Game Summary

Eastern defeated CSU Bakersfield, 67-58, on Wednesday night, snapping a four-game losing streak. EWU improves to 2-5 this season and CSU Bakersfield falls to 0-6. Peyton Howard delivered another 20-point game, scoring 21 on 7-of-18(38.9%) shooting and 3-of-9(33.3%) from three-point range. Kourtney Grossman set a new career-high with 12 points off the bench and Ellie Boni added 11.

During a high-scoring, closely fought first quarter, EWU took the lead. With the Eagles up four, the Roadrunners scored five-straight to get back on top. Eastern ended the back-and-forth opening period leading 22-21.

In the second quarter, both teams struggled to find the basket. Leading 26-24, EWU separated from the Roadrunners with a 10-2 run. EWU led 36-26 at halftime.

Eastern managed to outscore the Roadrunners by one in the third and maintained their double digit lead, 54-43.

Despite being out-scored in the fourth, Eastern held the lead and won the game, 67-58.

EWU shot 28.2 percent for the game, but was 78.3 percent from the free throw line (18-of-23). The Roadrunners shot 35.8 percent for the game.

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EAG NOTES

Defending Champs

Eastern Washington won the Big Sky regular season and conference tournament title last season. The Big Sky Tournament win was the first for the program since joining the conference. The program was a member of the Mountain West in 1987. Head coach Joddie Gleason won Big Sky Coach of the Year in her third season leading the team. Eastern advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history and first since '87. The Eagles were the No. 14 seed and faced the No. 3 seed, Oregon State, in the first round of the tournament. The Beavers defeated Eastern, 73-51, in the opening round game.

New Look Eagles

Eastern will look to replace its entire starting five players from last season and the team had nine players depart overall from the 2023-24 roster. Eight players return to team, while adding eight newcomers to the lineup for the upcoming season. Gleason rebuilt the team's roster with three transfers and eight true freshman.

Aggression is her Name

Peyton Howard is fitting in well already for the Eagles, leading the team with 16.1 points per game. She is shooting 48.2 percent from the floor and 42.1 percent from three. Howard holds 2nd in the Big Sky in scoring, while ranking 3rd and field goal and 3-point percentage. She also leads the team with 25 assists and 13 steals. She has 3, 20-point games this season.

Early Success on the Boards

Early in the season, EWU's rebounding is showing up as a clear strength, averaging 41.4 per game to rank 3rd in the Big Sky. The Eagles have a plus-6.0 rebounding margin - 3rd in the conference - averaging 28.1 defensive boards per game. True freshman Jaecy Eggers leads the team and is 16th in the conference with 5.3 rebounds per game. Against CSU Bakersfield, Eastern tallied 53 rebounds, the 2nd game this season the team has surpassed 50 rebounds in a game.

Junior Sharp Shooter

In her third season with the Eagles, Ella Gallatin is embracing her starting role. Gallatin is tied for 2nd on the team with

8.4 points per game, while shooting 36.5 percent overall through 7 games. She is shooting 30.4 percent from three point range. Gallatin is also second on the team with 4.9 rebounds per game.

Good from Range

From behind the arc, Eastern is slinging the ball, leading the Big Sky with a 34.9 percentage. They have made 49 threes on 141 attempts. Peyton Howard leads the Eagles with 16 made threes on 38 attempts.

The Spark off the Bench

Senior guard Alexis Pettis has been the steady presence for head coach Joddie Gleason in her tenure. In her three seasons, Pettis has played in 98 games, making 2 starts, averaging 15.5 minutes per game and 5.4 points per game. This season, Pettis is averaging 8.4 points per game - tied for 2nd on the team - in 21.9 minutes played this season, while shooting 39.3% from the floor.

Back to the Line

Eastern had a season-high 23 free throw attempts against CSU Bakersfield, making 18 for a 78.3%, also a season-best. It was only the second game this season the Eagles had ore free throw attempts than their opponent. Eastern is shooting 64.9% from the free throw line this season, but has a 76.7% over the last two games.

Block Party

EWU recorded a season-best 7 blocks against the Roadrunners. Peyton Howard and Jaecy Eggers each had 2 blocks in the game. Eggers leads the Eagles with 5 blocks this season, averaging 0.7 per game tying for 12th in the Big Sky.

Carrying over the Coach of the Year

Following up a record-breaking coaching performance, head coach Joddie Gleason was named to the preseason Coach of the Year watch list by Her Hoop Stats. The award honors a head coach from one the 26 conferences categorized as "mid-major". In January of 2025, the list will be trimmed down to 10 and down to five in March. The winner will be announced around the 2025 Final Four.

Gleason became only the second Eagle

coach to win Big Sky Coach of the Year, joining Wendy Schuller in 2010. She has drastically improved the program in three years, posting a 10+ win improvement between the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons - 9 to 19 wins - matching a program record for win improvement. She matched the mark last season, going from 19 to 29 wins.

Back to the Underdog Role

Eastern was slated to finish 7th in the preseason media poll and 8th in coaches'. Northern Arizona grabbed the top spot in both polls with 7-of-10 first place votes in the coaches' and 16-of-25 in the media. EWU won the Big Sky title last season with a 16-2 mark, with the 'Jacks finishing 2nd at 15-3.

First Time Starters All Around

The Eagles starting lineup against Washington State featured five players earning their first career start for Eastern. Bella Hays got her first start in her 29th game in Cheney, while Ella Gallatin earned her first start in her 42nd career game. Ellie Boni notched her first start in game No. 27. Peyton Howard started her first game after putting on the red. She started 95 games at Seattle U. True freshman Jaecy Eggers made her Eagle debut in the starting role.

A Season for the Books

Eastern Washington set a program and Big Sky record with 29 total wins last season. The record included 16 conference wins, setting a program record. The 2012-13 Eagles finished with 14 conference wins. The 23-24 Eastern squad won their 22nd game of the season against Northern Arizona, surpassing the 1983-84 team for most wins in a single season.

Replacing the Squad

Eastern will field a completely new starting lineup after losing Big Sky MVP/All-Conference First Team selection Jamie Loera, First Team selection Aaliyah Alexander, Second Team selection Jaleesa Lawrence, All-Tournament Selection Jacinta Buckley, and Eastern's all-time games played leader Milly Knowles. Also departing was 2023 Third Team and 2022 Freshman of the Year winner Jaydia Martin.

Overall, the team will have to replace 2050

of its 2392 points (87.5%) scored and 974 of its 1325 rebounds (73.5%) from last season Eastern losses, 81% of its total minutes played last season (5692) from the nine departures.

Eight Stay in Cheney

Despite the turnover, Eastern retains eight players from their record-setting 2023-24 roster. EWU keeps contributors senior guard Alexis Pettis, graduate student guard Ellie Boni, redshirt-sophomore power forward Bella Hays and junior guard Ella Gallatin. The Eagles will also have red-shirt-sophomore power forward Camille Jentzsch, junior small forward Addison Hall, redshirt-sophomore power forward Cori Wilcox and junior guard Breeje Schuler.

Eight Arrive in Cheney

With no returning starters, Eastern brings in eight newcomers to fill immediate needs across the board for the team. Three transfers join the Eagles with guard Peyton Howard (Seattle U), Rachel Harvey (Cal State Northridge) and Paris Kirk (Robert Morris). Augmenting the roster depth, EWU has 5 true freshman with power forward Jaecy Eggers, guard Valérie Cassidy-De Falco, guard Léa-line Romain, small forward Kourtney Grossman and guard Emily McElmurry.

Homegrown Talent

The Eagles strategize to keep the talented recruits in-state, with seven players residing in Washington. Among the in-state players, Ellie Boni and Peyton Howard both come from Spokane Valley, attend-

ing University and Central High Schools respectively.

Honoring a Pair of Legends

Eastern Washington inducted its 20th athletics Hall of Fame class, with two former women's basketball greats included. Stephanie Ulmer (2001-06) and Cristy Cochran (1982-85) cemented their Eagle legacy with their induction. Ulmer earned 2 All-Big Sky Conference honors for basketball, along with 4 for javelin in track and field. Cochran earned 1st team All-Big Sky honors for the 1985-86 season and is till the only player in program history to average 15 points, 8 rebounds and 3 assists in a season.

A Basketball School

Along with the women's team, the EWU men's team won the Big Sky regular season title last season. It is only the third time in the history of the Big Sky a university has won both the men's and women's titles. It is also the first time in the neutral site era.

Elite Off the Court

Eastern continued the tradition of academic success for the 2023-24 year, earning a Women's Basketball Coaches' Association honor roll special mention, for a team with a combined GPA above 3.0. The honor marks the 3rd-straight special mention for Joddie Gleason's team. EWU had a 3.42 cumulative GPA last season. The team was one of 5 Big Sky schools honored on the list. Six Eagles earned Big Sky All-Academic honors in May.

JODDIE GLEASON

Head Coach (4th season)

Joddie Gleason is the eighth head coach in EWU women's basketball history. Gleason took over at the helm after five successful seasons as Seattle University's associate head coach and has 12 years of head coaching experience at Humboldt State.

2023-24

In her Coach of the Year winning third season, Gleason led EWU to a 29-6 record, the most in program history, and 16-2 in the Big Sky. She led the Eagles to a 10-game winning streak to end the season, including carrying the momentum all the way through the Big Sky Championships to claim the regular season title, the first time since 1986, and the first since Eastern has joined the Big Sky. Under Gleason's guidance, the program set the program record for the fewest turnovers per game (11.5). Numerous students had post-season awards, with Jamie Loera earning Big Sky Player of the Year (Unanimous), Defensive Player of the Year, First-Team All-Conference, All-Defense, All-Tournament, and was Tournament MVP. Aaliyah Alexander also received a First Team All-Conference selection, Jaleesa Lawrence earned Second Team All-Conference and Jacinta Buckley received an All-Tournament Team selection. EWU had 6 players awarded winter Big Sky All-Academic Honors.

2022-23

In her second season, Gleason led EWU to a 19-11 record, Fifth-most wins in program history, and 11-7 in the Big Sky. She matched the program record for year-to-year wins improvement (10). In non-conference, Eastern defeated Boise State for the first time since 2013. The team finished the regular season on a 4-game winning streak. In the Big Sky Tournament, the Eagles advanced to semifinals with a win over Montana, the program's first postseason win since 2019. With Gleason's guidance, Eastern set program records for fewest turnovers (370) and fewest turnovers per game (12.3). The Eagles had three postseason awards including Jamie Loera earning Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, third team All-Conference and All-Tournament Team. Jaydia Martin was named to the third team All-Conference and Jacinta Buckley received an Honorable Mention. EWU had 10 players awarded winter Big Sky All-Academic Honors.

2021-22

Gleason finished her inaugural season with a 7-13 Big Sky record and 9-21 overall. A 101-38 win over Evergreen State(11/21), at Reese Court, marked Gleason's first win as a Division 1 head coach. Against Multnomah(12/7), Eastern set a program record with 18 made three-pointers in a 102-61 victory. Gleason's first Big Sky win also occurred at home, in a hard-fought, 56-52, win over Weber State(1/15). The marquee win of the season for Gleason and her squad was a 76-69 road win over Montana State, as the Eagles erased an 11-point, fourth quarter deficit to pull the upset over the Bobcats. With Gleason's guidance, Jaydia Martin earned Big Sky Freshman of the Year awards, along with an All-Conference honorable mention. Jacinta Buckley would earn All-Conference Third Team honors as well. Martin would also set program freshman marks in scoring average(15.2), total points(455), field goals(149), field goal attempts(476), three-pointers(71), and three-point attempts(223).

Prior to Eastern

At Seattle University, Gleason worked as the team's offensive coordinator where she was responsible for implementing practice plans and scouting reports. Gleason was also the point person for scheduling and summer camps while overseeing guard development.

In her tenure with the Redhawks, Seattle U was in the top-three in scoring offense in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) during the 2018, 2020 and 2021 seasons. In 2017-18, Gleason helped coach the Redhawks to the program's first-ever WAC Championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. The year prior, Seattle U advanced to the WAC title game and qualified for the WNIT for the first time since 2013.

Gleason also coached seven WAC All-Conference selections, two WAC Freshman of the Year honorees, two WAC Defensive Players of the Year and the 2021 Seattle Sports Commission Female Sports Star of the Year. Additionally, six players continued to play professionally overseas and the Redhawks maintained a team grade point average over 3.4.

Prior to her five seasons in Seattle, Gleason spent 12 years as the head coach at Humboldt State University. She compiled an overall record of 201-137 and was the program's all-time winningest coach upon her departure.

Under her leadership, the Lumberjacks qualified for the NCAA DII Tournament four times and won two California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) championships. In 2015, she was named the CCAA Coach of the Year after the guiding the Lumberjacks to a 23-6 overall record and a regular season title. Gleason coach three All-Americans, 14 First Team All-Conference selections and 34 First Team Academic award winners.

Gleason also served as the head coach at Butte Community College from 1999-2004 where she compiled a 107-45 overall record in five seasons.

She received her Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies (1992), a teaching credential (1994) and a Master of Arts in Kinesiology (2000) from California State University, Chico.

Gleason and her husband, Skip, who is currently the associate head coach for the women's basketball program at Eastern, have one daughter named Raimee.

SKIP GLEASON

Associate Head Coach (4th season)

Skip Gleason is in his fourth season at Eastern Washington University after spending the last five years at Seattle University as a women's basketball assistant coach.

Gleason's defensive coaching improved once again in his third season in Cheney. Eastern improved to 29 wins from the previous 19, matching for the second time the program record in win

improvement from season-to-season, as well as setting the new program record for most wins in a season. Gleason again coached guard Jamie Loera to greater heights, with Loera winning Big Sky Player of the Year, as well her second Defensive Player of the Year, and the All-Defense Team. The Eagles ranked first for the second season in a row in the Big Sky in turnover margin (+5.51). The team also had the third highest number of turnovers by the opposing team in program history (597).

Gleason's coaching on the defensive side of the court showed dividends in his second season in Cheney. Eastern improved from nine to 19 wins, matching the program record in win improvement from season-to-season. Gleason helped Jamie Loera earn her first Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year honors. The Eagles ranked first in Big Sky in turnover margin (+4.1) and second in turnovers forced per game (16.4). The team also had the fifth best opponent scoring margin in program history (63.5).

In Gleason's first season with Eastern, the team had a 6-13 record in the Big Sky and 9-21 overall. The Eagles set a program record with 18 made threes against Multnomah in a 102-61 win.

At Seattle, Gleason was the recruiting coordinator and added on the primary defensive and scouting coordinator responsibilities as well. During his tenure with the Redhawks, he helped lead the squad to a 2017 WNIT appearance and a 2018 NCAA Tournament bid. He coached two Western Athletic Conference (WAC) Freshman of the Year honorees as well as a WAC Defensive Player of the Year.

Prior to Seattle U, Gleason was the assistant women's basketball coach at Humboldt State University for nine seasons. He also served as the recruiting coordinator for the Lumberjacks and helped lead the squad to multiple NCAA DII Tournaments and two California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) championships. Gleason was also the SAAC advisor and has annual giving and corporate partnership experience.

Gleason also served as the head men's basketball coach at the College of the Redwoods for two seasons. He was named the 2007 Golden Valley Conference Coach of the Year and led the program to its first-ever outright GVC championship in program history.

He earned his Bachelor's in Liberal Studies at CSU Chico in 1995 and went on to earn a teaching credential from Chapman University in 1999. Skip and Joddie Gleason have one daughter, Raimee.



BRANDON MORRISON

Assistant Coach (4th season)

Brandon Morrison is in his fourth season with the Eagles after spending the last several years in various roles for the women's basketball program at UNLV.

Morrison continued the coaching excellence in his third season at Eastern, helping the team improve to 29 wins in the '23-'24 season. The team recorded 311 steals, ranking first in the Big

Sky, and fifth on the all-time program list. The Eagles also ranked second in the Big Sky with 8.89 steals per game. Morrison coached Eastern to the second fewest turnovers (404) in program history, and the fewest turnovers per game (11.5) in program history for the second season in a row.

Morrison began his second season at Eastern and helped improve the team's win total from nine to 19 games between the '21-'22 and '22-'23 seasons. The team record 269 steals in the season, ranking ninth on the all-time program list. The Eagles led the Big Sky with 9.0 steals per game. Through Morrison's coaching, Eastern recorded the fewest turnovers (370) committed and fewest turnovers per game (12.3) in program history.

Morrison started at UNLV and served as a scout team coordinator from 2011-16 before moving into the video coordinator role. In 2017, he was promoted to assistant coach and served in that role for three seasons.

He was in charge of scouting reports and film breakdown while also having a hand in recruiting. Morrison worked in player development for perimeter and post play, while also assisting in offensive play calling while running various UNLV camps. Morrison also coached the 2018 Mountain West 6th Player of the Year, the 2017 and 2019 MWC Defensive Player of the Year, three All-Mountain West team selections and two All-Mountain West Defensive Team selections during his time with the Rebels. UNLV also won a regular season championship in 2017.

Morrison has also served as an advanced scout for the WNBA Los Angeles Sparks where he created scouting reports and live-scouted WNBA games.

He graduated with his Bachelor's in kinesiology in 2016 from UNLV and went on to earn his Master's in Sport Administration from the University of Miami in 2018.





ANGELA SONG

Assistant Coach (1st season)

Xiaoyun Song- Angela - was hired as an assistant coach at Eastern Washington University in August of 2024 by head coach Joddie Gleason.

Song brings her wealth of international experience to the team as a former elite basketball player for the Chinese National Women's Basketball Team, where she played as a key point guard from 2001 to 2013. Song competed

in three Olympic Games (2004, 2008, 2012), two Asian Games (2002, 2006), and multiple FIBA Women's Basketball World Championships. Her impressive playing career includes winning two Asian Games championships and the Asian Championship title in 2003 and 2005, as well as finishing 4th at the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Her outstanding contributions earned her the title of International-Level Elite Athlete (Athlete profile: <https://www.olympedia.org/athletes/103063>).

From 2017 to 2019, Song served as the assistant coach for the Chinese National Youth Women's Basketball Team. In 2021, Song became a FIBA Level 1 instructor, further establishing her credentials as a coach. She has also been involved with the prestigious Nike All-Asia Training Camps and will take on the role of Head Coach for the Women's Division in 2024. Song is a signed Nike coach, reflecting her influence and leadership in the sport.

Song holds a master's degree in Sports Education and Training from Beijing Sport University, further solidifying her strong academic and athletic background.



JAMIE LOERA

Assistant Coach (1st season)

Jamie Loera joins the Eastern Washington staff for the 2024-25 season after a storied playing career at Arizona State, and then here at Eastern Washington.

While playing at Arizona State, Jamie was on the 2019 roster that made the Sweet Sixteen in the NCAA Tournament, and also qualified for the 2021 NIT Tournament. Jamie then transferred

to Eastern Washington starting in the 2022-2023 season, and immediately excelled with the Eagles. She was named the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, was named to the Big Sky All-Conference Third Team, and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Jamie continued her excellence into the 2023-2024 season, as she helped lead the Eagles to their first NCAA Tournament Appearance since 1987. Along the way, Jamie picked up more accolades, including being named the unanimous Big Sky Player of the Year, and First Team All-Conference. She repeated as Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, and was named to the All-Defensive Team. Jamie also earned Big Sky Tournament MVP, and was once again named to the All-Tournament Team.

Jamie ranks 9th All-Time in Total Assists in School Program History (339) and 4th All-Time in Steals in a single season (83).

Jamie has since graduated with her Masters in Organizational Leadership, and continues to bring excellence to Eastern Basketball, this time as a coach.



JORDYN BOESEL

Director of Operations (3rd season)

Jordyn Boesel is in her third season at Eastern Washington and joined the staff on September 6, 2022. As Director of Operations, Boesel helps coordinate travel arrangements, camps, meals, and other functions essential to the team.

Boesel played under Gleason in the 2021-22 season as a graduate student after playing four seasons at St. Mary's. During the season, Boesel

started 11 games and played in all 30 for the team, averaging 3.9 points and 2.2 rebounds per game. She scored 17 points against Evergreen State, with five made three-pointers and helped the Eagles tie the program record of 17 made three-pointers in a single game. Boesel was third on the team with 29 made three-pointers.

Boesel graduated in June of 2022 from Eastern with her Master's in Business Administration. She was named to the Winter All-Big Sky Academic Team and helped Eastern earn a Special Mention on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association 2021-22 Academic Top-25 Team Honor Roll.

At St. Mary's, Boesel averaged 8.5 minutes and 1.7 points per game, in 73 total games played. She helped the Gaels earn back-to-back WNIT appearances. Boesel earned an Honorable Mention West Coast Conference All-Academic Team and graduated from SMC with a degree in Business Administration.
