The Eagles, who finished the regular season with a 6-6 mark and 3-5 record in Mid-American Conference play are back in the postseason for the third time in four seasons, a program first. EMU made appearances in the 2016 Bahamas Bowl and 2018 Camellia Bowl.

Thursday, Dec. 26, in Detroit. Kickoff from Ford Field is set for 8 p.m. and

the contest will be broadcast on ESPN and WEMU (89.1 FM).

Eastern will meet the University of Pittsburgh in a matchup of the MAC against the Atlantic Coast Conference. Pitt is making its 35th bowl appearance in program history after finishing the regular season 7-5 and 4-4 in conference play.

Mike Corey and Rene Ingoglia will be in the booth for ESPN, while Allison Williams reports from the sideline. The game will also be aired on WEMU (89.1 FM) with veteran broadcasters Matt Shepard and Rob Rubick calling the action on the field, and Tom Helmer contributing from field level. WEMU's special 30-minute pregame show from the stadium begins at 7:30 p.m.

LET'S ROLL, LET'S BOWL: The Quick Lane Bowl marks the fourth Division I bowl game in program history, and EMU's third in its last four seasons. EMU is 1-2 in those games, as it defeated San Jose State, 30-27, in the 1987 California Bowl, fell to Old Dominion, 24-20, in the 2016 Bahamas Bowl, and came up short against Georgia Southern, 23-21, in the 2018 Camellia Bowl.

The trip to Detroit marks the first time EMU student-athletes have the opportunity to play in three postseason bowls during their careers.

Practice Procedures

Most practices are open to the media. However, all media are required to make an advance call to the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office to check on the status of practice for a particular day. Failure to do so may result in an individual's removal from the venue.

Head Coach **Chris Creighton** is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings. Coach Creighton will be available on the Mid-American Conference weekly conference call on Monday mornings. Individual players are available for interviews Monday-Wednesday. Please contact the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office at least 24-hours in advance to set up interviews. One note to the media: home phone numbers for players and coaches will not be given out by the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office.

During regular season practices, still photographers and videographers will be allowed to shoot only during pre-practice individual drills, which usually last approximately 15 minutes at the beginning of practice.

Media members covering practices or scrimmages will not be permitted to report any scouting information (formations, personnel groupings, etc.) without first speaking with a member of the EMU coaching staff or the media relations office. Failure to adhere to this guideline could result in the closing of all practices and scrimmages to the media.

First-year players, including freshmen and transfers, will be made available to the media <u>only</u> after they have made a significant contribution or at the coach's discretion

Interview Policies (Postgame)

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the team room of the Student-Athlete Performance Center at the north end of Rynearson Stadium. Both head coaches will be available to the media after a 10-minute cooling-off period. The visiting team will do their postgame outside of their lockerroom. Individual players may be available for interviews at the conclusion of the game. Please see a member of the media relations staff from either EMU or the visiting institution about player interviews. The lockerroom is closed to the media at all times.

Failure to abide by this will result in your removal from the press box.

WHO ARE WE?: Playing in a postseason bowl in consecutive seasons and the fifth time in school history, the Eagles enter the Quick Lane Bowl in one of the best four-year stretches in school history. Eastern's 25 wins over the past four seasons are the most since winning 25 from 1987-90, while the Eagles 6-6 record gave EMU back-to-back non-losing seasons for the first time since 1988-89.

The Eastern offense, led by senior quarterback **Mike Glass III**, was electric during the 2019 season, amassing 4,833 total yards, 45 touchdowns, and 349 total points. Glass was electric with 3,203 yards of total offense (345 rushing, 2,858 passing) and 29 touchdowns. He led the MAC and ranks 17th nationally in total offense with 291.2 yards per contest. He finished the regular season ranked 14th in the FBS in completion percentage (67.8%), 18th in completions per game (21.64), 18th in points responsible for per game (16.0), and 24th in passing yards per game (259.8).

On the national scale, Eastern is one of the most consistently disciplined squads in the country. The Eagles rank among the nation's best in both fewest penalties and fewest penalty yards per game. EMU's 56 total penalties rank 11th-nationally, while its 40.92 penalty yards per game is 13th-best in the country.

Defensively, it was another strong campaign for **Neal Neathery's** unit. Strong up-front, EMU tallied 20 sacks, while its veteran-laden secondary hauled in 11 interceptions, good for third in the MAC. Senior **Kobie Beltram** paced EMU with 116 tackles. His 9.7 stops per game is good for fifth in the conference and 17th in the NCAA, while he is just the fifth EMU defender to total 100-more tackles in a season since 2010.

SEARCHING FOR SEVEN: The Eagles head into the Quick Lane Bowl in search of its seventh win. If the Eagles emerge victorious, it will mark the third time in the last four seasons that the team accomplished that feat. Additionally, it would mark just the 15th time in the 128-year history of EMU football that the team finished with seven-plus wins.

Most recently, Eastern notched seven wins in 2018, and 2016. Prior to 2016, 1989 was the last time that an EMU squad reached that mark.

NOT ONE, NOT TWO, BUT...: In going to a bowl game for the third time in four seasons, 24 student-athletes will have the opportunity to do something that no one in program history has accomplished previously. EMU's roster includes 24 players that were part of the team when it participated in 2016 Bahamas Bowl, and 2018 Camellia Bowl.

Furthermore, Chris Creighton is the first coach to lead multiple Eastern teams to bowl games.

POSTSEASON CALIBER SCHEDULE: EMU's 2019 regular season included games against eight teams that are eligible for postseason play. Kentucky, Illinois, Central Michigan, Western Michigan, Toledo, Buffalo, and Kent State all eclipsed the six-win standard for Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) postseason eligibility, while Central Connecticut State rode an 11-1 record (its only loss was against EMU) to a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff appearance.

Eastern's six losses have come against teams that are a combined 26-22 in conference play and are 39-33 overall (.541). Five of those six teams are bowl eligible.

WHAT'S STILL AT STAKE: Plenty of opportunities to cement the team's legacy still await Eastern Michigan in its postseason bowl contest. EMU can post back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since doing so from 1986-89. It would also mark just the 13th winning campaign for Eastern since 1970. Furthermore, Eastern has never played in a bowl in consecutive seasons, as it looks for its first postseason victory since the 1987 California Bowl.

RIGHT DOWN THE ROAD: Rynearson Stadium, the home of Eastern Michigan Football, and Ford Field are separated by just 34 miles. Of the 78 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) postseason participants, Eastern in playing the closest to its home venue. This is with the exception of only Florida Atlantic and Hawaii, both of which are playing in their home stadiums this postseason (FAU at Boca Raton Bowl; Hawaii at Hawaii Bowl).

DOME, SWEET, DOME: Eastern Michigan has had a long-standing relationship with Ford Field as the Eagles previous hosted games in the venue from 2004 to 2007. The inaugural Collegiate Clash was held, Nov. 6, 2004, when the Eagles recorded a 61-58 four-overtime victory over MAC West Division rival Central Michigan. That first year's game was also part of a doubleheader with Wayne State and Hillsdale squaring off in the opener. Collegiate Clash II went to a single-game format with EMU dropping a 44-36 decision to MAC West Division rival Western Michigan, Nov. 5, 2005. The Eagles hosted Navy in 2006 and the team's last contest in Motown was in 2007 against Northwestern University.

EMU held an open practice in the venue in the spring of 2016 with hundreds in the stands, which also serves as the site of the league's annual championship game. The MAC has a long association with Detroit and Ford Field as the league has held its Marathon MAC Football Championship game as a neutral site championship event at Ford Field since 2004. Also, the MAC played the first-ever college football game at Ford Field as Toledo faced Boston College in the 2002 Motor City Bowl.

HEAD COACH CHRIS CREIGHTON

SIXTH YEAR AT EMU • KENYON, 1991 • @COACH_CREIGHTON

Chris Creighton was named the 37th Head Football Coach at Eastern Michigan University on Dec. 11. 2013. He is in his sixth season as the head man at EMU in 2019.

During his 23-year head coaching career, the 50-year-old Creighton

has accumulated eight conference titles and an all-time record of 167-92 (.645 winning percentage). He is the only coach in EMU history to lead the program to multiple bowl appearances with the 2016 Bahamas Bowl, the 2018 Camellia Bowl, and the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl, Voted a finalist for the 2016 American Football Coaches Awards' first-ever Comeback Coach of the Year, Creighton led EMU in to the program's first winning season since 1995 and its first bowl appearance since 1987.

Toughness, Pride, Resilience, These key words have come to describe EMU football during Creighton's tenure. Inspired by the region and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team has challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, EMU has nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff will go to work each day to help student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and

One of seven active Football Bowl Subdivision to record more than 160 wins, Creighton helped the Eagles to the program's first win in 126 season over a Big Ten or Power Five team with a 16-13 victory over Rutgers, Sept. 9, 2017. Nearly one year later, EMU used a 24-yard field goal as time expired for a stunning 20-19 win over Purdue, Sept. 8, 2018, for Eastern's first walk-off win in two decades. EMU repeated the magic for third consecutive season, when it walked off Illinois with a 24-yard field goal as time expired, Sept. 14, 2019. Under Creighton's leadership EMU is amid one of the best four-

year stretches in program history. Eastern Michigan finished the 2018 season with a 7-6 record after a last-second field goal proved to be the difference against Georgia Southern in the Camellia Bowl. EMU closed the regular season with five straight Mid-American Conference victories for its first winning record in conference play since 1995.

After setting program records on the offensive side of the ball last season, it was the defense's time to shine in 2017, as they had one of the most successful defensive campaigns in program history. The 23.3 points allowed per game ranked 12th best mark in school history in the modern era (since 1976), and the best since 1993. Furthermore, the 364.4 yards of total offense allowed were the second-best mark since 1998 and best since 2011.

The 2016 Eagles finished in a seven-way tie for the most improved program in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), bettering its win total from one win in 2015, to seven. Creighton led the Eagles to their first bowl appearance in 29 years following one of EMU's most successful seasons in its 125-year history. The turnaround was tied for the largest in school history, equaled only by the 1924 and 1977 teams.

As an offense, EMU ranked 35th in the FBS in total offense, posting 455.2 yards per game in 13 contests. The team also shattered the school record for total offense with 5,917 yards, breaking the previous record

On defense, the Eagles saw a remarkable improvement in its first season under defensive coordinator Neal Neathery. EMU allowed 86.5 yards per game less in 2016 (432.7 per game) than it did in 2015 (519.2 per game) to rank 83rd in the country and seventh in the MAC. The team also took a huge step forward in stopping the run, as the defense gave up 149 yards per game less on the ground in 2016 than it did a year earlier. Overall, EMU was nationally ranked seventh in fumbles recovered, 32nd in turnovers gained, 58th in interceptions, and 59th in rushing defense.

In his six seasons at the helm of Drake University, Creighton racked up a 35-13 (.729) record in Pioneer Football League action and a 31-9 (.775) record the last five seasons. Just the seventh DU coach to win 40-or-more games and the fastest to do so, Creighton needed just 60 games to accomplish the feat.

In his time with the Bulldogs, Creighton boasted a 30-5 home record and a 21-2 home conference record, going undefeated against five conference opponents. Drake had an 11-game home win streak during Creighton's tenure as well as winning 16-straight home conference games with him at the helm.

The energetic but veteran coach was named a winner of the Giant Steps Award presented by the National Consortium for Academics and Sports as part of National Student-Athlete Day on April 6, 2011. Creighton, awarded in the Coaching category, was one of just five 2011 winners of the Giant Steps Award, given annually to individuals who use sport to positively affect social change, actualizing the mission of the NCAS. The awards honor student-athletes, athletic administrators, civic leaders, coaches, parents, organizations, and other individuals who demonstrate an outstanding ability to manage life on and off the field, and who demonstrate a commitment to the betterment of society.

As an All-America quarterback, Creighton led Kenyon (Ohio) College to its only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was named conference player of the year after setting single-season conference records for passing yardage (2,843) and touchdowns (29). He was inducted into the Kenyon Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Creighton earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College in 1991 and a master's degree from Concordia (III.) University in 1993. He and his wife, Heather, have two daughters, Hallie and Kate, and

ALL-TIME VS. PITTSBURGH: The Quick Lane Bowl will mark the third meeting between the Eagles and Panthers (7-5, 4-4 ACC). Pitt and Eastern Michigan have played twice before, most recently in 2007, a 27-3 Pitt victory at Heinz Field. The initial meeting was in 1995, when the Panthers defeated the Eagles, 66-30, in Pitt Stadium.

#MACtion vs. THE ACC: Eastern will have a chance to notch its first-ever win over an ACC opponent against Pitt, Dec. 26. The Eagles are 0-9 against the conference all-time, with games played against Louisville (0-1), Miami (0-4), Pittsburgh (0-2), Syracuse (0-1), and Virginia (0-1).

EMU most recently squared-off against an opponent from the Greensboro, N.C.-based organization in 2010, when it traveled to the Commonwealth of Virginia for a bout against Virginia, Oct. 23. Then-freshman **Javonti Greene** rushed for 155 yards and two touchdowns as the Eagles dropped a 48-21 decision to the Cavaliers

THE MAC IN THE QUICK LANE BOWL: The Mid-American Conference holds a 0-2 record in the Quick Lane Bowl all-time. In the five previous games, the MAC has been represented by Central Michigan, which fell to Minnesota, 21-14, Dec. 28, 2015, and Northern Illinois, which lost to Duke, 36-14, Dec. 26, 2018.

CLOSE CONNECTIONS: Although the Eagles and Panthers have not met on the gridiron since 2007, the two schools have plenty of close connections.

Current Pittsburgh Athletic Director **Heather Lyke** held the same role at Eastern Michigan directly before moving to the Steel City. A native of Canton, Ohio, she held the top role at EMU from 2013-17. Perhaps her most notable accomplishment at Eastern is the hiring of none other than **Chris Creighton**.

With Lyke at Pittsburgh are both **Christian Spears** and **Chris Hoppe**. Spears, who was Lyke's Deputy AD at Eastern, holds the same role for the Panthers. Hoppe, the former Senior Associate AD for Administration at EMU, now serves as Pitt's Executive Associate Athletic Director for Sport Administration, and Student-Athlete Support Services. Additionally, **Jennifer Brown** spent three years as the head athletic trainer for the EMU football team before making the move to the Steel City.

The EMU-Pitt connection runs deeper than administration, as **Derek Moos**, the Director of Equipment Services for the Panthers, spent various years at EMU. A two-time graduate of Eastern Michigan, Moos completed his undergraduate degree while serving as the Director of Operations for the EMU baseball program. Following graduation, he shifted to the equipment room, where he served a two-year stint as a graduate assistant, earning his master's degree along the way. While in equipment, Moos worked for **Benjamin Herman**, Eastern's Associate AD for Equipment, and alongside **Dominic Velotta** (both were graduate assistants), who now serves as an Assistant Equipment Manager under Herman.

Rounding out the list of ties, **Ed Whited** was EMU's Director for Athletic Equipment from 1993-2001, while Tight Ends Coach **Tim Salem** was the offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach and kicking coach at Eastern Michigan during the 2003 season

ONE OF A KIND: Eastern Michigan is the only Mid-American Conference team to boast a victory over a Power 5 Conference opponent in 2019. EMU walked off Illinois of the Big Ten conference with a 24-yard field goal as time expired, Sept. 14, 2019. It was the third consecutive season that Eastern knocked off a Big Ten opponents (2017-Rutgers, 2018-Purdue).

SEVEN EARN ALL-MAC ACCOLADES: For the fourth consecutive year, the Eastern Michigan University football team saw at least seven of its student-athletes named to All-Mid-American Conference Teams. Senior defensive back **Vince Calhoun** collected first team honors and became just the seventh student-athlete. Senior QB **Mike Glass III**, senior wide receiver **Arthur Jackson**, and senior defensive back **Brody Hoying** were each named to the second team. In addition, sophomore wide receiver **Dylan Drummond**, senior linebacker **Kobie Beltram**, and senior defensive back **Kevin McGill** all garnered All-MAC third team honors.

PAIGE TABBED FOR AFCA 35 UNDER 35 INSTITUTE: EMU Wide Receivers Coach Darren Paige was selected to participate in the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) 2020 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute, presented by the AFCA and NCAA Leadership Development. The AFCA 2020 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute will take place on Sunday, Jan. 12, at the AFCA Convention in Nashville, Tenn.

This year's class of 35 coaches was chosen from a field of hundreds of under-35-year-old coaching applicants from all levels of high school and college.

NOVEMBER BOOM: EMU is 10-4 in the month of November the last four years. In the four seasons prior, Eastern combined for a total of seven wins during the entire 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 campaigns.

KEEPING IT CLOSE: EMU is one of just 10 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team to have played in at least seven one-score games this season. EMU is in a seven-way tie for the fourth-most single possession contests, as only North Carolina (9), Miami (Fla.) (8), and Pittsburgh (8) have played in more games that have gone to the wire.

CONTINUING TO FLUSH IT: For the past four seasons, Eastern Michigan's motto has been to go 1-0 each week while "flushing" the previous outcome. The short memory has proven beneficial for the program, with 29 of the last 50 contests decided by seven points-or-less. Of those contests, seven have been decided in overtime with 17 coming down to the final play.

BEST FOUR-YEAR STRETCH: EMU is currently amid one of the best four-year stretches in program history. EMU is 25-24 since 2016, its most wins in a four-season span since 1987-90 when the Eagles went 10-2, 6-3-1, 7-3-1, and 2-9.

THE BEST SHOW IN TOWN: Four of EMU's wins this season have been decided on the final drive of the game – interception (Coastal Carolina), walk-off field goal (Illinois), blocked punt (Central Connecticut), and punt (Western Michigan). Furthermore, three of EMU's setbacks have been decided on the final drive with EMU possessing the ball in the opponent's redzone.

WINTHETURNOVER BATTLE: A common goal in Head Coach **Chris Creighton's** program, Eastern has won or tied (21-3) the turnover battle in 23 of its last 26 victories under Creighton.

THE CREIGHTON DIFFERENCE: Head Coach **Chris Creighton** has won 50 percent (25-of-50) of his games since the start of the 2016 season. In the three seasons prior to his arrival in Ypsilanti, the Eagles were victorious in just 28 percent (10-of-36) of their games.

EAGLES ON MAC LEADERBOARDS: After 12 regular season games, a slew of Eagles have established themselves on one-or-more of the MAC leaderboards. Offensively, **Mike Glass III's** 259.8 passing yards per game ranks first in the league. Wide out Arthur Jackson III's 56.6 yards per game in the air ranks seventh in the league, just ahead of 14th-ranked **Quian Williams**' 49.4 yards per contest. Defensively, senior **Kobie Beltram** finished fifth in the league with 9.7 tackles per game, while fellow upperclassman **Vince Calhoun** is ninth with 8.1 per game. **Turan Rush** is 12th in the MAC with 0.42 sacks per game on the season.

CALHOUN MARKING MILESTONES: With his nine tackle performance against WMU, Oct. 19, senior **Vince Calhoun** moved past 300 in his career. The Middleton, Ohio product stands at 336 stops, which ranks 12th all-time at EMU. With four more tackles, Calhoun will move past Ron Johnson (1974-77) for 11th. Furthermore, Calhoun's 188 solo tackles are tied for fifth and needs five more to pass **Donald McCall** for fourth all-time. Meanwhile, his 48 career games started is an EMU record.

RECORD SETTING YEAR: EMU tallied a total of 95 game, season, or career entries into the EMU record books in 2019. Senior defensive back **Vince Calhoun** became the all-time leader in starts at Eastern when he took the field against Kent State, Nov. 19. Quarterback **Mike Glass III** is now second all-time in single-season completions, and running back **Shaq Vann** is now seventh all-time in career rushing yards (2,529). These are just some examples of the record book entries that EMU student-athletes have accomplished in 2019.

GET A GLASS OF THIS: Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** has been electric on offense, totaling 3,203 yards of total offense (345 rushing, 2,858 passing) and 29 touchdowns. He leads the MAC and ranks 17th nationally in total offense with 291.2 yards per contest. Glass in 14th in the FBS in completion percentage (67.8%) 18th in completions per game (21.64), 18th in the FBS in points responsible per game (16.0), and 24th in passing yards per game (259.8).

Glass ranks fourth in total offense in a season in EMU's 128-year history and needs just 188 yards to pass **Charlie Batch's** mark of 3,390 that has stood since 1997. Also, Glass is 422 yards away from passing Batch for the most in a single-season, while he needs two touchdown passes to surpass the two-time Super Bowl Champion's mark of 23 set in 1997. He is also just 23 passes short of tying **Andy Schmitt** for the most passes complete in a single year with 261.

PASSING THE BAR: Eastern's passing offense ranks second in school-history with 3,370 yards passing and has tied the program-record with 25 touchdown passes. Overall, the offense has rolled up 4,883 total yards (fifth all-time at EMU) and 349 points (fourth all-time at EMU).

MORE THAN A GAME: The EMU football program once again set a new standard for team GPA following the 2019 winter semester. EMU's football program posted a 3.023 semester GPA while improving its cumulative GPA to a 3.036. Both are all-time records since the department began tracking data. Furthermore, it marked the 19th occurrence in the past 23 semesters that it saw the overall cume GPA rise.

CREIGHTON CHECKS FINAL BOX IN MAC: With EMU's victory over NIU, Nov. 19, Head Coach **Chris Creighton** has now notched at-least one win against all 11 MAC opponents he has faced. He is the first coach in EMU football history to best every conference opponent.

Jim Harkema defeated the then-nine other MAC schools during his tenure from 1983-1992, while the late-**Rick Rasnick** downed nine of the 13 league members from 1995-99.

BREAKING THE STREAK: Eastern's win at Northern Illinois, Nov. 19, was its first against the Huskies since 2007, also the last time the team won in DeKalb. Additionally, EMU's 45-point showing was the squad's most at Huskie Stadium since the 1997 season.

Efficient is a term that best describes Eastern's 24-point third quarter. After an eight-yard TD rush by **Shaq Vann** put EMU up, 21-7, EMU went on to score three times in its next eight offense snaps. In all, the Eagles scored three touchdowns and a field goal in just nine offensive snaps.

BACK-TO-BACK BLOWOUTS: In its last two games, EMU has won by an average of 28 points, defeating Akron, 42-14, Nov. 12, and Northern Illinois, 45-17, Nov. 19. The last time Eastern compiled consecutive wins of better than 28 points was in 1971, when it bested Wisconsin-Milwaukee, 31-0, and Northern Michigan, 31-3, in back-to-back weeks.

PICKSILANTI: The Eastern Michigan secondary wreaked havoc on the NIU passing attack, Nov. 19, as it corralled three interceptions. The three picks were the most by Eastern since it nabbed four balls from Coastal Carolina in its week one matchup with the Chanticleers, Aug. 31.

Furthermore, Eastern's 112 yards off those picks rank third in program history. It marked the first time since Oct. 19, 1991, that EMU racked up more than 100 yards of interception return yardage.

Senior defensive back **Brody Hoying** had a two-interception day against Northern Illinois, Nov. 19. Hoying was the first Eagle to collect two picks in a game since **DaQuan Pace** did so against Ball State, Nov. 8, 2016.

GETTING IN THE BACKFIELD: The Eastern Michigan defense was stout against Northern Illinois, Nov. 19, as the unit racked up five tackles-for-loss. Senior **Kobie Beltram** led the defense effort with a team-high 10 stops, two TFLs, and a sack. Beltram leads all Eagles with 104 tackles on the season, while his 9.5 tackles per game is good for fifth in the conference and 20th in the FBS. For his efforts, Beltram collected MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week honors for the first time in his EMU career.

PAY DIRT PAYING OFF FOR VANN: Senior running back **Shaq Vann** was one of five players to score a touchdown against Northern Illinois, Nov. 19. Vann has scored five touchdowns in his last two appearances, dating back to the Eagles' game against Akron, Nov. 12, the most in a two-week span in the entirety of his six-year EMU career.

Vann is tied with **Bob Foster** (1986-88) for sixth in program-history with 24 touchdowns scored. He can tie **Kerry Keating** (1954-57) with one more score or **Larry Ratcliff** (1969-71) with two. Running back **Gary Patton** set the EMU standard with 31 touchdowns from 1984-87.

SEXTON SOARING: Senior wide out **Mathew Sexton** put on a strong display against Akron, hauling in a four catches for 76 yards. In 42 career contests, Sexton has totalled 100 catches for 1,335 yards and nine scores. His 1,335 career yards already rank 13th in school-history. Additionally, with his one grab at NIU, he become the 15th EMU player with 100-ormore catches in a career. The last Eagle to join the century club was **Sergio Bailey II** (2016-17), who had 114.

VAN HOEVEN NAMED COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT: For the second consecutive year, junior center **Mike Van Hoeven** was named Academic All-District® by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He joins **Andrew Wellock** (2005-06) and **Jean Oliver Gagnon Gordillo** (2004-05) as the only players in program history to collect the honor in multiple seasons. Additionally, Van Hoeven was one of nine Mid-American Conference players to be named to the 25-man team.

A master's student with a 3.95 GPA in exercise science, Van Hoeven has started every game this year at center for the Eagles. Part of a passoriented offense that leads the MAC and ranks 33rd nationally with 274.9 yards per game through the air, he has helped EMU quarterbacks record the first and second-best percentage of passes completed in program history (90.9 and 86.1%).

SHAQ SCORES FOUR: Senior running back **Shaq Vann** turned in one of his best performance in the 42-14 victory over Akron, Nov. 12. The South Bend, Ind. native used 28 rushing attempts to compile 142 yards on the ground and four rushing TDs. His 142 single-game rushing yards in the second-best of his career, just behind a 156-yard, two touchdown performance against Mississippi Valley State, Sept. 2, 2016.

With his fourth rushing score, Vann became the first Eagle to rush for four touchdowns since the 2012 season, when **Bronson Hill** hit that number against Toledo, Oct. 13. Additionally, the four scores were the most by a single player against Akron since the 2000 season, a 19-year stretch, when NIU's Thomas Hammock tallied that total against the Zips.

RUN, RUN, EAGLES: Eastern turned in its best rushing performance of the season against Akron, Nov. 12. The team tallied 42 attempts, 252 total yards rushing, a 6.0 yards per rush average, and scored six rushing TD's in the game, all season bests. Previously, EMU's best performance came against Toledo, Oct. 26, when it ran for 168 yards and three scores.

The last time EMU tallied six scores on the ground in a single-game was against Indiana State in the 2008 season opener, Aug. 28.

KEPT AKRON ZIP(PED): Neal Neathery's defense held Akron scoreless in the first half of the game between the Eagles and Zips, Nov. 12. The defensive unit's first half shutout was its first since Nov. 16, 2016, when it held Northern Illinois scoreless in the first two frames.

REWRITING HISTORY: Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III's** 80-yard touchdown pass to **Mathew Sexton** against Buffalo, Nov. 2, was the longest play from scrimmage for the Eagles in 2019. Additionally, the play was the longest pass in the 50-year history of Rynearson Stadium, edging **Charlie Batch's** 79-yard completion against Akron, in 1997. The play is tied for the second-longest pass in EMU football history, just behind **Walter Church's** 89-yard strike to receiver **Eric Powell** in 1998.

DUCES ARE WILD: EMU has attempted 11 two-point conversions this season, the most in the modern statistical era that began in 1999. The previous high was four set in 2004, 2016, and again in 2018. EMU is 3-of-4 on rushing PATs while just 1-for-7 when passing. Since 1999, Eastern success rate when going for two is 38 percent (19-for-50), including 43.8 percent (7-of-16) running and 35.3 percent (12-of-34) throwing.

GAME-WINNING PUNT = PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior punter **Jake Julien** proved pivotal for EMU in its win over Western, Oct. 19. Julien belted two punts for an average of 50.0 yards per kick, including a 53-yarder, his third-longest punt of the season. Julien's best work came in the final seconds of the game, however, as he successfully took the final 12 seconds off the clock with a near-perfect punt to close out the game.

For his efforts, he was selected the MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week.

STRONG STARTING DEBUT: Quarterback **Preston Hutchinson** filled in for the MAC's leading passer, a banged-up **Mike Glass III**, in the Eagles' 34-27 victory over WMU, Oct. 19. Hutchinson completed 31-of-36 passes for 357 yards and three touchdowns, including the game-winning 34-yard scoring strike to **Mathew Sexton** with 36 seconds left. The 357 yards passing are tied for 24th-best in program history. For his efforts, he was selected the MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week, a Manning Award Star of the Week, and MAC Scholar Athlete of the Week.

Hutchinson's perfect game-winning drive was part of a fourth quarter that saw him complete 11-of-12 passes for 140 yards and a pair of long touchdown passes. He also made plays with his legs, finishing with 10 carries for 29 sack-adjusted yards, including a six-yard touchdown run early in the third quarter that gave EMU its first lead of the game at 17-14.

Hutchinson was the ninth EMU quarterback to earn a start in the past decade, and the third signal caller to get his first career start against Western Michigan. Overall, his completions, attempts, passing yards, and touchdowns are all the best of any new quarterback since 2009.

SACK CITY: The EMU defensive front was electric in its game against Illinois, Sept. 14, racking up six sacks for 51 yards. Additionally, the Eastern defense added eight tackles-for-loss and forced two fumbles.

SEXTON EARNS MAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior Mathew Sexton was named the Mid-American Conference Special Teams Player of the Week, the league office announced, Sept. 23. The award comes following Sexton's block punt touchdown with 18 seconds left against Central Connecticut State, Sept. 21.

The play was the longest punt return by any EMU player this season. Sexton was also responsible for EMU's last blocked punt, which occurred during the 2018 Camellia Bowl against Georgia Southern, Dec. 15.

BIG TEN KILLERS: After compiling a 0-38 record against teams from the Big Ten Conference, Eastern has now taken three in-a-row from teams in the Rosemont, Ill.-based league. After downing Rutgers (16-13) in 2017 and Purdue (20-19) in 2018, the Eagles bested Illinois with a last-second field goal, 34-31, Sept. 14, 2019.

THE NEAL NEATHERY EFFECT: Prior to EMU Associate Head Coach/ Defensive Coordinator **Neal Neathery's** arrival in 2016, the Eagles recorded four-or-more sacks just eight times in the 10 previous seasons. Under his direction, Eastern has accomplished the feat 12 times, most recently in its 34-31 win over Illinois, Sept. 14.

ICE IN THE VEINS: Eastern needed a clutch field goal to best Illinois, Sept. 14. A back-and-forth contest, the game was tied with three seconds on the clock when sophomore kicker **Chad Ryland** drilled a 24-yard, gamewinning field goal to down the Illini. Ryland has now used a last-second field goal to beat a Big Ten foe in consecutive seasons, after walking-off Purdue, 20-19, in West Lafayette, a season ago.

RYLAND WRITING RECORDS: In addition to his second-career gamewinning field goal, **Chad Ryland** etched his name into the EMU record books against Illinois, Sept. 14. The Lebanon, Pa. native drained a careerbest 52-yard field goal with 4:43 left in the second frame. The kick is tied for the second-longest in school history, and is the furthest made field goal since the 2015 season when **Dylan Mulder** set the school record with a 55-yard make against Miami, Nov. 7. For his efforts, he was selected the MAC West Division Special Teams Player of the Week.

GLASS GOES OFF: Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** was highly-efficient in Eastern's win over Illinois, Sept. 14. The St. Louis native was 23-of-36 for 316 yards and three touchdowns to lead EMU. For his efforts, he was selected the MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week.

GAME-WINNING GLASS: Up seven, 31-24, the Eagles had Illinois facing its final down before UI quarterback Brandon Peters converted a 32-yard pass to keep Illinois' drive alive. With 1:44 on the clock, the Illini scored, and after making the extra point, tied the game at 31-all. Unphased by the late adversity, **Mike Glass III** marched the Eagles down the field, putting together an eight-play, 68-yard drive in which he completed 4-of-4 passes. With three seconds on the clock, EMU kicked a game-winning field goal, capping Glass' first-career game-winning drive.

HOYING SELECTED MAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior defensive back **Brody Hoying** was named the MAC West Division Defensive Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 8. It marks the second time he has collected the honor and the first since 2017. The Coldwater, Ohio product collected nine tackles and added a half-sack at Kentucky, Sept. 7. In all, the EMU defense racked up a pair of forced fumbles, two sacks and two TFLs at UK.

FLY THE FLAG: Mid-American Conference Commissioner Dr. Jon Steinbrecher debuted a pirate flag in 2018 for when a conference member posts a non-conference victory. Once again EMU helped fly the MAC Jolly Roger in 2019 with a 30-23 win at Coastal Carolina, Aug. 31. EMU has previously posted road non-conference wins in 2015 (Wyoming), 2016 (Charlotte), 2017 (Rutgers), and 2018 (Purdue). The streak is the longest by EMU since the then-Hurons rolled off non-league road triumphs in 10 consecutive years between 1966 and 1975.

FOUR PICK PERFORMANCE: It was a no fly zone in the Grand Strand, as the EMU secondary tallied three interceptions against CCU, Aug. 31. Considered a top secondary in the conference, the Eagles picked up right where they left off in 2018 after finishing third in the MAC and 33rd nationally in INT's last season. Seniors **Kevin McGill** and **Brody Hoying** notched their fifth and third-career interceptions, respectively, while sophomore **Blake Bogan** earned the second INT of his young career. Elsewhere on the field, senior **Clay Holford** tipped and secured a Coastal Carolina pass for his first-career interception.

It was the most by EMU since a four-pick performance at Vanderbilt, Sept. 29, 2007.

RYNEARSON TURNS 50: Rynearson Stadium, the home of EMU football, officially opened for its 50th season of action on Sept. 21, when Eastern hosted Central Connecticut State. The 2019 EMU football season will feature a year-long series of events, initiatives, and programming centered around fans, student-athletes, and the community. The celebration will salute the five decades of student-athletes that have played inside Rynearson Stadium, as well as the more than 2.8 million fans who have passed through the turnstiles to watch one of the 252 home games in the venue.

WHERE IN THE WORLD IS CHRIS CREIGHTON?: In his head coaching career, Chris Creighton has racked up the frequent flyer miles, coaching games in seven different countries. Creighton added the Bahamas to that list in 2017 when he lead the Eagles to the Bahamas Bowl after it already consisted of the United States, Sweden, Austria, Panama, Tanzania, and Germany.

SENIORS TAKE ANNUAL LEADERSHIP TRIP TO COLORADO: For **Chris Creighton**, being a coach is about so much more than just what happens on the field. On July 19-20, Creighton, staff and 26 members of EMU's senior class made the trek to Colorado for the annual senior leadership trip.

Meant to be used as a leadership and bonding experience, the group hiked up Pikes Peak, which has an altitude of 14,114 feet above sea level and is the 31st highest out of the 54 Colorado peaks.

During Creighton's introductory press conference at the Convocation Center in December 2013, he promised to make being part of the EMU program a memorable one. True to his word, each year since the Eagles have taken a trip out west on a journey that lasts more than 12 hours up Pikes Peak.

NEW-SOUNDING RADIO BROADCAST CREW DEBUTS: The EMU Department of Athletics and WEMU (89.1 FM) announced July 24, its broadcast team for the 2019 football season. **Tom Helmer**, 23-year broadcast veteran, will join the crew and work along side familiar voices **Matt Shepard** and **Rob Rubick**.

Helmer, a native of Saline, Mich., will contribute in numerous ways during the 2019 campaign including play-by-play, reporting, and contributing to the Eastern Insider Podcast. A veteran with 23 years with of experience, Helmer has worked the sidelines for FOX NFL Sunday, hosted the Colorado Rockies' pre-and-postgame shows, filled in on play-by-play for the Boston Red Sox, and hosted various studio shows involving the Denver Broncos as well as college football, basketball, and hockey.

Shepard, who became the primary play-by-play voice of the Detroit Tigers prior to the 2019 season, will re-join Eastern's broadcast team after the Tigers' season is completed. Shepard first handled EMU football play-by-play duties during the 1999 season. He returned in 2002 and held the post ever since.

Meanwhile, the 2019 campaign will be the 20th year for Rubick as part of the EMU broadcast team. Following a seven-year career as a tight end with the Detroit Lions, Rubick has established himself as a superb analyst, providing detailed and pertinent commentary

Hurons Fall Short in Pioneer Bowl to Louisiana Tech

Eastern was ranked as the No. 3 team in the country entering the contest

WICHITA FALLS. Texas - All of the stars seemed to be aligned as the Eastern Michigan University football team hit the mid-point of the 1971 season.

The then-Hurons had rolled through the first four games of the season with a perfect 4-0 record and were ranked No. 2 in the nation in the NCAA College Division's latest poll heading into an important Homecoming tilt with the

No. 5 ranked Eastern Kentucky University, Oct. 16, in Rynearson Stadium.

Added to EMU's lofty rating was the fact that their offense boasted one of the top tailbacks in the country in Larry Radcliff and an All-American defensive standout in Dave Pureifory.

Those two EMU greats were not the only talented players on the field as both teams had several top prospects.

EKU would answer the EMU tandem of Radcliff and Pureifory with a top tailback named Jimmy Brooks and a future pro defensive tackle named Wally Chambers.

Fumbles would prove to be the undoing for both offenses as EMU would lose all five of its drops while EKU would put the ball on the ground four times, losing one while also giving up two interceptions. Radcliff would set a singlegame school rushing record and become the school's all-time total offense leader after carrying the ball 40 times for 291 yards, but the game ended in a scoreless tie.

Despite that deadlock with EKU, EMU would roll off two straight wins, to go to 6-0-1 on the season before

traveling to Monroe, Louisiana to square off against Northeast Louisiana, Nov. 6.

Another tie, this time 10-10, pretty much eliminated EMU's chance to move to the No. 1 spot, leaving them No. 3 in the rankings and a post-season bowl bid on the line as the Green and White hosted South Dakota State, Nov. 13.

"If you are voting in the polls, you can excuse one tie...but two...well. I just don't know." a disheartened Head Coach Dan Boisture said of his squad's chance at the top spot after the tie at Northeast. "It's a pity too, we could have had it all."

Despite the letdown in posting that second tie, Eastern was still one of the favorites for a bid to the first-ever Pioneer Bowl, as the prognosticators guessed that EMU would take on Louisiana Tech in that bowl, Dec. 11, in Wichita Falls, Texas.

Whether it was the tie, or the challenge to make it to the school's first-ever bowl game, EMU rose to the occasion

against South Dakota State, posting a definitive 35-2 win over the Jackrabbits from Brookings, South Dakota.

Eastern, ranked No. 3 in the country with a 7-0-2 record, would indeed receive the bid for the Pioneer Bowl and their opponent was as predicted, the Bulldogs of Louisiana Tech.

Boisture's crew had recovered nicely from those two ties, but the Hurons would have to overcome even more

devastating news over the final few weeks of the season as the injury bug plagued the high-performing offense. Radcliff, who had rushed for a whopping 1,188 yards through the first six games of the season, was injured in the first quarter of game seven, against Northern Michigan, and was lost for the season with a knee injury. His replacement, **Don Madden**, also went down with a season-finishing shoulder injury in that same NMU game.

Those injuries to the top two tailbacks, who had, up to that point in the season, combined for 1,319 yards and 11 rushing touchdowns, were definitely two large obstacles for Eastern to overcome in the bowl game, but next man up was a youngster named **Tim Packral**l, and he was ready when called on at tailback.

Packrall, who had performed admirably in the absence of both Radcliff and Madden over the last three regular-season games, when he rushed for 474 yards with six touchdowns, proved his worth once again in the bowl game. Running behind a stout offensive line, anchored by center **Ted Hand** and bolstered by guards **Bert Brengman** and Jim Langan, tackles Bill Dulac and Charley Boytano, tight end Lou Yoyanovich and wide receiver Tim Cogswell, "Pack" would gain 122 yards on 31 carries but the rest of the offense could not keep up in a 14-3 loss to the Bulldogs. Louisiana Tech would open the bowl game with a first-quarter score when Glenn Berteau hauled in a 17-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ken Lantrip with Bates adding the PAT kick.

FRESNO, Calif. (EMUEagles.com) – All of the preparation was complete. The daily practices were history as were all of the special events for "Bowl Week." Game time was finally here as the Eastern Michigan University Hurons were set to take on the San Jose State University Spartans in the 7th Annual California Bowl, Saturday, Dec. 12, 1987, at Bulldog Stadium in Fresno,

Head Coach Jim Harkema's Hurons were 17-point underdogs heading into the battle with the high-scoring Spartans of San Jose. While most people agreed with that pre-game prediction of an easy San Jose State win, the EMU team and its faithful fans knew that the Green and White would be prepared to pull off the major upset.

As the sun rose on game day, it looked like the weather would be perfect for a football game. There was plenty of sun and cool weather as dawn broke and before the final gun sounded late in the evening after a 1:30 p.m. start, there would be all sorts of changes in that weather report, from sun to a small spot of rain to fog to cool temps as the night closed in on the San Joaquin

One reporter described the climate on game day as, "A day that included sun, rain and fog could not dampen the competitive spirit of the Eastern Michigan University football team."

Despite all of the vagaries of the weather, the two teams matched up in a great battle of prolific offenses and hard-hitting

defenses as EMU shocked the collegiate football world with a 30-27 victory.

Eastern, trailing 27-23 with just 3:59 left in the game, senior quarterback Ron Adams threw a long, arching pass to senior wide receiver Craig Ostrander for a 32-yard touchdown and Tim Henneghan added the PAT kick to give Eastern the 30-27 lead. That would be the last score of the game as the Hurons' defense held on for one of the most memorable wins in school

Senior tailback **Gary Patton** would be voted the Most Valuable EMU player after rushing for 130 yards and one touchdown The game was covered by a host of media representatives and the following leading paragraphs from printed newspaper stories captured the magic of the thrilling EMU bowl victory.

Eagles Fall Short in 2016 Bahamas Bowl to Old Dominion

Eastern out-gained ODU, 470-394, including 300-188 in the air

NASSAU, Bahamas (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team played a hard fought game, but ultimately fell short in the 2016 Popeyes Bahamas Bowl, 24-20, Friday afternoon, Dec. 23 at Thomas A. Robinson Stadium. The Eagles completed the season with their first winning record since 1995, finishing 7-6.

The Eastern passing game carried the day for the Eagles, as redshirt junior Brogan Roback had 300 yards passing on 26 completions and two scores. Staying true to the theme of the season, Roback spread the love, completing passes to seven receivers.
Redshirt freshman Dleuly Artistide was the leading receiver with 80 yards on seven receptions. Catching the TD passes were juniors Sergio Bailey II and Johnnie Niupalau. Sophomore Eddie Daugherty finished as the second leading wide out, catching six passes for 72 yards.
As a team, EMD outgained DOU (10-3, 7-1 CUSA) by a 470-394 margin, including 300 L98 in the air. Eastern was also extremely efficient in the clutch, making the line to gain 13 times on third down. On the defense, redshirt sophomore Kyle Bachwal finished the game as the leading tackler with eight stops. Freshman Vince Calhoun also notched his third interception of the season, which was the first NIT in bown history for EMU.

The Eagles began the game kicking off, giving ODU the first chance to put up points. The Monarchs were stynied on a third-and-short near midfield after a pair of first downs, and set up to put. They faked the play, instead snapping it to a running back that scrambel for a first down, to keep the drive going. Old Dominion eventually worked its way down to the 17, before being stopped again. A 34-yard field goal capped the 16-play, 58-yard drive, and opened the scoring at 3

the scoring at 3-0.

On the field for the first time, EMU's offense got started with a pair of rushes from redshirt sophomore lan Eriksen of six and 11 yards for a first down. A pass of five set the Eagles up near midfield, but the ODU defense held strong after that, stuffing EMU on three straight plays to force a turnover-on-downs. Following a quick three-and-out, the Eagles got the ball back on their own one following a pin purt. This time, EMU used the saing game to get out of the shadow of the endzone, as Roback found Daugherty for gains of six and nine to advance to the 16. for a 20-yard pass to set EMU at the 38.

The offense kept ticking, with an 11-yard completion to Aristilde, getting Eastern to the 49. From there, the ODU defense once again stood up, forcing an EMU punt, which sailed into the endzone for a touchback, and also ended the first quarter with the score sitting at 3-0.

Starting the second quarter, Eastern got its first big break when on a long pass, Calhoun undercut it and made a spectacular interception, and proceeded to return it 27 yards to the EMU 45. With the spark of the turnover, the Eagle offense went back to work.

Eastern Bested By Walk-Off Field Goal at the Camellia Bowl

EMU's touchdown with 3:33 left in the game overshadowed by GS's walk-off field goal

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (EMUEagles.com) - A 40-yard field goal by Georgia Southern University's Tyler Bass as time expired decided the 2018 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl, as the Eastern Michigan University football team fell, 23-21, Saturday, Dec. 15 at the Cramton Bowl here in Montgomery, Ala.

As one would expect with a game involving EMU, which played in eight games this season decided by a touchdown or less, the Camellia Bowl was a tight one with neither team ever leading by more than 10 points. There were two lead changes in the final four minutes with Eastern Michigan taking a 21-20 lead with 3:33 remaining thanks to a five-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Mike Glass III to Arthur Jackson III on a fourth-and-4. However, Georgia Southern marched right back down the field, and on a fourth-and-10, Eagles quarterback Shai Werts rushed 29 yards to put his team in field goal position. Three plays later, Bass gave his team

EMU closed the 2018 season with a 7-6 record (5-3 Mid-American Conference), its first winning conference record since 1995 and first US bowl appearance in 31 years.. With the win, Georgia Southern earned its first 10-win season at the FBS level, ending the year 10-3 (6-2 Sun Belt Conference).

Bass' game-winning field goal was the second in the brief history of the bowl. Appalachian State kicker Zach Matics' 23-yard FG as time expired lifted the Mountaineers to a 31-29 win over Ohio in 2015. The five Camellia Bowl games have been decided by 17 total points and all five have come down to the final minutes.

The Eagles' offensive efforts through the air outpaced Georgia Southern, 204 to just 33, as Glass III tied the Camellia Bowl record with three touchdown passes to finish 17-for-25 and three touchdowns. Jackson III led the $Eagles\ receivers\ with\ 86\ yards\ on\ three\ receptions, including\ two\ of\ EMU's'\ three\ touchdown\ with\ grabs\ of\ five\ and\ and\ another three\ properties and\ the properties of\ properties and\ properties are the properties are the$ 75. Senior captain **Blake Banham** was targeted a team-high seven times, pulling down six receptions for 44 yards. EMU's defense did its best to try win the contest, holding GS to only 104 total yards after the intermission as

they finished with 364, including 331 on the ground. In his final game in the Green and White, senior linebacker **Kyle Rachwal** led the Eagles' defensive efforts, tallying 12 tackles on the evening. Junior **Maxx Crosby** added a tackles-for-loss to finish with eight stops, while senior Jaylen Pickett added a nine-tackle performance

The game started with consecutive series resulting in three-and-out efforts from both squads. On their second series, Georgia Southern scored the first points of the matchup, driving from the EMU five-yard line on a 15-play, 95-yard scoring drive.

Eastern Michigan came back with a strong effort, as Willie Parker's 10-yard rush up the middle gave the Eagles their first first-down of the game. The Eagles drove down the field with another Parker rush, but were ultimately stopped at midfield after a false start penalty was too much to overcome.

The Green and White quickly got the ball back, as EMU's defense stepped up to stop GS's ensuing drive with a

huge stop on third-and-long from senior **Brody Hoying**.

On the following play, junior **Mathew Sexton** blocked Georgia Southern's punt attempt, as the kick trickled just 11 yards to mid-field. The block was the first in Camellia Bowl history and the third by EMU this year.

Eastern Michigan used the field positioning from Sexton in a six-play scoring drive to add seven to the board.

The drive saw sophomore Tyler Lyle's first-ever collegiate pass reception on the drive's scoring play, a one-yard rollout pass from Glass III. EMU used its strong passing game to get down the field, as the series was highlighted by a 20-yard catch by junior Isaac Holder and a 17-yard reception from freshman standout Dylan Drummond.

Georgia Southern quickly came back with their own touchdown to re-take the lead, before knocking in a 50-yard field goal to end the half. GS held a 17-7 advantage at the break.

Eastern used its first possession of the second half to close its scoring gap. On the Green and White's first play from scrimmage, Glass III threw a 75-yard touchdown pass to junior Jackson III for the second-longest pass play in

EMU's defense came out of the locker-room just as stout as the offense, forcing the Georgia Southern Eagles offensive off the field on the following drive in just five plays. The Green and White defense held GS scoreless throughout the third quarter, keeping the score at 17-14 through 45 minutes of play.

A 35-yard field goal make increased Georgia Southern's lead to six points in the fourth guarter. EMU kept the Eagles to just three points with a big stop from junior Hunter Andrews and freshman CJ Hunt on third-and-nine from the Green and White's redzone






Charlie Batch

One of the best quarterbacks in school history, Batch was a prototypical "gunslinger." A First Team All-MAC selection in 1995, Batch still ranks third in total yards (7,715), second in touchdowns (53), fourth in completions (579), and third in passing yards (7,592). Batch holds the all-time record for single-season passing yards with 3,280, and his 3,390 total yards in 1997 rank third in school history for a single season. Batch was drafted in the second round, 60th overall, by Detroit in the 1998 NFL draft and went on to become a two-time Super Bowl champion as a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers.



Lional Dalton

A three-time letterwinner from 1995-97, Dalton was a multi-year starter for the Eagles and served as team captain during the 1997 campaign. Nicknamed "Jelly Roll," Dalton was a First Team All-MAC selection in 1996 and 1997. The Detroit native totaled 116 tackles, four sacks and two forced fumbles during his career. He would go on to play nine NFL seasons with five different teams, earning a Super Bowl Ring as a member of the 2001 Baltimore Ravens. Dalton finished his NFL career with 110 tackles, nine sacks, 30 tackles-for-loss and three forced fumbles.



Bob Navarro

During his 1989 campaign, Navarro interceped 12 passes, a single-season record that has yet to be eclipsed. Navarro's efforts earned him First-Team All-MAC honors for the 1989 season, which he followed-up with a Second-Team All-MAC selection one year later. The Jackson, Mich. native also took home the John E. Borowiec Award for the team's most valuable defensive player during the 1989 season. Navarro's 12 interceptions during the 1989 season led all players in the NCAA that year.



Kenny Philpot

Starting for three years as a member of the Green and White, Philpot racked-up 170 solo tackles, and 354 total tackles. The Chicago native tallied 62.5 tackles-for-loss and 16.0 sacks in his career, adding seven forced fumbles along the way. His 62.5 career TFLs rank first in the EMU record books, while recording 30.5 stops behind the line in 2001 to lead the NCAA FBS ranks in per game TFLs (2.8) and total TFLs.



David Pureifory

Pureifory was the first EMU football player to receive honorable mention on three All-American teams in one year, and was the first player to win All-American honors in two different seasons. He was a First Team selection of the AFCA-College Division Team in 1970 and 1971, and a First Team pick of the NAIA in 1970. He was also named Second Team All-American by the AP-College Division teams of 1970 and 1971. Drafted in the sixth round of the 1972 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers, Pureifory went on to play 11 seasons in the NFL. In 1980 he was selected as the Detroit Lions ' "Most Valuable Defensive Player."



Mike Strickland

One of the best running backs in school history, Mike Strickland holds the top spot in career rushing yards at Eastern Michigan, with 3,234. Strickland is one of just two players in school history to amass 3,000 rushing yards in a career. The anchor of the EMU offense during his time in the Green ad White, Strickland ranks second all-time in carries, 10th all-time in career touchdowns, and finished with over 1,000 yards rushing in two of his three seasons as the starting running back for the then-Hurons. Strickland was drafted in the 14th round of the 1975 NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings.

The first major construction project on the athletics campus since the opening of the Convocation Center, the Student Athlete Performance Center is the first phase of the athletic department's plan to build a safe and highly-effective atmosphere for its student-athletes through the continual revitalization of its facilities and athletic campus.

Breaking ground in the fall of 2018, the new sports medicine and training facilities provides a 60,000 square foot structure that will house the sports medicine, performance and equipment operations areas. Additionally, the facility will house locker rooms, coaches' offices, and meeting spaces for the football team, while also including a new video board inside Rynearson Stadium.

Designed to enhance the student-athlete and fan experience at Eastern Michigan, the two story building offers a wide variety of operational spaces and amenities which allow for that goal to be met.

When entering the building, Students and guests first walk along a beautiful brick walkway in which the names of the donors and supporters who made the project possible are inscribed.

Through the main entrance is the grand atrium, a 1,288 square foot welcome room that displays the championship success of Eastern Michigan athletics throughout its history. The atrium also features a floor-to-ceiling glass panel entrance to Rynearson Stadium.

The east side of the main-floor houses a new equipment room, which includes offices, a full-service laundry facility, and extensive storage spaces for athletic apparel and uniforms, as well as a state of the art strength and conditioning center.

Dubbed "T.J.'s Garage," in honor of EMU great and former NFL Pro-Bowler T.J. Lang, the Thomas J. Lang Strength and Conditioning Center provides 7,000-plus square foot performance center, which includes inlaid weight tracks, cardio training, plyometic training, and a nutrition center. Two roll up garage doors serve as the football team's entrance into "The Factory," at Rynearson Stadium.

The west side of the ground-floor features the Phil Incarnati Football Locker Room, a modern space with an industrial flair that includes 115 lockers and access to a new players lounge, a space that allows football student-athletes to study, and bond with teammates.

Next to the locker room are eight team meeting rooms which house different position groups individually. The area also includes a full-team meeting room equipped with state-of-the-art audio-video

equipment, "Block E," branded seating, and a theatre design, which allows the entire team to see and hear clearly.

The top-floor portion of the newly constructed building is home to a sports medicine center, hydrotherapy room, recruiting lounge, and entertainment corridor, among other offices.

At nearly 5,000 square feet, the sports medicine center features rehabilitation equipment, medical examine rooms, athletic training offices, and medical storage. The space allows student-athletes across multiple sports the opportunity to be treated by an exceptional staff in first-class facilities. Attached to the sports medicine center is the hydrotherapy room. Containing three in-ground therapy pools, the hydrotherapy room features a underwater treadmill pool, a cold plunge pool, and a hot/cold therapy pool.

Overlooking Rynearson Stadium is the recruiting lounge. The 638 square-foot lounge offers a dynamic new entertainment space which is sure to enhance recruiting and alumni experiences for years to come. Along with the lounge comes the entertainment corridor. The corridor will be able to be utilized for entertainment opportunities for invited Alumni, friends and fans of Eastern Michigan.

Located on top of the building, the LED display measures 29 feet high by 53 feet wide to bring more than 2,000 square feet of visual real estate to events held at the stadium. The entire scoreboard structure will measure 38 feet high by 61 feet wide. The LED portion of the scoreboard will feature a 15HD pixel layout, the premier technology for outdoor sports used at many professional facilities. A fixed-digit scoreboard is a part of the project to provide standard game information including things such as score, time remaining, down and distance, and more

THE FACTORY

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. Those key words describe the EMU football program under Head Coach **Chris Creighton**. They are also terms befitting the proud residents of southeastern Michigan and their hardworking demeanor.

Inspired by this region of the state and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team has challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, the team has nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff will go to work each day to help "E Tough" student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and impact men. "The Factory" will be highlighted by Division I Football's first gray FieldTurf playing surface.

Since taking over reigns of EMU Football in December 2013, Creighton has rallied the program to "close the gap" between its current status and the pursuit of its true potential. He has studied the school, its surroundings, recruiting base and the current student-athletes. The one common thread throughout has been an uncommon 'toughness' that permeates the program.

In this spirit, the program's E Tough mentality represents:

Team first
Obsessed with getting better
Unwavering in adversity
Great effort
Heart

The concept of the "EMU Gray" field was born during one of the squad's notoriously intense winter workouts in 2014. The squad was challenged to an outdoor practice on the snow-covered Rynearson Stadium field rather than the warm confines of their indoor practice facility. True to their E Tough demeanor, the team accepted the challenge. Throughout each drill of the bitter cold practice, Creighton delivered the message that EMU Football has the will to compete against "anyone, anytime and anywhere... even on a parking lot covered with broken glass." Inspired by his team's toughness and commitment that day, Creighton's idea of an "EMU Gray" field was born and soon shared with administrators.

The new look within Rynearson Stadium, and moniker, "The Factory" serves as visual and name recognition for the program's ideals. They are a constant reminder to the student-athletes that being E Tough means coming ready to roll up their sleeves and to never give in or let up.

"Our colors are green and white but our collars are blue," said Creighton. "The Factory is where our coaching staff goes to work and our players develop. It is our home and one that we will protect. When opponents come to The Factory we want to make it known that they are in for a 60-minute fight. Our goal is to make it one of the toughest places to play in the Mid-American Conference."

Southeastern Michigan has long been viewed as one of the most significant manufacturing centers in the country, and the iconic 'Automotive Capital of the World.' Despite battling difficult times in recent years, local communities' toughness and resilience has been on display, as the region is experiencing a dramatic rebirth.

EMU football student-athletes come from these communities and have brought this toughness to the team. Ypsilanti has its own proud history in the automobile and manufacturing industries. The city was the home of Apex Motors, Preston Tucker and his Preston '48, and the last Hudson automobile dealership. The nearby Willow Run manufacturing complex played a critical role in producing B-24 "Liberator" heavy bombers in the early years of World War II. It was also at this location that Rose Will Monroe, the film and poster representation of "Rosie the Riveter," actually worked as a riveter before becoming the manufacturing icon of the era.

BUNDAR BLOCKS

When Head Coach Chris Creighton came onboard in 2014 he helped establish some new EMU initiatives.

- The Wrench a 51-pound pipe wrench given to Coach Creighton. It helps serve as a symbol of the team's mission to "close the gap." The tool's vices represent the gap.
- The Wall prior to running onto the field at home games EMU will break through a cinder block wall.
- Hammers of the Week the coaching staff will select hammers of the week for the big hit of the week. The selected players will have their number put on the sledge hammers used to knock down the wall.
- Eagle Walk a pregame prep rally outside the enterance of the stadium. The football team will arrive along with a special performance by the EMU marching band.



"The wrench, the field, the concrete wall, we know people will have comments, but they all have real meaning for us. It all goes back to the idea of investing, and working for something. It is about putting on those steel-toed boots, and going to work."

Eastern Outlasts Coastal Carolina to Open Season with 30-23 Win

Senior Mike Glass threw for 188 yards and three touchdowns to lead the way for EMU

CONWAY, S.C. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team overcame a slow first quarter to take down Coastal Carolina University in exciting fashion, 30-23, Saturday, Aug. 31, at Brooks Stadium. After falling 10-0 in the first quarter, the Eagles stormed back to outscore the Chanticleers 30-13 the rest of the way.

After Coastal (ó-1) connected on a 38-yard field goal to bring the score to 30-23 with just 40 seconds to go, the Chanticleers recovered an onside kick to give themselves one last chance. On their first play, Eastern (1-0) cornerback **Kevin McGill** pulled down an interception to put the game on ice.

EMU's first strike of the 2019 season was a touchdown to kick off the second quarter, as senior quarterback Mike Glass III connected with sophomore **Dylan Drummond** for a highlight-worthy 11-yard catch-andpass.

With Coastal driving into Eastern's territory on the ensuing drive, senior **Brody Hoying** picked off a pass for his third career interception. As the Eagles returned the drive, a fumble off the pylon and out of the endzone resulted in a turnover and touchback for the Green and White. Coastal Carolina capitalized on the turnover, knocking through a 52-yard field goal to take a 13-7 lead into halftime.

On the first drive of the second stanza, Glass punched in a two-yard touchdown on a quarterback keeper to put Eastern ahead 14-13. The run capped off a 13-play, 75-yard drive to open up the second half, and gave the Eagles a lead they would not relinquish. Running back **Shaq Vann** was crucial to the drive with and featured heavily all afternoon. The senior finished the game with 84 yards on 22 attempts.

Senior defensive lineman Clay Holford came up big for the Eagles on the Chanticleers' next drive, snagging a pass out of the air on Coastal's first play from scrimmage. Eastern's drive stalled on the nine-yard line, but sophomore Chad Ryland knocked home a 26-yard field goal to put the Green and White ahead 17-13.

As Eastern forced a three-and-out on the next Coastal possession, the Green and White responded quickly with a second Glass-to-Drummond connection from 19 yards out. The second touchdown catch of the day put the Eagles ahead 23-13 and, for Drummond, marked the first time in the Cleveland, Ohio native's career that he hauled in two touchdown receptions in a game.

The Eagles held Coastal's offense to 24 yards on three third-quarter drives that totaled 10 plays.

After Coastal used a six-minute drive to bring the score back to 23-20, Eastern's offense rose to the occasion to make it a two-score game once again. Facing a third and long, Glass connected for his third touchdown of the day with **Quian Williams**, putting EMU ahead 30-20 with 5:46 remaining.

On the second-to-last CCU drive of the contest, the Chanticleers moved the ball inside the red zone and were threatening to score when junior **Turan Rush** came up with EMU's first sack of the campaign to halt the drive. Though Coastal connected on a 38-yard field goal to bring the score to 30-23, Eastern was able to hold on for the win.

Eastern was led by Glass, who had an efficient 188 yards and three touchdowns on 20-of-22 from the pocket. Vann led the way on the ground with his 108 yards, and Drummond led a balanced attack through the air with 52 yards. Joining the aerial assault was senior **Matthew Sexton**, who had 48 yards on four catches, and Williams, who finished the game with 42 yards and two catches.

Defensively, **Kobie Beltram** and **Terry Myrick** were all over the field for the Eagles, finishing with 12 and 11 tackles. respectively.

Coastal Carolina was led by quarterback Fred Payton, who had 304 yards through the air to go along with two touchdowns and four interceptions. The four picks marked the most in a game since 2017. Receiver CJ Marable pulled down seven catches for 84 yards.

EMU's win over CCU marks the first win over a Sun Belt Conference member since defeating Louisiana at Lafayette in 2005, 31-10. Eastern's only other appearance in the Palmetto State was to take on the University of South Carolina, Sept. 16, 2000.

Football Drops Non-Conference Affair at Kentucky, 38-17

Mike Glass III threw for 337 yards and two touchdowns for the Eagles

LEXINGTON, Ky. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team could not slow the early firepower of the University of Kentucky Saturday, Sept. 7, as the Wildcats controlled the offensive side of the ball in the first half to turn the Eagles aside 38-17 at Kroger Field.

EMU (1-1) battled a tough crowd of 55,240 clad in blue, as UK (2-0) held the ball on offense for 33:01 and outgained the Eagles, 461-386. Though the Green and White finished with more yards through the air, 337 to 222, Kentucky used a dominant run game that outgained EMU 239 to 49.

Senior **Mike Glass III** threw for 337 yards and two touchdowns, completing passes to nine different receivers. It marked the first time since Oct. 26, 2017, that an Eagle quarterback completed passes to nine-or-more different receivers in a game.

Fellow senior **Mathew Sexton** led Eastern in receptions with seven for 54 yards, while senior **Line Latu** had four receptions for 49 yards and a touchdown, and senior **Arthur Jackson III** added five receptions for a team-high 71 yards. Junior **Bryson Cannon** caught his first touchdown as an Eagle, and finished the game with three receptions for 20 yards.

The Wildcats started the game with a bang as they needed just three plays and 1:13 to go 26 yards and take the 7-0 lead on their first possession. Eastern's offense was unable to get anything started on its next chance, and after a punt, Kentucky marched down the field on its next possession. The Wildcats capped off a 90-yard, 2:10-minute drive with a 32-yard rush to put the home team ahead 14-0. Eastern would possess the ball three times during the opening quarter, but was never able to work the ball into UK territory.

The second stanza began with UK methodically marching down the field, and as they were knocking on the door of their third touchdown, the Eagles forced a fumble for the first turnover of the game

Junior defensive end **Turan Rush** fell on the ball to give Eastern possession on their own one-yard line. Unfortunately for the Eagles, starting the drive from the shadow of their own goal post resulted in a Kentucky interception, and the Wildcats converted the turnover into three points to go ahead 17-0.

Kentucky halted the next Eastern drive in its tracks thanks to the Wildcats' second interception of the game. The Eagles' defense, however, was up to the task, and after UK missed a 48-yard field goal, EMU grabbed the momentum and drove down the field. The Green and White were halted in the red zone, but sophomore **Chad Ryland** knocked in a 24-yard field goal to put Eastern on the board, 17-3.

zone, but sopnomore **Chack Hyland** knocked in a 24-yard field goal to put Eastern on the board, 17-3. EMU outgained UK in the second quarter, 90-75, after the Wildcats dominated from the line of scrimmage in the first quarter, 158-21.

After Kentucky used a 15-play, 7:47 drive to make the score 24-3, Eastern got its own offense going on its second possession of the second half. Glass completed five passes to four receivers on the drive, ending with a 26-yard strike to Latu for the Eagles' first touchdown of the game.

Trailing 31-10 in the fourth quarter, Glass found Cannon for a seven-yard score to cut the deficit to two touchdowns at 31-17. The Wildcats took their final possession of the game to march down the field and add one more touchdown to their total, bringing the score to its 38-17 final.

Kentucky was led by its ground attack, as Kavosiey Smoke and Asim Rose rushed for 92 and 82 yards, respectively, while each scoring a touchdown. Quarterback Terry Wilson threw for 114 yards and rushed for 43 more, including a touchdown, while Sawyer Smith came in and threw for 76 yards and two touchdowns. Wilson was carted off the field late in the third quarter with an apparent knee injury resulting from a horse-collar tackle. Kentucky trainers placed a brace on Wilson's left knee before helping him to the cart.

Ryland's Last Second Field Goal Lifts Eagles over Illinois

The sophomore kicker drilled a 24-yard field goal as time expired to best the Illini, 34-31

CHAMPAIGN, III. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team is leaving a Big Ten Conference stadium with a win for the third consecutive season after beating the University of Illinois, 34-31, Sept. 14, at historic Memorial Stadium A back-and-forth contest, the game was tied with three seconds on the clock when sophomore kicker **Chad Ryland** drilled a 24-yard, game-winning field goal to down the illini. Ryland has now used a last-second field goal to beat a Big Ten foe in consecutive season after walking-off Purdue, 20-19, in West Lafayette, a season ago.

"Awesome, awesome day for our program," said Head Coach **Chris Creighton** said. "Our defense played well. We knew we veren't going to shut them out, because they are really good, but we did what we needed to. Our guys just executed. Hove this team - I mean, wow. What a great bunch of guys."

The Eagles improve to 2-1 on the year with the victory, while the Fighting Illini drop to 2-1. Furthermore, it extended the Mid-American Conference's winning streak to 14 consecutive seasons of defeating a Big 10 member, the longest streak in league history. During this 14-year stretch, MAC teams have defeated 12 different Big Ten teams – Illinois (4); Indiana (5); Iowa (3); Maryland (1); Michigan (1); Michigan State (1); Minnesota (2); Nebraska (1); Northwestern (3); Penn State (1), Purdue (6), and Rutgers (2) for a total of 29 wins during this span of time.

Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** was 23-of-36 for 316 yards and three touchdowns to lead EMU. **Jairus Grissom** rushed

three times for 52 yards, while **Willie Parker** had 23 yards on 11 carries and a touchdown.

After winning the coin toss and electing to receive to start the game, the Eagles failed to score in their opening drive, eventually falling behind, 3-0, when Illinois quickly hit a 57-yard field goal to open the game's scoring.

Eastern took flight in its second drive of the afternoon, however, marching 75 yards in just five plays to take its first lead of the game, 7-3. In as a wildcat quarterback, Grissom exploded on a career-best 47-yard run, setting up Glass, who capped-off the drive with a 26-yard touchdown pass to senior receiver **Arthur Jackson III**. The score was Jackson's first this season, and the sixth of his EMU career.

After relinquishing the lead in the next drive, 10-7, the Eagles and Illini traded three-and-outs before Glass and the Eagles struck again. This time, the St. Louis native fired a 54-yard dart to **Mathew Sexton**, who scored his first TD since Oct. 27, 2018, against Army. The play was the longest for the Eagle offense this season. Ryland added the extra point to give EMU a 14-10 adjants Affris. The ping was the longer to the Logic Science and Advantage.

A first-half filled with counter-punches, Eastern found itself down again, 17-14, at the end of the first quarter. Working

quickly, the EMU offense put together a five-play, 70-yard drive, scoring its third touchdown of the game when Glass found Jackson in the endzone for the second time during the afternoon. This time, it was a 31-yard dime to the senior wide out. Although the extra point was missed, the Eagles regained the lead, 20-17.

Holding the Illini scoreless for the remainder of the of the first half, EMU was able to extend its lead to six, 23-17, when Ryland drained a career-best 52-yard field goal with 4:43 left in the second frame. The kick is tied for the second-best in school history, and is the longest made EMU field goal since the 2015 season, when **Dylan Mulder** set the school record with a 55-yard make against Miami, Nov. 7.

The 23 first half points were the most by EMU since they put up 28 against Toledo, Oct. 13, 2018.

Stingy in the middle quarters of the game, the EMU defense was able to hold the Illini scoreless in both the second and third frames. The feat marks the ninth time in EMU's last 16 games that Neal Neathery's unit has held its opponent scoreless in the third quarter. Additionally, in Illinois first four drives of the game, it ran 21 plays for 173 yards. In its ensuing six drives, the Illini ran just 25 plays for 74 yards.

Reining MAC Defensive Player of the Week **Brody Hoying** was again critical for the Eagles, especially in the third quarter,

where he earned his sixth-career forced-fumble, recovering it to give the Eagles offense the ball back. Hoying forced another fumble in the fourth quarter, however the Illini were able to recover.

Elsewhere in the secondary, **Korey Hernandez** committed robbery on the Illinois receiving corps in the third quarter to tally

his first-career interception. In addition to the high-level play of the secondary, the Eagles defense finished the game with six asks, the most in a single-game this season.

Although it was unable to score in the third quarter, the Eagles offense rallied in the fourth quarter. Up 23-17, Glass led an

eight-play, 49-yard drive that was capped by a four-yard **Willie Parker** touchdown run. The score was the third of Parker's career. After a successful two-point conversion, the Eagles led 31-17 with 11:20 to play in the game. Up seven, 31-24, the Eagles had Illinois down to its final down before UI quarterback Brandon Peters converted on a 32-yard

pass to keep Illinois' drive alive. With 1:44 on the clock, the Illini scored, and after making the extra point, tied the game at 31-all. Uninterrupted by the late adversity, Glass marched the Eagles down the field, putting together an eight-play, 68-yard drive in which he completed 4-of-4 passes. The senior quarterback finished his day having completed 23-of-36 passes, for 316 yards, and three touchdowns. After two Illinois timeouts to try and "ice," the kicker, Ryland stepped in and hit the game-winning field

- After EMU forced a fourth down, CCSU went to punt it away with just 18 seconds left in the game. Mathew Sexton, who was lined up on the outside edge, burst into the backfield completely untouched with a perfect line to Central Connecticut State's punter.
- · With nobody there to stop him, Sexton blocked the punt. He then scooped the ball up with ease and ran it 30 yards into the end zone, sending Eastern Michigan to an improbable 34-29 win.
- · Prior to the block, EMU had a 0.01% chance of winning according to ES-PN's Win Probability Index.
- · A lightning strike in the area delayed the game for 47 minutes after Glass threw his fourth TD pass to make it 28-15 early in the fourth guarter.
- · In the jubilation of that win, defensive lineman Desmond Kelly saw the perfect opportunity to ask an important question. Kelly brought his girlfriend to near midfield of Rynearson Stadium. He then dropped to one knee, presented a ring, and asked for her hand in marriage.
- · By defeating Central Connecticut State, the Eagles ended their 0-10 skid following Big Ten wins over the past few years.

Sexton's Block Provides Last-Second Heroics for EMU

Mathew Sexton returns blocked punt 30 yards for game-winning touchdown

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) - Senior Mathew Sexton returned a blocked punt 30 yards for a touchdown with 10 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, as the Eastern Michigan University football team emerged victorious against Central Connecticut State University, 34-29, Saturday, Sept. 21 at "The Factory" inside Rynearson Stadium.

 $The \ \dot{E}agles \ improve \ to \ 3-1 \ on \ the \ year \ with \ the \ victory, \ while \ Blue \ Devils \ drop \ their \ first \ contest \ of \ the \ year \ and$ now hold a 3-1 record.

"It's adversity. Without adversity, it (EMU) doesn't make a great team," said Sexton, adding "It comes down to execution."

Senior quarterback Mike Glass III authored another strong performance under center, completing 26-of-39 passes for 279 yards and a career-high four touchdowns. In all, Glass has thrown two or more touchdown passes in five consecutive games dating back to the 2018 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl against Georgia Southern, Dec.

Sophomore **Quian Williams** enjoyed a career day for the Green and White, setting personal-bests with eight receptions for 115 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Senior Arthur Jackson III's lone catch resulted in a 48yard touchdown, while sophomore Hassan Beydoun made three catches for 45 yards and one touchdown. The score was the first-career for Beydoun. Junior Willie Parker led the ground game with nine carries for 51 yards, while Glass ran 10 times for a total of 16 vards.

The Eagles outgained CCSU, 373-346, and extended drives throughout the afternoon by going 3-for-4 on fourth-down conversions. On the defensive end, senior **Kobie Beltram** finished with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery, while fellow senior **Vince Calhoun** contributed 10 tackles, including one for-loss, and a sack.

CCSU received the ball to begin the contest and found the end zone on its opening series, marching 75 yards on 11 plays in a 6:17 span. The Blue Devils were successful on their first two-point conversion to take an 8-0 lead early on.

The Eagles bounced back on their first drive of the afternoon, needing fewer than three minutes to produce a touchdown of their own, when Glass lofted a 48-yard dime to Jackson, who had no trouble blowing past his coverage to make the catch in stride and trim the deficit to 8-7 with 6:02 remaining in the first period.

The Blue Devils restored their eight-point lead when junior Tyshaun James used runs of seven and 10 yards, respectively, to reach the end zone and widen the margin to 15-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Two plays later, Glass found Williams wide open on the right side of the field for a 25-yard touchdown pass to get the Green and White within a pair, 15-13 with 3:12 to go in the first half.

The Eagles managed to grab their first lead of the afternoon with 30 seconds remaining in the half. Parker's 11-yard run marked EMU's second successful fourth-down conversion, and Glass followed up by throwing a quick slant to Beydoun for a 21-yard touchdown pass to give EMU a 19-15 edge. The Green and White opted to go for two and succeeded when senior **Line Latu** finished off a perfectly-executed reverse to make it a 21-15

Both sides traded three-and-outs to begin the second half, as the EMU defense held CCSU to just 25 yards of offense during a scoreless third quarter. In total, the Eagles have kept opponents off the board during the third quarter in 10 of the last 17 games

Shortly after Williams made a 21-vard catch for his second receiving touchdown of the game, Chad Ryland's extra point attempt sailed through the uprights and extend Eastern's lead to 28-15.

The Blue Devils refused to go away despite the scoreline, adding a one-yard touchdown run to cut EMU's lead to 28-22 with 8:20 left in regulation. Though the Eagles' defense recovered to force a turnover on downs with 5:23 on the clock, CCSU regained possession and snatched a 29-28 lead on a 68-yard strike with 2:05 to go in the

To finish the game and claim the win, Sexton returned a blocked punt 30 yards to push the Eagles past the Blue Devils, 34-29.

• Willie Parker broke free for a season-best 26yard run against Central Michigan, Oct. 5. The rush was the third-longest of Parker's EMU career, and helped push him over the 100-yard mark for the season.

- 15 different Eagles compiled a multi-tackle game against CMU. That number was a season-high, bettering the 14 different Eagles that record multiple tackles against both Coastal Carolina, Aug. 31, and Illinois, Sept. 14. A balanced defensive attack, EMU has had a least 12 players cord two-or-more tackles in each game during the 2019 campaign thus far.
- CMU's David Moore threw two scoring passes, Jonathan Ward caught a touchdown pass and ran for two scores and Central Michigan set season highs in total yards and rushing yards

Eastern Falls to Central in 2019 MAC Opener

Senior quarterback Mike Glass III totalled 223 yards of offense and two touchdowns

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – Big plays proved too much for the Eastern Michigan University football team in the 2019 Mid-American Conference opener at Central Michigan University Saturday, Oct. 5, at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. The Chippewas tallied three touchdowns of 60-or-more yards en route to 587 yards of offense in the 42-16 decision.

Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** paced the EMU offense with 223 yards of total offense, throwing for one touchdown, and running for his eighth-career rushing TD. Senior **Mathew Sexton** contributed his second touchdown of the season, while junior defensive back **Noski LeFleur** recorded his first-career interception.

A first half that saw Eastern (3-2, 0-1 MAC) surrender 354 yards of total offense, Central (3-3, 2-1 MAC) was able to keep the EMU offense in check with just 146 total yards allowed.

Explosive from the start, CMU's offense completed a 37-pass on the game's first play from scrimmage. The Chips went on to complete a seven-play, 75-yard drive with 12:21 left in the opening frame, taking the contest's first lead, 7-0.

Facing a fourth-and-short on its first drive of the game, EMU was unable to move the chains, turning the ball over on downs in its first offensive series. Following a missed 50-yard field goal attempt by CMU, Glass marched the Eagles into CMU territory. Sophomore kicker Chad Ryland capped the drive with a 42-yard field goal make, pulling Eastern within four, 7-3.

Following another missed field goal attempt by Central, the Eastern offense took over with a chance to pull the game closer. Facing pressure for the CMU D-line, Glass launched a ball towards the endzone, where a Chippewa defensive back hauled it in for an interception.

Central added two more scores to take a 21-3 lead into the break.

Eastern's offense was unable to build momentum to open the second half, going threeand-out to begin the third frame. After Central extended its lead, 28-3, EMU pieced together a seven-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that was finished-off by a one-yard run from Glass. Ryland tacked-on the extra point to get Eastern within three scores, 28-10.

Eastern's defense brought the Green and White faithful to its feet late in the third quarter. With EMU still down, 28-10, senior defensive lineman **Shawn Simeon** batted a CMU pass allowing LeFleur to corral it and give EMU the ball back, inside the redzone. Unfortunately, the Eagles were unable to score, turning the ball over on downs.

Trailing 35-10, just minutes into the fourth, Sexton executed a perfect jet sweep, finding the endzone for the first time on offense since EMU's week-three win over Illinois, Sept. 14. Eastern's two-point conversion attempt was unsuccessful, keeping the score 35-16.

CMU would add a late touchdown to cap the contest at 42-16.

EMU Drops Homecoming Match up to Ball State, 29-23

Last-minute drive comes up short as Eagles fall to Cardinals

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team was unable to preserve a twopossession lead in its 92nd Homecoming contest, falling 29-23, to Ball State University Saturday, Oct. 21 at "The Factory" incide Propagatory Statlume

The setback snapped the Eagles' (3-3, 0-2 MAC) three-game winning streak against Ball State (3-3, 2-0 MAC), who

scored 15 unanswered points in the second half to clinch its first win at EMU since a 28-17 decision, Sept. 19, 2015.

Senior quarterback Mike Glass III was responsible for all three Eastern touchdowns, as he finished 20-for-34 with 283 yards and one touchdown pass along with a team-high 13 carries for 47 yards and two rushing scores. Sophomore Dylan Drummond led the Green and White with six receptions for 72 yards, while senior Arthur Jackson III and sophomore Hassan Revigue each stilled three carches for 48 and 41 yards respectively.

Hassan Beydoun each tallied three catches for 48 and 41 yards, respectively.

Sophomore kicker Chad Ryland matched the career-high he set in the Eagles' win at Illinois, Sept. 14, with a 52-yard field goal that gave EMU a 17-7 lead with 5:27 remaining in the second quarter. On the defensive end, senior Kobie Beltram shined with 12 tackles, one TFL, and one fumble recovery, while senior Vince Calhoun and Terry Myrick were both responsible for seven tackles.

The Eagles won the coin toss and received the ball to begin the contest, but were unable to grab the lead on their opening drive. Glass' first pass from scrimmage intended for senior wide receiver **Mathew Sexton** was incomplete, but the pair connected one play later on a 41-yard heave to put the Green and White at the BSU 34-yard line. Glass later extended the drive with a run on fourth-and-one from the 25, but his throw on Third-and-5 at the 7 was intercepted in the pool and by larger than the BSU 34-yard drive. Larger State 510.

Two plays later, Glass and Drummond collaborated on a 16-yard reception as the bosts set up shop inside the 30-yard-line.

Faced with Third-and-11 at the 29-yard line, Glass kept the ball and scampered 18 yards for a first down that put the Eagles in the red zone. Despite a false start pushing EMU back to the six later in the drive, junior Willie Parker recovered all five yards on the ground, before Glass punched in a QB sneak to put EMU ahead, 14-7, with 9:12 left in the second quarter.

After forcing a fast three-and-out, the Eagles took over and looked to make it a two-possession game. Glass began the drive with a 13-yard strike to Beydoun, and a defensive pass interference penalty advanced the ball to the BSU 39. EMU decided to try a field goal on fourth-and-six at the 35-yard line, where Ryland tied a personal-best with a 52-yard field goal to give the hosts a 17-7 advantage with 5:27 left in the second period. Ryland previously nailed a 52-yarder in EMU's victory at Illinois, Sept. 14, along with a 51-yard kick against San Diego State, Sept. 22, 2018.

Ball State responded within the final two minutes of the first half with a touchdown to close the gap,17-14, which proved to be the score heading into the break.

The Eagles got a defensive stop to begin the second half, and built a nine-point advantage on the ensuing drive. The passing game continued to shine, as Glass reached Jackson for a 24-yard reception, before consecutive passes to senior Bryce Kemp (Baxter, lowa-Baxter Community School) totaled 33 yards. Although a touchdown pass was negated by an illegal formation penalty, Beydoun made a 28-yard catch to get EMU down inside the BSU five-yard line, before Glass added a pair of one-yard runs to extend the margin to 23-14 with 7:32 left in the third.

Ball State answered with a 46-yard touchdown pass to cut the Green and White's lead to 23-21 with 4:49 to go in the third quarter, though the Eagles remained in front to begin the final frame. The Cardinals converted on fourth-and-one at the EMU 30, before Plitt added a one-yard run to put the visitors ahead, 27-23, with 11:13 left in regulation. On the ensuing two-point conversion, Plitt found redshirt senior Riley Miller to extend the lead to six.

Still trailing 29-23, the Eagles refused to go away quietly as they burned all three timeouts and earned a crucial defensive stop with 1:19 remaining in the fourth. Glass started the drive 5-for-5 for 59 yards as the Eagles marched to the Ball State 30 with fewer than 30 seconds to play. After spiking the ball to stop the clock with 19 seconds left, the Eagles' best chance for a miraculous win Glass aimed for Jackson at the left edge of the end zone, but the receiver was confirmed to have made the catch out of bounds following a video review. Two plays later, the Cardinals recovered a fumble on fourth down to ice the game.

(EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team earned a crucial victory in Mid-American Conference action, as senior Mathew Sexton collected his second game-winning touchdown of the season to clinch a 34-27 win over Western Michigan University Saturday, Oct. 19, in Mid-American Conference action inside Rynearson Stadium.

Trailing 27-26 with 1:51 left in regulation, the Eagles (4-3, 1-2 MAC) started what proved to be the game-deciding drive at their own

Vann paced the Eagles' ground game with 17 carries for a season-high 97 yards, while Jackson set season-highs with seven receptions and 98 yards. Drummond made eight catches for 69 yards and one touchdown, while sophomore Quian Williams caught the ball six times for 60 yards and a score.

The Eagles outgained the Broncos through the air, 407-192, and finished with 547 total yards compared to tWIU's total of 359. EMU was able to extend drives throughout the night, finishing 9-for-16 on third-down conversions, while succeeding on its Monty fourth-down attempt.

Football Drops Overtime Thriller at Toledo, 37-34

The Eagles charged back from 21-down to force the school's first OT game with Toledo

TOLEDO, Ohio. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team fought from 21-points down in the third quarter to force overtime with the University of Toledo Saturday, Oct. 26, in Mid-American Conference action at the Glass Bowl. Despite taking a three-point lead in the extra session, 34-31, the Eagles were unable to hold on for victory, dropping the contest, 37-34. The 47th all-time matchup between the squads, was the first that needed overtime to decide the winner.

A tie game at the half, Toledo (5-3, 2-2 MAC) scored three unanswered touchdowns to open up a 21-point advantage, 31-10, with 9:21 remaining in the third quarter. Undiscouraged, Eastern (4-4, 1-3 MAC) came charging back. Down seven, 31-24, with 2:25 on the clock, senior running back **Shaq Vann** busted a 27-yard touchdown run, stunning the fans that were left in the rain-drenched Glass Bowl. **Chad Ryland's** extra point tied the game at 31-all

After the EMU defense recovered a fumble in the ensuing UT possession, the Eastern offense had one final chance to clinch the game in regulation. With 1:59 left, Glass and the offense positioned the field goal unit with a 33-yard field goal attempt, which ultimately missed.

EMU continued to prove its resilience in the extra period. Unable to find the endzone, Ryland redeemed his earlier miss, this time drilling a 24-yard attempt, and giving Eastern its first lead of the game, 34-31.

Needing a defensive stop to win the game, the Rocket offense came through in the clutch. On third-and-10, UT quarterback Eli Peters threaded a perfect 15-yard touchdown pass to the Drew Rosi, ending the game, 37-34. After compiling just 26 yards in the first quarter, the EMU offense found its stride in the remainder of the game. Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** inished his day 21-of-37, for 268 yards, and two total touchdowns.

game. Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** finished his day 21-of-37, for 268 yards, and two total touchdowns. He added 43 yards on the ground as well. Pacing a receiving corps that had five players register two-or-more receptions, sophomore **Quian Williams** hauled in a career-best nine receptions, for 87 yards. Vann finished his effort with 110 total rushing yards, a season-best.

Defensively, a season-best 18 Eagles recorded multiple tackles. Freshman **Mikey Haney** and senior captain **Vince Calhoun** led the way with 10 tackles each.

Back on the gridiron, and healthy, for the first time since Oct. 12, Glass found passing rhythm in the second quarter after a slow first frame. Down ten, 10-0, with 9:46 on the clock, the St. Louis native fired a 41-yard bullet to sophomore Williams, kicking off EMU's best drive of the half. After finding Williams twice more in the ensuing three plays, Glass found senior **Arthur Jackson III on** a 24-yard strike in the back of the endzone. A well placed ball was met with Jackson's incredible hands, as the California native corralled the pass with just one hand as he used the other to brace a dive across the endzone.

After the EMU defense forced a quick three-and-out, the offense marched back down the field. This time, Glass orchestrated a seven-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard, game tying, Ryland field goal, his ninth of

With the rain still coming down at the beginning of the second half, Toledo took advantage of its first possession. The Rockets needed just three plays and 1:22 to break the 10-all tie, as they went 44 yards for a touchdown, regaining the lead, 16-10.

After two more Rocket touchdowns, Glass was able to lead an 11-play, 75-yard drive, capped off by a fouryard TD by the senior QB. A failed two-point conversion left the Eagles down 15, 31-16, but kick started an unbelievable second-half breakthrough.

With **Neal Neathery's** defensive unit playing stout, the Eagle offense regained possession and took advantage of the momentum it had built. With 8:18 left in the fourth quarter, Vann capped a 12-play, 74-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run. After a two-point conversion, EMU found itself down just one score, 31-24

With just over two minutes remaining in the game, it was Vann who struck again with his 27-yard carry. Although the Eagles were unable to win the game in overtime, their valiant effort did not go unnoticed.

Eastern Michigan Falls Against Buffalo, 43-14

Eagles record longest play and longest drive of the season in home defeat

YPSILANTI Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team fell to the University at Buffalo, 43-14, Saturday, Nov. 2, at "The Factory" inside Rynearson Stadium.

The Eagles (4-5, 1-4 MAC) scored the opening touchdown with fewer than seven minutes left in the first quarter, but the Bulls (5-4, 3-2 MAC) came back with 43 unanswered points en route to their first victory in five visits to Rynearson Stadium.

Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** finished 5-of-10 for 95 yards, including a season-long 80-yard touchdown pass to fellow senior **Mathew Sexton**, while sophomore **Preston Hutchinson** ended the game 9-for-15 for 90 yards with a rushing touchdown and an interception.

Sexton led the Green and White with three receptions for 87 yards, while sophomore **Quian Williams** made two catches for 47 yards. Senior **Eddie Daugherty IV** made a pair of catches for 32 yards, while senior **Shaq Vann** was one of nine Eagles to catch a pass in addition to his team-best six carries for 33 yards. On the defensive end, senior **Kobie Beltram** and freshman **Mikey Haney** each contributed 11 tackles, while senior **Vince Calhoun** made seven tackles and a TFL.

The Eagles went three-and-out during their opening series, but responded by keeping the Bulls off the board on their first drive. UB elected to punt on 4th-and-8 at the EMU 39-yard line, but appeared to have favorable field position when freshman Jackson Baltar's short kick was downed at the six-pard-line

Despite being backed up deep in its own territory, EMU needed just four plays and 81 seconds to reach the end zone on the strength of a season-long 94-yard drive. On 3rd-and-6 from their own 20-yard-line, Glass and Sexton combined for the Green and White's longest play of the season, as the latter caught an 80-yard touchdown pass to give the Eagles a 7-0 lead with 6:59 to go in the first quarter

Eastern had a chance to add to its lead later in the frame after Buffalo came up a yard short on 4th and-goal. However, Glass was brought down in the end zone three plays later for a safety that cut the margin to 7-2 with 1:01 remaining in the quarter. UB then grabbed the lead for good after the ensuing free kick, as Kevin Marks ran for nine yards to put the visitors ahead, 9-7, with 10:41 left in the second. Buffalo then capitalized on a turnover on downs, as redshirt sophomore quarterback Kyle Vantrease's 35-yard rush made it 16-7 with 7:33 to go in the opening half.

One drive later, Vantrease added his second rushing score of the afternoon, though a failed PAT kept the deficit at 22-7 with 3:49 left in the second stanza. Buffalo tallied another touchdown prior to the intermission, as Vantrease threw a 10-yard pass to junior Antonio Nunn to build a 29-7 advantage with nine seconds on the clock.

The Bulls continued to generate offense as they scored a pair of rushing touchdowns in the second half, eventually going in front, 43-7.

EMU was able to manufacture another touchdown in the waning moments of the inter-division matchup. Vann ran for 11 yards to the EMU 32, before the Eagles advanced closer to midfield following a UB personal foul. Hutchinson then found Daugherty for a 32-yard completion as the Eagles marched to the visiting 21-yard-line. Although Hutchinson was sacked on first down, Vann made up 10 yards, while Williams made a nine-yard catch to set up 1st-and-goal at the Bulls' nine-yard-line. The Green and White finally punched it in on 4th-and-goal at the UB 1, when Hutchinson crossed the plane to trim the gap to 43-14 with exactly 1:30 left.

- Shaq Vann rushed for 142 yards and four touchdowns and became the first Eagle to score four rushing touchdowns since Bronson Hill against Toledo on Oct. 13, 2012. He scored Eastern Michigan's first three TDs when the Eagles took a 21-0 halftime lead. He added his final score in the fourth quarter. He carried the ball 28 times. His longest run was a 19-yard score.
- Mike Glass III was 20-of-25 passing for 246 yards and added 83 yards rushing, including a TD.
- Willie Parker added the Eagles sixth score on an 11-yard carry.

Football Dominates Akron for Fifth Win of the Season

EMU tallied six rushing touchdowns for the first time since 2008

AKRON, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team was on the field for a "Midweek #MACtion," contest against Mid-American Conference East Division rival, the University of Akron, tonight, Nov. 12. While temperatures were well below freezing, the action on the field was hot, as EMU exploded for 498 yards of offense and six rushing touchdowns in its 42-14 win.

Eastern (5-5, 2-4 MAC) dominated every aspect of the game en route to its fourth-ever win in the Rubber City. Offensively, the Eagles were extremely efficient, racking up 42 points, 6.0 yards per rush, and six total functhowns (each rushing), all season-bests. The last time EMU tallied six scores on the ground in a single-game was against Indiana State University in the 2008 season opener, Aug. 28. Furthermore, with the win, the Eagles need just one more victory to become bowl eligible for the third time in the last four seasons, an accomplishment that has never been achieved at EMU.

Senior quarterback Mike Glass III completed 20-of-25 passing attempts (80%), for 246 yards in the air, while senior running back Shaq Wann turned in his best-ever performance, using 28 rushing attempts to compile 142 yards on the ground and four rushing TDs. With his fourth rushing scores, Vann became the first Eagle to rush for four touchdowns since the 2012 season, when Bronson Hill hit that number against Toledo, Oct. 13.

Defensively, EMU held Akron (0-10, 0-6 MAC) to just 54 yards on the ground, keeping the Zips off the board until the third quarter of the game. Senior **Kobie Beltram** led the way with 11 total tackles and a sack, while junior defensive back **Freddie McGee** added five stops, tying his season-best.

After winning the toss and electing to defer to the second half, EMU's defense faced an early fourth down test. Looking for its first touchdown since Sept. 28, Akron attempted to convert a fourth-and-five, but was met by combining of defective license of the total control of the second se

sophomore defensive lineman **CJ Hunt** before the line-to-gain.

Forced to punt on its first offensive possession, the EMU scoring unit found its stride in its second stint with the pigskin. Needing just two minutes to march his squad 63 yards, senior Glass completed three consecutive passes before rushing the ball down to the Akron six-yard line. The drive was capped on the next play, when Vann pushed forward for a six-yard score. A **Chad Ryland** extra point gave EMU a seven point advantage, 7-0, with 0:36 left in the game's opening quarter.

Eastern was balanced again in its next offensive possession, this time producing a seven play, 79-yard drive that was capped by another Vann touchdown. Senior wide out **Mathew Sexton** recorded three receptions, for 35 yards, during the series.

After forcing consecutive three-and-outs, the EMU defense again helped to position Glass and the offense for success. With the ball, and with 9:44 left on the clock, Eastern put together a 10-play drive, moving the ball 57 yards over a 5:29 span. On the five-yard line, the ball went to Vann, who blasted through the Zips' defensive line for his third TD of the half. Ryland made it a 21-point lead, 21-0, with the extra point make. With his score, Vann became the first Eagle to score three rushing touchdowns in a single game since lan Eriksen did so at Kent State, Nov. 23, 2018.

Neal Neathery's unit held Akron scoreless once more before the break. The defensive unit's first half shutout was its first since Nov. 16. 2016, when it held Northern Illinois scoreless in the first two frames.

The Eagle offense stayed hot in the second half. With the ball to begin the third quarter, EMU put together a 75 yard drive, which included a 3-of-4 passing mark from Glass, and 56 combined rushing yards. Again finding success on the ground, the drive ended with an 11-yard rushing touchdown, this time by junior running back **Willie Parker**, giving EMU its first four-TD game on the ground since its 2018 win over Kent State, Nov. 23.

Up 28-0 and following Akron's three-play, negative 20-yard series on offense, Glass decided to join the run-game fun. After a 41-yard strike to Sexton, and three consecutive rushes by Vann put the ball at the Akron one-yard line, Glass used his legs to provide Eastern's fifth rushing score, putting EMU up, 34-0. Ryland chipped another one-pointer to make it a 35-0 affair.

Akron got on the board for the first time in the third quarter when quarterback Nelson Kato found wide out Timothy Scippo on an 87-yard touchdown strike. Although the shutout ended, the EMU defense stayed locked-in. With 10:29 remaining in the game, senior defensive back **Brody Hoying**, registered his second interception of the season, his first since a week-one win over Coastal Carolina, Aug. 31.

With three touchdowns already, Vann added another, this time busting a 17-yard run to put EMU ahead, 41-7. Although Akron added a late touchdown, EMU capped a dominating night with the win, 42-14.

Football Earns Bowl Eligibility with Rout of NIU, 45-17

EMU is bowl eligible in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history

DEKALB, III. (EMUEagles.com) – It was a historic showing for the Eastern Michigan University football team, as it defeated defending Mid-American Conference champion Northern Illinois University in a Midweek #MACtion bout, 45-17, Tuesday, Nov. 19, inside Huskie Stadium. The win gives Eastern bowl eligibility in consecutive years for the first time, and for just the fifth time in program history.

The victory was Eastern's (6-4, 3-4 MAC) first against NIU (4-7, 3-4 MAC) since the 2007 season, while it was the Eagles' most points scored against the Huskies on their home field since 1997. Additionally, the game was only the ninth since 2000 in which Eastern has hung 45-plus points on a conference opponent.

Eastern overpowered the Huskies in every aspect of the game. Offensively, senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** was electric, completing 20-of-24 passes for 235 yards and three touchdowns. In total, five different players scored a touchdown, while senior receiver **Arthur Jackson III** hauled in five passes, for 78 yards, scoring two touchdowns in his effort.

Defensively, EMU provided one of its best performances of the year, forcing three interceptions while holding NIU under 350 total yards. Senior defensive back **Brody Hoying** collected two interceptions, making him the first Eagle to record two INTs in a game since **DaQuan Pace** did so at Ball State, Nov. 8, 2016.

On defense to begin the game, Hoying provided an early spark when he corralled his third interception of the season, however the ball was fumbled during the return, giving possession back to the Huskies. Despite the unique series of events, Hoying and the rest of the defensive unit regrouped to force an NIU punt.

With the ball, Glass and the EMU scoring unit picked up where it left off one week ago, when it scored a then-season-best 42 points against Akron, Nov. 12. The Eagles put together an eight-play, 62-yard drive that was capped by a one-yard Glass touchdown run. Sophomore kicker **Chad Ryland** knocked in the extra point to give Eastern the lead, 7-0, with 6:56 remaining in the first quarter.

After a punt-for-punt exchange gave the ball back to EMU, Glass again led a nearly-perfect drive. This time, the seven-play, 86-yard stanza was capped in the air, as Jackson collected a 36-yard dime, scoring his fifth touchdown of the season and first since Oct. 26, at Toledo. The extra point gave the Eagles a 14-0 advantage.

Although NIU added a second quarter touchdown to bring the score within seven at the break, 14-7, EMU was the dominant team. Glass finished the half with a 10-for-12 passing mark, including going 8-for-9 in the second quarter, for 112 yards in the air, while the EMU defense held the Huskies to just 146 yards of total offense.

The offensive clinic continued out of the break. With the ball to start the third quarter, **Aaron Keen**'s unit strung together a nine-play, 75 yard drive to extend its lead, 21-7. After a perfect 5-for-5 passing effort from Glass put the ball inside the NIU 10-yard line, senior running back **Shaq Vann** punched it in, his fifth score in two weeks.

In its next possession, the Eagles needed just two plays to drive 75 yards and score. After a 24-yard Vann rush and an NIU personal foul, Glass completed a 36-yard pass to senior **Line Latu** in the back of the endzone, giving EMU its fourth touchdown of the night. Ryland chipped in the extra point to make it 28-10.

The onslaught continued as EMU needed just six offensive snaps to add two additional scores in the third frame. Ryland hit a 27-yard field goal before Hoying's second interception of game set EMU up in NIU territory. From there, Glass found Jackson on a 22-yard strike, giving the pair two scores on the night, and putting EMU ahead. 38-10.

Refusing to let up in the fourth, the EMU defense continued to harass the NIU quarterback. With 13:33 on the clock, senior defensive back **Vince Calhoun** intercepted his first pass of the season, EMU's third of the game.

Again starting with a short field, sophomore play maker **Jairus Grissom** ran it in from three yards out, giving Eastern its sixth touchdown of the game, a 45-10 lead, and all-but-ending the Huskies' comeback hopes.

Although NIU added a late score, 45-17, Eastern was undoubtedly the better team, overpowering NIU in four straight quarters en route to its sixth win of the 2019 campaign.

Football's Late Push Falls Short on Senior Day

Mike Glass III throws for career-high 386 yards in final home game

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team rallied to score two unanswered touchdowns in the second half on Senior Day, but came up short on its final drive against Kent State University, falling, 31-26, Friday, Nov. 29, at "The Factory" inside Rynearson Stadium.

The Eagles (6-6, 3-5 MAC), who earned bowl eligibility in back-to-back seasons for the first time in program history at Northern Illinois, Nov. 19, concluded the regular season.500-or-better for the third time in the Chris Creighton era. Meanwhile, the Golden Flashes (6-6, 5-3 MAC) became bowl eligible for the first time since the 2012 campaign. Although eligible, Eastern is not guaranteed to be selected for postseason play. With 75 teams eligible, and 11 that can still become eligible, to fill 78 total spots (39 Football Bowl Subdivision bowl games), Eastern will wait to see if it is selected. A bowl invitation would give Eastern consecutive postseason appearances for the first time in its 128-year history.

Senior quarterback **Mike Glass III** completed 29-of-37 passes (78.4 percent) for a career-high 386 yards, three touchdowns, and two interceptions. The performance marks the second consecutive game and fifth time this season in which Glass has thrown for three or more touchdowns, and the third time this year he has ecliosed the 300-yard plateau.

Two senior receivers set career-highs in yardage in their final home game, as **Arthur Jackson III** made four receptions for a personal-best 129 yards, including a career-long 54-yard gain, while **Line Latu** caught nine passes for a career-high 108 yards and a touchdown. The Eagles had a pair of wideouts reach the century mark for the first time since **Dustin Creel** and **Tyreese Russell** recorded 152 and 113 yards, respectively, against Ball State, Nov. 22, 2014.

Additionally, sophomore **Quian Williams** added five catches for 58 yards and a touchdown, while fellow sophomore **Dylan Drummond** reeled in five passes for 47 yards. Junior tight end **Bryson Cannon** also posted three catches for 35 yards and a touchdown. Senior **Shaq Vann** paced the ground game with 18 carries for 73 yards and a touchdown, while Glass looked to help his own cause with nine rushes for 37 yards.

On the defensive end, seniors **Kobie Beltram** and **Brody Hoying** each contributed a dozen tackles, while sophomore **Blake Bogan** showed seven tackles and 0.5 TFL. Junior **Terry Myrick** also shined for the Green and White with 10 tackles, one sack, and 2.5 TFLs.

The Eagles received the ball to begin the contest, and needed little time to find the end zone on their opening possession. After Latu caught a seven-yard screen to set up 3rd-and-3 at the EMU 43, Glass connected with Jackson for a 27-yard pass to reach Kent State's 30-yard-line. One play later, Vann found a seam on the left side and sprinted his way to paydirt to give the Green and White a 7-0 lead with 12:19 left in the first quarter.

The Golden Flashes responded with a quick touchdown on their first series to knot the score at seven with 10:14 to go in the first period. After KSU secured a three-and-out, junior quarterback Dustin Crum eventually forced his way into the end zone on the next drive to put the visitors in front, 14-7, with 3:50 remaining in the same frame.

Although the Green and White came up empty-handed on their first trip to the red zone, they recovered to make it a 14-14 contest later in the second quarter. On 3rd-and-3, Glass threw a nine-yard slant to Williams to put the ball at midfield, and converted another third-and-short when Latu made a 13-yard catch to get down to the KSU 30. Two plays later, Glass kept the ball and rushed for 18 yards, before reconnecting with Williams on an 18-yard touchdown pass to restore parity with 3:39 to go in the first half.

However, the Golden Flashes bounced back with 10 unanswered points prior to the intermission. Sophomore kicker Matthew Trickett booted a 42-yard field goal to reclaim the lead with 1:06 remaining, before Crum recorded his second rushing touchdown of the first half with just nine seconds on the clock.

Ken² State padded its lead when it returned the second-half kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown, but the Eagles came away with a touchdown on their next series. Shortly after EMU extended its drive on a fake punt that went for 11 yards, Glass set up Cannon for a 14-yard completion to get inside the Golden Flashes' 35-yard-line. Two plays later, Glass and Latu teamed up on a 30-yard touchdown pass to cut the deficit to 31-20 with 12:16 left in the third quarter.

The Eagles continued to claw their way back into the game, and moved within one possession near the halfway mark of the fourth quarter. EMU crossed midfield when Kent State was called for pass interference, while Cannon made a 15-yard catch to march to the KSU 33. Two plays later, Glass set up Williams on an 18-yard reception, before Cannon made an exceptional one-handed catch on the right edge of the end zone to slice Kent State's lead to 31-26 with 7:58 left in regulation.

Kent State used a field goal to cap a clock-milking 14-play, 69-yard drive and open up an eight-point margin, but the Eagles had one final chance to complete a potential game-tying drive 1:27 to go n the final period. With no timeouts at his disposal, Glass made a pair of efficient passes as he found Latu and Jackson for gains of 23 and 24 yards, respectively, to set up shop at the KSU 28-yard line. After a penalty for an ineligible receiver set the Eagles back five yards, Glass scrambled for nine more yards to get to the Golden Flashes 24, but his next pass was intercepted in the red zone by junior Keith Sherald Jr. with 44 seconds left to end the combeack bid.
