YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) - The Eastern Michigan University football team will enjoy a second consecutive week at home as it welcomes Mid-American Conference West Division foe and in-state rival, Central Michigan University to town Friday, Nov. 27. The Black Friday affair is set to begin at 4 p.m. inside "The Factory," at Rynearson Stadium.

EMU (0-3; 0-3 MAC) is in search of its first victory of the season after falling to Toledo, Nov. 18. Meanwhile, Central Michigan (2-1; 2-1 MAC) will play following a loss for the first time this season, as the Chippewas were bested by Western Michigan, 52-44, on the same date.

The game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network with Jason Knapp providing the play-by-play and Malik Zaire serving as the analyst. WEMU (89.1 FM) will also air the game with Matt Shepard, Rob Rubick, and Tom Helmer on the call.

WHAT'S THE FAN SITUATION: The EMU Department of Athletics will remain active as it meets the extraordinary standards for risk mitigation set forward by the State of Michigan. Due to the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) orders, EMU will not be able to host any fans. This includes players and coaches guests, band, cheer, or dance team members.

ON BLACK FRIDAY: Eastern hopes to change its Black Friday fortunes under head coach **Chris** Creighton when Central Michigan comes to town, Nov. 27. EMU is 1-3 on the day after Thanksgiving since 2014, with its lone win coming in 2018 at Kent State.

HUTCHINSON CONTINUES TO PRODUCE: Junior quarterback Preston Hutchinson continued his hot start to the season against Toledo, Nov. 18. The Mason, Ohio native completed 25-of-38 pass attempts for 244 yards and four scores.

His total completions and completion percentage (65.8) were season-highs, while his four passing touchdowns is the best mark of his career. Hutchinson has thrown for 240+ yards in each of his last three contests, an accomplishment that has not happened since Mike Glass III hit the same mark between weeks six-eight last season.

Media Credentials

Requests for official working media credentials should be directed to the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office. All requests should be received no later than noon, four days prior to the game. Visit EMUEagles.com to request credentials online.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, 2020 football credentials will only be issued on a single-game basis and no passes will be mailed out prior to gameday.

On gameday, media should park in the Oestrike Stadium lot, pick up their credentials outside Gate 2 of Rynearson Stadium, go through a health screening check and enter Rynearson Stadium through Gate 2.

Masks will be required at both credential pickup and at any point inside Rynearson Stadium to comply with state of Michigan, Washtenaw County and University orders.

Scouting Passes

Professional scouts may obtain credentials through EMU's Athletic Media Relations Office. Scouts will be issued seating in the press box on a space-available basis.

Sideline Passes

Eastern Michigan follows NCAA guidelines regarding media representatives on the sidelines. Sideline shooting spaces will be extremely limited during the 2020 season but every effort will be made to accommodate media requests. Select photographers and videographers will be permitted to shoot behind the restraining lines in either end zone. The remaining photographers and videographers will be permitted to shoot from the stands or concourse areas in 2020.

Press Box Services

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via EMUEagles.com. To limit touch points, EMU will not be printing game notes or stats unless requested. Following the game, a complete post-game statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete playby-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, post-game quotes and post-game notes.

The press box is a designated working area and access is restricted to authorized personnel who have been assigned responsibilities pertinent to the scheduled game. In conjunction with NCAA and College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) policies, there is to be absolutely no cheering and/or criticizing players, coaches or other game officials at any point before, during or after the contest. Failure to abide by this will result in your removal from the press box.

Live Stats

Live in-game statistics will be available via SIDEARM Stats. Following each home game, EMU will be happy to email whatever information media members need to their respective agencies. Please ask any member of the staff for assistance on this matter.

Internet Access

Wireless Internet is available in the press box at Ryearson Stadium. Members of the Athletics Media Relations staff will be available to assist you. There is no access fee.

Media Availability

Out of an abundance of caution with the continued spread of COVID-19, these will be held in a digital capacity indefinitely.

Head Coach **Chris Creighton** is available to speak to the media via phone Monday-Thursday mornings.

Individual players are available for interviews, but please contact the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office to set up interviews. One note to the media: home phone numbers for players and coaches will not be given out by the EMU Athletic Media Relations Office.

All postgame media will be virtual this season. Coach Creighton and select student-athletes will be made available after the game via Zoom. An e-mail will be sent weekly to the football listserv asking for RSVPs to participate and a Zoom link will be provided. An off-site moderator will open the Zoom meeting shortly after the conclusion of the game and will field questions from the media.

STRAIGHT FROM THE BEAR: The EMU Office of Athletic Media Relations is no stranger to noting EMU's close-game tendencies, but last week, ESPN's Chris Fallica, known as "The Bear" on the network's flagship pregame show, College Gameday, took to Twitter to discuss it as well.

According to Fallica, 26 of EMU's last 29 MAC games and 39 of its last 44 games overall (prior to EMU's game against Toledo, Nov. 18) had either been a win or a one possession loss.

THE RECEPTION OF A LIFETIME: A normal team meeting speech from **Chris Creighton** quickly turned into an unforgettable moment, Nov. 17, as he announced that sophomore wide receiver **Tanner Knue** had officially earned a full-ride scholarship, a goal that the walk-on from Mason, Ohio set for himself when he arrived in Ypsilanti.

A basketball star during his youth, it was not until his senior year in high school that Knue took to the gridiron. There, he caught 21 passes for 352 yards and had five touchdowns, and averaged 17.2 yards per catch as the team posted a 9-3 record. Those numbers were good enough to catch the eyes of the EMU coaching staff, who went on to offer Knue a walk-on position with the team. Knue is off to an incredible start during the 2020 season. He burst onto the scene in EMU's Week One matchup at Kent State, Nov. 4. His third-career appearance saw him record his first-career start, collect his first collegiate reception, and subsequently set career-bests in receptions (4), longest reception (19 yards), and reception yards (45). He more than doubled that performance against Ball State, Nov. 11, as he collected eight receptions and amassed 121 yards, both of which are career-highs. His 100-yard game is just the 128th in the 129-year history of the program.

Knue notched another milestone in his football journey when he found the end zone for the first time in his career versus Toledo, Nov. 18.

FLY TO THE BALL: A staple of **Neal Neathery**'s defense is the "next man up" mentality. That mindset has been on display in full force through EMU's first three games of the season. One week after 20 different Eagles recorded two-or-more tackles against Ball State, Nov. 11.

A total of 15 EMU defenders tallied multi-stop efforts versus Toledo, Nov. 18. A similar trend occurred in EMU's Week One matchup with Kent State, Nov. 4. In that contest, 19 Eagles had two-or-more tackles.

LET'S TALK ABOUT TERRY: Senior linebacker **Terry Myrick** continued his hot start to the season in Eastern's matchup with Toledo, Nov. 18. The Atlanta-based run-stuffer recorded a career-high 14 stops, had 1.5 tackles for loss, picked up one sack, and forced a fumble. The sack and forced fumble were both season-firsts for Myrick. The defensive leader was equally impressive against Kent State, Nov. 4, and Ball State, Nov. 11, as he racked up 10 stops in each contest, both team highs. Myrick's 11.3 tackles per game average ranks third in the Mid-American Conference and 10th nationally.

THE CANNON CONNECTION: Senior tight end **Bryson Cannon** continues to make his presence felt within the EMU offense as the season progresses. The second-year Eagle had a career-best performance against the Ball State Cardinals on Nov. 11 as he had personal bests in receptions (5) and yards (76), and also hauled in a career-long 37-yard grab.

He followed that performance with a two-reception game against Toledo, Nov. 18. Cannon also scored a touchdown in that outing, his second of the season, which ties his personal-best for single-season scores. Cannon now has six multiple-reception games since his arrival in Ypsilanti, which leads all tight ends on the EMU roster.

BEYDOUN BOUNCES BACK: After sitting out of EMU's Week Two matchup against Ball State, Nov. 11, due to injury, junior wide out **Hassan Beydoun** bounced back with an impressive performance versus Toledo, Nov. 18. The Dearborn, Mich. native hauled in eight receptions for 64 yards, which was second on the team. Beydoun now has 8+ receptions in each of his last three games, dating back to the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl, Dec. 26.

He is the first player to accomplish that feat since the 2008-09 seasons, respectively, when **Jacory Stone** recorded three such games between weeks 11 and 12 of the 2008 campaign, and Week One of the 2009 season.

FIRST-TIME PLAYERS: Each year, teams across the country are able to debut new talent that has emerged. That was no different for Eastern Michigan in its Week One matchup at Kent State, Nov. 4. Fourteen Eagles made their first-ever appearance in the Green and White during the contest, including six defensive players, seven offensive players, and one special teams player. Nine of the first-time players are newcomers on the 2020 roster, while five participants have been on the team for at least one season.

An additional four players saw first-time action against Ball State, Nov. 11, including first-time starter, sophomore **Samson Evans**, who began the game at running back for EMU. Three additional players contributed off the bench.

Seven more Eagles touched the turf against Toledo, Nov. 18, bringing this season's total number of first-time players to 27, a number that is not surprising when considering EMU has the 19th-youngest roster in the FBS.

HEAD COACH CHRIS CREIGHTON

SEVENTH YEAR AT EMU • KENYON, 1991 • @COACH_CREIGHTON

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. These key words have come to describe EMU football as **Chris Creighton** enters his seventh season as the head man at EMU in 2020.

Named the 37th head football coach at Eastern Michigan University on Dec. 11, 2013, Creighton and his staff have made tremendous strides in changing the culture and mind-set surrounding the program.

During his 24-year head coaching career, the 51-year-old Creighton has accumulated eight conference titles and an all-time record of 167-96 (.635 winning percentage). He is the only coach in EMU history to lead the program to multiple bowl appearances with the 2016 Bahamas Bowl, the 2018 Camellia Bowl, and the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl. Voted a finalist for the 2016 American Football Coaches Awards' first-ever Comeback Coach of the Year, Creighton led EMU in to the program's first winning season since 1995 and its first bowl appearance since 1987.

One of eight active Football Bowl Subdivision coaches to record more than 160 wins, Creighton helped the Eagles to the program's first win in 126 seasons over a Big Ten or Power Five team with a 16-13 victory over Rutgers, Sept. 9, 2017. Nearly one year later, EMU used a 24-yard field goal as time expired for a stunning 20-19 win over Purdue, Sept. 8, 2018, for Eastern's first walk-off win in two decades. The magic continued in 2019, when Eastern posted its third-consecutive Big Ten road victory with a 34-31 walk-off triumbh at Illinois. Sept. 14.

Under Creighton's leadership, EMU is amid one of the best four-year stretches in program history. EMU is 25-26 since 2016, its most wins in a four-season span since 1986-89 when the Eagles went 6-5, 10-2, 6-3-1, and 7-3-1. Furthermore, EMU is 10-4 in the month of November the last four years. In the four seasons prior, Eastern combined for a total of seven wins during the entire 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 campaigns.

In 2019, Eastern played in a postseason bowl for the third time in the last four seasons, and for the fifth time in school history. It was also the first time in program history that EMU played in the postseason in consecutive campaigns.

There was plenty of reason to "say our name" in 2018, thanks to the play both on and off the field. After a successful regular season, Eastern aided its postseason hopes with a viral video of student-athletes lip syncing to Destiny's Child's "Say My Name" to help EMU claim its second bowl appearance in three seasons.

Eastern Michigan finished the 2018 season with a 7-6 record after a last-second field goal proved to be the difference against Georgia Southern in the Camellia Bowl. EMU closed the regular season with five straight Mid-American Conference victories for its first winning record in conference play since 1995. Furthermore, the Green and White's 22.1 points allowed per game tied for the 11th-best mark in school history in the modern era (since 1976), and the best since 1993.

One of the best football teams in recent Eastern Michigan history and arguably one of the best in the Mid-American Conference, the Eagles experienced plenty of moments of celebration as well as heartbreak in 2017.

The margin for error was razor thin for the Eagles this year as nine of EMU's 12 games were decided by seven points or less, including six of EMU's seven losses coming down to one possession, and a school-record three in overtime. All told, EMU's seven losses were by a combined 35 points.

The 2016 Eagles finished in a seven-way tie for the most improved program in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in 2016, bettering its win total from one win in 2015, to seven. Creighton led the Eagles to their first bowl appearance in 29 years. The turnaround was tied for the largest in school history, equalled only by the 1924 and 1977 teams. As an offense, EMU ranked 35th in the FBS in total offense, posting 455.2 yards per game in 13 contests. The team also shattered the school record for total offense with 5,917 yards, breaking the previous record of 5,010. Other notable offensive highlights for the Eagles included ranking 16th nationally in third down conversions, 18th in passing offense, 21st in red zone offense, and 25th in first down offense.

On defense, the Eagles saw a remarkable improvement in its first season under defensive coordinator Neal Neathery. EMU allowed 86.5 yards per game less in 2016 (432.7 per game) than it did in 2015 (519.2 per game) to rank 83rd in the country and seventh in the MAC. The team also took a huge step forward in stopping the run, as the defense gave up 149 yards per game less on the ground in 2016 than it did a year earlier. Overall, EMU was nationally ranked seventh in fumbles recovered, 32nd in turnovers gained, 58th in interceptions, and 59th in rushing defense.

Away from the field, EMU led the MAC in team grade point average for the 2015-16 academic year. It marked the second consecutive season the Eagles posted the top GPA in the league, holding a 2.90 team mark.

During the 2015 campaign, the Eagles finished the regular season ranked nationally in the top-60 in seven statistical categories to go along with 11 top-five rankings in the MAC. EMU finished the year with 39 touchdowns, a mark that is tied for the fifth-most in a single-season during the squad's history, while its 4,560 yards of total offense is also the fifth most.

In his first year in Ypsilanti, Creighton's Eagles finished the regular season ranked nationally in the top-60 in nine statistical categories to go along with six top-five rankings in the MAC standings. Nationally, EMU finished the year tied with Georgia Tech, Northwestern and Oklahoma State for most blocked kicks with six. The six rejections were the most since the 2009 season when the Green and White also blocked six kicks.

As an All-America quarterback, Creighton led Kenyon (Ohio) College to its only North Coast Athletic Conference title in 1989 and was named conference player of the year after setting single-season conference records for passing yardage (2,843) and touchdowns (29). He was inducted into the Kenyon Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

RARE FUMBLES: EMU has surrendered three fumbles in its last two contests, a trend that is rare for the Green and White. Prior to the giveaways in those games, EMU had not given the ball away on the ground in consecutive games since weeks 11 and 12 of the 2018 season, respectively.

JOLT OF JULIEN: Senior punter **Jake Julien**'s 53-yard blast against Toledo, Nov. 18, tied his season long for a single punt. The Barrie, Ontario native averaged 44.2 yards per punt over six tries on the night, totaling 265 yards. Julien was also able to pin the Rockets inside their own 20-yard line on two of his boots. Julien's 43.9 yards per punt average is second-best in the MAC and ranks 23rd nationally.

WELCOME HOME, WILLIAMS: Junior wide out **Quian Williams** had the best performance of his season against Toledo, Nov. 18. The Oklahoma City product recorded eight catches for 86 yards, which led the team. He also recorded his first score of the season when he hauled in a 12-yard touchdown reception with 7:13 left in the contest.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Quarterback **Preston Hutchinson** had plenty of options in the passing game against Toledo, Nov. 18, as a season-high seven Eagles recorded receptions, six of which brought in at-least two grabs. EMU has spread the wealth well this season in the passing game, as at least five different players have received a pass in each game this season.

COUNTING CAREER-HIGHS: A total of 10 different Eagles recorded career-highs in tackles against Toledo, Nov. 18. Senior linebacker **Terry Myrick** led the way for the Green and White with 14 stops, three better than his previous high of 11. Three players registered their first career-tackles in the game as well.

DEFENSE FORCING TURNOVERS: The EMU defense has been successful at forcing turnovers throughout the team's first three games this season. Eastern has recovered three fumbles and has two interceptions thus far, which ranks fourth and fifth in the conference, respectively. Through its first three games in 2019, EMU turned opponents over seven times.

EMU ON THE NATIONAL LEADERBOARDS: EMU has notched itself onto the national and conference leaderboards in a slew of individual and team-based categories. Senior linebacker **Terry Myrick** continues to be one of the nation's best tacklers, ranking third in the MAC and 10th in the NCAA in tackles per game (11.3), while as a team, EMU remains one of the most disciplined in the country (167 total penalty yards ranks 26th nationally).

CHIP DIP: EMU and CMU will meet on the gridiron for the 98th time in history between the two programs, with the Chippewas holding the series lead, 61-30-6. Last year, Central raced out to an early lead and never looked back as it was able to pull out the win, 42-16, in Mount Pleasant.

THE LAST TIME WE MET: Big plays proved too much for Eastern as the Chippewas tallied three touchdowns of 60-or-more yards en route to 587 yards of offense in the 42-16 decision.

Quarterback **Mike Glass III** paced the EMU offense with 206 yards of total offense, throwing for one touchdown, and running for his eighth-career rushing TD. Wide out **Mathew Sexton** contributed his second touchdown of the season, while then-junior defensive back **Alvinoski LaFleur** recorded his first-career interception.

LAST TIME CMU CAME TO TOWN: Tyler Wiegers threw a seven-yard touchdown pass to **Blake Banham** midway through the fourth quarter and the defense forced a fumble that led to a game-clinching field goal three plays later as Eastern Michigan beat Central Michigan 17-7, Nov. 3, 2018.

Wiegers directed a nine-play, 70-yard drive, completing all six passes on the drive for 66 yards. On the ensuing second down, **Jeremiah Harris** and **Ty Eddington** sacked Tony Poljan for a loss of 10 yards. On third-and-16, **Maxx Crosby** sacked Poljan and forced a fumble that Harris returned seven yards to the seven. **Chad Ryland**, then a freshman, booted a 26-yard field goal and **Vince Calhoun** picked off Austin Hergott with 2:08 to go to wrap it up.

Wiegers was 17-of-25 for 150 yards with a pick and Banham had seven catches for 99 yards. **Shaq Vann**, who put the Eagles up 7-0 with a 26-yard run on their first possession, had 117 yards on 13 carries.

Central Michigan was held to 138 yards with four turnovers. The touchdown was a 68-yard fumble return by Mike Danna.

ON THE HORIZON: EMU will finish its in-state rivalry series on the road against Western Michigan, Dec. 5. The final road game on Eastern's 2020 slate is set to kick-off from Waldo Stadium in Kalamazoo.

KEEPING GOOD COMPANY: First-year starting quarterback, junior **Preston Hutchinson** put on an impressive offensive show against Ball State, Nov. 11. Most notably, Hutchinson led the Eagles' rushing attack with a career-best 104 yards in 17 attempts. With that performance, Hutchinson became the first EMU quarterback to go for 100-or-more yards on the ground since **Mike Glass III** did so against Toledo (125 yards), Oct. 13, 2018. His three rushing touchdowns are the most by an EMU quarterback in a single game since the 2014 season, when **Reginald Bell III** ran for three scores against Buffalo in week six of that season.

CONTINUING TO FLUSH IT: For the past four seasons, Eastern Michigan's motto has been to go 1-0 each week while "flushing" the previous outcome. The short term memory has proven beneficial for the program, with 32 of the last 53 (60%) contests decided by seven points-or-less. Of those contests, eight have been decided in overtime with 19 coming down to the final play.

ANOTHER 100-YARD GAME: One week after junior **Hassan Beydoun** recorded a 112-yard receiving game at Kent State, Nov. 4, sophomore **Tanner Knue** registered a 121-yard performance of his own at Ball State, Nov. 11. The total yardage is not only the best by an EMU pass catcher this season, but is also a personal best for the Mason, Ohio native.

The 128th such performance in EMU football history, Knue's effort also gives Eastern three consecutive games with a 100-yard receiving performance. That streak, which dates back to the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl, is the best for the Green and White since the 2005 season, when **Eric Deslauriers** recorded three consecutive games of the sort between Nov. 5-19.

EVANS EATS IN DEBUT: Sophomore running back **Samson Evans** was impressive for the Green and White in his debut game against Ball State, Nov. 11. The lowa transfer got 14 carries in the game, second behind quarterback **Preston Hutchinson**, and ran for 63 total yards. That number was the best of any EMU back in the game, and is the second-best rushing total by an EMU running back this season (**Darius Boone Jr.** – 68 at Kent State, Nov. 4).

GOOD MERRITT: Freshman defensive lineman **Alex Merritt** has big shoes to fill if he hopes to be as dominant as the last Eagle to wear his newly-fashioned No. 92, **Maxx Crosby.** Although he may not be playing at the level of a fourth-round NFL draft pick just yet, he did put together an incredible game at Ball State, Nov. 11. The Queen City-product recorded six tackles (5 solo, 1 assist), one tackle for loss (10 yards), one sack, and also picked up a fumble recovery. Those numbers are all personal-bests.

RYLAND HITS FROM DEEP: Junior kicker **Chad Ryland** matched a career-best kick when he drilled a 52-yard field goal against Ball State, Nov. 11. The third 52-yarder of his career, Ryland has now hit four from 50+ in this, his third season, with the Green and White. The kick is the longest by any MAC student-athlete this season. Ryland's effort was three yards short of **Dylan Mulder**'s 55-yard make from 2015, which is EMU's longest all-time field goal make. Despite being just short of the all-time distance record, Ryland is now the only player in Eastern Michigan history with four makes from better-than 50 yards.

HOT IN NOVEMBER: If EMU is going to play two-thirds of its six-game slate in one calendar month, there may be no better span than the month of November. Eastern is 10-7 in the month of November the last five years. In the four seasons prior, Eastern combined for a total of seven wins during the entire 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 campaigns.





TWO X TWO FOR THE DEUCE: Senior tight end **Thomas Odukoya** did not disappoint in his first game donning "The Deuce," on Nov. 4. The first-year team captain put together a two reception season-opener, both of which were touchdowns, at Kent State. His reception and TD numbers were both career-bests.

HOW ABOUT HUTCHINSON: First-year starting quarterback, junior **Preston Hutchinson**, looked experienced and confident in his season-opener against Kent State, Nov. 4. He completed 21-of-35 pass attempts and amassed 241 yards through the air, which marks the best aerial performance for an EMU QB in a season-opener since **Brogan Roback** tossed for 267 yards against Charlotte in 2017. Hutchinson and Roback's respective numbers are the first and second-best in that category since the turn of the century at EMU.

HERE COMES THE BOONE: Darius Boone Jr. became the first freshman running back at EMU to rush for 65+ yards in a single game since the 2016 campaign when he went for 68 yards on nine carries against Kent State, Nov. 4. **Breck Turner**, the last player to accomplished that feat, did so in 2016's week seven matchup against Western Michigan. Turner tallied 86 yards on the ground in that performance.

HOT OUT OF HALFTIME: Defensive coordinator **Neal Neathery** continues to prove that his halftime adjustments are spot-on, as the EMU defense held an opponent scoreless in the third quarter yet again when it blanked Kent State in the third frame, Nov. 4.

The third-quarter shutout marks the 10th time in Eastern's last 28 contests that its opponent has failed to score in the first quarter out of the break. In their three third-quarter possessions, the Golden Flashes were able to muster just 29 yards of total offense and had the ball for just 2:57 of clock time.

BIG GAME BEYDOUN: Junior wideout **Hassan Beydoun** continued to expand his role within the EMU offense during Eastern's week one game at Kent State, Nov. 4. Beydoun hauled in nine receptions for 112 yards. His catch total ties a career-high. Additionally, Beydoun brought in a 35-yard reception in the fourth quarter, which also tied a career-high. His total reception yards was just one yard behind the career-best 113 he recorded in the 2019 Quick Lane Bowl.

SIGNIFICANT STRETCH OF DEFENSE: Eastern's defense was able to keep Kent State off the scoreboard for a stretch of five-consecutive possessions in its week one matchup with the Golden Flashes, Nov. 4. The effort, which saw the Eagles force three punts, an interception, and a clock run out, all between the second and third quarters, respectively, allowed EMU's offense to get back in the game.

The performance was the best for the Eastern defense since it blanked Akron for seven-straight possessions in week 10 of the 2019 season. Overall, **Neal Neathery**'s unit have stopped opposing offenses on at least five-consecutive drives 26 times in 22 different games since his arrival in 2016. EMU is 15-7 in those games, with four of the losses coming in overtime and five finishing within one score.

DIALING IN THE CALLS: For the first time in his EMU tenure, Head Coach **Chris Creighton** will be calling his own offensive plays after previously doing so at his other coaching stops. Creighton is one of 17 FBS head coaches that serves as the primary play caller for their team.

BIZZARO WORLD: For just the fourth time in program history, Eastern opened a season against the team (Kent State) it closed the previous regular season against. Prior to 2020, the last time it occurred was in 1986 when EMU opened the year at home against Western Michigan after wrapping up the 1985 campaign in Kalamazoo.

The Nov. 4 opener was also the latest kickoff to a season in program history, breaking the previous mark set by the 1899 squad when it battled the Michigan Freshman to a 5-5 tie, Oct. 30.

ONE OF A KIND: Eastern Michigan was the only Mid-American Conference team to boast a victory over a Power 5 Conference opponent in 2019. EMU walked off Illinois of the Big Ten conference with a 24-yard field goal as time expired, Sept. 14, 2019. It was the third-consecutive season that Eastern knocked off a Big Ten opponents (2017-Rutgers, 2018-Purdue).

WIN THE TURNOVER BATTLE: A common goal in Head Coach **Chris Creighton's** program, Eastern has won or tied (20-3) the turnover battle in 23 of its last 26 victories under Creighton.

NEATHERY'S SACK FACTORY: Prior to EMU Associate Head Coach/ Defensive Coordinator **Neal Neathery's** arrival in 2016, the Eagles recorded four-or-more sacks just eight times in the 10 previous seasons. Under his direction, Eastern has accomplished the feat 12 times, most recently in its 34-31 win over Illinois, Sept. 14, 2019.

TEAM THEME: Plastered along the halls of the Student-Athlete Performance Center, on team t-shirts, and on social media, the 2020 theme of EMU football is officially, "Breakthrough." The theme represents the team's mission to consistently do what is necessary to move the program into the next tier of success. According to team members, being competitive in the MAC and going to bowl games is not enough. Now, it is time for the team to have a "breakthrough," and compete at an even higher level.

2020 CAPTAINS: Eastern Michigan University's football team announced its captains for the 2020 campaign, Aug. 12. Providing leadership for the squad will be seniors **Thomas Odukoya** and **Turan Rush**. Both seniors each earned the honor for the first time. Additionally, this marks the first season under Head Coach **Chris Creighton** that each captain came to Ypsilanti by way of a transfer. Odukoya, an Almere, Netherlands native, began his career at Garden City Community College. Rush, of Charleston West Side, W. Va., started at Antelope Valley.

RECORD SETTING 2019: EMU tallied a total of 95 game, season, or career entries into the EMU record books in 2019. Then-senior defensive back **Vince Calhoun** became the all-time leader in starts at Eastern when he took the field against Kent State, Nov. 19. Former quarterback **Mike Glass III** finished first all-time in single-season completions, and former running back **Shaq Vann** etched his name as seventh all-time in career rushing yards (2,529). These are just some examples of the record book entries that EMU student-athletes accomplished in 2019.

CONSISTENT COACHING: When **Chris Creighton** stepped onto the field in Kent, Ohio, Nov. 4, to lead the Eagles against the Kent State, he officially began his seventh year at the helm of the program. Nine coaches, five head and four interim, have come-and-gone at EMU since the last time a head-man has coached seven years (**Jim Harkerma**, 1983-92) at Eastern. Harkema, who coached nine full seasons for the Green and White, resides one spot ahead of Creighton as the fourth-winningest coach in program history.

RUNNING BACK PRODUCTION: Eastern Michigan was one of just 10 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools not to have a running back on its roster with a game started. Furthermore, EMU's tailbacks open the 2020 campaign with a combined 10 career rushing attempts (**Karmi Mackey** 8, **Darius Boone Jr.** 2).

THE CREIGHTON DIFFERENCE: Head Coach **Chris Creighton** has won nearly 50 percent (25-of-53) of his games since the start of the 2016 season. In the three seasons prior to his arrival in Ypsilanti, the Eagles were victorious in just 28 percent (10-of-36) of their games.





THE NOT-SO UNDERDOGS: With EMU's win over Illinois, Sept. 14, 2019, Head Coach **Chris Creighton** picked up a third "Power Five" win in a three-year span. Creighton is one of two active MAC coaches to have multiple "Power 5" wins. He joins Ohio's Frank Solich (5).

CREIGHTON ENTERS TOP-FIVE: With six more wins in the 2019 campaign, EMU Head Coach **Chris Creighton** continued to climb the EMU all-time wins ladder. Currently the fifth-winningest coach in program history, Creighton is just 13 games away from tying **Jim Harkema** (41 wins) for fourth-best all-time at Eastern. The San Francisco native is the only coach in EMU history to take a team to three postseason bowl games.

WHERE IN THE WORLD IS CHRIS CREIGHTON?: In his head coaching career, Chris Creighton has racked up the frequent flyer miles, coaching games in seven different countries. Creighton added the Bahamas to that list in 2017 when he lead the Eagles to the Bahamas Bowl after it already consisted of the United States, Sweden, Austria, Panama, Tanzania, and Germany.

STABILITY IS THE NAME OF THE GAME: In an era when head coaches seem to change frequently, Eastern Michigan has been able to go seven seasons with the same football and men's basketball coaches. It is the longest by EMU since it also went seven years (1986-92) without a change under the leadership of football's **Jim Harkema** and men's basketball's **Ben Braun.**

Overall, EMU has the longest active streak of stability between the two program's in the Mid-American Conference.



More than 300 alumni, donors, and guests joined staff from the Eastern Michigan University Department of Athletics and campus administration to usher in a new era in EMU athletics with the grand opening of the Student-Athlete Performance Center, Aug. 27, 2019. In use by student-athletes since mid-July, the event welcomed members of the public to the new facility for the first

The first major construction project on the athletics campus since the opening of the Convocation Center in 1998, the Student Athlete Performance Center is the first phase of the athletic department's plan to build a safe and highly-effective atmosphere for its student-athletes through the continual revitalization of its facilities and athletic campus.

Breaking ground in the fall of 2018, the new sports medicine and training facilities provides a 63,000 square foot structure that houses the sports medicine, performance and equipment operations areas. Additionally, the facility has locker rooms, coaches' offices, and meeting spaces for the football team, while also including a new video board inside Rynearson Stadium. Designed to enhance the student-athlete and fan experience at Eastern Michigan, the two story building offers a wide variety of operational spaces and amenities which allow for that goal to be met.

When entering the building, students and guests first walk along a beautiful 18-foot by 16-foot Block E brick hardscape in which donors shared their EMU stories and support of the project. Through the main entrance is the Clouse Family Atrium, a 1,288 square foot welcome room that displays the championship success of Eastern Michigan athletics throughout its history. The atrium also features a floor-to-ceiling glass panel entrance to Rynearson Stadium, and a 12 foot tall replica of the Mid-American Conference championship trophy. The trophy, which boasts a large "150," across the front, showcases EMU's athletics success in the MAC, including its conference-best 150 team championships.

The east side of the main-floor houses a new equipment room, which includes offices, a full-service laundry facility, and extensive storage spaces for athletic apparel and uniforms, as well as a state of the art strength and conditioning center. Dubbed "T.J.'s Garage," in honor of EMU great and former NFL Pro-Bowler T.J. Lang, the Thomas J. Lang Strength and Conditioning Center, named after T.J.'s late father, provides 7,000-plus square foot performance center, which includes inlaid weight tracks, cardio training, plyometic training, and a nutrition center. Two roll up garage doors serve as the football team's entrance into "The Factory," at Rynearson Sta-

Next to the locker room are eight team meeting rooms which house different position groups individually. The area also includes a full-team meeting room equipped with state-of-the-art audio-video equipment, "Block E," branded seating, and a theatre design, which allows the entire team to see and hear clearly.

Down the Michael Hawks Hall on the ground floor is the Phil Incarnati Football Locker Room, a modern space with an industrial flair that includes 115 lockers and access to the Brian Clouse Players Lounge, a space that allows football student-athletes to study, and bond with

The top-floor portion of the newly constructed building is home to a sports medicine center, hydrotherapy room, recruiting lounge, and entertainment corridor, among other offices.

At nearly 5,000 square feet, the sports medicine center features rehabilitation equipment, medical examination rooms, athletic training offices, and medical storage. The space allows student-athletes across multiple sports the opportunity to be treated by an exceptional staff in first-class facilities. Attached to the sports medicine center is the hydrotherapy room. Containing three inground therapy pools, the hydrotherapy room features an underwater treadmill pool, cold plunge pool, and a hot/cold therapy pool.

Overlooking Rynearson Stadium is the recruiting lounge. The 638 square-foot lounge offers a dynamic new entertainment space which is sure to enhance recruiting and alumni experiences for years to come. Along with the lounge comes the entertainment corridor. The corridor will be able to be utilized for entertainment opportunities for invited alumni, friends and fans of Eastern Michigan.

Located on top of the building, the LED display measures 29 feet high by 53 feet wide. The entire scoreboard structure will measure 40 feet high by 60 feet wide to bring more than 2,000 square feet of visual real estate to events held at the stadium. The LED portion of the scoreboard will feature a 15HD pixel layout, the premier technology for outdoor sports used at many professional facilities. A fixed-digit scoreboard is a part of the project to provide standard game information including score, time remaining, down and distance, and more.

THE FACTORY

Toughness. Pride. Resilience. Those key words describe the EMU football program under Head Coach **Chris Creighton**. They are also terms befitting the proud residents of southeastern Michigan and their hardworking demeanor.

Inspired by this region of the state and the student-athletes' own backgrounds, the team has challenged itself to be "E Tough," committed to great effort, sacrifice and triumphing in the face of adversity. In this spirit, the team has nicknamed Rynearson Stadium "The Factory," a place where coaches and staff will go to work each day to help "E Tough" student-athletes become scholars, leaders, champions and impact men. "The Factory" will be highlighted by Division I Football's first gray FieldTurf playing surface.

Since taking over reigns of EMU Football in December 2013, Creighton has rallied the program to "close the gap" between its current status and the pursuit of its true potential. He has studied the school, its surroundings, recruiting base and the current student-athletes. The one common thread throughout has been an uncommon 'toughness' that permeates the program.

In this spirit, the program's E Tough mentality represents:

Team first
Obsessed with getting better
Unwavering in adversity
Great effort
Heart

The concept of the "EMU Gray" field was born during one of the squad's notoriously intense winter workouts in 2014. The squad was challenged to an outdoor practice on the snow-covered Rynearson Stadium field rather than the warm confines of their indoor practice facility. True to their E Tough demeanor, the team accepted the challenge. Throughout each drill of the bitter cold practice, Creighton delivered the message that EMU Football has the will to compete against "anyone, anytime and anywhere... even on a parking lot covered with broken glass." Inspired by his team's toughness and commitment that day, Creighton's idea of an "EMU Gray" field was born and soon shared with administrators.

The new look within Rynearson Stadium, and moniker, "The Factory" serves as visual and name recognition for the program's ideals. They are a constant reminder to the student-athletes that being E Tough means coming ready to roll up their sleeves and to never give in or let up.

"Our colors are green and white but our collars are blue," said Creighton. "The Factory is where our coaching staff goes to work and our players develop. It is our home and one that we will protect. When opponents come to The Factory we want to make it known that they are in for a 60-minute fight. Our goal is to make it one of the toughest places to play in the Mid-American Conference."

Southeastern Michigan has long been viewed as one of the most significant manufacturing centers in the country, and the iconic 'Automotive Capital of the World.' Despite battling difficult times in recent years, local communities' toughness and resilience has been on display, as the region is experiencing a dramatic rebirth.

EMU football student-athletes come from these communities and have brought this toughness to the team. Ypsilanti has its own proud history in the automobile and manufacturing industries. The city was the home of Apex Motors, Preston Tucker and his Preston '48, and the last Hudson automobile dealership. The nearby Willow Run manufacturing complex played a critical role in producing B-24 "Liberator" heavy bombers in the early years of World War II. It was also at this location that Rose Will Monroe, the film and poster representation of "Rosie the Riveter," actually worked as a riveter before becoming the manufacturing icon of the era.

BURDAR BLOCKS

When Head Coach Chris Creighton came onboard in 2014 he helped establish some new EMU initiatives.

- The Wrench a 51-pound pipe wrench given to Coach Creighton. It helps serve as a symbol of the team's mission to "close the gap." The tool's vices represent the gap.
- The Wall prior to running onto the field at home games EMU will break through a cinder block wall.
- Hammers of the Week the coaching staff will select hammers of the week for the big hit of the week. The selected players will have their number put on the sledge hammers used to knock down the wall.
- Eagle Walk a pregame prep rally outside the enterance of the stadium. The football team will arrive along with a special performance by the EMU marching band.



"The wrench, the field, the concrete wall, we know people will have comments, but they all have real meaning for us. It all goes back to the idea of investing, and working for something. It is about putting on those steel-toed boots, and going to work."



Second Half Surge Not Enough in Season-Opener

Eastern was led by numerous eye-popping offensive performances

KENT, Ohio (EMUEagles.com) – A second-half surge was not enough to lift the Eastern Michigan University football team over its Mid-American Conference East Division opponent, Kent State University, in the first game of both teams' shortened six-game

Schedule tonight, Nov. 4. The Golden Flashes trailed for just 4:24 of game time en route to a 27-23 win niside Dix Stadium.

Eastern (0-1; 0-1 MAC) saw tremendous individual performances on both sides of the ball as first-year starting quarterback, junior **Preston Hutchinson**, looked experienced and confident. He completed 21-of-35 pass attempts and amassed 241 yards through the air, which marks the best aerial performance for an EMU QB in a season-opener since Brogan Roback tossed for 267 yards against Charlotte in 2017. Helping the gunslinger was junior wideout **Hassan Beydoun**, who halled in nine receptions, for 112 yards. His catch total ties a career-high. Senior tight end **Thomas Odukoya** also made a significant impact, setting new career-bests in receptions (2) and touchdowns (2). In the run game, freshman **Darius Boone** became the first freshman running back to rush for 65+ yards in a single game since Breck Turner (86) did it against Western Michigan in week seven of the 2016 campaign. Boone finished with 68 yards on nine carries.

Defensively, the senior duo of linebacker Terry Myrick and Alvinoski LaFleur led the Eastern effort with 10 tackles, and an

interception, respectively. Myrick's double-digit tackling performance is the fourth of his career.

Kent State (1-0; 1-0 MAC) began the game with an efficient drive, quickly moving the ball into EMU territory after just three snaps. EMU recovered to force an early fourth down attempt at its own 26-yard line, although KSU was able to convert on a play-action fade to score the game's first touchdown and take an early lead, 7-0.

Junior returner Quian Williams brought high energy on the ensuing special teams play as he returned the kickoff 29 yards to the 50-yard line, setting up the EMU offense. **Chris Creighton** showed confidence in his new quarterback as he dropped back to complete his first pass attempt of the season to Beydoun, an eight-yard reception. Hutchinson tried for a long pass on the next play as he nearly found an open **Tanner Knue** deep in Kent State territory. Two plays later, it was EMU that went for a fourth-time conversion of its own, but it was unable to convert. Kent State eventually turned its good field position into a one-yard rushing TD

to go up, 13-0, with 7:45 on the clock.

The EMU offense was able to convert in its next possession. Boone picked up the first chain-mover of the season for Eastern via a 13 yard pickup through the air. The passing game continued to impress on the next snap as Beydoun hauled in a 19-yard completion to get the Eagles to the Kent State 25-yard line. Beydoun followed up with 17 more yards two plays later to get the Eagles to the Kent 10. Although the Eagles were unable to record a touchdown, Junior kicker **Chad Ryland** was able to nail a 34-yard field goal attempt to get Eastern on the board, 13-3.

The EMU field goal helped energize the Eagles' defense, who forced a quick three-and-out by the Golden Flashes in the next series. Hutchinson and Co. again moved efficiently in their third possession. Boone got in on the action with the best run of the night, a 34-yard pickup that got EMU inside the red zone. Two more runs by Boone added 14 more yards to his night and gave EMU a first down at the KSU five-yard line. From there, it was Odukoya who took control as he hauled in a five-yard pass to score

KMUs first touchdown of the season and bring the Eagles within four, 13-9.

Kent State grabbed the momentum in the early portion of the second quarter as it capped off a sk-play, 73-yard drive just 90 seconds into the start of the period to give itself a 20-9 advantage. Although Eastern showed steady offense in its next possession, its chance to score was cut short when KSU's Dean Clark corralled a one-handed interception on a ball thrown by Hutchinson.

With confidence and the ball, Kent again marched into Eastern territory. Undeterred, the EMU defense rose up, registering an interception and 43-yard return of its own when LaFleur collected his second-career pick with 6:46 remaining in the half. With the ball back in hand, the Eastern offense was able to move it to the Kent 34-yard line before Ryland missed a 52-yard field goal.

Defensively, Eastern was able to end the half on a high note, keeping Kent off the board and keeping its lead at just 11, 20-9.

Myrick paced EMU with seven tackles heading into the break.

A near-perfect attack saw Hutchinson engineer a 10-play, 69-yard set that concluded with a one-yard QB keeper, a score that brought EMU within five, 20-15.

The two squads punted during the next three possessions, respectively, before EMU's offense struck again, this time at the front-end of the fourth quarter. The Eagles needed just five plays to move the ball 55 yards for a score. Yet another reception by Beydoun, this time for 35-yards, which tied a career-best, put the Eagles in prime position. Just three plays later, Hutchinson found his top-tier tight end, Odukoya, in the end zone again. The three-yard touchdown pass was the second for the duo on the night, and gave Eastern its first lead of the game, 21-20. EMU added a successful two-point conversion to extend its lead to a field goal

Although it appeared to have the momentum, Kent State continued to fight throughout the fourth quarter until it eventually took the lead, 27-23, with 7:31 left. Although EMU got the ball back with time remaining, the Golden Flashes all-but sealed the deal when it picked off Hutchinson for the second time of the night. From there, Kent State was able to run out the clock and record the

EMU saw career-best offensive performances from numerous players

MUNCIE, Ind. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team fought back to erase a seven-point deficit with just over four minutes on the clock, but ultimately fell short, 38-31, in its Mid-American Conference matchup with Ball State University tonight, Nov. 11, at Scheumann Stadium.

Down eight, 31-24, with 5.02 remaining in the game, junior quarterback Preston Hutchinson engineered a three-play, 75-yard scoring drive

which culminated with a one-yard touchdown run by the first-year signal caller. The best play of the series came from sophomore wide out Tanner Knue, who hauled in a career-best 71-yard reception on the second play of the 50-second set to put the Eagles in great position to score. As it did all night, Ball State (1-1;1-1 MAC) responded in the next possession. The Cardinals, who scored in four of their final five possessions in the game, were able to eat the clock and score the go-ahead touchdown with just six seconds left in the game, ending any chance of an EMU

Despite the loss, Eastern (0-2; 0-2 MAC) put together an incredible offensive performance, filled with both impressive team and individual stats. As a team, the Eagles racked up 477 yards of offense, its best single-game total since recording 509 in its 2019 regular season finale against

Individually, Hutchinson shined bright. He finished the night with 250 yards through the air (17-of-29) and one touchdown, while rushing for a team-best 104 yards on 17 attempts, and three scores. His 17 pass compelions is the second-best mark of his career, while his rushing attempts, yards, and touchdowns, are all career-bests. Additionally, he is the first EMU quarterback to run for better than 100 yards since hike Glass III to trotted for 125 against Toledo, Oct. 13, 2018. Defensively, senior Terry Myrick led the way for the second straight week as he recorded another 10-tackle game for the Green and White. Elsewhere, freshman Alex Merritt recorded his first-career fumble recovery and sack.

The Eastern defense was strong right out of the gates, forcing a punt on the first drive of the game for the first time on the young season. If the defense started hot, than the offense was burning, as Hutchinson took over and led a nearly-perfect opening drive for the Green and White. The best play of the series featured a 37-yard crossing-route completion to Cannon, the longest reception of his career and second of four passes that he corralled in the quarter. That set up Evans, who carried the ball 13 yards to the Ball State one-yard line stream was in the lineup for the first time this season after missing EMUS Week One game at Kent State, Nov. 4. From there, Hutchinson took matters into his own hands, scoring his second rushing touchdown of the season. Junior kicker Chad Ryland added the extra point to give EMU a 7-0 lead with 8:59 on the clock.

Ball State answered quickly on its next possession, needing just 2:54 to score seven points of its own and tie the game, 7-7. The MAC West Division rivals traded punts to begin the second half as both defenses appeared to sure up some insecurities. Eastern struck first, however, on its second possession. Although the Eagles were able to move the ball just 28 yards on six plays, it was enough to give Ryland a field goal attempt from 52 yards. With the snap and hold down, the Lebanon, Pa. native blasted it through the uprights, matching his career-long and extending EMUS lead to 11, 24-13. The kick was Ryland's fourth-career make from 50+ yards.

Football Falls to Toledo in Home-Opener, 45-28

Terry Myrick led the Eagles with a career-high 14 tackles; Tanner Knue scored first TD

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University football team was unable to overcome an early deficit as it opened its 2020 home campaign with a Mid-American Conference setback, 45-28, to its West Division rival, the University of Toledo, at "The Factory," inside Rynearson Stadium, Nov. 18. Eastern (0-3, 0-3 MAC) outscored Toledo (2-1, 2-1 MAC) in the fourth quarter, but was unable to pull within striking distance before time ran out. Junior quarterback Preston Hutchinson found senior tight end Bryson Cannon for an eight-yard touchdown reception with 12 seconds left. The score capped off a drive

Offensively, Hutchinson paced the Eagles as he completed 25-of-38 pass attempts for 244 yards and four touchdowns. Junior receiver **Quian Williams** recorded a team-high eight receptions for 86 yards with touchdown grab, while classmate **Hassan Beydoun** tallied eight receptions for 64 yards.

On the defensive side, 10 Eagles posted career-highs in tackles. Senior linebacker **Terry Myrick** led the way with 14 stops. Junior **Tariq Speights** followed with 11, while junior **Korey Hernandez** and freshman **Mark Lee Jr.** each notched seven tackles, respectively.

Senior Jake Julien led the punting game for the Eagles with six boots for 256 yards. He averaged 44.2 yards per punt with a long of 53 yards, which tied his season long. Additionally, he placed two punts inside the 20-yard line.

The ÉMU defense was strong right out of the locker room, forcing a punt on the first drive of the game for the second time this season. However, the offense couldn't convert as the Green and White went three-and-out on their first drive of the game. On the Rockets' next drive, Myrick came up big with a strip-sack to force a fumble at the EMU 14-yard line to give the Eagles' offense a chance to strike.

After a booming punt from Julien, Toledo answered on its next possession, needing just 1:23 to score seven points of its own and take a 7-0 lead. The score came as UT quarterback Eli Peters connected with Devin Maddox for a 25-yard touchdown completion, while kicker Evan Davis added the extra point to close out the first guarter.

Down, 14-0, early in the second quarter, the Eagles took advantage of a muffed punt, scoring off of the turnover as Hutchinson found teammate sophomore **Tanner Knue** in the back of the endzone for a 17-yard completion with 10:43 left in the frame. The touchdown was the first for Knue in his career, and came just one day after receiving a full-ride scholarship. Junior **Chad Ryland** converted on the extra-point attempt to make it a one-score game, 14-7.

Although EMU's next drive ended with a fumble, the defensive players were able to rally with conviction, as senior defensive lineman **Turan Rush** picked up a huge sack to force a Toledo field-goal attempt, which ultimately missed. Despite the momentum, Toledo was able to take a 24-7 lead into the break.

Eastern Michigan's offense moved the ball well throughout parts of the third quarter, the Rocket defense was able to force two consecutive possessions out of the halftime intermission. Toledo took advantage of those stops, finding the back of the end zone in its first two drives of the third stanza, making the score 38-7, with 5:48 left in the quarter. The Eagles, who showed consistent resiliency, worked their way down the field just moments later for what was ultimately a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive. Freshman running back DJ Smith capped the scoring series with his first-career touchdown, a nine-yard reception. EMU attempted the two-point conversion, but couldn't capitalize, and went to the fourth down, 38-13.

The Eastern offense continued to fight in the fourth quarter, as it rattled off a five-play, 77-yard scoring drive over two minutes as Williams pulled in a 12-yard touchdown pass with 7:13 remaining. Hutchinson found Knue for the two-point conversion to cut Toledo's lead to 45-21. The Eagles' defense forced a Toledo punt on the next possession, and the offense marched back down the field over the next five minutes to score an eight-yard touchdown with 12 ticks remaining. The late score was Cannon's first of the season. Ryland's extra point attempt was good, and brought the score to 45-28, where it would ultimately finish.
