## In Memoriam Pete Nevins



Pete Nevins, the Sports Information Director at East Stroudsburg University for 33 years, from 1969 until 2002, passed away on January 7, 2007 following a short battle with cancer.

He was the beloved husband of Gail Nevins, with whom he celebrated 45 years of marriage on December 23, 2006.

Nevins was a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Hall of Fame and received the Warren Berg Award as the nation's outstanding college division SID. He served two terms on the CoSIDA Board of Directors, 1974-75 and 1978-80.

He also won the ECAC-SIDA's top honor, the Irving T. Marsh Award. In the summer of 2006, he was presented with the Bob Kenworthy Good Person Award at the annual ECAC-SIDA Convention. The award is presented to a person who through their actions shows an exceptional amount of respect for the profession, their fellow SID's, the media and the community.

Nevins served as president of ECAC-SIDA in 1976-77 and was a member of the NCAA Public Relations Committee for seven years.

Several awards have been either created or renamed in Nevins' memory. The Pete Nevins Award for Distinguished Achievement was created by ECAC-SIDA, while the PSAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year awards and the Lehigh Valley Small College Player of the Year awards were also renamed in his honor.

Nevins taught a graduate course in Public Relations in Sport Management at ESU. He wrote the sports section for the book, "Pride and Promise, a Centennial History of East Stroudsburg University."

The New York City native received a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from the University of Miami in 1960 and a master's degree in Health and Physical Education from East Stroudsburg in 1984.

He spent seven and a half years as a sportswriter at the Bridgeport, Ct. Post-Telegram and served as the SID at the University of Bridgeport from 1963-69.

## Dr. Robert J. Dillman President



Dr. Robert J. Dillman is in his 12th year as president of East Stroudsburg University. He became the 12th president of the university in July of 1996 and has initiated ambitious enhancements

that will chart the institution's success into the future.

Dr. Dillman has taken an active role in athletics and serves as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. Under the president's direction, night games will be possible for the first time as lights were installed at Eiler-Martin Stadium last spring. The track has also been resurfaced and expanded to eight lanes.

Other construction includes a new admissions center in the Reibman Administration Building and University Ridge, an apartment housing complex for students. Last May, ground-breaking took place for the new science and technology building.

Dr. Dillman has been instrumental in the initiation and expansion of the university's Business Accelerator, which offers real work business experience for students and affordable start-up capabilities for viable new businesses.

While in college, Dillman competed in four sports — soccer, baseball, basketball and track & field — at SUNY New Paltz.

Dr. Dillman came to ESU from Fairmont (W.V.) State where he was president for eight years. He earned a master's degree at Penn State University and a Ph.D from Clark University, both in geography.

## Dr. Tom Gioglio Athletic Director



Dr. Tom Gioglio is in his fourth year as the Director of Athletics at East Stroudsburg University. As the Director of Athletics & Athletic Department Chairperson, he

is responsible for providing leadership of an athletic department which sponsors 21 teams with over 500 participating student-athletes and a staff of over 50.

Athletic facility renovations under Gioglio include the lighting, outdoor track and concession area at Eiler-Martin Stadium and the dugouts at Mitterling Field. There has also been a significant increase in revenue raised to enhance the athletic scholarship budget through fundraising initiatives sponsored through the Warrior Athletic Club.

In 2006-07, ESU placed seventh in the standings for the Dixon Trophy, its highest finish since placing fourth in the inaugural standings in 1995-96.

A native of nearby Morristown, N.J., Gioglio previously served as Director of Athletics at Dakota State University and the University of Saint Mary in Kansas.

Gioglio earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Montclair State University and his first master's degree in education at Mansfield University, and his second at Northern State in Aberdeen, S.D. He also holds a doctorate degree from West Virginia University

Gioglio and his wife Melissa are the proud parents of two daughters, Kalista and Kinley.

Snyder earned her B.A. from Springfield in Physical Education and Ph.D. in Athletic Administration from the University of Southern California.

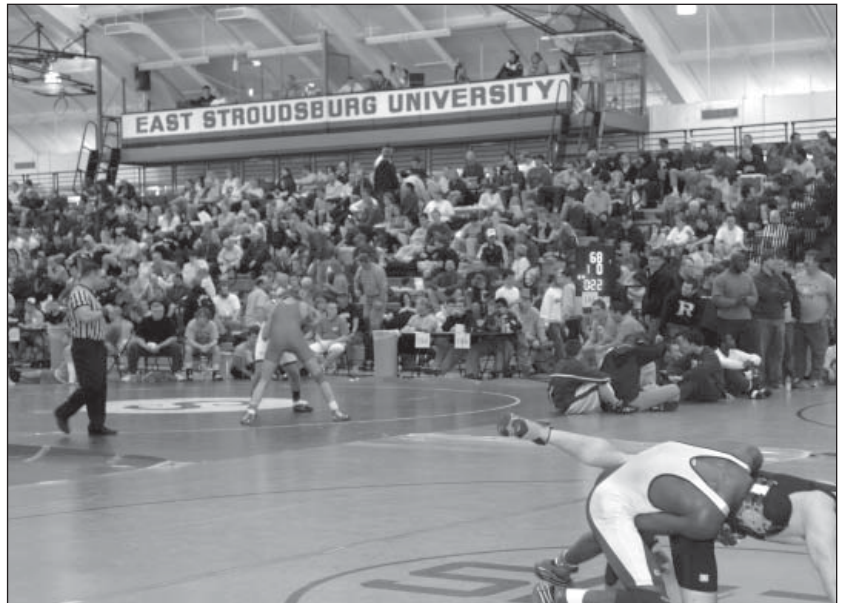

## Koehler Fieldhouse



**Koehler Fieldhouse** opened its doors in 1967 and is the home for East Stroudsburg University's wrestling, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's volleyball, women's volleyball and indoor track & field teams. The fieldhouse has a seating capacity of 2,500 with new bleachers and indoor track surfaced installed in the last seven years. A new playing surface was installed in the summer of 2003. The press box, located above the bleachers, offers a great view of the court and has seating for more than 15 people. Separate booths are provided for radio stations.

## Student-Athlete Center for Excellence

In 1998, ESU established a Student-Athlete Center for Excellence on campus. The center includes experts in exercise physiology, nutrition, academic counseling, psychological counseling and sport studies.

Nancy Jo Greenawalt serves as the Academic Coordinator for Athletics. Her main responsibility is to organize an academic support structure for nearly 500 Warriors student-athletes. Greenawalt has 23 years of experience in higher education, including 14

years at Albright College and nine at ESU. During her time at Albright, she worked as the Associate Athletic Director for Women and Physical Education Department Chairperson. She has also served on numerous NCAA, national and regional committees.

A 1978 graduate of Albright College, Greenawalt was inducted into the Albright Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 for her achievements earned as a five-sport student-athlete and head coach for volleyball, badminton and tennis. She earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from Albright and her master's degree in physical education from Penn State University.

# HEAD COACH JOEY RIVERA

Joey Rivera enters his first season as the interim head wrestling coach at East Stroudsburg University after spending the 2006-07 season as an assistant coach under Joey Rivera.

"We are excited that Joey has accepted the head coaching position on an interim basis," Director of Athletics Tom Gioglio said. "He brings great credentials to the wrestling room and has an outstanding knowledge of the sport."

"His firsthand knowledge Warriors wrestling will allow us to keep continuity in the program, and he will have the opportunity to build on the positive foundation that has been established," Gioglio explained.

Rivera has also demonstrated his ability as a recruiter, helping Kutz bring in a talented class for the 2007-08 season.

"I am extremely excited about the opportunity that I have been blessed with both for myself and the athletes," Rivera said. "I have always envisioned becoming a head coach, and to be able to do so at the university that I grew up around is an ideal situation for me. I also believe that having a familiar face to work with will provide stability for the student-athletes during this time of transition."

Rivera was an NCAA qualifier at



Boston University following a standout career at Stroudsburg High School. He was the team's outstanding freshman and outstanding wrestler while at Boston, and was team captain as a senior. He qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2004 and finished his career with a record of 86-30.

Rivera earned his degree in Psychology from Boston in 2005 and was a recipient of the Colonial Athletic Association Commissioner's Academic Award.

At Stroudsburg High School, Rivera was a four-time state qualifier and

set the school record with 137 career wins. He finished fifth in the state as a freshman and sophomore, eighth as a junior and fourth as a senior. He was also a two-time regional champion.

As a freestyle wrestler, Rivera placed eighth in the 60kg weight class at the U.S. National Freestyle Tournament last spring. It was the first freestyle tournament in which he had competed.

Rivera and his wife, Leah, were married in October and reside in Stroudsburg.



# GRADUATE ASSISTANT CHARLIE BRENNEMAN



Charlie Brenneman has joined the East Stroudsburg University wrestling staff as a graduate assistant for the 2007-08 season.

Brenneman is a 2004 graduate of Lock Haven University, where he went 35-11 at 174 pounds as a senior and reached the round of 12 at the NCAA Division I championships. He was named to the Academic All-America team and graduated with a 3.985 grade-point average, the highest in the nation among those who received Academic All-America recognition.

A 2000 graduate of Hollidaysburg Area High School, Brenneman finished his scholastic career with a record of 116-13 and was a two-time state runner up in Pennsylvania.

Brenneman has received national exposure in two arenas since graduating from Lock Haven. He was a winner on the reality television show

"Pros vs. Joes" in which he competed with his brother Ben, an ESU alum. In the series finale, he wrestled former Atlanta Braves relief pitcher John Rocker off the mound to win his competition.

Brenneman is also competing in Mixed Martial Arts and is currently undefeated through his first nine bouts, five as an amateur and four as a professional.

Brenneman will assist interim head coach Joey Rivera with the upper weights, as well as handle assigned recruiting and administrative responsibilities.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

The East Stroudsburg University wrestling program enters the 2007-08 season under interim head coach **Joey Rivera** looking to improve on a 2-11 dual record, its first season below .500 since 2001-02.

The Warriors also have a handful of wrestlers who are expected to compete for the program's first bid to the NCAA tournament since since Jeremy Sluyter in 2000.

The season will start with the 41st Annual ESU Open on Saturday, Nov. 17 at Koehler Fieldhouse. More than 500 wrestlers are expected to participate in one of the nation's oldest Division I wrestling opens.

ESU will also wrestle duals against EIWA opponents Army, Princeton, Rutgers, Navy, Franklin & Marshall and Bucknell before traveling

to Franklin & Marshall for the 104th EIWA Championships on March 8-9.

The EIWA will send 47 qualifiers to the NCAA Tournament, which will be held this year at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

Rivera expects several Warriors to be in contention for a trip to the NCAA's, including seniors **Sean Carr** (141), **Scott Heckman** (149) and **Dave Williams** (184), redshirt junior **Matt Swallow** (133), redshirt sophomore **Shane Mallory** (174) and sophomore newcomer **Chris Birchler** (285).

Heckman was the PSAC champion at 149 pounds last year, the first for the program since Stanley Foster (285) in 2005 and only the fourth in the last 16 years.

He was one match away from qualifying for the NCAA's at the EIWA Championships, which were hosted by ESU for the first time in school history. He has been sidelined by injuries but may be able to compete for a spot at nationals in March.

Carr went 16-12 last year in his first year in the program after transferring from Maryland. Carr hails from Whitehall, Pa. and is one of the team's co-captains this season.

Williams was 13-12 overall and tied for the team lead with an 8-5 record in duals. Known for his unorthodox wrestling style, Williams is always looking for the fall and should be a darkhorse at the EIWA's.

Swallow was also selected as a co-captain and will competitive every

time he takes the mat at 133. He enters the season with a career mark of 20-27 and continues to improve.

Mallory had a solid redshirt freshman year competing between 174 and 184 pounds. He was 7-9 at his natural weight of 174 pounds and had an 8-5 dual record, tied with Williams for the top mark on the team.

Rivera has high expectations for Birchler, who is in his first season after transferring from Caldwell College (N.J.) and has an opportunity to place at both the PSAC and EIWA Championships.

The rest of the lineup will be filled out by redshirt sophomore **Matthew Benedetti** or junior **Stephen Gambino** at 125, redshirt junior **Alex Bimes** at 149 and redshirt sophomore **Kyle Heselpoth** at 157.

Redshirt junior **Leif Ruschmeyer** was 3-7 in duals at 165 pounds last year and may be pushed by redshirt junior **Joe Schick** for the starting spot.

The 197 pound spot is vacant to start the season but may be filled by freshman **Jake Martin** at the start of the second semester.

Among the incoming freshmen, high school teammates **Andrew Arnold** and **Adam Hluschak** from Northern Lehigh are expected to form the foundation for the next generation of ESU wrestling. Arnold was the 2007 PIAA champion at 125 pounds and Hluschak was a four-time state placewinner and is the brother of Drexel All-American Ryan Hluschak.

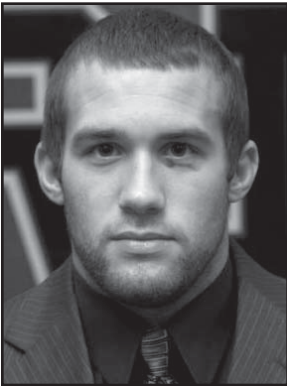
## Important NCAA Compliance Notice to Our Fans and Booster Club Members

One of the important foundations of the East Stroudsburg University athletic program is the devoted and passionate Warrior fans who support our teams. ESU athletics sincerely appreciates your interest, which stimulates and encourages our student athletes and energizes our university. We must be cautious, however, not to let enthusiasm for athletics lead us to conflict with the very specific rules and regulations of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) or the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).

By NCAA definition an "athletic representative" is any individual who has membership in East Stroudsburg University booster club, and/or who has made contributions to the booster club or the athletic department, and/or who is involved in any way in promoting the athletic program. An athletic representative is prohibited from providing student athletes with any "extra benefits." Examples of extra benefits include the provision of cash or loans, transportation, meals, clothes, housing, entertainment, gifts, and any other benefit offered to a student athlete.

As a member of the NCAA, East Stroudsburg University is responsible for institutionally controlling its athletic program. We are committed to developing competitive teams with goals that are consistent with the mission of ESU while maintaining the kind of responsible program in which we all take pride. Under this principle, the university is held accountable for the actions of all athletic representatives.
