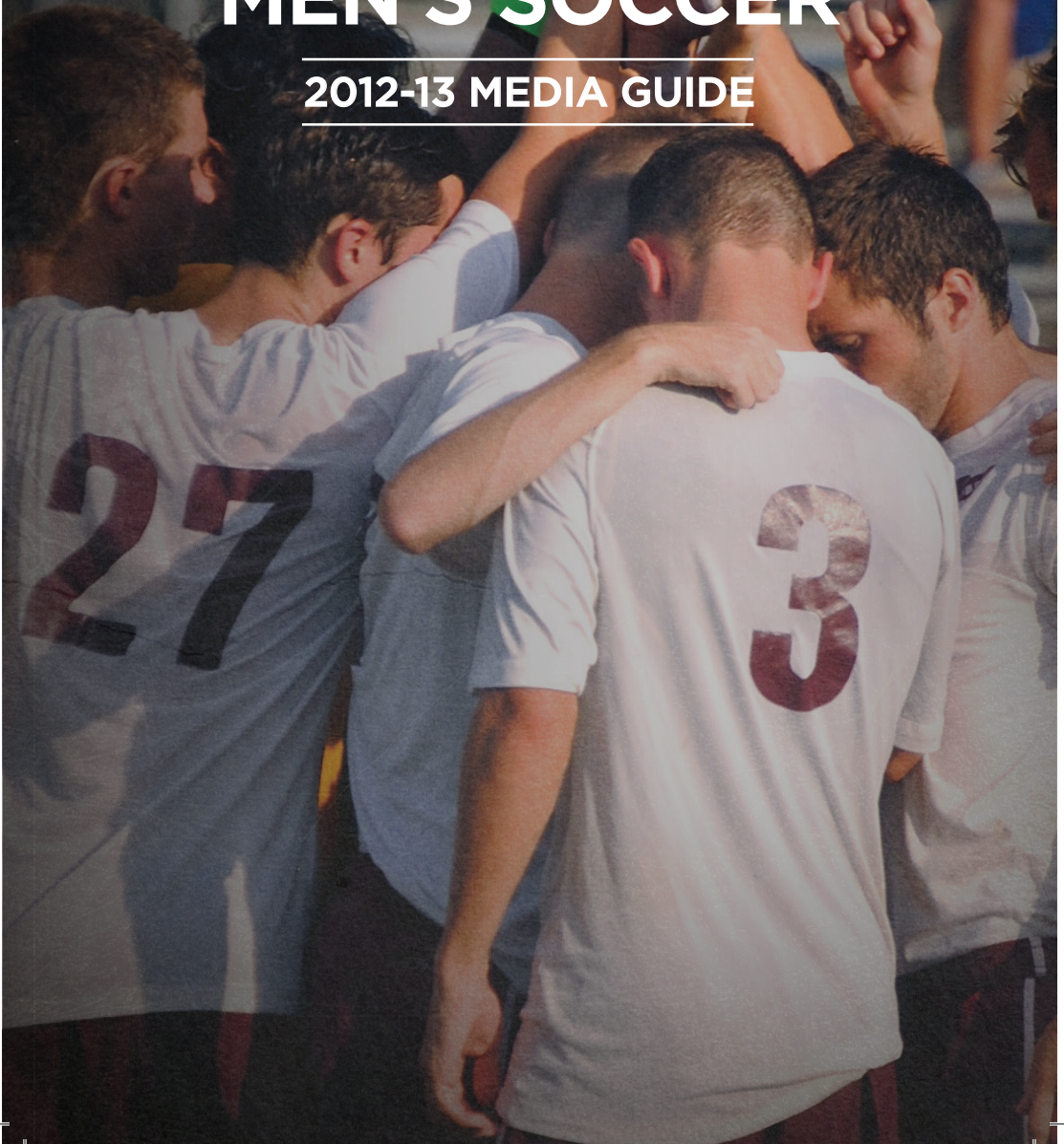

Huggins Field

Huggins Field, celebrating its forty-fourth season of use by the Flying Fleet, is among the finest playing facilities in the southeast. The field has Tifton Bermuda grass playing surface and is located directly behind the Galloway Activities Center. With a length (120 yards) and width (77 yards) that enables the full strategy and skills of soccer

to be employed, Huggins Field is also available for night play. In the past, Erskine has hosted the USYSA ODP region camp for boys and for three years was the site for the NAIA National Woman's Soccer Championship in 1987, 89 and 90.

ERSKINE MEN'S SOCCER

The Tradition

Boasting one of the oldest intercollegiate programs in the southeastern United States, Erskine initiated varsity soccer in 1966 and in three short years had built her program into a national power with a 12-2-0 record, including a 5-0 win over Clemson University. Forty-Four years of tradition have produced 13 NAIA District 6 Championships, 7 area crowns and consecutive NAIA playoff appearances.

Twenty players have earned All-American honors, six of them twice, four of them three times, and two, Veron Skinner and Garth Pollonais, four times. Numerous Erskine Stars have gone on to excel at the professional level, with goalkeeper Van Taylor, midfielder Mike Ortiz-Velez, and defender Veron Skinner and forward Brian Haynes leading the way.

Haynes was the first player selected in the 1989 AISA draft and went on to earn AISA 'Rookie of the Year' honors for the Atlanta Attack – where he now serves as head coach. Pollonais was a 1990 first round pick of the Atlanta Attack as well and was also drafted by the Wichita Wings of the Major Soccer League. Taylor, an exceptional goalkeeper in the NASL, ASI, and MISL for eleven years, and Ortiz-Velez, a five year pro who appeared in the 1980 Soccer Bowl, where he won MVP honors, were also both first round draft choices. Skinner, a free agent, was a three year

veteran of the MISL's Baltimore Blast and was also a member of the Maryland Bays of the American Soccer League. Former Coach Rick Wright and Charlie Shinn were both second round picks in the NASL. Erskine's Charlie McGinty, with 106 goals, at one time was third all time leading scorer in collegiate soccer history, and Pollonais won the NAIA scoring title with 34 goals in 1989.

Erskine has won a reputation as a 'cradle of soccer coaches' producing such collegiate coaches as Van Taylor of Lander University; Rich Wright, Greg Stone, Todd McCormick of Anderson University; Ralph Polson of Presbyterian College, College of Charleston and currently Head Coach of Wofford College, Billy Lesesne of Erskine College and currently Associate Head Coach of Duke University's Women's Soccer Program; Mike Riley of Hampton-Sidney and Elon University; Garth Pollonais of Erskine College, Greenville Lions of the USL and currently Director of Coaching for the Clearwater Chargers USSF Development Academy program; Brian Haynes has advanced in youth coaching in Texas as director of Hibernian Soccer Club, currently the First Team Manager of the Atlanta Silverbacks of the NASL; and Edward Joyce, of Presbyterian College and currently the first Assistant at Georgia State University in Atlanta, Georgia.

2012 SEASON OUTLOOK

When senior midfielder Jack Kimber (Manchester, England, Priestnall High School) arrived at Erskine, the Flying Fleet had just finished the previous season at 7-10-1 and tied for 8th in the conference standings at 3-6-1. Four years later the 3-time all-conference honoree and team captain looks to end his stellar career with the Fleet's first conference championship in over 10 years. Erskine is coming off back-to-back winning seasons and was voted to finish fourth in the recently release Conference Carolinas' Coaches Poll.

Erskine returns a strong core of starters from last year's squad. Upfront the Fleet return both strikers in sophomores Luke Boyce (Lincoln, England) and Andrew Settlemire (Beaufort, SC, Beaufort High School). Settlemire led the Fleet last season in goals (9) and was second in assists (3). Boyce contributed four goals while leading the team in assists (4) both of which will give Kimber plenty of options. Sophomore Micah Burklin (Rock Hill, SC, Rock Hill High School), whose freshman campaign was cut short due to a knee injury, will also see significant time upfront as well senior Jay Lang (Myrtle Beach, SC, Myrtle Beach Christian).

Junior goalkeeper Roberto De La Vina (Oviedo, Spain, San Ignacio) anchors an improving defense that returns three starters on the backline, including two-time all-conference honoree Jonathan Rutter (Birmingham, England, Fairfax). Junior P.C. Henry (Myrtle Beach, SC, Myrtle Beach Christian) provides a big physical presence inside while sophomore Daniel (Lexington, SC, Lexington High School) looks to improve on a successful freshman campaign and may see time at left midfielder as well.

For the Fleet to achieve a conference title, Coach Turner will need several new players to make an immediate impact, especially at midfield. There are high expectations for freshman Ross Henderson as he joins Kimber at center midfield. Strong play from the English freshman will open up offensive possibilities as teams will not be able to solely focus on Kimber. Transfer Jonathan Clark and freshman Dimitri Minick are excellent defenders and will push the three returning veterans while providing depth and versatility.
