Series Notes

- Today's game marks the sixth meeting between Fairfield and Wagner with the Stags holding a 4-1 advantage in the series that began during the 1963-64 campaign. The Stags won the first four games before Wagner posted a 76-64 win last season.

- The Stags are averaging 88.8 points per game in this series including a high of 105 points in the first-ever meeting with Wagner and two more 90-plus point performances.

- In last year's meeting, Fairfield jumped out to an early lead and led through most of the first half before Wagner took the lead for good just four minutes before the half. After trailing by as many as nine points early in the second half, Fairfield battled back within a point with eight minutes left. Wagner scored the next eight points to take control the rest of the way. Jerome Segura led all Fairfield scorers with a career-high 17 points, while Corey Henson netted a game-high 18 points for the Seahawks.

- Shannon Bowman recorded a double-double with 24 points and 14 rebounds while Greg Francis added 20 points in Fairfield's 86-71 win on the road. Wagner had a tough night from the floor, making 38 percent of its field goal attempts and 17 percent of its field goal attempts.

- In the 1995-96 edition, both Francis (24 points) and Bowman (20 points) combined for high scoring numbers again to lead Fairfield past Wagner 95-86 at Alumni Hall. Fairfield opened up a 15-point halftime lead by shooting 59 percent from the floor.

Scouting Wagner: The Seahawks bring a 1-1 overall record into today's game, opening the season with a 67-58 win over UConn before falling to UMass Lowell by an 87-76 count three days later. Today marks the home opener for Wagner, a venue which saw the Seahawks post a 13-4 record a year ago. Wagner advanced to postseason play a year ago after falling in the Northeast Conference championship game. The program received a bid to the NIT in which it defeated St. Bonaventure on the road before falling at Creighton. Head Coach Bashir Mason, who was the NEC Coach of the Year in 2015-16, returns his top two scorers from last year's 23-11 team, namely Corey Henson and Michael Carey. Henson paced the team with a 13.3 scoring average last year, and leads the squad with a 14.5 scoring average in 2016-17. Henson tallied 12.6 points per contest and stands fourth this year at 9.0 points every forty minutes. Carey just missed averaging a double-double in 2015-16 with a 9.1 rebounding average, and has improved on that mark with 9.5 rebounds per game this season. Both student-athletes earned All-NEC honors a year ago.

Scouting Fairfield: The Stags improved to 2-0 with a 79-62 win over Dartmouth, the team's second straight win by more than 15 points. For the second straight game, the Stags shot better than 50 percent from the floor, making 31 of 57 field goal attempts (54.4 percent) and raising the team's field goal percentage to .532 which represents the best mark in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC). The Stags never trailed in the game and only faced one tied score at 9-9 with 16:31 left in the first half. Fairfield scored seven of the next nine points to take a seven-point lead and continued to build on that throughout the game. Junior Tyler Nelson was at the heart of the team's offensive success with 28 points, netting 10 of 14 field goal attempts. Curtis Cobb continued to show his all-around game by connecting for 15 points and securing a team-best eight rebounds. Jerome Segura dished off five assists, giving the guard 15 assists against four turnovers through his first two games.

On This Date: The Stags will play a game on November 19 for the first time since dropping a 64-49 decision at Penn State during the 2010-11 season. Former Head Coach Ed Cooley earned his first collegiate win with a 46-43 victory against Central Arkansas at the XL Center in Hartford. The Stags opened the 1999-2000 campaign when they took on the University of Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse. The contest started a three-game road trip that sent Fairfield to Kansas, UNLV, and UCLA.

Three In A Row: The Stags are looking for their first 3-0 start since the 1995-96 campaign when the team opened with wins at Monmouth (81-79), at Hartford (79-71), and Western Illinois (62-59). The streak stopped in the final of the Coca-Cola Classic when host Montana posted a 92-62 win over Fairfield.

Rankings: The Stags numbers are standing up to in both the MAAC and nation. Fairfield leads the MAAC and ranks 24th nationally for field goal percentage (.532). Their accuracy led the team to an 82.0 scoring average which is tied for the top spot in the MAAC. Fairfield is also achieving success defensively, placing second in the MAAC and 64th in the nation for field goal percentage defense (.365). The Stags are also the MAAC leader in three-point field goal defense (.186) and scoring margin (+19.5).

20/20: Fairfield brings two student-athletes who are averaging 20 points per game into today's game, one of only 12 Division I programs to hold that distinction as of the November 18 NCAA stats. Curtis Cobb (20.5 ppg) and Tyler Nelson (20.0 ppg) represent the Stags in the 20-point club. Along with Fairfield, Brigham Young, Wright State, Purdue, Yale, Arizona State, Towson, Ball State, Oklahoma State, Washington, North Carolina-Wilmington, and St. Bonaventure has at least two players averaging better than 20 points per game. Only St. Bonaventure has three student-athletes netting an average of 20 or more points per contest.

High Octane: Fairfield is averaging 82 points per game through its first two dates after scoring 85 points against Sacred Heart and 79 points at Dartmouth. The 164 points are the most scored in the opening two games since Head Coach Paul Cormier's team recorded 166 points to start the 1994-95 campaign (74-64 win over Akron and 92-59 win over Toledo). In case you were wondering, the most points scored over the first three games of the season came in 1977-78 when the program netted 283 markers against Loyola (100-89 win), Bridgeport (98-86 win), and Stonehill (85-65 win).

Carom Catching: Fairfield enters the Wagner game with six student-athletes averaging five or more rebounds per game, the most for any team in the MAAC. Manhattan, Rider, and Saint Peter's are next in line with three student-athletes holding a rebounding average of 5.0 and above. For Fairfield, the entire starting lineup of Jerome Segura (5.5 rpg), Curtis Cobb (5.0 rpg), Tyler Nelson (5.0 rpg), Matija Milin (5.0 rpg), and Jonathan Kasibabu (5.0 rpg) join reserve Amadou Sidibe (6.5 rpg) for this distinction.

Sizzling Starters: Four of Fairfield's starting five are shooting 60 percent or better from the floor, namely Jonathan Kasibabu (.667), Jerome Segura (.632), Curtis Cobb (.621), and Tyler Nelson (.600). Overall, the starting five combines for a field goal percentage of .585 (58 of 99).

Shot Selection: Tyler Nelson has moved his game inside the three-point arc so far this season. Over his first two seasons with the Stags, the guard took 58 percent of his field goal attempts from outside the arc. This year, Nelson has taken just 28 percent of his shots from three-point range (4 of 7), which is fourth on the team for three-point attempts.

Streaking: Tyler Nelson extended his double-digit scoring streak to 17 with his 28 points against Dartmouth. He ended his 2015-16 season by scoring in double digits in 15 straight games, giving him the longest such streak of his career. His previous best was an eight-gamer set earlier in the 2015-16 season, during which he averaged 20 points per game. In his current string, Nelson averaged 17.5

points per game with seven games of 20 or more points (298 points in 17 games).

On The Rebound: Amadou Sidibe was the Stags' top rebounder following the 2014-15 season, grabbing 6.8 per game. After sitting out last season, the forward regained his knack for collecting loose basketballs by securing 13 rebounds to open the season, giving him a team-best 6.5 rebounding average.

Number One: Six different Fairfield student-athletes picked up a steal in the win over Sacred Heart, the most since six Fairfield players secured seven steals against Canisius last February. Marcus Gilbert had two of those steals that night.

The Nutmeg State: This year, Fairfield played a Connecticut-based team in a season opener for the 13th time since the 1970-71 season and improved to an 11-2 mark in those contests. The Stags have played Central Connecticut State University four times (3-1 record), in a season opener, the most of any state team. Southern Connecticut (3-0), Sacred Heart (3-0), Bridgeport (1-0), Quinnipiac (1-0), and Yale (0-1) have also been an opening game opponent since the 1970-71 campaign.

Exhibition: Fairfield hosted the University of Bridgeport in an exhibition game on November 4 and came away with a 91-59 decision at Alumni Hall. The Stags held a five-point lead at halftime, but scored 56 second-half points which allowed the team to open up its lead by game's end. Tyler Nelson led all scorers with 28 points, making six of nine three-point attempts and recording two assists and three steals without a turnover in 35 minutes of work. Curtis Cobb finished with a double-double, registering 14 points and 10 rebounds, while Amadou Sidibe also collected 10 caroms.

Rookies of the Week: Four Fairfield freshmen picked up a Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Rookie of the Week award last season. Jonathan Kasibabu earned the award on November 23, followed by Jerry Johnson (December 28), Curtis Cobb (February 1), and Matija Milin (March 1).

What's Next: Fairfield continues a three-game road trip that with Wagner today before finishing up at Loyola, Md. (November 23). The team returns home for its November 26 date with Army-West Point at Webster Bank Arena.

A Little Help: Jerome Segura also made an impression on the Stags single-season record book by dishing off 160 assists in 2015-16. The guard secured the 10th best single-season mark in school history. Segura has 224 career assists in 62 appearances, averaging 3.6 assists per appearance.

Pace of Play: The Fairfield University men's basketball finished the 2015-16 season ranked 27th in possessions per game. The Stags had a higher rate in away games by averaging 76 possessions per game as opposed to their 74.7 at home. For the season, the Stags averaged 75.4 possessions through the 2015-16 campaign.

Running Up The Score: Fairfield's increased number of possessions paid off in points as the team significantly raised its points per game total from 2014-15 to 2015-16. Two years ago, the Stags averaged 59.5 points per game in 31 contests. Last season, Fairfield raised that total to 76.4 points every forty minutes, nearly a 22 percent increase in scoring from one year to the next. The previous high for season scoring average under Head Coach Sydney Johnson was 65.3 points per game set in 2011-12, his first season at the helm.

Top Flight: The Fairfield University Class of 2019 finished the 2015-16 campaign as the top scoring freshman class in the MAAC. Curtis Cobb (10.8), Jerry Johnson (8.3), Matija Milin (8.2), and Jonathan Kasibabu (5.9) combined for a total of 32.2 points per game, four points better than Marist's freshman class. The Red Foxes had six student-athletes combine for 28.1 points per contest.

On The Slate: The Stags will play two games against Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schools on back-to-back dates in December, beginning with a trip to North Carolina State University on December 18. Three days later, Fairfield will play Boston College in Birthday of Basketball Classic at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. The doubleheader will also include Oklahoma and Auburn in the nightcap. The Stags have played in a national tournament or event in each of Sydney Johnson's six years with the Stags. Previously, the Stags participated in the 2011 Old Spice Classic in Orlando, the 2012 Preseason NIT, the 2013 Naismith Hall of Fame Tournament,, the 2014 Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament, and the 2015 CBE Coaches vs. Cancer Tournament.

Taking Off The Redshirt: Two Fairfield student-athletes will be on the floor after not playing a year ago. Thomas Nolan will begin his second season with the program but his first on the court after sitting out a year ago. Nolan was an All-State selection and helped lead Fairfield Prep to the a state championship. Amadou Sidibe missed last season with injury but will return for his fourth year with the program. Sidibe has been one of the program's top rebounders throughout his career, leading the team in that category with 6.8 rebounds per contest in 2014-15.

Over The Airwaves: The Fairfield University men's basketball team will have its share of face time on regional and national broadcasts this season. The Stags will eight games on ESPN3 with three of those contests also airing on SNY. The TV schedule starts with a game against Sacred Heart on November 11, an ESPN# only broadcast. The rest of the slate includes December 6 vs. Bucknell (SNY & ESPN3), January 5 at Manhattan (ESPN3), January 15 vs. Siena (SNY & ESPN3), January 20 at Iona (ESPN3), February 2 vs. Niagara (ESPN3), February 13 vs. Rider (ESPN3), February 21 vs. Monmouth (SNY & ESPN3), and February 24 at Canisius (ESPN3). The February 17 game at Quinnipiac will also air nationally either on ESPN3 or ESPN3.

Notebook

On Top: Jerome Segura leads the MAAC in assists with 7.5 per game while his 15 assists are more than any student-athlete in the conference. Segura has only four turnovers in his two games this season, averaging a turnover every 15 minutes of work.

Double-Double: Jerome Segura picked up his first career double-double with 17 points and 10 assists in the win over Sacred Heart. He tied his personal highs for points, rebounds (6), and field goals made (7). It's the *first double-double for a Fairfield student-athlete that included assists* since Derek Needham tallied 20 points and 10 assists against Rider (January 30, 2010) during the 2009-10 season. Needham also had 19 points and 14 assists against Sacred Heart earlier that year.

Top Ten: Jerome Segura dished off his 160th assist in the New Hampshire game during the 2016 CIT, adding to one of the best single-season totals in school history. The guard's performance was the 10th best for a season in Fairfield annals, surpassing A.J. Wynder's mark of 155 during the 1985-86 season. He was 12 assists shy of moving into the ninth slot which is currently held by Marvin Walters (172 in 1988-89).

Century Mark: Jerome Segura collected his 100th assist of the 2015-16 season in the Iona games on January 24. He became the first Fairfield student-athlete to reach 100 assists since K.J. Rose hit the mark with 112 assists in 30 games during the 2013-14 campaign. Segura was the fastest to 100 assists (20 games) since Derek Needham also reached the century mark in his 20th contest of the 2010-11 campaign.

Double Figures: Jerome Segura registered a career-best 11 assists in two separate conference games a year ago, the most recent coming against Manhattan College at home. Earlier in the season, Segura recorded 11 assists at Marist. Segura picked up eight or more assists in seven games in 2015-16, just missing double digits by one assist against Bucknell and Dartmouth.

Segura's Biography

2015-16

Jerome Segura emerged as the team's point guard from the beginning of the 2015-16 season, earning a start at the position in all 32 appearances as a sophomore. He posted a positive assist-to-turnover ratio in 24 of his 32 games and posted an equal number of assists and turnovers in five other games. He recorded a personal best 11 assists at Marist and later tied that mark at home against Manhattan. Segura also showed a knack for scoring when he scored a personal best 17 points in the Wagner game, one of his nine double-digit point totals a year ago. He finished the campaign strongly by scoring 10 or more points in three of his final five games, averaging 9.8 points per game and shooting 43.7 percent from the floor (21 of 48) during that run. He also recorded 20 assists against 11 turnovers during the final five contests. He ended the season with 160 assists which is the 10th highest single-season total in Fairfield basketball history.

2014-15

Segura was a regular all season long, playing in all but one contest as a freshman. He missed the Saint Peter's game after playing in his first 27 collegiate games. He posted a career-high 13 points in a start at Saint Peter's. He also reached double figures as a reserve with 11 points at Niagara in the regular-season finale. Segura was sure-handed with the basketball and was one of only three Stags with more assists than turnovers (64 assists/60 turnovers). He had more turnovers than assists in nine of his 28 regular-season appearances. He dished off nine assists against four turnovers in the team's Buffalo weekend, highlighted by six assists and two miscues against Canisius. Segura earned his first collegiate start at Siena on January 11, joining Tyler Nelson to comprise an all-freshmen backcourt.

Before Fairfield

Segura finished his final season at Langham Creek High School as an All-Region and an All-District player. He led his team to a 17-15 overall record in 2013-14 and a 9-4 mark in the District. He enjoyed one of his finest seasons as a Lobo, tossing in 16.9 points per game. The guard also added 3.5 rebounds, 3.4 assists, and 2.0 steals per game. Over his final three seasons with the program, Segura tossed in 1,153 points and averaged 12.4 points per game. In his final season at Langham Creek, Segura dished off 103 assists and recorded 60 steals in 30 games. He showed his three-point range with a career-high 22 long-range jumpers in 2013-14, and added a personal-best 105 rebounds.

Notebook

All For One: Jerry Johnson Jr. scored all 13 bench points in the Stags' season opener against Sacred Heart, making 5 of 9 field goals including 3 of 5 three point tries. He represented the top scoring reserve for the Stags in 2015-16. The guard netted 232 points which broke out to an 8.3 scoring average. More than half of his points came from behind the three-point line with 129 coming outside the arc. Johnson Jr. came off the bench in 27 of his 28 appearances with his lone start coming against Columbia.

Breaking Out: Jerry Johnson Jr. tallied a career-high 25 points against Marist on February 15, 2016, most of which came from behind the three-point line. Johnson Jr. netted seven of his nine three-point attempts in the game, including five during the second half (six attempts). The seven three-point field goals are the most by a freshman since Jermaine Clark posted eight three pointers (11 attempts) against Manhattan on January 17, 1999, finishing with 32 points. Kyle Commodore also made seven three-point field goals as a freshman, connecting on 7 of 9 attempts behind the arc in his collegiate debut against Monmouth, ending the game with 22 points.

Second Half Run: Jerry Johnson Jr. scored all 13 of his points in the second half and overtime against Loyola. After going scoreless in the first half, Johnson netted three three-point field goals in the second half to tie his career high in that category. He followed up with a pair of field goals in the overtime period.

First Frosh: Jerry Johnson Jr. became the first member of the Class of 2019 to score 20 points in a game with his performance against Dartmouth a year ago. The guard became the first freshman to reach the 20-point mark since Tyler Nelson netted 23 points at Canisius late in 2015-15. Nelson netted 20 or more points three times as a rookie in 2014-15. Before Nelson's accomplishment, Derek Needham was the last Fairfield freshman to score 20 points in a game, a task he achieved eight times during the 2009-10 campaign.

Rookie of the Week: Jerry Johnson Jr. earned his first MAAC Rookie of the Week award after averaging 12.5 points per game in a 2-0 week for the Stags. He came off the bench in both games and reached double figures in the Wagner game (10 points) and the Bucknell game (12 points). He established a career-high for assists (4) and free throws made (4) at Bucknell.

Johnson's Biography

2015-16

Jerry Johnson Jr. averaged 8.3 points per game which was fourth on the team, one spot behind classmate Curtis Cobb's scoring average of 10.8 ppg. Johnson was also fourth among his teammates with 43 three pointers, just one basket from third place. He ranked eighth in the MAAC with a .402 three-point field goal percentage (43 of 107). He made at least one three pointer in 18 games, including 11 games with two or more three pointers. One of his best performances from behind the arc came against Dartmouth when he netted five of six shots from behind the arc, second only to his seven three pointers (nine attempts) at Quinnipiac. The guard shot 40.2 percent from behind the arc, making more than half of his attempts in eight games. The freshman posted nine double-digit scoring games which included two 20-point efforts (20 vs. Dartmouth and 25 vs. Marist). Johnson started one of his 28 appearances, registering two points in 12 minutes against Columbia. He earned the MAAC rookie of the week on December 28.

Before Fairfield

Johnson Jr., joined the Stags' program after prepping at Notre Dame Prep School. He previously attended Houston High School in Tennessee. He was ranked 13th in Massachusetts (Class of 2015) and 48th overall in New England by New England Recruiting Report (NERR). He was listed as a two-star recruit by VerbalCommits.com and was picked as an All-Metro player in Memphis following the 2013-14 campaign. His versatile scoring and high basketball IQ helped Notre Dame Prep qualify for the prestigious 2015 National Prep Championship tournament.

Notebook

Shot Selection: Tyler Nelson has moved his game inside the three-point arc so far this season. Over his first two seasons with the Stags, the guard took 58 percent of his field goal attempts from outside the arc. This year, Nelson has taken just 28 percent of his shots from three-point range (4 of 7), which is fourth on the team for three-point attempts.

Streaking: Tyler Nelson extended his double-digit scoring streak to 17 with his 28 points against Dartmouth. He ended his 2015-16 season by scoring in double digits in 15 straight games, giving him the longest such streak of his career. His previous best was an eight-gamer set earlier in the 2015-16 season, during which he averaged 20 points per game. In his current string, Nelson averaged 17.5 points per game with seven games of 20 or more points (298 points in 17 games).

All-MAAC: Junior Tyler Nelson earned a spot on the All-MAAC Preseason Second Team, an award which was based upon the vote of the conference's head coaches. Nelson is the team's top returning scorer with 16.0 points per game. He netted two three-point field goals per game (66 field goals in 33 games), and led the MAAC in free throw percentage at 88 percent (147 of 167).

High Percentage Shot: Tyler Nelson finished 14th in the nation for free throw percentage, shooting .880 from the charity stripe. The sophomore netted 147 free throws in 167 attempts, which helped him establish the second highest single-season free throw percentage in school history. Joe DeSantis holds the record with a .892 free throw percentage (116 of 130) during the 1976-77 season. At one point during the season, Nelson made 33 straight free throws (January 29 to February 15).

On The Horizon: Tyler Nelson looks to become the Stags' next 1,000-point scorer in 2016-17, needing just 24 points to reach the prestigious plateau. The sophomore netted 848 points through his first 64 games, averaging 13 points per game.

Nelson's Biography

2015-16

Tyler Nelson looks to become the Stags' next 1,000-point scorer in 2016-17, needing just 164 points to reach the prestigious plateau. He comes off his best offensive season of his two-year career with a team-high 529 points which translated into a 16.0 scoring average. The guard earned a spot on the All-MAAC second team after placing sixth among the MAAC scoring leaders. He led the conference in free throw percentage at .880 (147 of 167), a number which was also good enough for 14th in the nation. He netted 2.0 three pointers per game which was ranked 12th in the MAAC as his 66 long-range jumpers raised his career total to 130 in 63 games. He netted three or more three pointers in 10 games during 2015-16, giving him Nelson started all 33 games last season, giving him 63 career starts. Nelson led the team in steals with 44 which ranked 12th in the MAAC at 1.3 per game, and placed second among his teammates with 95 assists. The guard ended the season with 15 straight double-digit scoring games including six with 20 or more points. He netted 20-plus points 11 times, highlighted by his career-best of 27 markers against Niagara in Bridgeport.

2014-15

Nelson emerged as one of the MAAC's top freshmen which was backed up by his appearance on the MAAC's All-Rookie team. The guard became one of the conference's top three-point threats by netting 64 shots from behind the three-point line, the most since Jermaine Clark' posted 70 three pointers as a freshman. Nelson averaged 17.5 points per game over the final six regular-season games and hit double-figures in each of those contests. The rookie scored 10 or more points in 15 games, second only to Marcus Gilbert (27 games). He scored 24 points against South Dakota in his fourth career game, his only 20-point performance until he reached the mark in back-to-back games late in the year (26 vs. Saint Peter's and 23 at Canisius). He was one of three Stags to have more assists (41) than turnovers (40). He just missed reaching the top ten for three-point field goal percentage in a season as his .424 field goal percentage was shy of Michael Van Schaick's mark of .430 (2005-06 season).

Before Fairfield

Nelson joined the Stags basketball program after securing the Massachusetts Gatorade Player of the Year award in 2013-14. He is an All-Conference player who scored 1,443 career points while attending Central Catholic High School. He took his high school team to the state championship game with a 22-6 record before falling four points short. Nelson averaged 22 points and six rebounds per game as a senior and netted 70 three-point field goals. He ended his career with 230 three pointers, averaging better than two made per game. He was named the Lawrence Eagle-Tribune Most Valuable Player for the second straight year following the 2013-14 campaign. He was a two-time Merrimack Valley Conference (MVC) Player of the Year and a two-time ESPN Boston All-State player. As a junior, Nelson averaged 16.2 points per game and was named to the All-MVC Team. He helped the Raiders win the MVC Large and Division 1 North sectional title.

Back In Line: Jonathan Kasibabu, who led the Stags in rebounding last season with 5.9 per game, picked up where he left off by registering a team-best eight caroms against the Pioneers. The forward was also the top offensive rebounder for the Stags with 69 last year, nearly twice as many as runner-up Matija Milin's 35 offensive caroms. He was the second leading rebounder among freshmen in the MAAC last season, trailing only Quinnipiac's Abdulai Bundu (6.6 rpg).

MAAC Tourney: Jonathan Kasibabu averaged a team-best eight rebounds per game in the team's two MAAC tournaments. The freshman posted seven in the win against Saint Peter's and nine in the loss to Monmouth. Kasibabu's nine rebounds were the most since he picked up 10 caroms against Manhattan on February 7.

MAAC Rookie of the Week: Jonathan Kasibabu earned the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Rookie of the Week after averaging a double-double in a 1-1 week. He posted a career-best 12 points and five rebounds at Northwestern. The forward followed with his first double-double of the season, a 12-point, 15-rebound effort against Sacred Heart.

Clutch Shooter: Jonathan Kasibabu tied his career high with five free throws against Niagara (Jan. 15), but went 4 for 4 in the final 39 seconds of the game. He iced the game when he connected on both free throw tries with four seconds left, turning a three-point game into a five-point edge and turning the game into a two-possession contest.

Double-Double: Jonathan Kasibabu posted a double-double with his 16 points and 10 rebounds against Saint Peter's, the second of his career. He registered 12 points and a career-best 15 rebounds against Sacred Heart for his first double-double. Kasibabu's Biography

2015-16

Jonathan Kasibabu led all Stags with 181 rebounds in 2015-16 which broke out to 5.5 rebounds per game. The forward was ranked in three MAAC statistical categories, namely rebounding (16th with 5.5 per game), blocked shots (7th with 1.2 per game), and eighth in offensive rebounding (2.1 per game). He was among the top rebounders during the MAAC tournament by averaging 8.0 per contest, highlighted by nine against Monmouth. He posted 10 or more rebounds in five games, two of which completed a double-double. The forward garnered 12 points and a personal-best 15 caroms against Sacred Heart and followed up with 16 points and 10 rebounds versus Saint Peter's. He blocked at least one shot in 21 games, putting together a run of 10 straight games with a block. He totaled 19 rejections over those 10 games (1.9 per game). He tallied four blocks in the MAAC tournament quarterfinal game against Saint Peter's, tying his season high set earlier at Marist. Kasibabu was the team's most accurate shooter with a .514 field goal percentage, the only Stag who made more than half of his attempts for the season. He earned the MAAC rookie of the week award on November 23.

Before Fairfield

Kasibabu attended Westtown School (Pa.) where he earned All-Friends School League first team honors. The 6-8 forward also gained attention when he was labeled a "Player to Watch" at the Chic-Fil-A Classic Holiday Tournament earlier in the season. He was voted team captain by his teammates and helped the team post a 25-8 record and capture the 2015 Friends School League title. Before his time in the United States, Kasibabu was selected to the Euroleague Nike International Junior Tournament All-Tournament team in 2014 and was one of 12 players who were designated Top Prospect that showed best potential at the same tournament.

At The Start: Matija Milin came off the bench in 28 of his 31 appearances last season, but his role seems to have changed in 2016-17. He was in the starting lineup for both the exhibition game against Bridgeport and in the season opener versus Sacred Heart. He tallied 11 points in the season opener and added five rebounds in 29 minutes.

Top Scorer: Matija Milin scored a team-high 16 points in the team's MAAC tournament semifinal loss to Monmouth last season, the first time he has been the squad's outright points leader. He was the co-leader in scoring with 16 points against Siena in the home finale, tying Tyler Nelson for the honor.

Rookie of the Week: Matija Milin became the fourth Fairfield student-athlete to earn the MAAC Rookie of the Week award last year. Milin averaged 16 points per game in a 1-1 week for the Stags, scoring 16 points in each of his two performances. Milin came off the bench in both games and led all Fairfield reserves in scoring. He shot 71 percent in the win over Siena (5 of 7) and had the same percentage at the line (5 of 7). He came back with three three-pointers and five free throws in the four-point loss to Saint Peter's. For the week, Milin shot 50 percent from the floor (9 of 18), 40 percent from three-point range (4 of 10), and 71 percent from the line (10 of 14). He joins Jonathan Kasibabu, Jerry Johnson Jr., and Curtis Cobb as a MAAC Rookie of the Week.

Minute Man: Matija Milin logged 282 minutes over the last 10 games of the season more than any other Stag reserve during that stretch. He averaging 11.8 points per game with 118 points over those minutes played. Milin collected 30 or more minutes in six of those 10 games, having played more than 30 minutes just one time in the previous 23 games (career-high 38 vs. Columbia).

Milin's Biography

2015-16

Matija Milin developed into one of the top sixth-men in the MAAC during the 2015-16 campaign, coming off the bench in all regular-season games. He garnered his first start in the MAAC quarterfinal game against Saint Peter's and remained among the starting five in the next two postseason games against Monmouth and New Hampshire. Milin reached double figures for the first time as a Stag with 11 points at Maryland-Eastern Shore which started a run of five straight double-digit scoring games. During that run, Milin posted his only double-double of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds against Columbia. He fell one rebound short of a double-double in three other games – Manhattan (19 pts.), Saint Peter's (10 pts.) and Monmouth (16 pts.). The latter two in that list came in the MAAC tournament which enabled him to be the team's top rebounder in the MAAC tournament with a 9.0 average. Milin was named the MAAC rookie of the week when he averaged 16 points in a 1-1 week against Siena and at Saint Peter's in the final week of the season. The forward later surpassed that five-game run of double-digit scoring when he hit the 10-point mark six times over the final four regular-season games and the two MAAC tournament dates. He was also successful distributing the ball, posting at least one assist in 15 games and three or more assists in six contests.

Milin, a 6-9, 220-pound forward, came to Fairfield from Belgrade, Serbia and was ranked as a high major player at the 2015 UBA Showcase in Istanbul, Turkey. He was a member of the Serbian Junior National Team from 2011-14 and was also a member of KK Zeman (Serbia) Junior Team.

Sidibe's Biography

2014-15 Season: Amadou Sidibe emerged as one of the conference's top rebounders during the 2014-15 campaign, posting five double-doubles. He started the year with a 10-point, 12-rebound effort against Central Connecticut. He tallied double-doubles in three straight games – Loyola, Md. (13 pts, 13 rebs.), Siena (10 pts., 11 rebs.), and Rider (12 pts., 15 rebs.). The forward finished the season among the MAAC leaders in rebounding, securing sixth place with 6.8 caroms per contest. He missed five of the last six regular-season games with injury, but returned to play 15 minutes against Saint Peter's in the MAAC tournament. He finished as the team's most accurate shooter, connecting on 49.1 percent of his shots. He finished with a field goal percentage of .500 or better in nine of 13 games in which he attempted four or more field goals. When he played more than 20 minutes in a game, Sidibe averaged 10.1 rebounds per game over 12 games and secured eight or more rebounds in 11 of those 12 contests.

2013-14 Season: Sidibe served as the team captain during his sophomore season, starting 27 of his 32 appearances in 2013-14. His five appearances as a reserve were in succession, starting with the Northeastern game on December 15 and running through his appearance at Manhattan on January 4. His first double-digit scoring performance came against at Siena when he netted 12 points. He surpassed that total with his double-double performance against Saint Peter's in the final regular-season road game, tallying a career-high 18 points and 14 rebounds. His specialty was rebounding, proven by his team-best 6.6 caroms per contest which ranked eighth in the MAAC. He collected 10 or more rebounds eight times, beginning with a personal-best 16 rebounds against Holy Cross. He shot 45 percent from the floor, shooting 50 percent or better in 18 games last season. Sidibe finished his sophomore season with a 5.6 scoring and a 6.6 rebounding average.

2012-13 Season: Sidibe collected the MAAC Co-Rookie of the Year and picked up a berth to the MAAC All-Rookie team, joining teammate Marcus Gilbert for that honor. He earned the MAAC rookie of the week honor on January 25 after averaging 9.3 points and nine rebounds per game in a 2-1 week. He led the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds and was one of the team's most accurate shooters with a .527 field goal percentage. Sidibe started the year as a reserve, coming off the bench for the first five games, before getting his first start against Fordham in the NIT preseason tournament. He responded with his first double-digit performance, netting 10 points and adding eight rebounds against the Rams. Two games later, he tallied his first double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds against DePaul as a reserve. He would add one more double-double during the year, registering a career-best 12 points and 11 rebounds against Loyola Md. at home. He would surpass that 11-rebound effort with a career-best 13 caroms against Manhattan on February 12 and Saint Peter's in the MAAC tournament. Sidibe was the team's top rebounder in the Stags' four postseason games with 30 (7.5 per game). For the season, Sidibe scored in double figures seven times and grabbed 10 or more rebounds five times.

Smith's Biography

2015-16

Steve Smith came off the bench for all 13 of his appearances, the last of which came in the Stags' postseason game against New Hampshire in the CIT. He scored points in his first three outings, averaging five points per contest during that stretch (15 points). He started with a three-point effort in three minutes of work at Maryland-Eastern Shore and followed up with season highs against Columbia (six points, four rebounds). He would equal that point total one game later at Iona, netting two of four three pointers to reach the mark. All 15 of those points came from behind the three-point arc, netting 6 of 21 attempts from long range on the season. After making five of his first nine tries from behind the arc, he finished the season with one three pointer in his final 12 attempts. Smith has 44 career three pointers in 58 career games. Smith did not play in the first four games of 2015-16 due to injury but came back to play in nine of the next 10 games for the Stags.

2014-15

Smith appeared in 18 games during the 2014-15 season which included the final 12 games played by the Stags. The guard scored in 11 of those 18 contests, highlighted by a season-high nine points at Canisius. He scored in three consecutive games during MAAC play with six points against Quinnipiac, three points at Manhattan, and three more at Niagara. During the regular season, Smith made all but one of his shots from behind the three-point line with his two-pointer coming at Marist. In the MAAC tournament game versus Saint Peter's, both of his shots were inside the arc. He shot 36 percent outside the three-point arc (14 of 39) and 27 percent inside the arc (3 of 11). He netted six or more points four times, hitting the mark at Northeastern, at Saint Peter's, and Quinnipiac while registering a season-high nine points at Canisius.

2013-14

Offensively, Smith spent nearly his entire season behind the three-point line as only four of his 74 field goal attempts came inside the three-point arc. The freshman made 21 of 70 shots from long range which included six games with two or more three pointers. He enjoyed a four-game run that include 11 three pointers in 25 attempts (.440), highlighted by five three pointers in seven tries at Green Bay on December 21 for a personal-best 15 points. For the season, Smith averaged 2.7 points per game and just under 10 minutes per appearance (264 minutes in 27 games). Smith appeared in 27 games in 2013-14 with all but one coming as a reserve. The guard picked up a starting assignment at Loyola, Md. on November 16, playing 10 minutes without scoring.

Supreme Start: Curtis Cobb could not have asked for a better start to a season. The sophomore scored the team's first 16 points of the game and went 8 for 8 in the first half to lead Fairfield to its season-opening win over Sacred Heart. He netted 18 points in the first half before settling for a career-best 26 points on 11 of 13 shooting from the floor. He also connected on four of five three-point tries. Cobb's 26 points were the most points on opening night since Tony George's 29 points at Marist during the 1984-85 season opener, a 79-76 victory for the Stags.

High Five: Curtis Cobb ended the 2015-16 regular season with a personal-best five-game double-digit scoring streak to a with his 23 points at Niagara. Over the five-game run, Cobb averaged 17.4 points per game including two 20-point efforts. His previous high was four straight games with 10 or more points, averaging 14.8 points over that time (January 11-22).

Steal Away: Curtis Cobb led all Fairfield student-athletes with a team-best 32 steals in MAAC play. He finished the season ranked 11th in the MAAC with 1.3 steals per game and was in a tie for second-place in steals for MAAC-only games with 1.8 per contest. He ended the campaign by registering two or more steals in 13 of the final 18 contests.

Dynamic Debut: Curtis Cobb earned a start in his first collegiate game, getting the nod against Yale University. The freshman responded by scoring a co-leading eight points in the game, joining Marcus Gilbert and Matija Milin for the honor. Cobb was perfect from three-point range, making both of his attempts against the Bulldogs.

Cobb's Biography

2015-16

Curtis Cobb emerged as one of the top freshmen in the MAAC as noted by his selection by the head coaches to the conference's All-Rookie team. He was in the starting lineup for most of the season including his collegiate debut against Yale. In his third game with the Stags, he tallied 13 points and grabbed seven rebounds against Northwestern, the first of 18 double-figure scoring games for the guard. He hit the 20-point mark for the first time at Marist, netting 21 points and securing seven rebounds. The Massachusetts native went on to tally 20 or more points three more times, highlighted by a personal-best 25 points against Canisius at Webster Bank Arena. He missed the final two regular-season games and two MAAC tournament contests with an injury, but came back to play 17 minutes against New Hampshire in the CIT. Cobb captured the MAAC rookie of the week award after his performance against Canisius. He finished his rookie campaign among the MAAC statistical leaders in scoring (28th with 10.8 ppg) and steals (11th with 1.3 spg). Cobb picked up two or more steals in 13 games, more than any other Stag in 2015-16.

Before Fairfield

Cobb, a 6-4, 175-pound guard, came to Fairfield as a highly-rated guard who is ranked sixth in Massachusetts (Class of 2015) by ESPN. He was listed as a three-star recruit by several recruiting services including Scout, Rivals, Yahoo Sports, and 24/7 Composite. He earned All-NEPSAC first team honors as a member of Wilbraham and Monsoon Academy and was a 2015 McDonald's All-America nominee. He was a member of the New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC) first team in 2014-15.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson



Sydney Johnson became the 12th head coach to oversee the Fairfield University men's basketball program when he was introduced in April, 2011. Johnson joined the Stags program after spending four seasons as the head coach at his alma mater Princeton University.

Head Coach Sydney Johnson begins his fifth season at Fairfield University, leading the Stags to the postseason in two of those campaigns. The 2011-12 Stags reached the MAAC Tournament Championship game, the CollegeInsider.com Tournament (CIT) semi-finals, and defeated Arizona State, Old Dominion, and Iona, among others, en route to a 22-win season. In 2012-13, the Stags earned another postseason berth as a participant in the 2013 CIT.

Fairfield posted 41 victories under Coach Johnson in his first two seasons and 55 wins overall. His 41 wins through his first two campaigns ties him for the most by any Fairfield men's basketball coach through his first two seasons. The Stags three

postseason wins in 2012-13 were the most by any team in school history. Fairfield also led the MAAC in scoring defense at 61.1 ppg in his inaugural season.

Since his arrival, five Fairfield student-athletes have signed professional contracts, namely Rakim Sanders (Israel), Ryan Olander (Lithuania), Derek Needham (Lithuania), Colin Nickerson (Canada), and Maurice Barrow (Austria).

At Princeton, Johnson led the Tigers to the 2010-11 Ivy League championship and an automatic berth to the NCAA tournament. Princeton took the University of Kentucky to the final seconds before dropping a 59-57 decision in the NCAA tournament second round. It marked the second straight season that the program advanced to postseason play, playing in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) in 2009-10. During his tenure, Johnson owned a 66-53 record as the Tigers' head coach.

Johnson helped turn around the Princeton program in his four-year stay as the Tigers posted a 6-23 overall record and a 3-11 Ivy League slate in his first season. After improving to 13-14 overall and 8-6 in Ivy play in 2008-09, Johnson led Princeton to its first 20-win season since 2004 when the team finished the year with a 22-9 overall record. This year, the Tigers tied the second-highest win total in Princeton history with a 25-7 mark.

Under his guidance, Princeton has become one of the top defensive teams in the country. The Tigers led the nation in scoring defense during the 2009-10 season, allowing fewer total points (1652) and fewest points per game (53.3) than any other Division I team that year.

Johnson was named the Ivy League Coach of the Year by Collegeinsider.com following the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.

Before taking over the Princeton program, Johnson was an assistant coach at Georgetown University under John Thompson III. He helped the Hoyas advance to the program's first Final Four in 22 years. Georgetown owned a 30-7 record that season, winning the Big East regular season and tournament titles. Georgetown advanced to the postseason in all three of his years as an assistant coach which included two NCAA tournaments and one NIT berth.

Johnson also experienced postseason play as a student-athlete, leading the Tigers to the NCAA tournament during the 1995-96 and 1996-97 seasons. In the 1996 tournament, Princeton upset defending national champion UCLA to advance to the second round.

As a student-athlete, Johnson earned the 1997 Ivy League Player of the Year as well as an All-Ivy League first team honors in 1995-96 and 1996-97. He is the only three-time captain in Princeton men's basketball history. He earned an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 1997, but decided to continue his basketball career overseas.

He was a starter for Gorizia Pallacanestro in Italy and helped the team capture the Italian Second Division championship. The following season, he was part of another championship team as Reggio Calabria won the league title.

"I think Sydney exhibits all the qualities of a successful head coach," said Fairfield University Director of Athletics Gene Doris. "He embraces the Jesuit philosophy, which is the cornerstone of Fairfield University, and exhibited a clear understanding of the University's mission during the interview process. He leads by example, something that is quite visible when you see the passion and enthusiasm he brings to everything he does. He has been a leader throughout his career, bringing teams to the NCAA tournament as a player and as a coach. He places strong value on academics, which is evident in the success his student-athletes have achieved in the classroom."
