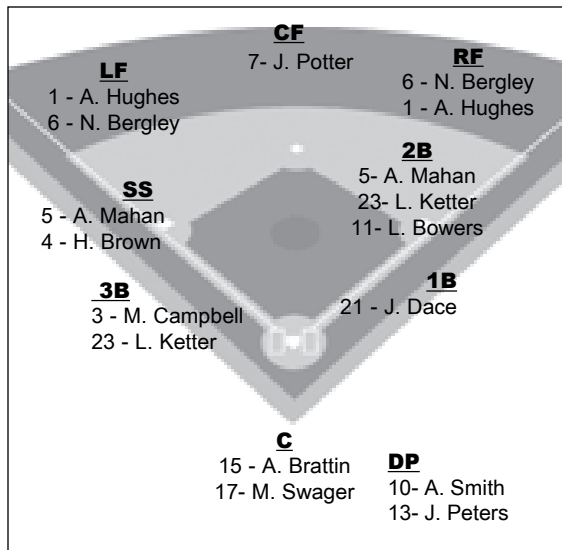

# 2009 PREVIEW

The Emporia State softball program has established itself as one of the top programs in the nation, appearing in the NCAA Division II National Championship game two out of the last three years. On their way to the National Tournament, the Lady Hornets have won five consecutive MIAA postseason tournaments and four consecutive MIAA regular season championships. With five returning position players and one returning starting pitcher, the Hornets look to be one game better this year.

"Our basic goal is to win a National Championship, but I think it is very important that we set goals that we need to accomplish first for that to happen," says fourth year head coach Kristi Bredbenner, who enters the season needing only nine wins to reach 200 in her tenure as a head coach. "The team has set goals to win conference and the conference tournament and to win each tournament we are participating in during the pre-season." If the Lady Hornets can do these things initially, they will be well on their way to their first NCAA Division II National Championship.

## THE BATTERY

Each year since 2006, Emporia State has replaced one All-American pitcher with another. Courtney Reed replaced Melissa Stevens and Samantha Sheeley replaced Reed. Megan Dennis now looks to continue the pitching dominance and step into the top spot at ESU.

"After losing Samantha, it is obvious to me that we have to have someone on the mound step up and lead this team defensively," says Bredbenner. "I think we have two capable pitchers in senior Megan Dennis and freshman Jennifer Heerey."

Dennis was 12-6 last season, including a win in the national semifinal game against St. Edward's University. The senior from Liberty, Mo. was an All-MIAA selection last season, despite returning from knee surgery.

"Megan has the experience and saw first hand last year the determination and work ethic a pitcher has to have to be successful," says Bredbenner. It will be essential for Dennis to continue passing on the pitching dominance at ESU, as Heerey is the only other pitcher for the Lady Hornets this year.

Heerey is a true freshman from Goddard, Kan. that will be asked to step into the circle right away.

"In my opinion, you wouldn't know Jenny is a freshman on the mound," says Bredbenner. "She throws hard, hits her spots, and keeps her composure on the mound. I am excited to see what this duo can do this year."

All games start with the pitcher, and as long as this tandem stays healthy, the Hornets should see immediate success.

Catching this pair will be senior Aubree Brattin. The Lee's Summit, Mo. native earned All-MIAA honors after batting .319 with 24 RBI last season. She was also named to the All-Tournament team at the National Championships. Only 23 runners tried to steal on her last season and she threw eight of them out. She is a reliable defensive threat behind the dish.

"Aubree Brattin is, in my mind, the best catcher in the MIAA," says Bredbenner. "She calls a great game, has a cannon for an arm, and really prides herself on working well with our pitchers."

To fill in for Brattin when she needs a break will be junior Melissa Swager. Swager, a Goodland, Kan. product is in her third season with the Hornets and provides a valuable role as Brattin's backup.

"Melissa Swager is the ultimate team player," comments Bredbenner, "She brings her best to the field everyday and that's all you can really ask as a coach. Swag is a valuable asset, and I can't say enough about her."

## INFIELDERS

Leading an infield that returns starters in three of four positions will be senior Jennifer Dace and junior Miranda Campbell.

"Offensively, they are two of the best hitters in the

league," says Bredbenner, "I look forward to seeing what they can do this year."

Dace earned All-MIAA and All-Region honors last season after hitting .319 with 11 homers and 57 RBI. The first baseman from Olathe, Kan. is a career .319 hitter and has started in 192 of 196 games since arriving at ESU.

With this experience, she will be looked at to be the anchor of the defense this season with a career fielding percentage of .984.

Campbell was an All-American at third base for the Hornets last year after batting .404 with 17 home runs and 58 RBI. The native of Bogata, Texas was the MVP of the North Central Regional last season as a sophomore and also joined Brattin and Sheeley on the National Championship All-Tournament team.

Angela Mahan is the other returning infielder for the Hornets at second base. She started 62 games last season with 35 of them coming at second.

Abby Hughes, a sophomore transfer will look to fill the open spot at shortstop with the graduation of April Huddleston. Hughes joins the team this year by way of the University of Nebraska where she started eight games and appeared in 35 for the Huskers.

"Abby Hughes gives us the speed we lost when Jessie Wiard graduated," Bredbenner says of the Olathe, Kan. product. "But she will also be looked upon to fill the spot at short left when April graduated. She is more than capable of doing both and I'm excited to see the energy she'll bring to the lineup."

A Johnson County Community College transfer, Lindsay Bowers also looks to fill the empty holes in the infield and in the lineup. The junior from Abilene, Kan. hit .345 for the Cavs last year and knows what it is like to be a part of championship play, as she was a part of the Cavalier team in 2007 that finished 2nd in the NJCAA, along with teammates, Brattin and Jill Peters.

## UTILITY PLAYERS

Peters, a senior from Wichita, Kan. will compete again with sophomore Liberty, Mo. native, Abby Smith, for time at the designated player position. Peters and Smith split time as the DP last season, each starting 29 games for the Hornets.

"With Abby Smith's ability to play the outfield, as well as hit, we may be moving some things around this year," comments Bredbenner. "Both girls can hit for power and have the ability to step up and drive the ball for us. It will just depend on who can do it consistently."

Last year as a junior, Peters hit .247 on the year, while Smith batted .202 as a freshman. Unless Smith gets that time in the outfield, whoever brings the big stick to the yard more consistently will probably see more time for the Hornets.

## OUTFIELDERS

Lone returner to the outfield will be Jenna Potter in center field. The junior from Emporia, Kan. was third on the team with five home runs last season and looks to add to that total this season.

Not only did the Hornets lose great speed in Jessie Wiard's graduation, but a good glove. Looking to fill that void will be junior Linda Ketter. Ketter, a Home, Kan. native will look to replace Wiard, converting from an infielder to an outfielder in the offseason.

"Linda's speed and ability to find the ball makes her a naturally good outfielder and we're excited to see how she does this season," says Bredbenner, "She's an extremely hard worker and it's great to see her having success."

Others vying for a spot in the grass will be sophomores Nicole Bergley and Haley Carpenter. Both have great speed and if they are not in the field, they will definitely be looked upon to add depth to an already potent lineup.

"Nicole Bergley and Haley Carpenter have tremendous speed," comments Bredbenner, "If we cannot find a spot for them in the outfield, they will definitely see some time running the base paths for us. All positions on the team are important, but for these two to come up big

will be vital to our success."

## SCHEDULE

The schedule will look a little different than in year's past. With the regional realignment of Division II, Emporia State will move from the North Central to South Central Region with the Lone Star and Heartland Conferences. ESU defeated South Central Region champion St. Edward's twice in the National Semifinals last season.

"Moving into the South Central region makes the early pre-conference schedule more important since you generally have to travel down south to play and the team most likely isn't as prepared as those in the warmer climates," says Bredbenner. "The South Central in the past has been dominated by the Heartland and Lone Star conferences. When you add a conference like the MIAA who traditionally gets 3-4 teams in the regional to that mix, there are going to be some good teams that may not make the regional tournament."

The Hornets will open the season playing nine of their first 11 games against teams that received votes in the NFCA Preseason Coaches poll.

"Obviously being in the MIAA helps with preparation for the postseason because the conference is so tough. Several teams have added quality players and the addition of Nebraska-Omaha really makes the conference tough," says Bredbenner. "It is very important to take care of business during the conference to make sure we are one of those teams getting into the regional."

The MIAA Tournament will return to the Kansas City area for the 19th straight season. For the first time, the tournament will be scheduled as a three day tournament, running April 30-May 2 at Blue Valley Sports Complex in Overland Park, Kan.

The NCAA Tournament has gone from an eight team regional tournament on one weekend to two four team regionals with the winners meeting in a best of three super regional.

"I do like the new format with the regional and the super regional," comments Bredbenner. "I think spacing things out over two weeks versus squeezing it into one week will keep the teams rested for the NCAA National Championship."

If all things fall into place for the Lady Hornets this season, hopefully that rest will be benefiting them as they gear up for a run at the National Championship title.

# 2008 YEAR IN REVIEW

When you've won three national championships in your history and haven't missed the NCAA tournament since 2003 the expectations are high. That would explain why some Emporia State softball supporters may have been worried after the Hornets started the season 3-7 in February. Turns out that by May there was no reason to worry as ESU finished the year 48-17, won the MIAA Regular Season, MIAA Tournament and NCAA North Central Regional Championships and advanced to the NCAA Division II Championship game.

Two-time MIAA Coach of the Year, Kristi Bredbenner led a turnaround from that 3-7 start to end the season on a 14-2 run with both losses to eventual national champion Humboldt State.

The season opener offered a glimpse of the Hornets potential as ESU secured a 5-4 win over then #9 St. Mary's (Texas) at the Abilene Christian Tournament. In fact two of the Hornets three wins in February came in Texas against top ten foes as ESU also defeated then #5 Angelo State 6-4 on Feb. 17 in the Rambelles own tournament.

The Hornets opened March by winning ten of their first 12 games with the losses being to defending national champion and then #1 ranked SIU-Edwardsville in Edwardsville and to then #7 Nebraska-Omaha in the second game of a double header in Emporia. The Hornets would end up 18-5 in March including five run rule wins.

April consisted solely of MIAA action as ESU rolled to their unprecedented fourth consecutive MIAA regular season title. The Hornets went 15-3 in conference action thanks in large part to the arm of MIAA Pitcher of the Year Samantha Sheeley and the play of the left side of the Hornet infield.

Sheeley, a senior from Coralville, Iowa, was 10-1 in MIAA action with a 0.81 ERA in 12 appearances. She went 9-0 and allowed just five runs in nine starts for a 0.58 ERA.

April Huddleston, a senior from Topeka, Kan., batted .512 in conference action with 13 RBI. She was stellar in the field as well with just three errors in 56 chances at shortstop. Miranda Campbell, a sophomore from Bogota, Texas, hit .415 with three home runs, 12 RBI and team best 15 runs scored in conference play.

ESU took a pair of games from Missouri Western 7-2 and 3-0 to open MIAA play before two run-rule wins over Southwest Baptist. A 3-1 win over Northwest Missouri put the Hornets at 5-0 in conference action before suffering their first MIAA loss, 7-5 in the second game of the double header. The Hornets didn't dwell to long on the loss as Sheeley tossed a no hit shutout in ESU's next game, a 3-0 win over Missouri Southern and Megan Dennis followed with a two-hit shutout in the second game of the double dip.

Following the dual shut outs, ESU began their longest true road trip of the season, eight MIAA games in eight days. The Hornets started the trip at Central Missouri. At the time the Jennies were ranked in front of the Hornets in the North Central Regional poll. Game one pitted two of the top pitchers in the MIAA in Sheeley and UCM's Megan Leonard against each other. Sheeley scattered three hits and struck out 11 while walking just three to pick up her second straight shutout win.

ESU took an early lead in the night cap after Campbell doubled and later scored on a Shelbe Hughes sacrifice fly in the second inning.

After the two teams played to a tie and no one scored in the eighth or ninth, Ketter was placed on second to start the tenth in the international tiebreaker. She was caught trying to steal third and Campbell flied out to right before Huddleston doubled to left with two outs. Mandi Dennis pinch ran for her and scored on Hughes' double to left center to give ESU a 4-3 lead. The Hornets scored an insurance run when Abby Smith's single plated Hughes and chased Leonard from the game. Sheeley then retired the Jennies in order in the bottom of the inning with two strike outs and a pop up.

The next day ESU used the same formula as they came from behind on the road in the seventh to force extra innings on the way to a doubleheader sweep. Miranda Campbell led off the top of the eighth with a home run to give ESU a 2-1 win over Truman in game one and followed it with a 3-1 victory in game two. The Hornets evened their record in extra inning games after entering the weekend just 1-3 games that went extra.

The Hornets ran their MIAA winning streak to seven with an 8-0 win in six innings at Ft. Hays State before stranding eight

runners in a 2-1 loss to the Tigers in the nightcap.

Emporia State clinched a share of the MIAA title with a 3-1 win at Pittsburg State in the first game of a doubleheader on April 26, but fell 2-1 in the final game of the eight game road trip. The loss to PSU snapped a string of 14 straight wins against the Gorillas.

The Hornets returned home to sweep Washburn 4-2 and 11-3 on Senior Day at the Trusler Sports Complex to clinch their fourth consecutive MIAA regular season championship and the top seed in the post season tournament. Playing in front of a regular season high crowd of 532, Campbell gave ESU a 1-0 lead when she tripled in Dace in the bottom of the first inning of game one. Sheeley would hold WU to just two runs on five hits with six strikeouts and did not allow a hit after the Lady Blues two run third inning.

WU took a 1-0 lead in the top of the second inning of the night cap before ESU responded with six runs in the bottom of the inning for the win.

The Hornets traveled to the Mid-America West Sports Complex in Shawnee, Kan. to defend their MIAA Tournament title. ESU opened the tourney with a pair of run-rule wins on the first day. The Hornets hit four home runs on their way to an 11-0 win over FHSU in five innings and followed that with an 11-2 win in six innings over WU. On Friday, ESU used a two out, two-run homer in the eighth from Jenna Potter to post a 6-4 come from behind win over Northwest Missouri in the tourney semifinals.

Due to rain delays on Thursday, the championship game was moved to Saturday afternoon. The delay didn't matter as the Hornets picked up their fifth straight MIAA Tournament Championship with a 4-0, 14 in-

ning win over Central Missouri. Sheeley had 19 strikeouts which set a MIAA Tournament record. April Huddleston gave the Hornets their other two runs, following Campbell's double with a two RBI single to right for a 4-0 lead. The win was ESU's 20th straight victory in MIAA Tournament play and secured the automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament the next weekend.

For the third time in four years the Trusler Sports Complex would serve as the host site for the NCAA Division II North Central Regional Tournament. The Hornets got things started with their fourth win over Washburn in 12 days, this time a 5-3 victory as Shelbe Hughes went two for two with two runs scored and an RBI. Sheeley picked up her 25th win of the year, scattering eight hits over seven innings with four strikeouts. The win put ESU up against Neb.-Omaha. Hughes' RBI single in the second inning was all the offense the Hornets needed in a 1-0 win over the Mavericks as Sheeley scattered six hits and struck out in the shut out.

The win sent ESU to the winner's bracket championship game against Winona State. Dace delivered a two out, two run home run in the bottom of the sixth to give the Hornets a 2-0 win over the Warriors in the winner's bracket championship game.

Tournament Most Outstanding Player Miranda Campbell had two home runs, one of them a grand slam, as Emporia State run ruled Winona State 9-1 in the NCAA Division II North Central Regional Softball Tournament Championship Game. Sheeley retired the final 11 batters she faced to send the Hornets to the National Championship Tournament for the second time in three years.

The Hornets opened the finals with a 6-0 victory over then #9 C.W. Post for the largest margin of victory in the first round of the finals. ESU took advantage of several Post miscues in the game. Samantha Sheeley was again impressive in the circle, scattering six hits while striking out nine for her 29th win of the season.

Dace was three for four with two RBI while Mahan was two for four with two RBI. Brattin went two for four with two runs scored at the plate and had three assists.

The second round featured a battle of top ten teams, as #6 Emporia State fell to #8 Humboldt State 3-0. The Hornets were shut out for just the third time this season and the first time since March 21.

All-Americans Samantha Sheeley for ESU and Lizzy Prescott of HSU were locked in a pitcher's duel through the first three and a half innings.

Prescott picked up the win for the Jacks, striking out nine and allowing only a Wiard single in the fourth inning. Sheeley took the loss, despite giving up just seven hits and retiring nine straight after a lead off single in the bottom of the first.

Campbell doubled and scored the game's only run while Sheeley tossed a three-hit shut out as Emporia State defeated Francis Marion 1-0 in front of a live national television audience on CBS College Sports.

ESU advanced to the final day of the NCAA Division II Championship Tournament with a 3-1 win over St. Edward's. Wiard opened the game with a slap single and then beat out the throw to second on a fielder's choice bunt by Mahan. Dace then sacrificed Wiard to third and she scored on Campbell's ground out for a 1-0 lead.

ESU would tack on two more runs in the fourth inning. Sheeley went the distance again for ESU, striking out nine and scattering five hits.

The Hornets defeated St. Edwards 2-1 in 13 innings in the national semifinals. ESU got on top 1-0 in the bottom of the first when Campbell singled in Wiard. Sheeley made that stand up into the seventh inning before SEU's Stacy Giles sent a 1-2 pitch over the left field fence to tie the score. Sheeley came back to end the inning with a strike out and would pitch another four scoreless innings before being replaced by Megan Dennis in the top of the 13th inning. She retired the Hilltoppers on four pitches to keep the game tied. Potter led off the bottom of the inning with a ground rule double to right center field. Wiard, the NCAA Division II career leader in sacrifice hits, did her job and sacrificed Potter to third. Mahan then hit a slow roller to first base and Potter beat the throw home to send ESU to the championship game. Dennis got the win in relief after Sheeley struck out ten and allowed only five hits over the first 12 innings.

Humboldt State would take a 1-0 lead in the top of the first of the national champion-

ship game when All-American Natalie Galletly homered to left field off Sheeley. That would end up being the only run of the game as Sheeley allowed only three hits the rest of the way. ESU had several opportunities to score off of tournament Most Outstanding Player Lizzy Prescott late. With one out Abby Smith singled to left field and Brattin followed with another single to left to put runners on first and second with one out. Potter then popped up to the pitcher and Wiard struck out to end the inning. Campbell singled to left over the third baseman with two outs in the sixth. Huddleston then sent an 0-1 pitch down the left field line that would have give ESU the lead, but was ruled foul. Prescott then recorded her ninth strike out to end the inning and retired the side in order in the seventh to give Humboldt State their second national championship.

Sheeley went the distance allowing only the first inning homer as she threw a total of 46.0 innings during the championship run with a 0.91 ERA and 40 strike outs.

Sheeley, Campbell and Brattin were named to the All-Tournament Team. Sheeley was 3-2 in the tournament and allowed only three runs in her last 33.0 innings pitched with two of them coming on home runs. Brattin hit .368 in the tournament while Campbell had a team high three RBI in the tourney and was errorless in 20 chances at third base. The Hornets were also honored for having the highest team GPA among the eight schools at the National Championship Finals. Sheeley and Campbell each received All-American honors from the NFCA with Campbell also earning Daktronics All-American honors.

Over the past 95 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. MIAA student-athletes have won 12 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, 153 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in eight sports for men and eight for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis and golf. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, softball, golf and tennis.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State University and Washburn University became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, the University of Central Missouri, Truman State University, and Northwest Missouri State University still remain a part of the MIAA.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest, Southeast Missouri State University and Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State).

Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: the Missouri School of Mines (later the University of Missouri-Rolla) in 1935, Lincoln University in 1970, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

The 1980s brought the biggest changes in the conference. In 1981, Southwest Missouri State University opted to move to NCAA Division I and the MIAA appointed its first full-time commissioner, Ken Jones, in July.

He would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Former Gulf South and Metro commissioner Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones, serving 10 years before his retirement in 2007. Jim Johnson succeeded McFillen in July of that year.

Southwest Baptist University brought membership back to eight schools in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern State College (now University) and Missouri Western State College (now University) ° formerly members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference ° began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season to move on to NCAA Division I, and was replaced by Emporia State University in the 1991-92 season.

In August 1991, Judy Willson was hired as the MIAA's first full-time sports information director. She left in 1994, and was succeeded by Matt Newbery, formerly the assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State. He became the assistant to the commissioner for media relations in 2005. A third full-time staff member was added in 2005, as former Emporia State track and field athlete Natasha Oakes was hired as the assistant to the commissioner for compliance. Larry House joined the staff in August 2007 as coordinator of external affairs.

The current membership of the MIAA is at 11 schools, with the departure of Missouri-St. Louis in 1996 and Missouri-Rolla in 2005, the forfeiture of membership by Lincoln in 1999 and the addition of Fort Hays State University in 2006 and the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2008.

The highest ranking of any MIAA school in the US Sports Academy Director's Cup, the most MIAA Players of the Year, the Most MIAA Freshmen of the Year, an MIAA high two Academic All-Americans, and more All-Americans in more sports than the rest of the league highlighted the 2007-08 school year for Emporia State University.

ESU was one of six MIAA schools to rank in the top 50 out of nearly 300 active NCAA Division II member institutions. The MIAA's six schools in the top 50 ranked first among the 22 conferences in NCAA Division II. ESU was the top ranked NCAA school in Kansas in the final rankings for the third straight year.

The school year began with the Hornet football team jumping to a 3-0 record to open Garin Higgins first season as head coach at his alma mater. The ESU would end the season with more big plays (sacks and interceptions) for more yards than any year since joining the MIAA.



The Hornet volleyball team advanced to its second NCAA Tournament in the last three years without a senior on the squad. ESU won its final seven home matches including a 3-0 sweep of then #4 Washburn in front of a school record crowd of 1,024 in White Auditorium. Ting Liu was named the MIAA and South Central Regional Freshman of the Year.

Jonel Rossbach began her senior season in style winning her second straight MIAA cross country championship and finishing fourth at the NCAA Championships. With Rossbach the only runner with collegiate experience, the ESU women placed second at the Jock's Nitch Invitational.

Skyler Delmott led the ESU men to the team championship at the Jock's Nitch Invitational and a fourth place finish at the MIAA Championships.

The Hornet soccer team ended the season ranked 57th in the nation in attendance despite not winning a match.



The Lady Hornet basketball team, led by three-time All-American Michelle Stueve, won their seventh MIAA championship in the last 11 years. The Lady Hornets would reach the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time. Stueve would break the MIAA career scoring record against Missouri Western on February 7 on the way to earning MIAA Player of the Year honors.

The men's basketball team advanced to the MIAA Tournament Championship game for the first time in school history. The Hornets were ranked as high as #7 in the nation before a series of injuries set in. ESU was involved in one of the most bizarre endings to a game when an apparent buzzer beater against Northwest Missouri was overruled when the official used a cell phone to time a replay of the shot. ESU would go on to lose in double overtime.



Both teams ended the season ranked in the top 15 nationally in attendance, the sixth straight year both programs have been in the top 25 nationally.

ESU swept High Point honors at the MIAA Indoor track and field championships on the way to top three finishes for both teams. Jonel Rossbach and Brooke Kent both won three events to share the High Point award for the second place women. The Hornet women tied for 23rd in the team standings at the national meet.

Kenton Lonberger won the 60m and 200m in school record time to claim High Point and Freshman of the Year honors for the second place Hornet men. The ESU men placed 11th at the national indoor championships thanks to three All-American efforts in the high jump by Dustin Andrews, Alex Pyle and Craig Saalfeld.





Spring saw the baseball and softball teams win MIAA championships for Emporia State. The softball team swept the MIAA regular season and tournament championships on the way to their second NCAA Championship Game appearance in three years. During the course of the national tournament, ESU made two appearances on national television - their 1-0 win over Francis Marion and the 1-0 loss to Humboldt State in the championship game. ESU has not lost an MIAA Tournament game since falling in the championship game of the 2003 tourney. Senior Samantha Sheeley and sophomore Miranda Campbell earned second-team All-American honors for the Hornets.

The baseball season was one of records for the Hornets as the team set a new MIAA record by going on a 35 game winning streak and earning the regular season title. Brian Majors set a new MIAA record for hits in a season, while Eric Shortell set a new record for home runs in a season. The Hornets had three All-Americans and Keith Hernandez was named the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. The Hornets hosted the regional, but fell in the regional semi-final to Nebraska-Omaha.



For the second straight year both the ESU men's and women's tennis teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The women advanced to the sub-regional championship game for the fourth straight year. The men made their second straight appearance after finishing in a tie for third in the MIAA Tournament. Natalie Villaflor and Julian Rios were named the Regional Female and Male Senior Players of the Year by the ITA. Amanda Morris was named the MIAA and ITA Regional Freshman of the Year for ESU.



Senior Jonel Rossbach capped her outstanding career with a national championship in the 5000m to propel the Emporia State women to a tenth place finish at the NCAA Division II Outdoor Track & Field Championships. Rossbach's championship was one of seven All-American efforts for ESU during the three day meet in Walnut, Calif. Rossbach broke her own school record in the 5000m, as she earned her seventh All-American honor and became the first Hornet to win a national championship on the track since Kadri Kelve won the steeplechase in 2003. Jennifer Robinson, Brooke Kent and Connie Philips all earned All-American honors for ESU.

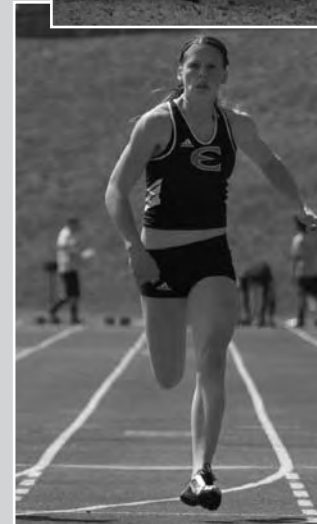
The Hornet men placed 18th thanks to All-American performances by Craig Saalfeld and Kenton Lonberger.



Emporia State excelled in the classroom as well with twenty-two Emporia State student-athletes named Academic All-MIAA during 2006-07. To earn this distinction, student-athletes must have a cumulative 3.50 grade-point average and earned All-MIAA honors in their sport over the past season. On the strength of two Academic All-America selections this year, ESU is ranked 11th in the nation in producing Academic All-Americans named by CoSIDA in the 21st century. Hornet student-athletes have been named Academic All-America 16 times since 2000. Over half of the Hornet student-athletes made the ESU Athletic Director's Honor Roll with a 3.00 GPA over the previous semester.



All of the success on the field and in the classroom showed up in the attendance figures as well. Nearly 115,000 fans turned out for ESU home athletic events during the school year with volleyball, football, men's and women's basketball all ranked in the top 35 nationally. This is the fifth-straight year in which ESU has gone over 100,000 in total attendance in all sports combined.



**HORNETS WRAP UP ANOTHER SEASON OF POST SEASON CONQUEST**

ESU had its highest finish ever in the Director's Cup as they finished 11th, the highest of any MIAA team. The Hornet softball team played in the national championship for the second time in three years.

**HORNETS DRAW OVER 100,000 FANS FOR 2007-08**

## “YAPS, YELLOW JACKETS AND HORNETS”



Here come the Hornets! Go Hornets Go! How did Emporia State University really get to known as the Hornets?

A casual conversation between Vic Trusler and an Emporia Gazette reporter named Cecil Carle led the establishment of the Hornets as Emporia State's mascot. In the early 1930's, the Teachers College students were called the Yaps. It is uncertain why the students were called that except popular legend suggests that because they were teachers, they did a lot of "yapping." In any case, most of the students were not fond of the moniker.

Trusler, a legendary figure on campus in the "30's," and coach at Roosevelt High School, and Carle, without design, were instrumental in getting the name changed. Carle was seeking information on the official name of the Roosevelt High School team. Trusler suggested he call the Roosevelt team the Bluejackets since they wore blue jerseys.

In that momentous conversation, Trusler further commented that the students at the Teacher College really did not like being called the Yaps. Instead he suggested they be called the Yellow Jackets because the men wore yellow sweaters with black stripes on the sleeves. And, like the insect, they had quite a sting to them. Nothing further was said, but the next Gazette article about the Teachers College referred to the students as Yellow Jackets.

The evolution of the name Yellow Jacket to Hornet is almost anti-climatic. A lack of newspaper space forced the Yellow Jacket to be shortened to Hornet. For a while the two names were interchanged and used throughout the state.

To further cement the Hornet tradition, the football team received new uniforms in 1936. They were almost entirely black prompting some to suggest that the team be called the Mud Daubers, which are yellow jackets, which are hornets, which game more sting to the legend.

"Corky" first appeared on the scene in 1934 when Paul Edwards, then a sophomore, made what he thought was a more representative figure of the school mascot than the stereotyped hornet being used. He entered it in a contest and finished second. Not to be discouraged Edwards redrew his hornet and showed it to Ray Maul, then manager of the Memorial Union, who thought he could "use the buzzard." The Corky figure would soon become popular on campus.

Edwards liked his Corky so much he patented the bug in 1936, which dated its 50th anniversary to 1986. During Homecoming 1987, Edwards dedicated a Corky the Hornet statue he sculpted, which was placed near Plumb Hall to welcome campus visitors to "Hornets Country."

The Sting Lives On!**

Emporia State continued to lead the way in athletic facilities during the 2006-07 school year. The projects continue to give Emporia State some of the finest facilities in NCAA Division II.

Emporia State announced on May 23, 2005 that the new Super Turf playing surface would be installed at Welch Stadium and that the new field would be named Jones Field in honor of the W.S. and E.C. Jones Testamentary Trust, the lead contributor to the project. The Super Turf surface allows the Hornet football team multiple practices and games in the stadium that were not possible with the natural grass surface. A grant from the Jones Foundation will supply fifty percent of the estimated \$675,000 project. The USD 253 Board of Education approved twenty-five percent of the funding and Emporia State Athletics secured the remaining twenty-five percent in private donations with a lead gift from John and Doreen Waechter. Welch Stadium will continue to also host Emporia High School games.



Zola Witten Track at Welch Stadium was resurfaced over the summer of 2005. The resurfacing prepared ESU as the host site of the 2006 NCAA II men's and women's outdoor track and field national championships. The facility hosted the same event in 1995 and 1999.

Groundbreaking for the Hanna Clubhouse at the Trusler Sports Complex, just north of the ESU campus, took place on April 30, 2005. The facility houses locker rooms for baseball and softball, as well as coaches offices. It gives Hornet student-athletes on the teams a place to call home before and after games and practices. The second floor of the building serves as an observation deck where fans may have parties. The building, named after donors Doris and Chuck Hanna.

Throughout NCAA Division II programs, White Auditorium is regarded as one of the premier basketball arenas in the nation. In 1999 the auditorium floor was replaced for the first time since 1940, using a Grade 1, one-inch thick, northern hardwood maple. The graphic design incorporates Emporia State's new logo and the finish brings out the natural beauty of the wood. Manufacturers are calling the White Auditorium playing surface "the best in the state of Kansas."

Built in 1940 as a product of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Public Works Administration (PWA), William Lindsay White Auditorium serves the needs of the Emporia community and Emporia State University. During the 1994-95 season the auditorium was renovated and bleacher seating was added to the south end of the court, expanding the seating capacity from 3,700 to 5,000.

The auditorium, located in downtown Emporia, is the home site of ESU men's and women's basketball, as well as volleyball.



ESU dedicated Milton Tennis Courts in 2004 in honor of former coach George Milton. Milton was a coach at ESU from 1966-99. The facility, located west of the HPER Building on campus, is used by the men's and women's tennis program and it hosted the Hornet women's first ever trip to the NCAA tournament in 2005.

The Hornet soccer program plays its home games at the Two Rivers Youth Soccer Association (TRYSA) Complex in west Emporia. The facility is lighted with a scoreboard and has one of the few elevated press boxes for soccer in the MIAA. ESU drew a then-regular-season record 1,820 fans to TRYSA for a match against Northern Colorado in 2002.



Jones Park in northwest Emporia is the home of the Emporia State cross country program. The park provides practice facilities and the host-site for the Jocks Nitch Invitational, a meet hosted by ESU each year.



Emporia State is committed to providing student-athletes with an environment that will maximize the potential for success. ESU's Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building houses offices for coaches and administrators, weight room facilities, a swimming pool, computer lab, five practice gymnasiums and a state-of-the-art training room. The practice gyms allow the baseball, softball and track and field teams a chance to practice indoors, as well as offer additional practice space for basketball and volleyball.



The computer lab on the HPER Building is just one of many available to student-athletes on the ESU campus. Over 200 computers are available on campus, providing ESU students the highest technologies available.



A swimming pool in the HPER Building provides student-athletes conditioning and an additional option for physical therapy.



The Emporia State training room facilities offer student-athletes the finest athletic medicine care available. Athletic trainers John Baxter, M.S., ATCR, and Leslie Kenney, M.S., ATCR, establish injury and illness prevention programs, evaluate and provide immediate care for injury or illness, rehabilitate and recondition athletic injuries, and provide health care administration, education and counseling as related to injury or illness, all under the supervision of team physician Dr. Marshall Havenhill, M.D. Assisting Baxter and Kenney are two certified graduate assistants and numerous undergraduate student assistants.





Emporia State student-athletes excelled not only on the field in 2007-08, but in the classroom and in the community as well.

The Hornets have been nationally recognized for their recent senior prom initiative. The prom incorporates several community retirement centers as student-athletes and seniors come together for the annual event. The student athlete advisory committee will be hosting the 3rd annual Senior Citizen Prom April 2, 2009 from 7:00-9:00pm in the MU Ballroom. This year's event will feature the Tall Grass Big Band. "Senior citizens play a big role in all of our athletic events and SAAC wants to show how much we appreciate them," said former ESU softball player and SAAC member Megan Grisell. "We learned about the senior prom idea at the NCAA Leadership conference and thought this would be a great way to get our new Community and Student Involvement team off the ground."

The ESU softball team helped to build a habitat for humanity home while on their trip to Houston for the National Championship.

Emporia State student-athletes didn't just provide the Emporia community with exciting sports action throughout the year, the Hornets also provided the community with over 1,800 hours of community service during the 2007-08 year.

Working with organizations like the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Special Olympics, the American Diabetes Association and the Big Brothers and Big Sisters, the Hornets contributed over 2700 hours of community service. From painting worn out park buildings, baby sitting, cheering on Special Olympics competitors, collecting canned foods and to recycling, Emporia State student-athletes could be seen all around Emporia lending their time.

Our relationship has been and will continue to be very strong with Emporia. Our teams have been a constant in the community being active in Special Olympics, Big Brother/Sisters, and Christmas in April. The teams pay attention to how the community perceives them and it is important that we maintain our great relationship.





## THIS IS EMPORIA STATE

Emporia State University is a comprehensive Regents university primarily serving residents of Kansas by providing leadership in quality instruction, related scholarship and service. A student-centered institution, its central mission is to develop lifelong learning skills, impart society's cultural heritage, and educate and prepare for both the professions and advanced study. Faculty, staff and students interact in a collegial atmosphere that fosters freedom of inquiry and expression.

In August 2000, Emporia State University was identified as a "best value" by the Kaplan/Newsweek College Catalog 2001. ESU was named a "top school" in six of its college and university ranking categories, being a school that offers a high level of individual academic attention from faculty that is a hidden treasure offering the best career services that is responsive to individual student financial aid needs that offers the best value that the guidance counselors would attend if they could repeat their college years ESU was among the top ten schools in this category. The top ten schools were UCLA, Michigan State, Stanford, Texas A&M, UC-Berkeley, Notre Dame, Wisconsin, Illinois, Kansas State, and Emporia State.

ESU was named one of the "Best in the Midwest" by the Princeton Review in 2005. One thing that puts this ranking above the rest is that it is based on student opinion data and surveys filled out by current ESU students.

In 2005-06, the overall headcount at ESU was up 3.5% and represented a 16% increase in first time freshmen. Recent data from the Office of Career Services indicated that 97% of our graduates from May 2005 were either employed or enrolled in graduate school. ESU Alumni are exceptional leaders in industry, business, medical and educational professions.

The university provides undergraduate educational opportunities designed to meet the broad goals of basic skill development and general education, as well as the more specific goals of a variety of programs in art and sciences, business, education, and library and information management.

Graduate programs serve needs and provide leadership within the region, the state and the Great Plains area. The university offers programs of national distinction in Education and in Library and Information Management, including a Ph.D. in Library and Information Management.



ESU's arts and sciences programs and offerings at the undergraduate and graduate levels provide a solid foundation for further learning, preparation for the many avenues of employment to which the basic disciplines lead, and the advanced knowledge necessary to enable professionals, including teachers, to move ahead in their fields and accept increased responsibilities and challenges.

As a national leader in teacher preparation, the Teacher's College at ESU has a rich history of preparing teachers to succeed in the classroom. ESU offers well-established teacher preparation programs that support the growing need for quality math and science teachers. ESU's teacher education program was selected as one of four "model" teacher preparation programs in the nation.

The school of Library and Information Management (SLIM) prepares students to analyze and manage information on a global scale. With coursework through the doctorate level, SLIM offers graduate-

level instruction for information managers in all professions. SLIM is the only school accredited by the American Library Association in a 12 state area.

ESU's School of Business educates students to be entrepreneurs, critical thinkers and leaders in the workplace. Graduates hold leadership positions in some of the most prestigious companies throughout Kansas and the nation. The School of Business is accredited by AACSB, a distinction held by only 25 percent of the business programs in the nation.

Beginning with the fall 2006 semester, ESU will be the first and only university in the world to offer a four-year degree in engraving arts. The Don and Mary Glaser Distinguished Professorship in Engraving Arts will provide the funding for a faculty member dedicated to engraving arts.

As an institution of higher education, Emporia State University is committed to helping students, faculty, staff, and administrators acquire those skills necessary to enable them to think critically, to question intelligently, and to analyze complex and diverse ideas in order to become thoughtful, educated world citizens.

Emporia was made famous by William Allen White, editor and owner of The Emporia Gazette newspaper. Today Emporia is a manufacturing, educational, transportation, trade, medical and cattle center of the east central Kansas region. Emporia is the county seat and the largest city in Lyon County, with a total county population of 35,935.

The Emporia area, located midway between Kansas City and Wichita on the Kansas Turnpike, is an important crossroads and trade area for the east central Kansas population of approximately 85,000 people.

The Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad mainline passes through Emporia. The Emporia Municipal Airport, with a 5,000 ft. hard surface runway can accommodate most corporate aircraft.

Emporia State University is one of the finest medium sized universities in the Midwest. Over 6,000 students are enrolled in the university, offering outstanding programs in education, business, arts and sciences, library science and information management.

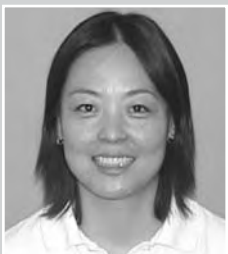

**President  
Dr. Michael R. Lane**

Dr. Michael R. Lane became the 15th president of Emporia State University on November 1, 2006. Under his watch the Hornet Athletics program has seen thirteen of the fifteen athletic programs compete in NCAA postseason competition. ESU was the top MIAA school

and finished ranked #11 in the nation in the 2007-08 U.S. Sports Academy Director’s Cup Standings.

The success is not only in the playing arena as ESU had an MIAA high two ESPN The Magazine Academic All-Americans in 2007-08 and ranks 11th in the nation in producing Academic All-Americans in the 21st century.

The NCAA and National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators recognized Emporia State as the MIAA’s recipient of the 2008 Community Engagement Award of Excellence.

“Athletics is a key part of the educational experience at Emporia State,” says Lane. “We try to foster a positive environment of sportsmanship and integrity for our student-athletes.”

Dr. Lane earned a Ph.D. in Accounting from Texas A&M University, a master’s degree from Northeastern University and a bachelor’s degree from Lowell Technological Institute (now the University of Massachusetts at Lowell).

A native of Melrose, Massachusetts, Dr. Lane’s career in higher education began in Boston as an assistant professor of accounting at Northeastern University. As a professor at Bradley University he served as Chair of the Department of Accounting, Associate Dean of the College of Business and Director of the MBA Program. In 1994 he was named dean of the School of Business at Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne. He later advanced to dean of the Campbell of School of Business at Berry College in Rome, Georgia. At Mansfield University of Pennsylvania, Lane served over four years as provost and vice president for academic affairs. Prior to coming to Emporia State University, he was vice chancellor for academic affairs and provost at the University of Arkansas – Fort Smith.

Dr. Lane was active for many years in the American Accounting Association, serving on the board of the Midwest region. He served Beta Alpha Psi, the national accounting honors and professional fraternity for several

years as faculty vice president at Northeastern University and Bradley University where he was selected as one of five “Outstanding Faculty Vice President” by the national organization. Dr. Lane also served on the national Council of Beta Alpha Psi.

As a business dean, Dr. Lane was active in regional activities of Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). Dr. Lane has published or presented more than two dozen papers and has written ethics cases for a principles of Accounting text book.

President Lane is a member of Congressman Jerry Moran’s Executive Committee. He also serves on the Advisory Committee for Science, Technology and the Future, chaired by Senator Pat Roberts. He recently completed a term as a member of the Math and Science Education Advisory Committee to the Kansas Legislature. He is currently a member of the Kansas Park Trust, and the Steering Committee for the Visitor’s Center at the Tallgrass Prairie National Preserve. He also serves on the Board of Directors for the Kansas Business Hall of Fame, the Regional Development Association of East Central Kansas and the National Teachers Hall of Fame. He is a member of the Kansas Cavalry, Emporia Area Chamber of Commerce and the Rotary Club of Emporia.

President Lane’s wife, Dr. Peggy Lane, is a Associate Professor in the Department of Accounting and Information Systems in the ESU School of Business. Their household includes a beagle (Lucy) and a cat (Brandy).





## **Athletic Director Kent Weiser**

Under the leadership of Director of Athletics Kent Weiser, Emporia State has consistently competed at the national level in NCAA Division II on the field, in the class room and in the stands. ESU has ranked in the top 50 of nearly 300

D-II schools in each of the last four years, highlighted by an MIAA best 11th place finish in the 2007-08 US Sports Academy Director's Cup Standings and a 12th place finish in 2005-06. In the classroom, Emporia State is ranked 11th in the nation in producing Academic All-Americans in the 21st century. The athletic and academic success has combined to place every ESU program in the top 25 in national attendance at some point during Weiser's nine year tenure.

The Hornets have won 19 MIAA team championships and have finished in the top 20 of Division II in eleven different sports under Weiser's leadership.

The Hornets had three top 10 finishes in 2007-08 as 12 of 15 programs made the NCAA post-season. ESU had top ten finishes in softball, women's basketball and women's outdoor track & field with runner-up finish at the NCAA Championship Tournament by the Hornet softball team highlighting the year. ESU also picked up top 20 finishes by the men's indoor track & field, baseball, women's tennis, volleyball and men's outdoor track & field teams.

In the classroom ESU ranks 11th in the nation among Division II schools with 16 Academic All-Americans in the 21st century. ESU regularly places over 50 percent of its student-athletes on the A.D.'s Honor Roll and has had an NCAA Top VIII Award winner under Weiser.

Eight coaches hired by Weiser have been named MIAA Coach of the Year in their respective sports. Ten of ESU's 15 varsity programs earned Top 25 recognition at some point during the 2007-08 school year. During the 2003-04 school year Emporia State was the first NCAA Division II institution to advance to the postseason in football, men's and women's basketball, baseball and softball with 11 of ESU's 15 programs competing in the NCAA postseason.

His leadership of ESU's fund raising efforts led to the largest single gift for athletics scholarships in school history, a \$1.25 million contribution in 2004. Major capital improve-

ments, such as the Hanna Baseball/Softball Clubhouse, Jones Field Super Turf, and the resurfacing of Witten Track have been completed under his watch with 100% of the nearly \$1.5 million coming from donors. These improvements have helped maintain those facilities as some of the best in the nation at the Division II level.

He helped establish the first department-wide shoe and apparel contracts in NCAA Division II, when ESU partnered with adidas in 2000. ESU is still just one of just two NCAA Division II athletic programs in the nation to be a Direct Sales Partner with adidas. The agreement stretches buying power of all 15 Hornet programs and is similar to programs designed for NCAA Division I institutions.

While other institutions were faced with reducing sports, Weiser spearheaded the effort to add women's soccer as a varsity sport, increasing participation opportunities for women at the University for the first time since 1980.

His efforts helped ESU receive a grant from the NCAA in support of expanding administrative opportunities for women and minorities. Weiser has been a guest panelist at numerous NCAA and NACDA meetings, including for the Division II Strategic Alliance Matching Grant Enhancement Program and the NCAA Leadership Institute for Minority Males.

Weiser, a native of Great Bend, Kan., received a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Science in Education from the University of Kansas. He began his career in athletics at KU, where he worked from 1981-88. During that time, he held administrative positions as ticket manager and marketing director. He also served as the Kansas women's golf coach from 1984-88.

He was the associate director of development for Ottawa University from 1990-93. He joined Emporia State in 1999, after serving as associate athletic director at Oregon State University for six years.

Weiser is married to the former Amy Pangrac, and the couple has two daughters, Katie and Abby.

She currently serves on the NCAA Softball Regional Advisory Committee. She is a past member of the NCAA Division II national women's basketball committee. She has served as a facilitator at the NCAA Leadership Conference and for the Division II Action Academy.
