Jones Field at Welch Stadium

The 2013 season will mark the 77th year of action for the Hornets in Francis G. Welch Stadium. The stadium is named in honor of Emporia State's long-time coach and athletic director. Welch guided the efforts of the Hornet football program from 1928-42, and then again from 1946-54. In those two spans, Welch won 115 games and is the all-time winningest coach in ESU football history. The Super Turf playing surface is named for the W.S. and E.C. Jones Trust that provided the lead gift for the artificial surface.

Opened in 1937 and dedicated in 1960, the stadium sits just north of beautiful Lake Wooster and has seated as many as 10,000 fans when bleachers were added in each end zone. Permanent lighting makes it possible to televise games and play at night.

The facility also has been used extensively by individuals outside the University community. Welch Stadium is the home field of the Emporia High School football team and has hosted the Hershey Track and Field State Championships, Special Olympics, the 1998, 2004, 2008 and 2012 Kansas Shrine Bowls.

In 1992, the "GOING THE DISTANCE CAMPAIGN" was initiated. With its completion, track and field events once again were held at Emporia State. The NCAA Division II National Track and Field Outdoor Championships were held on the Zola Witten Track within Welch Stadium in 1995, 1999 and 2006.

In 1994, as part of the campaign's second phase, the east and west side concession areas, restroom facilities, and entrances were renovated. A new scoreboard was hoisted into place at the south end of the stadium and a new landscaped fence was erected.

In 1997, the final phase was completed in time for the University's 100th season of football. The Hutchinson Family Pavilion is a three-tiered facility which has enclosed theatre seating on the first floor, a president's box and four sky-boxes on the second floor, and a game-day management and media center on the third floor. The facility was one

of the first on the NCAA Division II level to offer enclosed sky-boxes.

Prior to the 2006 season the addition of the Super Turf playing surface and upgrade of the stadium's sound system enhanced the playability and fan experience of the historic stadium.

The John Baxter Sports Medicine Center was completed in the fall of 2013 providing a needed update to the athletic training facilitites

The first game at Welch Stadium came on Armistice Day, 1937. The Hornets tied St. Benedict's College, 20-20. More than 6,000 fans saw the first game in the facility.

The Hornets gained a tie for the Central Intercollegiate Conference title by beating Pittsburg State, 7-0, on Homecoming 1951. Quarterback Bob Sherrer won the game with a 69-yard TD run.

The Hornets defeated Washburn on Homecoming 1972, 41-7. With the win, the Hornets won the Great Plains Athletic Conference and earned a berth in the Boot Hill Bowl Game.

In 1973, a record crowd of 10,000 saw the Hornets defeat Northern Colorado, 10-0, as the Hornets vaulted to a No. 3 ranking in the NAIA. ESU tied UNC for the Great Plains Athletic Conference championship in 1973.

The Hornets defeated Harding, 32-9, as ESU advanced to the NAIA semifinals in 1989. After winning on the road the following week at Adams State, ESU played for the national title against Carson-Newman.

The Hornets won their first ever Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association game when they defeated Missouri Western, 23-22, before a crowd of more than 5,800 on September 21, 1991.

The Hornets defeated Washburn, 64-35, in front of a regional television audience, on October 30, 1997. Brian Shay became the school's all-time leading rusher and finished the game with an MIAA-record 469 all-purpose yards.

On September 19, 1998 the Hornets defeated Pittsburg State, 38-28, in front of 9,200 fans - the second largest crowd in Welch Stadium history.

Emporia State again defeated Pittsburg State on October 12, 2002 this time by a score of 13-3 on the way to the Hornets first postseason appearance since 1989.

The Hornets went 4-1 on the Jones Field at Welch Stadium turf in 2010, their best home record since 2002. ESU then made it three straight season's at .500 or better going 4-1 in 2012.

The addition of Jones Field at Welch Stadium to the Hutchinson Family Pavilion ESU has maintained its position as one of the finest football facilities at the NCAA Division II level in the nation.




A new Super Turf artificial surface was installed at Welch Stadium in the summer of 2005.

Former Hornet Garin Higgins completed his sixth season at his alma mater by leading Emporia State to a 10-2 record and Kanza Bowl Championship. He has an 80-47 record in 11 years as a head coach after going 29-38 in his first six seasons with the Hornets.

Emporia State had one of the best turnarounds in the country in 2012. They improved by five wins over last year's 5-6 record and finished in second place in the rugged MIAA. Higgins offense set several school records in 2012 as the Hornets racked up ten wins for the first time since 1989, when Higgins was suited up as quarterback.

He led the Hornets to within one game of a post season berth in both 2010 and 2011 before last year's break through season. He has helped establish a true home field advantage for Emporia State, with the Hornets winning at least four home games in three of the last four seasons.

Under Higgins the Hornets have developed a high powered offense that ranked tenth in the nation in passing offense and 25th in total offense last season after ranking 23rd in the nation in total offense in 2011. They have been an opportunistic defense that ranked eighth in the nation in pass defense efficiency last season and led the nation in interceptions and was ranked second nationally in turnover margin in 2011.

Higgins compiled a 51-9 record (.857) as the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State University before becoming the co-offensive coordinator at Minnesota State in 2005. Prior to returning to Emporia State he was the offensive coordinator at Northeastern State in the 2006 season.

While at NWOSU, the Rangers qualified for the NAIA playoffs five consecutive seasons, had three national title game appearances and he was named the Central State Football League Coach of the Year five straight years from 2000 through 2004. Higgins's offense rolled up over 42 points per game from 1999-2003 and his rushing offense led the nation in 1999 and 2000. The Rangers won 31 consecutive games from Oct. 1998 through December 2000 and were 15-3 against NCAA Division II schools under Higgins. His .857 winning percentage is the highest in NWOSU history.

Higgins has coached three players that have gone on to play in the NFL - Lynn Scott with the Dallas Cowboys, Sam Breeden with the Green Bay Packers and current San Diego Charger Patrick Crayton. Former Hornet Adam Schiltz is in training camp with the Houston Texans this fall while former Hornet Harold Ayodele was with the Kansas City Chiefs in training camp in 2012.

"Emporia State can and will compete for conference championships in football," said Higgins. "And the MIAA is hands down the best conference in the nation."

He was named the 21st head football coach at Emporia State on December 15, 2006. Higgins was one of 72 formal applicants for the position.

A native of Blackwell, Okla. where he was an all-state quarterback, Higgins earned his undergraduate degree at Emporia State in 1992. He was a four-year letterman for the Hornets and helped lead the team to a national runner-up finish in 1989. He has been involved with four teams that have played for or won national championships as a player, coordinator or head coach.

"Emporia State provided me a wonderful experience as a student-athlete and I hope to do the same for my players," said Higgins. "We are going to recruit kids that want to come to ESU and represent this university well on the field, in the classroom and in the community."

Higgins and his wife Heather, a 1995 graduate of Emporia State, are the parents of three children - son Halen and daughters Harlee and Gracyn.

7 Questions with Coach Higgins



You had a great season last year, what does your team need to do to build on that?

We need to remember what got us to that point - hard work and investing in the program. We had great leadership from our seniors last season and current players need to step up and provide that this year. We need to believe that we are now a great team, but understand the difference between confidence and arrogance.

What are your goals for the program?

We have many different goals within our program that may change throughout the season. We feel that if we take care of things on a week to week basis we have an opportunity to reach the ultimate goals of winning an MIAA Championship, playing in the NCAA Postseason Playoffs and the ultimate goal of winning a National Championship for Emporia State.

What most excites you about this season?

We feel that our talent level is high and that has helped fuel the excitement that surrounds our program. Last season I think we wondered if we were good - now we realize that we can be great and compete for MIAA Championships.

What should fans expect to see out on the field when they come to Welch Stadium?

We want our players to bring high energy and a relentless attitude every time we take the field. We will be well prepared and disciplined so that we can play as fast as we can.

How do you want the typical Hornet football player to be perceived?

A player that has a strong work ethic, is concerned about his teammates and is mentally and physically tough. Someone having the right type of character off the field that is proud of their university and proud to be a Hornet.

What do you like the best about coaching at Emporia State?

First of all, anytime you get a chance to come back to your alma mater as the head football coach, it really is a dream come true. Right now we have a good young staff that has bought in to what we are doing. We have a great A.D. and although a lot of places talk about it. I feel we have a true family atmosphere with the other coaches and their sports..

When a player graduates from your program, what do you want them to remember from it?

I definitely want our player to have the same type of experience that I did as a student athlete at Emporia State. We want to be proud not only of our football program but of this great institution. We want them leaving here with a sense of pride that their alma mater is Emporia State University. We want them to be leaders in their communities and be a positive impact in everything they want to do in life.

Matt Walter begins his fifth season as ESU's Strength and Conditioning Coach and his third as Offensive Coordinator. His primary coaching position will be the offensive line.

Last season the Hornets led the MIAA and were ranked tenth in the nation in passing offense and were third in the MIAA and 25th in the nation in total offense. Emporia State scored over 40 points in six games last season, reaching 50 on three occassions.

Last season Emporia State was ranked 23rd in the nation in total offense and averaged over 430 yards per game. They had four games with over 500 yards of total offense with a season high 640 yards against Central Missouri. Center Lance Uhles was named a second-team All-MIAA and All-Super Region 4 selection. In his first season ESU ranked fourth in the MIAA in rushing offense, despite not having a running back in the top ten of the league's rushing stats. Two of his players earned honorable mention All-MIAA status.

In 2010 the Hornets ranked fourth in the MIAA in rushing offense, despite not having a running back in the top ten of the league's rushing stats. He has twice had a lineman earn second-team All-MIAA and a total of five earn All-MIAA honors in the last four years.

With four off-seasons under his belt, Walter has been able to fully implement his strength and conditioning program at Emporia State and the Hornets broke 43 records in the weight room last summer.


Walter spent the four previous seasons as the head strength and conditioning coach for the New Mexico State football team. Known to his athletes as 'The Punisher' for his grueling strength, speed and agility training, Walter guided the Aggies to break numerous school records in lifting, running and jumping. He also implemented a nutrition supplement program as well as the Lifter of the Year Award, given to the most outstanding achiever during the Aggies' off-season program. Walter is also recognized as a National Speed & Explosion Association certified coach.

Walter previously served as the head strength and conditioning coach at Southeastern Louisiana for one year. Prior to that, Walter spent one year at Louisiana Tech as an assistant strength and conditioning coach.

As a running back for coach Higgins at Northwest Oklahoma, Walter was named a 2000 NAIA Honorable Mention All-American as his squad finished as national runners-up. In 1999, Walter helped his team capture the NAIA National Title posting a 13-0 record.

Walter has two sons, Rowan and Torin.

Kansas; East Dallas; California, Arizona and Kansas Juco Matt Martin is in his sixth season as a coach Emporia State. He returned to his alma mater in 2010 following two years of coaching at Nebraska-Kearney. This is his fourth season as receivers coach and his third as special teams coordinator.

Last season he coached Shjuan Richardson to All-American honors as he ranked second in

single season receiving yards. He moved into second in career receiving yards as well. The Hornets had two receivers earn All-MIAA honors last season and they have picked up four all-conference honors in the last three seasons.

The receiving corps enjoyed a breakout season in 2011 with 15 Hornets catching a pass and eight of them pulling in at least an 18 yard reception. Shjuan Richardson earned All-MIAA honors with nine touchdowns to lead eight different Hornets with at least one touchdown reception.

In 2010 four different receivers caught touchdown passes and three of those four averaged over ten yards per reception with one earning honorable mention All-MIAA honors.

Martin spent the first four years of his coaching career on the defensive side of the football. He spent two seasons at Neb.-Kearney serving as the Loper's outside linebacker coach.

Following an outstanding playing career he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at

Emporia State where he coached the safeties.

Martin was a four year letterwinner for the Hornets. As a wide receiver, he caught 76 passes for 853 yards in his career and was a team captain on the 2003 MIAA Championship and NCAA Playoff team. Martin earned honorable mention all-state honors for Clay Center HS.

In his first season with the Hornets he coached Emporia State's first All-American at linebacker since 1999 and all three starters earned All-MIAA honors.

He spent 2011 at Missouri S&T. He joined

Missouri S&T for the 2011 Season as the Linebackers Coach and Special Teams Coordinator. He was named the Great Lakes Football Conference Assistant Coach of the Year after helping the Miners improve from a 3-8 record in 2010 to 6-5 in 2011. He worked with a defensive unit that ranked 14th nationally in sacks and was 30th in the nation in rushing defense. He coached two first team All-Conference linebackers, one of whom became the first Miner with 100+ tackles in a season since 2006 and only the fourth player to do it in 15 years.

S&T led the GLFC in net punting, punt return yardage defense, and kickoff return yardage. The Miners were ranked 20th in NCAA Division II in yards per punt return at 5.7 yards per return.

Nardo was a Graduate Assistant at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio from 2008-2010. While at Ohio, he coached the nickel backs and outside linebackers. During his last two seasons with the Bobcats, Nardo assisted a defensive unit at Ohio that earned bowl berths, making the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl in 2009 after winning the Mid-America Conference's Eastern Division title and the R&L Carriers New Orleans Bowl in 2010. Ohio's defensive unit was one of the best in the nation at forcing turnovers, ranking

first in NCAA Division I by gaining 37 turnovers in 2009 and finishing 20th nationally in interceptions a year later with 17. The Bobcats defeated rival Miami Ohio five straight years during Nardo's time in Athens.

He also served as a Student Coach at Ohio from 2004-08, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in sport management in 2008.

Nardo graduated from St. John Central HS in Bellaire, Ohio. A native of Shadyside, Ohio, his older brother Matt is the defensive backs coach at the University of Pikeville in Kentucky.



2013 Preview



Emporia State experienced a break through season last year, winning ten games, placing second in the MIAA and winning the Kanza Bowl. That breakthrough was a by-product of the hard work put in by the coaches and players as they moved into the upper echelon of the toughest football conference in NCAA Division II.

The Hornets look to build on last year's success with 14 returning starters and a total of 20 players that have started at least one game.

Offensively record setter Tyler Eckenrode has graduated, opening a quarterback battle in camp between sophomore Brent Wilson and red-shirt freshman Corben Jones. Wilson saw action in nine games as a true freshman in 2012. He was three for four for 70 vards and a touchdown over his last three games after earning Oklahoma Coaches Association Class 6A All-Star honors at Ponca City (Okla.) HS. He threw for 2,747 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior. Jones redshirted last season following an All-State career at Yukon (Okla.) HS. He threw for 1,999 yards and 20 touchdowns as a senior and had over 7,000 career passing yards for Yukon HS.

Whoever comes out on top of the quarterback battle will have seven of the top nine receivers back from last year led by two-time All-MIAA pick Ray Ray Davis. A big receiver with a knack for making catches in traffic, Davis has 111 catches for 1,439 yards in his first two seasons with the Hornets. He is a versatile athlete and threw a touchdown pass in the Kanza Bowl. Junior Austin Willis caught 26 passes last season for 326 yards. Also a member of the Hornet track team, he has shown big play potential with a 74 yard touchdown grab to give Emporia State the lead at Southwest Baptist last season. Kavaski Ervin played at both receiver and corner back last season and will start the year on the offensive side of the ball. He was the only Hornet to have a rush of over 25 yards and a reception of over 40 yards last season.

With All-American Adam Schiltz in training camp with the Houston Texans, Josh Klumpe will look to take over the H-back position. Klumpe had a 38 yard touchdown grab against Washburn and a 32 yard reception against Northwest Missouri last season.

Running backs Jordan Tice and Dozie Iwaugwa each averaged 3.9 yards per carry last season and combined for eight touchdowns. Tice had a 91 yard game against Central Oklahoma last season before suffering an injury that kept him out of the next game at Northeastern State. Iwaugwa then stepped in and gained a season high 80 yards against the RiverHawks. Look for them to split time again this season as the Hornets again spread the ball around.

One of the veteran groups for Emporia State is on the offensive line where four players return that started at least five games last season. Clayton Brown is the only returner to start all 12 games last season. He should be joined at the tackle position by Aaron Blount who started ten games. Jordan McAdoo started eight games as well between the guard and tackle position. Trey Rodgers started the first five games at guard before a season ending injury. Look for Danny Goodman and Garrett Ericson to be upperclassmen competing for the interior spots on the line as well.

2013 Preview



All-MIAA pick Chris Poston returns for his senior season and has been on several preseason All-American watch lists. He had four interceptions last season with a season long 47 yard return at Nebraska-Kearney. An honorablemention All-MIAA pick as a true freshman, he played in just three games and sat out the next two years due to injury. Former starters Julian Dozier and Gary Fortune will be coming back from injuries this season. Dozier saw action in the first two games before suffering a broken foot. Fortune injured his knee and missed the final five games of the season. The rest of the defensive backfield will be young with sophomore Jarett Srode one of the few to have game experience with the Hornets last season.

Jordan Sanders is back for his senior year after earning honorable mention All-MIAA honors last season when he was second on the team with 97 total tackles. He is also being mentioned on some preseason All-America lists after grabbing at least ten tackles in each of the last three games last season, including a season high 15 in the Kanza Bowl against Texas A&M-Kingsville. A pair of Division I transfers should be in the mix early for starting positions.

Tariq Allen was rated among the top 20 inside linebackers in the country as a senior at MacArthur HS before joining the Texas Longhorns. He will have two years remaining at Emporia State. Deshawn Dinwiddie played in 21 games for NCAA Division I-FCS Champion North Dakota State before transferring to Emporia State. A native of Hutchinson, Kan. he will also have two years remaining with the Hornets.

The defensive line lost three of four starters from last season. Aaron Mathews is the lone returner and he led the Hornets with four sacks and nine tackles for loss. Three other players saw significant time last season. Fifth year senior Ryan Louia played in all 12 games with one start last season. He is able to use his size to break up four passes and block two kicks at the line of scrimmage. True freshmen Justin Wilson and James Junious played in 12 and ten games respectively. Several transfers will be expected to help out in the rotating system including Ryan Kincaid from Ft. Scott CC. Nick Schutte from Ellsworth CC and Neil Shortell from UConn.


The Hornets used three different kickers to set an MIAA record with seven made field goals against Lincoln last season. Two of them are gone, but Eli Kuhns returns after tying the Emporia State record with a 51 yarder against the Blue Tigers. Last season he became the first Hornet true freshman to connect on six field goals of over 40 yards in a season. He also averaged over 53 yards on his kick-offs with eight touchbacks.

The punt game is one area of concern going into the season and running back Jordan Tice would be the projected starter heading into training camp.

With Truman moving to the GLVC this year, Emporia State will play just ten regular season games beginning with a pair of Thursday night games. The Hornets open at Ft. Hays State on Sept. 5 and will open the home season on Sept. 12 against Neb.-Kearney on Jones Field at Welch Stadium.

Over the past 101 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in

MIAA student-athletes have won 17 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, 186 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in eight sports for men and nine for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis, golf and wrestling. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, softball, golf and tennis.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State University and Washburn University became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, the University of Central Missouri and Northwest Missouri State University remain a part of the MIAA.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest, Southeast Missouri State University and Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State).

Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: the Missouri School of Mines (later the University of Missouri-Rolla and now the Missouri University of Science & Technology) in 1935, Lincoln University in 1970, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

The 1980s brought the biggest changes in the conference. In 1981, Southwest Missouri State University opted to move to NCAA Division I and the MIAA appointed its first full-time commissioner, Ken Jones, in July.

He would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Former Gulf South and Metro commissioner Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones, serving 10 years before his retirement in 2007. Jim Johnson succeeded McFillen in July of that year and served as commissioner until September of 2010. Dr. Bob Boerigter succeeded Johnson in September 2010 and is the current commissioner for the MIAA.

Southwest Baptist University brought membership back to eight schools in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern State College (now University) and Missouri Western State College (now University) - formerly members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference - began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season to move on to NCAA Division I, and was replaced by Emporia State University in the 1991-92 season. Missouri-St. Louis left the MIAA in 1996, as did Missouri-Rolla in 2005 Lincoln forfeited membership in 1999.

Fort Hays State University joined the MIAA in 2006, the University of Nebraska Omaha entered the league in 2008, and Lincoln re-joined the conference in 2010.

On July 29, 2010, the MIAA CEO Council voted to extend invitations to the University of Central Oklahoma and Northeastern State University to become members of the league, and on September 24, 2010, it voted to extend invitations to the University of Nebraska-Kearney and Lindenwood University to become conference institutions, beginning in 2012-13.

With the departure of Nebraska Omaha in 2011, the membership of the MIAA was at 11 schools. Central Oklahoma, Lindenwood, Nebraska-Kearney and Northeastern State will began league play in 2012-13 to push the league membership to a total of 15 schools. The league returned to 14 institutions with the department of Truman following the 2012-13 season..



ESU reached the NCAA Division II Playoffs in 2003. The Hornets held a 3-0 lead at the half before Winona State scored 10 unanswered points to grab a 10-3 victory. Tyler Paul rushed for 107 yards and Tad Hatfield passed for 150 yards.

Last time ESU won in the post-season

Tyler Eckenrode threw a school record five touchdowns as #24 Emporia State defeated Texas A&M-Kingsville 45-38 in the 2012 and final edition of the Kanza Bowl. The Hornets finished the season 10-2, their first ten win season since 1989. Eckenrode was named MVP for the Hornets after going 25 of 32 for 303 yards and a school record five touchdowns. Shjuan Richardson had six catches for 193 yards and two touchdowns while Adam Schiltz caught eight passes for 65 yards and three scores.



FACILITIES



Over the last several years, Emporia State has implemented several projects to upgrade their facilities. The projects continue to give Emporia State some of the finest venues in NCAA Division II.

The Emporia State Athletics Weight Room was renovated and expanded over the summer into one of the top facilities in the MIAA. The renovation increase the area of the current "Hornet's Nest" from 2,460 square feet to over 4,300 square feet and includes state of the art equipment. When the current Hornet track and field weight room, located on the lower level of the HPER Building, is added to the total ESU will have over 6,000 square feet dedicated to athletic strength and conditioning.




Opened in 1937 and dedicated in 1960, Welch Stadium sits just north of beautiful Lake Wooster in the heart of the ESU campus. Crowds as large as 10,000 fans have watched games when bleachers were added in each end zone. Permanent lighting makes it possible to televise games and play at night.

The facility also has been used extensively by individuals outside the University community. Welch Stadium is the home field of the Emporia High School football team and has hosted the Kansas Special Olympics, the 1998 and 2004 Kansas Shrine Bowl. The 1995, 1999 and 2006 NCAA Division II National Track Championships were held here as well.



A Super Turf playing surface was installed at Welch Stadium in the fall of 2005. The field is named Jones Field at Welch Stadium in honor of the W.S. and E.C. Jones Testamentary Trust, the lead contributor to the project.

Zola Witten Track at Welch Stadium was resurfaced over the summer of 2005 as well. The resurfacing prepared ESU as the host site of the 2006 NCAA II men's and women's outdoor track and field national championships. The facility hosted the same event in 1995 and 1999.







FACILITIES

Throughout NCAA Division II programs, White Auditorium, built in 1940 as a product of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Work Projects Administration (WPA), is regarded as one of the premier basketball arenas in the nation. The 70 year old facility was upgraded during the fall of 2008 with a new scoreboard and video board as well as a new color scheme on the arena floor and the throughout the entire building.

The approximately \$270,000 improvement project was funded with City of Emporia general fund and Convention and Visitors Bureau, along with contributions from ESU, the Walter S. and Evan C. Jones Trust, Emporia Sports Promotions, Inc., and Sunflower Gymnastics.

In the fall of 2009 the original wooden balcony seats were replaced with modern black plastic seats, that include cup holders.

In addition to White Auditorium, the ESU basketball and volleyball teams also have a practice facility in the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building on the Emporia State campus. The practice facility in the HPER underwent a major renovation during the summer of 2008. A new lighting system was installed as well as a the playing court getting resurfaced to match the arena floor at White Auditorium.

ESU dedicated Milton Tennis Courts in 2004 in honor of former coach George Milton. Milton was a coach at ESU from 1966-99. The facility, located west of the HPER Building on campus, is used by the men's and women's tennis program and hosted the Hornet women's first ever trip to the NCAA tournament in 2005. The courts were resurfaced adn painted in US Open blue during the summer of 2011. The Hornets also play matches at the Emporia High School Courts in northwest Emporia. The EHS complex has 12 lighted courts, allowing for men's and women's matches to be played a the same time.

Jones Park in northwest Emporia is the home of the Emporia State cross country program. The park provides practice facilities and the host-site for the ESU Invitational, a meet hosted be ESU each year. Jones Park was the host site for the 2009 MIAA Cross Country Championships.

The computer lab on the HPER Building in just one of many available to student-athletes on the ESU campus. Over 200 computers are available on campus, providing ESU students the highest technologies available.

Emporia State is committed to providing student-athletes with an environment that will maximize the potential for success. ESU's Health, Physical Education and Recreation Building houses offices for coaches and administrators, weight room facilities, a swimming pool, computer lab, five practice gymnasiums and a state-of-the-art training room. The practice gyms allow the baseball, softball and track and field teams a chance to practice indoors, as well as offer additional practice space for basketball and volleyball.

The Emporia State training room facilities offer student-athletes the finest athletic medicine care available. Director of Sports Medicine John Baxter, along with full-time staff members Blaise Kriley and Leslie Kenney establish injury and illness prevention programs, evaluate and provide immediate care for injury or illness, rehabilitate and recondition athletic injuries, and provide health care administration, education and counseling as related to injury or illness, all under the supervision of Dr. Marshall Havenhill, M.D. Assisting the full-time staff are two certified graduate assistants and numerous undergraduate student assistants.

HORNETS IN THE COMMUNITY

Emporia State student-athletes didn't just provide the Emporia community with exciting sports action throughout the year, the Hornets also provided the community with more 2,400 hours of community service during the 2010-11 year. The Emporia State Student Athlete Advisory Committee donated \$1,500 to the Make-A-Wish Foundation last year.

Student-athletes worked with organizations like the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Habitat for Humanity, Rebuilding Together, Abundant Harvest Food Kitchen and several local elementary schools on projects that included painting homes for the disadvantaged, dancing and visiting with the elderly at the Senior Prom, collecting canned foods and to recycling.

Our relationship has been and will continue to be very strong with Emporia and the Flint Hills area. Our teams have been a constant in the community. The teams pay attention to how the community perceives them and it is important that we maintain our great relationship.

2011-12 Community Engagement Spotlight.

One new initiative that has been in place the last couple of years is the Hangin' with a Hornet mentoring program. This very successful program has paired up Emporia State athletes from all teams with Emporia Middle School students. Emporia State student-athletes meet at the Middle School for lunch with students each week to discuss academics and other topics the students would like guidance on. Over 50 ESU athletes chose to be mentors in 2010-2011.

MIAA Game Environment Award of Excellence

In response to the creation of the Division II game environment initiative, ESU created "The Sportsmanship Statement", which is presented by a student-athlete either live, via audio recordings, or filmed and shown on a video board to the fans before the start of home football, soccer, volleyball, basketball, softball and baseball contests. The statement encourages fans to cheer for their team while also showing respect to other players, fans, coaches and officials. In addition to the Sportsmanship Statement, the ESU SAAC also created the Sportsmanship Creed, which is displayed in each team's locker room. The Creed was designed to not only convey what it means to be a student-athlete at the institution, but to address how student-athletes should conduct themselves within the campus, community and on the field of play by reaffirming the ideas of Honor, Outstanding, Respect, Nobility, Enthusiasm, Teamwork and Support, better known as H.O.R.N.E.T.S.

The quality of Emporia State's academic programs is also well-known. The university's many accolades include a first-tier regional university designation by U.S. News and World Report, a top-four model teacher education program and international accreditation for our School of Business. The university's four schools and graduate and distance learning programs embody that quality. In fact, U.S. News and World Report has rated Emporia State's online program as one of the best in the nation. In addition, Emporia State University-Kansas City has robust degree and certificate programs for working adults.

The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences is called the heart of the university for a reason. Every major requires take liberal arts and sciences courses to graduate. From stellar programs in the sciences to music and theatre, the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences has built a reputation of excellence throughout its curriculum by creating critical and creative thinkers.

Likewise, Emporia State's School of Business educates students to become entrepreneurs, critical thinkers and ethical leaders in the workplace. Graduates hold leadership positions at some of the most significant companies in Kansas and the nation. The School of Business holds prestigious Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International accreditation, a designation held by less than 5 percent of business schools worldwide. The accreditation is the "gold standard" that identifies business programs of the highest quality.

As a national leader in teacher preparation, the Teachers College has a rich history of preparing teachers to succeed in the classroom. Arthur Levine, former president of Teachers College, Columbia University, and president of the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, wrote "Educating School Teachers," a national study of America's education schools. He cited four "exemplary" programs in the nation, including Emporia State University. Emporia State is included for its curriculum, student teaching, partnerships (e.g., Professional Development Schools), and the commitment of the faculty to raise the quality of the entire state education system. "ESU is the Camelot for teacher education," Levine said.

The School of Library and Information Management prepares its students to analyze and manage information on a global scale. With coursework through the doctorate level, SLIM offers graduate-level instruction for information managers in all professions. SLIM is the only school of library and information management in a 12-state region accredited by the American Library Association. Its programs, offered in numerous states across the nation, can lead to a Ph.D.

Emporia State prides itself on its hands-on, student-centered approach to education. Along with its commitment to student success, the university has set the bar high for education outcomes. In fact, 90 percent of our graduates have a job or are in graduate school six months after graduation from the university.

Moreover, 85 percent of the seniors who responded to the recent National Survey for Student Engagement say they would choose Emporia State again if they could start their college career over.



CITY OF EMPORIA PROFILE

Emporia State University is located next to downtown Emporia, a vibrant town of about 27,000 with coffee shops, restaurants, a wonderful art deco theatre and an arts scene that includes a symphony orchestra, which links with Emporia State's renowned music program. Its system of city parks rivals Kansas' best.

Emporia was founded Feb. 20, 1857, and hailed as "the loveliest site in the world for a town." Named for a Greek market center, Emporia has thrived as a focal point for manufacturing and trade. Four major highways intersect in Emporia — Interstate 35, the Kansas Turnpike, U.S. Highway 50 and Kansas Highway 99. Emporia is an important crossroads for the east-central Kansas population. With nearly 700 lodging rooms, 80 dining choices and 30 meeting facilities, Emporia is a great meeting place for regional, state and national conferences and events.

Serving as the county seat, Emporia is the largest city in Lyon County, covering 8.97 square miles. The city's population is about 26,760, and Lyon County has a population of 35,935.

Because the Emporia State University Teachers College is embedded in the area's schools, the city's and area's elementary and secondary school systems are exemplary.

Emporia is known as the "Front Porch to the Flint Hills," the state's most magical landscape with the world's largest tract of undisturbed tall grass prairie. The beautiful Flint Hills also offer the following outdoor experiences:

- Twenty miles from town is the Tallgrass National Prairie Preserve with fishing and more than 40 miles of hiking trails.
- Ready to bike? At the north end of campus, there's College Trails, Emporia's oldest single track trail system. It consists of a network of winding trails that run along the Neosho River.
- Looking for more fishing? Consider the John Redmond Reservoir and Melvern Lake, where you can boat, camp, swim, bike and hike 30 minutes from town.
- Looking to spot an American bald eagle? Just 30 minutes away is the Flint Hills National Wildlife Refuge in Hartford.





MEMORIAL UNION RENOVATIONS

A \$20 million renovation of Emporia State's Memorial Union was completed this year. The Memorial Union was constructed in 1925 in memory of the students who fought and died in military wars. Additions were constructed in 1958, 1963 and 1972.

By an 80-20 percent margin, ESU students approved a fee increase to help pay for the project.

A Lawrence architectural firm, Treanor Architects P.A., designed the renovation plan following a series of meetings with ESU students, staff and Emporia residents.



Included in the renovation was:

- Creation of new student lounge space and performance area;
- Renovation of the current student resident dining;
- An addition on the east side of the building featuring a new entrance, information center and admissions office;
- Redesigned entrances to the building's west, south and east sides;
- Redesigned meeting spaces and traffic patterns inside the building;

MEMORIAL UNION RENOVATIONS


The Memorial Union has a long and storied history on the ESU campus.

On Aug. 15, 1922, — 90 years ago — the Memorial Union was incorported as a legal entity in 1922. This set in motion the earnest efforts of students and faculty to raise money to build this memorial to Emporia State students who made the supreme sacrifice in service to the country during the Spanish-American War and WWI. The first phase opened on Founders' Day, Feb. 15, 1925 becoming the first student union building west of the Mississippi River, the second student veteran memorial union, the eighth oldest student union in the U.S., and the 15th student union in the world.





EMPORIA STATE ADMINISTRATION



When Dr. Michael D. Shonrock became the 16th president of Emporia State University on Jan. 3, 2012, he brought a leadership style influenced by another 16th president — Abraham Lincoln.

"Get out of the office and circulate among the troops" is one tenet of Lincoln's leadership. Dr. Shonrock is always ready to give and receive high fives and fist bumps with students, faculty and staff alike when he walks across campus.

Lincoln also believed in building strong alliances. For Dr. Shonrock, this means building relationships with faculty, staff and students on campus; alumni and current and future donors; as well as members of the Emporia community, Kansas Board of Regents, Kansas legislators and other academic institutions in the state.

Since March, Dr. Shonrock has been traveling the state of Kansas, meeting with community college partners, media outlets and the public at alumni events. On campus, Dr. Shonrock is a strong advocate for shared governance and works closely with representatives of the Faculty Senate, Classified Assembly and Associated Student Government as well as a new Unclassified Staff Senate.

Partnering with the Emporia community is key to strengthening both the town and university, according to Dr. Shonrock. A Hornet Telethon held in April and organized by the Admissions office was a significant event from this partnership. During the telethon, community leaders worked telephones to contact newly admitted students and welcome them to campus. Other campus and community members spent the same time writing postcards to the new students.

With the enrollment management team, Dr. Shonrock is looking beyond student recruitment to student retention, a key component to increasing enrollment. One goal involves research opportunities for students.

Emporia State has a good reputation for undergraduate research, and Dr. Shonrock has recommended the experience be expanded so that all undergraduate students have the opportunity to participate in research and creative activities. Other goals include enhancing the honors program experience and extending a leadership studies minor. During the Fall 2012 semester, Dr. Shonrock plans to teach an introductory leadership course.

Under Dr. Shonrock's leadership, Emporia State is embarking on a much-needed housing project — upgrading and renovating Singular and Trusler residence halls. Already on a long-term plan, the project was moved up by allocating on-campus resources to complete the work. Work also is under way to expand the wireless network to cover the entire campus.

A self-described futurist, Dr. Shonrock is focusing on Emporia State's heritage — the regional institution celebrates its 150th anniversary in 2013 — to determine how to strengthen its future and reinforce the belief that Emporia State provides a private college experience at a public university price. An upcoming "President's Report on Innovations and Aspirations for Emporia State University" will show how the institution can become what Dr. Shonrock refers to as a "Division 2-plus."

Dr. Shonrock earned a bachelor's degree in geography with a chemistry minor and a master's degree in college student personnel from Western Illinois University, an education specialist degree from Pittsburg State University in Kansas and his Ph.D. in higher education administration from the University of Kansas.

He has worked in higher education senior administration for more than 20 years. With his wife, Karen, Dr. Shonrock has a history of community involvement, what he calls paying "civic rent," or giving back.

In Emporia, the Shonrocks attend First United Methodist Church. Dr. Shonrock will soon serve on the board of the United Way of the Flint Hills. He attends meetings of the Regional Development Association of East-Central Kansas, the Emporia Area Chamber of Commerce board and the Chamber's Joint Economic Development Activity Committee and looks forward to joining the RDA and Chamber as a board member in the future.

EMPORIA STATE ADMINISTRATION

Kent Weiser

Athletic Director

Under the leadership of Director of Athletics Kent Weiser, Emporia State has consistently competed at the national level in NCAA Division II on the field, in the classroom and in the stands. In the last five years, three different Hornet programs have competed in four national championship games, culminating with the Lady Hornets 2010 NCAA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship.

Emporia State University has ranked in the top 50 of nearly 300 D-II schools in each of the last five years, highlighted by an MIAA best 11th place finish in the 2007-08 Director's Cup Standings. In the classroom, Emporia State is ranked in the top 20 in the nation in producing Academic All-Americans in the 21st century. The athletic and academic success has combined to place every ESU program in the top 25 in national attendance at some point during Weiser's ten year tenure.

The Hornets have won 23 MIAA regular season team championships and have finished in the top 20 of Division II in 11 different sports under Weiser's leadership.

Emporia State Athletics had five top 20 team finishes in 2009-10 as ten of 15 programs made the NCAA post-season. In addition to the Lady Hornets national championship in basketball, Emporia State also picked up top 20 finishes by the

men's and women's indoor track & field, softball, and women's outdoor track & field teams.



In the classroom Emporia State ranks in the top 20 in the nation among Division II schools with 16 Academic All-Americans in the 21st century. Emporia State regularly places over 50 percent of its student-athletes on the A.D.'s Honor Roll and has had an NCAA Top VIII Award winner under Weiser. Nine coaches hired by Weiser have been named MIAA Coach of the Year in their respective sports. During the 2003-04 school year Emporia State was the first NCAA Division II institution to advance to the postseason in football, men's and women's basketball, baseball and softball with 11 of Emporia State's 15 programs competing in the NCAA postseason.

Major capital improvements, such as the Emporia State Athletics Weight Room, Hanna Baseball/Softball Clubhouse, Jones Field SuperTurf, the artificial turf infield at Glennen Field, new scoreboards at the Trusler Sports Complex and White Auditorium and the resurfacing of Witten Track have been completed under his watch with 100 percent of the nearly \$2 million coming from donors. These improvements have helped maintain those facilities as some of the best in the nation at the Division II level. His leadership of Emporia State's fund raising efforts led to the largest single gift for athletics scholarships in school history, a \$1.25 million contribution in 2004.

He helped establish the first department-wide shoe and apparel contracts in NCAA Division II, when Emporia State partnered with Adidas in 2000. Emporia State is still one of just two NCAA Division II athletic programs in the nation to be a Direct Sales Partner with Adidas. The agreement stretches buying power of all 15 Hornet programs and is similar to programs designed for NCAA Division I institutions.

While other institutions were faced with reducing sports, Weiser spearheaded the effort to add women's soccer as a varsity sport, increasing participation opportunities for women at the University for the first time since 1980. His efforts helped Emporia State receive a grant from the NCAA in support of expanding administrative opportunities for women and minorities.

Weiser has been a guest panelist at numerous NCAA and NACDA meetings, including for the Division II Strategic Alliance Matching Grant Enhancement Program and the NCAA Leadership Institute for Minority Males.

Weiser, a native of Great Bend, Kan., received a bachelor of arts and a master of science in education from the University of Kansas. He began his career in athletics at KU, where he worked from 1981-88. During that time, he held administrative positions as ticket manager and marketing director He also served as the Kansas women's golf coach from 1984-88.

He was the associate director of development for Ottawa University from 1990-93. He joined Emporia State in 1999, after serving as associate athletic director at Oregon State University for six years. Weiser is married to the former Amy Pangrac, and the couple has two daughters, Katie and Abby.







Senior Associate Athletic Director for External Operations

Shane Shivley is in his tenth year with the Emporia State Athletic Department. As Senior Associate Athletic Director, Shivley directs and manages all income generating activities for the athletic department. This includes supervision of the marketing, ticketing, and facilities offices. With his vision, the Hornets have spearheaded campaigns to upgrade facilities across the board. The Trusler Sports Complex has seen development of the Hanna Baseball/Softball Clubhouse, Glennen Field Baseball Turf, and a state of the art baseball hitting facility. Welch Stadium has seen the installation of SuperTurf for Jones Field and Witten Track has been resurfaced. Within the HPER Building, Emporia State has remodeled the Basketball Practice Facility, renovated and expanded the Emporia State Athletics Weight Room and Larry Kramer Hall of Excellence and renovated locker rooms for men's basketball, track and field and tennis. These improvements have helped maintain Emporia State University facilities as some of the best in the nation at the Division II level. Shivley has also led efforts to increase the annual athletic giving each year of his tenure. In 2009-10 Athletic giving topped \$1.45 million according to figures from the ESU Foundation.

In 2011, Shivley served as a speaker at the 2011 NAADD Convention in Orlando, FL speaking on the topic of "The Changing Culture of Raising Funds in Intercollegiate Athletics". Shivley also serves as a member of the South Central Regional Baseball Selection Advisory Committee.

A native of Parsons, Kansas, Shivley earned a bachelor's degree in business from Emporia State in 2000 and his Master's in Sport Administration from Wichita State in 2002.

He is married to the former Mary Decker. The couple are the proud parents of a daughter, Alexa and a son, Maddox.



Carmen Leeds

Senior Associate Athletic Director for Internal Operations/Senior Woman Admin.

Carmen Leeds is in her 12th year as Senior Associate Director of Athletics for Internal Operations and Senior Woman Administrator (SWA). She oversees areas of NCAA compliance, CHAMPS/Life Skills, student-athlete services, game management and athletic training. Carmen oversees the student-athlete advisory committee (SAAC) and community service. Under her supervision, each year ESU student-athletes perform over 2,000 hours of community service and SAAC has raised \$3,400 the past three years for the Make-a-Wish Foundation.

The student-athlete advisory committee has sponsored the annual Senior Citizen's Prom for the local community, winning the inaugural Community Engagement Award of Excellence for the MIAA. SAAC also won the 2009 NCAA Game Environment Award, a national award that recognized our schools commitment to creating a positive sports environment, which was spearheaded by the SAAC's development of the ESU Sportsmanship Creed. SAAC was also awarded the "Outstanding Recognized Student Organization" at Emporia State.

At the national level, she currently serves on the NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics and NCAA Student-Athlete Affairs Advisory Committee. Carmen was selected as a 2011 NCAA Pathways Program participant. At the conference level she is the chair of the Legislation and Handbook Committee and the Student Athlete Advisory Committee liaison for the MIAA. She is a past member of the NCAA Division II National Women's Basketball Committee and NCAA Softball Regional Advisory Committee. Carmen also has been asked to be a

facilitator at the NCAA Student Athlete Affairs Symposia, NCAA Leadership Conference, the NCAA Division II Regional Leadership Conference, NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills Orientation Conference.

A native of Black Mountain, North Carolina, Leeds earned her bachelor's degree from Appalachian State University (N.C.) and her master's of education from Clemson University. She began her collegiate career in athletics at Clemson University as an assistant women's basketball coach and then served as the head women's basketball coach at Brevard College from 1992-95.

She was the head women's basketball coach and Senior Woman Administrator at South Carolina-Upstate from 1995-99. She coordinated the Athletes Can Educate (ACE) program and implemented the school's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). As basketball coach, she had a 100 percent graduate rate among four-year players.

She is married to Greg Leeds, a 1984 ESU graduate, and the couple has three sons, Brian, Matt and Parker.

Assistant Athletic Director for Media Relations

Don Weast has been in charge of media relations at Emporia State for 11 years and is in his 12th year as a full-time member of the Emporia State University Athletic Department.

Promoted to the title of assistant athletic director for media relations in 2003, Weast oversees media relations, publications and website management for the 15 sport intercollegiate athletic program at Emporia State.


