Wagner Series History

Series Highlights: Tonight's game marks the fourth meeting between Fairfield and Wagner University with the Stags holding a 3-0 lead in the series which began in 1963-64. The time between meetings for these two teams stands at 17 years as the last two meetings come off 20-year breaks. The Stags started the series with a 105-59 win during the 1963-64 campaign as Mike Branch paced the offense with 24 points. The two teams took a lengthy break before meeting during the 1975-76 campaign in which Fairfield posted a 94-68 decision over Wagner. Once again, there was a long hiatus between meetings as the two teams did not get together again until the 1995-96 campaign. In that game, Greg Francis and Shannon Bowman tallied 24 and 20 points, respectively to pace the Stags. Tony Rice played all 40 minutes for Wagner and ended the game with 21 points.

Against The NEC: Stags will be playing a Northeast Conference team for the second time this year, hosting Sacred Heart on November 21. Fairfield has not lost to a Northeast Conference team since the 2007-08 campaign, falling at St. Francis, N.Y. (55-51). Since that loss, Fairfield has won 10 straight against the conference, defeating Sacred Heart five times, Central Connecticut three times, Robert Morris once, and St. Francis N.Y. once.

- **On This Date:** The last time that the Stags played on December 18 came during the 1982-83 campaign when the team beat Hofstra by a 92-68 count on the road. The team also posted an impressive 90-81 win over Xavier on the road on December 18, 1965. It was the second victory of a 12-game winning streak that season.

Last Time Out: In a well contested game that saw 16 lead changes, Fairfield outlasted Rider University by a 74-70 score at Webster Bank Arena on December 4. The Stags received good production from its freshman class as Jonathan Kasibabu (14 points), Curtis Cobb (13 points) and Matija Milin (13 points) combined for 41 of the Stags' 74 points. With the score tied at half-time (37-37), Rider pulled ahead early in the second half with a 14-6 spurt that gave the Broncs' their biggest lead at 51-46 with 14:31 on the clock. Fairfield scored the next five points to tie the game at 51-51, the start of an 11-0 run that put the home team in front at 57-51. Rider rallied to take the lead at 59-57 but it would be the last time that the visitors led in this game. The Stags tied the game at 59-59 off Cobb's layup and would lead by four points several times over the final six minutes of the game before settling for the 74-70 win.

Scouting Wagner: The Seahawks will play their third straight game against a Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) team this evening after picking up a road win over Rider (65-64) and a road loss to Monmouth (73-54). The victory against Rider was Wagner's first win away from home this season, sporting a perfect 4-0 mark on Staten Island. The team opened the season with a pair of losses at St. John's and Seton Hall before rallying for five straight victories from November 21-December 6. Wagner plays its third straight road game tonight and still has one left before returning home for a game against UMass Lowell on December 30. The Seahawks started the swing at Rider and Monmouth and finish the trip at George Mason on December 22. After the UMass Lowell game, Wagner gets into Northeast Conference play by heading to St. Francis Pa. and Robert Morris during the first week of January. Dwaun Anderson averaged 12 points per game against the MAAC schools which should be no surprise to those who follow the program as the guard ranks second among his teammates with a 12.6 scoring average. Corey Henson, who averaged 11 points per game against Rider and Monmouth, paces the offense with 14.9 points per game, and leads the squad with 28 assists in eight games. Michael Carey ranks first for Wagner with 6.9 re-

bounds per contest and with a .800 free throw percentage (20 of 25).

Scouting Fairfield: Fairfield continues to enjoy success on both sides of the court. Fairfield is averaging 77.9 points per game which places fourth in the MAAC. The scoring total is even more impressive when you consider that the team has played the last two games without the services of leading scorer Marcus Gilbert. The senior, who owned a season scoring average of 21.4 points per game after the Columbia win, played just six minutes against Iona and was not in the lineup at all versus Rider due to an injury. Still, he leads the team in scoring with 18.3 points per contest. Tyler Nelson is the other Fairfield student-athlete in double figures, netting 12.1 points per game. The sophomore has become better known for his ball-handling capabilities, dishing off 36 assists against just 11 turnovers to place first in the conference and 39th in the country with a +3.27 ratio. Freshman Matija Milin has moved up to the third for scoring, as his 13 points versus Rider raised his average to 9.4 points per contest. Fairfield continues to play solid defense as well, leading the MAAC in defensive rebounds (29.1 per game) and placing third in field goal percentage defense (.414). At the heart of the team's rebounding success is freshman Jonathan Kasibabu, who is the top rebounding freshman in the MAAC with 6.0 caroms per contest.

Freshmen Frenzy: The Fairfield freshmen comprise the top scoring rookie class in the MAAC, netting 32.1 points per game. Saint Peter's is next in line at 23.7, followed by Marist at 19.1 ppg. The Stags freshmen combined for 47 of the team's 74 points in the win over Rider, the most points that the class has scored in a game this season. The Class of 2019 also reached a combined 42 points at Iona and 40 points vs. Columbia. The freshmen class' lowest offensive output was 16 points at North Carolina.

Time Off: The Stags are coming off their longest layoff of the 2015-16 campaign, last playing two weeks ago against Rider University. The program has not had a 14-day break between games since the 2008-09 campaign when the Stags fell to Siena on December 7 (61-74) and to Saint Joseph's on December 21 (70-78). Both of those games were home as well that season.

Streak Stretched: Fairfield posted 74 points in the Rider win, extending the team's run of six straight games of 70 or more points scored. It's the first time that Fairfield has scored 70 or more points in six straight games since the 2005-06 season when the Stags went eight consecutive games (January 5-24, 2006), averaging 77.8 points per game during the run. Through this current stretch, the Stags are averaging 83.5 points per game which gives the team an overall scoring average of 77.9 points per contest.

Unbeaten: Fairfield has won its first three homes for the since the 2009-10 campaign when the Stags opened the year with eight consecutive home wins. During that run, Fairfield defeated Central Connecticut, Fordham (Alumni Hall), Marist, Holy Cross (Alumni Hall), Sacred Heart, St. Francis N.Y. (Alumni Hall), Loyola, and Manhattan. The streak ended with a loss to Siena (81-73) on January 16, 2010.

Three Of A Kind: Scott King Jr. earned a start in place of Marcus Gilbert on December 4, King's first start since the Northwestern game. He made the most of his opportunity by setting Fairfield career highs of six points, six rebounds and six field goal attempts (three made). King hit these marks despite playing just 18 minutes, his lowest time played with the exception of Columbia (12 minutes).

RPI Rankings: The Stags brings an 4-4 record into tonight's game with two of those losses coming against teams in the top 60 RPI rankings (#2 North Carolina and #54 Northwestern). Fairfield has another loss against a team in the top 100 RPI, namely #69 Iona College. Yale checks into the week at #138, the team's other loss. Among MAAC teams, the Stags are the fourth highest ranked behind Monmouth, Iona, and Siena.

National Statistics: Jerome Segura currently is tied for 25th in the nation for assists per game, dishing off 6.2 per contest. Segura is third in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) in assists with 6.2 per game.

Seven Scorers: Seven Fairfield student-athletes have scored 10 points in at least one game this season. Tyler Nelson has more double-figure scoring games than any other Stag, hitting the mark six times in his seven appearances. He missed the mark in the season opener against Yale, scoring six points in the game. Marcus Gilbert is next in line with four games, falling short with his eight point in the Yale game and no points at Iona. Others who have scored 10 points in a game include Segura (2), Johnson Jr. (2), Kasibabu (2), Cobb (3), and Milin (3).

Seven In A Row: Tyler Nelson has scored at least 10 point in each of the last seven games, the longest such streak of his brief Fairfield career. Nelson posted six straight double-figure games last season, averaging 17.5 points per game (105 point in six games). Currently, Nelson is averaging 13 points per game over his current seven-game run (91 points).

Bench Mark: Matija Milin and Curtis Cobb both reached a career-high for scoring at Iona. Milin scored a 13 points in the Iona game, his third straight double-digit scoring game. He was the top scoring reserve in the game, netting six of 11 shots from the floor, and was the only player off the bench to reach double figures. Cobb led all Fairfield scorers for the first time when he posted a personal-best 16 points at Iona. The freshman did most of his damage from behind the arc, making four of seven three-point attempts.

Leads & Ties: The Columbia game could not have been any closer as it featured 16 ties and 20 lead changes, including two ties and three lead changes in the five-minute overtime. Fairfield held the game's biggest lead at six points, at 27-21 with 5:07 remaining in the first half. Columbia's largest advantage stood at five points when the score was 52-47 with 13:52 remaining in the second half.

High Octane: Fairfield scored more than 80 points in three games from November 21-27, averaging 92.3 points per game during the stretch. The last time that the Stags' offense put up 80 or more points in three straight games came in 2002-03 when the team won at Iona (82-78), and at Siena (80-71) before falling to Manhattan at home (93-86). Fairfield's run was the best three-game scoring stretch since the 1990-91 team scored 297 points in three straight wins (91-69 over Marist, 94-67 over Bucknell, and 112-109 at Central Connecticut).

Money's Worth: Stags fans have received their money's worth at the first two home games as Fairfield won both contests in overtime. The last time that the Stags played two overtime home games to start a season came in 2004-05 when they Elon (59-58) and Manhattan (81-73). The Manhattan game was decided in two overtimes. The Stags played three overtime games in their first six games overall in 2004-05 and won all three, including Canisius 81-80 in overtime just four days after Manhattan. Fairfield went 3-1 in OT contests that year.

Rookie Trio: For the first time this season, the Stags started three freshmen in a game. Jonathan Kasibabu, Jerry Johnson Jr., and Curtis Cobb each received the nod against Columbia, combining for eight points by making four of 10 shots total.

Century Mark: For the first time under Head Coach Sydney Johnson, the Stags reached the century mark for scoring. Fairfield scored 113 points in its win against UMES, the most points since scoring a school-record 122 points against Holy Cross during the 1978-79 season. Fairfield has scored 100 or more points 41 times in school history and owns a 36-5 record. In the five losses, the margin of loss was four points or less three times.

On The Mark: Fairfield shot a season-high 57 percent from the floor against UMES, the highest single-game field goal percentage since the Stags made 59 percent of their field goal attempts in a 71-37 win over Marist. The Stags made 29 of 49 shots that night. Earlier in that year, Fairfield netted 58 percent of their shots in a victory over Drexel, netting 25 of 43 field goal tries.

In the UMES game, 10 players shot 50 percent or better from the floor.

School Record: The Stags set a school record for three pointers in a game when it made 17 shots from behind the arc. The 17 three pointers are the most since the Stags netted 16 against Rider University in January 2006 in an 85-81 win on the road. Fairfield's top three three-point performances have come on the road, adding in 14 three pointers against Rice University in December 1991.

MAAC Rookie of the Week: Jonathan Kasibabu earned the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Rookie of the Week after averaging a double-double in a 1-1 week. He posted a career-best 12 points and five rebounds at Northwestern. The forward followed with his first double-double of the season, a 12-point, 15-rebound effort against Sacred Heart.

Anyone's Game: Five different Fairfield student-athletes scored in the overtime period against Sacred Heart, combining for 11 points in the five-minute period. Jerome Segura led the way with four points including the two free throws that iced the game with 24 seconds left. Jerry Johnson Jr., Jonathan Kasibabu, and Tyler Nelson each scored two points while Marcus Gilbert added one free throw.

Up The Ladder: Marcus Gilbert scored 33 points against Columbia to raise his career scoring total to 1,270 points which moves him into the 17th position on Fairfield's All-time scoring list. His performance against Columbia moved him past Pat Yerina '86 (1,255), Kevin George '93 (1,265) '93, and Deng Gai (1,268). He needs 23 points to move past Anthony Johnson '10 who stands 16th all-time with 1,293 points.

Bench Warmers: The Stags bench continues to perform admirably this season, averaging 29.7 points per game. After starting the year with by scoring 27 of the team's 57 points against Yale, the bench posted 22 points in the Northwestern game and 28 points in the Sacred Heart game before erupting for 47 bench points at UMES. Freshman Matija Milin leads all reserve scorers with 9.4 points per game which places third on the team. Through

the first eight games, the reserves are shooting 50 percent from the floor (98 of 196).

Too Many Turnovers: The Stags turned the ball over 14 times against Northwestern. But the number of turnovers was not as much an issue as the fact that the Wildcats turned those miscues into 23 points, nearly 30 percent of the team's total 79 points. The Stags managed just seven points off seven Northwestern turnovers.

Down The Stretch: Fairfield held its own against the top-ranked team in the country on November 15 trailing North Carolina by eight points at halftime and with 13 minutes remaining in the half. The Stags were only down 11 points with nine minutes left in the game before North Carolina used a 16-7 run late in the game to take a 77-57 lead with five minutes remaining.

Long Range Jumpers: Fairfield has 75 three-point field goals in its first eight games, including 17 against UMES. The Stags are averaging 9.4 three pointers per game which is third best in the MAAC. Iona leads the conference with 12 three pointers per contest, followed by Canisius with 10.2 per game.

Season Opener Streak: The Stags saw its season opener winning streak end at six games following its loss to Yale. The season opening streak represented the longest streak in school history. The Stags won five straight openers from 1950-51 to 1954-55 and also from 1976-77 to 1980-81. Before this present run, the Stags lost 13 of 14 season openers between 1996-97 and 2008-09. During that 14-game run, Fairfield played Duke, Kansas, Wake Forest, and Memphis.

All-MAAC: Senior Marcus Gilbert earned a spot on the Preseason All-MAAC first team, the only Stag to earn the distinction. Gilbert, who was an All-MAAC third team pick in 2014-15, received the preseason nod after averaging 16.4 points per game which placed fifth among the conference scoring leaders. The senior forward was one of only two Fairfield student-athletes to start all 31 games last season, joining Mike Kirkland for that honor.

Tournament Central: Fairfield continues its run of in-season national tournament appearances under Head Coach Sydney Johnson. The Stags will participate in the CBE Hall of Fame Classic this season, playing at North Carolina on November 15 and at Northwestern on November 18. Previously, the Stags participated in the 2011 Old Spice Classic in Orlando, the 2012 Preseason NIT, the 2013 Naismith Hall of Fame Tournament, and the 2014 Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament under Coach Johnson.

Top-Ranked Team: Fairfield played the top-ranked team in the nation November 15 when the Stags traveled to the University of North Carolina. The Tar Heels occupy the top spot in the Associated Press poll and hold number two in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Fairfield last played a top-ranked team in 1998-99 when they played both Duke and UConn, the only team to play both teams when those squads occupied the top spot in the poll.

Road Map: The Stags needed a road map to keep their travel itinerary straight over the first two weeks. After playing their opener in Connecticut, Fairfield flew to Chapel Hill for a match up with North Carolina. After returning home on November 16, the team boarded a plane for Chicago one day later for its game with Northwestern. After returning home from the Windy City, Fairfield hosted Sacred Heart on November 21 before it took a bus 300 miles for its game at University of Maryland-Eastern Shore on November 24.

Bisacca Court: Fairfield celebrated the career of former Head Coach George Bisacca on November 6. Coach Bisacca led Fairfield into what is now considered Division I after the Stags played in the NCAA College Division for many years. Bisacca was at the helm when Fairfield played top-ranked University of Houston, during the 1967-68 season just two games after Elvin Hayes and teammates ended the UCLA 47-game winning streak. To honor his contributions to the program, Fairfield University placed his name on the court at Alumni Hall, officially becoming George R. Bisacca Court at Alumni Hall.

Road Warrior: Mike Kirkland had 11 double-figure games in 2014-15 with seven of those efforts coming on the road. However, his top two scoring performances came at home, namely 23 points vs. Iona and 20 points against South Dakota. In his road double-digit scoring games, Kirkland scored 13 points or less in six times with the lone exception coming at Iona (18 points). He scored 10 or more points in seven of his 10 MAAC road games last year, averaging 10.5 points per game in MAAC road games and 8.6 points per game in MAAC home games.

Eight Ball: Mike Kirkland started the Canisius game (Jan. 22) by netting eight of the team's first 12 points over the opening eight minutes of the game. He opened the game by netting three of his first six shots. Kirkland only took one more shot the rest of the way and finished the contest with eight points on three of seven shooting.

Towing The Line: Mike Kirkland reached the 20-point mark twice in his first season with the Stags and nearly had a double-double in both of those contests. He posted career highs with 23 points and 13 rebounds against Iona. Earlier in the year, Kirkland recorded 20 points and eight rebounds in the South Dakota game.

Half Hour: Mike Kirkland played 30 or more minutes in 10 games last season and scored in double figures in eight of those games. The forward averaged 13.1 points per game when he reached the 30-minute mark on the court. In games in which he played less than 30 minutes, Kirkland posted 5.5 points per game (121 points in 21 games).

At The Start: Mike Kirkland was one of two Fairfield student-athletes to start all 31 games last season, joining Marcus Gilbert for that honor. The forward was the only newcomer to garner a start in every game. The next closest newcomer was Tyler Nelson, who posted 27 starts in his 30 appearances. Kirkland was the second leading scorer among newcomers with 7.9 points, trailing only Nelson's 10.2 points per game.

Kirkland's Biography

2014-15: Mike Kirkland placed third among his teammates in both scoring (7.9 ppg) and rebounding (4.0 rpg) in his inaugural year with the Stags. He tallied 10 or more points in 11 games, which was third best among Fairfield student-athletes a year ago. His first double-digit effort was a 20-point night against South Dakota, a total he would surpass against Iona when he posted his only double-double with 23 points and 13 rebounds. Kirkland enjoyed a great deal of success on the road during MAAC play, posting 10 or more points in seven of the 10 conference road games. He averaged 10.5 points in MAAC away dates and 8.6 points per contest in conference home contests. Kirkland started the every game for the Stags, the only newcomer to stake that claim in 2014-15. One of his best overall games came against South Dakota in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, registering 20 points, eight rebounds with a career-high 10 free throws made and six assists.

Before Fairfield: Kirkland was part of a successful program at Eastern Florida State College. During his stay, the program captured the Florida Community College System Activities Association (FCSAA) Southern Conference championship in 2013 and finished fourth in the final FCSAA Coaches Poll with a 24-6 overall record. The forward earned All-Southern Conference honors following the 2013-14 campaign, after averaging 10 points per game. He reached double figures in 13 games last year, highlighted by a 26-point and a 21-point effort. At West Port High School, he averaged better than 15 points per game and over nine rebounds per contest. He was an All-County and All-District first team selection during his stay at the high school.

Quick Draw: Jerome Segura has collected 40 assists through the first eight games of the season, the most since Desmond Wade posted 42 assists after eight contests during the 2012-13 campaign. Wade ended that campaign with 110 assists, tying Derek Needham for the top spot that season. With 22 games remaining, Segura is on pace to reach 165 assists by the end of the regular season.

One & Only: Jerome Segura is the only Stag who has not had more turnovers than assists in a game this season. The Rider game marked the first time that he had as many turnovers as assists this season. In his previous six appearances, Segura had more assists than turnovers.

National Statistics: Jerome Segura currently is tied for 39th in the nation for assists per game, dishing off 5.7 per contest. Segura is third in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) in assists with 5.7 per game. He started the year with six assists against Yale and followed up with a career-best eight assists at North Carolina, a total he tied against Iona. He posted seven assists in the home opener.

Career High: Jerome Segura registered a personal-best 15 points in the win against Sacred Heart, including four points in overtime. The sophomore's two free throws iced the game in the final minutes for the Stags. The 15 points were more than the guard had scored in his first three games.

First Time: As a freshman, Jerome Segura earned his first career start by getting the nod at Siena on January 11, 2015. He joined Tyler Nelson in the starting lineup to give the Stags an all-freshman backcourt. K.J. Rose had started all 14 games before yielding to Segura. Segura finished the game with five points with two assists and no turnovers in 15 minutes.

Segura's Biography

2014-15: Segura was a regular all season long, playing in all but one contest as a freshman. He missed the Saint Peter's game after playing in his first 27 collegiate games. He posted a career-high 13 points in a start at Saint Peter's. He also reached double figures as a reserve with 11 points at Niagara in the regular-season finale. Segura was sure-handed with the basketball and was one of only three Stags with more assists than turnovers (64 assists/60 turnovers). He had more turnovers than assists in nine of his 28 regular-season appearances. He dished off nine assists against four turnovers in the team's Buffalo weekend, highlighted by six assists and two miscues against Canisius. Segura earned his first collegiate start at Siena on January 11, joining Tyler Nelson to comprise an all-freshmen backcourt.

Before Fairfield: Segura finished his final season at Langham Creek High School as an All-Region and an All-District player. He led his team to a 17-15 overall record in 2013-14 and a 9-4 mark in the District. He enjoyed one of his finest seasons as a Lobo, tossing in 16.9 points per game. The guard also added 3.5 rebounds, 3.4 assists, and 2.0 steals per game. Over his final three seasons with the program, Segura tossed in 1,153 points and averaged 12.4 points per game. In his final season at Langham Creek, Segura dished off 103 assists and recorded 60 steals in 30 games. He showed his three-point range with a career-high 22 long-range jumpers in 2013-14, and added a personal-best 105 rebounds.

Triple Play: Beginning with the UMES game, Tyler Nelson has a 3 to 1 assist to turnover ratio, registering 22 assists against seven turnovers over the last four games. The sophomore is currently tied for 35th in Division I with a +3.27 assist-to-turnover ratio. The NCAA lists just 412 student-athletes on its assist-to-turnover leader list and Nelson is one of 52 to have 11 turnovers or less on that list. He has played 30 or more minutes twice this year without committing a turnover - Yale (35 minutes with four assists) and UMES (31 minutes with nine assists).

Top Of The MAAC: Tyler Nelson leads the MAAC in assist-to-turnover ratio, nearly a full point more than Saint Peter's Travis Wyche who has a +2.4 mark (34 assists, 14 turnovers). Nelson has 36 assists against 11 turnovers, the least amount of turnovers by the top 11 assist-to-turnover ratio leaders in the MAAC.

Seven In A Row: Tyler Nelson has scored at least 10 point in each of the last seven games, the longest such streak of his brief Fairfield career. Nelson posted six straight double-figure games last season, averaging 17.5 points per game (105 point in six games). Currently, Nelson is averaging 13 points per game over his current seven-game run (91 points).

Came That Close: Sophomore Tyler Nelson just missed a triple double by scoring 20 points, nine assists, and eight rebounds. His assists and rebounds secured career highs for the guard with his previous high being five for each of those categories. Nelson has dished off 24 assists over the last four games, more than half of his 2014-15 assist total of 41.

Team Leader: Tyler Nelson was the team's co-leader in scoring with his 16 points against Sacred Heart. The sophomore shared the top spot with Jerry Johnson Jr. in the game. Nelson was the team's top scorer three times last season, scoring at least 23 points in those three games in which he was the top scorer.

Rookie of the Week: Tyler Nelson earned two MAAC Rookie of the Week honors during the 2014-15 season. In his first award, he averaged 14 points per game over three games, including a team-high 24 points in the win over South Dakota. He shot 65 percent from the in the three games (13 of 20) and 62 percent from three-point range (8 of 13). In his second weekly honor, Nelson reached double digits in all the of his appearances including 15

points at Iona, 14 points against Marist and 15 more points against Monmouth. For the week, he shot 43 percent from the field and 48 percent from three-point range.

Nelson's Biography

2014-15: Nelson emerged as one of the MAAC's top freshmen which was backed up by his appearance on the MAAC's All-Rookie team. The guard became one of the conference's top three-point threats by netting 64 shots from behind the three-point line, the most since Jermaine Clark' posted 70 three pointers as a freshman. Nelson averaged 17.5 points per game over the final six regular-season games and hit double-figures in each of those contests. The rookie scored 10 or more points in 15 games, second only to Marcus Gilbert (27 games). He scored 24 points against South Dakota in his fourth career game, his only 20-point performance until he reached the mark in back-to-back games late in the year (26 vs. Saint Peter's and 23 at Canisius). He was one of three Stags to have more assists (41) than turnovers (40). He just missed reaching the top ten for three-point field goal percentage in a season as his .424 field goal percentage was shy of Michael Van Schaick's mark of .430 (2005-06 season). His three-point shooting was effective when he could take multiple shots, making 61 of 135 attempts (.451) when he tried four or more three-point field goals in a game. When he shot three or less three-point attempts in a contest, he made 3 of 16 shots (.188).

Before Fairfield: Nelson joins the Stags basketball program after securing the Massachusetts Gatorade Player of the Year award in 2013-14. He is an All-Conference player who scored 1,443 career points while attending Central Catholic High School. He took his high school team to the state championship game with a 22-6 record before falling four points short. Nelson averaged 22 points and six rebounds per game as a senior and netted 70 three-point field goals. He ended his career with 230 three pointers, averaging better than two made per game. He was named the Lawrence Eagle-Tribune Most Valuable Player for the second straight year following the 2013-14 campaign. He was a two-time Merrimack Valley Conference (MVC) Player of the Year and a two-time ESPN Boston All-State player. As a junior, Nelson averaged 16.2 points per game and was named to the All-MVC Team. He helped the Raiders win the MVC Large and Division 1 North sectional title. Nelson also was the MVC Most Valuable Player as a golfer, winning a conference individual championship during his career.

Out Of The Lineup: Marcus Gilbert played just six minutes after suffering an ankle injury against Iona. He left the game with about 12 minutes remaining in the first half and did not return. Gilbert took three shots but did not score, his first scoreless game since the 2013 MAAC Tournament game against Manhattan.

Career High: Marcus Gilbert tallied a personal-best 33 points in the win over Columbia, the fourth time he has reached 30 points in a game during his career. He posted 31 points at Quinnipiac during the 2013-14 campaign, netted 30 points at Rider last season, and added 32 points in the UMES game on November 24. Three of his four 30-point performances came on the road with Columbia being the lone exception.

Back To Back: Marcus Gilbert posted back-to-back 30-point performances in the victories over UMES and Columbia. He became the first Stag to score back-to-back 30-point games since Troy Bradford accomplished the task on December 22, 1987 vs. Marist (30 points) and December 28, 1987 vs. Utah (33 points). Joe DeSantis is the only Stag to post back-to-back 30 point games twice in a career, netting 32 against Hofstra on January 6, 1977 and 30 versus St. Joseph's on January 8, 1977. He also did it against Loyola on November 28, 1977 and versus Bridgeport on November 30, 1977.

Up The Ladder: Marcus Gilbert scored 32 points against UMES to raise his career scoring total to 1,270 points which moves him into the 17th position on Fairfield's All-time scoring list. His performance against Columbia moved him past Pat Yerina '86 (1,255), Kevin George '93 (1,265) '93, and Deng Gai (1,268). He needs 23 points to move past Anthony Johnson '10 who stands 16th all-time with 1,293 points.

Double-Double: Marcus Gilbert became the first Fairfield student-athlete with a double-double this year, racking up 18 points and 11 rebounds against Northwestern. He had two previous double-doubles, both of which came last season. He recorded 30 points and 13 rebounds at Rider and added 16 points and 10 rebounds at Niagara in the regular-season finale.

Good Company: Marcus Gilbert scored 25 points against North Carolina in the Dean Smith Center, an accomplishment that did not happen often last year. Only three players netted 25 or more points against the Tar Heels on their home court, namely Florida State's Xavier Rathan-Mayes (35 points), Trevor Cooney (28 points), and Louisville's Terry Rozier (25 points). No non-conference opponent had a player score 25 points at the

Smith Center during the 2014-15 season. Brian Sullivan of Davidson was the last non-conference opponent to reach 25 points in a game, finishing with 33 points in a 97-85 overtime loss to the Tar Heels on December 21, 2013.

All-MAAC: Senior Marcus Gilbert earned a spot on the Preseason All-MAAC first team, the only Stag to earn the distinction. Gilbert, who was an All-MAAC third team pick, received the preseason nod after averaging 16.4 points per game which placed fifth among the conference scoring leaders. The senior forward was one of only two Fairfield student-athletes to start all 31 games last season, joining Mike Kirkland for that honor.

Gilbert's Biography

2014-15 Season: Gilbert emerged as one of the top scorers in the MAAC by averaging 16.4 points per game, good enough for fifth overall and second among non-senior players in the conference. He also ranked 10th in the MAAC for free throw percentage with a .777 mark (143 of 184). He placed second among his teammates with 5.6 rebounds per game, while his 25 steals were a team standard. He became the latest member of the 1,000-point club when he netted a free throw at Saint Peter's. Gilbert was a second-half scorer, netting 61 percent of his points after halftime. Perhaps his most memorable shot of the year came at Quinnipiac when he netted a 25-foot three pointer at the buzzer to tie the Bobcats at 46-46, a game which the Stags would go onto win 56-52. He was a preseason All-MAAC player and backed that up with a spot on the All-MAAC third team accolades following the regular season. Gilbert tallied 10 or more points in 28 of his 31 appearances and scored 20 points or more nine times. He netted 30 points at Rider on February 5, the second time he hit the 30-point plateau in his career (31 vs. Quinnipiac in December, 2013). He put together a pair of games which resulted in a double-double average. He recorded 30 points and grabbed 13 rebounds at Rider which he followed with 28 points and 7 rebounds at Saint Peter's, averaging 29 points and 10 rebounds over the two-games.

2013-14 Season: Gilbert developed into one of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference's (MAAC) top three-point shooters in 2013-14. The sophomore netted 73 of 199 attempts from behind the arc (.367), and connected on six or more three pointers in three contests - Holy Cross (6 of 14), at Quinnipiac (6 of 10), and at Monmouth (6 of 14). He made four of his three-point field goals in the opening half against Monmouth. Gilbert ended the year ranked second among his teammates with a 13.9 scoring average, just one-tenth off Maurice Barrow's team-high 14.0 points per game. Gilbert scored 10 or more points in 24 of his 32 games, including seven 20-plus point performances. He netted a career-best 31 points against Quinnipiac on December 6, netting 11 of 19 field goals overall and six of 10 from three-point range. He ranked as one of the team's most accurate shooters with a .406 field goal pct. and .768 free throw pct. .

2012-13 Season: Gilbert earned a spot on the MAAC All-Rookie team after a successful freshman campaign. The forward was named the MAAC rookie of the week three times, the last of which came on March 4 after averaging a team-best 12 points per game in a 0-2 week. He also garnered the award on December 3 and December 31. He tallied a career-high 11 points against Austin Peay on the road to earn the honor in early December and picked up eight points and a personal-best 10 rebounds in a road victory against Old Dominion on December 29. He received his first career start in the Austin Peay game and went on to start 20 more games. He owned a streak of 19 straight games from December 22 at Saint Joseph's through the regular-season finale at Marist on March 3. He tallied a double-digit game with 10 points against Kent State in the CollegeInsider.com (CIT) tournament, a game which also returned the Delaware native back to the starting lineup. Gilbert shot 54 percent from the floor in the team's four postseason tournament games, netting seven of 13 attempts.

2014-15 Season: Amadou Sidibe emerged as one of the conference's top rebounders during the 2014-15 campaign, posting five double-doubles. He started the year with a 10-point, 12-rebound effort against Central Connecticut. He tallied double-doubles in three straight games – Loyola, Md. (13 pts, 13 rebs.), Siena (10 pts., 11 rebs.), and Rider (12 pts., 15 rebs.). The forward finished the season among the MAAC leaders in rebounding, securing sixth place with 6.8 caroms per contest. He missed five of the last six regular-season games with injury, but returned to play 15 minutes against Saint Peter's in the MAAC tournament. He finished as the team's most accurate shooter, connecting on 49.1 percent of his shots. He finished with a field goal percentage of .500 or better in nine of 13 games in which he attempted four or more field goals. When he played more than 20 minutes in a game, Sidibe averaged 10.1 rebounds per game over 12 games and secured eight or more rebounds in 11 of those 12 contests.

2013-14 Season: Sidibe served as the team captain during his sophomore season, starting 27 of his 32 appearances in 2013-14. His five appearances as a reserve were in succession, starting with the Northeastern game on December 15 and running through his appearance at Manhattan on January 4. His first double-digit scoring performance came against at Siena when he netted 12 points. He surpassed that total with his double-double performance against Saint Peter's in the final regular-season road game, tallying a career-high 18 points and 14 rebounds. His specialty was rebounding, proven by his team-best 6.6 caroms per contest which ranked eighth in the MAAC. He collected 10 or more rebounds eight times, beginning with a personal-best 16 rebounds against Holy Cross. He shot 45 percent from the floor, shooting 50 percent or better in 18 games last season. Sidibe finished his sophomore season with a 5.6 scoring and a 6.6 rebounding average.

2012-13 Season: Sidibe collected the MAAC Co-Rookie of the Year and picked up a berth to the MAAC All-Rookie team, joining teammate Marcus Gilbert for that honor. He earned the MAAC rookie of the week honor on January 25 after averaging 9.3 points and nine rebounds per game in a 2-1 week. He led the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds and was one of the team's most accurate shooters with a .527 field goal percentage. Sidibe started the year as a reserve, coming off the bench for the first five games, before getting his first start against Fordham in the NIT preseason tournament. He responded with his first double-digit performance, netting 10 points and adding eight rebounds against the Rams. Two games later, he tallied his first double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds against DePaul as a reserve. He would add one more double-double during the year, registering a career-best 12 points and 11 rebounds against Loyola Md. at home. He would surpass that 11-rebound effort with a career-best 13 caroms against Manhattan on February 12 and Saint Peter's in the MAAC tournament. Sidibe was the team's top rebounder in the Stags' four postseason games with 30 (7.5 per game). For the season, Sidibe scored in double figures seven times and grabbed 10 or more rebounds five times.

Smith's Biography

2014-15 Season: Steve Smith appeared in 18 games during the 2014-15 season which included the final 12 games played by the Stags. The guard scored in 11 of those 18 contests, highlighted by a season-high nine points at Canisius. He scored in three consecutive games during MAAC play with six points against Quinnipiac, three points at Manhattan, and three more at Niagara. During the regular season, Smith made all but one of his shots from behind the three-point line with his two-pointer coming at Marist. In the MAAC tournament game versus Saint Peter's, both of his shots were inside the arc. He shot 36 percent outside the three-point arc (14 of 39) and 27 percent inside the arc (3 of 11). He netted six or more points four times, hitting the mark at Northeastern, at Saint Peter's, and Quinnipiac while registering a season-high nine points at Canisius.

2013-14 Season: Offensively, Steve Smith spent nearly his entire season behind the three-point line as only four of his 74 field goal attempts came inside the three-point arc. The freshman made 21 of 70 shots from long range which included six games with two or more three pointers. He enjoyed a four-game run that include 11 three pointers in 25 attempts (.440), highlighted by five three pointers in seven tries at Green Bay on December 21 for a personal-best 15 points. For the season, Smith averaged 2.7 points per game and just under 10 minutes per appearance (264 minutes in 27 games). Smith appeared in 27 games in 2013-14 with all but one coming as a reserve. The guard picked up a starting assignment at Loyola, Md. on November 16, playing 10 minutes without scoring.

Before Fairfield: Smith attended LaSalle College High School where he was a three-year starter for the Explorers. The forward was one of the program's top three-point shooters during his career. Smith set a school record for three-point field goals in a game, hitting seven against Cardinal O'Hara to finish with 25 points. He was among the team's top scorers as a senior, spending most of the year in double figures. His scoring comes from his ability to score from anywhere on the floor and looks to be one of the Stags' top outside shooters. As a junior, Smith averaged 7.8 points per game as one of the top scorers for the Explorers.

Board Room: Coleman Johnson WAS successful on the boards over a four game run (November 21-December 2), collecting 21 caroms for an average of 5.3 per game during that run. He posted a season-high seven rebounds against Sacred Heart to start the run and capped it with six caroms at Iona. For the season, Johnson is averaging 3.9 rebounds per game.

Nothing But Net: Coleman Johnson has started the season as well as any shooter could hope, netting 13 of 19 shots from the floor (68.4 percent) through eight games. The senior made all six of his field goal attempts over a three games run (November 21-27), connecting on three against Sacred Heart, one against UMES, and two versus Columbia. He was also perfect in the Yale game with three shots made in as many attempts.

All The Way: Coleman Johnson played the entire game against Saint Peter's on February 21, 2015, the first time that he went from start to finish as a Stag. The forward made the most of his time by tying his season high with seven rebounds against the Peacocks. He also added three blocks, the most since his five-block performance at Siena earlier this season.

Block Out: Coleman Johnson has blocked four or more shots in 11 games during his career with nine of those contests coming in 2014-15. He finished fourth in the MAAC in overall games with 1.5 blocks per game following the 2014-15 campaign. He closed the season with 13 blocks in his final six games.

Back To Back: For the third time in his career, Coleman Johnson posted back-to-back double-digit scoring efforts when he recorded 17 points against Central Connecticut and 11 markers at Duke to start the 2014-15 season. He accomplished the task in his final two games as a freshman (10 vs. Manhattan, 18 at Kent State), and a personal-best three games last year (10 at Providence, 12 at Quinnipiac, 16 vs. Iona).

Johnson's Biography

2014-15 Season: Coleman Johnson was a force in the paint as a junior, ranking among his teammates as well as in the MAAC for blocked shots all season long. He rejected two or more shots in 11 games and finished the campaign with 37 blocks in 27 games. Those numbers placed him in a tie for third among MAAC leaders with 1.5 blocks per game. The forward tied his career-high with five blocks at Siena. Johnson also showed his ability to score points during the year, starting with his season-high 17 points against Central Connecticut in the season opener. He followed up with an 11-point effort at Duke, netting five of seven shots from the floor. Johnson was also successful around the backboard, securing five or more rebounds in 11 outings. He posted seven rebounds in a game three times with the most recent game coming at Canisius in late February. He played a personal-best 40 minutes against Saint Peter's, the first time he played from start to finish as a Stag.

2013-14 Season: Coleman Johnson posted 5.6 points and 4.5 rebounds per game as a sophomore, gaining 28 starts in 32 appearances. The forward was a regular in the lineup, averaging just over 20 minutes per game (660 minutes). He posted a career-high 11 rebounds in two different games during 2013-14. Johnson just missed a double-double in both of those outings, registering nine points and 11 rebounds at Loyola as well as eight points and 11 rebounds at Canisius. He netted 10 or more points six times, including three straight games - Providence (10 points), Quinnipiac (12 points), and Iona (16 points). After not recording a field goal in his first two games, he made a basket in 29 of his final 30 games. Johnson was equally successful on the defensive side of the court, recording at least one block in 16 games and two or more rejections in seven contests. He blocked a career-best five shots at Bucknell. He placed 11th in the MAAC with 0.9 blocks per game.

2012-13 Season: Johnson saved his best for last as the forward posted both of his double-digit scoring games in the final two contests of the season. He started with 10 points against Manhattan in the MAAC tournament semifinals before registering a career-best 18 points at Kent State in the first round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). Johnson shot 68 percent from the floor in the team's four postseason games (17 of 25), including a 9 of 12 night against Kent State. Johnson scored in five straight games twice during the year, averaging 8.4 points per game from March 3-20 and 2.6 points from December 22 to January 11, Johnson scored in 20 of his 29 appearances, which helped the Virginia native finish the year with a 3.4 scoring average. He also averaged two rebounds per game, grabbing 28 offensive and 30 defensive rebounds over 29 games. Johnson was one of only two Stags to not attempt a three-point shot in 2012-13, joining Amadou Sidibe for that distinction. He shot 50 percent or better from the field in 15 of his 29 appearances, helping him accumulate a .549 field goal percentage.

Degnan's Biography

He became the first Pearl River student-athlete to earn a Division I scholarship when he signed his National Letter of Intent to attend Fairfield University. His efforts did not go unnoticed by his peers or basketball coaches as the 6-8, 215-pound forward was named Mr. Basketball for Section I by the Lower Hudson Basketball Coaches Association. He also collected All-Country honors as well in his senior campaign.

Steal Away: Jonathan Kasibabu picked up a steal in the Rider game, giving him a steal in five of his seven appearances this year. Tyler Nelson is the only other Stags with a steal in five different games this year but he has eight appearances to his credit. Kasibabu leads all Fairfield front court players with five steals on the season.

Hot Hand: Jonathan Kasibabu has found his shooting touch over the last few weeks. After going 0 for 3 through his first two games, the forward has made 21 of his last 33 shots, shooting 64 percent from the field. During that same stretch, the freshman scored 51 points for an 8.4 scoring average.

MAAC Rookie of the Week: Jonathan Kasibabu earned the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Rookie of the Week after averaging a double-double in a 1-1 week. He posted a career-best 12 points and five rebounds at Northwestern. The forward followed with his first double-double of the season, a 12-point, 15-rebound effort against Sacred Heart.

Top Freshman: Jonathan Kasibabu is the top rebounding freshman in the MAAC with a 6.4 rebounding average. The rookie has posted 10 or more rebounds twice - 10 at North Carolina and a personal-best 15 against Sacred Heart. If you discount the Yale game in which he played just five minutes before fouling out, Kasibabu averaged 10 rebounds per game against North Carolina, Northwestern, and Sacred Heart (30 caroms in three games).

On The Board: Jonathan Kasibabu tallied his first career points in the Northwestern game, reaching double figures with 12 points. The freshman made three of five field goals and five of six free throws in addition to netting his first three-point field goal. The long-range jumper came on the team's first possession that gave the Stags its only lead of the game at 3-0.

Double Digits: Jonathan Kasibabu secured 10 rebounds against North Carolina, becoming the first freshman to secure 10 rebounds in a game since K.J. Rose accomplished the task. Rose posted 10 caroms against Marist in the regular-season finale (February 28, 2014). Kasibabu reached his 10 caroms with four offensive and six defensive rebounds. Kasibabu, who did not have any rebounds in his debut against Yale, leads the team with 10 total rebounds (5.0 rpg).

Back To Back: For the first time in his collegiate career, Curtis Cobb posted back-to-back double-digit performances. He started the week with a personal-best 16 points at Iona before finishing up with 14 markers against Rider at home. He posted 31 points in his first six games but followed up with 30 points in the last two games.

Career High: Curtis Cobb led all Fairfield scorers for the first time when he posted a personal-best 16 points at Iona on December 1. The freshman did most of his damage from behind the arc, making four of seven three-point attempts.

Call In The Reserves: Curtis Cobb led all reserves with 13 points in the Northwestern game, accounting for most of the team's 22 bench points. The guard led the team in scoring at halftime with 10 points. The performance was also Cobb's first time in double figures.

Dynamic Debut: Curtis Cobb earned a start in his first collegiate game, getting the nod against Yale University. The freshman responded by scoring a co-leading eight points in the game, joining Marcus Gilbert and Matija Milin for the honor. Cobb was perfect from three-point range, making both of his attempts against the Bulldogs.

Before Fairfield: Curtis Cobb, a 6-4, 175-pound guard, comes to Fairfield as a highly-rated guard who is ranked sixth in Massachusetts (Class of 2015) by ESPN. He is listed as a three-star recruit by several recruiting services including Scout, Rivals, Yahoo Sports, and 24/7 Composite. He earned All-NEPSAC first team honors as a member of Wilbraham and Monsoon Academy and was a 2015 McDonald's All-America nominee. He was a member of the New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC) first team in 2014-15.

Grabbing The Bronze: Matija Milin moved up to third on the Fairfield scoring leader board with a 9.4 scoring average. He trails only Marcus Gilbert (18.3 ppg) and Tyler Nelson (12.1 ppg). In the MAAC stats, Milin is fourth in field goal percentage (.526) and is just off third-place holder Brian Parker of Marist (.532). Parker and Milin are the top two freshmen in the MAAC for field goal percentage.

Bench Mark: Matija Milin tied his career high for scoring with 13 points against Rider, equaling his total one game earlier at Iona. He has posted a double-digit scoring total in each of the last four games, the longest double-figure scoring streak by any of the Fairfield freshmen this season. Milin was the top scoring reserve against Rider and Iona, netting six of 11 shots from the floor at Iona and six of 12 shots from the field versus Rider.

Double Double: Matija Milin posted a career-best 11 rebounds and added 10 points against Columbia, completing his first double-double with the Stags. The freshman posted his second straight double-figure scoring game with the 10 points, one game removed from registering a personal-best 11 points at Maryland-Eastern Shore. He is the third Stag to register a double-double through the first six games, joining Marcus Gilbert (Northwestern) and Jonathan Kasibabu (Sacred Heart).

High Score: Matija Milin came off the bench and scored 11 points in the win over UMES. The freshman also enjoyed his best shooting night by netting four of his five shots including two of three three-point shots. In addition, Milin set a career high with a pair of assists.

Carom Catching: Matija Milin posted a personal-best six rebounds in the Sacred Heart game, surpassing his previous high of four caroms set against both North Carolina and Northwestern. He also picked up his first career assist in the game.

Score More: Matija Milin scored eight points in his debut as a reserve, but surpassed that one game later with nine points against top-ranked North Carolina. The freshman is currently fourth on the team in scoring with 7.8 points per game.

Charge It: Matija Milin has shown his ability to take the charge, picking up two in the exhibition game against Bridgeport and two more in the season opener against Yale. With his charges, Milin created four opponent turnovers.

Before Fairfield: Matija Milin, a 6-9, 220-pound forward, comes to Fairfield from Belgrade, Serbia and was ranked as a high major player at the 2015 UBA Showcase in Istanbul, Turkey. He was a member of the Serbian Junior National Team from 2011-14 and was also a member of KK Zeman (Serbia) Junior Team.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson



Sydney Johnson became the 12th head coach to oversee the Fairfield University men's basketball program when he was introduced in April, 2011. Johnson joined the Stags program after spending four seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Princeton University.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson begins his fifth season at Fairfield University, leading the Stags to the postseason in two of those campaigns. The 2011-12 Stags reached the MAAC Tournament Championship game, the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT) semifinals, and defeated Arizona State, Old Dominion, and Iona, among others, en route to a 22-win season. In 2012-13, the Stags earned another postseason berth as a participant in the 2013 CIT.

Fairfield posted 41 victories under Coach Johnson in his first two seasons and 55 wins overall. His 41 wins through his first two campaigns ties him for the most by any Fairfield men's basketball coach through his first two seasons. The Stags three

postseason wins in 2012-13 were the most by any team in school history. Fairfield also led the MAAC in scoring defense at 61.1 ppg in his inaugural season.

Since his arrival, five Fairfield student-athletes have signed professional contracts, namely Rakim Sanders (Israel), Ryan Olander (Lithuania), Derek Needham (Lithuania), Colin Nickerson (Canada), and Maurice Barrow (Austria).

At Princeton, Johnson led the Tigers to the 2010-11 Ivy League championship and an automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. Princeton took the University of Kentucky to the final seconds before dropping a 59-57 decision in the NCAA tournament second round. It marked the second straight season that the program advanced to postseason play, playing in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) in 2009-10. During his tenure, Johnson owned a 66-53 record as the Tigers' head coach.

Johnson helped turn around the Princeton program in his four-year stay as the Tigers posted a 6-23 overall record and a 3-11 Ivy League slate in his first season. After improving to 13-14 overall and 8-6 in Ivy play in 2008-09, Johnson led Princeton to its first 20-win season since 2004 when the team finished the year with a 22-9 overall record. This year, the Tigers tied the second-highest win total in Princeton history with a 25-7 mark.

Under his guidance, Princeton has become one of the top defensive teams in the country. The Tigers led the nation in scoring defense during the 2009-10 season, allowing fewer total points (1652) and fewest points per game (53.3) than any other Division I team that year.

Johnson was named the Ivy League Coach of the Year by Collegeinsider.com following the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.

Before taking over the Princeton program, Johnson was an assistant coach at Georgetown University under John Thompson III. He helped the Hoyas advance to the program's first Final Four in 22 years. Georgetown owned a 30-7 record that season, winning the Big East regular season and tournament titles. Georgetown advanced to the postseason in all three of his years as an assistant coach which included two NCAA tournaments and one NIT berth.

Johnson also experienced postseason play as a student-athlete, leading the Tigers to the NCAA tournament during the 1995-96 and 1996-97 seasons. In the 1996 tournament, Princeton upset defending national champion UCLA to advance to the second round.

As a student-athlete, Johnson earned the 1997 Ivy League Player of the Year as well as an All-Ivy League first team honors in 1995-96 and 1996-97. He is the only three-time captain in Princeton men's basketball history. He earned an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 1997, but decided to continue his basketball career overseas.

He was a starter for Gorizia Pallacanestro in Italy and helped the team capture the Italian Second Division championship. The following season, he was part of another championship team as Reggio Calabria won the league title.

I think Sydney exhibits all the qualities of a successful head coach," said Fairfield University Director of Athletics Gene Doris. "He embraces the Jesuit philosophy, which is the cornerstone of Fairfield University, and exhibited a clear understanding of the University's mission during the interview process. He leads by example, something that is quite visible when you see the passion and enthusiasm he brings to everything he does. He has been a leader throughout his career, bringing teams to the NCAA tournament as a player and as a coach. He places strong value on academics, which is evident in the success his student-athletes have achieved in the classroom.
